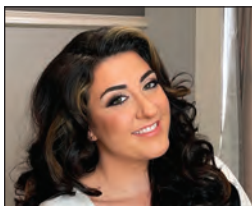

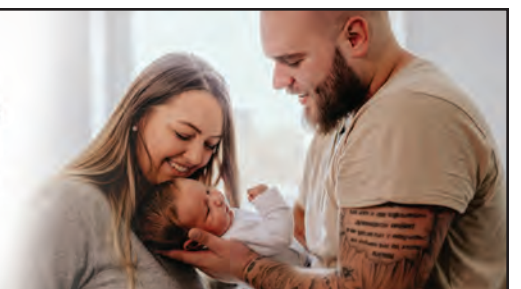

The State Treasurer's Investment Committee is an advisory committee that meets monthly to review the State's investment portfolios for statutory compliance, quality, diversification, maturity, and performance. The Committee also reviews portfolio controls and collateral adequacy and recommends investment procedural changes as well as changes to the State Treasurer's investment policy. The State's investment portfolio is currently worth over \$15 billion. As County Treasurer, Rodriguez manages Doña Ana County's \$200 million portfolio.

In partnership with the NMSU Dance Department, there also will be a master class presented on African dance, including multiple drummers, said NMSU Associate Provost for Student Success Patrick Turner.

Programming is also in partnership with the NMSU Athletics Department and the University of New Mexico, said Black Programs Interim Director Bobbie Green, also president of the Doña Ana County NAACP.

Echoing the message of civil rights leader Martin Luther King, Black History Month events will focus on nonviolence, Green said.

The month also will target Generation Z (generally defined as born between the mid- to late 1990s and the early 2010s).

"How can we better reach them?" Turner said,

recognizing that increasingly, younger people don't identify with a specific political party but are very connected to the social justice movement.

As Black History Month reflects, connecting all generations includes poetry, music, dance and spoken word, Turner said, and the need for "galvanizing people through social media."

Black Programs moved from Garcia Center to the second floor of Corbett Center last summer, said Green, Black Programs' fourth interim director since permanent director Festus Addo-Yobo left in 2019. Turner said NMSU interviewed two candidates for permanent director of the program in January.

NMSU said it will make an announcement soon regarding a permanent director for Black Programs.

The program continues weekly meetings with NMSU leadership, Turner said, to "keep making people accountable."

Green questioned why it was acceptable that NMSU has only one tenured faculty member who is black.

"The conversation about representation matters," Turner said. "Students of color need that familiar face." At the same time, Green said students who come into Black Programs' new office, "feel safe. It feels good. This is a victory. When I walk in here, I'm excited," she said.

"You fight every step of the way for something you deserve and reach for," Turner said. For more information, contact Black Programs at 575-646-4208 and blackpro@nmsu.edu.

LCU Hires First Hydrologist

With population growth and continued drought, the region will need to be proactive about securing its water future. For Las Cruces Utilities (LCU), that means hiring people with the experience to take the scientific data and help guide water operations. LCU's first hydrologist, Charles Neligh, will ensure that LCU has a broader understanding of its water system habitat.

“It’s complicated to think about underground water systems. There aren’t giant pools of water in caverns underground,” said Neligh. “When you drill a well, it’s helpful to have a hydrologist who can make decisions about water-bearing zones and formations and understands the creation and maintenance of a groundwater monitoring program.”

He explained that the lithology – the general physical characteristics of a rock or the rocks in a particular area – is more diverse than

what is pictured in elementary textbook, where there are even layers of rock.

“When we build a well, we continually look at the drill cuttings. What comes out is all different types of rocks, different shapes and sizes. Sometimes we can see how a specific type of rock lenses out and understand that we’re not running into the expected formations,” he said. “The depositional environment for an ancestral river valley can be more challenging.”

Growing up in Alaska and moving to New Mexico in his teens, Neligh was inspired to return to school at 28 after reading “Mining the Sky: Untold Riches from the Asteroids, Comets, and Planets.”

“Turns out there aren’t very many jobs for asteroid mining,” he said.

