FEDERAL FUNDS HELP COUNTY AND RESIDENTS

In the spring, the county was notified it would receive direct allocation of \$42,381,821 under State and Local Coronavirus Recovery Funds through the federal American Rescue Plan Act. Funding received will accelerate ongoing efforts to recover from the pandemic, including public health and economic impact, based on action taken by the Doña Ana County Board of Commissioners, Tuesday.

The funds are distributed in two separate installments. The county already received more than \$21 million in May and the remainder will be received in 2022. The intent of the funds is to help local governments stabilize their operating budgets after having unexpected, pandemic-related costs; and strategically use the funds for the betterment of communities, while adhering to the U.S. Department of Treasury guidelines.

At Tuesday's meeting, the commissioners unanimously approved the Doña Ana County State and Local Coronavirus Plan, which identified how more than \$32 million in American Rescue Plan Act funds will be spent, over the next three years. Over \$10 million remains available for the county to fund additional priorities or increase the allocation for approved projects in the plan.

"Moving forward, the Board will review progress of the approved plan and identify additional priorities," Doña Ana County Board Chair Manuel Sanchez noted. "We look forward to sharing this information with the residents so that they can see the progress and continue to have an open dialogue with their respective commissioner."

"The intent of the plan was to ensure that the county reviewed ongoing needs that our community had identified and then prioritized those needs for funding," stated County Manager Fernando R. Macias. "That is why broadband, flood mitigation, and behavioral health were prioritized."

Among the county's plan includes the following priorities:

- Respond to economic harms faced by small businesses by providing financial support through a fund to be determined.
- Address the medical bill burdens of county residents due to COVID-19, through a direct medical relief fund, to be established.
- Invest in flood mitigation for lower-income communities.
- Support countywide broadband accessibility.
- Additional funding to equip first responders with needed equipment.
- Improve ventilation in county buildings that house public health entities.
- Design and select a site for a new emergency management building.
- Construct an all-hazard shelter at the county fairgrounds, aiming at low congregate sheltering, to decrease concerns with disease transmission and functional needs of individuals.
- Conduct an emergency communications assessment.
- Address behavioral health and mental health disparity exacerbated by the pandemic through a recovery center assessment, mobile triage crisis unit and behavioral health services.
- Support affordable housing development to meet the needs of the most vulnerable residents.

The county will provide updates to the public when the direct assistance funds are established.

This county plan is part of a larger fund development strategy to secure and leverage monies from local, state and federal sources to fulfill the county's mission to enhance the health, safety, and quality of life for all residents. Since the announcement of the allocated funding under the American Rescue Plan Act, county management staff and commissioners completed an internal needs assessment, conducted community outreach and coordinated with other jurisdictions in the development of plan recommendations.

Parade entries celebrate America, end of pandemic

"I think the Electric Light Parade signals the restart of our city, state and our nation," Mayor Ken Miyagishima said.

"I think it also sends a message to our residents that we appreciate their patience and sense of community during the past 16 months," the mayor said, "and that we look forward to what the future has in store for us as Las Cruces."

The parade, which will begin at 9 p.m. Saturday, July 3, comes two days after Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham lifted all state public health restrictions on business operations and public gatherings that had been imposed because of Covid-19.

The parade will include 39 entries, said City of Las Cruces Recreation Services Supervisor Crystal Cooper. It will feature: more than 240 vehicles, including a crane; 28 floats representing businesses; UTV/SXS groups; vehicle clubs, sports teams and clubs; local Republican and Democratic parties; military and veterans' organizations; local law enforcement; and a Las Cruces Fire Department firetruck.

Zia Natural Gas Company will be defending its title — the company won best commercial float in 2018 and 2019, and was second in 2017. There was no parade last year

because of Covid-19. (The 2019 best non-commercial float winner was Las Cruces High School Class of 1971. The non-commercial winner in 2018 was Greater Mesilla Valley Aerostat Ascension Association, with the LCHS Class of 1971 finishing second. The best overall float winner in 2019 was Hernandez Plumbing; in 2018 it was Potter's House Christian Center Church.)

"We're having a great time with this," said Zia technician Johnathan Bunker. Bunker said he, Keith Cox and Christopher "CJ" Wahe of Zia have done a lot of the design and building of the float, with assistance from virtually every company employee.

"We put our heart and soul into this thing," Bunker said. "We're proud of who we work for and what we're doing."

The float will require three generators, plus a

5,000-watt inverter on the truck that will tow it, to operate all of the float's lights, said Zia Regional Manager Ron Reynolds.

The float includes a tribute to the raising of the American flag on Iwo Jima and the Statue of Liberty, complete with live flame.

