Chancellor: NMSU will fill gaps in services to Black students

"I am here to listen," New Mexico State University Chancellor Dan Arvizu said Friday, Jan. 28, as he participated in a community town hall sponsored by NMSU Black Programs and the NMSU Black Student Association (BSA).

The event was held in person at Corbett Center on the NMSU campus and via Zoom to discuss "the progress and ongoing opportunities" arising from a September 2019 town hall during which a number of Black student demands were presented to the NMSU administration. The Jan. 28 meeting also included discussions of the Black Education Act that became the law

in New Mexico in 2021 and "strategies for sustainable equity" at NMSU. Secretary of Identity, Equity and Transformation Vickie C. Bannerman said at the town hall.

to learn more about gaps in service to Black Programs and BSA and create "a strategic plan to meet those gaps and fill those needs."

"If it takes resources, so Only about 3 percent of New Mexico's population is African American, Bannerman said, but it is important that Black people be honorably represented.

"When I woke up this

"When I woke up this morning, I was a Black woman in New Mexico, so you cannot tell me that Black people are not living and working in New Mexico," she said. "We are here and we are not going

anywhere. Let's support the movement; let's support the work. Let's stop the conditions where we have to have the same conversations we were having 70, 60, 50 years ago. The time is now for action. Don't just tell me what you want. Let's talk about how to get there."

Black students made up 3 percent of NMSU's undergraduate students and 3.5 percent of its maincampus graduate students last fall according to an NMSU report. Blacks comprised 1.4 percent of the NMSU faculty 2018-20.

"We've been working very hard with minimal resources," said BSA President Ignacio Alvarado. "We don't have the resources or support to be successful as a team. We feel like we're falling behind."

The demands made at the 2019 town hall were "student needs which were listed as immediate needs prior to fall of 2019," Alvarado said. "We are now in 2022."

Black Programs, he said, needs additional funding for adequate staff and a complete renovation of its office.

"A commitment has been made for us to relocate," Alvarado said. "The deadlines have come and gone and we are no closer to moving into our new space in Corbett than we were before. We have received a lot of promises."

Alvarado also called on NMSU to make Black Studies Interim Director Kimberly York the program's permanent director. "We would like to know the long-term plan for Africana studies," York said.

"I am thrilled to hear that there is some work in progress," said NAACP Doña Ana County Chapter President Bobbie Green, Ph.D., a former NMSU faculty member. "These students need to see people that look like them ... in front of the classroom as professors. I want to make sure that we keep that momentum going. It is beneficial not only to the students but to the whole university that we make progress."

"What we need is systemic and structural change," said NMSU Vice President for Equity, Inclusion and Diversity Linda Scholz, Ph.D.

Good at repairs? SCSWA needs you as their Heavy Equipment Field Service Technician.

This job performs repairs, maintenance, and service as directed by the foremen or administrator on various types of solid waste equipment, on-the-road trucks, light-duty vehicles, and primarily heavy equipment. The pay range starts at 16.39 and goes up to 26.99, depending on experience.

Do you live in Chaparral or don't mind a commute? There are three positions at the SCSWA Chaparral Transfer Station at 180 McCombs Road:

- Chaparral Scale House Attendant / Cashier This position is responsible for weighing customer vehicles on scales to determine fee amount, collecting fees, and balancing cash/checks daily, as well as preparing daily deposits and assisting customers as needed. Starting pay is \$12.60 per hour.
- Chaparral Transfer Station Attendant This position monitors, inspects, and facilitates the safe delivery and disposal of solid waste and recyclable materials at the transfer station. Starting pay is \$11.54 per hour.

Teachers rally in Santa Fe for pay raise, other improvements

Members of The
National Education
Association-New Mexico
(NEA-NM) from Las Cruces and around the state,
along with the state and
national NEA presidents,
rallied outside the state
capitol in Santa Fe Sunday afternoon, Jan. 23, "to
seek relief from effects of
statewide staffing crisis,"
NEA-NM said in a news
release.

The New Mexico Legislature is in session through Feb. 17 and is considering teacher raises and other education-related legislation during the 30-day budget session.

