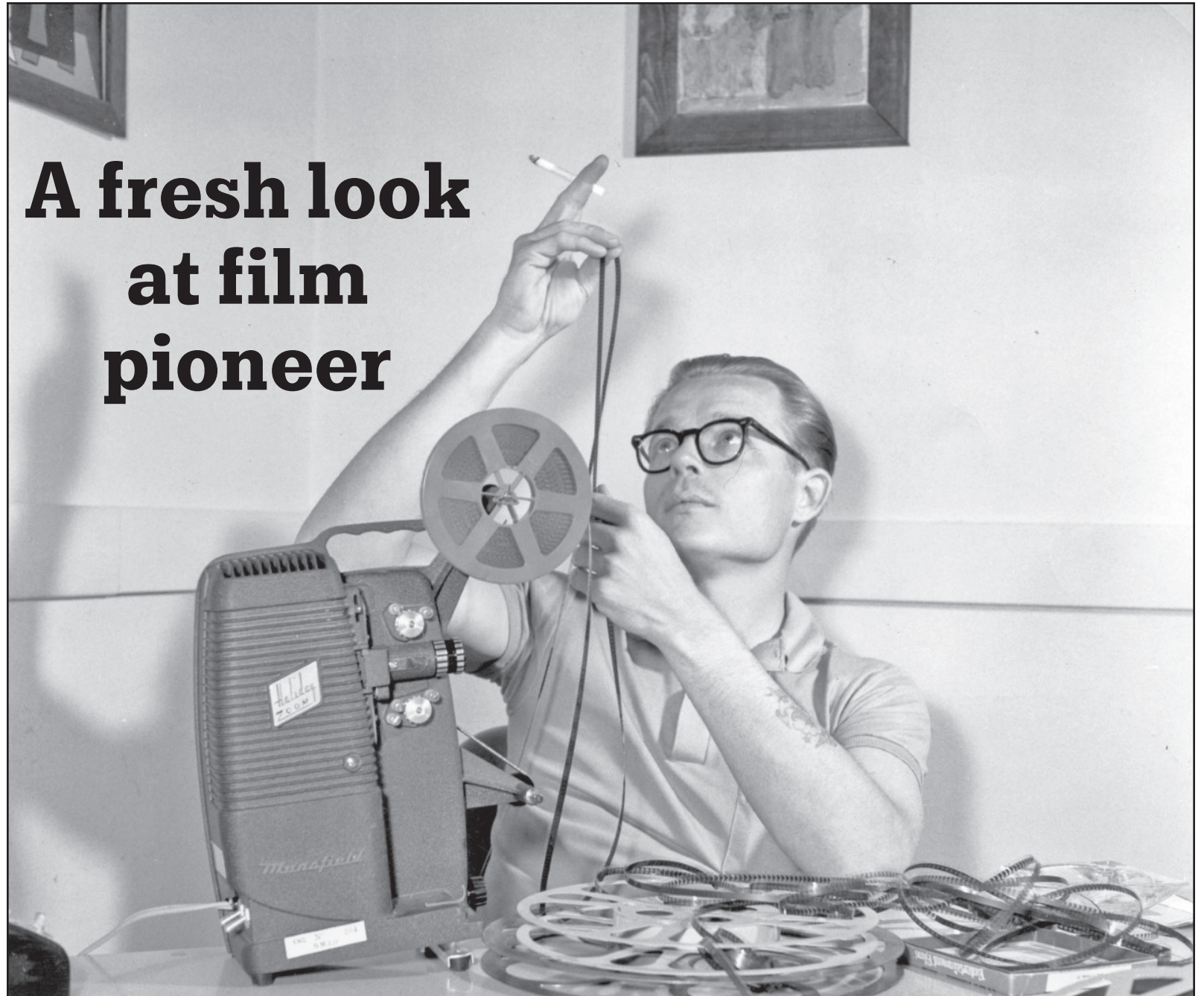

Board of education member leads move to rename admin building for late superintendent

The “caring personality, personal high standards and work ethic, and a collaborative leadership style set the tone and course for our district during times of crises when we needed these most in a leader,” Las Cruces Public Schools Board of Education Secretary Teresa Tenorio said about the late LCPS Superintendent Karen Trujillo, Ph.D.

On March 4, one week after the traffic accident that took Trujillo’s life near her Las Cruces home, Tenorio asked the

board and Interim Superintendent Ralph Ramos to consider renaming the LCPS administration building at 505 S. Main St. in Trujillo’s honor.

On March 16, Ramos appointed a committee to consider renaming the administration building as provided for in an LCPS regulation. The committee conducted a survey

that ended April 28 to gather public input on the proposal.

If the committee makes the recommendation to the board to rename the

building and the board approves it, Tenorio said a “COVID-safe outdoor naming ceremony will be an uplifting and healing event for those who

worked closest with Karen, who befriended her and who continued their crucial work for the district through their grief and in challeng-

ing times as we fully reopened schools.”

“Dr. Trujillo was one of the best superinten-

dents I have ever known, and it was an honor to work with her," said LCPS Board member Maria Flores, the longest-serving member of the current board. "She gave her heart and soul to the students of LCPS and she deserves this honor. Her memory is seared in the history of LCPS, and

it is only fitting that this building be named after her."

"I think that's wonderful," state Sen. Bill Soules, D-Doña Ana, said about the renaming proposal. Trujillo "brought some stability back to the district," said Soules, who is chair of the New Mexico Senate Education Committee.

Trujillo, he said, "led us out of some dark times (and) she always did it

with a smile and a positive outlook."

