A tough nut to crack: NMSU leads effort to map pecan genome

You might say New Mexico State University faculty Ph.Ds. Richard Heerema and Jennifer Randall are bringing pecans out of their shells.

Heerema, an NMSU Cooperative Extension Service pecan specialist, and Randall, a plant molecular biologist and plant pathologist in the NMSU Department of Entomology, Plant Pathology and Weed Science, are studying the pecan genome to develop pecan trees with the right genetics for specific climates, including the Southwest.

The ultimate goal of mapping a complete set of all genetic instructions (the genome) for the pecan is “more profitable and

efficient orchards,” said Heerema, who has a Ph.D. in plant biology and is one

of only a handful of pecan specialists in the United States. NMSU wants to

help pecan growers “do what they do and do it well,” he said.

“The broad genetic diversity available in specialty crops (including pecans) will be crucial when adapting cultivars (varieties) to new or changing pests, environmental conditions and consumer demands,” Randall wrote in an article published last June in the journal “Nature Communications.” Randall is director of NMSU’s Molecular Biology Graduate Program and principal investigator of a U.S. Department of Agriculture grant that is helping fund NMSU’s pecan research. She has a Ph.D. in molecular biology.

Pecans are a major nut crop consumed around the world, Heerema said,

and the only nut tree native to North America. Even though they are not indigenous to New Mexico, “they are very, very well adapted to New Mexico’s environment,” he said.

The state is today second only to Georgia in commercial pecan production. Doña Ana County, which produces 70 percent of New Mexico’s pecan crop, is the single largest pecan-producing county in the United States. The versatile and beloved pecan has become not only a staple of the local diet; its orchards, producers — and genetics — are icons of the culture and a major attraction to visitors.

Heerema said NMSU has become a repository for pecan seeds and trees

from throughout the region where pecans grow naturally, which stretches from central Mexico to northern Illinois, including parts of eastern Texas and Oklahoma.

NMSU is working with collaborators across the country to discover where a pecan’s most desirable traits are coded for in its genes, Heerema and Randall said.

“Modern pecan breeding has made some significant strides by selecting for genotypes with larger nut size, higher nut quality and tree tolerances of abiotic (living) and biotic (non-living) stresses,” Randall wrote in Nature Communications. Stresses include disease, pests, heat, high elevation, arid-

ity and high salinity levels in water and soil.

Scientists are also targeting the size of pecan trees in their breeding research so growers can plant more trees per acre, Randall said. And they are testing new irrigation methods to ensure that

pecan trees "receive the right amount of water at the right time," Heerema said.

NMSU is also studying yield to determine why trees produce a large crop of pecans one year and a smaller crop the next, and why trees bud earlier in Mexico and leaf out later the farther north you go, Heerema said.

In fact, it was work on

finding the gene the controls when pecan trees flower that brought Heerema and Randall together in 2009.

Randall has eight students working on the pecan genome project in her pecan lab at NMSU and in the field, grafting parts of one genetically different pecan tree onto another, studying rootstock, soil and water

issues and examining the pecans themselves, since each nut has its own unique DNA.

"She brought these people from all over the country to get this genome done," Heerema said.

"I'm so blessed with the students and collaborators that I have," Randall said. "We are building on the foundation of the science that came before us."

New Mexico's pecan pioneers include NMSU horticulturalist and national agriculture hall of fame member Fabian Garcia, who planted some of New Mexico's first pecan trees in the Mesilla Valley in 1913.

Many of the trees he planted in 1915 continue to thrive and produce, and are visible from University Avenue at the Fabian

Garcia Science Center, where work is continuing to discover the secrets of the pecan.

"We never know everything," Randall said. "There's so much more to learn."

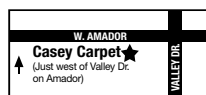

Recently, I had a conversation with a Bulletin customer who said, "I don't do email. I don't do texting. I still have a flip phone. I'm a dinosaur."

He expected me to be aghast but, actually, I was amazed. How does one participate in America in 2021 when you're technologically detached?

You can't even buy tickets to a baseball game without downloading an app to your phone. The last Major League game I went to, I nearly couldn't get a ticket even with the app.

State government is rolling in the dough, but needs to plan ahead

New Mexico has the third-highest poverty rate in the nation, ahead of only Mississippi and Louisiana, according to the state Department of Workforce Solutions.

But, while families throughout the state are struggling, the state government is more than flush.

