



Grandparenting summit coming in October, November

Karen Bailey and her husband, Brad, were so impressed with the Legacy Grandparenting Summit they attended simulcast they attended in Las Cruces last year, they have not only made plans to attend again this year, they also are volunteering to help with the event.

The Baileys have 29 grandchildren who live in Arizona, Texas, Colorado, North Carolina, Tennessee, Virginia and Washington, D.C.

"We have to be intentional if we want a relationship with our grandchildren," said Karen Bailey, who retired in 2021 after a long career with U.S. Bank. She also

started and was the coordinator of Coats for Kids of Las Cruces for 26 years.

Bailey said the faithbased summit and its "great mix of speakers" gave her and Brad a lot of really good ideas on how to connect and stay connected with their grandchildren.

"What do we want our grandchildren to remember," Bailey said. "What do we want to pass on to them?"

The summit coordinator is Tim Steele of Las Cruces, who, along with his wife, Sheila, are FamilyLife Ministry nonprofit representatives for New Mexico. FamilyLife is collaborating with Legacy Coalition and Crosstown Ministries of Las Cruces to bring the summit to Las Cruces,

Steele said.

"This is a faith-based couple of days," Steele said, but the summit is not "preachy or churchy," and attendees do not have to belong to any organized religion to participate.

"You just have to want to be a more attuned grandparent," Steele said.

People who are not grandparents but interested in what the summit will offer are also welcome, he said.

"This is for any grandparent," Steele said, including single grandparents and couples, grandparents who connect remotely with their grandchildren and those who are estranged from them "due to circumstances or choices," he said.

Steele said the simulcast

will be presented at 110 locations across the country and will include 20-25 speakers. The Las Cruces simulcasts will include recordings of 10 of those speakers and eight sessions, he said.

The Steeles have seven grandchildren, Steele said, including three in Las Cruces. That is why Tim and Sheila decided to move here three years ago from Family Life Ministries headquarters in Orlando, Florida.

Last year's summit "was right in our wheelhouse as grandparents," Steele said.

The summit simulcast will be held at two locations in Las Cruces:

Tents to Rents passes \$100,000 funds raised

Mesilla Valley Community of Hope (MVCH) has surpassed its \$100,000 goal for the 2022 Tents to Rents campaign to help people struggling with homelessness move into their own apartments.

"What an amazing community! Providing a safe outdoor space like Camp Hope is an honor. Thank you for supporting us and those we serve," said MVCH Executive Director Nicole Martinez.

The campaign began Aug. 15 and officially ended Sept. 23, but MVCH continued to receive donations for the campaign and surpassed \$102,000 by the end of September.

Partners included Good Samaritan Village's Housing Helpers, who raised more than \$24,500 for this year's Tents to Rents. Of the Same Ilk wine club raised almost \$5,000. St. Andrews Episcopal Church raised almost \$3,000. Hearts for Hope raised more than \$2,600. MVCH itself collected more than \$42,000 in donations.

"Supporting the Tents to Rents fundraising campaign is so crucial, especially now when so many folks are experiencing homelessness as a result of the pandemic," said Carrie Hamblen, president and CEO of the Las Cruces Green Chamber of Commerce. "Camp Hope serves as transitional housing but cannot be funded by federal grants. As a participant in this years' Tents to Rents, we have seen the incredible generosity of people in our community once again coming forward."

There are currently 45 residents of MVCH's Camp Hope tent city. It costs about \$7,800 to move people out on their own. Contact Martinez at 575-523-2219, extension 114, and hope@zianet.com. Visit www.mvcommunityofhope.org and www.tentstorents.org.

Then on Friday, Oct. 14, at the Rio Grande Theatre, it's the 10x25 Conference. It's presented by Doña Ana

Community College, whose film and digital media professor Lamaia Vaughn called it a "celebration of creativity and innovation as drivers of economic and social growth in the arts, education, health and entertainment industries." There's also a strong entrepreneurial aspect to this conference. (See Page 32)

Earlier this week, in Taos, was the New Mexico Outdoor Economics Conference, attended by several Las Crucens, and co-sponsored by the nonprofit Outdoor New Mexico, based in Las Cruces. (Page 31)

The outdoors, the future and the creative fields are all assets of our community. Very few communities have the combination of those we have.

