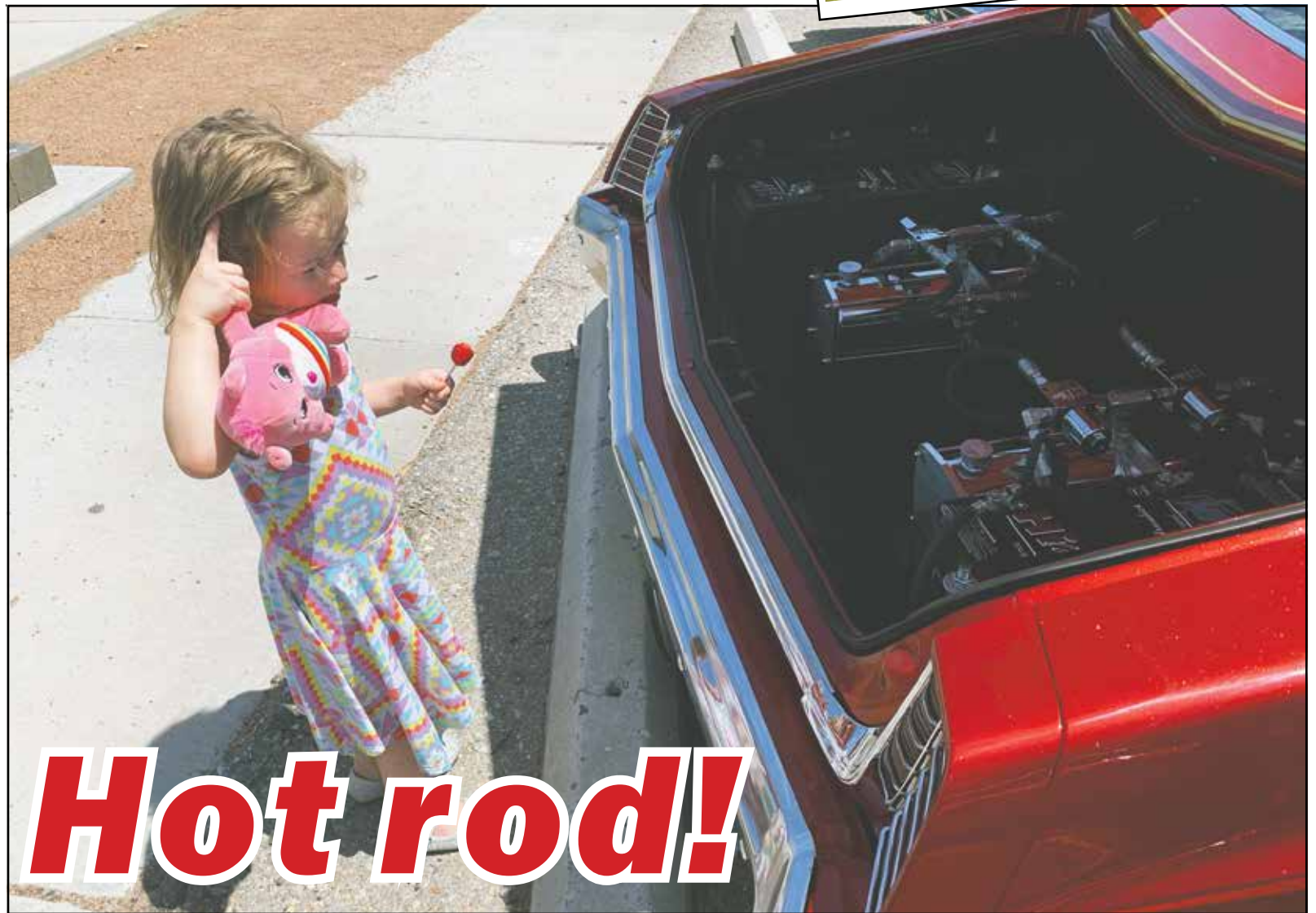

# NMSU's Arrowhead park has big plans for future

New Mexico State University's Arrowhead Park really does offer the sun, the moon and the stars.

The business and research park, located on about 200 acres on the Las Cruces campus, is about to complete a huge solar project that will supply half the campus' electricity. It's home to the headquarters for New Mexico Spaceport Authority, more than a dozen other science and technology companies, 320 employees and about 1,000 high school and medical school students. And the park has major plans to add tenants and increase employment in the next few years.

"We have a lot of potential," said Arrowhead Park Executive Director Wayne L. Savage, a 1980 graduate of NMSU's engineering program who joined Arrowhead Park in 2013.

