PAID INTERNSHIP PROGRAM FOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS BEGINS

Paid, real-life job experience internships will be offered to area high school students, through Doña Ana County's Summer Enrichment Internship Program, starting June 21.

The internship program is funded by a \$1,129,661.15 grant, awarded to Doña Ana County by the New Mexico Public Education Department's College and Career Readiness Bureau. The program's goal is to provide 520 high-school students throughout Doña Ana County a unique internship opportunity that may enhance a college or job application.

"This type of career-enhancing, on-the-job training for youth is infrequently available, as state and local governments have limited financial capability to offer it," County Manager Fernando R. Macias said. "To make this program successful, and offer a variety of learning opportunities, we have partnered with area schools, other municipalities, non-profit organizations and businesses."

Gadsden Independent School District, Hatch Valley and Las Cruces Public Schools, Alma d'Arte Charter, New America and Las Montañas Charter High Schools are involved in the program.

To participate, students must be at least 16 years old, by June 21. Recent 2021 high school graduates may participate, as well.

Students will work for six weeks, up to 20 hours per week and will be paid \$10.50 per hour. They will be classified as temporary county employees and will be covered by the appropriate insurance, during work hours.

Internship placements will be with local governments, school districts, nonprofit agencies and area businesses, in close proximity to where they live.

Internships will provide students an idea about what it is like to have a career, while developing marketable soft skills that are important to employers. Soft skills, such as communication, teamwork and problem solving influence how well someone can work or interact with others, in the workplace. Students can add the internship experience to their resume and college application and build upon their academic and other accomplishments.

Each of 26 coordinators will oversee 20 students and collaborate with local employers to foster a learning and rewarding experience.

Specific details about job assignments and program information will be shared with students during program orientation.

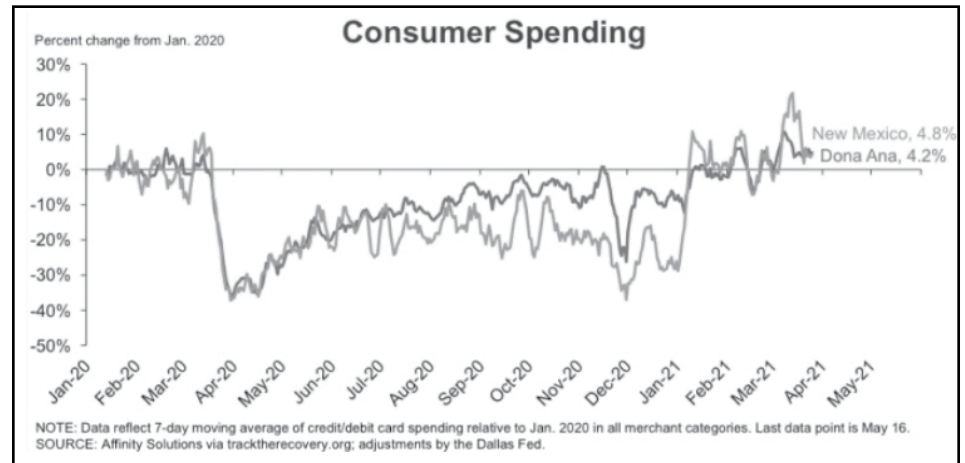
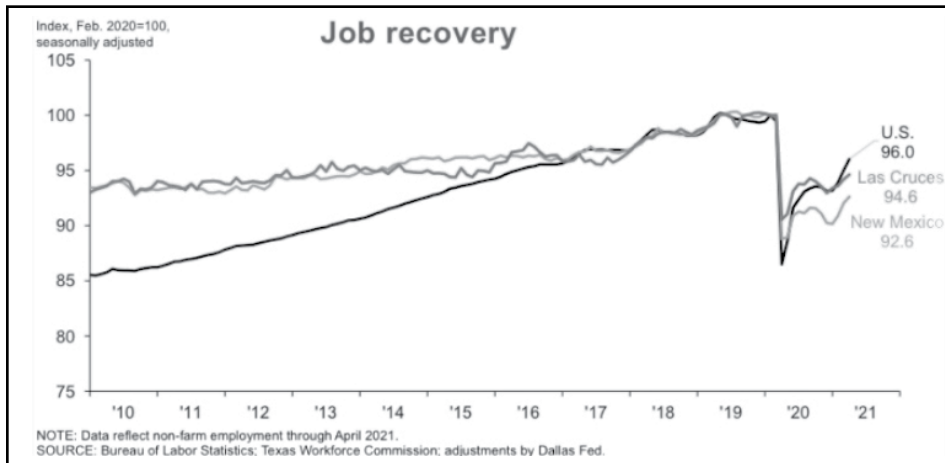

Local consumer spending shows increase, El Paso Federal Reserve official says

Consumer spending in Las Cruces is now higher than it was before the pandemic, Federal Reserve Bank of Dallas, El Paso Branch, Senior Vice President in Charge and Senior Economist Roberto A. Coronado, Ph.D., told the Mesilla Valley Economic Development Alliance’s (MVEDA) virtual forum on June 1.

Coronado said consumer spending in Las Cruces is 4.2 percent higher than it was when the pandemic began in mid-March 2020, and up 4.8 percent for the state.

He said the “substantial fiscal stimulus injected into the U.S. economy” because of the pandemic may help keep consumer spending up.

The figures Coronado presented in his update on the Las Cruces economy and his predictions for its future — what MVEDA President and CEO Davin Lopez called “the crystal ball ... for the economy of southern New Mexico” — were a mixed bag of good and not-so-good, hopeful and uncertain.

Coronado said Covid-

19 has been the region’s number one economic indicator for the past 14 months.

The pandemic also has impacted mobility among Las Cruces residents, Coronado said, which he said was 26 percent below where it had been before the pandemic started. But, like other economic measures, it has begun to pick back up, he said.

The federal stimulus has boosted income levels, Coronado said, which has helped create a “very strong spike” in

retail sales. And, despite supply-chain interruptions caused by the pandemic, the services and manufacturing sectors of the local economy are improving, he said.

Coronado said unemployment in Las Cruces has “increased substantially in the wake of the panic,” and now stands at 7.9 percent, compared to 6.7 percent in Texas, 8.1 percent for New Mexico as a whole and 9 percent for the rest of southern New Mexico. The national unemployment rate is 6.1 percent, he said.

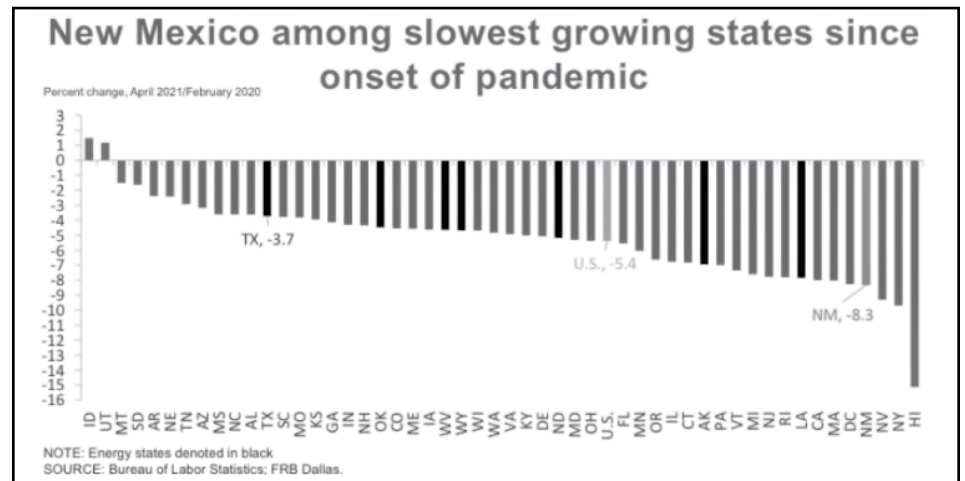
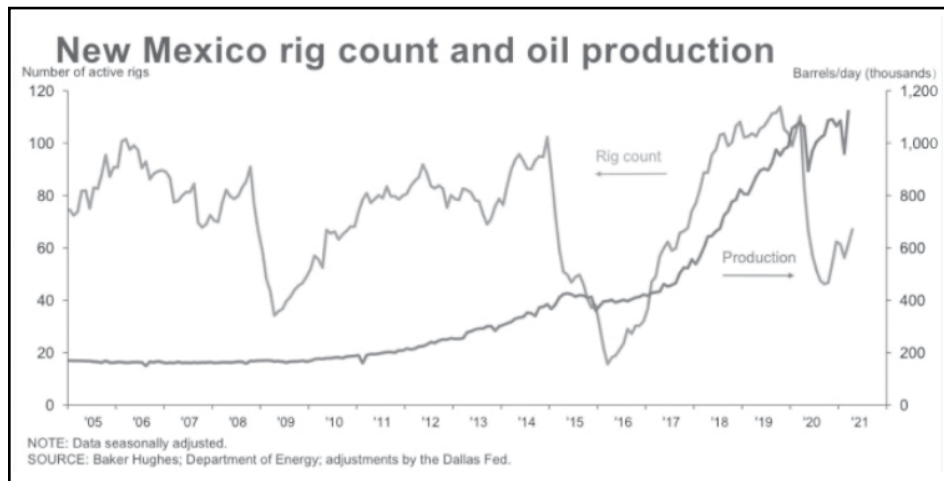

The local housing market is very strong, Coronado said, even though supply disruptions have caused price increases. The cost of lumber, for example, has tripled or even quadrupled in the

last few months, he said.

