ENGINEERING AND ROADS UPDATE

What it means to grade a road

Doña Ana County maintains over 700 miles of unpaved road that requires constant grading. Most of our roads are on the 4-week cycle. The aim of grading is to create and preserve road geometry which is required shape for dirt roads to function properly.

Our chip seal crew has completed paving projects on Schneberger, Tuna, Gramma Grass, Deer Grass and Maguey roads in Chaparral. The roads were graded to create a positive drainage, base course aggregate was placed and finally two inches of asphalt pavement capped the road surface to create an awesome surface. The paving will improve road safety and offer a more comfortable drive. Doña Ana County thanks the road crew members.

COUNTY TO DISTRIBUTE EMPTY SANDBAGS IN PREPARATION FOR MONSOON SEASON

Doña Ana County, NM - To help residents of Doña Ana County prepare for monsoon season, the Office of Emergency Management is setting up distribution sites for empty sandbags to help residents with flood mitigation.

City and county officials are assisting residents with preparation for potential flooding caused by heavy rain in a short period of time.

It is recommended to fill the sandbags close to where they are going to be used. It is advised to fill sandbags with either clean sand or soil. While vard dirt can be used, it is not ideal if it contains debris that could puncture the bag, providing an opening for water to penetrate the bag therefore weakening the ability to prevent flooding.

Good sources of sand are designated sand piles (at or near some County fire stations), as well as from arroyos. Sand can also be purchased in bulk (usually by the ton) from a variety of landscaping and sand/gravel companies (for those wanting to have it delivered to their houses).

Each household is allowed up to 25 empty bags, but in flood-prone areas, up to 50 per household will be provided. County residents may pick up sandbags at the following fire stations and community centers in Doña Ana County.

Nonprofit to benefit children founded, run by high schoolers

It all started when Shreeya Moolamalla was in ninth grade and met a speaker "who talked about how he was treated terribly due to his face deformity."

Moolamalla was inspired to help underprivileged children in her community. Three years later, she is a senior at Mesilla Valley Christian Schools (MVCS) and founder and president of HandinHand, sponsored under the Community Foundation of Southern New Mexico (CFSNM).

HandinHand, with its own board of directors composed entirely of MVCS students, is fundraising and advocating on behalf of Doña Ana County children dealing with neurodiversity (variations in brain function and behavior), health and financial issues.

"We seek to make a difference in the lives of the children we meet," HandinHand said on the CFSNM website.

"We are the first youth philanthropic organization that is completely run by high school students, and this is a great opportunity for more high school students ... for the reason that not only will they turn into leaders, but also help children who really need it," said Moolamalla, 16.

HandinHand members have volunteered at many local events, helping nonprofits and programs that benefit children. They have worked with special education students at Valley View Elementary School and children at the La Casa, Inc. domestic violence program and to benefit the children served by La Piñon Sexual Assault Recovery Services.

"It is such an amazing experience to meet these children," Moolamalla said.

"I love helping kids," said HandInHand Vice President Connor Coyle, 17.

Even though he was busy at school and playing baseball, basketball and football, Coyle said he "decided to go all in" with HandinHand.

"Kids can help in ways that better relate to children," said Coyle.

He has found ways to balance these new respon-

sibilities with his schoolwork and athletics, Coyle said.

"It's so much fun," he said. "It's a big part of me."

"HandinHand meant that I could finally make a difference in my community and I didn't have to do it alone, I would have fellow teens who wanted to help people as well that I could work and grow with," said HandinHand historian Keely Starritt, 17.

The organization has "taught me leadership skills, how to work and plan events with a group of people, and it has given me the opportunity to help people from a different walk of life. I am so excited to continue to work with Shreeya and all the members of HandinHand," Starritt said.

"I am happy I got to be part of it," said Handin-Hand treasurer Ethan Mondoux. 17, who moved to Las Cruces from California four years ago.

Mondoux said he was "not good with kids" before joining the organization, but has become more comfortable interacting with them and taking on a leadership role as HandinHand

treasurer, his first elective office.

Sharing kids' happy moments, helping them make good memories and "making an impact" in his community have become important to Mondoux, he said.

