COUNTY TO EXPAND BROADBAND ACCESS

Even before the pandemic, Doña Ana County was exploring ways to expand access to broadband, Wi-Fi and the internet into rural and underserved areas. Doña Ana Broadband, DAB, is a dedicated multi-agency group with representatives from various organizations that has been discussing the need to expand broadband availability in our community. The group is also discussing how to take advantage of grants that are now available to further those efforts.

The need is undeniable: New Mexico ranks 49th in broadband access. According to the Center for Community Analysis website at www.cca.nmsu.edu, Doña Ana County households without internet subscriptions are estimated at 22% in the Las Cruces Public School District, 38% in the Gadsden Independent School District, and 44% in the Hatch Valley Public Schools.

"Broadband and reliable access to high speed internet are essential infrastructure for our community and a key driver in economic recovery and development," County Manager Fernando R. Macias said. "Broadband access is key to education, jobs and economic opportunity, telehealth and even innovation and quality of life."

Recently, DAB began working with the Federal Reserve Bank of Dallas and a broadband consultant, Magellan Advisors, to develop a plan to expand access to high-speed internet throughout the county. "We want to ensure that all residents, wherever they live, can connect with online resources, any time," Macias said.

DAB's goal is to develop a feasible, cost-effective plan that will address any gaps. "Leveraging public-private partnerships to bolster broadband access will help bridge the digital divide and ensure 100% connectivity across New Mexico. I'm proud that Doña Ana County is helping to lead the way to connect all New Mexicans to the online world," said Senator Ben Ray Luján. "As Chair of the Commerce Subcommittee on Communications, Media, and Broadband, I'll continue working with local partners to invest in broadband infrastructure across New Mexico."

The group will seek funding from public and private sources to implement the plan to ensure that everyone has reliable access to the internet. The group will look at every aspect of getting people connected, from evaluating whether they have access to broadband infrastructure, to whether they own a computer or if they can afford internet service. As a community-wide effort, it will take multiple years to design the solution that best fits our community. "That is why we need to involve everyone who can contribute to its success," said Bob Bunting, Doña Ana County IT Director and DAB leader. "That means we will invite a cross-section of the community to join us in this effort."

New Mexico State University, Doña Ana Community College, the City of Las Cruces, all school districts, and the Mesilla Valley Economic Development Alliance are already active participants. "Very early, we also engaged El Paso Digital, a county-wide coalition of public, private and nonprofit partners dedicated to promoting digital inclusion in the El Paso community. Digital El Paso members graciously share their time, learnings and expertise with us," Bunting said.

The Dallas Fed will help convene community partners and provide training to help DAB work together effectively. Magellan Advisors, working with the Dallas Fed will provide technical help such as community needs and infrastructure assessments, help analyze different business models, and present budget options to optimize resources and funds.

"Ultimately, we will leverage Magellan Advisors and all community partners' contributions in our aim to connect everyone throughout Doña Ana County to affordable, dependable broadband," Bunting said.

What to expect this monsoon season

“Everybody thinks monsoons mean rain,” said National Weather Service (NWS) meteorologist Jason Laney. That’s not always the case – and it’s not even the correct definition.

A monsoon is actually “a seasonal reversal of winds,” said Laney, who works in the NWS El Paso office in Santa Teresa, New Mexico, and has been a meteorologist for 33 years.

And, however you define it, this year’s monsoon season, officially June 15 to Sept. 30, likely won’t produce record rainfall for southern New Mexico, Laney said.

New Mexico usually gets about 40 percent of its annual rainfall during the monsoon season, said State Climatologist Dave DuBois, Ph.D., who is based at New Mexico State University in Las Cruces. On average, the state gets about 9 inches of rain in a calendar year, he said, but it’s

been in a drought since 1999.

DuBois said the monsoon season means “a shift in the wind direction” from a southwest flow to a more moisture-laden southeast flow across Mexico. He said southern New Mexico, including Las Cruces, is likely to feel more of an impact from the summer monsoon than the northern part of the state.

Most local winds are from the west and southwest, Laney said, and are very dry because the

closest moisture source is the Pacific Ocean, more than 1,000 miles west across the Rocky Mountains.

When the jet stream changes direction, which usually coincides with the onset of summer, prevailing winds become south and southeasterly, Laney said, coming from the tropics and the Gulf of Mexico and bringing moisture that doesn’t get lost in the mountains. Combined with higher

Here are “sun safe habits” from the U.S. Department of Commerce’s National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) to prevent skin and eye damage this summer:

- Check NOAA’s UV Index forecast before you go out: www.cpc.ncep.noaa.gov/products/stratosphere/uv_index/uv_current.shtml.
- Apply — and reapply — sunscreen. Use an SPF 30 broad-spectrum, water-resistant sunscreen at least 30 minutes before sun exposure and reapply every two hours. If you are jumping in the water, apply even more frequently. Protect marine life by using a chemical-free, environmentally friendly sunscreen.
- Seek shade, wear sunglasses and wear protective clothing.

State climatologist keeps eye on trends

As New Mexico's state climatologist, Dave DuBois, Ph.D. assesses "the effects of climate on the natural environment, agricultural production, land and natural resources and human health in New Mexico."

The office is based at New Mexico State University, where DuBois also oversees the state Community Collaborative, Rain, Hail and Snow Network (CoCoRaHS). He's

been state climatologist since 2010, and before that spent four years with the New Mexico Environment Department's Air Quality Bureau. He introduced a course called Introduction to Air Pollution at NMSU, and taught Air Pollution Control Fundamentals and Meteorology and Climate at the University of Nevada

Las Vegas while working at the Desert Research Institute.

DuBois' office is involved in a number of studies regarding New Mexico climate and weather conditions. For example, he is looking for ways to reduce the evaporation of water from reservoirs in the state.

New Mexico's two-decade-long drought has significantly reduced water storage in those reservoirs, DuBois said. Elephant Butte, for example, is at "the lowest

drawdown possible" this year, he said. It can store almost 1 million acre feet of water, but only has about 200,000 right now, he said.

A "change in climate" is contributing to the reduced water level, he said, because higher temperatures mean more evaporation and an increased need for water for native vegetation to survive.

DuBois said Las Cruces broke its official high temperature record for June

How to join rain-monitoring program

If you are interested in state and local weather and climate, you might want to join CoCoRaHS (co-co-RAZ), which stands for Community Collaborative, Rain, Hail and Snow Network.

CoCoRaHS is based at New Mexico State University in Las Cruces and includes volunteer precipitation observers across the state.

"It's a fun and easy way to keep track of the precipitation falling (or not falling) in your backyard, and it allows you to contribute to a valuable national source of weather information," according to the collaborative's website.

Participation in CoCoRaHS requires a high-capacity, 4 inches-in-diameter rain gauge. The official CoCoRaHS gauge is on sale for \$32.75 at <https://weatheryourway.com/collections/cocorahs-gauge-parts>.

summer temperatures, that change means "a better chance for rain," Laney said.

"It has more to do with the wind," Laney said. "The rainfall is just a happy byproduct of the monsoon."

In the past 11 years, the Las Cruces area has received as much as 7.32 inches of rain during a monsoon season

(2010) and as little as 2.59 inches (2020), Laney said. Since 2010, there have been two "wet" (above average moisture) monsoon seasons, seven "dry" (below average) seasons and two normal seasons. The last wet season was 2017, which has been followed by three consecutive dry seasons.