The latest revenue estimate for the state projects that lawmakers will have an additional \$1.6 billion to spend when they meet in January for a 30-day budget session.

That's money in addition to the \$7.4 billion in this year's budget. And, that budget did not include billions of dol-

lars in federal relief funding, which the state Supreme Court has said must now be allocated by the Legislature, and not by Gov. Michelle Lujan

Grisham.

Much of the increase is due to rising oil and gas prices. Pain at the pump for New Mexico drivers is always a good thing for the bean counters in Santa Fe.

Revenue from both gross receipts taxes and income taxes were also higher than expected, reflecting a hike in both spending and wages.

That allowed the state to increase its reserves balances (unspent money) in the state

budget to a healthy 35 percent, triggering the release of additional funds into the newly created early childhood trust fund and for state schools.

New Mexico legislators are quite familiar with the boom-and-bust cycles that come with a state economy that is so dependent on the volatile oil and gas industry.

This year's boom has been magnified by a massive infusion of federal revenue. But, much of that was one-time money that has already been spent, not recurring funds.

The urgency for our state to diversify its economy grows greater with each passing year, as climate change continues to deplete pre-

cious water resources throughout the West, not to mention its devastating impacts around the world.

We have tied our children's education to an industry that must be replaced soon.

Passage of marijuana legalization this year will help diversify our economy when stores open for the first time in April. But much more needs to be done.

Thus far, Gov. Lujan Grisham has proposed a modest decrease to gross receipts taxes and a pay increase for teachers. That's nice, but it's a far cry from the transformative plan that our state so desperately needs.

The Legislature has been riding these boom-

and-bust cycles for so long that they have come to think of them as a natural part of the budgeting process — stick a bunch of money in reserves, start a new fund dedicated to this problem or that and then brace for the inevitable downturn. But even during the boom times for the state, families continue to suffer.

And, the booms won't continue. For the sake of our planet, they can't continue. Lawmakers need to start thinking like this one may be the last.

We've been nibbling at the edges with things like increased funding for job training or to recruit new business to move to the state.

Those are fine, but we

have the funding this year to do something much bigger, something that would transform and stabilize our economy moving forward.

I don't know what that will be, but I do know there needs to be much more urgency in our search.

This may be the last boom of this size, and the last chance lawmakers will have with this much revenue heading into a session to make transformational changes.

We can see the train coming. We need to figure out how to get off the tracks.

Community of Hope thanks community

The Mesilla Valley Community of Hope (MVCH) Board of Directors, staff and volunteers would like to express our gratitude to everyone that helped make the 5th annual Tents to Rents fundraising campaign such a success this

year. Thanks to our sponsors, participants and all the other wonderful people that contributed, we raised a total of \$76,702! Guardianship continues to be problem issue

Despite the New Mexico judiciary and The Developmental Disabilities-Office of Guardianship report to the N.M. Legislative Health and Human Services Interim Committee, the guardianship system in New Mexico continues to be in crisis.

The Guardianship Law, 45-5-101 through 45-5-617, was established to protect and preserve the

well-being and assets of the incapacitated person. However, this is not what is happening in The Land of Enchantment.

The individuals who control the outcome of the guardianship case are the petitioning attorney and the district judge. The judge grants the power to the appointed guardian and conservator who control every aspect of the "protected person's" life.

In order for true guardianship reform to occur,

district judges must appoint guardians and conservators who understand, respect and advocate for the wishes and "best interest" of the protected person. This is exactly why family members and guardianship advocate groups must be recognized as "equal partners" at the decision-making table. We are "the boots on the ground." A corporate guardian and conservator are complete strangers and have no prior personal

involvement or interest in the "protected person".

Our state leaders (New Mexico legislators, New Mexico cabinet secretaries, our New Mexico attorney general and our governor) must address these injustices to guarantee that our most vulnerable population's human rights, civil rights and protection of their financial assets are truly protected.

The Informal New Mexico Family Guardianship/Conservatorship Coalition

is a coalition of grassroots efforts and local New Mexicans, national groups and organizations working towards building awareness of injustices in the New Mexico Guardianship System that currently governs court-appointed corporate guardians, guardians ad litem or GALs, conservators and other court-appointed designees over vulnerable individuals and their families.

With friends, admirers and fellow volunteers looking on, Pollard received the Gerald H. Dea-

bel Legacy Volunteer of the Year award from Deabel Foundation President Don Beasley for her long-time service to Mesilla Valley Hospice (MVH) and many other Las Cruces nonprofits and causes.

