COUNTY ACCEPTS NM DOT FUNDS FOR ROADS

The Doña Ana Board of County Commissioners accepted funding from the New Mexico Department of Transportation, NM DOT for the Engineering and Roads Department to work on the following roads over the next 12 months, as follows:

- Accepted \$263,656 in funding from the NMDOT Local Government Road Fund (LGRF) County Arterial Project (CAP) to plan, design, manage construction, pavement rehabilitation or improvements and improve drainage of Higgins Lane, starting at the intersection with Watson Lane and continuing west for 0.63 miles to Desert Park, in Butterfield. The estimated cost of the project is \$351,541 and the County will contribute 25% or \$87,885.
- Accepted \$229,311 from the NMDOT Local Government Road Fund (LGRF) Cooperative Agreement Program (COOP) to plan, design, manage construction and drainage improvements of Westmoreland Avenue, starting 200 feet east from its intersection with Chiricahua Trail and proceeding east 0.42 miles to its endpoint in Doña Ana. The project's estimated cost is \$305,748 and the state will contribute 75% while Doña Ana County will invest \$76,437.
- Accepted \$142,377 from the NMDOT 2022-2023 Local Government Road Fund (LGRF) School Bus Route Program (SBR) to plan, design, manage construction and drainage improvements of Golden Sun Drive, starting at its intersection with NM 213 and proceeding northeast 0.49 miles to its endpoint, at its intersection with Sands Drive in Chamberino.

Church musician to retire after nearly six decades

Doug Weeks became a church pianist at age 10 and was playing the organ at church services when he was 12.

Weeks will soon lead the St. Paul's United Methodist Church Choir for the last time and retire after almost 60 years working in church music.

A Mississippi native, Weeks came to Las Cruces in 1995. When he puts down the baton after the Sunday, June 26, service,

Weeks will have been St. Paul's director of music ministries for almost 27 1/2 years.

Weeks, who turns 70 in August, said he decided to retire to have more time to spend with his family.

He and his wife, Rosanne, have been married since 1977 and have two children, Ryan, who

now lives in Baltimore, and Bethany, who lives in Denver.

"Having to reinvent myself is a scary prospect," Weeks said. "I'm excited to explore some possibilities."

"I've written a ton of music," he said, and, with the time now available to him, Weeks wants to get it online and available to other churches.

He taught elementary-school music for three years before going to work in music ministry, and has written about a

dozen children's musicals, including "Show-down" and "No Bully Zone," that "would be useful to churches with children's music programs" across the country, he said.

Weeks said he and Rosanne will stay in Las Cruces, continuing to live in the 1880 pecan-shaded farmhouse they bought not long after moving here.

"We love the house and garden," Weeks said.

He and Rosanne have two dogs, two cats, 14

chickens and 14 pigeons.

More than 50 years ago, as a ministerial student at Samford University in Birmingham, Alabama, Weeks was trying to decide if he would major in math or in music.

Whichever one was called first at his freshman orientation, Weeks decided, was what he would study for at least a semester.

"They called music first," he said. "I loved it. I didn't look back."

Looking back now,


Weeks has a lot of great memories in Las Cruces and at St. Paul's.

"I've had the freedom to do a lot of things," he said.

He has led St. Paul's choir to performances across the country and around the world.

He has led choirs and orchestras in a wide range of Christmas musicals that brought actors and visitors from the community to St. Paul's over the years, including

Las Cruces city government transitioning to electric vehicles

Slowly but surely the ICE Age is going to come to an end for the City of Las Cruces.

Today, the city's 700-vehicle fleet is comprised entirely of internal combustion-engine (ICE) vehicles. A resolution passed last year by the city council calls for 50 percent of the eligible fleet to be replaced by electric vehicles (EV) by 2030. City staff are working toward that goal despite high demand for EVs nationwide and a slowdown in their availability because of the pandemic.