Savage said the park is working with Mesilla Valley Economic Development Alliance (MVEDA), the Borderplex Alliance and other partners to find new tenants and to connect entrepreneurs to researchers. The park wants to attract more startups and businesses looking to relocate or expand, especially in the commercial space industry, health care and film and digital media, Savage said.

"We think those three sectors are going to grow in the research park," he said.

Arrowhead Park's

anchor, Burrell College of Osteopathic Medicine, broke ground in July on a new building to house the school library and student services so classrooms can be enlarged in the existing building next door, Savage said.

Burrell College has "been very successful," he said.

The park also is home to Arrowhead Park Early College High School (APECHS) — the first early college high school in New Mexico — and Arrowhead Medical Academy. APECHS opened in 2011; the medical academy, which is also an early college high school, opened in 2014. Burrell College opened in 2016.

In partnership with NMSU's Creative Media Institute, Doña Ana Community College's Creative Media Technology Program and others, the park is developing a "creative campus," Savage said.

"At this point, 'Creative Campus' is a concept: a state-of-the-art digital

media complex to be located at Arrowhead Park that would allow this region to increase our capacity to produce and deliver digital media content across a wide range of industries," DACC President Monica Torres said. "Representatives from Arrowhead Park, the City of Las Cruces, DACC, Film Las Cruces, MVEDA and NMSU are actively working together on developing plans, networks and resources to take Creative Campus from concept to reality.

"DACC is currently in the design phase of a building project that will be the new home of its Creative Media Technology Program," Torres said. "The building will

# What you need to know as kids head back to school this year

Las Cruces Public Schools' 2021-22 school year began Monday, Aug. 9, for K-12 students. Kindergarten transition days began Aug. 10.

For the first time in more than a year, school district buildings are open on the first day of the school year for in-person learning, despite a growing number of families who opted to enroll students in the district's Virtual Learning Academy (VLA).

## Virtual learning

The number of VLA students had grown to 850, or roughly 4 percent of LCPS' total student population.

Any student who wishes to attend classes virtually will be enrolled, said VLA Principal Stephanie Hanway.

Parents who contacted the district about VLA should expect to hear from their school next week, LCPS Deputy Superintendent of Teaching, Learning, Leadership and Research Wendi Miller-Tomlinson said in an Aug. 6 news release from LCPS. "We are working to contact every parent, and that process takes time," Miller-Tomlinson said.

Miller-Tomlinson said instruction will be adjusted to ensure there is no penalty for students who are enrolled after the start of school.

VLA is completely virtual learning; it is not distance or hybrid learning, Hanway said.

"Students will not be in

class on Zoom every day," she explained. "Teachers will outline the expectations for the week, and it will be the responsibility of the student to complete the work and reach out for assistance."

As a program, VLA has been an extension of LCPS for about 10 years. Originally offered as a way to recover credits or to accelerate, the need for VLA as an option for families became apparent when schools went fully remote in 2020.

## Masks and wellness checks

Superintendent Ralph Ramos announced Aug. 3 that masks will be required inside all LCPS buildings.

"Starting Aug. 4, 2021, all LCPS students and staff will be required to wear masks indoors dur-

ing the school day and during afterschool indoor events," Ramos said. "We will continue to monitor the state's public health orders and will comply with any mask requirements and social distancing guidelines as they relate to outdoor events on school grounds.

"We are following the most current guidance from our local and national health experts," said Ramos, who added that maintaining a safe environment for students and staff remains a priority in planning for the school year.

Parents are encouraged to conduct wellness checks on their children before sending them to school. Students who have a fever or Covid-like symptoms should stay

be the first educational building located at Arrowhead Park in support of the Creative Campus concept. Design is likely to be completed this fall with construction projected to start in spring of 2022. DACC is working with RMKM Architecture. Robert Estrada, from NMSU's

Office of Project Development and Engineering, will serve as project manager."

With health/bio science, the commercial space industry and fiber and digital media, Savage said he envisions a "mini-campus environment" at the park, with "the academic side blended with the industry side."

The park's three-megawatt solar array,

nicknamed Aggie Power, should go online in September, and will supply about one-half of the electricity to the whole campus, Savage said.

"We're excited about that potential," he said.

The array is part of an agreement with El Paso Electric, Savage said, that will generate power and also create research and education opportunities for NMSU students.

The park's new spec office building, which will be at least 18,000 square feet in size, will have Arrowhead Center staff and programs among its tenants, Savage said. Arrowhead Center is NMSU's "economic development and technology commercialization engine," the university said in a news release.