This year, "we're going to get more rain than we've seen the last two years," Laney said. That won't break the drought,

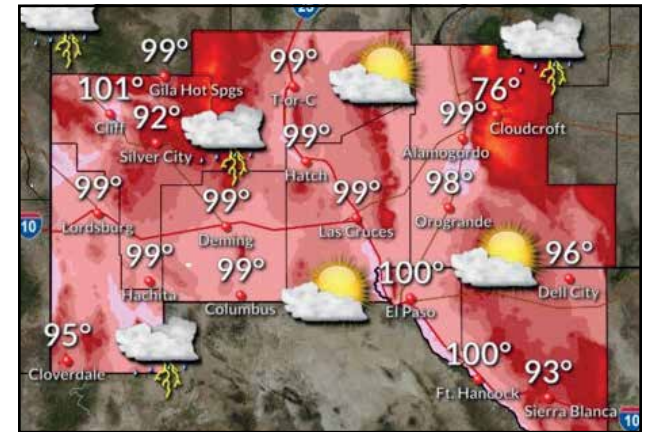
he said, but it will be a significant increase over the first five and one-half months of 2021, during which .48 inches of rain has been recorded in Las Cruces, which is 1.22 inches below normal, he said.

In his "unofficial forecast," Laney said he is "leaning toward a monsoon that's probably going to give us more rain than we've gotten the last two years, but slightly less than normal," which is 4.5 to 5

inches. It likely will be almost double "the last few years we've seen," Laney said. "That's still a positive note in my world."

As of June 11, the NWS Climate Prediction Center showed a 35 percent chance the 2021 monsoon season will be below normal, a 33 percent chance it will be normal and a 32 chance it will be above normal, he said.

"It's almost like saying it's anybody's guess," Laney said.



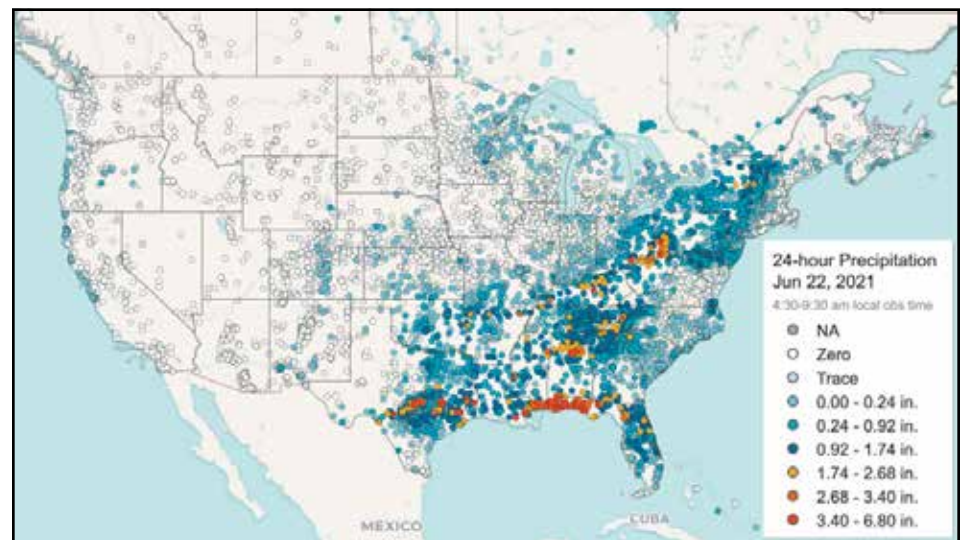

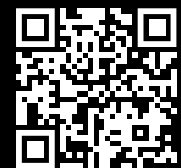

Slipping the surly bonds of Earth

More than 20 years ago, Len Sugerman drove from Las Cruces to give a presentation at the Tays Special Events Center at New Mexico State University-Alamogordo.

It was the first I'd heard the concept of a spaceport in New Mexico, but Sugerman, who arrived at NMSU in 1977 to direct the Physical Science Laboratory, was an early advocate of the concept ("At our altitude in southern New Mexico, the first mile's free," he would say). Right up to his death in 2007, he preached the spaceport the way a television evangelist preaches the Gospel: passionately, repeatedly and to anyone who would listen.

In the Gospel reading we heard in church last Sunday, Jesus talked about a prophet not being accepted in his home. You can't say that about Sugerman who has a building named for him on the NMSU campus. The idea of a spaceport in southern New Mexico, however, has always had as many skeptics as supporters here in the Land of Enchantment. Even recently,

there have been some elected officials in the state recommending New Mexico sell the spaceport.

Despite a lot of setbacks, Sugerman's vision, in the form of Spaceport America in nearby Sierra County, has come to pass. And

a new milestone is set to take place in the next few days.

Virgin Galactic, Spaceport America's original and most recognizable tenant, will open a flight window July 11 that will take to space its first crewed flight on SpaceShipTwo Unity. Previous flights have only had a pilot and co-pilot. That six-person crew includes Virgin founder Richard Branson, who is Astronaut 001, and will be "evaluating customer space-flight experience."

If everything goes well on this flight, Virgin Galactic will be readying the way for civilian flights.

This is something we've been hearing about and anticipating for more than a decade.

The state of New Mexico caused delays with several stops

and starts in legislation regarding the spaceport. Then, Virgin Galactic had its own delays, spurred most tragically by a 2014 crash in which one pilot died and another was seriously injured.

Now, finally, for Virgin Galactic's flight, it appears all systems are go.

Over the past few years, Virgin Galactic has moved many of its people from California to its Las Cruces offices. And the VG hangar at the spaceport is abuzz with activity. And it's not just Virgin Galactic. There are several other tenants at Spaceport America, all with projects in varying stages of progress.

We will be watching eagerly these next few days, and sending some silent prayers, in anticipa-

tion the flight will go well. Best of luck, Sir Richard Branson and crew.

Just three hours away from us, another suborbital flight is planned. Blue Origin, a space company sprouted from Jeff Bezos's Amazon billions, has scheduled a launch for July 20. Not only is that my oldest daughter's birthday, you may recall July 20 is also the day American astronauts Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin stepped on the moon in 1969.

Blue Origin's launch site is about 175 miles southeast of Las Cruces along Interstate 10 near Van Horn, Texas. The July 20 flight will include Bezos, his brother and an 82-year-old New

Future for college athletics will be on display during Olympics

When the New Mexico Legislature passed SB 94 earlier this year, allowing college athletes to profit from the use of their name, image or likeness, some lawmakers feared we were picking a fight with the mighty NCAA.

If that was the case, the masters of collegiate sports just cried uncle.

The NCAA changed its rules last week, just as new laws here and in other states were taking effect. College athletes will now be able to hire agents, sign endorsement deals, make commercials, leverage their presence on social media and get paid for promotional appearances, autograph-

signing sessions and coaching.

It wasn't just states pressuring the NCAA to change. Last month, the U.S. Supreme Court denied the NCAA's request

for immunity from anti-trust laws. In that ruling, Justice Brett Kavanaugh wrote, "The NCAA's business model would be flatly illegal in almost any other industry in America.

"All of the restaurants in a region cannot come together to cut cooks' wages on the theory that 'customers prefer' to eat food from low-paid cooks. ... Movie studios cannot collude to slash benefits to camera crews to kindle a 'spirit of amateurism'

in Hollywood."

The court ruling in that case did not mandate that athletes be paid, but it's not hard to see where this is leading.

For a glimpse into the future of the NCAA, all we need to do is look at Summer Olympics, which will start later this month in Tokyo.

Avery Brundage, who led the International Olympics Committee from 1952 to 1972, was just as fierce in his devotion to the purity of amateur sports.

But by the 1990s, when the Dream Team took the court in Barcelona, all of those barriers had come down.

The athletes who will represent the United States in Tokyo will be paid, but they're a long

way away from our concept of a professional athlete.

A recent documentary titled "The Weight of Gold," looks at both the mental and financial strain placed on Olympic athletes.

It features swimmer Michael Phelps, who talks frankly about his bouts with depression.