The increased demand for homes may be coming from investors “buying mortgage-backed securities,” he said.

“To what extent has that stimulated some of the pent-up demand for housing?” Coronado said, and is it “crowding out” families who want

to buy their first homes?

“We’re tracking that,” he said. “There may be more to it that we need to start thinking about.”

Coronado said supply-chain interruptions caused by Covid-19 and the resulting increase in the price of some goods could boost inflation. He said interest rates likely

will “remain at the current level for quite some time,” with spikes possible in 2022 or 2023.

New Mexico as a whole is one of the slowest growing states since the onset of the pandemic, Coronado said.

That is partly because of its “dependency on the energy sector,”

which “has been extremely hard hit in this pandemic,” he said. The state also has suffered because of a Covid-induced reduction in travel and tourism, which are major parts of New Mexico’s economy, Coronado said.

“My hope is that as things continue to im-

prove, we’ll see maybe a stronger comeback,” he said.

Lopez said the June forum is the last one MVEDA will hold virtually, with the lunch gatherings returning in-person in July.

Young entrepreneurs learn to create, research, sell in Acton Academy's annual business fair

"We definitely took lemons and made lemonade out of them," Acton Academy Mesilla Valley (AAMV) founder Anna Biad said about the school's annual Las Cruces Children's Business Fair, which continues through June 17 at www.kidsbusinessmarket.org.

The fair began in 2016, when AAMV opened, Biad said, but was cancelled last year and had to be held entirely online this year because of Covid-19. But that didn't stop about 60 of the school's students, ages 6 to 16, from creating products to sell this year.

The array of items available is "incredibly diverse," Biad said.

games, cosmetics, bath products, mugs, stickers, pottery, slime, craft sets, a bouncy-ball kit, essential oils, greeting cards, keychains, storage trays, pet leashes, rubber

Prices range from \$3 to \$40, with most items cost-

ing \$10 or less.

Each student entrepreneur participating in the fair chose his or her own product, researched and created it, priced it and, if financial backing was

needed, pitched it to an investor, Biad said.

A shark-tank panel of judges looked at each "business" and rated it

Take advantage of summer's 'golden hour'

In late May and early June we were lucky to have some cooler days, clouds and a little variety in our weather. My one complaint is my usual one after living 25 years in southern New Mexico: A lot of cloudy threatening looking skies producing little to no rain.

Soon enough we'll settle into that long relentless streak of hot days that won't let up until October.

Regardless how hot the days get, though, here in Las Cruces we can still count on pleasant, comfortable and gloriously beautiful mornings. At least if you get up early enough.

Here are some of the best things to do on a summer morning in the Mesilla Valley.

TAKE A WALK: This is perhaps the simplest, most obvious thing, but nothing beats walk-

ing for getting the blood flowing. And when it's warm, but not too warm, and you have beautiful mountain views to guide you, it can be a little slice of heaven here in the desert. Add two points if you see a roadrunner; subtract five if you see a rattlesnake.

WORK IN YOUR YARD OR GARDEN: Getting your hands a little dirty and exercising your green thumb is peaceful and pleasant on a summer's morning. Add a point for every flower bloom; subtract a point for every poke from a rose thorn or cactus needle.

HANG OUT WITH YOUR DOG: If you're blessed to have a good dog, your canine companion can make many morning activities better. Certainly, dogs make the walk nice, but even if you're just pattering around the

kitchen, having the dog around can be nice. Add five points if your dog enables you to meet a new friend; subtract 50 points if you don't clean up after your dog in a public place.

GO TO WORK EARLY: A lot of us go in to work early, either for want or for need, or just to get some things done before the rest of the office fills in. If you're doing this in the winter, the dark and the cold takes some of the fun out of it. In the summer, though, the light is bright by 6:30 a.m. and the sun is warm but not yet too hot. Makes you feel like you can accomplish a full day's work by 9. Plus, you could potentially score some points with your boss.

EXERCISE: I'm not a big fan of running, but if there's ever a time to do it, a summer morning is best. Morning's a great time for all exercise, really.

City council urged to support renovation of Amador Hotel

To: The Las Cruces Mayor, City Manager and city council,

I would like the City of Las Cruces to financially support the continuing renovation of the Amador Hotel.

Since 1980 I have done research on Las Cruces history and for the past 23 years have focused much of my work on the Amador family. The family is the best-documented Spanish Colonial-descended family in all of New Mexico.

The NMSU Library's Rio Grande Collection holds over

100 linear feet of their correspondence and many more feet of documents the Amadors collected in their business, political and church activities and from their travels.

The NMSU Museum, as well, contains another almost 600 family items given by family members to the university. The Amador Hotel is a lasting reminder of Las Cruces' Spanish Colonial and New Mexico Territorial history.

In interviews, I have conducted with Amador family members and longtime Las Cruces residents they speak of the happy times they spent at the hotel.

One elderly woman told me about the afternoons she and her

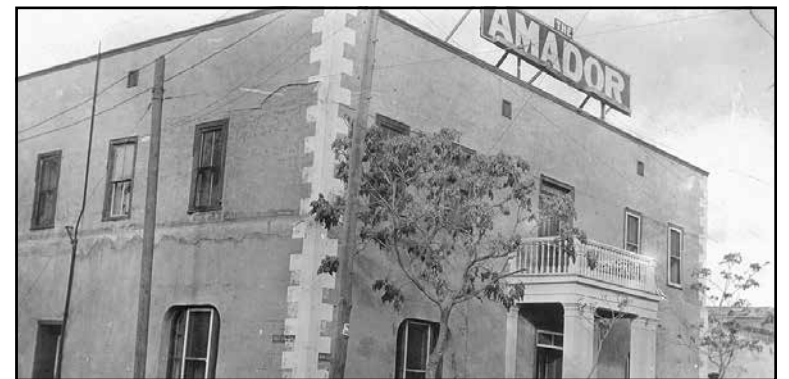

classmate friends spent in the hotel courtyard sipping cooling drinks after classes were over at the Loretto Academy.

University faculty members told me of spending delightful hours with their spouses after

work in the hotel bar. And of course, Amador family members told me about their lives and visits there before the hotel was sold. The hotel needs once again

Voters should have questions about state secrecy

Thanks to solid investigative reporting by Searchlight New Mexico, the state Children Youth and Families Department is no longer using a secure messaging system designed to circumvent open records laws by automatically deleting records before a request can be made.

The system allowed CYFD officials to automatically delete their text messages. According to former CYFD Chief Public Information Officer Cliff Gilmore, Department Secretary Brian Blaylock told top staff members that they should set their messages to automati-

cally delete after 24 hours, specifically to avoid the open records law. He

noted that once a request is made, records must be preserved. So, the best solution is to get rid of them before a request can be made.

Blaylock and the governor's office originally defended the practice, arguing that only "transitory records" were being destroyed. They described those as workplace banter and insignificant comments among employees.

But who gets to decide what is significant? Former FBI agents Peter Strzok and Lisa Page both argued that their personal

exchanges about then-candidate Donald Trump had no bearing on their investigative roles, and should have been considered transitory. But both should have known that communications sent between public officials on a public system are public records.

Investigative journalists and government watchdogs often find critical scraps of information while pouring through communications that others would deem insignificant. Destroying those records will eliminate our ability to learn what government officials are saying to each other when they're not in public view.

That shouldn't be allowed, and it isn't. There

is nothing in the state's open records law that suggests executive officers in state agencies can decide for themselves which exchanges are significant and which can be destroyed.