"Spending time with educators from all over the state allows us to see that our challenges and issues are common to all of us," said Centennial High School teacher and NEA-LC member Gail Wheeler. who attended the Santa Fe rally. "We need more support staff, we need to be compensated fairly and we need to have time to plan high-quality lessons. We aren't asking for anything unreasonable, but

all school employees need to be treated with more respect."

"This moment is a crossroads for our states' decision makers," said **NEA-NM President Marv** Parr-Sanchez, a Las Cruces teacher. "We have the potential to harness the unprecedented resources available to our state and invest them in our future — in our students. We need a paradigm shift in the way our schools operate. Too many children are slipping through the cracks in our system. The overreliance on standardized tests and unfunded mandates drives educators out and deprive children from the education they deserve. We must invest in proven strategies for improving our schools, such as the community school model and early childhood education," Parr-Sanchez said.

NEA-NM said educators "focused on six priorities to address the current education crisis: better wages, affordable health insurance, smaller class sizes, improved staffing, more access to prep time, childcare and affordable housing.

"There are more than 1,000 vacant licensed positions and over 800 vacant education support professional positions across our state, and teacher vacancies are only the tip of the iceberg," NEA-NM said. "These 1,000 vacancies alone represent over 20,000 of New Mexico's students without a high-quality, well-trained, permanent classroom teacher."

"This is a challenging time for our nation," national NEA President Becky Pringle of Philadelphia said at the rally. "We are faced with multiple crises. And yet, here in the Land of Enchantment, I see hope — hope that New Mexico can come together behind a vision that recognizes the potential of our children to be the light that will lead us forward through these dark and challenging times."

Looking at health care, education post-Covid

We've heard about Long Covid, the condition where people may face symptoms for a much longer time, possibly all their lives.

Our society may also feel long-term negative effects of the pandemic on two critical fields: health care and education.

The future of two of our most revered professions — teachers and nurses — is at risk.

Overwork, burnout, frustration, as well as their own battles with the disease, has led many teachers and nurses to leave the profession.

In a recent poll, more than half of the teachers who responded are considering leaving their jobs earlier than planned.

Teachers have always had to be many things to their students. The pandemic has forced them to be technology experts and deal with many student

issues unrelated to actually teaching them.

When teachers get sick, there

are fewer people available as substitutes. That's why, here in New Mexico, National Guard members have been activated to serve in that capacity.

With overloaded emergency rooms, nurses and health care workers have been slammed for two years.

When they get sick, there are even fewer qualified substitutes for teachers.

Overtime pay helps, but working 60-80 hours a week for two years is difficult even in the best conditions. When working daily among the sick and dying, along with all the other activities associated with the emergency room, the stress can be unbearable.

Of course, these aren't the only industries dealing with staffing and hiring issues. Almost every industry has been affected in some way.

However, if you have to wait a little longer for your order at Arby's, and they still messed up your order, I'm sorry, but that's simply not as important as a child waiting four hours with a broken arm.

Not only are we at risk of losing the current generation of educators and health care workers, millions of people who had considered these professions are now thinking twice. That could reduce our future pool of teachers and nurses.

The fear is many young people in high school or college will simply say, "It's not worth it."

The hope is, however, many young people will see the crisis as a call, and answer it. "There is a great need, and who can help solve it, if not me?"

That flame of hope might be fanned by some glimmers of positivity during the crisis.

Telemedicine, already ad-

vancing pre-pandemic, has shown excellent progress, and saved time and money for both patients and doctors. Of course, you'll never be able to eliminate emergency rooms; I mean, you can't fix that child's broken arm via telemedicine, but it does provide an option for many other purposes.

As medical technology continues to improve, doctors are more able to help people remotely, thanks to monitoring devices that are simple for patients to use and easy to transmit to medical professionals.

Online education also made strides pre-pandemic. Many people have gotten complete degrees through online education.

However, in my book, there's nothing like face-to-face teaching, especially for primary students. Our children, I believe, need that live, in-person warmth and care from a concerned, engaged teacher.

You could have seen this tax loophole from space

From the day in 2005 when the agreement between Bill Richardson and Richard Branson for what would later become Spaceport America was first announced, the business model for southern New Mexico has always been to separate wealthy tourists from their not-so-hard-earned vacation money.

