Passenger air service returns to Las Cruces

Passenger air service will return to the Las Cruces International Airport (KLRU) in January 2023, the City of Las Cruces said in a news release.

The announcement comes after the city finalized a twoyear contract that allows Advanced Airlines to provide weekday flights between Las Cruces and Albuquerque.

Advanced Airlines, based in Hawthorne, California, and more commonly referred to as Advanced Air, has agreed to provide seven flights per week – two flights each on Monday and Friday with one flight each day on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday – between Las Cruces and Albuquerque.

"This is a first step toward providing more convenient travel options for Las Crucens," said Airport Administra
Mexico Department of Traportation's rural air service hancement grant. The control requires the city to provide

tor Andy Hume. "We're excited about our new relationship with Advanced Airlines. They will be providing Las Crucens with the same top-notch service as they have for other New Mexico cities."

Advanced Air currently provides service between Silver City and Albuquerque, between Silver City and Phoenix and between Gallup and Phoenix, the city said.

Advanced Air primarily utilizes the Beechcraft Super King Air 350 for its fleet, the news release said. The twin-engine aircraft has a capacity of nine passengers.

The two-year contract includes a total budget of \$3,850,000, including \$1.75 million each year from the New Mexico Department of Transportation's rural air service enhancement grant. The contract requires the city to provide

\$175,000 annually.

KLRU (that's the official airport indicator) last had passenger air service in 2005 with Mesa Airlines.


Hume said the airport would like to explore the possibility of adding passenger air service to Santa Fe and interstate service to Dallas-Ft. Worth and Phoenix.

"Passenger air service has been missing from Las Cruces for nearly 20 years," Hume said. "This new service will help business travelers and opens travel options to connecting flights out of Albuquerque.

"We're excited about the possibilities and that this new ven-

ture will focus more attention on the airport, the growth potential we have and especially with the Las Cruces Innovation and Industrial Park.

"Plain and simple, this provides another travel option for business, health care needs, recreation and tourism," Hume said.



Bourger, who led the project. Phase I of the project began in March 2020 and was completed in

February 2021. But that amount was not ultimately what went to the landfill due to the use of new machines – called flip screens – which screened waste material from clean

soil.

"We were able to reduce waste hauled to the Corralitos Regional Landfill by 40 percent," said Bourger. The types of waste that LCU found were glass, plastic, tires, washer and dryers, and bricks. The final amount sent to the Corralitos Landfill was 29,281 tons.

Phase II of the project began in April 2022 and was completed in November 2022. The phase sorted 53 thousand cubic yards and sent 14,780 tons to Corralitos. The use of two flip screens on this phase reduced

waste by 80 percent and reduced the time by three months.

"In the next several weeks, we will be reseeding the recently excavated area that had been and are currently in the process of writing a completion report for the New Mexico Environment Department Solid Waste Bureau." Bourger said.

Currently, the area is still off-limits to the public. He continued. "The site will go under the management of public works, which will be responsible for continuing the management of the Storm Water **Pollution Prevention** Plan and continuing with the master planning process which the City of Las Cruces will develop for future use."

Bourger is appreciative of those involved in the project. "I'd like to send a shoutout of thanks to the



airplanes for a while.

At the Las Cruces Home Builders Association banquet Dec. 9, he told the assemblage the best way to be successful was through real estate. But I think Eddie owes his success to his nonstop thirst for learning, as well as his ability to get along with people.

At the banquet, Binns was honored for his years serving the LCHBA, of which he was a charter member. LCHBA named its event center Eddie's Event Hall, recognizing things he had done for the organiza-

tion, including the creation of the Home Builders offices and the event center. (See more on Page 9)

After receiving the honor, Binns shared some history of the LCHBA's early years.

There was a time, Binns said, when none of the builders would talk to each other or work together. It was as if they were holding onto secrets. He the audience back to 1957. and conversations between six established home builders and "the kid." The kid was Binns himself, newly married and newly graduated from New Mexico State University, in the last years it was still called New Mexico A&M.

The kid wanted to soak up on

the advice and knowledge he could. In Binns' mind, if all the builders could share their best ideas, evervone would be better

"The ability to find ways to work with others," Binns said, is another key to being successful.

Binns has also applied that to his many charitable efforts.

Another key, he said, is finding the right partner. At that point he pointed to his beloved wife, Bernice.

