BIA meets with governor

"Our Border Economic Development Day in Santa Fe went really well," Border Industrial Association (BIA) President Jerry Pacheco of Santa Teresa told the Bulletin.

Pacheco, Doña Ana County Manager Fernando Macias, Luna County Manager Chris Brice and others met with Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham Jan. 20 at the governor's office in Santa Fe.

"Our legislative reception (Jan. 19) was well attended by legislators from both sides of the aisle," Pacheco said. This event gives us face-to-face time with these policymakers to let them know what is going on at the border.

"(Jan. 20), we went to the capitol to meet with the governor," he said. "We talked to her about our developments and stressed the need for ongoing infra-

structure funds ... She expressed her continued support for what we are doing.

"Also on Friday, we had a luncheon with the State Land Commissioner (Stephanie Garcia Richard) as our featured speaker. The Land Office owns land in Santa Teresa, particularly the land on which the Santa Teresa Jetport's crossrunway will be built," Pacheco said.

"We had about 60 BIA members accompany us ... It was a successful event for the border."

Hwy. 70 work brings lane closures

The New Mexico Department of Transportation began a roadway rehabilitation project on U.S. Highway 70 Jan. 23, the City of Las Cruces said in a news release. The \$7.2 million project will stretch from U.S. 70 milepost 143, the Interstate 10 and U.S. 70 interchange, to milepost 161 at Organ. Weather permitting, the project is expected to take 220 work days to complete, NMDOT said in

the news release. Motorists can expect various daytime lane closures on the NASA and Del Rey Boulevard interchanges for roadway milling and paving. Each intersection is expected to take three to four days to complete. The hours of operation for Mountain States Construction, the contractor for the project, will be 7 a.m.-5 p.m., Monday-Friday.

County offers Valentine weddings

"Romance at the Rotunda" is the event's title, as the Doña Ana County Clerk's Office and county Probate Judge's Office partner to perform marriages Tuesday, Feb. 14 (Valentine's Day), at the Doña Ana County Government Center, 845 N. Motel Blvd., the clerk's office said in a news release.

"Both offices take pride in conducting the public service of performing marriages and recording marriage licenses," the county said. For couples getting married on Valentine's Day, here are the steps:

• Complete the online marriage application form at donaana. nm.publicsearch.us/. You will receive a transaction number, which you should keep. Marriage licenses are issued by appointment only. Appointments for Feb. 14 are filling up quickly, the clerk's office said, so applicants should complete the form soon. Couples who want to get married Feb. 14 but do not want to participate in the Romance at the Rotunda event must also make an appointment to acquire a marriage license prior to their ceremony.

· Call the clerk's office at 575-647-7421 to schedule an appointment to complete the application process. For Romance in the Rotunda, you will need to schedule a ceremony time slot in addition to scheduling the marriage application appointment. Give the clerk the transaction number from Step 1 above. Both applicants must attend the appointment in person at the clerk's office to finalize the marriage application.

• On Feb. 14, arrive outside of room 113 a half hour minutes before the scheduled ceremony time to check-in.

• Bring your marriage

license with you. Other items you may wish to bring include floral bouquet(s), a veil, ring(s), vows and a camera.

• After the ceremony, return the signed marriage license to the check-in table for recording and filing by the clerk's office.

Couples who miss the opportunity to sign up for a Feb. 14 ceremony time slot or are late can participate in a collective wedding ceremony with multiple couples at 4 p.m. Feb. 14 at the county government center. Couples must complete the marriage application and receive their blank marriage license prior to 3:30 p.m. Feb. 14 o participate.

The cost of a marriage license is \$25. There is no charge for the Romance at the Rotunda ceremony.

Celebrating NMSU's underdogs

At its best, sports can provide lessons to help us in life.

At the New Mexico State Uni-

versity football celebration Jan. 21 Downtown at Plaza de Las Cruces, Aggie Coach Jerry Kill called his team a great example for any person or group who is down, but not yet out.

In a collaborative event between NMSU and the City of Las Cruces,

hundreds of fans showed up to celebrate the team's December Quick Lane Bowl championship. Fans heard from Las Cruces Mayor Ken Miyagishima, NMSU

Chancellor Dan Arvizu, Aggie Athletic Director Mario Moccia and others before Kill took the

"This team started off the season zero and four," Kill said. "A lot of us in our lives have been zero and four. You've been there. I've been there. But this team didn't stay there."

