Country Club building razed

Designed by revered El Paso architect Henry Trost and built in 1929, the former Las Cruces Country Club clubhouse met its final fate Tuesday, March 7, as it was demolished by

construction crews.

The Las Cruces Historic Preservation Commission and others had tried to assemble efforts to save the building, but in the end there was neither enough money nor a viable plan

to bring the building back to life.

The clubhouse had languished for more than a decade, left vacant after the golf course closed and the Country Club moved to what is now RedHawk Golf Course.

Governor appoints Clemente to commission

Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham has appointed Fernando Clemente Jr. of Sunland Park as an at-large member of the New Mexico State Game Commission. The appointment was announced Feb. 28.

“Clemente is a wildlife biologist with more than 20 years of expertise and experience across multiple branches of natural resource management, the governor’s office said in a news release.

He has owned and operated New Mexico Specialized Wildlife Services since 2012 and has served as a professor at La Universidad Autónoma de Chihuahua since 2021 and as president of the Sunland Park Chamber of Commerce since 2019. Clemente is also president of the La Clinica de Familia board of

directors.

Clemente has a bachelor of science in wildlife science from New Mexico State University.

The gifts include televisions, coolers, hand-crafted items made by local artists, gift baskets and gift certificates to local vendors and business, Smooove Kicks said.

“The purpose of our organization is to raise money for underprivileged youth athletes in our community,” the news release said. “Smooove Kicks, Inc. is dedicated to helping these athletes by paying league fees and/or providing athletic shoes for the sport of their choice, as well as scholarships to underprivileged area high school student athletes to

assist in the advancement of their college education.”

“In memory of Jacob

Daniel Becerra and in the spirit of his loving, giving character, Smooove Kicks, Inc. was created by his family to keep that legacy alive,” the news release said. “Becerra

was an athlete who played sports in our community beginning in kindergarten and playing through his senior year of high school. Jacob loved his athletic shoes ... or kicks. He often donated shoes to players on his teams who were less fortunate than himself.”

The \$21 entry fee “represents what would have been Becerra’s 21st birthday (March 14),” the news release said. Becerra died Aug. 6, 2022.

“Youth participation in positive activities such as organized sports is a proven alternative to delinquent behavior and involvement in violent acts,” said Bryan Harrison of Smooove Kicks. “It is our mission to affect our community by helping our youth participate in organized sports, as well as provide scholarships to high school students wanting to attend college.”

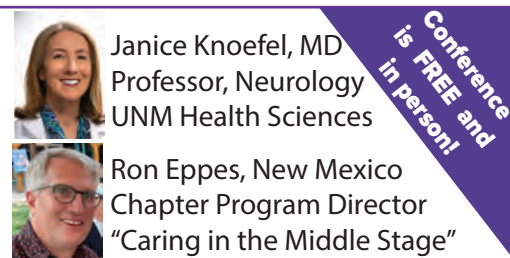

Exploring a building's demise

Back in the 1990s, when I drove a 1966 Mustang, it was fun tooling around in that nice-looking Ford. But if I was traveling more than 30 miles, I felt a lot better driving my 1978 Buick LeSabre. The newer vehicle was a lot more stable, safer and solid than the Mustang. The Buick even got better gas mileage.

The 1993 Ford F-150 I have today is also fun. But its door panels have a tendency to fall off. It doesn't have a beep to remind you the lights are on. And there are zero cup holders.

It's cool to experience something old and nice.

Unfortunately, those cool old things don't stay nice without a lot of pricey maintenance. And

unless they remain functional and useful, they can easily become, well, useless.

The Henry Trost-designed former Las Cruces Country Club clubhouse, erected in 1929, saw its demise Tuesday, March 7.

The building quit being used more than a decade ago, when the Country Club decided to leave its mid-city golf course next to Apodaca Park, with its eyes toward what they thought at the time would

be greener pastures: Red Hawk Golf Course. That didn't quite materialize.

