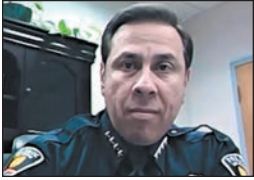

SEVERE DROUGHT MAKES FIREWORKS RESTRICTIONS NECESSARY

In light of extreme drought conditions throughout Doña Ana County, the Board of County Commissioners passed a proclamation to temporarily restrict the use of fireworks, effective June 8 for 30 days, including Independence Day weekend.

The National Weather Service and the United States Forest Service indices and information show Doña Ana County is experiencing severe or exceptional drought conditions, expected to continue through July.

“We want to prevent fires in the dangerous conditions we are experiencing. Fires can spread quickly in the dry and windy conditions typical to Doña Ana County,” said Fire Chief Shannon Cherry. “Help us keep our community safe and use fireworks safely and conscientiously.”

The types of fireworks allowed include cone fountains, crackling devices, cylindrical fountains, flitter sparklers, ground spinners, illuminating torches, toy smoking devices, and wheels. In an effort to prevent fires, fireworks can only be set off within the unincorporated areas of the County where water is readily available or areas that are paved or barren- away from vegetation, timber, brush or native grass.

The National Fire Protection Association recommends leaving fireworks to the professionals to safely celebrate our country’s birthday. Instead, they offer the following ideas at nfpa.org:

- Use glow sticks, they glow in the dark and are a safe alternative to a sparkler. Fun for all ages.
- Loud and proud. Noisemakers are sure to make a statement. They can be found at local party supply stores or make your own.
- Outdoor movie night. Set up a screen and projector.
- Don’t forget the bug spray!
- Red, white and blue silly string...fun for all ages.
- Make a patriotic craft with the family.
- Throw a birthday party for the USA, and don’t forget the cake.



Covid-19 contributes to increase in both violent and property crime

The City of Las Cruces saw an increase in both violent crime and property crime in 2020 and in the first four months of 2021, Las Cruces Police Chief Miguel Dominguez told the Las Cruces City Council during a recent work session.

Dominguez said much of the increase, including commercial burglaries and domestic violence, has been due to the pandemic. He said LCPD is working with the community, local groups and organizations and area law enforcement to reduce the crime rate and increase LCPD's accountability, transparency and community engagement.

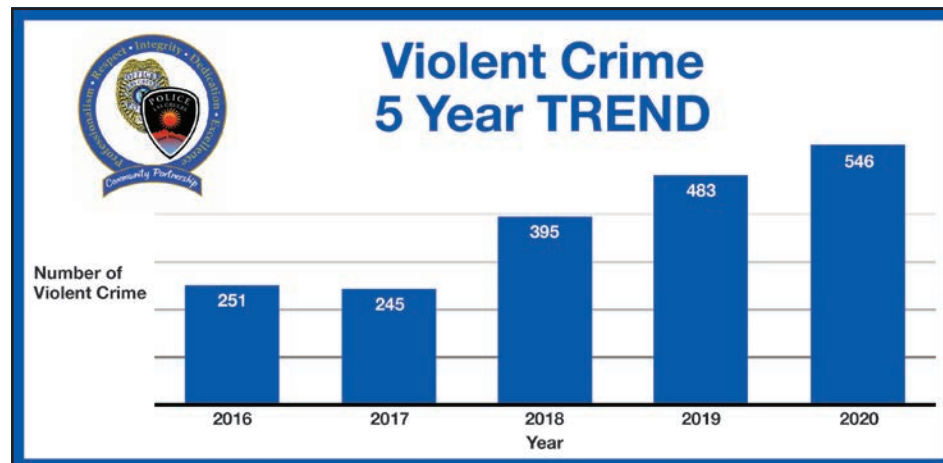
"Thank you for the great relationship that we do share with our community," the chief said. "I couldn't be prouder of our department and our civilian staff. The entire pandemic, we did not relent on our services."

The chief said LCPD "was inundated with calls at the start of pandemic," including many calls related to masks. The department was able to "bring those calls down through pro-active efforts," he said.

The chief said LCPD had 145,408 incident reports in 2020 and 47,300 during the first four months of 2021. Those numbers include 168,156 calls for service in 2020 and 55,192 in 2021.

2020 crime stats

Dominguez said violent crime increased 13 percent from 2019 (483 total violent crimes reported)

to 2020 (546 total). There were 11 criminal homicides each year; 44 sexual assaults in 2020, down from 71 in 2019; 54 robberies in 2020 compared to 57 in 2019; and 437 aggravated assaults in 2020 compared to 344 in 2019.

The chief said aggravated assaults included a 35 percent increase in reports of domestic violence, of which 20 percent of victims did not want to pursue prosecution against their abusers. Health and law enforcement officials have reported that pandemic stay-at-home orders have caused sharp spikes in domestic violence across the country.

The chief said property crime increased 26 percent from 2019 (3,572 reports) to 2020 (4,396 reports), including burglaries of businesses that were closed because of Covid. There were also a number of non-residential burglaries of storage facilities. There were 510 burglaries reported in 2019, compared to 776 in 2020; 2,762 reports of larceny/theft in 2019, compared to 3,145 in 2020; 297 vehicle thefts in 2019 compared to 469 in 2020;

and three cases of arson in 2019 compared to six in 2020.

Five-year trends

Dominguez said the city's five-year trend in

violent crime shows 251 reports in 2016, 245 in 2017, 395 in 2018, 483 in 2019 and 546 in 2020. The increase since 2018 is attributable in part to a new way of reporting that

Motor vehicle thefts rise in 2021

Las Cruces has seen a sharp increase in the number of auto thefts reported in the first four-plus months of 2021 compared to last year, the Las Cruces Police Department said in a news release.

The release said LCPD recorded 186 motor vehicles thefts from Jan. 1 through May 15, 2021, a 104 percent increase compared to the 91 motor vehicle thefts during the same period in 2020.

LCPD's Crime Analysis Unit has made these determinations about the 2021 thefts:

- Method used. 11 percent: Keys to the stolen vehicle had been previously lost or stolen; 31 percent: Keys were lost, stolen or left in the vehicle, or the person believed to be responsible for the theft was left in the vehicle; 8 percent: stolen vehicle was left running and unattended.
- Recovery rate. 65 percent of motor vehicles stolen in Las Cruces are recovered; 46 percent are recovered by LCPD officers; 90 percent of vehicles recovered are within Doña Ana County.
- Location of thefts. 70 percent were stolen from city residential areas; 58 percent from single-family residences; 30 percent from commercial locations; 26 percent from commercial locations are likely taken from a hotel or motel parking lot.
- Top five stolen vehicles by make. Chevrolet: 21 percent (58 percent are trucks); Honda: 11 percent (77 percent are sedans); Ford: 10 percent (35 percent are trucks); Toyota: 6 percent (50 percent are sedans); Nissan: 6 percent (75 percent are sedans). So far in 2021, LCPD said, approximately 32 percent of stolen motor vehicle reports have resulted in an arrest or a warrant for arrest or have otherwise been closed. In four cases, firearms were known to be in the vehicle that was stolen.

includes all crimes related to each reported crime, he said. For example, Dominguez said, if a burglary

LCPS board seeks applicants to fill vacant seat

The Las Cruces Public Schools Board of Education has approved a plan to fill the school board seat representing District 2 that was vacated when board member Terrie Dallman resigned, LCPS said in a news release.

