9-1-1 CENTER IMPLEMENTS LOCATION TECHNOLOGY TO IMPROVE EMERGENCY RESPONSE TIMES

The Mesilla Valley Regional Dispatch Authority (MVRDA) announces the roll-out of "what3words" location technology.

Using what3words addresses gives callers a simple way to describe precisely where help is needed, enabling responders to find and get resources to the scene faster. What3words has divided the world into 10-foot squares and given each square a unique combination of three words: a what3words address,

///.duvet.persons.icon, for example, is a precise 10-foot square location in the parking lot of the Doña Ana County Government Center.

What3words is free to use via the app for iOS and Android or the online map at what3words.com. The system works offline, making it ideal for use in areas with an unreliable data connection. What3words addresses cover the entire world and can be used in over 40 languages.

In an emergency, identifying precisely where help is needed is critical. This can be near impossible if you are in an area without an address or if that address is not clear enough to describe exactly where you are. In rural areas it is even more difficult to communicate location accurately, for example if you are hiking in the Organ Mountains or off roading in the desert. Callers who do not know where they are often use their phones to try and find themselves via a pin on a map — but it is difficult to describe that pin to someone over a 911 call.

Now when you dial 911 from a mobile phone in Doña Ana County, the caller's what3words location will be transmitted to the 911 dispatcher and the location will appear on their dispatch map. Callers using a landline or VOIP phone can verbally give their what3words address when dialing 911.

If they already have the app, callers can use it to find the three words that identify their location. The three words can then be used by the 911 dispatcher to identify the precise location and direct first responders to exactly where they are required. First responders can also use the what3words app to guide them to the three-word location that is reported to them by the dispatcher.

The Mesilla Valley Regional Dispatch Authority encourages all residents in Dona Ana County to download and install the what3words app in their mobile devices. It will help us help you.

Two decades in the making

Virgin Galactic's latest launch signals new era for New Mexico

From the beginning, 17 years ago when then New Mexico Gov. Bill Richardson and Virgin Galactic's Sir Richard Branson shook hands over a piece of desert in southern New Mexico, everything has led to the historic day of Sunday, July 11, 2021.

The Unity 22 flight, from Spaceport America, kicked off the future of space travel.

"It's a beautiful day for New Mexico," said former economic development secretary and one of the original conceptualists of the spaceport, Rick Homans, who served in the Richardson administration. "This is the day we have all been working for since 2005 when Governor Richardson

announced this great partnership."

Homans said the Unity 22 flight is a milestone for the commercial spaceflight industry and space tourism but it is just the beginning.

"The goal is to live, work and play in space," he said. "We have seen the industrial revolution and what we are experiencing now is really the beginning of the space revolution. It's a pretty hot market right now, and New Mexico is in the right time at the right place."

The facility, Homans said, cost \$250 million

with a lot of expense going into the 12,000-foot-long runway and the iconic Gateway to Space building and it couldn't have been done without the taxpayers of New Mexico, specifically Doña Ana and Sierra counties.

"The thing I would say to the taxpayers is thank you," he said. "Thank you for the confidence. Passing the tax was the key to moving it forward. They benefitted with money going into education programs through the years, but the big thing now is the money going into the jobs and the spaceflight industry. That's really when the payoff will come."


The 700 to 800 people gathered at Spaceport America last Sunday included not only press from across the world but also many of the "future astronauts," holders of the \$250,000 tickets to space purchased from Virgin Galactic. And on the VIP side of the event, Branson's family awaited his return from space along with family members of the others flying on the spaceship Unity.

Elon Musk, who is Branson's friend and owner of another commercial space flight company, SpaceX, was also present at the historic event. SpaceX launches from Florida, while a third company, Blue Origin, launches from west Texas near Van Horn, about two hours east of El Paso. Blue Origin is owned by Amazon founder Jeff Bezos.

A group of Las Cruces Public Schools students from Monte Vista Elementary School also attended the event, adding a youthful example of those childhood dreams of going to space.

Russian born Lina Boroczina was one of the first to sign up for a ticket to space. She's an example of Branson's dream of

making space accessible to everyone. Sixteen and a half years ago, she mortgaged her house to buy her ticket and has no regrets.

"I am a future astronaut, one of the founders," she said. "In 17 years of waiting, I am actually here to witness Sir Richard go up. It's a dream of a lifetime.

"When I was 5 years old, my dad used to tuck me in bed and tell me stories about being stowed away in a spaceship with my cousin," Boroczina added. "Stories that we used to go in space and come out in zero gravity and have space adventures with all kinds of space aliens and then we would land and grandma would be standing on the landing with her rolling pin and we would get grounded for like sneaking out on the space adventure. Every night, it was a different story."

Boroczina identified herself as a huge sci-fi nerd and a scientist.

"You cannot imagine how happy I am to be here," she said. "I cannot find words for it. The future is now. It is worth every penny -- every single penny."

Spaceport Director Scott McLaughlin said the event is important for the region, a milestone for New Mexico.

He called himself is a "boomerang," a third-generation New Mexican who left because there was little work in his industry of engineering and aerospace and then returned 25 years later.

"New Mexico invests in college grads and then they leave," he said. "Space involves virtually every technology we work on. I would like to grow the economy where people don't just decide to leave

after they graduate."

New Mexico Gov. Michele Lujan Grisham was there too, of course. She was touting the value of the event, and space tourism in general, to the state's economy.

"Ten million people are going to see this incredible site," she said. "They are going to get to know New Mexico. They are going to know the history of our technology footprint and of our space footprint."

Another future astronaut, New Mexico State University's Pat Hynes, also talked of New Mexico's long association with

the space industry.

"Our world has evolved in the space industry over time," she said. "This is a continuation of work we have been doing for many years."

Hynes is the curator of the International Symposium for Personal and Commercial Spaceflight held every year in Las Cruces. She is a strong proponent of the research component of taking humans to space and has been the developer of many experiments that have already taken place out of Spaceport America.

"There are many things we are learning by studying things in zero gravity," she said.

Because government changes in administration and funding is not an issue in the private space industry, she hopes that experimentation in space will have a continuity it has never seen before.

