COUNTY MANAGER RECEIVES BEN LUJAN PUBLIC SERVANT OF THE YEAR AWARD

Fernando R. Macias, Doña Ana County Manager garnered the New Mexico IDEA, NMIDEA 2020 Ben Lujan Public Servant of the Year Award.

Davin Lopez, President and CEO, Mesilla Valley Economic Development Alliance, MVEDA nominated Macias for the award, which recognizes individuals who has played a key role in economic development in New Mexico, during the past 12 months. The NMIDEA's is an association of economic developers, city officials and development related executives interested in and working toward the promotion of New Mexico, to create jobs.

"Since being the first MVEDA Director, Fernando has created a distinguished history of involvement in economic development in our region and state. This past year, the economy certainly faced numerous challenges," MVEDA President and CEO Davin Lopez said. "However, because of his focus, experienced leadership and determination, our region made strides in economic development during the pandemic."

In the past 12 months, Macias led the County's efforts in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, including seeking avenues to curb the economic impact on businesses and residents. In April 2020, the County entered a contract with Community Economics Laboratory to conduct an Economic Crisis Flash Assessment, a tool to help prepare for the pandemic's economic impact.

He also spearheaded efforts of the County to provide financial assistance to local businesses and residents adversely affected by the pandemic through funding from the CARES Act and the Emergency Rental Assistance Program. During the pandemic, areas of the county continued experiencing construction and business growth.

Senate tightens rules on medical marijuana

With two bills to legalize marijuana sales stalled in the Senate Judiciary Committee, the New Mexico Senate turned its attention to the state's medical marijuana program Monday, March 15.

With Senate Bill 340, the Senate voted to prohibit sales to out-of-state residents who do not have a medical marijuana card issued in New Mexico, after first rejecting an amendment that would have increased the daily sales limit for medical cannabis patients from three grams to two ounces.

The amendment was introduced by Sen. Jacob Candelaria, D-Albuquerque, who identified himself as a medical marijuana patient suffering from PTSD as the result of childhood rape. He blistered the state Department of Health (NMDOH) for its handling of the program, saying there is no scientific basis for the current limit.

"There is a lot of information that is being provided by the Department

of Health on this bill that is untrue," he said. "The department's rules that limit the amount of medical cannabis that I can purchase to about three grams a day is arbitrary and capricious, and it's not really based on a doctor or medical science or research. It's based on a political rule that was put in place years ago."

Candelaria said he has a card from California because he can't purchase enough cannabis to meet his needs with just the New Mexico card.

The cap of 1,750 plants per producer has not been increased in years, Candelaria said, creating an artificial shortage that has resulted in higher prices and less availability than in other states. He said the cap is based on politics, not science. "The plant caps were put in place when the governor was secretary of health. It's politics at its best," he said.

Sen. Cliff Pirtle, R-Roswell, who is the sponsor of one of the two legalization bills awaiting a hearing in the Judiciary Committee, supported the amendment. He said patients living in rural

areas of the state need to drive long distances, just to get three grams at a time.

Bill sponsor Sen Gerald Ortiz y Pino, D-Albuquerque, said the amendment would remove the safeguards to prevent abuse and would result in more marijuana being sold on the black market.

"It basically converts our carefully regulated medical cannabis program into a come-and-get-it free-for-all; whatever you need, whatever you want, just come and get it," Ortiz y Pino said. "It would create an enormous shortage immediately, and it would force the department to change the plant count, which is what the real purpose of this amendment is about. If we do that, the fear is it increases the supply for the black market," Ortiz y Pino said.

The purpose of Senate Bill 340 was to prevent people from out of state – mostly Texans – from getting medical marijuana cards in California and using them to purchase marijuana in New Mexico. It would change the definition of "reciprocal participant" to only

include state residents.

"People who live in Texas get online and get a California doctor to authorize a medical marijuana card, and then they come into New Mexico and use the card to purchase cannabis here," Ortiz y Pino said.

Sen. Jeff Steinborn, D-Las Cruces, said he has sympathy for those in Texas who need medical marijuana but do not qualify under the stringent laws in place there.

"I've come to understand just how lifesaving and miraculous the effects of cannabis can be for people who are undergoing a lot of different medical conditions, and just how restrictive some other states can be," Steinborn said, adding that it is only allowed in Texas for those with a terminal illness. "So, for

me, people in other states taking advantage of New Mexico's medical marijuana program is really humanitarian in nature."

Sen. Stuart Ingle, R-Portales, noted that when the bill was originally passed 14 years ago, it was sold as being for those dying of cancer. "We've come a long way since then," he said.

Candelaria, a practicing attorney, represented cannabis supplier Ultra Health in a lawsuit against NMDOH when it attempted to remove reciprocity by rule. First Judicial District Court Judge Matthew Wilson originally ruled that NMDOH failed to justify an emergency rule change, but later clarified that it could make the change through the normal rulemaking process.

SB 340 passed on a 28-11

vote, and now moves to the House with just five days left in the session, which ends Saturday, March 20. Sen. Craig Brandt, R-Rio Rancho, said after the vote that legislators could resolve a lot of issues with the medical marijuana program by passing the legalization bill.

"We need to get Pirtle's bill down to the floor so that we don't have to mess with this," Brandt said.

The Judiciary Committee did not meet Monday and was not expected to hear the marijuana bills Tuesday, pushing them to Wednesday at the earliest.

NMSU animation program ranked among nation's top 25

New Mexico State University's Creative Media Institute (CMI) animation program is ranked among the top programs in public colleges in the country. NMSU has placed among the top schools in Animation Career Review's (ACR) rankings for 10 years. The organization considered nearly 200 programs across the country this year. The 2021 rankings list NMSU's animation program 22nd nationally, seventh regionally and number one in New Mexico.

"CMI offers a very high-quality education at a very affordable price," said Eddie Bakshi, who

specializes in teaching 2-D animation production at CMI. "We offer access to industry-standard software, taught by highly skilled professors, many of whom have worked

on popular movies or TV shows."

"What we do at CMI is a really fun delivery system for a variety of skills that are useful in all areas, including en-

tertainment," said CMI Department Head Amy Lanasa. "One of the reasons the animation program is so popular right now is that there are a lot of students who understand that the future will be a place where we need the skills you can learn in this program."

ACR considers animation programs in degree-granting institutions with the exception of two-year community colleges. The criteria evaluated include academic reputation, admission selectivity, depth and breadth of program faculty, value as it relates to tuition and indebtedness, graduation rate, geographic location and employment data. The employment data has been given significantly

more weight in the ranking formula since 2020.

The criterion of geographic location is considered because students who attend school in some cities have a distinct advantage over students in other parts of the country in terms of employment opportunities.

"Honestly, I did not know what I was getting into when I chose to go to the animation program at NMSU," said Mazatl Aguilar, who will graduate in May with a CMI degree in animation said. "I had no experience, no knowledge of the animation world. I could never have gotten where I am now without being surrounded by instructors who have put in the time and energy to

learn their skills and had the passion to share it with me."

"I chose the animation program at NMSU because I wanted to tell stories," said T.J. Cousler, who will graduate from CMI this May and plans to pursue a career in the gaming industry. "CMI delivered on that hope tenfold. I now have a solid footing in a craft I'm deeply passionate about and am also equipped with the technical and professional skills I need to push forward in my career."

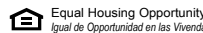

Drifting afield from the task at hand

Last month I complained about state and federal legislators spending a lot of time on things not relevant to governing.

My conclusion? They've spent a lot of time working on solutions to problems that don't exist, as we face the biggest health, economic and social crisis of our generation.

As our New Mexico State Legislature heads into its final days, I can't help but make one more dig.

New Mexico Senate Bill 94 passed in the House of Representatives. It went through debate in two Senate committees, discussion and voting on the Senate floor, debate in two House committees and, finally,

discussion and voting on the House floor.

This year, more than ever, with the global pandemic looming, legislators need to be laser-focused on what's critical, especially on a rebound from the crisis.

Back to Senate Bill 94. If the governor signs the bill, it means that New Mexico's college athletes could be paid for commercial endorsements or use of their likeness. Our state's law would not overturn the NCAA's rules, under which those payments are prohibited. Such payments could cost the student-athletes and their schools penalties, suspensions or loss of eligibility.

Let's put on hold the fact our

legislature spent all that time on something forbidden nationally.

Let's look at the practicality.

Athletes typically asked to do those endorsements are the super-duper-stars. For college, that would mean Heisman Trophy candidates, college basketball player of the year candidates. A note to the state legislature, and with all due respect to New Mexico's dedicated college athletes, those super-duper-stars are as rare in our state as El Chupacabra.

In the past 25 years, this state has produced exactly two college athletes of that caliber: University of New Mexico football star Brian Urlacher and New Mexico State basketball star Pascal Siakam. Urlacher was consensus All-America in college and is now in the Pro

Football Hall of Fame. Siakam was honorable mention All-America and WAC Player of the year as an Aggie. As a pro with the Toronto Raptors, he's won an NBA championship, Most Improved Player and an All-Star selection.