HandinHand Secretary Elizabeth Duvallon has been friends with Moolamalla since first grade.

"I just wanted to be there by her side," said Duvallon.

She has enjoyed "hanging out with the kids" and building relationships with them, Duvallon said. And, she believes it has made a difference to the children.

Part of the work Moolamalla and the other Hand-inHand officers are doing is focused on the organization's sustainability – keeping it going after they have graduated.

Moolamalla said she is interested in research work and neuroscience as a potential career. Duvallon wants to be a film director. Mondoux is interested in studying psychology. Coyle is thinking about a career in real estate or possibly going to law school. Starritt is thinking about studying marine biology.

HandinHand membership is open to anyone up to age 18, Moolamalla said.



Early monsoon season may deliver additional rain

"The rains are here," said National Weather Service (NWS) meteorologist Jason Laney.

It's an early start for the monsoon season, which could produce a total of six to seven inches in the **Southwest United States** by the end of September, Laney said in a telephone interview. He is the warning coordination meteorologist for NWS' El Paso weather forecast office in

Santa Teresa, New Mexico.

But even a wetter-thanusual summer won't end the region's drought, driven by a third consecutive La Niña climate pattern that forecasts a cold, dry winter, he said.

NWS defines the monsoon season as June 15-Sept. 30, but it doesn't usually start in the El Paso-Las Cruces region until mid-July, Laney said. This year, however, the conditions that define the onset of the monsoons were in place in June.

"We really started seeing monsoon conditions full force on (June) 21," Laney said, when both a highpressure air mass and rising dew point (measuring moisture in the air) were in place. The 2021 monsoon season official started June 28, he said.

But a monsoon isn't a rainstorm; it's a seasonal reversal of winds.

In the desert Southwest, prevailing winds are from the west and southwest, Laney said. They come off other desert regions, so

they don't produce a lot of moisture. The pattern shifts in the summer "and we begin to have more of a flow from the south or southeast," he said. "Most of the time it picks up moisture when it happens."

An area needs to receive at least 50 percent of its annual rainfall as a result of the wind change for it to be a true monsoon, Laney said. Since El Paso gets an average of 5.7 inches of rain during the monsoon season (59 percent of its annual total) and Las Cruces gets about 5.5 inches (57 percent), "we definitely qualify to be a monsoon," he said.

Because "summer thunderstorms can be quite isolated," Laney said, "the numbers only tell part of the story. So much of it is who gets what," he said, noting that west El Paso "took the brunt" during heavy monsoons in 2006 and La Union had severe flooding issues because of last year's monsoon precipitation.

But even with a wetterthan-usual summer this year, the region's drought is likely to continue, Laney

said.

That's because a La Niña weather pattern is in place for the third year in a row, creating a dryer, colder winter than one experienced during an El Niño.

El Niño is the warm phase of the El Niño-Southern Oscillation (ENSO) weather pattern (winds and sea-surface temperatures) in the equatorial Pacific Ocean that impacts weather around the world. La Niña is the opposite - a cooling phase of ENSO. There is also a third, neutral phase. ("El Niño de Navidad," a reference to the Christ Child, was given to the warm,

south-flowing air current centuries ago by Peruvian fishermen because it was most noticeable around Christmas. "La Niña" [the girl] came into use sometime later to denote the opposite air current.])

Laney said existing drought conditions began in the summer of 2020, during a weak monsoon season. The Southwest remains in NWS's D3 category, "extreme drought," he said. Categories range from D0 (abnormally dry) to D4 (exceptional drought).

Downtown tower has new owner, rich history

Frank O. Papen had big dreams for Las Cruces.

You've heard the saying, "When you dream, aim for the stars! Even if you miss, you might hit the moon!"

Space was big in the 1960s, and Papen was banking on it. Literally.

An influential board member, chairman and president of First National Bank of Doña Ana County, Papen was

Ana County, Papen was known as "Mr. First National." In 1962, President John F.

Kennedy had challenged America to get to the moon by the end of the decade. The Soviet Union had already beaten us with the first satellite (Sputnik, 1957), and the Space Race was on.