"Eligible fleet" means about 350 sedans and F150 pickup trucks used by city employees, city Fleet

Services Administrator Luis Vela said. Electric versions of larger vehicles are either not currently available or, like solid-waste-collection trucks, are in the test phase, Vela said.

And, because the U.S. is moving away from vehicles powered by fossil fuels, the demand for EVs like the Hyundai Aconas sedan and the Ford F150 Lightning pickup is great. "This is a direction ev-

everyone is going in," city Sustainability Officer Lisa LaRocque said, and "fleets are the last in line given the high demand of consumers ready to snatch them up."

The city has four Aconas on order, Vela said, which should be in use by the Las Cruces Police Department by the end of this year. Nine Ford Lightnings are also on order.

Transit ICE buses will be replaced by EVs next year. The other seven should be replaced within about two years, she said.

Why EV instead of ICE? "Half of greenhouses gases measured in Las Cruces are attributable to vehicles that use fossil fuels," LaRocque said.

With less pollution, people will "still see the beautiful Organ Mountains in 20-30 years," Vela said.

"I think it's great," Mayor Ken Miyagishima said about the fleet conversion to EVs.

"First and foremost, it's going to save the city money" because it will reduce fuel costs, he said. The changeover is also "beneficial to the environment," Miyagishima said, as it will reduce vehicle emissions.

EVs also are quieter than ICEs, LaRocque said, and have about one-tenth the number of moving parts: about 200 for EVs and about 2,000 for ICEs.

That will mean less

maintenance for Vela's staff as the fleet is converted.

EVs are "all wiring, chips and modems," he said.

City mechanics will be trained in how to service EVs along with ICEs, he said.

EVs cost a little more than ICEs, Vela said, but the cost of maintenance is lower.

As the city fleet begins the changeover to EVs, staff are determining how many chargers will be needed to adequately service the fleet, and where those chargers should be located in the city.

The simplest chargers are \$200-\$600, LaRocque said. Chargers that include recording devices and security features cost \$3,000-\$5,000 each, she said.

City staff are also working with El Paso Electric to determine the rate the city will pay for charging EVs. If the charging is done late at night/early in the morning, it could cost less than 1 penny per kilowatt hour (kwh), LaRocque said.

A Hyundai Aconas has a 75 kwh per full battery charge, so it would cost less than 75 cents to fully recharge its battery during off-peak hours.

The vehicle likely could travel about 260 miles on a single charge.

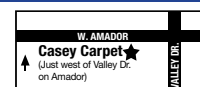

asked commissioners the obvi-
ous question: You approved
the results of the 2021 election
conducted on the same voting
machines; what's changed?We all know the answer to
that question. In a desperate
and dangerous attempt to stay
in power after losing the 2020
election, Donald Trump and his
supporters invented a myriad
of conspiracy theories. One of
those dubbed the craziest by
former lapdog Attorney General
William Barr was the notion
that Dominion voting machines

Jerry Christmore was born in Coffeyville, Kansas, on April 11, 1937. He passed away on Dec. 9, 2021 in Las Cruces, New Mexico, after a short illness. Grant will create paved trail at monument

BULLETIN REPORT

Friends of the Organ Mountains-Desert Peaks has received a \$33,000 grant from the Outdoor Recreation Division (ORD) of the Economic Development Department (EDD), EDD said in a news release.

"The project will pave a section of the La Cueva Trail from the Dripping Springs visitor center, the most popular area for visitors to Organ Mountains-Desert Peaks National Monument," the news release said. "The paving of the trail will make access for those in wheelchairs and with limited mobility. It will be the only trail of its kind within the monument. Close to three-quarters of a mile will be paved, including pullouts for wildlife and

scenery viewing. This is a joint project between the Friends of Organ Mountains-Desert Peaks and the local Bureau of Land Management office."

The project was one of 15 to receive ORD funding,

which is investing \$2.74 million in first-round outdoor recreation projects to expand access to the outdoors and grow the outdoor industry throughout New Mexico, EDD said.

