City expands Mano y Mano day labor program

The Mano y Mano day labor program provides a crew to travel to "hot spots" around the city, helping to clean sites where homeless people are encamped and to provide outreach services to the people living at those sites.

The program is under the City of Las Cruces, whose council voted unanimously at its July 5 regular meeting to expand the program.

Under the expansion, three crew members, referred by the Mesilla Valley Community of Hope (MVCH) and struggling with homelessness themselves, and supervised by staff from the Parks and

Recreation Department and other city programs, will be sent to homeless encampments in front of businesses, in city parks, along canals and elsewhere to clean up trash and other debris at those sites and connect the people living there with services to help get them off the street.

"I think this program does such good work," Councilor Becki Graham said at the meeting. The expansion of Mano y Mano to address the "the cleanup of some of the nuisance issues" and provide services will "hopefully (help) people move into better situations for themselves," Graham said.

The expansion is "another item to help combat what we've been seeing,"

Councilor Tessa Abeyta said. Abeyta was among elected officials

and community leaders who attended a May meeting in Las Cruces during which business owners complained about theft and vandalism they said was being committed by homeless people.

"I think this is a great program to expand," Abeyta said; "something that our city really needs right now."

"I'm one of these day laborers. I will give 200 percent to help alleviate this problem," Richard Barela

the proposed expansion.

"We wanted to come up with as many solutions as possible to address homelessness," MVCH Executive Director Nicole Martinez said. There is "a need for more services for our community. We wanted to help," she said.

People sign up at MVCH each weekday morning to participate in Mano y Mano that day, Martinez said. They are chosen by lottery and assigned to a work crew. Those who are chosen are paid minimum wage and given lunch.

Many have used the money they earn through Mano y Mano to pay security deposits "to get into housing," Martinez said, and to pay rent, utility and

said during public input on phone bills. The program also "makes people feel good having put in a day's work," she said.

Martinez said MVCH has served 500-600 people through Mayo y Mano since 2015.

Mano y Mano is "a public health and safety initiative building a bridge to needed resources and services for vulnerable unhoused residents," the city said.

It began seven years ago with one crew of 10 people working two days a week assisting Parks and Rec staff with landscape beautification, garbage removal and other tasks, the city said. The program expanded to two crews of 20 people working five days a week with an annual budget of \$412,000. The expansion approved July 5 adds \$93,000 to the program's FY2023 budget.

City continues work on GO bond projects

At its June 27 work session, the Las Cruces City Council was presented with an update on the status of current general obligation (GO) bond projects.

In an all-mail election held in July and August 2018, Las Cruces voters approved these four bond questions totaling \$35.6 million in 2018: 1) \$16.9 million to construct improvements to parks, including sports fields and other related facilities. (It passed with 57 percent approval.); 2) \$9.8 million to construct a new animal shelter facility and related improvements. (67 percent approval); 3) \$6.2 million to replace Fire

Station No. 3, 390 N. Valley Drive. (70 percent approval); and 4) \$2.7 million to construct and improve recreational walking, jogging and biking trails. (58 percent approval).

The June 27 update included this information:

- Of the \$35.6 million approved, \$26.6 million has been spent so far.
- \$3.7 million in improvements at the Hadley Recreation Complex are completed.
- \$1.8 million in parks and sports courts has been completed.
- \$2 million in improvements to Unidad Park are 59 percent complete.

• The \$6 million East Mesa Public **Recreation Complex** is about 21 percent complete. While all bond funding will be spent by this December, the estimated date for completion of the current phase of the complex's construction is Feb. 6, 2023. (The city estimates it needs an additional \$36 million to complete work at the complex, including additional sports fields and courts,

• Construction of a new \$10.7 million Animal Services Center of the Mesilla Val-

Rinconada and Burn Lake are 67 percent complete.

- Replacement of Fire Station No. 3 is 99 percent complete. The Las Cruces Fire Department is operating at the new fire station.
- \$2.4 million in improvements to walking, jogging and biking trails are 97 percent complete.

"A GO bond is a form of debt financing secured by property tax revenues," the city said on its website. "GO bonds can be issued for general purpose projects,

Retiring professor leaves legacy for students, Native American programs

After 25 years serving his tribal government in administrative jobs as a member of the Blackfeet Nation, Don Pepion was recruited to head New Mexico State University's American Indian Program (AIP). After 22 years serving NMSU, including shepherding the construction of the American Indian Center and initiating Native American studies at the university, the anthropology professor retired June 30.

"Don developed the curriculum for the undergraduate and graduate minors in Native American studies and made these learning opportunities available to all NMSU students across campus," said Rani Alexander, anthropology professor and department head. "Don is also an international scholar who values experiential learning, and he brings a global perspective to the classroom as well as to field settings."

In addition to spearheading the American Indian Center, Pepion's work as AIP director for more than seven years resulted in a nearly 50 percent increase in the number of Native students attending NMSU at the end of his tenure as director

"The reason we were able to do that is because I worked collaboratively with a lot of the Indian tribes and especially the different programs within New Mexico State that provided us the resources to go out and do recruitment and work with the Native communities," he said.

