# **Las Cruces Airport Appreciation Day Saturday**

Las Cruces International Airport (LCIA) will be the site of 2022 Airport Appreciation Day, 9 a.m.-2 p.m. Saturday, Oct. 15.

There is no charge to attend. Airport parking is free.

The event will include planes, helicopters and drones, said LCIA Administrator Andy Hume, and is "more focused on kids."

It will include STEM (science-technology-engineering and mathematics) activities and simulated aircraft for children, Hume said. There also will be Las Cruces Police Department drones and Las Cruces Fire Department fire trucks on display, along with police cars and city utility vehi-

cles. Civilian and military aircraft displays will include two King Air aircraft from Biggs Army Air Base in El Paso, the City of Las Cruces said in a news release. Virgin Galactic will have its aerobatic training plane on display.

At 1 p.m., a helicopter pilot will do a helicopter skills demonstration, Hume said.

Flights over the Mesilla Valley aboard a Pilatus PC125 are available for \$75.

The Pilatus PC-12 is a single-engine turboprop passenger and cargo aircraft manufactured by Pilatus Aircraft of Switzerland since 1991.

"It's a really cool aircraft and it's fast," Hume said. The flight will allow passengers "to experience the Mesilla Valley in a way

most people don't get to," he said.

The event will also have food trucks.

A goal of Airport Appreciation Day is helping area residents learn more about the airport that serves them, and, in some cases, make them aware that Las Cruces has an airport, Hume said.

Much like the challenge of bringing residents and visitors to downtown Las Cruces when he served as the city's downtown coordinator before becoming airport administrator, Hume said he wants to get more people saying, "This is our airport. This is a fun place to be."

The Oct. 15 event is

"another good step" in that direction, as it connects last year's Wings and Wheels event at the airport with next year's planned Las Cruces Air and Space Expo, he said.

"What all of this is about is having the airport playing a vital role as an economic development driver for the region," Hume said. The airport's master plan shows existing conditions at LCIA and forecasts future airport operations, he said. It shows "what the airport is going to look like over the next 20 years," Hume said.

The city recently received a \$3.8 million grant from the New Mexico Department of Transportation that will bring air service to Albuquerque from LCIA in the near future, Hume said.

The airport is located at 8950 Zia Blvd., about 10.5 miles west of downtown Las Cruces via Interstate 10, exit 32, or the frontage road on the north side of I-10

# Celebrating a one-of-a-kind

If you're of a certain age, and watched your share of TV re-runs, I'm about to put an earworm in your brain that will last the whole day.

"Their house is a museum, When people come to see 'em ..."

That's what crept into my head the first time I visited the home of Barbara Hubbard and saw the many, many, many plaques, photos, posters and memorabilia on her walls, shelves and cabi-

nets. Most of them were recognitions for her work, and most of them featured celebrities. It was 2008, and I was working on a series of articles about New Mexico State University's Pan American Center, which turned

40 years old that year.

If you don't know Barb Hubbard or what she does, here's a brief synopsis. She was the

Pan Am's first business manager when it opened in 1968. She quickly developed a knack for bringing the most popular music and entertainment acts in the country to swing through Las Cruces and do a show or two. Upon meeting her, these

famous entertainers typically fell in love with her and made a point to come back, often multiple times.

Country music icon George Strait, for example, has played 17 times at the Pan Am. That would not have happened without Hubbard's relationship. When Garth Brooks came to Las Cruces in 2017, he played five shows in three days. Again, Hubbard was instrumental.

As important as bringing all these great acts, is Hubbard's own ACTS (American Collegiate Talent Showcase). Over the years, in her time working at the Pan Am, Hubbard employed many students to help with the preparation, coordination, logistics and production of these shows. She was so impressed by so many of these young people, she wanted to help them get through school by creating a scholarship program, and so ACTS was born.

Since it began in 1978, ACTS has more than \$750,000 in scholarship funds and helped

hundreds of NMSU students finance their education and advance their careers in the many different areas of show business. There are now more than 25 endowed scholarships for ACTS, including ones named for Brooks and Strait. Some are very specific as to the student major and/or the purpose. For example, the Stevie Wonder, Ray Charles, Ronnie Milsap & Jose Feliciano Endowed Scholarship is for students with disabilities, particularly visual ones. All four of those blind musicians performed at the Pan

While Hubbard officially retired as arena manager in the late 1980s, she continues to

# Continued filming of 'Rust' disrespectful

I was disappointed to learn that filmmakers plan to resume production on "Rust," a Western that began filming in northern New Mexico in 2021. I also urge state regulators to keep a much closer eye on that set this time.

I can't imagine why anybody would want to see the film now, other than for morbid curiosity. Every time there is a scene where an actor pretends to get shot, viewers will know that a real person was shot and killed during filming.

Cinematographer Halyna Hutchins was shot by the film's star and producer Alec Baldwin, who believed he was firing a prop gun loaded with blanks. Director Joel Souza was also wounded in the shooting. Baldwin's claim that the gun fired itself defies both logic and physics.

Last week it was announced a settlement had been reached with Hutchins' family, and filming on "Rust" would soon resume. The ability to write a check with a whole lot of zeros can't make this go away.

The state Board of Fi-

nance recently approved an emergency request by Santa Fe District Attorney Mary Carmac Altwies for a special prosecutor, special investigator and other experts to investigate and potentially file criminal charges in the case. Four people, including Baldwin, could face charges ranging from homicide to violations of state guns laws, according to the Santa Fe New Mexican.

The state Occupational Health and Safety Bureau has already fined the production company \$137,000, alleging numerous violations of rules governing workplace safety. They said industry standards for the safe handling of prop guns were neglected in an effort to cut costs.

The criminal investigation continues, and I won't presume to know what the outcome will be. But it is encouraging to know investigators now have the resources they need to determine what really happened.

I'm glad Hutchins' family has made peace with Baldwin and the film production company, and hope the settlement will bring some closure for them. But New Mexicans still have questions about this industry we have invited into our state with generous tax credits.

The rapid growth of the film industry is a positive for our state as we work to diversify our economy and reduce our dependence on oil and gas revenue. That's especially true in Las Cruces, where local investments are

starting to pay off.

But state regulators must be able to keep pace with that growth to ensure that workers in the film industry have the same workplace protections as those in other occupations.

We live in a free nation, and there is no legal reason why the production of "Rust" can't continue. But it seems incredibly disrespectful to me, and dismissive of the human tragedy that occurred in the making of the movie.

Her unmistakable Arkansas drawl always cuts through the noise at any venue. She and I would always have an exchange

The predominant memory of Barb for me is also from a football game, the Arizona Bowl in Tucson in December 2017. If you'll recall, the Aggies, competing in their first bowl game in 57 years, defeated Utah State 26-20 in overtime. It seemed half of Las Cruces made the trip, including, of course, Barb Hubbard, who at the time was a spring chicken of 90.

As the PA announcer

was telling all the NMSU fans to stay off the field, I looked down from my seat to see this scene:
Barb Hubbard climbing over the rails to get on the turf and congratulate the football players. I don't have to tell you, but she made it.

Wednesday, Oct. 19, her fans and friends will be in the Pan Am Center, celebrating her life and her work. One of her biggest fans, comedian and ventriloquist Jeff Dunham, will be the emcee. True to Barb's form, the event will also raise funds for ACTS scholarships.

Barbara Hubbard will forever have NMSU students in her heart, and many, many people will have Barb Hubbard forever in their hearts as well.

A premium jewelry sale for yourself and holiday gift-giving mark the annual Kitty Glitter, said event coordinator Jackye Meinecke.



# City GO bonds would fund parks, recreation projects

EDITOR'S NOTE: The Nov. 8 general election ballot will include four general obligation bond questions for voters who live in Las Cruces (in addition to the state GO bond questions all New Mexico voters will vote on). The four questions are 1) \$6 million affordable housing fund to create homes and jobs; 2) \$10 million for a new fire station to enhance public safety and shorten response times; 3) \$2 million for park improvements; and 4) \$5 million for phase two of the East Mesa Recreation Complex.

#### **Park improvements**

There are 104 parks in the City of Las Cruces, ranging from small neighborhood pocket parks to multi-acre parks that attract visitors from throughout the city and the region.