Matt Baca, a spokesman for the state Attorney General's Office, said they are pleased that CYFD is no longer using the secure messaging system, and that they were planning to conduct a review to ensure that the department is following the open records law.

Despite that, the governor's office is still providing official guidance to its staff that virtually all of their messages should be considered transitory and destroyed every 10 days, according to a recent col-

umn by Patrick Brenner of the Rio Grande Foundation.

The AG's Office needs to issue a clear opinion as to whether that is allowed. In the unlikely event that it is allowed, the Legislature will need to update the law to include technology that didn't exist when it was first written.

Several years ago, I participated in a statewide experiment in Kansas where we requested a public record from every sheriff's office in the state, then reported on those who failed to comply with the law.

Even after our front-page stories, several sheriffs still refused to turn over what was clearly a public record under the law — an arrest report.

The lesson from that

experiment for me was that all public records laws are meaningless unless somebody is willing to spend the money needed to file a court case ensuring that they are followed. And that usually doesn't happen.

Beyond legal action, the only other way to try to ensure compliance is through public pressure. Sheriffs in Kansas are typically more popular than the local newspaper, and they were unmoved by our investigative efforts.

But this should be a question for Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham, assuming she runs for re-election next year.

Las Cruces needs to show love for animals with emergency hospital

To the editor:

Having moved here August 2019, I was shocked when the need arose to find that the second larg-

est city in New Mexico does not have a 7-day-a-week, 24-hour emergency animal hospital. We were forced to drive 45 minutes to an hour away to get our dog to the emergency hospital in El Paso.

It was full day of dangerous post-op reactions to pain medicine (vomiting

and bleeding), tests and the very real possibility he would need to be hospitalized on IVs, with us driving back and forth daily. The drive alone was terrible for him. He lived, but others might not.

Imagine a human not able to be seen in medical crisis. We should have the same concern for the animals in our lives.

Many cities smaller than Las Cruces have figured out how to provide such care. Case in point: Fargo, N.D. began its emergency hospital in 2005 when the population was only 91,965, below that of our fair city. Their method could surely be utilized by our local veterinarians if they truly care about the

animals here. They set up a board, had local vets agree to serve shifts so that no one had too much required of them, and let all animal owners know. They each put in some initial support and raised funds in the community, looked for donors of space, supplies, financial support to get started. Within time, they were able to both treat animals in need and calm their owners, as well as to turn a profit that allowed them to hire staff specific to the hospital. Some years ago they built

an even bigger, state-of-the-art hospital.

It is an outrage that this city and its veterinarians cannot provide emergency service at all times for animals and their owners. Can't someone donate space? Can't the capable veterinarians here get together to form such a professional consortium? I am so concerned about this matter that I have even dreamed ways of bringing this about. I do not play the lottery, but I did dream about doing so, winning, building a

state-of-the-art emergency veterinary hospital, AHA approved, and recruiting the best young vets to move here and serve. I love Las Cruces, the place and the people. I love our furry family. Surely we can do better.

Retired journalist, auditor announces bid for council District 6

William Beerman has announced his candidacy for representing District 6 on the Las Cruces City Council. Incumbent Yvonne Flores has previously announced she will seek a second four-term. The election is Tuesday, Nov. 2.

Beerman, 72, retired to Las Cruces in 2007. His wife, Martha, is a graduate of El Paso High School and “has longtime ties here,” Beerman said.

Making his first bid for public office, Beerman said he is running for council because “I have the skills necessary to make improvements and serve as a watchdog. I want to leave a healthy country for my grandchildren, and we

need to work on one town at a time.”

“The City government is out of control,” Beerman said, “as evidenced by the McHard investigation report, which cited ‘rampant’ wrongdoing, along with the revolving door for city managers, and the fact that four officials allegedly were fired for reporting wrongdoing as whistleblowers and sued the city. The city council just passed a new budget and bragged that they are not raising tax rates. Nevertheless, the budget has an increase of 20 percent and includes millions more in tax revenues. The city politicians are wallowing in taxpayer money and not managing it well. Money lost or squandered through fraud, waste, and abuse comes not only from those

who can afford higher taxes and utility bills, but from those who can’t, and lost money is unavailable to do worthwhile things.”

“The mayor is in his 13th year,” Beerman said. “About two-thirds of the voters (in the 2018 city election) knew his record but voted for someone else. Ironically, he won a new term through reallocation of votes in ranked-choice voting. City council has misplaced priorities. They cut 10.5 police positions while inflating the overall city payroll by 89 to 1,672,” Beerman said.

“When I knock on doors, I ask, ‘What are your concerns?’ Beerman said. “I hear about crumbling streets and the city’s East Lohman Development, but I have many more homes

to visit. The big problems Downtown at city hall affect every district.”

Now retired, Beerman said he “most recently worked nights for

the Defense Intelligence Agency for eight years in the Pentagon as an editor for the nation’s morning military intelligence report.” Before that, he was director of the editorial division and a certified internal auditor for the U.S. Navy Audit Service and worked for newspapers for eight years, including a year as managing editor of the Monongahela (Pennsylvania) Daily Herald.

As a part-time reporter, Beerman said he wrote “hundreds of byline stories

for the South Jersey edition of the Philadelphia Inquirer. I have covered dozens of municipalities.”

Beerman has a bachelor’s degree in journalism from Penn State, a master’s in library science from Drexel University in Philadelphia and 21 credits in auditing-related subjects from Camden County College in New Jersey.

Beerman said he considers himself “a compassionate conservative.”

“I am active in the local Republican Party and the Hispanic Conservative Outreach Committee,” he said. “A Democrat for decades, I could make a good liberal resume by today’s dubious social criteria if I wanted, having worked for two years as the only white reporter for a black newspaper, having lived

for eight years in a black neighborhood in Washington, D.C. and having been married to a fluently bilingual Latina for 31 years.”

If elected to city council, Beerman said as his first priority, he “will ask the city manager to establish a model internal audit function and an audit committee designed in consultation with the Institute of Internal Auditors.”

Beerman said his campaign adviser is Rob Wood. “Paid consultant Paul Smith and Rival Strategy Group, LLC, who worked for Yvette Herrell’s successful congressional campaign, laid the groundwork for my campaign,” he said. His campaign treasurer is Chynna Clark, the manager of Cruces Auto.

‘Good, bad, ugly’ of mushrooms

In partnership with chef John Hartley and the New Mexico State University School of Hotel, Restaurant and Tourism Management (HRTM), NMSU professor of fungal plant pathology Soum Sanogo, Ph.D., and students in his fungal biology course held the 2021 NMSU Mushroom Cooking Demonstration event.

The course’s theme is “Fungi: The Good, The Bad and the Ugly,” Sanogo said. A corollary theme is “Fungi: They Feed Us, They Heal Us and They Harm Us.”

“The uniqueness of this event was the fact it involved not only the students taking the course but a diverse audience of mushroom enthusiasts, including mushroom growers,” he said. “In addition, the program included a brief segment on research at the University of New Mexico being conducted on porcini mushrooms.”

Mushroom recipes provided by Hartley, who is also an HRTM college assistant professor, were also on the program’s menu.

The demonstration had 40 to 45 attendees, Sanogo said, including 13 students from his class, along with the owner of Full Circle Mushrooms based in La Mesa, New Mexico.

“I didn’t expect this much interest in the event,” he said. “I greatly appreciate this level of participation because it

provides a challenging environment to myself and the students in assessing the adequacy of our knowledge in responding to questions.

“I would say that the mushroom cooking demonstration event went amazingly well,” said Suman Sharma, a student in Sanogo’s class. “We got to know delicious mushroom recipes from chef Hartley using different mushroom species such as oyster, black pearl, lion’s mane and shiitake. As a part of a fungal biology course assignment, we searched for nutritional and medicinal properties of these mushrooms. It provided us as well as attendees with a tremendous knowledge about benefits of eating mushrooms. It was a great fun also via Zoom to participate in this event. I really enjoyed it and I hope all the attendees liked the event too.”

“I knew that mushrooms taste fantastic. What I learned from the student presentations is that mushrooms are practically health food (if they are not toxic),” said Joan Crowley, who participated in the cooking demonstration. “They can also be anti-inflammatory. Who knew? I enjoyed the cooking demonstrations, especially watching chef

Three Las Cruces Utilities (LCU) directors came together to discuss the department’s evolution over the past 40 years. Former Utilities director, from 1980 to 1996, Ken Needham joined Dr. Jorge A. Garcia, LCU director from 2001 to 2020, and the current LCU director, Delilah Walsh, to talk about the growth of the city and its utilities.