Pepion teaches that Indigenous groups from all over the world have basic shared views. Indigenous ways of knowing are connected to the natural world while Eurocentric knowledge or Euro Western knowledge is separated from the natural world.

"I teach philosophy of Indigenous people," Pepion said. "Science is just now catching up to Indigenous knowledge or what was labeled 'primitive' knowledge. Indigenous people would say everything is alive, even the rocks - so-called inanimate things. Scientists would say that's a primitive thought. But it's really not, it's actually right because through quantum theory we have learned that it's true."

"I've always had an educational philosophy of raising the consciousness of all people regarding the Native American situation," Pepion said. "To help improve the quality of living for Native American people, that's really the bottom line, and I think the way to that as I found both as an administrator and as a teacher is that everything starts with awareness and education. You can't change what you don't know until people are able to learn about the situation and they can make better choices."

Pepion demonstrated his equestrian skills in 2012 among hundreds of Indigenous groups who performed at the Queen Elizabeth II Diamond Jubilee Pageant. He also was invited to have tea with the queen.

"It was a privilege and an honor to be selected from our group to meet with the queen," Pepion said. "There were several hundred Indigenous nations represented there. But the important thing to me while we were there was the gigantic cook tent that they put up for us so we, as Indigenous people, could share our dances and our singing with other nations from around the world."

At a recent retirement dinner, Pepion received a gift from the Department of Anthropology faculty of a blanket from Eighth Generation, a Seattlebased brand owned by the Snowqualmie Tribe. John Isiah Pepion designed the blanket.

As a member of the Blackfeet of Montana and Canada, Pepion goes home each summer to practice traditional ways. In retirement, he plans to continue these trips but also continue his research. "So much of our culture and language is lost so, my vision is to help us bring back our language and culture.

"Change starts with the individual. And that's what I teach – that change process," said Pepion. "Who do you want to be?

MVEDA continues looking forward

The Mesilla Valley Economic Development Alliance (MVEDA) gave an annual report Monday

night about its work the past year. Of the statistics and dollar figures discussed, the biggest one was the \$246.3 million in capital investments made by companies MVEDA worked with during the year.

While MVEDA essentially met the goals for all seven of its benchmark

categories, the figure for capital investments was more than five times the goal.

While it was a strong performance, especially for another pandemic year, the presentation led by MVEDA President & CEO Davin Lopez left me believing MVEDA is poised for even better things in the near future.

For one, they will be better funded, thanks to increased contributions from Doña Ana

County, and the additional resource of the El Paso Electric NM Economic Development Fund, which assisted MVEDA to the tune of \$300,000 last year.

Secondly, they can again benefit from the New Mexico Economic Development Department's state closing

funds, designed to complement other state and federal resources to help economic developers close deals to bring new business opportunities to New Mexico.

"Whether it's public or private money, our duty is to be very responsible with those investments," Lopez said. Perhaps most important is MVEDA's forward-looking approach.

You may begin to hear MVEDA less, and NM Borderplex more. The term NM Borderplex better reflects the more regional approach MVEDA is taking and needs to take.

Imagine recruiting a multimillion-dollar company to Las Cruces. One of the first things thev'll want to know is the strength of the available workforce to fill their jobs. They'll be encouraged to know of the resources of New Mexico State University and Dona Ana Community College. But also consider the educational resources of University of Texas-El Paso, and El Paso's community college system, as well as the colleges and universities of Ciudad Juarez. Add them all together

and it's nearly 160,000 students.

As much as we like to play up our rivalries with El Paso and Texas, they are our neighbors and, often, our colleagues. The Santa Teresa area offers the Union Pacific rail hub, the expanded Jetport and International Port of Entry. These synergies, combined with those of Mexico, make this a region of serious impact and import.

We love our small city of Las Cruces, and the charm of Mesilla, but we have to realize we're part of something bigger.

I believe we can retain what makes Las Cruces great and still maintain a vital role in the bigger picture of our regional economy. I don't believe we can retain what makes Las Cruces great, however, without bring-

Ethics board dispute highlights conflict challenges

State Rep. Rebecca Dow of Truth or Consequences, who finished second in a five-person race for governor in the Republican primary election last month, has agreed to pay a \$500 civil penalty to settle a bitter dispute with the State Ethics Commission, according to the Albuquerque Journal.

The dispute stems from a complaint filed by Dow's Democratic opponent in the 2020 election, and highlights the challenges faced by both our unpaid legislators and our relatively new ethics commission to police a system where conflicts of interest are built into the process.

Like most members of the Legislature under the age of 70, Dow has another full-time job to pay the bills. She is the founder of a nonprofit educational center in Sierra County called Apple Tree, which receives funding from the state in both grants and contracts.