In a special meeting held Monday, June 7, the board voted to begin accepting applications for the seat beginning June 8.

Interested applicants have until 5 p.m. Tuesday, June 22, to submit a letter describing the applicant's interest in filling the position and why they are a good candidate, a copy of the applicant's voter registration card and a completed, notarized dec-

laration of interest, LCPS said.

Applicants must be 18 years of age or older, a registered voter and must physically reside in District 2, which includes most of central Las Cruces, stretching west to a portion of Fairacres and south to Pajaro Road. A copy of the district map can be found at www.lcps.net/board-of-education/wp-content/uploads/sites/40/2019/05/LCPS-District2.pdf.

In addition to legal qualifications, an appointed board member must commit to attend

regular sessions, work sessions and special board

meetings when called and attend other board and committee meetings, the news release said.

Candidates will be part of a special board meeting that will begin at 9 a.m. Tuesday, July 6, at Las Cruces High School, during which LCPS board members Ray Jaramillo, Maria Flores, Teresa Tenorio and Carol Cooper will interview the candidates and discuss the commitment and respon-

sibilities of the District 2 board member. The final candidate selection made that same day, following the special meeting, with the new District 2 board member sworn in at that time, LCPS said.

The appointed board member will fulfill the remainder of Dallman's term, which expires Jan. 1, 2022. Three LCPS Board of Education seats, including District 2, will be on the Tuesday, Nov. 2, combined local ballot.

Dallman resigned, following the board's June 1 appointment of Ralph Ramos as the district's permanent superintendent. Dallman was the only board member to vote against Ramos' selection as permanent superintendent.

Ramos was named interim superintendent March 1, following the Feb. 25 death of Superintendent Karen Trujillo.

In a text to the Bulletin, Dallman said, "I'm choosing to let the legal process play out. I do wish the new board good luck." She declined further comment.

The last LCPS board vacancy occurred in 2010 when then incumbent

Serena Shoop resigned. Shoop had been elected in District 2 in 2009. The LCPS board appointed Barbara Hall as her replacement. Hall completed the remainder of Shoop's unexpired term and was elected to a full four-year term on the board in 2013, running without opposition.

Hall did not seek reelection in 2016, when Dallman was elected to the seat, defeating three opponents.

Dallman was a bilingual teacher for 17 years at Zia Middle School and three LCPS elementary schools before retiring in 2015.

and an auto theft were part of the same incident, they had previously been counted as a single crime. Since 2018, they have been reported as separate crimes. About 20 percent of crimes reported in 2020 involved another crime, he said.

The city's five-year trend for property crime has shown a decline, Dominguez said. In 2016, 4,789 property-crime incidents were reported, compared to 4,486 in 2017, 3,648 in 2018, 3,572 in 2019 and 4,396 in 2020, the chief said.

2021 year to date crime stats

From Jan. 1 through April 30, 2021, Dominguez said there was a 43 per-

cent increase in violent crime compared to the first four months of 2020: 187 reports in 2021 and 131 in 2020. He said one homicide was reported during that period in 2021 compared to none in 2020; 26 robberies in 2021 compared to 15 in 2020; 13 sexual assaults reported each year; and 147 aggravated assaults in 2021 compared to 103 in 2020.

Dominguez said 1,448 property crimes were reported in the first four months of 2021 compared to 1,358 in January to April 2020, a 7 percent increase. That includes a decrease in residential burglaries from 82 to 72; a decrease in commercial burglaries from 55 to 49; an increase in non-residential burglaries from 49 to 71; a decrease in reports of breaking and entering from 43 to 35; an increase

in auto burglaries from 237 to 360; 75 reports of felony larceny/theft in each reporting period; a decrease in miscellaneous larceny/theft from 726 reports to 597; an increase in vehicle thefts from 91 to 186; and an increase in arson from zero cases in 2020 to three in 2021.

Community policing

Efforts to reduce crime through community policing initiatives include: LCPD's "If You See Something, Say Something"

campaign; interagency intelligence sharing; directed patrols; community and retail partnerships; a push to increase online reporting; and information sharing.

"We cannot do this without the support of all of our partners," the chief said. "I want to thank the City of Las Cruces for the support they've shown to all of us through some very difficult times. We are doing everything that we can to build the trust within our community."

Tips to prevent car theft

- Do not leave vehicles running and unattended.
- Do not leave vehicles running, unattended and with children inside.
- Do not leave keys inside the vehicle.
- Invest in and use an audible alarm system with an automatic kill switch that prevents vehicle from being started.
- Ensure that all windows are etched with the vehicle identification number (VIN).
- Close and lock windows and doors when leaving vehicles unattended.
- If possible, park vehicle in a garage or within a gated area.
- Do not leave keys to home, business or other properties inside vehicle.
- Do not leave garage-door remote openers in vehicle.
- Do not leave vehicle title or personal or financial documents in vehicle.
- Do not leave firearms inside vehicles.
- Immediately report suspicious persons or activity in your neighborhood.
- Immediately report a stolen vehicle by calling LCPD at 575-526-0795. Be prepared to provide the make, model and color of vehicle along with the VIN and current license plate number.

Their pre-recorded promise to call me back in "more than four hours" also missed.

During my frustrated efforts, I learned of a website devoted solely to helping people find live human beings to help with problems at big corporations. It's called www.gethuman.com. I haven't had the chance to try it yet, but I love the concept.

I read some reviews and, like almost everything else existing online, Get Human has drawn some great raves and a few horrible bashings.

Not surprisingly, most of the bad reviews are from people who tried and failed to find real

Leakers are essential to honest government

I rise today in support of leakers.

Here's to Daniel Ellsberg, a former Marine who was working as a private-sector military analyst in 1971 when he leaked the Pentagon Papers, a top-secret study on U.S. activities

in Vietnam dating back to the Truman administration. It revealed a decades-long history of lies to the American public by both military and civilian leaders, including their denials at the time of bombing raids beyond Vietnam's borders.

The 7,000-page document could not be smuggled out on a thumb drive in 1971. It took Ellsberg several weeks to sneak

the pages out and duplicate them on a Xerox machine. He faced up to 115 years in prison for doing so, and the Nixon administration went to court seeking to block publication. But in the end, the truth came out.

Here's to Edward Snowden, a computer intelligence consultant who was working as a subcontractor for the CIA in 2013 when he disclosed that the government was, in fact, collecting data on Americans, contrary to a denial under oath to Congress by National Intelligence Director James Clapper. Snowden was charged with violations of the Espionage Clause

in 2013. In 2020 the mass surveillance system he exposed was ruled to be illegal by the federal court.

Here's to Mark Felt, the former associate director of the FBI who advised reporters Bob Woodward and Carl Bernstein to "follow the money" in the days after the break-in at the Watergate Hotel.

Here's to Katherine Mitchell, who exposed VA incompetence and cover-ups while veterans died waiting for care; Linda Tripp, who advised Monica Lewinski to save that blue dress; Frank Serpico, who exposed corruption in the New York City Police Department and was later portrayed by Al Pacino; and Karen Silkwood, who exposed dangers at the plutonium

plant where she worked and was later portrayed by Meryl Streep.