Tenorio, who was elected to the board in November 2019, said she "was approached by constituents — and also noticed discussion on social media — about a community desire to honor (Trujillo's) legacy by naming (an LCPS) building after her. While some people expressed interest in renaming a high school, I thought it should be the administrative building complex aka 'central office,'" Tenorio said.

The administration building was the best choice, she said, because it is "where LCPS district decisions are made and where our district leaders work. It is my intent that every superintendent and board member going forward will walk under her name and be reminded of whose influence and leadership we hold as the gold standard for the district."

It will also be "significantly less costly" to rename the administration building than an LCPS high school in honor of Trujillo, as some have suggested, Tenorio said.

She said her "biggest why" in suggesting the building be renamed is that "Dr. Trujillo agreed to lead our district in a time of discord and dis-

trust."

"In the time we had her, she worked tirelessly to build and maintain team morale from her employees and grow trust from the community," Tenorio continued. "It took her time, communication, and earnestness. She spent the time and energy needed to build relationships with stakeholders, including myself, because she understood the importance. She handled obstacles with a can-do attitude, with focus, and with grace. At the core of her motivation was service to our children and educators, which came from a source of great love. She never wavered or buckled under pressure, despite the enormity of the 'unprecedented' events of a cyberware attack and a deadly pandemic, with which we are still contending.

"Dr. Trujillo was a great and humble leader," Tenorio added. "It is her humility that assures me that naming the administrative complex after her is the right choice. Perhaps it will be vocalized less often than it would as a school name, but it will also be spared association with rivalries between the schools. It is her greatness that continues to make a lasting

impression. She inspired those around her as well as those who only heard of her. As the face of the district, she made herself readily available for interviews from the media and from elementary school children alike. She learned quickly from and took the heat for any missteps or misunderstandings and gave credit for successes to her team, the board, school leaders, students and community partners. My grief has healed with gratitude for what Dr. Trujillo accomplished in her time on this Earth and with us, but it still aches to recall when I envisioned her potential as our superintendent for several years to come. Dr. Trujillo wasn't perfect but she perfectly exemplified the values she extolled in her Mondays Matter letters to the district. A quote of hers that I keep on my phone: 'Remember to have grace for yourself and always go above and beyond everyday...for each other. In service to the children and educators of Las Cruces.'"

Trujillo scholarship

Trujillo received bachelor's and master's degrees

in mathematics education from NMSU, and in 1997 she received her doctorate in secondary education, mathematics, curriculum and instruction, also at NMSU.

Trujillo's career in education

Trujillo, who was 50 at the time of her death, started her teaching career in Las Cruces in 1993. After teaching math at Las Cruces High School for two years, she taught at Cobre High School in Silver City and worked in New Mexico's Bootheel with Western New Mexico University. In 2000, she moved with her family to Truth or Consequences to teach math at Hot Springs High School and work with Mathematically Connected Communities (MC2). In 2004, she returned to Las Cruces to serve as an administrator at Las Cruces Catholic School. In addition, she taught at Alma d'Arte Charter High School, and 2010-18, she worked at NMSU in various capacities, teaching classes, writing grants and conducting research. During that time, she started Educators Rising NM and the Southwest Outreach Academic Research Lab and served as the interim dean for research.

Trujillo was appointed LCPS interim superintendent in September 2019. The board of education made the appointment permanent in February 2020.

Before becoming superintendent, Trujillo served as secretary of the New Mexico Public Education Department and briefly represented District 5 on the Doña Ana County Board of County Commissioners.

Zia Natural Gas Co. asks for emergency rate increase to offset winter storm

The Zia Natural Gas Company has applied to the New Mexico Public Regulation Commission (NMPRC) for an emergency authorization to increase its rates after May 1.

Zia says it is paying for a spike in natural gas prices — “an extreme pricing event” — resulting from the winter storm and freeze that hit Texas and the Southwest in mid-February.

Under the proposed rate increase, Zia customers in Doña Ana County – estimated at about 13,300 – would pay 24 percent more a month – from an average gas bill of \$39.62 to \$48.94, according to estimates provided by the company to the Las Cruces Bulletin.

The cost of purchasing and transporting gas to Zia’s system is passed directly on to the consumer under what is called the Gas Cost Factor.

Because of the winter storm, Zia says the cost of transporting gas to customers in Doña Ana County increased from \$0.2749/ccf to \$0.4731/ccf.

A regulated utility is not allowed to make or lose money on the cost of gas, according to a release issued by Zia.

Zia provides natural gas to about 40,000 customers throughout New Mexico. The cold February weather that hit Texas, New Mexico and the Southwest “sent temperatures plummeting and energy usage skyrocketing,” Zia said in its release.

As a result, wholesale

natural gas prices, which are unregulated, “rose astronomically,” Zia officials said in their media release.

Zia estimates it spent nearly \$19.6 million in February to purchase and transport gas to its system, including fees. Zia estimates that it pays \$1.9 million during a “normal” February. That translates to an “extraordinary” extra cost of \$17.7 million.

To put that into context, Zia spent \$10 million last year for its entire gas purchase for the year, the company said.

“Due to the major financial impact of this unprecedented price spike on the business, Zia had to immediately file for approval by the NMPRC to begin recovering the costs from customers,” the company said in its media release.

Zia is asking the NMPRC to spread the costs for that 7-day period of higher costs out over a 17-month period, instead of its normal 12 months.

Zia said it paid its gas supply bills to ensure it was continuing its ability to serve and supply its customers but has “protested the extraordinary costs and is cooperating with the New Mexico attorney general’s and the NMPRC’s investigations into the market pricing event,” the release stated.

If those investigations result in Zia getting a settlement or a refund, that amount would also be refunded back to its customers, the company said.

This gives you the ability to view and pay multiple accounts at the same time, and even review historical payment information made through UtilityHawk.