“Knowing the evolution of the utilities when it’s facing another series of evolutions through sustainability initiatives and climate action is incredibly valuable,” Walsh said. The online conversation started with increasing the city’s water rights that help sustains its needs now.

“What I learned from Ken was that a seat at the table, active participation, at the Texas Water Commission helps us even though we are a minor user, with 10 percent of use we still provide for 125,000 people,” Garcia said. Needham agreed, “Nobody will take care of interests as we do.”

Garcia and Needham talked about the innovation that came from not only hiring

in-house engineers – Needham being the first along with a gas and wastewater engineer – to centralizing the work at its current location at 680 N. Motel Blvd.

“We didn’t have email or cell phones; we had to travel to offices around the city,” Garcia said. “Putting everyone together was the beginning of making a department that it was not only an enterprise fund but independent from the city government.”

Needham explained that it was far-thinking people on City Council like Mayors Robert Munson and Albert Johnson, but also people who recognized talent. Needham said that he was eager to get back home to Las Cruces after he left the Air Force. On a plane back to Gallup, he encountered New Mexico State University engineering

professor Dr. Tom Gerhardt who suggested he apply to a new job in utilities.

“Our first job in 1975 was to convert the employee lounge to our office, and you can imagine how popular that made us,” Needham said. His first project was designing water supply on Highway 70 and Jornada north before master plans existed.

“We didn’t have a master plan or work with pressure zones, so we developed an in-house master plan based on hydraulic models to grow to the east,” Needham said. “We had to demonstrate utilities lines to educated developers.”

Garcia and Needham both recalled the growth of technology at LCU – first with a centralized phone system, all the way to a state-of-the-art computerized

monitoring system for well, booster, and lift stations.

Walsh said, “LCU remains innovative because of the seeds planted early on. It’s evident in how the staff thinks and approaches challenges now.”

From chowder to sauté: easy mushroom recipes

Black Pearl mushroom croutons recipe

WHAT YOU NEED: sliced black pearl mushrooms, olive oil or butter or both, salt and pepper to taste

WHAT TO DO: Heat the oil or butter in a sauté pan until shimmering, add a single layer of mushroom slices to the bottom of the pan. Brown and crisp one side of the mushrooms, flip and brown and crisp the other side. Remove mushrooms from pan and blot excess oil with paper towels. Season with salt and pepper.

Lion's Mane and Corn Chowder

WHAT YOU NEED: 2 cups cubed lion's mane mushrooms, 2 cups cubed potatoes, ½ cup diced onion, 2 tablespoons chopped garlic, 1 cup cut corn, 3 tablespoons cooking oil (corn, canola or vegetable), 3 tablespoons all-purpose flour, ¼ cup clam juice, 2 cup milk (half & half or heavy cream can be used

for a richer soup, but use half the amount of flour), salt and pepper, creole seasoning to taste.

WHAT TO DO: Heat oil in a saucepan or pot and sweat (do not brown) mushrooms, onions and garlic until onions are translucent.

Deglaze pan with sherry and allow sherry to cook away, almost dry. Add flour and mix well. Then immediately add clam juice, milk and remaining

ingredients. Bring to a boil, then turn down and simmer (stirring frequently) until potatoes are soft. Taste and adjust seasoning and serve.

Sauteed oyster mushrooms

WHAT YOU NEED: 2 cups oyster mushrooms, sliced lengthwise, 1 cup sliced leeks (scallions will also work), 2 tablespoons whole butter (or oil), 2 tablespoons chopped

garlic, salt and pepper to taste; herbs such as fresh thyme, rosemary, etc. can be added to make this pair with various foods.

WHAT TO DO: Melt butter in a sauté pan and add leeks. Sweat leeks on a moderate heat until tender and add mushrooms, garlic and seasoning. Continue to cook until mushrooms are tender.

showing off his sauté technique. Those mushrooms really jumped. (Sauté means jump in French.) The one dish I may try to make on my own is the mushroom and

corn chowder.

"I was privileged to participate in this class," Crowley said. "I commend professor Sanogo for opening the class to other participants. It's part of NMSU service to the community."

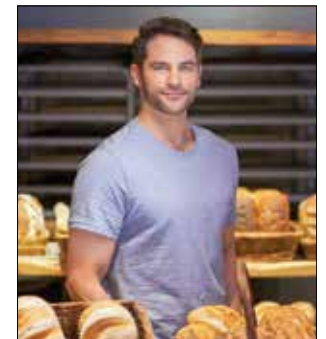

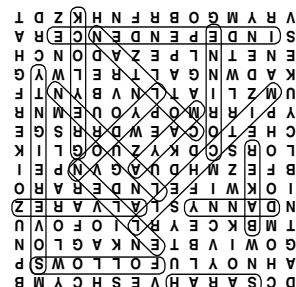

 Frequent "Top Chef" judge Gail Simmons hosts this new half-hour spinoff, which premieres with two back-to-back episodes. 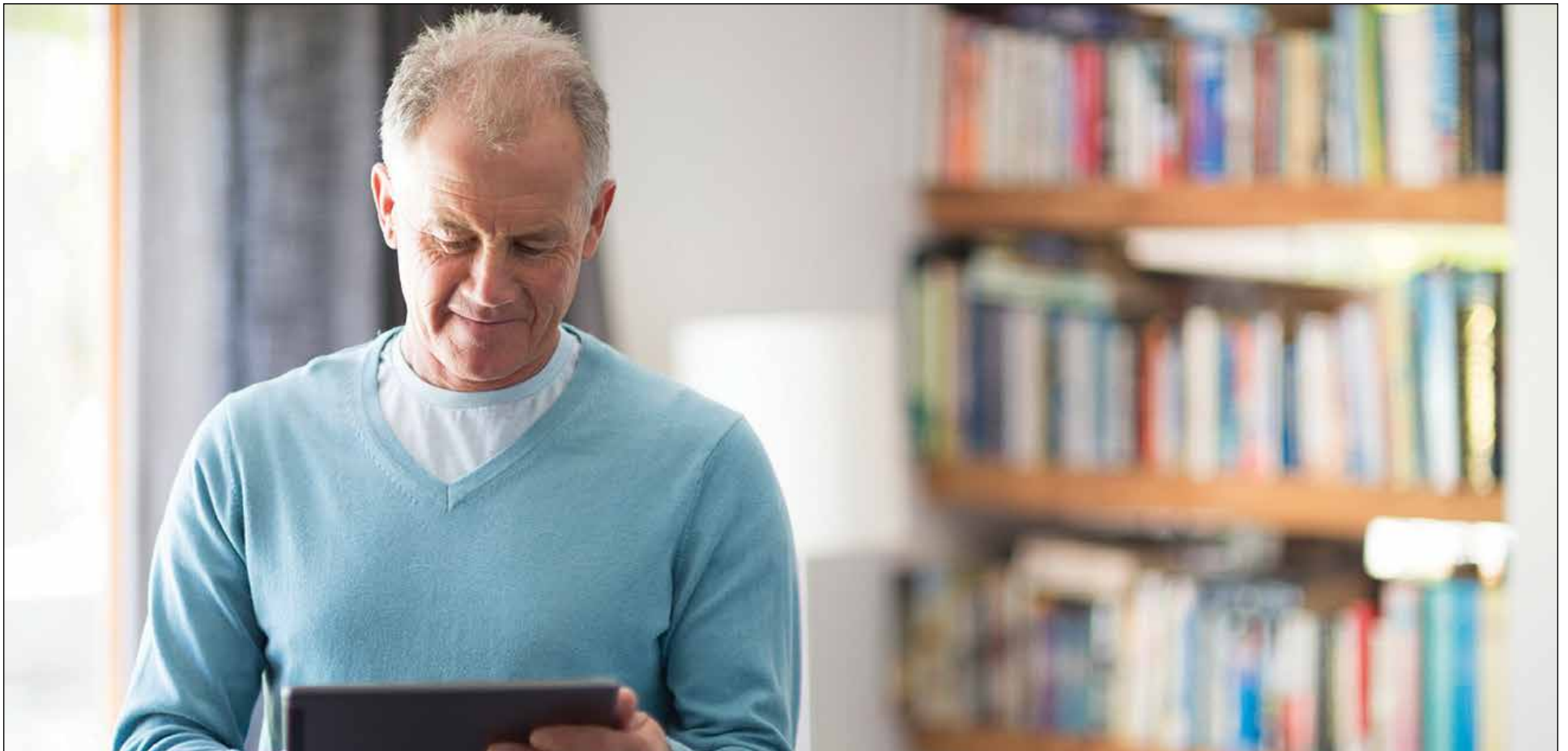

for viability, profitability and overall presentation, Biad said, and chose nine winners for first-, second- and third-place awards. Top finishers received business investments of up to \$150.

