DOÑA ANA COUNTY LAUNCHES REDESIGNED WEBSITE

Doña Ana County, NM - Doña Ana County unveils a redesigned website to provide visitors a dramatically improved experience in a new platform. The new site features an updated, more modern design that offers several search features to find a service, access public meetings or contact elected officials.

"We are making it easier for our website visitors to access the information they seek faster and to know what is going on at the County by subscribing to County news," Anita Skipper, County Public Information Officer said. "A small window pops up as soon as you visit the website to enter an email and select the topics of your interest."

Since February, more than 20,000 people became new subscribers to the Doña Ana County website by simply clicking on the pop-up window.

At the top-right-hand corner, an "I want to" feature is highlighted and enables website visitors to quickly find a service the County offers, ranging from requesting a marriage license to paying property taxes online or applying for a job at the County. A traditional "search" ribbon is also easily accessible at the top, center of the landing page.

After a short scroll down, the new website features an "Address look-up" function for a quick reference to residents' elected officials and a visible search function. Enter an address, without punctuation for quickest results. For example, the Government Center comes up after entering "845 N Motel Blvd".

The new calendar will more prominently feature public meetings, workshops and other events while Board of County Commissioner's livestreamed and recorded meetings are available from the landing page, making them easy and quick to find.

"While we are excited to offer this updated resource to the public, we will continue to seek ways to improve the user experience," Skipper said. "We invite those who have not visited our website to take a look. For those who are regulars, we hope you enjoy the new site."

Along with the new website, the County implemented an updated design and distribution system to share news and information with residents, media or small groups, as needed.

July 4, 2022: Happy Birthday, USA!

July 4 celebrates the Continental Congress' official declaration on Thursday, July 4, 1776, that the 13 American colonies were no longer under the authority of Great Britain's King George III and were "free and independent states," creating what would become the United States of America.

The Thirteen Colonies were New Hampshire, Massachusetts, Rhode Island, Connecticut, New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Delaware, Maryland, Virginia (the first colony, in 1607), North Carolina, South Carolina and Georgia.

Meeting in Philadelphia, the Continental Congress adopted the Lee Resolution ("The Resolution for Independence") July 2, asserting independence from Great Britain. The official declaration was made two days later. The resolution was proposed by Richard Henry Lee (1732-94), a Founding Father from Virginia and signer of the Declaration of Independence.

Former presidents John Adams and Thomas Jefferson both died July 4, 1826, the 50th anniversary of Independence Day. Not knowing that Jefferson had

Firefighter, vet named parade marshal

U.S. Army Staff Sergeant (ret.) Daniel Muñoz will be the grand marshal of the City of Las Cruces 2022 Electric Light Parade, which will be Sunday, July 3. Muñoz, 40, was born in Albuquerque and grew up in Hatch, graduating with honors from Hatch High School. He joined the U.S. Army in 2000 and served five tours of combat duty in Afghanistan and Iraq with the 82nd Airborne and 1st Ranger Battalion. Muñoz retired with 15 years of service after injuring his knee in a parachute accident while training.

He earned a bachelor's

degree in psychology and then joined a veterans' fire corps crew with the Conservation Corps of New Mexico. Muñoz served as a wildland firefighter for three seasons, including one season with the Silver City Hotshots, a group of firefighters that handled the largest, most complex fires across the country. Muñoz has worn a Smokey Bear costume in a couple of other southern New Mexico parades, and said he is "very honored" to serve as grand marshal (as himself) for the Electric Light Parade in Las Cruces.

"I'm honored to be chosen to represent the city," he said.

"I have had the pleasure



City's Telshor Fund: Millions to help where it's needed most

The City of Las Cruces' Telshor Facility Fund (TFF) has allocated millions of dollars to benefit local nonprofits, help with the community's emergency response to Covid-19 and provide humanitarian assistance to asylum seekers who were brought to Las Cruces in 2019.

As a special revenue fund, TFF allocations are restricted to "health-related public services for the benefit of city resi-

dents," according to city documents. The city created the Health and

Human Services Advisory Committee to evaluate proposals for funding. Committee recommendations go to the Las Cruces City Council, which makes final spending decisions. TFF is not part of DeLeon said at the city the city's general fund. TFF was created by

the city council in October 2004 after the city and Doña Ana County entered into a 40-year lease agreement with Providence Healthcare Company for the lease of Memorial Medical Center (MMC), which the city and county jointly owned.

The original fund corpus was \$30 million, including \$4 million held in an escrow account until 2019, city Chief Administrative Officer Barbara council's June 13 work session. The fund's May

2022 market value was \$37 million.

City Treasurer Erica Jacquez said her office manages 40 percent of TFF proceeds. The State Investment Council manages the other 60 percent, she said. Investment income has been about \$8 million a year since 2007, which does not decrease the corpus.