“The digital wallet is a secure tool for UtilityHawk users to save and store specific payment methods for future use, so they don’t have to enter that information again and again,” said Nicole Hawkins, Paymentus, vice president of sales and marketing. Customers can use debit and credit cards (Visa, Mastercard, Discover) and eChecks. The pay-by-phone service takes Visa, Mastercard, and Discover credit cards as well as savings and checking account information; however, it does not offer the digital wallet option.

Outpouring of support overwhelms Beck's owners

The first week of April, Arianna Parsons and Tyrell Thacker were marveling at the beautiful interior restoration progress of Willow & Blaine, their latest entrepreneurial business venture.

Located in an old, historical building, Willow & Blaine will be a restaurant, wine bar and patio garden on the 100 block of North Mesquite Street, across from Klein Park, and next door to their initial venture, Beck's Roasting House & Creamery.

The excitement and anticipation of the soon-to-open Willow & Blaine gave Parsons and Thacker, who are married with two sons, much to look forward to.

The giddy highs of the future, however, came crashing down with the lowest of lows of the present in the early morning hours of Saturday, April 24.

That's when one or more vandals smashed the windows of Beck's, entered the building and proceeded to thrash and trash everything they could,

leaving behind violent messages scrawled across furnishings.

Arriving at Beck's about 5 a.m. was Parsons' baker, Monica, who came to work to get started on the Saturday pastries. When Monica saw the devastation, she immediately called the police. Her next call was to Parsons, who drove to the shop immediately.

"Clearly, I wasn't thinking, because I put on my shirt inside out, which I didn't even realize until about 2 o'clock that afternoon," Parsons said.

"At first we didn't go in because the police weren't there," Parsons said, adding that they arrived about 40 minutes after Monica's initial call.

"The lights were on, and music was playing, and it just looked like broken windows," she said. "But when we got closer, and saw all the damage that was done, it was hard to take in.

"I just started crying," Parsons said. "It's really emotional seeing what is, essentially, your

home like that. We were terrified, but grateful no one was hurt."

Parsons and Thacker have owned Beck's for eight years, growing their business through a quality product, excellent service and relationships with customers. In June 2020, despite the pandemic, they opened a permanent location on Main Street, Beck's Express, the modified shipping container next to

Organ Mountain Outfitters.

While the vandals' interior damage was substantial, the most vital, expensive pieces of machinery were unharmed. Insurance cannot cover the loss of revenue for the days Beck's had to be closed, but spirits were buoyed by how quickly employees, friends and community members helped get the shop

Hindsight still blurry when it comes to virus

I'm scheduled to get my second COVID-19 shot Friday, meaning I'll be fully vaccinated in a couple of weeks.

The pandemic, for me, is almost over, and I'm incredibly grateful to the brilliant men and women who developed these safe and effective vaccines.

But this doesn't feel like victory.

Until March of last year, Americans saw pandemics as something that happens every few years in Africa or Asia. We were confident that our modern health care system would protect us. The notion of more than 562,000 U.S. deaths, and still growing every day, was inconceivable then.

We've been living with the mounting death toll

for more than a year now, but are no closer to having a unified strategy to defeat the virus now than

we were at the start. Even with the benefit of hindsight, there's no agreement as to what we would have done differently if we had the chance.

That's understandable, given the differing impact the pandemic has had on people's lives. The virus hit right as I was settling into retirement. It was easy for me to urge a more cautious approach because those business closures didn't hurt me financially. Other people had different circumstances.

Beyond that, there is the apparent random nature of the virus. Those urging more restrictions

like to point to New Zealand as the model for how it should have been done. An early shutdown strictly enforced has allowed them to return to normal life.

But how do they explain Texas? Cases have gone down in the Lone Star State in the weeks since Gov. Greg Abbott has lifted all restrictions there. I still think that was a bad idea, but the only way I can be proven right is for more people to get sick. So I hope I'm wrong.

Becoming fully vaccinated will allow me to more freely interact with others, but we will still be living in a pandemic until enough people get vaccinated to stop the spread.

For the next couple of months, vaccine supply will be the primary factor limiting how many people can get the shot each day.

But by the end of spring, the primary limiting factor will be fear of the unknown and distrust of the government.

Which will lead to the next big argument. We can't force people to take a vaccination against their will, but is it reasonable to restrict their access to travel and public places if they refuse?

Even after we gain control of the virus here, ultimate victory will not come until we gain control of it everywhere. And, that would still appear to be years away.

I have no doubt that for the rest of my lifetime, and likely far beyond that, those of us who lived through the pandemic will engage in heated arguments about what should have been done and who is to blame. We've all staked out our positions, and the

talking points on both sides are already well rehearsed.

That's assuming, of course, that we don't have another pandemic before we're done arguing about this one.

My hope is that those with more knowledge and responsibility are learning from past mistakes and better preparing for

the next health crisis. My fear is that only half the country will listen to them.

But that's for tomorrow. For today, there is a small, personal victory to be celebrated.

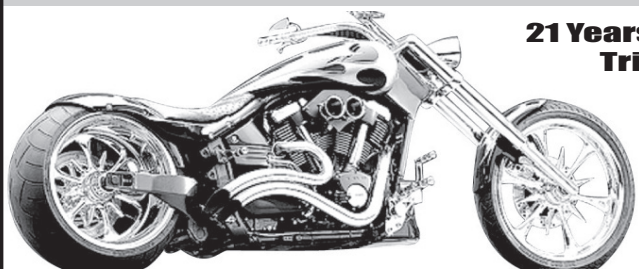

cleaned up.

"It was just an absolute mess," Parsons said. "It won't put us too far behind, but we're still assessing.

