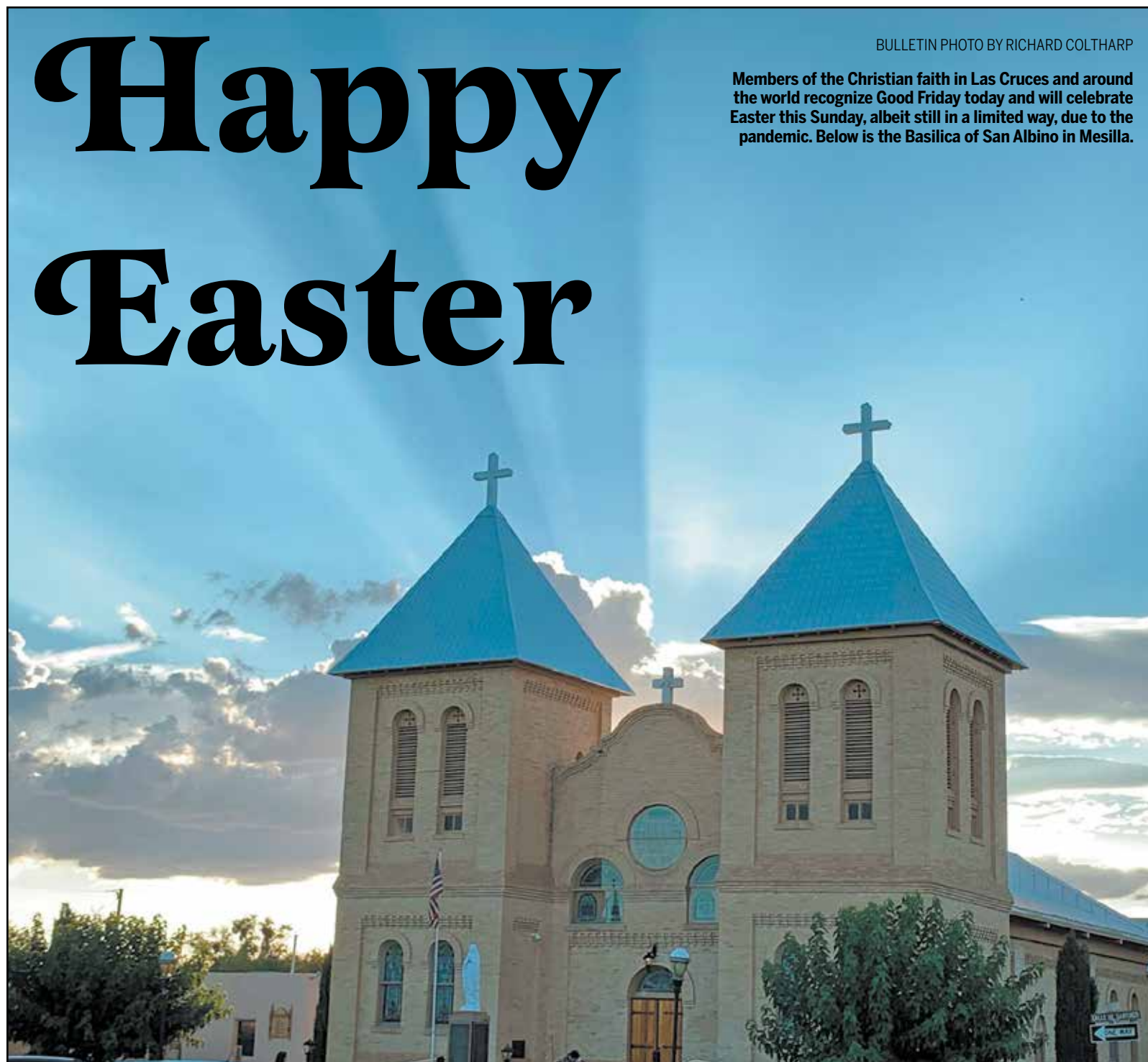

COUNTY SEEKS APPLICANTS FOR PLANNING & ZONING COMMISSION

Doña Ana County seeks applications to fill three volunteer positions to serve on the Planning and Zoning Commission by end of business on Thursday, April 15.

Members serve staggered two-year terms and three existing seats will expire on Apr. 30. The Board of County Commissioners will appoint the new members to the Planning and Zoning Commission, at their April 27 meeting. Applicants are encouraged to attend the meeting virtually or in person, to address any questions. Selected commissioners' terms will be effective on Saturday, May 1.

The seven-member Planning and Zoning Commission reviews land-use and development matters. Matters historically reviewed by the commission include variance requests to land use requirements; special use permits; zone changes; subdivision reviews and approvals; appeals of staff decisions; reports to the Board of County Commissioners; and recommendations related to amendments or changes to the county's comprehensive plan and Unified Development Code.

Meetings are generally held from 9 a.m. to noon, on the second and fourth Thursday of the month, either virtually or at the Board of County Commissioners Chambers, 845 N. Motel Blvd. in Las Cruces. Applications will be accepted through 5 p.m., Thursday, April 15. COVID recovery initiatives underway

City COVID-19 spending reaches \$3.3 million

The City of Las Cruces has distributed \$3.3 million to support local nonprofits, small businesses and programs serving those most in need, including the homeless, elderly and food insecure, during the health pandemic, the city said in a news release.

The city council also allocated \$500,000 to offer front-line city workers hazard pay for continuing to serve the public during the pandemic, the release said.



The city's COVID-19 response report, "Together We Can," which details how COVID-19 support funds were distributed, is available at www.lascruces.org/2450/COVID-19-Response-Reportdetails. Or visit www.lascruces.org and go to the City Manager's page and click

on the report.

Funds come from the city's Telshor Fund, a reserve account made up of the city's share of lease payments made by Memorial Medical Center, which the city and Doña Ana County jointly own, as well as from the city's general fund, the city said.

The "Together We Can" report is "a tool for the community to understand how diverse the city's response has been," City Manager Ifo Pili said. "We have been able to help community members with mortgages, rent, utility bills, food, masks, but also small businesses. We still

have work to do, but we are committed to investing resources and time into building back stronger," Pili said.

The 30-page report is divided into six sections: background, Las Cruces takes action, use of funds, COVID-19 vaccine plan, small business continuity grant and "Las Cruces Safe Promise."

It includes information about COVID-19 vaccinations, the city task force created to promote them and the city's bilingual "Sleeve Up Las Cruces"/ "Súbete la Manga Cruces" vaccination program.

"The report also in-

cludes the dates, times and locations of our vaccine registration events, as we understand some of our community members find the registration process complicated," said city Community Engagement Manager Jamey Rickman.

The report also details how the city's Small Business Continuity grant program has distributed \$5.4 million to local nonprofits and small businesses.

Delano Lewis named NMSU visiting senior fellow for Global Affairs

New Mexico State University is welcoming former U.S. Ambassador Delano E. Lewis as visiting senior fellow for Global Affairs, NMSU Provost Carol Parker announced in a news release.

"In this role, Ambassador Lewis will share his knowledge and experience in global affairs through guest lectures, hosting of conferences, seminars and workshops on relevant international issues impacting our community,

the state and the nation, all aimed at helping to

bring a global perspective across all academic levels,

and advance the mission of expanding and enhancing the knowledge and skills of all students in preparation for success in a competitive global society," Parker said.

Parker said Lewis gained his perspective and knowledge through a long and distinguished career as a diplomat, businessman and entrepreneur.

In June 1999, President Bill Clinton nominated Lewis as U.S. Ambassador to the Republic of South Africa. He served Dec. 22, 1999-July 13, 2001.