As part of its master plan and with a lot of

community input, the city Parks and Recreation Department has assessed and ranked all city parks in terms of their need for upgrades. Many of the parks do not have an identified funding source for improvements, Parks and **Recreation Department** Director Sonya Delgado said. So, as funds become available with sources that include GO bonds, the work begins.

If voters approve the \$2 million for city parks GO bond on the November ballot, it will provide upgrades and improvements to La Llorona Park and to Salopek/Stull, Tellbrook, Hess Terrace and La Fonda neighborhood parks, Delgado said.

• La Llorona Park, 3440 W. Picacho Ave., is "widely used by the community," Delgado said, for floating, kayaking, rafting, picnicking and hiking.

"It's packed there when the water is running" in the Rio Grande, Delgado said.

With GO bond funds, Parks and Rec will replace La Llorona Park's playground equipment, add additional shade structures, upgrade restrooms and repair trail.

borhood Park, 464 Salopek Blvd., would receive upgrades to its playground, shade structures and solar lighting.

• Tellbrook Neighborhood Park, 4290 E. Winchester Road, would have its exercise equipment removed and replaced if the parks improvement bond question is approved.

· La Fonda Neighborhood Park, 1600 La Fonda Drive, would receive benches with shade, trash cans and doggie doo bags if the bond is approved.

· Hess Terrace Neighborhood Park, 500 W. Picacho Ave. would receive trees, benches with shade, trash cans and doggie doo

Delgado said La Llorona Park would receive the largest share of the bond

if it is approved, with remaining funds being allocated to the other parks with the hope that improvements can be made at all five with the \$2 million.

Park improvements have a "direct, positive impact to the community," Delgado said. That was demonstrated more clearly than ever during the Covid-19 pandemic because local residents could access parks and trails during periods of isolation, she said.

The city has "recreation programs for all ages and abilities that utilize our outdoor spaces," she said. "We have recreational programs for all ages and abilities.

#### East Mesa Public **Recreation Complex**

Phase one of the East Mesa Public Recreation

Complex improvements was approved by voters in 2018. Approval of the 2022 bond will continue those improvements.

The \$5 million for phase two improvements to the 10-acre park would include sports and security lighting, including lighting for eight pickleball courts, two multi-use fields and two ball fields, Delgado said.

The complex is the city's third community-sized park, joining Young an Apodaca parks, the city said.

Improvements to the park will bring athletic tournaments to the facility, Delgado said, which will generate revenue for the

#### Parks and Rec Dept.

Parks and Rec staff are responsible for maintenance and beautification of city parks, trails, athletic fields, rights of way, medians alleyways and facilities that include pools and splash pads, Delgado said. The department has approximately 115 full-time employees, along with some who are part-time and temporary.

"This team works hard for the community," Delgado said. "We take this seriously. Our team does a great job."







# FYI Plus receives 'transformative' financial grant

Families and Youth Innovations Plus (FYI+) of Las Cruces has received a nearly \$4 million grant from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) "to transition into New Mexico's first certified community behavioral health clinic (CCBHC), FYI+ said in a news release.

"In 2021, our team reimagined, recharged and rebranded our agency as FYI+," CEO Brian Kavanaugh said.

"Today, we accept this transformative award from SAMHSA that will strengthen our responsive, collaborative efforts and impact by increasing access to and availability of a comprehensive range of quality behavioral health and community-based services in our region, which it wholeheartedly deserves."

Kavanaugh said the grant will mean 8-10 new hires at the onset, and that number could double or triple "as the model is built over the coming year and beyond," he said.

The central operation of CCBHC will be housed at FYI+'s main office at 1320 S. Solano Drive, Kavanaugh said.

#### Mental health focus

FYI+ received SAM-HSA funding for its grant submission "Advancing Care in Southern New Mexico through CCBHC Implementation," which indicated that one-third of the region's residents need mental health services, and 30 percent of those residing

in colonias identify a need for mental health support, FYI+ said, citing a New Mexico State University Center for Community Analysis

September 2020 report.

"This funding, combined with our dedicated team, has the potential to shift the trajectory of mental and behavioral health outcomes in our region," said FYI+ Chief Operating Officer Jolene Martinez.

"Through a collaborative effort with Incite Network, our team was able to develop a strategy and narrative which compelled SAMHSA to validate our community's needs and provide resources to change its course."

"Knowing that we played a role in FYI+'s growth and the region's increased capacity for behavioral health support is why we do what we do,' said Janet Mendoza, a senior strategist for the Incite Network, which has offices in Las Cruces and El Paso and helps health and human services organizations and others with strategic planning, program design and fund development, according to www.incite-network. com.)

FYI+ said the grant is "strongly supported" by New Mexico Human Services Department's Behavioral Health Services Division (BHSD) Director Neal A. Bowen.

#### **Addressing disparities**

In a region known for its health disparities, these funds will assist FYI+ (guided by CCBHC certification criteria) to elevate the community's behavioral health systems through planning for, developing and implementing a CCBHC; providing a comprehensive range of outreach, screening, assessment, treatment, care coordination and recovery supports; and supporting recovery from mental illness and/or substance use disorders by providing access to high-quality mental health and SUD services, regardless of an individual's ability to pay, FYI+ said.

"The CCBHC model is considered as the 'gold standard' of delivery system transformation, according to the National Council for Mental Wellbeing," Kavanaugh said. "The award from SAMSHA was simply not possible without the countless contributions and the high level of passion, commitment and dedication the FYI+ team has provided to our community throughout the years.

"The CCBHC model reinforces and accelerates our drive to continuously strengthen the care continuum, focus heavily on person- and family-centered integrated services and collaborative efforts across sectors and organizations, and to not only expand the number and variety of services available, but to make certain the services that

are available are provided in a timely manner," he said. understand, influence and change social inequality ties in health care and

#### Serve community

"Additionally, the CCBHC model allows for FYI+ to build a comprehensive delivery system of care in a financially sustainable manner, which will enhance our ability to recruit, retain and train and develop a strong workforce," he said.

"Building out the CCBHC model at FYI+ will bring more opportunity for all of us to better understand, influence and change social inequities in health care and related support services and serve our community better.

"We were awarded this grant because our application demonstrated the highest levels of readiness and capacity to participate in the CCBHC certification process," Kavanaugh said. "The award does not instantaneously make us a CCBHC; what it does is provide us the funding and technical assistance from SAMSHA and the state to work

towards certification and ultimately become a 'certified community behavioral health clinic.'"

FYI+ offers a wide range of community-based services to children, young adults and families, including its summer food program, therapy programs, housing and shelter resources and child well-being supports. The nonprofit began service in 1977.

#### **Statewide Constitutional Amendments and General Obligation Bonds**

To better inform the public about the important statewide questions on the ballot, before each General Election the New Mexico Secretary of State publishes the text of the proposed constitutional amendments and general obligation bonds. Voters can use this publication to research and better understand these questions before voting. Visit NMVOTE.ORG for more information and resources about the upcoming General Election.

#### IMPORTANT DATES FOR THE 2022 GENERAL ELECTION:

October 11: Voter registration (by mail or online) closes.

October 11: First day that absentee ballots can be mailed to voters (who have submitted an absentee application), and first day of early voting and same day registration (at the county clerk's office).

October 22: Expanded early voting begins at alternate voting locations. Same day registration is available at certain polling locations, please reach out to your county clerk for more information.

November 3: Last day to request an absentee ballot.

November 5: Last day of early voting.

November 8: General Election Day, same day registration is available at all locations across the state.

#### **Constitutional Amendment 1:**

Proposing an amendment to Article 12, Section 7 of the Constitution of New Mexico to provide for additional annual distributions of the permanent school fund for enhanced instruction for students at risk of failure, extending the school year, teacher compensation and early childhood education; requiring congressional approval for distributions for early childhood education.

#### Constitutional Amendment 2:

Proposing to amend Article 9, Section 14 of the Constitution of New Mexico to allow public investment to provide access to essential household services, including internet, energy, water, wastewater and other similar services as provided by law, upon the enactment of general implementing legislation by a majority vote of the members elected to each house of the Legislature.

#### **Constitutional Amendment 3:**

Proposing to amend Article 6, Section 35 of the Constitution of New Mexico to provide that an appointed judge serve at least one year before a general election is held for the office to which the judge was appointed.