The inherent conflicts in that relationship are obvious. But, in New Mexico's "citizen legisla-

ture," Dow is just one of several lawmakers with financial ties to the government they oversee. House speaker Brian Egolf provided legal representation to Ultra Health, New Mexico's largest medical cannabis company, in a lawsuit against the state at the same time he helped lead the legislative effort to pass recreational marijuana, according to a 2020 story in the Santa Fe New Mexican. Minority Leader Jim

Townsend worked as a consultant for an oil and gas company. Five legislators were married to lobbyists

State law recognizes these conflicts, and attempts to set boundaries. The State Ethics Commission, which

was approved by voters in 2018, is charged with enforcing those boundaries.

Dow is accused of violating ethics rules by essentially serving as a lobbyist for Apple Tree and receiving payment for those services. And she improperly included the title "Rep." in correspondence with state education officials.

Voters knew about the allegations in 2020 and re-elected

Dow anyway. She has defended her actions as accepting, "modest payment for an important nonprofit (Apple Tree) in my district." She said she is unable to talk about the settlement until it is finalized.

The settlement is an important confirmation for the ethics commission, which was passed after several years of debate and opposition from skeptical Republican legislators who feared that the board's investigations would be partisan.

With so many potential conflicts of interest in the Legislature, it will be critical that the ethics commission is evenhanded in the cases it brings forward, and that those investi-

gative efforts end in success. Democrat Georgene Louis was fined \$250 by the commission following her arrest for drunken driving.

A better solution would be to give those making laws in New Mexico both the salary and staff needed to perform those functions professionally.

Critical of Yazzie Discussion Draft

The comment period pertaining to the Yazzie-Martinez Discussion Draft ended on June 17, 2022. The draft plan was put forth by the New Mexico Public Education Department to address the findings of the Yazzie Court case regarding K-12 education in New Mexico.

Before I begin my remarks on the Yazzie-Martinez Discussion Draft, I need to give background to my remarks. I am part of a parents' group who fought against the NM PED's Culturally and Linguistically Responsive Education at Las Cruces Public Schools in May 2021. At that time, several of us specifically asked the School Board to enumerate any cases of discrimination that Policy JBC intended to rectify; to give parents some evidence. We received no response, and Policy JBC was passed.

A major premise of the draft is to advance the notion that minority teachers are needed for minority students, in order for them to "thrive." This is unacceptable condescension to minorities. Here is an excerpt from page 5 of the Yazzie-Martinez Discussion Draft: "The difference between the teacher and student percentages for each of these categories is the 'teacher-student' diversity gap. It is well-established that students thrive when their teachers reflect the community in which they work, and we therefore must prioritize obtaining a more diverse workforce." Baloney.

They are essentially saying that Hispanics can't learn from whites, but why do Asian students thrive no matter who the teacher? When my mom (a Hispanic) graduated salutatorian of Gadsden in 1957, there were many more white teachers, and who

cares? To advance such notions as "students need teachers who look like them" is to tarnish the reputation of every Hispanic student who will have it no other way than merit.

ing new jobs, new growth and new opportunities to the region.

A friend of mine from Houston recently visited Las Cruces, with an eye toward possibly moving here in retirement. We had one conversation about airports.

"How far are you from the airport?" I asked.

"It takes us more than an hour to get to either Bush or Hobby," he said.

"The El Paso airport is about 45 minutes from my house in Las Cruces," I said.

We are a region, alright, but less sprawling than many major metro areas.

In addition to growing funding, MVEDA is also fully staffed for the first time. They've added a fulltime marketing director, and a person dedicated solely to business development to work on retention and expansion of existing businesses.

Companies that established or expanded in Dona Ana County through MVEDA's efforts in 2021-22 were Artico Cold Management, Tecma, Saputo Cheese USA, Electronic Caregiver, Wind Turbine and Energy Cable Corp, Ma & Sons Chile, Hecate Energy and Yellowbird Solar. That translates to 777 jobs created, with an average wage of \$17.94 an hour.

My favorite part of the MVEDA name has always been the A for Alliance, signifying the many different entities that come together to support economic development in the Mesilla Valley and beyond. During his presen-

tation, Lopez mentioned collaborations with the City of Las Cruces, Doña Ana County, the Borderplex Alliance, the Border Industrial Association, the New Mexico Economic Development Department and many others. And they're only looking to grow those efforts.

"This is our year of partnerships," Lopez said.

the New Mexico Public **Regulation Commission** approved EPE's Transportation and Electrification Plan (TEP) and authorized EPE to invest more than \$1.2 million in EV infrastructure, education and outreach in its southern New Mexico service territory, EPE said in a news release. See the full TEP at www.epelectric.com/ renewablestech/electric-vehicles/ transportation-electrifica-

tion-plan.

Rodriguez said supplychain issues should be resolved by the end of the year, making it easier for consumers to purchase the EV model they want, either online or at dealerships.

She said EPE has been in touch with governments and school districts throughout its service area about electrification of school buses and fleets. The City of Las Cruces

has begun a conversion from internal combustion engine vehicles to EVs. A resolution passed by the city council in 2021 calls for 50 percent of the eligible fleet to be replaced by electric vehicles by 2030.