I'm no architectural expert, but I like Trost buildings. Henry and his brother, Gustavus, designed a ton of buildings in the Southwest.

Check out henrytrost.org. Dozens of them as standing strong and doing great.

I've stayed in three wonderful, well-maintained Trost buildings in west Texas: the Holland Hotel in Alpine; the Paisano Hotel in Marfa; and Hotel El Capitan in Van Horn. They are all cared for and well-used, although El Capitan was struggling mightily before Jeff Bezos brought Blue Origin to that region, and El Capitan became home to many of its employees.

There are some Trost buildings on the New Mexico State University campus, including Goddard Hall and the Honors building.

Everyone loves to look at these old, historic buildings, just as they love to look at old, antique cars.

But in both cases, few people have the commitment, financially and otherwise, to buy these relics, restore them and keep them in decent, functioning shape.

The Trosts' Valverde Hotel in Socorro, New Mexico, is an example of another Trost building that could be in danger from misuse or lack of use.

While I say the country club building in Las Cruces met its end March 7, 2023, its demise actually came years earlier, when no one was able to step forward and rescue it.

And what about the big, beautiful trees in the area that died from lack of care? That's a loss, too, isn't it?

I had the idea of using the club-

City Council has mixed-up priorities

Of the four general obligation bonds approved by Las Cruces voters in the November 2022 election, two addressed critical needs (affordable housing and a new fire station) and two addressed wants (improvements to city parks.)

Incredibly, the City Council has prioritized our wants ahead of our needs. And so, park improvements will go ahead as scheduled. And, thankfully, so will construction of a new fire station on the north side of the East Mesa.

But the most critical need addressed by the bond issue is affordable housing. And yet, it is the only one not moving forward.

City Treasurer Erika Jacques told members of the City Council the economy is too "volatile" right now. Really? The city budget increased by nearly \$16 million in the current fiscal

year. And, during a budget retreat last month, council members were told revenue for the next fiscal year is expected to be about \$10 million more than anticipated. And yet there's no money for affordable housing?

Funding for affordable housing is taxable, while the other projects will not be. That is apparently why it is being put on hold. One would hope council members were informed of that ahead of time and factored it into the total amount of the bond.

But even if they didn't, that's no excuse for putting parks ahead of housing.

Las Cruces has an affordable housing shortage of about

5,600 units, City Housing and Neighborhood Services Manager Natalie Green told the Las Cruces Bulletin before the election.

Affordable housing is defined as no more than 30 percent of the occupant's income. Wages in Las Cruces have not climbed nearly as fast as home prices. About 43 percent of renters are paying more than 30 percent of their income, forcing them to cut back on other family expenses.

Obviously, \$6 million would not come close to solving the problem. The plan was to use that money to leverage state and federal funding, bringing the total to \$36.5 million. That would have allowed for the construction of 175 new units.

It would have been a modest start. Now, even that's on hold.

Shelter comes right after food and water on the list of

basic needs for human survival. Our lack of affordable housing has had a negative impact on our community in many ways - increasing homelessness, contributing to our escalating crime rate and making it more difficult to attract new workers and industry.

The City Council needs to reconsider its decision to put affordable housing on the back burner. We can't afford to wait until next year. Construction needed to start yesterday.

Excise tax could fund alcohol abuse prevention, treatment

They found my niece dead three months ago today. Alone in her apartment from a fall, caused by heavy drinking. She had been through treatment over the years, but like so many others, it wasn't long enough to really remedy her pain that brought her to drink again. She was a sweet, sensitive and smart young woman who had learned to disguise from most of us, her drinking problem. For the over 2,000 people each year who die from alcohol related causes in New Mexico, we start a new year to count, and likely increase, the number of the friends and relatives who we will mourn.

It doesn't have to be this way! For a mere 25 cents per drink excise tax, we can raise nearly \$200 million dollars which can be used for prevention and treatment programs that will make a difference. The policy of increasing alcohol taxes, considerable research shows, is in itself a deterrent to underage drinking and reduces consumption by excessive and heavy drinkers.