Of course, those credentials aren't requirements for a player's endorsement. Dozens of charismatic Aggies would have been great spokes-athletes. I'd love to have seen a Las Cruces Bulletin ad featuring photos of one of the smaller Aggie volleyball liberos, such as 5-foot-0 Kaylee Neal, and former Aggie men's basketball 7-foot-6 Sim Bhullar — or maybe just their footprints. It would be fun to see Aggie basketballer and Las

Some Things Never Change

Imagine you were a livestock man in medieval England 1,000 years ago. It's early spring. Snow on the ground, mud in the cow lot. You walk the small pasture where the heavy heifers are kept. It's hard to see much with just the moonlight. But you spot one that's down in a swale. She's on her side in the process of calving. One foot is showing.

You check the rest of the cows the best you can and go back to the heifer. No progress. You wait a little longer, then resigned to your duty, you walk back to the cow lot and set the gates.

On your way back to get the heifer the wind blows down your neck and you shiver. Using a long stick, you get the heifer

up and drive her into the cow lot. There's some straw scattered behind the windbreak. She finds it and lays down.

You walk to the earthen roofed shed to collect your tools. You manage to ease up on her and drop a homemade halter over her head and tie her

loosely to a post on the windbreak.

There is tepid water in your oaken bucket. After takin' off your tunic, you wash yer arms and kneel down behind her.

Taking a three-foot leather thong, you slip a noose around the protruding foot. Following yer father's advice, you next slip a hand inside and search for the other foot. You attach a second thong to it, take a wrap around

each hand and begin to pull.

By pulling when she pushes, resting when she rests, you and she finally deliver the calf two hours later.

You rub him down, get him under the flank to suck and get to bed at daybreak.

Sound familiar? However, we have made some progress in 1,000 years. We've traded the moonlight for a flashlight, a (grass-hemp) rope for a nylon, wool underwear for goose down, leather shoes for rubber boots, leather thongs for chrome-plated O.B. chains and we've traded patience for a ratchet calf puller.

But for the most part, much of the process remains the same. Cold feet, bare arms, sweat in your eyes, small heifers and big calves, manual labor and dogged

determination.

Progress has mechanized, modernized and computerized much of our world from farming to pharmacy, from coal mining to dentistry, from astronomy to architecture.

But those of us who practice the ancient art of birthing livestock could trade places with our counterparts

1,000 years ago, or even 2,000 years ago, and we'd be interchangeable almost immediately.

Sorta like horseshoers, acupuncturists, dog trainers and herbal medicine salesmen.

Makes ya think, doesn't it?

A rule is broken with passage of every bill

Every bill passed by the New Mexico Legislature begins with a conspiracy to break the rules and then cover it up. And every member is in on it.

Before the start of floor debate on any bill, the sponsor has to read the following

disclaimer: "I ask unanimous consent that the rules be suspended and the record reflect that all actions have been taken ..." for final passage of the bill.

I always wondered why they didn't just change the rule, instead of agreeing to break it every time. And I wondered what

would happen if just one of the 112 members decided not to go along with the agreement.

Under the rules, every bill has to be read out loud in public before debate can begin. We saw a similar rule enforced in the U.S. Senate before

passage of the recent pandemic relief act. In Congress, that just delayed the inevitable.

But in a legislative session required to end at noon after 30 or 60 days, enforcement of that rule could jam up the whole process.

That's just one example where unanimous con-

sent is required to get around the old rules. Another is the floor leader standing up at any hour of the day and declaring that it's 12 o'clock, in order the "roll the clock." The rules also require that the journal be read out loud every day.

I remember once years ago when Lee Rawson was Senate minority whip that Republicans made vague threats about invoking the rule to read each bill out loud, but I don't know if it's ever been seriously considered in the years I've been here.

Which is a little bit surprising. In a system where the minority party doesn't have many built-

in protections, that would seem like an easy way to just blow everything up.

When I first started covering the Legislature, I found many of the outdated rituals to be intriguing. Kind of like joining a secret club. But I never thought of them as useful or efficient.

The word efficient almost never comes to mind when thinking about the Legislature. And that's probably OK. The process for passing new laws is intended to be long and difficult, with multiple opportunities for revision or rejection. But it shouldn't be made more difficult by antiquated procedures.

There may have been a

time when transmitting information was much slower, and reading bills out loud in public made sense, but it doesn't now.

Sen. Joseph Cervantes argued recently that he thinks our system was intentionally designed to limit the number of bills passed each year, given the difficulty back then of reprinting all of the law books and then distributing them throughout the state.

Those challenges no longer remain, but the system is still set up to limit what can be done each year.

There will be hundreds of bills with strong support from members in both parties that will die

on the Senate and House calendars at noon this Saturday, just as there are every year when the session is required to end.

Which bills get through, and which get left waiting in line, is a matter of pure luck, and can always be altered by just one member who decides to hold the floor and run out the clock.

I don't know why lawmakers haven't updated the rules through the constitutional amendment process. But I suspect just one person refusing to consent would be more than enough motivation.

Education reform must be achieved by legislators

The League of Women Voters of Southern New Mexico believes every student should have access to a high-quality, equitable public education system, regardless of ethnicity, ability, age, family income or location. The league believes accountability, transparency and education policies that promote student success strengthen New Mexico's economy and well-being.

A high-quality, equitable education system includes several elements: meaningful multicultural learning goals, knowledgeable and skillful

educators, integrated support for students (such as those found in community schools), high-quality early-learning opportunities and adequate, equitable funding.

With the legislative session underway, there are many education-related bills aimed at strengthening the New Mexico public education system to better provide equity of learning opportunities for students.

One of those bills that holds potential is House Bill 83, "Changing Graduation Requirements." The bill was introduced by Rep. Andrés Romero, a social studies/history teacher. It passed out of the House Education Committee Feb. 1. A primary

goal of the bill is to give students more choices and greater responsibility for their own educations to better engage them in learning.

An important change to the graduation requirements would be a capstone course developed by juniors and seniors, meeting academic content and performance standards and guided by highly qualified teachers. The projects could be structured to be culturally and linguistically relevant to the students' lives. The capstone course would incorporate a final product, performance and/or public presentation.

Other changes with the potential to better engage

students in learning are more choices for core courses and the expansion of government and civics education. Some topics, such as New Mexico history, are to be integrated into other courses, in this case into U.S. history.

Several issues need to be revisited. The number of mathematics credits should remain at four, with more options for courses that meet the requirements, such as financial literacy, discrete mathematics and computer science. Health, physical education, digital technology, music and other arts need to be required in high school also. Some subjects could be integrated and team taught

to make them practical for use in life. A language other than English is an option. Being able to communicate in more than one language gives students an advantage in the 21st century.

One of the biggest issues in HB 83 is the need for high-quality professional development for educators and counselors who would have responsibilities to assure the capstone courses meet the intended learning goals. Educators who value the influence of social and emotional learning on academics could best support students and guide them to assume more responsibility for their own education.

Whether this bill becomes law, changing graduation standards to better engage students in learning, expand civics education and provide a capstone course has the potential to result in higher graduation rates and improve readiness for college and careers. In turn, increasing the graduation rate from postsecondary institutions would strengthen the economy of the state and lead to improvements in well-being in the Land of Enchantment.

Water feeds us

To the editor:

A recent article in the New Mexico Political Report reiterates a story long told, that farms and farmers use about 70 percent

of all water in the state, while producing "only" about three percent of gross domestic product. This should neither be news nor indicative of wanton waste. That three percent is food.

Food is what economists call an absolute good, without an adequate supply of which life is miserable or impossible. Water and shelter fill out the bulk of the absolute goods. All other goods

and economic activities are rightly described as relative goods, consumed in variable amounts as options. Some, verging on antisocial, are what are called positional goods — "I have a bigger car than you do."

OK, back to water — why so much for agriculture? We're really talking irrigated agriculture, which produces globally 40 percent of our food on 20 percent of our culti-

vated land area, almost by necessity in our current economic system. We are locked into irrigated agriculture globally, because we humans have overpopulated the globe and consume more food than unirrigated land can produce. (We also waste much food, but that's another story.)

Finally, absolute physical and laws and plant biology demand that a plant use 200 to 1,000 times more

water than the final harvested mass. Plants will always use vast amounts of water. We have to look for solutions to water shortages in a mélange of basic economics, social justice and political discussions on what gets taxed or subsidized for the common good. Water allocation and water law can sort themselves out only after that.

Construction begins on NMSU, El Paso Electric solar project

Construction is underway on a renewable energy project at New Mexico State University's Arrowhead Park that is projected to generate enough solar electricity to power about one-third of the university's 900-acre Las Cruces campus by fall.

The project — called Aggie Power — is the result of a new partnership between NMSU and El Paso Electric (EPE) aiming to further mutual

goals related to state renewable energy, climate action and micro-grid development.

"NMSU is excited to develop strategic partnerships across our entire system to support a balanced and sustainable energy economy," said NMSU Chancellor Dan Arvizu. "This partnership with EPE moves us forward in a leadership role and is a perfect example of our ability to balance investments in infrastructure while providing a state-of-the-art living laboratory to com-

plement our educational programs."

NMSU and EPE outlined the details of the partnership and solar project in a memorandum of understanding signed in 2018. The technology includes single-access tracking solar panels and a one-megawatt battery pack made by Tesla.