#### Bond Question 1

The 2022 Capital Projects General Obligation Bond Act authorizes the issuance and sale of senior citizen facility improvement, construction and equipment acquisition bonds. Shall the state be authorized to issue general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed twenty-four million four hundred seventy thousand dollars (\$24,470,000) to make capital expenditures for certain senior citizen facility improvement, construction and equipment acquisition projects and provide for a general property tax imposition and levy for the payment of principal of, interest on and expenses incurred in connection with the issuance of the bonds and the collection of the tax as permitted by law?

#### **Bond Question 2**

The 2022 Capital Projects General Obligation Bond Act authorizes the issuance and sale of library acquisition bonds. Shall the state be authorized to issue general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed nineteen million two hundred sixty-six thousand dollars (\$19,266,000) to make capital expenditures for academic, public school, tribal and public library resource acquisitions and provide for a general property tax imposition and levy for the payment of principal of, interest on and expenses incurred in connection with the issuance of the bonds and the collection of the tax as permitted by law?

#### **Bond Question 3**

The 2022 Capital Projects General Obligation Bond Act authorizes the issuance and sale of higher education, special schools and tribal schools capital improvement and acquisition bonds. Shall the state be authorized to issue general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed two hundred fifteen million nine hundred eighty-six

thousand dollars (\$215,986,000) to make capital expenditures for certain higher education, special schools and tribal schools capital improvements and acquisitions and provide for a general property tax imposition and levy for the payment of principal of, interest on and expenses incurred in connection with the issuance of the bonds and the collection of the tax as permitted by law?

A JOINT RESOLUTION PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE 12, SECTION 7 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF NEW MEXICO TO PROVIDE FOR ADDITIONAL ANNUAL DISTRIBUTIONS OF THE PERMANENT SCHOOL FUND FOR ENHANCED INSTRUCTION FOR STUDENTS AT RISK OF FAILURE, EXTENDING THE SCHOOL YEAR, TEACHER COMPENSATION AND EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION; REQUIRING CONGRESSIONAL APPROVAL FOR DISTRIBUTIONS FOR EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. It is proposed to amend Article 12, Section 7 of the constitution of New Mexico to read: "A. As used in this section, "land grant permanent funds" means the permanent school fund described in Article 12, Section 2 of this constitution and all other permanent funds derived from lands granted or confirmed to the state by the act of congress of June 20, 1910, entitled "An act to enable the people of New Mexico to form a constitution and state government and be admitted into the union on an equal footing with the original states.".

B. The land grant permanent funds shall be invested by the state investment officer in accordance with policy rules promulgated by the state investment council.

C. In making investments, the state investment officer, under the supervision of the state investment council, shall invest and manage the land grant permanent funds in accordance with the Uniform Prudent Investor Act.

D. The legislature may establish criteria for investing the land grant permanent funds if the criteria are enacted by a three-fourths' vote of the members elected to each house, but investment of the land grant permanent funds is subject to the following restrictions: (1) not more than sixty-five percent of the book value of the land grant permanent funds shall be invested at any given time in corporate stocks; (2) not more than ten percent of the voting stock of a corporation shall be held; and (3) stocks eligible for purchase shall be restricted to those stocks of businesses listed upon a national stock exchange or included in a nationally recognized list of stocks.

E. All additions to the land grant permanent funds and all earnings, including interest, dividends and capital gains from investment of the land grant permanent funds shall be credited to the land grant permanent funds.

F. The annual distributions from the land grant permanent funds to the beneficiaries specified in the Ferguson Act and the Enabling Act shall be five percent of the average of the year-end market values of the land grant permanent funds for the immediately preceding five calendar years.

G. In addition to the annual distributions made pursuant to Subsection F of this section, unless suspended pursuant to Subsection J of this section, an annual distribution of one and one-fourth percent of the average of the year-end market value of the permanent school fund for the immediately preceding five calendar years shall be made as provided in Subsection H of this section; provided that the additional distribution shall not be made in any fiscal year if the average of the year-end market values of the land grant permanent funds for the immediately preceding five calendar years is less than seventeen billion dollars (\$17,000,000,000).

H. Unless suspended pursuant to Subsection G or J of this section, the additional distribution from the permanent school fund provided for in Subsection G of this section shall be as follows and as provided by law: (1) forty percent of the additional distribution shall be for the public school permanent fund beneficiary for enhanced instruction for students at risk of failure, extending the school year and public school teacher compensation; and (2) sixty percent of the additional distribution shall be for the provision of early childhood education.

I. As used in this section, "early childhood education" means nonsectarian and nondenominational education for children until they are eligible for kindergarten.

J. The legislature, by a three-fifths' vote of the members elected to each house, may suspend any additional distribution provided for in Subsection G of this section."

SECTION 2. The amendment proposed by this resolution shall be submitted to the people for their approval or rejection at the next general election or at any special election prior to that date that may be called for that purpose.

SECTION 3. The distribution provided for in Paragraph (2) of Subsection H of Section 7 of Article 12 of the consti-

tution of New Mexico shall not become effective without the consent of congress.

A JOINT RESOLUTION PROPOSING TO AMEND ARTICLE 9, SECTION 14 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF NEW MEXICO TO ALLOW PUBLIC INVESTMENT TO PROVIDE ACCESS TO ESSENTIAL HOUSEHOLD SERVICES, INCLUDING INTERNET, ENERGY, WATER, WASTEWATER AND OTHER SIMILAR SERVICES AS PROVIDED BY LAW, UPON THE ENACTMENT OF GENERAL IMPLEMENTING LEGISLATION BY A MAJORITY VOTE OF THE MEMBERS ELECTED TO EACH HOUSE OF THE LEGISLATURE.

#### BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. It is proposed to amend Article 9, Section 14 of the constitution of New Mexico to read: "Neither the state nor any county, school district or municipality, except as otherwise provided in this constitution, shall directly or indirectly lend or pledge its credit or make any donation to or in aid of any person, association or public or private corporation or in aid of any private enterprise for the construction of any railroad except as provided in Subsections A through H of this section.

A. Nothing in this section prohibits the state or any county or municipality from making provision for the care and maintenance of sick and indigent persons.

B. Nothing in this section prohibits the state from establishing a veterans' scholarship program for Vietnam conflict veterans who are post-secondary students at educational institutions under the exclusive control of the state by exempting such veterans from the payment of tuition. For the purposes of this subsection, a "Vietnam conflict veteran" is any person who has been honorably discharged from the armed forces of the United States, who was a resident of New Mexico at the original time of entry into the armed forces from New Mexico or who has lived in New Mexico for ten years or more and who has been awarded a Vietnam campaign medal for service in the armed forces of this country in Vietnam during the period from August 5, 1964 to the official termination date of the Vietnam conflict as designated by executive order of the president of the United States.

C. The state may establish by law a program of loans to students of the healing arts, as defined by law, for residents of the state who, in return for the payment of educational expenses, contract with the state to practice their profession for a period of years after graduation within areas of the state designated by law.

D. Nothing in this section prohibits the state or a county or municipality from creating new job opportunities by providing land, buildings or infrastructure for facilities to support new or expanding businesses if this assistance is granted pursuant to general implementing legislation that is approved by a majority vote of those elected to each house of the legislature. The implementing legislation shall include adequate safeguards to protect public money or other resources used for the purposes authorized in this subsection. The implementing legislation shall further provide that: (1) each specific county or municipal project providing assistance pursuant to this subsection need not be approved by the legislature but shall be approved by the county or municipality pursuant to procedures provided in the implementing legislation; and (2) each specific state project providing assistance pursuant to this subsection shall be approved by law.

E. Nothing in this section prohibits the state, or the instrumentality of the state designated by the legislature as the state's housing authority, or a county or a municipality from: (1) donating or otherwise providing or paying a portion of the costs of land for the construction on it of affordable housing; (2) donating or otherwise providing or paying a portion of the costs of construction or renovation of affordable housing or the costs of conversion or renovation of buildings into affordable housing; or (3) providing or paying the costs of financing or infrastructure necessary to support affordable housing projects.

