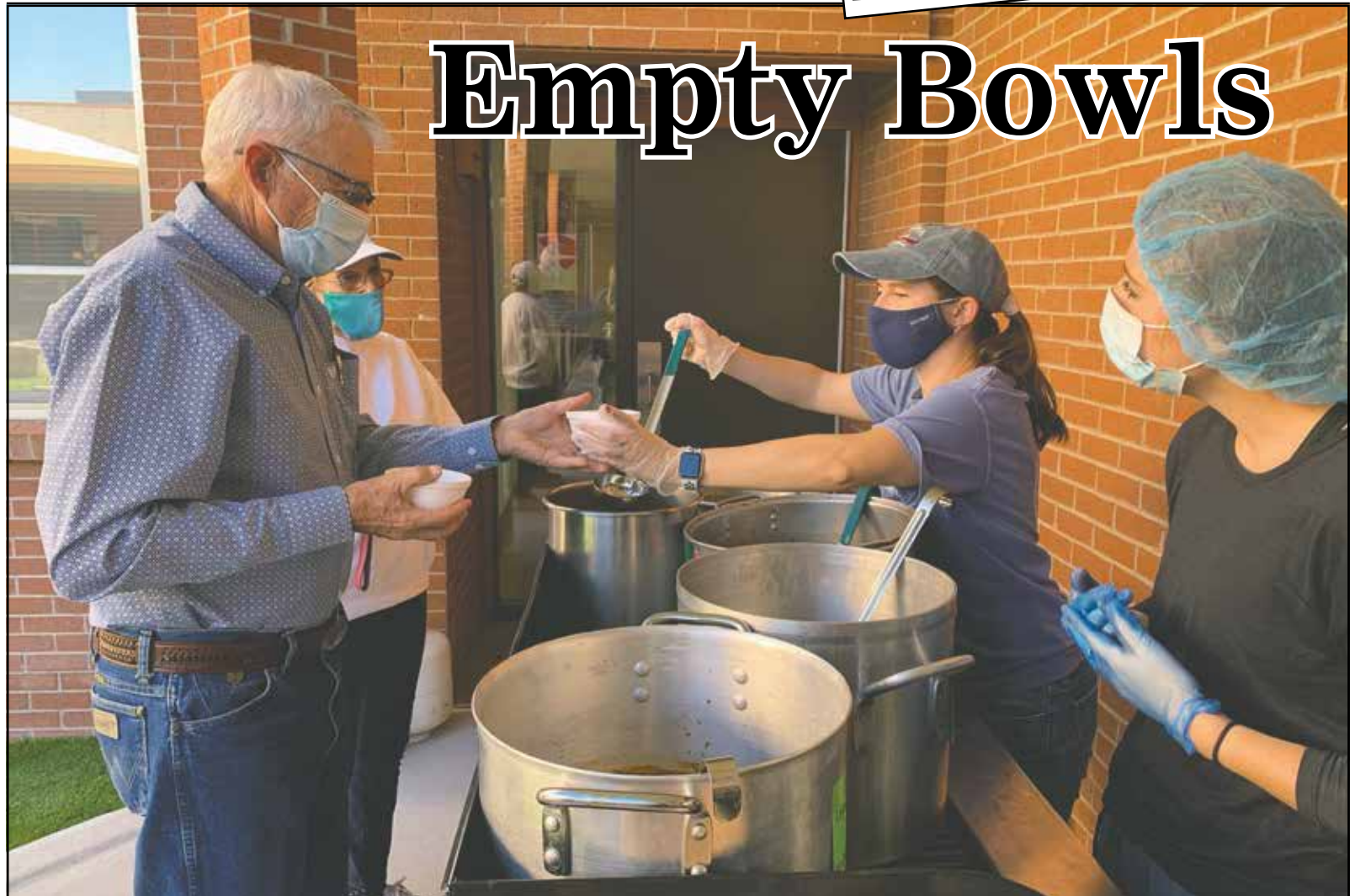

## EMERGENCY RENTAL ASSISTANCE DEADLINE IS EXTENDED

As October 15, Doña Ana County has paid out \$4.6 million in rental and utilities assistance to 793 households and encumbered \$0.86 million, which will be paid out by mid-November for a cumulative total of \$5.47 million. This is an important milestone to note as with this total, the County reached 65% of direct assistance—as requested by the U.S. Treasury. As a result of this 65% allocation, the County will not be required to return any of the \$9.3 million in funds made available by the federal government.

This milestone comes on the heels of the announcement that an extension has been granted for the first phase of the Emergency Rental Assistance Program to Sept. 30, 2022.

The County continues to look for innovative ways to make the application process as easy as possible by providing multiple ways for qualified applicants to apply. Along with a simple, step-by-step process on the website, in both English and Spanish, in-person application processing at the Government Center at 845 N. Motel Blvd. in Las Cruces, and assistance at County community centers, the County has now enabled the option for tenants and landlords to text and use video conferencing for those comfortable with the technology.

# LCPS bond won't raise taxes; mill levy also on ballot for local voters

*Editor's note: The Nov. 2 local election ballot contains two Las Cruces Public Schools questions: 1) the bond issue, and 2) the mill levy. Check the back of your ballot to ensure that you vote on both questions. The LCPS questions are on the ballot for all qualified voters who live in the school district. That means you can vote on the LCPS bond and mill levy along with your votes in city council, school board and soil and water conservation district elections, or you can vote in the school bond election and soil and water conservation district election even if your city council race and school board race are not on this year's ballot.*

Las Cruces Public Schools needs about \$500 million to bring all its schools up to standard, but it's only asking for \$50 million in the 2021 bond election to avoid an increase in local property tax, LCPS Superintendent Ralph Ramos said.