In September 2006, Lewis was named senior fellow at NMSU, where he established the Institute for International Relations and served as director. Lewis now serves on the board of the American Institutes for Research.

Lewis, 81, began the

Left Right Forward Foundation, which includes a wide-ranging series of podcasts, in 2018. He is also working on a project to chronicle the Black experience in America.

Lewis graduated from the University of Kansas in Lawrence in 1960 and from Washburn University School of Law in Topeka, Kansas in 1963. He worked in the Internal Security Division of the U.S. Department of Justice, was a lawyer with the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission, served on the staff of U.S. Sen. Edward Brooke, R-Massachusetts, became CEO of the Chesapeake and Potomac Telephone Company and served on the boards of directors of Colgate-Palmolive and Eastman Kodak.

Lewis helped guide pas-

sage of Washington, D.C.'s Home Rule Act through Congress in 1973. He ran for D.C. city council, losing to future D.C. Mayor Marion Barry and later led Barry's mayoral transition team.

Lewis is the author of "No Condition Is Permanent" and "It All Begins with Self."

Lewis and his wife, Gayle, have four sons – including television actor and director Phill Lewis – and 11 grandchildren. The couple retired to Las Cruces in 2001.

Birthdays, banking and barbecue

As you drive around Las Cruces today and see financial institutions on every corner, it's difficult to imagine our city had only two banks in 1969.

A few visionaries wanted to change that, and in April 1970, Citizens Bank opened its doors.

A half-century later, Citizens Bank still works to build what one of its founding shareholders, Jim Ikard, said in those original days: "We want a purely local bank."

Ikard's father, J.A. Ikard, and brother, John Ikard, were among the 47 original shareholders.

Earlier this year, I visited with Citizens Bank CEO Jed Fanning and Ruth Christopher, the bank's executive vice president and chief financial officer. They, and all the Citizens Bank team, were all set to spend 2020 with a big public celebration of the bank's 50th anniversary.

Well, the pandemic got in the

way, so they're celebrating this year instead.

The bank was founded with a community mission to give opportunities to the underserved in Las Cruces. The state's banking charter considered Citizens a minority bank because most of its stockholders were Hispanic.

The bank also sought to be a partner in small, locally owned businesses.

In 1975, Jesus "Chuy" and Elsa Rodriguez moved from California to Las Cruces, where the drier climate was better for Chuy's health. A random conversation in line at the grocery store put Elsa and Chuy in touch with a Realtor, who led them to the Ranchway restaurant at 604 N. Valley Drive, which was for sale.

"We went to see the little restaurant," Elsa said. "We sat down, and they were only selling three things: barbecue sandwiches, barbecue burritos and a

brisket plate. We had lunch, and we both said, 'This product is good. Let's do it!'"

Their accountant recommended Citizens Bank for the loan.

"Citizens Bank has been very wonderful for us," Elsa said. "Before the building was a restaurant, it was someone's house. When we got it, there was only one bathroom, and it had a tub."

Adding a bathroom – and eliminating the tub – is just one of the upgrades and renovations over the years. Citizens Bank has helped at each step.

For years, Jim Ikard worked directly with Elsa and Chuy.

"Jim became very important for us," Elsa said. "I was always grateful Ranchway was one of his favorite restaurants. He always came to eat with a person or two, and often with his family."

By popular demand, a few years in, Chuy and Elsa added Mexican food, borrowing recipes from Chuy's mother in Mexico.

"She was an excellent cook,

and when we brought in her chile chipotle, nobody knew what it was," Elsa said.

The pork steak adovada, one of their specialties, is one of my favorites.

"That recipe is also from Chuy's mother," she said.

Their son, also named Chuy, runs the restaurant now.

"He's worked there since he was 17, and now we've passed the responsibility to him," Elsa said. "But we're still very much involved."

I love all the Ranchway food, not to mention the cool art and memorabilia on the walls. In many ways, it's a Las Cruces museum. The barbecue is still great, and they make a mean green chile cheeseburger.

I've always been grateful to the Rodriguez family for Ranchway, a wonderful slice of Las Cruces flavor and history.

Now I know I also owe thanks to Citizens Bank. Happy 50th anniversary to the institution that helped build Las Cruces.

New laws checking NCAA a nod to reality

Rodeo may be the only college sport that isn't knee-deep in hypocrisy.

That's because rodeo is not part of the NCAA and has never held romanticized notions about the purity of amateur athletics. The sport has always been about prize money. The PRCA champion each year is the one who wins the most money. Marginal athletes in rodeo don't get cut or put on waivers. They know it's time to quit when they can't earn enough gas money to get to the next event.

And so, college athletes in rodeo compete for prize money. The ones who do

the best earn the most. And, they all will have the chance to try their hand on the pro circuit if they want to.

Most college athletes don't have that option. Swimmers, sprinters and gymnasts have no choice but to be amateurs. The very most elite may someday earn sponsorships, but they will never experience the fame or fortune available to those on the football and men's basketball teams.

The NCAA recently reported that the 2018-2019 men's basketball season generated a total of \$864.6 million in total net income. The 20 most

profitable college football teams generated even more, bringing in a combined \$925 million.

College coaches have reaped the rewards that come with heading multi-million-dollar operations. Kentucky basketball coach John Calipari makes \$8.158 million a year. Alabama football coach Nick Saban makes \$9.3 million a year.

And yet, in the make-believe world of the NCAA, the best players on the Kentucky basketball and Alabama football teams are worth no more than the best sprinter of the track team. A full scholarship is the most any of them is eligible for.

Anytime a rule is that divorced from reality, it is destined to be broken

often. Boosters with a deep affection for their alma mater, and deeper pockets, have found creative ways to lure top athletes to their school with cars, gifts and money handed out under the table.

State legislatures are stepping in to challenge the NCAA. Florida recently joined with California and Colorado in passing a law to allow college athletes to profit from their name, image or likeness, in violation of NCAA rules. A similar

law was passed by the New Mexico Legislature, and is pending consideration by Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham.

The NCAA is tweaking its rules, while at the same time lobbying Congress to block the new state laws. It is committed to maintaining the idyllic notion of the student athlete, who is competing for the love of the sport and will take the lessons learned on the playing field and apply them to whatever profession they will pursue later in life.

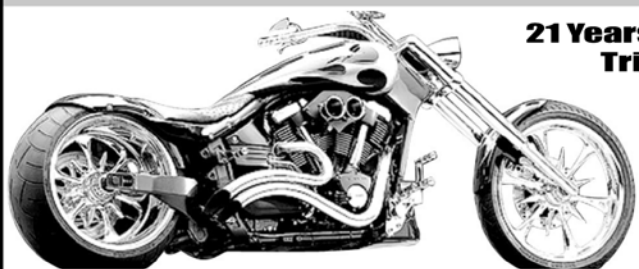
The vast majority of those competing in college athletics fit that profile, but, NCAA leaders can't have it both ways. They can't rake in millions of dollars, competing with professional sports leagues, movies, concerts and other forms of entertainment, while still pretend that their primary function is the education of star athletes.

The new state laws will only increase the divide between the haves and

To quote Buffett, 'If the phone doesn't ring, it's me'

My favorite song is "Come Monday," by Jimmy Buffett. It's a love song, but it's also a personal mantra that a new day is always coming, and if you're down today, the new day will likely be better: "Come Monday, it'll be all right."

Come Monday, I'll be retired again. Bulletin Publisher (and longtime friend) Richard Coltharp lured me out of my first retirement in December 2019, when he asked me to join The Bulletin team. I was a tad reluctant, but I took the gig and quickly got into the groove.

