County employee refuses vaccine, lawsuit filed

On Feb. 18, Doña Ana County Detention Center (DACDC) employee Isaac Legaretta was notified he must be vaccinated within five days. He is now embroiled in a lawsuit as attorneys Ana Garner and Jon Diener have filed a complaint in U.S. District Court against County Manager Fernando Macias.

On the same day he was notified of the vaccination deadline, Legaretta received a “coaching and counseling” write up for not complying with the vaccine mandate and was told he was in danger of losing his job. Macias had issued a memorandum Jan. 29, notifying county first responders and detention center staff that COVID-19 vaccinations would be required as a condition of employment.

Diener said the vaccine is “a different bird.” He said he only calls it a vaccine “loosely” because it is not a normal vaccine. He said the vaccine has only been approved on an emergency basis by the FDA and has not received full approval which means, until it is approved, it cannot be mandated.

“The FDA makes the determination regarding the use of drugs,” Diener said. “They said because of the emergency, which I dispute, we are going to let this go out even before it is thoroughly tested. So, when Doña Ana County (DAC) says, ‘Take this or

lose your job,’ we contend it’s a violation of federal law and a violation of due process.”

There are several points in the Bill of Rights, Diener contends, that protect the “zone of privacy,” which includes bodily integrity that can’t be interfered with by the government.

“We contend that to be injected by a chemical is clearly an invasion of [one’s] zone of privacy,” he said. “There are cases that say health choices are personal. We are asking to say this can’t be mandated and asking the court that DAC can’t fire or negatively impact [an] employee who doesn’t want to take the vaccine.”

Diener said he has heard of a lot of people having adverse reactions to the vaccine.

“Personally, I am not going to take it,” he said.

DAC Attorney Nelson Goodin said a federal judge has denied Legaretta’s request for a temporary restraining order, because Garner and Diener did not meet the necessary standards and requirements.

“They have not established irreparable harm,” Goodin said, adding the county has an obligation to keep detainees safe. When they come in, detainees are isolated and tested before going into the general population.

DAC, Goodin said, has an obligation under OSHA to provide a safe workplace for employees. The FDA doesn’t mandate the distribution of the

vaccine, and the CDC says it is up to states what they want to mandate in terms of employees.

He said the Otero County Detention Center has had 499 positive COVID-19 cases during the past year, with the most at one time being 60 within a population that hovers around 500.

As of Friday, March 5, 203 employees at the DACDC. Legaretta, he said, is the sole exception.

At this point, Goodin said, DAC has only given the vaccination mandate to first responders and DACDC personnel. When an employer mandates something, he said, the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission says they must make accommodations for objections involving religious and medical issues. There have been a handful of accommodations requested and granted along those lines.

Legaretta’s case is scheduled for a briefing in two weeks before federal Judge Martha Vasquez.

Dr. Karen Marie Trujillo

Dr. Karen Marie Trujillo, 50, of Las Cruces, New Mexico, beloved wife and partner to Ben Trujillo, mother of Taralyn, Tim and, Tavyn, transitioned from this earth to be with her Lord Jesus, and with the Communion of Saints, on Thursday, February 25, 2021.

Karen was born in Albuquerque on Sept. 25, 1970, to Gilbert and Bernadette Apodaca. After stints living in Farmington and Questa, her Apodaca family moved to Santa Fe. She was precocious, a student of life, always learning. She attended Kearney, Capshaw and Santa Fe High.

In her youth, she was active in 4-H, and began her lifelong affair with words, art, music and nature. She was first a teacher to her four younger siblings, and to many cousins and friends. The summer before her senior year, she was elected Lt. Governor of Girls State, then moved to Las Cruces. Excelling in her studies and active in drama, she graduated from Mayfield High in 1988. She was commencement speaker.

In 1991 Karen met the love of her life, Ben Trujillo. They were married in the summer of 1992 by Monsignor John Anderson at Holy Cross Catholic Church. They went on to have three beautiful children, Taralyn, Timothy and Tavyn.

Karen lived a profound life of service and was a force for education in the state. Her deep spirituality guided her each day. She delighted in her faith journey — with a particular devotion to Mary and the

Holy Family — and, at the same time, Karen saw the Spirit of God in all whose lives she touched, whatever their background. For 25 years, she dedicated herself professionally, with full resolve and purpose, and with much wisdom and joy, to the students, teachers and families of New Mexico. She lit up every room she entered with authenticity, intelligence and compassion. In a world built on transactional relationships, Karen did for others without expectation of something in return. She shared by example her vision for elevating others above self and working on being our best selves. She was living out God's purpose for her life.

Karen began her career as a math teacher at Las Cruces High in 1993. She thereafter taught at Cobre High in Bayard, Hot Springs High in Truth or Consequences and at Alma D'Arte Charter High School in Las Cruces. She served as principal of the Las Cruces Catholic School.

Karen was a proud Aggie, earning her bachelor's and master's degrees in mathematics education,

and her Ph.D. in curriculum and instruction in mathematics. As all who witnessed know, she loved cheering (intensely) for her beloved Aggies.

In 2000, Karen began working at NMSU as an adjunct professor and remained a local school administrator. While at NMSU, among other things, Karen wrote grants, conducted research and became director of K-12 outreach for the Alliance for the Advancement of Teaching and Learning with the College of Education.