After graduating from New Mexico State University, Neligh realized there were two specific fields for hydrogeologists - the environmental and the

oil industry. He went “oil field adjacent,” working for a private consulting field on remediation projects for oil companies and drove a thousand miles easily in a week. Now Neligh is in the office, getting up to speed on foundational documents that LCU has set up for water policy and production, plus looking at sites for new wells and plans to rehabilitate old wells.

Deputy Director Water Ronald Borunda is excited to add Neligh to the team.

“Hiring a hydrologist enables LCU to build out its future development with a more holistic understanding of the scientific fundamentals that will

guide environmentally sound long-range planning,” said Borunda. “Neligh can ask new or tougher questions and give an extra set of eyes on how we approach designing our water system. Having him on our team is definitely groundbreaking for LCU and we’re hoping for great things in the near, and foreseeable, future.”

Neligh said, “I wanted to do something somewhere where it felt like more like a group effort. There are very smart people at LCU, and the nature of the work is fundamentally more cooperative than a private company. You’re working for the people.”

Getting back to face-to-face

The Greater Las Cruces Chamber of Commerce wrapped another edition of Las Cruces Days in Santa Fe, the usually annual event that was interrupted the last two years by the pandemic.

But there's nothing like face-to-face visits, especially with the legislators who are tasked with distributing taxpayer money.

At one of the events, State Sen. Joseph Cervantes made a pertinent observation during some remarks he made to the crowd.

"I may be one of only two Democrats left who own a business in Las Cruces," Cervantes said. He said it with a smile and, of course, it was an exaggeration, but it did point out somewhat of a disconnect between

Santa Fe and the Las Cruces business community.

Democrats handily control both the state House and the state Senate. We have a Democrat governor and almost exclusively Democrats in cabinet positions and other important roles of power in state government.

Increasingly, those Democrats are leaning more to the left, deemed by the common term "progressives." While there are still some more centrist, conservative Democrats in the state, the progressives have mounted several successful challenges in recent years to the old guard.

To Cervantes' point, a high percentage of business owners in New Mexico, and certainly in Las Cruces, are Republicans.

Knowing they have the power – meaning the votes – to pass pretty much anything they would like, will those Democrats listen to the concerns of Republican business owners, or the concerns of anyone politically right of them?

You always hope so, but that's the whole point of events like this. Citizens of all backgrounds and political stripes can meet face-to-face in an informal setting with their legislators, and let them know their concerns.

Several of our legislators saw presentations from the City of Las Cruces, Doña Ana County, New Mexico State University and Las Cruces Public Schools. It's important those legislators see the requests and the needs of those vital entities in our community. But it's also important for regular citizens to see those

needs and concerns.

Yes, there is a record amount of money in New Mexico's state budget this year, but it's still a finite amount. When you see the price tags of the projects being requested by the city, the county, the university and the school district, it's staggering. Much of it will not be addressed simply because the money won't stretch that far. And many of the needs are very basic: fixing crumbling roads and providing public safety. So, in some ways, this will be a more difficult session than one where there's no money to go around.

I know we all got used to Zoom during the pandemic, and we all text and email all the time.

But there's nothing like face-to-face visits, and Las Cruces Days in Santa Fe offer visits you can't find anywhere else.

New hope for beleaguered part of city

The city has had an extensive, detailed plan to revive the El Paseo corridor ever since 2009.

That was the year Las Cruces was one of a handful of cities selected by the federal government for a new program to revitalize economically depressed sections in core areas of the city. We were awarded \$2 million, which was enough to conduct a pretty thorough survey.

But the rules stipulated the money could only be used for planning. A plan without funding is an academic exercise. And so, in the 14 years since then, El Paseo Road has continued to deteriorate, with more businesses in primary locations boarding up their windows.

Now, there may finally be funding for new investment on the way for not only El Paseo but also its twin brother to the east, Solano Drive.

The City Council is in the process of designating the El Paseo and Solano corridor as a Metropolitan Redevelopment Area (MRA), a tool provided by the Legislature more than a decade ago and used to great advantage in revitalizing downtown Las Cruces.