F. The provisions of Subsection E of this section are not self-executing. Before the described assistance may be provided, enabling legislation shall be enacted by a majority vote of the members elected to each house of the legislature. This enabling legislation shall: (1) define "affordable housing"; (2) establish eligibility criteria for the recipients of land, buildings and infrastructure; (3) contain provisions to ensure the successful completion of affordable housing projects supported by assistance authorized pursuant to Subsection E of this section; (4) require a county or municipality providing assistance pursuant to Subsection E of this section to give prior formal approval by ordinance for a specific affordable housing assistance grant and include in the ordinance the conditions of the grant; (5) require prior approval by law of an affordable housing assistance grant by the state; and (6) require the governing body of the instrumentality of the state, designated by the legislature as the state's housing authority, to give prior approval, by resolution, for affordable housing grants that are to be given by the instrumentality.

G. Nothing in this section prohibits the state from establishing a veterans' scholarship program, for military war veterans who are post-secondary students at educational institutions under the exclusive control of the state and who have exhausted all educational benefits offered by the United States department of defense or the United States department of veterans affairs, by exempting such veterans from the payment of tuition. For the

purposes of this subsection, a "military war veteran" is any person who has been honorably discharged from the armed forces of the United States, who was a resident of New Mexico at the original time of entry into the armed forces or who has lived in New Mexico for ten years or more and who has been awarded a southwest Asia service medal, global war on terror service medal, Iraq campaign medal, Afghanistan campaign medal or any other medal issued for service in the armed forces of this country in support of any United States military campaign or armed conflict as defined by congress or by presidential executive order or any other campaign medal issued for service after August 1, 1990 in the armed forces of the United States during periods of armed conflict as defined by congress or by executive order.

H. Nothing in this section prohibits the state from expending state funds or resources for the purpose of providing essential services primarily for residential purposes if the assistance is granted pursuant to general implementing legislation approved by a majority vote of those elected to each house of the legislature. The implementing legislation shall provide for accessibility to essential services primarily for residential purposes and include safeguards to protect public money and other public resources used for the purposes authorized in this subsection. As used in this subsection, "essential services" means infrastructure that allows internet, energy, water, wastewater or other similar services as provided by law."

SECTION 2. The amendment proposed by this resolution shall be submitted to the people for their approval or rejection at the next regular election or at any special election prior to that date that may be called for that purpose.

A JOINT RESOLUTION PROPOSING TO AMEND ARTICLE 6, SECTION 35 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF NEW MEXICO TO PROVIDE THAT AN APPOINTED JUDGE SERVE AT LEAST ONE YEAR BEFORE A GENERAL ELECTION IS HELD FOR THE OFFICE TO WHICH THE JUDGE WAS APPOINTED.

#### BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. It is proposed to amend Article 6. Section 35 of the constitution of New Mexico to read: "There is created the "appellate judges nominating commission", consisting of: the chief justice of the supreme court or the chief justice's designee from the supreme court; two judges of the court of appeals appointed by the chief judge of the court of appeals; the governor, the speaker of the house of representatives and the president pro tempore of the senate shall each appoint two persons, one of whom shall be an attorney licensed to practice law in this state and the other who shall be a citizen who is not licensed to practice law in any state: the dean of the university of New Mexico school of law, who shall serve as chair of the commission and shall vote only in the event of a tie vote; four members of the state bar of New Mexico, representing civil and criminal prosecution and defense, appointed by the president of the state bar and the judges on the commission. The appointments shall be made in such manner that each of the two largest major political parties, as defined by the Election Code, shall be equally represented on the commission. If necessary, the president of the state bar and the judges on the commission shall make the minimum number of additional appointments of members of the state bar as is necessary to make each of the two largest major political parties be equally represented on the commission. These additional members of the state bar shall be appointed such that the diverse interests of the state bar are represented. The dean of the university of New Mexico school of law shall be the final arbiter of whether such diverse interests are represented. Members of the commission shall be appointed for terms as may be provided by law. If a position on the commission becomes vacant for any reason, the successor shall be selected by the original appointing authority in the same manner as the original appointment was made and shall serve for the remainder of the term vacated.

The commission shall actively solicit, accept and evaluate applications from qualified lawyers for the position of justice of the supreme court or judge of the court of appeals and may require an applicant to submit any information it deems relevant to the consideration of the application.

Upon the occurrence of an actual vacancy in the office of justice of the supreme court or judge of the court of appeals, the commission shall meet within thirty days and within that period submit to the governor the names of persons qualified for the judicial office and recommended for appointment to that office by a majority of the commission.

Immediately after receiving the commission nominations, the governor may make one request of the commission for submission of additional names, and the commission shall promptly submit such additional names if a majority of the commission finds that additional persons would be qualified and recommends those persons for appointment to the judicial office. The governor shall fill a vacancy or appoint a successor to fill an impending vacancy in the office of justice of the supreme court or judge of the court of appeals within thirty days after receiving final nominations from the commission by appointing one of the persons nominated by the commission for appointment to that office. If the governor fails to make the appointment within that period or from those nominations, the appointment shall be made from those nominations by the chief justice or the acting chief justice of the supreme court. The person appointed shall serve until the first general election following one year

after appointment. The appointee's successor shall be chosen at such election and shall hold the office until the expiration of the term in effect at the time of election."

SECTION 2. The amendment proposed by this resolution shall be submitted to the people for their approval or rejection at the next general election or at any special election prior to that date that may be called for that purpose.

AN ACT RELATING TO GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS; AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF CAPITAL PROJECTS GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS TO MAKE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES FOR SENIOR CITIZEN FACILITY IMPROVEMENTS, CONSTRUCTION AND ACQUISITIONS, FOR LIBRARY ACQUISITIONS AND FOR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS AND ACQUISITIONS AT INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION, STATE SPECIAL SCHOOLS AND TRIBAL SCHOOLS; PROVIDING FOR A PROPERTY TAX LEVY FOR PAYMENT OF PRINCIPAL OF, INTEREST ON AND CERTAIN COSTS RELATED TO THE BONDS; REQUIRING APPROVAL OF THE REGISTERED VOTERS AT THE 2022 GENERAL ELECTION OF THE STATE; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.--This act may be cited as the "2022 Capital Projects General Obligation Bond Act".

SECTION 2. PURPOSE.--For the purpose of providing funds for capital expenditures as authorized in the 2022 Capital Projects General Obligation Bond Act, general obligation indebtedness of the state is authorized for the purposes and in the amounts set forth in Section 10 of that act.

SECTION 3. BOND TERMS.--

A. The state board of finance, except as limited by the 2022 Capital Projects General Obligation Bond Act, shall determine the terms, covenants and conditions of bonds issued pursuant to that act, including: (1) date or dates of issue, denominations and maturities; (2) principal amounts; (3) rate or rates of interest; and (4) provisions for redemption, including premiums, registration and refundability, whether the bonds are issued in one or more series and other covenants relating to the bonds and the issuance thereof.

B. The bonds shall be in such form as the state board of finance determines with an appropriate series designation and shall bear interest payable as set forth in the resolution of the state board of finance.

C. Payment of the principal of the bonds shall begin not more than two years after the date of their issuance, and the bonds shall mature not later than ten years after the date of their issuance. Both principal and interest shall be payable in lawful money of the United States at the office of the paying agent within or without the state as the state board of finance may direct.

D. The bonds shall be executed with the manual or facsimile signature of the governor or the state treasurer, and the seal or a facsimile of the seal of the state shall be placed on each bond, except for any series of bonds issued in book entry or similar form without the delivery of physical securities.

E. The bonds shall be issued in accordance with the provisions of the 2022 Capital Projects General Obligation Bond Act, the Supplemental Public Securities Act and the Uniform Facsimile Signature of Public Officials Act and may be issued in accordance with the Public Securities Short-Term Interest Rate Act.

F. The full faith and credit of the state is pledged for the prompt payment when due of the principal of and interest on all bonds issued and sold pursuant to the 2022 Capital Projects General Obligation Bond Act.

SECTION 4. EXPENDITURES.--The proceeds from the sale of the bonds shall be expended solely for providing money to be distributed for the purposes and in amounts not to exceed the amounts set forth in Section 10 of the 2022 Capital Projects General Obligation Bond Act and to pay expenses incurred under Section 6 of that act. Any proceeds from the sale of the bonds that are not required for the purposes set forth in Sections 6 and 10 of that act shall be used for the purpose of paying the principal of and interest on the bonds.