While director, in 2015 she founded Educators Rising New Mexico, a program which recruits high schoolers to teaching careers. Karen also started NMSU's Southwest Outreach Academic Research Lab and worked in multiple research and development roles for Math Snacks, a grant-funded program which developed a set of games and animations to help children understand math concepts. Later, Karen became interim associate dean for research in NMSU's College of Education.

In 2018, Karen ran for the District 5 seat on the

Doña Ana County Commission and won. After weeks in office, and her selection as chairwoman, she was nominated to be Secretary of the New Mexico Department of Education. She was unanimously confirmed by the New Mexico Senate and served with grace and knowledge. She tirelessly rallied the state's students and teachers to a belief that there was hope to be had in our shared future.

Karen thereafter returned home, where she became superintendent of the Las Cruces Public School District. She guided the children and teachers of Las Cruces with a steady hand. She navigated a cyber-attack and the pandemic. She never was overwhelmed by circumstance or expectation, because she always knew that education was the business of changing lives. There was nothing she would rather do. She led without fear, and with the conviction that we all have a duty to use our gifts to make our community and world a better place.

Until they are together again, Karen leaves her husband and children: Ben Trujillo, Taralyn Trujillo and John Melvin (Carson and Kennedy), Tim Trujillo and McKenna Chavez and Tavyn Trujillo; her parents, Gilbert and Bernadette Apodaca; her mother-in-law, Elisia Trujillo; her siblings: Deborah Apodaca and fiancé, John Griffin (Samuel, Celia, Oushyn), Frank Apodaca and wife, Kyndra (Violet, Noelle), John Apodaca and wife, Marquita (Asher, Elyse), Julie Borrego and husband, Juan Carlos (Jeremiah, Josiah); her siblings

A year later, early pandemic memories persist

One year ago today, March 12, 2020, our world began changing.

For me, it was a slow-motion change. The edges of the world were melting, as if we were trapped in a Salvador Dali painting.

Unsurprisingly, since the sport has been part of my life since second grade, I first felt the changes through the lens of basketball.

It was tournament time and, at The Bulletin, we were monitoring the progress of our local high school basketball teams in Albuquerque for the state tournament, as well as New Mexico State University, whose stellar men's team was in Las Vegas, Nevada, for the Western Athletic Conference tournament.

The afternoon of Wednesday, March 11, I listened to Jeff Matthews' radio broadcast of the Las Cruces High School boys' 51-46 quarterfinal victory

over Clovis. You could hear the excitement of The Pit in Albuquerque. Cheerleaders cheering, fans screaming, bands playing and the telltale sneaker squeaks of players on the court. The Bulldawgs were the only local team still alive.

Then came Thursday, March 12.

We were hearing things nationally about events going on without fans, or being canceled altogether, due to this mysterious pandemic.

The Aggies were scheduled to play a Thursday game in the WAC's first round, and I was tuning the radio to hear Jack Nixon call the action. Soon we learned the entire WAC tournament was canceled. The Aggie players were all dressed up with no place to go, having arrived in Las Vegas for the WAC, then standing around waiting to come back home.

The league declared NMSU as

its representative in the NCAA tournament — fitting, since the Aggies went 16-0 in the conference. But another question was brewing: Would there even BE an NCAA tournament?

So, what about the New Mexico high school tournament? It would continue, but in front of no fans at The Pit.

For the Thursday evening semifinal pitting the LCHS Bulldawgs against Albuquerque's Volcano Vista, I again tuned in to Jeff Matthews on the radio. But something wasn't quite right.

I knew there were no fans, so I didn't expect to hear the cheering and the bands. But where were the sneaker squeaks? Where were the referee whistles?

Soon enough, Matthews explained: In addition to fans, media had also been largely excluded from the arena, meaning he was calling the game from his hotel room, viewing a live feed on his computer.

The whole thing seemed un-

natural, compounded by eerily overcast skies in Las Cruces.

The Bulldawgs beat Volcano Vista 47-31, earning a berth in the final on Saturday, March 14, when they defeated Santa Fe Capitol, 65-53, to win the 5A state championship. I believe it was the last high school title game played in America in 2020. LCHS Coach William Benjamin said it was weird and a little spooky, but he believed the lack of distractions helped his team.

Friday the 13th, we got word Las Cruces Public Schools would have a two-week spring break, to give the administration time to chart a direction.

That first week, Las Cruces was like a ghost town. No one knew if it was safe to even grab a door handle or pump gas.

Over time, we each found our own ways to adjust to this strange new world. But the surreal, haunting nature of those first several days, living in a sci-fi movie, is something I won't soon forget.

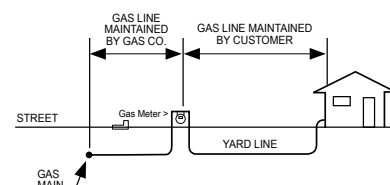

Please keep in mind that:

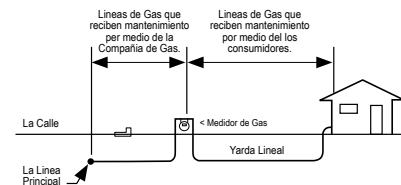
1. Buried steel gas piping that is not maintained may be subject to the potential hazards of corrosion and subsequent gas leakage.
2. Buried gas piping should be:
 - a. Periodically inspected for leaks.
 - b. Periodically inspected for corrosion if the piping is metallic.
 - c. Repaired if unsafe condition is found.
3. Before excavating near buried gas piping, the piping should be located, marked, and excavated by hand.
4. Licensed gas fitters/plumbers and contractors can assist in performing the required inspections described in (2) above, making leak repairs, and locating the buried gas piping prior to the start of any planned excavation.