Phelps won an astounding 23 gold medals, making him one of the few athletes able to cash in on their Olympic fame. Every four years there are a handful of athletes who attract our attention, but even for them the window is short.

When's the last time we heard from Apollo Ohno? Simone Biles won't still be making GrubHub ads next year at this time.

Those are the best of the best. The vast majority of Olympic athletes are just scraping by. Athletes are now able to receive both stipends from their national organizations and commercial sponsorships, as well as prize money for winning events.

But that's often not enough to come close to paying the bills. It's estimated that about half of the track and field athletes ranked in the top 10 in their event earn less than \$15,000 a year from competing.

At \$45 million for a 16-game season, Kansas City Chiefs quarterback Patrick Mahomes will likely make more money in one game than the entire Olympic archery, badminton, bicycling (BMX,

mountain and road) canoe/kayak, equestrian, fencing, handball, judo, karate, rowing, shooting, volleyball (gym and beach) and water polo teams make combined in a year.

College sports will be no different. Almost all of the money will go to football and basketball players. Those in big cities and power conferences will rake in the most, and men will have far more financial opportunities than women.

I'm not sure what that will mean for competitive balance or compliance with federal law mandating gender equality.

Mexican named Wally Funk. Funk, who lives in Taos, was one of 13 women who trained in the 1960s for the Mercury space program, although none were selected by NASA. The fourth passenger on the Blue Origin flight is a yet-to-be-announced winner of an auction that topped out at \$28 million.

Weather permitting, Branson will beat his fellow billionaire into space by nine days.

You may or may not have a rooting interest in whether Branson or Bezos gets to space first. But here's who I see as the real winners: young

people in southern New Mexico. Kids growing up here can see spaceflight is real, and it's all around us. Southern New Mexico has many ties to the earliest days of space exploration. Like the film industry, in which a handful of stars get noticed, there are hundreds of people behind the scenes making things go in space. That translates to hundreds of jobs, hundreds of careers, perhaps even one for my youngest daughter, who wants to be an astrophysicist. And maybe nearby there's a young, hopeful female astronaut who won't have to wait until she's 82 to go into space. It also means hundreds of ancillary jobs for people in and around Las Cruces to support the space industry and space

tourism.

In 2008, I participated in the Greater Las Cruces Chamber of Commerce Leadership program. Our class was fortunate enough to get a tour of the Virgin Galactic hangar while it was still under construction at Spaceport America. I lagged behind the tour group when I spied a magic marker, and a blank spot on the back of a wall. A spot that would soon be covered and visible only to a few dustmites.

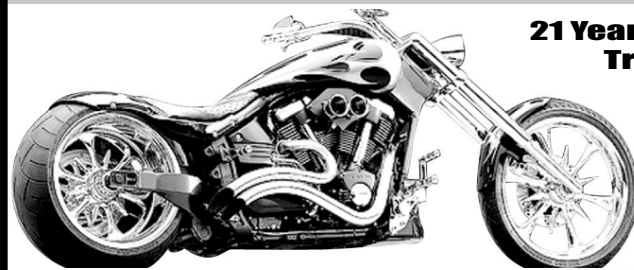
So even though you can't see it, somewhere in the bowels of the hangar is scrawled, in my bad handwriting, the word ¡Arriba!

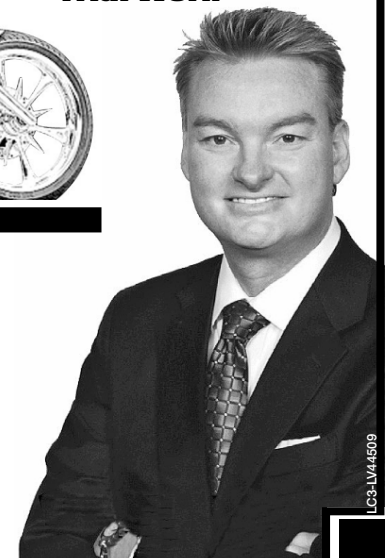

Leonard, was an authority on the ailments of cows and mules. That was 20 years before the widespread availability of penicillin in 1939. The lifespan of the average person was 47 years old.

Today, it is 78 years old (pre-Covid).

That is just one ex-

ample of the uncountable human lives science has saved by diseases cured and prevented, not to mention those of domestic animals. My time practicing veterinary medicine was mostly in feedlots, on big ranches and dairies, on range ewes and saddle horses. I spent and used millions and millions of dollars to save animal lives and prevent disease. All my medicines were approved by the USDA (vaccines) and the FDA (pharmaceuticals), and took years of testing to prove that it did what it said on their labels.

I, as a DVM, am respon-

- Set water and wastewater impact fees in compliance with the City Development Impact Fee Ordinance.

13 when it hit 107 degrees at NMSU. The day before, it tied the 103-degree re-

cord. (The city's official record high of 110 degrees was recorded at NMSU in

1994, DuBois said.)

NMSU has weather records for Las Cruces

going back to 1892, he said. One of its original temperature readers was Fabian Garcia (1871-1948), the first director of the Agricultural Experiment Station at what was then New Mexico College of Agriculture and Mechanic Arts and is now NMSU.

DuBois' office is also advising the New Mexico Department of Health on ways to mitigate the impact of dust on the human immune system — recommending, for example, that people plant more vegetation around their homes to reduce dust and that construction projects not be undertaken "just before the onset of the windy season," he said. The City of Albuquerque has a dust ordinance, DuBois said, and that might be a possibility for Las Cruces.

His office is measuring dust storms in a project along Interstate 10 near

Lordsburg that includes the use of time-lapse photography, DuBois said. One of the recommendations from that study to the New Mexico Department of Transportation was to pave highway shoulders in certain areas so vehicles have an area to park if the New Mexico State Police stop traffic because of a severe dust storm.

"It's all for human health," DuBois said.

He is also working with the City of Las Cruces to improve its shade canopies, which could reduce temperatures by several degrees, is working with the New Mexico Interstate Stream Commission to determine the impact of climate change on water and overseeing the expansion of climate monitoring statewide through the ZiaMet Agricultural Weather Station Network (<https://weather.nmsu.edu/ziamet/>).

Health professional seeks District 5 seat in first bid for office

Becky Corran is making her first bid for public office by running for the open District 5 seat on the Las Cruces City Council.

District 5 incumbent Gill M. Sorg is not seeking re-election to a fourth four-year term on the council. He was first elected to the seat in 2009.

The district covers much of northwest Las Cruces.

Corran, 41, said she decided to run for the District 5 council seat because of her background as a public health professional and her interest in issues like access to health care and other

health issues, a livable wage for workers and the accessibility of goods and services in the city. Banning plastic bags citywide is also important, she said.

“City council is where a lot of those decisions are made,” Corran said.

As a longtime volunteer for local animal rights and animal care organizations, Corran said she also “could contribute a lot” on animal control issues.

Corran has a dog and a cat and has fostered 70 dogs and cats over the years.

Her concerns for District 5 include balancing the district’s development with necessary services – including neighborhood grocery stores – and green space to ensure its livability, sustainability and access, Corran said.

At present, she said, there are no grocery stores in the district.

Both traffic management and walkability are important issues in the district, she said.

“You can’t have everyone driving everywhere all the time,” Corran said.

If elected to the city council, Corran said her first priority would be to work with city staff and her constituents to provide incentives to bring

development to District 5 “in proportion to the rest of the city,” she said.

Ensuring that the district has enough city parks is another priority, Corran said.

Looking at locations where parks are still needed in the district is something she has talked to Sorg about, Corran said, along with implementing electric vehicles.

Corran said City Manager Ifo Pili “seems to be thinking about the future,” and city government is appropriately focused on “figuring out priorities” and “thinking toward the long term.”