In his deep, crusty voice, Binns said, "It's a great life as far as I'm concerned. It starts with having a good partner. I picked a great partner, and for 65 years she's put up with my B.S. and my comings and goings."

City can't demand advocates split costs

I was 13 or 14 when I came to the realization that tennis is way cheaper than golf. So, I haven't spent much time in golf clubhouses. But I'm certainly aware that those connected to country clubs have a well-earned reputation for racism and sexism.

The Augusta National Golf Course, where the Masters is played every year, didn't admit its first Black member until 1990 and its first female member until 2012. And so, it's not surprising that when Las Cruces had a country club, it had a similar history.

Now, some in our community want to use that ugly history against the building itself. That doesn't seem right. It's a structure; it's incapable of discrimination.

The local country club closed in 2011, and soon after became an embarrassment on Main

Street, greeting newcomers to our city with untended weeds and unwatered, dead trees for far too long.

Developers are finally ready to make that

property productive again. That will require removal of the clubhouse, which was designed in 1929 by Trost & Trost Architects and Engineers. A permit has been requested for the demolition.

Those who understand historical architecture better than I do say the building is rare and should be preserved. Mayor Ken Miyagishima has concocted an ill-conceived plan to save the building.

He estimates the total cost to be \$290,000, and said the devel-

opers were willing to pay what they had budgeted for demolition, \$40,000. His plan is for the city to split the remaining \$250,000 with those advocating for the building's preservation.

City officials can't ask residents to get involved in local government and then charge them for the issues they advocate for. Would we expect those calling for clean energy to chip in every time the city buys a new electric bus?

At a time when the city budget is growing faster than backyard weeds following three straight days of rain (up by nearly \$16 million this fiscal year), it seems petty to be quibbling over \$125,000.

The larger question is what value does the building have, and what would the total costs be to not only move it but then maintain it. Then, there are

the questions of where to put it and what to do with it. Could it become part of our museum system, or would it just end up being a burden?

City officials must always be aware that any historic structure lost can never be recovered. If they decide the old clubhouse has value and can be put to use, they should pay the full costs for that to happen. If not, they should issue the demolition permit.

Violence as a public health issue

Violence is a widespread, complex public health issue that impacts all of us. Its various forms (intimate partner violence, sexual violence, child abuse and neglect, bullying, teen dating and youth violence, suicidal behavior, elder abuse or neglect and more) are interconnected with overlapping causes.

Learning about the factors that influence violence can help with prevention.

The Division of Violence Prevention of the Center for Disease Control (CDC) for about 40 years, has been doing research to identify what works, bringing together data, science, and action. Their framework uses a four-level model showing the complex interaction among individual, relationship, community, and society factors. In order to prevent violence, it's necessary to act across these multiple levels at the same time. Some of the protective factors the CDC identifies for individuals includes skill

development in solving problems non-violently, assertiveness, and conflict resolution; for relationships, connections to family, a caring adult, and school are critical; at the community support level, employment with living wages, access to mental health and substance abuse services, and coordination of resources and services are essential; at the society level, policies supporting economic, gender and ethnic equity are important. At the federal level, the Violence Against Women Act, reauthorized in March 2022, provides improved prevention and response to sexual violence and expands criminal jurisdiction of Tribal courts to include non-Native perpetrators of sexual assault. People of any gender can be at risk. Another recent federal law ended forced arbitration for sexual assault and harassment, which stops companies from

forcing workers to give up their right to a jury trial with such claims. According to an article in Forbes (March 4, 2022), companies generally prefer arbitration instead of courts, because arbitration is not public and has fewer costs to the business.

In Doña Ana County, we are fortunate to have resources for addressing risk (unemployment, crime, access to guns, prolonged toxic stress and distress, antisocial beliefs, authoritarian attitudes) and protective factors.

The Doña Ana County Resilience Leaders are working to limit adverse childhood experiences (ACEs, trauma and adversity) to ensure children, students, and families are safe. They released a survey for Doña Ana County in 2020, identifying levels of need and access to 10 basic family services. The survey described a number of barriers to accessing the 10 survival services (medical care, behavioral health care, food, housing, transportation, parent supports,

early childhood education, community schools, youth mentors, and job training). They have provided educational events and developed a strategic planning process to guide their mission. There's additional information at www.dacrl.org/reportspublications

The League of Women Voters has positions that support many of the protective factors cited by the CDC. Violence prevention programs need to train childcare providers, teachers, administrators, and coaches; and to be in school curricula. Individuals, businesses, agencies, institutions, and governments need to take a more active roles in preventing violent behavior. There are no easy solutions for preventing violence, but we all have a right to feel and be safe in our families, work, and communities.