Mountainscapes, camping, bicycling and hiking. Space, science and military. Film, anima-

tion and fine arts. All of these things we have. All of these things are growing in region. All of these things bring economic opportunities, visitors and jobs.

I'm glad we're taking a look at all of these things in the context of business for Las Cruces. Our whole state needs to capitalize on the strengths we have, and develop and diversify our other opportunities.

New Mexico certainly has its struggles and its faults, but there's no denying we are indeed the Land of Enchantment. The care and feeding of that strength is something we should always be building.

Filibuster must die to save Supreme Court

During the next few weeks, voters will get their first chance to weigh in on the recent rulings by our new Supreme Court, with its 6-3 conservative majority.

The unelected and unaccountable justices are not likely to notice or care. They will be too busy reshaping our nation's laws to fit their religious and political preferences.

After ending 50 years of women's reproductive rights, neutering the Environmental Protection Agency, overturning local gun laws and forcing states to fund religious schools in last year's session, justices have a new slate of cases lined up for this year.

This term, the court will end the use of race in college admissions, give state legislatures authority over the courts in certifying elections, allow more businesses to refuse service to LGBTQ customers and strip

protections from the Clean Water a chance to actively participate.

Given the court's 6-3 majority, there's no question which way it will rule on any of these issues. The only question is how will Chief Justice John Roberts vote, and how will he continue to defend the court as being neutral arbiters above the political fray when we all know that

is a lie. All of which leads to one sad conclusion, the end of the filibuster in the U.S. Senate.

I've written three columns on the issue previously, all defending the filibuster. A career of covering government in both red and blue states has given me sympathy for the minority party, regardless of which one it is, and a strong belief that government works best when both sides have But political maneuvering in

the Senate has created a Supreme Court that is far more politically conservative than the nation as a whole, and is completely unrestrained in its efforts to turn back social advances.

Democratic political leaders are hoping to use these decisions to

motivate a discouraged base to get out and vote in the midterms, and I second that motion. But Supreme Court Justice Samuel Alito isn't up for re-election, and never will be.

We have a super-majority of conservative justices who, for the most part, are young and healthy and have decades of conservative rulings to come. Nothing we do at the polls will change that.

The only way to change it will be through legislation reforming the Supreme Court, and that can't happen without removal of the filibuster.

The goal should be to depoliticize the court as much as possible and select justices through a merit-based system where political leanings take a back seat to knowledge and experience. And we need term limits. No government appointment should be for life. That notion should have been rejected when we decided on a democracy over a monarchy.



Barbara 'Mother' Hubbard to be honored Oct. 19

Actor, comedian, ventriloquist Jeff Dunham will host "95 and Very Much Alive," New Mexico State University's tribute to Barbara "Mother" Hubbard, at 5:30 p.m. Wednesday, Oct. 19, at the Pan American Center.

"Dunham was the winner of an American Collegiate Talent Showcase (ACTS) organized by Hubbard and continues to show his appreciation for her and the program," NMSU said in a news release. In 2016, Dunham brought Hubbard on stage during his performance at the Pan Am Center and presented her a \$25,000 check to support her ACTS Scholarship Fund.

"I am the luckiest woman on this planet that people like Jeff continue to remember what the ACTS Scholarship Fund is all about," Hubbard said. "It makes everything I have tried to do completely worthwhile."

Brennin Hunt, one of the stars of Fox's "RENT Live" and the Broadway production of "Pretty Woman," will also perform at the Oct. 19 event, NMSU said. Hunt, like so many others, attributes his success to Hubbard.

The event will begin with a cocktail reception and silent auction. Dinner and a special tribute to Hubbard will follow. Tickets are \$100 or a table

of 10 for \$1,000. Sponsorships are also available.

Hubbard, who turned 95 in July, was director of special events at NMSU 1968-96 and is credited with bringing

the first-ever concert to the Pan American Center.

