DOÑA ANA COUNTY PROCLAIMS SEPTEMBER AS NATIONAL HISPANIC HERITAGE MONTH

On Tuesday, Sep. 14, the Doña Ana County Board of Commissioners proclaimed September 15 - October 15, 2021 as National Hispanic Heritage Month in Doña Ana County.

Americans observe National Hispanic Month by celebrating the histories, cultures, and contributions of American citizens whose ancestors came from Spain, Mexico, the Caribbean and Central and South America.

The observation started in 1968 as Hispanic Heritage Week under President Lyndon Johnson and was expanded by President Ronald Reagan in 1988. It was enacted into law on August 17, 1988.

The Latino population of the United States as of July 2019 was 60.6 million, making people of Hispanic origin the nation's largest ethnic or racial minority. Hispanic, Latino and Latinx Americans represent a significant and fast-growing demographic of New Mexico. We honor the invaluable ways they contribute to Doña Ana County as caring neighbors and business owners. The number of people within Doña Ana County who identified Latino or Hispanic heritage, is 67.3 percent of the total population, 7.4 percent higher than the 2010 population

In honor of National Hispanic Heritage Month, activities in Doña Ana County include:

- A Talk by writer and educator Roberto Lovato entitled "Stirring the Radical Imagination: The Poet Warrior Tradition of Las Americas" on September 22 will be held at NMSU.

'Hidden gem': NM State's Physical Science Laboratory celebrates diamond jubilee

This year is New Mexico State University's Physical Science Laboratory's (PSL) diamond jubilee, or 75th anniversary, a major milestone for what NMSU Chief of Staff Leslie Cervantes calls one of southern New Mexico's "hidden gems."

"Lots of people don't know what PSL is or what we do," said Marcella Shelby, Ph.D., PSL's strategic initiatives officer.

PSL was set up in 1946 to support U.S. military telemetry and missile systems, said Director Eric L. Sanchez. Now 75 years later, PSL works with the U.S. Department of Defense, NASA, the Federal Aviation Administration, Los Alamos National Laboratory and many others on a wide range of programs and projects across

the country and around the world. About 40 percent of the work PSL does is classified, Sanchez said.

Housed in Clinton P. Anderson Hall, 1050 Stewart St., PSL covers 7 acres on NMSU's Las Cruces campus.

Sanchez, a retired U.S. Army brigadier general and former commander of White Sands Missile Range, is a 1987 distinguished military graduate of NMSU with a degree in education. He became PSL director in June 2020 after 32 years of active-duty military service, including

deployments in the Middle East and the Republic of Korea, NMSU said.

Today, PSL's "domain expertise" continues to include work on telemetry and missile systems, along with electronic warfare, counter measures to detect, avoid or distract an enemy's weapons systems or tactics, unmanned aerial systems, scientific ballooning (including a program to help bring broadband to the Navajo Nation) and custom flight hardware.

Freshman state senator looks back on first legislative session

Freshman Republican state Sen. Crystal Diamond praised her colleagues on both sides of the aisle and in both chambers for their work during the past session, even though she felt that far-left progressives capitalized on limited public input because of the pandemic.

At times, Diamond said, legislators were “passing laws behind locked doors in the dead of night” because state public health orders restricted public access to the State Capitol in Santa Fe and caused some legislators to attend hearings and sessions entirely by Zoom.

The Capitol lockdown made it impossible for legislators to properly consider all the bills that came before them, Diamond said, and was a disservice to New Mexico and to the people she represents in Sierra, Luna, Hidalgo and Doña Ana counties.

“The people’s home should be open,” Diamond said about the State Capitol.

She is, however, hopeful the Legislature will continue to make live committee hearings accessible on Zoom, which “allows my rural constituents to participate,” Diamond said.

The 2021 session was the first for Diamond, an Elephant Butte rancher and New Mexico State University graduate who defeated Neomi O. Martinez-Parra of Lordsburg in the November 2020 general election to win the District 35 state Senate seat that had been held for

32 years by John Arthur Smith of Deming.

Diamond said she spent the entire session at the State Capitol.

“Locked in the building for 60 days straight,” Diamond said she developed good relationships with other legislators. “We were breaking bread and working,” she said.

In particular, Diamond said she has “very high regard for Joseph Cervantes,” a Las Cruces Democrat who serves with her in the state Senate. Cervantes, she said, “conducts himself very well in the chamber, and embodies what Senate decorum should be.”

Diamond said she has also enjoyed getting to know fellow freshman state Sen. Carrie Hamblen, another Las Cruces Democrat, whom Diamond sat next to in the Senate chamber during floor sessions.

Diamond said she also worked closely with House members Nathan Small of Las Cruces, Micaela Lara Cadena of Mesilla, Rebecca Dow of Truth or Consequences, Candie Sweetser of Deming and Luis Terrazas of Santa Clara. Small, Cadena and Sweetser are Democrats; Dow and Terrazas are Republicans.

Diamond, a member of the powerful Senate Finance Committee, praised committee Chair George Muñoz, a Gallup Democrat, as “reasonable” and “a good chair,” and said

House Appropriations and Finance Committee Chair Patty Lundstrom, also a Gallup Democrat, is “a very balanced chair.”

Diamond said she meets regularly at La Fonda Restaurant in Deming with Smith, the former Senate Finance Committee chair who lost in the 2020 Democratic primary.

During the session, Diamond said she often found that she had more in common with “Democrats who represent areas like mine than urban Republicans.”

Diamond said she also found “bipartisan support of good policies” during the session.

“I’ve tried to be very reasonable with the other side, and that’s all I would ask for,” she said.

Diamond partnered with state Sen. Siah Correa Hemphill, D-Grant, Catron and Socorro, in sponsoring a bill that creates a “rural equity ombudsman” in the New Mexico Department of Finance and Administration to “work on issues of concern to rural and frontier communities” with state and federal agencies, counties and nonprofits.

The bill, which Diamond said will provide a stronger voice for rural New Mexico and ensure that rural areas get an equitable share of state and federal funds, was signed into law by Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham, a Democrat, in April.

