

NEW COUNTY COMMISSION DISTRICT BOUNDARIES EFFECTIVE JAN. 1

Doña Ana County Board Commissioners in New Mexico approved the Concept F redistricting map for commission district boundaries on November 23, 2021. The new map went into effect on January 1, 2023 and was authorized by County Resolution 2021-123. Redistricting is done every ten years to adjust voting districts according to population shifts, with the goal of having each district's population as equal as possible within +/- 5%. The U.S. Census Bureau data revealed that County Commission District 4 had the largest population growth over the last decade.

'This is power': Cotton says to MLK audience

"I wasn't always Sgt. Jamar Cotton. I wasn't always an Aggie football player. I was that little black boy who didn't have a choice," Jamar Cotton told the Doña Ana County NAACP's Martin Luther King Jr. breakfast Monday morning, Jan. 16.

Cotton, a sergeant with the Doña Ana County Sheriff's Department, spoke to an overflow crowd at the Las Cruces Convention Center that included Mayor Ken Miyagishima, Mayor Pro Tempore Kasandra Gandara and City Councilors Yvonne Flores and Johana Bencomo; City Manager Ifo Pili and Assistant City Manager Ikani Taumoepeau; County Manager Fernando Macias, County Commissioner Manuel Sanchez and County Sheriff Kim Stewart; Third Judicial District Attorney Gerald Byers and District Judge Robert Lara; New Mexico State University Vice President for Inclusion and Diversity Teresa Maria Linda Scholz, Associate Provost for Student Success Patrick Turner and Head Football Coach Jerry Kill and members

of the Aggie football team; Las Cruces Public Schools Superintendent Ralph Ramos and LCPS Board of Education President Teresa Tenorio; Temple Beth-El Rabbi Evette Lutman; Las Cruces icon Barbara Hubbard; Las Cruces Symphony Orchestra Director Emeritus Lonnie Klein; and long-time educator and storyteller Dorris

"Today is the day," Cotton said, with the audience echoing his words. "I can and I will be the difference. This is the power."

Hamilton; among others.

The world today is "lacking in mentors and teachers," Cotton said. So many people "need somebody to talk to them; need somebody to listen to them," he said. For Cotton, the person "who believed in me" was his Irvington (New Jersey) High School track coach, Martin Hawkins.

"This man told me I could be a champion,"

Cotton said. "I laughed at him."

But Hawkins got Cotton into track, he said, where, by his senior year, he had become ranked in the top 15 nationally.

Cotton came to NMSU on a football scholarship and was an Aggie line-backer, 2006-10. He joined the sheriff's department in 2010 and is today third vice president of the DAC NAACP and youth president of the New Mexico Martin Luther King Jr. State Commission Ambassador Program.

Citing issues that were important to King, Cotton said "Change is needed," as are love, compassion and understanding; "justice for all, not some"; and equality – "We're still fighting that battle," he said.

"Silence is a big issue," Cotton said. "We're too quiet. We fail to speak up. This community doesn't get better with you being quiet."

Cotton closed with this quote from King: "If you can't fly then run, if you can't run then walk, if you can't walk then crawl, but whatever you do you have to keep moving forward."

Legislators get public input

"Keep doing the work that you're doing," Las Cruces Public Schools Superintendent Ralph Ramos told three Doña Ana County legislators during at Jan. 12 public meeting at Las Cruces City Hall.

Ramos was one of nearly a dozen people who spoke at the meeting hosted by state Sens. Jeff Steinborn and Bill Soules and state Rep. Angelica Rubio, all D-Doña Ana.

Others speaking included Las Cruces psychologist and former Doña Ana County Manager Al Galves, FYI+ Executive Officer Brian Kavanaugh, Hidalgo County Commissioner Kelly Peterson, former Doña Ana County Probate Judge Diana Bustamante, bicycle activist George Pearson and Yoli Diaz, founder of Cancer Aid Resource and Education, Inc. (CARE) of Las Cruces.

Also attending were Mayor Pro Tempore Kasandra Gandara, City Councilors Johana Bencomo and Tessa Abeyta, Las Cruces International Airport Administrator Andy Hume and New Mexico State University Creative Media Institute professor Ross Marks.