Corran said it’s also important to balance the needs of all council districts and the city’s sustainability as a whole. For example, a continued

focus on Downtown renewal will be important, even though it’s not in District 5, she said.

Councilors must look at “a bigger picture,” she said.

Corran has been on the Health and Human Services Department faculty at Doña Ana Community College for the past 12 years.

She has bachelor’s degrees in biology and anthropology, both from Indiana University of Pennsylvania, and a master’s degree in public health from the University of Arizona.

She moved to Las Cruces in 2009 from Tucson, Arizona.

Corran is an alumna of Emerge New Mexico and is a former board president of the organization,

which recruits and trains “Democratic women who want to run for office,” according to its website.

Corran said she identifies as a queer woman. That has given her “the privilege of seeing things from a marginalized perspective,” she said, and has helped her recognize the need to include diverse individuals “in the conversation,” she said.

She has volunteered for LGBTQ projects in Tucson and Las Cruces.

She also was a member of a women’s professional football team in Tucson.

Corran is not married and has no children.

Corran’s campaign manager is Connie Chapman.

Her campaign treasurer is Mary Prentice.

Arrowhead grad to Annapolis, continues tradition of service

Elijah Myers is continuing his family's proud heritage of service.

Both Elijah's grandfathers served in World War II – one was a tank driver, the other a paratrooper. His dad, Ben, is a longtime Las Cruces firefighter. His mother, Sandra, has been a home-school teacher to Elijah and his younger siblings. And on June 29, Elijah became a midshipman at the U.S. Naval Academy (USNA) in Annapolis, Maryland.

Elijah got a personal phone call from U.S. Rep. Yvette Herrell, R-N.M., telling him he had been accepted to the Naval Academy, after receiving nominations from U.S. Sens. Martin Heinrich and Tom Udall, and then U.S. Rep. Xochitl Torres Small, all D-N.M.

"I wanted to serve my country," said Elijah, a 2021 graduate of Arrowhead Park Early College High School (APECHS). "The best place I could do that is in the Navy."

Elijah, 18, has already done a lot to serve his community and Las Cruces Public Schools.

As a member of the LCPS Student Advisory Council, Elijah visited the New Mexico Legislature to lobby on behalf of three education bills. He advised Families and Youth, Inc. on alcohol and drug abuse, and wrote a newspaper column about the dangers of marijuana use by children. For the Children, Youth and Families Department's local Juvenile Justice Advisory Committee,

Elijah did research and provided student opinions on issues in presentations across the city. He wrote, directed, edited and acted in a video for the Unified Prevention (UP!) Coalition of Las Cruces about helping parents talk to their children and served as a member of the Success Partnership Leader's Circle.

Elijah was a state champion swimmer in multiple events, 2017-20, and was 2018-21 team captain of the Wild West Aquatic Club of Las Cruces.

He also was a member of the National Honor Society and performed more than 60 hours of community service. He also plays the guitar and writes songs.

"He's a total over-achiever, but in a good way," said Elijah's dad, Ben Myers, who has been with the Las Cruces Fire Department for almost 15 years and is an LCFD

training officer.

Elijah graduated from APECHS with a 4.3 GPA, never earning a grade lower than an A in any class, and was the salutatorian of his class. He also earned a two-year associate of science degree from Doña Ana Community College (DACC) and was on the DACC dean's list 2018-21.

"Elijah is an impressive young man and I have really enjoyed getting to work with him these

past couple years," said Mike Kingery. Elijah was in Kingery's dual-credit precalculus, differential calculus and integral calculus classes at APECHS.

"Through my 25-year teaching career, Elijah has definitely been one of my favorites as he always has a very positive and inviting personality, he is very respectful and is a tremendous student," Kingery said in his letter recommending Elijah for the Naval Academy.

"He won't quit," said Ben's mom, Sandra, who home-schooled Elijah before high school, along with Elijah's sister, Naomi, 15, who now attends APECHS, and brother, Daniel, 12.

Sometimes, Sandra said, she would find Elijah still awake at 1 a.m., doing his homework.

At USNA, Elijah plans to study mathematics and try out for the academy swim team. During his five-year commitment to

the Navy following graduation, Elijah hopes to become a Navy SEAL.

"My next nine years are planned," Elijah said. "I want to try to shoot for the stars."

"I'm proud of him," Elijah's brother, Daniel, said about his Elijah's USNA acceptance. "I'm going to miss him." Daniel, a home-schooled seventh grader, is interested in game design and computer programming.

"I think it's pretty cool," said sister Naomi, who made straight A's during her first year at APECHS.

All three kids swim together, were home-schooled together, including during Covid-19, and even made home movies together.

Sandra said she and Ben's message to all their children has always been: "Whatever you want to do, we'll help you get there."

"It's going to be sad," said Sandra, about the family dropping Elijah off for his flight to Annapolis.

That moment will be "so bittersweet," Ben said. "We're so proud of him — the man he's becoming. He's just such a uniquely driven kid."

Las Cruces Utilities Locators Keep An Eye On the Prize

At Las Cruces Utilities (LCU), Darrell Morales spends his workday on the hunt using specialized equipment to find things the eyes can't see. Darrell is a trained utility line Locator and part of a team of Locators who keep track of the miles of gas, water, and sewer lines that service LCU's territory. Each day, Darrell is in the field marking underground lines and updating the LCU digital mapping system that lets customers know where the utility lines are located when they call 811.

Recently, members of the LCU Locator team received certification training from Staking University (SU). Instructors provided classroom and field lessons for all experience levels. "The training was really informative and thorough and explained

exactly what I need to do in the field and the equipment I need to use. It also included the different variables and obstacles I may face every day," said Darrell Morales, LCU gas Locator. The seminars are designed to aid locators in developing superior troubleshooting techniques, skills to consistently provide accurate and complete utility location information and a mastery of locating equipment. Following the two-day seminar, Darrell was required to pass an exam to be certified. "This was my very first experience with the Staking University lessons. I've been locating for over five years, and I believe I'm good at it, but this training was a lot more in-depth than my last job," said Darrell. Darrell's day starts early in the morning, and while

his shift ends around three in the afternoon, every day is different. As he puts it, "You can be called out at two in the morning or 10:30 at night. The city never sleeps and there's always something going on such as a gas or water emergency somewhere," said Darrell. There's no such thing as a typical day for LCU Locators. From collecting GPS (global positioning system) data and uploading it to the mapping system to responding to emergencies such as a

water main leak, no two days are the same. And when it comes to leaks, the locating team is on the spot marking the gas lines to ensure that the line is protected when an emergency repair is being done on another utility line. "Our days go from real busy to just being really hammered with a lot of work," laughed Darrell.

Darrell and his fellow crew members are responsible for locating all active gas lines during emergencies and non-emergencies. "LCU gives us several tools and resources along with maps. The equipment itself varies because not all the lines are the same, some are steel or poly (polyethylene)," said Morales.

While Darrell Morales is new to the LCU family, he's dedicated to his job. "I love my job. I'm looking forward to being here," concluded Darrell.

Incentives Drive Opportunity at Industrial Park

If you have plans for a business that might need space, the Las Cruces Innovation & Industrial Park (LCIIP), formerly known as the West Mesa Industrial Park, may be waiting for you. Established in the 1980s, the 1,800-acre Park on the west edge of Las Cruces is home to 20 companies, ranging from a cheese manufacturer to a satellite communications firm.

If you've been considering looking at expanding your business or starting a brand new one, there are plenty of state and City of Las Cruces (CLC) incentives that might help you along.