"While special revenue funds are not unusual for a city to have, the source of this fund - revenue from the long-term lease of MMC - is certainly exceptional since not every

community has this kind of asset or lease agreement," DeLeon said. "The restriction that council placed upon the fund - for health-related programs and capital projects - is also particular to the priorities of council and the community. Municipalities typically do not have health departments since that is generally the purview of states and counties, so the Telshor Fund allows the city to address health needs in the community while preserving general fund expenditures for traditional city operations and services. As defined by council, the fund also provides for safety and housing needs as part of the overall initiative to address the physical, mental, developmental, emotional and social well-being of City of Las Cruces residents," DeLeon said.

Here are some of the allocations from TFF:

• \$1.075 million to help about 1,600 asylum seekers coming to Las Cruces in 2019. The city was

I love America. I love the concept of America. I love the diversity of its physical beauty

and its people. I love the amazing things we have created. Our ingenuity is boundless.

Alaska – Healy, 2021: sitting in the back of a truck, in a light rain, eating Pad Thai from one of the myriad Thai food trucks that - for reasons I

never fully learned - dot our 49th

Arizona – Tucson, 1991: At the McKale Center at the University of Arizona, the day before NCAA sub-regional basketball games. Crews were covering, with black cloth, the RC Cola logos in the arena, because Coca-Cola was the official NCAA soda sponsor, and had the vending rights for the tournament.

Arkansas – Fort Smith, 1990: Right after the University of Arkansas clinched a spot in the NCAA Final Four, I was in a barber shop. Patrons were criticizing and making racist comments about Razorback head coach Nolan Richardson, an African-American. I walked out.

California – Riverside, 1990: After having my first In-N-Out burger (double-double, animal style), watching the movie "Fantasia" at a special re-release for its 50th anniversary in a beautiful theater with a giant old-Hollywood-style silver screen.

Colorado – Eight Mile Creek, 2009: Spending the day fly fishing with my lifelong friend David Allen.

Connecticut – Hartford, 1990: Touring Mark Twain's House and Museum, as wonderfully eclectic and fascinating as the man himself.

Delaware – Wilmington, 1990: Trying to take an old-school selfie in front of an "America's First State" roadside sign and watching my Yashica fall off the top of my car as the self-timer expired.

District of Columbia – 1993: Weeping at the Vietnam Veterans Memorial on the National Mall.

Florida – Fort Lauderdale, 1989: body surfing in the Atlantic Ocean.

Georgia – Atlanta, 2005: Eat-

ing oysters at Spondivits.

Hawaii – Kona, 1993: Surfing on an authentic Hawaiian outrigger canoe with native islanders.

Idaho – Pocatello, 1976: Rafting down the Snake River.

Illinois – Chicago, 1984, 1986, 1989, 1990, 1993: Watching the Cubs in Wrigley Field, and singing "Take Me Out to the Ballgame" with Harry Caray during the seventh-inning stretch.

Neither safe nor sane each Fourth of July

I doubt if there is any law on the books more flagrantly and routinely violated every year by otherwise law-abiding residents of our community than the city's restrictions on fireworks.

Under the "Safe and Sane" fireworks law, the only things that can legally be set off are ground and hand-held sparkling and smoking devices, cylindrical fountains, flitter sparklers, illuminating torches, smoke devices and wheels.

sion you hear not coming from a sanctioned fireworks show is illegal.

Violation of any of these pro-

visions can result in a \$500 fine and 90 days in jail. But there is safety in numbers, and your odds of winning the Powerball lottery are probably greater than your odds of getting cited for breaking fireworks laws in Las Cruces.

I live in a quiet neighborhood where the loudest sounds are typically from children playing or dogs barking. But each year at this time, my neighbors are neither safe nor sane, at least as defined by the city. The latenight explosions typically start several days before the Fourth of July and continue for several days after. All with complete and absolute impunity.

Which is why the city's failure to get a drought ordinance passed in time for this year's holiday really won't make much of a difference. If it had been passed, the order would

Obviously, those are both really good ideas, but the ordinance would not have been enforced. Laws without enforcement are mere suggestions, and anyone with common sense would already know to do those things.

I don't blame the police. If residents of our community decide en masse to violate the law, there's not much they can do about it.

For me, it's a nuisance. I'll be awakened in the middle of the night and mumble obscenities at the inconsiderate jerks down the street before

rolling over and going back to sleep.

For dog owners, it can mean long nights trying to calm terrified terriers.

But those impacted the most each year are military veterans who associate explosions with combat, not celebration.

None of which will matter. The blasts from firecrackers will begin several days before the Fourth and continue for several days after, just like every year. I won't waste print space appealing for people to be considerate of their neighbors. They won't be.

I would simply note that you can't knowingly, intentionally violate the law and still consider yourself a law-abiding citizen. Not in that moment, at least. Crimes committed with impunity are still crimes.