Papen knew NASA had a future in Florida and in Houston, but NASA had a presence in Las Cruces (White Sands Test Facility, 1963) and he was betting on the come.

He envisioned thousands of Las Crucens working for NASA in a big building downtown. After all, southern New Mexico was a cradle of space history,

with Goddard's rocketry pioneering in Roswell, Von Braun's V2 at White Sands Proving Grounds, the high-speed test track at Holloman Air Force Base and, of course, 1945's atomic bomb test.

So, he built a building that would get as close to space as any building

in Las Cruces ever would: The First National Bank Tower. Construction began in 1966 for a seven-story building, and by the time It opened its doors in 1967, it had grown to 120 feet and 10 floors, 11 if you count the basement. Las Cruces was as poised as any Southwest city for an explosion.

Most of those NASA jobs, however, stayed in Florida; Houston; Huntsville, Alabama; and elsewhere. The flurry of skyscrapers never came.

First National Bank sold to

Wells Fargo, which had the tower for many years and maintained offices in the tower, as did several government agencies. In 1983, Abraham's restaurant took a space on the fourth floor. (When I came to Las Cruces in 2007, Abraham's also took a space in my heart. I love their meatloaf, burgers, pie and, of course, the fact they sell RC Cola). But by the mid-2010s, everything with the aging tower seemed to be taking the "down" elevator.

A half century after Papen, however, another man came along who had big dreams for Las Cruces.

In 2009, Anthony Dohrmann began a little company now known as Electronic Caregiver, which creates devices that assist people with healthcare and safety. A few years ago, having grown the company steadily, Dohrmann looked for some bigger office space.

If you've ever met Dohrmann, you know he doesn't think small. So, he went for the biggest building in town. At first, they occupied one floor, then two, then three, then four and more. The next step: Stripping Wells Fargo's name from the top of the tower and replacing it with Electronic Caregiver.

And now, the biggest step: Monday, July 11, Electronic Caregiver bought the whole building.

For Kiel Hoffman, Las Cruces market president of Pioneer Bank, which orchestrated the loan for the \$8.9 million purchase price, the deal has additional personal meeting. His late father, Bob Hoffman, was a New Mexico economic developer who worked on the original deal for the building in the 1960s and attended the ribbon cutting.

The sale solidifies not only Electronic Caregiver as a force in New Mexico and beyond, it further solidifies the Las Cruces community and our re-emerging downtown.

Here's to the big dreamers!

Desert Hope complex drawing keen attention

The city of Las Cruces has a lot invested in the Desert Hope apartment complex for low-income residents.

It's not just the financial investment, coming from local, state and federal sources. There is also a large segment of our community eager for the opportunity to say, "I told you that was a bad idea; never try that again," if things go wrong.

Which is why it was so discouraging to read reports last month from both residents and neighbors that the complex was

being neglected. Residents said

there has been a lack of security and maintenance, resulting in damages to the property that do not get repaired, and increased criminal activity.

Neighbors on or near Pecos Street have complained about aggressive panhandlers,

people sleeping on or near their property, attempts to break into their homes and finding waste left behind. Cue the NIMBY Chorus, just as city officials are planning an expansion

of the facility.
The shame is that
Desert Hope, and other
complexes like it, are
exactly what the city
needs to address a

growing homeless population.

Getting people off the

streets and into a safe, secure environment is often the critical first step in helping them turn their lives around. A wellmanaged Desert Hope would be a benefit to the community and a Godsend to some of its most vulnerable members.

That's where the JL Gray Company comes into the picture. It has been hired to manage the complex, and has already started to clean and make repairs, company director Jeff Curry said. He said they would work to educate residents on the rules, and would terminate leases when necessary.

Las Cruces Police said they planned more patrols in the neighborhood around the complex. They have also started a new neighborhood watch group with area residents and business owners and installed a new security camera near the apartments.

It is wrong to associate homelessness with crime. Desert Hope residents have the same desire for safety and security as we all do. They want to see the trouble-makers removed just as much as the neighbors do.

City officials plan to expand on the Desert Hope model as they continue working to assist those who do not have stable, permanent housing. That's why it's so important to learn from past mistakes and to get this right.