Winners in the Discovery West (third and fourth grades) competition were: Cooper Gandy, first place; Juliet Martinez, second place; and Emerson Phillips, third place, all 9 years old. Winners in the Discovery East (fourth and fifth grades) competition were: Lilah Berkson, 11, first place; Holden Abrams, 9, second place; and Piper Gandy, 11, third place. Winners in the Journey/Launchpad (sixth to 11th grades) competition were: Lexi Schwartz, 16, first place; Mary Hadrian, 15, second place; and Henry Tatum, 12, third place.

Entrepreneurship is “such a powerful skill,” Biad said. Students learn how to take a product from idea to production, develop a brand, create a marketing strategy and speak publicly about their product. They also learn about packaging and shipping and curbside pickup, depending on their customers’ preferences.

Sometimes, young entrepreneurs also learn to deal with disappointment, Biad said, if, for example, they don’t create enough product to meet demand, underprice their product and wind up losing money or wind up with poor sales.

Overcoming those fail-

ures is part of what they learn from the fair, Biad said, which is so valuable in a non-classroom setting.

The academy will have about 100 students when the new school year begins in September, Biad said.

What the young entrepreneurs learned from the business fair experience

“I learned that centripetal force and high-pressure air have a lot of power and that duct tape is the best tool,” said Holden Abrams, 9. He is selling an air-compressed potato gun and duct tape ball on a string. “I liked to make stuff go far,” he said. This is Holden’s third business fair.

Lexi Schwartz, 16, said she learned that “doing something you love is more important than something you do to get done.” She made New Mexico wildlife stickers. This is her fourth business fair, and she said she “put her heart and soul into it this time.”

“I learned that coloring was fun,” said Cooper Gandy, 9. He made wooden square calendars for the business fair.

“I learned if you don’t put effort into something it probably won’t turn out well,” said Juliet Martinez, 9, who made dog blankets and chew toys.

“Resin is a hard material to use,” said Piper Gandy, 11, adding, “I had a lot of fun.” She made resin rings.

“Making slime is hard,” said Emerson “Emme” Phillips, 9. “It shrinks.” She made and is selling slime during the fair.

Artist takes 'crazy dive' to pursue his passion

Helping young artists discover their identities and find their voices — as he has done — is a passion for artist José P. Montoya, who lives in El Paso but has deep roots in southern New Mexico.

Montoya is a self-described “queer artist” working in a lot of media, including drawing, painting and graphic design. He has converted the living room of his central El Paso apartment into a small studio and feels “quite at home throughout the borderland,” he said.

“El Paso and southern New Mexico are equally

important to me, as is Juarez,” he said.

Montoya grew up “in what people would call the barrio” in Alamogordo, he said.

“I didn’t realize that I was low income until somebody pointed it out,” he said.

Montoya didn’t have “many outlets to be who I wanted to be,” he said. But, with a lot of pop culture influences, he became an artist at a young age. In his bedroom, Montoya would “turn the music on and draw — in

my little corner of the world, just drawing my little heart out,” he remembers. His first drawing was of singer-songwriter Selena — one of many “iconic, strong women” who are featured in his art, Montoya said.

It wasn’t until high school that Montoya gained the confidence to begin showing his art to others, he said. He came to Las Cruces as a first-generation college student, earning a bachelor’s degree in journalism and a master’s degree in criminal justice, both from New Mexico State University.

After working at a jail-to-community re-entry center in Denver and volunteering for the Metro Denver Partners (a youth social services program), Montoya returned to Las Cruces and began working with the NMSU College Assistance Migrant Program (CAMP).

About 10 years ago, he “decided to take the crazy

dive into the art world.” He’s had art shows in Las Cruces, El Paso, Juarez and Denver and works as a professional artist/educator.

“In order to eat, I have to keep pushing my message across and hope people will buy my art,” he said. “You become your own small business. It’s been a lot of work.”

Montoya has also continued to volunteer as a community activist, mentor and teacher, combining his love of art with a drive for social justice and racial equality.

Last summer, after the death of George Floyd, Montoya got involved with the nonprofit Empowerment Congress of Doña Ana County, becoming the lead artist for a mural project just completed in Chaparral, New Mexico. He guided the work of nine students, ages 13 to 18, from Chaparral, Anthony, La Mesa and Berino in creating the mural, which he said

helped them learn about the history of the borderland and express their feelings about the colonias where they live.

Many of the students “didn’t know how the outside world viewed them,” Montoya said.

While others might think of a colonia as an unincorporated settlement with poor services and below-standard living conditions, the people who live there have a very different view, Montoya said.

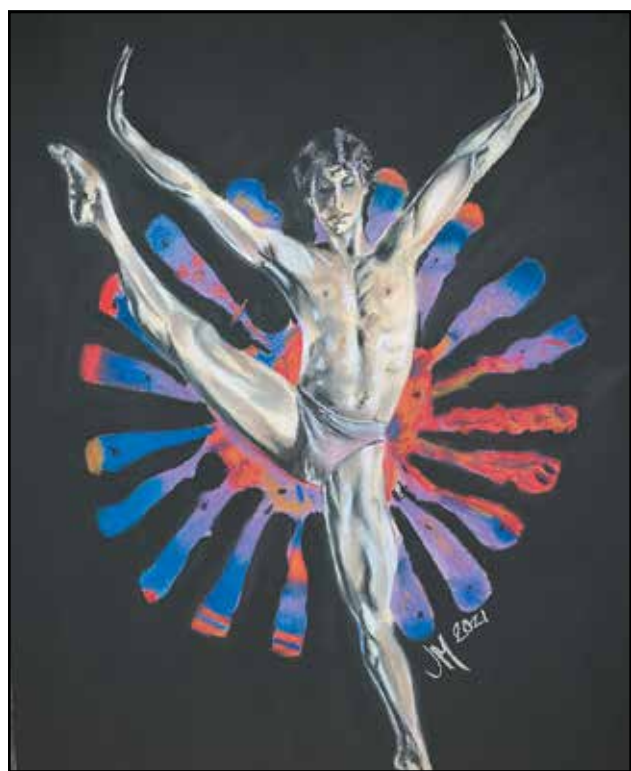
“Hard-working immigrant families live in the colonias,” Montoya said.

They have a strong sense of community, of being unified, he said.

The mural project helped young artists express “that sense of family they feel in their colonias,” Montoya said.

His students “created some really bold statements,” Montoya said. “I am proud of the work they did.” The mural project, he said, is part of “an education they’re not going to get in the school district.”

Sandino was born and raised in California and is happy to call Las Cruces home. She has been a lifelong artist, winning her first award and scholarship as a high-school student. Sandino taught art at the elementary-school level in the early 1990s while raising her family.

Most of the work in "What a Relief" was created during the pandemic.

Sandino finds carving the woodblocks to be very meditative and calming instead of painting, which requires more thinking and analyzing.

She is a member of the California Society of Printmakers and was the president of ArtForms of Las Cruces, and is a member of the 10 O'clock Club, a local women's art support group. Her work can also be seen at MAS Art, 144 Wyatt Drive, at www.noelsandino.com and on her Instagram page, #monoprintess.

Juneteenth event combines uniquely American music, culture, history

The City of Las Cruces is teaming up with a jazz musician and a filmmaker, both from Las Cruces, to present the all-virtual Juneteenth Jazz Festival, Friday and Saturday, June 18-19.

All events at the festival are free and open to the public.

The festival combines outstanding jazz music, including two world-renowned jazz musicians, with Black history and culture in America. Juneteenth celebrates June 19, 1865, when Texas and other Confederate states finally abided by the Emancipation Proclamation issued by President Abraham Lincoln more than two years earlier.

The festival “is encapsulated by this phrase: ‘Jazz history is Black history,’” said event coordinator Derrick Lee, who is a jazz musician and a New Mexico Music commissioner. “You look at the history of jazz and you get a direct view of Black history. Take people ... into the experience, it shows, empathetically and intellectually what it’s like to be Black.”