Savage hopes to select the project developer this month, start signing ten-

ant leases soon after that and complete design and construction by the end of 2022.

On the horizon for the park are plans for an interchange that directly connects Interstate 10 with Arrowhead Drive to "dramatically impact access and capacity to the park," Savage said, helping to attract businesses with higher-wage jobs and increasing employment in the park by 1,200 to 1,500.

Mixed-use development

plans for the park also include "future retail, residential and town center areas," NMSU said.

Savage said NMSU plans for a research park date back as far as 1984, documented by a hand-drawn master plan illustration.

J.B. Pruett and partners built the first building in the park for General Dynamics in 2000.

Development really took off after then NMSU College of Business Dean

(and future chancellor) Garrey Carruthers, former NMSU regent Jim Manatt and the late Kevin Boberg attended the Rice University Business Plan Competition in 2006 and came back to NMSU with ideas to spur growth of Arrowhead Center and the park.

Savage said Boberg, who helped launch Arrowhead Center in 2007, "was also the boots on the ground" for park development, including leases for new buildings and U.S. Economic Development Administration grants for roadways and utilities.

Current Arrowhead Center CEO and Director Kathryn Hansen and Pam Wood were also major players, he said.

"We're in a very good position to see growth," Savage said.

# Former governor, chancellor played a major role at Arrowhead

I was particularly instrumental in getting the Research Park started when, as governor, I supported and signed a bill, authored by a young state representative, Kip Nicely (R-Bernalillo, 1991-98) — The University Research Park Act — which authorized the formation of

university-owned corporations that would be more entrepreneurial and could operate business without the restrictive rules and business restrictions common to the public sector.

When I became dean (of the New Mexico State University College of

Business), I requested of the (New Mexico) Legislature modifications to the University Park Act to add more flexibility.

That amended act is referred to as the University Research Park and Economic Development Act. Dr. Kevin Boberg and I

then set about developing the Arrowhead Research Park while I was dean.

During that time, we added a business building, currently housing a unit of Virgin Galactic and the USGS (U.S. Geological Service), the Arrowhead Park Early College High School and the Burrell College of Osteopathic Medicine.

I now see a joint proj-

ect of El Paso Electric and NMSU to have a solar electricity farm on the southernmost tip of the park.

Development of the park has been slow but has attracted the kind of projects we envisioned back in the day.

It is a good idea that is getting better.

Garrey Carruthers, who

turns 82 on Aug. 29, was governor of New Mexico from 1987 to 1990; dean of the NMSU College of Business (and NMSU vice president for economic development) from 2003 to 2013; and president/chancellor of NMSU from 2013 to 2018. Carruthers, a native of Alamosa, Colorado, has a Ph.D. in economics from Iowa State University.

**Always call 811 two business days before you dig!**



Even small projects such as planting a tree or installing fence posts can be very dangerous if you do not know what utilities are buried around your dig site. Whether you are a professional

excavator or homeowner, you can be fined AND held financially responsible for repair costs to damaged utilities when 811 is not called. How it works:

1. Use white spray paint and/or white marker flags to mark the ground where you plan to dig.
2. Call 811 two business days before beginning your project and they will alert all of the local utilities to respond to your dig site and mark where the utility lines are buried. Utility companies will have two days, once notified, to respond to your dig site.
3. Once utilities are marked, you must adhere to the "18 inch" rule, which is no mechanical digging (tractor, auger, etc.) within 18 inches of the utility markings. If you must dig within 18 inches of a utility marking, it has to be hand dug or vacuum excavated.
4. Once all of the utilities have been marked, you will have 15 days to complete your digging project. If your project is not complete in that time frame, you must call 811 again.

# Which of our brains do we need for this?

The current Las Cruces economy has got to be the strangest one it has ever had.

Houses are selling like crazy, at prices higher than we've ever seen, thanks in large part to interest rates lower than we've ever seen.

Many businesses are gone, having failed during the difficult times of the pandemic.

Some businesses are rocking and rolling.

Other businesses have huge demand, and lots of customers, but are struggling to find enough employees and/or product inventory to meet those demands.

There are fewer people in the workforce, due to pandemic cutbacks, or people who lost their jobs when businesses went under.

Yet there's a lack of urgency for many to re-employ. The combination of stimulus checks, unemployment checks

and tax refunds have given many people a cushion.

And the pandemic lifestyle, which featured a lot of people working from home, reduced outside activities such as shopping and eating, and less driving, meant people's expenses were reduced.