The governor and law-

makers created the Outdoor Recreation Trails+ in 2019 to support projects that enhance communities' outdoor recreation opportunities. Trails, river parks, wildlife viewing areas, and more contribute to economic development, prosperity and wellness.

On March 1, Trails+ opened on a rolling basis with \$7 million in federal American Rescue Plan Act funding, which was appropriated in the 2021 December special session. This investment enables ORD to broaden the scope and ambition of the grant, with local awards of up to \$99,999 and regional awards up to \$500,000.

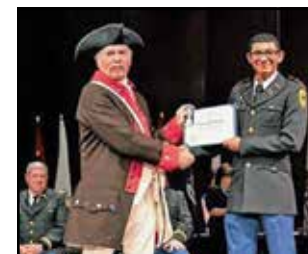

All 28 graduates will have completed rigorous training exercises and passed comprehensive state

exams that made them eligible for their New Mexico peace officer certification, the city said.

The education LCPD cadets receive exceeds requirements established by the New Mexico Department of Public Safety. LCPD's state-certified Academy provides more than 1,000 hours of law enforcement education and training. About 75 percent of the academy is classroom instruction. The remainder consists of field training in and around Las Cruces, the news release said.

Upon completion of the academy, each graduate joining LCPD will be assigned to an experienced field training officer who will guide him or her during an additional 14 weeks of instruction before becoming a patrol officer.

7 p.m. on CNN
Movie: Citizen Ashe

This new documentary from filmmakers Rex Miller and Sam Pollard explores the legacy of tennis legend and humanitarian Arthur Ashe, highlighting his enduring relevance to today's social movements. Ashe, who died of AIDS-related pneumonia in early 1993 at age 49, would have turned 79 next month. Before his untimely death, however, Ashe created a unique blueprint to advance civil rights for oppressed and disenfranchised people around the world. The film features

contemporary interviews with tennis icons Billie Jean King and John McEnroe, activist Harry Edwards and members of Ashe's family.

7 p.m. on STARZ
Who Is Ghislaine Maxwell?

This three-part docuseries, which will air on a weekly basis, endeavors to uncover how Ghislaine Maxwell — the Oxford educated youngest daughter of publishing editor Robert Maxwell who counted Britain's Prince Andrew among her close friends — wound up on trial for sex abuse linked to accused sexual predator Jeffrey Epstein. Epstein committed suicide in 2019 while awaiting trial, after which Maxwell became a fugitive to evade federal authorities. She was arrested in 2020 and convicted last December, and is due to receive her sentence this week.

8 p.m. on TRAV
Alaskan Killer Bigfoot

Seventy years ago, a murderous Bigfoot-like creature sent residents fleeing from Portlock, Alaska. Now, this new paranormal docuseries follows an expedition as it returns to that abandoned fishing village to reclaim the land and its

resources from the terrifying beast locals call Nantinaq. In the series premiere, after being blessed by a priest, the team makes its way by boat to Portlock, where the new arrivals feel a deep sense of foreboding. Even Kyle, a Bigfoot skeptic, can't shake the sense that he is being watched by something unknown.

8 p.m. on SUNDANCE
Movie: Building a Bridge

After many of his church peers seemed to shrug off the 2016 massacre at the Pulse gay nightclub in Orlando, Fla., New York-based priest, author and journalist Father James Martin was moved to pen a book about the often fractious relationship between the Catholic Church and the LGBTQ community. This feature-length 2021 documentary from filmmakers Evan Mascagni and Shannon Post follows the outspoken but affable Martin as he speaks on this topic to packed houses, often heckled by protestors, and consoles queer youth and their struggling parents.