In addition to the award itself, Pollard also received a \$20,000 check from the Gerald H. Deabel endowment, which she said she and husband

Warren would quickly reinvest in the community.

"I believe Heather is the epitome of what Gerald Deabel envisioned for outstanding volunteerism when he created this award, not only because of all she's done for Mesilla Valley Hospice but because of all she's done for this community as a whole," MVH CEO Nina Salmon said. "She has

given so much to our community."

Pollard spearheaded a major capital campaign for MVH in 2014, and in 2015 helped found The Emporium, a Las Cruces gift and antique store. One-hundred percent of The Emporium's profits benefit MVH, and Pollard is one of about a dozen Las Cruces women who volunteer their time to

run it.

She also was instrumental in creating La Casa, Inc. domestic violence program, the Downtown Las Cruces Partnership, the Doña Ana Arts Council and La Piñon of South-

ern New Mexico sexual assault recovery services, among other programs.

The Deabel Legacy Society was founded in 2003 by Gerald H. Deabel (1934-

A \$20,000 grant from the Educational Credit Management Corporation Foundation (ECMC) will help several New Mexico State University departments support students, faculty and staff needs.

Aggie Cupboard, which is an on-campus service department within the Aggie Health and Well-

ness Center that provides students, faculty and staff free supplementary food assistance, is one of the

grant recipients.

“Over the last 18 months during the Covid-19 pandemic, our personal care items have been hit the hardest in trying to keep up with the demand,” said Aggie Health and Wellness Center interim executive director Amanda Blair. “Currently we do not purchase any personal care items, and these are provided purely off donations. We see an extreme need to expand

this area at our pantry as we often run out or have nothing to provide.”

With grant funds, Aggie Cupboard will focus on new initiatives and expanding current services. For the first time, Aggie Cupboard will purchase toiletries items such as toothbrushes, toothpaste, diapers, deodorant and feminine hygiene products. An additional way to help students overcome barriers is to aid them

where they are, and Aggie Cupboard has extended its reach on campus. Program Specialist Amanda Nuñez has established campus partnerships with organizations such as the American Indian Programs, Black Programs, Chicano Programs and the Burrell College of Osteopathic Medicine.

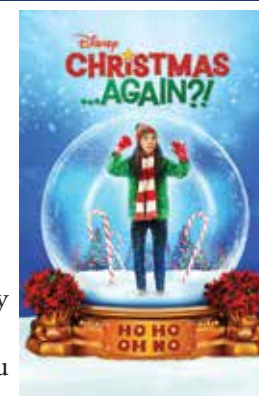

movie review

'Love Actually' actually remains a holiday favorite

Many holiday-movie classics date back a lot of years, but "Love Actually" is one of relatively recent vintage.

Writer-director Richard Curtis' many-charactered, multi-plotted, enormously entertaining 2003 comedy-drama — which Freeform shows Tuesday, Dec. 14, and Saturday, Dec. 18 — has Christmas baked right into its plot, opening several weeks before the yuletide in England. Its major figures connect in a "Six Degrees" sort of way, though in certain cases, it takes getting through the whole movie to know just how.

Among them: the newly elected prime minister (Hugh Grant), who does all he can to resist his foul-mouthed but engaging personal aide (Martine McCutcheon); his sister (Emma Thompson), who counsels a new-widower friend (Liam Neeson) while having doubts about her husband's (Alan Rickman) fidelity; and one of the husband's employees (Laura Linney), who has a crush on a co-worker (Rodrigo Santoro) that's obvious to everyone else at the office.

But wait! There's more! To wit: the widower's young stepson (Thomas Sangster), who's nursing his own crush on a classmate (Olivia Olson ... and wait until you hear her cut loose on "All I Want for Christmas Is You" in a school talent show); a writer (Colin Firth) who becomes attracted to his housekeeper (Lucia Moniz) while isolating for work; two actors in a porn movie (Martin Freeman, Joanna Page); a groom's (Chiwetel Ejiofor) best friend (Andrew Lincoln), who secretly pines for the bride (Keira Knightley); and mildly self-delusional Colin (Kris Marshall), who leaves the U.K. for America, intending to captivate its female population.

