



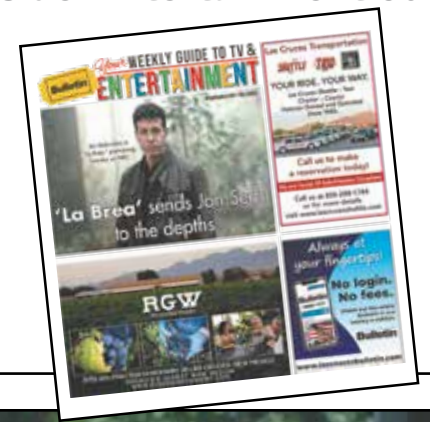

### 988 AND SUICIDE PREVENTION HOTLINE

In August 2019, FCC staff—in consultation with the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration, the Department of Veteran Affairs, and the North American Numbering Council—released a report recommending the use of 988 as the 3-digit code for the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline. In July 2020, the FCC adopted rules designating this new phone number for Americans in crisis to connect with suicide prevention and mental health crisis counselors. The transition, which will take place over the next two years, will result in phone service providers directing all 988 calls to the existing National Suicide Prevention Lifeline by July 16, 2022.

Americans who need help today can find it by calling the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline. The National Suicide Prevention Lifeline can be reached by calling 1-800-273-8255 (1-800-273-TALK) and through online chats. Veterans and Service members may reach the Veterans Crisis Line by pressing 1 after dialing, as well as by chatting online at [www.veteranscrisisline.net](http://www.veteranscrisisline.net) or texting 838255.

## Early voting starts Oct. 5

### A look at key races, important dates in upcoming local election

Early voting in the Nov. 2 local election begins Tuesday, Oct. 5 at the Doña Ana County Government Center, 845 N. Motel Blvd. Alternate early voting locations will open across the county Oct. 16.

With two disqualifications, one withdrawal and two write-ins since filing day on Aug. 24, there are a total of 60 candidates vying for 37 public offices in Doña Ana County in the Nov. 2 local election.

The races include municipal offices in Las Cruces (three city council seats), Mesilla (two town council seats and municipal judge), Anthony (mayor, two city council seats and municipal

judge), Sunland Park (three city council seats and municipal judge) and Hatch (mayor and two village council seats); Las Cruces Public Schools (three seats), Gadsden Independent School District (three seats) and Hatch Valley Public Schools (two seats) boards of education; Doña Ana (two seats) and Caballo (two seats) soil and water conservation district boards of supervisors; the Anthony Water and Sanitation Board; the La Union Watershed Board; and the Lower Rio Grande Public Water Works Authority.

With the addition of write-in candidate Gregory Shervanick in District 3, there will be ranked choice voting races on the ballot in Las Cruces City Council districts 3

and 5. Shervanick joins Bev Courtney and Becki Graham on the ballot in District 3. In District 5, the candidates are David Telford, Robert Paquette, Ronnie Sisneros and Becky Corran. There are only two candidates in the District 6 race, incumbent Yvonne Flores and challenger William Beerman, so there will not be ranked choice voting for that seat.

Las Cruces is the only municipality in the county that adopted ranked choice voting. The winners of multi-candidate races in the other municipalities will be the candidates in each race who receive the most votes, whether a majority or a plurality, in a single round of voting.

## Masks now required indoors until Oct. 15

The statewide requirement that face masks be worn in all indoor public spaces, with only limited exceptions and regardless of vaccination status, will be extended through at least Oct. 15, the Office of Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham announced.

Lujan Grisham authorized the reimplementation of the mask requirement last month in an effort to stem the state's rising tide of Covid-19 infections and hospitalizations.

The reimplemented face mask requirement has contributed to reducing viral transmis-

sion in the state over the last month, the governor's office said, adding that the state's state-day average Covid-19 test positivity rate was 9 percent on Aug. 16 and decreased to 6.5 percent as of Sept. 14. But total statewide hospitalizations have remained generally steady over the past month and staffed hospital beds remain in short supply, as primarily unvaccinated individuals continue to spread a more infectious variant of the virus, the governor's

office said.

Health officials, including at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, continue to recommend face masks be worn in indoor spaces as they are effective in limiting the spread of the more transmissible "Delta" variant, the release said.

The governor, acting upon the counsel and analysis of the state Medical Advisory Team and state health officials, may decide to extend or lift the mask requirement as necessary.

The separate public health order requiring health care workers to be vaccinated and vaccinate-or-test requirements for school workers remains in

place, the release said.

Vaccination continues to be the most effective tool against Covid-19, the governor's office said. The New Mexico Department of Health reports there were 58 percent more vaccinations administered in August than in July statewide, likely attributable at least in part to the state's financial incentive program.

Despite New Mexico's status as one of the nation's leaders in vaccination rates, around 30 percent of eligible New Mexicans are not yet fully unvaccinated, necessitating the continued use of face coverings in public settings as the infectious variant remains in circulation, the news release said.

Officials will receive training in opening and closing the polls, setting up voting equipment and issuing ballots.

# City Councilor Gabe Vasquez announces his bid for Congress

Las Cruces City Councilor Gabe Vasquez made it official during a celebration event Saturday afternoon, Sept. 18: He is running for Congress in New Mexico's 2nd Congressional District, which includes Las Cruces and all of the southern part of the state.

Incumbent U.S. Rep. Yvette Herrell, R-N.M., "is doing her best to demonize black and brown people," Vasquez said at the event. Herrell, he said, "can't be the future of this community. I refuse to let her continue to represent this district without a fight."

Vasquez will be a candidate in the June 7, 2022 Democratic primary for the U.S. House seat. The general election is Nov. 8, 2022.

Vasquez, 36, was elected to the city council in 2017. He announced earlier this year that he will not seek re-election to the council.

A native of El Paso, Vasquez is a project director for the Western Conservation Foundation. He is a first-generation Mexican-American whose parents were migrant workers.

Vasquez grew up in Juarez and El Paso and has lived in Las Cruces since 2002. He graduated from New Mexico State University in 2008 with a bachelor's degree in English with a minor in journalism and public relations.

His professional experience includes working as the business editor of

the Las Cruces Bulletin, executive director of the Hispano Chamber of Commerce de Las Cruces, vice president of public relations for a local medical monitoring device company and as an aide to U.S. Senator Martin Heinrich, D-N.M. Vasquez also worked in Washington, D.C. as a communications director and public policy expert for a nonpartisan children's advocacy organization.

The Sept. 18 event was attended by Doña Ana County Commissioners Manuel Sanchez

and Shannon Reynolds; County Clerk Amanda Lopez Askin and Chief Deputy County Clerk Lindsey Bachman; City Councilors Kassandra Gandara, Johana Bencomo and Tessa Abeyta-Stuve; state Rep. Angelica Rubio and state Sen. Carrie Hamblen, both Las Cruces Democrats.

If elected to Congress, Vasquez said his priorities will include immigration reform, raising wages for the working class, fighting against climate change and increasing funding for childcare and education.



South Central Solid Waste Authority's (SCSWA) Chaparral Collection and Recycling Center caught fire on October 12, 2020. The Center, at 180 McCombs Road, had significant amounts of fire damage to the main building. Repairs and reconstruction are underway now, as long materials for repair arrive on time. "During the repairs, we have been partially open to residents with only residential household waste," explained Eddie Sanchez, SCSWA Chaparral Transfer Station Manager. "At the moment, commercial customers are not permitted to dispose of construction materials allowing us to manage the volume of waste safely for the public and staff while under construction."

Sanchez said the incident would serve as an example to help staff educate customers on what is not allowed to be disposed of at our collections site to avoid future fires.

"Our staff are trained on how to inspect our customers' waste to prevent fires," Sanchez said. "And, to improve our screening process we will be using a

handheld thermal camera to detect any heat – that may indicate something dangerous – within the waste that is coming in."

While reconstruction started on July 12, 2021, it was delayed because the construction materials were back-ordered by vendors; however, some initial work was done, such as pressure washing and then painting the structure's frame. Once the painting was complete, the siding started to be replaced in phases. Next was the roof and the electrical install with new wiring and lights.

"Once we have a final update on when the concrete will be poured, we should have a better time frame of when it is safe and we can be fully operational," Sanchez said.

"The fire-damaged



concrete has been broken and removed, but the contractor is on a delay because of the backorder of the rebar that allows them to install high strength concrete to resist heavy equipment. Plus, once the rebar is installed, it will need to go through all inspections and approvals."

He said, "Some of the things are out of our control to get the repairs done, but we are looking forward to the reopening of our Collection site to be in full operation as soon as possible."

## Eastwood and the Land of Enchantment

The actor-director-movie star Clint Eastwood is always good for a quote.

Some of the famous ones are “You just gotta ask yourself one question: ‘Do I feel lucky?’ Well do ya, punk?!” from 1971’s “Dirty Harry,” or “Go ahead, make my day!” from 1983’s “Sudden Impact,” or “Get off my lawn!” from 2009’s “Gran Torino.”

Some of my personal favorites include, “A man’s got to know his limitations,” from 1973’s “Magnum Force,” “It’s a helluva thing, killin’ a man. You take away everything he’s got and everything he’s gonna have,” from 1992’s Oscar-winning “Unforgiven” and, of course, the all-time greatest, from 1983’s “Sudden Impact,” “Nobody, I mean nobody, puts ketchup on a hot dog!”

Before any of those movies, in 1967, when he was still best known for playing ramrod

Rowdy Yates on the TV cattle drive Western, “Rawhide,” Eastwood came to Las Cruces.