Electric buses coming to region

BULLETIN REPORT

The South Central Regional Transit District (SCRTD) plans to be 100 percent emission free within the decade. The district's board of directors recently approved SCRTD's first zero emission fleet transition plan, as required by the Federal Transit Administration to apply for federal funds.

The New Mexico Transportation Department provided the district with grant funds for the development of the plan.

SCRTD has submitted a \$3.1 million grant application to fund the first of three electric emission buses with charging infrastructure, SCRTD said.

If approved, the first electric buses would begin operating in March 2024 from the Sunland Park bus facility. "The transition plan

provides a guideline and target to reach district goals for making the fleet zero emissions by 2032," SCRTD Executive Director David Armijo said. "To reach this goal, the district will deploy both

25- and 35-foot buses to operate within the range possible with electric power."

The district will partner with El Paso Electric to support technical requirements to install and operate the electric buses from the Sunland Park facility.

"The transit district's plans will complement the city's plans to move toward electric vehicle use and the community will benefit from cleaner running buses on our streets," said Sunland Park Mayor Javier Perea.

Much of the funding in the plan will come from federal grants, Doña Ana County and member agencies' contributions, SCRTD said.

Election season ended early for commissioner candidate

Christopher Schaljo-Hernandez will not be officially declared Doña Ana County Commissionerelect until after the Nov. 8 general election. But the Mesilla resident and local business owner is the only candidate for commission District 1 on the ballot, so the outcome is a foregone conclusion.

No Republicans or Libertarians filed to run for the office in the June primary, leaving the write-in process as the only option for potential candidates. None came forward on filing day, June 30.

The only battle for Schaljo-Hernandez was the June 7 Democratic primary. He defeated incumbent Commissioner Lynn Ellins and former county assessor Emma Johnson Ortiz in that race.

Schaljo-Hernandez brings a blend of youth, family, business success and political experience when he becomes commissioner next January.

Along with his husband, Russell Hernandez, Schaljo-Hernandez, 32, is co-owner of Salud! de Mesilla restaurant, which he said has 44 employees, including nine recent additions. The couple have three children, ages 6, 8 and 9 who attend Las Cruces Public Schools.

Schaljo-Hernandez is the former chair of the Doña Ana County Democratic Party, serving 2017-19, including the 2018 general election when Democrats won every county office, including Ellins' commis-

sion-seat win.

He also served as chair of the Las Cruces Economic Recovery

Ad Hoc Board, which the city formed in 2020 to help guide the reopening and recovery of businesses as pandemic restrictions were eased.

Schaljo-Hernandez said he plans to meet with County Manager Fernando Macias and other county and community leaders in the coming months and looks forward to helping facilitate a closer working relationship among commissioners and the county's other elected officials.

As a commissioner, Schaljo-Hernandez said he wants to focus on economic development, infrastructure and education. His goals will be to boost young entrepreneurship to build business startups in the county and state to help keep New Mexico children living and working in New Mexico after they graduate from high school and college.

Transportation is also a key issue for the county, he said, as some families have no vehicle or are sharing a single vehicle and must rely on public transportation. Making sure county roads are properly maintained is part of that, he said.

As a parent and soon-tobe county commissioner, Schaljo-Hernandez said he wants to make sure education is accessible to all county residents, along with childcare and after-school care.

In a news release, Schaljo-Hernandez said he also will focus on "land and use planning that promotes growth but maintains our unique and treasured qualities."

Schaljo-Hernandez said the county also must ensure residents have access to water and sewer service and are protected from flooding, which has posed serious risks to county residents and property in the past.

Making sure firefighters hired by the county are paid a competitive wage is also important, Schaljo-Hernandez said, and ensuring county residents have adequate fire protection. Having broadband connectivity is also a necessity for all county residents, he said.

The county needs to continue supporting Santa Teresa, including the county jetport and port of entry that connects it with San Jerónimo, Chihuahua on the Mexican side of the international border, he said. Santa Teresa is going to "have the biggest economic impact for Doña Ana County over the next 10-20 years," Schaljo-Hernandez said.

During his primary campaign, Schaljo-Hernandez said he heard from county residents about a variety of issues, including unleashed dogs posing a safety threat, speeding in rural areas and the accessibility of community centers to residents of small communities.

Schaljo-Hernandez had kind words for Ellins.

"I respect Lynn to no end," Schaljo-Hernandez said. "He issued the first gay marriage license in the state." (Ellins granted the first marriage license issued to a gay couple in New Mexico in August 2013 when he was Doña Ana County clerk.)

"I am looking forward to his words of wisdom in the future," Schaljo-Hernandez said of Ellins.

County Commission District 1 includes the South Valley communities between Vado and Mesilla Park, Mesilla, Picacho Hills and downtown Las Cruces.

"We dabble in a lot of areas, but at the end of the day, we're out here to facilitate the successful execution of Navy Test and Evaluation events to ensure that the warfighter is getting a quality, timely product.'