Purple Heart order on upswing after years of doldrums

"I'm here to brag for them," City of Las Cruces Veterans Advisory Board member Rod Gajewski said about Raymundo Rivera III, Greg "Doc" Long and Jeronimo Del Bozque.

"If it wasn't for them, the chapter wouldn't have gotten going again," Gajewski said, referring to the Mesilla Valley Military Order of the Purple Heart, Chapter 2004 (MVMOPH), which was started in Mesilla in the 1990s, languished after a few years and was revitalized in 2015 in Las Cruces.

"It was a lot of work," said Long, a Purple Heart recipient for his service in Vietnam in 1966-67 with the U.S. Navy and Marine Corps, a past commander of MVMOPH and a current post trustee.

Long said he attended a veterans' event in Albuquerque and talked to another veteran who was wearing a Purple Heart shirt. That revived his interest in having a vibrant Purple Heart chapter in Las Cruces. He, Rivera, Bozque and Oscar Duran each donated \$100, "and that's how it restarted," Long said.

Las Cruces became the second Purple Heart city in New Mexico and 99th in the country in August 2015. A year to the day later, chapter members joined local Gold Star mothers in dedicating a Purple Heart monument at Veterans Memorial Park in Las Cruces. And, Mayor Ken Miyagishima and the Las Cruces City Council declared Aug. 7, 2017 as Purple Heart Day in Las Cruces.

On Aug. 7, 1782, Gen. George Washington created the military decoration that would become the Purple Heart. It honors members of the armed forces who have been wounded in combat, and

it became an official military decoration in 1935.

Recipients were "wounded all over the world," said Rivera, a corporal in the U.S. Marine Corps who received a Purple Heart in 1968 during his service in the Vietnam War. He still has a metal plate in his head from the severe injury he received.

It took Rivera five years to learn to talk again after the injury, he said. He is a member of the New Mexico State Council of the Vietnam Veterans of America and, like Long and Del Bozque, is a member of the U.S. Marine Corps League.

The oldest MVMOPH member is Paul Roach,

who is in his 90s and is the chapter's only World War II veteran, Gajewski said. The chapter also has four veterans of the Korean War, six veterans of the Gulf War, two active-duty military members and one woman.

If he sees anyone driving a vehicle with a Purple Heart license plate, Long said he will "chase you down and give you an application" to join MVMOPH.

The local chapter has grown from six to 65 members since it was restarted, and regularly helps Purple Heart recipients and their families "whatever their needs," Gajewski said. The chap-

ter also regularly participates in veterans parades and conducts a candle placement ceremony every Memorial Day at Veterans Memorial Park in Las Cruces. On May 31 this year, chapter members placed 204 candles on the Veterans Memorial Park wall to honor the fallen since World War I.

Chapter members devote a lot of time and resources to the 150 retired military living at the New Mexico State Veterans Home in Truth or Consequences. They recently donated more than 400 pairs of diabetic socks to the men and women at the home. They have also donated a wheelchair and

other necessities to Veterans Home residents.

"Those people appreciated us coming," Gajewski said.

On their last visit, residents were "grinning like kids," he said. "It just made their day somebody cared to actually come up there and do that."

Now that Covid-19 is receding, chapter members can also begin hosting ice cream socials at the Veterans Home every few months, Long said.

The chapter also has sponsored a local veteran on an Honor Flight. Chapter members have also helped veterans get the

"We are looking forward in entering our float, and to be part of our community event," Ortega said. "We hope the community enjoys it."

Ortega said nine people, including family and friends, will have worked more than 100 hours on the float by the time it was ready for the parade. Including lights, red, white and blue bunting and American flags, the float follows the parade theme of Stars and Stripes Forever.

History lesson

July 4 celebrates the Continental Congress' official declaration Thursday, July 4, 1776, that the 13 American colonies were no longer under the authority of Great

Britain's King George III and were "free and independent states," creating what would become the United States of America.

On July 2 in Philadelphia, the Continental Congress adopted the Lee Resolution, also known as The Resolution for Independence, asserting independence from Great Britain. However, the official declaration wasn't made until July 4. The

resolution was proposed June 6, 1776 by Richard Henry Lee (1732-94), a Founding Father and signer of the Declaration of Independence. Lee served as justice of the peace for his native Westmoreland County, Virginia, as a member of the Virginia House of Burgesses, three times as a member of the Continental Congress, a member of the Virginia House of Del-

egates, president of the Confederation Congress and a U.S. senator from Virginia.

Three American presidents died on July 4: John Adams and Thomas Jefferson died a few hours apart July 4, 1826, the 50th anniversary of Independence Day; and James Madison died July 4, 1831. The 30th president, Calvin Coolidge, was born July 4, 1872.