Industries such as construction and restaurants are particularly affected by the internationally disrupted supply chains.

All this put together means business and the economy are terribly difficult to predict and understand right now.

Did the pandemic forever change the way things are done? Or were the changes just temporary? Most likely, we'll use the best of what we learned and chalk the rest to experience.

Remember, this was the first pandemic any of us have gone

through, so no one had all the answers. We still don't.

When trying to wrap my head around things, I weighed some comments from two of our Las Cruces Bulletin columnists in their offerings last week.

In his "Tales from the Cassock" column in our Religion section, Father Gabriel Rochelle, an Orthodox priest, said, "The heart unites; the mind divides."

In his "Golf Doctor" column in our Sports section, Charlie Blanchard talks about the two sides of the brain, and how they affect one's golf game.

Too much conscious thinking, especially negative thinking, can really drag down your golf game, was the way I interpreted it.

The right side of the brain, Blanchard said, deals with images, intuition and the right now. The left side deals with logic, calculations and the future. Turning that left side

off, and being present with the right side's "feel and flow," will serve you best on the golf course, Blanchard concludes.

A lot of us thought, or at least hoped, when the Covid numbers kept dropping in the spring, and everything opened back up, the economy and everything else would start heading back to normal.

But now, with the surge of Covid's Delta variant, and stagnating vaccination rates, more unpredictability is on the horizon.

Between July 25 and Aug. 8, the number of cases increased in all 50 U.S. states by an average of 111 percent. The highest increase was in New Hampshire (310 percent) and the lowest was Nevada (21 percent). New Mexico was above the average at 160 percent.

And while our state is back to February/March levels, seeing nearly 300 new cases a day,

locally things are a little better. Doña Ana County has not spiked. We're still seeing a dozen or so new cases a day; however, none of those should be discounted in any way.

America's travel patterns could still affect us.

The states with the highest rates per 100,000 are all in the South: Louisiana, Florida, Arkansas,

Mississippi and Alabama. All of us know people in those states, and people in those states are traveling all over America. And Americans from all over are traveling there.

That's not to mention other countries, most of which have a much lower vaccination rate than America's 50 percent fully vaccinated rate. Some examples: Japan, 32 percent; Mexico, 21 percent; Philippines, 9 percent.

Canada, which leads all nations, still has a long way to go at 62 percent.

Both your left brain and your right brain will tell you from that information we're not out of the woods with Covid yet.

We're an easily divided country these days, an easily divided world.

And we're often divided by relatively insignificant things, and our desire to have the better-sounding answer than our neighbor, regardless

of what's the correct answer.

In July 2020, the LCU Board of Commissioners approved a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between LCU and SCSWA, with Resolution No. 20-21-LCU002, for SCSWA to provide funding for a customer service position at LCU to address the needs of residents related to solid waste collection, disposal, and recycling. LCU, in turn, will fund a second position for a "One Stop, One Call" for utility-related questions.

"With the support of the LCU Board of Commissioners, we're aiming to get new recycling containers for all of our customers that will have one easy number to call if customers have questions," explained Patrick Peck, SCSWA director. That new number – (575) 541-2111 – will allow customers to get answers about what can be recycled and any issues with solid waste or grappler pick-up.

Previously, questions on things like recycling

were sent back to SCSWA, and any trash pickup questions – such as why a container may not have been picked up or what to do if a container was broken – would have been sent back to LCU.

Another upcoming initiative will be that SCSWA aims to revitalize with recycling even more; the change in containers throughout the city will be the first effect customers will see.

In the past, Friedman Recycling, headquartered in Phoenix, Arizona, would take Las Cruces recycling to their El Paso material recovery facility. Peck is working to take that in-house as well, but plans are still in development.

Peck said, "We will be investing \$1.3 million on new trucks and employees to beef up

our recycling program in Las Cruces to capture the full value of what we work to keep clean and ready to recycle."

Customers may have seen the recent 35 cent increase in recycling that took effect July 1, 2021. This is part of a phased-in increase to support local recycling after China closed its border to U.S. recyclers, dropping the market value, particularly for contaminated recycling such as cardboard pizza boxes with grease.

"There will always be an intersection between solid waste and recycling," said Peck. "But we want to make it easier for customers to take out their trash while making their ability to recycle second nature. When that happens, we can grow our facility's future ability to be the hub of recycling for our area."

# Partisan efforts are keeping Covid vaccination rates down

When President Joe Biden announced a plan to send local public health workers door-to-door on a mission to increase Covid-19 vaccinations, conservative pundits warned that those foolish enough to open their doors would be forcibly vaccinated against their will.