SECTION 5. SALE.—The bonds authorized under the 2022 Capital Projects General Obligation Bond Act shall be sold by the state board of finance at such time and in such manner and amounts as the board may elect. The bonds may be sold at private sale or at public sale, in either case at not less than par plus accrued interest to the date of delivery. If sold at public sale, the state board of finance shall publish a notice of the time and place of sale in a newspaper of general circulation in the state and may also publish the notice in a recognized financial journal outside the state. The required publications shall be made once each week for two consecutive weeks prior to the date fixed for the sale, the last publication thereof to be at least five days prior to the date of the sale. The notice shall specify the amount, denomination, maturity and description of the bonds to be offered

for sale and the place, date and hour at which the sealed bids shall be received. At the time and place specified in the notice, the state board of finance shall open the bids in public and shall award the bonds to the bidder or bidders offering the best price for the bonds. The state board of finance may reject any or all bids and readvertise and may waive any irregularity in a bid. All bids, except that of the state, shall be accompanied by a deposit of two percent of the principal amount of the bonds in a form acceptable to the state board of finance. The deposit of an unsuccessful bidder shall be returned upon rejection of the bid. The state board of finance may also sell the bonds or any part of the bonds to the state treasurer or state investment officer. The state treasurer or state investment officer is authorized to purchase any of the bonds for investment. The bonds are legal investments for any person or board charged with the investment of any public funds and may be accepted as security for any deposit of public money.

SECTION 6. EXPENSES.--The expenses incurred by the state board of finance in or relating to the preparation and sale of the bonds shall be paid out of the proceeds from the sale of the bonds, and all rebate, penalty, interest and other obligations of the state relating to the bonds and bond proceeds under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, shall be paid from earnings on bond proceeds or other money of the state, legally available for such payments.

SECTION 7. PROPERTY TAX LEVY.—To provide for the payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds issued and sold pursuant to the provisions of the 2022 Capital Projects General Obligation Bond Act, there shall be and there is hereby imposed and levied during each year in which any of the bonds are outstanding an ad valorem tax on all property in the state subject to property taxation for state purposes sufficient to pay the interest as it becomes due on the bonds, together with an amount sufficient to provide a sinking fund to pay the principal of the bonds as it becomes due, and, if permitted by law, ad valorem taxes may be collected to pay administrative costs incident to the collection of such taxes. The taxes shall be imposed, levied, assessed and collected at the times and in the manner that other property taxes for state purposes are imposed, levied, assessed and collected. It is the duty of all tax officials and authorities to cause these taxes to be imposed, levied, assessed and collected.

SECTION 8. TREASURER—DUTIES.—The state treasurer shall keep separate accounts of all money collected pursuant to the taxes imposed and levied pursuant to the provisions of the 2022 Capital Projects General Obligation Bond Act and shall use this money only for the purposes of paying the principal of and interest on the bonds as they become due and any expenses relating thereto.

SECTION 9. IRREPEALABLE CONTRACT--AUTHORITY FOR ISSUANCE.—An owner of bonds issued pursuant to the provisions of the 2022 Capital Projects General Obligation Bond Act may, either at law or in equity, by suit, action or mandamus, enforce and compel the performance of the duties required by that act of any officer or entity mentioned in that act. The provisions of that act constitute an irrepealable contract with the owners of any of the bonds issued pursuant to that act for the faithful performance of which the full faith and credit of the state is pledged. Without reference to any other act of the legislature, the 2022 Capital Projects General Obligation Bond Act is full authority for the issuance and sale of the bonds authorized in that act, and such bonds shall have all the qualities of investment securities under the Uniform Commercial Code, shall not be invalid for any irregularity or defect in the proceedings for the issuance and sale of the bonds and shall be incontestable in the hands of bona fide purchasers or holders thereof for value. All bonds issued under the provisions of that act, and the interest thereon, are exempt from taxation by the state and any subdivision or public body thereof.

SECTION 10. PROJECTS.--The proceeds from the sale of bonds issued under the provisions of the 2022 Capital Projects General Obligation Bond Act shall be distributed as follows for the purposes and in the amounts specified:

A. for senior citizen facility improvement, construction and equipment acquisition projects, to the aging and long-term services department: (1) forty thousand one hundred forty-one dollars (\$40,141) to purchase and install meals equipment and other equipment for the Barelas senior center in Albuquerque in Bernalillo county; (2) three hundred seventy-five thousand fifty dollars (\$375,050) to purchase and equip vehicles for the city of Albuquerque senior affairs nutrition and transportation program in Albuquerque in Bernalillo county; (3) three hundred fifty-three thousand three hundred fifty-eight dollars (\$353,358) for renovations to the Highland senior center in Albuquerque in Bernalillo county; (4) two million nine hundred seventy-one thousand four hundred forty-two dollars (\$2,971,442) for renovations to the North Valley senior center in Albuquerque in Bernalillo county; (5) one million dollars (\$1,000,000) for renovations to the Palo Duro senior center in Albuquerque in Bernalillo county; (6) two hundred thirty-five thousand dollars (\$235,000) for renovations to the Raymond G. B. for library acquisitions at public libraries, public school libraries, academic libraries and tribal libraries statewide: (1) to the cultural affairs department: (a) six million dollars (\$6,000,000) for equipment, library furniture, fixtures and supplemental library resource acquisitions, including print, non-print and electronic resources, collaborative library resources and information technology projects, and for the purchase and installation of broadband internet equipment and infrastructure at non-tribal public libraries statewide; and (b) one million dollars (\$1,000,000) for equipment, library furniture, fixtures and supplemental library resource acquisitions, including print, non-print and electronic resources, collaborative library resources and information technology projects, and for the purchase and installation of broadband internet equipment and infrastructure at tribal libraries statewide; (2) to the higher education department, six million dollars (\$6,000,000) for supplemental library resource acquisitions, including books, equipment, electronic resources, collaborative library resources and information technology projects, for academic libraries statewide; and (3) to the public education department, six million dollars (\$6,000,000) for equipment and supplemental library resource acquisitions, including print, non-print and electronic resources, at public school libraries statewide; and

C. for capital improvements and acquisitions at institutions of higher education, special schools and tribal schools statewide: (1) to the board of regents of eastern New Mexico university: (a) two million four hundred seventy-five thousand dollars (\$2,475,000) to plan, design, construct, renovate, purchase and install fire suppression systems for the occupational technology center, physical education center and arts and science center at the Roswell branch campus of eastern New Mexico university in Chaves county; and (b) nine million dollars (\$9,000,000) to plan, design, construct, furnish and equip a new student academic services building at eastern New Mexico university in Portales in Roosevelt county; (2) to the higher education department: (a) fifteen million dollars (\$15,000,000) to plan, design, construct, furnish and equip a trades and applied technologies facility at central New Mexico community college in Albuquerque in Bernalillo county; (b) one million six hundred eighty-five thousand dollars (\$1,685,000) to plan, design and construct infrastructure improvements, including drainage and parking lot improvements, at Clovis community college in Clovis in Curry county; (c) two million one hundred thousand dollars (\$2,100,000) to plan, design, construct, furnish and equip a vocational trades building at New Mexico junior college in Hobbs in Lea county; (d) four million dollars (\$4,000,000) to plan, design, construct, furnish and equip a trades building at Navajo technical university in Crownpoint in McKinley county; (e) five million dollars (\$5,000,000) to plan, design, construct, furnish and equip a student services facility for the south campus at the Shiprock branch campus of Dine college in San Juan county; (f) three million dollars (\$3,000,000) to plan, design, construct, purchase and equip information technology infrastructure upgrades campuswide at San Juan college in Farmington in San Juan county; (g) one million five hundred thousand dollars (\$1,500,000) to plan, design, construct, renovate and equip infrastructure improvements campuswide, including heating, ventilation and air conditioning replacements, at Luna community college in Las Vegas in San

