

LCPS adopts 'balanced calendar' with July start

Citing an unprecedented opportunity to do what is best for students, the Las Cruces Public Schools Board of Education voted March 15 to adopt a balanced calendar for the 2022-23 school year.

The option was one of two choices presented to the board, supporting an additional 10 days of enriched learning time for students. It includes a 3 percent pay increase for educators, which comes in addition to the 7 percent pay increase passed by the New Mexico legislators and signed into law by Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham earlier this year.

The biggest difference between the two options the board voted on was summer breaks.

The traditional calendar included an eightweek summer break; the balanced calendar provides a six-week summer break and one- and twoweek breaks scheduled throughout the school year to address burnout and pandemic-related trauma reported by educators and families.

The 2022-23 school year starts July 21, 2022. Kindergarten, sixth- and ninth-grade students will start classes July 20 to allow for a smooth transition. Transition dates for pre-kindergarten will children and families to learn about kindergarten.

"Our board has set the course for doing something different for stu-



dents that this district has never done before," LCPS Superintendent Ralph Ramos said. "The time is now, and the success of this plan happens through shared leadership and collaboration with our unions, parents and students to do what's best for kids."

'We have an opportunity to foster innovation," said LCPS Board President Ray Jaramillo. "We get hammered that we are 50th in the nation when it comes to education, yet we don't want to do anything to change it. I hope that after we finish talking (about the calendar options), we know how lucky we are to have millions of dollars available to us to make this happen."

"We have been through so much in this pandemic," board member Pamela Cort said. "Opportunities like these show our commitment to students to bring a diverse curriculum inside our classrooms. Our combegin Tuesday, May 10, for munity will rally around education."

"These student programs truly help us grow our own future workforce," board member

Carol Cooper said. "Kids get to literally put their hands on learning. That does not always happen inside a traditional classroom."

"Like everyone else on the board, I received a tremendous amount of feedback from families about these options," board member Bob Wofford said. "Any decision we make will not be ideal for everyone, but as a board, we are committed to ensuring the success of all students. This is the first step in that direction."

"It doesn't happen that easy," board Vice President Teresa Tenorio said, "and we've experienced it as we re-engaged with students coming out of remote learning. What I see is an opportunity that will bring students to the classroom with enthusiasm."

Tenorio also expressed concern about accommodating parents who addressed the board at the March 15 meeting and in emails about prior commitments that were made when school was expected to start in August. The

Sheriff running for re-election to finish what she started in 1st term

Doña Ana County Sheriff Kim K. Stewart is running for re-election in 2022 "to see through some things" she implemented in her first term.

Stewart defeated incumbent sheriff Enrique "Kiki" Vigil and three others in the June 2018 Democratic primary and defeated Republican Todd Garrison, who had previously served 10 years as sheriff, in the November general election.

"I've changed a whole lot in three years," Stewart said. "I believe the changes are good for the county." Stewart said she would like to serve a second four-year term to cement those changes into the culture of the Doña Ana County Sheriff's Office (DASO).

The 2022 election, Stewart said, "is about moving us forward or keeping us back."

It took the first 1 1/2 years of her term to "bring us back to some type of thoughtful operation," she said.

Stewart said she in-

herited "a blank canvas" when she became sheriff Jan. 1, 2019, as "no attention had been paid" to DASO's budget or organizational structure. The office also had "a mass of computer platforms no one knew how to use," she said.

Before she took office, Stewart said, DASO's records management system was using only about 15 percent of its capacity. As she begins her fourth year as sheriff, Stewart said that figure is now 85 percent.

The department was

short 32 deputies when she started, Stewart said, and is now at full capacity. With 20 slots kept open for newly trained cadets, DASO has 137 deputy positions, she said, 193 total employees and an annual budget of \$24.8 million.

Before she became sheriff, Stewart said DASO "had been doing weekly budget transfers" to manage its budget. Now, she said, the department is doing five transfers a year, and is growing despite a flat budget. Stewart said she also has increased departmental training,

started a peer support program and created an organizational chart "to reflect our adaptability and flexibility."

Stewart said her staff just completed the first update of DASO policies and procedures in more than 20 years, covering more than 140 policies governing best practices for the department and vetted to state and national court rulings.

"The detail in it is remarkable," Stewart said, not only in terms of each policy but also "how they

relate to other policies," she said.

Part of the motivation to do the policy update, Stewart said, was feedback from deputies, who told her, "'We're not on the same page; we're not sure what we should be doing and what we shouldn't be doing," the sheriff said.

Within the next two years, Stewart said she is hopeful DASO will become one of only a handful of law enforcement agencies in the state that is certified by the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies, Inc. That accreditation will make DASO policies and procedures "a living document," the sheriff said, by keeping it updated on the latest court rulings impacting law enforcement.

Stewart said DASO was also the first sheriff's office in the state to adopt a pandemic protocol.

The sheriff said it took 2 1/2 years to purchase rapid-DNA-testing technology for DASO. Integrating that kind of science and technology enhances "good old-fash-

ioned police work," she said, so the department has 'everything at our disposal to solve crime."

DASO has also upped the number of major crime categories it reports to the FBI from 12 to more than 40, Stewart said, and has significantly reduced the number of reporting errors.