City council approves Pioneer Women's Park gazebo project

The Las Cruces City Council has approved plans to renovate one of the city's oldest public structures.

The Pioneer Women's Park gazebo, 500 W. Las Cruces Ave., has been the site of weddings, candle-light vigils, Christmastree lightings and many other public events for well more than a century.

Built in May 1898, the gazebo underwent a major renovation in the 1970s and has had incremental replacement and repair work done over the years,

including lighting and irrigation improvements, with new play equipment added about 10 years ago, city landscape architect Cathy Matthews told the city council at its June 21

regular meeting.

At that meeting, the council voted unanimously to approve plans for the first phase of gazebo renovation, including design and construction.

Matthews said phase 1A will cost about \$400,000. She said the city has received \$200,000 for the project from the New Mexico Legislature and will seek additional fund-

ing from the Legislature and other sources to cover the remainder of the cost.

Matthews said the renovation will "retain the original footprint and character of the gazebo."

"This is really important not only to the area there but across the city. The entire city really reaps the benefit of this park," said Mayor Pro Tempore Kasandra Gandara, who represents Council District 1, which includes the 2.7-acre park.

The park master plan, which the city council approved in 2019, calls for the renovation project to include the gazebo itself, including its roof and floor, along with the addition of a brick patio around the gazebo, additional trails, more play equipment and the restoration of arbors on the east and west sides of the gazebo. The arbors were last in place in the 1930s, Matthews said.

Plans for gazebo renovations included input from people who live near the park "and interested folks throughout the community," Matthews said. The city held public input meetings in November 2021 and in February and April of this year, she said.

• \$1.2 million in a loan to La Piñon Sexual Assault Recovery Services.

• \$1.155 million to Mesilla Valley Community of Hope for its expansion.

• \$361,000 to Families and Youth, inc. for its emergency youth shelter.

• More than \$1.5 mil-

lion to Roadrunner Food Bank to combat hunger.

• With TFF support, the Boys and Girls Club of Las Cruces has saved families \$1.5 million per year in childcare expenses; programs like El Crucero and My Friends Place have provided longterm tenancy support for families; Third Judicial District Court got help leveraging a federal grant to launch a pilot veterans treatment court; and Southern New Mexico Diabetes Outreach was assisted in providing 6,000 annual diabetes tests.

• Almost \$3.2 million in FY2023 TFF allocations include \$1.73 to the Las Cruces Fire Department's Mobile Integrated Health program and crisis intervention training; a match of \$871,000 to the city's public transit system for the conver-

sion to electric buses; and \$105,000 to the city Police Athletic League.

• From FY2009-18, the city allocated \$300,000 annually to nonprofits for health-related services, increased to \$400,000 FY2019-22 and to \$600,000 FY2023-26.

• As of May 31, 100,433 people had been served by TFF funds during the current fiscal year, which ended June 30.

City considers bond projects for November ballot

Questions to be placed on the Nov. 8 general election ballot asking City of Las Cruces voters to approve \$23 million in general obligation (GO) bonds likely will include \$10 million to replace Fire Station No. 9 in northeast Las Cruces, \$6 million for continued East Mesa Recreation Complex development, \$5 million for affordable housing and \$2 million for parks and recreation improvements.

That is how Mayor Ken Miyagishima, speaking at the Las Cruces City Council's June 27 work session, summarized city priorities and input received from

city councilors and the public on a wide range of potential bond projects.

The council also discussed GO bonds at a June 13 work session.

About 20 people spoke at the two work sessions about bond projects. Most were members of the Las **Cruces Coalition for** Attainable Housing, who advocated for spending bonds "on attainable and affordable housing." to quote coalition member Jo Galvan-Nash, who spoke at both meetings. There are "not enough affordable rental properties in Las Cruces," she said.

Others speaking in support of using bonds for affordable housing included state Rep.

Joanne Ferrary, D-Doña Ana. Doña Ana County Commissioner Shannon Reynolds, former City Councilor Sharon Thomas and Art Marrujo of Tierra del Sol Housing Corp. in Las Cruces.

Other speakers at the June 13 work session said GO bonds should help pay for additional pickleball courts. City Parks and Recreation Department Director Sonya Delgado said the city needs more sports complexes for all sports and needs to renovate infrastructure, including irrigation systems, at many city parks and facilities. George Pearson spoke at both work sessions in support of funding for trails projects.

At the June 27 work

session, city Community Development Department Deputy Director David Weir reviewed results of a public survey the city conducted about potential Recreation Complex; and GO bond projects. The city received 2.533 completed responses to the survey, which closed June 19.

Survey respondents' top priorities included neighborhood reinvestment and improvements (streets, sidewalks, public lighting, etc.); affordable housing; rehabilitation of existing city parks; a new fire station No. 9: additional trails and multi-use paths; additional recreational fields, courts and facilities; a new multipurpose community

facility/recreation complex; library system expansion/renovation: continued development of the East Mesa Public new city parks.