"Emotionally, we're trying to not focus on the who and the why, because that can make you crazy," Parsons said. "We're focusing on next steps, what we do, and how we compensate our 23 employees."

The one bit of levity, wrapped in wisdom, came

out of the mouth of Arianna and Tyrell's 4-year-old babe, Thomas: "Some sneaky person came in and made some really bad choices."

If those choices were a result of behavioral health problems, Parsons hopes for a sincere, supportive response from authorities.

"It's important to me, if this was someone with mental health issues, we don't just throw them into jail," she said. "They really need help."

She also doesn't want the issue to be a black eye on the Mesquite Historic

District.

"This has been such a safe neighborhood and home for so many years," she said. "This really appears to be the actions of one individual.

"The most important thing to us, has been the sense of community and outpouring of support. It really makes me emotional."

Cinco de Taco: Local writer offers up tasty recipes to celebrate May 5

Kelley Coffeen has been writing cookbooks since 1994. When she was about 15, she started making recipes on her own.

“Cooking is a joy to me, and I love giving the gift of food to others,” she said.

One of her biggest passions is Mexican and Southwestern flavors, she said. They reflect the “culture and friendship and lifestyle along the border.”

It should be no surprise that Cinco de Mayo is one of her favorite holidays and that she celebrates in style — with tacos.

The holiday is much more celebrated in the United States than in Mexico. The day celebrates the success of Mexican general Ignacio Zaragoza, who led a small Mexican army against the French in the Battle of Puebla in 1862.

“It has become not only significant in the United States to celebrate the victory, it has become a wonderful culinary celebration as well, bringing together people and sharing flavors and culture,” Coffeen said. “In this region, we have such a unique kindness and we embrace one another and I think we do that through the foods that we eat and we love.”

Coffeen said it is not unusual to celebrate for the whole week of May 5. In fact, Experience Mesilla will be doing just that for the 2021 Taco-Palooza with the Mesilla restaurants offering specialty tacos and taco specials May 1-8.

One of Coffeen’s cookbooks, “300 Best Taco Recipes,” shares those flavors and multiple combinations for the occasion, and any taco occasion. She said one of the reasons she loves Southwestern food is the endless ways it can be combined for individual tastes.

“You can’t do Cinco de Mayo without tacos,” she said. “So I would definitely say tacos, guacamole and margaritas, are probably the most popular dishes and ways to celebrate. I probably will do a carne asada taco piled high with guacamole and accompanied by a margarita.”

Coffeen said there are plenty of traditional desserts — flan, churros, tres leches cake — that can satisfactorily top off a Cinco de Mayo dinner but she will keep it simple and fresh by taking some fresh fruit, splashing it with a margarita mix and sprinkling some red chile flakes over it.

“Then you have a real after dinner delight,” she said.

Grilled Carne Asada Tacos

200 Easy Mexico Recipes (Robert Rose Publishing)

Carne Asada is an intensely flavored meat that is very popular in Mexican cooking. It is quick to marinate and easy to grill.

Makes 12 tacos

- » Barbecue grill
- » Marinade
- » Juice of 3 lemons
- » 3 cloves garlic, minced
- » 1/2 cup drained sliced pickled jalapeño peppers
- » 1/2 cup teriyaki sauce
- » 1 tbsp. minced red bell pepper
- » 1 tbsp. granulated sugar
- » 2 tsp. kosher salt
- » 1-1/2 lbs. beef skirt or minute steak
- » 12 6- to 8-inch flour or corn tortillas
- » 2 limes, each cut into 6 wedges 2

1. Marinade: In a medium bowl, combine lemon juice, garlic, jalapeños, bell pepper, teriyaki sauce, sugar and salt until sugar and salt have dissolved.
2. In a large resealable plastic bag, add marinade and meat and seal. Work marinade through meat with your fingers. Refrigerate meat for at least 2 hours or for up to 6 hours.
3. Preheat greased barbecue grill to medium. Remove meat from marinade, discarding marinade. Grill meat for 4 to 5 minutes per side for medium-rare. When meat is just barely pink inside, remove from grill. Let stand for 8 to 10 minutes. Carve meat across the grain into thin slices, then cut into bite-size pieces.
4. To build tacos, skillet warm tortillas. Divide meat equally among tortillas and top with guacamole and a favorite salsa. Fold tortillas in half. Serve with a sliced lime.

Tip: There are several different cuts of meat you can use for this recipe. Skirt steak or minute steak are best due to the thin cut and quick cooking time.

- » 1 bottle (1.75 liters) premade non-alcoholic margarita mix
- » 12 oz your favorite tequila
- » 1/3 cup grenadine
- » 4 cups cracked ice
- » 4 to 5 limes
- » Kosher/Margarita salt

In a large pitcher, combine margarita mix, tequila and grenadine. It is that simple! Chill for up to 2 hours. Just before serving, cut 2 limes into thin slices and add to the pitcher along with cracked ice. Cut remaining lime into wedges. Rub the rims of 4 to 6 highball glasses with a lime wedge and salt the rims of each glass. Fill with margarita mixture, additional ice if needed and garnish with lime wedge.

Classic Guacamole

200 Easy Mexico Recipes (Robert Rose Publishing)

This is a classic version of guacamole that is tasty and simple with onion, garlic, lime and seasonings. I serve it in tacos, on tortas and offer it with chips and salsa.

Makes approximately 2 cups

- » 5-6 avocados, mashed
- » 1 clove garlic, minced
- » 1/4 cup minced onion (optional)
- » ¼ tsp. crushed red pepper flakes (optional)
- » 2 tbsp. freshly squeezed lime juice
- » Salt to taste
- » Ground black pepper to taste

In a large bowl, gently combine avocados, garlic and onion. Add pepper flakes, lime juice and mix well. Add salt and pepper to taste. Serve immediately or transfer to an airtight container and refrigerate, stirring occasionally, for 30 minutes or for up to 2 hours.