The toll one drink has on our state is \$3.74 in health care costs, lost wages, damages, etc., for a total cost of \$2.2 billion annually, or over \$1,000 for every person in New Mexico.

This isn't a regressive tax, 48 percent of us don't drink at all. Those who are excessive or heavy drinkers by income levels would see proportional increases, from \$54 for those with an income of \$25,000 or less to \$63 for those with incomes greater than \$75,000 annually, and it would provide more services for those at the lower income levels, making

it a progressive tax.

Other policy changes can be made too, but raising the liquor excise tax, which hasn't been done for 30 years, is the most immediate and effective solution we have to start saving the health and lives of our friends and family: A small price to pay, and one many of us would trade to have our loved ones back. The reduction in consumption will help reduce domestic violence, sexual assaults, homicides and all the alcohol-related health issues seen over time.

After meeting with the craft brewers and listening to other legislators that support their local businesses, it seems like the exception for lower excise tax has made sense. Their products are higher priced and not usually what heavy or binge drinkers would consume in order to be intoxicated. An increase to adjust for inflation that is approximately twice the low one-cent per drink to two-cents per beer would seem reasonable to ask for microbrewers to contribute to offsetting the terrific costs to our state. We are now planning a 15-cent per drink increase for all other alcohol wholesalers, so we can save lives, and improve the health and safety of New Mexicans.

Call or email your Legislators to support HB230 and SB259 the Liquor Excise Tax Increase and Alcohol Harms Reduction Fund. We need these bills to be considered in both chambers' tax omnibus package this session.

house as the headquarters for a miniature golf course. It could have been an homage to the departed golf course and something fun to do.

We wouldn't expect the same investment for a nondescript beige metal building from 1985, regardless of the nature of the activity it housed.

SCSWA Preps for Wind with Streamlined Procedures

With some shingle-shaking winds, southern New Mexico has recently seen its fair share of heavy gusts. While wind has always made an appearance in spring, South Central Solid Waste Authority has decided to streamline its procedures when it comes to the safety of customers and its employees during the windy season, particularly when it comes to closing the landfill.

"We've decided to update our standard operating procedure to ensure that we are notifying commercial haulers who use the landfill or customers who might have concerns about their trash or recycling pickup on extra windy days," said Miguel Fernandez, SCSWA program administrator.

Effective March 6, 2023, the Corralitos Regional Landfill Closure & Operational Postponement Notification outlines the operational and administrative communications in the event inclement weather poses a safety concern to our operations which would result in landfill closure or operational postponement. When

communicating a landfill closure, SCSWA will consider the safety and well-being of the public and internal and external customers and how to comply with the SCSWA Corralitos Regional Landfill Permit per the New Mexico Environment Department.



Winds make a mess, especially when it catches loose trash and scatters it in the desert. During windy days, SCSWA tries to mitigate environmental and human harm during windy days with its standardized procedures.

Once winds reach 30 miles per hour or inclement weather is determined a safety hazard, the Landfill manager or supervisor will initiate a closure notification and start the communication chain.

"That notice fans out from our foremen to cashiers to commercial truck drivers that transport waste to the landfill," said Fernandez. "We also

let our partners at the City of Las Cruces know so that when customers call their one-stop-shop of Customer Central at 575-524-2111, they'll know that we're also stopping loads to the landfill."

Fernandez explains that SCSWA keeps an eye on the weather reports and will try to pick up earlier in areas buffeted by heavy winds.

"Initiating a facility closure helps mitigate any potential operational safety hazards and injuries to the public, SCSWA staff, and commercial haulers," he said. "It's a way to prevent plastic bags or any litter that has the potential to become airborne and end up outside exterior landfill fencing."