Miguel county; and (h) two million three hundred thousand dollars (\$2,300,000) to plan, design, construct, renovate and equip infrastructure improvements, including heating, ventilation and air conditioning systems in the main and west wing buildings, at Santa Fe community college in Santa Fe county; (3) to the board of regents of the New Mexico school for the blind and visually impaired, four million dollars (\$4,000,000) to plan, design, construct, furnish and equip a residential cottage at the New Mexico school for the blind and visually impaired in Alamogordo in Otero county; (4) to the board of regents of New Mexico highlands university, four million five hundred thousand dollars (\$4,500,000) to plan, design, construct, furnish and equip a facilities building, including abatement and demolition, at New Mexico highlands university in Las Vegas in San Miguel county; (5) to the board of regents of the New Mexico institute of mining and technology: (a) five million dollars (\$5,000,000) to plan, design, construct, renovate and equip infrastructure improvements to the Playas training and research center at the New Mexico institute of mining and technology in Playas in Hidalgo county; and (b) three million three hundred thousand dollars (\$3,300,000) to plan, design, construct, furnish and equip Kelly hall at the New Mexico institute of mining and technology in Socorro in Socorro county; (6) to the board of regents of New Mexico military institute, four million dollars (\$4,000,000) to plan, design, construct, demolish, furnish and equip an expansion to Bates hall at the New Mexico military institute in Roswell in Chaves county; (7) to the board of regents of the New Mexico school for the deaf, one million four hundred thousand dollars (\$1,400,000) to plan, design, construct, renovate, furnish and equip improvements and an addition to the Albuquerque preschool facility for the New Mexico school for the deaf in Albuquerque in Bernalillo county; (8) to the board of regents of New Mexico state university: (a) twenty-two million five hundred thousand dollars (\$22,500,000) to plan, design, construct, furnish and equip a college of engineering facility, including abatement and demolition of Thomas and Brown hall, at New Mexico state university in Las Cruces in Dona Ana county; (b) thirteen million five hundred thousand dollars (\$13,500,000) to plan, design, construct, renovate, furnish and equip the health and social sciences building and O'Donnell hall at New Mexico state university in Las Cruces in Dona Ana county; (c) two million dollars (\$2,000,000) to plan, design, construct, renovate, furnish and equip the school of nursing skills and simulation center in the health and social services building at New Mexico state university in Las Cruces in Dona Ana county; (d) one million three hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$1,350.000) to plan, design, construct, renovate, furnish and equip infrastructure improvements, including roof replacement. at the Dona Ana branch community college campuses of New Mexico state university in Dona Ana county; (e) one million two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$1,250,000) to plan, design, construct, renovate and equip infrastructure improvements, including roof replacement, to Martinez hall at the Grants branch campus of New Mexico state university in Cibola county; and (f) ten million five hundred thousand dollars (\$10,500,000) to plan, design, construct, renovate, furnish and equip, including abatement and demolition, the New Mexico department of agriculture building at New Mexico state university in Las Cruces in Dona Ana county; (9) to the board of regents of northern New Mexico state school, three million dollars (\$3,000,000) to plan, design, construct and repair infrastructure improvements, including parking lots and roads, at the Espanola and El Rito campuses of northern New Mexico state school in Rio Arriba county; (10) to the board of regents of the university of New Mexico: (a) forty-five million dollars (\$45,000,000) to plan, design, construct, furnish and equip a new center for collaborative art and technology at the university of New Mexico in Albuquerque in Bernalillo county; (b) thirty-six million dollars (\$36,000,000) to plan, design, construct, renovate, furnish and equip a children's psychiatric center for the health sciences center at the university of New Mexico in Albuquerque in Bernalillo county; (c) three million dollars (\$3,000,000) to plan, design, construct, renovate and equip infrastructure improvements to Gurley hall at the Gallup branch campus of the university of New Mexico in McKinley county; (d) one million three hundred thousand dollars (\$1,300,000) to plan, design, construct, renovate, furnish and equip infrastructure improvements campuswide at the Los Alamos branch campus of the university of New Mexico in Los Alamos county; (e) three million dollars (\$3,000,000) to plan, design, construct, renovate, furnish and equip renovations and an addition to Fred Peralta hall at the Taos branch campus of the university of New Mexico in Taos county; and (f) nine hundred thousand dollars (\$900,000) to plan, design, construct, renovate, furnish and install improvements, including roof replacement and solar installation, to the learning commons resource center at the Valencia branch campus of the university of New Mexico in Valencia county; and (11) to the board of regents of western New Mexico university: (a) two million dollars (\$2,000,000) to plan, design, construct, furnish and equip a Deming learning center at western New Mexico university in Deming in Luna county; and (b) two million dollars (\$2,000,000) to plan, design, construct, renovate, furnish and equip infrastructure improvements, including roadway improvements to Kentucky street, at western New Mexico university in Silver City in Grant county.

#### SECTION 11. ELECTION .--

A. Bonds issued pursuant to the 2022 Capital Projects General Obligation Bond Act shall be submitted to the registered voters of the state at the general election to be held in November 2022, and, if they receive a majority of all the votes cast thereon at such election, shall take effect upon certification of the state canvassing board announcing the results of the election. No bonds shall be issued or sold under that act until the registered voters of this state have voted upon and approved the bonds and property tax as provided in this section. Any bonds issued under that act shall be issued within thirty months from the date of such election.

B. The ballots used at the 2022 general election shall contain substantially the following language:

C. Each question set forth in this section includes a specific work or object to be financed by the bonds. The failure of a question to be approved by the electorate at the 2022 general election shall not affect those questions that are approved at the election.

D. The secretary of state shall include the submission of the capital projects general obligation bonds to the people at the 2022 general election, and it shall be included in the general election proclamation. The secretary of state shall cause the 2022 Capital Projects General Obligation Bond Act to be published in full in at least one newspaper in each county of the state if one be published therein, once each week, for four successive weeks next preceding the general election as required by the constitution of New Mexico.

SECTION 12. ART IN PUBLIC PLACES.--Pursuant to Section 13-4A-4 NMSA 1978 and where applicable, the appropriations authorized in the 2022 Capital Projects General Obligation Bond Act include money for the art in public places fund.

#### SECTION 13. PROJECT SCOPE--EXPENDITURES--REVERSION.--

A. If an appropriation for a project authorized in the 2022 Capital Projects General Obligation Bond Act is not sufficient to complete all the purposes specified, the appropriation may be expended for any portion of the purposes specified in the appropriation. Expenditures shall not be made for purposes other than those specified in the appropriation.

B. The state agencies and state institutions to which money has been appropriated in the 2022 Capital Projects General Obligation Bond Act shall be responsible for monitoring the projects funded in that act to ensure compliance with the constitution and laws of New Mexico and shall cause to be reverted any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the earlier of the third full fiscal year after issuance of the bonds or the termination or completion of the specific project. Reverted funds shall be deposited in the debt service fund established by the state treasurer for the purpose of paying the principal of and interest on the state's general obligation bonds.

SECTION 14. SEVERABILITY.--If any part or application of the 2022 Capital Projects General Obligation Bond Act is held invalid, the remainder or its application to other situations or persons shall not be affected.

SECTION 15. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.

#### "MACK & RITA"


Though many age-switching comedies make their central characters younger – think

# Border Archives Bazaar Oct. 22 at NMFRHM

The Border Archives Bazaar is a "fun and educational event that brings visitors face to face with fascinating historical materials from the border region, the Border Regional Archives Group (BRAG) said in a news release.

The event will include "rare documents, photographs, maps, publications and more, that highlight the unique history and cultural heritage of our region," said BRAG, which organized the bazaar.

The sixth annual bazaar will be 10 a.m.-4 p.m. Saturday, Oct. 22, at New Mexico Farm and Ranch Heritage Museum, 4100 Dripping Springs Road. There is no charge to attend.

BRAG is "an informal

organization made up of people who work with archival materials in southern New Mexico. west Texas and northern Chihuahua," said BRAG member Dennis Daily, head of the Archives and Special Collections Department at New Mexico State University. "We operate to support one another, to bring greater awareness of archives and history to the community and ultimately to ensure that we are better able to serve researchers on their quest for information about our cultural heritage," Daily said.

#### **Bridges to the Past**

The theme of this year's bazaar is "Puentes al Pasado" (Bridges to the Past), which BRAG said highlights the role archives play as bridges from the present to the past.

"The event brings together resources from more than a dozen libraries, archives and museums of the southern New Mexico, west Texas and the borderlands," BRAG said. # Changes in the air for Project in Motion

## New director has high hopes for aerial dance company

"For 23 years, we've done community dance," Project in Motion (PIM) founder and long-time director Hillary McDaniel said, as she steps aside as from her leadership role to join a writing program at Queens University in Belfast, Ireland.