DAR installs bee hotels at Farm & Ranch Museum

The Farm and Ranch Heritage Museum in Las Cruces expects an upsurge in visitors due to some new hotels on their premises -- visitors of the multi-legged variety, that is

The Doña Ana Chapter of the New Mexico Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution (NMSDAR) installed five bee hotels at the museum to fulfill their state leader's aspirations to raise awareness of the decline of pollinators. Two hotels stand in the Discovery Garden, with three poised in the proposed Native Plant Garden in front of the vineyard.

Hailed as bee hotels, these distinctive habitats are the culmination of State DAR Regent Patricia Barger's idea to help save the planet. Regent Barger, of Rio Rancho, was in Las Cruces Dec. 10 for the dedication ceremony. Other daughters from across New Mexico joined with Doña Ana DAR for the ceremony at the museum.

"We greatly appreciate the DAR's gift to the

museum and we look forward to including it in the future development of the Discovery Garden," said Heather Reed, the museum's executive director.

One of the museum's goals on its strategic plan is to renovate the Discovery Garden on the northwest side of the building, Reed said.

"This garden will serve as an outside laboratory for our educators to teach school children and host adult workshops with a focus on increasing agricultural literacy," she said. "The DAR's gift of pollinator hotels contributes to the museum's focus of encouraging a greater understanding of how agriculture works and the importance of green space to our community and the state."

"Our planet is in the middle of an insect apocalypse," Barger said. "Pollinators are in crisis and dwindling in numbers due to the loss of critical feeding and nesting habitat."

Her bee hotel project provides nesting habitats for pollinators. Bees are the predominant pollinators, but the hotels should also attract beetles, flies, ants, moths and butterflies, to name just a few.

"The greatest threat to our planet is the belief that someone else will save it," Barger said. The bee hotel project shows that "people can, on a very local scale, do positive things to protect pollinators, as opposed to larger scale environmental issues."

Barger engaged NMS-DAR members to build hotels for pollinators in peril. The Doña Ana chapter is the first NMSDAR chapter in the state to install the hotels.

"We are excited about the hotels," said, Doña Ana Chapter Regent Linda Bartlett. "They help make southern New Mexico a little more hospitable to the dwindling numbers of pollinators, a world-wide problem. Making the hotels successful can definitely raise awareness and 'bee' a community effort."

DAR's national Conservation Committee's mission -- to educate members about pressing environmental issues and to encourage good stewardship practices for a more sustainable future -- is important to today's daughters, Bartlett said.

"There is no special criteria for the building of the hotel," Barger said, "except that it be made of materials found in the pollinators' natural habitat and that the objects be safe and untreated."

Hotels should be securely anchored and raised off the ground a sufficient height so that if there is a heavy rain the bugs are not harmed, Barger said.

The NMSDAR Doña Ana Chapter daughters concluded that a tall hotel, the original goal, would be vulnerable because of the high winds of southern New Mexico, and opted for more small hotels rather than one large one. The hotels are situated in front of native wildflowers.

"If an entire community made small-scale changes like these, the payoff would be widely felt," Barger said. "Ask yourself, 'How can I help bees and other pollinators?""

"We can all fight climate change by adopting sustainability behavior," she said. "Everyone can do their part by planting a diversity of plants so a diversity of pollinators is

attracted. We need to be biodiverse, and we want as many insect residents as possible. We can think creatively about how we manage our own yards and the public land in our communities. The next time you see a pollinator

visiting a flower, know that their species has a better chance at survival with the launch of projects like this," Barger

Ramos: It's a good time to be a teacher, student

"I think the best career in New Mexico right now is to be a teacher," Las Cruces Public Schools Superintendent Ralph Ramos said.

With increases in salaries and benefits teachers received this year, along with the school district's new balanced calendar and other changes, "people are excited to be here," said Ramos, a former teacher, coach and principal who is completing his second year as LCPS superintendent. He has been with LCPS for 28 years.