U.S. Rep. Marjorie Taylor Greene went one step further, as is her wont, comparing those health-care workers to the Nazi Brownshirts who aided Adolph Hitler's rise to power.

Greene has become the leader of a perverse effort on the far right that seems intent on keeping our nation's vaccination rates down.

To further that effort, she has introduced HR 2317 — the We Will Not Comply Act — legislation so vaguely titled that it would seem an endorsement of all defiance against the rule of law.

The bill would pervert the Civil Rights Act of 1964, which prohibits discrimination on the basis of color, religion or place of birth, by extending those same protections to people who choose not to get vaccinated.

If passed, the bill would prohibit schools, colleges and employers from implementing vaccine mandates, and would incentivize people not to get vaccinated.

Schools could still require students to get vaccinated for things like

diphtheria, measles, mumps and polio, but not for the virus that's causing a raging pandemic.

Fortunately, the bill won't pass.

It's one of those "message" bills Congress is so well known for, and is not a real attempt at legislating.

Greene's message is clear.

I'm not as clear as to what message my representative, Yvette Herrell, is sending by signing on to the bill as a co-sponsor.

The horror stories about door-to-door forced vaccination were obvious attempts at partisan fear mongering. Nobody will be vaccinated against their will.

But, required vaccinations as a condition of employment or public school enrollment will be an important part of our strategy to get vaccination rates to a level needed to stop the spread of this ever-mutating virus.

In May, Doña Ana County Manager Fernando Macias announced that all county employees would need to get vaccinated to keep their jobs.

An executive order by Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham requires state employees to either get vaccinated or agree to regular testing.

And, President Joe Biden has required all federal employees and in-person contractors to be

fully vaccinated.

United Airlines, Tyson Foods, Google, Netflix, Disney and Morgan Stanley are among the growing list of private corporations now requiring that employees be vaccinated. More are sure to follow.

We all have the right to make poor health decisions.

But when exercising those rights has a harmful impact on others — such as smoking indoors — the rights of the group trump those of the individual.

Parents sending their older, vaccinated children to school have the right to expect that they will not be exposed to children who have not been vaccinated.

Employers have the right to ensure that unvaccinated employees are not spreading the virus in the workplace, endangering both customers and fellow workers.

As the Delta variant of the virus has taken hold, hospitalization and death rates have risen sharply in areas of the country where vaccination rates are the lowest.

That has caused millions of Americans to rethink their opposition to the vaccine.

But millions more never will.

We can't make them get vaccinated, but we should take reasonable steps to prevent them from spreading the virus.

home. According to guidance from the New Mexico Public Education Department, anyone exhibiting symptoms of Covid-19 should self-isolate for 10 days.

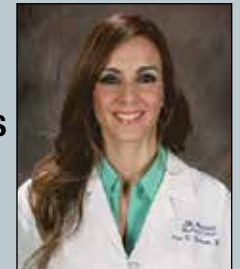

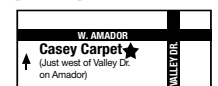

# Maria Flores won't seek another term

The longest-serving member of the current Las Cruces Public Schools board has announced she will not seek re-election this November.

Maria Flores was first elected to represent District 3 on the school board in 2009, winning by two votes in a three-way race. She was re-elected by wide margins in 2013 and 2017, and her term, like the terms of many other elected officials around the state, was extended by almost a year when New Mexico adopted the Local Elections Act that combined school board, city council and other local elections.

"I think 12 years and 10 months is long enough," Flores told The Bulletin. "It has been an honor to serve but it is time for someone else to step forward. My time on the

Board of Education has been exciting, challenging and gratifying overall."

Flores taught for 15 years at Tombaugh Elementary before being elected to the board. She has nearly 30 years of service as an LCPS parent volunteer, teacher and school board member.

Flores and her husband, Dr. Ernest A. Flores, are the parents of three LCPS graduates – two from Las Cruces High School and one from Mayfield.

Flores, who has served as both president and vice president of the board of education, was one of the founding members of the Children's Reading Alliance and has served for three years as a Big Sister through the Big Brothers Big Sisters organization.

# Water conservation grants now available

The New Mexico Interstate Stream Commission (NMISC) is now accepting grant applications from members of the agricultural community who are willing to conserve groundwater in 2022-23, NMISC said in a news release. The deadline is Monday, Aug. 23.

Successful applicants will receive grant funding to temporarily stop the use of groundwater for an 18-month period beginning Jan. 1, 2022.