Fourteen years ago, when I first began working in Las Cruces, my friend Joe Enriquez, who grew up here, showed me one of the locations where Eastwood and crew filmed scenes from the movie “Hang ‘Em High.”

Fifty years after “Hang ‘Em High,” Eastwood returned to the Mesilla Valley to shoot several scenes for his 2018 movie, “The Mule.” The movie had mixed reviews, but I liked it a lot, and it was fun seeing all the recognizable locations, despite the fact they were identified as El Paso.

Eastwood is still directing and acting in movies at age 91, and he must have a favorable opinion of the Land of Enchantment, because he returned yet again.

His latest effort, “Cry Macho,”

is out now, and this one was also filmed in New Mexico. Sierra County is as close as they got to Las Cruces this time. There are scenes in Socorro, Sandoval and Bernalillo counties as well.

And then there’s the movie that wasn’t shot in New Mexico, but should have been.

The first time I saw the 1966 Eastwood classic “The Good, the Bad and the Ugly,” a friend scoffed at the Civil War scenes taking place in the high desert, questioning the authenticity. This was way back when I was in college, and it wasn’t until many years later I learned that, indeed, there were several Civil War battles fought in the high desert, particularly in New Mexico.

Though “The Good, the Bad and the Ugly” doesn’t say the name of the place or the battle in the film, most educated guessers believe it’s very loosely based on the Battle of Glorieta Pass, in the Sangre de Cristo Mountains of New Mexico,

between Santa Fe and Pecos, in March 1862.

Those scenes were shot in Spain and directed by an Italian.

I’ve probably seen “The Good, the Bad and the Ugly” a dozen times or more, but the most enjoyable was at a Saturday matinee at the Fountain Theatre a few years back. It’s certainly a “guy” film, and I went with some great guys, and we all enjoyed it immensely. When we walked out of the theater onto the Mesilla Plaza, it felt like a time warp, as some of the buildings there are almost as old as the setting of the film. In fact, the property where the Fountain Theatre stands was once Confederate headquarters for the Territory of Arizona.

In his incredibly long and productive career, Eastwood has explored a great variety of topics. The Westerns, of course, and the Dirty Harry films, are iconic. He’s also done films about jazz, stalkers, a punching orangutan,

# Remembering the Big Dog's bite and the mark he left on NMSU

The Big Dog is gone. Neil McCarthy died in his sleep last Sunday after living for 81 years.

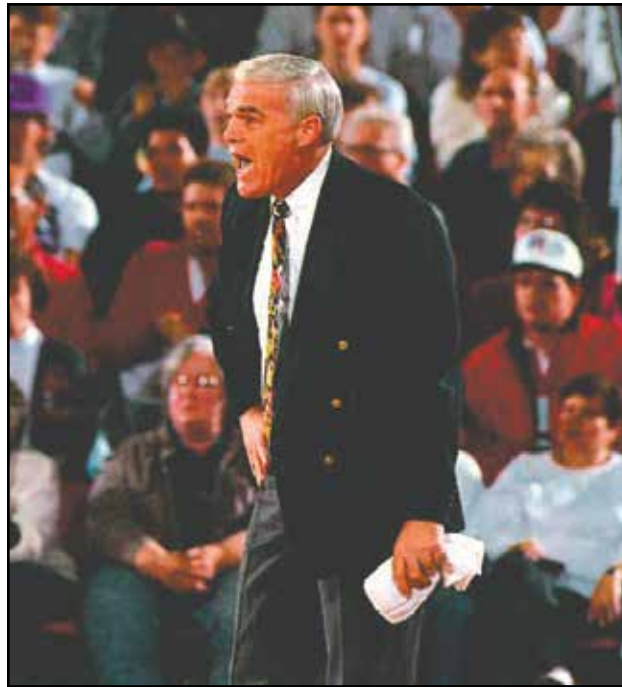
The first time I met Neil was at the All-College Tournament in 1978. NMSU had beaten his Weber State team for the championship and we spoke briefly at the post-tourney dinner.

He dressed like comedian Steve Martin back then. He wore a white suit, as Martin did, and bore a passing resemblance to the funny man from across the court.

Little did I know that this would be a man that I would accompany on one of the most successful and unpredictable athletic eras at NMSU.

I returned to Las Cruces for the 1986-87 season, which was Neil's second year coaching the Aggies. That year and the next produced .500 seasons in the win column. That would change in 1988-89 and the postseason appearances continued for the next seven years.

In my job, I have to get

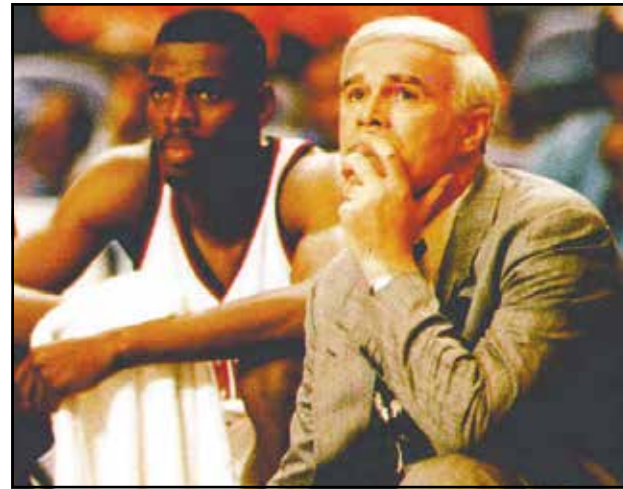

along with all the coaches I work with, obviously this is easier with some than others. Neil was cooperative with me as far as interviews and coaches shows, and didn't offer much more than the bare facts in an aloof manner. But he really had a bully's mentality and I gained his respect when I refused

to change a column I had written in The Bulletin. Neil called me on a Sunday asking me to retract or correct the column because he was getting heat from the player's agent. I believed in what I had written and chose that over whatever fresh hell could rain down on me in the future from Coach.

I said I appreciated his position, but that I wasn't going to do what he asked. He said OK, and after that, I was a made man in Neil's world. Welcomed openly at practice, more engaged interviews not that there weren't some postgames interviews that led to drama.

After a game at Long Beach State in 1988, unhappy with the officiating, Neil called one of the refs a "cheating little worm" and a "sick old man." I tried my best to steer him

on to anything else unsuccessfully for the next five minutes. After completing his rant, he said, "Now we can talk about the game".

Neil referred to himself as "The Big Dog" and by the early 90s was used to getting what he wanted at home or on the road. After a game at UC-Irvine, the team was connecting through Phoenix. McCarthy became engrossed in a college game on TV in the lounge. The flight was called and a member of his staff came to retrieve

him. Neil wanted to see the end of the game and told his staffer, "The airline won't leave the Big Dog." They did.

He caught a later flight back to El Paso.

Neil had a very kind, generous side, that he showed to a select few. There was a time, when Neil's advice saved my world. My sister was terminally ill and I was having trouble dealing with her son, who was 17 at the time.

I knew Neil had lost his first wife to leukemia and reached out to him at his home. His advice was on point and helped diffuse an emotional situation.

Neil was a special type of person and whether you liked him or not, his mark is indelible on NMSU athletics.

### Steps to fight climate change

On August 9, 2021, the U.N.'s International Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) released its sixth assessment of global climate science. The U.N. chief called the findings a "code-red for humanity." In unequivocal terms, the climate crisis is here, driven by our obsession with burning fossil fuels. Unless we take immediate and aggressive

action, we will experience catastrophic climate outcomes.

The good news is there is still time to act. Like most cities across the country, one of the biggest sources of emissions in Las Cruces is from transportation. Right now, the City has broad authority to reduce transportation emissions and make Las Cruces a more resilient, healthier and equitable city. As a bonus, benefits to local air

quality from emissions reduction would be immediate.

Electric vehicles will not save us, but less driving will. We are too late to rely on automakers to manufacture electric vehicle fleets at scale. Fortunately, we possess the tools to encourage less driving by expanding public transit and investing in safe pedestrian and bicycle infrastructure. In the long-term, the City can incentivize develop-

ers to build mixed-use, pedestrian-oriented development so residents can live, work and play without the need to drive. We chose to build a city in which the prerequisite for participating in daily life is car ownership. We can choose a better future.

Las Cruceans should urge our city leaders to undertake the following actions immediately:

One, adopt a city-wide policy requiring all major

road work and repaving projects to include new or enhanced pedestrian and bicycle safety measures consistent with the nationally recognized NACTO Urban Street Design Guide.

Two, adopt a city-wide policy to prioritize pedestrian and bicyclist safety above automobile traffic on all city-owned and maintained roads regardless of street classification.

Three, construct 100 percent of the Top 20 Priority

Bikeway Projects identified in the Active Transportation Plan by the end of 2023.

Our city leaders must take aggressive action in redirecting the course of our transportation infrastructure.

The science is clear. The policies are proven. We must not delay.

# Work of love: Author writes 2 books on legacy of Cruces High

When a friend in Rio Rancho asked Martha Saunders to check in on her father in Las Cruces, the rest was history, literally. Saunders needed to think of a reason to visit her friend's 75-year-old father and decided to tell him she wanted to interview him for a book.

"It was an excuse to do a home visit," Saunders said. "I wanted to make sure his environment was safe at that time. I wanted to have a reason to check

on him, so the book was my reason."

But Saunders was also

inspired because she attended the 100th graduation of Las Cruces High School (LCHS) in 2019 and started thinking about the school's long legacy.

"That's what I wanted to commemorate," she said. "We invited three alumni, two are in my book, Mr. Roach and Mr. Trujillo, one graduated in 1945, the other one in 1947."