As White Sands' new

officer in charge, Laney arrives at a time when the detachment is focused on the fu-

ture needs of the Navy and its partners. Priorities include defining long-range corridors to accommodate faster, longer-range weapons; developing hypersonic test events for initiatives across the Department of Defense; and advancing the nation's suborbital vehicle capability.

Laney brings broad experience in testing and evaluating a variety of missiles and other weapons, in part during a previous tour with NSWC PHD. Most recently, he worked for the Missile Defense Agency (MDA) in Dahlgren, Virginia, which is precisely where Monk is headed.

Ahead of the change of charge, Laney was frocked to commander in a ceremony at WSMR April 28.

Although this is his first tour at the White Sands Detachment, Laney isn't new to NSWC PHD. For his first assignment as an engineering duty officer, he served as a project officer for Combat System Ship Qualification Trials (CSSQTs) in Port Hueneme, California, from 2013 to 2016.

During his previous tour at NSWC PHD, Laney led a successful CSSQT aboard a Republic of Korea destroyer, and he supported multiple Aegis Combat System and Standard Missile test events. He said he was impressed by the caliber of people he worked with, and he's glad to return to the command.



movie review BY JAY BOBBIN Nearing 50 years old, 'Jaws' retains its bite


Especially appropriate viewing during the summer, a certain movie still generates immediate fear of going in the water.

It's not hard to guess the film in question is "Jaws," whose monstrous success put director Steven Spielberg on the map. AMC shows the 1975 classic Friday, July 29, and Saturday, July 30 (with the first two sequels also running there this month). The picture's legendary production problems, which included a malfunctioning mechanical "shark," provide a lesson in how the result still can succeed.

In the adaptation of Peter Benchley's bestseller, the gruesome death of a moonlight swimmer causes concern among residents and officials of tourist-supported Amity Island. Eventually, the sheriff, a shark expert and a local shark hunter (played by the ideal trio of Roy Scheider, Richard Dreyfuss and Robert Shaw) join forces to go to sea to find and eliminate the recurring threat.

The pursuit is thrilling and involving, backed by a brilliant John Williams score that incorporates one of the most famous musical themes in screen history. However, what really sells "Jaws" is the creative approach by Spielberg, who has admitted that he thought

he'd be fired by producers Richard D. Zanuck and David Brown (or the studio, Universal, which scored one of the biggest hits in screen history by sticking with him) at any of numerous points during the location filming in New England.

Catching up with ... Billy Garrett Former county commissioner leads state museum

By MIKE COOK

Las Cruces Bulletin

"The longer I've been here, the more I am humbled by the position," said Billy Garrett, former Doña Ana County commissioner, director of the New Mexico History Museum (NMHM) in Santa Fe.

After eight years on the county commission (2011-18), Garrett was "trying to figure out what I was going to do next," he said, when he got an offer to become NMHM interim director. Garrett was named permanent executive director a couple of weeks before COVID-19 hit, closing the museum and public buildings across the country.

The shutdown "afforded

us an opportunity as a staff to become a lot more comfortable doing things remotely," Garrett said. The museum continues to encourage visitors to come to

the museum and is also creating "opportunities for people to see some of these things online," he

A good example is "Fred Harvey Weekend," which NMHM had been hosting for a decade to celebrate the Harvey House restaurants and hotels that began springing up along the Santa Fe Railroad in 1876, connecting New Mexico and the West to other parts of the country.

Instead of canceling the event in 2020 because of the pandemic, Garrett and his staff changed the format into a Zoom lecture series and an "online cooking show

(with) really great chefs in Santa Fe" sharing their recipes with an audience from a national and international audience that "was cooking along with us," he said.

Last year's event was a hybrid, with an in-person dinner in Santa Fe and additional online content. The 2022 event is Nov. 11-15 in Santa Fe, Lamy and Las Vegas, New Mexico, and the "Setting the Standard:

The Fred Harvey Company and Its Legacy" exhibit continues at NMHM through 2024.

"That's an important indication of the direction we're taking as a museum," Garrett said. "A good part of that is trying to figure out how we can be more relevant and more connected to people within New Mexico and who are interested in New Mexico."

NMHM also has important material for researchers, writers and students, Garrett said, and is "working very hard" to get materials digitized and available online. The museum also has an "aggressive educational program" to connect it with teachers and students statewide.

Garrett is also busy with a major project to preserve the 400-year-old

Palace of the Governors. Work began in 2018 and will continue for about two more years, he said.

Current exhibits at NMHM include "Curative Powers: New Mexico's Hot Springs," which closes Sept. 4; "The Palace Seen and Unseen: A Convergence of History and Archaeology, which continues through June 2026; "WORDS on the Edge" poetry exhibition that closes Aug. 31; "The Massacre of Don Pedro Villasur," "The First

World War" and "Telling New Mexico: Stories from Then and Now," that continue through 2030.