The U.S. Congress made Independence Day an unpaid holiday for federal employees in 1870. It became a paid holiday by an act of Congress in 1938.

This year marks the

245th anniversary of July 4. The United States will celebrate its semiquincentennial (also called sescentennial or quarter millennial (250th anniversary) July 4, 2026.

retirement and medical benefits they are entitled to, and, sometimes, the military decorations they are entitled to but have never received.

Local veteran Frank Tuma, for example, spent more than a year in a hospital after his Vietnam War injury with the U.S.

Army.

It took 49 years for Tuma to receive the Purple Heart he had earned. He finally got it in 2019.

"We look after each other," Gajewski said.

MVMOPH members also help New Mexico State University ROTC students operate a water station during the annual Bataan Memorial Death March at White Sands Missile Range.

Reviving the Las Cruces chapter of the Military Order of the Purple Heart is "real important," Long said, "because people today don't really know the price of freedom." Long was a corpsman (medic) with the Navy

and Marines who was wounded saving the lives of other Marines in Vietnam.

"They don't respect it," Gajewski said.

"People don't understand the price that you

pay for your freedom," Del Bozque said.

"They don't understand the sacrifice you have made," he added.

Del Bozque joined the Marines in 1953 and retired in 1977.

MVMOPH meets monthly in Las Cruces.

Policing changed for the better thanks to new marijuana law

Frank and I were home after our first year of college, and Bruce had just graduated from high school in the summer of 1977 when we decided it would be safe to smoke pot in an abandoned field off a quiet road.

We were in an abandoned field because none of us had a home of our own at the time. We were all staying with our parents for the summer. Several years ago, a Sunland Park City Council member got caught driving around town getting high with his buddies. And I wondered, doesn't that man have a living room?

The abandoned field wasn't safe. The police officers dumped our baggie into the wind, took down information from our IDs,

gave us a stern talking to and ended by threatening that they would "talk to their shift commander about what to do next." There was no next.

With the benefit of 44 years hindsight, I can now see that the officers were both reasonable and professional. But that didn't stop us from cursing the "pigs" later that night while passing around joints at a party where we told and retold the story over and over, ginning up more outrage with each new telling.

That was my only experience with the police back then, but they were never far from my mind. Anytime I was buying from a person I didn't know that well, or trying

to find a place away from home to smoke, I was always worried and on high alert.

I suspect my friends and I were never far from the officers' minds either. Enforcement of marijuana laws was a huge part of a policeman's job back then. The Drug Enforcement Administration had just been created four years earlier, in 1973. Mandatory sentencing laws would soon follow.

For my friends and me, it created an us-against-them mentality toward police that still exists, although to a much lesser extent. And I do regret the porcine slurs.

That same 44 years of hindsight tells me that my friends and I had a privilege that we did not recognize or understand at the time. The officers

were never angry or acted aggressively toward us. I never felt in any kind of physical danger. And, I always suspected we would be able to talk our way out of it.

I now know that others in that same situation would not have had my sense of confidence or expectation that all would end well.

The job of police officers in New Mexico changed for the better Tuesday, when possession of marijuana became legal. According to Sheriff Kim Stewart, the job has been changing for some time. It's been a while since marijuana enforcement has been a priority, she said.

That's a good thing. There has been a loud cry for police reform during the past year, since the

death of George Floyd. Reform should not mean defunding the police, but it should mean reassessing how we use those resources, and what we can reasonably expect from police officers.

If the war on drugs has proven anything, it's the limitations of law enforcement. Police officers can and should investigate, solve and work to prevent

crimes. But we need to better define what is, and what is not, a crime

Police can't change society. They can't mend our bad habits or dictate our private activities. And nobody should have ever suggested to them that they could.

Las Cruces Utilities Locators Keep An Eye On the Prize

At Las Cruces Utilities (LCU), Darrell Morales spends his workday on the hunt using specialized equipment to find things the eyes can't see. Darrell is a trained utility line Locator and part of a team of Locators who keep track of the miles of gas, water, and sewer lines that service LCU's territory. Each day, Darrell is in the field marking underground lines and updating the LCU digital mapping system that lets customers know where the utility lines are located when they call 811.