"Now you see it: We have research capacity," she said. "Commercial is so important because it is not dependent on government. Private industry has to do this."

It was at the press conference as the entire event

was wrapping up that Branson said directly to the school children, "If we can do this, just imagine what you can do."

"It's impossible to describe," he said, clearly still high from the experience. "The views as you go into space – we are so lucky to have this planet that we all live on. At Virgin Galactic, we must all be doing everything we can to help this incredible planet we live on. I will devote the rest of my life to doing that."

Police Department looking for 'good people' in recruitment effort

"We need good people,"
Las Cruces Police Lt.
Jeremy Story said earlier
this month, as the Las
Cruces Police Department
(LCPD) continues to recruit new officers for its
academy.

The department has almost 200 total positions, and currently has about 150 officers, which is "the lowest in a very long time," Story said.

LCPD's current recruitment drive ends July 30.

The "sentiment across the U.S. ... the negativity that's out there," has "affected recruiting and morale" in Las Cruces to some degree, he said, even though LCPD has strong support from the community, city management, Mayor Ken Miyagishima and some members of the city council, Story said.

The pandemic has also made recruiting more difficult for police departments and "across the spectrum," said Police Academy Coordinator David Rodriguez.

Understaffing has meant more overtime for current officers, who are coming in early and staying late so the department can continue to answer calls for service, said Story, a former U.S. Marine, who has been with

LCPD for 15 years.

"I feel like I'm making a difference," he said. "Every day, you wake up and you know it's going to be different."

"It's a different environment from any kind of 9 to 5," said Rodriguez, a native of El Paso who is beginning his eighth year with LCPD.

"It's a good career," he said. "You can make an impact on the community you live in."

Sometimes, even "the smallest changes" a police officer makes can "impact somebody's quality of life," Rodriguez said.

Rodriquez said he gets some questions from recruits and the public about qualified immunity for police officers.

He says LCPD officers receive "more positive

feedback than negative, even on their worst day."

While they don't always get thanked for the service they provide, Las Cruces police officers have "overwhelming community support," he said.

"We appreciate the women and men of law enforcement, and we recognize that those who choose this career do so because of their calling, which is to help protect our community while making a difference in the lives of their neighbors and our residents," Mayor Ken Miyagishima said.

"We appreciate the families who give so much through their sacrifice and sometimes when their family gives the ultimate sacrifice." the mayor added. "The city owes a tremendous debt of gratitude that we can never repay. I ask all of our residents when they see a police officer to say: 'Officer, thank you for your service; I appreciate you very much!'"

LCPD is "more professional now than ever" in terms of its training, standards and accountability, Story said.

"Las Cruces has a very well trained, professional department," he said, but it "can always be better." LCPD continues to focus on improved training and increased professionalism to "deliver better service," Story said.

"I always wanted to be a police officer," said Sgt. Erik Hechler, a native of Truth or Consequences. Hechler joined LCPD a decade ago at age 30, after a 10-year career in construction, and said he felt "a calling to do it."

Being a part of LCPD's Community Outreach Unit is "right where I fit in," he said. "It's been rewarding for me. You do something that makes a difference."

The six-member Community Outreach Unit is focused on creating partnerships within the community, Hechler said, and interacting with people.

Members of the unit participated in drive-by parades for a Las Cruces retirement community during the pandemic lockdown, Hechler said.

They also partnered with staff from Buena Vida Apartments, 1505 La Fonda Drive, to repair and replace basketball goals on that property in June, according to a City of Las Cruces news release.

Officers support New Mexico Special Olympics, including participating in Law Enforcement Torch Runs.

They also have been involved in local Keep Las Cruces Beautiful cleanup efforts and they helped with last month's repainting and refurbishing of the Police Athletic League (PAL) building, 700 N. Solano Drive.

The A in PAL will soon change from Athletic to Activities, Hechler said, as police officers and other volunteers coach and mentor local youth in sports and other activities.

School resource officers – police officers assigned to local schools – "are a great asset," Hechler said.

They participate in a wide range of activities at schools throughout Las Cruces, reaching out to "kids who need a little extra attention," he said. Officers recently helped organize kickball teams at two Las Cruces elementary schools, he said.

"We're your friends," Hechler said. "Come and see us. Talk to us."

He also encouraged community members to "get involved" with LCPD and its outreach programs and efforts to serve and protect the community.

"Be involved," Hechler said. "Stay vigilant. Never hesitate to call us. We'll respond."

"If you want to see a change in the community," apply to the Las Cruces Police Academy, Rodriguez said.

"It's my career plan," Rodriguez said about LCPD. "I'm actually training police officers of the future."

Another giant leap for New Mexico and space

Seventy-six years ago today, scientists based in New Mexico, detonated the world's first atomic bomb. It happened in a place a little over two hours' drive from Las

In other words, drive to San Antonio, New Mexico, for a green chile cheeseburger at the Owl and/or the Buckhorn, then drive a half hour or so east, and you're at Ground Zero.

Cruces.

Five days ago today, another significant scientific achievement took place in New Mexico. Unless you've been hiding under a giant moon rock, or the world's biggest piece of Trinitite, you know Sunday, July 11, Virgin Galactic launched an aircraft from Spaceport America in Sierra County, about 45 minutes from Las Cruces.

Its six-person group, including Virgin founder Richard Branson, flew to the edge of space, achieved weightlessness, free from the bonds of gravity and safely returned on, essentially, a glider ride to the Space-

port America runway.

The history of space flight, and all kinds of important sci-

entific discovery, has deep roots in southern New Mexico. Many New Mexicans, including myself, may underestimate the accomplishments.

Southern New Mexico's space bona fides:

• Twelve men have walked on the moon. Two of them claim southern New Mexico as

their home. Edgar Mitchell, the sixth man to make the walk, 50 years ago with Apollo 14, grew up in Artesia. Harrison Schmitt, the last person to walk on the moon, with Apollo 17 in 1972, is from Silver City

- American rocket pioneer Robert Goddard took up residence in Roswell in 1930, and accomplished some of his most important work there.
- After World War II, the U.S. military brought German scientist Werner Von Braun to White Sands Proving Grounds (now White Sands Missile Range) to perfect the V2 rocket.