Many of those projects also received community support at 11 public meetings the city held and through emails.

Public comments are still being accepted, Weir said.

"It is incredibly important that we get this feedback from the community to help set the direction for what projects the city will choose to benefit the community," Weir said at the city council's June 13 work session.

Councilors suggested

the city's 2023 capital outlay requests from the New Mexico Legislature include funding for projects that don't make it into final GO bond questions.

The city council could vote on final GO bond questions at its July 18 regular meeting. The deadline for the city to submit ballot GO bonds questions for the general election ballot is Aug. 23.

Bonds approved by voters would be spent within the following four vears.

A GO bond "is a form of debt financing secured by property tax revenues," the city said.

\$23 million in bonds could be approved by city voters without raising property taxes.





4 p.m. on BBCA Planet Earth: Dynasties

Narrated by estimable British filmmaker and naturalist Sir David Attenborough, this breathtaking five-week journey into the secret lives of some of the most charismatic animals on Earth has never disappointed, taking viewers up close to such critters as pumas, cheetahs, hyenas and meerkats. Moreover each episode has packed an emotional wallop by revealing the complex interactions among these animal characters. Capping this docuseries is "The Making Of," which celebrates the daunting challenges this production's creative team faced during filming.

7:55 a.m. on ESPN2 Formula 1 Racing

You'll excuse Lewis Hamilton if his love for the Silverstone Circuit, the site of today's British Grand Prix, is too apparent. The British driver has won here a record eight times, though his most recent victory a year ago didn't come without some drama. Fighting back from a 10-second penalty for a first-lap collision that halted the race and sent Max Verstappen to hospital, Hamilton drove his Mercedes past Ferrari's Charles Leclerc with two laps to go to register his 99th career series victory.

10:30 a.m. on KTSM IndvCar Racing

One of the country's classic road courses is on display today as Mid-Ohio Sports Car Course plays host to the Honda Indy 200 at Mid-Ohio. 



moviereview It's 'No Time to Die' for Daniel Craig's James Bond

First things first: Fear no spoilers here. Though most people know Daniel Craig left the role of James Bond in "No Time to Die," how it happens won't be detailed here.

The nearly three-hour 2021 adventure – starting Saturday, July 9, on EPIX while also streaming on Prime Video – certainly puts virtually everything possible into the exit. And those who made it had plenty of time to do that; the film's release was delayed for the better part of two years, largely because of the coronavirus pandemic and the producers' insistence that the movie open in theaters rather than on a streaming service. (As it happens, "No Time to Die" lead studio MGM now is owned by Amazon, which also operates Prime Video.)

As the saga begins, Bond has retired from the British Secret Service and is settling comfortably into a life with Madeleine Swann (Lea Seydoux, reprising her "Spectre"

role), but he finds that he can't shake off his enemies easily ... nor some espionage acquaintances, since CIA pal Felix Leiter (series returnee Jeffrey Wright) wants him to help locate a missing scientist.

locate a missing scientist.

Things escalate from there, and director Cary Joji
Fukunaga and the screenwriters (including "Fleabag's"
Phoebe Waller-Bridge) throw in everything including the kitchen sink, resulting in the longest Bond movie to date.
The picture easily could have been shorter and tighter, but if the aim was to give Craig a thorough farewell to the world of Agent 007 – well, mission accomplished.



New symphony conductor looking forward to first season

"For conductors, you're always looking for ensembles where you really enjoy collaborating with the people and musicians that make up the organization," said Ming Luke, the new music director and conductor of the Las Cruces Symphony Orchestra (LCSO).

Las Cruces, Luke said, is a place he really wants "to be a part of and help grow coming out of the pandemic."

LCSO introduced Luke as its new director during a June 10 gala fundraiser at the New Mexico Farm and Ranch Heritage Museum.

"He will bring that skill and excitement to the LCSO. Ming strongly believes in the power of music to connect to people and bring the community together. Las Crucen Rivers Ventura: composing, promoting, living the dream

"Now that I'm living it, the pressure is on to make it," Las Cruces musician, songwriter and entrepreneur Rivers Ventura said.

Ventura and his band, also called Rivers Ventura, won the top prize in last August's Minerpalooza Battle of the Bands in El Paso, and continue to perform in Las Cruces and the region.

Ventura, 20, rehearses and performs with fellow band members, Rafa Dayrell (lead guitar), Leo Chavez (rhythm guitar), Gilbert Parra (bass) and Adrian Marquez (drums). He also writes the band's songs, books shows and promotes the music and performances.

"I do it full time," said Ventura, who is also a full-time student, studying marketing at New Mexico State University in Las Cruces and at the University of Texas-El Paso.