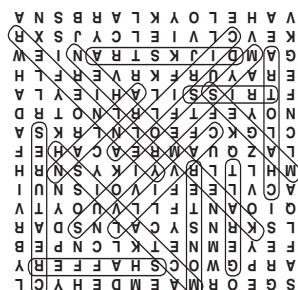

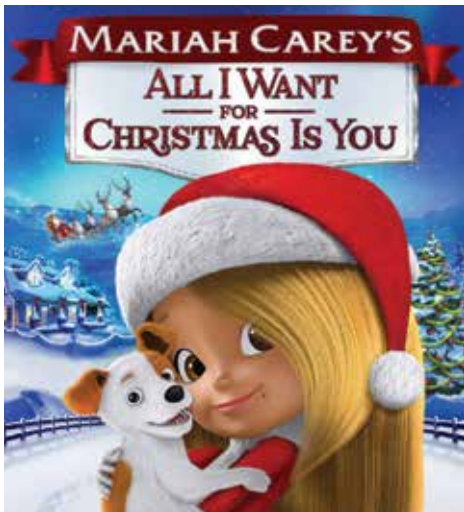

Academy of Music and Dance ends 27-year run with final show

After 27 years, thousands of music and dance classes and hundreds of performances, Leslie Kowalski is closing the doors of the Academy of Music & Dance (AMAD) of Las Cruces forever in December.

When she moved to Las Cruces with two 4-year-old twins in 1994, Kowalski started “Musical Beginnings” (which became AMAD) with a goal of “bringing Kindermusik and the arts to young families,” she said.

Kowalski also wanted to deliver the brain-building benefits of music, singing and dancing to as many young children as possible, Kowalski said, beginning before their first birthdays.

“The beat, the beat, the beat; that’s all you need at that age,” she said.

Moving, singing along and putting their small hands on pianos, violins, guitars and other instruments for the first time also was a spark for many toddlers that blossomed

into participation in school bands and choirs and a lifelong love of music that many have passed on to their own kids, Kowalski said.

She still gets called “Miss Leslie” by many former students, now in their 30s, and by their parents, now in their 50s, Kowalski said.

Kowalski reached out to

NASA parents and college professors when AMAD opened, and remembers hearing stories about parents singing parts of Kindermusik songs to each other as they passed in the hallways at NASA.

Parents discovered that songs could also help to set a child’s routine at home, she said, including things like brushing teeth,

getting ready for bed and getting dressed in the morning.

“I had a song for everything,” Kowalski said.

Kowalski changed the name of her program from Musical Beginnings to Academy of Music & Dance in 2011 when she built a dance floor and began offering dance classes.

“We’re going to go out with a bang,” said Leslie Kowalski, founder and owner of Academy of Music & Dance (AMAD), which will have its final performance ever later this month.

Kowalski is inviting all former AMAD and Musical Beginnings students and parents to attend the show.

She operated an arts preschool, ABC Academy from 2008 until the pandemic forced it to close in March 2020.

“It was the only school of its kind in town, modeled after schools in Oregon and Texas, and many parents moving to Cruces from other parts of the country who were familiar with this type of school were our biggest supporters,” Kowalski said.

“It’s been a great run,” she said.

Kowalski will continue to teach music at Mesilla Elementary School and to sing with Las Cruces’

“Oldies But Goodies” Doo Wop band. She also plans to participate in the Masterworks Choir that is returning to New Mexico State University, Kowalski said.

AMAD has been located at First Christian Church, 1809 El Paseo Road, for the last decade, and Kowalski said one of AMAD’s teachers, Rachel Butzke, will continue to oversee private music lessons there.