Topics raised by participants included public housing; accessibility for bicyclists, pedestrians and the disabled; banning plastic bags statewide; the need for additional senior citizens centers and healthcare access in Hidalgo County; housing for homeless youth; locating a group home in Las Cruces for people suffering with schizophrenia; cannabis; supporting public education; access to cancer treatment in Las Cruces for people who do not have health insurance; and unemployment benefits and medical leave.

Steinborn said the legislature will have about \$3.5 billion in new funding during the 2023 legislative session.

He said the state has about 40 percent of its budget in reserve funds. Much of the surplus is do to a boom in the oil and gas industry that is likely to "last a few more years," Steinborn said. But, he said, energy development is moving away from fossil fuels and "it is essential that we diversity our economy. We need to plan for the future." Steinborn said.

With an eye toward the future, Soules said one of the bills he will introduce during the 2023 session will be to begin high-speed rail service between Chihuahua, Mexico, and Denver, Colorado, running the entire length of New Mexico.

"We need to be looking up and out to what the future could be," he said.

Soules, chair of the state Senate Education Committee, said he will support additional salary increases for New Mexico teachers and for other school staff, including educational assistants, custodians and cafeteria workers. He also will support additional teacher preparation programs, revised graduation requirements and more funding for career and technical education.

Soules said he will introduce bills to ban assault weapon sales in New Mexico, ban high-capacity gun magazines and appropriate \$2 million for an assault-weapon buyback program.

"Assault weapons are designed to kill people and we've got to get them off the streets," Soules said.

Steinborn said the bills he plans to introduce this year include increasing the incentive to film movies in New Mexico outside Bernalillo and Santa Fe counties from five to 10 percent, establishing a new Creative Industries Division within the New Mexico Economic Development Department, funding a feasibility study to create a new

U.S. Sen. Lujan visits southern New Mexico

U.S. Sen. Ben Ray Lujan, D-N.M., visited the Las Cruces Fire Department (LCFD) Jan. 10 to announce more than \$1 million in federal allocations to support crisis response and improve behavioral health services in Las Cruces.

LCFD's Mobile Integrated Health (MIH) is "a program I'm really excited about," Lujan told Las Cruces Fire Chief Jason Smith, firefighters, social workers and the media as he got an update on the program from Smith and MIH Coordinator Paul Ford.

Lujan, who suffered a stroke at his Nambe, New Mexico, home in January 2022, said the emergency services he received in route to a hospital in Santa Fe "saved my life. You do that every day," he told the Las Cruces firefighters and EMTs.

"The work they did on me (in the mobile unit) is part of the reason I'm here today," Lujan said.

Ford told Lujan LCFD responded to 22,850 calls for service in 2022. Less than one percent of those calls (211) were for fires; more than 62 percent (14,293) were for medical issues, including non-emergency transport, 1,263 "lift assists" (helping people in and out of bed, etc.) and 1, 251 calls to assist people who had fallen.

Ford said MIH was created in 2016 to deal with the high volume of 911 calls LCFD was receiving from a small number of people who needed

assistance with non-emergency issues but did not have access to other healthcare services.

LCFD MIH now has 10 employees, including two full-time firefighter/paramedics, three social workers, a case manager and a data analyst, he said. It includes the Opiate Overdose Outreach (OOO) program and Operation Blue-Bird, which pairs

Las Cruces police officers with MIH paramedics and social workers "to follow up on behavioral health referrals."

"That personal touch; that's what it's all about," said Las Cruces City Councilor Johana Bencomo, who participated in the Jan. 10 meeting.

"It's pretty incredible. I'm very excited to continue our partnership," said Families and Youth Innovations Plus (FYI+) Senior Clinical Director Lisa Chavez.

Chavez said FYI will expand its MOU with the MIH program. FYI+ Executive Officer Brian Kavanaugh also attended the meeting.

"It's amazing how much trust the community has in the Las Cruces Fire Department," said social worker Allison Stoner, who joined MIH in 2021.

Ford said more than three-quarters of the people MIH serves are senior citizens with mobility issues who cannot afford the caregiver services

they need, and people over age 55 who have a mobility-related disability. Most are in poverty, he said.