The designation provides two means for raising revenue for new investment. A Tax Increment Development District allows all gross receipts taxes collected within the district to stay in the district, including the portion that would go to the state. For that reason, it requires approval from the Legislature. A Tax Increment Finance District increases prop-

erty taxes in the district, with the new money staying in the district.

The designation also allows loopholes to the state's detestable Anti-Donation Clause, allowing cities to buy and sell land, such as the plot where Plaza de Las Cruces now sits, and make investments in private developments.

When I moved here in 2000, Church and Water streets were both one-way roads looping around a section of Main Street that had been closed off for a downtown mall that nobody liked. The Rio Grande Theatre had been shut down for 13 years. The federal courthouse was still in the design phase. And, there was a bank on the land where the plaza now sits.

It took a coordinated effort that included help from both the state and federal governments,

but passage of the MRA provided a huge boost to downtown re-development, including funding to purchase the land and build the plaza.

The question is if the same support can be generated for an area of the city not as vital to the entire community. If businesses, residents and government all work together, the MRA is a tool that can make a real difference.

Country Club building: Should it stay or should it go?

EDITOR'S NOTE: The Las Cruces Country Club clubhouse building, more than 90 years old, is facing demolition. Some historians are distraught at the thought of losing it, but as of this writing, no viable plan has emerged to save it. Below are excerpted comments from historic preservationist Jo Ruprecht, via a letter; and from developer Randy McMillan, via an interview with the Bulletin's Mike Cook.

STAY ...

... The Trost Clubhouse has been checked by two structural engineers and deemed safe and still sound. ... We are now working with Randy McMillan as principal representative of the owners/developers to allow for documentation of the building as it currently exists. ... We have also let Mr. McMillan know about our interest in salvaging some parts of the structure, including distinctive interior elements and possibly the facade. ...

To have some sort of "win" here for historic preservation we need money and time. We've set

up a GoFundMe account and are also reaching out to the local community for help with the money question. The amount we need is minimally \$1,000 per a request by Mr. McMillan as buy-in from the community for documentation costs. Equipment and personnel costs will go beyond that figure ...

We need the City's help and Mr. McMillan's grace to have the time we need. ... The citizens who have been working earnestly on finding a win-win for historic preservation AND for the owners of the property, have been at this for less than four months. Despite our efforts, no one

has emerged with deep pockets and a shovel-ready project to breathe new life into the Trost Clubhouse. But, in some way, we've done more for this culturally significant building in a few months than others have done in a decade.

Here, finally, is MY ASK:

Is there some way now that you can help us by appealing to the grace of Mr. McMillan to postpone demolition until Feb. 7? That date would allow volunteers (more time) to accomplish the tasks outlined above with some allowance for winter weather.

"There's a lot of people out there who want to save this building and I understand that," Randy McMillan said in an interview about the building on land owned by McMillan and others who plan to demolish it as part of the site's commercial development.

"Ten years ago, that building was useable," McMillan said. "It's not now. It's in such bad shape it would cost more to use it than you could ever rent or sell it for. Trash in that building is knee deep."

Original development plans included utilizing the building, designed by El Paso architect Henry Trost in 1929, as an information center, McMillan said.

However, damage to the

building by trespassers, a collapsing roof and continued aging mean developers "don't have a use for it," he said.

"A half-dozen, self-appointed neighborhood association people" opposed development of the site when it was first proposed about 10 years ago, McMillan said. About 90 percent of the area's residents were in favor of development, he said, and urged developers to "do something before all the trees are dead."

"We told the city, if you want a park there, make us an offer," he said. The city offered \$1 million, McMillan said, which was "significantly less" than developers' investment in the property.

A decade later, the build-

ing contains "a foot of trash, bottles and human feces, and the ceilings are caving in. There's no way to save it," he said, and no one has proposed a plan to move the building to another site.

McMillan said developers hired an architect to do a three-dimensional drawing of the building so it could be reconstructed somewhere else. He also has provided copies of the original building plan.

"I've gone above and beyond," said McMillan, who said he attended a dance in the country club building when he was in junior high. "I offered to give them the building. To help tear it down and move it. If that's not enough, if people still want to blame me, so be it," he said.