She is remembered and revered for attracting some of the biggest names in entertainment to Las Cruces, including Garth Brooks and Trisha Yearwood, George Strait, Tina Turner, Charley Pride, U2, the Eagles, Pearl Jam, Earth Wind & Fire, Whitney Houston, Foreigner, Carrie Underwood, Brad Paisley, Trans-Siberian Orchestra, Elton John, Billy Joel, Van Halen, Prince and Metallica - and Jeff Dunham - Visit Las

Cruces (VLC) said when it honored Hubbard and other Las Cruces women pioneers earlier this year. Professional boxing cards, wrestling matches, circuses and other traveling extravaganzas attracted thousands more visitors to Las Cruces during Hub-

bard's illustrious career, VLC said.

In fact, Brooks' World Tour sold out five shows and attracted more than 60,000 fans to Las Cruces over a three-day period in April 2017. Con-

certgoers from 47 states purchased tickets to the shows, and Hubbard's legacy was cemented – if it was not already – as a pioneer in promotions and local tourism, VLC said.

Hubbard "is southern New Mexico's icon," Mayor Ken Miyagishima said when he presented Hubbard with the mayor's distinguished service award, "in recognition of your commitment and dedication in helping to make Las Cruces a better community," in May. "She put the Pan American Center on the nation's map in addition to bringing a lot of great music to Las Cruces and the borderland."

Among the honorary chairpeople of the event for Hubbard are Reba McEntire and Louis Messina, one of the top concert promoters in the U.S.

"Mother" Hubbard, a nickname given to her by Bob Hope because of her dedication to her students - her "kids" - is still a force to be reckoned with. Even as she starts her 95th year, she remains active in promoting concerts, mentoring, and providing student scholarship funds. She has generated over \$750,000 in scholarship funds for NMSU students alone, where she continues teaching a Venue Management class. Additionally, she has provided scholarship funds for students in several other colleges and universities.

Former governor offers advice to candidate

"Focus on the personal side of being the governor of the state of New Mexico. That would bring us together more than we are right now."

That is the advice former New Mexico governor and NMSU Chancellor Garrey Carruthers has for Mark Ronchetti if the Albuquerque Republican is elected governor in November.

Carruthers, also a Republican, said he frequently walked on the floor of the New Mexico state Senate and House of Representatives during legislative sessions while he was governor, 1987-90, talking to legislators and leaders from both parties.

He created windows in his schedule for any legislator, Republican or Democrat, who requested a meeting during the session or at any other time.

Carruthers also kept one Saturday morning a month open for 15-minute appointments at the governor's mansion in Santa Fe for anyone who wanted to come and see him to talk about any issue.

"People here expect to go see the governor," he said. "They want to be heard."

Carruthers also regularly held what his administration called "government days" in towns and cities across the state, taking cabinet secretaries and other officials with him to meet with residents and visit their communities.

Whenever he met with a constituent, Carruthers said he made sure a staff member was present so there could be immediate follow up on any issue raised during the meeting.

And, Carruthers said he was always honest about any requests or demands people made when they met with him.

"If I couldn't do it, I'd tell them I couldn't do it," he said.

Carruthers said he would also advise Ronchetti to reorganize state government and reduce governor's cabinet positions to "a reasonable number."

There are today nearly twice as many New Mexico state cabinet secretaries as when he was governor, Carruthers said.

For the secretaries of the most important departments, the former governor said he would advise Ronchetti to "look for the best professional people you can find and don't worry about party affiliation."


Carruthers said he appointed several Democrats to his cabinet, and retained some from the administration of the previous governor, Democrat Toney Anaya.

When he interviewed Lane Cotter, who would become his Corrections Department secretary, "I didn't ask his party affiliation," Carruthers said.

If he becomes the new governor, Ronchetti also needs to take advantage of the record state budget surplus expected for the 2023 legislative session, Carruthers said.

"Now is the time to restructure the state's tax system," he said, to make it "equitable and fair and not so complex."

Carruthers said he served on a tax reform task force for former Gov. Bill Richardson and would be willing to do so

again.

On the national level, "to pull back together," Carruthers said, what the country needs "is a 50-year-old Ronald Reagan who can advocate a Republican agenda" of law and order and fiscal restraint.

The GOP has always stood for a balanced budget, freedom of speech, a strong military and free enterprise, he said, and those initiatives are "very sound and still relevant to America."

Now, however, "We're not hearing those voices," Carruthers said, even among moderate and conservative Republicans. "We need to go back to those principles; go back to Lincoln," he said. "It's a good map of where the party ought to be."