It's also a pretty good time to be an LCPS student.

Fees have been eliminated for all student activities, Ramos said, technology has "advance(d) 10 years into the future" and schools are more focused than ever on insuring success for both college-bound students and those who are looking for good-paying jobs immediately after they graduate from high school.

"What are we not offering our students?" is a question Ramos has frequently been asking, he said, as he encourages teachers,

administrators and other staff to be innovative as they guide the classroom and extra-curricular activities of about 24,000 students in nearly 40 schools in Las Cruces, Doña Ana and Mesilla and on White Sands Missile Range.

Ramos said LCPS' priorities for the 2023 legislative session will include suf-

ficient funding for transportation for after-school programs; enhanced school safety and security, including gun safety and awareness; behavioral health support; community schools; upgraded career and technical education infrastructure and facilities; and salary and benefits funding support for teachers and other staff.

"Let's keep fighting for those raises," Ramos said.

A major focus for the district is early childhood education, he said. LCPS is serving about 1,600 three- and four-year-olds, he said, but there are nearly four times that number of children who need services.

That's why Ramos said he will ask the legislature to fund early childhood education centers in Las Cruces and southwest New Mexico. Helping children to thrive before they begin school is a critical part of making sure they graduate from high school, he said.

"It starts with teachers

making connections with kids," Ramos said.

It's also about making sure students and staff are safe in their schools and classrooms, the superintendent said.

LCPS is in the process of ensuring that every campus has a six-foot security fence and is also enhancing security by installing secure vestibules in all buildings, Ramos said.

There are school resource officers – armed police officers – at every LCPS middle and high

school, Ramos said, and the New Mexico State Police and Las Cruces Police Department have "adopted" local elementaries, with offices at the schools which they regularly visit.

LCPS schools have "access to law enforcement like never before," he said.

LCPS has a no-tolerance policy for bullying, violence and drug use on school cam-

puses, Ramos said, but the school district is moving away from suspending students in favor of in-school interventions, which are a better way to help them learn from their inappropriate behavior, he said.

Because "everybody needs to grow," Ramos said he supports professional development not only for teachers, but also for administrators, school counselors and custodians.

He would also like to see a stronger connection among all educational institutions that serve students in Doña Ana County, with LCPS, Gadsden Independent School District and Hatch Valley Public Schools, and including school board members from each school district and members of the Doña Ana Community College Advisory Board.

With the new balanced

calendar that added 10 days of instruction and other innovations, LCPS has "a model system in place for others to follow," Ramos said. The school district has a grant for five electric buses, as it begins to change most of its fleet from diesel engines to EV, he said.

And, school technology is on a three-year rotation cycle, Ramos said, to make ensure regular upgrades. With high-speed connection and hot spots across the district, LCPS is committed to making sure every student has internet access.

Every LCPS school has "a media fingerprint," he said, and is using television and social media platforms to "showcase a lot of the positive things that are happening."

The school district wants to use highly successful community schools concept to broaden career and technical education for students to better prepare them for college and the workforce, Ramos said.

LCPS is getting noticed other school districts around the state, Ramos said, because "the same old, same old is not getting them there."

"I want to move New Mexico ... to the top 10" in public education, Ramos said.

State funding helps county expand mobile crisis response

Outside of the Crisis Triage Center (CTC) in Las Cruces, Doña Ana County Commission Chair Manuel A. Sanchez announced earlier this month the state of New Mexico will fund the expansion of mobile crisis response services in the county.

As of Dec. 1, those services are dispatched through 988, the national suicide and crisis lifeline. State funding will support operations through 2024, after which the service will be sustained through Medicaid reimbursement, the county said in a news release.

"Today's announcement is a big movement forward for the residents of Doña Ana County," Sanchez said. "Doña Ana County is proud to be the first in New Mexico to implement all three components of the ideal crisis response system, now giving people in crisis someone to call, someone to come and somewhere to go whenever help is needed."

"This model aims to get the right help at the right time," county Health and Human Services Department Director Jamie Michael told the Bulletin. "If someone asks for help when calling 988 it is a peer and a clinician who come to you, not law enforcement or EMS. This reduces stress and stigma, so I hope people are more likely to ask for help."

"I think it is just fabulous that the first full Crisis Now Model in New

Mexico is in Las Cruces," said Dr. Neal Bowen, director of the Behavioral Services Division of the New Mexico Department of Health. Bowen participated in the county's announcement via Zoom.