Recently, members of the LCU Locator team received certification training from Staking University (SU). Instructors provided classroom and field lessons for all experience levels. "The training was really informative and thorough and explained

exactly what I need to do in the field and the equipment I need to use. It also included the different variables and obstacles I may face every day," said Darrell Morales, LCU gas Locator. The seminars are designed to aid locators in developing superior troubleshooting techniques, skills to consistently provide accurate and complete utility location information and a mastery of locating equipment. Following the two-day seminar, Darrell was required to pass an exam to be certified. "This was my very first experience with the Staking University lessons. I've been locating for over five years, and I believe I'm good at it, but this training was a lot more in-depth than my last job," said Darrell. Darrell's day starts early in the morning, and while

his shift ends around three in the afternoon, every day is different. As he puts it, "You can be called out at two in the morning or 10:30 at night. The city never sleeps and there's always something going on such as a gas or water emergency somewhere," said Darrell. There's no such thing as a typical day for LCU Locators. From collecting GPS (global positioning system) data and uploading it to the mapping system to responding to emergencies such as a

water main leak, no two days are the same. And when it comes to leaks, the locating team is on the spot marking the gas lines to ensure that the line is protected when an emergency repair is being done on another utility line. "Our days go from real busy to just being really hammered with a lot of work," laughed Darrell.

Darrell and his fellow crew members are responsible for locating all active gas lines during emergencies and non-emergencies. "LCU gives us several tools and resources along with maps. The equipment itself varies because not all the lines are the same, some are steel or poly (polyethylene)," said Morales.

While Darrell Morales is new to the LCU family, he's dedicated to his job. "I love my job. I'm looking forward to being here," concluded Darrell.

Firework Safety for your Trash Bin

Hot coals from BBQs and unused fireworks can cause fires in your trash bin, which can end up causing a whole trash truck to catch fire.

Just when you think you've picked up all the used firework shells from your front yard, be careful with the smoldering remains or unused fireworks that could accidentally set off something more dangerous – like a fire in your trash bin.

"It's not just fireworks," said Miguel Fernandez, South Central Solid Waste Authority program administrator. "We also see the coals from BBQs during the summer months. People think they are out when they throw them in the trash bin. One little spark and it catch other material on fire – especially if it's flammable."

Like hot coals in the summer and hot ashes from a fireplace in the winter, fireworks that may not have burned out are a part of the Fourth of July holiday, along with the trash that tends to end up spilling into the desert.

But when a fire starts in the trash, the best-case scenario would be that it just ends up melting a bin that needs to be

replaced at a cost to the customer. The worst-case scenario could cause an entire truckload to burn if it gets picked up while the bin still has a spark. Even if the homeowner's bin doesn't catch fire, which is already dangerous as it's usually next to the home, it's also hard to know what else is in the trash truck.

This warning also extends to commercial bins, the big 6- or 8-cubic yard metal dumpsters. When a fire starts in a metal dumpster, the rubberized lid

can catch fire and melt, and the paint on the dumpster bubbles up from the heat. The dumpster must be sandblasted, repainted, and the lid replaced, a cost passed onto the customer.

There are plenty of dangerous items you shouldn't throw in your trash bin – like car batteries, paint, oil, or fluorescent light bulbs, or fluorescent light fixtures with ballasts – but coals and unfinished fireworks can make your party end up more costly than intended.

College rocket engineers compete in Spaceport America Cup

Seventy-five teams of college engineering students from around the world participated in the 2021 Spaceport America Cup sending rockets climbing into the clouds in a variety of different categories. After the event was canceled in 2020 due to the pandemic, students were eager to get back onto the rocket platforms and compete in the Experimental Sounding Rocket Association (ESRA) event.

The overall winner of the cup for 2021 was the team from the University of Minnesota, Twin Cities. Spaceport America has announced the return of an in-person Spaceport America Cup in 2022 from June 21-25 at the closing ceremony of the 2021 virtual event.

"Congratulations to the University of Minnesota, Twin Cities and all the other teams that competed in the 2021 Virtual Spaceport America Cup," said Spaceport America Executive Director Scott McLaughlin. "The event

turnout has been incredible, and the caliber of the design and innovation has really impressed us. We look forward to welcoming the teams back to New Mexico in 2022."

"ESRA is extremely pleased to be able to provide a virtual competition this year," said ESRA President Cliff Olmsted. "The level of engagement and commitment by university teams competing from across the globe has been outstanding and inspiring. These teams are paving the way to the future. We are looking forward to the 2022 competition."