Carruthers voted for Trump in 2016 because he thought "the change might be what we needed," he said.

But Trump was "incredibly disappointing to me as president," Carruthers said. Trump "did not represent the people. The one thing he represented was himself. We've never had people call their political opponents the names he called them."

"I'm not a Trumper at all," said Carruthers, who voted for Joe Biden in 2020.

Even so, Carruthers remains a staunch Re-

publican. He was state Republican Party chair 1977-79.


"I would never leave the party," he said.

There are still "all kinds of principles Republican candidates can run on," both in New Mexico and across the nation, Carruthers said.

But political campaigns have become so adversarial and meanspirited, he said, "I'm glad I'm 83 years old and don't have to go through that."

From 1981-84, Carruthers served in two administrative positions at the U.S. Department of the Interior. After serving as dean of the College of Business, he was NMSU president and chancellor 2013-17.



Vice President for Equity, Inclusion and Diversity Teresa Maria Linda Scholz announced the appointment Sept. 27.

"I am absolutely delighted that Dr. Green has agreed to take on this interim role," Scholz said in the announcement. "She is a compassionate, forward-thinking and steady leader who understands the needs and challenges faced by our Black students. We are very fortunate to have

her on board." Green, has been a profes-





tivist, an expert lecturer, a writer, a choir director and a public speaker. She has created hundreds of videos and has taught thousands of students as a college professor in a career that spans more than 20 years. At NMSU, she served as a college associate professor in the College of Business for more than 13 years - a portion of that time as director of the college's Master of Business Administration program.

"Because of those who came before me and demanded equity, I've had the opportunity to teach at a university that once denied the first African American student the right to sit in the classroom while she attended classes here," Green said. "It was the compassion of wellmeaning faculty who demanded that Clara Belle Williams be allowed to sit in a segregated classroom, undoubtedly risking their own livelihoods in the process. My mother was a cook at NMSU. But I didn't have to work in the kitchen at NMSU. Instead, I was allowed to work in the classroom. Therefore, I have an obligation to pay it forward."

'Hunger Strike' nears \$80,000

Casa de Peregrinos (CdP) 2022 Hunger Strike fundraiser has collected more than \$70,000 "and the number is still climbing," CdP Executive Director Lorenzo Alba said.

Alba said the campaign had surpassed \$76,000 by Sept. 29. That surpasses the group's goal for this year's campaign by more than \$15,000. Since it began in 2019, Hunger Strike has collected more than \$225,000 to benefit the countywide emergency food program, Alba said.

To raise the money, nearly 60 participants began a fast Sept. 22, after a breakfast from CdP partners Luchador food truck. They created social media messages asking friends, family and co-workers to support them by donating. Most of the fasts lasted 24 hours, until a Sept. 23 breakfast at The Shed, during which owner Gabe Mendoza donated \$2,000.

"We are humbled by the overwhelming support and generosity of this community and the courage and drive of the participants," Alba said.

Hunger Strike not only raised money for CdP, it gave participants and the community an opportunity "to have a day of solidarity with our neighbors that struggle with hunger (food insecurity) in their everyday lives," Alba said.

Jimmy Smits is seeing, and living, another side of police work in his latest series role.

The "L.A. Law" Emmy winner who spent several seasons on "NYPD Blue" is now playing a department superior in "East New York," CBS' new Sunday drama. His Chief John Suarez oversees officers including Regina Haywood (Amanda Warren), just appointed the captain of a precinct where others doubt her ability to be a leader.

"What is the role of law enforcement in the time that we're in now?," reflects Brooklyn native Smits. "How can you be representative of the community when at the same time, if there's a problem, you call the cops? Those questions come into play, and this is a guy who's been around for a while. 

Arts & ENTERTAINMENT Painting rhythms, hearing secrets

Baseball Hall of Famer Willie Mays once described his profession as, "They throw the ball, I hit it. They hit the ball, I catch

Las Cruces artist Virginia Maria Romero has a similarly on-point explanation for what she does: "You start with a blank canvas. You create something. Somebody connects with

that."

Art lovers throughout New Mexico, across the country and around the world have connected with Romero's uniquely beautiful paintings, retablos and public art, adding them to collections in homes, galleries, museums and nonprofits.