- Clyde Tombaugh, the discoverer of Pluto, taught astronomy at New Mexico State from 1955-73, and retired in Las Cruces until his death in 1997.
- The International Space Hall of Fame was established in Alamogordo in 1976.
- Several aircraft and pilot innovations later used by astronauts were tested at Holloman Air Force Base.
- NASA opened its White Sands Test Facility to test propulsion in 1963, the same year President John F. Kennedy came to visit WSMR and inspect the latest missile expertise. In 1961, Kennedy had told Congress, America should put a man on the moon before the end of the decade. His vision became reality in July 1969, just a few months before the end of the decade.
- In 1982, the Space Shuttle Columbia landed at WSMR.
- If that's not enough for you, how about this? David Bowie filmed part of the 1975 sci-fi film "The Man Who Fell to Earth" at WSMR.
 - I won't even mention the

1947 Roswell UFO incident.

- In 2011, New Mexico opened Spaceport America, which contrary to popular belief, has housed many tenants in the past decade, not just Virgin Galactic, and has been the site of multiple launches and tests, by a number of companies and organizations.
- And, of course, the latest, the July 2021 launching of commercial passengers into space and returning safely.

I watched the Virgin launch from the Rio Grande Theatre in Downtown Las Cruces.

I'm grateful to the city for making the opportunity available, but now I regret not being at the spaceport to see it with my own eyes.

The first time I saw the unimposing obelisk at White Sands Missile Range, marking the spot where the atomic bomb was first detonated, I got emotional.

I certainly hadn't anticipated that. But what happened on that spot changed the course of human history.

One day we'll look back on the July 11 spaceflight as another event that changed history.

Money for nothing and the checks for free

There are no free lunches. If you don't work, you don't eat. Everybody has to pitch in and carry their weight.

These aphorisms from

my youth, passed on by my parents and others from their generation who survived the Great Depression during their childhood, pop into my mind each time I hear about a new government plan to give people free money.

Democratic presidential candidate Andrew Yang proposed a plan in which all citizens of working age, regardless of their income, would get \$1,000 checks each month from

the federal government.

Las Cruces City Council member Johana Bencomo has now proposed a new city program in which low-income residents would re-

ceive a "guaranteed basic income," through direct payments from the city government. She wants to start with a small group of residents in a pilot program first.

Details are still being worked out, but Bencomo said she would like to see those selected for the pilot program get at least \$500 a month, which they could spend any way they wanted. She said similar programs elsewhere have led to improved health

outcomes and employment opportunities for participants.

And, I don't doubt a pilot program here would have the same result, assuming we picked the right people for the program.

Bencomo's plan is to take the money from existing funds. That will work for now, but the program would need a recurring funding source to be sustainable.

But beyond the question of if we can, is the much larger question of if we should. More specifically, if we give people money for not working, will that reduce their incentive to work? And if that happens, what will it mean for our nation's productivity?

The \$600-a-month boost

to unemployment benefits made available through the federal CARES Act has led to millions of workers opting to delay their return to the workplace, while employers desperate to get up and running again after the pandemic are scrambling to find help.

I understand the argument for a guaranteed basic income. The federal minimum wage has been frozen at \$7.25 an hour since 2009. Union membership has been decimated by right-to-work laws, with barely 10 percent of the workforce now enjoying representation. As a result, the wealth gap in the United States has increased to indefensible levels.

According to the Pew

Research Institute, in the years 2001 to 2016, upperincome families saw their wealth increase by 33 percent. Middle-income families saw their wealth shrink by 20 percent, while those at the bottom experienced a 45 percent

Since 2016, the Trump tax cut and the pandemic have both combined to make the wealth gap even wider. I understand that millions of people need help. And, I'm sparing my tears for employers who have steadfastly opposed any increase to the minimum wage and are now having a hard time finding workers.

I fully support increased spending on childcare services, job training, rental assistance, afford-

able housing and emergency food programs. I agree that wages need to be higher and employees need stronger workplace protections.

The playing field has been tilted in favor of the rich and the wealthy for too long. It's shameful that a nation as wealthy as ours has so many people living on the streets, without the security of shelter or the comfort of knowing where their next meal will come from.

We absolutely need to do better. But money for nothing? Free checks in the mail each month just for being? I'm still having a hard time with that one.

Using public education to spur a strong, healthy democracy

The League of Women Voters of New Mexico (LWVNM) believes that education is the foundation for a strong and viable democracy and that the public education system should impart to students an understanding of the nature of democracy, the ability to think critically and the skills to function successfully in a complex society.

One approach to this goal involves democratic learning communities — groups of people — students, families, educators and the public -- working together to provide relevant learning.

In the May 23, 2021 Las Cruces Sun News, Mesilla

Elementary kindergarten teacher Aimee Parra described it skillfully. The





young learners/leaders in her class shared responsibility for a well-functioning community, working together to achieve learning goals.

Their experiences included planning and resolving issues, engaging them in meaningful communication, empathy, teamwork and self-reflec-

With attention to social and emotional learning, students practiced skills of self-confidence, friendships, problem solving, curiosity and responsibil-

Policy (JBC), that the Las Cruces Public School Board recently adopted.

The JBC Policy commits the school district to fairness, equity and inclusion as principles of the system and to modification of "negative stereotypes of historically under-represented, underserved and marginalized student populations, cultures and languages."

High expectations for all students and everyone involved will advance leadership skills. With the violence, abuse and

suicidal patterns found in our society, developing social and emotional skills is also essential. In other words, the policy can be seen as a response to the court findings in the Yazzie/Martinez lawsuit. In the court decision, the judge ruled that New Mexico was violating the constitutional right of students to "a sufficient education" for all students, especially those living in poverty.

According to the court's judgments, schools must: 1) expand multicultural curricula, 2) provide learning experiences involving family and community, 3) supply equitable enriched resources, 4) use multiple, relevant assessments, and 5) provide relevant, ongoing professional development for educators. Multicul-

tural education is identified first because it is so significant.

Multicultural education is basic education that includes curriculum, learning strategies and interactions among teachers, students, families and the community.