“Suddenly, Juneteenth is a hot topic,” said filmmaker, hip-hop artist and educator Julian Alexander, co-coordinator of the festival along with Derrick Lee.

The festival is “expanding the whole vibe of Juneteenth,” Alexander said, building on the Juneteenth celebrations held locally by the Doña Ana County NAACP. The festival is about great music and also will be “an educational experience,” he said, as “there’s going to be a lot of people saying, ‘What is Juneteenth?’”

“It’s just as American as any other holiday,” Alexander said. “It’s possibly one of the earliest purely American holidays. It’s celebrated by this mass of people that helped build this country in the first place.

“Every American should know about this. If you know Juneteenth,” he said, you are aware of the contradiction between “how slavery ended and how things happened after the Civil War.

“This is what Juneteenth is,” he said. “Now let’s add it to your celebration and let it be part of your history. New Mexico is so close to Texas, and

that’s where it went down. The education is a really exciting part.”

A celebration of Juneteenth helps to “contradict the white-washing we’ve all grown up with,” Lee said.

It will bring people “into the conversation of Black America,” he said. “Look at what’s happening now and look forward. Not just look back. Music is a great syringe through which to deliver these very charged

and critical topics of our time: social justice, race, equity — all the things we’ve all started to see more clearly during this period.”

Lee said it will “draw them in with the music. And let’s also get into these other things.”

“Juneteenth is a celebration,” Alexander said. It’s about issues like slavery and police brutal-

NMSU film teacher takes students ‘behind the scenes’

During the semester that just ended, New Mexico State University film teacher Rajeev “Raj” Nirmalakhandan connected his students with some of the leading filmmakers in the country, who spoke directly about what it’s like to work in a wide range of jobs in the motion picture industry.

Sixteen professionals in sound, animation, makeup and other aspects of filmmaking that Raj has worked with as a filmmaker and while attending the UCLA School of Theater, Film and Television, connected live with his students in online sessions in a class Raj called “Artists Behind the Scenes: Speakers from the

Film Industry.”

Among them was Ken Fischer, who worked for more than 40 years in feature-film post-production, primarily as a sound editor at Lucasfilm’s Skywalker Sound. His film credits include “Apocalypse Now,” “Star Wars: The Empire Strikes Back,” “Indiana Jones and the Last Crusade,” “Terminator 2” and “Avatar.”

“The students were highly motivated and asked many insightful questions,” said Fischer, who lives in Santa Fe. “I got the feeling that I was speaking with the next generation of New Mexico

filmmakers.”

Raj said his students were “encouraged and inspired” by what they learned.

“This course was truly an eye-opening experience for any student who wants to enter the film industry,” said Alexis Ziegelmeier, one of Raj’s students.

Participating filmmakers were “fully invested in the class,” Raj said. “Some of them had presentations. They showed photos, showed behind-

the-scenes videos. They spoke about their journey and the reality of their profession and answered questions.”

“What I found really astonishing was, all of these folks did it as a favor, none of them got paid,” said Raj, who has been a college instructor with NMSU’s Creative Media Institute for 15 years.

“It was so much fun to speak with this stimulating group of ambitious young creatives,” said M. Elizabeth Garland, an award-winning composer for film and stage who grew up in Las Cruces and now lives in Albuquerque. “They were totally engaged and posed fascinating questions.”

“I really enjoyed talking with the classes,” said storyboard artist, character designer and illustrator

Avian Anderson. “I am as passionate about my job as I am about those who view my craft and the people who share my love for it. It was wonderful to see people who haven’t yet got burnt out from cruel studios and I wanted to give them tips on how to keep the love of animation alive for as long as possible, as it is a very difficult industry.”

“I wanted to give them all the wisdom I gathered over the years to keep their souls ignited and burning as they take their steps out into the world, such as ‘fail often and fail spectacularly,’ and ‘one doesn’t go into animation because it’s easy, one does it because the heart and soul knows no other way to speak or sing,” Anderson added. “Strangely enough, for a while I was starting to lose my own spark along the

way, but speaking to them also helped remind myself why I do what I do. I was very grateful to talk with them.”

Sharing that kind of “immersive experience” is vital to film students, Raj said. “They need to learn the nitty gritty of work out on the battlefield,” he said.

“When I graduated from film school, I knew how to make a movie,” he said. “But I didn’t get a sense of the real world, on the ground, what it’s like to work in the film industry.”

Raj said all the speakers offered to help his students when they graduate.

“That would have been a huge benefit if I could graduate and contact someone who worked in the niche of the industry I wanted to pursue,” he said.

“I cannot wait to do this class again,” Raj said.

The history of Juneteenth

JUNE 1, 1863: The Emancipation Proclamation (which had been issued the previous Sept. 22 by President Abraham Lincoln) becomes effective. It frees only Black enslaved peoples in the Confederacy. Many slave owners refuse to abide by it.

JUNE 19, 1865 (JUNETEENTH): On this date, Texas and other Confederate states that did not abide by the Emancipation Proclamation fall and are forced to liberate the last Black enslaved people in the Confederacy. As Black enslaved peoples in Texas were informed of their freedom, many for the first time, the Juneteenth celebration is born. (Despite the surrender of Confederate States of America Gen. Robert E. Lee two months earlier, the western Army of the Trans-Mississippi didn't surrender to Union forces until June 2. Union Maj. Gen. Gordon Granger arrived on the island of Galveston, Texas, on the morning of Monday, June 19, to take command of federal troops who had recently landed and to enforce the Emancipation Proclamation.)

DEC. 6, 1865: The 13th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution becomes law. It makes slavery illegal in both the North and the South. It includes a loophole that makes slavery legal if it is the punishment for a convicted crime. Slave patrols violently enforced this exception to keep Blacks in a form of slavery.

ity, but also "focusing on rising above it and coming together and celebrating our existing, taking that trauma and that pain and celebrating that were still here."

Juneteenth is community-driven event, said Kayla Myers, who is curator of education for the City of Las Cruces Museum System and is working with Lee and Alexander on the event.

"The music tells the story," Myers said. It expresses "the celebration and the creativity" of Juneteenth and the city-sponsored festival, which also includes "incredible speakers and panels," she said. Doing the festival virtually this year, including "subtitles on everything," means people, including those who are homebound and disabled, "can tune in," Myers said. Videos will be available on Zoom and the entire event will

be archived on Facebook.

"Jazz is alive," said Lee, who will conduct a rhythm and drumming workshop during the festival.

"It's constantly evolving and changing," he said. "The takeaway for audience members is, 'I can do this, I can create in the moment. I can have access to this lifestyle, to this creativity.' That's the beauty of jazz."

Performers include the legendary jazz bassist Nat Reeves (<https://natreeves.com/>) and acclaimed jazz vibraphonist Warren Wolf (www.warrenwolfmusic.com).

Speakers will include Doña Ana County NAACP President Bobbie Green, Ph.D.; NMSU general counsel Roy Collins; and Debra Alexander, an expert in diversity, equity and inclusion and a Georgetown University faculty member.