Garrett is also excited about an exhibit that opens Aug. 7 and continues for a year at NMHM: "Honoring Tradition and Innovation: 100-Years of Santa Fe's Indian Market 1922-2022." The exhibition will include 250 objects associated with the past century of the market, which annually includes the largest juried Native American art show in the world.

The exhibit demonstrates "changing federal Indian policy," Garrett said, showing the shift from "paternalism to one where Native Americans are much more in control of how their work is presented and who judges

they do and directs sales of their items."

As museum director, "I'm constantly finding out new things and seeing new things," Garrett said.

During a TV interview he did in a room in the Palace of the Governors, for example, Garrett said the camera lights "caught a shadow in one corner," showing a faint pictograph scratched into the wall more than a hundred years ago as part of an exhibit of findings and artists' renderings from an archeological dig north of Santa Fe.

Garrett found similar etchings in other corners of the room, but "I can't find any references to any of these in our historic documentation. No one in the museum had seen

them before."

Garrett, who retired from the U.S. Forest Service in 2009 before running for county commission, said there is more he wants to accomplish at NMHM "before I retire vet again."

He and his wife, Cynthia, sold their house in Las Cruces to make the move to Santa Fe, but "Las Cruces and Doña Ana County are in my blood," Garrett said. "It's my home. It's always my sort of spiritual anchor point."

History of history museum

Housed in the Palace of the Governors and two other buildings in Santa Fe's historic district, the New Mexico History Museum (NMHM) includes a library of 6,000 volumes, a large map collection, 800,000 to a million images and 16,000 objects.

NMHM is part of the largest statesponsored museum system in the United States and is managed by the New Mexico Department of Cultural

The Palace of the Governors was built in 1610 and first used to exhibit the collections of the Historical Society of New Mexico in 1885. The Territorial Legislature authorized its use by the Museum of New Mexico in 1909. The building became a National Historic Landmark in 1960 and was

placed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1966.

Major Gen. Lew Wallace (1827-1905) wrote the final chapters of "Ben-Hur: A Tale of the Christ" (the best-selling American novel of the 19th century) in the palace while serving as New Mexico territorial governor in the late 1870s. It was featured on a 1+1/4-cent postage stamp in 1960.

The palace became NMHM's home in 2009. The museum also includes the Chávez Library Building, built in 1907, purchased by the state in 1990, and named for Fray Angélico Chávez (1910-96), a priest, author, archivist and artist; and the Pete V. Domenici Building, which opened in 2009 and is named for New Mexico's longest serving U.S. senator.







"It's a matter of trust," said Las Cruces Utilities (LCU) Solid Waste Heavy Equipment Operator Mike Apodaca. "Customers trust that I do my job, and it's a

trust I take seriously." Apodaca is a part of the Solid Waste line of business at LCU, specifically as a Commercial trash truck driver. Even more specialized, he's the driver that picks up in tight spaces for the smaller dumpsters hidden in tight alleyways or smaller parking lots all over town, especially in the older neighborhoods.

Commercial dumpsters come in sizes from 1.5 to 8 cubic yards, depending on the needs of the business. When businesses only have space for a small dumpster, it may be picked up more than once a week for an additional charge. The same rules apply to dumpsters as regular trash: no hot ashes or coals, tires, dead animals, or hazardous materials. including medical waste. Construction

or remodeling material should also not be included, and everything should be bagged. Any enclosures should be kept free and clear for the truck to be able to pick up the dumpster.

Over the last 15 years, Apodaca has been a steady face in the community, picking up all over town. LCU Solid Waste Supervisor Philip Glasson explained that specialized roles like Apodaca's are one way to enhance customer service.

"This is how

we can be more accommodating to our customer needs," Glasson said. "So many of our customers know who he is and wave to him. He's like the old-fashioned trash truck driver and plays a big role in keeping our city sanitary."

Apodaca agrees and takes pride in meeting business owners and residents, from the very young to the older customers. "I asked one mom if I could buy her son a truck for Christmas because I would see them so often," he

said. "And during the pandemic, another resident made me masks that she sewed herself."

Apodaca said that his route enables a bit of flexibility that allows for humanity as well. "My next stop after this is the cemetery," he said. "If there is a service in progress, I come back later. It's about respect for families and respect for our community. It's not important what we do, but how we do it."



City, state, El Paso Electric funds support job growth

The Las Cruces community is "coming together as a team, as a city to help you grow," Mesilla Valley Economic Development Alliance President and CEO David Lopez said Wednesday morning, July 13, as MVEDA, El Paso Electric (EPE), the Community Foundation of Southern New Mexico (CFSNM), the City of Las Cruces and other partners presented a \$100,000

check to Electronic Caregiver (ECG).

The money is from EPE's New Mexico Economic Development Fund "to assist in the creation of 120 new jobs here in Las Cruces," Lopez said.

It is "a game-changing investment," said John Hummer, one of EPE's community advisors on the \$20 million fund. MVEDA helps identify projects for funding and CFSNM manages grant funds.

Hummer said he is im-

pressed with the "passion and energy level" at ECG.

"There's something going on here," he said.