"... First flights of a suborbital spaceliner (are) now planned in late 2008, early 2009," Virgin Galactic announced in a 2005 press

release, the first of what to town on vacation. would be many overly optimistic projections.

As the opinion page editor for the Sun-News at that time, I supported the spaceport, even though I understood it was a glorified playground for the

super-rich. That support continued through the lean years after the fatal test flight in 2014, not because of my love for the super-rich. But I did, and still do, see the economic potential in bringing a whole bunch of them

All of which makes the decision by the New Mexico Legislature not to tax the millionaires and billionaires who. I hope, will someday be launching from Spaceport America so perplexing ... and so insulting to the residents of Doña Ana and Sierra counties who continue to pay an increase in our gross receipts taxes for construction of a facility that was finished years ago.

A 2019 change to state tax rules reclassified space tourists as "payload," which is exempt

from the gross receipts tax under a bill designed specifically for the spaceport, and not passengers, which are not exempt.

And so, while New Mexico residents pay gross receipts taxes on all the basic necessities, out-of-state billionaires blasting into space don't pay the tax. It must be the most regressive policy in the state's entire tax code.

A bill that would have closed the loophole was tabled in the

Our state, and others, have made efforts to improve teacher pay, but conditions need to improve as well.

I like the idea of National Guard members serving as substitute teachers.

House Commerce and Economic Development Committee last week, based on arguments that the state had made a promise to Virgin Galactic right from the start, and now must keep that commitment.

Virgin Galactic executive Sirisha Bandla told House committee members that the loophole passed in 2019 had been

anticipated 14 years earlier when the original deal was made.

If that's true, why wasn't it clearly spelled out in the original contract? Between Virgin Galactic and the state of New Mexico, it's hard to imagine how many attorneys and how many billable hours went into its drafting. Did they all just forget? Why the need for legal sleight of hand now, pretending that people are no different than scientific experiments tucked into the nose cone?

Opponents of the bill also argued that taxing the rich would stifle an industry that is still in its infancy.

This would be a good time to note that the price for a ticket has gone up from \$200,000 in 2005 to \$450,000 now. This, despite the fact the Virgin Galactic has yet to prove that it can deliver on its promise of safe, routine launches.

The notion that charging gross receipts tax will somehow deter those willing and able to pay \$450,000 a ticket, or sour

what will be a once-ina-lifetime experience, is preposterous.

New Mexico taxpayers spent some \$225 million to build the spaceport, and continue to spend \$4 million a year for maintenance and operations, according to the bill's sponsor, Rep. Jason Harper. It's time that we started to see a return on that investment.

His many assignments included two tours in Vietnam, obtaining a master's degree in electrical engineering at the University of Arizona, a second NATO tour in then-occupied West Berlin and five years in the Pentagon where he was instrumental in guiding the TacFire program and working on the Patriot missile. He was then sent to White Sands Missile Range where he was promoted to full colonel and served as director of Missiles and

Electronic Warfare.

His 28 years in the armed services included an Army Commendation Medal and a Bronze Star. But as a Signal Corps Officer, he was most proud of the combat infantry badge he earned during his second tour in Vietnam.

He retired from Army service in 1982 and taught electrical engineering at New Mexico State University for 14 years. Students said if you wanted to be an electrical engineer you had to pass Pollard's class.

After retirement from NMSU, he played golf at

the NMSU Golf Course with his good golf buddies, and he also was very active with Habitat for Humanity, where he helped build many homes in this area. Despite being a Southern boy, he loved New Mexico, performing his duties all over the massive missile range, enjoying his home in the historic Alameda District and his regular consumption of green chile burgers.

He led a life of service to his country and was treasured by his family and friends. He is survived by his wife of 58 years,

Heather, his two children Rebecca (Scott) and Howard (Jenifer), and four grandchildren, Lynden, Catherine, Graham and London. His daughter Elizabeth pre-deceased him.