“I appreciate her support for us,” Diamond said.

At the same time, Diamond said the public health orders Lujan Grisham signed in re-

sponse to Covid-19 represent an abuse of power, as do decisions she has made without legislative input on how to spend federal Covid relief funds coming to the state.

“That makes the legislative branch completely irrelevant,” Diamond said. “That’s not fair to New Mexico.”

Redistricting

Diamond said the Legislature is expected to meet in special session after Thanksgiving to consider redistricting of local, state and congressional district boundaries based on results of the 2020 Census. She credited both chambers of the state Legislature for their “good-faith effort” to create a nonpartisan commission to draft redistricting proposals to

be considered by the Legislature and governor.

“We have to forget where the lines are,” she said, and redraw districts that “put the interests of New Mexico ... before politics.” Adequate representation for rural areas should be a strong consideration in redrawing district lines, she said.

2022 legislative session

Diamond said the Legislature will have a lot of money to spend during the 2022 legislative session.

It will be important for legislators “to be good stewards,” she said, and put the money “to good use” during the 30-day session, which is restricted to budget matters and the governor’s call.

Diamond said public schools are well funded, but, with a sharp rise in child-abuse cases, the state Children, Youth and Families Department “clearly needs our help.”

“We haven’t stopped the bleeding,” she said about fraud allegations and overspending in the New Mexico Workforce Solutions Department.

Capital outlay

Diamond said she allocated a portion of the capital outlay funding she received during the session to protective equipment for law enforcement in her district. She noted that New Mexico State Police officer Darian Jarrott was killed in her district in February, and she is part of an effort to erect a memorial in his honor.

PSL is also a business and economic development asset, Sanchez said, and provides educational and work opportunities for students.

Like many organizations, PSL was slowed by the pandemic, Sanchez said. But by mid-July, the facility was “matching what we did prior to Covid,” he said.

“Over the last 10 years, PSL has brought in contracts and made research expenditures at an average of \$37 million annually,” Shelby said.

There are plans for major growth at PSL during the next five years, including doubling its program size, Sanchez said. That will mean substantial investments in information technology and infrastructure, he said, and a step-up in PSL’s participation as a regional leader in economic development and its support for student learning and workforce readiness.

PLS launched the Classified Ready Employee Workforce (CREW) program in 2020 to foster the

next generation of the national security workforce, Sanchez said.

The two-year co-op program helps students learn about national security and earn clearance to classified systems that makes them “very, very marketable” to potential employers, he said.

CREW students have often been hired before they graduate by companies like General Dynamics and Northrup Grumman and “are now leaders in the field,” said Shelby, who earned a doctorate in economic development from NMSU in 2015. After graduation, she worked for the New

Mexico Economic Development Loan Fund and later moved to California. Shelby returned to NMSU to work for PSL in August 2020.

CREW has attracted national attention from leaders at Spaceport America, the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and others.

“It needs to be a national program,” Sanchez said.

PSL currently has about 150 employees, including engineers, scientists and support staff, with that number expected to rise to 200 by the end of 2022, Shelby said. The lab employs an average of 25

students and 10 co-op students each semester.

“Since 1946, we have had nearly 20,000 students come through our doors as student employees and co-ops,” Shelby said.

PSL has an “excited and dedicated workforce,” Sanchez said. “Everybody’s giving 100 percent every day.”

As PSL obtains additional grants and contracts, there are “lots of ideas and lots of opportunities for innovation,” Shelby said.

“PSL has such a rich history of working on issues of national importance,” NMSU Chancellor Dan Arvizu said. “When I was a student in the 1970s, PSL was a vibrant place doing great work, especially with satellite tracking around the world. At that time, they had hundreds of co-op students, including many of my friends. PSL is a great asset to the country, to our state and to NMSU.”

Clinton P. Anderson Hall

The building that houses PSL was built in 1965 and dedicated Oct. 23 of that year, the 70th birthday of U.S. Sen. Clinton Presba Anderson, D-N.M.

Anderson (1895-1975) was a U.S. senator from 1949 to 1973 and served as a member of the U.S. House of Representatives from New Mexico, was U.S. secretary of Agriculture during the Truman Administration (1945-48) and was New Mexico’s ninth state treasurer (1933-34).

More than 800 people attended the dedication, which included a birthday cake for Anderson. Baked by the NMSU food service bakery, it was the largest cake ever baked in the state, including more than 100 pounds of icing, according to the NMSU archives.

Anderson was chair of the U.S. Senate Committee on Aeronautical and Space Sciences from 1963-73, and he was a strong supporter of the U.S. Space Program.

"Are you telling me the Cruces-Mayfield game is THIS Friday? And you're talking about the Las Cruces High School-Mayfield High School FOOTBALL game?"

"But wait. Isn't it too early?"

Those are reactions a lot of Las Cruces have had recently regarding the annual Trojans-Bulldawgs clash.

Yes, it's true. The Mayfield-Cruces football game is this Friday, Sept. 17. Depending on when you're reading this, it might even already be over.

And if you're planning to walk up to the stadium and buy a ticket just before kickoff, think again. Only advance tickets.

And if you're thinking the game's going to be at Aggie Memorial Stadium, as it's been for years, think again. It's at the Field of Dreams.

If you went into a hiberna-

tion pod or science fiction sleep chamber in December 2019 and woke up in the past month or

so, you might think the world has turned on its axis. (Actually, given the events of the past 18 months, there are probably a lot of us who might think a sleep chamber wouldn't have been a bad place to be during that time.)

For years, there were a few things you could

always count on between summer and Thanksgiving in Las Cruces.

1. Green chile season and the smell of roasters in front of the grocery stores.

2. Students returning to New Mexico State University, bringing vibrancy and an economic boost to the region.

3. Cruces and Mayfield playing in Aggie Memorial Stadium the first Friday in November.

So why is the game early this year?

Well, this is one thing you can't blame on Covid.

Because of the changing residency patterns in Las Cruces, and the declining student population of Mayfield, the two high schools are no longer in the same classification. LCHS remains at 6A, but MHS is now in 5A. That means they are in different districts, and district games are always played at the end of the season.