"We are always looking for creative partnerships with our customers to provide options for more sustainable solutions that will benefit the region and our en-

vironment," EPE Chief Executive Officer Kelly A. Tomblin said. "We applaud NMSU and are proud to be part of this history-making project. Together, we will bring new meaning to Aggie Power by using cutting-edge technology to capture and harness the power of the sun like never before. With the installation of Aggie Power, NMSU elevates its role as a clean energy leader in the state of New Mexico, further sup-

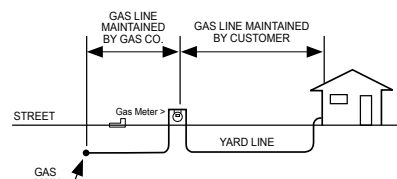

Notice: In accordance with Congressional Mandate (Docket PS-135, Amendment 192-3), the City of Las Cruces Gas Section hereby notifies you that the portion of gas piping (yard line) between the gas meter and the house/building is not maintained by the Gas Utility Company. Please see drawing.



Please keep in mind that:

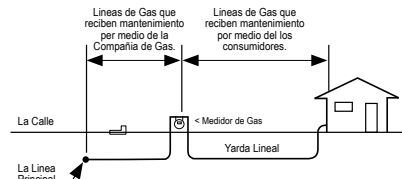
1. Buried steel gas piping that is not maintained may be subject to the potential hazards of corrosion and subsequent gas leakage.
2. Buried gas piping should be:
 - a. Periodically inspected for leaks.
 - b. Periodically inspected for corrosion if the piping is metallic.
 - c. Repaired if unsafe condition is found.
3. Before excavating near buried gas piping, the piping should be located, marked, and excavated by hand.
4. Licensed gas fitters/plumbers and contractors can assist in performing the required inspections described in (2) above, making leak repairs, and locating the buried gas piping prior to the start of any planned excavation.

porting its standing as an educational institution of choice.”

EPE received approval on a special rate contract application related to the project from the New Mexico Public Regulation Commission in August 2020 — a requirement that allowed EPE and NMSU to move forward.

Construction began in mid-December, with receipt of the solar panels and battery packs, said

Wayne Savage, executive director of Arrowhead Park. After completing testing and commissioning activities, the project will begin supporting a portion of NMSU's electrical utility load with renewable energy and storage.

“This system will provide power to about one-third of the NMSU campus, as well as some of the Arrowhead Park buildings,” Savage said.

Pat Chavez, director of Utilities and Plant Operations, said NMSU has several smaller solar

projects throughout the Las Cruces campus, but Aggie Power will be the largest source of green energy once finished. It will be one of three energy sources powering the main campus and give NMSU more flexibility in managing its utility rates and receiving energy, he said.

City council calls for more equitable distribution of COVID-19 vaccine

The Las Cruces City Council has unanimously approved a resolution calling on Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham and the New Mexico Department of Health to provide equitable distribution of the COVID-19 vaccine to Las Cruces and Doña Ana County.

The resolution, which the council approved at its March 16 regular meeting, states that the city and county “should be prioritized in receiving a greater proportion of vaccines. The region remains in the highest risk level in the state’s framework, yet Doña Ana County has received proportionally fewer vac-

cines than all but a few counties in New Mexico. This is the case even though the county has many residents who are at a greater risk of developing serious, life-threatening complications if they contract the virus, including a large elderly population and many individuals with chronic medical conditions.”

The resolution says NMDOH “should greatly increase the proportion of vaccines being delivered to the city and county.”

Councilor Tessa Abeyta-Stuve, chair of the city vaccination task force created by the council in January, brought the resolution forward, she said, because the city needs to

continue to advocate for an increase in vaccines coming to the city and county.

Assistant City manager Eric Enriquez said a city application to NMDOH for the Las Cruces Fire Department to become a vaccine provider is pending.

“I don’t know what the delay is,” Enriquez said at the meeting. “We have a pharmacy, we have a medical director. We meet all the criteria.”

“It looks like we’re not getting the proportion of vaccines that we should be,” Councilor Yvonne Flores said. She also is a member of the city’s vaccine task force, along with Mayor Pro-Tem Kasandra Gandara.

“We’re seeing a discon-

nect with how the state is communicating with our community,” Gandara said, adding that vaccinations administered at Memorial Medical Center are not being counted in NMDOH totals.

The NMDOH vaccine dashboard (<https://cvvaccine.nmhealth.org/public-dashboard.html>) shows that, as of March 15, 25.8 percent of Doña Ana County residents have received at least one shot of the vaccine and 13.1 percent are fully vaccinated, with 47.4 percent registered for the vaccine. That compares to 27.9 percent and 16.9 percent for Bernalillo County, with 49.6 percent registered; 31.1 percent and 16.9 percent for Santa Fe

County, with 59.8 percent registered; 36.2 percent and 25.8 percent for San Juan County, with 23.2 percent registered; 22.8 percent and 14.3 percent for Otero County, with 30.6 percent registered; and 37.5 percent and 25.4 percent in Sierra County, with 43.8 percent registered.

Councilor Johana Bencomo said there also is a “large discrepancy by race in terms of who’s getting vaccinated.”

The dashboard shows that, as of March 15, 33.5 percent of the state’s Native American population of the state (145,589) has received at least one shot of the vaccine and 21.7 percent has been fully vaccinated; Asian/Pacific Islander population

(31,147): 30.1 percent has received at least one shot and 18.4 percent fully vaccinated; black/African American population (36,934): 16.1 percent has received at least one shot and 9.2 percent fully vaccinated; Hispanic/Latino population (780,908): 20.9 percent at least one shot, 12 percent fully vaccinated; white population (686,030): 29.5 percent has received at least one shot, 17.5 percent fully vaccinated.

Mayor Ken Miyagishima directed City Manager Ifo Pili to contact NMDOH and find a department official who can answer city council questions about vaccine distribution at a regular or special council work session.

Spring equinox is March 20

March means clocks, the spring equinox and a full moon named for fish bait.

Daylight saving time returned March 14 (it's now MDT instead of MST), and the 2021 spring equinox will take place at 3:37 a.m. Saturday, March 20. The March full moon — the Full Worm Moon — follows at 12:50 p.m. Sunday, March 28, according to almanac.com.

Because it is the first full moon after the spring equinox, March's full moon is the Paschal Full Moon, the website said. That means its date determines the 2021 date of Easter (April 4). Paschal comes from Pascha, the Greek and Latin word for



Passover.

Easter is always held on a Sunday between March 22 and April 25. Because the Christian Church follows a calendar created in 325 A.D., ecclesiastical dates for the full moon and spring equinox may differ from astrological dates.

Full moon names used by The Old Farmer's Almanac come from Native American, Colonial American and European sources, the website said.

The March Worm Moon may refer to the earthworms that appear as the soil warms in spring. Or, according to almanac.com,

it could be because Capt. Jonathan Carver, an 18th-century explorer, wrote that this moon name refers to beetle larvae beginning to emerge from the thawing bark of trees and other winter hideouts.

April's Full Pink Moon — named for creeping or moss phlox, also known as moss pink, an early springtime wildflower native to eastern North America — occurs at 9:33 p.m. Monday, April 26. May's Full Flower Moon — named for all the emerging blooms — is at 5:14 a.m. Wednesday, May 26. June's Full Strawberry Moon — Algonquin tribes knew it as a signal to harvest strawberries — is at 12:40 p.m. Thursday, June 24.

Delano Lewis named NMSU visiting senior fellow for Global Affairs

New Mexico State University is welcoming former U.S. Ambassador Delano E. Lewis as visiting senior fellow for Global Affairs, NMSU Provost Carol Parker announced in a news release.

“In this role, Ambassador Lewis will share his knowledge and experience in global affairs through guest lectures, hosting of conferences, seminars and workshops on relevant international issues impacting our community, the state and the nation, all aimed at helping to bring a global perspective across all academic

levels, and to advance the mission of expanding and enhancing the knowledge and skills of all students in preparation for success in a competitive global society,” Parker said.

Parker said Lewis

gained his unique perspective and knowledge through a long and distinguished career as a diplomat, businessman and entrepreneur.

In June 1999, President Bill Clinton nominated

Lewis as U.S. Ambassador to the Republic of South Africa. He served Dec. 22, 1999-July 13, 2001.

In September 2006, Lewis was named senior fellow at NMSU, where he established the Institute for International Relations and served as director. Lewis now serves on the board of the American Institutes for Research.

Lewis, 81, began the Left Right Forward Foundation, which includes a wide-ranging series of podcasts, in 2018. He is also working on a project to chronicle the Black experience in America.

Lewis graduated from the University of Kansas in Lawrence in 1960 and

from Washburn University School of Law in Topeka, Kansas in 1963. He worked in the Internal Security Division of the U.S. Department of Justice, was a lawyer with the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission, served on the staff of U.S. Sen. Edward Brooke, R-Massachusetts, became CEO of the Chesapeake and Potomac Telephone Company and served on the boards of directors of Colgate-Palmolive and Eastman Kodak.

Lewis helped guide passage of Washington, D.C.’s Home Rule Act through Congress in 1973. He ran for D.C. city council, losing to future D.C. Mayor

Marion Barry and later led Barry’s mayoral transition team.

Lewis is the author of “No Condition Is Permanent” and “It All Begins with Self.”

Lewis and his wife, Gayle, have four sons – including television actor and director Phill Lewis — and 11 grandchildren. The couple retired to Las Cruces in 2001.