Saunders' book, "LCHS 100, a Tribute to Our Legacy," came together quickly after her interviews with the two alumni. They referred her to others, and it kept growing.

"I have a lot from 1949," she said. "One woman said you have to interview this person and that per-

son and so on."

After spending about eight months tracking and interviewing LCHS alumni, she put the stories together. Some interviews took five hours and some just one hour, she said. With four generations of her family attending the school, it's no wonder she feels close to it.

Her grandfather, James F. Saunders, was the first Bulldawg in the family. He graduated in 1939. In addition to herself, her father, uncle and son also graduated from the school.

Then, when it was published, she put in the footwork to distribute it during the Covid-19 crisis. Saunders' newest book,

ers for the book and also includes 10 teachers in a memorial section.

"The oldest teacher I interviewed was Mrs. Hubbard or Mother Hubbard, just before her 94th birthday," she said.

Las Cruces community icon Barbara Hubbard was a LCHS teacher before going to teach at New Mexico State University. Saunders said she had to go back three times to get the interview done because Hubbard is still such a busy woman.

In the book are memorable teachers like Donald Jones who taught Spanish and world history and was at the school for 41 years. Saunders said Jones retired and went back and substituted for another year. Another teacher who taught for 41 years, she referred to as Mrs. Thomas.

Also in the book is re-

"The Legendary Teachers of LCHS," is now out, and she will be presenting and signing it from 3 to 5 p.m. Oct. 2, at the Rio Grande Winery, 5321 N. Highway 28.

After the first book, she realized the teachers at the school were the people who made the difference, not only teaching but mentoring students. She interviewed 23 teach-

# Paquette makes first bid for elective office in District 5 city race

Members of the Las Cruces City Council “are not representing the people who elected them to office,” said Robert Paquette, who has lived in Las Cruces for 25 years and is a candidate for city council.

“I’m not pointing fingers. I’m about solutions,” Paquette said. “I believe we can do better.”

Current council members, he said, “are doing the best they can with the information they have.” What’s missing is communication and a city councilor who will “reach out to the public,” Paquette said, and “put the unity back in community.”

Paquette is one of four candidates in the race to succeed Gill Sorg, who is not running for re-election in District 5. Because there are more than two candidates in the race, it will be decided by ranked choice voting in the Nov. 2 election.

With a background in marketing, communications and video production, Paquette said he knows how to find the “pulse of the community in real time” and make the right decisions based on what people want their government to do.

The city, he said, should invest more in technology to improve communication, create measurable results and provide feedback to the community.

Paquette said he has a long work history in desktop publishing, building websites and databases and surveying the public. He worked for seven years in the Memorial Medical

Center information technology department before starting his own company in 2010, he said.

Paquette previously had a career in the medical field in Seattle, he said, driving an ambulance and working in paramedics, nursing and physical therapy.

Paquette said he has recovered from stage four colon cancer, including multiple rounds of chemotherapy and surgery over several years, and has been cancer free for 15 years.

“I was given a second chance at life,” he said. “Not for me, for others.”

Paquette said his goal

is to “use the skills and talents I have for us as a community. I’m involved ... because I love this community.”

Paquette said he also lived on the street for four years before coming to Las Cruces, and that helped drive his desire to help others.

Paquette is the former president of La Mesa Lions Club and an award-winning club member. He also has volunteered for Big Brothers Big Sisters, March of Dimes and other nonprofits.

Paquette said he is concerned that the Las Cruces Police Department is not at full strength.

“We need to pay more,” he said.

The salary increase should be at least 5 to 10 percent more than the state’s average salary for

police officers, Paquette said.

Paquette said he also wants to work with Chief Miguel Dominguez “to have a more community-engaged police force.”

Paquette said the city should also be doing more to help local business owners with direct financial assistance.

“Don’t just say, ‘Good luck, guys,’” he said.

One possibility would be to create a “pandemic tax” levied on large businesses that operate in Las Cruces and aren’t locally owned but have made

record profits during Covid-19.

“Put us first,” Paquette said, including local business owners, employees and citizens.

The city also needs to think ahead, Paquette said. “Be proactive, not reactive.” With regard to the pandemic, he said, the city should “plan like it’s going to happen again.”

It’s also time to “stop the panic mode” in Las Cruces and “lower the anxiety in the city,” he said. “We don’t need to be reminded every second, every day about the pan-

dem.”

Paquette said he is “not anti-vaccine, but I believe in choice.” The right to choose should be protected, he said.

“I will get vaccinated for you, for the public,” he said. “I will wear a mask for your comfort.”

Paquette said he is concerned about “push(ing) the whole world to have a vaccine without having it tested.”

# Bev Courtney makes third bid for District 3 city council seat

Fair elections, smaller government and freedom of choice are among the issues in Bev Courtney's campaign for the District 3 seat on the Las Cruces City Council.

Courtney is making her third consecutive run for the District 3 seat. Incumbent Gabriel Vasquez

is not running for re-election. Courtney, Becki Graham and write-in candidate

Gregory Shervanick are in the race to succeed Vasquez. Because there are more than two candi-

dates in the race, it will be decided by ranked choice voting in the Nov. 2 local election.

Courtney lost to Vasquez in 2017 and lost to then incumbent Olga Pedroza in 2013. Courtney also ran unsuccessfully for mayor of Las Cruces in 2019 and for state representative District 37 in 2018.

Courtney said election integrity is a major issue in her 2021 campaign. She won court cases over ballot signatures that were required in previous city council races, Courtney said, and she continues to be concerned that local elections be administered fairly.

"I haven't been given a fair, square deal," Courtney said. "That's why I'm here again."

Elections, she said, should be free, fair and honest.

A longtime Republican, Courtney said she doesn't believe that "one party has all the answers." But, she said, there are currently no conservatives on either the city council or the Doña Ana County Commission.

In the nonpartisan city council race, Courtney said she is running as a conservative who believes "smaller government is better government."

Courtney said she doesn't like government mandates.

Covid-19, she said, is a good example. Her two children, both of whom work in the medical field, have convinced her to wear a mask, but people should be allowed to make up their own minds about wearing them, she said, and about getting a Covid vaccine.

Another example, she said, is the city council's recent support for an ordinance to limit the use of plastic bags.

"It's better to persuade," she said. "Don't force it."

"I don't want the government to do harm by force," she said. "I believe in freedom of choice. That's what I'm running for."

In terms of health, education and other issues, Courtney said, that also means the freedom "to work hard and do better."

Safety is another issue

"of utmost importance," Courtney said in a campaign news release. "Our police department is approximately 50 officers short. Nationwide sentiments regarding police misconduct and questions about the appropriate role of police officers have affected recruitment efforts and officer morale."

Courtney said she "will work to develop a strategy of recruitment and retention."

More police training and additional police academies are also needed, she said.

"People need to be safe," Courtney said.

An Oklahoma native, Courtney was one of seven children and was raised by a single mother. Courtney has lived in Las Cruces for about 30 years. She has managed a number of apartment complexes over the years, owned a retail business selling belts and holsters, homeschooled her children and been a community activist and a volunteer on a number of political campaigns. A Christian, Courtney has also been a church volun-

teer, including for a prison ministry. Courtney also is NRA trained and is a state-certified concealed carry weapons instructor. In fact, it was gun rights, she said, that got her involved in politics to begin with.

While it's important to keep guns out of the hands of the mentally ill, Courtney said she does not favor a so-called red-flag law because it violates due process.

If elected, Courtney said public access will be a very important issue in her council service, including monthly district meetings held during the evenings so community members can attend.

"Have integrity," she said. "Listen to people. I like the debate of ideas. Hear the debate and treat everyone with respect."

Transparency is also important, she said.

Courtney has a GED and attended two years of nursing school.

"If you work hard, you can do anything you want," she said.

tired French teacher Pamela Court, named New Mexico Teacher of the Year in 2012 and currently on the Las Cruces Public Schools Board.

LCHS is special because she was a student at the school and had wonderful teachers, Saunders said.

"This book is a thank

you to those teachers that were there at the time, two of which are in it," she said.

Saunders said she feels honored when people buy her books. When an 88-year-old woman bought 30 copies to hand out to her sorority and when a family put her book on the memorial table of a subject who passed away, they touched her, and she knows it's all worth it.

"I wanted to be able to have their stories even when they are no longer here to tell them," she said.

The new book is dedicated to her grandmother who taught elementary school for 35 years. The grandmother is also has been a big source of inspiration for Saunders.

# Council considers noise changes, going net zero in city buildings

Changes to the City of Las Cruces noise ordinance could soon be offered to the Las Cruces City Council for consideration.

At its Sept. 13 work session, the city council discussed recommendations that came from a preliminary study that was completed in February 2019 by Bohannon Huston, Inc., which is a consulting firm specializing in engineering, spatial data and advanced technologies that is headquartered in Albuquerque and has an office in Las Cruces.

The independent study determined that the city noise ordinance does not

mention or define decibel levels, making it difficult to enforce for the city to enforce.

The city received 737 noise complaints from March through early September of this year.

The primary source of noise complaints in the city is vehicles that have modified exhaust systems or are playing loud music. The second-most noise complaints are for live music; and one to two complaints a month are about noise from Utility Task Vehicles (UTVs).

The study has proposed setting a level of 72 decibels, at a distance of 25 feet from the noise source, as a generally acceptable noise level in commercial and industrial zones during day-

time hours; 67 decibels, both day and night, in residential zones, and 67 decibels at night in commercial and industrial zones.

However, there was council discussion that noise levels vary throughout the city and the recommended decibel levels in the study might not be suitable in commercial or industrial areas.