The Spaceport America Cup is the world's largest intercollegiate rocketry engineering contest (IREC) and has been held in New Mexico since 2017. Over 1,700 students and faculty come to Southern New Mexico for the annual IREC competition. Drawn by the opportunity to collaborate and

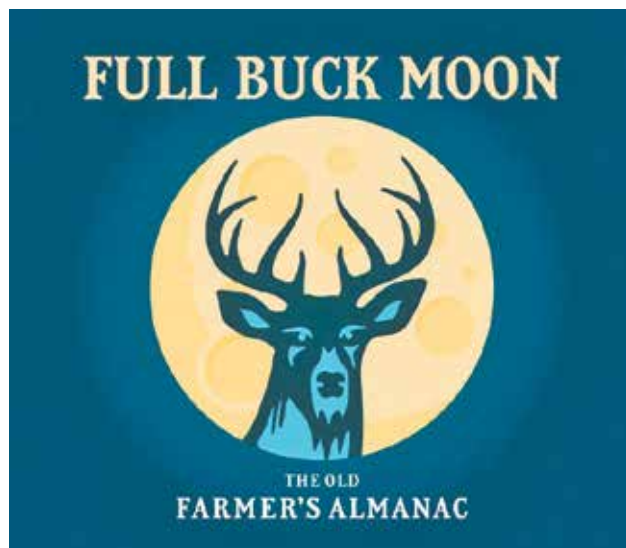
July a long, hot month but filled with historic moments in NM

July is an important month historically for New Mexico.

Pat Garrett shot and killed Billy the Kid July 14, 1881 in Fort Sumner; on July 8, 1947, Roswell Army Air Field issued a news release saying it had recovered a "flying disc" near Corona, New Mexico, riveting worldwide attention on what has become known as the Roswell UFO Incident; and on July 16, 1945, the experimental atomic bomb called "Fat Boy" was set off a few seconds before 5:30 a.m.



at Trinity Site, about 118 miles north of Las Cruces, on what was then the

United States Army Air Forces Alamogordo Bombing and Gunnery Range

and is now part of White Sands Missile Range.

Another world-famous New Mexico icon, Smokey Bear, almost has a July anniversary. Smokey first appeared on an Advertising Council poster as part of its campaign to prevent forest fires Aug. 9, 1944. A real, live baby black bear that would be named Smokey was rescued by a forest ranger after the Capitan Gap wildfire in the Lincoln National Forest that started May 4, 1950. He lived at the National Zoo in Washington, D.C. until his death Nov. 9, 1976.

The calendar year

reached its halfway point Friday, July 2, the 183rd day of 2021.

Looking ahead from July 3, it's 81 days until the fall equinox (Sept. 22), 120 days until Halloween, 127 days until the end of Daylight Saving Time (Nov. 7), 122 days until the combined local election (Nov. 2), 145 days until Thanksgiving (Nov. 25), 175 days until Christmas

This option sounds great. However, I didn't choose to rewind. I think changing my past decisions would be detrimental to my future. All the

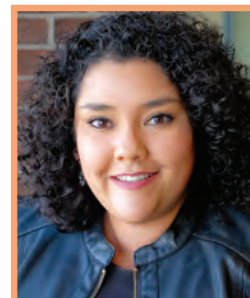
choices I've made, good or bad, wise or stupid, reckless or cautious, are what make me who I am.

Rio Grande Theatre (RGT) Venue Manager Chris Faivre (FAY-ver) and his staff have done a lot of work during the pandemic to make the theater an even more welcoming Downtown venue. And, after a lengthy shutdown, the historic RGT will reopen with live theater, movies and other programming in July.

The theater's newly renovated ADA section now includes six disabled-accessible spaces and six spaces for companions, Faivre said. Previous renovations were made to the stage, the lobby and the concession area. The theater, which is owned and operated by the City of Las Cruces, also has a full bar. Including its balcony, RGT seats about 390.

"We are ready to move forward," Faivre said.

Live theater returns to RGT with productions of "The Mad Ones," by Bree Lowdermilk and Kait Kerrigan, running July 2-18, and "The Complete History of America (Abridged)" by Adam Long, Reed Martin and Austin Tichenor, running on Wednesdays from July 7-28. Both are presented by Las Cruces-based Blank Conversations Theatre Company, founded by New Mexico State University Theatre Department student Gus Sanchez.

RGT provided a venue for a Children's Theatre of

the Mesilla Valley (ACT) and Doña Ana Repertory Theatre (DART) productions before Covid-19 and looks forward to working

with them and other local production companies as live, indoor theater returns, Faivre said.

RGT's Classic Film

Series and Saturday Kids Dollar Movies both return July 24 with, respectively, "Dr. Strangelove (or: How I Learned to Stop Worry-

ing and Love the Bomb)" and "The Lion King."

RGT will also have a special Halloween triple feature and movies during Space Festival Week.

"We're always looking for fun content," he said.

Faivre has also begun booking national and regional performers and productions into the theater.

A Blues and Rock Series at RGT will include Marc Black's History of the 50's and 60's through Popular Song, Sept. 25; Oldies but Goodies, Oct. 2; and Eli Cook, June 3, 2022.

The Mr. Skynyrd Band, a Lynyrd Skynyrd tribute band, will perform Aug. 27. Stairway to Zeppelin, a Led Zeppelin tribute band, will perform Feb. 12, 2022. The Long Run (As the Alter Eagles), an Eagles tribute band, will perform March 25-26.

