








OUR MISSION

Our programs encourage both the athlete and the beginner to participate within their own 5-year age category starting from 50-54 and going up to 90+. Senior Olympics in Doña Ana County is a volunteer group, with support coming from your modest registration fees. We offer 20+ events with opportunities for singles, doubles and mixed doubles play. When participating in any of our events, each person is covered by an athlete insurance policy. Your age group for competition is the age you are on Dec. 31 of the registration year.



Prominent Las Cruces Senior Olympian Jayne Milavec

ayne Milavec, age 61, has been a vibrant figure in the New Mexico Senior Olympics for almost a decade. Her moto and mantra is: "To stay fit, healthy, and happy while doing activities that I love!"

A resident of Las Cruces since 1991, Jayne began her Senior Olympics experience by competing in the 2015 Doña Ana County Senior Olympics (DACSO). She came home with multiple medals in swimming, track and field, power walk and other recreation events. She has since continued to compete and medal at all the county, state and national games every year they were held. At the national games in 2022 in Fort Lauderdale, Florida, Jayne broke the 1500 meter power walk record with a winning time of 9:55.20 for females age 60-64 and also came in first for the 5K power walk. That year New Mexico placed 19th in the United States for participants attending the games. The athletes that year brought back a total of 121 medals!

When asked which swimming events she competed in, she immediately answered: "All of them!" As an example of her success in the games, in 2018 she compiled 15 medals in swimming events alone. She has several racks of medals hanging in her home that she has earned over the years. Having brought home dozens each year, those racks are full.

Jayne has a rigorous training regimen that she fits into her busy life. On her days off, working as a nurse, she runs for 1-1/2 hours and swims for 1-1/2 to 2 hours. On the days she works, she does only one or the other. She also runs a marathon each year. Her eyes light up when she states that she loves to run and swim and "could be in the water all day!" Always interested in improving her times, she said, "Every year my swim times are less and less. By the time I am 90, I'll be really good!"

Living life to its fullest, Jayne is a good natured, active mother, wife, nurse and volunteer, besides being an incredible athlete. She grew up in an energetic family with six sisters and a brother. She credits her mother for encouraging a healthy, fun competition with each other in a variety of sports. Jayne has always enjoyed running. She swam and ran track in high school. Her husband, Anton, son Justin, and daughter, Micaela, are also all active in sports. Anton competes in the Senior Olympics as well, and together they won a medal in the couples dance event in Swing/ Jitterbug. Their church is an important part of their lives. Jayne and Anton, a dentist by profession, have traveled to India and Costa Rica as missionaries with Doña Ana Community College with the School of Hygiene.

With no plans of taking it easy after she retires, she wants to continue with what she is doing and incorporate more biking, pickleball, yoga and ballroom dance into her life.

Jayne not only competes, she is a volunteer member of the DACSO board that organizes and runs the local games every year. Between competing in her many activities at the games, she is the event manager for both Pickleball and Fun and Rec.

When asked if she had any advice for anyone considering to compete in the Doña Ana County Senior Olympics, she simply said, "Find an activity you love."