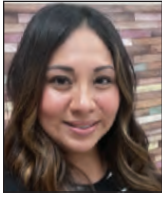

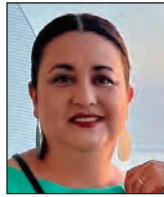

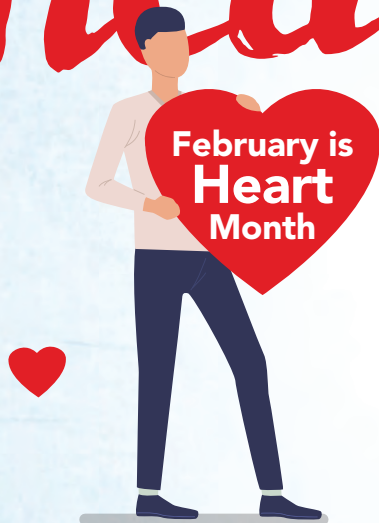

Thunder rolls

The United States Air Force Air Demonstration Squadron “Thunderbirds” returned to Spaceport America Jan. 9, for two weeks of winter training, according to a press release. This is the third visit to Spaceport America by the USAF display team since September 2021.

“Spaceport America is honored that the USAF Thunderbirds selected our site again for their winter training” said New Mexico Spaceport Authority’s Executive Director Scott McLaughlin. “The team of over 70 people have stayed in the local area for the last two weeks and have created a significant economic impact in this region. We wish the Thunderbirds the best of luck as they prepare for their display season, and we hope to see them back again soon.”

The Thunderbirds’ train-

ing season, from November through March, is a time to integrate and synchronize the team and practice the demonstration display. The 2023 winter training trip kicked off at Spaceport America and will continue to Edwards Air Force Base in California.

The team features six F-16 Fighting Falcons, the Air Force’s premier multi-role fighter aircraft. Assigned to Air Combat Command, the squadron is composed of 12 officers and more than 130 enlisted personnel serving in nearly 30 Air Force job specialties.

The USAF Thunderbirds have a rigorous schedule, performing hour-long demonstrations across the world for nearly 30 weekends between March and November. The team’s first public performance takes place Feb. 19, when they will perform a flyover at the Daytona 500.

Planes N' Coffee: Sharing fly-ins with community

The airplanes come in, flying from all around southern New Mexico and lining up on the runway at the Las Cruces International Airport. Single pilots and families flying together, descend, sometimes in groups and they want to share their love of flight with community members coming in from the street side of the airport.

Brett Hahn has been a pilot based at LCIA since he learned to fly in the 1990s and said he and fellow pilots want to connect the air community and welcome the rest of Las Cruces, so they came up with a monthly event for everyone.

“We wanted to do some-

thing that is more relevant to the community, so that's what the Rio Grande Planes N' Coffee is all about,” Hahn said. The next one is 9-11 a.m. Saturday, Feb. 4, at the airport, 8960 Zia Blvd.

Hahn's co-conspirator in the event, Jim Leon, owner of Jim Bob's BBQ at the airport, said after two months of holding the Planes N' Coffee event they have had plenty of participation.

“Some planes bring their whole family,” he said. “They come from Come from the El Paso airport or Santa Teresa. Also from Ruidoso, Truth or Consequences, Alamogordo and Silver City.”

There are groups of flyers that like to travel together out of El Paso, Alamogordo and beyond.

“That's usually how they travel,” Hahn said. “They call it the 100-dollar hamburger – by the time they fly up here and go back, it's 100 dollars.”

Leon provides the free coffee, makes the hamburgers, and his restaurant is the perfect place to hang out and chat about flight. The restaurant has been there for two years now in the space once known as the Crosswinds Grill.

Visitors also will see the numerous flight and airport related memorabilia that Leon has been collecting.

“The airport goes back to World War II aviation in southern New Mexico,” he said.

A tour around the lobby and restaurant space boasts a vintage para-

chute, artwork from the history of flight of the past, including posters from the facility's Wings and Wheels yearly event, navigational charts and a military wall.

Leon said they would like to expand the event to

be a joint planes and cars gathering.