"I've seen how these changes had such a positive effect on our ability to provide service," she said.

Promotions within DASO are now based on who is best for the job, Stewart said, instead of the old way of promoting because of "who you know."

Stewart said she is proposing "a bold budget" for the coming fiscal year that would restore the DASO criminalistics unit that was eliminated a decade ago. Stewart said she expects the county give raises to county employees, including DASO.

"I am frankly sick of hearing, 'We don't have the money,'" Stewart said. "We have the money."

Even though "county

For Las Cruces Utilities, Safety is a Priority

City of Las Cruces

Organizational safety requires the ability to train staff and contractors, inspect workplaces and machinery, and investigate incidents. It also requires a dedication to building the awareness and culture of safety from the ground up. Las Cruces Utilities (LCU) is investing in employee and public safety with its first centralized safety coordinator. an addition to LCU's strategic business plan for the upcoming fiscal year.

LCU Training Safety Coordinator Case Van Dyke has been with the City of Las Cruces (CLC) for nearly a decade but is returning to his safety roots. After a career in the Air Force, in which safety took up fifteen of his 23 years, Van Dyke grew more decades of safety experience with Boeing, NASA, Jacobs Engineering, and in the public sector.

heavy equipment, and providing

disaster happened, NASA wanted as many safety specialists at the Kennedy Space Center as possible," said Van Dyke, who worked as a contractor for the safety of orbiter payloads.

In a search for a less humid climate, Van Dyke came to El Paso as a NASA site safety manager. After a stint in New Orleans, he looked back to the desert. "I made Las Cruces home but lasted about one year in actual retirement – then started working for the City as a safety officer," he said.

He recalled a success for city workers was as simple as watching them in action. "I had a supervisor come to me to say that his crew kept having shoulder issues," he said. "We walked through their routines and realized they were taking equipment out of the back of their truck beds, up and over the tailgate. Once we installed a sliding

drawer in the truck bed, the injuries decreased."

As Van Dyke transitioned to LCU, his focus was on the certified training for natural gas employees and contractors. He is also working with contractors on-site and ensuring they have the proper certifications to work on public infrastructure.

"At every organization, it's important to create and enhance the culture and awareness of safety. This position, to consolidate all safety oversight for all areas, allows LCU to ensure that annual training is timely and tailored

to the exact needs of different crews," said Van Dyke.

"Our own safety officer and safety program has been a priority since I started as the LCU Assistant Director," said LCU Director Delilah Walsh. "Case's experience will lend a deep measure of security not only for our employees, but for the services that the public relies on as well."

Van Dyke's priorities include a deep dive into all the spaces and routines throughout LCU, walking through work areas to find the common "slip and fall" hazards.

"LCU training material will not be off the shelf but specific to the needs of the crews and our customers," said Van Dyke. "It's important to work with and trust those in the job. I want to make their day-to-day safer and, if possible, more efficient."

management interfer-

ence" has impacted morale within DASO, it "hasn't impacted our ability to recruit and retain," Stewart said. "We're a good place to work. We're still getting applicants."

Within DASO, it's important to "take care of our people because they will take care of the public," the sheriff said.

"The people in our county like us; they support us," Stewart said. "They want us to show up."

Stewart said she has 43

years of experience "in and around" law enforcement, including 20 years of direct involvement with law enforcement and 23 additional years of government service. She said there are about 3,100 sheriffs nationwide, and she is one of 55 nationally and two in New Mexico who are women.

LCPS school board takes bold action

Here's a statistic you probably don't know, and it's one in which New Mexico ranked No. 1 in the U.S., and it's

No. 1 in the U.S., and it's actually a positive category.

In 2019-20, the state of New Mexico ranked No. 1 in the country in the increase of spending, per student, on its public education.

According to figures from the National Education Association, in 2018-19, we spent \$11,315 per child in school, which made us 34th in the nation in spending. The next year, 2019-20, we spent \$12,793 per child, which moved us to the top half in the country, at 24th in the nation.

That increase, a rise of 13 percent, was the No. 1 percentage increase in America.

Since my arrival in New Mexico in 1995, we have regularly been in the middle of the pack nationwide when it comes to per-student spending. Unfortunately, we've also regularly hovered in the bottom five when it comes to stu-

dent outcomes.

While I applaud that big increase in 2019-20 it came, at least in part, in response to a lawsuit — Yazzie/Martinez v. State of New Mexico — that took our state to task for the poor job it was doing providing programs and resources needed

to help students accomplish basic skills and aptitudes, particularly low-income, Native Americans and other challenged students.

The lawsuit cited our state's 70 percent high-school graduation rate, worst in the country, and the fact 70 percent of New Mexico students can't do reading, writing and 'rithmetic at their own grade levels.

I will add here that, in Las Cruces, our graduation rates are significantly higher than that, thanks in large part to a communitywide effort, more than a decade ago, to do something about it.

Throwing money often at problems often, but certainly not always, makes a difference. It all depends on how the money gets spent.

What's our problem here in New Mexico? Is it because, historically, a large number of our residents did not receive a lot of education? Is it because of our systemic poverty and myriad issues associated with that? Is it because low salaries hurt us when trying to attract good teachers? Is it because some of our teachers aren't trained as well as they could be? Is it because some students just don't care? Is it because some parents don't know how to help? Is it because our state's high rate of hunger hurts students' focus?