The state of New Mexico's Job Training Incentive Program (JTIP) can reimburse your company for a portion of your training costs for above-average wage positions. There is also WagePlus, a supplement to the JTIP program, which rewards businesses for hiring and paying above the median wage. The program provides a \$1,500 per

job reimbursement for qualifying companies hiring and training new employees for jobs paying at least 10 percent more than the county median wage.

The Local Economic Development Act (LEDA) is a multi-year business expansion type project that would reimburse you for new job creation and allows you to spend funds on a variety of projected capital expenses, including manufacturing equipment, land purchases, and more.

"Soon CLC will have an asking price for each City-owned parcel and a process to submit requests," said Cilicia Villegas, CLC real estate specialist senior. "Businesses considered eligible to purchase City-owned property at LCIIP will be those which provide a measurable level of economic impact to the area."

Virgin founder set to go on next test flight

A flight window opens for SpaceShipTwo Unity on July 11. If weather allows, Sir Richard Branson and a full crew will take off from Spaceport America for another test flight into space as Virgin Galactic continues toward its mission of making space available to everyone.

The “Unity 22” mission will be the 22nd flight test for VSS Unity and the company’s fourth crewed spaceflight, according to a Virgin Galactic press release. It will also be the first to carry a full crew of two pilots and four mission specialists in the cabin, including Branson, the company’s founder, who will be testing the private astronaut experience.

Building on the success of the company’s most recent spaceflight in May, Unity 22 will focus on cabin and customer experience objectives, the release says.

Goals include:

- Evaluating the commercial customer cabin with

a full crew, including the cabin environment, seat comfort, the weightless experience and the views of Earth that the spaceship delivers — all to ensure every moment of the astronaut’s journey maximizes the wonder and awe created by space travel.

- Demonstrating the conditions for conducting human-tended research experiments.
 - Confirming the training program at Spaceport America supports the spaceflight experience.
- Following this flight, and in line with normal procedures, the team will complete inspections of the vehicles and an extensive data review, which will inform the next steps in the test flight program. Two additional test flights are planned before the company expects to begin commercial service in 2022.

Virgin Galactic is sharing a global livestream of the spaceflight. Audiences around the world are invited to participate virtually in the Unity 22 test flight and see firsthand the extraordinary

experience Virgin Galactic is creating for future astronauts. The livestream will be available to watch on Virgin Galactic.com and will be simulcast on the Virgin Galactic Twitter, YouTube and Facebook channels. It is expected to begin at 7 a.m. on the day of the flight, July 11.

“I truly believe that space belongs to all of us,” Branson said. “After

more than 16 years of research, engineering and testing, Virgin Galactic stands at the vanguard of a new commercial space industry, which is set to open space to humankind and change the world for good. It’s one thing to have a dream of making space more accessible to all; it’s another for an incredible team to collectively turn that dream into reality.”

Sculpture of Billy the Kid celebrates history

July 14 is a very important date for Las Cruces artist Bob Diven, and for New Mexico history.

Diven was born that day in 1959. And, 78 years before that, July 14, 1881, the world's most famous outlaw, Billy the Kid, was shot and killed by Lincoln County (and future Doña Ana County) Sheriff Pat Garrett in Fort Sumner, New Mexico.

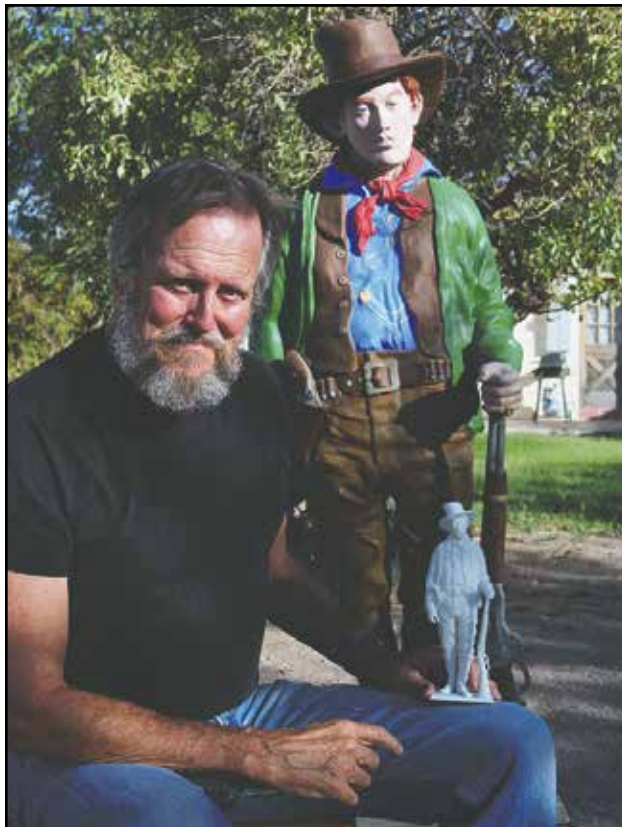
That makes this year the 140th anniversary of The Kid's death.

What brings Bob and Billy together is Diven's ingenuity and artwork — a polychromed cast of Billy the Kid and a 3D-printed, 10-inch version of the sculpture.

One of Diven's casts is now in the collection of the New Mexico Farm and Ranch Heritage Museum and will be part of an exhibit on the Lincoln County War, Diven said. Another cast is on display in Julienne's Jewelry, 2329 Calle de Guadalupe, across from La Posta Res-

taurant on the historic Mesilla Plaza — less than a block from where Billy was convicted of murder in April 1881.

Diven has two more of the casts available for sale that he is first offering to New Mexico historic sites.

Diven said his original sculpture was created out of oil-based clay.

"I then made a silicone rubber mold of that sculpture, backing it with a hard resin 'mother mold,'" he said.

"I then cut the mold

from the original clay sculpture, and then used two rotational casting machines of my own design to cast the sculpture in sections," he said. "I then fit and cemented the pieces together, blending the seams, prepped them for paint and finished them with a hand-rubbed bronze finish."

The completed life-size resin cast is finished to "look like bronze," he said.

He took one of the resin casts of Billy to Albuquerque, where it was

3D-scanned to produce the small reproductions, he said.

"I first started this sculpture after talking with Pat Beckett of COAS Books," Diven said. "He was joking that 'the way to get people Downtown was to build a 100-foot Billy the Kid and put a restaurant in his sombrero.' So I came up with the idea for The Billy the Kid Building downtown, with a giant fiberglass Billy as a local landmark and tourist draw. I haven't been able to make the building happen, but at least the life-size version of the sculpture now exists."

Henry McCarty, aka William H. Bonney, Henry Antrim, alias Billy the Kid, was born in New York City in 1859. He is buried in Fort Sumner. McCarty's mother, Catherine Antrim, died Sept. 16, 1874 (which may be the day before Billy's 15th birthday. The date of his

birth is disputed; it was either Sept. 17 or Nov. 23,

1859.) She is buried in Silver City.

Review: 'The Mad Ones' marks a great live return

There was a stage. And there were actors. And there were songs. And it was good. It was very, very good.

What an incredible return to live theater is Blank Conversations Theatre Company's production of "The Mad Ones," by Kait Kerrigan and Bree Lowdermilk, which opened this past weekend at Rio Grande Theatre, 211 N. Main St. in Downtown, and continues for two more weekends.

The production is a triumph at every level; mostly, as it should be, because the cast is brilliant.

Victoria Cox, Peyton Womble, Bryan Berard and Della Bustamante fill

the entire space with energy and grace and the incredible magic that is live theater as people of great talent make it happen.

If I gave out gold stars as they were earned by this ensemble, I would need a boxful for each one.

The singing and the acting were superb and the chemistry among the four

was amazing.