"You are so well prepared and so well posi-

tioned to deliver in an exemplary way and a way that is going to be a great model for everyone across the state of New Mexico," Bowen said. "The significance of the mobile crisis response system lies in the years of groundwork that has been laid by stakehold-

ers across the state. This is the model that people have been asking for and they will make the best use of when needing crisis care. This will also lower the overall system cost of responding to behavioral health crisis."

"In the last 50 years, we have operated under a 911 system for emergencies by sending the police, fire or EMS, even when it is related to a mental health or substance abuse crisis," said Paul Galdys, deputy CEO of Recovery Innovations International (RI), the Arizona nonprofit that operates CTC under a contract with the county.

"Through 988 or the statewide Crisis and Access line, someone can speak with you and talk you through some of the situations. 90 percent of issues can be resolved over the phone through the support without the presence of law enforcement, which often can lead to booking and incarceration," Galdys said.

Creating a system that was Medicaid reimbursable was a critical component to making this system sustainable statewide, the county said.

It is important to note the mobile crisis response service does not replace 911, the county said. Instead, county residents can now call 988 and receive support during a mental health or substance use crisis.

CTC is available for walk-ins 365 days a year, 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Visit 988nm.org.


petroleum development, enhanced geothermal systems and underground carbon and hydrogen storage.



Karen Robinson has not only been making holiday joy, she has been sharing it with her Las Alturas neighbors since coming to Las Cruces in 2014.

The largest outdoor wooden Christmas ornament Robinson has made spells "JOY." Each letter is the size of a sheet of plywood, and the "O" is a nativity.

She also has done Santa's Workshop, complete with elves building toys, wrapping them and taking them to Santa's sleigh, complete with reindeer - and one elf who is playing instead of working.

She also has made wooden ornaments showing Santa and Mrs. Claus on the Santa Cycle and Santa on horseback, a

For each item, Robinson said she cuts the pattern and assembles the pieces, primes, traces on the pattern, paints and adds a protective plastic coat.

"It takes time - weeks -but I'm totally rewarded," she said.

"Our house was the only house on the block with lights. We kept decorating each year and adding more," Robinson said. "I had to spread the cheer. told my husband (Billy Baker) the only way to get more decorations is to give everyone a cutout."

Robinson called together the seven women she regularly walks the neighborhood with and gave each one a cutout.

"This neighborhood, not just the walkers, but most all of the folks, meet at Christmas for dinner, this year at our house, it is wonderful. When we first arrived, it was a progressive dinner, cocktails at one house, dinner at another, desserts at yet another. We did it on Christmas Eve, most walking from house to house. Of course Covid changed us, but last year

we all got our vaccines... and had (just) the dinner at our house - as it was the Christmas house after all!. We are doing it again (this year).

"We are blessed to have moved here, we all know it and continue to support each other and have potlucks all during the year. People move and here we go again.

"I love this season," she said. "Christmas brings out the smiles in people, it's JOYful.

Robinson's neighbor and friend, Cynthia de Lorenzi, called the decorations "incredible," and said she has "gifted them to many of our homes as well."

Howdy Mr. Snowman!

Christmas, holiday traditions have sources worldwide

Both history and folklore surround our many holiday traditions. Here are some of the facts and fancies.

• Santa Claus comes from Holland. Father Christmas is based on a real person, St. Nicholas, a Christian leader from Myra in modern-day Turkey in the fourth century AD. He wanted to give money to poor people without them knowing it was from him, so, one day, he climbed on the roof of a house and dropped a purse full of money down the chimney. (Another legend says one such purse landed in a sock hung by the fireplace to dry, and so was born the Christmas stocking.) Cartoonist Thomas Nast drew Santa Claus for Harper's Weekly in 1862 as a small elf-like figure who supported the Union in the Civil War. Nast continued to draw Santa for 30 years, putting him first in a tan coat and then changing it to red. Starting in 1931, Coca Cola magazine ads illustrated by Michigan native Haddon Sundblom showed Santa as a kind, jolly figure in a red suit - the Santa we still see today. Sundblom was inspired by Clement Moore's 1822 poem "A Visit from St. Nicholas," ac-

• Christmas cards come from England, where the tradition started in 1840 with the first "penny post" public postal deliveries. The first known Christmas card was sent by Michael Maier to James I of English and his son, Henry Frederick, Prince of Wales, in 1611. The first commercially available Christmas card showed three generations of a family rising in a toast and was designed in London in 1843. Christmas cards began being mass produced about 1860.