The New Mexico Legislature appropriated \$7 million to NMISC in 2020 to develop and fund water management. The grants are part of NMISC's FY2020-FY23 water management pilot

project for the Lower Rio Grande.

In the project's first year, water conservation grants were provided to compensate irrigators for temporarily conserving groundwater by not irrigating previously irrigated parcels, NMISC said. Twenty-four grants totaling \$865,000 were awarded to participants, encompassing 1,272 acres.

Groundwater-irrigated land is eligible for participation in the grant program if the irrigated acreage within the parcel is at least 10 acres in size, with partial and multiple parcels accepted as long as the 10-total acre requirement is met; the acreage has been irrigated with groundwater only, or

with a combination of groundwater and surface water, for at least four years out of the five years 2016-2020; the water rights associated with the acreage are in good standing with the New Mexico Office of the State Engineer (NMOSE); and other NMISC due diligence requirements are satisfied. The nine-member

NMISC is charged with protecting New Mexico's right to water under eight interstate stream compacts, and water planning. The State Engineer's office administers the state's water resources, with the state engineer serving as NMISC secretary.

# 'A Coupla White Chicks ...' has a lot of pluck; don't miss it

There is a lot to enjoy and appreciate about Black Box Theatre's (BBT) current production of "A Coupla White Chicks Sitting Around Talking," by playwright John Ford Noonan.

This one-act, 70-minute play is set in Westchester County in southeast New York state, but it could take place anytime and anywhere. You can easily imagine Maude Mix (Karen Buerdsell) and Hanna Mae Bindler (Gina DeMondo) in an adobe-walled kitchen in Las Cruces or Mesilla, although Maude might be baking biscochos instead of chocolate-chip cookies as the play opens.

This is a timeless tale of two "mortally wounded suburban housewives," as one of the characters so poignantly describes them. It is a study in contrasts between two very different women, played in this production by two very talented actors.

Gold stars go to Karen and Gina, who already had on-stage chemistry, having worked together in BBT's 2019 production of "The Mrs. Wheatland Pageant." They are wonderful as neighbors whose backdoors are a few feet apart but whose lives, at least when they first meet, are worlds apart.

Maude and Hanna Mae share their husband-inflicted wounds with each other in a friendship that is prickly at best to begin with but blossoms, pretty much because Hanna Mae won't give up on Maude. They both take a beating, physically and emotionally, but keep answering the bell for the

next round.

It is story of survival, and one of the things I like best about this play is that Maude and Hanna Mae are the only two characters in it. Everything is from their point of view.

Another gold star goes to first-time director Robert "Bobcat" Young. Young clearly knew the talent he had in Gina and Karen, and he let them shine.

Kudos to technical director Peter Herman, light and soundboard operator Bekah Taulbee, set builder Joshua Taulbee, costumer designers Misty Morton and Gillian B.

together with his spotter, moves back and forth mostly behind the Iron Curtain during the Cold War era of the 1970s.

“Mark Twain is credited with saying that authors should write what they know, and since I know a lot about the Cold War, that’s what I decided to write about,” Ioerger said.

“Because I already knew what I would write about, I thought this book would come together quickly,” Ioerger said. “Once I got started, however, it became a blubber project and the more I chewed on it, the bigger it got, so it took longer than I thought it would. Now that I’ve done it once though, the level of satisfaction is a huge inducement to start another writing project and I would encourage anyone else who is toying with writing to set aside some time for yourself and get

started. It’s not a sure cure for the common cold, but it will make you feel better.”

• Born and raised in southern New Mexico, **Rosario “Chayo” Garcia** learned the value of family and friends early on, she said. Garcia spent her youth during the 1960s and ‘70s riding her bike on the banks of water canals and running through freshly plowed fields with family and friends.

Garcia met the love her of life while attending New Mexico State University, got married and started a family, she said. After completing a bachelor’s degree in business administration, she and her family moved to northern New Mexico. There, she raised her two boys, ran a family business and was very active in the community, Garcia said. She also grasped that people of different cul-

tures, races and religions “can live together, building a colorful tapestry of life.”

After helping her husband take care of his aging parents, Garcia realized that life is short, and the quality of time was so precious, she said. Her sons had started on their own journeys, and it was time to move back home. This is when Garcia decided to share her imagination with her kids, grandkids and others through children’s books, which are illustrated by local artist Rebecca Courtney.

• **Samuel O. Sanchez**, 75, was born in Santa Rita, New Mexico, a small copper-mining town in Grant County. He was one of three boys, with three younger sisters. The family moved to Morenci, Arizona in 1952, where Sanchez attended school. During his senior year,

the family moved back to Silver City, New Mexico.