It was as if they passed among them a bright jewel throughout every minute of the performance: Victoria brought it on stage with her when she opened the show; then she passed it to Peyton; then they had it together — how I loved their dance choreography; then Bryan had it — the

sweetness and charm he brought to "Run Away With Me" was one of the highest of this show's many highlights; then Della had it — and there is almost no one I would rather hear sing and watch perform than Della Bustamante.

Victoria and Peyton are like twin souls in this show — great joy and unbearable sorrow that makes you laugh and makes you cry and makes you truly glad to be alive.

The story is about Samantha Brown (Victoria) as she graduates from high school.

Should she listen to the voice of the one who has died but tells her to live like the mad ones (credit: Jack Kerouac)? Or should she listen to the voice of

the living that cautions her not to die on the dangerous and erratic road trip of life?

I strongly encourage you to take this journey with these four exceptional guides and discover Sam's choice with her, and enjoy the great songs and powerful script in this 90-minute wonder, which has no intermission.

It deserves a full house, and so does the magnificent Rio Grande Theatre.

Co-directors Xodia Chocate and Victoria Cox (in addition to performing) deserve abounding credit for bringing this cast and crew together, including costumes (Yamilex Holguin and Virginia Phillips), set design and props (Topher Lininger), lighting (Frankie Gomez

4 billion years of history in 1-hour Zoom talk

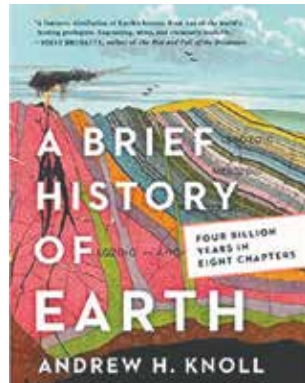

accessible biography of Earth, charting our home planet's epic 4.6 billion-year story. Placing 21st-century climate change in deep context, 'A Brief History of Earth' is an indispensable look at where we've been and where we're going."

"One thing I find fascinating is the timetable of Earth history, as most of the things we tend to

view as ancient actually occurred relatively recently in our planet's past — dinosaurs, come readily to mind," Knoll said. "For the first 2 billion years of Earth's history, there were few continents exposed above the sea and no oxygen in the air. Our familiar world of animals comes around only in the last 15 percent of the story, and humans enter the picture just yesterday in geologic terms (less than one thousandth of a percent of Earth history). I think we need to understand this story to appreciate the remarkable alteration of the planet by humans, and its consequences for us all."

Knoll is the Fisher professor of natural history and a professor of earth and planetary sciences at Harvard. He received

a bachelor's degree from Lehigh University in 1973 and a doctorate from Harvard in 1977, both in geology.

Following five years on the faculty of Oberlin College in Oberlin, Ohio, Knoll returned to Harvard as associate professor of biology in 1982.

His research focuses on the early evolution of life, Earth's environmental history and the interconnections between the two.

For the past decade, he has served on the science team for NASA's MER mission to Mars.

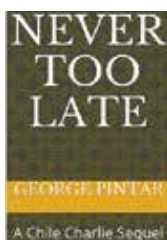

In her latest release, "When Doubt Creeps In," Bronson's best friend isn't returning calls. Has his friend become a killer and a thief?

Hayden also has been a public speaker about major cruise lines. In 2006-07, she hosted Mystery Writers of America's talk show, "Murder Must Air."

"Believe in yourself" is Hayden's advice to would-be writers. "Don't ever let anyone discourage you from writing - and that includes you. Go for it!"

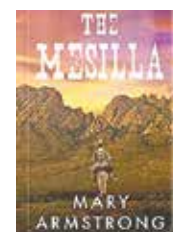
Albert Jennings Fountain and his young son, Henry, to gain a better understanding of what for 30 years he has thought was a senseless act of violence," Armstrong said.

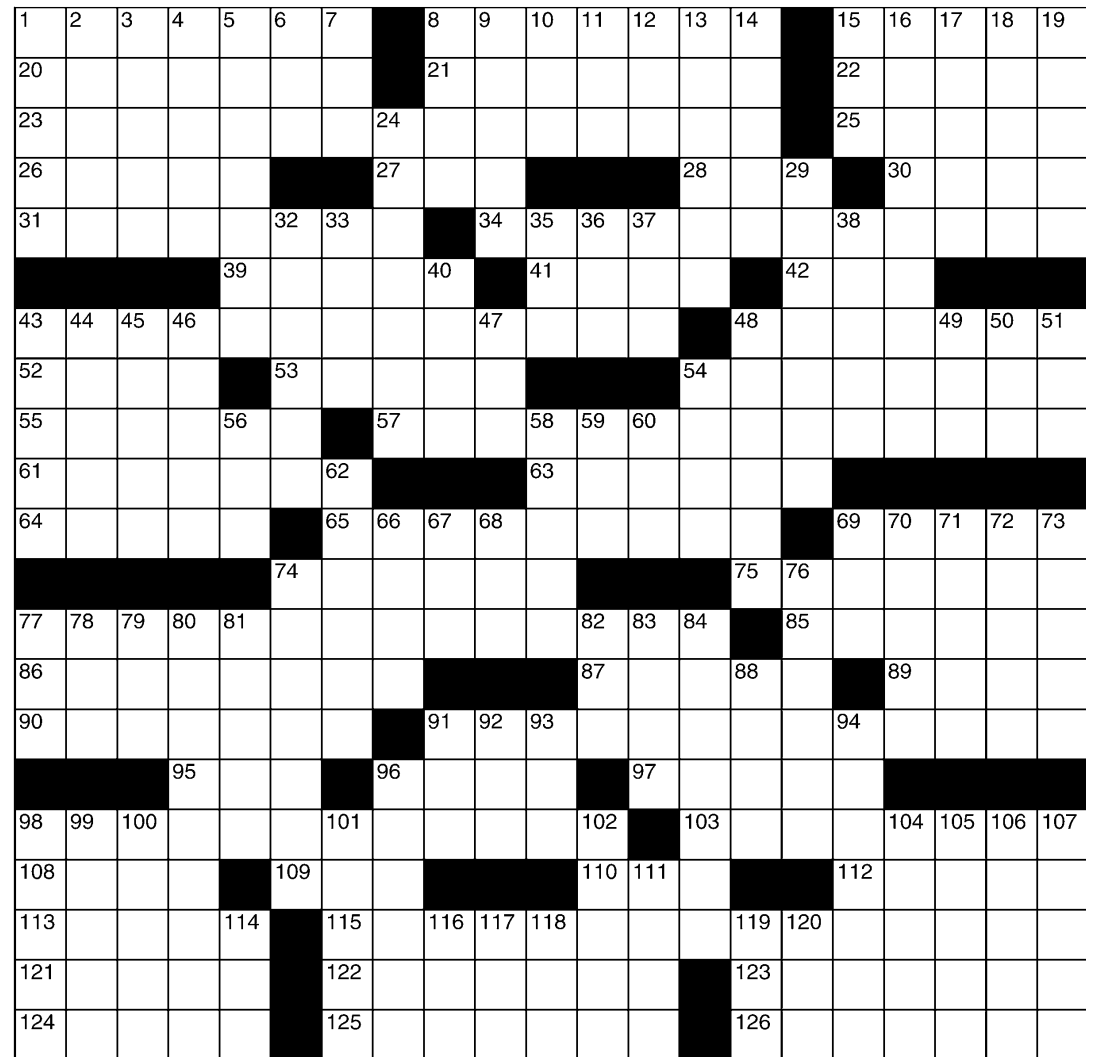

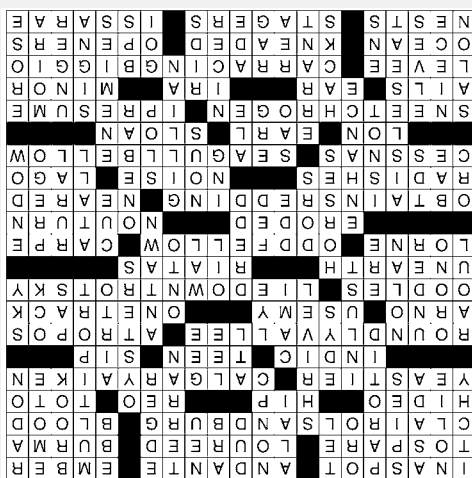

Some unlikely inspiration from a famous reader

Funny thing about writing a column: As you read this, you and I are having a conversation but when I write, I am alone, and my focus is extremely narrow. Once I send this off to the editor, the only other person I know who will read it, I am done. So, it is always a happy surprise when someone tells me that they read my column.