“These kinds of Saturday morning get-togethers are done all up in the Midwest,” Hahn said. “Aviation enthusiasts get together on Saturdays; they have pancake break-

fasts; on Tuesdays they have flyouts every week. Aviation is a huge part of the culture there but not so much here. So we are trying to change that.

“It's paid for by the taxpayers, this is your airport, not my airport.”

One of the great challenges for an actor is to empathize with and find the humanity in a despicable character.

For David Giuntoli, who plays wheelchair-bound alcoholic in recovery and consummate selfish jerk Eddie Saville in the ABC ensemble drama "A Million Little Things," that was red meat into which to sink his acting chops.

"You know, there's this saying," the 42-year-old St. Louis area native explains, "(that) nobody thinks that they are a jerk – people think that from the outside. But people have motivations and behaviors come from psychologies and so you become this character as much as you can. ... It's like you don't judge your character, is what it is. Bad guys don't think they're bad."

As the series opens its fifth and final season Wednesday, Feb. 8, a sense of normalcy is just returning to Eddie's life when he receives a mysterious phone call from the woman who hit him that rocks his world. While Giuntoli could offer no further details on that lest he give away spoilers, the actor does disclose that Delilah (Stephanie Szostak) will return, as will the daughter she had with Eddie, Charlie.

Giuntoli feels fortunate to play such a rich character for five seasons and says he will miss Eddie and his castmates when filming wraps for good in March. For him, to end the series when it did feels right and he's glad showrunner DJ Nash got to do it his way.

"He didn't want it to go forever and ever and ever," Giuntoli says, "He wanted it to remain grounded as much as he possibly could. So the fun thing is you really get to write to a close and there are going to be some very satisfying endings of some storylines."

Review: 'Love, Loss and What I Wore' fabulous

Even in the dark, I knew I was going to like Black Box Theatre's production of "Love, Loss, and What I Wore."

The actors walked on stage with grace, confidence and even a bit of sparkle.

When the lights came up, there were five women standing on small rugs with colors and patterns as distinctive as their characters. Their costumes were all black, each uniquely and perfectly designed for that actor and that character.

From the first word to the final bow, what I knew I would like became what I could not help but love. I have seen many shows – and acted in a few – at BBT, and "Love, Loss, and What I Wore" will go down as one of my all-time favorites.

The passion and the energy of this show zoomed around the stage, as Nancy Clein Tafoya, Debbie Jo Felix, Jamie Bronstein, Autumn Gieb and Karen BuerdSELL portrayed multiple characters in monologues, dialogues and ensembles. Transitions were flawless and the chemistry was exceptional.

Just as the title suggests, the characters discussed marriage and divorce, the death of a child, breast cancer, prom dresses, motherhood, purses and over-filled closets.

They laughed, they cried, they searched for shoes, and

the audience was with them every moment.

I loved the tiny pauses that sometimes came between scenes – much as with the final reveal on the old "What's My Line" game show – as the actors looked at each other and we waited to see who would rise from her chair and speak next.

I loved that while the play is about women, it isn't a man-basher. It's not about fault or blame, it's about life:

sorrow and joy, tragedy and triumph.

I loved the intimacy of the actors. They listened to each other when they weren't speaking, reacting with nods and smiles, but never stealing focus, and always in support.

I loved the simple but elegant graphics appearing on the wall above the characters throughout the show. There was just enough to enhance the brilliant performances without overshadowing them.

I loved that this is a show without an intermission, without props or scenery, without costume changes. With a wonderful script by Nora Ephron, Delia Ephron and Ilene Beckerman and thoughtful direction by Ceil Herman, this production is about the outstanding performances of five talented actors.

Additional kudos to Peter Herman for his scenic and lighting designs, to the wonderful and amazing Deb Knapp for her choreography and to Bekah Taulbee for her faultless light, sound and projection work.

Remaining performances of "Love, Loss, and What I Wore" are 8 p.m. Friday-Saturday, Feb. 3-4 and 10-11; 2:30 p.m. Sunday, Feb. 5 and 12; and 7 p.m. Thursday, Feb. 9.