Editing The Bulletin was full circle for me, having edited a string of other newspapers in the

1980s and 90s, before coming home to Las Cruces in 1995 to earn my master's degree. During that time, I taught at NMSU and tended bar at My Brother's Place. Shortly after graduating, I took a job at the county in 1998

and stayed there nearly 21 years.

Getting back into newspapering felt right after the initial adjustment. The team is a great one, with talented, funny and passionate folks seated at every desk in the building. I thought, "Well, I could

see myself doing this for a while."

I was still spoiling my granddaughters on weekends and playing golf every few weeks. Richard was cool with me bringing my Sancho Panza — Toby, my aging Yorkshire terrier — into the office most days. I could feel the ink pulsing through my veins again, and I felt of use to the community. Life was good.

Then came COVID-19. As a lifelong asthmatic whose battles with pneumonia have been harrowing, I was particularly respectful of the implications of contracting the virus. So, I went into lockdown. On March 14, 2020, I left the busy, buzzing office for the last time and set up shop in a makeshift corner of the living room at home.

Like so many others, I had to learn to work remotely, and it was complicated by the fact that my home system is Apple, and I was communicating with a PC network. There were hiccups, but for the most part, the transition worked seamlessly. Email was how we conducted most communications, with only an occasional telephone call.

A naturally social animal, I came to be grateful for the hours spent writing for and editing The Bulletin rather than pacing the cage that had become my home. I learned a new normal of FaceTiming with family and friends during evenings and weekends.

This went on for most of a year. When the vaccine development was looking really promising in Janu-

ary, I looked at my options and gave my notice to Richard, telling him March 31 would be my last day. Here we are.

I want to thank everyone at The Bulletin and in the community who shared their kindnesses, stories, laughter and wisdom along this 15-month journey. I'm honored to have been along with you for the ride.

On Tuesday, March 30, Virgin Galactic unveiled the Company’s first SpaceShip III in its growing fleet, VSS Imagine, according to a release from the company.

“The spaceship showcases Virgin Galactic’s innovation in design and astronaut experience,” the release said. “Imagine also demonstrates progress toward efficient design and production, as Virgin Galactic works to scale the business for the long-term. VSS Imagine will commence ground testing, with glide flights planned for this summer from Spaceport America.”

The livery design, fin-

ished entirely with a mirror-like material, reflects the surrounding environment, constantly changing color and appearance as it travels from earth to sky to space. Along with providing thermal protection, the release said, “This dynamic material is naturally appealing to the human eye, reflecting our inherent human fascination with space and the transformative experience of spaceflight.”

The SpaceShip III class of vehicles are built to enable improved performance in terms of maintenance, access and flight rate, laying the foundation for design and manufacture of future vehicles.

As VSS Imagine begins ground testing, manufacturing will progress on VSS Inspire, the second SpaceShip III vehicle within the Virgin Galactic fleet. The introduction of the SpaceShip III class of vehicles kicks off Virgin Galactic’s multi-year effort that targets 400 flights per year.

Future astronauts are invited to be part of the Virgin Galactic journey. One of Virgin Galactic’s future astronauts, Dee Chester, had a unique opportunity to play her part in the rollout of VSS Imagine, as her Astronaut Edition Range Rover towed the new spaceship out of its hangar for the first time.

Street maintenance: millions of dollars, hundreds of miles

There are 488 centerline miles of streets in the City of Las Cruces, with an annual budget of \$4.2 million for paving, maintenance and rehabilitation, city Public Works Department (PWD) Director David Sedillo said.

The city uses pavement management software and a pavement condition index (PCI) to access the quality of each street and determine where work is needed most, Sedillo said. As a whole, city streets have a PCI of 66 out of a possible 100, he said. The goal is at least 80.

Sedillo said it would cost about \$105 million to bring all city streets up to the 80 mark, or about \$7

million a year for 10 years.

"I would love to see that increase happen," he said, recognizing that the city has "many other priorities and needs, as well."

PWD has 118 employees working in five programs: administration, construction management, engineering/architecture, street management and traffic management. PWD also heads up the city's general-obligation bond projects, more than \$35 million in construction approved by city voters in the August 2018 all-mail election.

Street management staff includes two licensed professional engineers and three engineering technicians, who review available data on street conditions and run com-

puter models to determine "the best way to attack our maintenance of streets with the available funding," Sedillo said.

Road construction crews, including project managers and inspectors, are responsible for preventive maintenance of streets, grading roads and alleys, patching potholes, making utility-patch repairs and doing chip seal and small paving jobs, he

said. They also handle special projects like de-icing bridges, Sedillo said. City crews even assisted the New Mexico Department of Transportation in de-icing U.S. Highway 70 overpasses, outside city limits.

Most city paving projects are contracted out to private companies, with the city using local vendors for "a lot of our contracted work," he said.

"We want to ensure we get the best possible results in our pavement maintenance for our residents and community," Sedillo said.

Street management also includes six street sweepers and a five-man concrete crew that does ADA-ramp installation and the construction and repair of sidewalks and concrete structures that are part of the roadway system, Sedillo said.

If one crew is down because of weather conditions or some other issue, its members work with a different crew, he said.

"There's a lot of hats that they wear through the year. They do an excellent job," Sedillo said.

"You can imagine the level of responsibility they have throughout the city based on the centerline model," Sedillo said. Centerline miles measure a street's length regard-

HIGH DENSITY MINERAL BOND: Spray applied in two applications to protect asphalt from moisture and UV rays.

CRACK SEALING: Placing an adhesive sealant into cracks on the pavement surface, preventing the infiltration of moisture.

MICRO-SURFACING: A protective seal coat, which is a thin, tough layer of an asphalt blend, which extends the life of pavement.

CHIP SEAL: A layer of fine aggregate placed over asphalt road.

CAPE SEAL: A chip seal covered with a slurry or micro surface.

OVERLAY: A new pavement section (generally 1.5-two inches thick) placed over the top of an existing pavement surface.

MILL AND OVERLAY: Requires the removal of the top layer (two inches) of a street by a large milling machine. After the top layer is removed, a new layer of pavement is put in its place.

PAVEMENT REPLACEMENT: All asphalt is removed, base is recompact and new asphalt is placed.

FULL RECONSTRUCTION: An entire road is reconstructed and typically includes updating all utilities (water, sanitary sewer, gas, storm drain), curb and gutter, sidewalks, streets lights and ADA ramps.

less of how many lanes it has.

Street projects often involve more than paving or resurfacing, Sedillo said, and his road crews work closely with the Utilities Department and other city departments to add or replace utility lines, storm drains, lighting and signaling.

"There's quite a bit that goes into installing those infrastructure needs into a project," he said.

It sometimes means dealing with utility lines dating as far back as the 1940s.

"We do our best to do the research we have based on the records we have for what's underground," Sedillo said.

"You do find some things that are unexpected. We work as quickly as we can."

Sedillo said crews do their best to minimize inconvenience to nearby

residents and businesses.

Upcoming city road maintenance projects include work on portions of McFie Street, Midway Avenue, Walnut Street, Campo Street, Camino Coyote and Sonoma Springs Road (leading into the East Mesa Public Recreation complex), Solar Ridge, Bellamah Drive and the extension of Madrid Road.

Pavement maintenance and replacement projects also continue, Sedillo said, along with crack seal work.

Sedillo is a professional engineer who was recently promoted to PWD director. He has been with the city 15.5 years. He was born in Las Cruces and grew up in the village of Doña Ana.

"I consider it an honor to serve the community," Sedillo said. "I feel I have a great responsibility and I don't take that lightly."