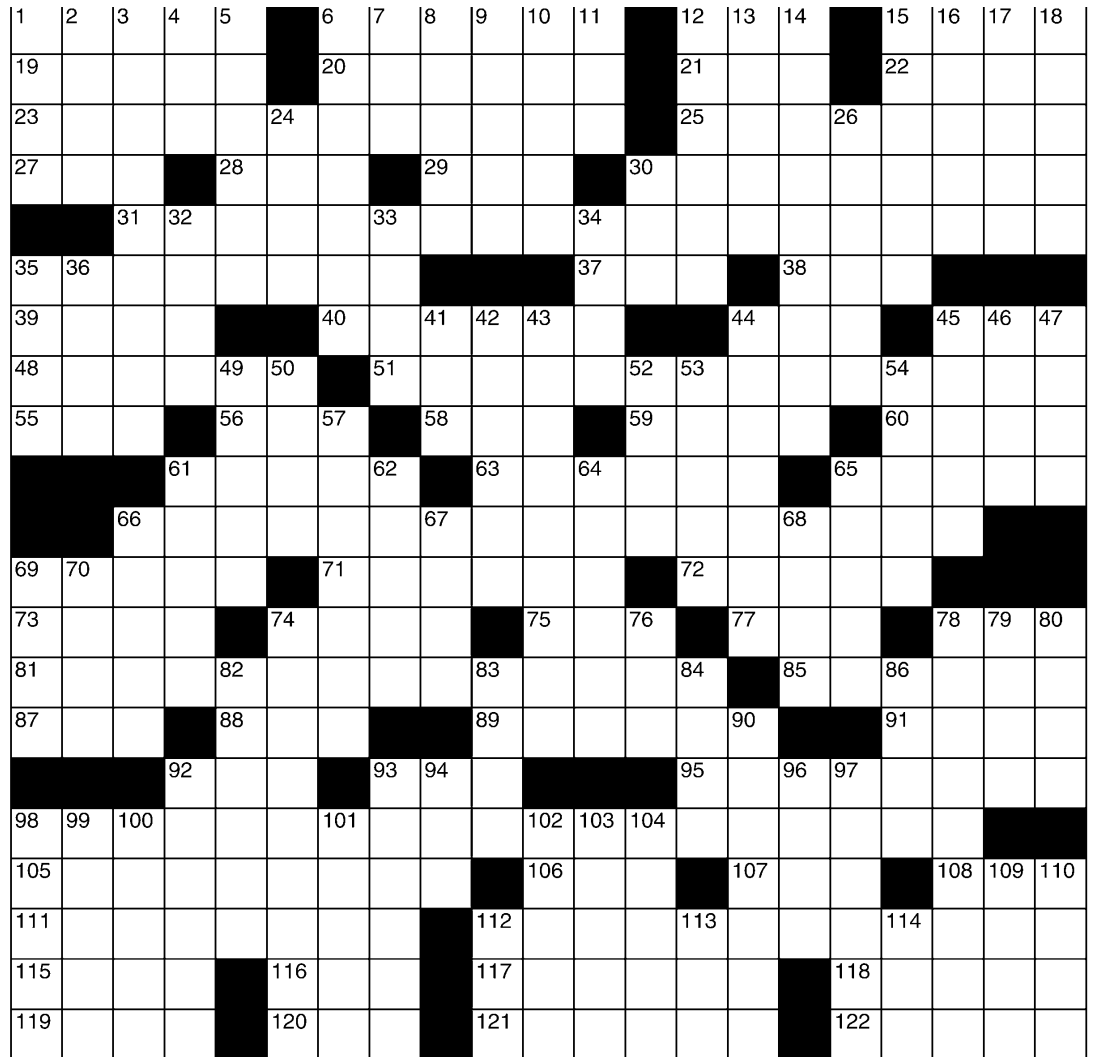

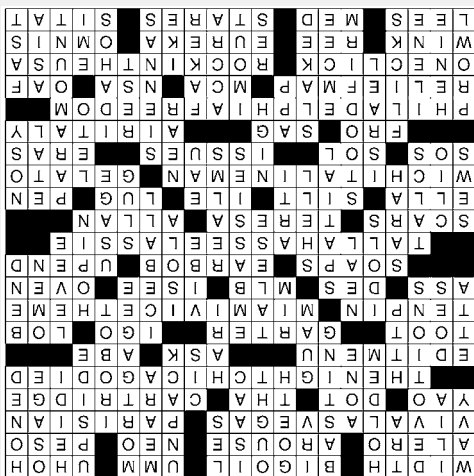

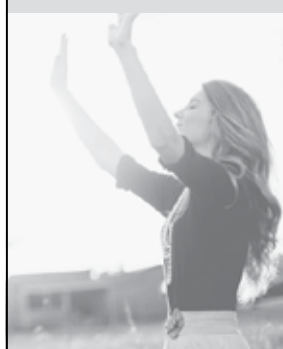

Bilingual stories bring our community together

When Alma Flor Ada first read the ancient Aztec story, “The Lizard and the Sun,” “It was not more than a paragraph in a reading textbook,” she remembers. But the tenacity of the lizard appealed to her then and stayed with her years later when grown-up author Ada began writing for children.

In her book, “The Lizard and the Sun/La Lagartija y el Sol,” Ada and illustrator Felipe Davalos bring the lush wilderness and the vibrant Aztec city of Tenochtitlán to life.

In this retelling of a traditional Mexican folktale, the sun has disappeared

for many days, and everyone is worried. All the animals search for the sun with no results. Eventually all but one of them quits looking. Only the tenacious little lizard continues the search.

Eventually she sees the glow of the sun coming from inside a rock.

The little lizard bravely travels to the great city to tell the emperor. Together, they try to convince the sun to wake up and come out of hiding. The emperor finally coaxes the sun back into the sky with the promise of beautiful music and colorful dancing in the plaza in front of the highest pyramid. In

that way, life, laughter and growth are restored.

Actor and musician, Jonathan Contreras, will perform “The Lizard and the Sun/ La Lagartija y el Sol” in both Spanish and English at 7 p.m. on June 18 in a Zoom room.

“The Lizard and the Sun” is the fifth event in the Talking Stories series developed by the Children’s Reading Alliance with help from the New Mexico Humanities Council, the National Endowment for the Humanities and the Las Cruces Bulletin. Each month a different story provides rich literature and in-depth discussion for families. The stories are selected for their inter-generational appeal and signifi-

cant content to encourage thoughtful communication across cultures.

Every presentation is designed to create space for families of different backgrounds and home languages to come together through literature.

Besides introducing young readers to quality children’s literature, we are building a platform for interesting parent/child discussions no matter which language is spoken at home.

According to the Latino Family Literacy Project, “No matter which language the parent speaks, or the child speaks, reading at home is crucial to ensure that kids develop a love of reading and for learning new vocabulary

and concepts. A reading routine at home should include sharing stories and talking together. In one family, there can be two languages in the home. Some parents speak Spanish while their kids are learning English at school. A simple solution is to share bilingual books. Parents can read in Spanish with their kids while their kids might enjoy reading in English. Together, they are learning new vocabulary and can have interesting conversations about what they read.”

In July, our story will be “The Rooster Who Would Not Be Quiet!” by Carmen Agra Deedy. This book is written in English with some Spanish. Actor/

singer Cassandra Reveles will present the story in both languages.

Upcoming bilingual titles in the Talking Stories lineup include: “Don’t Say a Word, Mama/No Digas Nada, Mama” by Joe Hayes in August; “The Festival of Bones/El Festival de las Calaveras” by Luis San Vicente in October; and “A Spoon for Every Bite/Una Cuchara Para Cada Bocado” by Joe Hayes in November.

Panel brings together health experts to ‘pull in same direction’

Bringing together stakeholders in the mental and physical health industries, a panel held May 25 at the Electronic Caregiver offices featured individuals from area health industries and as far away as Austria.

Serving as moderator, Dr. David Keeley, chief technology officer at Electronic Caregiver, said the overarching objective of the panel event was to stimulate conversation.

“We have resources that we did not know we

have as a community,” he said. “If you look at the metrics and the data we have related to healthcare in this region, you will find that it is very important we learn how to pull in the same direction.”

Keeley, introducing the panel, welcomed Behavioral Health Clinical Director at La Clinica de Familia Jose Valdiviezo.

“Recent times have shown the importance of including the behavioral health, the mental health aspects in talking healthcare in the United States,” Keeley said.

He then introduced the

rest of the panel members: Dr. Danielle Fitzsimmons-Pattison, family medicine, Memorial Medical Center; Professor Dr. Juergen Osterbrink, director of the World Health Organization’s Collaborating Centre for Nursing Research & Education at Paracelsus Medical University (PMU) in Salzburg, Austria; Emma Schwartz, president of the Medical Center of the Americas (MCA) Foundation and CEO of BIO El Paso-Juarez; and Jaime Olivas, chief behavioral health officer at La Clinica de Familia.

The first question Keeley asked was for Osterbrink, setting the tone for the conversation. Asking what the key characteristics of positive collaboration are, he noted he has seen a lot of positive competition but sometimes that competition becomes toxic.

Osterbrook said from experience where his team is teaching teams in the Ukraine, identifying goals and similar outcomes is essential. Focusing on similarities rather than cultural differences

is helpful.

Answering the same question, Olivas said, “It is important that we have a collaborative approach as well as meeting physical health needs im-

portant to have the multi-disciplinary approach.”

At the end of the panel discussion, everyone agreed the approach to education of providers is a key to the future of health care.

“It’s important to help the educational system create and gain interest

in the health world, specifically in the behavioral health areas,” Olivas said. “Initiating interest through elementary, middle and high school would increase connections, create real world providers.”

And Valdiviezo returned to the idea of integrated healthcare.

“It would be great if we could help to teach more about the importance of all health care and how a mental health provider can help a physical health provider, can help a dental health provider, in terms of clinical patients,” Valdiviezo said.