But McDaniel is not leaving things up in the air (well, sort of) for the aerial dance company, as former PIM danceraerialist Lauren Sosa has taken over as executive and artistic director.

PIM actually began in Indianapolis in 1999. Mc-Daniel brought it to Las Cruces in 2001, forming the professional company in 2005. The nonprofit makes its home in the old cotton gin at 430 N. Compress Road less than a mile west of downtown Las Cruces and a little north of the 35-acre site where California-based 828 Productions will build a movie studio.

"We're right where we need to be," said Sosa, an

El Paso native who joined PIM in 2011. She was a company member for six years before leaving Las Cruces for three years to dance and teach in Las Vegas, Nevada and travel across the country.

Sosa also performed with an aerial dance company in Austin, Texas, and in plays and ballets in El Paso. She has a bachelor's degree in dance performance from New Mexico State University.

Sosa returned as PIM assistant artistic director in 2020 and is excited to take the reins at PIM as the community it serves comes fully out of Covid-19.

"Las Cruces is ready to support the arts in a way that maybe it hadn't in the past," she said.

It's great to see her come into (the PIM leadership) position," McDaniel said of Sosa. "She knows the community. She cares about the community."

The cotton gin's 45foot ceilings make it "the perfect spot for us," Sosa said. "The art itself draws people in."

"It's easy to teach dancers to climb," McDaniel

PIM's training and performance space has also attracted "all sorts of athletes that have elected to come into our tutorial slots and apprentice," she said, along with jugglers and even physical therapists.

Las Cruces-Mesilla "is a very creative community," McDaniel said. That sense of community is what she



## 'The American Experience' premieres

Las Cruces photographer and filmmaker Manfred Schreyer premiered his film "The American Experience 2021" to an enthusiastic crowd at the Fountain Theatre in Mesilla in late September.

"What do people actually know and what do we hold as the truth?" Schreyer asked at the event.

"There is no objective truth. So how do we arrive at truth? What knowledge do we have as Americans?"

The film includes Schreyer's questions about Covid-19, politics, history and business to average citizens in Las Cruces and as far away as New York City, New Orleans, as he traveled 19,000 miles across 48 states in 10 months in 2021 to shoot the film and collect photographs "of people, circumstances, landscapes, etc. of our nation" for his book with the same name as the movie.

The project is "a time capsule of 2021," Schreyer said. "This is who we are."

"The American Experi-

ence" has won awards and recognition from the New York Movie Awards, Stanley Film Awards, 195 Countries Film Festival, Florence Film Awards, Docuworld Film Festival, Roshani International Film Festival. Best Istanbul Film Festival, IndieFEST Film Awards, New Filmmakers New Orleans, Atlanta Movie Awards, International World Film Awards, Nawada International Film Festival and Montreal Arthouse Film Festival.

Going forward, Schreyer said he is exploring a number of options for his documentary, including negotiating with a professional movie/cinema distributor and submitting the film to a clearing house that will then distribute it to streaming services.

A native of Germany, Schreyer was a high school exchange student to the U.S. in 1975-76 and immigrated here in 1984. He moved to Las Cruces from Ohio more than four years ago.

A freelance photojournalist and web designer, Schreyer is the creator of Mirage Art Photography.





## NMSU WERC ENVIRONMENTAL DESIGN CONTEST: Follow Up

Las Cruces Utilities (LCU) was a proud co-sponsor of the 32nd WERC Environmental Design Contest organized by the College of Engineering at New Mexico State University (NMSU). This year was the first time in 3 years that the event was held in person due to the COVID-19 Pandemic. The turnout showed the excitement of teams coming together with 21 teams from 9 universities totaling 161 participants. Even more encouraging this year is that 50% of participants were females.

"Statistically one third of all STEM graduates and students are female showing how incredible a turn out of 50% of participants being female is," WERC Environmental Design Contest Program Manager Dr. Ginger Scarbrough stated.

The WERC Contest offers six engineering challenges in total. "We design this as a workforce development opportunity, keeping in mind what industry engineering firms ask for when putting out their request for proposals," Scarbrough pointed out. Task 2 this year was sponsored by LCU and El Paso Electric Co. and focused on Carbon Conversion for the Energy Transition. The main challenge was to find a way to repurpose the CO2 that is captured after burning natural gas at a power plant.

The teams were judged on the quality of their written reports and presentations, how well their bench-scale models perform, and whether their plan for commercialization is viable. LCU was able to send Interim Utilities Director Adrienne Widmer and Utilities Deputy Director Natural Gas and Energy Lucio Garcia to serve as two of the judges this year.

"This was my first year participating in the contest as a judge and I was impressed and

awed by the students and their unique designs," LCU Interim Utilities Director Adrienne L. Widmer, P. E. stated. "This was a rewarding experience for me to assist NMSU WERC and I look forward to participating in the future," Widmer concluded.

of eliminating the CO2

from a power plant. They received second place for Task 2 and walked away with a \$1,000 cash reward for their efforts.

The first-place winner was the University of Idaho. This team converted CO2 into two commercially useful chemicals: one is used as a catalyst in pharmaceuticals with a market value of \$9/lb. and the other, used for fabric dying, has a current market value of \$0.73/lb. They predict the return on investment for the pharmaceutical catalyst to be 1160% over 10 years of production. The potential success of their process prompted them to file for a patent. The team was awarded the first-place prize of \$2,500 for the quality of their research and potential for producing a marketable product.

This year's contest showed great innovation in the industry, growth in diversity, and excitement for collaboration and teamwork with industry professionals. Everyone is eager to start their research for next year's WERC contest.



## Reynolds seeks second term on commission

Being a county commissioner is "a full-time job," said Shannon Reynolds, a Democrat seeking his second four-year term on the Doña Ana County Commission in the November general election.

Reynolds said he has kept a full calendar throughout his nearly four years on the commission, often working 12-hour days representing a district that includes part of Las Cruces and residents and communities in the southeastern part of the county.

Reynolds said part of the reason he decided to seek re-election was encouragement from his wife, Maggie, who told him, 'You've still got too much to do. There are people in the county who count on you."

Among commission accomplishments during his

first term, Reynolds listed:

• The county has allocated more than \$8 mil-



lion to assist more than 1,500 families with rent, mortgage and utilities payments, with another \$7 million in federal assistance to continue until 2025 and an additional \$4 million coming in state assistance.

- Doña Ana County was the first county in the state to pass an emergency declaration because of COVID-19, giving the county access to FEMA reimbursement funds.
- The county has expanded bus service from Las Cruces south to El Paso, east to Alamogordo and north to Hatch, Rincon, Radium Springs

and Doña Ana; approving a \$4 million. "We have more to do," Reynolds said, including getting bus service to Truth or Consequences, which would give county residents direct connection to the New Mexico State Veterans' Home. He would also like the county to extend bus service from Chaparral to Alamogordo, Reynolds said. "Seriously improving transportation so everyone in the county has reliable, free access so they can get where they need to be" is a top priority for his second term, Reynolds said.

• The county entered into a \$4 million contract to install fiber conduits from Hatch to Las Cruces. The county is "moving in the right direction" in infrastructure development, Reynolds said, but added he is concerned not all students in the county "have good connectivity."

Improving internet access in the county is his top priority for state funds allocated to the county, Reynolds said.

- County "fire service is getting better as promised," Reynolds said.
  County ISO ratings, which help determine insurance rates, were improved from a 10 (no service) in some areas to a 5-7 during his first year in office, Reynolds said. County Fire Chief Shannon Cherry is "doing a fantastic job," he said.
- The county has invested millions of dollars in improvements and job growth in Santa Teresa, Reynolds said. Under the leadership of Border Industrial Alliance President Jerry Pacheco and others, Santa Teresa is "relocating the economic center of commerce from northern New Mexico to the southern part of the

state," Reynolds said. Pacheco and leaders from the county, the state, the U.S., Mexico and the Mesilla Valley Economic Development Alliance (MVEDA) "know what the opportunity is and they're committed to it," he said. The county Jetport in Santa Teresa has received millions of dollars in county, state and federal investment, Reynolds said. Santa Teresa, he said, "has the potential to become the No. 1 border crossing in America."