All of those factors and more play a role.

Enter the Las Cruces Public

Schools Board of Education.

The state and, by extension, the school board are flush with funds this year, thanks primarily to the increased value of oil and gas, which generates copious tax revenues to help fund our education system.

The board made two major decisions at its most recent meeting.

First, they gave teachers a 3 percent pay increase, which is added to the 7 percent raise legislators gave all the state's teachers. That's a 10 percent increase total.

Second, they will implement a "balanced" or "year-round" school calendar starting this July.

The year-round calendar is nothing new. About 4 to 5 percent of the nation's schools do this.

The number of summer days off are reduced, and some extra days and weeks off are sprinkled throughout the year.

An important first step for police reform, but more is needed

Las Cruces residents joined with Americans throughout the nation during the summer of 2020 in pro-

tests demanding police reform. While protests in other

cities turned violent and destructive, ours were peaceful and respectful. Which isn't surprising, given the generally positive relationship between police and our community.

But that respect should not be confused for a lack of purpose or determination for real reform.

Some protesters were misguidedly calling for abolition of the police, but most were seeking a more thoughtful approach and a new understanding of when and how that force should be used.

The new crisis intervention units being established through the Las Cruces Fire Department are a terrific first step toward that new vision. Teams will include a firefighter who is a certified EMT and a mental-health provider. A licensed clinical social worker will serve as coordinator.

They will be authorized to respond to five different types of calls that would have previously gone to police: welfare checks, intoxication, overdoses, suicide attempts and behavioral issues. Our emergency system handles an average of about 700 calls a month dealing with those issues. Transferring those duties away

from police will free officers to focus on more serious crimes and reduce incidents where a call for help results in lethal force being used.

The city had planned to only have the teams available six days a week for part of the day, but is now considering doing more.

It will be money well spent. If we're going to make real change, it can't be a part-time commitment.

Here in Las Cruces, MacArthur and Booker T. Washington elementary schools used this calendar for a number of years before switching back.

J. Paul Taylor Academy, a Las Cruces charter school whose students range from kindergarten to eighth grade, has used a balanced calendar since its

inception.

A lot of parents are upset about this change.

From the people I've talked with, the anger comes not necessarily from the plan itself, but from the timing.

By starting the new

schedule this year, it will interrupt some of the summer plans families have already made.

Fans of the balanced calendar say it helps prevent the "summer slide," when students spend so much time away from the classroom.

They like the more frequent breaks during the year, which fight burnout. Opponents say it takes away from tradition, and reduces time for both students and teachers to earn money at summer jobs.

Will this new plan, with a different calendar and higher teacher salaries make Las Cruces students better? Maybe. Maybe not.

But you don't get anywhere if you don't act.

But, this is only a first step. A critical piece to the puzzle is a crisis triage center that works efficiently with law enforcement to help people during a mental health emergency. And, that piece still doesn't fit.

Sheriff Kim Stewart has alleged that services at the center are unreliable,

and has directed her officers to stop taking people to the facility until her department has an agreement with the private company operating it.

That needs to happen soon. While the crisis triage center can only admit those who are voluntarily seeking assistance, it is a valuable resource that needs to be included in the larger community effort to provide help and reduce harm.

The final piece of the

reform puzzle is accountability. The national outrage in 2020 was sparked by cell phone videos of George Floyd's horrific death in Minnesota. Officer Derek Chauvin was found guilty of murder, and sentenced to more than 22 years in prison.

That same summer, we learned about the death of Antonio Valenzuela at the hands of Las Cruces Police Officer Christopher Smelser, who used a neck restraint hold that was allowed by LCPD then, but is not now. Smelser has been charged with seconddegree murder, and is scheduled to go on trial this month.

His trial will be a first, in a system where local law enforcement officers investigate their colleagues.

Legislation passed in 2021 makes it easier to sue officers for damages in civil court. But a seperate bill that would have established a uniform statewide system for criminal investigations of police-involved deaths failed, as did legislation for needed improvements to the State Law Enforcement Academy.

We are fortunate in Las Cruces to have a police force that is reflective of and respectful to our community.

But improvements can be made through structural changes that shift priorities, provide greater support from professionals in related fields and demand accountability.

Artist, weather watcher Penny Duncklee keeps spirits up after dog attack

A beloved Las Cruces icon, Penny Duncklee, encountered two dogs in her yard last week, March 16, which attacked and mauled her before a neighbor was able to stop them, probably saving her life. Transported to University Medical Center in El Paso, she went into surgery for her injuries. She lost her right arm up to the elbow and has had repair work done for the left.

According by a Go-FundMe (gofund.me/ b53509f8) page set up in her name, when first asked if she knew what happened, Duncklee said, "I was attacked by dogs. I fought back and screamed and screamed. I'm one tough cookie."

Her family says the page is set up primarily to share information about how Duncklee is doing, and any funds generated will be used for charities/causes that are important to her.

Born Easter Sunday 1937 in Hingham, Massachusetts, Duncklee has done many things. She was a sailor and boatmaker, a potter, an elected coroner and a tour guide as well as an artist. Since 2001 in Las Cruces, she has been a beloved local artist, a member of the New Mexico Watercolor Society — and twice the president of its southern chapter - a member of the Las **Cruces Arts Association** and founding member of the Ten O'Clock Club, another local organization for artists.