As is traditional with "Westworld," a thick cloak of mystery surrounds Season 4

of this adult sci-fi series, which opens with several familiar faces in the cast. Whether those faces are playing the same characters, however, is very much in question. Leading lady Evan Rachel Wood, for instance, saw her iteration of the android host Dolores killed in Season 3, but the actress returns playing a new character, a writer. Other returnees include Emmy winner Thandiwe Newton, James Marsden, Ed Harris, Jeffrey Wright, Aaron Paul and Tessa Thompson.

APRENDAMOS has been serving our Las Cruces and surrounding communities for over 15 years. Aprendamos has partnered with families and community partners to bring services directly to families' homes. Aprendamos is made up of six programs serving children, adolescents, and families, and Aprendamos Early Intervention and Cariño Home Visiting serve our youngest population, infants, toddlers, and their families.

Cariño Home Visiting program provides free parent education and support to help families meet their goals. Our Home Visitors support expecting parents who are getting ready to welcome a new baby. They also provide breastfeeding support and education, a safe sleep curriculum, and can provide a free bassinet for families who qualify.

Cariño Home Visitors also screen infants, toddlers, and their family members for various things. Screenings and questionnaires include depression screenings, needs assessments, ages and stages for infants and toddlers, and much more. Cariño Home Visiting Team collaborates with community partners and Aprendamos Early Intervention team to bring families resources and therapy interventions so each family can reach their highest potential.

Aprendamos Early Intervention provides free developmental services for children ages birth to three. From evaluation to treatment to graduation, our teams are there to support

infants, toddlers, and their families. Our team of therapists and developmental specialists work with families to ensure their child is reaching their milestones and setting the foundation for a lifetime of success.

Aprendamos Early Intervention provides speech-language, occupational, physical, and family therapy. They also offer nutrition services, have nurses on staff, feeding specialists, infant massage specialists, social workers, developmental instructionist, and more. They also have dedicated Pediatric Specialists to help children who have been in the NICU (neonatal intensive care unit) or PICU (pediatric intensive care unit) or who are more medically involved.

Cariño Home Visiting and Aprendamos Early Intervention programs are excellent complementary services for expecting parents, infants, toddlers, and families. These two programs are unique, and services are offered in Doña Ana and Sierra Counties. Cariño Home Visiting also serves Otero County.

movie review

Dwayne Johnson takes on ‘Rampage’-ing monsters

This much has to be said for “Rampage”: It’s big and it’s loud, and if you know the classic video game it’s based on, it’s just what you’ll expect.

Being shown Sunday, June 26, and Monday, June 17, on TNT, it’s also a vehicle for Dwayne Johnson – who has redefined the movie action hero in his own sly way, adding knowing touches of humor while still putting forth all the brawn you could want from someone who has to stop three animals-turned-monsters from destroying Chicago.

Playing a primatologist, Johnson already has a friendship with an ape who becomes one of the outsized aggressors after being exposed to material that fell from a doomed space station. He doesn’t want to destroy the mega-gorilla that he relates to better than he does

most people, but he may have no choice if he wants to keep the Windy City reasonably intact.

A reptile and a wolf are the other giant problems for Johnson and his colleagues, who include “The Walking Dead’s” Jeffrey Dean Morgan and the always excellent Naomie Harris, also a “Moonlight” star and Miss Moneypenny to Daniel Craig’s James Bond in recent years.

Though “Rampage” is less an actor’s movie than a special-effects machine, credit also goes to a perfectly icy Malin Akerman (formerly of the series “Billions”) as a human villain who doesn’t care if a metropolis gets trashed, as long as her own immediate needs are met. Jake Lacy plays her partner in evildoing.

Guitarist follows journey to Las Cruces with inspiration, practice

Hunter Beck plays guitar a lot.

The classical guitarist practices six days a week. He slips into his music and, hopefully, his mind goes away.

"It becomes the music ideally," Beck said. "It takes a lot of practice to get there — it's fleeting. It de-

pends on where you are. If I would have started when I was 5 years old, achieving that would be easier. You want to be where there is no hands, no fingers and the muse is connecting with the music."