Modern 'jury' finds Billy the Kid innocent

On April 24 and 26, a play re-enactment of "The trial of Billy the Kid" brought the past into the Rio Grande Theatre as directed by Ross Marks. While William Antrim (Billy the Kid) was found guilty at the time, April 6, 1881, the modern-day audiences at the theater found him innocent both nights.

Lincoln County Sheriff William Brady was killed in Lincoln County and Billy the Kid was tried for the murder at the Doña Ana County Courthouse in Mesilla. The event was part of the infamous Lincoln County War, a violent conflict that lasted almost two years.

"The Trial of Billy the Kid" really exceeded my expectations in terms of the tense courtroom drama and tremendous audience response," Marks said. "It really whetted my appetite to take it to other theaters (he's already in talks with Ruidoso and Silver City) and turning it into a film. The success of the play proves what I already knew, which is that there is a ton of talent right here in Las Cruces."

Following the Sunday performance, the organizers of Billy the Kid Festival held over the whole weekend, were surprised with a special presentation. The organizers, also known as The Friends of Pat Garrett (part of the Doña Ana County Historical Society) received gifts from Scott Davis, the great-grandson of Pat Garrett, who shared gifts of appreciation for keeping the history of his great-grandfather alive.

The gifts were 16-1/2-inch sculpted figurines of Pat Garrett in marble and covered in a liquid bronze coating. Each member of the group was presented with a copy.

On Feb. 25 the festival presented the movie "Young Guns" as well as a live presentation, "Sing the Legend," featuring Emmy award-winner Dan Crow, Karla Steen, Steve Smith and Anne Luna with original songs about Billy the Kid, Pat Garrett, Stagecoach Mary Fields, The Fountain Mystery, Deacon Jim Miller and more.



Learn to Grow Your Own Fruit Trees

If you dream of showing up with a pie baked with fruit grown from your own tree, there is a way to make this possible, even in the desert. The Las Cruces Utilities (LCU) Water Conservation Program's Lush & Lean Workshop, "Fruit Trees for the Las Cruces Environment," on Thursday, March 16, will provide a free opportunity to learn the best way to get started with trees in your yard. New Mexico State University (NMSU) Extension Urban Horticulture Specialist Dr. Marisa Y. Thompson will recommend fruit tree varieties, help you pick an ideal spot to plant, discuss best planting practices, and offer care tips to optimize tree health and fruit production.

First, Thompson will explain the USDA plant hardiness zone that encompasses the area but will dig a little deeper into how to prep for planting. "Consider the microclimate in your yard, what tree species you want, and site location, for example,

planting a tree that doesn't grow too tall against your house, and the tree species you want to plant," said Thompson. She will explain why soil compaction can be a problem.

"Roots don't seek water, they grow where the soil is moist," she said. "In the best-case scenario, the lateral roots will grow outward two to four times the height of the tree, and 90 percent of the active roots will be in the top three feet of the soil profile."

She has some recommendations of trees that grow very well here: apple, fig, jujube, peach, plum, and pomegranate. These trees can be very productive in our area. Surprisingly, apricots grow here but fruit production is not as reliable. "We have common crop loss in apricots due to late frost," she said. "I suggest planting several varieties of fruit and see what works best for your yard."

Thompson will also discuss each type of

tree and what specifics it might need, such as pruning and common problems. "It might sound overwhelming, but I'm here to guide residents' decision making. Having healthy, beautiful trees is within their grasp," she said. All workshops are free to the public and will be held at the Branigan Library, Roadrunner Room, 200 E. Picacho, Las Cruces, on Thursdays from 5:30 PM

to 7:30 PM. Presentations begin promptly at 5:45 PM. The following upcoming workshops are:

State adds second economic developer to region

If you own a business or are thinking about starting one and you need help, who you gonna call?

If you are lucky enough to live in Las Cruces and anywhere in the seven counties that comprise the New Mexico Economic Development Department's (NMEDD) southwest region, you're in luck.