LCPS' 2021 bond issue addresses needs identified in the school district's facilities maintenance plan, which it updates every four years, LCPS Community Outreach Liaison Brigitte Zigelhofer said.

The bond question also includes \$15 million to rebuild Columbia Elementary School. The school was closed in 2018, after

mold was discovered. The new school building will be erected at the same location, 4555 Elks Drive.

LCPS Director of Construction Gloria Martinez said the school district is in the process of hiring a general contractor to do the Columbia Elementary demolition work, which she said could begin by this December. Martinez said she is also working on hiring an architect to design the new school, with the design likely to start in January.

Since the school's closure, Columbia Elementary students have been attending classes at Centennial High School. The new Columbia Elementary building is expected to open in fall 2024, Ramos said.

Other items that will be paid for with 2021 bond money, if voters approve:

- \$11 million for new maintenance facilities

at the LCPS operations annex on Tashiro Drive;

- \$1 million for Americans with Disabilities Act compliance districtwide;

- \$1.018 million for the design and construction of softball dugouts (\$288,000) and to resurface and replace the existing track (\$730,000) at the Field of Dreams;

- \$500,000 for a new LCPS solar project;

- \$3.3 million for enriched learning opportunities for LCPS students, including career and technical education and early childhood education;

- \$1.7 million for the rebuilding of an interior wall at Zia Middle School;

- \$5 million to remodel kitchens at Highland Elementary School and Lynn Middle School — \$2.5 million each;

- \$5.65 million in contingency funds and for

land acquisition. The money will help pay for unforeseen expenses in bond projects, including price increases for materials, and to purchase land for future school district needs, which Ramos said could possibly include a new elementary school on the East Mesa;

- \$4.1 million for roof replacements at César Chávez (\$2.1 million) and Hermosa Heights (\$2 million) elementary schools;
- \$1.375 million for security fencing (\$880,000), intercoms (\$145,000) and safety doors (\$350,000), including \$80,000 each for fencing at César Chávez, Doña Ana, Sunrise, University Hills and Valley View elementary schools; \$120,000 for fencing at

Hermosa Heights, Hillrise, Mesilla and Mesilla Park elementaries; \$32,000 each for intercoms at Mesilla and Mesilla Park elementaries; \$73,000 for intercoms at Central Elementary; \$8,000 for intercoms at Lynn Middle School; and \$350,000 for safety doors at Mayfield

High School.

- \$350,000 for a bus loop at Zia Middle School.

LCPS' second yes-no question on the 2021 local elections ballot asks voters to approve the renewal of a 2-mill capital improvements levy that will provide funds to pay for maintenance, school

equipment, playground improvements, classroom furnishings and other

projects districtwide.

The mill levy, also known as SB (Senate Bill)

9, must be approved by voters every six years.

# Elections shape our future — do your part

In recent years, election officials have made it easier and easier to vote.

Early voting, mail voting, convenience centers and other improvements demonstrate that municipalities recognize the busy nature of American life in the 21st Century.

Tuesday, Nov. 2, is the official Election Day here in Doña Ana County, but early voting is going on and it will continue through Saturday, Oct. 30.

You can vote 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday at the Doña Ana County Government Center, 845 N. Motel Blvd. through Election Day.

Early voting can be done 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Tuesday through Saturday at the following locations: Anthony City Hall, Hatch High School, Doña Ana

Community College in Sunland Park, Sonoma Elementary School in Las Cruces, Delores C. Wright Educational Center in Chaparral, Las Cruces City Hall, New Mexico State University Corbett Center in Las Cruces and Mesilla Town Hall.

Even if you're not yet registered to vote, you may register during the early voting period, which lasts until Oct. 30, at the above locations. Then you can vote the same day.

What are you voting for? If you live in Las Cruces or Mesilla, you'll be voting for city councilors or town trustees, as well as school board members, a Las Cruces Public Schools bond and a school mill levy.

There are other races in Hatch, Sunland Park and Anthony, New Mexico.

And there are races for the often overlooked Soil and

Water Conservation District representatives. It's not a glamorous position, but the importance is right there in the name. Where would we all be without safe and available soil and water?

In Las Cruces, there are contested races for Council districts 3, 5 and 6.

In districts 3 and 5, there are more than two candidates, so ranked choice voting will be in place. There has been a lot of confusion and misrepresentation about ranked choice voting but, in my opinion, it's been way overstated.

Just do exactly what it says: rank your votes by choice. Put your No. 1 choice in the No. 1 slot, your No. 2 choice in the No. 2 slot, etc. Some people have tried to attach ulterior motives to it, or to apply strange strategies on how to rank the candidates, or to only vote for one. The best way to have your voice heard, though, is just to rank them in order.

If you want to acquaint yourself with candidates or issues, you can find articles about all of them in recent issues of the Bulletin, found online at www.lascrucesbulletin.com. Click the EEDITION and peruse recent issues. And if you click on SPECIAL SECTIONS, and scroll down to VOTERS GUIDE, you can look at the League of Women Voters Guide, which includes candidates' comments in their own words.