In June, I announced the month's Talking Stories/Cuentos que hablan event, "The Lizard and the Sun/La Lagartija y el Sol" by Alma Flor Ada.

This author's name was familiar to me because her children's books

impact CRA programs. "Ten Little Puppies/Diez Perritos" is one of the first books we share with parents during First Teacher/Primer Maestro. Others of her titles are chosen by children during Summer Book Buddies events.

Recently, I became acquainted with "My Name is Maria Isabel" and had just ordered copies for the upcoming Hatch Valley Literacy and Resource Fair on July 30-31 at Hatch Valley High School.

I never imagined that Señora Ada might be reading me. My surprise was huge when she emailed a request to join

us on Zoom for the story.

"I was delighted to read in a Las Cruces publication that 'The Lizard and the Sun' has been included in the Taking Stories project," she wrote. "It certainly sounds like an excellent project and I appreciate having had 'The Lizard and the Sun' included. It has been one of my favorite books to share with children who get very involved in the story. The lizard is one of my many characters with whom I identify more closely because she was persistent in her search. I have faced many challenges and have learned that persistence is the key to success."

Ada's participation in Talking Stories on June

18 was a treat. She is a delightful storyteller in person. She shared glimpses into her life's work, her childhood and her writing practice. But the most wonderful thing we learned was that she has dedicated her life to literacy, bilingual education and cross-cultural understanding.

"How lovely to know you share 'Diez Perritos' in the First Teacher/Primer Maestro program," she added. "Recognizing that parents are indeed the first and most constant teachers, has been something (fellow author) Isabel Campoy and I have promoted for many years. Inviting parents to share picture books with their children

has also been the core of much of my work. Thanks for doing something so meaningful for the parents and their children."

The summer heat in El Paso inspired a story while Ada served as visiting professor at UTEP. "I was walking across campus and was so hot that I was sure I could see the smoke coming out of my mouth. By the time I got back to my room, I sat down and wrote about fire-breathing dragons that ate trucks and trains."

Ada added a bit of her own family wisdom.

"My extraordinary grandmother used to say, 'We must free ourselves from, "What would they say? Liberarse del que

diran."

"It is indeed a great freedom, not easily achieved, but rewarding. I have learned throughout my own life that when we can be authentically vulnerable, we help others to realize there is nothing to be ashamed of our limitations and frailty."

NM moves up in child wellbeing

New Mexico is no longer ranked last for child wellbeing by the national 2021 Kids Count Data Book.

The data book, released in June by the Annie E. Casey Foundation, ranks New Mexico 49th – up from 50th last year. The higher ranking correlates with improvements the state is seeing in child wellbeing prior to the start of the pandemic, the New Mexico Voices for Children (NMVC) nonprofit said. NMVC is part of the Kids Count national network.

This year's ranking is based on the most recent comprehensive data, most of which are from 2019, so this ranking does not reflect the hardships many families have faced since the pandemic began.

"It's encouraging to see that child well-being in New Mexico was improving before the pandemic hit," NMVC Executive Director James Jimenez said. "We're cautiously optimistic that investments the state made in children and families beginning in 2019 (and) throughout the pandemic helped offset some of the health and financial problems caused by the pandemic."

Rio Grande Winery a 'dream' for new owners

After Randy McMillan and his wife, Carol, purchased the defunct subdivision now known as Mesilla Vineyard Estates south of Las Cruces in 2012, the longtime Las Cruces real estate broker "planted 10 acres of vineyard to bring ambience and life back to the property," he said.

The McMillans later built a new home and it is now surrounded by more than 20 acres of vineyards. They began selling grapes to New Mexico wineries and "making some good homemade wine" in his garage, McMillan said. The McMillans took winemaking classes at New Mexico State University and had always been regular visitors to vineyards in the Napa Valley in northern California.

"We love wine and the Wine Country," Carol said.

While enjoying the view of the Organ Mountains

from the rooftop patio of their home, they would "dream about having a winery someday."

Then, longtime owner Phillip Gordon Steel decided to sell Rio Grande Winery, and contacted Randy at NAI First Valley Realty in 2019.

The McMillans decided to buy the 23-acre property, located about 3.5 miles south of Mesilla. They partnered on the venture with three other local couples: Chris Lang and Carrie Lang; Bob and Sharon Martinez; and Richard and Alyson McDonald.

"It was just perfect," Carol McMillan said.

Randy oversees the vineyard. Carol is the designer. Chris Lang handles the marketing. Richard McDonald, who is Bob Martinez's son-in-law, is a professional winemaker, and Martinez is a longtime real-estate customer of McMillan's and now a partner in the winery.

The deal closed on the winery just as Covid-19 hit, which meant the win-

ery couldn't sell wine by the glass because of state public health orders, but it continued to sell bottles of wine and to produce 15 to 17 wine varietals, including Mission wine (a variety that dates back about 500 years), Pinot Grigio, Sauvignon Blanc and Malbec.

"We knew what we were getting into," Randy McMillan said. "We stayed open."

McDonald has guided the winery's development of seven of its own varietals, Carol said, including Desert Nights Rosé and Land of Mañana Moscato.

Carol stayed busy throughout the pandemic working with contractors to remodel the property, adding an outdoor fountain, new patio furniture,

a larger outdoor dance floor, sod and other landscaping, brand-new bathrooms and even privacy curtains (great for surprise parties) and a large outdoor sofa that helps create "a living patio (that) can move around to fit whatever function you need," she said.

The new owners have also converted the former winemaker's residence next door into The Clubhouse, a wedding venue with the same spectacular view of the Organs as the winery tasting room and patio, plus a large indoor entertainment space with room for live musicians, private dressing rooms and even a children's room.

The Clubhouse is "a dif-

ferent venue with a totally different feel," Carol said.

Steel "left us with very good bones. All we had to do was dress it up," she said.

Carol described the winery's employees as "the best staff in town," including event planner Sarah Boothe, winery manager Ariana Herrera and vineyard manager Nicolas Ruiz, whom Randy McMillan said has tripled Rio Grande's grape production in a year.

The winery has live music on Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays, has plans to continue special events on Easter, St. Patrick's Day and other holidays, and plans to add

sip and paint nights, regular movie nights, open mic and possibly father/daughter date night.

"We're going to be doing a lot of really cool things out here," Carol said.

When it is time to harvest the grapes, the winery will invite its customers (coming from as far away as Phoenix) "to

help us pick our grapes," Randy McMillan said. The winery will host "harvest parties" on six consecutive Saturdays beginning in mid-August, with 30 to 40 participants picking grapes, and learning how

to crush them doing a "Lucy Stomp" (remember that episode of "I Love Lucy"?) and how they are made into wine.

Rio Grande Winery is located at 5321 N. Highway 28. You will see the signs

on the left-hand side of New Mexico Highway 28 as you travel south. Turn just before you get to the large pink house on the left.