The Las Cruces Public Schools Board of Education has unanimously chosen Camino Real Middle School Principal Ralph Ramos to fill the position of interim superintendent. The decision came after the Feb. 25 death of Superintendent Dr. Karen Trujillo.

Ramos has been CRMS principal for 13 years. He has been with LCPS 28 years.

"What an honor to be able to serve in honor of Dr. Karen Trujillo," Ramos said following the decision. "I definitely learned from her, and I

appreciate the opportunity to serve our students and families."

Board members expressed their concern for continuing Trujillo's compassionate leadership during a difficult time, and felt that Ramos possessed similar qualities as Trujillo, according to a news release.

"One of Dr. Trujillo's greatest qualities is that she regarded us as team members," said board Vice President Carol Cooper. "She regarded anyone who had a connection with children as

a team member, and I see that in Mr. Ramos."

"She touched so many individuals in this district," Ramos said about Trujillo. "I'm

here to fulfill the duties Dr. Trujillo has left, and to try and keep going with her positive vision."

During his time at CRMS, Ramos said he has worked to build "the happiest, most awesome staff" he could.

Ramos began his career with LCPS in 1992 as an eighth-grade science teacher at Picacho Middle School. In 2000,

he moved to Sierra Middle School, where he became assistant principal. In 2006, Ramos was named assistant principal at Vista Middle School and in 2009, he became CRMS principal.

"It touches me to have served the Camino community, and it's hard to leave," said Ramos, noting that a search has been launched for an interim principal at the school. "I believe in distributive leadership. We embedded leadership opportunities with ev-

eryone at Camino, from student government, ensuring our students have a voice, to our teachers who also have a voice. We have team leaders, department heads, and we collaborate and work together."

Building an anti-bullying model for his school community is one of the highlights of Ramos's time at CRMS. He described the framework as a philosophy that everyone was expected to emulate.

"We committed to no

bullying, no violence and no drugs," said Ramos. "And with that came three expectations: don't participate, walk away and tell the truth. That transformed our school into a safe space where learning can take place."

Ramos will serve as interim superintendent until June 30 or until the board hires a permanent superintendent. He will receive a prorated additional \$16,354 added to his current salary of \$100,938.

Las Cruces Utilities Sewage Line Extension now moves in to Phase II at Hacienda Acres Subdivision *By Cassie McClure*

During the 2019 New Mexico Legislative Session, a \$1,006,370.00 grant was approved for the Las Cruces Septic Systems Replacement project, Hacienda Acres is one of two areas in Las Cruces that will benefit from the grant funding. Approved by the Las Cruces Utilities (LCU) Board of Commissioners via Resolution No. 20-21-LCU026, the Hacienda Acres Phase II Sewer Improvements Project will now go to construction.

The Hacienda Acres Phase II Sewer Improvements project consists of installing an 8-inch gravity sewer main, utility holes, and a 4-inch PVC sewer service line in Calle de Ranchero and Avenida del Sol Road. Installation of the new sewer main and services will allow for 32 sewer connections for residents along these streets as a part of this septic replacement project.



LCU will be connecting new neighborhoods to its City's sewer lines thanks to a grant from the 2019 New Mexico Legislature.

Carl Clark, P.E., deputy director Environmental & Technical Support, explained that LCU is ready to get started with their contractor Smith & Aguirre, Inc. "The project should last around 80 working days," Clark said. "We continue to expand our services to those customers that are in city limits and meet the 'High Priority' criteria area defined by the Septic

Tank Identification and Prioritization Plan, written by CDM Smith. High density residential subdivisions utilizing septic tank systems such as the Hacienda Acres Subdivision could result in nitrate concentration in local aquifers that exceed the drinking water standards."

With a connection to the LCU system, homeowners could also see a benefit to selling their homes in the future due to taking the need for septic tank maintenance out of their hands and into the hands of the system. John Mrozek, deputy director Wastewater, "The downside of a septic system is getting

them pumped to prevent backups and overflow."

He explained that the tank collects water from sinks, tubs, and toilets. The waste is separated from the water and the water is sent to outgoing grid field pipes also known as a leach field, where it is then released into the soil underground.

"Septic systems sometimes cannot handle large amounts of sewage and can be overloaded, and the failure of the system can be very costly," Mrozek said. "Plus, any clogs won't just be in a drain or pipe heading out of your home; it's stuck in your system and can cause problems with the tank or the leach field."

Reporter says legislative session was productive, cooperative

For the most part, Democrats and Republicans got along and had a productive 2021 legislative session, said long-time New Mexico reporter and editor Walt Rubel of Las Cruces.

Minority Republicans didn't get steamrolled by majority Democrats in either the New Mexico Senate or House of Representatives, as some had expected, said Rubel, who covered the 2021 session for a media consortium that included the Las Cruces Bulletin. Rubel has covered about a dozen legislative sessions since 2004.

And, despite technical problems and pandemic-generated restrictions, he said, legislators were able to conduct committee and floor sessions virtually.

Collectively, nearly 200 bills, memorials and resolutions were passed during the session.

An all-virtual session "certainly isn't conducive to free-flowing ideas," Rubel said, remembering a House committee meeting where one member participated from in a McDonald's parking lot, with his camera pointing at the dashboard of the vehicle he was sitting in.

But virtual sessions did allow state cabinet department secretaries and others to participate in more than one committee hearing at a time.

"In the old days, they put their tennis shoes on," Rubel said.

And, while a virtual session let residents participate in committee hearings without having

to travel to Santa Fe, the impact of their virtual comments "was not nearly as great as it was in a past committee room where people were reacting to what they say," Rubel said.

A lot of the work legislators have conducted in the hallways or vacant rooms of the capitol in the past probably took place by phone this year, Rubel said, although some legislators were in the Roundhouse. In general, "it just seemed liked the interactions ... the debates were a lot more difficult," he said.

That was especially true in the House, Rubel said, which placed restrictions on how many of its 70 members could be on the floor at any given time. That meant some House members participated in the session entirely by Zoom. House members also were limited to introducing no more than five bills each.

The 42-member Senate didn't have the same restrictions, Rubel said. It required members to wear facemasks and use plexiglass dividers, but it conducted regular floor sessions.

"Every committee did it differently. There just is no way to do it well," Rubel said, adding that the differences between the two chambers were "magnified because of the pandemic."

Rubel's thoughts on issues that came before the 2021 legislature include the following:

- Budget: "The budget right now is in much better shape than they an-

icipated," Rubel said. Legislators were "anticipating a huge hit to oil and gas revenue [but] 'that didn't really happen. Right now, production is pretty good, and prices are pretty good. Legislators are worried about the freeze on oil drilling on federal lands and have a lot of concern for the future.'"

Rubel said gross-receipts taxes also came in stronger than expected, in part because of taxes imposed by the legislature on Internet sales. The state also was helped by the influx of federal money to offset losses due to the pandemic.

- Education: Perhaps the biggest change to come as a result of the 2021 session, Rubel said, is the joint resolution passed by legislators that will, if approved by voters in the November 2022 election, increase the contribution to the state's early childhood education trust fund from the state's Land Grant Permanent Fund by 1.25 percent, equal to about \$211.5 million in FY23. The change also requires congressional approval.

- Liquor license reform: "This was a fascinating bill to watch," Rubel said, as legislators dealt with the state's "antiquated quota system" for liquor licenses. The bill allows communities to set up local-option districts to allow restaurants to sell beer, wine and mixed drinks. It bans the sale of mini-bottles of liquor, allows Sunday liquor sales and provides hundreds

of thousands of dollars in tax credits for existing liquor-license holders. Those license holders told legislators the changes in state law will devalue their licenses, which many have used for collateral for business loans, Rubel said, and banks could call the loans.