Indeed, they didn't. The Aggies' fourth

game of the season was a 66-7 blowout defeat in a road game at the University of Wisconsin. They returned home a week later for their first victory, beating Hawaii 45-26. But then they lost again, falling 21-7 in a close home game Oct. 1 against Florida International to drop to 1-5.

What better way to right the ship, though, than defeating an arch-rival at home, which is what the Aggies did Oct. 15, beating the University of New Mexico Lobos, 21-9. From there, NMSU went 5-1, culminating the season with a 24-19 win over Bowling Green in Detroit at the Quick Lane Bowl, and finishing 7-6 on the year.

"This group of young men came from all different backgrounds," Kill told the Plaza crowd. "They came from all

different races. All different beliefs. But they came together to accomplish this mission. I wish our damn country could learn that lesson."

From where I was standing. that line drew the biggest applause from a crowd that was loudly cheering from the start of the event to the finish. I thought it was a great line, too, and demonstrates Kill's straightforward, focus-on-what-reallymatters approach.

Another big crowd-pleaser was the team singing the Aggie fight song.

For much of the event, the

Local lawmakers claim greater power

Three years ago, none of the committees in the New Mexico House of Representatives were chaired by a member from Las Cruces. This year, our representatives lead three committees, including the one that writes the budget.

Nathan Small was elevated from vice-chair to chairman of the House Appropriations and Finance Committee, which is charged with writing the first draft of the state budget each year. Other changes included local Reps. Doreen Gallegos taking over as chair of the Commerce and Economic Development Committee and Joanne Ferrary taking over the Consumer and Public Affairs Committee. Gallegos had earlier been moved out of her position as majority whip.

On the Senate side of the Roundhouse there are two more Las Crucens. Joseph Cervantes returns as chairman of Judiciary, and Bill Soules as chairman of the Education Committee.

The committees are where the work gets done in the New Mexico Legislature. Some

bills are weeded out immediately. Others are amended or rolled into companion bills. The vast majority of bills introduced each year never make it out of committee, and almost nothing makes it through without changes.

The two most important committees are Finance and Judiciary. Every bill dealing with money goes through Finance; every bill dealing with law goes through Judiciary. The fact Las Cruces now has chairmen heading those committees in both the House and the Senate is a big deal.

That's especially true given the lack of representation Las Cruces specifically, and southern New Mexico in general, has had throughout the remainder of state government. Gov. Michelle

Lujan Grisham has consistently shown a bias toward her Albu-

querque home, and her new home of Santa Fe, when selecting for positions that do not have specific geographic requirements.

Las Crucens Karen Trujillo, as education secretary for six months, and Bill Mc-Camley, as workforce

secretary for two years, each had down here for disasters and stints in the governor's cabinet during her first term. Las Crucen Jeff Witte remains on the cabinet as agriculture secretary, but that position is constitutionally mandated to be based at New Mexico State University. Lt. Gov. Howie Morales is from Silver City, but he was elected by the voters, not appointed by the governor.

No judges or attorneys from Las Cruces have been appointed by Lujan Grisham to the Appeals Courts or the Supreme Court.

The new members of the now-

appointed Public Regulations Commission include one from Albuquerque, one who was raised in southern New Mexico but has been living in Washington, D.C., and one who came to the Legislature from Clayton but has been working in Santa Fe.

The fact we are four hours from the state capital means we will always be at a geographic disadvantage.

Governors typically only come photo ops. And so, we need to look to the Legislature to make sure our interests are not being ignored.

Kill has worn it proudly since, particularly to fight

the chill in Detroit during the Quick Lane Bowl visit.

Kill, his coaches and his players have learned it doesn't matter how you look or what people think of you.

If you work hard and give it your best effort, you're not guaranteed victory.

But you'll almost always be in the game.

Every mountain of trash has a huge portion of food waste. While the South Central Solid Waste Authority's (SCSWA) mission is the safe disposal of trash, it must also work to mitigate the effects of decaying food waste, which usually means the production of methane that comes from landfills. Landfills produce the third largest methane emissions in the United States. according to the U.S. Environmental **Protection Agency** (EPA). Methane's presence in the atmosphere affects Earth's temperature and climate, and per the EPA, food is the single largest category of material placed in municipal landfills.