A better health system will attract providers

Two years ago, 21 New Mexico physicians from seven counties signed an Op-Ed in the Albuquerque Journal. Our goal? To highlight how the state's Health Security Plan could alleviate the state's chronic shortage of medical providers.

Now evidence for that has arrived, just as a bill to start designing that plan (House Bill 203) is working its way through the legislature.

A recent national inquiry of healthcare providers — mostly physicians — showed 74 of 92 who replied would move or consider moving to New Mexico if we imple-

ment a universal health coverage system. Positive responders included doctors, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, pharmacists and counselors. The poll, done by Physicians for a National Health Program, contacted about 1,000 of its members.

Opponents argue the Health Security Plan would drive providers to flee the state. But this data suggests something very different: that many badly needed primary care providers and subspecialists would be drawn to practice here if we were to achieve universal health coverage via this route. Also, a 2020 independent financial analysis of this new approach showed huge savings while assuming no reduction in providers' incomes, so there would

be no financial reason for providers to leave. Logic and the evidence clearly favor a future net gain in providers, not a net loss.

The truth is, insurance companies are terrified of losing a big chunk of their business to a new, nonprofit, co-op style health plan. In response, they hope to scare us into believing a myth about a flood of providers moving away.

Right now, New Mexico ranks 40th in the nation in access to medical care. Of 33 counties, 32 are totally or partially considered Health Professional Shortage Areas. Our current approach is failing. Also, in 2019, New Mexico had the oldest physician workforce in America. Looming retirements will make matters worse in coming years.

The new information

also confirms what we know from clinical experience: Most providers are weary of wasting energy on multiple drug formularies, excessive "prior authorizations," network obstacles, assisting un/underinsured patients, etc. If New Mexico greatly reduces those aggravations, we believe it's bound to help the state keep and attract providers.

Consider this: Three national studies since 2017 show up to 66 percent of doctors are fed-up and now favor a national health system. In the absence of that, where would they most likely choose to work? New Mexico, assuming we adopt this innovative, multi-payer approach that makes sure everyone is covered, is simpler, costs less, largely eliminates

insurance networks and expands mental health care!

We ask you to imagine just one percent of America's providers pondering moving to New Mexico. If only one quarter of that group actually relocated, New Mexico would gain more than 3,000 primary care providers and subspecialists in the next five to 10 years! Let's be first out of the gate, and give those caring, frustrated providers a new home. HB203 starts the process; please urge your legislator's support.

where one not born in the U.S. becomes a U.S. citizen.

February 26, 2021, a client and friend, Amidu, was naturalized. I can't

imagine this young man's feeling on that monumental date. He escaped indescribable violence in Ghana, Africa. In 2013, he trekked to the U.S., first hiding in the stowage compartment of a commercial ship and then walking from Colombia to the southern border

of the U.S. At the border, where he thought he may be met with kindness, the Border Agents shouted at him, called him names, but eventually took him into custody and put him into detention at the El Paso Processing Service

Mesilla marshal seeks owners of recovered stolen property

The Mesilla Marshal's Office (MMO) wants residents to claim items stolen in a series of burglaries in Mesilla, Las Cruces and throughout Doña Ana County and El Paso dating back to 2019 and perhaps earlier.

MMO detective and crime scene investigator Danny Garcia broke the case in January, when he took a report of a shoplifting incident at Julienne's Jewelry Store on the Mesilla Plaza.

"I began to follow up on this case, and holy cow, it led to numerous burglaries, larcenies of stores, stolen vehicles," he said. "Numerous commercial rented storage units were broken into, and to date, I have identified over 40 victims from all jurisdic-

tions," Garcia said. "My investigation led to four suspects who were identified as the perpetrators of these crimes. It turned out to be a theft ring, which I dubbed as Operation Gonzales Moving and Storage."

Garcia said Alexander Baca-Gonzales, 41, of Las Cruces, was identi-

fied as the ringleader. Baca-Gonzales has been charged with theft and other crimes in the investigation, along with other suspects, Garcia said, and more arrests are expected.

Two of the suspects, Joseph Gonzales and Sarah Brewer, "continued their crime spree in Mesilla" after bonding out of jail,

Garcia said. "They took packages from porches and broke into three mailboxes, stealing mail and checks, including one check in the amount of \$6,000."

The two were re-arrested, Garcia said, and additional stolen items were recovered from their vehicle.

With assistance from the Doña Ana County Sheriff's Office, Las Cruces Police Department and the New Mexico State Police SWAT team, the MMO executed search warrants last month on a mobile home, which Garcia said was used as a "stash house" and contained "stolen property from one end to the other."

Four vehicles containing stolen property related to the thefts were found, and a home on Stern Drive was found to contain "lots and lots of stolen mail," Garcia said.

MMO personnel had a meeting with numerous potential victims at the Mesilla Senior Community Center Feb. 25, Garcia said. Participants watched a PowerPoint photo show of recovered stolen items and participated in a walk

through in the auditorium to identify stolen items.

"We did have a few victims identify their property, and we are in the process of returning the items to the owners," Garcia said.

Anyone who thinks he or she might have been victimized can visit the MMO at 2670 Calle de Parian in Mesilla to pick up a CD with photos of stolen items. People who can prove ownership can contact Garcia at dannyg@mesillanm.gov about reclaiming property.