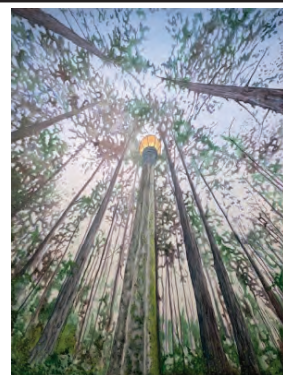

Injections may have multiple skincare benefits

Innovative Aesthetics uses 'Platelet-rich fibrin' to boost clients' healing

The healing properties of your own blood can be an important factor in having healthier skin.

Because she has her own lab, Innovative Aesthetics of Las Cruces founder Nora Medina can draw a client's blood and use it to create platelet-rich fibrin (PRF) injections. PRF treatments have many potential benefits, Medina said, including wound care, reducing surgical scars and acne scars and healing physical injuries.

Medina said she has seen "a real benefit" to

her clients from PRF injections, which can also help rejuvenate skin and reduce signs of aging. Research indicates PRF can also reduce hair loss.

PRF can be an important part of "healthy, quality skincare" for anyone, Medina said, no matter his or her skin type or skin color.

Medina, who is a certified esthetician (skin care technician), clinical medical assistant, laser technician and permanent makeup and paramedical tattoo artist, has written a paper on her trademarked PRF treatment regimen, which she recently presented at a medical convention in Las Vegas, Nevada, and will present at an international conference in London in June, she said.

PRF is a new technology, Medina said, and she would "like to see more physicians embrace it."

"I just want people to be happy with their skin," she said.

Often, three, once-monthly PRF injections will provide the results clients are looking for, Me-

dina said.

She charges \$35-\$190 for treatments.

Medina said she takes a holistic approach to her work, reviewing a client's health and lifestyle choices as they impact skin care.

"I treat the whole person," Medina said.

Medina was a finalist in the compromised skin category in the 2019 Skin Games, as she completed an eight-week case study of a Las Cruces client diagnosed with lupus. Medina used an aggressive treatment program that included exfoliation, chemical peels, micro-needling and hydration, along with dietary changes and dry-skin treatment that got the client's skin "to a really healthy space," she said.

Medina has an associates degree of applied science from New Mexico State University.

Medina has been in the skincare business for 16 years and has lived and worked in Las Cruces since 2014.

You may also know her as an actor and director in local theatre, where

NMSU Extension develops nutrition site

While most people strive to eat more nutritious foods on a daily basis, understanding how to accomplish that goal every day can be a challenge.

A new website has been designed to help users find easy ways to understand how to make better food choices. Recently, Innovative Media Research and Extension (IMRE) at New Mexico State University collaborated with NMSU’s Ideas for Cooking and Nutrition (ICAN) and a U.S. of Agriculture-funded program in Puerto Rico to create MyPlate-MyDay.org, a website that customizes daily meal plans, which incorporates foods from different cultures.

The site is an extension of MyPlate.gov, which the USDA established to help people understand how many servings to eat from different food groups using a food plate as the graphic representation. The food

plate replaced the food pyramid in 2011. Currently, IMRE, a department in NMSU’s Cooperative Extension Service, has developed two versions — New Mexico and Puerto Rico, both are available in English and Spanish.

“When you are thinking about what you eat each day, it’s important to do it with the foods you actually eat,” said IMRE Interim Department Head Barbara Chamberlin. “This tool offers tips, like putting veggies on a sandwich, and it helps you see how posole, burritos and other region-

ally specific foods fit into a healthy menu.”

With the site, users plan a day’s menu and receive visual prompts for foods they may need more of, such as vegetables, or limit, such as fats. The tool is a proactive site that guides users to experiment and practice thinking about their nutritional needs in an accessible way. MyPlateMyDay also is available on mobile devices.

“We use the site in our educational sessions – to extend learning and further explain the concepts we teach in class,” said ICAN Director Donna Sauter. “MyPlateMyDay really benefits our participants by providing an easy-to-use tool that will help with planning healthy meals that includes familiar

foods.”