A few years ago, Cruces-Mayfield was named one of the top high school football rivalries in the nation. The game lived up to it, as out-of-town alumni planned trips back home for the game. Dozens of families split their allegiances, with one parent from Mayfield and one from LCHS, or the parents from one school and the children from another. The energy and the cross-generational camaraderie in a packed Aggie Memorial Stadium were unmatched.

There are other things different about Cruces-Mayfield this

year.

As you know, for many years, these were two of the top teams in the state, and as district rivals, that big rivalry game often determined the district championship, and seeding in the state playoffs.

Perhaps the peak of the rivalry came in 2013, when the two teams met for the state championship in Aggie Memorial Stadium. Both teams entered the game 11-1, and it was the 50th meeting between the pair. The game lived up to the billing, with the Bulldogs eking out a 27-26 victory.

Each team has made a return trip to the championship (Mayfield in 2014 and LCHS in 2016) but neither has brought home another blue title trophy.

This year's matchup may be the first time in generations neither team comes in with a winning record. Mayfield is 2-2, and LCHS is 1-3. Mayfield is ranked fifth in the state in 5A, and the

Redistricting: What will new congressional districts look like?

Following each decennial census, the seats in the U.S. House of Representatives are reapportioned so that rapidly growing states gain representation and states with slower growth lose. Then, the states draw new district boundaries (redistricting) to reflect shifts in population within the state. While New Mexico's total seats will remain at three, the current congressional districts (CDs) have grown at different rates and redistricting is required to keep the three districts about equal in population. Our large CD 2 District grew the most and will be reduced in size in some way to accommodate the change. Similarly, legislative and other districts of elected officials have to be adjusted.

Of interest in southern New Mexico is how CD 2 will change. A recent headline indicated the district could shrink geographically. Beyond that, its general configuration could be relatively unchanged with small tweaks to reduce population by shifting precincts along the border to other CDs. (Guidelines adopted by the New Mexico Legislative Council state that districts should not split

precincts.) Alternatively, a more dramatic change could occur such as an east-west split of the state outside the Albuquerque area.

In hopes of avoiding challenges to district maps created by the Legislature, in 2021 the Citizen Redistricting Committee (CRC) was created to put some distance between the legislators, who have a vested interest in what the legislative districts look like, and the process of drawing maps. The goal is to have voters pick their legislators rather than legislators pick their voters. The CRC, consisting of seven citizens who do not hold elective office, has held eight meetings around the state, two being in CD 2, to receive public input concerning communities of interest and the general concerns of citizens. Recordings of the meetings (in-person and virtual) are available at nmredistricting.org. Also accessible from this site is a place to submit your own comments, in-

cluding maps, and to view and comment on the submissions of others.

Redistricting is especially challenging when the geographic areas are so large relative to the population. Even at the level of NM legislative districts (with ideal populations of 30,000 for the House and 50,000 for the Senate), citizens speaking to the commit-

tee expressed concern about legislators who must travel many miles to reach parts of their district. Distances are even more significant for two of the existing congressional districts. People prefer a district where they have an opportunity to elect a representative whose views reflect their own.

A good redistricting process is one that

is conducted "in the sunshine" rather than behind closed doors and preserves and protects "communities of interest." Through the public input process, the CRC is learning about voter preferences across the state. The League of Women Voters of Southern New Mexico urges residents to let their voices be heard. Plan to participate in

the next round of citizen input meetings. Watch for announcements of the meeting in Las Cruces, scheduled for 3 to 7 p.m. Oct. 4 at the NMSU Corbett Center Student Union.

Even small projects such as planting a tree or installing fence posts can be very dangerous if you do not know what utilities are buried around your dig site. Whether you are a professional excavator or homeowner, you can be fined AND held financially responsible for repair costs to damaged utilities when 811 is not called. How it works:

1. Use white spray paint and/or white marker flags to mark the ground where you plan to dig.
2. Call 811 two business days before beginning your project and they will alert all of the local utilities to respond to your dig site and mark where the utility lines are buried. Utility companies will have two days, once notified, to respond to your dig site.
3. Once utilities are marked, you must adhere to the "18 inch" rule, which is no mechanical digging (tractor, auger, etc.) within 18 inches of the utility markings. If you must dig within 18 inches of a utility marking, it has to be hand dug or vacuum excavated.
4. Once all of the utilities have been marked, you will have 15 days to complete your digging project. If your project is not complete in that time frame, you must call 811 again.

Bulldawgs are ranked 17th in 6A. It's weird to see neither team ranked No. 1 or No. 2.

And it's extra weird to see the Bulldawgs ranked behind No. 7 Centennial, a school that didn't even

exist until 2012.

There were times in years past the two teams entered the rivalry game undefeated. This year, both teams come into the game following a decisive loss. Last week, Mayfield lost to the aforementioned Centennial Hawks, 56-23. Las Cruces High School got drubbed on the road

42-7 by No. 1 ranked and undefeated Cleveland High School in Rio Rancho.

Minister builds connections to deal with strife, promote healing

"The very air we breathe connects us all," said the Rev. Carol Wilkins, who began her own ministry in Las Cruces in 2020 after a year as pastor at Wellspring Church.

That connection has been vital, Wilkins said, as people have dealt with the "global awakening" that resulted from Covid-19 and the murder of George Floyd.

"The power of communication" has never been more apparent, she said, even through the isolation caused by the pandemic.

Through her Inspiration Ministry and other local, national and international platforms, Wilkins has provided "support to lonely people all over the world," she said.

Black people especially, Wilkins said, "needed a space to express their pain," not only to talk

about Covid and the Floyd murder, but "to express the pain of everyday living."

Through her own ministry, national online Black healing circles that began a week after Floyd's murder in May 2020 and other programs, Wilkins provides a "safe place" for those who connect with her.

She offers spiritual guidance along with self-help tips like breathing exercises to release negative feelings and ways to activate the vagus nerve, which is the main component of the parasympathetic nervous system that controls major bodily organs.

"It's effective," Wilkins said. "I'm not looking at numbers. I'm looking at sharing."