Tips: You can mash up avocado into a creamy consistency or mash some and dice the rest the avocado for a semi-creamy/chunky-style guacamole

City council adopts changes to election code

The Las Cruces City Council unanimously adopted a number of changes to the city's election code, bringing it into closer alignment with the New Mexico Secretary of State's campaign finance guidelines. The changes are the first to be made to the city's campaign code since 2013.

The changes include:

- Adding definitions for phrases and words, including in-kind contributions, loan and treasurer;
- Changing the total amount a candidate for city office can receive from \$2,300 to \$2,800. That includes contributions from any individ-

ual, political committee or any other entity, and includes a candidate's family members;

- Eliminating raffles as campaign fundraiser. The New Mexico Gaming Control Board does not include campaigns, campaign committees or political committees as organizations eligible to conduct raffles under the state's Bingo and Raffle Act. Violations of the Bingo and Raffle Act could result in criminal charges;
- Allowing special events or fundraisers to be conducted if tickets cost \$25 or less and no more than \$1,000 in net contributions is received;
- Allowing for the voluntary return by the candidate to the contributor

of excessive or prohibited contributions;

- Establishing a \$100 limit for an individual anonymous contribution for the length of an election campaign. The previous limit was \$25;
- Mandating that, regardless of the outcome of an election, a candidate is required to continue filing campaign finance reports until his or her campaign account is closed.

The changes were proposed after a review of the code following the 2019 municipal elections determined that there was no real accountability regarding the filing of financial reports.

Also, at the April 19 meeting, the council unanimously adopted a resolu-

tion approving a contract not to exceed \$9,173,003, plus state gross receipts tax, to Jaynes Corp. of Las Cruces for construction of the Animal Services Center of the Mesilla Valley (ASCMV) New Adoption Center, which will also include the Rinconada and Burn Lake dog parks.

The project is part of the \$36.5 million general obligation (GO) bond project approved by Las Cruces voters in the all mail-in election in August 2018.

The ASCMV New Adoption Center and the Rinco-

nada Dog park will be at 3551 Bataan Memorial West. The Burn Lake Dog Park will be within Burn Lake Park, 855 Amador Ave.

The council also unanimously adopted two other items at the April 19 meeting:

- A resolution requesting a one-year extension to update public safety development impact fees while continuing their collection and expenditure under the current fee structure through June 30, 2022. The one-

year extension will enable the city to issue a request for proposals to hire a consultant to determine what changes could be recommended. Public meetings to review the fees and proposed changes could be conducted through March 2022.

- An ordinance updating the city's buildings and building regulations to reflect changes in the state's 2015 Uniform Plumbing Code and the 2015 Uniform Mechanical Code.

Waning Moon

This waning crescent moon was seen over the Organ Mountains early morning on Friday, April 9. Earlier this week, we saw April's full moon, which was a Super Pink Moon. It appeared at 9:31 p.m. Monday, April 26. A super moon appears when the moon is closest to the Earth in its elliptical orbit. There are 12 or 13 full months during a calendar year, of which three or four reach the super-moon classification. The April 26 super moon was the first in almost a year. The full moon closest to the Earth this century will be Dec. 6, 2052.

Bri Bagwell: Las Cruces native rules the country music scene in Texas

Las Cruces native, singer-songwriter Bri Bagwell has hit the big time in Texas, with her music reaching listeners throughout the Southwest.

Bagwell attended East Picacho Elementary and Picacho Middle School and graduated from Mayfield High School before graduating from the University of Texas at Austin.

In 2010, she found herself with a day job in doing marketing for a start-up health and beauty website while playing shows at night.

"That wasn't going to work," Bagwell said, deciding at the time, "I need to dive all into one or the other."

She chose a career in music, and a decade later has seven No. 1 Texas radio singles and eight Texas Regional Radio Report female vocalist of the year awards. And, earlier this year, while receiving her latest female vocalist award, Bagwell was also presented with the "Decade Award" for the most female vocalist award wins in 10 years from the radio network, which has stations in Texas, New Mexico, Colorado, Kansas and Oklahoma.)

"That was a complete surprise," Bagwell said. "They hid it from me."

Bagwell began performing in Las Cruces at age 14. She found a "dusty keyboard in my parents'

garage" and learned to play it, Bagwell said. Mom and dad Marilyn and James Bagwell later bought her an old upright church piano at auction. (Her cousin, county musician Tom "Bleu" Mortenson, sent Bagwell her first guitar when she was in college.) Bagwell also was singing in the Mayfield High School Choir, and joined her brothers, Bryan and Brandon, who are identical twins, in forming a band.

"I got the honkytonk education really early," Bagwell said.

"What I remember most and what comes to mind first, was when I started incorporating my own songs into the set, starting to play my own music for a crowd," she said. "It was the first taste of, 'This is

what I want to do.' Those songs probably weren't any good, but I did it."

Bagwell also remembers her volleyball coach at Mayfield, Michael Sautter, playing the harmonica with her band and other local bands at High Desert Brewery in Las Cruces.

"He was very musical," Bagwell said of Sautter. "It was very neat for me to have an influence that also played music."

During Bagwell's senior year, Mayfield won its first district volleyball championship in 15 years and its first state championship ever, and Bagwell was named the Gatorade and the 5A volleyball player of the year for the state of New Mexico.

As a musician and singer (she plays the guitar as well as keyboards),

Bagwell has performed with Willie Nelson, Dwight Yoakam and her personal idol, Maranda Lambert, among other country music stars.