"I feel bad for the [people] of each jurisdiction who had their property stolen, and I am doing my best to return these items and avoid an auction after a certain time period of storing the property at our evidence section," Garcia said.

Center, consistent with the law at that time. He had passed his credible fear interview, and sat in detention for a year

before his chance to plead his case in front of an Immigration judge. Most are unaware of the love these asylum seekers have for the United States.

Amidu won his asylum case in 2014 in an El Paso immigration court where

most asylees are denied. He then moved to Las Cruces. In the next four years, he graduated on the Dean's list from both Dona Ana Community College and New Mexico State University with a degree from the Creative

Media Institute. Amidu is now gainfully employed in the New Mexico film industry. What this young man has accomplished is admirable. We, as a society, need to applaud asylum seekers who become new Americans. We

need to turn away from the hateful rhetoric spewing from people who have no knowledge what it is like to be forced to flee violence and persecution from your home. We need to welcome these new Americans with enthusi-

asm and appreciate their assistance in building a better and more inclusive United States.

The year 1888 is an important one in New Mexico - it marks the year our oldest public institution of higher education was founded, New Mexico State University. 1888 also marks the year the "straw" was patented in Washington D.C., by Marvin Stone. The patent consisted of a manufacturing process where the straw was produced using winding strips of paper. However, in the 1960s, it was replaced by a toxic material called plastic, which is the common straw we know today. While it may seem harmless and quite silly to think a simple plastic straw could have a negative impact in our environment, the truth is, it does. One plastic straw can take approximately 200 years to decompose, which means there are over 140 years to go before straws produced in the 60s will decompose. Can you imagine how many more plastic straws have been produced since then? Have you ever wondered how long a plastic straw lasts for its intended purpose? Plastic straws are discarded immediately once a beverage is consumed (probably quicker than it takes to produce one) and how many beverages do people consume using plastic straws daily? Is it even necessary



to use a plastic straw versus tipping the glass to get a drink? There are alternatives to plastic straws for those who necessarily need them. Personally, I prefer to tip the glass, but the issue of the plastic straw has become an important one to the extent that municipalities throughout the U.S. have created ordinances banning or restricting the use of plastic straws. Why would they do that, you might ask? Perhaps to help mitigate the negative effects plastic straws have in our environment, such as the toxic byproducts they cause when exposed to heat or the physical harm they cause to marine life. Furthermore, plastic straws are not one of the items that we can recycle in our recycling stream. They end up at the landfill, desert landscape, streams, or polluting the ocean in a big way. Perhaps it's time to skip the straw. One way to start is by asking your waitress or drive-thru attendant to leave the straw off when placing your order. It is that simple. Prizes and stipends valued at \$50,000 will be awarded at the national finals, including \$20,000 for first place, \$10,000 for second and \$5,000 for third.

The illustration for the 2021 official state final poster is titled "Dissection of an Unidentified Object" and was drawn by Emily Cai, a student at CHS.

Cai was a New Mexico and National Gold Key awardee in the 2020 Scholastic Art and Writing Awards. She also is a National American Visions awardee in drawing and illustration. Her CHS teachers are Huaqing Cai and Amanda Marcott, the news release said.

"This piece was part of

a series of 'otherworldly still lifes' in colored pencil," Cai said. "Basically, I wanted to portray ordinary objects from an alien's point of view."

Las Cruces police seek help identifying 'porch pirate' suspects

Las Cruces police are asking the public to be on the lookout for at least two men who have been known to follow delivery vehicles and steal packages from their intended destinations.

Shortly before 11 a.m. Jan. 25, a FedEx delivery van, equipped with a dash camera, recorded video of the suspect vehicle as a passenger walked toward a home and stole a package that had just been delivered. The intended recipient of that package also witnessed the event.

Las Cruces police obtained the video from FedEx and identified the suspect vehicle as a gray Hyundai Sonata. The registered owner of the vehicle was also identified. The owner told police he frequently loans the car to friends and acquaintances. Police are asking for the public's help identifying the driver of the gray Hyundai and the passenger who was seen stealing a package from the 1300 block of Burley Court. Police believe the pair are responsible for other thefts.

Anyone with information on their identities is asked to call police at 575-526-0795.

The Las Cruces Police Department is actively conducting an undercover operation to combat porch piracy. The operation has already resulted in one arrest.

LCPD suggests following tips to help prevent porch piracy:

- Track deliveries online and try to be home when packages are delivered.
- Require a signature for home deliveries.
- When scheduling a delivery, leave instructions on where the package can be placed.
- Request electronic notification when delivery is made.
- Ask a trusted friend or neighbor to receive packages at the time of delivery.
- If possible, have the package delivered to a location where it can be securely received.
- Schedule online purchases from big-box retailers to be delivered to their local store for curbside pickup.
- Have the package delivered to a FedEx or UPS store where it can be held for pickup.
- Consider installing a motion-detection home security system that records video and sends immediate notice of activity to a smartphone.
- Be a good neighbor, watch for suspicious activity and call police if it is seen.

Consumers might also consider purchasing insurance for the contents of packages at the time delivery is scheduled. Insuring the items does not prevent them from being stolen but helps provide restitution if items go missing.

welding the bottom of a broken dumpster. She had some basic welding skills and has been working on improving upon those skills.