As performers make up dates that were canceled

across the country and around the world because of the pandemic, it will likely take the industry 12 to 18 months to recover from the backlog of makeup dates due to the shutdown, Faivre said.

In addition to serving as RGT venue manager, Faivre is also interim Downtown coordinator for the City of Las Cruces. 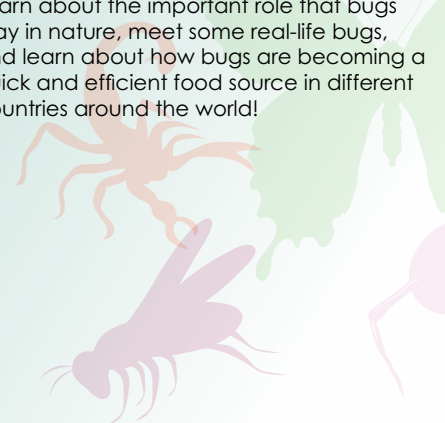

Reading Bible can't exist in a personal vacuum

Biblical texts cannot be read in a vacuum, as if there were no safeguards to prevent one person pushing a private agenda. The history of interpretation reveals several checks against idiosyncratic readings.

First, these texts come to us "read in communities" in which they interplay with ritual and drama, with art and hymnody. The strong hymn tradition of Germany and Britain, for example, provided powerful tools for ongoing interpretation of the Bible, as does the tradition of icons in Orthodoxy.

Second, these texts come to us enmeshed in a history of interpretation.

This rich history enables their reading. Protestantism took from the past what it found useful and consistent and pushed forward with its own history of interpretation. Orthodoxy

and Catholicism took from the past the interpretations of renowned Bible readers such as Basil of Caesarea, Origen and Augustine of Hippo.

Third, these texts are read within helpful constraints and boundaries known as the Great Tradition; this Great Tradition consists of patristic readings, liturgical texts, decisions of church councils and the witness of the lives, deeds and teachings of the saints. This consensus pervaded

the whole of the Eastern and Western arms of the one, holy, catholic and apostolic church for 1,000 years. It is being slowly recovered across denominational lines. The "Ancient Christian Commentary on Scripture" – 29 books with comments by early interpreters on the entire bible – was edited by a Methodist, with contributors from many backgrounds.

Any notion of "Scripture alone" is a fallacy. This notion emerged out of a historical dilemma in the Western church and it came to a head in the 16th century with the Protestant Reformation. Confronted with what was perceived as a twisted reading of Scripture, these reformers sought a way out and, thus, called for a return to the sources, which became in time a

position called "sola scriptura" – "Scripture alone" – a position never previously held in the church. However, any check on the original writings of the principal reformers – Calvin and Luther – would reveal that they were steeped in the Great Tradition. They had no intention of abandoning the tradition the church bore over centuries.

One late New Testament letter, Second Peter, says, "No prophecy of the Scripture is of private (idios in Greek, meaning one's personal take) interpretation." For the writer of Second Peter, there was already a context and a community in which scripture was read and interpreted. Yet, sadly, emphasis on private interpretation drove the Western church from the

Reformation forward. Independent and idiosyncratic interpretations of the scripture led to a further fractured church – what we see in our midst today. Hence the multitude of "denominations".

Without the constraint of a central consensus of interpretation, over centuries all sorts of novel ideas reduced the body of Christ to bits and pieces, sometimes warring with each other. This is understandable. When the late medieval Catholic church stonewalled the reformers, they had to fend for themselves. They were forced outside and, thus, had to re-invent "church" for their followers. We might wish none of this tragic history had happened, but it is the backstory of Western Christianity, and it is

foundational for American Christianity.

The recovery of the Great Tradition can be of great help now. As we continue to experience church-shrinkage everywhere, return to tradition can unify the witness and word of the churches. It may be that we should see this recovery as a gift of God rather than lamenting the loss of people in pews. Out of renewal will come a stronger, albeit smaller, church of the future.

The Diocese of Las Cruces has a new priest.
Francis Gyau, a native

of Ghana in West Africa, was ordained on June 3 into the order of the Presbyterate, which is one of the three holy orders of the church and is considered the second order of the priesthood.

The ordination Mass was presided over by Las Cruces Bishop Peter Baldacchino at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

In this ceremony, Gyau became a priest and was bestowed with the ability to minister in Christ's name.

When he was a youngster, Gyau was active in his local parish church in Ghana, where he volunteered. He studied mathematics in college, joined the campus ministry and was active in the Legion of Mary, where he fostered his understanding of Scripture and Catholic doctrine.