Ford said more than one-third of MIH calls are for mobility-related issues, more than one-quarter are for mental health issues, 11 percent are dementia related, nine percent are housing vulnerable/homeless related and four percent are substance-abuse related.

MIH had 1,629 referrals from the fall of 2016 when it was created to Jan. 1, 2023, including 505 referrals in 2022. The program had 170 "graduates," including 33 in 2022, Ford said.

Graduates refer to clients who are "the most complicated, at-risk people" and have had "good health outcomes" as a result of MIH service, he said.

"We're very proud of these numbers," Ford said.

Ford said MIH will launch Project LIGHT (Lessen the Incidence of deal with behavioral health issues, suicide attempts and ideations, overdoses, welfare checks and CPRs in progress. Operation BlueBird

workers dispatched to

Operation BlueBird will continue to operate alongside Project LIGHT, Ford said, so MIH can collaborate with the police department on behavioral health referrals. He said OOO will transition to a "Narcan leave behind program" as part of the Project LIGHT response model.

MIH and programs like it "need more people on the ground providing services," Lujan said.

Other visits

During his visit to southern New Mexico,

Lujan also visited students and staff at Booker T. Washington Elementary School in Las Cruces to talk about the federal government's investment in early childhood education programs.

He was at New Mexico State University Jan. 11 "to highlight \$5.8 million secured for multiple projects" that involve NMSU, including agriculture and research, Lujan's office said in a news release.

Lujan visited the New Mexico State Veterans Home in Truth or Consequences Jan. 12, and also visited Hatch Valley Public Schools "to celebrate the \$200,000 funding secured to construct an animal science facility," his office said.

We love the dream, but don't forget King's reality

Imagine going with some friends to a local restaurant.

You've checked in and are waiting for your table.

Another group walks up to put their name on the list, and the host says to them flatly: "We don't serve your kind here. If you want, you can call in a to-go order and pick it up at the window when it's ready."

Your first thought would be disbelief. "Wait, did I just see what I saw?"

Your second thought would probably be anger.

Yet there was a time in this country (and many other countries), where this was so commonplace no one would have batted an eye. That type

of discrimination was deeply ingrained, established and tolerated.

And that time was not so long ago.

Even though the United States Supreme Court found segregated schools unconstitutional in 1954, there were many states still practicing segregation into the 1980s. For some states, the response to the 1954 ruling was to

attempt ending state-supported public schools. Many segregationists would rather have had no schools at all than to have their white children go to school with African-Americans.

In South Africa, racial apartheid didn't officially end until

1996

These types of discrimination across human history have been based on skin color, economic class, religion, gender, age, ethnicity, language. You name it. If there is a human trait – physical, mental, emotional or social - you can bet there are some humans who don't like it.

We sometimes like to think New Mexico is somehow different. Yes, we have, as the pledge to our state flag includes "friendship among united cultures."

We are also a state that has seen brutal treatment against and within those cultures.

In museums, I've seen a number of signs that once hung in New Mexico bars and restaurants bearing messages such as this: "No Indians, Mexicans or dogs."

As I write this in the wake of the Martin Luther King Jr. holiday, we are more than a half century beyond Dr. King's death. Most living Americans don't have a recollection of King even being alive. And this makes it easier for people to misuse and misinterpret his memory.

There are efforts to flip the story, and if you bring up the idea racism exists, YOU are somehow racist. I've heard people twist Dr. King's words about being judged by the content of one's character, not by the color of skin. Yes, that was his dream. For him it was a conceivable dream, but a far,

City makes pitch for switch to electric

Did they ever pry that gun away from Charleton Heston, or did they just bury him with it?

Inspired by Heston, U.S. Rep. Ronny Jackson, R-Texas, made a similar vow last week, though it will be tougher to bury him with the object of his devotion.

"If the maniacs in the White House come for my stove, they can pry it from my cold, dead hands," he declared. I assume he'll die with oven mitts on?

The freakout following a suggestion by a member of the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission that a ban on gas stoves could be under consideration comes at the same time the city of Las Cruces is sponsoring a big event at the Convention Center trying to convince residents to switch from gas to electric, and not just with stoves.