For Las Cruces, the City Council is guaranteed to have at least two new members.

The incumbents in districts 3 and 5 — Gabe Vasquez and Gill Sorg — are not running for re-election. In District 6, challenger Bill Beerman is taking on incumbent Yvonne Flores.

As of this publication, you have about 11 days to make your decisions.

The most important decision you will make is the decision to go cast your vote.

# Democrats will have tough choice ahead on redistricting maps

Democrats in the New Mexico Legislature will soon have to choose between good government and good politics.

On the side of good government is the New Mexico

Citizen Redistricting Committee, a seven-member board which has been holding public meetings throughout the state to gather input from residents to guide the redrawing of political district maps, as required every 10 year after the census.

According to the group's website, its mission is to "propose district lines that are drawn fairly, through a transparent, open and participatory process," and to "develop maps that allow New Mexico voters to choose their

representatives, not the other way around."

That's a departure from past efforts, when ensuring that lawmakers' homes remained in their district was the

primary objective.

The committee was formed by legislation passed earlier this year. The original bill would have required the Legislature to accept one of three proposals for each new district without making changes. But it was amended during the committee process to give legislators the freedom to disregard the entire effort.

And that has opened the door for good politics.

The Center for Civic Policy and other progressive political groups are

proposing a new map for the state's 2nd Congressional District, now represented by Republican Yvette Herrell, according to a story in the Albuquerque Journal.

The plan would break up the area known as "Little Texas" into all three of the state's districts. Hobbs would be in the same district as Santa Fe, Carlsbad would be in the same district as the South Valley and Roswell would be in the same district as Albuquerque.

I haven't seen the actual map, but that's got to be some first-class gerrymandering.

The plan would move the South Valley and parts of Albuquerque's west side into our district, creating a new district that would be about 60 percent Hispanic.

New Mexico is the most heavily Hispanic state in the nation, and should have a congressional district with a strong Hispanic majority, argued Oriana Sandoval, CEO of the Center for Civic Policy.

Republicans in Little Texas have responded with howls of protest. With the exception of two terms, the GOP has held this seat ever since the death of Harold Runnels in 1980.

The 2nd Congressional District has now become the Republican Party's only source of power in the state. If they were to lose it, Democrats would have single-party control. But, GOP leaders would have only themselves to blame.

Republican attorneys argued for an end to laws

prohibiting partisan gerrymandering, and conservative justices agreed with them in the 5-4 Supreme Court ruling in 2019, all of which makes the map being proposed by the Center for Civic Policy perfectly legal.

And, it must be frustrating for Democrats in the state Legislature here who have watched Repub-

licans in other states use gerrymandering to their advantage. Two wrongs don't make a right, but in politics they do even things up.

Still, I suspect that good government will win out, as it should.

# Write-in candidate wants to bring critical thinking to council

“The city doesn’t use critical thinking,” said Las Cruces City Council District 3 write-in candidate Gregory Shervanick.

City leaders and staff need to fully consider all the impacts and implications of their decisions before those decisions are finalized, Shervanick said in an interview with the Bulletin. That’s true for a number of city projects in District 3, he said, and also in the city as a whole.

“Be really critical about the details of the project,” he said.

In a written document, Shervanick said his cam-

paign “is focused on several ideologies that are lacking when it comes to interaction and communication with the city’s administration from the top of the management chart to the departmental level.” Those ideologies include ethics, transparency, budget and accountability, he said.

Honest communication is also important, Shervanick said, so citizens know what they are expecting from the city

vs. what they are actually getting.

He said the city needs to develop “an educational program so every citizen could use the resources provided by the city’s excellent website and so they would always have up-to-date, real-time information concerning events, programs and projects.”

Shervanick has lived in Las Cruces for most of the past 50 years and has attended many city council meetings and other city and community meetings during the past five years. If elected to the city council, Shervanick said he would like to use the knowledge he has gained and the relationships he

has developed with city leaders during the thousands of hours he has spent at those meetings.

“It’s now time for me to invest my service back to the city,” Shervanick said. “I know a lot,” he said. “I don’t know everything. I’m learning every single day.”

Shervanick said he wants to support entrepreneurs and small-business owners and work with other councilors on affordable housing and childcare and other community development issues.

Shervanick is making his first bid for elective office. He said he is a write-in candidate because he wanted to take the time before filing to look carefully at the race and be certain he could make the

necessary time commitment to serve if elected.

If the issues Shervanick raises in the campaign “are of value to District 3 voters, they will take the extra time to write-in” his name, Shervanick said.

Shervanick was born in Las Cruces while both his parents were stationed at White Sands Proving Ground. He returned to Las Cruces to attend New Mexico State University, earning a degree in anthropology in 1980 while working as an entertainment rigger at both NMSU and UTEP.

Shervanick owned La Taza coffee bistro in Mesilla in the 1980s. After moving to Seattle for a few years, he returned to Las Cruces in 1988 and moved into the home he still occupies in District 3.

Shervanick is a long-time entrepreneur and has worked as a substitute teacher. He has done government and commercial archaeological surveying work in the region and has also worked in adobe renovation and construction. Shervanick now operates a firm called “Shervanick,” which does home rehabilitations and renovations and handles rental properties.

# NMSU ROTC: Training, service, and Bataan Memorial Death March

New Mexico State University was founded as Las Cruces College in 1888. Fourteen years later, during the 1902-03 school year, the college began the Department of Military Science and Tactics, which evolved into the NMSU "Desperado" Battalion.