You are likely to get a face-to-face meeting with former Doña Ana County Manager Julia Brown, who joined Louise Marquez late last year as a second NMEDD community, business and rural development representative in NMEDD's region five that includes Doña Ana, Luna, Hidalgo, Grant, Sierra, Catron and Socorro counties.

Brown is a rep with a rep. In addition to serving as Doña Ana County manager, she also was Sunland Park city manager and was vice president for Charles Schwab Bank and director of the Oakland, California Office of Economic Development and Employment, served on both the District of Columbia and Oklahoma public utility commissions, as an assistant attorney general in Oklahoma and in various public administrative and public policy positions in Washington, D.C., Oklahoma, California and New Mexico, NMEDD said in a news release. She also was a United States Army judge advocate general, retiring

as a lieutenant colonel and deputy commander of the 75th Legal Support Organization. And, Brown serves as national board chair of the American Association of University Women.

Marquez also has impressive credentials, with an extensive career in local government before joining NMEDD in September 2020. Marquez worked as the director of community and economic development for the City of Sunland Park and also worked for the Village of Tijeras in Bernalillo County and for Torrance County.

As a Local Economic Development Act (LEDA) specialist, Marquez has been involved in more than 30 LEDA projects in NMEDD region five, helping an algae farm add 20 jobs in the small Luna County community of Columbus and helping Saputo Cheese USA add 150 jobs in Las Cruces. Marquez's first LEDA project for NMEDD was helping Stampede Meat expand into Sunland Park, where it created more than 1,000 jobs.

"We are focused on good jobs," Marquez said, that pay well and include benefits.

"We're the boots on the ground," she said.

She and Brown regularly travel to businesses throughout their region "to meet them where they're at," Marquez said.

NMEDD has "the biggest, fullest tool box in the state's history," Brown said, to help guide businesses of any size with LEDA and

other possible funding assistance, tax credits, connecting to NMEDD's Collateral Assistance Program, better utilizing the space they occupy and connecting with economic development experts at New Mexico State University, Doña Ana Community College, Western New Mexico University and New Mexico Tech and organizations like the Mesilla Valley Economic Development Alliance (MVEDA).

In many cases, they are helping business owners learn about state and federal programs they didn't know existed.

Some of the first questions Brown asks are, Who have they talked to? What do they need?

"We're out on the trail," Brown said, as she and Marquez travel hundreds of miles to meet with business owners from Reserve to Lordsburg, Chamberino to Truth or Consequences. Or they can meet and make connections with others through Zoom.

"I still felt like I had something to contribute," Brown said.

She was raised to believe that education and life and work experience "are gifts from God and meant to be shared with others who might not have had the opportunities you have had," she said. "It's unacceptable not to do it."

"The payoff is so immediate," Marquez said. "When you're made the situation better, you know it. It's amazing

to sit down with somebody who has no hope in their eyes, who is skeptical that you're there to help, and then watching that change," she said.

HOSA helps Trailblazers find path to healthcare

Even though he plans to pursue a career as an archeologist, Dominik Gutierrez is an officer and active member of Arrowhead Park Early College High School's chapter of Future Health Professionals.

The international organization was founded in 1976 as Health Occupations Students of America (it still uses the HOSA initials) to help students train for careers in the medical field. The APECHS chapter is also big on leadership training and community service, which appealed to Dominik.

"Through competition, HOSA piqued my interest in forensic science, an event I competed in last year and this year as well," Dominik said. "Alongside a degree in history, I'm also pursuing a forensic science certification as well because of it. Even if you're not going into (medical school) or don't find anything interesting at first glance, there's something for everyone," he said.

APECHS HOSA Chapter President Mackenzie Kahle

is a little different story. Like Dominik, she is a senior, and was drawn to HOSA because of its focus on building leaders and helping the community. But Mackenzie wants to pursue a career in public health. HOSA is helping her "learn how to be a medical professional" as she prepares for entry into medical school.

"It's great to find a community," Mackenzie said. "it's a support network."