"The welding has had a surprisingly calming effect," said Alvarado. "It's repetitive and requires a steady hand, but it's also a little artistic, which is something I like."

Performing repairs on dumpsters is only a part of the job. Alvarado also delivers new and repaired dumpsters, washes route trucks, continues to perform minor maintenance of the trucks, and hopes to take the next step to learn to drive the trash trucks when she gets her Commercial Driver's License (CDL). With the training that LCU provides, the options for her future seem wide open.

"I've learned a lot,

but I was surprised to learn about the organization that happens behind the scenes and to have patience with the hiring process," she said.

Deputy Director of Solid Waste Robin Lawrence explained that it's not just the driving of the trucks

that people see on the road, but a whole crew, behind the scenes, that helps LCU solid waste operate daily.

"We need people who are innovative and come up with solutions and recommendations to keep our equipment running and extend the life of our dumpsters and trash containers. What we do in-house saves ratepayers money by reducing the need to outsource," said Lawrence. "Every LCU associate can learn more in their position and grow at LCU, while providing a fundamental service to our community."

Redistricting bill reaches Senate floor

A compromise bill establishing procedures for the upcoming redistricting effort passed through the New Mexico Senate Judiciary Committee unanimously Saturday, March 6, and now moves to a vote of the full Senate.

Senate Bill 15 maintains an independent commission to redraw district maps, but would not require the Legislature to select a map without making changes to it, as was originally proposed by a task force headed by retired New Mexico Supreme Court Justice Edward Chavez and retired state Court of Appeals Judge Roderick Kennedy.

"It moves us in that direction, and yet it is also constitutional under our current structure," said sponsor Sen. Daniel Ivey-Soto, D-Albuquerque.

Federal law requires political districts to be redrawn every 10 years after the Census to account for population shifts. In New Mexico,

new maps need to be drawn for the three U.S. House of Representatives districts, 42 state Senate districts, 70 state House districts and 10 Public Education Commission districts.

Disputes between Republican governors (Gary Johnson in 1991 and Susana Martinez in 2001) and Democratic-controlled Legislatures foiled the past two efforts. Both times it was left to the court to draw the maps, with costs to taxpayers approaching \$10 million.

The redistricting task force was formed last year in an effort to avoid new litigation. Its report called for sweeping changes, including a constitutional amendment in the future to remove the Legislature from the redistricting process.

As for this year, the task force called for the Legislature to be limited to selecting maps without the ability to revise them.

The commission would have seven members, one appointed by House and Senate leaders from both parties and two appointed by the State Ethics Commission. The

chair must be a retired state Supreme Court justice or Appeals Court judge. No more than three members could be from the same political party.

Task force members said they still support the bill but are hopeful a couple of changes can be made either on the Senate floor or in the House.

Dick Mason of the League of Women Voters said he would like to see a requirement stipulating written justification for any changes made to the maps. Mario Jimenez of New Mexico Common Cause said legislators should add a provision to ensure protecting incumbents is not part of the consideration.

House Bill 211 is a duplicate of the original SB 15, retaining the original plan to require legislators to choose a map without changing it. It still needs to get through both the House Judiciary and the House Appropriations and Finance committees.

City economy showing signs of recovery

While economic conditions in Las Cruces are significantly worse than before the pandemic hit, there are signs of improvement, according to a 2020 fourth-quarter economic update presented to the Las Cruces City Council at a recent work session.

Economic Development Department (EDD) Director Griselda Martinez, Ph.D., said at the beginning of 2020, the city was seeing its lowest unemployment figures since the onset of the 2008 depression.

The city's unemployment rate was 5.3 percent in January 2020, which Martinez said is "very close to full employment." It reached 12.3 percent in April, after state public health orders closed many businesses statewide in response to COVID-19. City unemployment peaked at 13.6 percent in July and has continued to decline since. It was 7.7 percent in December 2020, compared to 4.7 percent in December 2019. The state's unemployment rate is 8.2 percent and the national unemployment rate is 6.3 percent.

The hardest hit sector of the local economy was food service and accommodations, which showed a decline of almost 23 percent from the third quarter of 2019 to the third quarter of 2020. That equated to a job loss of 1,478 people, from 6,517 to 5,039. Employment in the administrative and support services category was down more than 25 per-

cent in 2020 compared to 2019, EDD economist Kyle Eagar said, as the city lost two large call centers last year.

Overall, city employment dropped from 51,796 in the third quarter of 2019 to 47,880 in the third quarter of 2020. That's 3,916 jobs and a decline of 7.56 percent.

New housing starts in the city also showed a decline corresponding to COVID-19, Eagar said. But, he also said the median home price in Las Cruces continues to increase, reaching \$242,000 at the end of 2020, up from \$212,000 in December 2019.

New construction permits, for both residential and commercial building, increased almost every month in 2020 despite COVID-19, Eagar said. They were down slightly in May and October, and even in July. In 2020, 771 total permits were issued, according to city data, compared to 609 in 2019.

New business registrations in the city showed a decline, dropping to 12 in April 2020 compared to 48 in April 2019. July numbers were almost even, however, and August registrations were higher in 2020 (43) than 2019 (34), and so were November registrations: 43 in 2020 and 19 in 2019. Registrations were almost even in September, with 71 issued that month in 2019 and 68 in 2020. 54 registrations were issued in October 2019, compared to 38 in October 2020. And 36 new businesses were registered in December 2019 compared to 27 in December 2020.