In 1989, the Desperado Battalion was re-named to the "Bataan" Battalion "to recognize the contributions of New Mexico veterans during World War II in the Battle of Bataan, December 1941-May 1942," the Bataan Battalion said on Facebook.

The cadet class of 1988 held the first Bataan Memorial Death March in April 1988, as NMSU celebrated its 100th an-

niversary. The march route began on the NMSU horseshoe and traveled east to Baylor Canyon Pass in the Organ Mountains. The event was moved to White Sands Missile Range in 1989.

Today, Cavazos 1st Lt.

Saul Navarro, 25, is the recruiting operations officer for the NMSU ROTC program, which has 56 students enrolled and is a big proponent of and participant in the march. (The rank of "Cavazos first lieutenant" honors

U.S. Army Gen. Richard E. Cavazos (1929-2017), who was awarded a Distinguished Service Cross as a first lieutenant during the Korean War. He was the Army's first Hispanic

four-star general.)

A native of El Paso, Navarro said he first became interested in the military when he saw Army recruiters at his middle school. He joined JROTC while attending Bel Air High School in El Paso and decided to make a career of it more than three years ago.

"I could see myself doing it," Navarro said. Once he got the uniform on, Navarro decided, "I like this," he said. "I'll stick with it."

When his time at NMSU is up next May, Navarro will be promoted to the rank of captain and move on to his next duty station at Fort Sill, Oklahoma.

But that's not before Navarro participates in his eighth BMDM next March 20.

Because of its terrain

and high altitude, BMDM is among the most difficult marathons in the United States, Navarro said. He's looking forward to pushing the miles he's logged in the event since age 15 to more than 200. Navarro has also participated in marathons in Oklahoma City and in El Paso, he said.

As a recruiter, Navarro talks to area high-school students and other interested groups and organizations not only about the NMSU ROTC's Memorial Death March teams, but also about the many other life, scholarship and career opportunities offered by the program.

Navarro said any NMSU student can take the ROTC class for credit. Cadets learn basic military

Las Cruces ballot. He joins qualified candidates Becki Graham and Bev

Courtney on the District 3 ballot. Because there are more than two candidates in the race, it will be decided by ranked-choice voting.

Because Shervanick

is a write-in candidate, his name will not appear on the ballot with those of Graham and Courtney. But there will be a "proper line provided for a write-in vote for that

office and position (Las Cruces City Council District 3)." according to state statute.

If there is a question about the name of a declared write-in candidate

on a completed ballot, state statute says that "when the presiding judge and election judges reviewing the write-in vote unanimously agree that the voter's intent is

clearly discernable, an abbreviation, misspelling or other minor variation in the form of the name of a declared write-in candidate shall be accepted as a valid vote."

## Las Cruces Utilities: Build a Career, Build a Future

On October 6, 2021, the Las Cruces Home Builders Association's (LCHBA) Build My Future event allowed Las Cruces Public Schools (LCPS) high school students who may be interested in the trades that build their community from the ground up – or even deeper, by taking an experiential learning approach with their future. Las Cruces Utilities (LCU) was on hand to show students that infrastructure underground is also a career for consideration.

LCU Interim Deputy Director Ronald Borunda had two challenges for students at the booth. One: Building pipes that account for gravity to get water from a pitch of water – a small version of a tank – to a bucket, which would be how it shows up at a tap. If it leaks, points came off.

David Barela, Allen Wallace, and Joziah Navarrete, all juniors at Las Cruces High School, came together as a team to work through the challenges and

learn about internship opportunities.

“One person can't do everything alone,” reminded Borunda, who watched the students put together the second challenge, connecting two large pipes. Each student had a role, and each role was important.

“We want to educate students not only about what a job could look like for them but explain that there is a lot to know about how we work together

and set priorities for the work we do,” said Borunda. “For example, when I get calls about water leaks, I like to explain that we assign priorities as a hospital does. Some water leaks are emergencies like a car crash, and some are like a broken bone. We want to help those in the crash first and then help mend the bones. Similarly, we just have to focus our attention to the worse leak, but every leak is a priority to us.”

For water leaks, LCU assigns repairs based on levels of severity. Once LCU is alerted - either by the alert system or by a customer - a service staff member comes to the site to access the leak. The four levels are:

- Level 1 is an emergency event, for example, flowing water impeding traffic or a loss of water to large city sections.
  - Level 2 is a serious event that immediately affects the area but is not an immediate threat to safety.
  - Level 3 is a leak that looks like it needs investigating for a source that is likely not a mainline for the city.
  - Level 4 is judged as the most benign, such as a slow drip from a broken water meter. It receives attention in the order it is received after the three previous levels.
- If you see a leak, give Utilities Emergency Dispatch, available 24 hours a day, a call at (575) 526-0500.

## New Gas System Ready to Go at Corralitos Landfill

After two years of progress, South Central Solid Waste Authority (SCSWA) finally received the final piece to its new gas collection system, the motor and flare. The new gas collection system will now funnel in the methane gas from all ends of the Corralitos Landfill to be burned off three days a week for about three hours at a time.

“We continually monitor what the landfill puts out because as our trash decays, it can release gases,” said Patrick Peck, SCSWA director.

“And while it was just barely a blip over the limits in our readings – back in 2019 – once we tripped the limits that the EPA [Environmental Protection Agency] set, it forced us to work toward getting this system installed.”