She said she encourages

people to "live a life that is creative, compassionate and inspirational."

"I teach dignity," Wilkins said, which has been vital in helping people say goodbye to loved ones lost during Covid. Remembering refrigerator trucks carrying the bodies of pandemic victims in New York City, "my heart opened and ached for them," she said.

Wilkins said she also has given a voice to people of color who have worked on the front lines since the onset of Covid but haven't been talked about or recognized, including nurses' aides, orderlies and others working in "lesser jobs" to support doctors and nurses at hospitals and to staff senior centers across the country.

"They saved our lives, yet we don't pay people

living wages," Wilkins said, who is clergy engagement and donor development manager for NM CAFé, a Las Cruces nonprofit that works to shape public policy.

Many Black people are part of a nationwide counterculture that began when their ancestors were slaves and then became indentured servants, she said. "They never made it out," Wilkins said. "They never came out of debt."

The Floyd murder has also had a greater impact on Blacks, Wilkins said, who thought of her partner, her brother and her adopted son when she heard about Floyd's death. "It could have been any one of them," she said.

And while many white people are concerned about the murder and compassionate about

its impact on the Black community, "the feelings aren't the same," she said.

While living in California before coming to Las Cruces, Wilkins said she also encountered a "depth of pain" among young Blacks — including her partner's two children and her own students — as a result of the way they were treated by the police because of their race.

Wilkins said she is saddened because of "things we just swallowed."

"We live with it. We encourage our children to get over it," she said. "That's what people don't see."

Without the video of Floyd's murder that was captured by a Black teenager, "there would never have been a conviction" of the police officer who killed Floyd, Wilkins said.

"I am grateful to her."

"I am not anti-police," she added. "I have opened my heart to interactions with the police. I am a great American. I believe in democracy. I remember learning the Pledge of Allegiance."

Since the Floyd murder, Wilkins said, young Blacks are "now taking up the mantle, marching and protesting. I am just so touched by that."

At the same time, Wilkins said, the notion of white privilege is "so disrespectful" and "the rhetoric of today" can be frightening, especially to people who don't know the truth about what's going on.

"I have never seen such a divide before," she said. "There's more work to be

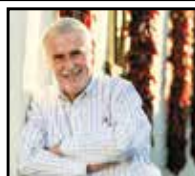

What Changes in Solid Waste Municipal Code Means for You

It's been 33 years since there were updates to Chapter 25 of the City of Las Cruces Municipal Code. It's the chapter on solid waste, defining the management of the city's trash. While you may think, how much can trash change since 1988, Las Cruces Utilities (LCU) has certainly grown right alongside the city and, most importantly, has integrated technology that residents may take for granted. However, those changes had never been defined in the actual codes.

"For example, Solid Waste transitioned to operating fully automated collection vehicles for both residential and commercial containers," said LCU Interim Deputy Director Solid Waste Rosa Montoya. "This affects the placement and type of containers required and how these containers are serviced, which was not reflected in the current municipal code." The code now specifies that trucks are hydraulically operated

and have an arm to retrieve the bins. Changes to the code clarify situations for residents, such as how a driver cannot get out to take things set next to the container and anything that might hinder the pickup around the container, leading to the driver needing to skip that pickup.

Montoya also explained that definitions were updated to include things like illegal dumping and food waste. From the

updated code:

- Illegal dumping refers to the placement of waste in any area not designated for waste collection to include arroyos, occupied lots, abandoned or vacant lots, and shall include persons placing any of their own solid waste with that of any other persons residential property, or business establishment, without authorization, for the purpose of avoiding payment of solid waste fees or for the purpose of evading any regulation or limitation on solid waste management.

- Food waste refers to food, such as plate waste, (i.e., food that has been served but not eaten), food preparation waste (i.e., preparation trimmings), spoiled food, or peels and rinds

considered inedible to be composted or anaerobically digested or to be landfilled or combusted with energy recovery.

"We changed the municipal code's food waste language to ensure we have opportunities available for usable food waste collections," explained LCU Director Delilah Walsh. "While we won't have a food waste program in the City's Solid Waste line of business specifically, we want to open doors for a local circular economy so that local business owners can step up and create solutions." Walsh said, "Innovators could use our city's waste to create jobs which could divert waste that ends up in the landfill; we want to help support that."

Summer nearing end, autumn starts Sept. 22

Fall officially begins with the autumnal equinox at 1:20 p.m. MDT Wednesday, Sept. 22.

Equinox comes from Latin *aequus*, meaning “equal,” and *nox*, “night.” On the equinox, therefore, day and night should be about equal in length.

On Sept. 22, there will, in fact, be 12 hours, 7 minutes and 20 seconds of daylight and 11 hours, 52 minutes and 40 seconds of night, according to www.timeanddate.com.

Day and night are almost exactly equal Sept. 27, only missing perfect balance by 17 seconds.

During the equinox, the

sun crosses the celestial equator, an imaginary extension of Earth’s equator line into space, according to www.almanac.com. “The equinox occurs precisely when the sun’s center passes through this line. When the sun crosses the equator from north to south, this marks the autumnal equinox; when it crosses from south to north, this marks the vernal equinox.”

The full moon closest to the fall equinox is called the harvest moon.

This year, that comes two days before the equinox, at 5:54 p.m. MDT Monday, Sept. 20.

In case you’re wondering, daylight saving time ends Sunday, Nov. 7.

teaching Manufacturing Technology at EPCC’s Advanced Technology Center in El Paso. After 9/11, he went to work White Sands Missile Range managing DoD projects for the US Navy, Air Force, Army and NASA. But it was LRU – the Las Cruces International Airport – that started him on his aviation adventure where he learned to fly.

“We were flying hang gliders in Hawaii, but now I was back in New Mexico, 38 years old, with kids in school and teaching full time in another state,” he said. “There was this tiny ad and a phone number. My wife encouraged me to go out and take an introductory flight. I remember trying to write out a check while we were landing for the club dues. I was so excited!”

He tried to take lessons twice a week, and nine months later Hahn earned his private pilot’s license at LRU. Since then, he has crisscrossed the

country, logging over 750 hours of flight time in everything from aerobatic biplanes to Warbirds and turboprops. “I’ve been in love with flying, and everything related to it,” he said.