Here's to everyone who has risked their career, and sometimes their freedom, to shed light on government lies and corruption.

Last week, it was reported that the FBI had seized the records of Congressmen Adam Schiff and Eric Swalwell in an effort to learn who was providing accurate information to the media regarding the Trump administration's dealing with Russia.

Former Attorneys General Jeff Sessions and Bob Barr both denied knowledge of the operation, as did Assistant AG Rod Resenstien. We're to believe a mid-level functionary had final ap-

proval on the decision to spy on Congress.

These revelations came days after we learned that the FBI had also collected data from reporters at CNN, the Washington Post and the New York Times, for the same purpose. The reporting that prompted these surveillance abuses may have been embarrassing and politically damaging to the Trump administration, but it did not compromise national security.

And, this isn't just a Trump problem.

The Obama administration prosecuted three times as many cases targeting whistle-blowers and leakers than all other presidents combined. It also abused surveillance powers, spending months

going through the records of Associated Press reporters and editors in an effort to plug leaks. And, it set a new record for denial of documents requested under the Freedom of Information Act.

One of the few things Trump and Obama would seem to agree on is their love of secrecy and disdain for those in government who shed light on areas they wish to be kept dark.

This can't be fixed by simply electing new leaders. Congress needs to rein in the ability of any administration to use the FBI as a weapon against them and the free press.

Looking at different ways to increase safe, affordable housing

The League of Women Voters studies and takes positions on public policy issues at the local, state, and national levels. Based on a local housing study completed in 2012, the League of Women Voters

of Southern New Mexico (LWVSNM) supports efforts to increase the availability of safe housing that is affordable to moderate- and low-income households.

Actions the League endorses include: housing options that are appropriate for seniors, the disabled and first-time home buyers; a variety of

types of housing for rent and purchase integrated within the community; and strategies such as use of public-private partnerships and grants, rehabilitation, fee waivers and a housing trust fund and land bank to promote housing affordability.

Housing is a topic that regularly engages the City Council, especially recently as local government has grappled with the implications of the pandemic for residents and as the City has been updating its consolidated plan related to housing. Issues of energy efficiency and fuel sources, as well as transportation, are critical components of housing affordability

and sustainability.

Currently, League members are updating

their knowledge of local housing issues and are particularly engaged in looking at innovative ways the City might use its own land and other resources to promote better integration of housing types and a mix of income levels throughout the community.

Types of housing might include single family houses with accessory dwellings, duplexes, townhomes and multi-family housing. This sort of configuration would allow people to stay within a given area or neighborhood as their circumstances change.

That is, a first-time home buyer or renter in an area could move to a larger home as circumstances allowed and occupants of larger homes could downsize within the same area, not needing to move to a different part of town.

Moreover, members of extended families might find it easier to live within the same neighborhood. In a diverse community such as ours, essential workers could find safe and suitable housing convenient to transportation and services.

The League is particularly encouraged by the possibilities suggested to the City Council for the East Lohman Development Plan. The project can be a model for the future of the city, allowing us to build a diverse neighborhood that includes energy-efficient

housing options for people at a variety of income levels along with access to public transit and safe bicycle and pedestrian paths, public parks, open space and scenic vistas.

Maintaining natural drainage features, desert vegetation and wildlife habitats is also possible. This project includes a variety of housing types at a range of costs for people at very different stages of their lives. Such a project illustrates what can be done with creativity and relevant resources.

Safe, energy efficient and mixed-income housing in neighborhoods with commercial and public services will support equity and inclusion for a well-functioning democracy. The LWVSNM approves the City's efforts to educate the public and implement attainable housing.

The Community Service of Recycling

Mike Garcia finds the trucks in the metal pile. Over his 22 years at the Las Cruces Recycling Center, Garcia has an impressive collection of toy trucks lining the walls, and has collected stories about how recycling has changed over the years.

"I've seen the age of people who recycle get much younger," he said. "When I started, it used to be just older people. We see people come with their whole family, with the young kids helping to recycle too."

For him, working for the community was almost the family business. His dad worked 26 years at Las Cruces Utilities in gas; his brother and sister for over two decades in the city's transit department.

"Working with South Central Solid Waste Authority (SCSWA) has been full of benefits, something I heard about from my dad," Garcia said. "I am working toward a retirement, and I've been able to take what I liked about working grocery stores for 17 years, the customer service, and use it to help educate people who come to recycle."

Garcia keeps an eye on those questioning

what they bring, from plastic bags to the types of plastics that are recyclable. In the last two to three weeks, he's greeted more people back in the Center, as people have felt more comfortable and COVID-19 restrictions have eased.

"They want to recycle plastic bags, but it's not something we can do," said Garcia.

Part of Garcia's tasks to transporting recycling brought to the Center, located at 2855 W. Amador Ave., right before the transfer station entrance and weigh scale, up the hill to the station to bale it and load it for transport out of Las Cruces.

"Transportation is one of the most expensive parts of our recycling program," said Patrick Peck, director of SCSWA. "If we could sort the recycling here, it would cut our costs long-term. Plus, looking at how we

work with plastic bags – like the discussion at City Council – will also help. Plastic bags seem like they would be easily recycled, but they become a rope that jams sorting machines. In the future, we're looking at ways to be more flexible in how we manage recyclables separately, not just plastic bags but also high-value items like cardboard and aluminum cans." Transportation costs are part of a 35 cent increase next year on the monthly recycling fee that help keep the program going – new trucks and bins – and manage a growing city.

Garcia still has a few more years before he retires, but he may see more people join him as recycling in Las Cruces grows. "I wish my dad could see how the city has grown," he said. "There would be a lot he wouldn't recognize; he'd be amazed."

Third-graders go on trip to space(port)

After spending a school quarter learning about science and space and participating in an art project with the Doña Ana Arts Council, two classes of third-grade students got to spend a day at Spaceport America in early June.

While at the spaceport, the students got to work with scientists, do experiments with marshmallows in a vacuum and launch miniature rockets. During their tour, they also got to see the emergency services center and hear from Virgin Galactic's Emelie Woog.

"This is a culminating activity to the art and sci-

ence project that we did." said Monte Vista Elementary School third-grade teacher Brenda Sorensen. "The kids are having a blast at the science and arts. They have been so excited and so engaged. This is awesome."

The students visited Spaceport America's activity gallery and got to try out the centrifugal trainer, spinning around and upside down in a simulation of the training that pilots must undergo. Of course, the students were not subjected to nine times the force of gravity like pilots are.

"It was fast, and it made me dizzy," said student Ashaya Potter. "But it was fun."

Ashaya said she has learned a lot from the program "about planets and

space and astronauts and what they do."

Since 1996, the Doña Ana Arts Council (DAAC) and Las Cruces Public Schools (LCPS) have been members of the Kennedy Center Partners in Education (KCPE). The Las Cruces KCPE Team focuses on arts integration, an approach to teaching that leads students to demonstrate understanding through an art form.

This year, the team put together educational activities based on the Las Cruces Space Festival's virtual art show, "Dawn of Discovery." The exhibition, which includes 90 pieces of artwork from 46 international and local artists reflecting the excitement of space exploration, was the jumping-off point for the 2021 Dawn of

Discovery Arts Integration Project. The artists' work reflects a working knowledge of the solar system, space exploration, art history and New Mexico iconography, making it and the artists incredible resources.