"It's just exciting," Romero said of the international reputation she has gained as an artist. "\$100 or \$10,000, any time I sell a piece of artwork, somehow, somebody gravitated to something I did and they want it," she said. "That never gets old."

Much of Romero's art reflects her personal connection to nature and wildlife. She has a particular affinity for coyotes, who frequently show up in her artwork. Having looked one in the eye, Romero said she recognizes their

right to co-exist.

Romero also paints bobcats, ravens, owls and other wild creatures.

"When I paint then, I try to paint not what I remember, their features," she said, "but how they

affected me. I'm painting the primal connection we share with everything on the planet. Animals are reflecting that color essence of the universe."

You may also find turtles, Romero's

power animal, in some of her paintings.

If you see a drum in her artwork or a photograph she has taken, it likely represents for her the rhythm, the heartbeat, that connects humans to all creatures.

"They're the same," Romero said. "They have a heart too."

The images that come to her in "dreams, visions and imagination" reflect "how I would like the things to be vs. how they are around some of the social issues like the environment and wildlife," she

Romero has donated the use of some of her artwork to wildlife groups, including Project Coyote and the Northern Jaguar Coalition.

"I view my work helping make social change," she said.

Romero shares her Las Cruces home with husband, Alfonso, and four

The whole house is her studio, Romero said.

"I paint everywhere," she said, "as long as I don't disturb the cats.'

"I don't live my art, my art lives me," Romero said. It's an expression ... a reflection of my life."

Romero's art has been exhibited in a number of local venues and it part of the collection at Bill Hester Fine Art 613 gallery on Canyon Road in Santa Fe. She is at work on the 12-17 pieces of her art that will be part of an exhibition at Galleri Artsight In Stockholm, Sweden next May.

Romero is a native of Sheffield Lake, Ohio. She read about Santa Fe in National Geographic and lived there for 10 years before moving to Las Cruces with her husband more than 30 years ago. One of Romero's hobbies is beadwork, making belts, hatbands, vests and fetish pouches as she did before taking up painting. It helps her to unwind, Romero said, and to meditate.

"Painting does the same thing for me," she said. "I have no idea what my technique is. I start with color or a thought and it evolves into something. I just paint what I feel."





Mural celebrates founding of Las Cruces, El Camino Real

A mural is taking shape on the corner of Las Cruces Avenue and Mesquite Street.

This is the first of what could turn into 30 (maybe even 60 or more) murals on Mesquite Street, all the way to the village of Doña Ana. Mesquite Street is part of El Camino Real.

The driving force behind this is Carlos Melendrez, the great-great grandson of Pablo Melendrez.

Pablo, from the Village of Doña Ana, hired an Army guy, Lt. Delos Bennett Sackett (1822-85), to plat Las Cruces in 1849.

Carlos would like to establish a founders day celebrating some of the early inhabitants and the very old trail those people used (El Camino Real and earlier incarnations). These murals are the first step on this journey.

The painter is Lorenzo Braulio Zepeda, a native of Los Angeles who grew up in Anthony, Texas,

and has lived in Las Cruces for 20 years. He has a fine arts degree from New Mexico State University with a painting/drawing emphasis. He began painting murals in 2014 while teaching on a project with the city Juvenile Citation Program and Parks and Recreation Department.

Zepeda began work on the murals in mid-September. His first two subjects are famous Indian warriors.

The old man went by the name Nana (grandma or lullaby). He married Geronimo's sister and rode with Geronimo. He had the longest fighting career of any Apache warrior.

"Carlos Melendrez reached out to me in early August this year," Zepeda said. "He shared his vision. I then shared my own mission to highlight the stories of people from this land, specifically, the magnitude of the Camino Real in the Mesilla Valley, beyond its connection to the Conquest and 'La Entrada.'"

The young female is Lozen, sister of Victorio, an Apache chief, and was, herself, a well-known warrior. (Victorio will have his own mural.) She was known for her bravery and military prowess. After Victorio died, she joined Geronimo. Lozen was known as the "Apache Joan of Arc."

On the east side of this building will be portraits of Geronimo and Victorio.

Carlos already has 15 property owners interested in having murals and would like to sign-up at least a few dozen more.