Mackenzie said she "never spoke in class" until she got involved with APECHS HOSA, where "I found what I want to go into," she said.

Mackenzie served as the chapter's vice president for fundraising before becoming president. The Arrowhead Park ECHS chapter has 91 members, and more than 60 attended a recent HOSA meeting, Mackenzie said. The organization has a \$12,500 annual budget and hosts a variety of fundraisers organized by its officers and members – like last fall's Halloween dance – to help pay club expenses, including travel to HOSA conferences in New Mexico and across the country.

Mackenzie, Dominik and

other APECHS chapter members will attend the New Mexico HOSA State Leadership Conference in April in Albuquerque and the international conference in June in Dallas.

Conferences include competitive events in everything from medical spelling and epidemiology to CPR and first aid, with APECHS HOSA members regularly bringing home medals for top finishes. Competitive events also include pharmacy science, physical therapy, sports medicine and veterinary science.

Chapter members also will compete for the HOSA Barbara James Service Awards, which recognize students for their participation in community service projects. For APECHS HOSA chapter members, that has included volunteering at El Caldito Soup Kitchen and at La Casa, Inc. domestic violence program's Holiday Bazaar.

APECHS will also compete for New Mexico HOSA 2023 chapter of the year, Mackenzie said.

APECHS HOSA's bimonthly meetings regularly include

professionals working in the medical field, said chapter advisor Richard Moreno, a teacher at the school. Guests at recent meetings have been a sign language interpreter and a social worker.

At APECHS and within its HOSA chapter, "The students are very, very bright," Moreno said. "it's a privilege to be at this school. The teamwork is monumental."

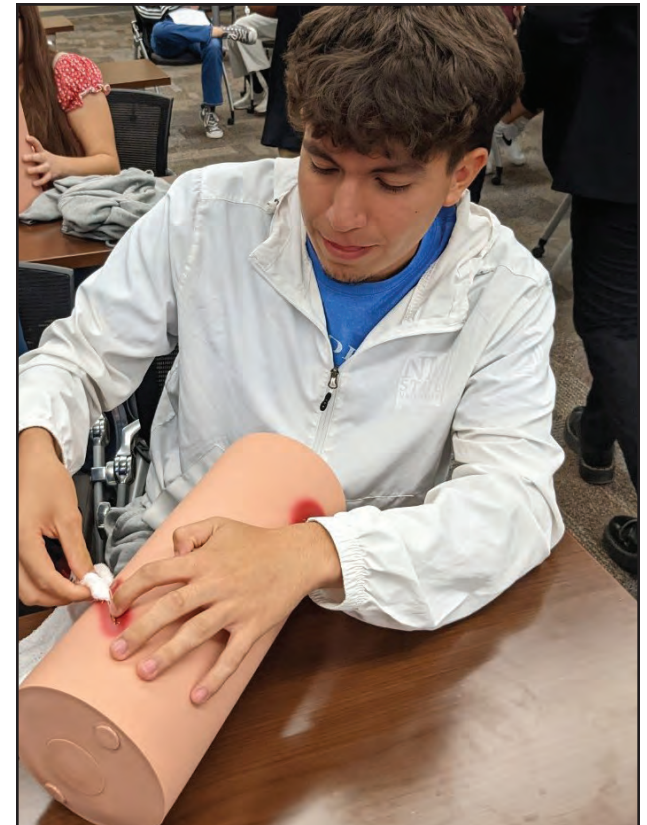
The goal at APECHS is to train doctors, nurses and medical technicians, with the hope that many of them will live and work in Las Cruces and the surrounding area after they have completed their educations, Moreno said.

HOSA also connects students to internship opportunities, Moreno said. And, the chapter also helps members with college and job applications.

Including advisors and HOSA leaders, "It's a support network," Mackenzie said.

"It really is like a community," Dominik said.