In developing MyPlate-MyDay, Chamberlin said designers worked to solve frustrations users faced with MyPlate. Challenges included planning for an entire day and how to achieve the recommended servings; determining how to categorize combination foods such as chicken noodle soup; and handling unique foods such as posole (a soup or stew with hominy and, traditionally, pork), malinga and yucca (both ARE root vegetables originating in South America).

Additionally, the site can be customized for age groups.

The Puerto Rico version of the site was tailored to Puerto Rican culture, which often includes items such as fried plantain (cooking bananas), mofongo (plantains are the main ingredient) and sancocho (a traditional soup), said Maria L. Plaza-Delestre, associate professor in the Department of Food Science and Technology Program at the University of Puerto Rico. New Mexicans can find their foods on the site, and the design team hopes to expand the tool to other specific menus. Visit myplatemyday.org.

18 helpful golf tips presented by your golf shrink

Today I'm going to add to the untold number of golf tips that have been offered through the ages. The theme is "if you want to shrink your handicap, listen to your shrink." In this case your intrepid Dr. Golf is your shrink. Eighteen is a good number in golf, so these are concise.

1. Book a golf lesson with a PGA pro every so often. Have your pro look at and video both your swing and your putting in order to give you honest helpful feedback and suggestions.

2. Carry several new golf gloves in your bag. When one glove gets soggy, let it dry and put on a fresh, dry one so your hands don't slip. Check out sales and buy in bulk.

3. Use a chalk line and a string line for putting practice. For those testy putts from 4 to 8 feet you need your eyes directly over the ball and the putter going straight back and through.

4. Get your eyes checked every 24 to 36 months by an optometrist or ophthalmologist, especially if you are over 45. As we get older, vision often becomes a problem. Had Ben Hogan's aging eyes been better, no telling how many more majors he would have won.

5. Add at least 15 more yards to your drive. Of course, this is golf's Holy Grail, but you can't score unless you get your drive in position to attack the green. One way you do this is getting stronger, and gym workouts are a must for sure. Also, refer to tip no. 1 above.

6. When you buy new

clubs have them fitted. The latest clubs have a lot of variations, like loft, lie angle, shaft length, stiffness and more. Fitting helps with balls and putters also.

7. Use a laser rangefinder or GPS device or both. They give you distance and speed up play.

8. Devote half your practice time to putting and chipping, since half your strokes are there.

9. For chip shots near the green, keep the ball low and running. Leave the high flop shots to the big-money pros. Consider using a hybrid to run the ball up if you're on shorter

grass.
10. Take a break from Facebook or YouTube and read some great classic golf books.

11. Replace your long irons with hybrids. Unless you are a legitimate scratch handicap you shouldn't carry anything stronger than a 6 iron in your bag.

Hybrids are a whole lot easier to hit, and go longer and higher, for folks with swing speeds under 100.

12. Spend some time practicing with alignment sticks or clubs on the ground when on the range. Two sticks, placed like rails, will help aim your

feet, hips, eyes, arms and shoulders.

13. Keep track of your stats. Most amateurs only look at score. If you're serious about golf you should know your numbers. Chart your fairways hit, GIR's, up-and-down saves, putts and so on. You will find this will highlight your strengths and will direct your practice effort.

14. Pack light when taking a golf trip. Airlines charge for golf clubs, except for Southwest. I keep a nice set of golf clubs with faraway family members so I don't have to drag them around for visits there. Pack things like rainwear, caps and shoes

in your golf bag, and secure the clubs in a rolling travel bag with an extendable Club Glove Stiff Arm for protection.

15. If you are a business executive organize (and pay for) a corporate golf outing with a cursory meeting. Take your company employees and sales force out for a day of golf; even a member-guest affair, whether locally or at a resort. Do it with class and it will go a long way to keeping your key employees and even your clients happy and impressed.

16. Buy an adjustable driver if your clubs are still in the dark ages. The ever-quickenning pace of

technology means clubs get outdated in only a few years. You can adjust the loft, face angle and launch trajectory with a simple manufacturers tool.

17. Dress sharp like you're a golfer and honor the game. No jeans, t-shirts or flip-flops.

18. But you don't always have to adhere strictly to the book. There are 24 Rules of golf in the USGA book. I have one extra - "rule 25": Have fun.