The Arts Integration Project with LCPS was implemented during April and May 2021 to support Monte Vista Elementary School's third-grade, fourth-quarter solar system unit and culminated with the students visit to the spaceport.

The team developed a series of enrichment and art activities that supplemented what the teachers were doing as well as demonstrating arts integration. The students created New Mexico symbol-inspired retablos on cardboard and spent time analyzing the "Dawn of Discovery" virtual art show, and the KCPE team

threw in a game of Space Trivia at the end of the project.

"Encouraging students to develop an interest in science, technology, engineering and mathematics through art is exciting," said DAAC Program Manager and KCPE team leader Karen Conley. "Both art and science require inquiry, creativity and exploration to understand the world around us. The 'Dawn of Discovery' art show is a conduit for science and an incredible resource at the local level. These are the kind of opportunities educators and artists are looking to tap into because they demonstrate the connection between art and science."

NMSU educator makes first bid for office in council District 3

Becki Graham is making her first bid for elective office as she campaigns for the District 3 seat on the Las Cruces City Council.

Graham, 44, is hoping to succeed current Councilor Gabriel Vasquez, who is serving his first term and decided not to seek re-election.

The Nov. 2 local election includes three seats on the Las Cruces City Council as well as other town and city elections in Doña Ana County; Las Cruces Public Schools, Gadsden and Hatch Valley schools elections; and the elections of members of soil and water conservation districts in the county. The winners

will be sworn in next January.

Graham came to Las Cruces from her native Pennsylvania in September 2000 to attend graduate school at New Mexico State University “and never left,” she said. She has been a student, staff or faculty member at NMSU ever since, now doing writing and research at NMSU’s Arrowhead Center with a focus on entrepreneurship and infrastructure. She also serves as an occasional adjunct professor in English, teaching composition classes.

Graham has a bachelor’s degree in psychology, a master’s in anthropology and a doctorate in

English – the last two from NMSU.

Graham said Covid-19 figured in her decision to run for a city council seat.

The pandemic “made our local community so

much more relevant,” she said. “Our neighborhood and our community became the whole world.”

That helped Graham to see the gaps in meeting local needs, she said, and was “a call to serve.”

“Watching decisions made in real time” by city leadership during the pandemic, “pulled back the veil on so many things,” Graham said, and gave her “accessibility to leadership.”

Her husband, Mike Gra-

ham, is a firefighter and driver at Las Cruces Fire Station No. 4, Graham said, and that also impacted her decision to run for city council.

“I think I have the capacity to make a much bigger impact,” she said.

Graham said she is “looking forward to knocking on doors” in her district during the campaign. “Nobody has all the answers,” she said. “I’m ready to learn from the people in my district. I look forward to learning what people in my district are needing and wanting.”

In fact, Graham said, her first priority if elected to the city council will be to “bring to the table what I’ve learned from my constituents.”

She said issues in Dis-

trict 3 will include infrastructure – streets and traffic control – and public safety.

And, while the needs of each district are important, “Las Cruces needs to grow together,” she said. Her role if elected to the city council will be to listen and learn how District 3 fits in, its “strengths and challenges” and how to balance those with the needs of the city as a whole, Graham said.

Graham said she thinks Las Cruces is well-run.

“There is less division in our community than back East,” she said, and “that makes me optimistic about being in leadership. I see that caring, I see that heart. That speaks to me.”

Graham said she is not affiliated with a political

party or group in Las Cruces, but has an account with ActBlue, which is a nonprofit “available to Democratic candidates and committees, progressive organizations, and nonprofits that share our values,” according to the group’s website.

Graham said she has “found a home here” in Las Cruces, met her husband here and brought her parents here to live.

Graham learned to box at age 32 while a Ph.D. candidate, she said. With one foot in the Ph.D. arena and one in the boxing ring, it’s “where I became part of my community,” she said.

Graham’s campaign manager is Connie Chapman. Her treasurer is Jen Ward.

Summer officially starts June 20 – what the solstice means

The summer solstice is at 9:32 p.m. MDT Sunday, June 20.

The solstice marks the first day of summer and the longest day of the year in the Northern Hemisphere.

In Las Cruces, the sun will rise at 6 a.m. June 20 and set at 8:16 p.m. Along with June 21, it will provide 14 hours, 16 minutes and 17 seconds of sunlight, two seconds more than June 19 and three seconds more than June 22, according to www.timeanddate.com. That means June 20 has four hours and 14 minutes more sunshine than the winter solstice last Dec. 21.

The solstice occurs at

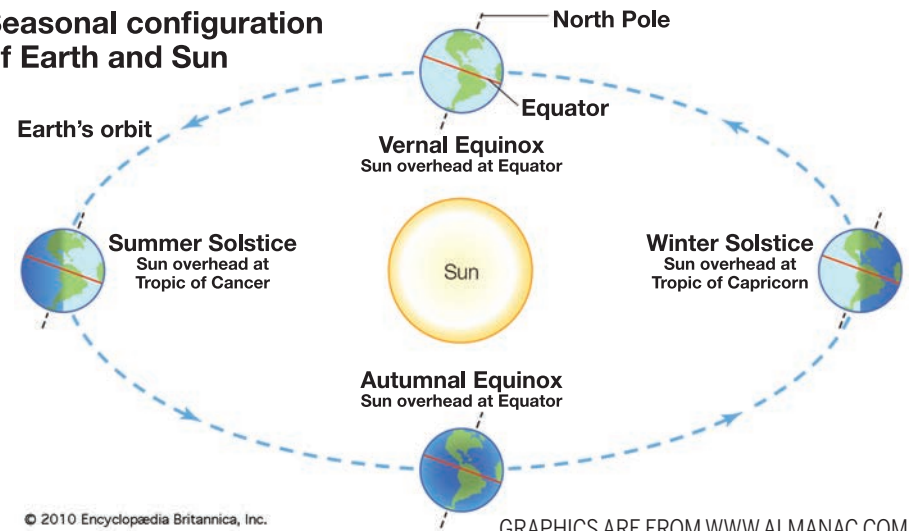


the moment when the “Earth arrives at the point in its orbit where the North Pole is at its maximum tilt (about 23.5 degrees) toward the sun,” according to www.almanac.com.

The word “solstice” comes from Latin solstitium (sol), meaning sun, and stitium, meaning still or stopped, almanac.com said.

“Due to Earth’s tilted axis, the sun doesn’t rise

in the same place in the sky each morning; its position moves northward or southward in the sky as we travel around it through the year,” almanac.com said. “The June solstice is significant because the sun reaches its northernmost point in the sky at this time, which makes it look like the sun’s path has stopped moving for a brief period of time.”

The summer solstice always falls on either June 20, 21 or 22.

It’s on different days “because of the difference between the Gregorian

calendar system, which normally has 365 days, and the tropical year (how long it takes Earth to orbit the sun once), which has about 365.242199 days,” according to almanac.com.

The June full moon — the Full Strawberry Moon — occurs at 12:40 p.m. MDT Thursday, June 24. It’s the first full moon of summer.