With a cost of over \$2.5 million, most of the work needed to be done around the landfill itself. Thirty-five wells were dug into different areas of the landfill and then connected to piping that needed

to lead to the flare. Engines will suck the methane in, and it will go through filters to clear out impurities and moisture, and will then be burned off.

“The three percent increase that has come onto customers costs in Las Cruces ties into keeping our landfill from doing damage to the environment,” said Peck. “Not only were there the initial startup costs of the system, but we’ll need to hire an engineer to maintain the

system. And lastly, when the trash in an area of the landfill hits five years old, we’ll need to put in a new well in that area to feed into the system.”

“Unfortunately, these incremental additions to the system will need to happen in perpetuity,” he said. “The more we can recycle, reduce and reuse, and keep things out of the landfill, the longer we can hold off on increases to the gas collection system.”

## City to apply for certification to boost historic preservation

The Las Cruces City Council expressed its support for the city’s application to become the 10th local government in New Mexico to join the National Park Service’s (NPS) Certified Local Government (CLG) Program to encourage local historic preservation efforts and help fund them.

At the city council’s Oct. 11 work session, Mayor Ken Miyagishima said he would support the city’s application for CLG certification, which will be forwarded to the New Mexico Department of Cultural Affairs’ Historic Preservation Division (HPD) for approval.

Becoming a CLG “makes historic preservation a matter of public policy and is duly recognized by HPD and the U.S. Department of the Interior (DOI), which certifies their qualifications,” said

city Historic Preservation Specialist Troy M. Ainsworth, Ph.D.

CLG status “provides benefits to local governments in the form of funding opportunities, technical assistance, and participation in the nomination process for listings in the National Register of Historic Places,” Ainsworth said.

DOI “allocates funding to all states and territories to conduct historic preservation projects,” he said, and each “dedicates 10 percent of its annual allotment specifically to CLG grant opportunities.”

With a successful CLG application, the City of Las Cruces could apply for a portion of those funds. Projects eligible for CLG grants include: bricks-and-mortar restoration projects; heritage tourism programs, including walking tours; and public outreach components, such as webpages, Ainsworth said.

He said the city already meets all the qualifications to become a CLG, including enforcing state statutes and local ordinances for the designation and protection of historic properties, having a city Historic Preservation Commission, maintaining a system to survey and inventory historic properties and providing public participation in local historic preservation efforts.

There are currently 46 National Historic Landmarks (NHL) in New Mexico, but none in Las Cruces, Ainsworth said. There are two NHLs in Doña Ana County: Mesilla Plaza and the V-2 Rocket Launch Site at White Sands Missile Range.

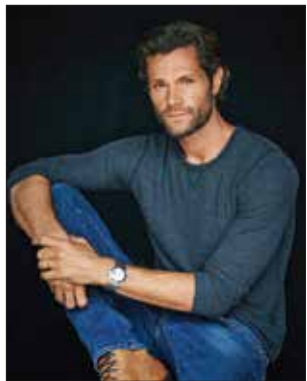

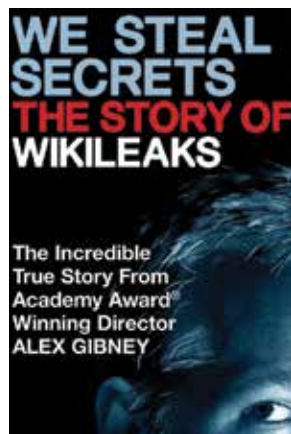

## movie review

### Some notable names return to ‘Zombieland’

If there was going to be a sequel to “Zombieland” 10 years later, the Halloween period certainly was the season for it.

Though 2019’s “Zombieland: Double Tap” (which FX presents Thursday, Oct. 28) has a definite feel of “been there, done that” – not only thanks to its own forerunner, but also to numerous other tales of survivors fighting the undead – there’s still fun in seeing such “A-list” stars as Oscar winner Emma Stone and Jesse Eisenberg being willing to return to the genre, considering how much else they accomplished in vastly different kinds of projects after the first “Zombieland.”

Along with fellow returnees Woody Harrelson and Abigail Breslin, their characters’ situation remains just what it was. They’re certainly more experienced in vanquishing zombies, but they’re still crossing a ravaged America after finding temporary shelter in (of all places) the White House.

As they take their quest back on the road, they encounter characters played Rosario Dawson and Zoey Deutch. The daughter of actress Lea Thompson and filmmaker Howard Deutch (“Pretty in Pink”), Deutch is especially good here, getting plenty of mileage out of applying what she’s established as her offbeat sensibility to the now-quite-familiar scenario of a zombie invasion.

Still, that’s not to dismiss others whose connection to “Zombieland” franchise has been long established. After her notable turns in “La La Land” (which brought her an Academy Award) and “The Favourite,” to name just two, Stone is marvelously game to play tough again as she takes on otherworldly opponents once more.