Community of Hope has endured throughout pandemic

Mesilla Valley Community of Hope (MVCH) and its Camp Hope tent city have continued to serve people struggling with homelessness throughout the pandemic, and MVCH Executive Director Nicole Martinez has responded to multiple requests in the past year for information about how to set up similar camps across the country.

Martinez has shared a PowerPoint, a site plan and policies and procedures about Camp Hope with officials in about a dozen cities, including Albuquerque, El Paso, Austin, Denver, Reno and Atlanta.

"I feel like it's a model that works," Martinez said.

Having a safe, outdoor space to temporarily house people has been "helpful during the pandemic," she said. The fenced camp has tents erected inside wooden structures with three sides and a roof. The camp has restrooms and showers. El Caldito Soup Kitchen and Amador Health Center are also part of the MVCH campus at 999 W. Amador Ave.

Camp Hope has seen an increased need for its services because of the pandemic, Martinez said.

From April 2020-Febru-

ary 2021, MVCH served 1,105 people directly impacted by COVID-19, she said, including temporary shelter, helping with rent and providing advice on tenants' rights.

"A lot of people weren't prepared for this," Martinez said. "They didn't know how to advocate for themselves."

Camp Hope served a total of 234 people in 2020.

"In total, we housed 570 of our 2,744 clients served overall at Community of Hope, 150 of which were children in families," Martinez said.

During the 2019-20 fiscal year, MVCH provided more than 36,300 services to nearly 3,000 people who needed housing, help with utility payments, food, clothing, case management and other services.

Clients included both men and women ranging in age from 18 to 95 and included 317 military veterans.

MVCH helped 62 people move from the tent city to permanent housing, thanks in part to its Tents to Rents annual fundraiser.

Without MVCH, most of the people it serves would be on the street, Martinez said.

In March, MVCH completed the installation of new flooring throughout much of the building,

which was built in 2005, Martinez said. Replacing

State Rep. Small has big role in crafting state budget

The \$7.4 billion budget built by the New Mexico House of Representatives Appropriations and Finance Committee (HAFC) “has us poised to build our way out, to grow our way out, to seek and learn our way out of the worst pandemic and public health crisis any of us have ever seen,” said committee Vice Chair Rep. Nathan Small, a Las Cruces Democrat.

The proposed budget has “targeted increases that focus on healthcare, education, job creation and infrastructure,” Small said. “We are putting dollars in the right places while still being fiscally responsible and insuring we have sufficient reserves to weather what

are truly, truly unprecedented and very volatile times.”

House Bill 2, the General Appropriation Act of 2021, was passed unanimously by the 19-member committee and by a 60-10 vote of the full House. All 45 House Democrats voted for the bill, along with 15 of the chamber’s 25 Republicans and its only independent. HB 2 has been in the Senate Finance Committee since the House passed it Feb. 24.

Bipartisan support for HB 2 reflected the “pride in the work and the details” that committee chair Rep. Patricia Lundstrom, D-McKinley, San Juan, and members put into crafting the bill, Small said, adding that

HB 2 includes a \$332 million (4.6 percent) increase over the budget passed by the House during last June’s special session.

“There were many who called for far deeper cuts,” Small said. “We had to work hard to avoid those worst-case outcomes. We would have been in a far worse situation without the ability to make these careful yet strong moves toward progress if we had overreacted in June 2020,” he said.

The state budget has been “buoyed by federal help, key policy changes, very large construction projects, including wind-energy projects that brought much-needed revenue,” Small said, along

with a significant increase in oil prices.

The budget passed by the House includes \$1.76 billion (almost 24 percent) in reserves, which is more than double the reserves in the current budget. It allocates \$3.39 billion (a 5.5 percent increase) for public education, including \$20 million for community schools and increased funding for lottery scholarships, broadband connectivity, along with \$23 million for higher education.

The bill includes a 1.5 percent cost-of-living adjustment for all school, higher education and agency employees, which has a total cost of \$64.5 million. It provides increases of \$64 million for Medicaid, \$10 million for the New Mexico Department of Public Health and

\$22 million for the Early Childhood Education and Care Department.

The budget also includes \$3 million for a Lower Rio Grande voluntary program “that will address the particularly tight water supply and the ongoing deep drought that we’re under,” Small said. It also will fully fund the New Mexico Attorney General and the state engineer in the Texas vs. New Mexico water-rights lawsuit “that is going into a critical period” at the U.S. Supreme Court.

The bill also includes a

one-time appropriation to the state unemployment trust fund, Small said, so businesses don’t have to pay additional taxes to refill the fund, depleted by billions in unemployment compensation paid since the onset of COVID-19.

HB 2 also provides \$600 to “workers who have been on the front lines during this entire pandemic,” he said, and provides support to the restaurant and hospitality industries “that have been hardest hit.”

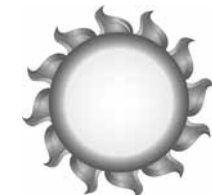

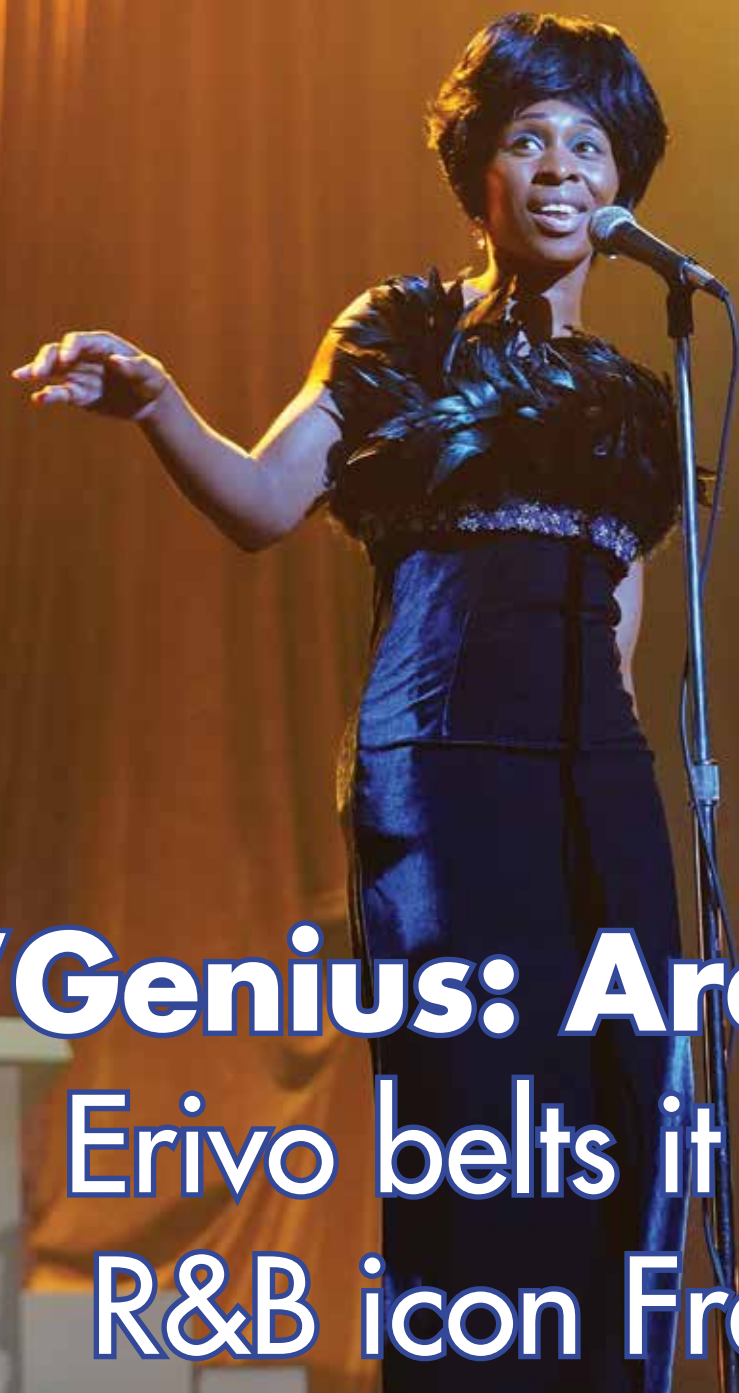

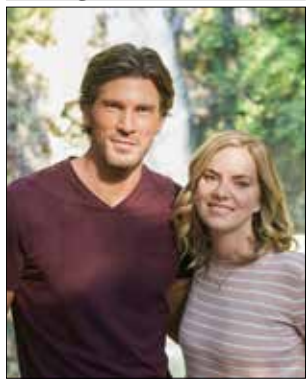

So, don't waste any more time, create a routine good enough for you that will get you ready for a day at work.

Have consistent sleeping hours

Working from home can seriously mess up our sleeping schedules. We're tempted to stay up longer and then wake up late. Similarly, taking a nap in the afternoon can turn into an hour or two long sleep.

Instead of giving in to sleep temptation, try to stick to consistent sleeping hours. This means going to bed at a reasonable

time and waking up early enough to get to create the above-mentioned morning routine.

Having a consistent sleeping routine can be a very beneficial aspect of our self-care routine. People who have a consistent sleep schedule are energetic and productive.

When it comes to afternoon naps, instead of napping, try going outside for a walk, doing some exercise, or if you must sleep make sure it's no longer than 20 minutes.