As a songwriter, Bagwell said, "the most important thing I can do is write even when I'm uninspired." To help maintain that discipline, she is part of a songwriting group, with members writing a song every two weeks.

"That to me is a numbers game," she said. "Some of them are going to be great. You get a prompt, you just sit down by yourself and write a song."

Bagwell said she gets a lot of inspiration for her songs from social media.

She laughs, "People have to keep posting their drama on Facebook for

me to borrow for songs!"

Bagwell said a personal goal for her as one of the few female performers and recording artists with her own band is "to make things a little easier" for girls who want to follow in her footsteps.

Bri Bagwell and the Banned comprise six musicians and crew who travel together all over Texas. And, while she is grateful "to be able to make a living doing what I love," Bagwell said she is not ruling out a move to Nashville and the national market at some future point.

"I'd love to be playing

bigger stadiums and bigger things," she said. "I'll leave it open to the universe."

Like many other musical artists, Bagwell had to postpone performing and recording because of the pandemic. But, she is already performing sold-out shows again, and will soon have a new release.

NMSU instructor's grant will preserve, expand southern New Mexico film culture

Orville Wanzer is best known for his genre-bending western "The Devil's Mistress" (1965), the first feature film made in the Las Cruces area.

Arriving in New Mexico in 1959 to teach English at NMSU, Wanzer brought his robust knowledge of film culture from his hometown of Brooklyn, New York, along with his experience as a projector in the U.S. Navy and a brief stint in Hollywood before he became a professor.

Soon after he arrived in Las Cruces and inspired by the desert landscape, Wanzer set to making movies, and forming a film society sponsored by the Museum of Modern Art in Manhattan. Soon he was developing a film program for the newly formed journalism department at New Mexico College of Agriculture and Mechanic Arts, which became New Mexico State University in 1960.

By the end of the 1960s, Wanzer had established a film program that included filmmaking and film studies, and was working on his second feature length film.

Weeks before his passing in February 2019, I filmed a series of interviews with Wanzer, hav-

ing learned of his archive at NMSU and seeing his works at the Institute of Historical Survey Foundation (IHSF) in Mesilla Park.

In collaboration with these archives, along with interviews with his family, friends and former students, I discovered that Wanzer was instrumental in growing an independent film scene in southern New Mexico through various foreign-film series, special screenings and student mentoring. Over the last two years, I have been working to digitize and curate the Wanzer collections at these archives, especially his 16- and 35-mm films housed at NMSU, and his photographic slides at IHSF.

Last year, I was awarded the New Mexico Historical Records Advisory Board grant from the New Mexico History State Records Center and Archives with IHSF for my proposed "Orville Wanzer Digitization Project."

Set for completion this summer, this project is focused on digitizing Wan-

zer's photographic slides at IHSF for open access viewing, and determining the contents of a rare distribution copy of "The Devil's Mistress."

Upon completion, this grant will have increased

the Wanzer archives' accessibility to researchers and the public. This project expands the Wanzer Archive, adding to the historically rich culture of filmmaking, film study and visual arts in southern New Mexico.

A significant accomplishment of the grant has been the discovery of a rare distribution copy of "The Devil's Mistress" on a 35-mm film reel. Donated by Teddy Gregory (one of the last surviving cast members of the film), the reel had been buried in his backyard shed for the last 40 years. According to Gregory, my interest in the film inspired him to excavate this hidden treasure. This once endangered artifact

Theatre Department Head Wil Kilroy directed one of the scenes for the production.

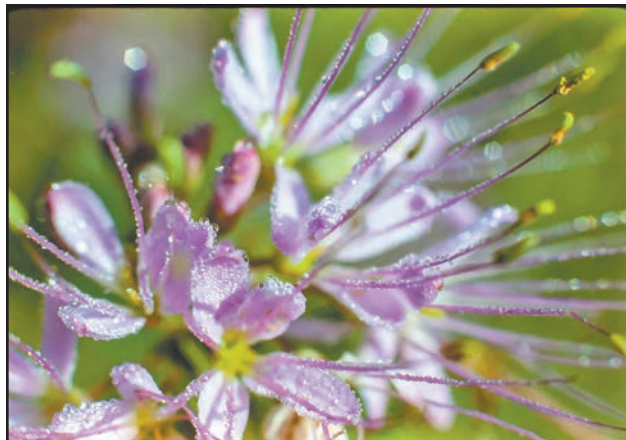

Dance company founder returns to Las Cruces to create new digital dance

Dallas' Dark Circles Contemporary Dance (DCCDUSA) is in residency in Las Cruces to create and shoot a new made-for-film dance, said company founder and artistic director Joshua L. Peugh, a native of Las Cruces.

Peugh has been commissioned to create an original made-for-film dance for DANCE NOW production company's 25th anniversary digital season, Peugh said in a news release.

"The commission is to create a work that will fit inside a space, indoors or outdoors, that is the same small size (165 square feet) as the stage at Joe's Pub at

the Public Theatre in New York, where the original live performance was to take place before COVID-19," Peugh said in the news release. "I wanted to choose a place with personal poetic resonance. What better place than my hometown, which is itself small but situated inside a

seemingly endless desert landscape. The light is magical, the mountains are spectacular and the world seems quieter. I'm constantly trying to get back home and to bring people to share it with. This commission is the perfect alibi."

The company will cre-

ate the new work while training at Michele's Dance Academy, where Peugh began dancing at age 3 with directors Michele and Kevin Self, before filming the work on location around the city.

"I'm very excited to share and celebrate the people and the place I was raised and nurtured in with my company members and collaborators," Peugh said.