Desert Hope will be a model, one way or the other. Right now, it is Exhibit A for all of those screaming, "Not in my backyard!" But, the right steps are being taken to alter that reality and make the complex an asset for our community.

Protecting citizens' right to vote

The League of Women Voters supports election procedures that protect the right of every citizen to vote and that are verifiable. New Mexico is fortunate to have a wellfunctioning voting system and has been rated in the top half of the states by the MIT Election Performance Lab. Recently, however, we have seen how pandemics, wildfires, and partisan activities pose challenges to orderly elections, the vote counting may be confusing, and threats to election workers, a form of voter suppression, have become more frequent.

Elections are administered by professionals whose day-to-day activities focus on voting and they depend crucially on citizens who assist by serving as voter registration agents and poll workers. Elected officials, such as county clerks, county commissioners, and secretaries of state, are also important to successful elections.

Some nonpartisan organizations have been examining election administration to see how our system might be strengthened. A fairly simple step would be adoption of a code of ethics and oath of neutrality for elected administrators. County clerks and secretaries of state would commit to refrain from endorsing or fundraising for other candidates; they would also agree to step back from decisions involving their own race.

Other reforms could include designating these election-related positions as nonpartisan, so that candidates for the offices run without a party affiliation on the ballot.

Additional issues receiving attention involve the federal Electoral College. Controversies over the counting process were particularly problematic in the 1876 presidential election when neither Rutherford B. Hayes (Republican) nor Samuel Tilden (Democrat) received an electoral majority and multiple states presented serious problems. A 15-member commission appointed by Congress ultimately decided the disputes in favor of Hayes.

The Electoral Count Act of 1887 was intended

to resolve some of the issues, but confusion remains. Electors are appointed in each state on Election Day and subsequently meet to send certificates of their votes to the U.S. Archivist, the President of the Senate, and the federal judge in the district where the electors voted. A joint session of Congress convenes in January to certify the vote and declare official results of the election for President and Vice President. The President of the Senate (the Vice President), presides over the joint session, preserving order and opening all the certificates.

Potential reforms under discussion include

Health secretary reviews 'game-changers'

Oral treatments, taken from the convenience of home, reduce our chance of severe outcomes from COVID-19, including hospitalization and death, by nearly 90 percent. What more needs to be said? But wait, there is more: Oral treatments can prevent our hospitals from being overrun during surges. That's

a game-changer.

You might be saying, sounds good, but who gets these oral treatments? Just those at risk for hospitalization or death? Well, yes and no. Yes, of course those at increased risk for severe outcomes qualify for oral treatment. But what constitutes a high risk individual? You may be surprised to know: Anyone who is over 65, overweight, pregnant, has asthma, is a smoker, diabetic and more. So in fact, that means the majority of us here in New Mexico. The more qualifying conditions a person has, the more likely they'll suffer severe outcomes. If this is you, the time is now to speak with your doctor about a plan for oral treatments.

So how do we all get started? A positive test result is required, along with any COVID-19 symptom, even fatigue. A few options: The Department of Health has launched a resource to help you find a treatment. Test-to-treat locations offer both testing and treatment during the same visit. Since treatment needs to start within the five-day window of the first symptom, the value of one-stop shopping goes beyond convenience.

Another is at-home tests; quick results mean you'll have the best chance at seeking treatment fast. If you don't already have a handful of these tests at your house now, order some today at findatestnm.org.

As tired as we are of COVID-19, it is not tired of us. And it's not done with us. By using these game-changing tools, we become the game-changer ourselves.

You have that power; I urge you to use it just like one of my patients did Memorial Day 2022. She had a positive home test, is over 65 and has other risk factors. She texted me while I was out with my wife on a bike ride, and after we returned home I called her, verified her test result, symptoms and risk factors. Then I sent a prescription for oral treatment to her pharmacy. As I write this, she's already taken her first dose.

I'd like to thank all of you for your continued efforts to safeguard your fellow New Mexicans. COVID-19 may not be over, but we are stronger than ever and can reach that day in the hopefully not too-distant future, together.

The simple take away: Get vaccinated. Get tested. Get treated (right away).