Putting shovel to ground to start a \$9.8 million project at Animal Services Center of the Mesilla Valley (ASCMV), officials and contractors set their sights on the new addition to the facility.

Las Cruces Mayor Pro Tempore Kasandra Gandara, introduced as the longest serving board member on the Animal Services Board, began by thanking the voters for approving the GO bond in the August, 2018, all-mail city general obligation bond election. The project had a 67 percent approval rating, she said.

Located next to the existing ASCMV at 3551 Bataan Memorial Highway in Las Cruces, the project is set to be completed by Sept. 30, 2022, she said. There will be

Handy: Bank still has 'community' feel

Grey Handy has had a personal and professional relationship with Citizens Bank of Las Cruces literally since day one.

At age 11, Handy went with his father, Wes, to the bank during its April 6, 1970 grand opening in the historic Amador Hotel as the elder Handy opened a commercial account for Little Playmates Child-care and Development.

That same day, the younger Handy opened a savings account. He has had "a continuous banking relationship with Citizens Bank" ever since.

The family companies owned and operated by Grey Handy include: Aristocrat Assisted Living; Mountain Shadows Home Care; and Little Playmates Child Development Centers, as well as various real estate interests.

The companies have 750 to 800 employees working in Las Cruces and throughout southern New Mexico.

"It's been interesting

to watch the bank evolve," Handy said. "It's evolved into a strong regional presence."

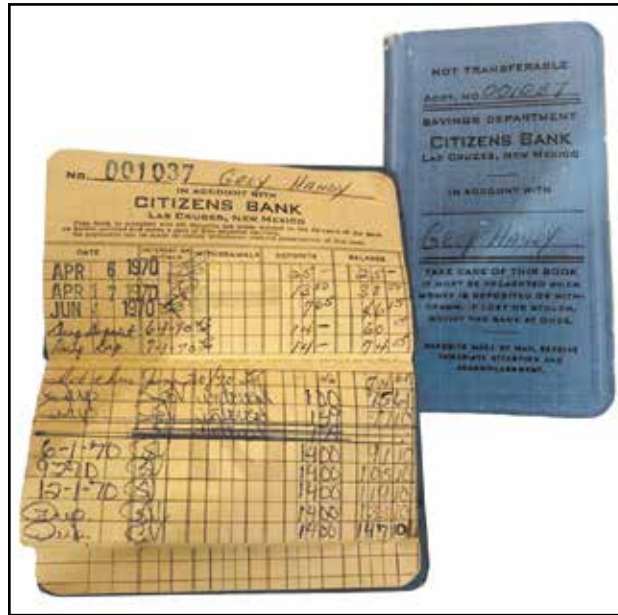

The New Mexico State University Athletics Department is no different and is taking an innovative approach to marketing its

brand while appealing to its alumni and fans.

The Aggies already have a branded beer, whiskey, roasted coffee and even a scented candle that's called Pistol Pete's Smell of Victory. No, the candle doesn't smell like napalm in the morning. It's actually apple and maple bourbon.

Last week, NMSU Athletics Director Mario Moccia hosted a special event at historic La Posta restaurant in Mesilla.

A panel of judges tested salsas from six finalists, representing different chile producers from around the state. They came up with a recommendation for a hot salsa and a medium one, but the results weren't announced.

The university still needs to hammer out details with the winning chile makers, Moccia said. They hope to come up with a name and a look and have the NMSU-branded salsa hit the shelves in the near future, he added.

A branded salsa, using New Mexico's world-famous green chiles, adds another wrinkle to what Moccia and his Athletics Department are trying to do through a new category of licensing and merchandising called consumables.

"If you can create something that is new and create a significant revenue stream, it is just gravy," Moccia said. "We are more bone than muscle.

We don't have a lot of fat."

Moccia hopes that in the near future, revenue NMSU sports gets back from salsa, beer, wine and other sales of consumable products will total \$100,000 a year.

That kind of dough may not make much difference to a school like the University of Texas at Austin, but it is a huge deal for NMSU, Moccia explained.

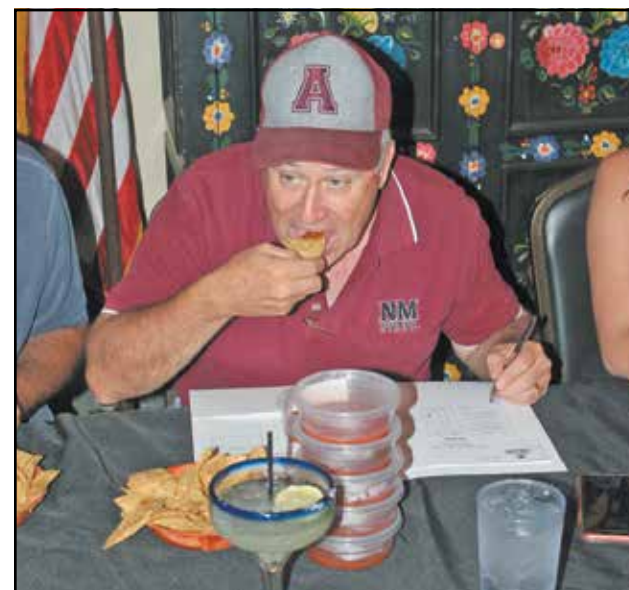
"When you buy a consumable product, the revenue we get back really helps our 400 student-athletes and our 16 teams," Moccia said. "It doesn't go into a special fund. It doesn't just go to football. It goes to help all our student-athletes."

Moccia said it's certainly important to come up with innovative ways to raise money and market the university's sports teams, but they want to make sure they are partnering with the right businesses, preferably New Mexico-based small businesses with ties to NMSU.

"We do behind-the-scenes work to make sure we aren't just slapping our name on anything," Moccia said. "We want to make sure it is a quality product. We know they will buy it once but we want them to keep buying it."

Moccia said it is a fun way to tell the NMSU story.

"We have to be innovative and unbelievably proactive," Moccia said. "We have to be more in-

Not having as much fun as you want playing golf? Here's a few suggestions

Play a round with a buddy using only one, two or at the most three clubs.

It's fun. You'd be surprised how you can invent and create shots when you don't have a full bag. A few years ago, I played an "emergency" nine holes with friends all using just one club. I had shot a 36 on that nine earlier; I shot 39 using one club! That was fun.

Go out of town, or out of the country, on a "buddies trip" and play legendary golf courses. Forget about the time or money. You only go around once (I think). Buddies golf trips are fun. I used to do a buddies trip every summer called "Doc's Clambake,"

in reminiscence of Bing Crosby's Pro-am tournament he started in the late 1930's.

One year I gave each of my guests actual Jim Beam decanters (not replicas) from Bing's outings in the 1970s. Unlike at Bing's parties, there were no aspiring starlets at my clambake.

To have real fun you need to play with a kid. You have no idea how young it will make you feel teeing it up with a young wannabe golfer who really enjoys just being out playing golf, when his friends are at home playing with their Xboxes. Golf is the great equalizer among generations. You get to know each

other.

Play a pro-am. If your club pro hasn't asked you yet, go ask him. Make sure you have a valid USGA handicap. The pro-ams put on by the Sun Country Section of the PGA are legitimate golf tournaments, well run and a lot of fun. Sure, you feel the pressure to do well, but so what. You get an emotional sense for what those pros go through.

Play a one-person scramble against a friend, with your opponent picking which of your two shots you will play. Better hit 'em both good. He better hit both good also. It's fun.

Golf can be too serious these days. I like a match that includes two "do-overs" per nine. Call them Mulligans or Shapiros or

whatever, but it makes things less serious among friends. Traditionalists might object, but do-overs get you away from the business of giving and taking (adjusting) strokes, especially when nobody's handicap is believable, which is the mostly the case.

If you're with a small group that likes to wager, try putting up drinks for most greens-in-regulation, most fairways hit, fewest putts, fewest three-putts, longest putt made, longest fairway drive and maybe include "polies" (a putt for par or better longer than the length of the flagstick), barkies (a par off a tree), "greenies" (closest to the pin on a par 3) and "sand-ies" (a par out of a bunker or penalty area). Don't get involved playing for drink

shots on the golf course.

It's fun to play a game where players select each other's clubs for each shot (except putting). For example, if you have a 90-yard shot to the green, and your opponent tells you to hit a 7 iron, you had better dial in your imagination and create a shot with some finesse. But maybe you'll

get him back with his next shot from a greenside bunker when you select a 7 iron.