The work will be danced by Erin Vonder Haar and DCCDUSA Executive Director Chadi El-Khoury. New music for the work has been commissioned from composer and Dark Circles collaborator Brandon Carson, Peugh said. Costumes have been designed and constructed by Eugenia P. Stall-

ings. Former DCCDUSA dancer Orlando Agawin will serve as director of photography and videographer.

The new work will premiere as part of DANCE NOW Chapter 6, with a performance release and watch party scheduled for 4 p.m. Thursday, May 6. An artist-to-audience celebration will be 5 p.m. Thursday, May 27.

Proceeds from ticket sales will support future artist commissions, Peugh said.

Peugh is a graduate of Southern Methodist University. He has created work for festivals in Asia, Europe and North America, winning awards for his choreography in South Korea, Japan, Canada and the United States. Peugh

was the recipient of the grand prize at the McCallum Theatre's 18th annual Choreography Festival and was chosen as one of Dance Magazine's "25 to Watch."

Peugh founded DCCDUSA in 2010 in Seoul, South Korea. The company has performed around the world.

DANCE NOW provides dancemakers with paid performance, commissioning, teaching and residency opportunities through five programs, and partners with other organizations, schools and universities to present the work of more than 50 "new, emerging, established, and veteran innovators."

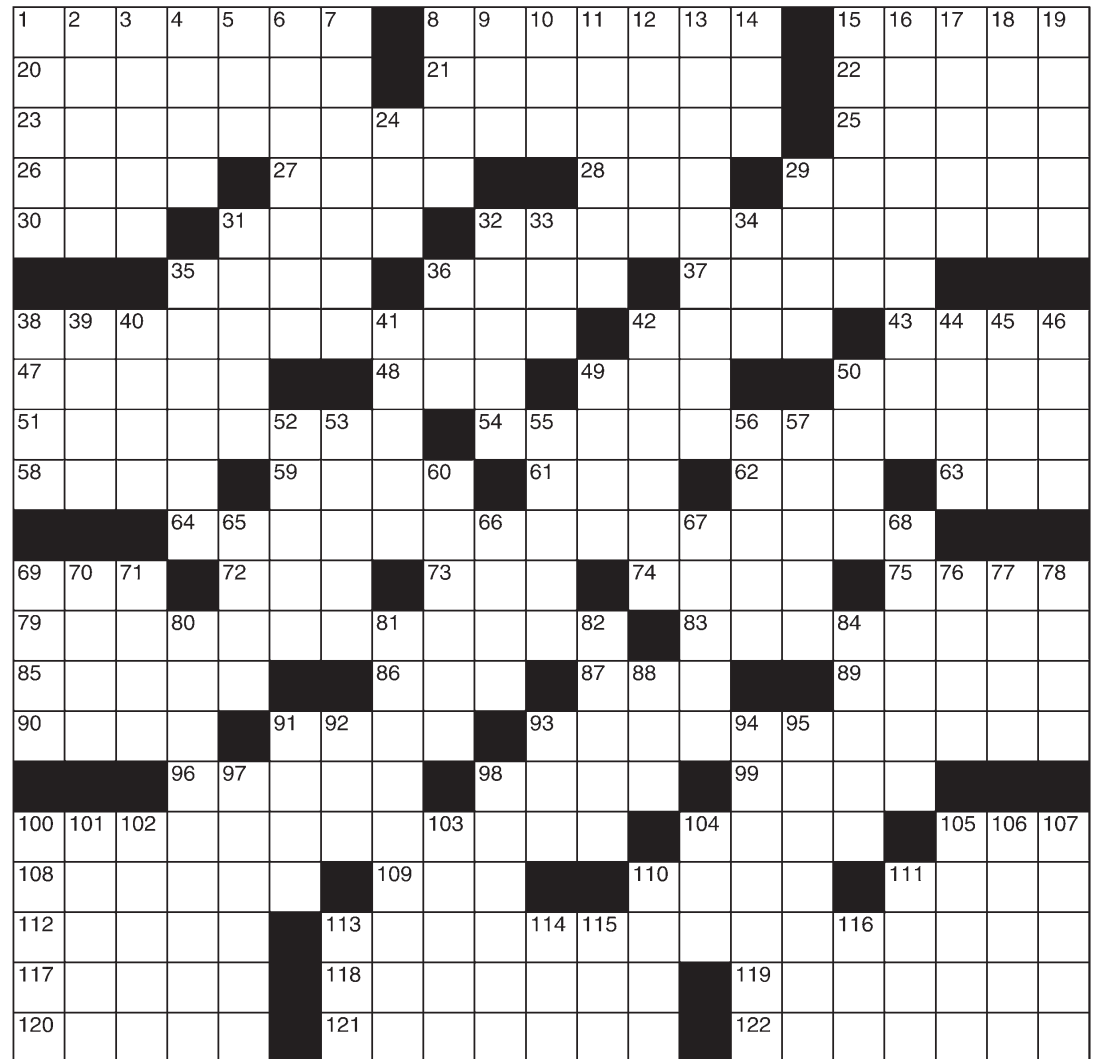

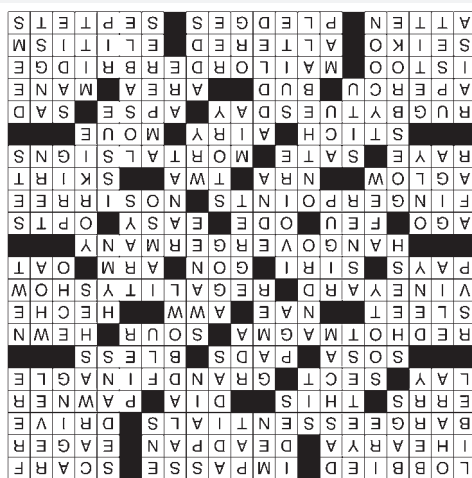

State creates outdoor recreation business directory

The New Mexico Outdoor Recreation Division (ORD) of the state Economic Development Department (EDD) has created the state's first digital outdoor recreation business directory, the agency said in an April 15 news release.