Last year, the New Mexico Legislature passed a historic resolution that will propose a constitutional amendment to the voters this fall to invest more than \$245 million each year in additional funding from our state's \$26 billion Land Grant Permanent Fund to support our children's education in our state. Around \$127 million of that away from the greatest opnew funding would support early childhood programs every single year.

I have been proud to be a part of this effort alongside so many parents, educators

and children's advocates. I was the first member of New Mexico's Congressional Delegation to support investing more of the resources in the Permanent Fund in early childhood education. And I am now leading the effort in Congress to pass the New Mexico Education Enhancement Act, which would provide the congressional approval that the State Legislature requested for the proposed state constitutional amendment.

This new, consistent level of investment will help us deliver high-quality preschool education to all of the 3- and 4-year-olds in our state so all of our kids can arrive at their first day of kindergarten ready to learn. We will also be able to grow our early childhood workforce and provide long-needed and consistent support to the childcare providers and fair wages to early childhood teachers across our state.

We are now only steps portunity in our lifetimes to transform our state's future—from early childhood on—by investing in our children at the level they have long deserved.



Turner Classic Movies shows it Tuesday, July 19, as part of a festival of features based on Verne novels ... and as fantastical as the others also may be, none holds a candle to the sheer grandeur of "80 Days," which crammed every star it could get into the proceedings.

who accepts a wager to prove he can circle the globe in – you guessed it – just under three months. He brings his valet Passepartout (Mexican actor and comic Cantinflas) along, using various means of transportation including a hot-air balloon to accomplish the journey.

Shirley MacLaine also stars as a princess saved from a terrible fate by the duo, becoming their companion as the path brings them to America ... but Spain, Italy, India, Hong Kong and Japan also are on the itinerary, with filming actually done in every country featured in the saga. As a problematic police inspector, Robert Newton completes the starring quartet, but the "name" talent certainly doesn't stop there.





Mesilla restaurant wins Wine Spectator award

Salud! de Mesilla, 1800 Avenida de Mesilla, has won Wine Spectator's 2022 award of excellence.

Wine Spectator is a magazine focused on wine and wine culture. It began the Restaurant Awards Program in 1991.

Salud! was the only restaurant in Las Cruces, one of only two in southern New Mexico and one of 24 statewide to receive the honor as Wine Spectator recognized restaurants in all 50 states and more than 70 countries and territories worldwide with 2022 restaurant awards for outstanding wine programs.

Salud! co-owner Christopher Schaljo-Hernandez said the restaurant is adding more wines to its selection and will feature 122 varieties by the end of July, including wines from the United States, Europe and South America. Salud! specializes in California, South American, Spanish and Italian wines, he said, with a focus on wines produced by minority-and women-owned wineries.

Prices range from \$28 to \$187 a bottle and \$7-\$51 a glass.

As part of their training, Salud! servers learn about the restaurant's different wines, how to present them and how to pair them with the food they serve, Schaljo-Hernandez said. The training includes staff wine tastings so servers know first hand which wine complements a particular food item on the menu, he said.

"The Award of Excellence is given to restaurants that offer thoughtfully chosen lists, containing both quality and diverse selections that are compatible with the menu's style and pricing," Wine Spectator said on its website.

Schaljo-Hernandez and partner Russell Hernandez opened Salud! in 2016. It has 44 employees.

Blank Conversations Theatre Company (BCTC) is gearing up for all kinds of shows for the 2022-23 season at Rio Grande Theatre (RGT), 211 N. Main St. downtown. As it enters its third year, the company expects this season to be full of nothing but honest, exciting and thoughtful presentations.

BCTC leaps into the farcical world of "The Importance of Being Earnest" by renowned playwright Oscar Wilde. Directed by Christopher Lininger, who directed Blank's production of "Singin' in the Rain" earlier this year, the play follows the story of two bachelors, John "Jack" Worthing and Algernon "Algy" Moncrieff, who create alter egos named Ernest to escape their tiresome lives. They attempt to win the hearts of two women who, conveniently, claim to only love men called Ernest. The pair struggle to

The play premiered Off Broadway in 1968, but regained popularity with a Broadway revival in 2018 and a subsequent film adaptation on Netflix. The show is set to open July 2023.