There was agreement among council members that a balance in noise levels should be struck. The council also agreed that any amendments to the city's noise ordinance may be reviewed by policy review committees established by the city.

Also at the meeting, council members discussed the merits of

implementing net zero energy use in city buildings.

The city's Sustainability Office presented recommendations the council could enact to transition to net zero.

Net zero is an effort to meet a building's or a community's energy needs through renewable energy and other complementary sustainable practices.

The transition to net zero could reduce cost burden, improve health and help achieve goals outlined in the city's

Climate Action Plan to reduce greenhouse gases.

The recommendations presented to the council included developing either an ordinance or resolution that would require any new construction of city government buildings to utilize net zero policies and practices.

The city has already implemented some of those practices, including the use of solar energy and the installation of electric vehicle chargers at some city facilities.

The council also discussed developing all-

electric city buildings and possibly incentivizing builders to develop all-electric subdivisions.

Some council members and city staff agreed that working toward electrification transition could achieve potential financial savings for low- and moderate-income Las Cruces residents in the future.

A resolution supporting net zero practices in city buildings likely will be presented soon to city council for formal consideration and possible adoption.

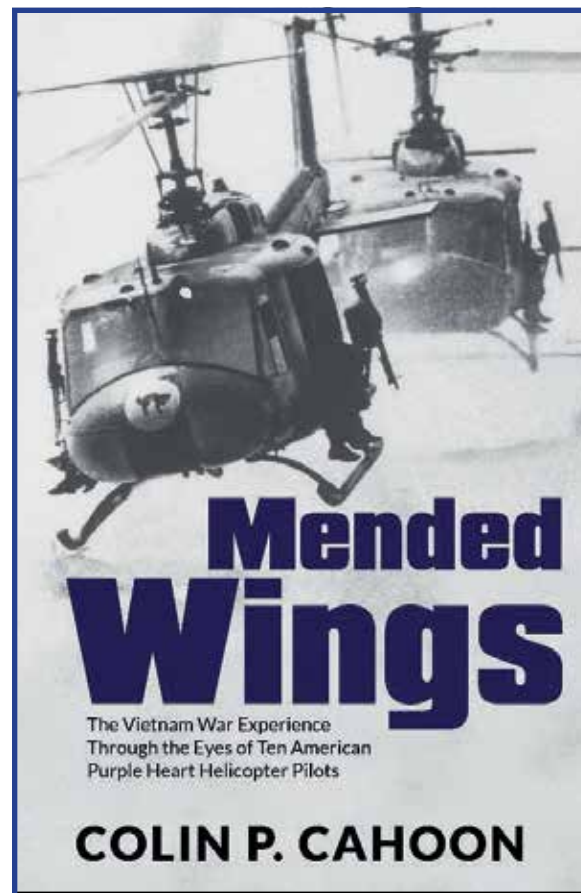

## Pregnancy Food Guidelines

Nutrition during pregnancy isn't exactly the same as a "normal" diet. For example, during at least the last six months of pregnancy, women should consume at the minimum 300 additional nutrient-rich calories per day, according to the U.S. Library of Medicine. Ever wonder why eating sushi is considered taboo during pregnancy? Certain foods that are normally considered healthy may be harmful to your growing baby. Here's why.

Many soft cheeses such as queso blanco, Brie, Camembert and feta are made with unpasteurized milk, and can contain the *Listeria monocytogenes* bacterium, which causes an infection known as listeriosis that may lead to miscarriage, premature birth or stillbirth. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), cheeses are up to 160 times more likely to cause listeriosis when made with unpasteurized milk. Some soft cheese labels say they're made with pasteurized milk, but even these cheeses have caused infections, so it's better to steer clear.

Some types of fish contain high levels of methylmercury, a neurotoxin that can hurt an unborn baby's developing nervous system and has been linked with developmental problems. The Food and Drug Administration recommends pregnant women avoid shark, swordfish, king mackerel and tilefish. You should also limit sushi, as raw fish is more likely to cause foodborne illnesses.

Deli meats can also become contaminated with *Listeria*, even though the meat is cooked. That's because contamination can occur after the meat is cooked but before it's packaged. According to the CDC, 1,700 cases of *Listeria* infection occur every year in the United States, and pregnant women and newborns are especially vulnerable.

Alcohol from wine, beer or liquor can easily pass through the placenta to the baby. Exposure to alcohol increases the baby's risk of developing a birth defect or a fetal alcohol spectrum disorder (FASD). FASDs include a range of



behavioral and developmental problems, including fetal alcohol syndrome. Drinking even small amounts of alcohol while pregnant can lead to fetal harm or death, according to the American Academy of Pediatrics.

There are few things as delicious as a prime cut of rare steak — the kind with a juicy, ruby-red center. Unfortunately, undercooked meat can contain harmful bacteria, such as salmonella, or a parasite called *Toxoplasma gondii* that causes toxoplasmosis, a serious blood infection. When toxoplasmosis passes to a fetus, it can cause premature birth, jaundice, developmental disorders and brain damage. Although infections are rare, moms-to-be should make sure their meat is cooked to a safe internal temperature. Use this list as a guide when you're cooking meat:

- beef, pork, veal, lamb: 145° F
- ground beef, ground pork, ground veal, ground lamb: 160° F
- fish: 145° F
- ground poultry: 165° F
- poultry: 165° F

# Bariatric Weight Loss Surgery - Is It for Me?

## Weighing Your Options

Obesity in the U.S. has reached epidemic proportions, and is now considered the number one cause of diabetes and heart disease in the nation. For many people, traditional methods like calorie restriction and exercise have failed to produce initial or sustained weight loss results. If you have failed to lose weight through other methods and are considering a more aggressive approach to deal with the issue, you are not alone. Nearly 580,000 people undergo bariatric surgery annually according to the American Society for Metabolic and Bariatric Surgery (ASMBS).

Current estimates are that 1 in every 3 Americans have obesity, and 6 percent are “extremely obese,” with a Body Mass Index (BMI) greater than 40. A recent study by the National Institute of Health (NIH) revealed that those living with obesity are likely to die an average of 14 years earlier than if they lived at a healthy weight.

“While the most obvious frustrations around obesity are often cosmetic, the real impact of excess body weight is on the patient’s health and longevity,” said Dr. Karina McArthur, MD, DACS, ABOM. “The majority of people living with obesity also

deal with associated pain, diabetes, high blood pressure or depression, and experience a significant impact on their energy levels and quality of life.”

Is now the time for a change for you or a loved one? There are a variety of procedure options in weight loss surgery and many can be done through small incisions for minimal scarring and faster recovery. Here are some important facts if you’re considering a surgical solution:

### Gastric Bypass

Gastric Bypass is considered the gold standard of weight loss surgeries, and is the most commonly performed of the procedures worldwide. The procedure creates a new stomach pouch that is considerably smaller than before, facilitating smaller meal portions and resulting in fewer calories consumed daily. Advantages of Gastric Bypass include its ability to promote significant long-term weight loss (up to 60 to 80 percent), and its ability to physically restrict the amount of food that can be consumed. It also induces beneficial changes in gut hormones that reduce appetite, reduce



the risk of type II diabetes, and may lead to feelings of increased energy. Typical patients maintain weight loss of greater than 50% after gastric bypass.

### Sleeve Gastrectomy / Gastric Sleeve Surgery

Sleeve Gastrectomy is a restrictive weight loss surgery. Restrictive weight loss surgeries restrict the amount of food that can enter the stomach. During this procedure, approximately 85% of the stomach is removed. The remaining stomach is about the size and shape of a slender banana. Patients typically experience substantial weight loss due to the decreased stomach size, as well as the fact that this surgery removes the part of the stomach that secretes ghrelin, a hormone that stimulates hunger. With less appetite and less stomach capacity, some patients may lose up to 55-60% of excess weight and maintain this at five years post-op. Gastric sleeve surgery may be effective in patients with an extremely high BMI, as well as an alternative for patients who are considering gastric bypass or gastric banding.

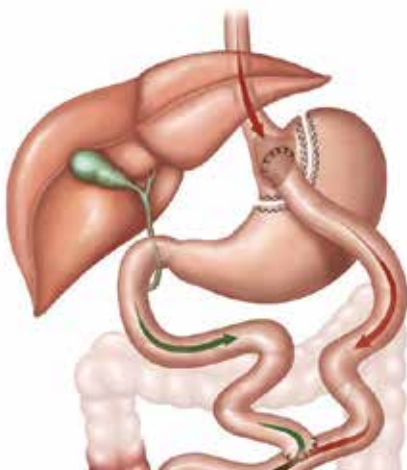
### Laparoscopic Adjustable Gastric Banding

The Laparoscopic Adjustable Gastric Banding procedure is one of the most well-known weight loss surgeries. It is popular with many of our surgical weight loss patients because it can be adjusted and reversed. In this procedure, a small saline-filled band is placed around the stomach. The band can be adjusted by your weight loss physician in-office via a small port just below the skin. This procedure is typically performed laparoscopically as an outpatient surgery. It is oftentimes used in patients who have a BMI of 30-35 and one or more obesity-related comorbidities.

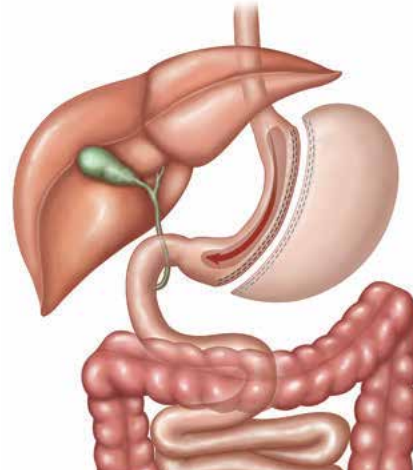
“As with any health issue, surgery should be considered only after other, less invasive methods have failed,” said Dr. McArthur. “The patient’s compliance with pre-surgical education and post-surgical nutrition and follow-up guidelines are the key indicator for initial weight loss success and long-term maintenance. This is a health condition that is very much within the patient’s control.”

