Hundreds to descend on LC for pecan conference

The Western Pecan Growers Association's (WPGA) 57th annual conference, Sunday, March 5-Tuesday, March 7, in Las Cruces will include an educational program covering every aspect of the pecan industry, from shelling to selling.

Pecan experts from across the United States will discuss the current pecan market, irrigation, mechanical pruning, weather, two new pecan varieties, pecan research, pecan pests and more.

"This is a really good group of speakers," said New Mexico State University pecan specialist Richard Heerema, Ph.D., who coordinated the conference's educational

programming along with WPGA Director John White.

The conference keynote, "State of the Industry: The World is Going Nuts for Pecans," will be delivered by American Pecan Council President Alex Ott of Fort Worth to kick off the conference.

National Pecan Federation Chair Larry Don Womack of De Leon, Texas, and National Pecan Shellers Association Chair Steve Zaffarano of Atlanta, Georgia, will present "Advocating for Pecans."

University of Arizona Extension Meteorologist (emeritus) Paul Brown, Ph.D., will present "Consumptive Water Use of Pecans and Winter/Spring Weather Update."

Other presentations will include:

- "Insect Pests in the News," presented by state Entomologist Tiffany Johnson of the New Mexico Department of Agriculture in Las Cruces;

- "Finding Fungi: A Study on the Fungal Communities in Pecan Orchard Soils in the Southwestern U.S.," NMSU masters student McKenzie Stock;

- "How can we Manage Irrigation for the Benefit of Both Farm and Aquifer?" Sam Fernald, Ph.D., NMSU professor of watershed management and director of the New Mexico Water Resources Research Institute;

- "Comparison of Deep Percolation and Yield in Pecan Fields Under Different Irrigation Systems," NMSU Ph.D. student Jorge Preciado;

"A Changing Market

Environment: Potential Impacts for Pecans," Jay Lillywhite, Ph.D., assistant dean of economic and rural development at NMSU;

- "New USDA Pecan Variety Releases: 'Zuni', 'Pueblo' and 'Seneca,'" Xinwang Wang, Ph.D., pecan research geneticist with USDA pecan breeding and genetics, College Station, Texas. Heerema noted that two of the new varieties "are named after significant American tribes in the state of New Mexico." New pecan varieties "are really promising for the western region," he said.

- "Picturing Pecans: Detecting and Predicting Pecan Tree Characteristics," Warren Chatwin and Angelyn Hilton, both Ph.Ds. and pecan research geneticists at College Sta-

tion, Texas.

The conference will also include the Pecan Food Fantasy contest, which has 16 categories with cash prizes of up to \$1,000 for the best pecan pie and other pecan recipes and is open to everyone. The WPGA banquet on Monday night will include an auc-

tion of the Food Fantasy contest prize-winning dishes, with proceeds benefiting the WPGA scholarship fund.

There also will be an exhibition of the pecan industry's latest innovative products and services, a trade show and a corn hole

Feb. 25 forum offers vital benefits info to veterans

The Las Cruces Vet Center, the VFW New Mexico Foundation and VFW Post #6917 will host a PACT (Honoring our Promise to Address Comprehensive Toxics) Act forum about new health care and other benefits for veterans, 9 a.m.-1 p.m. Saturday, Feb. 25, at the Las Cruces Con-

vention Center, 680 E. University Ave., the vet center said in a news release.

The event will provide veterans, their families, caregivers and survivors important information about the PACT Act and encourage them to apply for toxic exposure-related health care and benefits they have earned, the

news release said.

Albuquerque VA Regional Benefits Office Director Cesar Romero will be one of the speakers. Local VA staff will be on site to help veterans apply for benefits, complete toxic exposure screenings and enroll in VA health care in compliance with the PACT Act of 2022, a

new law that expands VA health care and benefits for veterans exposed to burn pits and other toxic substances, the news release said.

To help expedite and complete claims, attendees should bring the following documents, if available: medical records/medical evidence (doctor

or hospital reports), any documents that provide historical or military information needed for the disability being claimed, discharge or separation papers (DD 214 or equivalent and dependents' records (marriage certificate, death certificate, child's birth certificates)). Spouses/widows may be eligible for dependency and indemnity compensation when a veteran dies because of a presumptive disability, the vet center said.

"Because these conditions have already taken a serious toll on so many Veterans and their families, we are considering all conditions established in the PACT Act to be presumptive on Aug. 10, 2022, the date the bill was

signed into law," Romero said.

The PACT Act expands and extends eligibility for VA health care for veterans with toxic exposures and veterans of the Vietnam, Gulf War and post-9/11 eras; adds more than 20 new presumptive conditions for burn pits and other toxic exposures; adds more presumptive-exposure locations for Agent Orange and radiation; Requires the U.S. Veterans Administration to provide a toxic exposure screening to every veteran enrolled in VA health care; and helps the VA improve research, staff education and treatment related to toxic exposures. Sure, we're all going to die eventually, but isn't that all the more reason to start living and living your best life?

Things going on in our vibrant community supported my optimistic view.

In this week's Bulletin, you'll

find a center section called Active Aging, which has a lot of good information to help us all age better.

For a story in the section, I had the good fortune of interviewing Hannah Cole and some of the dancers at her SOL Ballroom. The

dancers are of all ages and abilities, but each of them found a healing power in dance, and it was reflected in the smiles on their faces.

On our front page, you've got the irrepressible Marci Dickerson, one of a group of Cancer Warriors for Las Cruces, who have decided to turn the pain and struggle of their cancer journeys into something that can help others.

Starting soon in Doña Ana

County are the Senior Games. We had a program in our Feb. 10 edition, listing all the different events and opportunities for people 50 and older. It's a great way to hold yourself accountable to your exercise, but also, according to everyone I've talked with regarding the Senior Games, it's also an important social exercise, a place where people have made friends for life.

Of course, you don't have to be part of something organized to stay young at heart. My colleague Christy Anchondo has a small bumper sticker on her vehicle that says simply, "Beat Yesterday." Christy is an avid bicyclist and runner, but she's not trying to set any world records. She's following the advice from her Garmin watch, which tracks her exercise, to try and do better than yesterday's time.

Also in this week's Bulletin is a piece about Families & Youth Innovations Plus, the LC3 Behavioral Health Collaborative and Apple, working with people in the community to create a mental health app. There's been an increased focus in our society on mental health awareness, probably something that's overdue. This app could help people work on their own mental health.

Every week in our publication, we have information on events that are great things to get you out and get you active. Whether it's going to an Aggie softball game, attending a local play or concert, or just browsing at the library, gallery or museum, doing things either by yourself or with others can help make that one day closer to death better than yesterday.