There will be no immediate services due to Covid but a celebration of his life will be held in the spring for friends and family. Animal group hosts low-cost vaccine, microchip clinic Feb. 12

BULLETIN REPORT

ACTion Programs for Animals (APA) is hosting a low-cost microchip and vaccination clinic 9 to 11 a.m. Saturday, Feb. 12, at the APA adoption center, located at 537 N. Solano Drive.

APA will provide free Distemper, Adenovirus, Parainfluenza and Parvo (DAPP) vaccinations and free Feline Viral Rhinotracheitis, Calicivirus and Panleukope (FVRCP) vaccinations for Doña Ana County-area pets.

The free vaccines are made possible through Petco Love's national vaccination initiative, which is providing 1 million free pet vaccines to its existing animal welfare partners, including APA, for family pets in need, APA said in a

news release.

Pre-registration is not required. The vaccines will be offered on a first-come, first-served basis. Any remaining vaccines will be distributed at subsequent clinics. Rabies vaccines, Bordetella vaccines and microchips will be offered at \$15 each. APA is the only local low-cost clinic that offers three-year rabies doses when appropriate, APA said.

"We are grateful we're able to offer the free dog and cat yearly boosters to ward off common diseases, thanks to Petco Love," said APA Executive Director Michel Meunier. "We encourage pet owners in our community to take advantage of this special offer."

APA is only able to

serve well-behaved dogs on leashes and cats in carriers. Anyone in need of a drive-up clinic should call the Mesquite Animal Vaccination Clinic at 575-650-2000.

APA also offers a pet food bank 1 to 3 p.m. the first and third Saturday of each month, also at its adoption center. Veterinary-care records and proof of low income are required.

Masks are required for anyone entering the APA building.

Since May 2012, more than 5,000 animals have been rescued. The majority of these have been dogs and cats/kittens pulled from the municipal shelter. APA is able to do this




Leadership Las Cruces Criminal Justice Day



moviereview 'Fatal Attraction' still warns powerfully of wrong affairs

To schedule a showing of "Fatal Attraction" on Valentine's Day, someone must have a good-or at least macabre – sense of humor.

The famously disturbing 1987 melodrama about an ill-advised affair turns up Monday, Feb. 14, on Cinemax ... and watching it particularly on that occasion might nip some relationships in the bud. At the time, the subject matter landed stars Michael Douglas and Glenn Close on national magazine covers to illustrate detailed discussions of the movie's theme, which the stars' pairing remains representative of this many years later.

Director Adrian Lyne's film casts Douglas as an attorney who meets book editor Close through work circumstances. While his wife and young daughter (Anne Archer, Ellen Hamilton Latzen) are away, one thing leads to another, and eventually to a one-night stand that Douglas' Dan takes much more casually than Close's Alex does.

As Alex tries to insinuate her way deeper into Dan's life, he tries to make it clear that she doesn't have a permanent place there, increasingly angering her. As she starts to lash

out in various ways – one of them memorably involving the daughter's pet rabbit – Dan fears he's going to have to come clean to his trusting spouse about his infidelity.

Glenn Close in "Fatal Attraction"

The success of "Fatal Attraction" (which Paramount+ is turning into a series that will star Joshua Jackson and Lizzy Caplan) launched a number of movies for Douglas, also including "Basic Instinct" and "Disclosure," about men making the wrong sexual choices. That well could have become his entire screen identity for years, had he not shown his diversity through such other roles as his Oscar-winning turn as ruthless business raider Gordon Gekko in "Wall Street."

NMSU's 'Medea in LA' takes modern look at Greek tragedy

The New Mexico State University Theatre Department's production of "Mojada: A Medea in Los Angeles," opens Friday night, Feb. 18, for a two-weekend run at the ASNMSU Center for the Arts, 1000 E. University Ave.

The play has a preview performance at 5:30 p.m. Thursday, Feb. 17. Opening night is Friday, Feb. 18, at 7:30 p.m. Additional performances are at 7:30 p.m. Saturday, Feb. 19, Friday and Saturday, Feb. 25-26, and 2 p.m. Sunday, Feb. 27, all at the ASNMSU Center for the Arts, 1000 E. University Ave.