Ventura also finds time to give back to his community. The band performed May 29 at The Range in Las Cruces, collecting donations for domestic violence shelters — something near and dear to

Ventura's heart — in Las Cruces and El Paso.

"I really believe in my music," said Ventura, who has recorded two extended-play (EP) records of five songs each on the 88 Rising label.

During a visit to Beverly Hills, California with his father, Ventura was bold enough to hang a bed sheet on which he had painted the Rivers Ventura band logo over the door of Live Nation Entertainment's corporate office. (The move got him calls from a couple of talent scouts.)

Ventura grew up in

El Paso, but was born in Oxnard, California. His music reflects those early roots — Ventura writes and performs what he calls "surf rock" or "mellow rock."

"It sounds like the ocean, the shore," Ventura said. "It's a unique sound."

He didn't start playing guitar until age 17, first collaborating with Chavez and other high-school classmates to create his band. He started writing songs within the first few months of picking up a

guitar and convinced his father to let him travel to California to record his first song.

the light, sound and projections operator.

Here is a description of "Women Playing Hamlet" from Playscripts, Inc. an independent publisher of new plays and musicals, which published the play: "Hamlet's a challenge for any actor, but when Jessica is cast as the titular character in a New York production, it sends her into an existential tailspin. It doesn't help that every Starbucks barista with an MFA tells her she's too young for the role. Or that she's somehow managed to make Sir Patrick Stewart her nemesis. Not to mention the fact that she's a woman. How can Jessica figure out how 'to be or not to be,' when she can't even figure out herself?"

The play was first produced in April 2015 in

Miami, Florida. The BBT production is its 50th, with a September-October 2022 production scheduled in Columbus, Ohio.

"Women Playing Hamlet" is the ninth play written by Downs that BBT has produced. The others are "Cockeyed," "Mad Gravity," "Seagulls in a Cherry Tree," "Headset" and "How to Survive Your Family at Christmas," produced live; and streaming plays "The Meaning of Life," "Karl the Magnificent" and "Mr. Rogers, American Terminator!"

Downs, who lives in Las Cruces in 2019 to see a performance of "How to Survive Your Family at Christmas" at BBT.

Downs has won awards as both a playwright and a screenwriter. There have been more than 300

northern Colorado, was in productions of his plays in theatres worldwide.

> Downs has an MFAs in acting from the University of Illinois and in screenwriting from UCLA. He worked as script secretary on the NBC television series "Moonlighting," was a staff writer on the CBS television series "My Two Dads" and wrote episodes for the NBC series "Fresh Prince of Bel Air and "Amen."

Downs has co-authored four books: "Naked Playwriting," "Playwriting: From Formula To Form," "Screenplay: Writing The Picture" and "The Art of Theatre."

"Women Playing Hamlet" is the 63rd play Ceil Herman has directed at BBT, with two more coming during the theater's current season. Ceil and

Women Make Movies: A celebration at the Rio Grande Theatre

Kicking off 50 years of distributing and supporting films made by women, Ariel Dougherty of Truth or Consequences has spearheaded a New Mexico tour of women's film creations over the years. She will be wrapping up this tour in Las Cruces, 7 p.m. on Wednesday, July 6, at the Rio Grande Theatre Downtown. The event is free.

Today the company Dougherty and Sheila Paige started in New York in the 1970s, Women Make Movies, is the globe's largest distributor of women's films.

Dougherty and Paige were both film teachers. Dougherty's first teaching

job was at an agricultural high school in Queens, New York, and she found her joy in working with young filmmakers. The two women decided to work together with the women in Chelsea, New York, and for a while they were working out of a

church rectory basement, working around other church events, often on weekends and evenings.

"In the summer and fall of 1972, we got a small grant from the New York Council for the Arts," Dougherty said. "We completed five films with that money and were invited to the International Women's Film Festival in Toronto."

Through the 1970s, Women Make Movies taught filmmaking and held workshops, resulting in the creation of 40 women-made films.

"We started to attract more women committed to social change through media," she said. "Film schools were rare in those days."

In 1980, the organiza-

tion stopped teaching and creating films and moved to distribution and supporting women filmmakers across the globe. As of today, the non-profit's achievement includes 59,612 movie screenings with 2,883 filmmakers over 86 countries.

While an independent filmmaker and feminist cultural advocate, Dougherty is no longer part of the organization, but she continues to support the mission.

"In 1980, we were told women were not an audience," she said. "That just showed how the film industry was, and remains, in Lala Land about women's role in cinema."

Despite the challenge of the current trend of sitting at home streaming video, Dougherty said she is committed to live audience screenings.

She will be showing two works from contemporary women's film teaching projects at the event.

The Rio Grande Theatre screening includes several films made by women and starts with two shorts from more contemporary girl-centered community film teaching programs.