A roommate of Beck's played guitar — had three different guitars — and that started the musical journey. At the time Beck mostly played the room-

mate's electric guitar because he enjoyed the sounds he could produce.

"When I was 21 and I went to the music store, there was a classical guitar on the wall, an Alvarez, and that's what I took home," he said.

He got some books and learned from them, and meanwhile got a job working for the phone company.

"About five years later, it was a spring day, I was on a telephone pole, and I said, 'I'm going to climb down off this pole and go give my notice and go to guitar school.'"

So that's how, at age 26 he found himself at the University of South Carolina working on his bachelor's degree. Continuing his education, Beck got a teaching assistant scholarship and moved out west to Phoenix.

Finding Phoenix summers terribly hot, he started to play in Santa Fe in the summer. Graduating, he moved there, stayed for some 30 years.

"Santa Fe was really good in the 1990s and 2000s," he said. "A lot of my musician buddies bought houses and did really well. But then they lost their houses in 2010; it

(Santa Fe) really changed. It just got weirder and weirder, more and more rich people. I couldn't afford to live there."

So, he packed everything into his big old car and left. He went up through Colorado, down through Arizona, looking at various towns on the way.

"I went through all these mountain passes with my car fully loaded down, along with the bicycle and the dog," he said. "Finally, I said 'I guess Las Cruces it is.' And when I saw it for first time coming in from the west I thought 'OK, I'm home.'"

Before Covid, Beck had gigs around town. Now he is working to build his

playing business up again. But even when he doesn't have a gig, he practices and practices and focuses on balance. He also teaches Tai Chi.

"The modern lifestyle is push, push, push at the 95 level and it's hard to maintain balance when you do that," he said. "But the golden rule is the 70 percent rule. Never practice more than 70 percent of your capacity."

Beck said he doesn't think most Americans know what classical guitar is. It is a finger style, played on a Spanish nylon string instrument, he said.

"There is a whole repertoire of music for the classical guitar, but then you can really play anything

that way," Beck said. "The whole characterization of classical guitar is the texture, bass, lead and accompaniment. We use all five fingers. Why use a pick and deny the use of all these other fingers?"

Beck distinguishes between music and songs, saying they actually access different sides of the brain.

"As far as music goes, words access one side of the brain and musical tones access another side," he said. "I follow the melody, follow the line, try to be true to the music and the composer. A lot of people will throw in a lot of funky things that are from themselves, because they think they are neat, so that kind of changes tracks on the intent of the composer."

There are many variables in music interpretation, Beck said. It's about what the listener is used to hearing and how long they have been listening.

"I have been listening," he said. "It's been my specialty for a long, long time."

Diamonds to hoops: A look at top sports stories during school year

Summer is officially here and the school year is over. So it is a good time to look back on the top sports stories at the collegiate and prep levels during the past academic year.

10) Las Cruces High school wrestler Avery Atma truly suffers for his craft. Atma, a senior, won his third straight state title in Rio Rancho in February after suffering a hairline fracture of his collarbone in the semifinals and a possible torn knee ligament in the final.

Atma finished with a 31-0 record — his second straight undefeated season — and won the New Mexico 5A title at 126 pounds.

Las Cruces freshman Alyssa Sedillo won the girls state 5A title at 100 pounds, while Centennial's Tye Barker won the 5A title at 138 pounds. It was Barker's second straight state title.

9) The New Mexico State University women's basketball team had a tough year — battling Covid with multiple games having to be rescheduled. The Aggies never seemed to find their rhythm and had difficulty playing a full 40 minutes of basketball en route to a disappointing season.

Athletics Director Mario Moccia declined to renew the contract of fifth-year coach Brooke Atkinson and hired Jody Adams-Birch as her successor.

Adams-Birch brings a serious winning pedigree to Las Cruces.