City mural project beautifies Alameda Arroyo tunnel

Colorful landscapes and iconic local symbols beautify the walls of the Alameda Arroyo multi-use trail tunnel that runs beneath I-25 between Triviz and Northrise drives, providing a mural art experience to those who walk, bike or run the highly used trail, the City of Las Cruces said in a news release.

The tunnel-long mural was created as a collaborative public art project among the city Parks and Recreation Department, Las Cruces Public Art (LCPA) and Keep Las Cruces Beautiful (KLCB), with grant funds from New Mexico Conservation Corps.

"The LCPA master plan identifies the Alameda Arroyo multi-use trail as a community collaboration public art opportunity," said City Art Board (CAB) Chair Christina Ballew. "We were very excited when Parks and Recreation and the mural team presented their plans for the tunnel to CAB. Not only do collaborative proj-

ects like this add visual interest and beauty, but they instill teamwork and community pride. We really appreciate the team's dedication and creativity."

"We had a team of seven young people, 16-20 years old, facilitated by a local artist, who started the project in October with a deadline to complete by Dec. 31," said KLCB Coordinator James Woods. "The tunnel is at least 60 yards long with 10-foot-high walls. It was a very short timeline for a project so large in scope, but they did it."

Members of the tunnel mural team were facilitator Laramie Medina with Kimberly Riley, Josef Buckingham, Stephanie Villegas, Remy McDowell, Kimberly Esparza, Marina Vasconcellos and Christian Cruz. They include high school and college students, along with a KLCB work study student.

The artists chosen for the project responded to an announcement from KLCB seeking tunnel mural team members and were hired after a review

"The city would love to have more mural projects if the funding is available," Woods said. "KLCB plans to collaborate with CAB and LCPA to repair and rehabilitate aging murals around the community in the near future."

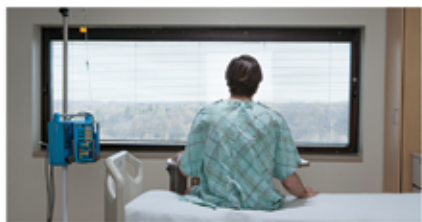

Recovering from COVID

Some people with COVID-19 have had prolonged hospital stays. People who have been hospitalized are demonstrating significant functional impact from that experience and show signs of intensive care unit acquired weakness, post intensive care syndrome, shortness of breath, and drop in oxygen saturation in their blood.



Nearly all patients who have been in the hospital due to COVID-19 are reporting **moderate to severe decrease in endurance**. The amount of endurance reduction seems to be correlated with the severity of the disease – those with more severe disease symptoms have more reduction in strength and endurance. Clinically there is a greater loss of muscle mass compared to people with other kinds of problems that result in prolonged hospital stays. We certainly know that bed rest and immobility is or at least in part the cause of loss of strength and endurance, but it seems that having had **COVID-19 increases the severity** of these problems.

Decreased muscle mass and the resulting weakness and loss of endurance have a dramatic functional impact. People experience a decrease in their independence, having to call on family and friends to assist them with simple daily activities. There is loss of mobility, meaning that they may completely lose their ability to move around independently, or may require the use of an assistive device such as a walker or cane to safely move from place to place in their home. Additionally, weakness and loss of endurance results in a significant **increased risk for falling** and injury due to the fall.



When people think about COVID-19, it's unlikely that they think about physical therapy. However, physical therapy is a critical intervention for those who have had prolonged hospital stays, and even for those who have "weathered the storm" at home and now experience weakness and loss of endurance.

Physical therapists address loss of mobility, independence, and safety concerns in the presence of weakness and reduced endurance. It is reported that people are experiencing **prolonged recovery times post-COVID infection**. In many of these people, physical therapy treatment is essential in assisting them in a safe progression of an exercise program to return to their prior level of function.

Research indicates readers are 'WEIRD'

Reading helps shape the brain, according to Joseph Henrich, Harvard professor of human evolutionary biology.

Development of what he calls mankind's "collective brain" powered the evolutionary success of our earliest ancestors. Later, the modern world began to take shape when reading became widespread.

Henrich researches how humans evolved from "being a relatively unremarkable primate a few million years ago to the most successful species on the globe," and how culture shaped our species' genetic evolution.

In his book, "The Secret of Our Success," Henrich writes, "Our collective brains operating over generations — not the innate inventive power or creative abilities of individual brains — explain our species' fancy technologies and massive ecological success."

Henrich asserts that, because of the cultural evolution of the collective brain, humans were able to design new organizations, institutions and policies. We are adaptive cultural learners who acquire ideas, beliefs, values, norms, motivations and world-views from others in our communities. Our collective brain strengthens our ability to imagine

alternative solutions and work through complex problems.

According to Henrich, humans are status seekers, our preferences and motivations are not fixed and social norms are strong. Innovation depends on the expansion of our collective brains and the ability of social norms, institutions and the psychologies they create to encourage people to freely generate, share and recombine novel ideas, beliefs, insights and practices.

Different societies possess quite different social norms, institutions, languages and technologies and consequently they possess different ways of reasoning, mental heuristics (shortcuts), motivations and emotional reactions.

In his latest book, "The WEIRDest People in the World," Henrich looks to Europe in the Middle Ages for the seeds of what we now think of as the Western World. He credits the Protestant Reformation for bringing access to the written word to the general population.