Dedicated a workspace

Take a break every hour or two to destress and relax. Allow your eyes to rest by closing them, practice breathing to destress, and

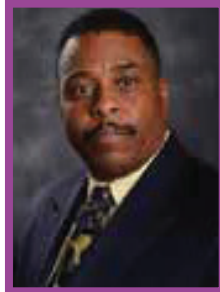

New Mexico Native in Charge of Spaceport America

Scott A. McLaughlin, a long-time business and engineering professional, has been selected by the New Mexico Spaceport Authority Board of Directors as the new executive director of Spaceport America.

McLaughlin, a New Mexico native, grew up in Las Cruces graduating from Mayfield High School and later from New Mexico State University with a B.S. in Electrical Engineering. He worked at White Sands Missile Range for the Atmospheric Sciences Laboratory (later the U.S. Army Research Laboratory), and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), as well as in the private sector with tech and engineering companies.

He served as Director of Business Development at

Spaceport America prior to being named interim Executive Director of Spaceport America in July 2020.

“Scott brings deep knowledge and extensive experience to the management of New Mexico’s Spaceport America,” Secretary Keyes said. “He has proven himself as a skilled administrator who can collaborate with employees, the state, and our innovative business partners to ensure Spaceport America operates safely and continues to drive job growth in Southern New Mexico.”

McLaughlin moved to Texas and then on to Colorado where he eventually established a radar design and manufacturing business. He traveled the world installing, maintaining, and marketing specialized wind radar systems. His innovative designs

support space launch, test ranges, aviation operations, weather service networks, atmospheric research, pollution studies, and shipboard wind measurements. Consumers of the radar systems include research and defense agencies such as NASA, NOAA, DOE, U.S. Army, U.S. Navy, U.S. Air Force, and universities, serving customers in Spain, Taiwan, India, UAE, Thailand, Kuwait, Mexico, Samoa, and Colombia as well.

McLaughlin returned to New Mexico in 2018 and was hired as an engineer at Spaceport America in 2019. He was soon promoted to director of business development. McLaughlin says the Spaceport has grown into a hotbed of commercial aerospace activity.

“Spaceport America is

starting to be a catalyst for aerospace industry growth in New Mexico,” McLaughlin said. “With Virgin Galactic, SpinLaunch, UP Aerospace, and HAPSMobile, we are steadily seeing increased interest and growth. Like any new market in early tenuous phases, a key is to cultivate customer interest and for us all to work together to tell our prospects what southern New Mexico and the rest of the state have to offer.”

Spaceport America is hosting new customers C6 Launch Systems on site this month. Canadian Corporation C6 invested \$150,000 on a static rocket test stand constructed by Highland Enterprises of Las Cruces, New Mexico. Highland designed, fabricated, and installed the stand at Spaceport America at the start of 2021. The flexible design

All donations must be made during the 23-hour time frame and must be made online via the link provided for the donation to be eligible for the matching funds.

Nonprofit organizations and donors throughout our community are invited to join the Volunteer Fair and Giving Day to promote philanthropy and use social media to engage new

donors in our community. Nonprofit organizations can reach their fundraising goals, but also reach new donors and share messaging about their vital programming.

As the son of an immigrant, I know firsthand the promise that America represents for those seeking to build a better life. many ways that New Mexicans responded to the migrant humanitarian crises in recent years with both kindness and compassion. But local communities like Las Cruces, Columbus, and Deming should never have to shoulder burdens created by new and unbudgeted costs when federal agencies do not provide sufficient shelter and humanitarian aid. That's why I was proud to introduce legislation with Senators John Cornyn (R-Texas) and Ben Ray Lujan (D-N.M.) to ensure there will be reimbursement funds for border communities and non-profits that step up to the plate and deliver critical assistance in a time of need.

We must also provide

border agents on the frontlines with the medical resources they need to prevent unnecessary tragedies. I've worked with key stakeholders to find common ground on pragmatic, responsible solutions to address the health and safety challenges along remote stretches of our southern border region. I am reintroducing the Remote, Emergency, Medical, Online Training, Telehealth, and EMT (REMOTE) Act to require EMT and paramedic training for border agents in the field, ensure 24-hour voice access to a physician or health care provider with pediatric training, and ensure all remote stations have emergency medical supplies.

There is still so much more work ahead to help

all of our communities heal from the COVID-19 pandemic, to help families and small businesses recover, and to help rebuild our economy. I am committed to supporting President Biden's American Rescue Plan to stand up an effective national vaccine distribution plan, secure the resources that schools and small businesses need to safely reopen, and provide immediate relief to families and children bearing the brunt of this crisis.

allow your hands to get some needed rest from typing.

Changes considered to upgrade local election procedures

At its March 8 work session, City Clerk Christine Rivera presented Las Cruces city councilors with proposed changes to streamline and modernize the city election process for both candidates and voters.

The council also heard proposed changes to the city's animal ordinance.

The city adopted the Local Elections Act (LEA) in 2018 that combined local elections and used ranked-choice voting for the first time in 2019.

After that election, "some administrative issues became apparent involving campaign finance, community education, and accessibility of information to the public," the city said in a summary of the election-process review. Rivera presented the review.

The changes she proposed would include moving from paper to online packets for

candidates filing to run for city offices and installing campaign finance software to create online and searchable documents for candidates.

Other changes would mandate candidates close out their campaign accounts after an election is over, which Rivera said some losing candidates fail to do; regulate the size and placement of campaign signs; and revise the city campaign finance ordinance to bring it into full compliance with state requirements.

Rivera said proposed changes to the city ordinance would include definitions, adding, for example, a definition for in-kind contributions and campaign contribution limits. The current city ordinance limits contributions to \$2,300 per person, while the state's limit is \$5,000, Rivera said. She said proposed changes to the city ordinance will be presented to the council for a vote in April.

Rivera said she is hopeful changes can be in place before the November city elections, when three city council seats will be on the ballot.

The changes proposed by Rivera would update the city election system "to reflect current trends and standards, which I think is really beneficial not only to candidates but to the public as well," Councilor Tessa Abeyta-Stuve said.

Rivera said the city also will take the lead in educating the public about ranked-choice voting, which was confusing to some voters in 2019, so the city is creating a robust education program in both English and Spanish.

Rivera said the council also could again require petition signatures for candidates running for mayor and city council, and add guidelines to city code regarding campaign signs. These issues would be for the council's future consideration, Rivera said. Any changes would not be enacted before this November's city election.

Rivera said the city removed the requirement for petition signatures for mayoral and council candidates when it adopted LEA. Before that, the city had required 25 signatures of registered voters within his or her district for a city council candidate and 150 signatures citywide for a mayoral candidate, she said.

Mayor Ken Miyagishima said petition signatures should be required for candidates for mayor and city council.

Animal control ordinance revisions

From the work session summary of the city's Animal Service Center of Mesilla Valley ordinance review

"Since 2017, the Animal Care Task Force, consisting of informed members of the community, city staff, and staff from the Animal Services Center of Mesilla Valley, reviewed Chapter 7, Animals of the Las Cruces Municipal Code."

Based on their review, the task force proposed the following changes:

- Repeal the old form of pet licensing with the modern and more-effective procedure of microchipping.

City Animal Services Supervisor Gino Jimenez said the proposed change is based on a decline in pet

owners licensing their pets and a "tremendous amount of participation in microchipping."

- Regarding barking dogs, revisions "clarify the proof needed to prosecute a violation, ensure witness cooperation in prosecution and enumerate an animal control officer's authority to mediate between neighbors."

- Allow aviary enthusiasts to maintain special breeds of pigeons and drakes with the proper permits.

- Provide a humane alternative to euthanasia for feral cats. The revisions include a trap-neuter-return program, which is consistent with a community cat policy, provides financial and educational resources for the care, spay and neutering of feral cats, includes a four-strike policy for problematic cats, provides the community with affordable options to humanely repel cats, and prohibits the release of cats to locations that are harmful to the community or local wildlife.

Animal Services Center of the Mesilla Valley Executive Director Clint Thacker said 321 feral cats were euthanized at the shelter in 2020, while 404 cats were trapped, neutered and released. Thacker said it costs \$50-\$60 per cat to trap, neuter and return and about the same cost to euthanize a cat.

Task force member Athena Huckaby, a public health professional, said the task force's proposed changes create "a workable, enforceable, functional ordinance that all can live with. All sides made compromises and came together to create this ordinance," she said.

City Art Board: Working for public art, artists, creative economy

The seven-member City Art Board (CAB) was created by Las Cruces City Council in 2013. CAB members are appointed by the mayor with council consent.

The board advises the council and assists city staff in the development of guidelines, programming and policy for art-related projects and programs. In 2014, the city began setting aside one percent of the general fund as a dedicated funding source for public art.

The Bulletin reached out to CAB members for

their thoughts about public art in Las Cruces:

Chair Christina Ballew is an artist, graphic designer and co-founder/creative director of NMCO Media. She

moved to Las Cruces eight years ago from Alaska. Ballew has curated more than 35 art shows in Las Cruces. Ballew was also the first graphic artist to be featured in the fine arts magazine, *The INK*.

"Las Cruces is an excellent community that's so supportive of the arts," Ballew said. "This city is an emerging arts destination, and CAB's goal is to help facilitate quality artwork in public spaces while developing opportunities for local, regional and national artists. Board members are so passionate about energizing public spaces that will help improve the quality of life and experiences within our community."