"One of them is from a program with the New Mexico Media Literacy Project," she said. "The film, 'Las Mujeres Dentro De Mi / The Woman Inside Me' (2013 4:54m) by an anonymous director is an imaginative, sensitive, cinematic poem about a youth's complex sexual urnings."

"Do You Know How

We Feel?" (2002, 21m) is a series of skit exchanges about street harassment made by two groups of girl filmmakers taught in Mumbai, India by Paromita Vohra and in New York City by Maria Nicolo. The cross-cultural video reflects both countries traditions, vet has amusing views of the common, daily sexual exploitation suffered by girls and women. Dougherty will show an 11-minute selection from the piece.

"Surviva" (1980, 32m), Dougherty's film, co-made with Carol Clement, is about livelihood challenges of a rural woman artist and her women's support group, is rich in animation. It will be

In either your physical bill that hit your mailbox or the electronic version that hit your inbox, June's Las Cruces Utilities (LCU) bill asks a favor – to fill out a survey that lets LCU know how they're doing.

"The Annual LCU Survey is an educational tool to ensure we are helping our customers understand what we do and what they might need to do," said LCU Director Delilah Walsh. "For example, it's a way to remind customers when to put out their trash container and why the LCU Dispatch is important, especially during emergencies."

The survey is also a way ensuring that the public knows the difference between the grappler and the Green Grappler which picks up yard waste to become mulch that is given out free to the public from the City of Las Cruces Foothills Clean Fill location at 555 S. Sonoma Ranch Blvd.

Public engagement is requested for the 12-question survey, which highlights how customers can also engage, and monitor, two utility services through a free online portal called UtilityHawk.

The survey also asks about residents' confidence in drinking water quality, whether containers should go on the curb or the street, and if they remember the 3-digits to "Call Before You Dig" so that a tree planting doesn't end up damaging a water pipe in your yard. If you prefer to

fill out the survey physically, it can be mailed in or dropped off at one of the two Customer Central locations at City Hall or the East Mesa Customer Central location at 5195 Bataan Memorial West.

Walsh said, "We do review the results of the survey and it lets us know in what ways we might need to detail the services we offer, which are paid for only through services provided and not through tax dollars."



Southwest Sport and Spine does it all, now has three clinics

When Denise Campbell opened Southwest Sport and Spine Center (SSSC) in Las Cruces May 1, 2000, the staff was comprised of herself (a licensed physical therapist) and an office manager. Today, as SSSC celebrates its 22nd anniversary, the company has three clinics in Las Cruces and El Paso as part of the nationwide Fyzical Therapy & Balance Center (FTBC) franchise and 80 employees.

At clinics in Las Cruces and El Paso, SSSC staff provide medical and scientific-based physical therapy and fitness and are on the cutting edge in the study and treatment of balance and breathing issues that are at the core of good health.

SSSC specializes in orthopedic and post-surgical therapy, aquatic therapy, work injury management,

athletic training and performance enhancement (neuromusculoskeletal), vestibular rehabilitation (inner ear issues like balance and dizziness), chronic pain management, concussions and temporomandibular joint disorders (TMJ and TMD) of the jaw and face.

"Clinic balance technology is used to measure reaction strategies for NMSU athletes," said SSSC Director of Sports Medicine David Gallegos. "This helps provide insight into performance needs and baselines to measure return to normal after injuries."

Since becoming a part of the FTBC franchise in 2017, SSSC has become a primary care provider for musculoskeletal disorders, which include tendinitis, carpal tunnel syndrome, arthritis, fibromyalgia and recovery from bone fractures.

SSSC is also "one of the highest-level" balance centers in the Southwest, Campbell said, and has one of only 50 computerized dynamic posturography (CDP) machines in the United States.

CDP measures how well a patient can maintain balance under different conditions. It can help pinpoint which area of the body is taking the lead (usually the eyes, which can weaken with age) in maintaining balance and which areas need to be strengthened, Campbell said. It can detect innerear, vision, joint and flexibility issues that could contribute to balance, falls and injuries, she said.

In many cases, she said, issues can be reversed within a few weeks using simple exercises that the patient can do at home.

Using special lightblocking goggles, SSSC can detect benign paroxysmal positional vertigo (BPPV), which causes dizziness, vertigo (spinning sensation), loss of balance and nausea, Campbell said, and can often be corrected in two to three clinic visits.

Aquatic therapy is available to treat injuries and health issues like strokes, arthritis and recent surgeries for which weightbearing exercises are not practical.

With major scientific advances in the last decade, physical therapy and fitness are about the whole person, Campbell said, including heart-rate variability, the autonomic nervous system, the immune system, carbon

dioxide levels and brain chemistry.

SSSC staff are doing work in breathing science that is not going on anywhere else in the country, Campbell said.