Duncklee told the Bulletin in a previous interview that she started painting on a regular basis while living in Colorado in the 1980s.

"I guess I've been painting ever since," she said.

Duncklee's son, Dave Crowell, reports daily on their GoFundMe page to let people know how she is doing. He said she is doing well and keeping her spirits up. She is "humbled" by the wealth of positive thoughts and photos folks are sharing via social media. In particular, because she loves sunsets, photos of sunsets have been flowing her wav.

Duncklee sends regular sunrise, sunset and other weather-related photos to KTSM, a TV news station in El Paso, earning their 2021 Weather Watcher of the Year award. The station has shared her images on their website.

Meanwhile, her natural cheer and enthusiasm are spreading through her environment as people look forward to seeing her everyday and she was even offered a job teaching other patients how to rehab.

She told them she already had a job as a weather watcher.

Robert Lara announces candidacy for district court judge

Third Judicial District Court Attorney Associate Robert Lara is a candidate for district judge Division 2 in the June 7 Democratic primary, Lara said in an interview.

With five years of experience as a staff attorney, Lara said he has worked directly with Doña Ana County district judges on family and civil cases that comprise the court docket, has "experience with court operations" and is "familiar with the process."

"I wrote that order," Lara said. "I researched that order. I've talked to that plaintiff."

Lara, who lives in Santa Teresa, said he has been an attorney since 2009, practicing in both family and civil law. He is a bar commissioner and a driving

force in the reactivation of the Doña Ana County Bar Association.

"I'm choosing to run for judge because I want to continue public service," Lara said. "We have a responsibility to help our neighbors and help the profession." The district court bench, he said, is where his skills and passions are best suited to help people.

If elected judge, Lara said he will seek "sympathetic solutions that are supportive of the law," for those who come before the court.

In divorce cases, Lara said a judge must consider not only both parties, but, if they are parents, must also consider the best interests of their children. Cases and rulings can include not only money and property, he said, but also issues of child support child custody, especially if one parent is relocating.

"Family law has its own unique challenges," Lara said, including that about 80 percent of those who come before the court are self-represented, about half are in poverty and many do not speak English. Many cases, he said, involve grandparents seeking guardianship of their grandchildren.

Lara said his goal is to

"streamline the system so you spend less time in my court and more time being a parent or grandparent."

As a judge, Lara said he will approach each case with "sympathy and creativity," recognizing that each is "unique based on the family."

As a judge, Lara said he also will help those who come before the court to find the community resources they need.

Civil proceedings are often landlord-vs.-tenant cases, he said, or the result of injuries suffered in a traffic accident or business partners who have split. As with family court, he said, civil cases must be considered on an individual basis, and must be moved forward to settlement or trial in a timely manner so the parties are not "buried in

A look at process of picking a judge

The Third Judicial District Court Judicial Nominating Commission considered three applicants (Robert Lara, Ramona J. Martinez-Salopek and Jeanne Quintero) for the court's Division 2 judgeship vacancy that was created by the recent retirement of Judge Marci Beyer, according to a news release from the University of New Mexico School of Law.

On Jan. 19, the commission recommended to Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham that she appoint Quintero to the judgeship. On Jan. 24, Lujan Grisham asked the commission to reconvene "to send her the names of additional people to consider" along with Quintero, the news release said. Both Lara and Martinez-Salopek have reapplied for the appointment, UNM said.

Whomever the governor appoints will fill the judgeship until a permanent judge is selected in the November 2022 general election and sworn in. The winner will serve a six-year term and be subject to a voter retention election in 2028.



Trinity Site open house set for April 2

White Sands Missile Range will open Trinity Site to the public on April 2. Trinity Site is where the world's first atomic bomb was tested at 5:29:45 a.m. Mountain War Time July 16, 1945.

The open house is free and no reservations are required. At the site, visitors can take a quartermile walk to Ground Zero where a small obelisk marks the exact spot where the bomb was detonated. Historical photos are mounted on the fence surrounding the area.

Visitors may ride the missile range shuttle bus 2 miles from Ground Zero

to the Schmidt/McDonald Ranch House, where the scientists assembled the plutonium core of the bomb. Visitors can experience life as it was for a ranch family in the early 1940s.

There are two ways to access Trinity Site.

Nearest to Las Cruces, a guided caravan leaves from Tularosa. Vehicles meet at Tularosa High School Athletic Field at 7 a.m. The caravan is limited to 125 vehicles and leaves promptly at 8 a.m.

The other entrance is through White Sands Missile Range via the Stallion Range Center Gate, 5 miles south of U.S. Highway 380. The turnoff is 12 miles east of San Antonio and 53 miles west of Carrizozo. The nearest city for hotel reservations is Socorro.

This is a free event. The Stallion Gate is open from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. Visitors arriving at the gate between those hours will be allowed to drive unescorted the 17 miles to Trinity Site. The road is paved and marked. The site closes promptly at 3:30 p.m.

To enter the range all vehicles, proof of insurance and registration are required; and all adults require picture ID.