SCSWA diverts
methane produced
at the Corralitos
Landfill through
pipes running
throughout the
landfill and
processes it into
energy to power the
diversion system.

"We encourage residents to reduce their food waste before it hits our landfills," said Patrick Peck, SCSWA executive director. "Sometimes taking steps toward reduction include education,

Said CMI Department Head Amy Lanasa: "(Jon Sepp) has believed in and contributed to this vision since before his amygdala was fully developed. This ranking certainly wouldn't have been possible without the work that he and his staff (which includes Andrew Jara, another CMI alumnus) have done.

Regional, national issues affect local gas

Issues affecting natural gas hundreds of miles from Las Cruces are causing an increase in costs for consumers in Doña Ana County.

Maintenance issues on pipelines from the Permian Basin to the east are forcing Las Cruces Utilities (LCU) to obtain natural gas from the northwest in the San Juan Basin, where lower-thannormal storage levels caused prices to jump as much as 89 percent in December.

LCU obtains natural gas from two separate areas: the Permian Basin and the San Juan Basin, according to a news release from the city of Las Cruces.

"Unfortunately, the El

Paso Natural Gas line that provides LCU natural gas from the Permian Basin can currently only provide a limited supply of natural gas because of line maintenance issues," the release stated. "This means LCU must obtain additional natural gas from the San Juan Basin, which is much more expensive at this time. This affects the price LCU must pay for natural gas, which in turn, impacts customers' bills."

Lower storage levels are a nationwide issue, according the U.S. Energy Information Administration EIA, which noted there was record consumption of natural gas in the electric power sector in 2022.

In its daily snapshot of

regional energy prices on Jan. 24, the EIA reflected natural gas price increases in nine of its 10 measured regions, ranging from 2.8 percent to 18.1 percent. The 18.1 percent increase was in its Southwest region.

The Las Cruces cost increase will be reflected in the January utility bill customers will receive, LCU said, adding the cost of natural gas is directly passed on to LCU customers.

To ease the potential effect, LCU is offering customers additional payment plans related to the price increases. LCU customers who have any questions can call 575-541-2111 to work out a payment.

LCU has also provided

an insert in January utility bills related to the cost of natural gas. The insert encourages LCU customers to be mindful of their energy use to manage their bills.

LCU orders its baseload of natural gas to get utility customers through each month. The utility then keeps an eye on the city's demand compared to the baseload, and then adjusts the requested supply accordingly.

Some measures LCU recommends to keep homes warm include keeping windows and doors – especially garage doors – closed. Upgrading thermostats to smart, energy efficient models is recommended, as well as simply setting the thermostat lower.



Winter Gas Prices: Continue to be cautious of your natural gas usage

Heating your house, showering, cooking and even doing laundry are a few of the many ways you may be using natural gas in your home.

As your natural gas usage rises during the winter months, the price you have been paying has also been rising.
As Las Cruces Utilities (LCU) highlighted in the October 28, 2022, Las Cruces Bulletin article, natural gas prices are on the rise globally, and it's important to make sure your budget is prepared for these out of norm increases.

LCU has been working hard to ensure they are watching natural gas price forecasts and purchasing at the best rates possible. "Prices have gone higher in the past. The difference now is that the price increase is not just lasting a day or two, but it is staying high for longer periods of time," LCU Gas Business

Analyst Mario Puentes stated.

The Southwest and West Coast are feeling the brunt of these increased prices a little more than the rest of the nation. One reason for the increased costs is the colder than normal weather in high populated western regions. When major winter storms hit, such as the one that hit the nation this past December, it affects the pricing, transportation, and extraction of natural gas. Other reasons include the increased use of natural gas to generate electricity, the export of liquefied natural gas (LNG) overseas, and geopolitical events such as the war in Ukraine.

LCU purchases a portion of winter gas supply in layers or batches to create a portfolio of gas supply with the objective of achieving a manageable average price. But it must buy more gas when the weather gets colder and

daily prices currently are dynamic, e.g., "From one day to the next, prices jumped from \$7.75 to \$19.66 per dekatherm and continue to rise in areas like the California border where the price increased to \$22.00 per dekatherm," Puentes pointed out. "In November, prices were between \$7.00 and \$13.00 per dekatherm, but in December prices were between \$24.00 and \$44.00 per dekatherm," Puentes stated.