Changes to the body after weight loss surgery are mostly positive, and are an important benefit of the surgical weight loss route. But some of the physiological changes can lead to long-term vitamin and mineral deficiencies. Patients must commit to a lifelong plan of healthy food choices and vitamin and mineral supplementation. And while there is risk associated with any surgical procedure, the 30-day mortality rate for bariatric surgeries is actually only 1 in every 1000 patients, much lower than the number of deaths caused by obesity itself.

# Breaking Heart Attack Stereotypes

When you think of a typical heart attack patient, there's a good chance the person who comes to mind looks something like this: an older man in his 50s or 60s, clutching his chest in sudden pain. That doesn't always align with reality, however. Which of these people do you think is most at risk for a heart attack?

**SCENARIO #1:** A 65-year-old woman with a family history of heart disease is overweight, but gets a moderate amount of exercise and tries to follow a healthy diet. She is aware that her weight and family history put her at higher risk, but her cholesterol and blood pressure numbers are good, and she keeps in close contact with her doctor.

**SCENARIO #2:** A 40-year-old man maintains a healthy weight by vigorously exercising every day but also consumes a high-fat diet. He has a family history of heart disease and smoked in his youth, though he quit at age 30. He rarely visits the doctor, only going when he is actively ill or injured.

**SCENARIO #3:** A 55-year-old woman has no family history of heart disease and works in a high-stress job. She exercises sporadically and has a family history of diabetes. She doesn't have a primary care doctor, though she does her best to maintain a healthy diet.

While all three individuals have some level of heart attack risk, the woman in scenario 1 is at less risk of having a

heart attack than the individuals in scenarios 2 and 3. Her relationship with her doctor allows her to monitor her risk factors and take appropriate and timely action to keep her health in check. The man in scenario 2 consumes food that raises his heart attack risk, along with having been a smoker in the past, and the woman in scenario 3 is unaware of her risk level because she doesn't see a primary care doctor.

Educating yourself about your heart disease risk and maintaining a close relationship with your primary care doctor are important parts of managing the risk you live with every day. Don't take a chance — heart attacks don't follow a script.

You know the obvious ways to keep your risk of

# Choosing a Primary Care Provider



When it comes to maintaining good health, it takes a village – a multidisciplinary team of experts – to provide comprehensive health care. It's not unusual for your preventive care regime to include regular visits to more than one doctor: a family physician, an obstetrician or gynecologist, and any specialist involved in treating chronic conditions: an allergist, dermatologist, orthopedist or cardiologist, for example.

However, it's important to have one team leader quarterbacking your health care, so to speak. This person is your primary care physician and he or she serves as the main gatekeeper for your care. Choosing a primary care physician may be the most important step in caring for your health.

## What is a primary care physician?

Your primary care physician (PCP) is the doctor you typically see for an annual physical, i.e., your main health care provider for non-emergency care. Your PCP performs routine tests that are needed at various stages throughout your life to monitor your health and diagnose and treat medical problems. If needed, your PCP can refer you to a specialist if a serious illness requiring special management is necessary.

A PCP serves as the chief facilitator for other physicians involved in your care, making sure that all the components– from treatments to prescribed medications – work together effectively, for your good health. A PCP will provide preventive care, based on their knowledge of your unique health history, heredity, and other factors. He or she will also provide you with health education, so that you can make informed decisions about your lifestyle, nutrition, and physical activity.

A PCP is typically a family practitioner or an internist, although some obstetricians may function as a PCP for their patients. A family practitioner is a generalist who can treat children and adults of all ages, and may also perform obstetrics and minor surgery. An internist is a doctor who has completed a residency in internal medicine and is trained to care for adults of all ages, as well as treat many different medical problems, from common to complex illnesses.

The advantage of having a PCP over using a walk-in clinic or urgent care center for routine health maintenance is continuity: an ongoing relationship with a single medical professional will have in-depth knowledge about you and your health history, family background, past injuries or illnesses, allergies, and risk factors for certain diseases.

## Choosing the right doctor for you

You and your PCP will be together for a long time, so making the right choice is important. You may ask family and friends for recommendations, check with other health providers you may know, or consult with your local hospital for a physician referral.

As you begin your search for a primary care provider, consider the following tips from the National Institutes of Health:

- Does the physician participate in your insurance plan (also known as an “in-network provider”)? If not, the amount of your co-payment for seeing the physician may be higher.
- Is the physician accepting new patients?
- Is the practice located in an area that is close to your home or work location? Are the office hours convenient for your schedule?
- What is most important to you in a good PCP? General health and wellness? Experience in the treatment of certain chronic diseases?
- What about your personal preferences? Do you feel more comfortable with a male or a female doctor? A young doctor or an older physician? A warm, casual and friendly communication style or one that is more formal?
- Does the physician use a conservative or aggressive approach to medical treatment? Does he or she ask about the patient's preferences regarding specific types of medical treatments?
- Is the physician easy to reach by phone? Does he or she use (and encourage patient contact) via email or telehealth? Are office staff members friendly and helpful?

## movie review

# “Network” still packs a punch with its view of TV

When it was released in 1976, “Network” largely was considered a satire. Now, not so much.

Writer Paddy Chayefsky and director Sidney Lumet’s searing, Oscar-winning look at the media – being presented Tuesday, Sept. 28, by Turner Classic Movies to lead off a tribute to late co-star Ned Beatty – has proven over time to be a remarkable forecast of developments in the television industry, most notably the lessening of the line between news and entertainment.

The story’s main symbol of that is Howard Beale, the depressed chief anchorman of the fictional UBS network. Brilliantly portrayed by Peter Finch in a performance that was honored with a posthumous Academy Award, he declares that he’s going to commit suicide on the air ... prompting his bosses to remove him, until the ratings for his newscast show an immediate and enormous spike.

Close friend and news director Max Schumacher (William Holden, also superb) resists exploiting Beale, but desperate-for-a-hit UBS entertainment chief Diana Christensen (Faye Dunaway, another Oscar winner here) inserts herself into the process and takes over the news program, supported by soulless conglomerate deputy Frank Hackett (Robert Duvall, perfect in the part).

What had been a straightforward newscast is turned into a broadcast sideshow of sorts, with Beale positioned as “The Mad Prophet of the Airwaves,” backed by such added attractions as “Sybil the Soothsayer.” Though the show stumbles initially, it eventually finds its groove as Beale beseeches his audience to take action against the wrongs in society ... never more so than through his legendary mantra, “I’m as mad as hell, and I’m not going to take this anymore!”

### Arts Council honors artist Jo-an Smith with comprehensive October show

The Doña Ana Arts Council is excited to present a comprehensive exhibition of Jo-an Smith's artwork titled "Celebrating 89 Years and More!" that will run Oct. 1-28 at the DAAC Arts and Cultural Center, 205 W. Amador Ave.

DAAC will extend its hours until 8 p.m. on Friday, Oct. 1, to participate in the First Friday Arts Ramble and will also hold an artist reception for Smith from noon to 5 p.m. Saturday, Oct. 9.

The show will include mainly paintings (watercolors, oil, and alcohol inks) with some additional enamel jewelry and drawings.

"I envision this as a first-time comprehensive gathering of my art from

my personal collection, as well as work now in progress," Smith said.

Smith, a well-known artist in Las Cruces, grew up in the Pacific Northwest but frequently moved until landing in

Las Cruces in 1972. Some of the more exotic places she lived include Alaska, Argentina, El Salvador and Panama. All of these locations, including New Mexico, have influenced her work.

"Once I settled in New Mexico, this enchanted land has inspired me in many ways," Smith said. "My earliest paintings were primarily landscapes, including many of our ancient cliff dwellings. I have also explored the inner landscapes of chile peppers and created a series of Virgin of Gua-

dalupe designs on gold leaf."

Smith received her bachelor's degree in art from the University of Texas at El Paso in 1971 and went on to earn a master's degree in art from New Mexico State University in 1975. Working her way to becoming a jewelry designer, she completed The American Gemological Institute Jewelry design course in 1978. She has studied with Alexander Titovets, Cheng Khee Chee and Stephen Quiller.

Highlights from her career include the Biennale Internationale "l'Art de l'email" in Limoges, France, Shippo International Enamels in Tokyo, Japan and the Salmagundi Club Juried National Exhibition in New York City. She was a designer and resident art-

ist at The Cutter Gallery in Las Cruces for 43 years until the gallery closed its doors in 2019. Smith has held many solo shows and her work has been exhibited and collected in the U.S. and abroad.

"I am intuitively drawn to the full rounded forms of our terrain which are intriguingly combined with ancient and contemporary man-made structures," Smith said. "There is such an abundance of inspiration from our multi-cultural heritage that I would need several more lifetimes to create all that I might wish."

## Las Cruces filmmaker debuts short horror film 'Crawl' Oct. 3

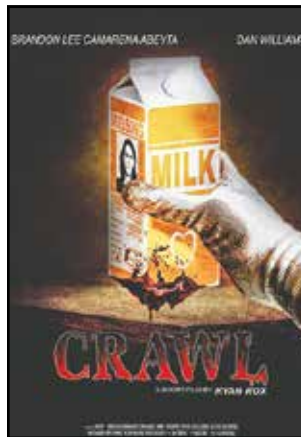

"Crawl," a short film by writer, director and producer Ryan Rox of Las Cruces, will have its world premiere at 4:45 p.m. Sunday, Oct. 3, at the Fountain Theatre, 2469 Calle de Guadalupe, on the historic Mesilla Plaza.