Legislature considers waiting period for guns

Change at the New Mexico Legislature usually comes in small steps taken over a long period of time. That's especially true with gun laws.

The last significant changes came in 2019 with a bill to expand background checks and 2020 with one to allow the courts to file an emergency order temporarily taking guns from those proven to be at risk to themselves or others.

This year, I had high hopes for House Bill 101, which would ban assault rifles and high-capacity magazines. It cleared its first committee fairly early in the process, with a change that would allow current gun owners to keep their weapons.

But it seems that bill may be a step too far this year.

During a recent interview on KTAL-LP community radio, Miranda Viscoli of New Mexicans For the Prevention of Gun

Violence expressed both support for the bill and doubt that it will make it through this year. And so, their focus is on other bills.

One of them is Senate Bill 427 sponsored by Sen. Joseph Cervantes, D-Las Cruces, who is chairman of the Senate Judiciary Committee. It would require a 14-day waiting period after the initiation of the federal background check before a gun could be transferred.

"That's a game-changer in terms of suicide prevention and homicide prevention," Viscoli said, noting that many suicides are impulsive and that 59 percent of all gun deaths in New Mexico are by people taking their own lives.

Nine states now require waiting periods, including conserva-

tive Florida, which was moved to act following the Parkland school shooting in 2018, back when the American public still had some capacity for shock and horror.

A 2017 study published in the National Library of Medicine found that waiting periods reduce homicide rates by an average of 17 percent. But the larger impact is on suicide rates.

Oftentimes, suicide attempts are cries for help. Those who attempt to take their lives by other methods have a much better chance of having those cries heard than those with access to a gun.

Another effective way to reduce both suicides and accidental shootings is to require proper gun storage. We don't have a law covering that, but House Bill 9

would at least hold gun owners responsible if their weapon was used by a minor in a way that would threaten or endanger others. It narrowly passed the House and is now in the Senate.

Opponents argued that keeping guns out of the hands of toddlers would put domestic violence victims in grave danger. And so, you can understand why the prospects for passing an assault weapons ban this session are bleak.

At 114, NAACP's legacy of battling injustice continues

The National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) was founded on Feb. 12, 1909, as a direct result of the outrage sparked by lynchings and other egregious acts of injustice. Now, 114 years later, the NAACP has 2,200 units nationwide, and more than two million members.

The players are different now, but the battle continues. The founders of the NAACP have long since passed on, but the torch has been handed down through generations. It wasn't always legal for Black folks to read and write. Even now, books that simply tell the story of Black history are being banned throughout the country.

Nonetheless, there is hope. The descendants of slaves are now the educated leaders of the most powerful civil rights organization in this country, at the national, state and local levels. As the president of the local NAACP, I am keenly aware of my obligation to organize when it becomes necessary, to speak up when

Students are being shielded from reading about Black history at school, yet they are not protected from the threat of gun violence and mass killings at those same schools. We have work to do.

circumstances demand it, and to educate both inside the classroom and outside the classroom. The legacy I inherited from those who came before me dictates I must fulfill this obligation.

My lived experiences are such that I cannot ignore the systemic injustice happening at the national level or when it hits closer to home. The minority-serving university in my own backyard has historically been a revolving door for marginalized Black faculty, staff and students. Black students have been historically underrepresented, underfunded and underserved. That is part of our local Black history too.

So, I look to the legislative actions that have historically helped secure political, educational, social, and economic equality in the past. This has worked before. It will work again. So, I have no choice but to seek meaningful changes and improve the conditions for students in my own backyard. That is the least I can do.

How could civic engagement strengthen community safety?

The League of Women Voters, a nonpartisan organization, encourages citizens to be civically engaged in their communities. Every community has problems, some being common throughout our state and nation. These problems include lack of affordable housing, health care, food security and safety. To solve the problems, government, businesses, nonprofits and academic institutions need to work together. But individuals can also contribute by volunteering with civic organizations and using their voices to help find solutions and to encourage others to do the same. That is authentic civic engagement.

We all want to feel safe in our homes, work and communities. The League supports safety practices for law enforcement officers and the communities they serve. It also supports policies for law enforcement that build public trust and positive collaborative relationships through engagement with community members. One form of engagement could involve an independent community oversight committee as a vehicle for sharing information about policing issues and increasing the flow of information to the public.

Several Las Cruces citizens have developed a proposed ordinance for a Civilian Police Oversight Board, which

they want the city council to consider. But oversight agencies are not always effective and may even exacerbate tensions among local officials, law enforcement, and activists. They need to be empowered with appropriate tools and they require collaboration among other government and community efforts. This would include ongoing training for members of the oversight committee and for police officers.

We know that police officers have a challenging job protecting residents of a community and they generally serve us well. Law enforcement agencies have begun to make changes to improve their services. In Las Cruces, the police department now provides racial bias training and prohibits the use of chokeholds and other types of excessive force.

Seeking external review of complaints about the police, the City of Las Cruces contracted in March 2021 with the California-based OIR Group to provide audit reports of completed Las Cruces Police Department (LCPD) internal affairs complaints. The third audit report is scheduled to be presented at the City Council meeting Monday, Feb. 27. These reports provide the council and members of the public with information about the handling of police matters. Previous re-

ports are linked on the Council's website. OIR reported in August that the LCPD had responded favorably to feedback provided by the auditor. For example, LCPD is collecting more complete information about the demographics of those involved in incidents and about the outcomes of complaints. The LCPD is also expanding its review process concerning the use of force.

Is this type of external review sufficient? Or could an independent community oversight committee partner with law enforcement to increase safety and improve quality of life for all residents? How, specifically, would an effective committee be designed in our community?

The community's voice is essential for solving local problems. Community oversight focused on safety is one example of civic engagement with one complex problem. The League encourages individuals to become more civically engaged with issues of importance to them.

Torres Small nominated as USDA deputy secretary

President Jo Biden has nominated former U.S. Rep. Xochitl Torres Small of Las Cruces as deputy secretary of the United States Department of Agriculture.

The Feb. 15 nomination “reflects the Biden-Harris administration’s commitment to rural prosperity, advancing equity and making USDA the best place to work,” said USDA Sec. Tom Vilsack.

Torres Small was confirmed by the U.S. Senate as USDA undersecretary for rural development in

October 2021.

If again confirmed by the U.S. Senate, Torres Small will replace Jewel H. Bronaugh as second in command at USDA.