Mike Groves has been capturing the power of the Organ Mountains and the other iconic landscapes of southern New Mexico for years. Adding one of these images to your wall will certainly signify a sense of place.

Also, bear in mind, a framed piece of art doesn't necessarily have to live all the time in the same place on the same wall. Changing and refreshing your framed art and photos can bring a new look and feel to the entire home.

"When it comes to home décor, it's important to remember that everyone has their own style," Nevue said. "When I work out a design with a customer, I always

because "a professional should do your flooring."

Schweinebraten, Stout Hardwood Floors Residential Project Manager Marek Rogers and Malooly's Flooring Company Manager Chris Todd also said hard-surface flooring has overtaken carpets in popularity, although Casey and Malooly's also continue to offer many carpet choices as well.

"Our showroom at one point was 15 percent hard surface," Schweinebraten said last year. "Now it's probably 50 percent." Hard surface is more durable than carpet, he said. For a living room, dining room or family room, "you're more apt to go hard surface right now because it's some-

thing you won't change for a long time."

Casey Carpet's stock includes "floating floors," Schweinebraten said, which "people can do themselves" because they simply click together and aren't attached to the floor. They're easy to care for, he said, and can be moved from one room to another.

• A Traeger grill. One of the most popular additions to a backyard is a Traeger pellet-burning grill, said a project manager at Western Stoves and Fireplaces in Las Cruces last year.

Traeger grills range from \$899 to \$1,499 and work like a convection oven.

"They have a blower that circulates the heat around your food, so you get a real even cook. It uses smoke to add flavor. You can bake in it, grill in it, cook in it and even do a little bit of a boil in it."

• A pizza oven. Who doesn't love pizza? Western Stoves and Fireplaces carries both indoor and outdoor versions of these ovens. which start at more than \$2,000. An outdoor oven can transform your backyard to the most popular place on the block when you host pizza night. It's also a great way to have a quick, homecooked summer meal without heating up your indoor kitchen.

Hiring a professional not only means the job will be done well and in a timely manner but also can benefit the homeowner with professional connections. For example, Sandino said he has connections in the financing industry he can recommend. He also only starts with 10 percent and then draws expenses as needed. He suggested customers beware of companies that require 100 percent of the cost of a job up front. He also has professional sub-contractors and suppliers he is familiar with and trusts.





moviereview 'St. Elmo's Fire' stays lit

Almost 40 years later, its stars largely remain identified as members of the so-called "Brat Pack."

Such was the impact "St. Elmo's Fire" initially had ... and continues to have, with Hulu currently streaming the 1985 comedy-drama. Directed by the late Joel Schumacher, the film was seen at the time as a younger take on "The Big Chill," which had been released two years earlier ... and it's no small thing that every major star of the picture has had an enduring career.

The central characters are friends from college who remain a tight-knit group, frequenting a Georgetown bar and leaning on one another while dealing with their respective steps into adulthood. Billy (Rob Lowe) is a big reckless musician who's pretty much a washout as a young husband and father, but his sincere social-worker pal Wendy (Mare Winningham) loves him unconditionally. The emotionally shaky Jules (Demi Moore) worries her buddies through her personal involvement with her boss.

Political worker Alex (Judd Nelson) is unfaithful to longtime girlfriend Leslie (Ally Sheedy), eventually complicating the close relationships both have with aspiring writer

Kevin (Andrew McCarthy). And entrepreneur-in-training Kirby (Emilio Estevez) develops a massive crush on an older doctor (Andie MacDowell) that drives him to make some questionable moves.

questionable moves.

Much of what makes "St. Elmo's Fire" works is how generally agreeable the cast is, keeping the proceedings interesting no matter what combination the actors are in ... whether it's only two of them of virtually all of them together. By definition, that also keeps the dynamic changing; you get something much different, for instance, from Sheedy with Nelson than you do from Sheedy with McCarthy.





CMI professor: Animation changes how you see the world

Animation is something Alex Santiago does as a modeler and filmmaker and teaches as an adjunct professor at New Mexico State University's Creative Media Institute. It's also changed how he sees the world.

"Animation is a unique way to tell a story," said Santiago, 32, who was born in Tucson, Arizona, and grew up in Alamogordo.

And since "everything is story driven," he said, animators have "more creative freedom" in a wide array of careers that stretch far beyond Walt Disney cartoons to include gaming, filmmaking, health care and many other industries.

Santiago took more than a year's leave from

CMI in 2020-21 to attend the prestigious Vancouver Film School (VFS), where he studied 3D animation and visual effects and graduated with honors. He was one of six "exceptionally promising animators" from the United States, Canada and Brazil selected from among more than 500 applicants worldwide by Pixar animator and director Michal Makarewicz to attend VFS on a full scholarship, according to the VFS website.

Santiago is an NMSU Crimson Scholar with a bachelor's degree in creative media. He was an adjunct professor at Doña Ana Community College for a year before joining the CMI faculty in 2017.

"Alex is amazing. We are really lucky to have him teach for us," said CMI Department Head Amy Lanasa.

The rigorous VFS curriculum is similar to what Santiago learned and is teaching at CMI, he said, but more geared toward animation for film and entertainment where CMI offers a more general study of animation.

Santiago said the VFS experience also connected him to professionals in the animation industry around the world and expanded his portfolio as a 3D modeler.