Tickets are \$9. The doors open at 4 p.m. The premiere is followed by a meet and greet with Rox and the cast of "Crawl!"

"Crawl," a short horror film, is the first movie Rox has made. The cast includes Brandon Lee Camarena Abeyta, Dan Williams, Nora Brown, Jessica Jimenez, Nick Check and Rox.

The premiere will also include screenings of "Bedridden," in which Rox co-stars, and his sec-

ond short horror film, "Quiet Hours."

"Last year, although we couldn't really go out for Halloween, the horror marathons on TV and new horror releases on streaming platforms made up for it," Rox told the Bulletin. "I was so

inspired by those films, as well as a few serial-killer documentaries I have seen, that I decided, by this time next year (October 2021), I'd have a horror film of my own out... and here we are!"

Rox said he wrote "Crawl" in two weeks and cast the film at the end of 2020. He completed pre-production on the film and crowdfunded it by March of this year. Filming began in Las Cruces April 3 and continued over four days into June.

"All that I knew about making films was from what I picked up while being an actor in them," Rox said. "Surprisingly, set experience and YouTube were my 'crash course film-school teachers.'

“One of my biggest, if not the biggest, inspirations as a filmmaker is Quentin Tarantino,” he said, “and like he once said, ‘When people ask me if I went to film school, I tell them, ‘No, I went to films.’” The best way to learn is by doing, and that’s what I did. I learned so much, even as early as the first day. It’s so much more work than people realize, but it’s also so much more rewarding — and I don’t mean financially.

“Having such talented individuals all working so hard to bring to life something you imagined in your head one day is an indescribable feeling,” Rox said. “Luckily, as an actor who had worked on student and local short films over the past few years, I was able to bring with me people who I already knew were amazing and trustworthy.

“I think the past year and a half was hard for everyone, and that includes creatives in the film industry,” he said. “Seeing the hurt in the world, our first instinct as creatives

was to do what we do best, and that’s to entertain. So, I was very excited to be able to hire local film industry workers, crew and cast, for something that we all need right now — entertainment. Horror movies got me through a quarantine Halloween in 2020, and I hope ‘Crawl’ will distract you from whatever pain you might be feeling this October, even if it’s just for a half hour.”

The film was shot entirely in Las Cruces with the exception of one scene shot in El Paso, he said, and consists entirely of

local talent, crew and cast.

The film was named best New Mexico short for May-June 2021 at the Mindfield Film Festival in Albuquerque.

Rox said “Crawl” is unrated “but contains some frightening moments and language, therefore viewer discretion is advised.”

Lujan said.

Each Friday, a different word is selected as the theme for the coming week’s drawings, and participating artists could submit as many drawings as they wanted based on that word.

The Facebook group is now home to more than 500 drawings, he said, and is ongoing.

“We are all connected with art,” Lujan said. “We are Art Magnets.”

Art Magnet is one of a number of Facebook groups that Lujan administers.

“We all want to show what we can do,” he said.

In addition to drawings, paintings and banners, Lujan’s exhibit will include sculptures by the artist.

With concrete bases, the sculptures include a wide range of found objects like pieces of wood, television and computer components, seashells,

gaskets and even a plastic lid that lay for some time in a roadway.

From these “off-the-wall, junk discards,” Lujan has made one-of-a-kind art in spectacular colors.

Next February, Lujan is planning to include 30 to 35 artists in his “Erotica” art show, which is returning in 2022 after taking 2021 off because of the pandemic.

The show has become popular with art lovers and with local artists who “just had these pieces they couldn’t show anywhere,” Lujan said. About 125 pieces will find space in Lujan’s “showhouse,” with a black and white room and an “over-the-edge” green room (not to be missed!) that even includes caution tape because of the controversial nature of its pieces, he said.

“We’re amazed at the work,” Lujan said.

The show always includes erotic art by some longtime Las Cruces artists.

“Really? I didn’t know

you did this kind of stuff,” Lujan said is often his response to submissions for the show.

“I had nowhere to show it,” is often the response he hears, Lujan said.

Art began for Lujan when he was learning how to write; he put curlies on all his letters. “We don’t write like that here,” Lujan was told by his first-grade teacher in Mesa, Arizona, where he grew up.

But that only inspired Lujan, who said he has “always been outside of the box since then.”

“If you give me something,” he said in a 2017 Bulletin interview, “I’ll turn it into something else.”

Lujan is one-half Taos Tewa Indian. He attended Pikes Peak Community College in Colorado Springs, Colorado, on a Bureau of Indian Affairs scholarship and earned a four-year degree in commercial art. In his spare time, Lujan was a theater set and costume designer. He owned Smart Move Graphics art gallery in

Colorado Springs.

He was at one time a dishwasher at a very successful Mexican restaurant in Huntsville, Alabama, and owned The Gallery in Five Points in

Huntsville.

Lujan also was the owner of In Effect in Downtown Las Cruces.

Las Cruces artist and author George Mendoza has been nominated for a 2022 Pulitzer Prize in fiction for his book "Journey of the Spirit Man." Mendoza is also an internationally recognized painter and competed as a runner in the 1980 and 1984 Paralympic Games.

15, he said. Some peripheral vision remains, along with the colors he sees — and paints — on top of the blind spots. He had been painting and

drawing since childhood and began painting full time in the early 1990s.

Mendoza has also become a prolific author, with more than 30 books and manuscripts to his credit, including six children's books, two motivational works and other books in the "Spirit Man" series waiting to be published.

The books are set throughout the Mesilla Valley and New Mexico, as well as other states and many countries Mendoza has visited. The Spirit Man series is "a modern-day fable," he said.

Using audio books, Mendoza is an avid reader, and a fan of the late Tony Hillerman, he said. He uses JAWS screen reader for com-

puter users with vision loss to send and receive emails, including communication with his agent and discussions of potential book and movie deals.

A New York City native, Mendoza graduated from New Mexico School for the Blind in Alamogordo, which is prominently featured in book No. 7 of his series: "Song of the Spirit Man," Mendoza said.

He is founder of Wise Tree Foundation, a nonprofit he started to promote the arts for the disabled

He is a Smithsonian fellow and received the New Mexico State University distinguished alumni award in 2014.