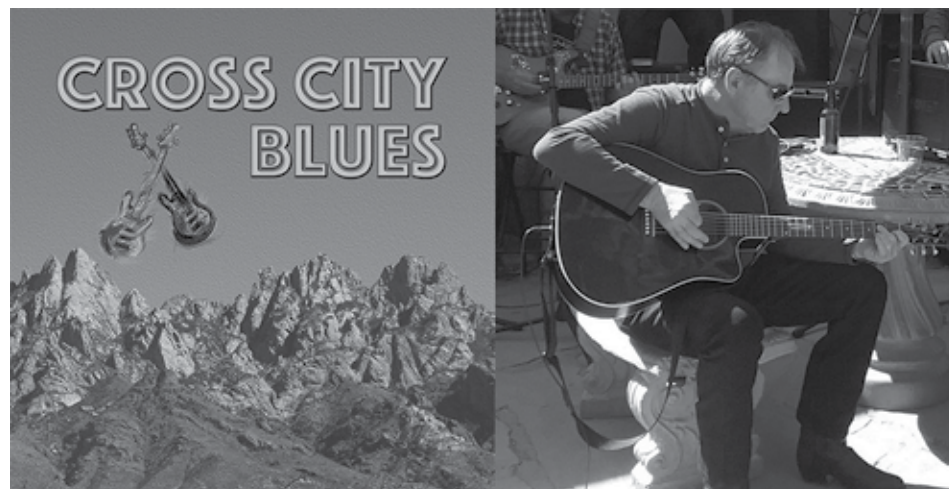

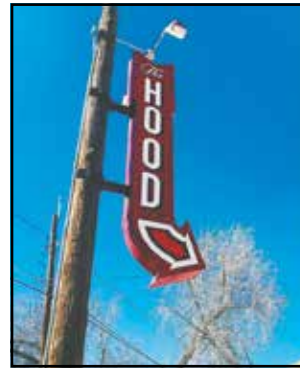

Plan ahead, prioritize to keep mental health intact during holidays

I can always tell when holiday season begins for me because my thoughts become a tangle of blinking-colored lights. End-of-year tasks and holiday obligations, real and imagined, put a strain on the brain that require organizational skills that only the frontal lobe can provide. The frontal lobe of the brain is responsible for the executive functions that help us get things done. This is the part of the brain responsible for setting goals, managing time, paying attention, switching focus remem-

bering details, planning and organizing. We rely on these skills our whole lives. Our children are developing their skills as they pick up cues from us. Here are a few tips to get yourself through the month coupled with some best practices for helping your child develop the resilience they will need to develop positive behavior, healthy choices and academic success.

Plan

Ask yourself two questions. What do I have to

accomplish in December? What do I want to do? On a piece of paper jot down all these activities. Now, prioritize items in a list. Focus on the top ones and erase the rest.

Children learn to plan and stay focused during make-believe play. Provide materials for them to create props for a pretend restaurant, spaceship, trek into the jungle.

Sequence

Create three columns labeled First, Next, Last. Start with the job that needs to be completed first. Think your way through and jot down in order the steps you must

take.

Children are calmer if they know what to expect each day. Add a little preview of the events of the day to your child's morning routine.

Children love to hear stories and tell stories. Sequencing skills are built through storytelling. Help them retell their favorites using words like: first, in the beginning, next, then, later, finally, at the end. By telling their stories, children develop working memory by holding information mentally and putting thoughts in order.

Reflect

Look at each item on

your list. What emotion arises when you think about doing that job. Consider again which emotionally charged tasks you need to do, what will help you to get yourself ready, and when will be the best time.

Children need your undivided attention at the end of the day to process what has happened during their day and express how they feel about it. Children need help naming their emotions. This quiet nighttime conversation should be a cozy moment of reassurance. Really listening to your child will take less time and energy than dealing

with a meltdown later.

Self-management

We all talk to ourselves. It's the tone that we take that matters! Make sure you are being kind to yourself especially when feeling tired or facing a challenge. If you tend to blame and berate yourself, then it is time to reframe the conversation!

Start early with babies and toddlers to encourage positivity. Confidence and perseverance grow from encouragement and reasonable expectations. By modeling your own self-talk — "I'm still learn-

Safe Haven Animal Sanctuary celebrates a milestone anniversary

In 1996, a group of dedicated animal lovers came together with a dream of creating a no-kill, non-profit organization that would help spare the lives of homeless animals in the Las Cruces area.

With a small group of volunteers, loads of donated goods and lots of elbow grease and sweat, their dream became a reality in the East Mesa desert of Las Cruces. And so, 25 years ago, Safe Haven Animal Sanctuary was born.

Safe Haven is a no-kill 501(c)(3) nonprofit animal rescue and adoption cen-

ter for homeless cats and dogs in the Las Cruces area.

Safe Haven also operates a thrift store located at 840 El Paseo Road. The income raised through thrift store sales is the main source of funding for the organization and is used to provide care for the animals residing at the sanctuary as they await adoption. Safe Haven currently operates its thrift store and sanctuary utilizing five full-time employees and eight part-time employees.

I have been at the helm of the organization for six years. When asked what I consider to be our greatest achievement, my response is, "Being able to offer low-cost spay/neuter clinics to the pet owners of our community is what I

am most proud of for Safe Haven."