SSSC breathing technician Paola Quiroz not only helps patients deal with a wide range of health issues by improving their breathing, she also is teaching diaphragmatic breathing techniques to members of her own family – and they are helping the 22-year-old deal with the knee and hip issues she has had for the past nine years.

"For me, it's literally life-changing," Quiroz said. "It has opened my eyes to so many other aspects of being a health care worker."

"There's a lot you can do, and we can guide you," she said.

Every patient who needs it will get a treatment plan to address

whatever issues an initial evaluation discloses. A payment plan can also be created, although some Medicare and Medicaid patients may have to pay nothing for the treatment they receive.

Campbell said her clients include middleschool athletes as young as 12. Others have been with her since SSSC first opened its doors.

A native of southeast Texas, Campbell was a four-sport athlete in high school. A dislocated knee got her interested in physical therapy, which she has been doing her entire adult life "in a way that I knew could help people." Campbell's work has included helping professional athletes around the world recover from everything from concussions to knee injuries.

Campbell and her husband, John, made the

decision to keep their business in Las Cruces and offer services that are generally available only in larger cities.

"You have to bloom where you are planted." Campbell said.

Her advice to busy people taking care of families, jobs and homes: "Spend time on yourself." It is easier to not lose it (good health) then lose it completely and never get it back," she said.

It's Aggies vs. Lobos in \$1M summer ESPN hoops tourney

If you can't wait until November for the start of college basketball season and want a taste of New Mexico State University hoops this summer, you are in luck.

A team of NM State alumni, calling themselves the Panamaniacs, will play in The Basketball Tournament, a \$1 million, winner-take-all summer event that will be broadcast on the ESPN family of networks.

That game is scheduled to be the nightcap of four games of action at 8 p.m. July 18.

Notable Panamaniac players include Wendell McKines (2007-12), Johnny McCants (2017-22) and Justin Hawkins (2006-08).

The team will be coached by current NMSU Athletics Director and former Aggie baseball great Mario Moccia.

"This is taking place in a traditional quiet time for college athletics," Moccia said. "In August, you start ramping up for football season. In those quieter times, it is great to have things that remind people of Aggie athletics. Even if it is basketball and it's alums, it is great to say, 'Hey, in seven weeks, we have our home opener in football (Aug. 27 vs. Nevada)."

These type of events can help to increase the exposure of New Mexico State athletics and its former players and can be used as a way to stay connected with alumni living in the Albuquerque metropolitan area and the northern part of the state, Moccia said.

Moccia said he will rely heavily on his assistant coaches – guys like William Benjamin, Billy Keys and Preston Laird – to do the real coaching.

Moccia said participating in these kinds of events is crucial for New Mexico State to keep itself in the public's eye.

"We don't have the luxury of being in an El Paso or Albuquerque media market with 700,000 or 800,000 people with multiple television stations and radio sports talk shows," Moccia said. "We have to go the extra mile to keep Aggie athletics on the tip of everyone's tongue so that is one of the reasons why I said I'd love to participate in this."

In words of Yogi Berra, the future of golf 'ain't what it used to be'

The late Frank Thomas, who was the longtime USGA technical director (and a TV analyist) stated flatly: "Equipment will not change measurably in performance, no matter what marketers claim." Wow! That's like the U.S. Patent office officially proclaiming at the turn of the 20th century (1900) that "everything that can be invented has been invented;" and that was prior to household telephones, mass ownership of automobiles and universal electric wiring.

Fortunately Mr.
Thomas was way off the mark, as even the occasional golfer can attest, outfitted with the latest titanium clubs, balls and rangefinders. Without clever inventors, some of us aging avid golfers wouldn't hit it out of our

shadow. The pros now bomb drives 300 to 350

yards, and hit 5 irons 260. (Hence, the USGA's Distance Insights investigation.) The equipment we play today is the best ever, and the stuff will just keep getting better. The men and women pros will

just keep getting better, and the golf courses will just keep getting longer.

As to golf courses, designer Dr. Michael Hurdzan noted his view of the future back in 2000: "The American golf course will retain its image of a lush, green oasis, but will use significantly less water, fertilizer, pesticides and fossil fuels.

These changes will not be so much government mandated as driven by the competition of our free enterprise and American value systems." I'm not an expert, but I have played plenty of golf and plenty of golf courses, both private and munis, from the East Coast to the West Coast, from the North to the South, as well as Hawaii. Regrettably, I have not seen the "lush green" oasis Hurdzan thought would happen. In the 20plus years since 9/11, our economy has not been booming and money has been tight. So are the lies, both from fairways and the bunkers. We better get used to it because the lush green carpets for us to

play on every day are still a long way off, and only seen on television.