Located at 9400 Zia Blvd. Hangar-C, BRAHN Sport Aircraft is an authorized distributor for Verner Radial Aircraft Engines, the dominant portion of his business. “People from all over the region come to buy aircraft parts, but people from all over the United States and Canada come to buy engines,” he said. Hahn explained that they also specialize in sheet metal, aerospace quality welding and fabrication, including building custom aircraft. “If you have a Cessna 172 and you want to get your oil changed, you can go to any one of our great mechanics here on the field,” he said. “However, if you’re interested in restoring or building a custom

Woman space engineer special guest at Wings n Wheels Fest

One of the nation's top space industry engineers will be a guest at Wings n Wheels Fest 21, which will be held 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday, Sept. 25, at Las Cruces International Airport (LCIA).

Anita Gale is the CEO of the National Space Society (NSS) and runs engineering design contests for high-school students around the world. She worked on the Space Shuttle for almost the entire length of the program and then became a senior project engineer for space vehicle cargo integration for the Boeing Company. Gale served as chair of the American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics Space Colonization Technical Committee

2013-14. She holds three U.S. patents for space cargo interface standardization.

"Anita is a representative for our theme of Women in Aviation," LCIA Administrator Andy Hume said. "She is also an exhibitor with the Na-

tional Space Society and Space Settlement Development Competition."

Gale lives in Nassau Bay, on the southeastern edge of Houston, Texas. She grew up in the Pacific Northwest "catching fishing, digging clams and picking berries," and earned bachelor of science and master of science degrees in aeronautics and astronautics from the University of Washington (UW) in Seattle and a certificate in systems engineering from Cal Poly Pomona.

When Gale was attending UW, women made up fewer than 1 percent of all U.S. engineers.

"I didn't tell my high school counselors I wanted to be an engineer because they would have discouraged me. Women weren't in engineering," she said. "To prove I deserved to be in the aerospace industry, I had to get stinking hot grades and graduate near the top of my class. In college, I had to be one of the hot-shots."

Gale went to work for Rockwell International on the Space Shuttle program in 1980. She transitioned to Boeing when it took over the Space Shuttle contract and continued working on that NASA program at Johnson Space Center in Houston until her retirement in 2011.

In 1984, Gale co-founded Space Settlement Design Competitions (SSDC) and continues to conduct national and international contests for high-school students "that involve writing the future history of human activities and development of infrastructure in space."

With the design competitions, "We're a catalyst for getting kids interested in education," Gale said.

Often during a com-

petition, she has heard participating students say, "Now I understand why I need to study math and science!"

"With any luck, in 20 years, having a career in space will be normal," she said. "Space is where humans can learn to cooperate."

A design competition she coordinated in New Delhi, for example, found students from traditional enemies India and Pakistan working together on the same team.

"You get high-school kids all wrapped up in this excitement of what can happen to mankind in their lifetime," she said.

Earth's moon is just one example. An industry could be built around processing lunar materials to make air and water and sell to people living on the moon, Gale said.

"We're just right at the beginning of this big new economy," she said. "The kids ... get so into it. They get transported into this future reality and to them it is absolutely real."

Gale said she is open to the idea of hosting a regional design competition in Las Cruces, which has close proximity to

Spaceport America, White Sands Missile Range and other aerospace facilities.

NSS is "the organization where serious discussion of people living in space is happening," Gale said. "We're doing this for real and we need to prepare for it. There's going to be a space economy. I want to look at the future of the space industry 20, 30, 40, 50 years from now. There are technologies we can start developing right now."

Gale, 70, owns four sailboats and loves rafting down the Grand Canyon.

Out of Darkness event aims to combat 'suicide epidemic'

The fourth annual American Foundation for Suicide Prevention (AFSP)'s Las Cruces Out of the Darkness Walk will be a little different from past years, said AFSP New Mexico Chapter board member and event chair Robyn Rehbein-Narvaez.

"Due to Covid-19, we have moved the walk to a hybrid in-person event," Rehbein-Narvaez said.

This year, the event will include a drive-thru at 8:30 a.m. on Saturday, Sept. 25, followed by a bead ceremony at 10 a.m.

The drive-thru and bead ceremony will be held at the Doña Ana County Government Center, 845 N. Motel Blvd. Participants can choose to walk

after the bead ceremony or schedule their walk at any time they choose.

The drive-thru is so participants can pick up goodie bags from event volunteers, Rehbein-Narvaez said.

The bead ceremony includes nine different-colored beads "to represent losses and struggles with suicide," she said. "We go through each color bead and have people hold up their bead so that they can

see they are not alone."

Rehbein-Narvaez encouraged everyone to check the website before the event in case there are schedule changes.

The last in-person Out of the Darkness Walk had nearly 1,000 participants and raised more than \$20,000 "for education and prevention of suicide in New Mexico," Rehbein-Narvaez said.

"Like many, I walk because suicide has affected

me personally," she said. "In February 2018, I lost my nephew to depression and anxiety by the means of suicide. Since then, I have dedicated my time to educating others about suicide prevention and mental health."

Rehbein-Narvaez is the clinical supervisor and registered play therapist-supervisor at Art of Healing Therapy Center in Las Cruces.

The walk's goal "is to spread awareness about the suicide epidemic, as New Mexico has the highest rate of suicide in the U.S., and it is the second leading cause of death for ages 10-34. We want people to know they are not alone," she said.

City council tables Estrada memorial, creates redistricting panel

At its Sept. 7 regular meeting, the Las Cruces City Council indefinitely tabled a resolution to name the soundstage at the south end of Plaza de Las Cruces in honor of longtime Las Cruces icon Roberto Estrada so that city staff can meet with Estrada's family to help determine a suitable name for the memorial.

At the meeting, the council also created a citizen committee to address city council redistricting proposals and addressed cannabis use inside city limits.

The Estrada memorial resolution will be brought back to city council for consideration at a future

date for adoption.