The rescue work we do at Safe Haven offers at-risk pets the chance at a better life, which is amazing and very rewarding. But the truth is, we get more requests for pet surrenders than we do for pet adoptions. Our sanctuary is limited by space, so we cannot help them all.

Looking forward, getting to the root of the problem is the key if things are ever going to change.

The community problem at hand is pet overpopulation. The solution is easily attainable and affordable spay/neuter options for our area pet owners.

Safe Haven first sponsored and staffed a low-cost spay/neuter clinic

in 2016. Since 2018, Safe Haven has been offering its own Snip Snip Hooray! low-cost spay/neuter clinics to area pet owners. These clinics include the options of vaccinations and microchipping with the purchase of a spay or neuter. The latest clinic held this past September was a three-day clinic in which 177 cats and dogs were spayed or neutered, vaccinated and microchipped.

Safe Haven plans to hold two three-day clinics in 2022 and will spay or neuter more than 350 cats and dogs during the year.

Today, the 1996 dream for Safe Haven Animal Sanctuary is still alive. Safe Haven has grown to an even greater endeavor, thanks to the ideas and sacrifices of Safe Haven's early pioneers.

Though two and a half decades have passed since its inception, the spirit of those pioneers has been kept at the forefront of the work Safe Haven does on behalf of the abandoned cats and dogs who reside at the sanctuary and the community pets who benefit from our spay/neuter services.

There are so many people who have sacrificed

for Safe Haven to become what it is today. From the volunteers to the donors and the many businesses in our community who have helped us, we give our sincere thanks. It is because of the dedication and support that we have received from the animal

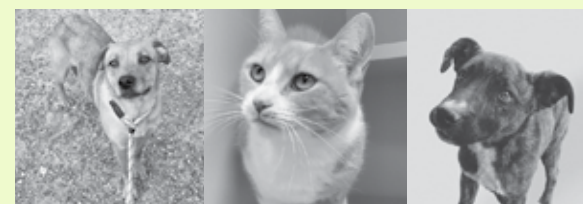
lovers of the Las Cruces area that we have been able to continuously improve the lives of animals in need, and we offer our heartfelt gratitude to our community for making our work possible!

'Interconnected in fashion industry'

Aggie Fashion Club partners with National Retail Federation to boost students

Working to enhance the future of fashion, the New Mexico State University Aggie Fashion Club (AFC) locked in a partnership this year with the National Retail Federation (NRF) that will expand its platform for students.

NRF is a retail trade association that provides people opportunities to get in contact with big fashion retail organizations.

For more than 30 years, AFC has been an organization in the NMSU

College of Agricultural, Consumer and Environmental Sciences that connects students with professionals in the fashion industry outside the classroom.

Kelley Coffeen, an assistant college professor in Family and Consumer Sciences and co-adviser of Aggie Fashion Club, said the partnership with NRF offers students access to the fashion industry in areas including merchandising, accounting, supply management and more.

"Las Cruces and New Mexico State could be seen as a little isolated in

being able to connect to the fashion industry," Coffeen said, "and this has really given us the opportunity to give our students in contact with professionals at big fashion retail organizations such as Macy's, Nordstrom, Petco., Home Depot, lots of different retail organizations across the United States."

There is also room for growth for students studying in the College of Business, she said.

"It's a huge industry," said Coffeen, who is also a popular cookbook author.

"Online retailing, e-commerce, supply chain management, creativity and design: It is all interconnected in the fashion industry, but it does not mean you have to be a fashion major," Coffeen said. "It just means that you have a passion or interest in the industry and that is where the NRF can bring us all together."

Lara Alvarez, a senior at NMSU, was selected

to be the first NRF student ambassador at NMSU. She's completing her degree in fashion merchandising and design, with a minor in business administration and marketing. Being selected for this role, Alvarez said it's her job to encourage students to join the organization, provide information and get them involved with seeking internships and job opportunities through NRF.

"It's a whole program. It's not only for internships and full-time jobs, but also to grow and just know about the retail industry," Alvarez said. "I felt very proud of myself. I was so nervous at first. It's a lot of responsibility, because I am the first student ambassador, but I'm trying to make the best out of it."

Coffeen added Alvarez has been one of the top students in the program, which was why she was selected for this role. "We've really seen growth

form everyone on campus that this program (NRF) is already paid for by the Aggie Fashion Club, which is a great opportunity for everyone to take advantage of, because it's free for every NMSU student."