"I am proud of the work I did with CAB," **Vice Chair Susan Frary** said. "My appointment expires soon, and then I will be moving to another volunteer position. Ten years ago, I volunteered on the city's ad-hoc arts committee under Laurie Grumet, with several local artists and gallery

owners. We were tasked to review the city-wide public art situation and make recommendations and identified several needs: more and better venues for local artists; art for public facilities, including the new city hall; and tourism advertising (that) was not featuring our local arts scene. When the results were presented to city council, CAB was formed. I volunteered, was appointed and served two full terms."

Secretary Alysa Grayson-Aulbach is a social-impact entrepreneur whose work focuses on leveraging cultural art education's network effect as an asset toward economic development. Her theoretical perspective and evidence-based research gained her in-

ternational recognition from the Global Forum for Education and Learning as one of 2020's Top 100 Visionaries in Education.

"The richest asset, accumulating appreciation after every generational change, through the community placement of stories, history and culture is public art," Grayson said.

Member Saul Ramirez is a multidisciplinary artist who was born in El Paso and has always lived along the Rio Grande. Ramirez studied at New Mexico State University, beginning as a student of physics and astronomy and graduating with degrees in studio art and art history in 2018. Ramirez's work centers on a multidisciplinary practice that engages various mediums, including painting, instal-

lation, drawing, music and writing to engage issues of colonial history, civics and education.

"The essence of education is to give us the capacity to live well and dream," Ramirez said. "The essence of art is to make that life and those dreams come about; our goal in public art is to make those means available to everyone."

Member Chantelle Yazzie-Martin grew up in Smith Lake, N.M. and is part of the Navajo tribe. She has a bachelor's (2015) and a master's (2016) in social work from Calvin College in Grand Rapids, Michigan. Yazzie-Martin works as a mental health clinician, photographer, blogger and artist.

“Public art is important to a city’s heart and identity,” Yazzie-Martin said. “When we visit a town or city, we visit and embrace the sights, sounds and even eats of the town. Public art enhances that definition, and Las Cruces is up and coming for being a city of color to match the beautiful diversity and love our community has.”

Member Katrina Chandler, has been working in graphic design for the past 10 years. She completed a BA from NMSU in 2016 with a concentration in graphic design and is pursuing an MFA from NMSU with a focus on digital art. Chandler also works full-time for NMSU as a student media advisor.

“I love public art,” Chandler said. “I enjoy how public art unites communities, brings focus

to local artists and uses resources to give back to the community. One thing I have noticed from being on the board, even for this short amount of time, is how the artwork can pay tribute to, or honor, the history of the community, which is beautiful.”

City Art Program Coordinator Ceci Vasconcellos grew up in Las Cruces and graduated from NMSU with a BA in journalism-advertising and marketing. She has been with the city for five years and at her current position since January 2021.

“I remember playing on the bronze lions that sat in front of the old City Hall as a kid, not knowing or caring that they were public art and not meant to be played on,” Vasconcellos said. “I know better now, but I have a happy memory that is triggered every time I see them. That to me is what public art should be: art that energizes a public space and

Mesilla Valley Fine Arts Gallery features artists Ray Baird, Michael Nail

The Mesilla Valley Fine Arts Gallery (MVAG), 2470-A Calle de Guadalupe, on the historic plaza in Mesilla across from the Fountain Theatre, will feature the works of local artists Ray Baird and Michael Nail in April, and continues to feature art by Linda Hagen and Philip Krumholz in March.

Baird, an oil painter, grew up in the Midwest and has a BFA in drawing and painting from the University of Kansas. He has lived in Las Cruces since the 1990s. Baird's work, lightly described as impressionistic expressionism, uses translucent complementary colors to represent his feelings,

air. Her love of nature and animals is reflected in her work, but she holds a special regard for horses.

Krumholz was born in Peoria, Illinois and moved to Las Cruces with his wife, Jeanie, in 2017. He began metalsmithing,

learning the arts of blacksmithing, metal casting and fabrication. Krumholz uses no patterns or dies for his pieces, which are made from scratch, one at a time.

MVAG features the work of 30 artists in various media, including oil, acrylics, pastels, watercolor, fused glass art jewelry, woodturnings, stained glass, photography, ceramics, mixed media, decorated gourds, handmade textile weavings, art tile, fiber art, natural gemstone jewelry, colored pencil, basket weavings, charcoal, pen and ink, prints, cards and miniature paintings.

The money collected from the sale of glasses and cards goes to promote all of businesses as a group, Mesilla-wide. “You can pay for your glass the first time you use it,” Switzer said. “We came in second place in New Mexico for ‘Most Unique Community Collaboration Grassroots Program.’ We are just excited that it took place in our area.”

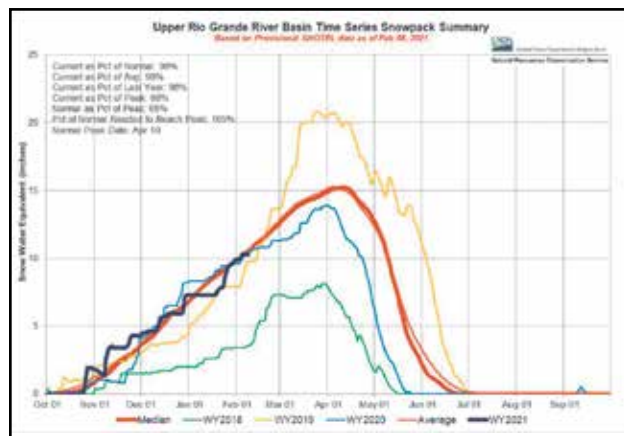
EBID forecasts slim water allotment for farmers

The winter outlook for projected moisture in the watersheds supplying the Rio Grande remains entrenched in a La Niña weather pattern according to Dr. Phil King, engineering consultant for Elephant Butte Irrigation District (EBID). However, reservoir inflow has remained steady and is contributing about 933 acre feet per day. King said these statistics are better than 2013 but not up to 2019 levels.

During the district's February board meeting, EBID directors continued to evaluate precipitation in the watershed, as well as surface water storage statistics. Seasonal project supply currently sits at 188,421 acre-feet of usable storage in the combined Elephant Butte and Caballo reservoirs. An acre foot is a unit of volume equal to the volume of a sheet of water



one acre in area and one foot in depth and is equal to 43,560 cubic feet.

Much of the western U.S. remains in severe to exceptional drought in early 2021. King warned that the watershed is drier than this time last year. In this situation, what moisture does fall is often consumed by the dry soil and vegetation before it can make it to Elephant Butte Dam.

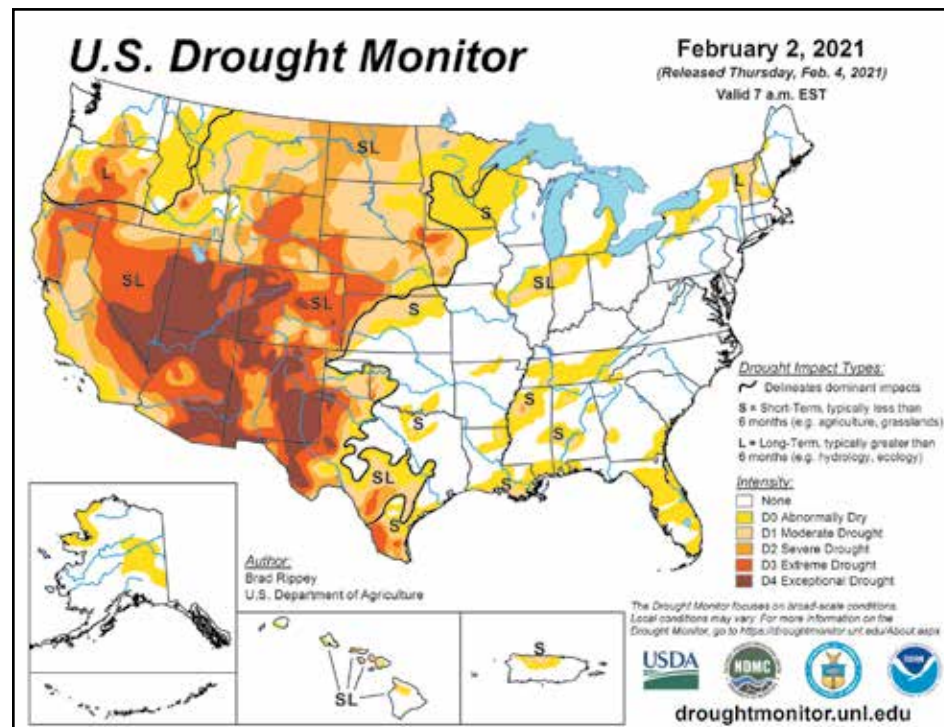
Ongoing drought requires planning, as agricultural producers prepare to plant spring

crops that will help feed and clothe the nation. Each year, they rely on the analysis and scientific data provided by the district to evaluate the situation and determine the correct relationship between water availability and crop needs.

"We're going to be dependent on the aquifer to get through this year," said Dr. Erik Fuchs, EBID groundwater resources director. He presented to the board a snapshot of aquifer conditions in the Mesilla and Hatch/Rincon valleys, using data collected via the district's data-collection system.