It is evident everywhere, from bulletin boards to lunchrooms, sports events and assemblies.

The curricula and learning are based on affirming social justice, critical thinking about historical records, cultural and language diversity and a broad range of knowledge.

In the JBC Policy, the word "equity" means using fair learning processes to meet the strengths, interests, and needs of all students. A

fair education system uses learning resources where students see people who look like them.

We can all benefit from having a broader, more inclusive view of history, learning about how people are similar and different and how different individuals and groups overcome challenges they

Providing relevant, real-world learning experiences in democratic learning communities gives students more choices and greater responsibility for and engagement with their own learning.



Avanza program helping low-income students

Avanza is the Spanish word for "advance," and that's what Doña Ana Community College's Avanza program is all about – helping lowincome students move up and move ahead.

Avanza is an integrated services support program that began in southern Doña Ana County to assist current and incoming DACC students realize their educational goals and achieve the quality of life they want for themselves, their families and their community. Unique services also include: mentoring, career exploration and employment readiness; help connecting students to community resources and social service organizations; food pantries in Anthony and Sunland Park; and childcare resources.

"Our goal is to ensure that citizens of Doña Ana County can access and benefit from programs and resources at DACC," said DACC President Mónica F. Torres, Ph.D. "We do know that in order to do that well, people need to have their basic needs met. The wraparound services provided

by Avanza do exactly that – provide access to resources that allow students to concentrate on their studies."

"We realized there was a great need for students in our southern county," said DACC Avanza Program Specialist Alma Olacio. "Many of them are first-generation college students who need extra support and guidance to make their studies successful and help them graduate. Our intent is to assist students overcome barriers they may experience in completing their programs."

"I want to improve reading, writing, listening and speaking my English in DACC," said a 36-year-old student participating in

DACC's Avanza program. The female student, who wished not to be identified, has studied English at DACC since 2018. The student has a degree in administration from the Institute Technology of Ciudad Juarez in Juarez, Mexico. The Juarez native, who now lives in Anthony, New Mexico, also has the equivalent of a bachelor of science in business administration from the **International Education** Research Foundation, Inc. She worked as a teacher for eight years in Juarez.

The student hopes to get a job in education, she said, and will be helped by the Avanza program.

"I like to teach and help children," she said. "I would like to work in a daycare or school."

"A major part of Avanza is to build trusting relationships with our students and with our community," Olacio said. "We are creating a culture of empathy and awareness at DACC by making sure our students are doing well personally, not only academically. We continue adding services to meet our students' needs at the time. Collaborating with community service providers has played an important role.

"During fall 2020, due to all classes switching to online, a common hardship was access to technology," Olacio said. "With the assistance of a grant from Union Pacific (Foundation), we purchased 31 iPads for south DACC students and coordinated the distributions following all safety guidelines. Some of the recipients of the iPads shared with us that they had been using their cell phones to complete their assignments prior to receiving an iPad. Others mentioned sharing laptops with their siblings or their children and how difficult it was for them to all attend Zoom meetings

Emergency relief funds now available for DACC students

Emergency relief funds are now being made available to Doña Ana Community College students, the college announced.

The funds are Higher Education Emergency Relief Funds (HEERF III) that students can now apply for. Eligibility requirements include that students must: have been enrolled for one credit hour for spring or summer 2021; have direct deposit set up through their MyNMSU account; and verify they were affected by Covid after March 13, 2020.

Students can apply for these funds through https://fa.nmsu.edu/heerf/.

In addition, DACC is currently accepting applications for its fall semester, scheduled to begin in August.

DACC encourages applicants to apply early in order to better assist them with obtaining financial aid and/or scholarships. Applying early also allows students more time to attend orientation, meet with their advisers and register for classes.

Retired teacher Cort picked to fill vacancy on LCPS board

Pamela Cort, a retired Las Cruces Public Schools teacher was appointed July 6 to serve as the District 2 member on the Las Cruces Public Schools Board of Education.

Cort was one of five candidates who qualified during the selection process, held July 6 at Las Cruces High School, LCPS said in a news release. The others participating in individual interviews

conducted by board members were Charlene Bencomo, Carissa Brealey, Scott Ochs and Henry Young.

Candidates were given an opportunity to give an opening statement, followed by questions from each board member and a question submitted by students, LCPS said. At the end of the interview, candidates had an opportunity to give a closing statement. Questions ranged from thoughts and opinions on equity in education to what ideas can-

didates had for improving engagement and communication among students, parents and teachers.

The final selection process, voted on by the board just prior to the first interview, was to conduct a ranked-choice vote of the candidates. Board members assigned scores to each candidate from one to five, with one being the best score. The

ranking was tallied and the candidate with the lowest combined score could be nominated, which required a motion and second. Although Bencomo received first-place votes by two members, Cort received the overall lowest score, or first place in a ranked choice.

Cort's career as an educator spans a total of 31 years, 26 of which were spent with LCPS. She was the New Mexico teacher of the year in 2013.

Since her retirement in 2019, Cort has stayed involved with state teacher organizations to create professional development opportunities for educators, LCPS said. The next step, Cort said, was to serve her community as a member of the LCPS Board of Education.

During her interview, Cort spoke extensively on her experience as a high school French teacher, promoting cultural and linguistic diversity in the classroom.

She also spoke about the need to create an open-door policy to make parents feel comfortable and welcome on school campuses.

"The welcome centers at our high schools are a great resource, but they aren't widely advertised," said Cort, who taught at Las Cruces High School.

Cort will finish the fouryear term of Terrie Dallman, who resigned from the board last month. The term ends Dec. 31.

Board seats in districts 1, 2 and 3 are up for election in November.

Cort was sworn in July 7.

Las Cruces Utilities Customers Have a Voice in Their Rates

As a Las Cruces Utilities (LCU) customer, your opinion counts. In fact, if you have opinions about gas rates, the Utility **Customer Advisory** Group (UCAG) wants to hear from you. The UCAG is an ad hoc committee created by resolution in 2016. The five volunteer members are tasked with reviewing LCU rates for all four services (gas, water, wastewater, and solid waste). A panel of customers, the UCAG is uniquely qualified to gather customer input because they themselves are customers. Now the **UCAG** wants your input on the gas rate review and its recommendations. The committee will gather customer feedback and inform the LCU Board of Commissioners, which will submit their recommendation to the City Council.