- Most contentious: Rubel said a bill repealing an invalid law still on the books outlawing abortion and one mandating paid sick leave were probably the most contentious bills passed during the session, with both passing on party-line votes.

Republicans tried to get a bill passed to give the legislature a role in public health orders, but it wasn't voted on by either chamber. Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham "let it be known she would veto the bill," Rubel said, and "Democrats respected that. The one bill where she really flexed her muscle, she got what she wanted."

- Bipartisanship: During the session in general, Rubel said, "I did feel like Republicans were making meaningful contributions during the committee process and were being listened to. Their amendments were being seriously considered."

One example, he said, was a bill passed late in the session to create a redistricting commission to come up with a plan to redraw congressional, legislative and state Public Education Commission district lines based on the 2020 Census.

Rubel said state Rep. Rebecca Dow, R-Grant/Hidalgo/Sierra, played a major role in getting the bill passed.

Dow "was able to work out a compromise on that bill that just seemed to lift the tension and kind of paved the way for other things to get passed," he said.

- Didn't pass: The House passed a bill to legalize the recreational use of marijuana, but it died on the Senate calendar. It was to be considered in a March

30 special session called by the governor. Also failing was a bill that would have set a new annual percentage rate for small loans. It passed both the House and Senate by significant margins but died in the final days of the session because of a lack of concurrence between the two chambers on a final version.

St. Andrew's continues Second Sunday Suppers at Camp Hope

Second Sunday Supper, started in July 2018, is a potluck-style dinner sponsored by St. Andrew's Episcopal Church at Camp Hope, the tent city at the Mesilla Valley Community of Hope (MVCH).

The idea of Second Sunday Supper is to spend time with our brothers and sisters who are experiencing homelessness. That experience can be dehumanizing and humiliating, and we offer simple companionship and human dignity as we sit down to eat a home-cooked meal together.

But the food is secondary. The primary goal is to spend time talking with people experiencing homelessness. If they

want to talk about their struggles, that's great. But if they want to talk sports or news or politics, that's great, too. We just want to spend time with them.

Before the pandemic, St. Andrew's parishioners brought tables, chairs and tablecloths to Camp Hope,

shared dinner and conversation with people at the camp and then packed it all up to prepare for the next month. Basically, it was a pop-up potluck.

The last potluck Second Sunday Supper was March 2020, just before social distancing became the

norm. Since then, St. Andrew's has partnered with Luchador Food Truck to provide 70 boxed meals with a soda.

Ivan Saenz, owner of Luchador Food Truck, was a natural collaborator for this project, as he also has a heart for people experiencing homelessness. He occasionally parked his truck before the pandemic at the Community of Hope and provided free food for the people there.

This partnership has been a win/win/win, as St. Andrew's has been able to continue this ministry, Luchador has had a bit more income during the pandemic and people experiencing homelessness enjoy Luchador's culinary creations.

"One of the great things about Second Sunday Supper is how great our car smells when we have it loaded up with Luchador meals," St. Andrew's volunteer Neal McMillan

said.

Meals are delivered to people living at Camp Hope, as well as others living or sitting on or near the premises. Face-masks have accompanied the meals every month, as have special gifts at Christmas and Easter.

St. Andrew's plans to continue to bring Luchador boxed meals to people at Camp Hope through the pandemic. However, parishioners are looking forward to the day when they get to have a traditional potluck with home-cooked meals, tables, chairs and tablecloths.

Burrell doctors learn where they will practice; 15 stay in Las Cruces, El Paso, Albuquerque

It was Match Day March 19 at Burrell College of Osteopathic Medicine (BCOM), as 136 physicians discovered where they will first practice medicine and continue their medical educations after graduation.

Match Day is special," said BCOM Dean Bill Pieratt. "It not only marks the hard work and accomplishments that got our students to this point, but it also provides a clearer picture of the future and the next step of the journey to becoming a practicing physician."

The Class of 2021 submit applications to residency programs across the nation. Matches included numerous respected matches, such as urology at University of Texas Health Science Center in San Antonio, emergency

medicine at St. Barnabas Hospital in New York City, orthopedic surgery at University of Washington Affiliated Hospitals in

Seattle, neurology at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston and internal medicine/pediatrics at Louisiana State University

About one third, 43 doctors, will remain in Arizona, New Mexico and

Texas, helping to alleviate the physician scarcity in the southwest United States.

Many graduates will stay and train closer to home, pursuing their residencies at Las Cruces' MountainView Regional Medical Center and Memorial Medical Center, Albuquerque's University of New Mexico Health Science Center, Gallup's Rehoboth McKinley Christian Hospital, El Paso's HCA Las Palmas Del Sol Healthcare and Paul Foster School of Medicine at Texas Tech University Health Science Center. Fifteen graduates will pursue residency training in Las Cruces, El Paso and Albuquerque.

"The exceptional outcomes of the Class of 2021 — 136 student matches and placements — are a testament to the hard work and determination of

our students, said BCOM President John Hummer. "We are extremely proud to see our students competing on the national scale, placing in residency programs across the country. We are pleased to see such a large group of students match within the states of New Mexico, Texas and Arizona, with so many of them placing in Albuquerque, Las Cruces, El Paso and Tucson."

Nine graduating physicians will pursue neurology, 13 will practice emergency medicine and 34 will train in family medicine.

BCOM graduates also will pursue residencies in anesthesiology, general surgery, internal medicine, pediatrics, obstetrics and gynecology, pathology, physical medicine/rehabilitation and psychiatry.

La Casa celebrates 40 years

When Henry Brutus, executive director for La Casa Inc., saw the position advertised two and a half years ago, he said he really didn't know much about domestic violence.

But upon jumping in with both feet, Brutus took a good look at the 40-year-old organization, learned a lot about

domestic violence and started thinking about changes. Coming from a healthcare administration position, he was able to see some direction for positive changes at La Casa.

Brutus said it's a calling for those who work there.

Founded in 1981, La Casa is the largest domestic violence agency and has the most comprehensive emergency shelter

and youth program in the state. It provides transitional housing, legal and immigration advocate services and a batterer's intervention program for abusers.

In addition to providing shelter, La Casa offers a non-residential program, events and outreach, and has an office in Anthony that can do everything except for emergency shelter. Clients don't have

to be in the shelter to take part in the programs, which include support groups, parenting classes and one-on-one time with case managers.

In 2019, La Casa helped 472 survivors, 272 of whom were children with 222 of those children being 11 or younger.

With the pandemic, Brutus said, the need has

When Walter Smith got out of prison about six years ago, he was without a job or a home in east Texas. He had heard about "a tent city in Las Cruces, New Mexico, that sounds like it might be right down my alley," he said.

So, Smith walked and hitchhiked more than 600 miles from Austin to Las Cruces over the next four days and arrived at Mesilla Valley Community of Hope's (MVCH) Camp Hope Tent City.

The camp was full when he arrived, so Smith bought camping equipment with his military pension money – Smith served six years in the United States Army – and set up his own small camp outside the tent city, where he lived for three months until Camp Hope had a spot for him.

Then, about five years ago, Smith was placed in one of MVCH's group homes in Las Cruces, called Abode, for people struggling with homelessness who also have disabilities. He's lived there ever since.

Smith, who turned 69 in March, estimates he's spent about 35 years of his

adult life in prison, serving time for kidnapping, counterfeiting, armed robbery and aggravated assault with a deadly weapon – "bad, bad stuff," Smith said.