“Venus is low in the western sky among the stars of Gemini” on the night of the solstice, Las Cruces astronomer Bert Stevens said. “Thirteen degrees northeast of it is the

God of War, Mars, which has been slowly dropping toward the sun after having reached its closest approach to the Earth last October. It will soon be gone from our skies as it passes by the sun. High up in the southern sky is the bright star Arcturus, forming the base of the kite-shaped constellation Boötes. The light we see today from this nearby star left it in late 1984, shortly after the reelection of Ronald Reagan,” said Stevens, who is co-director of the Desert Moon Observatory.

The award is based on demonstrated excellence in the four areas of system integrity, system improvement, employee safety, and workforce development. LCU was one of 15 SOAR recipients recognized in 2021, joining the 41 previous SOAR award recipients. "LCU was highly rated in all four areas that are required of SOAR. LCU consistently demonstrates a commitment to providing natural gas safely and efficiently to all those in their community and as such, serves as a model for all other natural gas utilities in the country," said APGA President and CEO Dave Schryver.

Of the 152 possible points, LCU received a total of 140 or 92% with the highest score going to employee safety, scoring 39 out of 40 points. "LCU's safety protocol is rigorous. It includes daily 10 to 15

minute tailgate sessions for all field workers and quarterly meetings that review training in fire extinguishers, excavations, respiratory, traffic control and pipeline purging. We ensure that our employees are sufficiently trained for every situation that could occur," said Garcia. In addition, every staff member must complete 30 hours of OSHA training every other year. Employees have the authority to identify unsafe conditions and stop work until the condition is corrected.

APGA believes that earning a SOAR award is an indication that the affected gas system is striving to operate safely and efficiently. LCU maintains

the natural gas distribution system integrity, ensuring that it functions safely and efficiently while distributing energy to all customers. LCU is also committed to system improvement programs that include an eye on the future through research, development, and technology integration. "We are also putting a focus on workforce development. It is important that LCU deploys creative recruitment programs to identify new talent while nurturing the skills of our current staff, so they progress within the utility," said Garcia.

Utility customers entrust public natural gas systems to deliver clean and affordable natural gas. To accomplish this mission, a forward-thinking natural gas utility constantly strives to improve, overcome challenges, and adapt to its changing environment. "APGA is proud to recognize LCU and is confident in their continued success," concluded Schryver.

City, county adopt fireworks restrictions

Doña Ana County joined the City of Las Cruces in restricting the sale and use of fireworks for the July 4th holiday and beyond because of the area's extreme drought conditions.

The Doña Ana County

Commission voted 3-0 at its June 8 regular meeting to prohibit the sale of aerial and ground audible devices, including "the sale and use of missile-type rockets, helicopters, aerial spinners, stick-type rockets and ground audible devices, including chasers and firecrackers" within unincorporated

areas of the county, according to the county proclamation.

The Las Cruces City Council voted 7-0 at its June 7 meeting to prohibit "the sale and use of missile-type rockets, helicopters, aerial spinners, stick-type rockets, ground audible devices such as chasers, and firecrackers," according to the resolution passed by the city.

The city ordinance and county proclamation also limit the use of permissible "safe and sane" fireworks to include "cone fountains, crackling devices, cylindrical fountains, flitter sparklers, ground spinners, illuminating torches, toy smoking devices and wheels," which may only be used within the Las Cruces city limits and unincorporated areas of Doña Ana County "that are paved or barren, or areas that have a readily accessible source of water for use by the home-

owner or general public," according to the county proclamation which is essentially the same as the city ordinance.

The city ordinance is in effect until July 7.

The county proclamation, effective immediately upon its passage, continues from June 8 for 30 days.

The county amended its proclamation to allow Bowlin's Travel Centers to continue to sell aerial and ground audible devices to people who are not residents of Doña Ana County. Bowlin's Old West Trading Post, located about 15 miles west of Las Cruces near Interstate 10, qualifies under county ordinance as the only specialty retailer in the county that is allowed to make the sales.

Bowlin's Travel Centers Director of Operations Kit Johnson spoke at the commission meeting requesting the sales be allowed to continue.

"We card them," Johnson said at the meeting. "We let them (customers) know by notice coming into the store and also by posting at the cash register that we do not sell to county residents." Purchasers are also advised that the restricted fireworks should not be used within the county, he said. At the commission meeting, county attorney Nelson Goodin said

other incorporated areas of the county, including Anthony and Mesilla, may allow the sale of some fireworks that are prohibited by the county proclamation and City of Las Cruces ordinance.

Goodin said Otero County and El Paso County have adopted fireworks restrictions similar to those imposed by Las Cruces and Doña Ana County.

This 2020 documentary from filmmakers Tom Ratcliffe and Becky Paige provides the back story to one of the most iconic sports photos in American history: the image of two Black Olympians raising their fists and bowing their heads on the awards platform during the 1968 Mexico City Games. Wildly polarizing during that racially charged civil-rights era of U.S. politics, the photo today underscores how many problematic concerns those athlete's were protesting remain urgent today, more than half a century later.

In the last 15 years, she has parlayed that “hobby” into a full-time career, becoming a highly respected and sought-after professional makeup artist in the movie industry.

“I have worked with Pepper on several films. She is a joy to be around and an absolute profes-

sional,” said New Mexico State University Creative Media Institute professor Ross Marks. “You can count on Pepper to not only do a great job in terms of makeup, but to elevate the work of her team and the entire crew. Her positive attitude and great work ethic are contagious. I look forward to working with her on many more projects.”

A native of Hobbs who

grew up in Silver City, Gallegos has lived in Las Cruces since 1991.

And, even though most of the movies she has worked on were produced in northern New Mexico, “I have lived in Las Cruces the whole time,” Gallegos said. It was a decision she made early on in her career to give her three children, now grown, a stable home.

“I had to make the sacrifice,” Gallegos said. “It has been a challenge.”

But there is “always a way to do something if you’re determined,” she said.

Gallegos has done makeup for actors in local productions and for commercials, television series and major motion pictures.

Among the most famous people to sit in her chair are Oscar winners Christian Bale and Tommy Lee Jones. Gallegos described Bale as “a very genuine person,” and

said Jones was “very serious, kind. I was amazed by how talented he was.”

She has also done makeup for Linda Hamilton, whom she met while working on “Refuge,” a 2010 movie written and directed by the late Tony-winning playwright Mark Medoff.

“I absolutely love her as a human being,” Gallegos said of Hamilton. “She has a genuine love of people.”

Working backstage on productions like “Transformers II,” “Stargate SGI,” and the pilot for “Breaking Bad,” Gallegos has also done makeup for Christopher McDonald, Thomas Jane, Jon Bernthal, Jason Momoa in “Stargate Atlantis” and many other actors.

Gallegos said Ben Browder (“Farscape”) is probably her favorite actor among all those she has worked on. “He’s a good ole Texas boy,” she said. And with her, he

was the only American on a movie they worked on together in Vancouver, Canada.

But big names and famous faces don’t impress Gallegos.

“I don’t look at actors. I work on them,” she said. “I was a sculptor and a painter before. I just now do it on people.”

Gallegos is known in particular for her tattoo work, and she worked on many unusual makeup projects, including putting hair on a prosthetic device and creating many “fatal” wounds and “making up the bodies.”