Estrada, who died Aug. 18, was a Las Cruces philanthropist, Guinness World Record holder and founder of Roberto's Mexican Food Restaurant. In 1980, he was approached

by the Las Cruces Chamber of Commerce to contribute his cooking skills to an event that was then known as Vaquero Days. The event was renamed The Whole Enchilada Fiesta, and it became an

ongoing annual event that put Las Cruces on the map.

The fiesta culminated with Estrada, his staff and volunteers preparing a huge red enchilada.

With only two exceptions, Estrada made his signature enchilada every year from 1980 to 2014, when the festival ended.

His world-famous 10.5-foot-in-diameter enchilada held the Guinness World Record from 2000 to 2010 for the world's largest flat enchilada.

The fiesta had received recognition as one of the top 100 festivals in the U.S. and as one of the three largest events in New Mexico.

Also at the meeting, the council unanimously adopted a resolution to create a citizen ad hoc

committee to work with Research & Polling, Inc., of Albuquerque to evaluate city council redistricting proposals. Results of the 2020 U.S. Census were publicly disclosed Aug. 12 and the city's population has grown an estimated 14 percent to more than 111,000.

As a result of the population increase, the city charter requires that each council district "shall contain as nearly as possible substantially the same population based upon the most recent federal census." The council, as a result, must approve a redistricting proposal.

The Ad Hoc Redistricting Committee will consist of seven Las Cruces residents. Each city councilor will appoint one member who is a resident of the

councilor's district, and the mayor will appoint the seventh committee member.

The council also adopted an ordinance that will address cannabis uses within the city. Information about the ordinance and the amendments to it that were passed by the council will be available at www.las-cruces.org/2506/Cannabis-Information.

In early 2021, the state of New Mexico legalized cannabis for adult recreational use with the passage of House Bill 2, which includes the Cannabis Regulation Act. Until the city council's Sept. 7 action on the local ordinance, the municipal code had no provisions regulating adult-use cannabis production, manufacturing and consumption.

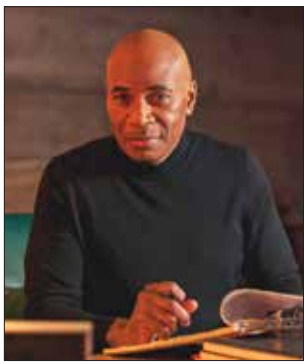

movie review

'Grease' still is the word for movie-musical fun

"Grease" always will be timeless, and for a good reason.

Brig shown by AMC on Saturday, Sept. 25, the 1978 screen version of the hit stage musical unapologetically presents actors who clearly are well beyond their high school years as ... high schoolers. The audience is in on the joke from the start, though, so the Randal Kleiser-directed picture's campy undercurrent is a huge part of its appeal.

John Travolta was just coming off a gargantuan success with "Saturday Night Fever" when he went back to his pre-stardom roots with this project, which he had done in live theater with a touring company. As cooler-than-cool gang member Danny Zuko, he lets his guard down during a summer fling with the virtuous Sandy (depicted here as an overseas exchange student to accommodate Olivia Newton-John, a charmer in her first major film role).

Flash forward a bit, and Danny is stunned to find Sandy has transferred to be one of his fellow pupils at Rydell High — where he puts up a charade to try to keep others from discovering the softer side he showed with her. Naturally, she isn't happy with his turn in attitude toward her, so she aligns with rough-around-the-edges Rizzo (Stockard Channing) and the other Pink Ladies to win him back.

Admittedly, this is not the deepest of plots, but where "Grease" really succeeds is in topping that with massive doses of star appeal and great music. Though many of the tunes come from the original version, "You're the One That I Want" and "Hopelessly Devoted to You" were added for the film, as was Frankie Valli's title song (written by Barry Gibb). All were enormous hits on the charts, as was "Summer Nights," from the original stage score.

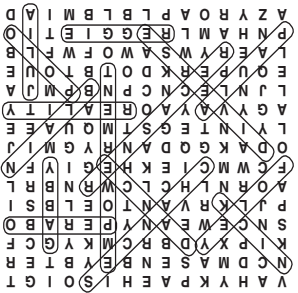

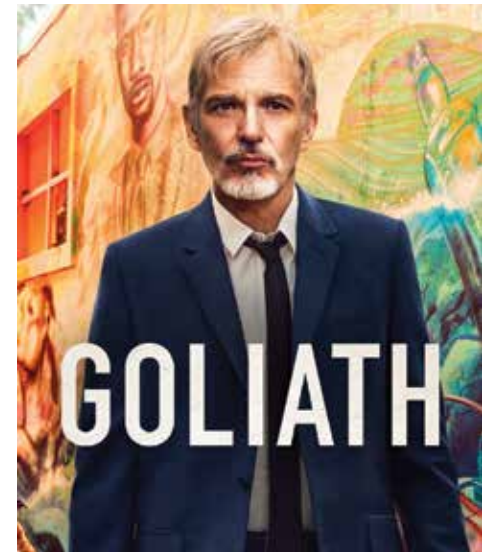

‘Laughing Wild’ opens at Black Box

1980s play offers ‘strange, wacky way’ of looking at world that remains fresh

“Laughing Wild,” by Tony-winning playwright Christopher Durang, will open Friday, Sept. 24, and continue for three weekends at Black Box Theatre (BBT), 430 N. Main St. Downtown.

Performances are at 8 p.m. Friday and Saturday, Sept. 24-25, Oct. 1-2 and Oct. 8-9; 2:30 p.m. Sundays, Oct. 3 and 10; and 7 p.m. Thursday, Oct. 7.

The play is directed by BBT co-owner Ceil Herman.

“We have previously produced Durang’s ‘Beyond Therapy,’ directed by Bradd Howard and ‘Baby with the Bathwater,’ which I directed, both audience favorites,” Herman said. “Durang has such a strange and wacky way of looking at the world. Even though this play was written in 1988, and we are setting it in 1987, the subject matter is very current.”

In the play, a man (Brad Martinez) is looking at cans of tuna in a grocery store when a woman (Jamie Bronstein) appears behind him and ultimately conks him on the head because he won’t talk to her.