His research suggests reading rewired our brains, strengthening our ability to imagine alternative paths, remember details, picture detailed scenes and think through complex problems, and made

us more empathetic. In short, reading makes us not just more knowledgeable, but also functionally smarter.

This renovation has left western, educated, industrial, rich and democratic (WEIRD) people with a specialized area in the left ventral occipital temporal region. It also has shifted facial recognition into the right hemisphere, reduced our inclination toward holistic visual processing, increased our verbal memory and thickened the corpus callosum, which connects the left and right hemispheres of the brain.

Some characteristics that make us WEIRD are individualism and personal motivation, which results in self-focus, patience, desire for choices and low conformity. Our impersonal prosociality manifests in a linear concept of time and notions of progress, our belief in free will and willingness to cooperate with strangers, as well as impersonal institutions. Perceptual and cognitive abilities and biases lead to analytical problem solving, over-valuation of our own stuff and over-confidence.

These characteristics have worked in our favor so far, but Henrich offers a note of caution: "This process is not linear, and cultural know-how can be lost if the size of the group and their interconnectedness declines."

'COVID to Home' shows Electronic Caregiver's remote-patient monitoring is healthcare's future

Even as Electronic Caregiver works closely with the local medical community during the COVID-19 pandemic, the Las Cruces-based company continues to grow and to expand its services across the country and around the world.

ECG has supplied "COVID to Home" digital technology to local healthcare providers to monitor COVID-19 patients in their homes during the pandemic, reducing the number of Las Cruces hospital beds in use by COVID patients and the cost of their care, ECG President Joe Baffoe said.

COVID to Home has proven once again the value of remote-patient monitoring that is the core of ECG's mission, Baffoe said.

"We're an overnight success that took 10 years,"

he said.

CEO Anthony Dohrmann founded ECG in 2009 in Las Cruces. Doubling in size in 2019, the company has grown to more than 150 employees, with a goal of 1,000-plus and a place in the Fortune 500, Baffoe said. It has raised \$70 million from private investors and has developed relationships with Amazon, Intel Corporation (which awarded ECG a grant for COVID to Home "to expedite access to technology that can combat the current pandemic and enable scientific discovery that better prepares the world for future crises,"), Google and other international technology companies, he said.

"They love us, and they want us to succeed," Baffoe said.

ECG also continues close relationships with New Mexico State Uni-

versity, Burrell College of Osteopathic Medicine and other local and regional partners, he said.

"We're very thankful we're here," Baffoe said. "We're not leaving Las Cruces."

ECG occupies all of the eighth, ninth and 10th floors of the Electronic Caregiver Tower at 506 S. Main St. downtown, and recently expanded to include half of the tower's seventh floor, where ECG's corporate training and event room is located. Including the Addison Care building next door to the tower, ECG's total footprint in Las Cruces exceeds 50,000 square feet.

As the company continues to grow, it wants to help Las Cruces grow, as well, Baffoe said.

"We want to elevate the area," he said, helping to create a technology corridor that stretches from Juarez to Santa Fe.

ECG's flagship, Addison Care, billed as "the world's first virtual caregiver," represents "a paradigm shift for health care," Baffoe said. "No one else in the world is doing it."

Addison already addresses the issue that accounts for about half of all healthcare problems in the U.S., Baffoe said, which is patients not complying with doctor's orders, including either forgetting to take their medication when they should or taking a double dose.

Addison can alert caregivers and care partners if a health issue is perceived, and she soon will be able to detect changes in speech and gait that could be warning signs of a

stroke, a fall or some other serious health problem.

This more advanced version of Addison is "mind blowing," Baffoe said.

She also will be able to connect with more devices in the home and remotely, be more engaging to the user and offer an ever-increasing range of information and advice about health issues and other topics.

"Precision remote patient monitoring will become the standard of care," Baffoe said, leading

the healthcare industry away from episodic and symptomatic to more proactive care.

"ECG and Addison are saving a lot of lives (and) helping people thrive in their homes," Baffoe said. "We're very proud of what we do."

"2021 is going to be an awesome year," Dohrmann said.

NMSU to launch Center for Border Economic Development

New Mexico State University's College of Business will house a new resource hub dedicated to promoting business expansion and economic development in New Mexico's southern border region.

Planning is well underway for the Center for Border Economic Development (C-BED), a new project spearheaded by longtime NMSU economics Professor Christopher Erickson.

"In our conversations with private businesses and organizations, we

identified a need for economic analysis and data along this region," Erickson said. "We, of course, plan on being a source for data as we move forward with setting up the center."

Erickson said the center remains in its early stages, but his overarching goal is to further economic devel-

opment in Doña Ana, Luna and Hidalgo counties.

Recent expansion of international trade has not resulted in a commensurate increase in employment and growth in the New Mexico southern border region, Erickson said. For example, he said, overall trade at the

Santa Teresa Port of Entry totaled more than \$30 billion in 2019, an increase of 17.4 percent over 2018, but gross domestic product lags in other key border areas across southern New Mexico.

"Our center will work closely with businesses, governments, nonprof-

its and other border stakeholders to identify impediments to economic development and propose solutions to help overcome those impediments," he said.

Erickson will fund the center's first year with

City's Industrial Park gets new name, logo

The City of Las Cruces is making a major move forward to attract new businesses to the city's

West Mesa industrial park, according to a news release.

At a Feb. 22 city council work session, Senior Real Estate Specialist Cilicia

Villegas presented a new name for the industrial area: Las Cruces Innovation & Industrial Park. The new name and a new logo will be used when recruiting businesses throughout the region and nation, the city said.