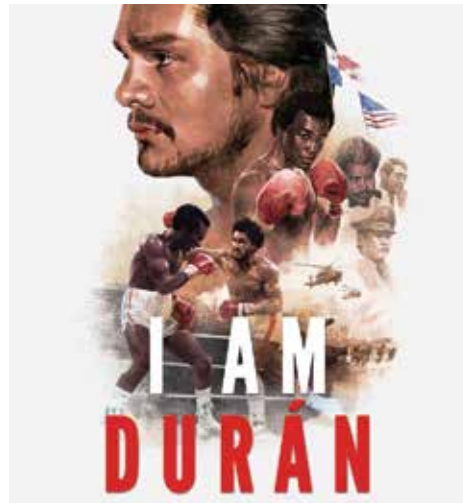

## Museum mural includes students', community members' art

*Editor's note: A new mural greets visitors as they enter the north door of the Las Cruces Museum of Art, 491 N. Main St. Downtown. The mural was created by Las Cruces artist Coy Lowther, who made small discs so students and community members could add their own original art pieces to the project.*

I cut out more than 200 round discs for community members to decorate to include with the mural. The backboard I used to cut the discs from ended up being the eye of the Gila monster, which was my husband's idea and one of my favorite details.

As a new parent and traversing through the rocky world we've all been dealing with the past few years, I felt the need to reconnect with our community. Although my

original idea was to have Las Cruces Public Schools students decorate the individual discs in hope that they would form a special connection with the museum and art, I'd estimate 40 to 50 K-12 school students still participated.

But seeing the teachers' devotion to their students through an extra-trying

semester triggered my idea to evolve into incorporating a larger portion of our community; the idea that the inspired can't exist without the inspiring. So, I personally reached out to people who inspire me (teachers, social workers, firefighters, farmers, nurses, artists, etc.) and let them know

how they have affected the world in a wonderful way.

I then asked them to decorate a disc depicting what inspires them or what they love about Las Cruces and also asked some people to share discs to be decorated by people they found inspiring, sort of as an icebreaker to start a chain reaction

of connecting through kind and positive gestures and ultimately end in an inspiring community collaboration. So, I think the title of community mural or community art piece is appropriate.

I don't know how successful I was in the positive chain reaction, because it was out of my hands at that point. People picked up and dropped off their finished pieces at The Frame and Art Center and I later assembled them. In hindsight, I wish each person would have signed the front of their artwork and I could have individually talked to everyone, but with Covid and a deadline, it was impossible.

What I do know is, I was overjoyed with the community output. There are so many beautiful and interesting discs that tell different stories, and all together it gave me an even greater appreciation

for our community. I am so very grateful for the opportunity.

One area of the mural encircles the discs people used as memorial pieces with flowers and butterflies, with the three crosses in the background which pays homage to those who paved the way before us.

Another area of interest in the mural is the placement of a fourth-grader's disc who drew a hero disc next to the Doña Ana firefighters and also state Sen. Carrie Hamblen's disc next to a high schooler and elementary schoolers' pride discs. I hoped kids would make the connection with people in inspiring positions in their own community.

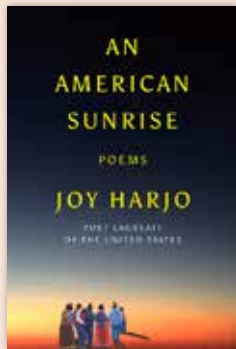

# A'mazing: Animals, two mazes and plenty of fun in La Union

In the town of La Union between Las Cruces and El Paso, 1101 Highway 28, Lucy Sondgeroth and her husband Robert have been running a corn maze and adding attractions for 21 years.

A fall season borderland tradition for many families, folks can enjoy not only the 13-acre maze, pumpkin patch and jumping pillow but also the 20 other attractions to choose from.

There are two mazes to choose from, one short and easy and the other quite a bit more challenging. Since the site is open weekends until 10 p.m., you can take a flashlight and wander the mazes at

night for an additional challenge.

"We try to make the maze relevant to what's going on in the world," Sondgeroth said. "We put farming into it. This year we put some sunflowers

and a tribute to health workers."

Visitors can usually find Sondgeroth at the concessions stand, selling tokens for treats like corn cobs and brisket sandwiches as well as snacks

and drinks.

"We have been pretty busy," she said. "It has been a great challenge this year. It's hard to get people to come to work these days."

The site is open for schools to schedule field trips during the week, but reservations are a bit harder to get this year. Last year, the farm was completely shut down except for pumpkin sales.

"We capped the schools this year because we didn't want to have more than a certain number," she said. "We need to ease into it."