His last stretch in prison, five years at Texas State Penitentiary at Huntsville, "convinced me to go straight," Smith said.

"I am a firm believer in karma. The old saying, 'What goes around comes around,' has a lot of meaning for me," he said. "You can't atone for anything, but you can pass on the lessons you've learned."

Smith has been coun-

seling others since he arrived in Las Cruces, to help them avoid making the same mistakes he made, and he's spoken at a number of MVCH fundraising events.

"He's really good with the young ones," said Abode Housing Case Manager Cassandra Calway. "He's kind of like the godfather out there (he often sits on the back porch at Adobe). The guys have a lot of respect for him."

That respect is hard for Smith to accept "because of his past," Calway said. "He doesn't think he deserves it. I think they listen more to him than they do to me."

There are 15 men, ranging in age from 27-69, in the two Abode houses that stand side by side.

Smith has donated hundreds of dollars to Toys for Tots, to buy clothes and food for local migrant families and to help Camp Hope residents.

"I try to make my actions now mean something," he said. "They tell me I'm a good person now. I see myself as a being a very bad man."

His military service was "the good part of my life that I didn't screw up," Smith said. He enlisted at 17 and served at a number of installations in the U.S., becoming a medic. Each year, "I celebrate Veterans Day on my own," he said, attending local standdown events.

Smith suffers from neuropathy in his feet and lipedema. He uses a walker.

"Other than those two things, I'm pretty healthy," he said. "I get around just fine."

Smith spends part of most days playing casino games on his i-Pad, watching movies and reading his family Bible.

"I take a lot of guidance from the Bible," Smith said.

His favorite quote is John 3:16: "For God so

loved the world that He gave his only begotten Son that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life."

Smith said he has five sisters and one brother in different parts of the country.

"They all love me to death," he said. But Smith values his independence and is happy to remain in Las Cruces.

Smith was married briefly more than 50 years ago. He hasn't seen his wife since they separated and isn't sure a divorce has ever been finalized.

"No progeny at all, that's one of my main regrets," Smith said. "I wish I had somebody to leave my Bible to."

"This is a very good town," Smith said. The city, he said, "could do a little more for the homeless people, but other than that, this is a good town."

A lot of progress has been made at Camp Hope, he said.

"As far as helping the homeless, they do a good job," Smith said.

Born in Kerrville, Texas, and raised in Clarksville, Arkansas, Smith began traveling around the country when he was a teenager, visiting every state except Hawaii.

increased.

"The fear of the unknown is adding to domestic violence and probably child abuse," he said.

While the pandemic has been challenging,

Brutus said La Casa has not stopped any services throughout the year.

"We are still here 24-7," he said. "If anything, we're providing more services. Before the pandemic, we were at a staff of 30, and now we have 45 and still have vacancies."

The community is gen-

erous, he said. Not only is communication on the organization's team important, but external communication, as well. With 80 percent of its income grant-funded, external communication and funder relationships are paramount, he said.

CAV Gallery in downtown Las Cruces: pushing forward with hope, joy, beauty, love

Marcus Xavier Chormicle is both an artist and an entrepreneur.

At 23, the Las Cruces native is a talented, experienced photographer and digital marketing specialist. He's also converting a downtown property into a gallery space — the Cristian Anthony Vallejo Memorial Gallery (CAV) — for his work and that of other local artists.

Chormicle graduated from Las Cruces High School in 2016 and earned a journalism degree from Arizona State University, with minors in digital marketing and studio art. He returned to Las Cruces in March 2020, and opened his studio two months later in an upstairs office space at 128 S. Main St.

Downstairs in the same block, he is clearing out an old furniture-store storage space that will be converted into CAV Gallery.

The gallery will include Chormicle's photography, as well as curated shows and exhibitions featuring local and regional artists, reflecting a diversity of media, he said. It also will be a retail space for fashion and skateboard supplies.

Since moving back to Las Cruces, Chormicle has done photographic, social media and graphic design work for a wide range of clients, including Josephina's Old Gate res-



taurant, Ice Box Brewery and Organ Mountain Outfitters. He also completed a University Art Museum internship.

Chormicle said he likes digital photography and prefers to shoot in color, "making the most of the moment." He said each photo he takes "feels very real" and allows him to share the moment and the space with both his subject and his audience.

A photographer "can't help being a participant and a witness" to everything he shoots, Chormicle said. "It's so powerful. I can make very specific choices of what I want to see in the frame," he said.

Chormicle said he makes specific choices when deciding which of the many photos he's taken of a single subject to print, frame and display. At that point, he considers it art.

"It's the most powerful thing I have the potential to make," Chormicle said.

"I try to involve everybody I'm around, the people I admire and love."

He said he often takes photos of his parents, his brother, uncles, aunts, cousins and grandparents.

Chormicle also has captured people and places "worthy of attention" in his travels outside Las Cruces.

"The entire world has many interesting moments happening," he said. "How many great photos are happening now? No moment is mundane, if you have the skill and the knowhow [to capture] anything you see with the click of a button. I think there's a lot of magic that happens in photography."

The gallery name, CAV, commemorates Cristian Anthony Vallejo, a beloved cousin who Chormicle and his family lost last September.

Chormicle said the death of his cousin "was just unbelievable. I felt like

there was no other option than to dedicate [the gallery] to him. Nothing can ever make up for the loss," Chormicle said, adding that his goal is to "push forward with hope, joy, beauty and love."

"It's a space for family first," Chormicle said, which includes his own and the community he lives in and loves.

"It's very exciting to me," he said, especially be-

cause it will be "a presence in my neighborhood."

Chormicle doesn't have a specific date for the gallery opening, but he hopes it will be late spring or early summer.

"I'm looking the opportunity in the eye," he said. "I want to live up to the potential."