In May, the UCAG conducted virtual

meetings with customers regarding the LCU gas rate review. This summer, UCAG is holding two in person public meetings due to the relaxed COVID-19 restrictions. The deadline to provide feedback on the gas rate review options is July 31, 2021. During the meetings, UCAG will present information provided by Stantec Consulting, the firm responsible for evaluating current gas rates, revenue requirements, and the cost of providing services. According to Paul Royalty, UCAG Chair, "LCU customers have an opportunity to provide input to the Utility Board and the City Council concerning the proposed rate increases. The Utility **Customer Advisory Group** is here to help customers voice their opinions and concerns." The last time LCU reviewed natural gas rates was 10 years ago. The current gas rate review reflects cost increases in every aspect of running a public utility from employee wages and benefits to equipment maintenance and replacement.

The three rate options under consideration are:

- 1. A full cost implementation of new rates in one year;
- 2. A limited phased-in cost increase for the two most impacted customer classes (small and large commercial) over three years;

3. A full phased-in cost increase for all customer classes over three years.

- The average residential monthly gas bill today is \$26.87, including the access charge. A full-cost increase would raise the average residential bill to \$29.33.
- · The average small commercial monthly gas bill today is \$75.15, including the access charge. A full-cost increase would raise the average small commercial bill to \$107.24.
- "I urge the public to take advantage of the opportunity to voice their opinion in person, city utilities affect everyone," said Royalty.

Recycling in Las Cruces has a transportation problem: How does what gets put in the blue bin get to a place where it can be reused or remade?

"The best bet would be if our recycling could get a second life in Las Cruces or Doña Ana County," explained Patrick Peck, director of South Central Solid **Waste Authority** (SCSWA). "If local businesses stepped up to create a new industry from material previously used, it could strengthen our circular economy."

A circular economy is when recyclables that originate in our region can be reused or remade into products to be sold and purchased again, a regenerative approach instead of the traditional linear economy where the mindset is singleuse. For every load of clean recycling that could be kept local, the cost of transportation is saved, particularly since Las Cruces Currently, local 18-wheel trucks and

is far away from processing plants. recycled materials are transferred into hauled 40 miles to Friedman Recycling in El Paso — the only recycling processor within 250 miles of

Las Cruces. The gas, the drivers, all parts of the open-loop that eats up the recycling value that could stay in the city.

However, there are efforts to make use of the recycled material. Local business owner Gabriel Lopez is an example of a member of the circular economy. Lopez takes the recycled glass that is given away free at SCSWA to grind up for his pressure washer. The glass becomes like sand and a way to clean things

like graffiti and calcified tiles that are 100 percent green by using no chemicals.

"These are the business initiatives that will increase the value of our own recycled material," Peck said. "If other entrepreneurs can solve a need with things like clean corrugated cardboard, aluminum or plastic, we can have our own circle that promotes not only a green lifestyle but green businesses."

and submit assignments on time.

"Currently, we are focusing on two major things: mental health awareness and services for the undocumented/ DACA community," she said. "We hosted an (April) event, Undocu-Student Support, where we had a panel of service providers to include an immigration attorney providing information to students, staff and families. Our goal with these events is to raise awareness to the added barriers our undocumented/DACA

students face and to create a community of supporters. We had a total of 84 attendees, which shows the amount of interest in the topic. We also have put together a list of scholarships that are open to DACA and undocumented students."

DACC held a June 30 virtual event in Spanish titled "Depression How to Prevent and Overcome It," Olacio said.

Rosalva Blanco, a licensed master social worker from La Clinica de Familia, was the guest speaker.

"Avanza cares about the well-being of students," Olacio said. "Mental health is a fundamental

part of our health in general and is directly related to our well-being. We will continue hosting events like these for students."

Avanza is funded by a grant from the W.K. Kellogg Foundation of Battle Creek, Michigan, and will continue after the grant period is over.





8 a.m. on APL Serengeti

4 ways to build community in your business

Spaceport America hosts Sir Richard Branson's spaceflight

uly 11, 2021, Sierra County, NM- Spaceport America, the world's first purpose-built commercial spaceport, hosted Virgin Galactic's first commercial passenger spaceflight from Southern New Mexico with Virgin founder Sir Richard Branson on board. This is the first of many commercial human spaceflight operations from the New Mexico spaceport as Virgin Galactic looks to begin regular passenger flights in 2022.

"This flight is the culmination of decades of work by many hundreds of people focused on the creation and operation of Spaceport America," **Executive Director Scott** McLaughlin said. "As the owners of the site, I hope the citizens of New Mexico see the benefits of the investments made and we all see the aerospace marketplace continue to grow in economic impact. Thank you to Spaceport America employees and partners for your dedication over years to get to this point."

New Mexico has been at the forefront of advancements in aerospace since Robert Goddard arrived in the state in the 1930s. Spaceport America's partner White Sands Missile Range (WSMR), is known as the birthplace of America's missile and space programs. WSMR has launched more suborbital flights than any other range in the U.S. WSMR control 6,000 square miles of restricted airspace from the ground to infinity and has an agreement with Spaceport America to share access to that airspace.

Spaceport America has been used as a research and development launch complex since 2006. It is the only FAA-licensed launch facility with both horizontal and vertical launch areas. Spaceport America has hosted flights from student rocket launches at the annual Spaceport America Cup, to Boeing Starliner capsule

tests, and now human spaceflight since May 2021.

Spaceport America was designed, built, and is owned and operated by the State of New Mexico. The New Mexico Spaceport Authority (NMSA) manages Spaceport America. NMSA coordinates all the airspace, manages all facilities across the 18,000 acres, and provides security, fire, and

EMT support. All facilities at Spaceport America are paid for by New Mexico taxpayers.

"Spaceport America is currently in talks with several customers and tenants that encompass vertical and horizontal launches, engine building and testing, and UAS/UAV training and testing" said Business Development Lead Susan Raitt. "We are in a good position to attract more aerospace businesses to New Mexico and grow our employment numbers in the coming years."