The PowerUP Las Cruces Expo and Training will be held Friday and Saturday, and is intended to persuade us to change from gas (or, as they put it, "fossil fuel appliances and/ or vehicles") to electric.

The View From Here

Why should the city get involved in the free-market competition between those selling gas appliances and those selling electric? Lots of honest small businesspeople in our community make a living selling and servicing gas furnaces and water heaters.

The answer is the impact on both our personal health and the environment. We've long known about the adverse consequences of gas-powered vehicles, but the notion that furnaces, water heaters and, yes, even stoves should be seen in the same light is fairly new.

A 2022 study found that nearly 13 percent of childhood asthma cases in the U.S. can be attributed to exposure to nitrogen dioxide released during cooking with a gas stove. Other toxic pollutants released into our homes by cooking with gas or propane stoves include carbon monoxide and formal-dehyde, according to an article by Professor of Environmental Health Jonathan Levy.

While the federal government is still a long way away from coming after Rep. Jackson's stove, states and local governments are moving more quickly. California will ban the sale of natural-gas appliances starting in 2030.

I understand the health and environmental arguments behind that decision, but still think it's the wrong approach. Education is the answer. Once people understand the dangers, most will want to keep their families safe. I hope this week's expo will help people make better-informed decisions.

But, for those who think a steak isn't the same when cooked on an electric grill, I get it. As long as we know the risks, we should all be able to weigh those against the rewards and make our own decisions.

New Mexico needs a modernized legislature

As the 2023 session of the New Mexico legislature begins, actions to "modernize" the state's lawmaking body will likely be considered. Discussions about modernization occur in the context of a state whose population has grown by a factor of more than six since statehood, giving individual members of the House and Senate constituencies of 30,000 and 50,000 respectively.

Additionally, New Mexico remains geographically large and demographically diverse. The legislature needs to address complex challenges, including poverty, economic diversification, disposal of nuclear waste and limited access to health care and internet services.

The League of Women Voters and other civic organizations support lengthening the sessions, hiring permanent yearround staff, and creating salaries for members.

Currently, New Mexico's sessions are among the three shortest in the country (alternating between 60 days in odd-numbered years and 30 days in evennumbered years). The scope of the short session is limited to the budget and topics specified by the governor.

Proposed changes involve expanding, at least the short session, to allow

more time for bills to be studied and debated with consideration of a greater range of topics. Hopefully, a longer session would also discourage delaying tactics of "running out the clock," leaving bills to die at the end of the session.

Now the legislature's work is supported by a permanent staff of about 168 (about 1.5 per legislator) and most legislators do not have dedicated staff. Having access to more staff throughout the year would assist legislators in researching and analyzing bills. Staff can also aid in providing improved oversight of executive agencies. Having more staff would also decrease legislators' reliance on paid lobbyists for information on bills and would better serve constituents.

A third area of modernization involves paying legislative salaries, as is done in the other 49 states.

New Mexico legislators do receive mileage and per-diem payments to attend sessions and interim committee meetings, but lack of salary seriously limits the ability of a large part of the population to serve in the Roundhouse. Those financially most able to serve are retired (with various kinds of pensions), independently wealthy, or self-employed in businesses that can be

more easily combined with legislative work. Younger people, essential workers, those with young children, and those with full-time jobs find service in the legislature to be far more difficult. If there is a decision to pay salaries, the level of salary can be set in a variety of ways, including by an independent body. Rep. Angelica Rubio (a Democrat from District 35 in Las Cruces) and others plan to introduce a bill creating a legislative salary commis-

If the legislature approves changes in the length of sessions and legislative compensation, those issues will be put before the voters as constitutional amendments. Increased staffing may be approved by the legislature. A modernized legislature would enhance the capacity of the legislators to perform their role in the policy-making process.



LCU Annual Survey Results and Looking Forward

Surveys are the way for LCU to know what you know about its services. Keep your eye on your mail for the physical copy to fill out, or, how to go online and fill it out when the next survey is released this year.

For Las Cruces Utilities (LCU), feedback from customers is invaluable. It gives direction to the LCU Board of Commissioners. It allows LCU to know if customers know about services included with their connections, like when the monthly grappler arrives or if clear bags are key to yard waste disposal.