Playwright Luis Alfaro "takes the Greek tragedy 'Medea' and sets it in Boyle Heights Los Angeles circa 2012-ish," said Theatre Department Associate Professor Larissa

Lury, the play's director. "In popular culture, it's the tragic end of Medea that folks tend to remember and reference; sometimes, we forget how much it is a story of a couple who have become 'foreigners,' and cannot return to their home-

lands."

In "Mojada; a Medea in Los Angeles,"Lury said, "Medea and Jason stand at opposing sides of what it will take to survive as immigrants to the U.S. Jason sees the need to assimilate into the culture he sees around him; Medea sees the necessity to hold onto the culture that made her who she is. The struggle plays out over the fate of their son.

"The play brings home how much what we see when we look at one another defines who we are, or who we're allowed to

be in the world," Lury said. "If I look at you as a queen, treat you as a queen — you are a queen; if you see me as an 'alien,' I become one. Throughout the play, the characters name themselves and each other: 'housekeeper,' 'friend,' 'sister,' 'costurera' (seamstress), 'boss,' 'mi reina' (queen), 'her first and last,' 'just a door,' 'immigrant,' and the slur that gives the play its title. It is heinous to think of how easily we can strip one another of our identities, how we can dehumanize with the use of a word; and yet, it's also empowering to consider that changing the way we see one another can be a real act of transformation," she said.

"Medea's family is from Michoacán, and Mexican culture, including Nahua culture, philosophy and spirituality, are central to the play," Lury said. "The dialogue weaves Spanish and English in a way we're accustomed to in New Mexico and includes some Nahuatl as well. Working on the play has given us the gift of learning more about, celebrating and examining the heritage, cultures, languages, religions, practices, policies and world views that shape the characters in the play."

Lucia Carmona and Carlos Aceves, two of the founders of Raices Del Saber Xinachtli Community School in Las Cruces, "have generously consulted with us, helping us with the Nahua references in the play," Lury said.

The cast includes Elia Vasquez as Medea, Omar Moreno as Jason, Dominque Gomez as Tita, Bianca Castro as Josefina, Ashley Almanda as Armida and Santiago Garzon

Husband, wife team will perform 'Love Letters' on Valentine's Day

It will be performed by husband and wife and veteran Las Cruces actors Marissa Bond and Rafael Medina reading the roles of Melissa Gardner and Andrew Makepeace Ladd III in the play written by A.R. Gurney (1930-2017).

"It has been a number of years since NSTC last presented A.R. Gurney's enchanting reading," said BBT co-owner Ceil Herman. "The play has gained a unique reputation all over the United States and overseas owing to the celebrity casts who performed it throughout the 1990s."

Bond and Medina performed together in Las Cruces Community Theatre's "The Mousetrap" 10 years ago, and more recently in NSTC's "Nora," Herman said. In 2020, Bond (a former Las Cruces Bulletin writer and editor) directed Eugene Ionesco's "The Killing Game."

Rob Minkoff, director of the original "Lion King" Disney film, has had a long and varied career in his field.

He began at the California Institute of the Arts in an animation program founded by Walt Disney and learned from Disney artists from the golden age of animation, Minkoff said. By the end of his second year with the program, he was invited to do an internship at Disney.

Honored to work with one of "Disney's Nine Old Men," Eric Larson, he learned the Disney approach to animation. Then, Minkoff was hired by the company and became not only an animator but also worked as a story artist, co-wrote a song and worked up to being a director.

While he left Disney in 1995, Minkoff has not slowed down completing numerous works ever since in many different capacities. Films he has worked on include "The Great Mouse Detective," "The

"I don't know what I love the most," he said. "It's been exciting to be able to do a lot of different things, work with so many different artists, exploring new avenues. I enjoy doing new things I haven't done before — climbing new mountains."

On March 4, the Las Cruces International Film Festival honors Minkoff with its "Outstanding Achievement in Directing" award. Minkoff will be on hand with his wife, Crystal Minkoff, and will screen his box-office smash, the highest grossing 2D animated film of all time "The Lion King" at the Allen Theatres Cineport at 7 p.m. He also hosts a question-and-answer session with the audience following the film. Earlier, at 3:30 p.m., he will speak at the Cineport about his career.