If possible, LCU advises replacing your older appliances to energy efficient models and making sure your home insulation is up to date.
LCU also recommends
keeping all windows,
doors, and especially your
garage door closed to
help keep the heat inside
your home. Upgrading
your thermostat to a
smart, energy efficient
thermostat is also
something you can do
easily to assist in keeping
your energy bills within
your budget.

It is important for you to know that LCU does not like the current price environment. It is a priority for LCU to alert you of any major changes in the market, so you are prepared for your monthly bill. "In my 30 plus years in this industry, I had not experienced market dynamics like we see today, but LCU will continue to ensure it provides a reliable natural gas supply to our customers," Puentes concluded.

Rush Allen Creating film fest poster

Rush Allen has been "doing art" his whole life.

The young artist, 29, has been chosen to create the artwork for the Las Cruces International Film Festival this year and is busy creating color layers, and building chroma on the upcoming work which will culminate with a poster release party Feb. 11.

Growing up in Las Cruces, Allen took all the art classes he could through school and even bought himself a silk screen press. He started creating his own brand and realized he needed to know more about all the programs.

"So, when I went to college, I went into graphic design," he said.

After earning his associate's degree in digital graphics at Doña Ana Community College, he followed up at New Mexico State University with a bachelor's in fine arts.

Interspersing graphic design freelance work with his art studies and creations, Allen has built a substantial collection of experience and completed a wide variety of work. His love and specialty, though, is painting oil portraits with classical realism.

"It's nice to have a balance," he said. "My bachelor's was more contemporary and modern - then I did a school semester in Italy, that was in From modernist work to classical realism to graphic

Florence, and that's when I started getting into traditional mediums and look-

ing more into art history." With Italy in his mind, he wanted to return to Europe. That led to spending sessions at Studio Escalier (a traditional studio learning environment atelier) in France working from live models and continuing his art education.

"In Paris, I was doing figure drawings in the morning and then I would go the Louvre and draw there," he said.

Then he came home and the following week, Covid shut down the world.

Allen's classical realism portraits are full of light and character, the detail keeps going the deeper you look into the pieces. They are painted from live half his time in Santa Fe, models in stages.

"The models end up becoming my friends," he said. "The whole thing is you are trying to communicate and express the experience that you have with the model. That's why you work from life, because you are not copying, you are trying to represent a moment in time.

"You want to capture the light effect and the character of who they are. Everyone is in a different state of mind and that's what you are trying to capture with working from life."

Allen considers realism one of the biggest challenges for an artist. But that just makes him like it more. It's about thinking and analyzing things deeply and understanding nature and how everything is interconnected.

"Every person is a puzzle with unique features," he said. "Every painting is just a new puzzle you have to figure out - the hue, value, chroma, structure, composition, light effect."

Today, Allen spends working at a sister studio to the one in Paris.

He sells his work through people he knows and supports his income with graphic design work. His paintings can be found in Crossland Gallery in El Paso; Laguna Beach, California; Kansas City, Missouri; and more.

For the film festival poster, Allen said he is pulling together a different references, combining everything together to

reflect the roots of film in New Mexico.

"The reason [the film industry] came here was for the light and the landscape," he said. "And then what brought everyone to know New Mexico is films like the westerns, so I wanted to pull a little bit of narrative into that."

Since he went to NMSU, the poster will also symbolize a message for the students.

"I wanted to represent the journey of life," Allen said. "Since I grew up here, I have always seen the Organs, the contour, as basically a metaphor for life. They change and they grow and so it feels like the different paths of life. There's always peaks and valleys."

Film festival organizer Ross Marks said local artists have designed the official poster for eight years in a row.

"We give the artist total freedom," Marks said. "You create what you want, tap into whatever inspires you and moves you. It's one of my favorite parts of the film festival to see what the artists create."

Marks said the hints he has seen previewing the 2023 poster makes him believe it could be one of the best.







At its Jan. 17 regular meeting, the Las Cruces City Council adopted a resolution establishing the City of Las Cruces Small Business Store Front Repair Program.