"Due to COVID, we haven't conducted a survey since 2019," said LCU Senior Office Manager Alma Ruiz. "But based on the 2018 survey that we did, we were asked to identify any goals in our Strategic Business Plan that we could then add to our survey, which

we did beginning in 2019, and we have carried those on to 2022 as well."

The survey was both in English and Spanish and had 12 questions. LCU had a booth at the downtown Farmer's Market, an online SurvevMonkev option, and sent the survey to customers as an insert to their physical and electronic bills. There were 843 responses, which was only about 2 percent of customers.

"An astounding 97 percent knew what not to throw down their drains, which outscored the 2019 record of 84 percent and beat the goal of 85 percent," said Ruiz. "But 47 percent of our customers do

not know to call 811 before digging in their yard, and that this is a free service where our Utility locators then go out to mark the lines."

Other questions asked about LCU services and environmental stewardship including showing that over 60 percent of respondents felt confident or very confident that LCU processed wastewater safely recycled back into the environment, the same percentage as in 2019 and past years.

For possible gas leaks, early 70 percent of respondents knew to either call LCU Dispatch at (575) 526-0500 or 911. "It's fine to call 911 because the smell of sulfur can be worrying; however, our Dispatch is just as responsive to a gas emergency 24/7," said LCU Deputy Director Natural Gas and Energy Lucio Garcia.

The last question was about UtilityHawk, which allows customers to monitor their gas and water usage. Unfortunately, 65 percent had never heard of it, and 24 percent weren't interested. "This gives us the opportunity to educate the public more about the new, free tools they have available as part of their accounts," said Ruiz.

state park in northern Doña Ana County, cleaning up uranium-mining contamination in the state and prevent-

ing the opening of a high-level nuclear waste storage facility in southeast New Mexico.

"I really want to see the federal government do their job," Steinborn said, and come up with "a permanent solution" to the storage of high-level nuclear waste.

Rubio said she will focus on housing, economic diversification and modernizing the legislature in 2023.

"We lack housing," Rubio said. "So many people are unhoused."

As the state moves away from oil and gas production, it "must make sure" workers in those industries "are taken care of for years to come," she said.

Rubio said she is one of nine legislators who will push to create a commission to set a base salary for New Mexico legislators. She also will support replacing the legislature's 30-day budget session in evennumbered years. Rubio said providing paid staff for legislators is also "really important."

The Jan. 12 meeting was one of eight community meetings Steinborn, Soules, Rubio and state Sens. Crystal Diamond, R-Sierra, Luna, Hidalgo, Doña Ana; and Carrie Hamblen, D-Doña Ana; and state Reps. Nathan Small, D-Doña Ana, and Tara Jaramillo, D-Socorro, Sierra, Doña Ana; held in Las Cruces, Doña Ana, Organ, Radium Springs and Hatch Jan. 9-14 as they prepared for the New Mexico legislative session that began Jan. 17.

"This is a really great and exciting time," Mayor Ken Miyagishima said Tuesday morning, Jan. 10, as the City of Las Cruces welcomed Advanced Airlines President Levi Stockton and cut the ribbon to celebrate the return of commercial air service to Las Cruces International Airport.

"It's such a huge moment," said City Councilor Johana Bencomo, whose district includes the air-

"It's really exciting to be here," Stockton said.

"Welcome to our family," Greater Las Cruces Chamber of Commerce (GLCCC) President and CEO Debbi Moore said to Stockton.

The daily flights between Las Cruces and Albuquerque "are going to bring economic prosperity to our city," said Mayor Pro Tempore Kasandra Gandara. "This takes us to a different level," she said, for transportation, jobs, education and attracting more businesses and industry to Las Cruces.

Also attending the ribbon cutting were Las Cruces City Councilors Becky Graham and Tessa Abeyta, City Manager Ifo Pili and

Gabe Vasquez, both D-N.M., and New Mexico Department of Transportation (NMDOT) Aviation Director Pedro Rael and Planner Marilu Melendez, along with GLCCC Ambassadors.

Advanced Air began commercial air service operations in Las Cruces Jan. 16, the city said. The last time commercial air service was available in Las Cruces was 2005.