"We want people from across campus. We want students from the local high schools to get involved with us and we want to bring them in. Anyone that's interested in clothing, accessories, shoes, design or retail, we really think that they will find a home here with us," Coffeen said.

Aggie Fashion Club plans to host a fundraiser and an upcycle fashion show in early April.

Stampede Meat lands state training funds

Stampede Meat, Inc. of Sunland Park was among 10 New Mexico companies to receive state Job Training Incentive Program (JTIP) funds in November, New Mexico Economic Development Department (EDD) Secretary Alicia J. Keyes announced in a news release.

The award to Stampede Meat, \$548,610, will pay for 90 trainees at an average wage of \$14.07 an hour, the news release said.

"Stampede Meat is a leading provider of portion-controlled protein solutions," EDD said. "The company creates seasoned and prepared, value-added meats, portion cuts and a variety of fully cooked meats that serve the numerous national food chains, restaurants, retailers, club stores, food service distributors, cruise lines, casinos, home delivery, military, hospitality, schools, airlines and other markets in the United States and internationally."

JTIP's reimbursement model pays 50 to 85 percent of a qualifying company's trainee and intern wages.

The percentage of reimbursement is higher for high-wage jobs and for jobs in rural or frontier areas.

The awards will support training costs for 212 new employees and three interns, EDD said.

Stampede Meat has four facilities in the Chicago area with a combined size of approximately 285,000 square feet with a combined production capacity in excess of 190 million pounds annually, according to the company's website.

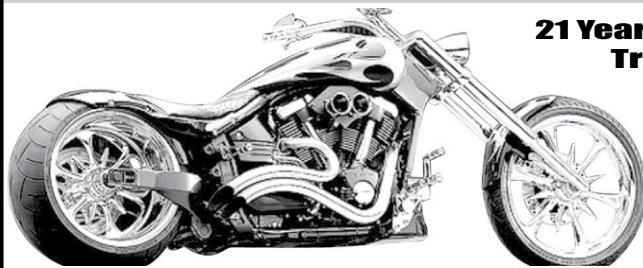

No time to Kill: New coach on mission to turn around Aggies

Jerry Kill, the new head football coach at New Mexico State University, credits football with saving his life.

Beyond the pressbox

Kill, 60, was introduced as the new coach at New Mexico State on Monday, Nov. 29.

He succeeds Doug Martin, whose contract was not renewed. Martin went 25-74 over nine years, including a mark of 2-10 this year.

Martin's tenure included a 2017 trip to the Arizona Bowl where the Aggies won their first bowl game since 1960. But

it has been tough sledding for the football program ever since.

Kill has survived stage 4 cancer and has battled

epilepsy for most of his adult life. He had to retire as head coach at the Uni-

versity of Minnesota in 2015 because of a variety of health issues, but now

he is back, ready to tackle the next challenge in his life.

"I still believe the game of football and the players saved my life," Kill said during his introductory news conference. "It gave me something to look forward to every day. I would tell you this: None of us get any do-overs in life. You only get one life."

Kill said he took the New Mexico State job, viewed as one of the toughest places to win in the country, for several reasons.

He likes challenges, he has known Athletics Director Mario Moccia

How you can combat, survive, thrive through pre-tournament jitters

Tournament golf competition can be a gut-wrenching experience for amateur golfers who are not prepared for the pressure. Even the tour pros feel some pre-tournament jitters as they start their quest for victory (and golf immortality) on the first tee. Jack Nicklaus once admitted that if he wasn't a little nervous starting a competition it wouldn't feel normal to him. Jack always contended that a really good opening drive — the first shot of the round — gives a strong sense of confidence and a feeling of being in control for the rest of the

day. It all starts with solid preparation and an attitude that you trust your swing. Slightly edgy is normal; too tense and anxious is a recipe to play your worst. Here's how to get over that.

Most golfers hit decent warm-up shots on the range, but they don't pick precise targets and often don't visualize and execute the very shots they are certain to require during on-course play. Hit your practice shots like you're already there. On the practice putting green, don't get all caught up in 20- and 30-foot chest-pounders; find a flat 3-foot

spot and make at least 10 in a row. That routine will give you the confidence you need as you head into the round that counts.

When you approach your opening tee shot as you begin your tournament, be sure to focus only — I mean only — on your established pre-shot routine. It's crucial that you hide in the cocoon of your pre-shot routine, while erasing all other considerations, including visual uneasiness and negative self-talk. The main purpose of a pre-shot routine is to normalize the feeling of what you are doing, thereby eliminating any interference. That's why you see tour players stop and re-start

their routine once they're distracted.