Minkoff's newest project, "Blazing Samuri," which comes out later this year, takes some inspiration from the classic Mel Brooks film "Blazing Saddles."

"The thing about this new movie — it's very different," Minkoff said. "Our movie is a general audience comedy for everybody. It's a story about tolerance — about a dog who becomes a samurai in a world of cats."

"The work the actors are doing is remarkable," Lury said. "Only two weeks into the rehearsal process, I find myself on a roller-coaster ride through the humor, love, and trauma the story demands; they are honoring the story and deepening their telling of it with

every rehearsal.





Well-meaning investment mutual funds won't save the planet

A fad on Wall Street is the creation of investment funds that promise to invest in companies that have desirable environmental, social and governance attributes. These sorts of funds are very

popular. Principles for Responsible Investment, a United Nations-backed non-government organization, recently announced, for example, that signatories to its standards have \$121 trillion of assets under management. This represents most of the world's managed money.

The appeal is obvious. People want to earn a decent return and they want to feel good about themselves as they are doing

it. Want to earn 8 percent while fighting global warming, invest in a climate fund. Concerned about labor conditions, invest in a fund that promises to invest in companies paying a living wages. Any

cause you can think of, there is a responsible investment fund for that.

The hope is that by funding responsibly run companies, those companies will be able to gain more market share, displacing unethically run companies. The problem is this doesn't work in a capitalist system.

The reasons are straight forward. In a capitalist system, businesses seek out profit opportunities.

Where those opportunities exist, they will be exploited regardless of moral appropriateness. People often justify their actions with the comment that if they hadn't done it, someone else would have. While this is hardly an excuse for polluting the atmosphere or hiring child labor, in fact, in a capitalist economy, it is nevertheless a correct assertion. There is always someone willing to exploit profit opportunities even when they are unethical.

Refusing to hold an asset does little good as the asset is still owned by someone and that someone continues to operate the unethical business underlying the asset. Indeed, because the asset is undervalued, the ultimate acquirer may earn outsize

profits to compensate for any guilt they might feel. To wit, cigarette stocks have for many years paid an above market return, the extra lucre assuaging moral qualms of the shareholders.

Suppose a philanthropist billionaire decided to buy the undesirable businesses, then close them permanently. This won't work either. Competitors will expand to serve the orphaned clientele of the closed business. The profit motive will incentivize these businesses to adopt the same questionable practices as the now defunct former competitor.

If our goal is to stop undesirable behavior by private profit seeking businesses, the answer is not responsible investment funds nor is it welling-meaning billionaires. Rather, what needs to happen is to make bad behavior unprofitable. That takes government regulation.

If we want to stop global warming, for example, the answer is to make the emission of greenhouse gases unprofitable. Once that is done, businesses will soon find ways to avoid emitting. Cap-andtrade is my preferred approach, but a carbon tax would work also. The implementation of either cap-and-trade or a carbon tax requires government regulation and enforcement. The market can't do it without government intervention.

Feel-good responsible investment funds won't work as long as there is profit in irresponsible and unethical business practices. While most businesses people are moral people who want to do what is right, where there is profit, that is to where investments will flow and there is profit in pollution, child labor and exploitation.

If you really want to save the planet, work to establish government regulation that take the profit out of irresponsible investment.

"FMP will target sheet converting plants in the southwestern U.S. and the maquiladoras and Mexican domestic market." FMP was one of 12 New Mexico companies to receive JTIP funds during the JTIP board's Jan. 14 meeting, NMEDD said, and the only company in southern New Mexico to receive funding. About \$3.5 million was awarded to support 183 trainees and two interns at the companies, the news release said.

"All 12 JTIP recipients are either science/ technology based or have developed innovative manufacturing," NMEDD said.

Anxious moments: Many golfers struggle with performance anxiety

Let's talk about anxiety. Perhaps, an overused and misunderstood term in today's culture, anxiety is a mental and emotional reaction and condition that goes well beyond simple "worry," and be-

comes a serious issue that often impairs well-being and behavior.