He moved to the United States in 2013, and he joined the Diocese of Las Cruces as a seminarian after he completed his master's degree in math from New Mexico State

University.

"He hopes to be a fitting bridge between God and his people with the grace of God, and to work tirelessly for the salvation of souls through prayer and works of charity," the Las Cruces Diocese said in a statement sent out announcing Gyau's ordination.

He will serve as the parochial vicar at San Jose Church in La Mesa, San Miguel Arcangel Church in San Miguel, San Luis Rey Church in Chamberino and their missions.

"I have these lovely women," Nevarez said.

Centennial girls card memorable season

For the Centennial High School girls golf team, 2021 will be a year they won't soon forget.

Of course, the Lady Hawks had to deal with Covid and all the restrictions that came with practicing and playing during a pandemic.

But the Centennial girls also had plenty of success on the links.

The Hawks won district, qualified for the state championship for the first time ever as a team, took third as a team at state in 5A and had an individual gold medalist at the state championships.

Centennial sophomore Alex Armendariz shot a 1-under 71 at the Arroyo Del Oso Golf Course in Al-

buquerque on June 21 to become the first girl from a Las Cruces public school to win a state individual golf title.

Courtney Andersson of Mesilla Valley Christian won a state title in A-4A

in 2016.

"It feels really good," Armendariz said of her individual title. "It has been my dream to be a state champ. Ever since I was a little, I wanted this. My brother (Robert Armendariz Jr.) played for Centennial. I always watched him practice with the team and thought it was cool. My dad sometimes plays for fun too."

Centennial golf coach Greg Garcia said the "sky's the limit" for Armendariz.

Garcia, a retired police detective, was quick to point out that the Hawks got plenty of other strong performances that helped boost his girls into a third-place team finish at state.

Sophomore Brooklyn Maes shot an 82 at state and finished 10th. Junior Macy Silva shot a 94 and took 24th, teammate and fellow junior Sidda Schultz shot 100 and took 34th and sophomore Arianna Rel came in at 113

and finished 47th.

"It is a steppingstone," Garcia said. "They are probably thinking the same thing I am: Everyone is coming back and next year, we have a chance to do better."

Despite her top-10 finish, Maes said she was slightly disappointed with her showing. She was 2-over through 13 holes and "then things happened," she said.

Maes said that what really helped pull the Lady Hawks through the challenges of playing golf during a pandemic was how good of friends everyone on the team is.

"We went through a lot, but I don't think it fazed us," she said. "We really came together during the season."

Silva said everyone on the team was scattered across the Arroyo Del Oso Golf Course at state but she saw that Armendariz was 2 or 3 strokes under par at 12.

"I was like, 'Come on Alex, I know you can do it,'" Silva said.

"I was so happy for Alex," Silva added. "I was crying for Alex. Brook was crying for Alex. And then we found out we got third (as a team). So that made me proud of our team too."

Schultz said that the Lady Hawks are all "super competitive, but we are also happy when someone else (on our team) does well."

"I'm excited for next year," Schultz said. "If we stay at the rate we are going, we should have a really good season."

Rel played golf competitively for the first time this season.

She said the key to their successful year was "all the hard work we put in and the coaching."

The Las Cruces High girls team took fourth place, finishing five strokes behind Centennial.

Junior Erica Williams took eighth place for Las Cruces with an 81, while Abriella Muniz, another junior, was tied for 14th at 85.

Also for Las Cruces, sophomore Hannah Michael shot 92 for a 21st-place showing, freshman Ariana Cisneros shot 94 for 24th place and sophomore Kaci Groves carded a 119 for 51st.

Oñate baseball, softball fall in semis

Both the Oñate High School baseball and softball teams saw their seasons end in the semifinal round of the state 5A playoffs.

The Knight baseball team lost to eventual state champion La Cueva of Albuquerque 6-4 on June 24. Earlier, Oñate, the eighth and last seed in the eight-team tournament, knocked out top-seeded Rio Rancho 1-0 on June 22.

La Cueva, the fourth seed, won the state 5A title with an 11-2 win over second-seeded Hobbs on June 26.

In the 5A softball playoffs, Oñate also saw its season end with a loss in the semis to the eventual state champion. The Lady Knights lost 1-0 to top-seeded Cleveland High of Rio Rancho on June 24. In the first round, Oñate, the fourth seed, beat fifth-seed Cibola 6-0 on June 22.

Cleveland won the state 5A title with a 3-0 win over third-seeded Carlsbad on June 26.

In the state 1A baseball playoffs, Mesilla Valley Christian lost 19-2 to Gateway Christian in the first round on June 22.