At 11 a.m., Monday, Oct. 10, there will be a dedication event on the corner of Mesquite and Las Cruces – or it may be moved to Klein Park if too big a crowd shows up.



When we recycle. we want what goes into our blue recycling bin to be recycled. However, sometimes a whole recycling load can be lost due to contamination. This contamination happens when dirty or unaccepted items end up in the bin. Sometimes recycling can be sorted out. but food waste often attracts rodents. cords and plastic bags tangle the machines, and too much trash cannot be separated out.

"Recycling contamination is an issue because it inhibits our move to a more circular economy - where items we use can be reused or repurposed - and results in more items ending up in the landfill that don't need to be there," said South **Central Solid Waste Recycle Education** Coordinator Brandi Misquez.

Here are some of the most common recycling contaminants seen at the Amador Transfer Station:

1. Set it free so it can be recycled easily: Bagged recycling cannot be sorted and often goes to waste. Plastic bags and other soft plastic wrapping

cause problems by wrapping around machinery at the recycling facility. Think: plastic grocery bags, zip lock bags, produce bags, bubble wrap, and any flexible wrap that food items may come in.

2. Paper towels, napkins, paper plates, paper cups, and tissues: These items can be composted but not recycled.

3. Tanglers: Water hoses, wires, chains, and electronic cords. Like plastic bags, these items jam recycling machinery and create hazards for sorters.

4. Styrofoam packaging: Think to-go containers and packing peanuts

commonly used in moving boxes. Since Styrofoam cannot be recycled and is not biodegradable, it is best to avoid using this whenever possible.

5. Food and liquids: Recycling must be rinsed, cleaned, and dry.


6. Pizza boxes: It's surprising because while the hard cardboard might seem perfect, the grease contaminates it making it non-recyclable.

"It's time that we all take an active role and do everything we can to reduce the impact on our planet," said Misquez. "Recycling correctly is as important as doing it in the first place."

Review: Brilliant return of 'Steel Magnolias'

Director Greg Thompson said it himself when he welcomed playgoers to the opening-night performance of "Steel Magnolias": Las Cruces is producing outstanding live theatre.

Las Cruces Community Theatre's (LCCT) production of this timeless classic - the beloved 1989 movie is based on Robert Harling's 1987 play – is set in Truvy's in-home beauty parlor in the Louisiana parish of Chinquapin, but it is a tale of life and death, joy and suffering, triumph and tragedy, the trivial and the lifechanging that could take place in Las Cruces, New Mexico, or anywhere.

How wonderful it is to welcome the return of Truvy (Courtney Curtis), Annelle (Sarah Neely), Clairee (Shari C. Reinhart), Shelby (Chloe Curtis), M'Lynn and Ouiser (Judy Parker Dougherty) back to the LCCT stage, which produced "Steel Magnolias" for the first time during its 2012-13 season.

Even before the lights go up, you notice Thompson's attention to every detail of the beauty shop, converted by Truvy's husband from their garage, from all the haircare products and posters down to the framed business license. The entire play is set here, so it must welcome the audience as it welcomes the characters. I have spent very little time in beauty parlors in my life, but even I felt at home at Truvy's.

The costumes, by Janet Beatty-Payne, who was in LCCT's first "Steel Magnolias" cast, are another carefully crafted element of the show, including such small but important details as Christmas sweaters and wedding rings.

I sat in the front row and marveled as Courtney and Sarah really did style the other women's hair throughout their conversations. Each either has training as a beautician or devoted much rehearsal time to it, because it is another flawless feature that adds immeasurably.

The set, the costumes, the lights, the sound (including Scott Brocato as the KPPD Radio DJ) are all in support of an outstanding cast who bring these characters to life.

You forget you are watching a play as you become absorbed in the ordinary and extraordinary details of the lives of these women, their husbands, their children and the world around them.

The evolution of Annelle is a tribute to all of that - the hair, the costume and especially the talent of the actor. Courtney and her portrayal of Truvy is the rock that holds them all together from start to finish. Sheri's and Judy's Clairee and Ouiser are fixtures in the beauty parlor and the appeal and timing of these two actors is priceless. Nora played Shelby in LCCT's original production of "Steel Magnolias," and is adding another outstanding performance to her

theatre resume as Shelby's mother, M'Lynn, this time around. And Chloe was brilliant – strong as steel, delicate as a magnolia blossom – in her performance as Shelby.