Sanchez graduated from NMSU in 1970 with a bachelor of science degree in electrical engineering. He married Sylvia Nava Aug. 31, 1968; they have three sons. Sanchez began working for Kennecott Copper Corporation in Hurley, New Mexico in 1970. He later worked for Lockheed Electronics in

Las Cruces.

“In 2014 when Organ

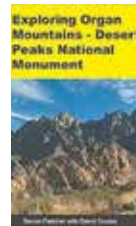

## Is reading becoming a luxury to be enjoyed only by the privileged?

In my backyard, each spring, desert turtles emerge from their underground homes. They do so tentatively, staying close to home, gingerly venturing further each day; sometimes returning to their holes for a bit more sleep.

I feel a bit like that right now. This spring, armed with two vaccinations, I felt safe enough to cautiously return to limited socializing but wary enough to keep masks handy and ready to scurry back.

New adventures in meeting with friends often involve enthusiastic chatter about the books we are reading. We have done a great deal of reading over the past year and a half, as I suspect you have as well.

Lots of people had more time to enjoy that luxury but not all. And the significance of who is not reading impacts the children who have suffered the most learning loss.

Time Use Survey reveals adults increased their reading time to 34 minutes a day in 2020 from 28 minutes a day in 2019. This seems to reverse the consistent downward trend

tracked by the American Academy of Arts and Sciences from 2003 through 2018. That's good for kids. Children who consistently see significant adults in their lives reading tend to fare better in school. However, how the amount of time spent reading varies among economic and educational groups perhaps reveals a picture of who has the time, access and desire to read.

According to analysis reported by Thomas B. Edsall in his June 23 New York Times essay, time spent reading is distributed unevenly among economic and educational groups. For Americans without high school diplomas the daily average dropped 42 percent in 2020 to 11 minutes while people with bachelors' degrees

increased 24 percent to 52 minutes. The biggest boost in time reading occurs among people in the 50th to 75th percentile of weekly earnings -- a 131 percent increase to 37 minutes.

Time reading fell 27 percent in the lowest 25th percentile of earners. Respondents identifying as Hispanic and Latino Americans registered no change at 10 minutes.

This bodes ill for many children in Doña Ana County. School has been interrupted for a year, and has been especially tough for children in homes without broadband. The Labor Department survey reports a slight decline in time

spent reading and talking to/with children by adults caring for them as a primary activity, but for the people who do read and talk with their children there was a slight increase. Early interaction with language and books is an important predictor of school success.

Members of the Children's Reading Alliance have not been idle. We created, Talking Stories/Cuentos que hablan so parents and their children could enjoy discussing classic children's literature via Zoom.

Thanks to the determination of volunteer Nancy Breard, public buses on the rural routes have continued to be stocked with

books, and Jennifer Alvarado distributed books at events by every social service agency and non-profit she could.

The need is clear, and Las Cruces are energetic and generous. Your enthusiastic support and participation will get our programs up and running again.

First Teacher/Primer Maestro programs for parents will start just as soon as group meetings are appropriate.

We are reconnecting with our loyal and effective volunteer Reading Buddies to be ready when LCPS allows them back into schools. Talking Stories/Cuentos que hablan will be coming to commu-

nity venues throughout DAC.

Wunderlich opened the boutique — her initials give the store its name — in the two-story La Esquina Plaza, 300 N. Main St., on the corner of Main Street and Las Cruces Avenue in Downtown, in 2018.

The business expanded in July with the addition of MEW + Company Children in La Esquina's courtyard, directly behind the boutique.

The boutique includes unique handmade gifts, jewelry, handbags, home goods, posters, calendars and paper goods. The children's store has handmade clothing, bedding and toys.

"Mary is huge into art and she loves children,"

## Counting down days till Aggie opener

“Words can’t explain how excited I am, honestly.”

With that, New Mexico State University quarterback Weston Eget

summed up what players and the school’s fans are thinking after nearly two years without meaningful games.

The Aggies began their fall practice on July 30 and open their season at home on Aug. 28 against archrival UTEP.

New Mexico State was one of just two FBS (Football Bowl Subdivision) teams to see its entire season canceled last year because of the pandemic. The other was Connecticut.

The Aggies did play an abbreviated two-game spring season at an empty Sun Bowl on rival UTEP’s campus in El Paso. The games were treated more like scrimmages but gave the team a huge leg up heading into the 2021 season.