This season will also see the return of the famed "Rocky Horror Shadow Cast" events,

Fort Selden has guided tours; 'A Night of Folklore' is July 23

A step back into the history of the Old West is only a 20-minute drive from downtown Las Cru-

Hop on Interstate 25 and head north of Las Cruces. Take the Radium Springs exit (exit 19), follow the signs and you will arrive at Fort Selden Historic Site.

There you can tour the ruins of Fort Selden, a frontier fort that was home to United States Army cavalry and infantry, including the famed Buffalo Soldiers, 1865-91. A young Douglas MacArthur (1880-1964) lived here as a young child when his father, Arthur MacArthur Jr. (1945-1912) was post commander.

The recorded history of the area dates back to about 400 A.D., according to New Mexico Historic Sites records, when it was home to Mogollon farmers. In 1598, the area was a campsite along El Camino Real del Tierra Adentro (The Royal Road to the Interior Lands).

Fort Selden Historic Site is open 10 a.m.-4 p.m. Wednesday-Saturday; closed Sunday, Monday and Tuesday.

and Sierra de las Uvas to the west of the site and experience a family friendly night dedicated to New Mexican folklore. Family activities, food, music and a history of folklore will highlight the evening, culminating in a visit by one of New Mexico's most famous folktales: La Llorona, The Wailing Woman, as presented by actor and vocalist Rosalia Pacheco. La Llorona is the infamous ghost from Spanish folklore known for her terrifying cries as she searches in vain for her drowned children.

· Campfire cooking with Ranger Mike. 11 a.m.-2 p.m. Saturday, July 30. Learn some basic campfire cooking.

The cost of these special events is included in the site admission fee: \$5 for adults and free for children aged 16 years and younger. New Mexico residents with ID are admitted free the first Sunday of every month. State residents 60 years old and older with ID are admitted free every Wednesday.

More History

From the New Mexico Historic Sites website:

"In 1848, New Mexico formally became a United States territory. With the new government came more settlers further encroaching into the traditional homelands of the Apache, leading to a worsening of hostilities that had been increasing throughout the 19th century. In an effort to bring peace to the region, the U.S. government established Fort Selden in April 1865. The New Mexico Volunteers and troops from California constructed the adobe buildings. For 25 years, about 1,800 soldiers (infantry and cavalry) were stationed there protecting settlers from raiding and general lawlessness, and escorting travelers throughout New Mexico Territory."



There is no place in the world like it. White Sands National Park (WSNP) covers more than 146,000 acres in the Tularosa Basin, covering parts of Otero and Doña Ana counties and including 275 square miles of white sand dunes. It is the largest dune field of gypsum crystals on earth: Astronauts on their way to the moon could see it from space.

Here is some of what the park has to offer in July, August and going forward.

Full Moon Nights

Experience WSNP under the glow of the full moon. If you go in September, you can watch the Harvest Moon rise.

There is no fee for the program.

Events dates and times are Friday, Aug. 12: 7-11 p.m. (Sturgeon Moon); Saturday, Sept. 10: 7-11 p.m. (Corn/Harvest Moon); and Monday, Oct. 10: 7-10 p.m. (Hunter's Moon).

Full Moon Hikes

Sign up for ranger-led one- to 1.5-mile hikes and explore the beautiful dunes in a whole new light.

Hike dates and times are Thursday, Aug. 11: 8 p.m.; Friday, Sept. 9: 7:30 p.m.; Sunday, Oct. 9: 6:45 p.m.; Tuesday, Nov. 8: 5:15 p.m.; and Thursday, Dec. 8: 5:15 p.m.

Tickets are \$8 for ages 16 and older and \$4 for ages 15 and younger.

Pre-registration is required at Recreation.gov or by calling 1-877-444-6777. Participants meet the ranger at the Dune Life Nature Trail, a 2.3-mile drive from the fee station, 30 minutes before the program begins

Sunset Stroll

This ranger-guided stroll through the dunes is a chance to learn about the park's geology, plants and animals. The stroll ends at sunset to provide a panoramic view of the sun setting over the mountains.