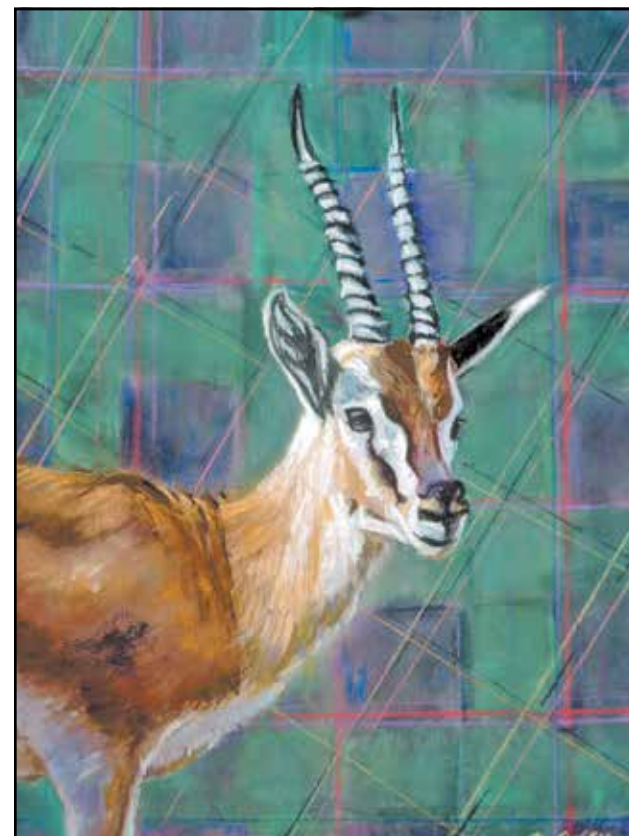

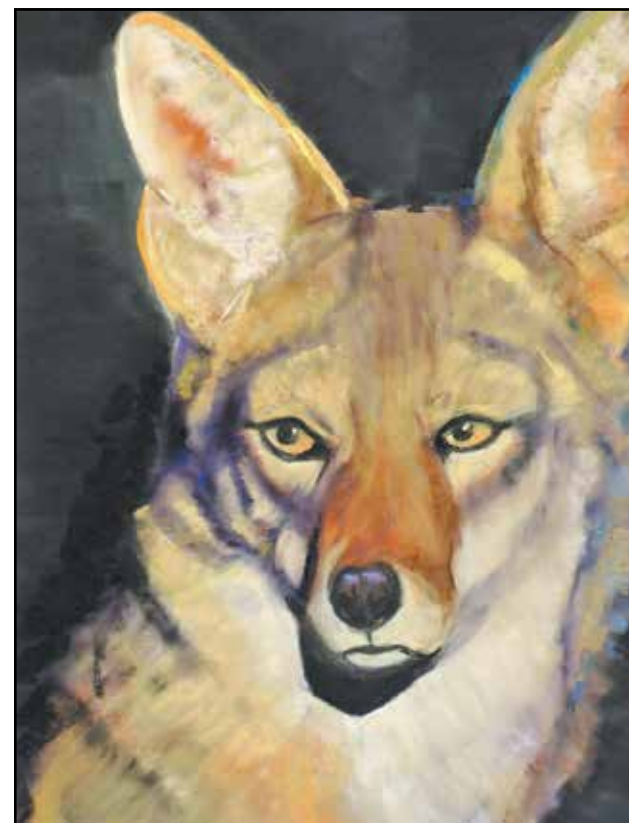

'Walking With Herb' hits the big screen

Joe Amable-Amo is a bank executive and former amateur golfer struggling with his faith after an unexpected tragedy. Faced with doubts about himself, his purpose and his belief in God, Joe is stunned when God tells him that he's been chosen to inspire the world and play in a world championship golf tournament. Guided by God's eccentric personal messenger, Herb, Joe learns that the seemingly impossible is possible through faith, family and second chances.

"Walking With Herb" was completed in December 2019 with its first major screening planned in Los Angeles in March 2020.

Las Cruces-based director Ross Marks and other cast and crew members were on their way, flying in from across the country. The studio said no at the very last moment, because the pandemic had begun. "Walking With Herb," was stopped in its tracks.

"We were really scrambling to figure out how to release during a pandemic," Marks said. "I believe movies are made to be watched as a big-screen experience."

The distributors have a plan, and the movie will hit big screens in April. In a time when only about half of the 40,000 movie screens in the United States are open, "Walking With Herb" will open in 1,000 to 2,000 theaters across the nation.

In Las Cruces, Allen Theaters will open the Telshor drive-in for two weeks to open the film on its release date, April 30. A special Las Cruces premiere will take place April 29 with a dine-in fundraiser for a local charity.

It will also be available in El Paso theaters.

Marks said he always wanted to make a faith-based movie. Marks' friend, Las Cruces banker Joe Bullock, wrote the book, "Walking With Herb" and Marks was inspired.

"This one all starts with the material," Marks said. "I wrote a screen-

play. Then, like everything I've done in past 33 years, I showed it to Mark Medoff."

Tony Award winning playwright and agnostic Medoff read the screenplay and thought the idea was great, Marks said. Medoff then took over the writing and, after several drafts, the two felt they had something to show.

"We really wanted to make the movie a celebration of Las Cruces," Marks said.

They changed the lead character to a Latino male, and thought, "Who is the best Latin actor in their 70s?" and the name Edward James Olmos

came up. Marks knew Olmos and sent him the script. He loved it and said yes.

Then they thought, "How would God's messenger appear to a Latino, and who is the perfect comedic Latino actor?," so they sent the script to George Lopez, and he said yes.

"This never happens," Marks said. "The first one never says 'yes.' Both our first choices said 'yes.'"

With Bullock's help, Medoff and Marks found local investors and created the movie as a "real Las Cruces project," he said. Actress Kathleen Quinlan rounds out the

cast.

"This is exactly the type of movie people need," Marks said. "We had 250,000 views on the trailer with comments like, 'I need something uplifting in my life right now.' It's a feel good, upbeat, inspirational story."

The film is dedicated to Medoff, who died April 23, 2019, without seeing the final product.

Marks said when they started making the film, he had recently come out of a dark place in his life. Having made a dark film about three guys in jail, he wanted to go in the opposite direction.

"I wanted something

good and positive," he said. "This one earned a PG rating. It's really a tremendous family film. I wanted to make a movie parallel to my experience from darkness to light. This was very cathartic and therapeutic."

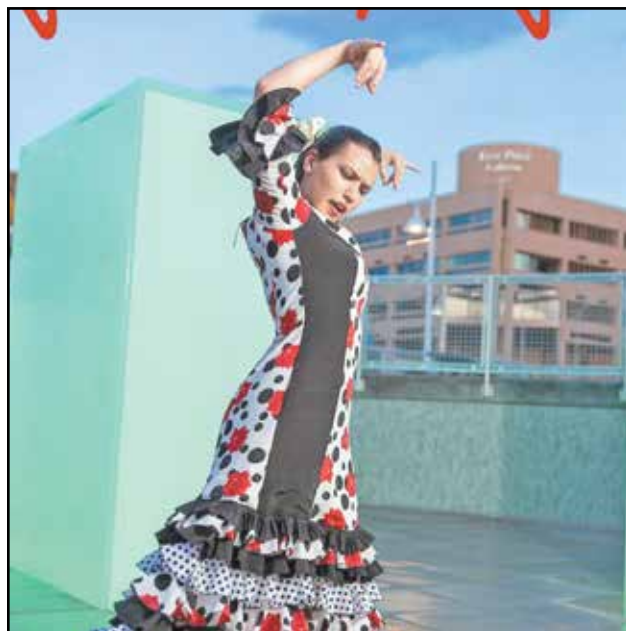

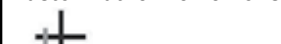

Look in the mirror. Who are you, really?

I joined with members of Temple Beth-El in recent weeks to discuss how various Star Trek series teach about values that find expression in Jewish tradition.

In our second session, we focused on one episode from the second season of "The Original Series" in the 1960s. It was titled "Mirror, Mirror."

The storyline thrust several familiar cast members into a parallel universe, where cruelty and competition (often to the death) were the hallmark of life on their ship, also called the Enterprise.

The ruthless counterparts of the four crew members, due to the same

unexpected phenomenon, appeared on the Enterprise in the "regular" universe. The first officer, Mr. Spock, was fascinated (and saddened) by their extreme behavior, which, he believed, indicated the evil tendencies that reside in the human psyche

(which we do our best to suppress). The counterparts were detained until their return "home."

In our session, we discussed why the writers might have set up a parallel universe where morality was turned on its head. In terms of creating science fiction, such a choice was not necessary.

We concluded that the

intention was to demonstrate that human beings have the capacity for making a wide range of choices, some based on compassion and cooperation, some not so much.

There is a teaching of the Jewish sage Hillel that declares, "In a place where there is no decent human being, strive to be a decent human being."

In that spirit, the "regular" crew members caught in a hostile environment found a way to act upon their sense of ethics and duty. That included providing the "regular" Captain Kirk with an opportunity to encourage the "mirror" Spock to rise to a higher standard of behavior and resist the cruelty around him, allowing the logic of his upbringing

to guide him.

The Jewish holiday of Passover, which began on the evening of Saturday, March 27, focuses on retelling a story of standing up for decency amid a sea of human cruelty.