APECHS, which was the state's first early college high school when it opened in July 2010, has two programs, one STEM

focused and the other a medical academy. ARECHS sophomores, juniors and seniors are dual enrolled at Doña Ana Community College and often earn associate's degrees from DACC before they graduate from high school. The school also partners with

nearby Burrell College of Osteopathic Medicine and NMSU to create university pathways, career opportunities and lifelong learning, Moreno said.

Spring forward is March 12, spring equinox March 20

Daylight saving time (DST) returns at 2 a.m. Sunday, March 12. Set your clocks forward one hour. It is also a good time to check smoke-alarm batteries.

DST was first enacted in the United States in 1918, then repealed the next year and reinstated as “war time” February

1942-September 1945 during World War II. It became permanent in 1966, and started in earlier than before in 1974, after President Richard Nixon signed the Emergency DST Energy Conservation Act because of an October 1973-March 1974 OPEC oil embargo.

President George

W. Bush signed the Energy Policy Act in 2005, moving the end of DST from the last Sunday in October to the first Sunday in November and the start date to the second Sunday in March.

And by the way, the correct spelling (and the correct way to say it) is Daylight Saving Time – there is no “s”

at the end of saving.

New Mexico is one of 48 states that observes DST.

Only Arizona (except for the Navajo Nation) and Hawaii do not recognize DST, along with American Samoa, Guam, Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands.

Spring equinox

The 2021 spring

equinox will take place at 3:24 p.m. MDT Monday, March 20.

Equinox is a Middle English word which means “equal night.”

The equinox occurs at the exact moment when the Sun crosses Earth’s equator, at which time day and night are of approximately equal length.

12th annual Trail Runs take place March 11

The 12th annual Sierra Vista Trail Runs, presented by the Southern New Mexico Trail Alliance (SNMTA), will be held Saturday, March 11, beginning at the Sierra Vista North Trailhead, just off Dripping Springs road, approximately 7.6 miles east of Interstate 25, Exit 1 (University Avenue), SNMTA said in a news release.

The event consists of four separate trail races with distances of 50 kilometers (31 miles), half marathon (13.1 miles), 10k (6.2 miles), 5k (3.1 miles) and a free one-mile kid’s fun run.

The 50k begins at 7 a.m.; the half marathon begins at 8 a.m.; the 10k begins at 9 a.m.; the 5k begins at 9:30 a.m.; and the kids’ run begins at 10:30 a.m. The cutoff time to finish is 5 p.m.

The race began in 2011 when two Las Cruces trail runners, Dan Carter and Eugene Smith, decided to create the area’s only trail marathon and half-marathon, SNMTA said.

“What started as a free, low-key event with fewer than 100 finishers quickly grew into one of the premier ultra-marathon trail races in New Mexico,” the news release said. “An ultra-marathon is generally considered any footrace longer than marathon length (26.2 miles), with most ranging from 30 to 100 miles.”

Beginning in 2014, the Sierra Vista Trail Runs became the primary fundraiser for the nonprofit SNMTA, which was created that year, SNMTA said. The all-volunteer SNMTA connects communities through trails and the outdoors by coordinating user groups to preserve and enhance trail and outdoor recreation opportunities in the region, the news release said. Its activities include organizing monthly trail maintenance work days; advocating for public input into government land use policy; educating trail users through workshops and informational materials; acting as a central resource for information such as trail

maps and guides, event schedules and public lands policy input opportunities; and identifying potential new trail development opportunities.

The annual runs draw more than 300 participants from around the country and some of the top runners in the region, the nonprofit said.

The Sierra Vista Trail is a National Recreation Trail located on BLM land within the Organ

Mountains-Desert Peaks National Monument. National recreation trails are established under the National Rivers and Trails Act, which celebrates its 50th anniversary this year.

'You possess the power': NMSU honors student athletes

"Be kind. Make a difference," the keynote speaker told student athletes being honored at New Mexico State University's Sneakers and Suits Gala Feb. 21 at the Stan Fulton Center on the NMSU campus.