This cast and its equally outstanding crew, led ably by Thompson, have produced great theatre. Bravo.

Take a giant leap with NMSU Theatre's Big Frog'

"I was thrilled by the production and so impressed by the brilliant work the students were doing," playwright Dylan Guerra told me about New Mexico State University's production of his new play, "Big Frog."

I too was impressed by this outstanding cast of young actors and the space that director Nichole Hamilton gave them to create their characters individually and as a group of high school students who gather on a Miami golf course to smoke pot, drink and deal with their traumas.

They find a blue frog that becomes something of a mascot, but things change dramatically when a dare is accepted and everyone licks the frog. One of the five disappears and the other four gather 10 years later to discuss what to say in an upcoming podcast on that unsolved mystery. The frog remains and grows dramatically in importance to the story.

"Time is fluid in this play," Guerra said. "Sometimes we will skip 10 years, sometimes minutes. This play is not about understanding. Lean in to the ridiculous."

"The play's structure is intriguing, the plot mysterious, and the style, well... quite the wild ride," Hamilton said. "I found themes of cultural and generational trauma, addiction, sexual identity, isolation, and youth searching for an understanding of their past, present, future and

how they tie together."

Does licking the frog release a hallucinogenic, or is this colorful amphibian some sort of four-legged, croaking, deadly mystic?

The play has no intermission, and the simple, powerful set and costumes never change. The focus is on the actors and the story, which hops like a frog from present to past to future.

Gold stars to every cast member, all of whom are NMSU theatre students. They come to the edge of the stage fearless and, in one case, almost naked, inviting you to step into the universe they have created.





"Abnormality," stars Devin G. Macias "in an intense psychological thriller about a deranged and murderous family man that toys with a detec-

tive, played by Nickolas S. Lowe, who seeks vengeance for the murder of his sister and nieces," Sepp said. The movie was filmed entirely in Las Cruces.

"Everyone involved in this project was either friends or family," said Estrada. "The actors, crew, companies, they were all friends and family."

After the screening, Las Cruces Police Department Deputy Chief Kiri Daines presented the young filmmakers with a token given to Las Cruces citizens who "shine a positive light on the community," Sepp said.

When asked about their future career plans, many of the cast and crew mentioned law enforcement, he said. Estrada said nothing will get in the way of his future as a feature film director.

Even though many of the film's actors do not plan film careers, they did well portraying Estrada's characters, Sepp said.

"Lowe explored a wide

variety of emotions onscreen and you'd think he had been doing this as a career for years," he said.

"The hardest challenge I faced was getting into character," Lowe said. "My favorite location tofilm at was my detective office."

Estrada plans to work again with cinematographer Austin Smith on another feature film that will again star Macias and is slated for production in summer 2023.



Project Cougars gets middle schoolers outside

Thanks to a \$10,000 grant from the New Mexico Economic Development Department's (EDD) Outdoor Recreation Division, the Desert Community Wellness (DCW) nonprofit of Las Cruces is creating a program called Project Cougars Outside that will connect Lynn Community Middle School students "to New Mexico histories and wellness experiences outdoors."

Project Cougars Outside will take place during the school day, "breaking down barriers of cost, time and transportation all while supporting the learning taking place in the classroom," EDD said in a news release. (Lynn Community School's nickname is the Cougars.)

"This project will give Lynn students hands-on, enriched experiences to foster a love of learning, connections to New Mexico histories and wellness experiences in our beautiful outdoors," said DCW President Kasey Peña, who will lead the project.

"Cougars Outside will create access to students by taking place during the school day, breaking down barriers of cost,

time and transportation while enriching the learning taking place in the classroom," Peña said. "This school year provides a unique opportunity with enrichment days built in (Las Cruces Public Schools converted to year-round schooling beginning with the 2022-23 school year, which started in July), so students won't miss instruction. As a community school, this project is a great additional learning support offered to students and families," she said.

DCW, housed at Downtown Desert Yoga, 303 S. Alameda Blvd., was created to help all segments of the community understand the importance of wellness and have access to it, Boyd said.