"We're doing well, we're going gangbusters," said ECG Executive Director John Muñoz, who thanked the community "for embracing what we want to do and our vision."

ECG has grown from a handful of employees to nearly 300 today and will continue to expand, said ECG founder and CEO Anthony Dohrmann.

ECG buys tower

"We bought it. This is our home," Electronic Caregiver (ECG) President Joe Baffoe said. "It's an investment in Las Cruces."

Baffoe was talking about the Electronic Caregiver Tower, 506 S. Main St.

ECG moved into the tower, 506 S. Main St., in 2017 with 25 employees and has continued to expand its footprint there. Its name has been on the tower for the past three years.

Baffoe said the purchase was completed July 11 for \$8.9 million.

The tower, built in 1962, is 120 feet tall (easily the tallest building in Las Cruces) and has 11 stories and 105,000 square feet, Baffoe said.

He said \$4.5 million in upgrades

have been made to the building in the past five years, and ECG plans more, including an updated lobby, a health and wellness center in the basement and upgraded restrooms.

Baffoe credited Pioneer Bank for its assistance in the purchase. Pioneer President Kiel Hoffman is "the best banker in town," Baffoe said. "We love them."

ECG's footprint also includes the Addison Care building next door to the tower.

Dohrmann said 99 percent of ECG employees are New Mexico State University graduates.

"We couldn't have put this team together anywhere else in the country," he said.

"It really does take a village," said ECG President Joe Baffoe, who came from Chicago at Dohrmann's request to join the company.

ECG has brought \$100 million in investment to Las Cruces and will raise

an additional \$250 million in the next one-two years, Baffoe said. ECG's goal is to become the first Fortune 500 company in New Mexico and "the preeminent healthcare company" in the United States and the world.

MVEDA's role is to identify projects, conducts ROI analysis and due diligence, and then provides a recommendation to the Community Advisors who have final approval. The Commu-

nity Foundation of Southern NM manages the overall grant dollars for all applicants receiving funding.

ECG's workforce expansion is also supported by funding from the State of New Mexico Job Incentive Training Program (JTIP) and the City of Las Cruces WagePlus program.

ECG is a digital health technology company founded in 2009.


LCHBA also was able

Life-long learning: Everyone has something to teach us

U.S. They were prescient in understanding that civiliza-

One of the characteristics consistently discussed in the development of a 21st Century workforce is understanding the need to embrace "life-long learning."

It's no surprise that the world of work is in a constant state of change, so it's critical to stay on top of learning new technology, new trends, and even new modes of communication.

But I think life-long learning goes

deeper than that. It's about being "teachable" – willing to learn from others – and having an openness to mentors that will be part of the journey of your life.

Teachers are critical mentors on that journey. I was blessed to have really top-notch teachers, especially in high school. Without ever expressly stating it, they taught me that, "Those who forget history are doomed to repeat it." Watching the miniseries, The Holocaust, in history class as a 9th grader opened my eyes to a reality I could never have imagined – man's inhumanity to man. Reading Alexander Solzhenitsyn in 10th grade English class warned of the depravity of governments that showed no regard for their people. My world history teacher in 11th grade assigned us research papers comparing characteristics of the Roman Empire before

tions separated by time and space were really not so different.

My career journey started just a year later at Blue Bell Creameries as an intern. Men who are now rec-

Bell Creameries as an intern. Men who are now recognized in the Texas Business Hall of Fame were my mentors. The first day of my public relations career, I learned, "Everybody needs an editor," which helped me see that someone else's input can always make you better. I also learned, "Never make a promise you can't keep," which is a principle for building and maintaining credibility that I cling to to this day.

My world really opened up when I moved into the foundation world in San Diego. My mentors there were the men and women of 20 different cultural groups, backgrounds, educational and income levels who overcame decades of division to revitalize their under-invested community. Working alongside a family foundation, I saw the power of art, culture, passion and commitment to transform blight into economic opportunity and an improved quality of life.

I learned the power of asking the right questions and then listening well to find areas of agreement and shared ownership of solutions. One of those amazing people taught me, "No one rises to low expectations."

Another who saw real issues in her the community

said, "I used to think, 'Someone ought to do something about that.' What I didn't know is I was the person I was waiting for."

All that I had learned before ultimately became the foundation upon which The Bridge of Southern New Mexico's board of directors and all of our community partners would later build. I saw the power of shared actions when community leaders came together as partners and peers to leverage their collective resources to make change. I learned how to look at things through multiple lenses to find "win-win" solutions. And, out of necessity, I mastered the art of "learn while doing."

The young people I interviewed from that first class of Trailblazers at Arrowhead Park Early College High School taught me that just one college class could change the identity and the aspirations of a 9th grader – "I thought college would be too hard for me. But now I realize I am a college student." And I learned to seek "outcomes" for our work together, not just "outputs."

What I've come to realize is that everyone has something to teach us ... if we're open and teachable. The second we think we have all the answers is the second we stop growing.