“I’m honored to be considered for the role of deputy secretary for USDA,” Torres Small told the Bulletin. “From growing up in New Mexico, to representing my home in Congress, to serving as undersecretary for rural development, I’ve seen the hard work in rural America that supports our nation. That’s why rural people deserve every opportunity

to thrive in the places they call home. If confirmed, I look forward to continuing to chart a course to deliver on the Biden-Harris administration’s historic investments in rural America, to drive investments in the next generation of workforce, and to ensure USDA is well-equipped to best serve the American people, now and into the future.”

Torres Small was elected to the U.S. House of Representatives in November

2018 to represent New Mexico’s Second Congressional District. She lost reelection in 2020.

“The granddaughter of farmworkers, Torres Small grew up in the borderlands of New Mexico. She has worked as a Field Representative for Sen. Tom Udall, D-N.M., clerked for U.S. District Court Judge Robert C. Brack and served as an attorney practicing water and natural resources law,” the White House said in a news release about Torres Small’s nomination to be deputy

secretary.

Torres Small is married to New Mexico State Rep. Nathan Small of Las Cruces. A graduate of the University of New Mexico School of Law, Torres Small “became the first woman and first person of color to represent New Mexico’s second congressional district,” the news release said.

“Throughout her career, Torres Small has put her experience to use in the name of making lasting investments in the people, institutions and infrastructure essential for tribal

nations and communities throughout the rural U.S. to thrive,” Vilsack said. “Her expertise will further USDA’s mission to advance equity and opportunity in and for rural America, and USDA’s commitment to build an organization invested in the success of its workforce and the customers we serve.”

“Congratulations to my friend Xochitl Torres Small on her nomination as USDA deputy secretary,” said U.S. Ben Ray Lujan, D-N.M., who served with Torres Small in the U.S. House of Representatives.

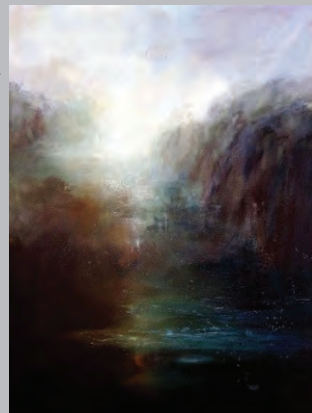

tournament.

Heerema will moderate a growers panel on the mechanical pruning of pecan trees, which will feature four pecan producers from across the Southwest discussing all the ways they trim trees to maximize pecan production.

White said a vendor presentation program has been added to this year's conference, allowing vendors to talk about the products and services available to pecan growers across the country.

WPGA will honor long-time board members Mike

Kilby, who is retired from the Arizona Cooperative Extension Service and has attended more than 50 WPGA conferences, and Art Ivey of Tornillo, Texas, whose grandfather was instrumental in the creation of WPGA.

WPGA, founded in 1971, is based in Mesilla Park. The nonprofit represents pecan growers in California, Arizona, New Mexico and West Texas.

New Mexico is second only to Georgia in commercial pecan production. Doña Ana County produces 70 percent of New Mexico's pecan crop and is the largest pecan-producing county in the U.S.

NMSU has become a repository for pecan seeds and trees from the region where pecans grow naturally, which stretches from central Mexico to northern Illinois, including parts of eastern Texas and Oklahoma.

The conference will be held at Las Cruces Convention Center, 680 W. University Ave. About 600 people are expected to attend.

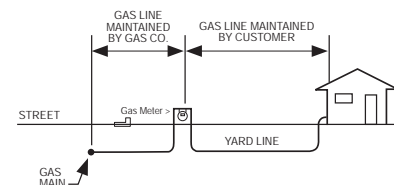

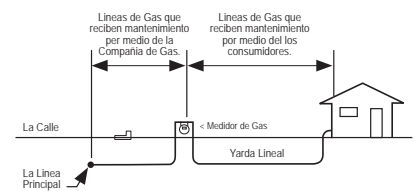

City seeks to address high pedestrian fatality rate

Per capita, New Mexico has the highest rate of pedestrian fatalities of any state, according to the U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT), and the rate for Las Cruces – which averaged nine pedestrian fatalities a year from 2011 to 20 – is 60 percent above the national average.

Those were among the statistics reported to the Las Cruces City Council during its Feb. 13 work session on pedestrian safety.

“Safety is a community goal,” said Trung Vo of Toole Design, a transportation planning and design company with offices in 18 cities in the United States and Canada.

Vo, the director of Toole’s Denver office, and currently contracted with the City of Las Cruces to provide consulting services related to traffic safety.

“People make mistakes,” Vo told council members via Zoom, but those mistakes do not have to result in death or serious injury. “Deaths are preventable.”

The Safe System Approach (SSA) advocated by Toole and USDOT has five “complementary objectives:” safer people, safer roads, safer vehicles, safer speeds and post-crash care.

To reduce pedestrian deaths and injuries in Las Cruces, he said, the city should focus on its entire traffic system rather than just hot spots.

“We focus on safety for

everyone,” Vo said.

As an example, he said, nearly 90 percent of pedestrian fatalities in Las Cruces occurred on streets with speed limits of 35 miles per hour or higher. Streets can be designed or redesigned to prioritize lower speeds, especially where people are walking or bicycling, Vo said.

Street reconfigurations, which can be expensive and time consuming, can include only one lane going in each direction, a turn lane, bike lanes between the roadway and pedestrians and physically separating walkers and bikers from motorists, he said.

Short-term interventions include speed-safety cameras, traffic calming devices like speed cush-

ions and speed humps, improved crosswalk visibility, repairing broken streetlights, striped and paved street shoulders and sidewalk repair, Vo said.

City Traffic and Streets Administrator Soogyu Lee said street lighting is being studied in five areas of Las Cruces, and the city is also looking at five traffic corridors to find ways to make them safer.

Three of the corridors: El Paseo Road, Roadrunner Parkway and University Avenue, are city streets. The other two, north Main Street and Picacho Avenue, are state roads maintained by the New Mexico Department of Transportation (NMDOT), Lee said.

The city and NMDOT

must work together to identify traffic safety issues, plan and design ways to deal with them and find funding to implement changes, he said.

“Speed is an important factor,” said George Pearson, president of Velo Cruces, a nonprofit “seeking to make Las Cruces a more bike and pedestrian friendly community.” Reducing the default roadway speed limit from 30 to 25 miles per hour would make streets safer, Pearson said, and “would send the message that council is looking at this and raise some awareness.”

“One of the biggest causes of pedestrian congestion is schools,” said Ashleigh Curry, coordinator for Las Cruces Public Schools Safe Routes to Schools Program, one

of the most successful walking- and biking-to-school programs in the nation. “If we can make our streets for our kids to be able to walk and bike to school, we can reduce a lot of those conditions around the schools of traffic congestion,” said Curry, who is also a member of the NMDOT’s Pedestrian Safety Workforce.