Project Cougars Outside is a perfect fit with DCW's mission to create sustainable partnerships "to share accessible wellness practices" in the community by helping people - including middle school students - to understand what personal wellness means. DCW's definition has five pillars: physical, social-emotional, creative, financial and environmental, which interweave to support "living with passion and purpose" in harmony with the environment, community, career, belief systems, physical activities, selfcare, eating, selfesteem, creative activities and more.

EDD's Outdoor Recreation Division awarded more than \$800,000 in Outdoor Equity Fund

grants in August to 48 organizations across the state, including DCW and four others in Doña Ana County. EDD said the fund was created to provide New Mexican youth with

"outdoor experiences that foster stewardship and respect for New Mexico's land, water and cultural heritage."

"The awarded groups will bring 12,391 young New Mexicans hiking, biking, camping, hunting and more, from now through 2023," EDD said.


The 2022 New Mexico Outdoor Economics Conference wraps up Friday, Oct. 7, in Taos.

Knowledge is power: Know yourself, your emotions

Probably the most apparent aspect of knowledge for golfers is how much we actually know about our golf swing.

"Golf is such an individual game, and no two golfers swing alike," says professional golf's all-time winner (with 88 wins) and New Mexico's own Kathy Whitworth.

Most of us have never seen our swing on camera, so we think we know what we're doing, but we can't know for certain. If you know and understand your swing, you can grasp certain tendencies and limitations. Some golfers hit a natural fade and some draw the ball. Go with what you can predict. Two famous golfers did pretty well managing a power fade - Jack Nicklaus and Lee Trevino.

Along the same lines as knowing your swing is knowing your game. Are you a risk-taker, a deliberate analyst, a fairwaysand-greens kind of player, or perhaps a golfer to

whom winning the bet is everything?

Although every person has a unique personality, I have found that golfers fall into categories or stereotypes, and usually they are not too hard to figure out. The point is, if you know your game, and play it, chances are you'll do well. For example, if you are not a great scrambler, and struggle with your short game, you better realize that fact and avoid taking unnecessary chances. As Shakespeare wrote in Hamlet, "To thy own self be true, and ... thou canst not then be false to any man." Or any golf course.

One of Malcolm Gladwell's many bestseller books was "Outliers: The Story of Success," in which he makes the point that one does not need to be consummately brilliant nor an intellectual genius in order to be successful in life. You just need to be smart enough to solve the important problems you

face. So it is with knowledge, and specifically knowledge in golf. You don't have to know

everything about everything, even though some fellows would want you to think they

do; you just need to know

what's important. And just about the top priority of what to know is knowing yourself. Useful self-knowledge and selfunderstanding go well beyond things like your swing and your strengths and your talent. Look first at emotions. Performance experts are nearly all in agreement that emotional intelligence is a huge part of the package which leads to success in sports. In competitive sports, whether it's golf, tennis or football, emotions rule. At crunch time, emotions

override thinking, reaction, memory, attitude and everything else. Exactly how does the primacy of emotions affect performance? The answer is everything, but it's mostly about nerves, concentration, clear thinking, tension, reactions, muscle movement and senses.

Many golfers don't realize how crucial control of emotions really is. Have you known someone who has made a bonehead dumb mistake barking "Oh, I just wasn't thinking!" No, the problem wasn't thinking. It was because he didn't know his own basic emotions, much less how to get them under control. Folks who don't know their emotions, and don't know their fragile insecurities, have few resources to control them. They often sabotage themselves. And there is a more subtle dimension to emotions here. Making good decisions, good risk-reward choices along with intel-

ligent plays are certainly keys to playing well. At certain critical moments in competition, you can over-think; worse yet, you can over-emote.

It's time to ask: is your failure to get in touch with your emotions holding you back from playing your best golf? Do you know exactly how stressors on the golf course lead to certain responses on your part? When the pressure is on, are you conscious of how you make decisions? Are you in touch with your tendencies under pressure?

Often emotions, like an iceberg, have their biggest effect below the surface below one's threshold of awareness. In "Golf And The Spirit" M. Scott Peck writes, "If you are a very good golfer, it is probable that you are emotionally mature – at least on the golf course." Golf is a powerful teacher of emotional maturity, he adds.