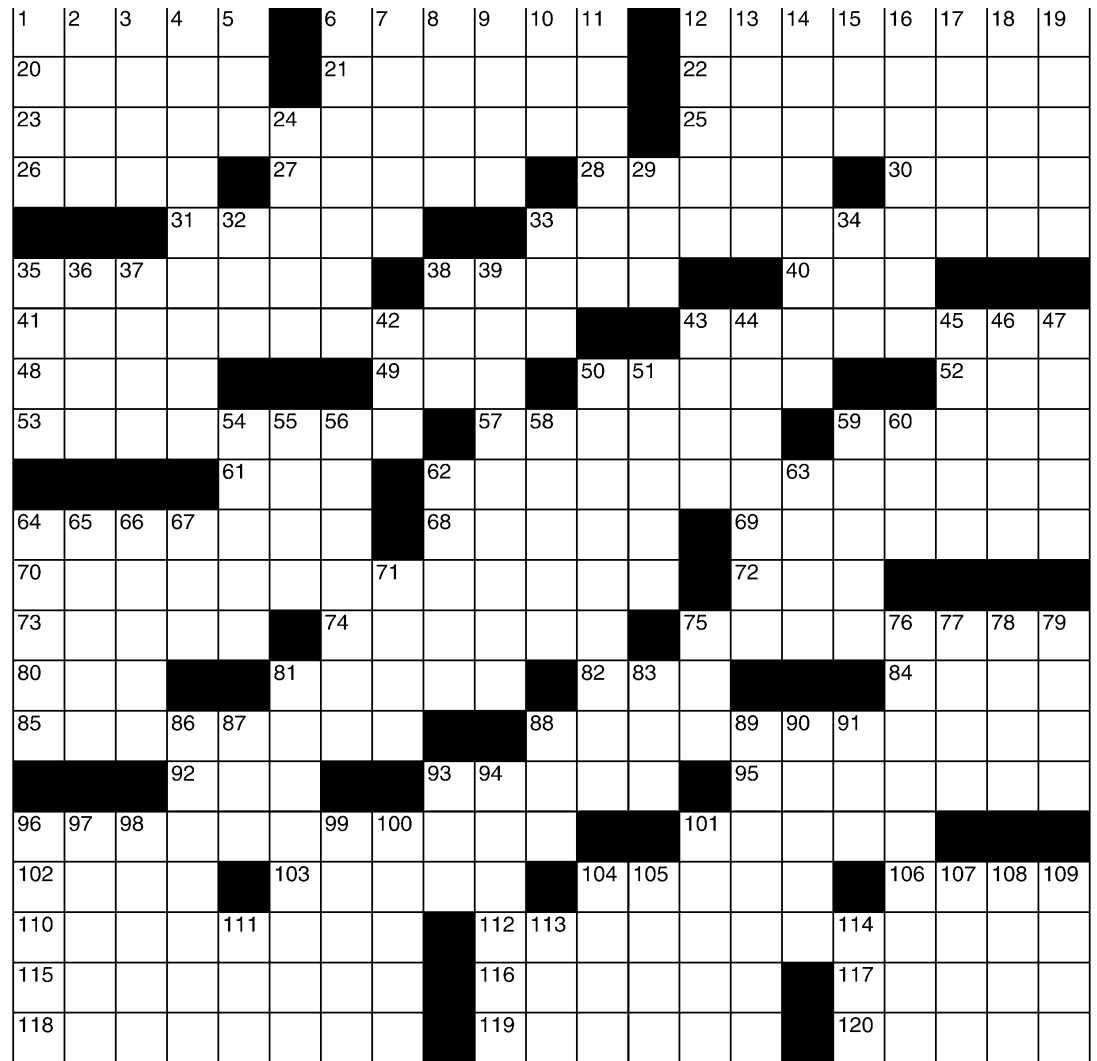

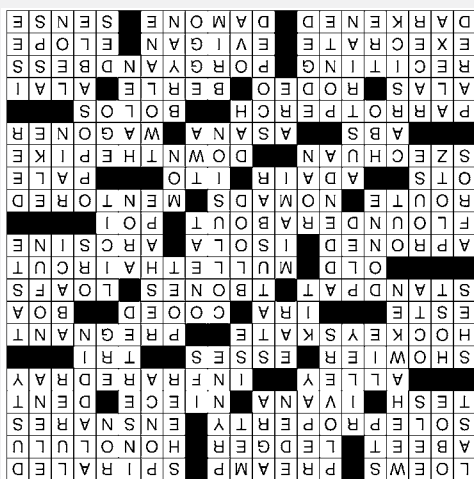

## Santa Teresa port, industrial parks create \$1.1B in impact

### FROM NMSU AND BULLETIN SOURCES

A New Mexico State University study shows that the Santa Teresa port of entry (POE) and Santa Teresa industrial parks were responsible for nearly 6,000 jobs in 2020 and more than \$1 billion in total output.

The study, which was done by NMSU's Arrowhead Center and the Center for Border Economic Development (C-BED), found that employment and construction activities at Santa Teresa POE and four Santa Teresa industrial parks produced the following impacts in 2020:

- 3,262 direct jobs and 5,849 total jobs.
- \$1.1 billion in total output, with \$411 million in value-added production.
- More than \$90 million in taxes generated, \$57 million in federal taxes,

\$26 million in taxes paid in New Mexico and \$8 million in taxes paid in Texas.

- \$24 billion in international trade was facilitated, and it grew at a 5.8 percent compound annual growth rate 2010-2020.

- About 80 percent of the economic benefits of Santa Teresa accrue in New Mexico, with the remainder in Texas.

"The Border Industrial Association (BIA) commissioned C-BED, as its very first project, to do the Santa Teresa economic impact study, which is the first of its kind," BIA President Jerry Pacheco told the Bulletin. "The Santa Teresa industrial base is growing rapidly and helping to diversify New Mexico's economy."

The study shows the billions of dollars year-after-year that Santa Teresa is contributing to the state's economy and the thousands of good-paying jobs that have been created here."

"Economic development is vital for the state of New Mexico, and it's at the forefront of our efforts at NMSU," NMSU Chancellor Dan Arvizu said. "This report gives us a much better understand-

ing of how vital Santa Teresa is for our state as well as our region."

"It was of critical importance that the impact of the Santa Teresa region be quantified to highlight the key role the region is playing in the state's economy," said NMSU C-BED research fellow Lucinda Vargas. "The region is now the source of the majority of the state of New Mexico's exports, at 58 percent of the total."

"This study gives clear data on how Santa Teresa benefits New Mexico," Arrowhead Center Director and CEO Kathryn Hansen said. "By having the concrete data, we can now better work our local businesses to be a part of this growth and bring in even more industry that can see that we are part of a growing international hub."