Advanced Air provides air service between Silver City and Albuquerque,

between Silver City and Phoenix and between Gallup and Phoenix, the city said.

Advanced Air primarily utilizes the Beechcraft Super King Air 350 for its fleet, the news release said. The twin-engine aircraft

has a capacity of nine passengers.

The two-year contract for Las Cruces air service has a total budget of \$3,850,000, including \$1.75 million each year from NMDOT's rural air service enhancement grant.

State Rep. Nathan Small, a Las Cruces Democrat, is the new chair of the powerful Appropriations and Finance Committee in the New Mexico House of Representatives.

Small was named chair Jan. 17, as the legislature convened in Santa Fe. He replaces Patricia Lundstrom.

As chair, Small will guide passage of the largest budget in state history, estimated to be about \$12 billion, an increase of more than 40 percent from last year's budget.

Incentive program helps support jobs

The NMBorderplex Incentive Program created by the Community Foundation of Southern New Mexico (CFSNM) and the Mesilla Valley Economic Development Alliance (MVEDA) committed \$530,000 to six companies in 2022 that will create 937 new economic-base jobs and more than \$105 in new capital investments in Doña Ana County, MVEDA said in a news release.

Recipients of the incentive include Artico Cold Storage, Electronic Caregiver, BitWise Industries, Worthington Farms and two additional companies that will be formally announced in the coming months, the news release said.


The incentive program is a post-performance, economic-based, job-creation grant managed by MVEDA with financial assistance from the New Mexico Economic Development Fund (NMEDF), a multipurpose economic development initiative administered by CFSNM, MVEDA said.

"It is estimated the economic impacts of these investments in 2022 will lead to over \$126 million in new household spending and an overall economic impact of \$461 million to the region over the next five years," MVEDA said.

To date, in its first two years of existence, the incentive program has provided financial commitments of \$805,000 across nine projects in the region, assisting in the creation of more than 1,400 new economic-based jobs, the news release said.

NMEDF was established by El Paso Electric to provide \$1 million per year for 20 years in support of private businesses, projects and organizations that make or will make a measurable difference in achieving economic growth and development and creating new quality jobs within El Paso Electric's New Mexico service area.


"NOVA: CRYPTO DECODED"

Author has new book





Arts Council finds new home in arts and culture district

BULLETIN REPORT

"The Doña Ana Arts Council (DAAC), one of the key parties in the establishment of the Las Cruces Arts and Cultural District (ACD), is now actually housed in that singular district," DAAC said in a news release.

DAAC's new home, 230 S. Water St., is just inside ACD's southwest corner, the news release said.

"For most of its first 50 years, DAAC was located at several street addresses in what would eventually become the ACD in 2018," said DAAC Executive Director Greg Smith. "A significant portion of that time, DAAC was rehabilitating and then occupying and managing the historic Rio Grande Theatre (RGT), one of most iconic and significant landmarks in ACD."

In 2017, DAAC turned RGT management over to the City of Las Cruces and moved to Bulletin Plaza on Avenida de Mesilla.

"The Mesilla Location was beautiful," Smith said. "Still, considering the Arts Council's various roles with the ACD and discussions about things like artist live/ workspaces being situated there, it made sense to explore what was available near downtown Las Cruces."

After three years in Mesilla, DAAC moved to a location that Smith described as "spectacular," a former bank building just outside ACD. The owners worked with DAAC to make what Smith described as a "premier gallery space." It worked well for almost two years, but new ownership and a different use for the space required moving again, he said.

"We are thrilled to be in such a great spot, and back, if you will, in the ACD," Smith said about the Water Street location.

Smith praised the work the landlords have done to

LCCT accepting scripts for one-act plays

Las Cruces Community Theatre (LCCT) is now accepting applications from interested authors and/or directors for LCCT's 34th annual One Act Play Festival, which will be presented in performances March 17-19 and 24-26, LCCT said in a news release.

All play scripts must be submitted by Friday, Feb. 10.

With the festival, LCCT promotes local playwrights by offering them an opportunity to present their work in front of live audiences, the news release said.