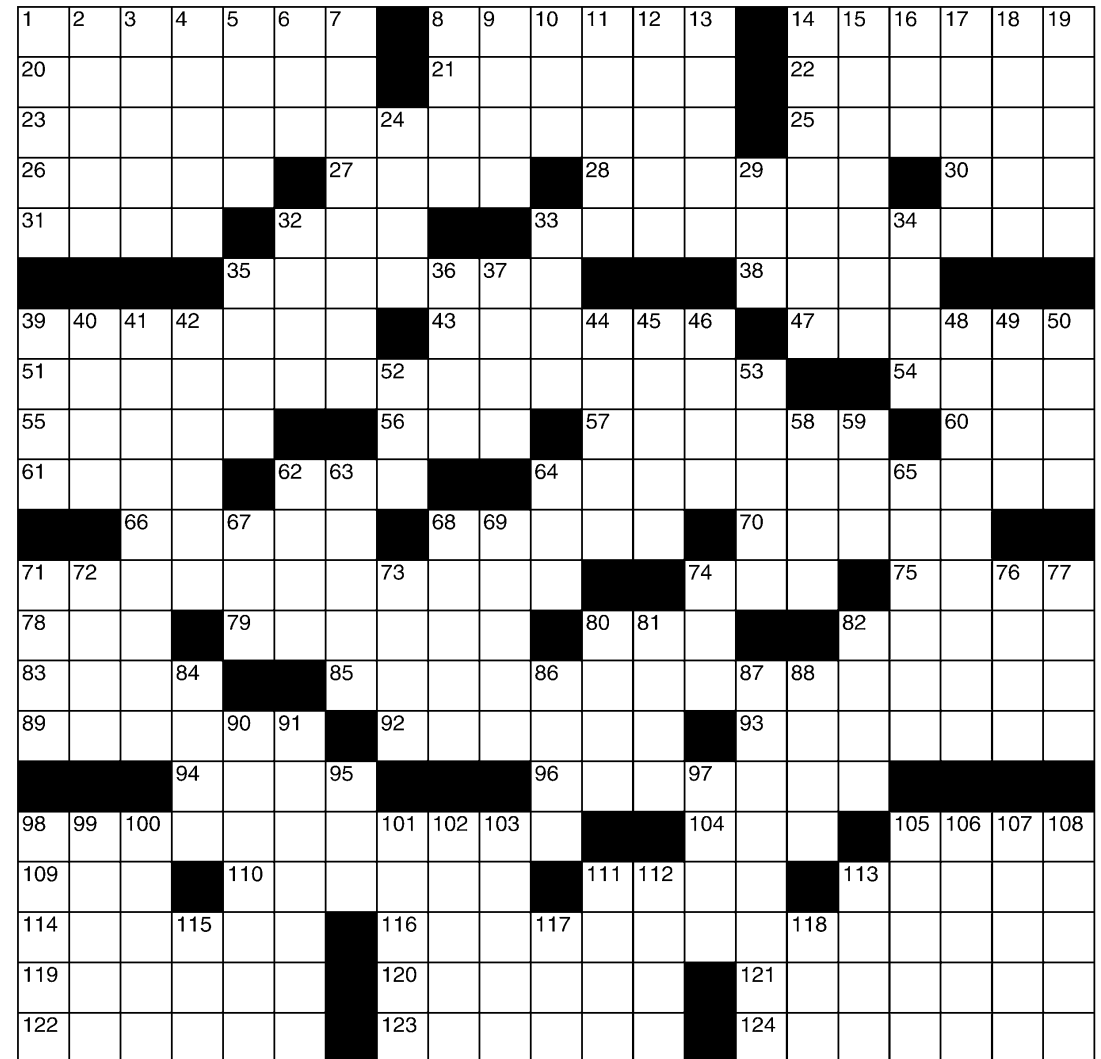

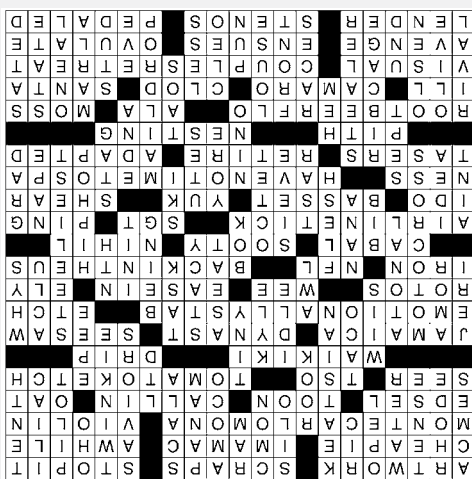

## Crisis Triage Center going strong in third month of operation

The Doña Ana County Crisis Triage Center (CTC) has seen about 40 guests since the facility opened earlier this year, CTC Clinical Director Jess Spohn said.

The CTC, which accepted its first guest June 21, is open 24/7 365 days a year to anyone age 18 or older, suffering from a mental health or substance abuse crisis, Spohn said during a Zoom presentation to the Greater Las Cruces Chamber of Commerce's 2021 Leadership Las Cruces class.

Those visiting CTC — the staff calls them guests — can stay up to 24 hours. Referrals are voluntary, Spohn said, and no one is

turned away.

Spohn said referrals are not required for anyone to receive service. All insurance is accepted and no one receives a bill for CTC service.

CTC operates on four

shifts during a 24-hour period, Spohn said.

Each shift is staffed with a registered nurse, licensed mental health provider/clinician and peer support specialists. A psychiatric provider is

available via telehealth.

A stay at CTC includes nursing, clinical and psychiatric evaluations, medications (if prescribed), peer support, three meals a day, showers and laundry service and a compre-

hensive discharge plan to help the guest return to the community or to seek a higher level of care.

CTC can host up to 12 guests at a time. The facility has two beds and multiple recliners.

So far, Spohn said, the average stay for a guest at CTC is six to seven hours.

First responders typically spend less than five minutes taking people to CTC, she said.

CTC is operated by RI International, a nonprofit based in Arizona.

It is located at 1850-B Copper Loop in Las Cruces.

## NM State launches platform to store, track vaccine status, information

Since New Mexico State University announced in August that all NMSU system students and employees must become fully vaccinated against Covid-19 or begin to undergo weekly testing effective Sept. 30, developers have been working to create a system for accepting, securely storing, verifying and reviewing the vaccine and testing documentation submitted by students, faculty and staff.

The resulting site, at [vaxtrax.nmsu.edu](http://vaxtrax.nmsu.edu), went

fully live Sept. 15, to accept CDC vaccination cards or other proof of

vaccination.

“Our Information and Communication Technol-

ogy team has worked hard to ensure that the site can handle a high volume of activity,” NMSU Covid-19 Project Manager Jon Webster said. “But it’s possible that we may have thousands of vaccine card submissions attempted at the same time, so we may see some lag if this happens. Please be patient and try again later.”

The platform is only accessible for uploading documentation through NMSU’s private network, so students and employees will need to either use an on-campus computer or use NMSU’s Virtual

Private Network to access the site. For information about accessing NMSU’s VPN, visit [vpn.nmsu.edu](http://vpn.nmsu.edu).

A user guide for accessing and using the VaxTrax portal is available on the NMSU Now pandemic action plan site, at [now.nmsu.edu/vax/vaxtrax-guide.html](http://now.nmsu.edu/vax/vaxtrax-guide.html). More information is available at [learn.vaulthealth.com/nm](http://learn.vaulthealth.com/nm).

Staff will monitor vaccine and testing compliance through the VaxTrax

portal, and students or employees who do not provide appropriate documentation will be subject to corrective action, Webster said. For employees, this may involve warnings or more serious consequences such as suspension without pay, demotion or termination of employment. For students, consequences may include disciplinary action through the student code of conduct.

# Medical cannabis patients should keep cards after legalization

Effective April 1, 2022, recreational use of cannabis will be officially legal in New Mexico. Law enforcement and the mental health community are preparing as well. It will take time but New Mexicans will benefit from the legalization efforts.

In 2007, the Lynn and Erin Compassionate Use Act became law and allowed for legitimate medical patients to legally use, buy and grow cannabis.

On April 1, 2022, a legal world will be in place for recreational users, and rules and regulations will be in place to continue to protect the public. Some have waited 50 years to be able to consume cannabis without fear of arrest. More states are establishing medical cannabis programs and more are legalizing as well.

Federal legalization is next if we are going to stop ruining lives. For over 40 years, I have been in the trenches with patients and recreational

users. Ultimately the hope is that legalization is going to be beneficial for all.

Growing pains? Of course. The medical and mental health communities must rise to the occasion and actively participate. We need research on long-term effects, especially on developing brains of the young.

Based on anecdotal evidence, cannabis has a profound and positive effect on the quality of life of cancer, pain patients and PTSD patients (many of our cannabis patients are veterans). It should not be seen as a dangerous drug or a threat to someone's wellbeing. It has been proven that with guidance and education, the benefits of cannabis far outweigh the risks.

My colleagues and I have been serving and certifying medical patients for years, when no one else would. Many patients do not want to smoke; they want to know

how to use the herb medicinally.

This year, medical cannabis patients are asking why keep their medical cards if legalization is coming.

Here is what I say: The New Mexico Medical Cannabis Program must be protected at all costs. Medical patients deserve to be respected and protected. The New Mexico Department of Health and practitioners, such as myself and my colleagues, will continue to work toward that end. Medical patients can continue to be certified if they have a legitimate medical condition. The program has had its challenges since 2007 but for the most part it has served the needs of the NM medical patients. There are now over 100,000 medical cannabis

patients in NM.

If you are a patient with a medical cannabis card, I would advise, keep your card. Continue to work with your primary-care doctor and your certifying practitioner. There is so much for all to learn.

It is a privilege to be a medical card holder. You deserve the benefits and the quality of life that it brings you. For the record, here are some reasons to keep your medical cannabis card.

1. It legitimizes you as a medical patient and you have the support of your PCP and your certifying practitioner.

2. It protects you from potential misunderstandings with law enforcement. Officers of the law are still going to do their jobs to keep us all safe. They need to know if you

are a legitimate medical patient or a recreational user.

3. On April 1, 2022, recreational users will pay a 15 percent excise tax; medical patients will no longer be charged tax.

4. FYI, as of June 29, 2021, medical patients no longer have to pay to grow for personal use. NM adults over 18 are now allowed to grow 12 plants

per household, under local and state rules and for personal use only.

# Medical professional raising funds for Tents to Rents campaign

Athena Huckaby, who works in health care in Las Cruces, is one of the participants in this year's Tents to Rents campaign, which is raising funds to help improve the quality of life for people struggling with homelessness at Mesilla Valley Community of Hope's Camp Hope tent city and to move some of the camp's residents into their own apartments.

"I am working with the Mesilla Valley Community of Hope (MVCH) to raise funds to help people break the chains of homelessness and move into stable housing," Huckaby said.

Housing Helpers, St. Andrew's Episcopal Church, Trinity Lutheran Church, Unitarian Universalist Church or one of the other individuals or organizations that are participating this year.

By mid-September, MVCH had raised more than \$40,000 of this year's goal of \$60,000. The campaign continues through Friday, Oct. 8.

"The experience of homelessness can start not from a single catastrophic event or life choice, but rather simply from a series of small events that lead to unstable housing," Huckaby said.

### A Camp Hope story

Carolyn joined the Community of Hope only recently, when her efforts to connect with a friend in El Paso didn't work out according to plan, Huckaby said.

Carolyn is originally from Idaho Falls, Idaho,

and held various jobs there, including caring for developmentally disabled children.

"She is clearly a very giving person, and sees the best in everyone she meets, even if sometimes they end up disappointing her," Huckaby said. "But she remains a hopeful person — she hopes the job she just landed a few days ago will be a good fit for her, and that she will do well. She would like to have enough security in her job to be able to establish herself in an apartment, and she also would like to go back to school and complete a degree, so she could have more em-

ployment opportunities. She is looking into possibilities to attend NMSU, where she hopes to study law or social work. Carolyn is optimistic about her future and hopes to keep a job and find more stable housing in the near future."

In fact, Carolyn had her eligibility interview Sept. 9 to get an apartment at Desert Hope Apartments, said MVCH Executive Director Nicole Martinez.

"MVCH is committed to paying the security deposit for clients entering the Desert Hope Apartments this year," Martinez said, adding that funds raised through

Tents to Rents "is helping us do that."

Desert Hope is a partnership among MVCH, Mesilla Valley Public Housing Authority, the City of Las Cruces and the New Mexico Coalition to End Homelessness, with additional funding provided by the New Mexico Mortgage Finance Authority.

The 40-apartment complex opened in August and provides efficiency apartments to people who are struggling with homelessness.