“I’ve killed people left and right,” Gallegos joked.

For “Breaking Bad,” she had to make actor Aaron Paul look like he had been kicked in the face, she said.

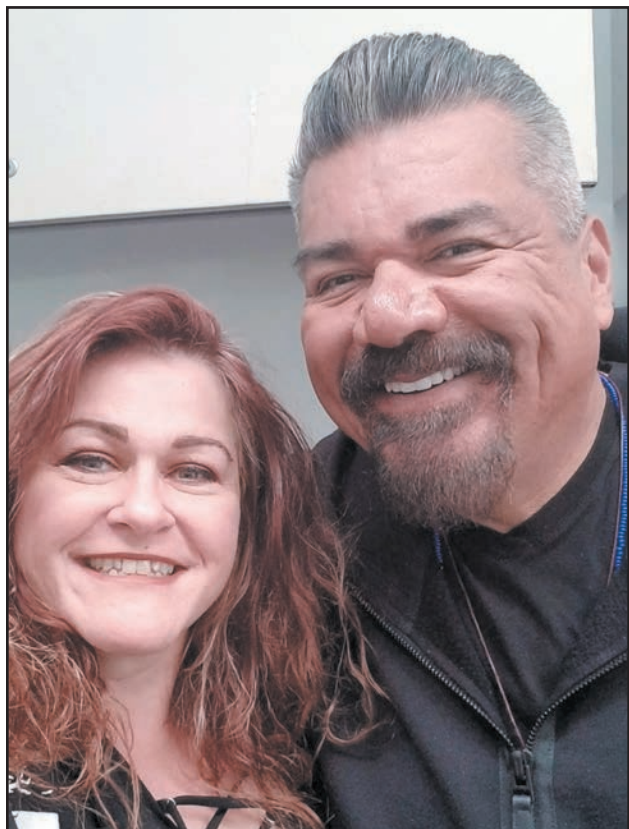
No makeup request shocks Gallegos anymore, she said. “I did put a tampon up someone’s nose once. You do what they tell you.”

At the same time, Gallegos has refused to do anything that might put an actor in danger, including putting contact lenses in one actor’s eyes.

Makeup artists and other crew members are “the heart and soul of the movie industry,” she said. Professionals who do hair, makeup and wardrobe “transform people into the character. Without us, an actor and camera would be standing there not knowing what to do.”

“Pepper is a great ambassador for the film industry in New Mexico,” said state Sen. Jeff Stein-

about the Mexican cartels, it's about a guy and his mom and about a

justice system that processes through the poor," Gilmer said. "He is somebody who really cares about his mom and feels trapped and knows he is powerless to do something. He is doing things that are pretty awful to try and save his mom."

Gilmer said Blevins has been killed in more films than any other person.

"He has been in over 90 films and always played a bad guy," he said. "This is giving him the opportunity to show he could do something more than be a one-dimensional actor."

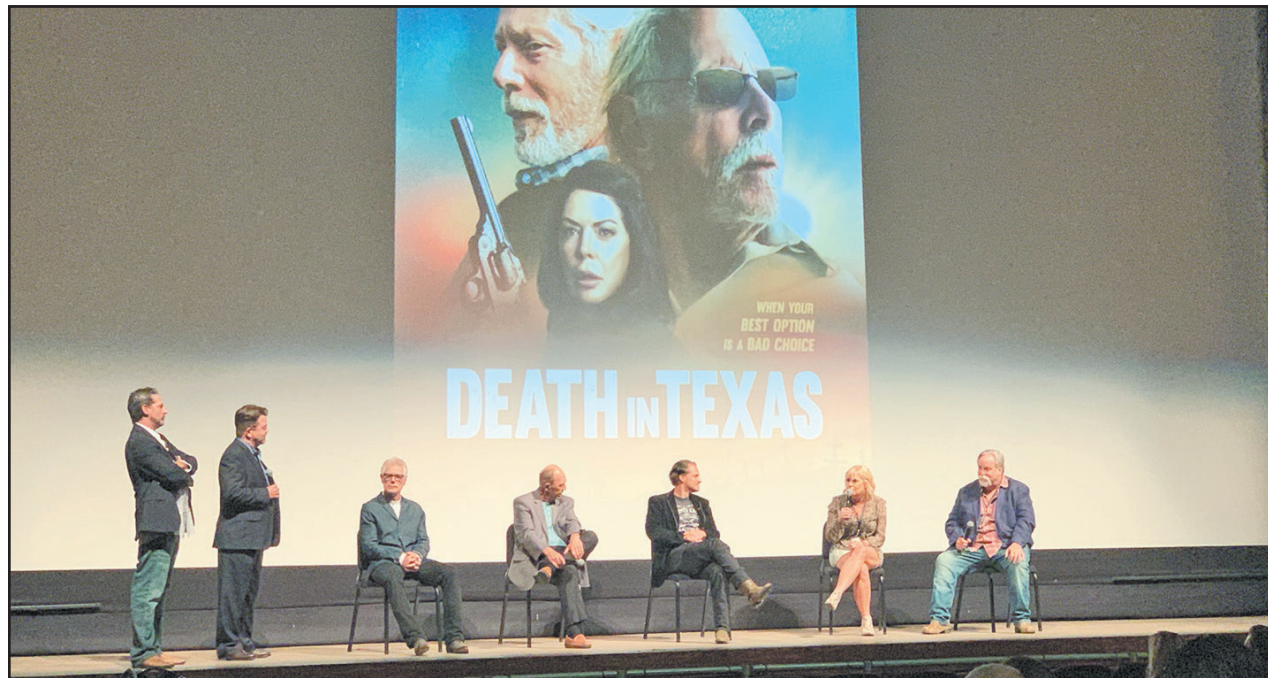
During a Q&A session after the movie premiere, Blevins himself admitted there have been a lot of no-dimensional parts he has played with "not a lot of nuance."

"This was just a role

with nuance and color," he said. "The script gave me a chance to simplify and execute some stillness and show some inner life. There are the million things in the list that is central to the play, there is the fact that this production marks the return of live theater to Las Cruces and there is the performance by Autumn Gieb.

This is a one-woman show, and brilliant is the word for Gieb's work. She is in full command of her character and she owns every inch of the stage from the moment she steps on it.

Gieb's character is

also the show's narrator, drawing many audience members into the performance (staying safely

in their seats), including theater owners Ceil and Peter Herman. Ceil, who directed the play, plays

a school counselor and voices a sock puppet.

Ceil and Peter had been part of rehearsals for the

play, but the rest of us in the audience didn't know what lines we might be asked to recite or ad lib. It added sparkle and spontaneity to the already highly polished production.

It also added another dimension to Gieb's performance. She sometimes waited for a response from an audience member, sometimes encouraged it and always seamlessly incorporated whatever she got into the scene.

Gieb was never rattled, never thrown off, never pulled out of character. This is her Gieb's show, and she is outstanding.

This is a play about coping with a loved one's severe depression and attempted suicide. Its message is relevant and stark. Its story might make you cry a bit; it certainly will

make you laugh. Its star is brilliant.

The production also includes an art show, "The Turquoise Invitational," in Black Box Theatre's gallery.

"Understand the work behind your job," Gallegos said.