While he thrived in Vancouver, Santiago said he was anxious to return to CMI, whose animation program is consistently ranked as the best in the state and among the tops in the nation.

"I always have liked teaching," he said.

Santiago loves helping his students learn to "stop and really look at something."

Part of learning to be an animator, he said, is training the eye to see the specific details of an object, not only its dimensions and colors, but its textures, its play of light and shadow, its background and other qualities.

"You learn to observe your environment and the beauty in it," Santiago said.

"I love those little learning moments," he said, when he's with a student and "you can just see it. The lightbulb went on."

When his students discover "where they really want to shine and what they want to do, it's such

a fulfilling moment," Santiago said. "I love helping start students off on their journey."

Santiago said his passion for animation began in the second grade when he fell in love with 3D art and going behind the scenes to understand how animated cave trolls worked.

He encourages his students to "learn the why" of what they see on a computer screen and in the real world. And he reminds them that, in animation, there are no mistakes — only "happy accidents."

"If something doesn't work, you can delete it and start over, or press 'undo' a bunch of times," he said.

"You make it to break it. It's fun. You can just create. You start to think in 3D."

Even small projects such as planting a tree or installing fence posts can be very dangerous if you


UTILITY COLOR CODES Gas, Oil, Steam, Petroteum do not know what utilities are buried around your dig site. Whether Reclaimed Water, Irrigation & Sturry vou are a professional

excavator or homeowner, you can be fined AND held financially responsible for repair costs to damaged utilities when 811 is not called. How it works:

- 1. Use white spray paint and/or white marker flags to mark the ground where you plan to dig.
- 2. Call 811 two business days before beginning your project and they will alert all of the local utilities to respond to your dig site and mark where the utility lines are buried. Utility companies will have two days, once notified, to respond to your dig site.
- 3. Once utilities are marked, you must adhere to the "18 inch" rule, which is no mechanical digging (tractor, auger, etc.) within 18 inches of the utility markings. If you must dig within 18 inches of a utility marking, it has to be hand dug or vacuum excavated.
- 4. Once all of the utilities have been marked, you will have 15 days to complete your digging project. If your project is not complete in that time frame, you must call 811 again.





Fiber optics company Conterra Networks expands to Borderland

Conterra Networks, which has been providing fiber-optic network services for more than 25 years, is continuing to expand service in the El Paso-Las Cruces area, with local clients that include La Clinica de Familia (LCDF), Gadsden Independent School District and the City of Las Cruces, with city contracts at Las Cruces International Airport and West Mesa Industrial Park.

"The thing that really appealed to me about Conterra ... they are very community oriented," said Senior Account Ex-

ecutive Doug Boberg of Las Cruces, who recently joined the company. "They are very commit-

ted to the customers they do business with. It really does feel like a family," said Boberg, who is the principal coordinator for the Dress the Child program that has provided new clothes and shoes each year to hundreds of children in Las Cruces Public Schools and GISD.

Conterra began in Charlotte, North Carolina, in the 1990s by providing a fiber backbone for carriers like AT&T and Verizon, along with fiber to area school districts. They also provide business Internet: ethernet and VoIP technology that link multiple business locations, government, school districts and commercial businesses: along with back-up services if a network goes down.

"We have an extensive network here in Las Cruces and it's constantly expanding," said Conterra Senior Account Executive Carlos Medina.

Conterra's 100 percent fiber-based network is why LCDF partnered with the company for its 18 locations throughout Doña Ana County, said Medina, who lives in Las Cruces.

Providing fiber for all its services rather than a mix of copper, coaxial and fiber "improves the performance of the network and the quality of the services you get," said Conterra Area Sales Manager

Kirk Jefferson, a native of El Paso.

"If you've got fiber in the ground, you can upgrade and expand the network," Boberg said. "If you have copper or coax underground, you have to rip it out and replace it to be fully fiber."

Sales Engineer Pablo Rojo of El Paso said he worked with a local car dealership that had gotten used to poor Internet service.

"Those times are over," Rojo said. "You don't have to put up with that kind of stuff. The way we approach our clients is to ask questions ... to help

Booming Santa Teresa helps spur New Mexico to record export year in 2021

Led by the boom in Santa Teresa, the state of New Mexico "had a record year for exports in 2021," said New Mexico International Business Accelerator (NMIBA) Executive Director Jerry Pacheco.

The state's exports to the world were 46 percent higher in December 2021 than December 2020, according to an NMIBA report citing statistics from the U.S. Census Bureau.

The state had almost \$4.5 billion in exports in 2021, Pacheco said, compared to almost \$3.7 billion in 2020, almost \$4.7 billion in 2019, \$3.9 billion in 2018 and almost \$3.7 billion in 2017.

"Santa Teresa has boomed during the pandemic and never had to recover," said Pacheco, who is also president of the Border Industrial Association. "This is evidenced by the strong export performance. The recruitment of new companies that export to Mexico accounts for the


lion's share of exports. These companies are primarily located in Santa Teresa," he said.

Pacheco said the Russian invasion of Ukraine that began in late February is "developing and it is too early to speculate" on its

economic impact on New Mexico exports. However, Pacheco said he expects the export trend to con-

them fulfill their mission," he said. "We give them exactly what they need, and we have an idea for the future — what do you want to do down the line?"