"The One Act Play Festival at LCCT is a spring tradition that returns this year," said long

time Las Cruces actor and director Gail Wheeler, who is the festival coordinator. "As we celebrate the return to normal, we've decided to add a theme to this year's festival: 'A New Beginning.'

Having to close the theater right before opening a major production, and then having to re-build it again is what made us all think about starting again," Wheeler said. "A New Beginning expresses what we want to do with the festival. We encourage ALL writers to submit a script because part of a new beginning is to encourage everyone to come to the theater...there are many stories to be told and we want to include many."

For the festival, LCCT is seeking plays that:

- Are original scripts written by local playwrights
- Are one-act plays or cuttings from full-length plays
- Are 10-15 minutes in length
- Have simple technical/design requirements
- · Have casts of six or fewer actors
- Contain content that is suitable for a general audience.

Playwrights interested in submitting original works for the festival should apply with a stage director, LCCT said. If the playwright does not have a director and the play is chosen for the festival, LCCT will assign a director.

All play scripts must be submitted by Friday, Feb. 10. Application forms are available at www.LCCTNM.org/ one-act, along with instructions regarding where to email the script and completed application.

If a play is selected for the festival, Wheeler will meet with the author and director before the first rehearsal to discuss the design and technical aspects of the play.

LCCT will hold a group audition for all of the one-act plays selected for production in 2023 from 6:30-8 p.m. on Wednesday, Feb. 15, at LCCT, 313 N. Main St. downtown. All the directors and authors seeking cast members should attend the audition.

"It is often a challenge to find directors, so playwrights should have someone in mind or plan to direct their own work. We will have open auditions where playwrights, actors and directors can come together. We encourage anyone who has ever thought about auditioning to come on down because this is a great way to start if you've 'always wanted to act," Wheeler said.

Directors should plan on eight hours of rehearsal for the typical 15-minute play, not including the week of dress/tech rehearsals before opening, LCCT said. The first rehearsals at the theatre will begin Monday, Feb. 20. Rehearsals will typically be scheduled in the evenings and on weekends. Tech week rehearsals are tentatively scheduled for Monday, March 13-Thursday, March 16.

Performances will be at 7:30 p.m. Friday-Saturday, March 17 and 18 and 24 and 25 and 2 p.m. Sunday, March 19 at 26 at LCCT.

Mojica: Acting is about theater, the theater of life

The skills and techniques actors use on stage and in film can also help non-actors become better lawyers and police officers, doctors and CEOs, athletes and parents.

That's what Monika Mojica has discovered as an actor, director, and playwright, as a theater teacher at New Mexico State University, as a trial consultant for Kastl Law

Mojica is also the owner of Mo Bu Creative, a company that trains local first responders in crisis intervention and standardized patients who are part of the curriculum at Burrell College of Osteopathic Medicine.

"My job is giving a voice to the voiceless," said Mojica, who is also a wife and mother.

As a trial consultant, this means sitting down with victims of negligence and "unwrapping the narrative of their full trauma and suffering," she said.

"They tell me their story," Mojica said. "I ask what life was like before the traumatic event and what it's been like after that. Although I have heard troubling challenges, I am humbled by their fortitude."

Her training also helps attorneys with Krisi Kastl P.C., which has offices in Dallas and El Paso, to bring out the whole story in court in a way that helps their clients "recover their own resiliency," she said.

Using a wide range of role-playing scenarios she has created in partnership with the Las Cruces Police Department and other law enforcement agencies. Mojica employs a group of actors - creating characters like "Headwound Harry" and "Man with Dementia" to help train police cadets to successfully interact with individuals they deal It's a gift to be truly pres-

with daily who may be struggling with mental or behavioral health issues, homelessness or domestic violence.

The skills she has honed as an actor and teacher are also valuable in all these roles "because acting is about being open," Mojica said. "That lends itself to anything."

For attorneys and police officers, who "are trained to be very factual," she said, the more holistic theater techniques that actors learn can help them to see "the whole being" of the person they are dealing with, to "open up to the experience and connect and more fully with the individual in crisis.

"You think differently," she said, becoming more aware of assumptions, stereotypes and personal biases."

"There's something sacred when you're privy to another human's opening up," Mojica said. "It's an honor to hear that story.

ent with someone."