“We are actively working on identifying the data, analyzing it and creating solutions,” said city Innovation and Strategic Manager Srijana Basnyat. “With better design and long-term thinking we can provide solutions to these problems.”

The city council is expected to look again at pedestrian safety during an April 10 work session.

“As a proud fronterizo and member of Congress, I will educate my colleagues on the importance of this port of entry, the importance of building fruitful relationships with Mexico, and the need to foster international trade. Our shared vision for the border includes a vital economic gateway between the United States and Mex-

ico that is built on trust, respect, and mutual economic benefit,” Vasquez said.

“With the help of the New Mexico Border Authority, the Border Industrial Association (BIA), MVEDA (Mesilla Valley Economic Development Alliance) and the Borderplex, our local governments and strong federal partnerships, we can support initiatives that promote economic development on both sides of the border,” he said.

“It was good to have the Ambassador tour the Santa Teresa port facilities and have first-hand knowledge of our issues and needs,” said BIA President Jerry Pacheco of Santa Teresa, who attended the news conference.

Shoho, dean and professor emeritus of the School of Education at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, has been named New Mexico State University's new provost and chief academic officer following a national search, NMSU Chancellor Dan Arvizu announced Feb. 20. Shoho begins his new role April 17.

"Dr. Shoho has tremendous experience both as an administrator and as a researcher in the fields of education and social justice," Arvizu said. "His vision for NMSU aligns with the progress we've made toward the goals outlined in our

LEADS 2025 strategic plan, and I am sure he is the best fit to help elevate our research and social mobility initiatives."

"The search committee for the provost and chief academic affairs officer did its due diligence, and worked very hard and in a very professional, cordial and dedicated manner. We are delighted that the hard work ended with the hiring of Dr. Alan Shoho. We stand ready to work with Dr. Shoho and assist him during the transition," said Rolando A. Flores Galarza, dean and chief

administrative officer for the NMSU College of Agricultural, Consumer and Environmental Sciences and chair of the provost search committee.

Before serving as dean at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee for five years, Shoho was associate vice provost for academic and faculty support at the University of Texas at San Antonio for two years. He started his academic career as an assistant professor in the University of Portland's School of Education in 1991. Previously, he worked as a high school math teacher in Hawaii after working as an electrical engineer for Hughes Aircraft Company and Rockwell International. Shoho's father, a

Korean War veteran who grew up on the island of Kauai in Hawaii as the seventh of 11 children, earned a degree in electrical engineering from the University of Illinois using the G.I. Bill.

"I have personally experienced how families are transformed with the opportunities created through access to higher education," Shoho said. "Had he not been able to attend and earn his degree in electrical engineering from the University of Illinois, my life would likely have been very different. Consequently, I am very passionate about providing students with the same opportunities."

Shoho said he was interested

in becoming NMSU's provost because of its status as a Hispanic-serving institution and a land-grant university, and because of the university's mission to improve student success and advance equity, inclusion and diversity.

"Improving student success is critical to NMSU's future, and similarly equity, inclusion and diversity is integral to creating a healthy culture, where NMSU can re-achieve its R1 status and address grand challenges like racism and generational poverty, and borderland, environmental, health and social issues, to improve the quality of life for all New Mexicans and beyond," Shoho said.

Schools' 'Data Jam' continues for Asombro Institute

Desert Data Jam is underway at Asombro Institute for Science Education (AISE).

Hosted by the nonprofit AISE and the United States Department of Agriculture's Jornada Experimental Range and schools in southern New Mexico, the jam is continuing through April 25, with about 350 students and teachers participating from Vista, Sierra, Picacho and Zia middle schools and White Sands School, AISE Communications and Operations Coordinator Amy Tront said.

For the competition, students are provided with real datasets collected locally, AISE said. They "learn how to use data to answer questions and then design a creative project and presentation board about data trends.



Past creative projects have included children's books, songs, videos, physical models, infographics and games."

The top three projects from each participating class earn a place in a finals competition that will be held April 25-27 at New Mexico State University, with cash prizes (\$300 for first place, \$200 for second and \$100 for third) and other awards presented.

"Desert Data Jam is not like a science fair, students

will not be collecting data, instead they will be looking for data trends and communicating the data and trends through their presentation boards and creative projects," AISE said.

This year is the 12th jam, and the first one held in person in two years because of the pandemic.

The Asombro (the Spanish word for "wonder") Institute "is dedicated to increasing natural science literacy through engaging, place-based education," according to the AISE website. It provides thousands of children and adults with hands-on, inquiry-based science education programs each year in classrooms, schoolyards and the Chihuahuan Desert Nature Park north of Las Cruces.

AISE was incorporated as a nonprofit in 1990 as

the Las Cruces Nature Park. It was renamed Chihuahuan Desert Nature Park in 1997 and AISE in 2008.

Grant received

The New Mexico Public Education Department recently awarded AISE a New Mexico Outdoor Learning start-up grant to develop and launch a new "Schoolyard Field Trip" program, where Asombro will work with Las Cruces Public Schools to bring "a well-rounded, full-functioning, educational field trip experience to schools right in their own schoolyards," AISE said.

One step at a time

Each piece makes a difference when it comes to heart health

MountainView Regional Medical Center's cardiothoracic surgeon Dr. Charles Dow said awareness is growing in communities and medical offices about heart health and coronary disease. The recognition that the presentation of heart problems is not only the typical known symptoms but can have other warning symptoms that need to be taken seriously.

"Because the typical symptoms of coronary disease, which is blockage of the arteries of the heart, in a woman may be different

than a man," he said. "A woman may not complain of the classic chest pain down your arm which is not necessarily that common. They may come in and complain of fatigue or shortness of breath maybe a pressure sensation or maybe just feeling a little bit different. Now clinical providers are realizing they may have heart disease."

Dow said maybe treatments haven't changed much but the process of best medical therapy has changed.

"I think the awareness and the prescription to instruct patients to take care of themselves better has made some dramati-

cal effects on care and is hopefully decreasing the incidence of heart disease," he said. "But it's still there, still the number one (killer of men and women in the United States)."

Dow said lifestyle changes can make all the difference and there are things individuals can control. He said the old adage "you are what you eat" is a big part of it, but there are others.

"We have learned stress plays a big role in heart disease," Dow said. "(things people can take care of include) the cessation of smoking; managing diabetes better; getting on the right medications to control blood pressure; taking charge of your health care; checking blood pressure, making sure it's not high all the time."

Dow said while all these things have helped prevent patients from suffering the ill effects of coronary disease, each one can make a difference by itself.