"This is a big step forward to tout what we have in Las Cruces," said City Manager Ifo Pili, who has been a vocal advocate of fostering economic development since he arrived in Las Cruces last September. "We have a gem with this industrial park that can be immediately competitive. We'll be making improvements and creating incentives, but we have the infrastructure in place right now — power, utilities, land — to get companies to locate here."

There are approximately 20 companies at the 1,820-acre park, located immediately south of Las Cruces



International Airport off Interstate 10.

A 2020 economic development study outlined recommendations to bolster the park's usage and attract additional tenants to both the park and the airport, including a focus on three specific industries to recruit to Las Cruces: aerospace/aviation/defense, advanced manufacturing and value-added agriculture, Villegas told the council.

Strengthening partnerships with Mesilla Valley Economic Development Alliance (MVEDA), the New Mexico Economic Development Department, New Mexico State Uni-

versity, local brokers and others has already begun, said Director of Economic Development Griselda Martinez.

Among other improvements already on the city's priority list for the industrial park are broadband access, beautification, providing spaces for interested industries, installing for-sale/lease signage and creating an interactive online map showing which parcels of city-owned land are for sale.

Villegas said the map is already available at www.las-cruces.org/2420/Las-Cruces-Innovation-and-Industrial-Park. (Or, visit www.las-cruces.org and type in Innovation and Industrial Park in the search box.)

Villegas said renaming the industrial park was based on input from residents and businesses and was chosen in February

by the city's Economic Development Policy Review Committee. While the West Mesa is familiar to Las Cruces, it could be confused with other locations by out-of-state companies. So, it was recommended to use "Las Cruces" in the name, making it clear where the park is located, she said.

"Right now, the goal is to make the world know what this park is and who we are," Pili said.

The draft Las Cruces Innovation & Industrial Park Master Plan is available for public review at <https://las-cruces-industrial-park-development-plan-dps-abq.hub.arcgis.com/>. It was compiled by consultants from the design firm of Dekker/Perich/Sabatini, the city said.

funding associated with the Garrey E. and Katherine T. Carruthers Chair in Economic Development.

Additional funding will come from the NMSU Community Outreach work-study program.

Erickson recently hired one full-time employee, Lucinda Vargas, a former Federal Reserve economist

and postdoc researcher, to help launch the center. An undergraduate work-study student also is on the team.

For the center's first project, Erickson and Vargas are creating a database of resources for border businesses facing economic uncertainty due to the pandemic. Once complete, the database will be accessible free on a public website. Erickson and Vargas will likely collaborate with the New Mexico Border Authority to develop and launch the site.

"Right now, we're developing data pages on how to recover from the impact of the pandemic," Erickson said. "We're also looking at the effects of the pandemic

on border traffic and activities along the border. With this information, we hope to develop insights that will allow us to help people, businesses and governments recover from the pandemic."

C-BED also plans to partner with NMSU personnel from the colleges of Business, Engineering and Arts and Sciences on projects to promote business expansion in the border region.

infamous words of former ABC golf commentator Bob Rossberg, "He's got no shot." Not deterred, Homa manufactured a hooded lob wedge and put it on the front edge of the green, two putting for a par to keep the playoff going.

Miracle? No, just calm and gutsy.

Never count any of the young guns out. On the second playoff hole, the par-three 14th, Finau made bogey, while Homa made an easy par; but the win was hard. Known as one of the happiest guys on tour, Homa, the 30-year-old L. A. native, said later about his victory that "positive thinking" was key to his success.

As a kid growing up in suburban Cleveland, Ohio,

I specifically remember my mother, a schoolteacher and librarian, speaking often about her belief in positive thinking. The term became popularized by Dr. Norman Vincent Peale, who wrote "The Power of Positive Thinking" in 1952. The book captivated America, which was then embroiled in the Korean War, and remained on the New York Times bestseller list for 186 consecutive weeks.

In his writings of "The Power," as well as numerous other books, Peale offered testimony and evidence of the benefits of positive thinking through examples, anecdotes and

experiences of real individuals who found success, health, fulfillment and private peace of mind by following his ideas and advice.

Thinking in a positive manner is self-evident. Do you know any negative thinkers who bitterly complain, whine and belittle themselves? Are they happy? Positive thinking is not Pollyannaish. It combines with other self-evident philosophies of thinking and acting, like taking personal responsibility of one's own behavior and performance, living by a strong work ethic and doing unto others as you would have them do unto you. These are fundamen-

tal truths of life.

One of my positive mantras is, "I never give up on a hole." That bit of positive thinking came from a statement by Jack Nicklaus years ago, who said, "Resolve never to quit, never to give up, no matter what the situation is."

Negative thinking is linked inexorably to emotions. Golf legend Sam Snead once said, "Of all the hazards, fear is the worst." Yes, fear is a negative thought and emotion. Negative thoughts are the absence of positive thoughts. It's the difference between, "I have this shot" and "This is an impossible shot."

Positive thinking also

is a matter of attitude. It's an attitude about belief in yourself, an attitude about confidence and an attitude about dreading the outcome. One of the greatest positive thinkers of all time on tour was the late Payne Stewart, who once remarked, "A bad attitude is worse than a bad swing."

Lastly, Bobby Jones said, "Golf is played on a five-inch course, the distance between your ears."