Then there's the matter of money. Here's what former USGA chief (and TV analyst) Frank Hannigan asserted about professional golf: "The money has gotten too big." Gee Frank, ya' think? Offering his predictions about the general golfing population back in the year 2000 was Joe Louis Barrow, son of the famed boxing champion Joe Louis, and former CEO of The First Tee. Barrow's vision 22 years ago was that "golf will not be for those rich with time, but for those who care to take a walk in the park for an hour or three."

He must have been thinking that most golf facilities are planning to hire Army drill sergeants for "player ambassadors" to speed play. I like what Barrow added: "The (future) game will be more about family than individuals."

bins or dumping in an alleyway is for SCSWA, but for trash, reach out to the joint SCSWA/Las Cruces Utilities' "One Stop, One Call" number 575-541-2111. For illegal dumping in the County, call 1-877-NO-THROW.

3. Make sure the incident was recent to ensure a timely resolution.

"If you saw it a week ago, it's probably something we can still go out to fix, but if it was a few months ago, what you saw dumped may not be there anymore," said Peck.
4. Consider Attainable Expectations.
"We're able to pick up the illegal dumping,

the illegal dumping, but we, unfortunately, don't have the manpower to do patrols or investigate who may have done it," said Peck.

Peck also explained that many solutions that customers have involve many stakeholders that SCSWA is accountable to, including the City of Las Cruces and the Doca Ana

County, which are both represented on the SCSWA Board through the mayor, city councilors, and county commissioners, and county manager.

"For example, if the customers suggest that we move to a private hauler, that's a long-term policy discussion that gets decided through the Board," he said. SCSWA was established in 1995 as a Joint Powers Agreement between Dona Ana County and the City of Las Cruces.

Mexican American Cultural Institute to honor heritage, culture, history

When it opens in 2024, the Mexican American Cultural Institute (MACI) will be the first-ever national cultural center on the United States-Mexico border and the first center in the U.S. "exclusively dedicated to the distinctive experience of Mexican Americans." And, it will be less than 50 miles from Las Cruces.

MACI (pronounced MAH see) will be housed in the historic Lincoln Center in south-central El Paso. The nonprofit signed a long-term lease with the State of Texas in January, with renovations beginning shortly after. The center is expected to open in late 2024.

It "will celebrate the achievement of Mexican Americans through research, archives and programs," said Orlando Padilla, Las Cruces businessman and member of the MACI Board.

"We have so many supporters from all fields," Padilla said, including community, business, government, academia and the arts. Major supporters in addition to the State of Texas include the Raza Development Fund (RDF) of Phoenix, with other funders in discussion, Padilla said.

With support from Padilla, master fresco artist Frederico Vigil of Santa Fe and others, the center will have strong ties to New Mexico, said MACI Board President Silvestre Reyes

of El Paso. A recent MACI Board strategic planning retreat was held in Mesilla, as will the next one.

"It's something that we are tremendously proud of," said Reyes, who has many family members in Las Cruces and Mesilla. Reyes represented El Paso in the U.S. House of Representatives, 1997-2013, and has been involved with MACI since 2014.

MACI is "dedicated to the study, research, promotion, advancement and celebration of the arts, culture, history and traditions that promote the knowledge and richness of the Mexican American heritage, as expressed and experienced nationally and in our unique border region," according to the institute's vision.

For Reyes and others with MACI, it is a deeply personal commitment that honors internationally famous Mexican Americans like civil rights activist César Chávez; others whose contributions are often overlooked. like Fabian Garcia, who transformed agriculture around the world during a 50-year career with New Mexico State University; and the struggles and triumphs of everyday **Mexican Americans** whose lives are intricately woven into the fabric of American culture.

Reyes, 77, remembers a sign he saw at age 9 in Balmorhea, Texas: "No Mexicans, N----- or dogs allowed."

"I learned early on what the struggles were and they're still here," said Reyes, a native of Canutillo, Texas, and the first Hispanic to represent El Paso in the U.S. House.

El Paso County is 83 percent Hispanic, Reyes said. The U.S. Census Bureau lists Doña Ana County's population as almost 69 percent Hispanic.

"As Mexican Americans, we have much to be proud of," Reyes said in a MACI brochure. "What we don't have are enough facilities where we can tell our own story and document our own accomplishments. MACI intends to change that through this project."

"I want to make our area a destination point," Reyes said, similar to the Smithsonian Institution in Washington, D.C. MACI exhibitions, events, education and research will focus on many aspects of the history and culture of Mexican Americans, including the Bracero program (1942-64 federal farm labor agreement with Mexico), Medal of Honor recipients (61 Hispanic American service members), mariachi music, Dia de los Muertos, immigration and Mexican American culinary arts.

MACI said Latinos make up 18.7 percent of the U.S. population, generated \$2.7 trillion to the U.S. gross domestic product in 2019, have \$1.7 trillion in purchasing power (growing 70 percent faster than non-Latinos) and are the youngest major ethnic group in the U.S. with a median age of 28.