The first act of the play consists of two extended monologues, one by the woman and one by the man, talking about their experiences in the store. In the second act, the man and woman enter a series of dream sequences imagining what might have happened during their encounter and in other circumstances, like appearing on a talk show or participating in the Harmonic Convergence.

Set in 1987, “Laughing Wild” covers topics that include nuclear proliferation, sexual identity, AIDS and mental health.

NMSU tackles ‘Fefu and Her Friends’ in return to live theater Sept. 23

The New Mexico State University Theatre Department celebrates the return of live theater to the Mark and Stephanie Medoff Theatre with the premiere of “Fefu and Her Friends.”

There is an early pre-view performance at 5:30 p.m. Thursday, Sept. 23. Additional performances are at 7:30 p.m. Friday and Saturday, Sept. 24-25 and Oct. 1-2 and a matinee performance at 2 p.m.

The cast includes NMSU theater students Sage Drake, Dominique Gomez, Darcy Harman, Yasmine Jahangiri, Karyn Neill (as Fefu, which is short for Stephanie), Eliza Phillips and Jensen

Stell, along with NMSU Theatre Department adjunct professor Christa Fredrickson.

Tickets are \$20 for adults, \$12 for senior citizens, \$12 for students and \$6 for under age 18.

Seating will be limited to 80 attendees for each performance and will be general admission with no assigned seating.

of the directors of 2019's top movies were women, the highest percentage in more than a decade, the news release said. "Yet women are still painfully underrepresented in the medium where the overall percentage of female directors from the past 13 years remains at 4.8 percent. LUNAFEST's goal is to change those numbers by highlighting the work of women directors, provide opportunities for them by supporting Chicken & Egg Productions and to support community nonprofits like Soroptimist International."

All proceeds from LUNAFEST ticket sales will benefit SILC Dream Programs, the news re-

lease said. SILC Live Your Dream Awards provide financial assistance that help women complete post-secondary education. Most awardees have faced and overcome obstacles such as domestic violence, teen pregnancy and homelessness.

All awardees are their families' primary wage earners. SILC's Dream It, Be It program empowers high-school girls through workshops on defining goals, overcoming obstacles to success, managing money and professional etiquette.

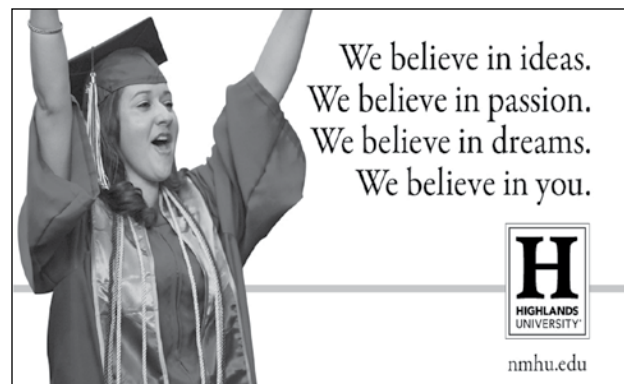

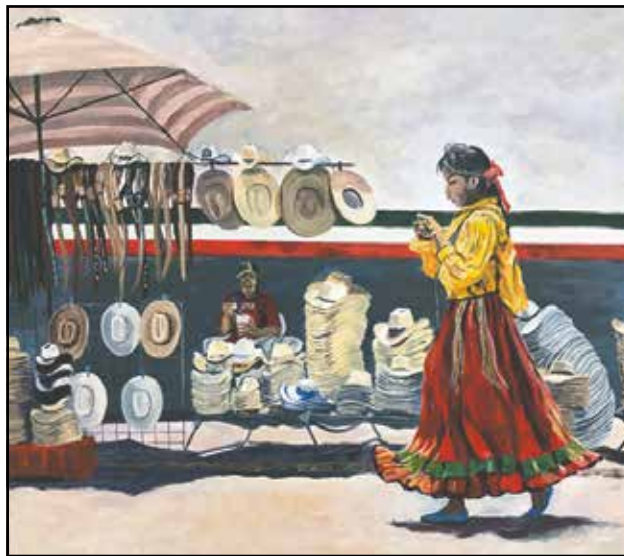

Is it finally time for New Mexico to fully fund Dual Credit courses?

If there's been one consistent message coming from The Bridge of Southern New Mexico over our 12-year history, it's been the importance of accelerating students not just toward high-school graduation, but also college completion.

Why? Because academic outcomes lead to economic impact — empowerment — freedom. And, these academic outcomes are directly tied to building a skilled and ready workforce capable of driving economic development.

Dual Credit courses are a proven vehicle for this acceleration.

Dual Credit, which allows high-school students

to take college courses and get credit in both places, demonstrated its power early on when 100 percent of the first students at Arrowhead Park Early College High School graduated high school and earned associate degrees and/or career-focused credentials in just four years.

Access to Dual Credit courses within Career and Technical Education pathways are also linked to students earning valuable career credentials that they can use whether they go on to continue their education or go straight into the workplace after high school. Students in CTE pathways similarly graduate at, or very near, 100 percent.

In fact, New Mexico's upward trajectory on high-school graduation rates in the past few years directly coincides with the advancement of Dual Credit courses in the state. The majority of these classes are taken by students of color, including 48 percent by Hispanic students. Interestingly, the gap in graduation rates for Hispanic students and all students has closed over the same time period.

As of the 2019-20 school year, there were 21,757 students taking 54,265 classes, roughly 1 in 5 New Mexico students.

Now, look at what we've learned in the past year and half thanks to the pandemic.

Those with a high-school diploma or less were the ones most likely

to be unemployed by the Covid shutdowns. Those without college credentials were least likely to be able to transition to remote work, and unemployment rates during the pandemic were highest among those who did not hold some level of college credentials, while jobs for those with college credentials actually increased during the pandemic.

New Mexico has always had the power to change its economic trajectory by realizing the importance of becoming a PK-14/16 state, meaning that we have all the assets we need to propel a whole generation of students toward some level of college completion while in high school: career-specific certificates and associate degrees. Setting this expectation before students

early in their academic journey would enable them to make academic choices that increase their incomes over the course of their lives.