If you want to do makeup professionally, practice as much as you can, she said. "Do it on everybody. That's how you learn and that's how you keep learning. You just do it."

Fully vaccinated but still full of questions

I'm fully vaccinated but I'm not going out yet. And even though you may be fully vaccinated, I'm not ready to invite you into my home. I ask that you respect my decision.

As a 90-year-old who is positive for all the Covid-19 risk factors, I don't really enjoy any room for error in how I manage my exposure to the coronavirus. While mask mandates are being abandoned across the U.S. and many now believe they may do as they please, I will continue to stay home except for medical appointments. When I go to a doctor, I will continue to wear a mask and disposable gloves.

My wonderful internist agrees that this is the best strategy. Important

unknowns about the Covid-19 vaccines identified by the U. S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) make caution the prudent approach.

First, the CDC says that it is still learning the degree to which vaccinated people who don't have symptoms can still spread the virus. This means that even though you are vaccinated, there's still a possibility that you could infect others.

Second, the CDC says it is still learning how long Covid-19 vaccines protect people. A booster shot may be needed at some point.

Third, the CDC says it is still learning about how

effective the vaccines are against the many new variants of the virus that are popping up across the globe — many of which have appeared in the United States. In fact, other scientists recently reported that Pfizer's vaccine — the vaccine I received — elicited a weaker antibody response

to the Delta variant, first detected in India, than the original virus, especially among older people. This raises the probability that a booster shot will be needed.

Considered together, these three unknowns regarding the protectiveness of the vaccines mean that

vaccinated people may still be vulnerable to Covid.

We also must keep in mind that there are many unvaccinated pockets in our country where the virus continues to run rampant, sickening and killing people at elevated rates. I continue to pray for the many people who are still struggling to gain access to the vaccine, both in this country and across the world.

I also continue to pray for the unmasked "rugged individualists" who refuse to get vaccinated. Their actions around those who would like to stay far away from them often show deep disrespect for humankind. Many people much younger and healthier than I are likewise not ready to return to their

pre-pandemic patterns of behavior. They continue to wear masks and try to socially distance when they must go out.

But I understand from them that it is much more difficult to maintain a distance now because so many are increasingly returning to their old ways — carelessly crowding others, pushing toward the item they want to buy or toward the route they want to take — all while going maskless and, frequently, talking energetically into their cellphones. All caution has been thrown to the wind without concern for those who are trying to be careful and keep a distance.

Scientists and public health specialists readily acknowledge that they

don't know what courses the coronavirus and its many variants will still take. While vaccines have provided a significant improvement in the forecast for humanity, no one can say with certainty that the worst is over and that we are now safe to do as we please.

Let's do our best to respect others' choices if they are not ready to return to their previous ways.

The City Parks and Recreation Department will begin scheduling

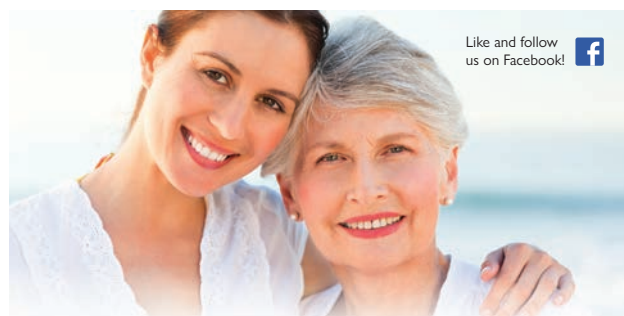
times to demonstrate how to use the park's new equipment, the news release said, with schedules to be announced. Parks and Rec staff will begin offering AARP-

A Bite of Belgium doesn't waffle with triumphant re-opening

"We brought the inside out," A Bite of Belgium owner Jodie York said about their huge dining tent – it can seat up to 250 people – located behind the restaurant at 741 N. Alameda Blvd., No. 16.

Planter boxes are filled with colorful flowers, plants and even strawberries, and the interior is cooled by two five-ton air conditioners and medical-

grade air ducts, she said. It even has music and chandeliers. The tent offers the same customer service to outdoor diners, and there are even restrooms nearby.

"We want to be here for Las Cruces," said Jodie York, who opened A Bite of Belgium with her husband, Jim, in October 2012. They have owned Telstar Networks of Las Cruces since 1980.

The Yorks and their staff survived a kitchen

fire in May 2018 that closed the restaurant for more than three months. After a grand re-opening that August, they were making plans to expand when Covid-19 hit. The Yorks stopped indoor service twice because of public health orders, but still managed to serve 450 people curbside last Thanksgiving. A planned full re-opening in February was delayed two weeks because of road construction on Van Patten Avenue on the restaurant's north side.

Jodie York said she received texts from many regular customers "to make sure we were OK. Talk about making you feel good," she said.

Regulars have returned to dine in the tent or back inside the building from Las Cruces, El Paso and surrounding areas and from as far away as Albuquerque, Phoenix and Tucson.

"We must be doing something right," Jodie York said.

And even when public health orders are lifted and the restaurant can return to 100 percent indoor service, the Yorks have no plans to take down the tent. Their guests are loving outdoor dining, Jodie York said, and she and her husband plan to continue it and also to use the tent

for large events.

"We wanted it up for good," Jodie York said.

A Bite of Belgium serves breakfast all day and also serves lunch. You can call ahead and make reservations for both meals.

The restaurant's menu includes its signature Belgian waffles and even Belgian biscuits made from waffle dough and a "Belgian Burger" made with caramelized onions and Gouda cheese. It also has a gluten-free menu. The Yorks already have a beer and wine license and, under the state's new liquor law, will soon add a full bar, Jodie York said.

As it continues to thrive and grow, A Bite of Belgium is looking to hire more staff, Jodie York

said. It currently has 25 employees, but needs 35, she said, and is hiring all positions, including servers, bussers, line cooks and prep cooks.

"I do appreciate my staff," Jodie York said. "They work hard for us."

Workforce development is a team sport for Doña Ana County

But since then, the work of the Workforce Talent Collaborative in partnership with The Bridge of Southern New Mexico has expanded dramatically — uniquely positioning our county for economic recovery post-Covid. Our collective work never stopped during the shut-

down — it only became more urgent.

Now that reopening lies just ahead of us, we took time to revisit what we set out to do together and celebrate just how far we have come, opening new opportunities and resources to help our people and our businesses access everything they need to emerge from Covid hopefully stronger than before.

We have mobilized on numerous solutions, thanks to the strengths of our relationships and state-leading research, evaluation and action. In fact, together we now have at a minimum gained funding, resources and/or oversight of \$42.6 million to support the goals, objectives and actions that we set out to do together.

Here's a list of some of this amazing group's collective accomplishments.

Funding

- \$1.1 million annually for career and technical education now supports high school and college courses that prepare students for many of the highest-potential careers in our community's top eight industries.
- \$865,000 three-year grant from the W.K.

- \$72,000 in grants to The Bridge to bring employers into closer collaboration with education and workforce providers by understanding and communicating the top credentials, degrees and skills needed in their

industries and opening new work-based learning opportunities for teachers and students.

• \$90,000 from the New Mexico Legislature to the South-Central Regional Transit to support transportation from Las Cruces to the great jobs in the Santa Teresa industrial parks.