• Christmas trees were first documented in Riga, Latvia in 1510. The tree is the one symbol that unites almost all northern European winter solstice traditions. Live evergreen trees were brought into homes during harsh winters to remind inhabitants that soon their crops would grow again. Christmas trees were not popular in America because they were viewed as pagan. Then, in 1846, Queen Victoria, Prince Albert and their children were sketched in the Illustrated London News standing around a Christmas tree. That made them fashionable in England and America. Christmas ornaments began arriving in the U.S. from Germany

in the 1890s.

· Yule logs and mistletoe come from northern Europe where pagans celebrated the winter solstice with vule ("wheel," the pagan symbol for the sun) or yuletide festivals honoring the birth of the pagan sun god Mithras on the shortest day of the year. It was customary to light a candle to encourage Mithras and the sun to reappear each year, and huge vule logs were burned in their

honor. Mistletoe was considered a sacred plant and the custom of kissing under the mistletoe began as a fertility ritual.

• Wreaths date back to the Persian Empire where they were first used as symbols of importance and victory. The evergreen circle symbolized the recurring seasons and candles represented the coming light of spring. Holly berries were thought by ancient pagans to be a food of the gods.

• Candy canes come from Germany, where in 1670

the choirmaster of the Cologne Cathedral gave his young singers sugar sticks to keep them quiet during long ceremonies. He had the sticks bent in the shape of shepherds' crooks to celebrate the Christmas season. White candy canes have been produced in the U.S. since 1847. Bob McCormack started Mc-Cormack's Candy Co. in Albany, Georgia in 1919. His Starlight Mints are still produced today. McCormack's brother-in-law, Father Gregory Harding Keller, invented machines in the 1950s to twist candy dough into spirals, cut it and shape into it a cane

• Luminarias date back hundreds or perhaps even thousands of years and may have originated in New Mexico, which was then a part of the Republic of Mexico. They began as bonfires built to guide the faithful to Christmas mass. U.S. settlers brought Chinese lanterns from overseas in the early 19th century to hang from their doorways instead of lighting bonfires, and then began making their own small lanterns using paper bags, sand and candles. The correct term for these

little lanterns is farolito.

• Reindeer come from northern Europe, but it took a poem ("A Visit from St. Nicholas") written by Clement Clarke Moore in New York in 1923 to give Santa's original eight reindeer their names. Robert L. May invented Rudolph the Red-Nosed Reindeer as part of a Montgomery Ward promotion in 1939. His brother-in-law, Johnny Marks, wrote the song, which was first recorded by Gene Autry in 1949. It is Columbia Record's highest-selling record of all time and second only in sales to Bing Crosby's 1942 recording of Irving Berlin's "White Christmas."

• Elves were called Álfar or huldufólk, ("hidden folk") in Norse mythology and may have first appeared in print in Louisa May Alcott's 1850 unpublished manuscript "Christmas Elves." They likely showed up for the first time in Santa's workshop on the cover of Godey's Magazine and Lady's Book 1873 Christmas edition. The monthly women's magazine was published in Philadelphia 1830-78.

• Holiday gift giving began with the Roman celebration

of Saturnalia when people exchanged lucky fruit gifts as part of a winter feast. When the Christmas tree became popular, small toys were tied to its branches.

· Snowmen date to the Middle Ages if not earlier. One legend says the first American snowman was built by Vernon Paul and his 9-vear-old daughter, Yetty (no apparent connection to the abominable snowman), in Eau Claire, Wisconsin Jan. 7, 1809. There are apparently illustrations of snowmen in books dating from the late 14th century. "Frosty the Snowman" is a Christmas song written by Walter "Jack" Rollins and Steve Nelson. It was first recorded by Gene Autry and the Cass County Boys in

• Poinsettias are native to Central America. The name comes from Joel Roberts Poinsett (1779-1851), an amateur botanist who is credited with introducing the plant to the U.S. while he was serving as the first U.S. minister to Mexico, 1825-29. The plant is called Flor de Nochebuena (Christmas Eve flower), or Catarina, in Mexico.