Through the program, eligible small businesses and nonprofits can apply for grants of up to \$2,500 to help repair storefront property damage that occurred on or after Jan. 1, 2021, the city said in a news release.

Funds can be used to pay for current or past property damage.

Grant applications begin Feb. 1, 2023. The city Economic Development Department (EDD) will continue to accept applications until all funding is spent.

The city allocated up to \$400,000 in federal American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding for the program.

Eligible property damage includes broken windows, doors and locks; graffiti, etching on windows; and damage to landscaping, the city said. Grant funds will not cover stolen goods or preventive measures such as guards, cameras or window or door coverings, the city said.

To be eligible for funding, a business or

nonprofit must have a current business license or nonprofit registration, operate within the city and be currently open to the public, have 40 or fewer full-time employees as of March 15, 2020; be a locally owned, noncorporate franchise or chain business; must have experienced direct economic disruption due Covid-19, must provide a copy of the police report showing damages due to vandalism and proof of repairs to doors, windows and locks.





Valuable lessons from favorite golf quotes

As we start the new year 2023, "hope springs eternal" for nearly all golfers, looking forward to better golf, better scoring, better weather and a happier time on the golf course. With that in mind, I share a few of my favorite golfing quotations with some personal comments.

My first quote is from Ben Crenshaw, a 19-time winner on the PGA Tour, including two Masters, with the emotional second win in 1995, a week after his coach and mentor, Harvey Penick, passed away. "Golf is the hardest game in the world," Crenshaw said. "There is no way you can ever get it. Just when you think you do, the game jumps up and puts you in your place." You don't need to remind both Jordan Spi-

eth and Colin Morikowa about that. Morikowa had as much a nine-shot lead with 17 holes to go in the final round of the Sentry Tournament of Champions in early January, until he had a meltdown, and lost to John Rahm, who shot 61. Spieth shared the first-round lead at 6-under in the Sony Open Jan. 12; then he shot 5-over in the second round and missed the cut by one. We all have meltdowns occasionally, but not for millions of dollars, thankfully.

My next quote is from the late, great Arnold Palmer, who passed in 2016: "Golf is deceptively simple and endlessly complicated. It satisfies the soul and frustrates the intellect. It is at the same time rewarding and maddening - it is with-

out a doubt the greatest game mankind has ever invented."

I suppose that is exactly why so many of us are addicted to golf. One dav. after a sadly inept round we wonder



why we even go out and play; and then the next round we play brilliantly and score a personal best, giving us our answer why we play.

The legendary golfer Bobby Jones is highly quotable but this is my favorite: "Golf is so much more fun when it is played well. I've always thought that if the game was worth playing at all, it was worth

making some effort to play to learn how to take care it correctly." I endorse Jones' attitude entirely. That was the idea when Herb Wimberly and I started Performance Golf Schools in 1999, with the thought that we desired to help golfers of all abilities to play their best. It is why I devote so much space in these writings to helpful tips so that readers can find ways to improve. Here's a thoughtful

quote from my all-time favorite golfer, Jack Nicklaus, who won 18 major championships, which, I believe, will never be equaled. "Let's look at the expression 'self-management.' What does that mean? I guess it means managing your assets to get the best out of them. Your health is an asset, so you owe it to yourself

of it. Your skill is an asset, so you must keep it honed. Your brain is an asset, so you must keep it exercised, challenged and sharp. Your attitude is also an asset - but only if you keep it positive. Physical fitness is an asset, so you make sure you remain physically fit. Your family is an asset, so you love and cherish your family. Life is an asset - so make the most of it and the best of it." From Jack's book, Golf and Life, 2002.

Ben Hogan was one of the most thorough students of the game from every aspect. His practice demonstrated a strong work ethic, so that his confidence in competition was rock solid. He sized golf up this way: "You can hit your shots great and

still shoot 80 every day because of poor management. The shots are 30 percent of the game. Judgment is 70 percent." And, of course, "judgment" referred to every golfing decision, awareness, estimation, astuteness, clear thinking and steady nerves.

Finally, here's some advice from former Notre Dame football coach Lou Holtz, which we all should strive to internalize: "Work hard, have a good attitude and practice in preparation for any opportunities."