There are over a dozen psychiatric disorders with anxiety as the basic element, from panic attacks to acute stress to PTSD. But here we're focused on low to moderate levels of anxiety as it affects a golfer's (and other's) performance. We can define

prehensive anticipation of future danger or misfortune accompanied by feeling of nervousness and/ or physical symptoms of tension. For golfers and other athletes, a

anxiety as the ap-

sense of anxiety - some call it dread — can be persistent, and ever-present, but generally it is brief and situational, like teeing off before a crowd of onlookers. Mostly, the person becomes unsettled and unable to think clearly. Even pro golfers struggle with anxiety, like PGA Tour star Bubba Watson. "I was so worried about what others believed about me that I wasn't acting like the person I wanted to be," said Bubba in Guideposts February 2022.

Several years ago, when I was asked to coach Heather (not her real name), a 15-year-old highschool golfer with ample talent and a burning desire to do well, her mother offered that she was the best player on her team, but there was "something holding her back." After several conversations during coaching sessions, it became painfully evident that Heather was seriously hurting herself with anxiety that went beyond random. (You may be able

to relate to feelings she did disclose.)

She was quick to admit that she often felt "edgy" and inadequate when things went wrong, and she especially fretted under any kind of pressure, like having to make an important par-saving putt late in her round. I asked her to tell me what was going through her thoughts before a pressure putt. "I just think, this will be so embarrassing when I miss," she shared candidly.

Hers seemed to be a classic case of self-sabotage, the kind that causes grown adults to avoid taking good jobs because they can't stand the thought of

having to give a speech. As the situational stress mounted, Heather described it this way: "I get all tight and then I can't even think." At that point, with a putter or a wedge in her hands, she has no chance to make a high quality shot. Often the problem lies under the surface, below one's threshold of awareness.

As I probed further it turns out that there were several variations on Heather's "I'm a fool" theme, but they all seemed to boil down to one recurring thought: "Everyone will see I'm a loser." Again, a common theme for young and old alike. I noted the emerging

root of self-esteem, that mom didn't realize was holding her back. "What would a badly missed putt suggest to you," I gently asked. Hesitating she replied, "Then, they will know how awful I really am." "And what would that mean?" I continued. "I let Mom down. That I'm a failure, a horrible person, I guess," she poured forth, tears now streaking down her cheeks. Her unreasonable thoughts had taken hold of her. And taken hold of her performance, as well as dampened the talent she already had.

submerging thoughts and feelings, seems to plague golfers just like sadness follows regrets. For many it's a different, more exaggerated sense of worry than we would have in everyday life. It seems that some anxiety is part of the package of life. It's a natural byproduct of having a brain that is capable of such high-wire acts as considering the future. A little anxiety is good, even necessary, and a great motivator to get us to play well and perform ably. Yet too much anxi-

ety can be self-defeating, and anxiety-caused panic downright disabling.

Whether it's in sport or in the office, performance anxiety is characterized by a pattern of frequent, agonizing over specific activities and events.

Fortunately for Heather she had friends, did well in school and was a normal teenager, with her anxiety flare-ups usually confined to golf.

The drones will help with project management, and perhaps more in the future, and Natural Gas & Energy employees were the first to get the training.

their new aircraft to document existing conditions and progress reporting." Reisch explained that the training covered the rules and regulations for UA within the National Airspace System (NAS). Because UA and manned aircraft share the skies, both need to be aware of airspace classifications, traffic patterns of manned aircraft, ability to read sectionals, and reading weather reports while also understanding the effects of different

locate and mark lines, those markings can be documented for contractors to ensure that the record of the location is kept, even if the ground that is marked might be dug up during the project. LCU started with the Gas employees to help with project management, but other uses could become available with different training and upgrades.

"It'll give the crews more oversight on how a project might integrate with

different areas and allow us to plan for related projects," said LCU Deputy Director Natural Gas & Energy Lucio Garcia. "But in the future, with more adaption and training, we may be able to use it for leak detection or calculate the emissions from different areas in town. However, right now, it's a way to have projects aided with all the knowledge they need to do work more effectively."

"We want our team to learn the newest and most efficient technologies used in the utility industry across the country," said LCU Director Delilah Walsh. "Keeping our employees at the forefront of their skills will match our ability to provide the best and lowest cost services we can to our customers."