For attorneys, first responders and for actors role playing with the police and with medical students, the training also focuses on ways to fully connect with the client, the person on the street, the student doctor while maintaining their emotional stability and "without letting their tragedy become ours," Mojica said.

At the same type, actors must always be aware that their role playing "may save a life," she said. "It's beautifully fragile."

"Monika puts her whole heart into everything she commits to," said NMSU Theatre Arts Department Head Wil Kilroy. "Her ability to work with a variety of unique actors, giving each one full acceptance along with her personable insight is impressive."

Remembering Tom Weiskopf and Kathy Whitworth

It's a shame I only have a short space to summarize the life and times of Tom Weiskopf who died Aug. 20, 2022, at his home in Big Sky, Montana, after a battle with pancreatic cancer. Weiskopf played his college golf at Ohio State just a few years after Jack Nicklaus. He turned pro in 1964.

One writer described his swing as "pure poetry and his game equal parts of power and control." Golf pundits expected Weiskopf to challenge his rival Buckeye, Jack Nicklaus, but he ended up only beating Nicklaus twice in his 16 PGA Tour wins (including the 1973 Open Championship) and once in the 1995 USGA Senior Open.

Many analysists believed Weiskopf didn't get anywhere near what he should have out of his talent. He was not a club thrower, nor prone to outbursts of profanity. But he raged inside when things

went wrong and let those emotions erupt.

Media folks dubbed him the "Towering Inferno." His most notorious meltdown happened on the par-3 12th hole at Augusta

National during the 1980 Masters when he recorded an unimaginable 13. Looking back on his competitive career Weiskopf came to believe his own expectations of his golf game may have been too high.

"Perfectionists are determined to master things, and you can never master golf," Weiskopf said in a 2001 interview with Golf Digest. Weiskopf also had issues with alcohol, admit-

ting finally "it was a serious problem. It ruined my career," he said 18 months after gaining sobriety in

> 2000. "Every big mistake I've made can be traced back to drinking."

In the late 1990s Weiskopf turned his considerable talents to golf course design. In over two decades he

designed 43 championship golf courses, including TPC Scottsdale Stadium course, home of the WM Phoenix Open. I have personally played four Weiskopf courses: Double Eagle Club (Galena, Ohio), TPC Craig Ranch (McKinney, Texas), the Ridge at Castle Pines North (Denver) and Buffalo Creek G.C. (greater Dallas). He designed great, playable golf courses, period.

The answer to "Who is the winningest golfer in history?" may stump a few contestants on "Jeopardy," but golf aficionados know it is not Sam Snead or Tiger Woods, both with 82, but New Mexico's own Kathy Whitworth with 88 victories, who passed away Dec. 24, 2022. She was 83.

Whitworth was born Sept. 27, 1939, in the small West Texas town of Monahans, but shortly thereafter her family moved to Jal, New Mexico, where she learned to play golf when she was 14 on a 9-hole course built for the El Paso Natural Gas emplovees.

"I was really fortunate that I knew what I wanted to do," Whitworth once told Golf Digest. "Golf just grabbed me by the throat."

After turning 18, she

won the New Mexico Amateur Championship in 1957 and 1958. She then began working with famed coach Harvey Penick and turned pro, joining the LPGA in December 1958. She won her first LPGA tournament when she was 22 - The Kelly Girls Open. Her 26th win was in October 1966 in the Las Cruces Ladies Open at Las Cruces Country Club. The United Virginia Bank Classic in May 1985 was her last win. "Winning never got old," she had said.

By today's standards there wasn't much money in LPGA tournament purses but Whitworth still was the first woman to win \$1 million on tour.

Her 88 wins included six majors, but, sadly, she was missing a U.S. Women's Open championship. "I would have swapped being

the first to make a million for winning the Open," she said, "but it was a consolation which took some of the sting out of not winning." Whitworth was the LPGA player of the year seven times in an eight-year span (1966 through 1973). She was the Associated Press Female Athlete of the Year in 1965 and in 1967, and she was inducted into the World Golf Hall of Fame in 1982. Annika Sorenstam expressed on Twitter "thanks (Kathy) for setting the bar so high," and referred to Whitworth as a "total class act."

She will always be remembered that way.