Las Cruces Olympian living her dream

Ever since Rachel Dincoff was a teenager growing up in Indiana, she would draw the Olympic rings – along with a cross for her faith – on her mirror.

It was a way to keep her inspired and motivated during the ups and downs of pursuing her dream of one day representing the United States in the Olympic Games.

Dincoff, who has lived, worked and trained in Las Cruces since 2017, recently qualified for the Tokyo Olympics in the women's discus.

"It is an unbelievable feeling," said Dincoff, a native of Auburn, Indiana, who has served as a volunteer track coach at New Mexico State University for the past four

years.

"I am surprised I am not as emotional as I thought I would be (after qualifying for the Olympics)," said Dincoff, age 27. "This was my child-

hood dream. I thought I would be extremely emotional. I was at first, but I think because I still have a job to do, that I have the Olympics coming up, it hasn't quite sunk in yet."

Dincoff was an All-American thrower at Auburn University in Alabama. After she graduated in 2016, she started working with Doug Reynolds, who at the time was the throwing coach at the University of Alabama.

Dincoff would commute, driving 5 hours round trip from Auburn to Tuscaloosa, at least once a week, to train with Reynolds. When Reynolds was hired to be the head track coach at New Mexico State, Dincoff followed him here to Las Cruces.

Since graduating from college, Dincoff has done a series of part-time jobs to help support herself financially and to continue to pursue her Olympic dream.

She has worked as a bartender, waitress and in retail.

"The only issue: I would be very exhausted by the end of the day," she said. "I had to push through. I wanted to reach this dream and these jobs provided me with the flexibility to continue to train."

She now works part-time remotely using her computer from her home for a family friend.

"That has been a game-changer," Dincoff said. "I can actually get the recovery I need from my body and still have the flexibility to train. She is a huge supporter of what I am doing and understands and is flexible. I am very grateful to have

Golfer, swimmer with ties to NMSU make Olympics

At least two other Olympians who will compete in Tokyo have ties to New Mexico State University.

Former Aggie women's golfer Alena Sharp has qualified to represent her native Canada for the second time.

While at New Mexico State University, Sharp won the 2000 Big West championship and then won the 2002 and 2003 Sun Belt championship.

She also helped lead the Aggies to two NCAA championship appearances in 2000 and 2001. The Hamilton, Ontario, native took 13th place at the 2000 national championships.

Sharp is a 16-year veteran of the LPGA and has finished in the top 10 at 14 events. She finished in 30th at the 2016 Rio de Janeiro Olympics.

Future Aggie swimmer Lina Khiyara has also qualified for the Tokyo Olympics where she will represent her home country of Morocco.

Khiyara is a freestyle specialist who has represented Morocco at the 2019 World Aquatic Championships in South Korea and the 2019 African Games.

Khiyara is set to join an NMSU swim program that took second at the WAC championships during its past season.

World of golf will be just fine without rival golf leagues

The buzz surrounding the proposed alternative professional golf league has not gone away. With an ageless Phil Mickelson winning the PGA and Jon Rahm's stunning play at the U.S. Open, the Premier Golf League is simply back page news, for now. Trust me, it will soon rear its ugly head. But first, there is one misconception that needs clarifying. There are two proposed mega-bucks golf leagues: a proposed Super Golf League, believed to be financed by Saudi money, is totally separate from (and not tied in with) the proposed Premier Golf League, with the principals based in London, and possibly dozens of investors that they call "share-

holders." According to a recent piece on globalgolfpost.com written by Ron Green, Jr., the push to launch the PGL is headed by Andy Gardiner, a 49 year-old former corporate finance lawyer, whose disruptor vision is to transform big-time men's professional golf as we now know it. "What Gardiner and his supporters/investors envision — a 48-player, team-golf concept with 18 no-cut 54-hole tournaments with \$20 million purses, shotgun starts to assure five-hour broadcast windows and immense financial guarantees to players — is an audacious proposal," writes Green. This idea has been incubating for the past six

years, and the PGA Tour knows it. Just last month, the Gardiner group officially debuted their vision through a website (premiergolfleague.com), a Twitter account (@premiergolfleague) and an "open letter to the world of golf."

The open letter states, "We're doing this because we believe professional golf can and should be better; it's not about the money." Right. There's a true old golf saying, "You can't buy a better game."

At this point, the PGL is only a pie-in-the-sky brainchild by a few rich Europeans who have noticed the ridiculous amount of money involved in all aspects with 21st century professional golf, and want a part of it. Presently, they have no players, no media partners, no venues and no

sponsors. A few PGA Tour players are rumored to be interested, and a few, like Rory McIlroy, have said categorically "no." Commissioner Jay Monahan has stated that any PGA Tour player who jumps ship to PGL will be barred from PGA Tour play.

From Green's interview with Gardiner, it seems the PGL people have talked with a number of top media and golf sponsor executives who have voiced their unhappiness over men's pro golf as it now stands. One of them allegedly chirped that golf is "stuck in 1968." I don't know what episode of *The Twilight Zone* he was from.

For one thing, they don't want any big names (stars) going home on late Friday, thereby lowering TV ratings. And that's where they got the idea

of guaranteed big money contracts to 48 of the top players, and tournaments with purses bigger than anything the game has ever seen.

With the exception of online betting (more ways to lose), golf is in a very good place right now. Perhaps foreseeing the future, the PGA Tour established the FedEx Cup in 2007, with the total payout now up to \$70 million. And injured and older Tiger would not be of interest to PGL, but if he were asked to join at \$20 or \$40 million, he would undoubtedly respond that his World Golf Hall of Fame legacy is secure and should not be tainted by a group of money-grabbing foreigners.

Other pro tour professionals have to be thinking about golf's past, their legacy, including the four

majors which span many, many years of history. It is also interesting that the European Tour was reportedly offered huge sums of money to side with the PGL, but instead decided to ally with the PGA Tour.

The more important golf community is made up of 25 million golfers in the U.S. and hundreds of millions worldwide. Golf is not defined by the pro tours, the television cameras, or even the USGA or R&A. Golf is the people who play and love the game. I seriously doubt that the brokers who want to proceed with the PGL have ever checked with them.

fallen into that blessing. That has really helped me with my Olympic dream."

At the Olympic Trials in Eugene, Oregon, Dincoff threw the discus 60.21 meters or 197 feet, 6 inches to earn the third and final spot for Team USA in the event.

Her qualifying throw came on her fifth out of six attempts. At the time, she was sitting in fourth place, one spot out of making the Olympic team.

Her goal for Tokyo is to set a personal-best mark. Her previous personal

record was a mark of 64.41 meters or 211 feet, 4 inches at the Tucson Elite meet in May of this year.

Dincoff said the Olympics being postponed a year definitely benefited her.

"I am not sure how my season last year would have turned out, but I don't think I would be in the same situation as I am now, if it wasn't postponed," Dincoff said. "The extra year gave me time to grow as an athlete and as a person as well. It gave me more time to learn and figure out what it takes to be successful at this sport.

"It's a very tactical sport," she continued. "I

had to spend a lot of time figuring out my technique and what works best for me."

The Olympics are scheduled for July 23 through Aug. 8, but will still be impacted by the pandemic. For instance, athletes will not be permitted to arrive until five

days before their first event, Dincoff said. That means she will have to miss the Opening Ceremony but will still be able to stay in the Olympic Village while there.

"I'm very sad (about missing the Opening Ceremony), but I'm also very grateful to have this

experience in general," Dincoff said.

Dincoff said she loves living and training in Las Cruces.

The weather allows her to train year-round. She also loves the close-knit family-style atmosphere

at NMSU and in Las Cruces in general.

"I am so grateful for all the support, all the love, for everyone reaching out," Dincoff said. "I see it and feel it and am so excited to compete at the Tokyo Olympics."