The one-hour strolls are held every Friday, Saturday and Sunday with these starting times: 7 p.m.: now through Aug. 13; 6:30 p.m.: Aug. 14-Sept. 10; 6 p.m.: Sept. 11-Oct. 1; 5:30 p.m.: Oct. 2-15; 5 p.m.: Oct. 16-Nov. 5; 4 p.m.: Nov. 6-Dec. 31 (no tour on Christmas Day).

Lake Lucero Tours

Take a three-hour tour to Lake Lucero with a WSNP ranger and learn about the formation of the sands. Rangers will share the geologic story of the park as you traverse a steep gully down to the lakebed and walk by thousands of exposed selenite crystals. The lake is dry and only fills with water when there is abundant rain or snow in the area.

Tour dates are Nov. 19 and Dec. 17, 2022; Jan. 21, Feb. 18 and March 18, 2023. All tour dates are Saturdays, and all tours begin at 10 a.m.

Tickets are \$8 for ages 16 and older and \$4 for ages 15 and younger.





Lower health insurance premiums for small businesses

New Mexico Superintendent of Insurance Russell Toal announced a new initiative will reduce small business health insurance premiums by 10 percent beginning in July.

"Small businesses are the backbone of New Mexico's economy," Toal said. "This premium relief comes at a critical moment in our state's economic recovery."

The Small Business Health Insurance Premium Relief Initiative, available to businesses with 50 or fewer employees that offer health insurance compliant with the Affordable Care Act to their employees, was made possible by a bill passed during the 2021 legislative session that created a Health Care Affordability Fund.

Under the law, the New Mexico Office of Superintendent of Insurance (OSI) is charged with implementing programs to lower health insurance costs for individuals, families and small businesses.

This fall, OSI will launch a program to lower premiums and out-of-pocket costs for individuals who purchase health insurance coverage on beWellnm, the state's Health Insurance Marketplace.

"We hope that OSI's initiative will provide meaningful economic relief for small businesses and their employees," said Rob Black, CEO of the New Mexico Chamber of Commerce.

A DAY IN THE LIFE: **Natural Gas Crews**

While you are fast asleep, **Las Cruces Utilities** (LCU) natural gas crews are already hard at work to make sure your morning shower is hot. Most of the LCU natural gas crews work from 6:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. not only to beat the desert heat, but to make sure LCU customers have the natural gas to keep their day running smoothly.

I tagged along with LCU **Natural Gas Compliance** Inspector Ruben Garcia to witness a day in the life of a LCU natural gas crew member. Garcia is well versed in the work of natural gas utilities with many years in the welding industry prior to his 10 years working at LCU.

Before the sun rises over the Organ Mountains, each crew member checks in and makes sure they are fully up to code with the personal protection equipment (PPE) required by New

Mexico Code. The PPE requirements include a hard hat, steel-toed boots, a safety vest, and other items depending on the daily job assignments. The crew members also wear long pants, a longsleeved shirt, and some sort of covering on their face to protect from the harsh rays of the sun.

Not only are the LCU gas crews out in the summer heat, but they work in all weather conditions, from rain to wind, hail, snowstorms, and the famous southern New Mexico dust storms. Besides the changing outdoor conditions, LCU natural gas crews also have to be aware of wildlife, neighborhood dogs, construction crews, and residents.

One natural gas crew member told a story on how a large dog came out of nowhere and tried to attack the crew on one of their job sites. The reaction of the crew was

not just to keep them safe, but make sure no harm came to the dog as well. In the end all was well, but dangers like this happen weekly to LCU team members in the field.

"We are the hidden people behind the scenes when it comes to public safety, fire safety, and being the first responders to most gas leaks," Garcia stated while talking fire safety. "Most of the time it is our guy down in the hole in a flash suit and oxygen mask fixing the leak," Garcia concluded.

Not only is safety a priority at LCU for the community, but the

crews must go through physical tests to confirm they are fit enough to be able to withstand the stress that comes with fixing a gas leak in a flash suit. All LCU welders must re-certify every six months to be able to maintain their position. These certifications are only passible with a 100% score on their written and practical tests. With over 65 recertifications, most LCU natural gas crew members stay busy when they are not out on the field by keeping up their qualifications and skills. Every LCU crew member I encountered was happy to be there and extremely welcoming while showing me their day-to-day work life.