"The Santa Teresa industrial park(s) is a major source of jobs for New Mexico, responsible for the creation of 5,800 jobs, most in Doña Ana County," said NMSU economics professor Chris Erickson, Ph.D.

"The jobs created by the industrial park(s) are good jobs, with an average pay of about \$23 an hour in wages and benefits," Erickson added.

# Topsy-turvy real-estate prices can provide lessons for the savvy

As with many things, Covid has turned the real-estate market topsy-turvy. Rather than the more typical fall in housing prices in a recession, this time prices are up. Here in Las Cruces, for example, the August median home price increased by 27 percent compared to a year previous.

Analysts have given several reasons for this, from city folk fleeing pestilence-infected urban centers to reluctance to having virus-laden potential buyers tramping through otherwise sanitary homes. Regardless of the reason, it is the strength in the real-estate market that have motivated

many economists to predict a rapid recovery.

While real estate is the hero in the current recovery, at other times, it has played a less beneficial role. In the 1990s, the collapse in Thai prop-

erty values triggered the Asian Currency Crisis. Closer to home, the Great Recession was caused by the collapse of residential housing, ultimately resulting in a financial panic. Given for this: It is not surprising that a vast literature on housing has emerged. Recently, a consensus has begun to form on how housing markets work.

First, the slow adjustment of housing supply to changes in demand means

that real-estate prices are very persistent. There is considerable momentum; housing bubbles are common. And importantly, we can use this price momentum to predict what will happen. Price rises last year can predict price increases next year. A clever real-estate investor can craft a strategy that can generate extra profits. This is in contrast to stock and bond markets where even predicting tomorrow's prices is very difficult.

A second lesson: Rents are not a good predictor of housing prices. The thought would be that higher rents makes owning a home more valuable. The owner can live in the home so as to escape high rents. Alternatively, the owner could rent the

house to others thereby benefiting from the high rents. Either way, higher rents make home ownership more valuable, so you would expect higher prices. But this is not what we find.

The reason for this is the slow adjustment of rents compared to housing prices. Rents are set by leases that last months or even years. Add to this the reluctance to raise rents on incumbent tenants and you can see that rents only slowly adjust to reflect higher prices.

A third lesson is: Credit conditions are key to understanding housing prices. Any inflow of credit makes it possible for marginal buyers to purchase homes driving up demand. And given the slow adjustment of

housing supplies, this means higher prices. The housing bubble of the mid-2000s was driven by credit inflows. Similarly, the rising prices during the pandemic was pushed by stimulus checks.

Finally, spatial differences in prices are explained by differences in the responsiveness of housing supply. Locales like Las Cruces with a great deal of empty land on which to build homes have more stable housing prices and are less subject

to housing bubbles. Locales like southern California with a shortage of developable land and with strict zoning laws that restrict construction are much more likely to have housing bubbles.

Manager Pete Jimenez, Community Engagement Manager Stacie Allen and Tresco board member Bill Bornhauser, along with Tresco employees Lydia Hernandez and Les Clary.

Tresco partners with federal, state and local employers to provide jobs to more than 230 full- and part-time individuals with a variety of disabilities.

Clary, for example, is a repair technician working for the New Mexico Department of Transportation doing maintenance, repair and upkeep on nine highway rest areas. He has a knee injury sustained during his U.S. military service.

Working for Tresco means "finding a job that allows you self-respect," Clary said.

Jackson said he learned about Tresco while working at White Sands Missile Range.

"When I started my business (American Document Services), that's the first place I went," he said.

"It's the best experience I've ever had. You talk about somebody dedicated," Jackson said about his Tresco employees.

Boston also recognized Lydia Hernandez at the breakfast.

Hernandez is lead custodian at the U.S. District Court building in Las Cruces.

She represented Tresco as one of 50 self-advocates selected from across the

country to participate in the annual national SourceAmerica Grassroots Advocacy Conference in April.

Ramos said LCPS is looking forward to working with Tresco in a pilot apprenticeship program that was scheduled to

begin in 2020 but was interrupted by the pandemic.

When hiring, Boston encouraged local employers to "think of people with disabilities too. We won't disappoint," he said.

His selection was initially announced in 2019 and he was scheduled to be honored in March 2020 during the state basketball tournament.

But the celebration was put on hold for more than a year because of the Covid-19 pandemic.

Viramontes also has coached track, football and basketball at the middle-school and high-school levels for LCPS.

A native of Deming, Viramontes was a two-year letter winner in football and basketball when he was a student at Deming High School. He was all-district and all-state in football and all-district in basketball.

Following high school, Viramontes attended New Mexico State University, where he earned a bachelor's degree in physical

education with a minor in math and a master's degree in bilingual education.

He began his career as a P.E. teacher at Central and Fairacres elementary schools in 1984 before moving to Picacho Middle School in 1987, serving as a P.E. teacher there as well.

He spent six years at Picacho Middle School before going to Sierra Middle School, where he worked as a school counselor and assistant principal. In 1999, he moved to Las Cruces High School and served as an assistant principal and academic dean.

Starting in 2004, he moved to the district office where he first served as assistant athletics director for two years before becoming the district athletics director in 2006, a position he still holds today.

During his time as district AD, he has been instrumental in several facilities improvement projects including the addition of the Field of Dreams baseball and softball complexes and the turf on the Field of Dreams football field.