Proper golf etiquette courteous, leads to faster rounds

It's time to revisit some do's and don'ts about golfing etiquette. Unlike sports such as hockey and mud wrestling, golf has long been thought to be a genteel game, rich in tradition and replete with myriad practices falling under the umbrella of sporting manners.

Arnold Palmer had this to say about manners: "From the time I first stepped on a golf course, my father made sure that I observed golf etiquette. What that meant to me then, and what it means now, is being considerate of other golfers, taking care of the course, playing quickly, and controlling my temper."

Arnold, Gary, and Jack have long been the poster icons for golf manners.

For some who are new to the game, and some who simply have not had anyone explain golfing things to them, golfers are expected to adhere to a rather universal set of customs and behaviors

in other words, they practice good golf etiquette.

Golf is a game that relies on the integrity of each player to show respect for other players to not only abide by the rules of the game but to play fair and be contact.

play fair and be considerate to fellow golfers. According to official USGA dictum: "All players should conduct themselves in a disciplined manner, demonstrating courtesy and sportsmanship at all times, irrespective of how competitive they may be. This is the spirit of the game."

So let's take a look at some of the specific USGA guidelines.

• First, be on time and ready to play so you don't

inconvenience others.

• Next, dress neatly and appropriately in normal

golf attire and accordance with local dress codes. (Note, this has changed some in recent years, and is far more relaxed that in years past.)

• Choose the correct teeing ground that best

matches your ability; that means "tee it forward."

- Play "ready golf" wherever possible, meaning that the player who is ready to hit should step up and play without delay.
- Stay silent while other players are hitting their shots or putting. Wherever you stand, strive to be as unobtrusive as possible when others are hitting.
- Wait until the group up ahead is out of range of your best shot. Hitting into the group ahead is the most common source of

antagonism (and fights) on golf cart well out of the the golf course. golf cart well out of the way and behind players

- Walk or ride briskly between shots, and be ready to play when it's your turn.
- Respect the golf course by replacing or sanding divots and raking bunkers. It's a courtesy to leave the course in better condition than you found it. Carry a small ball mark repair tool with you and be sure to repair your ball's pitch mark on the putting green.
- Avoid stepping on the line that other players are putting on. Replace the flagstick into the hole with great care so as not to disturb the cup edge. If there is a chance of an out-of-bounds shot or a lost ball, hit a provisional ball.
- Throwing and slamming of clubs, temper tantrums and rude, obnoxious behavior are never acceptable.
 - •Keep your motorized

golf cart well out of the way and behind players, while safely away from greens, thereby minimizing damage to the turf.

• Treat others with respect; behavior should always be as a gentleman or a lady.

Regarding pace of play, the main thing I notice on busy days at local golf courses is that slow groups seem oblivious to others trying to keep a reasonable pace. Some folks don't realize if you take slightly over 100 strokes a round (most common), and take and extra 30 seconds for each one, you will add nearly an hour to finish your game.

Spaceport America Cup winners announced for 2022

Spaceport America and the Experimental Sounding Rocket Association (ESRA) have announced the winners of the 2022 Spaceport America Cup sponsored by Sierra Space. The University of Sydney took home the overall winners' trophy after impressing the judges with their 30,000-foot rocket launch.

More than 1,300 participants attended the 2022 Spaceport America Cup in southern New Mexico in June, representing 95 higher education institutes from 16 countries across the globe. Student teams participated in presentations and displays at the Las Cruces Convention Center on June 21, followed by two and a half days of launching at Spaceport America's vertical launch area.

"The Cup fulfills Spaceport America's mission to promote educational involvement in spaceport activities and training of the workforce to develop the skills needed to enter aerospace careers" said Scott McLaughlin, Executive Director of the New Mexico Spaceport Authority. "We have seen many rocketeers return to Spaceport America once they have graduated and joined the aerospace workforce. We are particularly excited to see so many of our local institutions getting involved in the competition this year and competing for the Chile Cup."

The Chile Cup award was created high-power r

by Spaceport America to help encourage friendly competition between New Mexico and borderland universities. The first award was won by the University of New Mexico (UNM) in 2019 with New Mexico State University (NMSU) as the only other competitor. This year, four local teams participated including UNM, NMSU, New Mexico Tech, and the University of Texas-El Paso with NMSU taking home to Chile Cup for the first time.

"I'm extremely proud of all of the teams who joined us at the 2022 Spaceport America" said Cliff Olmsted, President and Chairperson, Experimental Sounding Rocket Association. "Each team faces their own unique challenges and hurdles to overcome throughout the competition. The caliber of the students after gaining this experience is invaluable. Watching the positive impact that Spaceport America Cup has on the world is inspiring."

The Spaceport America Cup is the world's largest intercollegiate rocketry engineering and has been held in New Mexico since 2017. The event is a partnership between the Experimental Sounding Rocket Association and Spaceport America.

The year-long engineering competition begins at the start of the academic year and requires teams to manage complex projects designing amateur high-power rockets carrying avionics

and payloads to 10,000 and 30,000 feet in altitude.