"If you take one thing out of this, stop smoking and you have just decreased your risk by a lot," he said. "If you don't smoke and you say, 'I'm going to try and eat better three times a week or walk 30-40 minutes three times a week or even just 20 minutes,' you have improved your heart health. Take one thing and say I'm going to focus on one thing at a time.

"What we can't do is

change our genetic predisposition, but you can get close through management. Follow up; there are a lot of things we can do to control heart disease."

Dr. Craig Cannon and nurse practitioner (DNP)



Kimberly Miller work at the heart clinic at MountainView where they see about 50 patients a day. They must look at the patients referred to them, decide which ones are actually heart patients and determine a course of

actions for each.

Miller said heart disease is prevalent in this area where there is a lot of diabetes and other related things that lead to heart disease.

"We have a lot of disparity – poor diet, obesity – we are pretty packed (at the clinic) most of the time. It's a very busy business. Get potential problems treated early. If you leave it alone, you end up with heart failure and things that are very difficult to treat."

"Fifty percent of Americans will die of heart disease," Cannon said. "But there is a lot you can do on your own to help. Stay active and exercise, restrict your diet. Most heart disease is preventable."

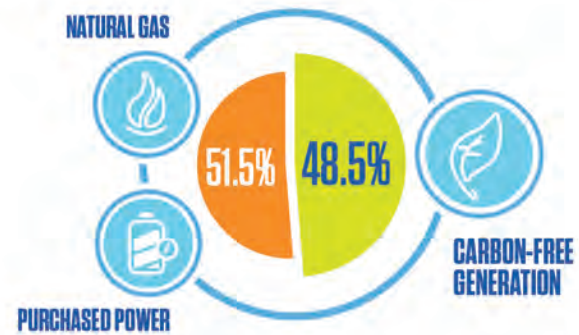

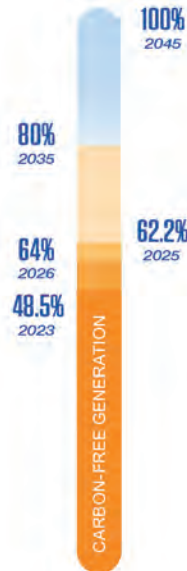

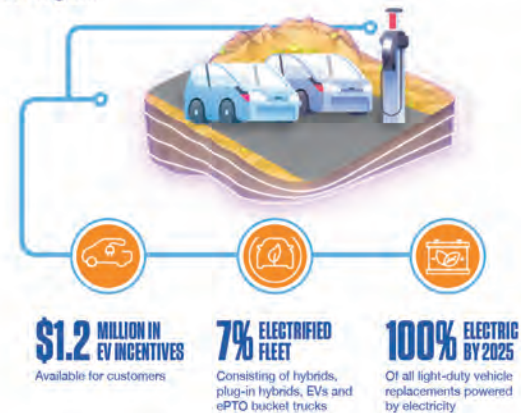

OR (outdoor recreation) offers great opportunities for active aging

You would never know it to look at him, but Jim Glover is 65 years old.

Glover is an enthusiastic bicyclist and founder and co-director of endeavorOR New Mexico, an outdoor recreation (that's the capital OR in the name) business alliance based in Farmington.

Speaking at the Mesilla Valley Economic Development Alliance's (MVE-DA) Business in the New Mexico Borderplex forum at Hotel Encanto in Las Cruces in February, Glover and three other people representing national OR businesses and organizations touted the health and economic benefits of outdoor recreation.

If you hike, hunt, cycle (bi- or motor-), camp, kayak, raft, ski, fish, hang glide or view wildlife, you already know something about the almost unlimited OR opportunities that exist locally and all across New Mexico.

But you may not know just how impressive and important OR is in New Mexico.

"My passion right now is really working with the youth," Glover said.

Just one statistic was all Glover needed to make his point: Kids now spend seven to nine hours a day on digital devices and seven-nine minutes a day outdoors.

Part of endeavorOR's work is to help create a greater appreciation for OR among young people; connect them to mentors, apprenticeships and job opportunities; and just "get them outdoors where they can see their pathway to success," Glover said.

OR also presents tremendous economic opportunities for entrepreneurs, he said.

The No. 1 maker of backpacks in the United States is Osprey, Glover said, which found its home in tiny Cortez (population: 8,766) located in southwest Colorado, just above the New Mexico state line.

Smartwool, a very successful maker of

outdoor apparel, was founded in 1994 in Steamboat Springs in northwest Colorado, which has a population of less than 14,000 people, Glover said.

"It doesn't really matter the size of your community," he said.

"When people get outside, really good things happen," Outdoor Recreation Roundtable Senior Director Chris Perkins said at the forum. "We support local economies."

Nationally, OR generated \$365 billion in 2021, and \$2.2 billion in New Mexico, where it has created more than 30,000 jobs.

Rebecca Gillis, state and local government affairs manager for the Outdoor Industry Association,

said OR businesses not only provide jobs and "outdoor access to all," they are good stewards of natural resources.

"We believe the outdoors is a fundamental human right," said Tom Bugert, state and local government affairs manager for Recreation Equipment, Inc. (REI), a cooperative based in Seattle.

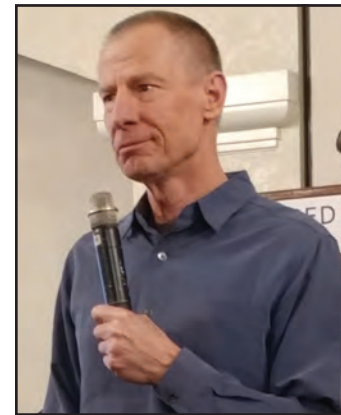
One of REI's goals is to grow outdoor advocacy and give its advocates a louder voice, Bugert said.

"On a national level, people are really looking into New Mexico," Glover said.

He touted the annual New Mexico Outdoor Economics Conference, which was started by state Sen. Jeff Steinborn of Las Cruces in 2018, as "a world class affair."

The 2022 conference, held in Taos, drew more than 350 attendees from across the state, said Steinborn, whose 2015 legislation created the Rio Grande Trail Commission to oversee the development of a 500-mile recreation trail running the entire north-south length of the state. Steinborn also sponsored legislation in 2019 that created the New Mexico Economic Development Department's Outdoor Recreation Division.

"We're getting there," Glover said.

Dancing: Light on the feet, heavy on the fun

It's not called smile therapy, but ballroom dancing classes may just be the same thing.

At a recent group lesson at SOL Ballroom Dance Center, everyone in the building sported a big grin even before instructor and Sol's founder, Hannah Cole, shouted her encouragement: "Smile! Show your teeth!"