ORD's business directory is a free, comprehensive list of New Mexico's outdoor recreation businesses, nonprofits, government agencies,



educators and others across the state, the news release said. The directory is already populated by 26 outdoor recreation businesses — all members of endeavOR New Mexico,

the state's first outdoor recreation business trade alliance — and is growing fast, the news release said.

"This is an exciting next step for the state to showcase all of its diverse outdoor recreation small businesses," said state Sen. Jeff Steinborn, D-Doña Ana. "It will be a helpful tool for both

tourists and companies looking to do businesses here and with each other. I encourage all Las Cruces and Doña Ana County outdoor recreation-based companies and nonprofits to sign up."

ORD was created July 1, 2019, as NMEDD's sixth division through legislation sponsored by Steinborn and co-sponsored by state Reps. Nathan Small and Angelica Rubio, both D-Doña Ana.

"There are hundreds of thriving outdoor recreation businesses already

in New Mexico," ORD Director Axie Navas said. "Together they comprise the state's \$2.4 billion outdoor economy. We want this new, free resource to highlight these companies and make it easier for directory users to connect with guides, retailers, manufacturers, glamping outfitters, land advocates, and much more."

Navas is encouraging all businesses related to the outdoor economy to register to be included in the directory. As of April 15, the directory was still

seeking its first registered business based in southern New Mexico.

Businesses need to complete a short registration form to begin the registration process, ORD said. Once approved by ORD staff, each business will be listed live on the directory's website. It must be directly related to the outdoor recreation industry and be based in New Mexico to be included.

Hats, mint juleps and a long-shot remembered: Kentucky Derby returns to traditional weekend

In a sign that we just might be getting back to some semblance of normal, the 147th running of the Kentucky Derby will be this weekend.

It marks a return of the “most exciting two minutes in sports” to its traditional time on the first Saturday in May.

Last year, the race, which is considered the Super Bowl of horse racing, was held in September and without any spectators because of the coronavirus pandemic.

This weekend, the race will return to its rightful place in the sports universe, but not without some restrictions. Plans called for limiting spectators to about 40 or 50 percent of capacity in the reserved seating areas at Churchill Downs, or to about 25,000 to 30,000 racing fans.

Race officials say they may consider selling general admission tickets to the infield if the pandemic continues to improve.

But no matter what the final arrangements will be, it will be a big improvement over last year when the first leg of horse racing's Triple Crown was run in front of a virtually empty stadium, giving it an eerie, post-apocalyptic vibe.

According to Wallethub.com, the race lost

\$122 million in ticket revenue last year. According to the same web site, the total amount of money wagered on the race was down about 50 percent — to \$126 million — compared to the year before.

But with the return of fans, even at half capacity, that will bring out some of the color and tradition that the race is known for — the fashionable, often pricey hats worn by women racing races and the ubiquitous mint juleps, the signature cocktail of the race, among just a few.

Of course, the chance to see history is also one of the things that makes the race so special.

In nearly a century and a half, just 13 horses have won the Derby and have gone on to win the Preakness and Belmont to capture the coveted Triple Crown. The most recent were Justify in 2018 and American Pharoah in 2015.

American Pharoah, with his misspelled name, ended 37 years without a Triple Crown champion.

And who can forget perhaps the greatest upset in Derby history by a horse with huge Borderland ties.

Mine That Bird was a 50-to-1 longshot in 2009 and came out of nowhere to win the race. Mine That

Bird had raced at Sunland Park Racetrack and Casino and came in second at the Borderland Derby (now the Mine That Bird Derby) and fourth in the Sunland Derby, which has been a qualifying race for the Kentucky Derby in the past.

Unfortunately, the entire live racing season at Sunland Park was canceled this year, after seeing the last month axed

in 2020. Both moves were because of the pandemic.

You can watch the Kentucky Derby on NBC TV; comprehensive coverage begins at 12:30 p.m. Mountain time on Saturday. Post time is estimated to be at 4:57 p.m.

Settle back, break out the chips and dip and celebrate one of sports true spectacles, even if it does have some different twists because of the pandemic.

Starting early this year, things got partly back to routine, sans spectators, with Brooks Koepka winning the Waste Management Phoenix Open on schedule, and then Justin Thomas brilliantly winning the Players Championship in March.

and the entire PGA Tour staff high marks for demonstrating sensible safety precautions and bringing Tour golf back sooner rather than later.

Jordan Spieth said recently, "There was a lot of concern about whether we would be able to play golf in 2020 and beyond."

"I give a lot of props to Jay Monahan for the work he put in," Spieth added. "It's easier to see how good a leader is when you're in tough times."

Resuming regular play on all the tours truthfully sets the stage for recreational golf to blossom in popularity.

As Max Adler, editor of Golf Digest, noted last May, "As our world braces to be drastically reshaped, is it heedless to wonder what will become of golf? I don't think so. There's no reason to apologize for a game giving meaning to your life." Along with most other golf fans, I am hoping the return to normal will include full spectator attendance at events on all the tours, with or without masks.

Monahan has said

things will start to be normal when a high percentage of players have been vaccinated, but he is not requiring it.

"If golf teaches us anything, it is to be resilient and adaptable in the wake of disasters. I'm stirred to imagine how our game will contribute meaningfully to bring about the changed world that awaits," Adler so mindfully observed.