If you haven't settled on a rehearsed automatic pre-swing routine, then spend the next couple of weeks on the range establishing a personal one. It should take about 10 to 14 seconds, once you are ready to go; waggle once, take a deep breath and swing like you mean it. Any more than that and you risk too many negative swing thoughts.

In a report called "The 10 Deadly Mistakes Athletes Make With Their Pregame Attitude," sport psychologist Dr. Patrick Cohn talks about the pregame nerves. (Dr. Cohn's website is www.peak-sports.com.) "Pregame jit-

ters are a natural part of sports," he observes, "but pregame performance anxiety will cause most athletes to tense up and not perform to their ability." He advises golfers to use their preparation as a time to get control and manage emotions and thoughts about an upcoming competition. According to Dr. Cohn, who has worked with pro tour players for many years, the number one mistake competitors make is placing strict expectations on the performance to follow. "You (may) set yourself up for a success or failure proposition," he says. If you don't achieve your anticipated expectations you tend to question your abil-

ity that day, leading to a drop in overall confidence on the next outing. In my personal view, I say you should look at your on-course play as a process, with full attention paid to how you are playing in terms of focus, concentration, being in the present and staying relaxed. Dr. Cohn has found that a lot of the damage is done mentally by players worrying too much about results or outcomes before they tee it up. Let's not worry about the outcome — results will take care of themselves, providing you attend the process of playing.

For overcoming pre-

for years from their time together at the University of Southern Illinois and he loves football and being around the players.

“My motto is: Take it one day at a time,” Kill said.

During a 23-year career as a head coach at the NCAA Division II, FCS and FBS (college football classification subdivisions) levels, Kill has compiled a 154-101 record, including six bowl-game appearances.

He is mostly known for his stint at the University of Minnesota, where he guided the program to three straight bowl-game appearances from 2012-14, including the school’s first New Year’s bowl in more than 50 years.

But that run of success was halted by health issues. He took some time off, walked on the beach, wrote a book and now has his health back.

In the past few years, Kill has served as an assistant coach at Rutgers, Virginia Tech and most recently as assistant to the head coach and then

interim head coach at Texas Christian University after his good friend, Gary Patterson, was fired midway through this season.

While serving as interim coach, Kill went 2-2 at TCU, with a victory over nationally ranked Baylor.

He says he’s lost 20 pounds, is sleeping better and has no health issues.

“I have the best doctor in the country and maybe the world,” he said. “I have a little chip on my shoulder and I think our players have a little chip on their shoulder too. I

want to show people: ‘You counted the old man out. You were wrong.’”

Kill has a history of turning around down-trodden football programs — at Southern Illinois, Northern Illinois and then Minnesota.

“My daddy always taught me: ‘I heard what you are saying. I will trust what you do,’” Kill said. “For me to tell you what we are going to do, you won’t believe them anyway. This is all I’ve done my whole life (turn around football programs).”

“You take over at Min-

nesota and then go to Ann Arbor and we beat Michigan,” he added. “Nobody expected us to do that. ... I’ve always taken tough programs and turned them (around).”

Kill says he won’t have a lot of rules for his players — be on time, act right, go to class.

“If you are going to ask me what type of kids we are going to recruit, we are going to recruit tough kids,” he said. “We are going to recruit people that can relate to us — hardnosed, tough, blue collar, guys who roll up their sleeves.”

To play for Kill, you also have to love the game of football but be fast on the gridiron.

“The secret to coaching is I’ve gotten bailed out by people who can run,” Kill said.

“Hey, coach, that was a great call,” he said. “No, it wasn’t. The guy made a heck of a play ‘cause he is fast.”

Kill says football is a hard game but is the “greatest game ever invented” because of the life lessons it instills.

And now, Kill wants to pass those lessons on at New Mexico State.

tournament jitters, attitude is everything. Stop

worrying about how you will do and about what others will think.

Worry just guarantees you to psych yourself out; if you allow fear of failure

to be your main motivator you are sabotaging your performance.

Winning golf takes self-discipline, so start by deciding on positive at-

titudes and feelings that will enhance your play, not undermine it.

Prepare a little 3-by-5 card printed with three simple keys: keep relaxed,

just play this shot, forget the past.

Look at it for every shot. Play “process golf.”