The system, developed by Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) Department Director Patrick Lopez, provides accurate, real-time information. The public can access it at www.ebid-scada.org. Fuchs said the district is the only organization working with real-time data, thereby providing a resource for timely decision making.

Efforts to increase ef-

iciency in surface-water use include piping projects, voluntary water transfers, stormwater capture and tactics to concentrate surface water use. These initiatives have resulted in progress with aquifer recharge in the region.

In fact, recharge efforts from 2017 "helped substantially in terms of recharge," Fuchs said, adding that water consumers in the region "are learning to mitigate our impacts on the aquifer."

As a result, he said, the "aquifer savings account" is in reasonably good shape this year.

Although snowpack has improved slightly since January, resulting in an increase of 27,000 acre-feet into the reservoir,

King said caution remains the watchword.

"Runoff and resulting allotment that may materialize will not arrive until spring runoff," he said. "Water and farm managers are recommended to plan accordingly for likely low spring runoff and a critically short year with an allotment of six inches or less."

He said initial allocation numbers will likely be based on April 1 conditions and initial allotment likely based on May 1 allocation. He advised the district to plan for a late start to the surface-water irrigation season with an expected release date of June 1.

Allocation is the amount of water available

to the Mexico, El Paso and Elephant Butte districts diversion. Allotment refers to how much water EBID has available to deliver to farmers' irrigation ditches.

EBID continues to closely monitor snowpack data, climate and weather conditions as spring progresses. They hope for significant seasonal storms to deliver needed moisture but must strategize for the worst.

New program helps New Mexicans cope with COVID-19

The New Mexico Human Services Department (NMHSD) has launched a statewide mental-health support line to help New Mexicans experiencing anxiety, stress or emotional challenges due to the COVID-19 pandemic, NMHSD said in a news release.

The Cope with COVID-19 Crisis Counseling program provides free and confidential short-term mental health services. Anyone seeking free and confidential counseling to help cope with social isolation and other challenges brought on by the pandemic can call 505-954-1057. The phone line is open 8 a.m.-8 p.m. seven days a week. Operators will connect callers with a

crisis counselor within 24 hours.

“It can be helpful to talk to someone when you are facing anxiety, depression and stress, which are common emotions to experience when dealing with all the uncertainties of the pandemic,” said Neal A. Bowen, PhD, director of NMHSD’s Behavioral Health Services Division (BHSD). “

A June 2020 survey from the national Centers for Disease Control and Prevention found that 40.9 percent of respondents reported “at least one adverse mental or behavioral health condition,” including depression, anxiety, posttraumatic stress and substance abuse, with rates that were up to four times the rates one year earlier. Of the 5,412 U.S.

adults surveyed, 10.7 percent reported seriously considering suicide in the previous 30 days.

A new study by a New Mexico State University researcher found depression and anxiety rates in the United States have more than doubled among adults amid the pandemic, according to an NMSU release.

The NMSU study, published in the *Journal of Public Health*, represents a comprehensive national assessment of the prevalence of depression and anxiety in the adult U.S. population.

A total of 1,978 adults from across the U.S. participated in the study, said Jagdish Khubchandani, public health sciences professor in the NMSU College of Health and

Social Services, and the study’s lead author.

The study found rates of depression (39 percent), anxiety (42 percent) and psychological distress (39 percent) were more than double than before the pandemic. Psychological distress includes symptoms of both depression and anxiety.

COVID-19 crisis counseling helps individuals and groups having psychological reactions to large-scale federally declared disasters recover, NMHSD said. Disaster-crisis counseling is a strength-based, outreach-oriented approach to help those affected by disasters understand they are having a normal reaction to an unusual situation, identify their individual needs and link them to

personal and local community resources.

Crisis counselors also work to enhance social and emotional connections to others in the community and promote effective coping strategies and resilience. Crisis counselors work closely with community organizations to get to know the available resources and connect survivors to needed services.

The National Center for Health Statistics partnered with the Census Bureau to obtain information on the frequency of anxiety and depression symptoms. New Mexico ranked third highest in the country for those symptoms, NMHSD said.

The Cope with COVID-19 Crisis Counseling program is funded by the

Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).

BHSD has contracted with specially FEMA trained certified peer support and community support workers through contracts with Life Link Training Institute and Presbyterian Medical Services to provide free and confidential COVID trauma crisis services aimed at the unique emotional COVID-induced trauma facing Native Americans, Spanish-language speakers, school-age youth, parents, teachers, justice-involved individuals, housing insecure and homeless, elderly and those quarantining in care centers, NMHSD said.

NMSU’s Arrowhead Center helps New Mexico healthcare company secure grant to study pain

A New Mexico health care company has received a \$250,000 grant to develop its product, thanks to support from the New Mexico Federal And State Technology (NMFAST) partnership program at New Mexico State University’s Arrowhead Center.

Just Health Care LLC (JHC), based in Albuquerque, received a \$256,000 National Science Foundation (NSF) Small Busi-

ness Innovation Research (SBIR) grant to conduct research and development on a new biomedical device that measures and maps pain intensity onto a 3-D image of the human body.

JHC has been providing medical services to uninsured and low-income New Mexicans since 2003. Clinicians developed integrative health approaches to chronic pain for patients, often helping patients get off opioid medications. Through these experiences, Dr.

Andru Zeller envisioned PainScan, a highly technical medical device that uses computer vision and a sophisticated clinician glove to fully map a patient’s pain intensity.

“We are so proud that our New Mexico business has been selected by NSF and that we can continue our ground-breaking research into improving health outcomes for people suffering with chronic pain,” Zeller said. “This ‘hi-tech, hi-touch’ approach personalizes the physical exam, improves

patient care and can help direct patients to non-opioid solutions. This new technology helps clinicians visualize the full pain picture to improve diagnostic accuracy and identify best therapies.”

Zeller said the global chronic pain treatment market is worth about \$83 billion and expected to reach \$152 billion by 2030.

“PainScan is positioned at the confluence of rising senior populations, escalating chronic diseases and favorable policies around pain research and

treatment,” he said.

NMFAST provides proposal development assistance to small businesses throughout New Mexico. NMFAST provides the resources, support and expertise necessary to submit competitive proposals for grants from SBIR and Small Business Technology Transfer programs, which are often referred to as “America’s Seed Fund” and are highly competitive sources of undiluted funding for businesses.

Startups or entrepre-

neurs who submit three-page project pitches will know within three weeks if they meet NMFAST’s objectives to support innovative technologies that show promise of commercial or societal impact and involve a level of technical risk.

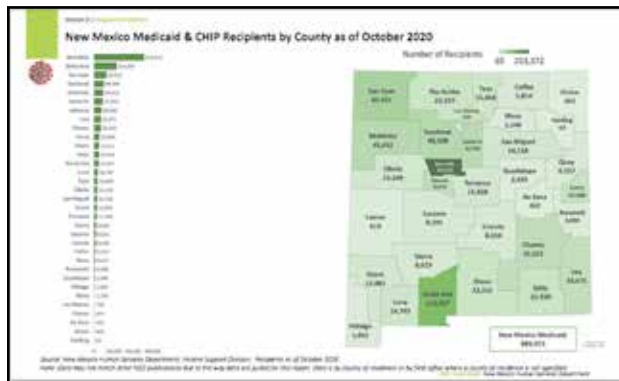
State Human Services Department publishes 2021 data book

Recovering from COVID

Some people with COVID-19 have had prolonged hospital stays. People who have been hospitalized are demonstrating significant functional impact from that experience and show signs of intensive care unit acquired weakness, post intensive care syndrome, shortness of breath, and drop in oxygen saturation in their blood.



Nearly all patients who have been in the hospital due to COVID-19 are reporting moderate to severe decrease in endurance. The amount of endurance reduction seems to be correlated with the severity of the disease – those with more severe disease symptoms have more reduction in strength and endurance. Clinically there is a greater loss of muscle mass compared to people with other kinds of problems that result in prolonged hospital stays. We certainly know that bed rest and immobility is or at least in part the cause of loss of strength and endurance, but it seems that having had COVID-19 increases the severity of these problems.

Decreased muscle mass and the resulting weakness and loss of endurance have a dramatic functional impact. People experience a decrease in their independence, having to call on family and friends to assist them with simple daily activities. There is loss of mobility, meaning that they may completely lose their ability to move around independently, or may require the use of an assistive device such as a walker or cane to safely move from place to place in their home. Additionally, weakness and loss of endurance results in a significant increased risk for falling and injury due to the fall.

When people think about COVID-19, it’s unlikely that they think about physical therapy. However, physical therapy is a critical intervention for those who have had prolonged hospital stays, and even for those who have “weathered the storm” at home and now experience weakness and loss of endurance.

Physical therapists address loss of mobility, independence, and safety concerns in the presence of weakness and reduced endurance. It is reported that people are experiencing prolonged recovery times post-COVID infection. In many of these people, physical therapy treatment is essential in assisting them in a safe progression of an exercise program to return to their prior level of function.

Atrium Physical Therapy is fully prepared to assist people in our community in recovering from the physical effects of a COVID-19 infection. We observe all precautions recommended by the CDC and health department, with enhanced disinfection procedures to ensure that our patients and staff are safe and healthy during this time. ThreadBear: New shop offers quilted comfort

Ann and Michael Siewert had a successful and popular fabric shop in Las Vegas, New Mexico they had been running for 11 years or so. They decided it would be a good thing to move their business to Las Cruces. It was February 2020 when the deal was completed and the lease signed, so there was no turning back, Ann said.