### Homelessness in Las Cruces

There are probably about 250 to 300 people struggling with homelessness in Las Cruces right now, Martinez said. Martinez said about 100 of those people likely are not receiving any services.

Speaking Sept. 10, during the Greater Las Cruces Chamber of Commerce's 2021 Leadership

Las Cruces program, Martinez said MVCH offers a wide range of services to people struggling with homelessness, including Camp Hope, which can house up to 50 people at a time; help finding permanent housing; clothing; income support; employment referrals; and assistance and referrals to other social service agencies.

Martinez said MVCH helps 500 to 600 people a year move into permanent housing.

When she started in 2006, Martinez said, MVCH received funding from a single housing program. Today, she said, there are nearly a dozen federal, state and local housing programs providing funding to MVCH.

The MVCH campus, at 999 W. Amador Ave., also includes El Caldito Soup Kitchen, Amador Health Center, Casa de Peregrinos emergency food program and Jardin de los Niños childcare and education program for children and families struggling with homelessness.

# Jardin de los Niños gets \$10K grant to help families hurt by Covid pandemic

## 'The Game' still has epic feel to it despite changes

The annual football grudge match between

Las Cruces and Mayfield high schools had a little bit different feel this year, but is still a huge deal.

You can't help but feel the history and electricity down on the field when Las Cruces' two oldest high schools play.

Since the late 1960s, the two schools have met on the gridiron, usually with a district championship on the line. Twice, the schools have met in the state title game.

In the past, the annual grudge match was usually played on the first week-end of November, but that changed this year because the two schools are no longer in the same district.

Mayfield, which has been dealing with declining enrollment in recent years, is now in 5A while Las Cruces remains in 6A.

But the earlier date for

the game didn't seem to diminish the intensity of the rivalry when the two schools met Friday, Sept. 17.

The Field of Dreams was nearly filled to capacity. Both schools' fans were out in force, tailgating before the game.

And of course, the bands and cheerleaders provided the usual amount of pomp and color.

Las Cruces, which came into the game with an uncharacteristic 1-3 record, used a dominating second half to beat Mayfield 35-14. The game was tied 14-

all at the break.

The Bulldawgs are hoping they can use the win as a springboard for a successful district season. They have a bye this week and then will face Carlsbad in their district opener at 7 p.m. Sept. 30 at the Field of Dreams.

"I don't think we are a 1-3 team at heart," Las Cruces coach Mark Lopez said after the game. "Obviously, our record is what it says you are. But at the end of the day, we felt we were playing tough teams week in and week out.

"We are preaching to our guys to follow the process and really start believing and understanding what football is all about," Lopez said. "You have to rebuild the groundwork after what happened last year (Covid pandemic wiping out the fall season). A lot of these kids didn't play last year or had like two JV games."

Lopez said the only difference he felt in the rivalry game being played at mid-season instead of

at the end of the year was: "It's a lot hotter now."

"This rivalry is huge," Lopez said. "You see this community. We have such an incredible community that supports high-school athletics. There is such a bond between this community and high-school athletics and activities — the band, the band parents. The band is incredible. Our cheer program is incredible. You just see everyone coming together for a week like this."

Mayfield coach Michael Bradley said the rivalry game with Las Cruces is still a huge event.

"It is tradition," he said.

"Our schools, our assemblies, everything is built on this rivalry, but it is just one week and then you move on," Bradley said. "Usually, it is the last game of the year. Now, it is the fifth. It is a little bit different. I think it is just as big and this will grow into something bigger than it is."

Mayfield dropped to 2-3 with the loss and will travel to Roswell for its district opener at 7 p.m. Friday, Sept. 24. Roswell has won the state 5A title in 2019 and 2018, the last two years New Mexico had full football seasons.

"I'm so proud of our kids," Bradley said. "I know we are going to continue to get better. We have a lot of young people, sophomores and juniors, who are playing their first 6A teams. We will take our licks, but we got to keep on ticking and staying positive."

### NMSU football scores first win

The New Mexico State University football team won its first game of the year, beating South Carolina State 43-35 on Saturday, Sept. 18 at Aggie Memorial Field.

The Aggies are now 1-3, after beating the Bulldogs, a Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) team that they had never faced in school history before.

Walk-on sophomore quarterback Dino Maldonado got the start after being thrust into action the week before against New Mexico because of injuries to Jonah Johnson and Weston Eget. Maldonado completed 12 of his first 13 passes in leading the Aggies to a 22-0 lead. Maldonado finished the night 24-of-32 for 321 yards and three touchdowns.

The Aggies will host Hawaii in their annual homecoming game at 6 p.m. Saturday, Sept. 25. Pre-game festivities will include the annual AG Day from 2 to 6 p.m. in the south parking lot of the Pan Am Center and the northeast parking lot of Aggie Memorial.

### Organ Mountain shines in Belen

The Organ Mountain High School boys cross country team continued a strong start to its season Saturday, Sept. 18 at the Adron Gardner Classic Cross Country Invitational at Belen High School.

The Knight boys had the top individual runner and five runners in the top 10. They also won the team competition.

Dax Rios of Centennial was seventh (18:15) and Alexander Pineda, also of Centennial, was eighth (18:28).

# Do you know what a 'quacker' is? A 'hosel rocket'? Read on

Golfers seem to have their own jargon, sayings and expressions, and some are downright hilarious. For example, let's take the term "chili dip" as used in golf as opposed to a party snack.

It applies to hitting well behind the ball while taking a big slice of turf; also the terms hitting the ball "fat" and a "chunk" shot describe the blunder, as well as "hitting the big ball (Earth) before the little one."

Some of those awful shots (but not all) are produced by "hackers," "duffers" or "chops." Although patently uncharitable to the animal world, golfers often refer to golf courses that are in rather

poor condition as a "dog track" or a "goat farm," while calling the short fringe around the green "frog hair," and they use "chicken wing" to describe a swing with a flying elbow.

We all know what a "worm-burner" looks like. And a shot with a driver or fairway wood that darts left (or right for a left-hander) is a "duck-hook" or in short form a "quacker."

If you play a ball to bail out as far away from a hazard as possible, you wind up in "chicken flats." But one compliment to the animal world is supplied by our term "albatross" for a stunning 2 on a par 5. Golfers

even evoke military terms like "Army golf" when a chop hits left-right, left-right and going "bunker to bunker" is a "Hitler" shot. Of course, a sand bunker is also known as "kitty litter." And a wild slice is called a "banana ball." Beer? "Swing oil," or "birdie juice."

In golf, we have numerous expressions for the "game within a game," putting. A "knee-knocker" is a putt (maybe 3 to 4 feet) that is not quite a "gimme," but rather a "tester," and once holed a player might mumble "for the doubters." Putts are hard to make on "Velcro" (very slow) greens. When a player's ball does a 360 around the hole and spins out, you might hear a partner claim, check your pockets you were

"robbed."

If one decides to putt from well off the green, he is choosing to use his "Texas wedge." That shouldn't be confused with the well-known "foot-wedge." One of the dreaded afflictions that can beset golfers happens when a person cannot seem to gain control of his hands and arms with his putter, and ends up flinching and nervously stabbing at the ball: this painful putting disease is called the "yips." And when all the pressure is on in the final hole of a match a short miss with the putter usually means someone "choked."

Those new to the game may need to become acquainted with some of the more regular slang sayings for common oc-

currences. A smack with a driver well beyond where you may normally drive the ball is "nuked," but when you "air-mail" a shot long over the green it isn't good. A strike off the inside shank of the iron shaft that goes diagonally instead of straight is known as a "hosel rocket."

Hitting your splendid approach shot on the green is, of course, getting to the "dance floor," but alas you may be a long way from the band. If you follow that up with a "three jack" (3 putts), it's a downer. Making a par after hitting a tree may earn you a few dollars for a "barkie," but misdirecting your ball into the long, heavy, deep rough many call the "cabbage" may result in a round-ruining

"snowman" — an 8. Likewise a shot that splashed into a pond — it's a ball that has been "rinsed." That shot was probably the consequent of hitting your ball way right when you tried to hit left, referred to as a "double cross."

Then there are many tellingly funny golfing references to famous persons and celebrities. Two popular ones are a "Rush Limbaugh" that is hit too far to the right, and a shot in the other direction is "way more left than Nancy Pelosi."

# Former pro player offering tennis lessons at Picacho Hills CC

Picacho Hills Country Club has a new head tennis professional who wants to expand the sport and get the word out about the great facilities the club has to offer.

John Hattersley, a former professional tennis player originally from Sheffield, England, arrived at Picacho Hills in early September. And he wants to spread the word about the club, located at 6861 Via Campestre.

He played professionally for several years before severely injuring his back during the Qualifiers at Wimbledon.

wins were the Under-18s and Under-21s championships at the Hull Open, a tournament that has been won by Pat Cash, a former Wimbledon champion, and Yannick Noah, a former French Open champion.

After he was no longer able to continue his professional career, Hattersley turned to coaching

to stay connected to the sport he loves.

He coached in England and then moved to the United States in 1984. He spent 35 years in the Boston area, coaching both on his own and with a couple of prestigious clubs — Tennis 128 in Burlington, Massachusetts, and at the Marcus Lewis Tennis Center in Boston. At

the Marcus Lewis center, his players won 185 U.S. Tennis Association-sanctioned tournaments.

“I love the East Coast and Boston but it was time,” Hattersley said about why he relocated to New Mexico. “The weather (in Boston) can be tough on you. It was time for a nicer climate.”

At Picacho Hills, Hattersley is creating a high-performance tennis program for junior players age 4 to 18. He is offering private, semi-private and group lessons for both members and nonmembers. He is also offering lessons for adults.