She is the all-time winningest women's basketball coach at Wichita State and she played for four years at the University of Tennessee under legendary head coach Pat Summitt.

In Knoxville, Adams-Birch was a key part of three Southeastern Conference championship teams and a national championship team in 1991.

8) Track athletes at Organ Mountain High competed under a new name after being Oñate for three decades, but still experienced the same level of success under legendary track coach Dave Nuñez.

The Knights brought home three individual state championships in 5A this May and a handful of other strong performances at state including several school records being broken at the big meet.

Senior James Limon set a school record in winning

the state 5A title in the 400 meters, often considered the most difficult running event in track, while teammate and fellow senior Jonathan "J.T." Torres won the boys pole vault. In the girls competition, sophomore Shaolin Munir won the title in javelin.

7) It was a banner year for high school and college golf in southern New Mexico. The Centennial High girls team won the school's first-ever state team title in golf, whether boys or girls, in 5A competition, while the Mesilla Valley Christian boys won the school's first boys state title since 2005 in A-3A.

Organ Mountain's Eleanor Warden won the individual state title at 5A as an eighth-grader, edging defending champion Alex Armendariz of Centennial by 3 strokes.

The New Mexico State University women's golf team won its seventh Western Athletic Conference championship in eight years and 17th conference title in program

history and advanced to the NCAA regional in Albuquerque, where the Aggies finished 11th.

6) Both the Centennial High School and Mesilla Valley Christian softball teams had storybook runs through the postseason tournament but did it the hard way.

Centennial, seeded No. 2, had to work its way through the consolation bracket to reach the state 5A title game, where the Hawks lost to eventual state champion Carlsbad. The Hawks had to win three do-or-die games in one day to reach the final.

Mesilla Valley Christian, seeded No. 5, made a similar run in the state A-2A playoffs. The Son-Blazers also marched through the consolation bracket and were one win away from also getting to the state title game.

5) The Las Cruces High School football team started out its season 1-3 but ended up advancing to the state final four in 5A, where the Bulldogs gave Cleveland High all it could handle before eventually

losing.

The Bulldogs won two playoff games including a memorable revenge game against crosstown rival Centennial to reclaim the mythical city championship. Earlier in the year, Centennial overcame a late 27-point deficit to beat Las Cruces 42-41.

4) The New Mexico State football team has a new coach and a new attitude heading into the fall.

Jerry Kill was hired after a 2-10 season in 2021. Kill has a well-deserved reputation for turning around programs, most notably at the University of Minnesota in the Big Ten. During spring practice, sessions were open to the public and optimism is the word heading into the new season.

3) The New Mexico State University baseball team suffered through a frustrating, up-and-down regular season but caught fire at the end and squeaked into the WAC tournament. The Aggies ran the table in Mesa, Arizona, going 4-0 to win the conference tournament

championship and earned a spot in the NCAA tournament.

In the Corvallis, Oregon, regional, New Mexico lost to No. 3 national seed Oregon State in extra innings before being eliminated by Vanderbilt.

2) The Las Cruces High boys basketball team's quest for a state title ended with a heartbreaking overtime loss to Volcano Vista in the state 5A game in March. Both the Bulldogs and Volcano Vista were undefeated going into game.

The Bulldogs were led by a trio of seniors William "Deuce" Benjamin, Isaiah Carr and Kaden Self. During their time together, they made three straight trips to the state title game, winning in 2020.

1) The New Mexico State University men's basketball team had a season that will long be remembered by Aggie Nation — for a couple of positive achievements and one bittersweet one.

The Aggies won their first NCAA tournament game in 29 years, beating the University of Connecticut before losing a tight game with Arkansas in the second round.

Not even 24 hours after that loss, head coach Chris Jans announced that he was leaving Las Cruces to take the head coaching job at Mississippi State.