A little prevention can help you cope with sun-related maladies

Prevention is the key with regards to sunburn, sun poisoning, heat exhaustion, heat stroke or other sun-related health matters. For golfers, it's important to wear looser, breathable clothing. Some of the newer ventilated fabrics for shirts and shorts are much better in this regard compared to the old sticky cotton stuff.

Broad-brim hats will keep the sun from doing further damage to ears, face and neck because of full partial shading.

The most important prevention of all is to apply sunscreen generously and often. WebMD online recommends applying sunscreen 15 to 30 minutes before going outside, and reapplying every two hours, because sunscreen washes off with sweat and none are really waterproof. You should opt for sunscreen with sun protection factor (SPF) of 30 or higher,

and make sure it's labeled "broad spectrum" which means it blocks both UVA and UVB sunlight.

Dermatologists advise us that when applying sunscreen we should cover our face, ears, nose, neck, arms, back of hands and legs. Don't skimp or do a haphazard job; you'll pay the price

later.

If you suspect sun poisoning, you should immediately get out of the sun. As soon as possible, take a cool (not cold) shower and/or apply cool compresses. Aloe gel is recommended treatment for sunburned areas, and if pain is substantial over-the-counter pain relievers are often suitable.

Stay out of the sun until the condition resolves, and completely cover sunburned areas when going outside. You should seek immediate medical care in cases where the sunburn forms major blisters or covers a large area and is very painful. Also, if you

have facial swelling, high fever and chills, severe headache, confusion or faintness, you should go to the doctor or ER.

Doctors who treat stroke and heat-related illnesses note that, when recognized in the early stages, less severe conditions, such as mild heat exhaustion, can be treated at home.

The first thing is to stop the vigorous activity, get out of the heat and rest. Get into a cooler environment like shade or an air-conditioned space, and elevate your feet while removing as much clothing as practical.

Immediately drink water or rehydration drinks to replace fluids. For persons with greater heat illness symptoms, WebMD urges companions to get the person out of the sun and heat, and to help remove as much clothing as possible thereby exposing affected skin surface to cooler air. First aid involves cooling the person's entire body by sponging or spraying

cool water and fanning the air around them to lower the body temperature. Ice packs can be applied to the groin, neck and armpits where large blood vessels lie close to the skin surface. Immersion in an ice bath is not recommended. If the symptoms are beyond the simple home treatments, the individual needs to go to the ER.

For golfers who usually ride in carts, there are portable misters and portable fans available, both in a variety of sizes from Amazon.com.

A moist coolish towel around your neck is another option.

When we indulge in outdoor endeavors, like golf, hiking or even yard work, the only sure way to beat the heat is to hydrate, hydrate, hydrate. And not with beer. Drink water, while replacing electrolytes with legitimate sports drinks. Sports physicians tell us to drink at least a quart every hour when the temp is over 70 degrees. Many golf facilities have course ambassadors with coolers or bottled water; many have

water coolers or fountains every few holes. To be assured of cool, clean, plentiful water when you want it, bring along a full gallon insulated water jug. Excess alcohol consumption on the golf course on really hot days will only increase one's risk of heat prostration. Remember, don't drink and drive – don't even putt.

School super: 'Time is now. We're all in this together.'

Keeping with the main thing is the main thing for Las Cruces Public Schools new superintendent, Ralph Ramos, and the main thing for him is the students.

Ramos delivered that message during the Greater Las Cruces Chamber of Commerce's education update lunch, the chamber's first in-person gathering since the onset of the pandemic, June 25 at the New Mexico Farm and Ranch Heritage Museum.

Ramos was named permanent superintendent effective June 2. He was named interim superintendent when then-Superintendent Karen Trujillo was stuck by a vehicle and

killed in February.

"I really appreciate what Superintendent Karen Trujillo left for me," Ramos said. His goal as her successor is "to do what is right for kids every day," Ramos said.

A major concern, he said, is that 14 percent of high school seniors in Doña Ana County don't graduate.

"We've got to get kids to graduate," Ramos said, and help them continue on into higher education, the military or the workforce.

Ramos said LCPS has also been concerned with keeping track of all of its approximately 24,000 students during the pandemic. The school district discovered that it couldn't account for a total of 80 students, but was able to find 62 of those, with

all of them returning to LCPS classrooms, he said. School district officials are tracking down the other 18 students, Ramos said.

"To me, the time is now. We've got to come to-

gether," Ramos said. "Let's embrace each other (and) become true partners. We're all in this together."

Before becoming superintendent, Ramos served

13 years as principal of Camino Real Middle School. He began his career with LCPS in 1992 as an eighth-grade science teacher at Picacho Middle

School.

Ramos has a two-year contract as LCPS superintendent at an annual salary of \$180,000.