On the first two nights of Passover, Jews participated in a ritual (and meal) called a Seder (which means order). A book called the Haggadah (which means "telling") brings together the prayers and text that retells the story, enabling participants to relive the Israelite experience of moving from slavery to freedom.

The narrative in the book of Exodus casts Moses and his brother, Aaron, as the Israelite leaders who stood before

Pharaoh to demand an end to the bondage of their people (with extensive divine support).

Almost nothing convinced Pharaoh to grant that liberty, as he was too entrenched in the hatred that had taken over his entire being. He was unable to see other people as human. He refused to recognize their pain and suffering.

There is a site in Montgomery, Alabama, which commemorates the deaths of several thousand African-American victims of lynching and racial violence from 1877 to 1959. It is called the National Memorial for Peace and Justice, and it sits near a location where enslaved African Americans were once sold.

Bryan Stevenson's Equal Justice Initiative created the memorial, hoping that it would move all people, going forward, to be their best selves, and to nurture genuine respect and fairness in society.

After witnessing recent violent attacks and senseless murders in Atlanta and Boulder, we are called upon, more than ever, to stand up for decency and engender hope.

That is the mission before us. Mirror, mirror.

Seeking Harmony

Of sheep, psalms and consolation

The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want. He makes me to lie down in green pastures; He leads me beside the still waters. He restores my soul; He leads me in the paths of righteousness For His name's sake. Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil; For You are with me; Your rod and Your staff, they comfort me. You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; You anoint

my head with oil; My cup runneth over. Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me All the days of my life; And I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever.

This psalm is one that everyone who ever memorized scripture knows. It may be the most popular psalm in the Bible, and with good reason. I cite

the King James version because that's the one many of us grew up with and memorized.

The image of God as shepherd who cares for the sheep spills over into other portions of both the Hebrew Bible (Ezekiel 34, Micah 7, Isaiah 40, Psalms 28, 78, 80) and in the New Testament John 10, Hebrews 13:20, I Peter 2.

For an agrarian society, this was an image of care, concern and close attention, since sheep could not be left to forage on their own. Often the image is used of a king like David, or a leader like Moses.

The imagery in the Psalm speaks of God as the One who protects us, like sheep, in every sort of danger. The rod is used to correct us when we stray and the staff is used to lead us

and comfort us; together they help us find the way through danger.

The imagery abruptly shifts to a banquet, where the host anoints the guests and offers more wine than they need. The "rational sheep" (the rite for chrismation in the Orthodox Church uses this term for converts into the community) has found her home in the "house of the Lord" (no doubt referring to the Temple of Solomon), surrounded by

goodness and mercy.

How I need mercy. Today and always. I am grateful being one of the sheep. This Psalm may offer consolation for those struggling in the time of coronavirus.

Humane Society receives grants, shares one with SNAP

The Doña Ana County Humane Society (DACHS) has received two grants — one shared with another local organization — to expand its service to pets and pet owners.

PetSmart grant

With a \$40,000 grant from PetSmart Charities, the Spay Neuter Action Program (SNAP) DACHS are collaborating to support pets and pet parents in need of services through the Animal Relief Fund and spay/neuter vouchers,



DACHS said in its spring newsletter.

"Pets are family, and we know in times of uncertainty, pet parents will do whatever they can to care for their beloved pets," said Kelly Balthazor, community grants manager at PetSmart Charities. "We're

thrilled to support this work to make affordable veterinary care accessible to the Doña Ana County community. Whether for emergency care, spaying and neutering services or preventive care to avoid costly treatment, these two programs working in tandem will ensure pets in need receive essential care."

Pets for the Elderly Foundation

The Pets for the Elderly Foundation (PFE) is continuing its funding of DACHS' Pets for Seniors

program with a \$4,000 grant.

"With the tremendous need for veterinary assistance for low-income families, PFE expanded its reach and offered participating organizations the opportunity to apply for grant funding that would specifically assist senior pet owners age 60+ with veterinary care assistance," the newsletter said.

The \$4,000 can be used over the next six months to provide Animal Relief Fund veterinary assistance vouchers to under-resourced senior citizens

in Doña Ana County.

"We are proud to continue our partnership with DACHS," said Pets for the Elderly Foundation Executive Director Susan Kurowski. "They have been a model participant in our program for many years, so we could not be more pleased that they will be one of the first to utilize our enhanced program for veterinary needs for senior citizens. We look forward to seeing the results of their work within the community, using the PFE program."

The Pets for Seniors program helps seniors find companionship and helps shelter pets become adopted. The Pets for Seniors

program covers \$25 of all adoption costs, up to \$2,000 per year, the DACHS newsletter said.

\$64,000 in assistance provided in 2020

In 2020, DACHS managed to provide more than \$64,000 in assistance through its Animal Relief Fund through vouchers for medications, vaccinations and veterinary care to pets in need. DACHS' Ruff to Ready program trainer Hope Movsesian assisted owners of recently adopted shelter dogs with socially distanced and remote training sessions in 2020 to help the dogs adjust to their new homes, the DACHS newsletter said.

One of my all-time favorite business books is "The Ten Commandments for Business Failure," by former Coca Cola President Donald R. Keough. Rumor has it Keough was asked to write about keys to success, but he said to his publisher, "Can't do it. But I can tell how you can surely fail."

His advice was spiked by "quit taking risks" and "keep doing what has worked for now."

I thought that type of complacency would practically guarantee failing at golf, so I created Golf Doctor's Ten Commandments

for How to Fail at Golf.

In my view, failing equates to an overwhelming combination of consistently poor performance, unsatisfying results, gross inadequacy and scarcity of any true mastery of the game. But apply your own private logic to failure.

1. Remain mindlessly unaware of your gross swing flaws, not noticing how better golfers swing the club and manage to strike the ball solidly and consistently, ignoring the thousands of books, articles and videos analyzing

the golf swing.

2. Never practice your short game — chipping and putting — which is where most of your strokes are accounted for.

3. When you do go to the range, cluelessly keep flailing away, and eventually like the proverbial monkey with a typewriter, you'll get the ball airborne.

4. Embrace paranoia. Maintain a golfing attitude that is characterized by persistent negativity, pessimism, defeatism with the sense that nothing will go your way.

5. Cheat. Do this by believing that the rules of golf are for losers, meant to be broken. I know some

golfers who follow the football, baseball and hockey mindset, where it doesn't become a foul unless you're caught at it.

6. Staunchly avoid lessons. Stupidly thinking that you don't need or can't afford golf lessons may let you save some cash, but it'll leave you struggling and failing without any comprehension of the fundamentals of the golf swing or the game itself.

7. Don't even look like a golfer, clad in cutoff blue jeans, faded t-shirt and sandals. And continue to delude yourself that you are clever and cagy with those fake knockoff clubs.

8. Accept the fact that you have been playing golf for many years and have not gotten one bit better in all that time. Remain satisfied by failure and mediocrity, while staying unwilling to make any significant change with your golf swing, your thinking or your game. Habit may be comfortable, but it ain't successful.

9. Remain dependent on your bloated handicap. You probably haven't improved your game, because you insist on maintaining your artificially inflated handicap, so you don't lose face or money when playing with equally inept cronies who also masquerade as

"golfers."

10. Continue to be a choke artist. Get nervous, stewing over nothing but the implications and disappointment of missing a putt, along with possibly having to face the savage needling of your buddies.

And while clenching your putter with a death grip, jerk your head up quickly, before even finishing the stroke, to look anxiously, only to see your ball slide well past the hole.