Virgin Galactic is the largest employer at Spaceport America with around 180 employees and holds a 20-year lease agreement for the use of the Gateway to Space and the horizontal launch area. Other tenants with long-term leases at Spaceport America include AeroVironment/ HAPSMobile, UP Aerospace and SpinLaunch. Boeing, Swift Engineering, Stratodynamics, C6 Launch Systems and White Sands Research and Developers are among the many short-term customers at Spaceport America.

Virgin Galactic a Magnet for Tourism and Economic Growth

n July 11, years of planning, hard work and determination paid off for Virgin Galactic, and, potentially, for Las Cruces. On a beautiful Sunday morning, Sir Richard Branson and his amazing crew opened the doors to commercial space tourism. It was a flawless flight and the most awesome experience I ever witnessed.

For years, we watched

Virgin Galactic blossom from an idea to a viable entity. Many in our community felt, and some still feel, that we will never see our return on the investment made in Spaceport America

Virgin Galactic makes a strong effort to purchase goods and services from New Mexican companies, and they have supported educational and other programs that have helped our children. They are an integral part of the Las Cruces community.

Of course, many are already asking what comes next? Will we finally derive

benefit of this amazing effort? Besides growing the size of the company tenfold in New Mexico and actively hiring staff from within our community; Virgin Galactic's presence in the Las Cruces area is a tremendous asset for bringing additional businesses.

During the weekend of Sir Richard's flight, every hotel in the area was completely full. Many restaurants experienced a huge surge in business. Those in attendance included press and future astronauts from around the world who are planning their journey into space. Estimates from Visit Las Cruces claim that there was a \$400,000 benefit during the weekend. Some critics complain that right now space tourism is only for the very rich. The first commercial airplane flight

took place in 1914. The flight traveled from St. Petersburg to Tampa, Florida. The flight lasted 23 minutes for an 18.6 mile flight. The cost of the flight at the time was \$400 (which would be valued to over \$10,000 in today's market.) No one can argue the economic impact and mass appeal of the airline industry today. The point is innovation and technological advances are expensive, but these innovations will yield big dividends for our children and our children's children.

Bringing wealthy people into our area is a tremendous opportunity. If they

One of the summer virtual programs provided by TRIO Upward Bound GISD/LCPS' 2021 Crimson Summer Institute is the Aggie Academy. The Aggie Academy provides a six-week academic curriculum including math, English, reading, science, career prep and college knowledge, a foreign language and educational and

cultural workshops. Additionally, this summer the programming will include a study abroad theme along with a new component, Wellness Wednesdays, featuring health and financial wellness.

Our organization coordinated six financial sessions during the summer program. Presenters were requested from the local Money Smart Week coalition which includes bankers, government entities, businesses, and nonprofit organizations. leading role in implementing climate solutions.

We also need to build a nationwide network of charging stations for the growing number of electric vehicles on our roads, make it easier and more affordable for homeowners and businesses to electrify their appliances, and site new transmission lines like Sun-Zia to make room for new, utility-scale wind and solar energy projects in New Mexico that will power our economy for years to come. Finally, we urgently need to prepare all of our infrastructure to handle more extreme weather events, extended drought conditions, and more destructive wildfire seasons.

As the new Chairman of the Military Construction and Veterans Affairs Appro-

priations Subcommittee, I am also overseeing all of the Department of Defense's construction funding and the entire budget for the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA). I am committed to building the modern facilities our military needs to keep all of us safe and keeping America's promise to our service members and their families to provide them the benefits that they earned when they return home as veterans.

I will be especially focused during my chairmanship on restoring the funding for military construction projects at Holloman and at White Sands Missile Range that the Trump administration wrongly raided to pay for the misguided border wall. I will also make sure the

VA has all the funding it needs to improve telehealth services for rural veterans, support a strong Covid-19 vaccination campaign for veterans, and provide better health care and housing assistance for veterans experiencing homelessness.








The Las Cruces Youth Orchestra (LCYO) is coming back stronger than ever after a pandemicenforced break, LCYO director and founder Simon Gollo said.

Blank Conversations Theatre Company is celebrating the return of live theater to Las Cruces with a second outstanding production at Rio Grande Theatre (RGT).

Following last weekend's opening of its brilliant "The Mad Ones," Blank Conversations premiered "The Complete History of America (Abridged)," by Adam Long, Reed Martin and Austin Tichenor, to a large and appreciative audience Wednesday night, July 7. The show will continue for two more Wednesday night performances—live and in person — through July 28 at RGT.

The props and special

effects – including confetti, squirt guns, an Abraham Lincoln balloon-head and a beachball – are hilarious, and the costumes – Lucille Ball and Andrews Sisters (sort of) wigs, a coonskin cap, a giant Uncle Sam hat, tutus and sunglasses, to name a few – are excellent.

But, like their "The Mad Ones" counterparts, "History of America" co-directors Gus David Sanchez and Eva Cullen recognized that what really makes this show rock is its extraordinary cast.

Stars Brianna Horvath, Alyssa Gose and Collin Duffey are each so talented and so appealing. Individually, they are

charming and fearless, each with amazing comedy timing that belies their youth.

Collectively, they are a ball of fire.

They sing (the brief bits of harmony were outstanding), they dance, they do great improv during an unrehearsed Q and A with the audience, they frolic and, collectively, they create a truly fun evening poking fun at everyone from Sacagawea to Spiro Agnew.

Each actor has many truly memorable moments in this show. I loved what Brianna did in an all-toobrief appearance as FDR; Collin was a great George W. Bush and a freakishly on-the-nose Joe Biden, and Alyssa was so cool in a trench coat and slouch hat as the film noir private eye Spade Diamond. And that's only a tiny taste of the dozens of historical figures that each one portrayed on their journey from 1492 to 2021.

The 90-minute, twoact play is a little racy in places and completely irreverent.

One of my favorite bits was the unique blending of two presidential assassinations, featuring a giant bullet that kept finding its way into scenes throughout the evening.

Go see this show. You may or may not learn anything about American history; you most certainly will have a great time and laugh a lot.