Arrowhead receives \$1.2 million grant

New Mexico State University's Arrowhead Center has been awarded a \$1.2 million grant from the **Economic Development** Administration (EDA) of the U.S. Department of Commerce, NMSU said in a news release.

The grant is awarded annually as part of the EDA's Build to Scale program. The 2022 program was comprised of two competitions: the Venture Challenge and the Capital Challenge. ASCMV set to open Dec. 27

The new Animal Services Center of the Mesilla Valley (ASCMV) should reach substantial completion and open its doors to the public Tuesday, Dec. 27, ASCMV **Executive Director Clint** Thacker said.

City of Las Cruces voters overwhelmingly approved a general obligation bond question in 2018 that allocated \$11 million to build the new center, along with two one-acre dog parks, one next to ASCMV on Bataan Memorial West and the other at Burn Lake.

Thacker said the existing ASCMV building will be used as an animal medical facility, while the new center will handle intakes and adoptions. Of the 18,000 square feet in the new building, Thacker said 13,000 is devoted to animals and animal care.

In October, Thacker said more than 800

animals were brought ASCMV. He said 56 percent were brought by City of Las Cruces and Doña Ana County animal control and the other 44 percent by members of the public, including owner surrenders and stray cats and dogs.

Apply your other life successes to your golf game

It is very often difficult for highly successful business and professional people to apply to golf the same basic emotional and thinking skills that made them successful to begin with.

High-powered folks sometimes get impatient and expect things will come automatically for them. Then it's frustrating when it doesn't happen. At times ego gets in the way. I've noticed there's a tendency for ego-driven individuals to think golf should be easy and that it should be fair.

Neither of those beliefs are true or realistic.

I suggest we erase the "should" from our minds, and understand golf takes the same amount of patience, practice and devotion as did medical school or the rise to the top of the corporation. To be

sure, the golf swing and the game itself are particularly difficult things to learn and accomplish with any measure of real mastery.

All successful people have set specific goals with high standards for themselves. They set themselves on a path they believe will take them where they want to go. In order to experience a quantum leap in improve-

ment of your golf game (or even to simply learn the game, for that matter), it means doing essentially the same thing: create measurable goals and a game plan. High achievers overcome one challenge at a time, with uncommon focus and commitment. That same discipline and dedication to excellence

will carry you a long way as a golfer.

Before I retired several years ago I was a licensed clinical psychologist and a certified executive coach.

My coaching clients included CEOs, managers, professionals and key managers, who desired to perform better and advance higher as leaders and managers.

sation was asking "what do you want to happen?" This prevented getting stuck in the complaints about wanting other people to change. These complaints often took this form: "Well I work for a jerk and he just needs to respect my work and my effort more." (This theme is also common in mar-

riage counseling.)

You can't change the other person.

Nor can you change the golf course.

Note that two of the three original rules of golf, settled on by the Scots hundreds of years ago, were: Play the course as you find it; and play the ball as it lies. Incide

ntally, the third rule was "do what's fair."

That's an interesting business premise, isn't it?

Now, since you can't change your boss or your peers, I guess you must change yourself in one way or another for things to improve. Which is what personal coaching helps you do. How do you get better? Don't look at the golf course. Don't count on your opponents to collapse. Don't think a new driver is the answer.

Improve yourself. Get

coaching. Take lessons. Read. Practice. Raise the bar. Isn't this how you've made it in business or your profession?

To some, this may be a minor thing, but how we dress says a lot about our character. If you're a physician or an attorney or a salesperson or a banker, you probably dress appropriately, according to your professional role.

When we set foot on the golf course we should wear golf attire: neat, appropriate apparel that is befitting a round of golf. I like what PGA tour veteran Tom Lehman says about how he dresses: "I dress nice. When I dress nice, I feel good. When I feel good I play good. When I play good I make lots of money." It's "dress for success" applied to golf.

Finally, let's talk about

behavior on the golf course. For some reason, grown men think the standards of civility go out the window once they get out of the office and out playing golf. Oh, contraire. Golf is a sport for gentleman and ladies. Our actions should reflect how conscientiously we play, how we treat others, how we care for the golfing grounds, and how we approach the game. These behaviors should reflect a deep appreciation of the traditions of the game.

How we act reflects who we are. Remember, politeness is the easiest way to make friends.