That ended a stellar five-year run under Jans, who won four WAC titles

throughout New Mexico and enriched my singular goal to reach multiple goals, thanks to the support of LCU Director Delilah Walsh, who made sure that professional development was integral to my daily duties,” she said. “By enrolling in the NM EDGE program, I have understood the impact my role has on my community, our citizens, the Utilities Department, LCU Board and CIAC members, my employees, and other local government entities.”

Ruiz credits two of the classes, “Conflict Resolution and “Improving Your Writing Skills,” that were instrumental in identifying techniques

she could use immediately, “I was able to build a stronger relationship with my direct staff by differentiating between formal and informal problem solving,” she said. “And, I shared with them that writing is a matter of thought and care, especially in the workplace, even while we focus on being clear and professional.”

Ruiz said, “What stuck with me is Charles Swindoll’s quote that we covered in class - that life is 10% what happens to you, and 90% how you respond to it. I post it at home to remind me daily that I am in control of how I will respond to life’s challenges, including seizing opportunities to develop myself and those around me.”

Best golfer who never won: The Laura Baugh story offers caution

One of the most amazing and compelling stories in all of professional golf is that of Laura Baugh.

She was born in 1955 in Florida. Her father, Hale Baugh, competed in the 1948 Summer Olympics (London) in the modern pentathlon. An excellent golfer, he introduced Laura to golf at an early age and she took quickly to it. She won the National PeeWee Golf Championships five times. Her parents divorced when she was 11 and she and her mother moved to Long Beach, California. At 14, she won her first of two straight Los Angeles City

Golf Championships. She capped her early career by winning the 1971 U.S. Women's Amateur Championship at age 16, being the youngest champion in the event's 76-year history.

Laura was a blonde, strikingly beautiful girl, and her beauty brought her considerable publicity. She was chosen Los Angeles Times "Woman of the Year" in 1971, and in 1972 she was named Golf Digest's "Most Beautiful Golfer." In 1973 she turned professional, earning her LPGA Tour card on her first try, then signing with International Management Group as

her agent. The very next week she placed second in her tour debut and earned 1973 "Rookie of the Year" honors.

With IMG's help the lucrative endorsement contracts came quickly, including Ford, Rolex, UltraBrite toothpaste and Wilson Golf. Tim Rosaforte wrote this 26 years ago for Sports Illustrated: "There was always a Norma Jean Baker quality about Laura Baugh, the blonde starlet who was supposed to take women's golf to Madison Avenue. IMG and the LPGA took every opportunity to promote her pulchritude over her putting."

It's funny the way things turn out in golf and in life. The expectation in 1973

was that Baugh would win 30, maybe 40 tournaments, setting new galactic heights for women's pro earnings. It turned out that she did not win a single tournament. In her 25 years on the LPGA Tour, she had 10 runner-up finishes (some painful) and 71 top 10 finishes, but no wins. Baugh's complicated personal life had a lot to do with that.

Winless in her first 12 years on tour, Baugh saw her big chance at the Uniden Invitational in 1986, but a leaderboard error led her to take a big risk on the final hole and she lost by one shot. Nerves and a tremor in her hands started to take its toll. She stayed at the bar after golf,

downing two large glasses of wine. Her hands stopped shaking. Months later there was a rain delay in the afternoon, and certain her golf was over for the day, she drank five glasses of wine during the wait. But play resumed and she proceeded to make five quick birdies. She was hooked. For the next 10 years, Baugh's alcoholism and denials continued to worsen. In 1996 it almost killed her, when she came within a moment of totally bleeding out at Sand Lake Hospital in Orlando. She was given Last Rites. Miraculously, she survived and entered Betty Ford Clinic in Palm Springs. She has been sober now for 26 years. In 1999, she wrote

about her golfing career and battles with alcoholism in her book "Out of the Rough," with forward by Arnold Palmer.

Baugh had been married and divorced four times. Her first lasted only a month. She then married South African and former PGA Tour player Bobby Cole. Her seven children are from that marriage.