When the coronavirus hit and everything shut down, the Siewerts had no choice but to keep their business plans moving. Opening in May 2020, ThreadBear Quilt and Yarn Shop, 2205 B, Main St. Las Cruces, made its bid to survive.

“We just needed a bigger market,” Ann said. “So, we are just making the best of it.”

The couple started ThreadBear because Ann loves fabric. The quilts

she made became the excuse to use the materials. Currently, she is working on a chicken quilt, putting out one chicken square after the other.

“We started during the Great Recession at the bottom of 2009,” Michael said. “That wasn’t nearly as scary as this. But it is driven by the passion. That’s why you do this.

It is no get-rich-quick scheme. It’s about color and beauty and the integrity of hand work.”

Michael is a knitter. The shop contains a large selection of quilting fabrics, as well as a wall covered with skeins of yarn. It also has a long-arm quilting machine with a two- to three-month back-up of customers

who want their creations quilted by the machine.

Michael said they are enjoying their new home and the warmer weather in Las Cruces.

“Down here, it seems all light and warmth and nice people,” he said.

When the Siewerts found their location, they were prepared to lease

the front part of the store, about 3,000 square feet. But there was an additional space at the back of the building that was not being utilized, and it was offered to them at a good price.

“We ended up with what we would consider to be a luxuriously large classroom,” Michael said. “As

it turns out it, was a lucky deal.”

Now, the extra square-footage is paying off. ThreadBear can offer space for people to work and holds classes with room to socially distance.

As things open up and people keep becoming more aware of ThreadBear, stock will be growing fairly significantly, he said.

“Because of what we have learned about our customers here, we are adapting to the needs of the area,” he said. “Soon, we’ll be carrying a good deal more yarn.”

They are working with area wool dyers too. Michael said there is a woman who lives in Doña Ana, Ladonna Maxwell, whose dyed yarns they carry.

“Were always looking for local yarns in particular,” he said. “Fabric tends

believe that it’s important to remember that together, we can build a more robust university.”

Numbers paint the picture of COVID-19 vs. students

At the one-year mark of the COVID pandemic, we're all pretty familiar with COVID numbers.

Throughout the crisis, we at The Bridge of Southern New Mexico have been keeping our eyes on other numbers relevant to the cataclysmic chain reaction of impacts brought on by the COVID-19 shutdowns. Specifically, how is this impacting education and employment?

We'll start with the good news.

Just released high school graduation rates were up for 2019-20 school year (despite the onset of the pandemic): 83 percent across the county's three

school districts — the county's highest so far.

By district, the breakdown is as follows: Las Cruces Public Schools — 86.2 percent; Gadsden Independent School District — 82.2 percent; and Hatch Valley Public Schools — 80.2 percent.

Thank you to our educators, parents and (of course!) the students themselves, who found ways to make sure our seniors had the support they needed to earn their diplomas.

These 2,755 graduates are so important, because they have significant economic impacts on our county. Once this group

hits the workforce, they represent: \$60 million in annual earnings, if they only finish high school; \$72 million in annual earnings, if they earn college-level career credentials or two-year degrees; and \$112 million, if they earn four-year degrees.

They are vital contributors to our economic recovery as a community and state.

What about jobs? If they continue to pursue their educations after high school, will they have jobs ready for them here? YES!

There were 6,048 jobs available in February in Doña Ana County, ranging from entry-level to professional degrees.

That number rises and falls throughout the year, but there are consistently

thousands of jobs available in our county.

That's why we work so hard to maximize our people's earning power right here, growing and flourishing in local careers. Their earnings flow out across the county in spending, growing the tax base, and perhaps in creating their own companies. Our goal is to keep as many of them here as possible.

Now for the bad news.

In our county, 9,504 people are still receiving unemployment benefits (as of March 8, 2021) and 110,663 statewide, according to the New Mexico Department of Workforce Solutions data.

Four industries account for about two out of every five jobs lost here: 1,497 – accommodation and food

service; 1,053 – healthcare and social assistance; 829 – retail trade; and 773 – construction.

In 2019, these four industries were the top private-sector employers in our county – illustrating the dramatic change underway in our economy. That's why we are laser-focused on the industries that are key to our ongoing growth and economic sustainability for families: healthcare, aerospace, defense, energy, digital media, value-added agriculture, advanced manufacturing, transportation and logistics.

Healthcare is unique in appearing in both lists, but it has come roaring back. Today, there are 786 job openings just in healthcare and social assistance.

Why do these private sector industries matter? Because without a strong private sector, our public sector won't have the resources needed to serve our county well.

Here's one last set of numbers we should be tracking. A recent report from McKinsey & Company assessed the impact of school closures on student outcomes nation-

ally. What they found was troubling. From March 2020 to June 2021, students will have suffered, on average, seven months of learning loss, translating to \$61,000-\$82,000 in lifetime earnings lost, and \$173 billion-\$271 billion in lost gross domestic product.

If we genuinely believe our students and our people are the greatest resources we have, we must focus in the days ahead on helping both. Each group has great potential, and each can have a bright future.

Doña Ana County is uniquely positioned to support both — I believe more than any other county in the state. We understand our interconnectedness, and we act that way.

As we go back to school, back to opening and back to work, I believe our numbers will be able to tell a great story about what this county did — acting together.

Hogan came back from a crash. Can Tiger?

On the morning of Tuesday, Feb. 23, the sports world — the whole world for that matter — was jarred by the breaking news that Tiger Woods had been critically injured in a single-vehicle rollover car crash in suburban Los Angeles.

According to a local resident of Rolling Hills Estates, who heard the crash and walked to the scene, Woods was unconscious. First responders arrived at 7:18 a.m. and found Woods to be conscious, “lucid” and able to answer questions. He was determined to be “not impaired.”

It is immediately striking to anyone who has looked at the photos of the smashed SUV lying on its side in a wooded ditch that Woods was lucky to survive. He suffered serious injuries to his right leg, ankle and foot that required multiple surgeries, along with “pins, screws and rods.”

The previous week, Woods had been hosting the Genesis Invitational

PGA tournament, which benefits Woods’ foundation. He didn’t play, but he remained in the area for some appearances following the end of play Sunday.

He was heading for a video shoot Tuesday, driving along a winding stretch of Hawthorne Boulevard, known to be a dangerous and accident-prone stretch of road. Reports of the accident stated that Woods’ SUV hit an upright sign, crossed a center divider, traveled 150 feet across a shoulder of the road on the other side, through shrubbery and an uprooted tree, before coming to a stop, resting on the driver’s side. Woods’ recovery will be long and arduous.

Almost immediately after the news flash of the crash, golf historians and golf media pundits began drawing similarities between Woods’ accident and the car crash that nearly killed Ben Hogan 72 years ago, also in February.

In February 1949, Ben Hogan was indisputably

the number-one golfer in the world, having already won twice a month earlier, and coming off a 10-win season in 1948. Since the end of World War II, he had collected 37 tour titles. Hogan, 36, had finished playing a tournament in Phoenix, as he and his wife, Valerie, drove their new black Cadillac sedan east to return home to Ft. Worth.

They were traveling east on a fog-shrouded, icy road, just 37 miles east of Van Horn, when a westbound Greyhound bus tried to pass a truck in the blind fog and slammed head-on into Hogan’s Cadillac. Hogan was going 25, the bus was going 50 mph. Hogan later recalled that he only saw “four headlights blinking at me.”

In an instant, Hogan hurled his body across the front seat to shield his wife, saving both their lives. Valerie had only minor injuries, but Hogan’s were quite serious, including a fractured collarbone, a double pelvis fracture, a broken ankle and cracked ribs. The crumpled car revealed

that the engine block had rocketed back into the cab, ramming the steering wheel through the driver’s seat, which Hogan was not in at impact.

Hospitalization and rehabilitation following the accident were long, painful and difficult. Blood clots developed in Hogan’s legs, endangering his heart, a matter he had to face for the rest of his life. But a determined and stubborn Hogan returned to competitive golf an amazing 11 months after the accident. He then managed to win 13 PGA tour events, including six

majors, for his career total of nine major championships.

In June 1950, playing the U.S. Open at Merion Golf Club, just outside Philadelphia, Hogan hit one of golf’s most legendary shots, with a one-iron, to the 18th green, and two-putted for par. He won a three-way playoff the next day. That win became known as the “Miracle at Merion.”

Still, the real miracle was the one at Van Horn. Hogan’s incredible post-crash play was encapsulated in the 1953 season, where he won five of six

events, including three majors: the Masters by six strokes, the U.S. Open by six and the Open Championship by four. Hogan’s was the greatest sports comeback of all time.

It remains to be seen if Tiger can make a similar Phoenix-like rise from the ashes of his crash last month.

to be a larger scale operation. but there are a lot of gifted dyers out here. We may even move into looms and weaving supplies at some point.”

In the meanwhile, ThreadBear is an open and comfortable space for quilt groups, knitters and learners to visit, filling a niche in Las Cruces.

“We hope we are filling a real need in the community, and we hope we are building a relationship

that will last long after this is over,” Michael said. “Right now, its great to have the space and offer a facility for groups that traditionally met in senior centers and churches, many of which are still kind of locked down.”