Kudos also go to stage manager Steven Cousler (he starred in Toad Hall's excellent 2018 one-man show "Van Gogh" in 2018), assistant stage manager Kaylin Berglund, lighting designer Frankie Gomez, sound operator Carissa Galban, crew member Brianna Miranda and technical director and producer Topher Lininger.

Gold stars all around for these wonderful actors and this outstanding crew.

The NMSU Department of Mechanical and Aerospace Engineering (MAE) is pursuing a new type of surface called the Binary Surface, or BiS, that changes the way liquids boil. When liquids boil over a surface, substantial amounts of heat can be transferred from the surface to the liquid without causing the surface to heat up more.



Since trees take much longer to grow to maturity, many times we do not live in a place long enough to enjoy the trees or their fruit ourselves, but we are planting for others to eniov.


This is true of seeds of kindness sown in the hearts of others. The most valuable planting that all of us do is in terms of loving human relationships.

Construction on the Interstate 25/University Avenue Project is expected to be completed in late summer, officials from the New Mexico Department of Transportation said in a project summary.

The project started in January 2020 and will cost about \$33.3 million in state and federal funds. It was designed by Molzen Corbin Associates. La Calerita Construction is the general contractor. Both are Las Cruces companies.

NMDOT said project benefits include: a renovated University Avenue bridge and a new Pan American bridge, both spanning Interstate 25 to accommodate growth; a Triviz Drive underpass under University Avenue connecting North Triviz to South Triviz; a continuation of the multi-use Triviz Trail to the New Mexico State University trail system; a new exit

ramp from southbound I-25 directly to NMSU beneath University Avenue; better local traffic flow through roundabouts merging traffic on both sides of the University/Triviz underpass; a new entrance ramp from NMSU to southbound I-25; and roadway improvements to University

Avenue from Triviz to Las Alturas to accommodate pedestrians and bicycles.

NMDOT said the project also "promotes sustainability."

NMDOT is recycling demolition materials for use in backfill and construction of MSE (mechanically stabilized earth) retaining walls; using high-efficiency LED lighting and structures that reduce light scatter; extending local trail systems and making both the Roadrunner Transit stop at University across from the Pan Am Center and the Aggie Transit Stop at the Pan Am Center "more inter-

What's next for I-25 project

Continuing through July, Interstate 25 is reduced to one lane in both directions near University Avenue for construction of concrete wall barriers and bridge piers in the median and additional construction activities. Access from University Ave to the southbound I-25 on-ramp is through the Triviz/University intersection and the new south roundabout. Detour signs are in place.

The I-25 northbound loop ramp is closed for reconstruction. Both eastbound and westbound traffic on University Avenue can access northbound I-25 from the on-ramp at the traffic signal.

Regular work hours are 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday. Crews may work longer hours or on Saturdays as needed.

Recovery from pandemic depends on jobs, jobs and more jobs

New Mexico's
economic recovery
from the pandemic is wholly
dependent on how
well we can build
an "ecosystem
of opportunity"
between New
Mexicans looking
for work and our
businesses and employers who desperately
need them.

The Workforce Connections system plays a pivotal role in the ecosystem, receiving upwards of \$20 million in federal funds each year to help job seekers access education, training and employment, and help employers get the skilled-and-ready workforce they need now and for the future.

Long before Covid hit, our state had lagged the country in outcomes for these investments, ranking in the bottom third of states and last in our region for workforce, according to a publication for site selectors. In 2019. the currently configured system served only one in 10 New Mexico employers and 4,500 job seekers. Going into this year, the best-case scenario is 5,600 job seekers for the 2021-2022 program year, if the boards met all of their metrics, which historically they don't. To put this in perspective, there are more than 68.500 New Mexicans currently receiving unemployment benefits.

As currently configured, three of the state's four workforce boards were consistently failing to achieve many, if not most, of their goals. In fact, the Southwestern Area Workforce Development

Board (which covers Doña Ana County) is the lowest performing region in the state, despite receiving the second largest amount of money. Going into this new program year, its

best-case participant scenario is to serve 7 percent of the current 9,700 people unemployed in the region.

To create the conditions for optimizing the workforce system and achieve two to three times the outcomes for these investments (like other states do), the New Mexico State Workforce Board approved and submitted a formal recommendation to Gov. Michelle Lujan-Grisham to move from the existing four-region system, established two decades ago, to a two-region system devoted to meeting the unique needs of our diverse state.

There's two ways to approach this. The top recommendation is to focus specifically on the unique needs of the Rio Grande Corridor (Santa Fe to Las

Cruces) with one region and the more rural/frontier parts of the state with a second.

These larger metropolitan areas and their surrounding counties have commonality in industry sectors and delivery and access to services, setting the stage for increasing alignment of these dollars toward economic development targets – rendering the best return on investment for the job seeker, the business and the taxpayer. The second region would be solely focused on workforce investments aligned to building the regional economies of rural communities - including expanding entrepreneurship to build back businesses and create new jobs that may have been lost in the pandemic.

Or \dots a second scenario that's been explored cuts the state in half and structures those two regions to serve the needs of communities with intentional investments based on characteristics like key industry sectors, commuting patterns, location of higher education institutions, etc. With the needs of the urban and rural communities being so different, the leadership of these regions would need to become far more innovative in developing and deploying new and more effective approaches to meeting the needs of their diverse communities.

Over the next three to four months, the De-

HIGHLANDS UNIVERSITY partment of Workforce Solutions and the State Workforce Board will be hosting eight community meetings across the state to gather input from key stakeholders in building a robust workforce system: businesses; chambers of commerce; economic developers; those who've been or are now job seekers; elected officials; and current workforce board members. A meeting is being planned for Las Cruces in September.

For the local region, the workforce system working hand-in-hand with economic development is a game-changer.

Centennial throwers come up big at state track meet

For the Centennial High School girls track and field team, the wait was worth it.

After seeing their 2020 season canceled because of the Covid-19 pandemic, the Hawks had a season to remember this spring and summer.

Centennial High had never had an individual state champion in track and field before in its history, but this year ended up with two girls taking home three gold medals from the state 5A meet on June 26 in Albuquerque.