Boberg said Conterra has moved into the Southwest as part of its focus on underserved markets like El Paso and Las Cruces/ Doña Ana County.

Having a premium fiber network is important to Las Cruces, Boberg said, because its availability is one thing businesses look for when they relocate or expand.

"If Internet is slow or unreliable and, if you don't have access to premium band-width services, they are likely to pass your city by," Boberg said.

"Businesses in Las Cruces have demanded better Internet service, and Conterra Networks is here to deliver," said Conterra President and CEO Craig Gunderson.

The company has invested more than \$35

million in its El Paso fiber-optic network over the past five years and has more than 400 miles of fiber in the El Paso-Las Cruces area, Conterra said.

Its investment in New Mexico, which includes both Albuquerque and Las Cruces, totals \$5 million.

Aggies end memorable season on a couple of bittersweet notes

It was a season everyone associated with the New Mexico State Univer-

sity men's basketball team will long remember, but there was also a twinge of the most bitter-

sweet emotion of all - of what might have been.

The Aggies, 27-7 overall, won their first NCAA tournament game in 29 years, upsetting the University of Connecticut 70-63 March 17 behind Teddy Allen's 37 points and came tantalizingly close to advancing to the Sweet 16, losing 53-48 to Arkansas March 19 in the

second round.

Adding to the bittersweet end to the season, head coach Chris Jans took the head coaching job at Southeastern Conference member Mississippi State not even 24 hours after the Aggies'

season ended.

That ended a stellar five-year run for Jans in Las Cruces, in which his teams won four Western Athletic Conference titles and went to the NCAA tournament three times.

Jans, during what

turned out to be his final news conference as Aggies coach, got emotional when talking about this vear's team.

"None of us wanted it to end," Jans said, shortly after the loss to Arkansas. "It's been special. We wanted to soak it up. I tried to get them to understand how rare these runs are and create some memories.

"We weren't shy about talking about San Francisco (where they would have gone to if they had advanced to the Sweet 16) and beyond," Jans added. "To be honest with you, I thought this team had a chance to make one of those special runs. Unfortunately, it didn't happen."

It still accomplished plenty. Besides the victory over UConn, the Aggies also won a share of the WAC regular-season title and won the conference tournament.

"We won a game in March Madness," Jans said. "That is probably what I will remember the most. I'm happy we gave that to our fan base; they have been starving for that. I'm sure they are disappointed tonight, like we all are. As the days get away and we gain some perspective. I think we will look back fondly on what we accomplished this year but (this loss to Arkansas) will sting for quite some time."

The Aggies committed 12 turnovers in the first

half against Arkansas and managed to score just 17 first-half points, but found themselves down by just nine at the break.

NM State battled back to briefly take the lead in the second half but Arkansas went on a run to put the game away.

In the first game, it was Teddy Allen with the heroics. His 37 points were the most scored ever in an NCAA tournament game at KeyBank Center in Buffalo, N.Y. Jameer Nelson of St. Joseph's had held the record with 33 points in a game with Liberty in

Against Arkansas, it was Oñate High product Johnny McCants who

New Mexico State University football coach Jerry Kill is on a 24/7 mission to sell his program and get players, fans and the wider community pumped up about it.

Spring football practice kicked off March 15 with a little different atmosphere under the direction of the Aggies' new coach - with music blaring from the sound system at Aggie Memorial Stadium and the public invited to attend practice.

"I tell them as long as you have insurance,

I don't care where you stand on the field," Kill joked.

Kill was hired last No-

vember after a 2-10 season. New Mexico State has a reputation for being one of the hardest places to win

in college football.

But that doesn't deter Kill or keep him from being optimistic. He is well-known for turning around programs, most notably at Minnesota in the Big Ten.

"I am fortunate to have turned about five programs around," Kill said. "They are all different, too. This one, we are focusing on fundamentals and technique."

Kill said the players he has on the roster have been receptive and energetic. And he's thrilled with their attitude.

"The kids have been tremendously responsive," Kill said. "I think they have bought into what we do. I don't think they have ever worked like this and this fast (paced)."

While conceding the program needs to attract more talent in the future, Kill is liking what he is seeing so far.

"I haven't had one player talk back to me," he said. "It's all, 'Yes, sir.' 'No, sir.' We have to get more talent and all that stuff. These are the guys right now. All I can ask them: It takes no talent to play hard. It takes no talent to give effort. It takes no talent to know what to do if you concentrate and focus."

Getting the fans and community to buy into the program is also crucial, Kill said.

"When you take over a program, it's not your program. It's not mine," he said. "It's the school's program. It is Las Cruces' program. It's the lettermen's program. It is all those people's program. Our job is to make them proud of the program."

Offensive coordinator Tim Beck said the kids are "trying extremely hard."

"We are putting a whole new system in," Beck said.

This month, let's pay tribute to history-making women golfers

In appreciation of Women's History Month during March, I thought it would be appropriate to honor some of the important women golfers of our time. Two of them were inducted

into the World Golf Hall of Fame (WGHF) a couple of weeks ago, and two others from New Mexico were already there. These four are Susie Maxwell Berning, Marion Hollins, Nancy Lopez and Kathy Whitworth. There are a total of 37 women currently on the WGHF.