• \$37,000 to The Bridge to build out New Mexico True Talent, a one-stop, bilingual website and mobile app to shine a light on these amazing opportunities and how to prepare for them.

• \$10,000 to bring a STEM-focused, social/emotional support program called EduGuide to middle-school students in the Gadsden district.

New collaborations

We are currently working with four local employers and all three districts to launch cross-district virtual internships for high-school students in

aerospace, international trade and digital media.

The City of Las Cruces worked through its Human Resources Department to hire a career coordinator to launch new efforts in mentorship and internships for high-school students.

Doña Ana Community College is working in close partnership with the City of Las Cruces on two new educational efforts for those receiving Temporary Assistance for Needy Families funding.

Oversight/influence

Thanks to the state-leading work of this group, we now have three members of our Collaborative on the State Workforce Development Board, which oversees annual funding of approximately \$25 million, and three other mem-

bers on the Southwestern Area Workforce Development Board which serves our county and six others with about \$5.5 million.

As we've always said, the power of our community lies in the power of our collaboration... working together toward common goals. Together, we know we will see a strong economic recovery for people, families and communities, as we emerge from the Covid pandemic.

"EVUS technology supports the hot water-based heating market and other

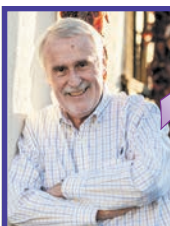

Aggie greats who climbed summit

Back when I was a kid, I remember my mother once asking: “Are the basketball playoffs still going on? Seems like they’ve been on TV for a couple of months now.”

Well, that’s the beauty of it, if you love basketball.

I, for one, know exactly what I will be doing for the next six weeks, each night, up until the NBA Finals wrap up in late July.

I will be parked in a comfortable chair, a Dr Pepper and bag of chips nearby, watching the NBA playoffs.

It’s that time of year when high-school and New Mexico State University sports are dying down and it’s time to look elsewhere for some sports action.

And it’s not a hard decision on what to watch, especially if you are a basketball junkie, like I am.

Of course, the past year has been tough on all of us, with the pandemic. So not being able to see the Aggies or any college basketball in person may not have been the worst thing in the world, but it felt like a big void.

This year, the NBA playoffs have been great entertainment and have featured the return of real-live fans to arenas around the country.

It also features probably the most wide-open field we have seen in years.

All four remaining teams in the West have never won an NBA title, and in the East, it has been decades since three of the four teams have won it all. And the prohibitive favorite to win it all, the Brooklyn Nets, have never won a championship since joining the NBA in 1976-77.

Of course, this all got me thinking about the rich history of NMSU basketball.

Several Aggie players have won championship rings as professionals.

The Nets, back when they called Long Island, New York, home, did win two ABA titles before joining the more established NBA.

Everyone, of course, remembers the high-flying, game-changing Julius “Dr. J” Erving, but one of Erving’s talented Nets teammates had a strong

NMSU connection.

John Williamson played for the Aggies in 1971-73 and was known as Super John. He was a key part of both of the Nets’ title teams. In an eight-year ABA and NBA career, Super John averaged 17.5 points.

Williamson had such a big impact on the Nets franchise, he is one of just seven players to have their uniform number retired by the team.

Tragically, Williamson died young at age 45 after suffering an illness related to diabetes. Those who saw him play during his time at NMSU say he is certainly one of the greatest players to ever lace them up here in Las Cruces.

Randy Brown, who played for the Aggies in 1989-91, also tasted the ultimate in team success.

Brown was an important player off the bench during the second of the Chicago Bulls’ three-peats during the Michael

Jordan era and was a fan favorite for his high energy and enthusiastic play.

And more recently, Pascal Siakam, who played for NMSU in 2014-16, was a standout on the Toronto Raptors’ title team that ended the Golden State Warriors’ dynasty in 2019.

Of course, the first time I ever heard of NMSU was in reference to the great Sam Lacey, who played 13 years in the NBA, mostly with the Cincinnati Royals/Kansas City Kings, who are now the Sacramento Kings.

Lacey, a prized early Lou Henson recruit and an integral cog in the Aggies’ 1970 Final Four team, never won an NBA title. But he was a fearsome big man who played well enough to have his No. 44 jersey retired by the Kings franchise.

He always made a big impression on this native Californian, when I was a

Beyond the rules of the game to golf etiquette

It's time to talk about golf etiquette. Etiquette is a nice word that translates as "stop doing stupid things to annoy others and make you look like a fool."

Unlike sports such as tailgating and mud wrestling, golf is thought to be a genteel game that is rich with tradition and has quite a number of practices falling under the umbrella of sporting manners.

Arnold Palmer once had this to say: "From the time I first stepped on a golf course, my father made sure that I observed golf etiquette. What that meant to me then, and what it means now, is being considerate of other golfers, taking care of the course, playing quickly and controlling my temper." Amen.

For some who are new to the game, and some who simply have not had anyone explain golfing things to them, golfers are expected to adhere to some rather universal customs and behaviors; in other words they practice good golf etiquette.

Golf is a game that relies on the integrity of each player to show re-

spect for other players, to not only abide by the rules of the game but to play fair and be considerate to fellow golfers. According to the official USGA dictum, "All players should conduct themselves in a disciplined manner, demonstrating courtesy and sportsmanship at

all times, irrespective of how competitive they may be. This is the spirit of the game." With the help of the USGA guidelines, let's look at some of the "do's" and "don'ts."

First: Be on time and ready to play so that you don't inconvenience others.

Next: Dress neatly and appropriately in normal golf attire and in accordance with local dress codes.

Choose the teeing ground that best matches your ability. Play "ready golf" whenever possible, meaning that the player who is ready should step up and play without delay. Stay silent and still, while other players are hitting their shots or putting.

Wherever you stand, strive to be as unobtrusive as possible when other are hitting. Wait until the

group up ahead is out of range of your best shot. Hitting into the group ahead is the most common source of antagonism on the golf course.

Walk or ride briskly between shots and holes, and be ready to play when it's your turn. Respect the golf course by replacing or sanding divots and raking bunkers. It's a courtesy to leave the course in better condition than you found it.

Carry a small ball mark repair tool with you and be sure to repair your ball mark (called a "pitch mark") on the putting green.

Avoid stepping on the line that other players are putting on. Brush up on your rules of golf so that rules and decisions and procedures go smoothly and quickly.

Throwing and slamming of clubs, temper tantrums, and rude, obnoxious behavior are never acceptable. Keep your motorized golf cart well out of the way and behind other players; drive safely and away from greens, while minimizing damage to the turf.

Treat others with respect. Behavior should be always as a gentleman or a lady.

Other suggestions would not necessarily be found in USGA or PGA Tour instructions but they are certainly worth heeding.

First, never stand directly behind a player hitting on the tee, or any other place on the golf course for that matter. It's simply inconsiderate; on tour it may be grounds for a penalty.

On the putting green, be conscious of the line of the putts for other players and walk carefully to avoid stepping on the "thru lines," which are those lines directly on the other side of the hole following the through direction of the putt.

We haven't covered everything, as there are lots of other situations where we need to know prevail-

ing protocol and customs, such as playing "business golf," playing at an exclusive private club, playing in "member-guest" events and pro-ams. A future column in the making.