Dave Clements and his wife, Janet, have been dancing together for 17 years, and are regulars at Sol.

"We don't just do it to be fit, although it helps with that," said Clements, who is 82. "But it's also fun, and very satisfying for me and my wife. It's greatly enhanced the romanticism in our marriage."

"Most people, most days, do three things: walk, stand and sit," Cole said. "So we lose the ability to use a lot of muscles."

Dancing, particularly with a partner, Cole said, brings many different muscles

into play, not to mention your brain cells.

"All movement is good," Cole said.

"Even just standing on one leg will open new neural pathways. But in partner dancing there are so many different elements. You'll go from high impact to slow and sustained. You're using your body in different ways, and that's what our body likes. The movement of your hands, especially above your heart, is good for cleansing your body."

Cole also cites studies from the Albert Einstein College of Medicine that have shown the benefits of dancing for keeping the brain sharp as people age. The College's website, citing a recently published paper, said, "... social dancing may be a safe, enjoyable, and effective alternative to traditional physical exercise for preventing cognitive decline and reducing risk for Alzheimer's disease."

"Running or jogging doesn't have the mental components," Cole said. "Even dancing by yourself doesn't have the mental components of patterns, navigating the

floor, connecting with your partner, having to make snap decisions in an analytical way and choose responses. In no other physical activity do you do all that. And at the same time, you're listening to music, which engages your emotions."

There are also social benefits both during classes and after, when people use their new skills out in the world, whether it's at a small family wedding or a big nightclub dance floor.

"As we age, that loneliness factor can really set in," Cole said. "But 45 minutes of dancing really does change your mental state. With depression and anxiety, dancing just makes such a difference. It gives you something to look forward to, a place to belong."

Often as not, people come to dance lessons by themselves instead of as a couple. They quickly make friends with other students, Cole said, and many learn things about themselves they never knew.

"The self-expression is beautiful," Cole said. "It's wonderful for someone who does that thing just for herself."

George Moscona, 80, has been dancing most of his life, so already knows most of the steps, but loves coming to Sol.

"I really enjoy the socializing, and being included in such an inclusive environment," Moscona said.

Julia is a student who takes lessons to help her progress and heal from a series of injuries and issues that left her "broken,



broken and broken." Each lesson reduces her reliability on using a walker. But she likes another thing about SOL, telling Cole one day: "I just came for my afternoon hug!"

SOL's youngest student is 4, and there are a few in their 80s, and just about every age in between is represented.

"We have a lot of college kids spending Every Other Friday Night (a special dance party program) here," Cole said. "What better way to spend a Friday night than to dance and burn a thousand calories?"

Cole, originally from California, has

been teaching dance for 30 years. She competed professionally for several years, and came to Las Cruces in 2012 to work with the New Mexico State University DanceSport program. Many may know her from her involvement with the fundraiser “Look Who’s Dancing.”

SOL has three ballroom instructors and a ballet instructor, and Cole is always looking at new ways to serve the community. One possible future class she’s considering is hip-hop for adults.

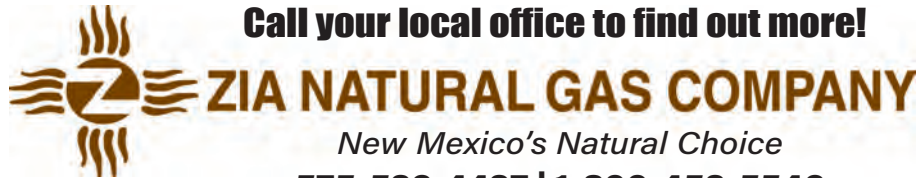

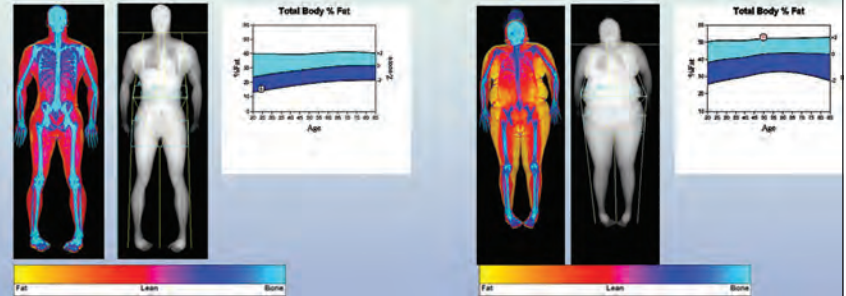

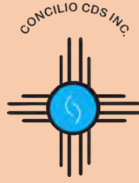

Looking back: Las Cruces' Nestor Armijo family

Tuesday, Feb. 28, 2023, is the 192nd birthday of Don Nestor Armijo, patriarch of one of the most important families in Las Cruces history.

The property he bought (for \$4,050) in 1877 at 150 E. Lohman Ave., now called the Armijo House, is today home to the Greater Las Cruces Chamber of Commerce (GLCCC). A 2015 historic preservation grant from the New Mex-

ico Historic Preservation Division and the National Park Service Historic Preservation Fund helped Mesilla Valley Preservation, Inc. (MVP) renovate the house, and the chamber held a grand opening Dec. 7, 2017.

Research conducted by MVP, in partnership with Architectural Resources Group based in San Francisco, shows the likely builder of the two-story adobe house, in 1866, was Mesilla Valley pioneer John D. Barncastle, MVP said in a news release. The carpenter likely responsible for the house's defining woodwork was Benjamin Franklin Hanover, MVP said.

Barncastle and Hanover

were veterans of the Union Army who came to the Mesilla Valley with the California Column that marched nearly 1,000 miles through Arizona and New Mexico territories April through August 1862, during the second year of the American Civil War.

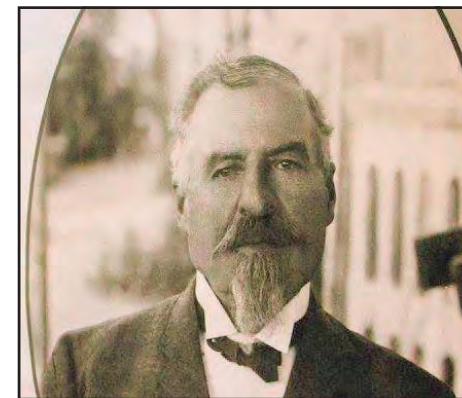
Nestor Armijo was born Feb. 28, 1831, in Los Padillas, New Mexico, now part of Albuquerque. He was the eldest son of Juan Cristobal Armijo and Juana Chavez, according to historical records.