So, what has prevented our state from looking at what clearly works and doing it more and better? To date, it's been the unwillingness to make an essentially a small investment in the context of the state budget — around \$12 million — to fund the higher education institutions who offer these courses to students tuition-free.

While our community colleges and universities have been increasingly making these opportunities available to students, the actual cost to deliver the same class and same services to high-school students as a college student has never been fully funded. Complicating this is the fact that high-

school students do not have access to financial aid for college courses. In fact, some have said tuition-paying students are essentially subsidizing non-tuition-paying Dual Credit students.

With the state currently awash in money, it seems like now is the time to fully invest in the future of our students by intentionally, strategically, funding Dual Credit statewide. We will be calling upon our elected officials to take this opportunity to make a generational investment in a PK-14/16 education system, knowing beyond a shadow of a doubt that it's the key to our states economic prosperity for generations.

Felicia Hale, Storm Sermay and Roberta Stathis set or tied numerous national or state records at the Summer Nationals in Roswell this summer. The event was sponsored by the Natural Athlete Strength Association, which offers competitive weightlifting in a drug-free environment.

All three women, who look more like they should be baking cookies than pumping iron, qualified for the Masters Nationals in Oklahoma City Nov. 20-21.

"There is a lot of misconceptions about (weightlifting) — that it is for young guys who are muscle giants," said their

coach Rich Kahle who oversees the women and their workouts at 1 More Rep gym on El Paseo Road.

"This is more about personal achievement and competing against people who are the same size, the same age as they are and

working on personal improvement," he added.

Hale competes in the Master 3 Division (age 60-69) in what is known

as powerlifting — squat, bench press and deadlift. She set national records in all three individual events and in the combined total in the 198-pound weight group.

Sermay competes in the Masters 4 Division (age 70-79) in what is called powersports — curl, bench press and deadlift. She also set national records in all three individual events and the combined total in the 132-pound weight class.

Stathis competes in the Masters 3 (60-69), also in powersports. She set New Mexico state records in the three individual events and in the combined total in her weight class of 119 pounds. She also tied the national record in the deadlift.

Stathis said she was going through a rough time earlier this year after her husband died.

She called herself a "mess" and tried to back out of her training but Kahle insisted that she come out and continue working out.

"It took my mind off being sad," she said.

Stathis said when she arrived at the meet in Roswell, she was terrified of competing.

But she said she took off her glasses and thought, "I can't see them so they can't see me."

"I had a blast," she said. Hale said she loves weightlifting and she just sets simple goals of doing better than she did at her last meet.

"You always fail, but it's successful failures," she said. "Wherever I left off at the last meet, that's where I want to start at my next meet and go beyond that."

Sermay said she started lifting weights about 20 years ago when she was doing triathlons but injured her foot and couldn't run.

"I tried powerlifting; I could bend down and pick something up that was heavy," she said.

Sermay took more than a dozen years off from the

In life, we have to give up some things to get better things. It's called "delayed gratification," and it's one of those secrets to a successful life that even many adults don't comprehend.

So too in golf, there are things we need

to let go of in order to make gains in ability and outcomes. If we want to get better, we are challenged to give up those attitudes and behavior patterns that are holding us back.

We must be able to put

aside certain beliefs, habits and actions that are no longer serving us well. Let's examine some of what we should let go of.

The first thing to do is let go of fear. What are you really afraid of anyway? I'll bet you haven't thought of how hidden fear, below the threshold of awareness, is holding

you back from much better performance. Do you fear looking foolish or embarrassing yourself? Being seen as a loser and someone who chokes? Being ridiculed as a chump or a pigeon? We often imagine that bystanders, or even playing companions, are closely watching everything we

do and every bad swing we make. That may be true in the pressure of Ryder Cup play, but in truth fellow players are concerned about their own business. Have the courage to let go of fear completely.

Deeply ingrained maladaptive notions are rooted in destructive core beliefs that often

take the form of "musts," "shoulds" and "have tos" that generally do us harm when it comes to performing at our best. In a detached, rational view, it's of course ridiculous, but the whole idea of feeling the impending panic of failure can be intensely

implanted in our emotional makeup. When you let go of the “musts” and the fear, you let go of tension, which is the enemy of good golf. We need to do a little soul searching and boldly identify what our inner fears really are. After challenging our demons, being willing to face them directly as truly unfounded, perhaps even immature, we will choose to let them evaporate. Remember also that true

courage is not being absolutely fearless: it is acting correctly and with resolve in the face of fear. Like our boys did in the Battle of the Bulge and the beaches of Normandy.

Along with letting go of fear, we do ourselves a big favor when we let go of doubt. If you doubt that you will be able to play your best golf when you tee it up in a tournament, it is very unlikely that you will. If you doubt you can win, you probably won't even give yourself a chance to win. Doubting yourself is born of

insecurity — not trusting yourself and your ability. It rears its ugly head, for example, by looking up to see the ball before finishing the swing or the putt. Releasing self-doubt will be the first step toward newfound confidence. Be positive; I mean simply deciding to be optimistic, where you see possibilities, not pitfalls. Make it your business to know your own game and trust yourself to play it solidly when it counts.

How about letting go of bad habits, like being too lazy to exercise or work

out, or being unwilling to practice or remaining stuck in old and unproductive swing patterns. In his bestselling book “The Seven Habits of Highly Effective People,” author and consultant Stephen Covey tells us that high achievers select personal and lifestyle habits that work for them instead of against them.

Mayfield and Las Cruces will meet up in football at 7 p.m. Friday, Sept. 17, at the Field of Dreams, at the corner of Motel Boulevard and Tashiro Road.

According to district Athletics Director Ernie Viramontes, 5,000 tickets will be sold for each high school. No tickets will be sold at the Field of Dreams on game day.

Tickets will be available at both high schools from 8 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. on Thursday, Sept. 16, and Friday, Sept. 17.

“It’s exciting to feel a sense of normalcy with the return of regular-season football in the fall here in Las Cruces,” Viramontes said. “This longstanding rivalry game adds to that excitement.”