"We have great benefits, opportunity to grow, and a fulfilling job here at LCU. I never thought my career would have gone in the direction it has taken me, but I have been extremely happy every step of the way," Garcia ended.



Turns out a lot of people are addicted to golf in one form or another. Are you? If that thought concerns you here are a few warning signs and symptoms that suggest golf addiction.

First, you have let golfing interfere with your work, so that your job or business is suffering.

Another key item has to do with golf affecting personal relationships and loved ones, resulting in friction and resentments. In other words, your golf gets in the way of family obligations and functions, often leading to arguments.

Other ways you can tell if you might be a golf addict is if you have more than 1,000 golf balls in your garage; or if you secretly buy golf clubs and hide them; or if you suffer injuries due to stupidity or



Sometimes folks find themselves attracted to golf partly because they find it helps their self-confidence and self-esteem. A lot of golfers have a strong need for a sense of personal competence and worth and control; they find golf to be a way of demonstrating and reinforcing that feeling, just like addiction to work in a way.

Others find the fairways and greens a great escape from whatever they want to get away from.

That's not crazy.

However, if you let golf take over and occupy a completely inappropriate dimension in your life, to the extent that it has replaced other recreational pastimes or normal activities and interests you used to enjoy, you may be struggling with real problems. I don't mean to scare anybody, but over the years golf has surprisingly been a frequent cause for divorces and people going broke.

Just about all addictions have fundamentally the same underlying habits, thought distortions, denials and emotions in common. Yet, compulsive golfing seems a more socially benign affliction than say gambling or drug abuse

So what's an obsessed chop to do? Go to AA? Hardly.

Get a shrink and suffer

a few visits on the couch? Find a local Golfers' Anonymous? Go it alone cold turkey? Of course, one paradoxical option could be joining the Golf Nut Society (www.golfnut.com) and admit you're powerless over golf.

The most famous Golf Nut member (# 0023) is basketball legend Michael Jordan, who earned the title in 1989 when he didn't bother to show up for his first NBA Most Valuable Player Award because he was at Pinehurst Country Club playing two back-toback rounds.

Bob Hope was a Golf Nut board member. The 2006 Golf Nut of the year was Steve Thorwald, who played golf on his wedding day and then played 36 holes each of three days on his honeymoon. The marriage didn't last. He went on to marry another certifiable Golf Nut.

County collection centers managed by South Central Solid **Waste Authority** (SCSWA) have been getting upgrades for the workers and customers who use these eight locations throughout Doña Ana County (DAC). The Centers give all residents the opportunity to dispose of their trash, recyclables, and household hazardous waste safely and properly.

Currently, the Centers serve as a One-Stop-Shop to meet residents' recycling and waste disposal needs. Attendants on duty, while the Center is open, can also guide residents about where to offload their material.

"The Centers operate in locations that are farther away from our main transfer station and were developed through community need," said Miguel Fernandez. **SCSWA Program** Administrator. "The attendant stations needed not only upgrades like better air conditioning but technological upgrades for being able to take card payments in the future."

The Centers operate with flat-rate coupons and punch cards, and both are sold at \$12, \$24 or \$48 increments.

Coupons can also be billed to an existing County wastewater account in good standing. (For more information, contact DAC Utilities at 575-525-6194.) DAC sells disposal punch cards to residents at the DAC **Government Center** and other locations, including SCSWA Transfer Station, La Fina in Mesquite and Dona Ana, and Jim's Supermarket in Hatch. The full list of where to purchase can be found here: https://www.scswa. net/175/County-**Collection-Centers** Note: Coupons are no longer being sold from any of the DAC Sheriff's Department substations.

Every time a resident brings trash to a collection center, the punch card will

be punched until it is used up. The amount is determined by the station attendant per SCSWA guidelines. Small loads, for example, a full-size pick-up bed, costs \$4 or 1 punch. A larger load for two punches could include a pickup and a trailer.