- The gross county product has grown from \$3.52 billion to more than \$4.84 billion (37.5 percent) since 2018, Reynolds said.
- Using 2020 census data, Reynolds said he worked with a county contractor to ensure the redistricting of county commission districts "more reflected the culture of the representative population." As

a result, he said, with a county population that is 65.7 percent Hispanic, all five commission districts now have a majority of Hispanic residents.

· While serving as Spaceport America regional district chair, Reynolds said a renegotiation of bonds saved the county more than \$8 million finance and other charges. Reynolds said he would like Spaceport, located in Rincon in northern Doña Ana County, become a selfsustaining entity and "the premiere spaceport in the United States." The county has received gross receipts tax revenue from Spaceport, he said, but "should not bear the brunt" of its construction and other costs.

"I represent the people of the county," Reynolds said. "I do what is best for every person in the county."

FMP will target sheetconverting plants in the southwestern United States and the maquiladoras and Mexican domestic market.

• Organ Mountain Wellness LLC (OMW), Las Cruces, one trainee with a wage of \$38 for a total award of \$22,986. OMW is a family-owned military veteran team providing recreational cannabis products for adults 21 or older.

• Stampede Meat, Inc., Sunland Park, 97 trainees with an average wage of \$14.98 for a total award of \$755,590.

Stampede Meat creates seasoned and prepared value-added meats, portion cuts and a variety of fully cooked meats that serves numerous national food chains, restaurants and other markets.

## Kimble challenges for Dist. 3 spot in county

Republican Patricia S. "Susie" Kimble is making her first bid for elective office as she challenges incumbent Democrat Shannon Reynolds for the District 3 seat on the Doña Ana County Commission in the Nov. 8 general election.

Kimball, who has lived in Las Cruces since 1986, said her nearly 20 years' experience in behavioral health care would be an asset to the commission, especially as it considers how to spend millions of dollars the county received through the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA).

Kimble has been a member of the Governor's Behavioral Health Planning Council since 2005. The council advises the governor, legislature and state Behavioral Health Collaborative.

Kimble was appointed to the council by Gov. Bill Richardson, a Democrat, and re-

appointed by Gov. Susana Martinez, a Republican, and Democrat Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham.

Kimble is also president of the New America School of Las Cruces Governing Council.

Kimble wants to "help make the right decisions" for the county Triage Crisis Center (CTC) so it can "do the best for the most people."

CTC has served about 1,000 voluntary clients since it opened in 2021, Kimble said, but is underutilized.

Kimble said she would like to see state law changed to allow CTC to

accept involuntary clients and to extend clients' maximum stay from the current 23 hours to two weeks. Kimble said she would also like to see CTC expand its community partnerships and work with insurance carriers so services can be covered by Medicare and private insurance. Currently, its only funding sources are the county and Medicaid.

"There are several more steps that need to be done," Kimble said.

Kimble said she has been talking to voters throughout the district, which will include parts of the City of Las Cruces and the unincorporated communities of Chaparral and Vado, along with residents of other unincorporated parts of the county, when newly redrawn county commission districts become effective Jan. 1. Chaparral residents "feel really neglected,"

Kimble said.

Chaparral, which straddles Doña Ana and Otero counties, has about 30,000 residents and lacks adequate law enforcement and infrastructure, she said.

Kimble supports making Chaparral its own county. That makes more sense than incorporating as a city, she said, because, as a county, it could collect both gross receipts taxes and property taxes.

The most recent model for creating a county in New Mexico, Kimble said, is Cibola County, which was carved out of Valencia County in 1981. Los Alamos County which was created in 1949 and has "both county and municipal authority and powers," according to www. nmcounties.org/counties/ los-alamos-county, could be another model, she said.

Colonias -- unincorporated, low-income commu-

nities in the county -- also have been neglected, she

"There is so much more need in those unincorporated areas," Kimble said.

There also needs to be better fire and ambulance service and better roads in the southern part of the county, she said, where flood control projects need to be completed.

"You want everybody to succeed," Kimble said.

"My main priority for Doña Ana County is fiscal responsibility for the \$330 million annual budget to ensure that the needs of county residents are met," Kimble said on her campaign website.

Kimble said she also is concerned county officials sometimes are not as responsive to the needs of residents as they should be, and don't always keep them apprised of what the county is doing.

Kimble said the county should also "make it easier for businesses to succeed," to create more jobs and more revenue to help county residents.

The county commission needs a Republican (all five current members are Democrats) for better balance. Kimble said.

"I'm not a far-right, scary kind of Republican," she said.

Former Republican County Commissioner Ben Rawson 'was a great commissioner," Kimble said. "I want to be like him.'

If elected, Kimble said, her door will be open to all county residents.

"Come and talk to me, if you're in my district or not," she said.

"I want to try and make a difference," Kimble said.

Kimble and her husband, Dave (a former county GOP chair) have two grown children and a granddaughter.

## Rates affecting sales

One of the obligations I take seriously in writing this column is to keep our readers up to date on important and breaking golf

As most of you know by now, men's professional golf has been basically thrown into chaos by the introduction of LIV Golf, a brainchild of Greg Norman and financed by the Saudi Public Investment Fund.

I began explaining this in January, just as Norman began buying players from the PGA Tour. In my June 17 column, I covered Phil Mickelson's prominent role in assisting the start-up of LIV Golf, as well as some of the wellknown players who were paid enormous sums for

signing on to LIV Golf, and a willing who were suspended indefinitely by the PGA Tour. On Aug. 26 in my "sport vs. game" article I summarized lawsuits brought by LIV Golf players aimed at the PGA Tour.

Now let's get up to date. On Sept. 28, the PGA Tour filed a lawsuit against LIV Golf seeking damages for lost revenues and reputational harm. With eight players dropping out of the original LIV suit against the PGA Tour only three remain: Matt Jones, Bryson De-Chambeau and Peter Uihlein (son of retired CEO of Titleist), along with LIV Golf, Inc. Writing for si.com/golf, Alex Miceli reports it is the PGA Tour's assertion that "LIV was

participant in convincing players to breach their contracts with the Tour by paying them large sums of money."

In some cases that was in excess of \$100 million. This is a highly complicated case, with one precedent already decided with the U.S. District Court judge in northern California ruling that three LIV players were not entitled to participate in the FedEx Cup playoffs. In both cases, the original LIV Golf antitrust lawsuit, and the PGA

former PGA Tour player and 2018 Masters champion Patrick Reed (now a LIV Golf player) filed a \$750 million lawsuit Aug. 16 in U.S. District Court against golf analyst Brandon Chamblee and the Golf Channel (owned by NBC), alleging they had been "actively targeting Reed since he was 23 years old to destroy his reputation, create hate, and a hostile work environment for him, with the intention to discredit his name and accomplishments."

As of Sept. 28, Reed's attorney has moved the suit from Texas to a Florida court and added Golf Channel personalities Damon Hack, Shane Bacon and Eamon Lynch, as well as Golfweek (magazine) and its parent company, Gannett. Lynch is also a golf writer for USA Today and Golfweek.

As one of golf's leading analysts, Chamblee was highly critical of Reed following a rules incident during the 2019 Hero World Challenge tournament in which Reed was penalized for improving his lie in a sand bunker. Repeated videos of that gave very little doubt. There have been numerous other reports of Reed cheating, dating as far back as his college days at Augusta State.

Reed has claimed Chamblee and The Golf Channel "conspired" with the PGA

Tour and commissioner Jay Monahan to "engage in a pattern and practice of defaming" him.

Meanwhile, there's the issue of possible inclusion of LIV golfers into the Official World Golf Ranking (OWGR) system. Those golfers have not gotten OWGR points since they joined LIV Golf. OWGR points are a critical factor for playing in all four majors.

In mid-September a group of 50 LIV players sent a letter to Peter Dawson, the chairman of the OWGR, seeking that body to quickly consider its application for world ranking points. That letter challenged the "historical


value" of OWGR for every month they are denied. The soonest points could be allowed is the middle of 2023, if ever. The biggest shortcomings for LIV to get points are OWGR rules for a 36-hole cut, no 72-hole events (only 54 holes), and small fields of only 48 play-

Rory McIlroy recently made a public statement that "golf is ripping itself apart."

I disagree.

It is Greg Norman who is disrupting the golf ecosystem, and it may go on for years to come.