By playing a couple of games, they were able to get in more practices under NCAA rules — 15 for a normal spring vs. nearly 40 with the games.

“This is really uncharted waters for any program to go through,” NMSU coach Doug Martin said in an interview before fall practice kicked off.

“I am really proud of our players, the way they

have handled it, the coaching staff for the way they have gone out and recruited to help us,”

Martin continued. “We are excited about getting back on the field.”

Martin is also excited about the collection of skill players he has on offense and improved team speed on both sides of the ball.

He has even said a bowl berth is not unrealistic. In 2017, the Aggies had one of their most memorable seasons in school history — beating Utah State 26-20 in the Arizona Bowl. It was their first bowl berth and bowl win in 57 years.

“Our offense can carry us and put us in a position to win games,” Martin said. “I think we

have made a lot of strides defensively. We will be a much faster team on defense. The Dixie State game (a 36-29 win last March) is a good model of what we can look like. Our offense played well. We put a lot of points on the board and our defense came alive and shut them down. It was a good team win. That is what it will take for us. We have to be a good team.”

To get back to a bowl game, they will need improved quarterback play, and Martin said they have two “really quality” candidates to step into the role that Tyler Rogers played on that bowl team.

Eget is a redshirt freshman from California. The other main candidate is Jonah Johnson, a junior transfer from Fresno City College.

“I’m super excited; the whole team is super excited,” Eget said at the team’s media day. “We will be ready to rock and roll on Aug. 28” in the season opener.

Eget says he and Johnson both have a slew of talented teammates to get the ball to and “let them do their thing.”

“I talk to the players every day, and they say they wish they could skip all these days and go straight to game day,” Eget said.

Back in July, New Mexico State announced that it will allow 100 percent capacity at all home sporting events. Let’s

game," said a fellow who has been playing golf for 30 years, adding that, "I can't stand the first tee shot with everybody watching because it's unnerving."

And one golfing friend surprised me with this: "I don't know about the hardest shots, but the easiest for me are the Mulligan, the Shapiro (do-over) and the conceded putt."

Seriously, everyone has their Achilles' heel golf shot, but there are a few that most everyday golfers can relate to as being the most challenging: (1) the long sand shot from a fairway bunker; (2) the half wedge shot from inside of 60 yards to the green; and (3) the fairway wood or long iron shot from a downhill lie, as you

might hit as the second shot on a par 5 hole.

Let's take first: the long sand bunker shot. For most normal long bunker shots, the idea is to hit a crisp shot with a full swing, taking very little sand. This is vastly different than an explosion shot from a greenside bunker, where you are lifting the ball out by blasting the sand underneath it. The very top priority of any shot from a penalty area, like a bunker, is to get the ball out and in the direction of the target. If there is a raised bunker face in front of your ball, be sure to take enough of a lofted club to elevate the ball over the bunker lip and "take your medicine" without compounding the error by leaving the ball in the bunker. For the mostly flat fairway bunker shot, be sure to take

plenty of club, contact the ball before any sand and trust the club to do the work.

Short game guru Dave Pelz says that, based on his extensive research with high-handicap golfers, the half-wedge shot is absolutely the hardest shot for regular folks to hit consistently well. This fact is partly due to existing swing flaws and partly due to a misunderstanding of the technique required. Golf teachers agree that the secret to the short wedge is acceleration. The mistake that many players make is that they "quit" on the shot (i.e. decelerate), sensing that they have taken too much swing or too much club. For most, golfers a 60-yard shot to the green requires a sand wedge or a lob wedge. It's a "feel" type shot that must be

hit with what amounts to a full swing that is downsized or abbreviated, struck with a descending blow and a certain amount of weight shift. Practice on the range is needed to ease your comfort level on the course.

Thirdly, let's take the case of the second shot on a par-5 hole, in which the situation calls for a "lay-up" shot that is short of a pond or other looming penalty area. Inexperienced golfers as well as higher handicap golfers all seem to struggle with long fairway shots, mainly because they instinctively think they have to hit the ball a long way, or they fail to focus fully on the shot in the same manner as they would a shot to the green. A lay-up shot demands precise accuracy for direction and controlled

distance. Usually, a long fairway shot on a par-5 is the second shot and it is a position shot. Your priority is positioning your ball so that your approach to the green is one in which you can hit your favorite iron. Hybrid clubs are the club du jour for these lay-up shots. When you have a slightly downhill lie simply align your body along the down-slope so that your swing is now more level. Swing along the slope, "chasing" your follow-through along the downward angle. To play all the hard shots well, the late Julius Boros said, "Swing easy and play hard."