Armijo attended St. Louis University and married Maria Josefa Yrissari (1838-1906) in 1851. In 1853, Armijo drove 55,000 sheep from New Mexico to Cali-

fornia, braving multiple manmade and natural dangers along the way. Armijo and his younger brother, Nicolas, ran mule trains transporting goods from St. Louis to stores Nestor Armijo owned in Las Cruces (opened in 1862), El Paso and Chihuahua, Mexico.

Armijo was credited with thousands of acts of charity and in February 1904, was elected first vice

president of the new Mesilla Valley Chamber of Commerce – the president was Hiram Hadley (1833-

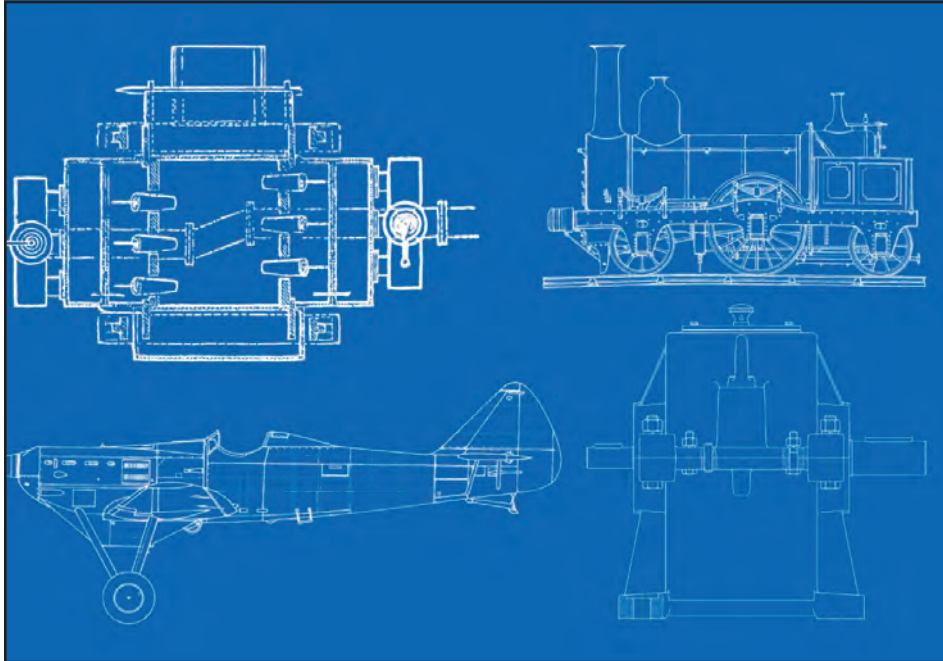

The Recycling Center, 2855 W. Amador Avenue, is looking for employees to help grow the Las Cruces recycling program.

The growth of recycling in Las Cruces, and for the world, is part and parcel to a sustainable future. "Other duties include the coverage of our recycle and bulk waste operation areas which will require the use of hand tools, sprayers, yard equipment, and light equipment operation," said SCSWA Recycling

Operations Foreman Daniel Ortega. "Regular attendance is an essential function of this job because we have residents and commercial businesses coming at various times of the day, depending on their needs."

The position will also inspect vehicle loads and monitor incoming loads for unacceptable materials. 1922), founder of New Mexico College of Agriculture and Mechanic Arts, which became New Mexico State University.

Nestor and Josefa's son, Carlos (1855-1903), married Beatriz Otero in 1877. Carlos Armijo

managed Three Rivers Ranch ("Tres Ritos") near Tularosa, which his father owned. Carlos and Beatriz, who both pre-deceased Nestor and Josefa, had four children who survived to adulthood: Nestor Jr., Dolores, Gertrudis ("Nina") and Josepha ("Josephine"). Three of the four married siblings of the prominent

Ascarate family of Las Cruces; Josephine married Peter Gallagher of El Paso.

Nestor Armijo lived in the house that bears his name until his death there on May 7, 1911, at age 80. Members of the Armijo family are buried in their own section of San Jose Cemetery, 101 N. Espina St.

The chamber has many original photographs of Armijo and his family and a sizeable collection of family heirlooms.

New Mexico State University Archives and Special Collections has "quite a lot of Armijo family papers, photographs, etc.," said Department Head Dennis Daily.

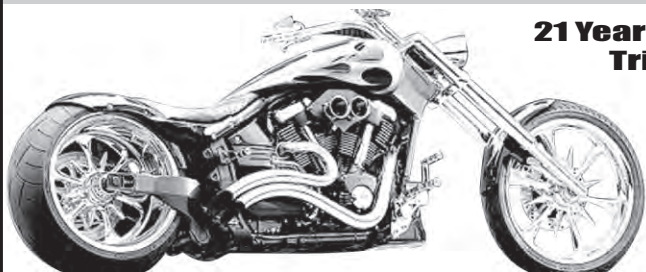

FYI+, LC3, Apple merge on mental health app

To help fill a local behavioral health need, Families & Youth Innovations Plus (FYI+) Training & Technical Assistance Division hosted a brainstorming session for stakeholders in January in Las Cruces to create a mobile app.

Representing 12 agencies, 35 participants were divided into seven groups for the competition, FYI+ said.

They included mental health providers, people with lived experience,

faith leaders and members of the business community.

The challenge was "to create an app that could be used by everyone who is in need of behavioral health services, in collaboration with Apple, Inc., local community partners and the LC3 Behavioral Health Collaborative, the strategic hub for behavioral health in Doña Ana County," FYI+ said.

The winning design was named "Doña Ana Assistance," FYI+ said.

The group that designed it was comprised of "promotoras" (community health care workers) who primarily spoke Spanish, public health and mental health providers and a person with lived experience, FYI+ said. The slogan for their app was "No crisis too big or too small."

The app idea is designed for all ages, is multilingual and would respond "to anyone who is in a mental health

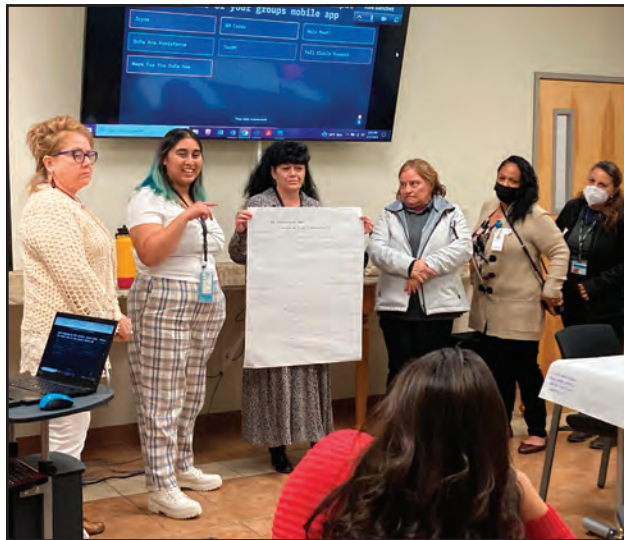
crisis by offering different options,” including speaking with or texting a therapist or counselor.