Ku'upualiliapihamekealoha "Lia" Pili took first in the girls discus with a throw of 134 feet, 1 inch and in the shot at 44 feeteven.

Teammate Lauren Ocampo took first in the girls javelin 121-even and was fifth in the discus (110-3).

Pili, a senior, was also named the Gatorade girls track and field athlete of the year in New Mexico.

It was Pili's first and only year at Centennial. Her father, Ifo Pili, is a former college and professional football player who is new city manager for Las Cruces.

She had spent her three previous years going to high school in Utah, where she grew up.

"I was there my whole life so it was like culture

shock coming here," Pili said. "It's been good, though. I grew up knowing one thing and I came here and it was a whole different thing. It's been good to get out of my comfort zone."

When she arrived at Centennial last fall, she started working out with her new teammate, Ocampo. Two younger sisters are also throwers.

Lelei Pili, a junior, was sixth in the girls discus at state (101-10) and seventh in the shot put (32-11 $\frac{1}{2}$). Ave Pili, a sophomore, was third in the shot (33-11) and sixth in the javelin (105-2).

A fifth Centennial girl, Ayanna Leal, a senior, made finals at state, taking seventh in the discus (100-3).

It all made for a group of real and adopted sisters who worked out together and pushed each other, Lia Pili and Ocampo said.

"We were each other's energy," Lia Pili said. "We really drew from each other."

Ocampo said she had a hard time during the early stages of the pandemic staying motivated, with no end in sight and no meets on the horizon.

But she said when Pili and her sisters arrived this fall, it turned the whole dynamic around.

"I kind of lost my motivation, because I didn't see an end to this," said Ocampo, the daughter of Aaron Ocampo, the Centennial throwing coach and head football coach. "Once the Pilis moved here, we would hold each other accountable and go out and throw and have our own little competitions."

Pili said it was almost like living a real-life version of the movie

"Groundhog Day," where you keep experiencing the same day over and over again.

"It is hard to see how that is going to help you immediately because you weren't competing," she said.

"You just need to put your head down and trust in the process."

Ocampo said she is thrilled to have won a state championship and is looking forward to the next two track seasons.

"Obviously, it would be cool to be a three-time state champion," she said. "But I'm just focusing on the next meet and the next PR (personal record)."

Pili said she is weighing scholarship offers from Brigham Young University and Weber State, in her home state of Utah, and from New Mexico State University.

In boys 5A, Centennial's Jayden Gunn was second in the discus (145-1), and Paul Whitelock was fifth in the pole vault (11-6).

Oñate earns 11 state track medals

Oñate High School's Alex Contreras had a huge day at the state 5A track and field championships June 26 in Albuquerque.

Contreras took second in the boys triple jump with a mark of 44 feet and a quarter inch. He also took fifth in the high jump at 6-2 and was part of two relay teams that medaled.

Contreras was a member of the fourth-place boys 800-meter relay that clocked in at 1 minute, 31.2 seconds, and was on the sixth-place 400 relay (44.12).

A balanced approach a key to success on the golf course

Balance is a critical element if you are to play your best golf. Of course, a balanced golf swing includes a balanced stance, weight shift, tempo and finishing position. However, let's talk about other types of balance: mental, emotional, behavior and attitude.

I view the challenge of balance in athletic performance as a continuum, with extremes on either end. For some folks, the balancing act is between indifference and perfectionism. Over my years of doing golf schools, I have seen lots and lots of average, recreational golfers who show an "I don't care" attitude, playing "hit-and-giggle" golf, as opposed to golfers who demand that every shot be perfect, or at least much better than it turned out. I have seen perfectionist attitudes in many young golfers who are just learning the game. The vast majority are simply not good enough yet to get that mad and down on themselves and to get so upset when they mess up.

In between apathy and trying to make everything perfect lies a positive approach of striving for excellence and accepting the results at any given moment. Still, I must admit that I do

favor a mindset that sets high standards of performance, as opposed to an attitude of settling for just average or "whatever."

Golf is not a game of "perfect." As Mr. Hogan said, golf is mostly a game of misses; we just want our misses to be such that we can work with them.

One of the really important balancing acts we must be aware of concerns our level of arousal; call it stimulation or excitement, even. On the one end, we have the lethargic golfer, who doesn't seem too motivated by much at all, or at least not induced to perform at his or her very best. No effort, no intensity, no forethought, no real exertion. On the other hand, there is the somewhat manic golfer who is just stoked. It's like he has just consumed three bold grande coffees

or three Monster drinks. If you're a defensive tackle whose job it is to sack the quarterback, it's hard to be over-aroused. But if you're over-aroused as a golfer, with a high adrenalin flow, you could be in trouble.

Fine motor skills, like those used in putting (and playing the piano), don't respond well when we're overly aroused. We need to be more calm. We should be motivated, enthusiastic, optimistic – but not over-zealous, or over-nervous and not over-eager.

That balance is what I call "passionate detachment." It's where you badly want the desired result, but you are not so attached to the outcome that it gets in the way of your present play.

Now, let's talk about the continuum of insecure on the one end and cocky on the other. If you want to see insecure, take a look at the golfer who seems to be constantly in fear. Playing with a continual subconscious state of fear, even in its hidden, subtle form, can be performance-sapping.

Whether it's the fear of

failing, fear of losing, fear of looking bad or just fear in general, it's going to sink us eventually. Being afraid of poor results and awful play is a recipe for failure. My experience with cocky golfers is that they seem to be narcissists. They're usually self-centered, ego-driven, boorish know-it-all characters, who are not welcoming to suggestions or advice, and are not much fun to play with.

However, there is a middle ground typified by the confident, self-assured player who knows himself and who knows that things will be OK regardless of the outcome of this particular match. Confidence, in reality, is the quiet conviction in how you have prepared and that you are doing

things properly. It's believing in yourself and your method. That amazing attitude will get us through almost anything. It is starkly evident when we think how the brave men who struggled up the beaches of Normandy on D-Day, and fought on Iwo Jima, won the War for us. My friends know that I mark my golf ball on the green with pieces called "challenge" coins honoring and remembering World War II heroes. I do that partly to keep the game of golf properly in perspective. Golf is simply a game. Life is not a game.