First, Susie Berning (WGHF 2022) is originally from Pasadena, California, and moved to Oklahoma City when she was

13. She promptly won three Oklahoma State high school championships. After playing college golf at Oklahoma City University, she joined the LPGA Tour in 1964. During her pro-

fessional LPGA career, spanning most of three decades, she had 11 LPGA wins, including three U.S. Women's Open championships.

Next is Marion Hollins (WGHF 2022, posthumously). Hollins (1892-1944) was a fine American amateur golfer. In fact, she qualified for the U.S. Women's Amateur 15 times, and was runner-up on her first attempt in 1913; she won the event

in 1921. However, Hollins is best known as a golf-course architect and developer, a truly unique combination for a woman in that era. During the 1920s she played a major role in developing the Monterey Peninsula into a golf mecca, having been involved in Pebble Beach, Cypress Point and Pasatiempo at Santa Cruz. After becoming friends with Bobby Jones, she also inspired Jones to pick Alister MacKenzie to be co-designer of Augusta National. Hollins would soon become MacKenzie's "eyes and ears" — to report back her valued impressions of the course as it was being constructed.

Kathy Whitworth had 88 professional career wins (including six majors), the

most victories than any other golfer on either the LPGA or PGA Tours — six more than Sam Snead and Tiger Woods. Whitworth was born in Monahans, Texas, but grew up in Jal, New Mexico, and went to Odessa College. She was LPGA Player of the Year seven times and won the Vare Trophy for best scoring average seven times, all between 1965 and 1973.

She is a member of the New Mexico Hall of Fame, Texas Sports Hall of Fame, Texas Golf Hall of Fame and the Women's Sports Hall of Fame. At the celebrated opening of Sierra Del Rio Golf Club in Truth or Consequences in 2008, which hosted a small LPGA exhibition event, Whitworth gave a brief clinic and I had a chance to chat with her on that occasion. She is friendly, forthcoming and personable; and oh by the way, she had a flawless golf swing at 69. She was inducted into the World Golf Hall of Fame in 1975.

Nancy Lopez was born in Torrance, California, but spent her childhood in Roswell, New Mexico. She had prodigious golf skills as a kid. She won the New Mexico Women's Amateur in 1969 when she was 12 vears old. When she was a student at Goddard High School in Roswell, she was so good she played on the boys golf team. As a college freshman in 1976. Lopez was named All-American and Female Athlete of the Year for her play at the University of Tulsa.

She left college in her sophomore year and turned pro in 1977. During her first full season on the LPGA Tour in 1978, she won nine tournaments. Lopez is considered to be one of the greatest women golfers ever, having amassed 51 professional wins, and was named LPGA Player of the Year four times and the Vare Trophy winner three times. Lopez was inducted into the WGHF in 1987.

After the UConn game, McCants, Allen and Jabari Rice all said they were thrilled to be able to win a game in the NCAA tournament for Aggie fans across the state of New Mexico and the country.

"I love our fans," Mc-Cants said after the UConn game. "They are basically the heart and soul of our team. They bring energy and pick us up."

Aggie fans could say the same thing about Mc-Cants and this bunch — about the energy and joy they brought all season long, even if the ending wasn't quite what everyone wanted.

The strength of the Las Cruces Recycling Program relies on each person knowing what goes in their blue recycling container and what doesn't. For each bag of trash, pizza box with grease, and any stray Styrofoam, the entire truckload would be at risk of contamination when being screened.

Las Cruces: Do you know what does NOT go in your recycling container?

> Do NOT Bag Recycling

While you should bag your regular trash, your recycling gets sorted through a mechanical process and by human hands. Cans are separated from cardboard. and plastic bottles go in a different recycling stream than shredded paper. When recycling is in a bag, it can't be sorted and determined if it is recycling or trash and must be removed and landfilled. The plastic trash bag also tends to get caught in the recycling machinery and damages the equipment.

> Do NOT Recycle Styrofoam

Styrofoam of any kind cannot be recycled. This

includes packing peanuts commonly used in moving boxes, Styrofoam coffee cups, coolers, etc. Since Styrofoam cannot be recycled and is not biodegradable, it's best to avoid using this item whenever possible and, at minimum, never let it go in the blue bin.

Do NOT Recycle Anything with Food

While your latenight pizza or Chinese takeout may come in cardboard containers, these types of boxes cannot be recycled. Any grease or food particles present is contamination and can potentially contaminate the other clean materials to be recycled. Plus, materials with grease or food particles lure rodents and insects, known as "vectors," in the industry. Vectors transfer viruses & bacteria. and diseases to humans, causing a health and safety issue at a Material Recovery Facilities.

Do NOT Recycle "Tanglers"

Old rubber garden hoses might feel like a safe bet to recycle, but, along with things like wire extension cords, these are more examples of aspirational recycling, where you might believe there is a way to recycle them: remember: "When in doubt. throw it out." When tanglers come into the recycling stream in Las Cruces, they will find no home and damage sorting machines.

Remember to Keep It Simple and Dry

Things that can be recycled are clean, dry, and typically simple items. The most valuable recycling materials are corrugated cardboard, from Amazon or USPS, or plastic bottles, like rinsed milk jugs, and aluminum, steel, or tin cans.