It would also offer different coping skills to immediately assist a person in crisis, such as breathing techniques, mindful meditation and de-escalation techniques, FYI+ said, along with navigation to local mental and behavioral health resources. And, it would allow the user to connect to the 988 crisis hotline and the Doña Ana

County Crisis Triage Center.

With the app design workshop completed, the next step is three more workshops facilitated by Apple which will take the concepts of the larger group and fine tune them and come out with a finalized app design based on the data and input gathered from the meeting we hosted,” said FYI+ community organizer Logan Howard.

NMSU’s Arrowhead Center might take the lead in the app’s actual development, said Howard, “based on the final product coming out of the Apple sessions.”

Las Cruces Utilities (LCU) has several programs in place to make sure the Las Cruces community is safe. One such program is a continuous leak survey for regulator high pressure gas maintenance.

Every morning by 6 A.M. LCU Leak Surveyors are scanning the streets in trucks equipped with special leak detection technology. Six cones hanging six inches from the ground use a vacuum pump to detect a natural gas leak within an 80-foot radius. If the truck surveillance equipment detects a leak, the Leak Surveyors confirm it with an additional handheld device.

In total, there are three LCU Leak Surveyors running road checks and answering last minute emergency calls.

The City of Las Cruces is split into four quadrants that are swept continuously on a five-year schedule to ensure all areas are surveyed for safety.

“We drive three miles per hour (MPH) when conducting these sweeps,” LCU Natural Gas Leak Surveyor Javier Holguin pointed out. “It can get dangerous when the community does not understand what we are doing and fly past us even when we have our lights flashing,” Holguin continued.

Once a natural gas leak is identified, it is reported and rated. These ratings are based on location to the public, severity of the leak based on size, and when they were called in. The highest-level rating is a Grade 1 natural gas leaks that

are in busy, high traffic areas or if the natural gas is migrating towards a home or business, these leaks receive immediate attention. A Grade 2 natural gas rating is given to leaks in more rural areas and are repaired within six months. A Grade 3 Natural Gas Leak is the lowest rating is given to gas leaks that are low level and in areas with little to no traffic. These are fixed within 15 months. No matter the level, all leaks are monitored regularly for the safety of the community.

After a gas leak is identified, rated, and repaired, the cleaning process starts. The soil around the gas leak holds some of the natural gas that was escaping. This will cause the area to read as if there is still a natural

gas leak although it has already been repaired and is harmless. A special machine is brought in to clean the ground around a leak.

“It is important for our citizens to know that they need to call our Utilities Dispatch at 575-526-0500 immediately if they smell gas,” LCU Natural Gas Leak Surveyor Mario Pacheco pointed out. “Most of the time when we respond to a call it is a false alarm, but the times that it is a true gas leak we are able to fix it quickly and secure the area,” Pacheco concluded.

Other LCU safety programs include corrosion surveys of natural gas lines, continuous recertification courses, and annual drills with LCU and the local fire department.

PGA merchandise show back in business in a big way

In January I attended my 23rd annual PGA Show in Orlando.

The 70th edition of golf's largest industry gathering witnessed a long-awaited infusion of positive energy with no pandemic restrictions. More than 30,000 PGA professionals, golf leaders, industry executives and golf merchandise companies from 86 countries came together at the Orange County Convention Center. The PGA Show, which began with golf pros selling merchandise out of the trunks of their cars at a winter tournament in Florida in 1954, has since developed into golf's longest-running and largest global business, industry, trade display and convention. More than 800 media members (including me) reported from the event.

The week started out on a glorious warm and sunny Tuesday with Demo and Fitting Day at Orange County National Golf

Center in nearby Winter Garden, where industry attendees had a chance to try out golf clubs and other equipment in exhibitors' tents and hitting bays positioned along the 2/3 mile circumference and 700 yard diameter circular practice range. It's a treat.

Stepping onto the exhibition floor at the Convention Center the next morning you might think you were at an auto show instead of a golf show, with the proliferation of high-end, tricked-out golf cars on display everywhere.

They aren't your father's golf carts anymore; they're golf cars.

Another thing one notices among the 800 exhibitors is the continued emergence of golf simulators. A golf simulator is a large fabric screen (12x15 feet large), where a golfer hits balls off a mat at a screen displaying realistic golf course or range images. The recorded data

from the shot is then displayed with full details.

Most club fitters and big golf retailers have one. Home versions are expensive. Visiting the major club manufacturers (e.g. Titleist, Callaway, etc.) one is struck by the fact you can't get a new top-end driver for under \$600!

At this year's show I discovered several new and amazing products the first is the GolfForever at-home training system. It is mainly an asymmetrical resistance bar, complete with two handles and two exercise rubber bands, with multiple use for training and stretching. There are two carabiners to hook the bands and bar to a stationary object at the gym or at home. There is a GolfForever app which delivers to users personalized video workout plans from PGA Tour doctors and trainers.

Over 100 PGA Tour players use the GolfForever training system, including product ambassadors Zach Johnson (2023 U.S. Ryder Cup Captain) and Scotty Scheffler. Go to www.GolfForever.com. I'm not a product ambassador but I have one and really like it.

Then there is a product that showed up at the PGA Show almost as an accident in 2022. Mark Wolf, president of Fireside Industries, has been entrenched in the camping/outdoor world for almost a decade. He was persuaded by golfer friends to attend

the golf industries' biggest event after his company donated dozens of unique insulated drink tumblers with a built-in speaker to a local charity event. The product won the 2022 Best New Product Award. His invention is called "Vibe" and looks like an ordinary 28-ounce insulated tumbler, but features a 3.7-watt detachable Bluetooth speaker in a puck-like bottom.

To emphasize the power of the PGA Show's business impact, 12 months after winning the coveted 2022 award Wolf's Vibe Tumbler is now in more than 3,000 golf courses and resorts across the country. He now has associations

with Tito's vodka and Maker's Mark bourbon to name a few. Looking back at his product's meteoric rise, Wolf says, "to be honest, it has been pretty spectacular." You may want to go to Amazon or www.firesideoutdoor.com.

Finally, if you want to shock your friends (like I did) get ahold of a box of Mach One (single use) golf balls at www.machonegolfballs.com, the world's loudest golf ball; like a cherry-bomb.