"You positively impact people simply by being an athlete," Melvin Turner III told the Aggies, who were honored for their achievements in the classroom as well as on the athletic field during the event, which was hosted by NMSU Black Programs, the NMSU Men of Color initiative and the NMSU Department of Athletics. Use that, he said, to inspire and motivate others.

Turner said he and his four siblings – including younger brother Patrick Turner, who is NMSU associate provost for student success – grew up in a housing project in Birmingham, Alabama, in an environment of crime and violence.

An outstanding high school athlete in four sports, Turner said he wanted something better,

and "to do something positive," he said.

Turner overcame personal "bitterness and anger because of my environment" to attend Mississippi State University on a track and football scholarship. He graduated with a bachelor's degree in business administration and also holds a bachelor's degree in theology from Christian Life School of Theology a master's in public management from Troy University.

"You have to persist even when you think the world is unfair," Turner said. "You possess the power to fail or succeed. You have that authority."

NMSU student athletes, who "work hard at a chosen sport but also in the classroom," have maintained a grade point average of 3.0 or better for the past 35 semesters, said gala co-host Bobbie Green, president of the Doña Ana Chapter of the NAACP.

"It's our job to make sure you feel supported," said gala co-host Patrick Turner.

Student athletes inject "passionate spirit and excitement" into the community, said Associated Students of NMSU President Garrett Mosley. Their "individual academic achievement continues to encourage and inspire the people around them."

"As a student athlete, I learned that leadership is not

at a position, it's a disposition," said NMSU Vice President for Student Success Renay Scott.

The connectedness offered by college athletics can "help people find communities, and, most importantly, belonging," Scott said. That is important, she said, because "not all diversities are easily seen or easily understood."

"Tonight, we're celebrating a bunch of champions on the field and in the classroom," said NMSU women's basketball coach Jody Adams. "Each and every one of these young women has left a mark on my life."

The choices a person makes each day and his or her habits determine success, she said.

"At the end of the day, love wins," Adams said.

"I'm coaching for one reason; it's these kids," said NMSU football coach Jerry Kill, whose team won the Quick Lane Bowl last December in Detroit. "I got more out of these kids than anybody I've coached in the last 40 years." he said.

Kill coached at the University

of Minnesota 2011-15, where then Head Football Coach Murray Warmath (1954-71) was one of the first (predominantly white) college coaches to recruit Black players, Kill said, which "changed the game of football."

"You're a part of the movement," Kill told his players and other student athletes at the gala. "I challenge you to look back at history."

Joe Kelly, who played football at NMSU 1955-58, was the university's first African American student athlete, said NMSU Athletic Director Mario Moccia. Moccia said Rob Evans, a native of Hobbs, was one of only three Black assistant basketball coaches (serving under legendary Head Basketball Coach Lou Henson) in the U.S. when he coached for NMSU 1969-76.

Moccia said Nora Carter of Alamogordo was the first African American member of the Aggie women's basketball team, in 1974.

Difficult choices have to be made like, 'Should I pay for this textbook for class or pay my light bill?'" Low-income students face the same challenges as more affluent students, however, the consequence or impact can be more devastating. The goal of the Academic Excellent Fund is to ensure that our students don't have to give up on their dreams and also to serve as a support resource to their academic and social journey."

'Stones' play presents challenging themes

Las Cruces actors Steven Cousler and Jason Wyatt will perform multiple roles in Toadhall Theatre's upcoming production of "Stones in His Pockets."

The two-act play is directed by Ken Forestal, who founded Toadhall in 2014.

Performances are 7 p.m. Friday-Saturday, March 10-11 and 17-18 and 2 p.m. Sunday, March 12 and 19 at First Christian Church, 1809 El Paseo Road.

Tickets are \$10 general admission and \$5 for students and seniors.

In the show, Cousler plays Jake Quinn and Wyatt plays Charlie Conlan and both actors portray multiple other characters, Forestal said.

Cousler was stage manager and crew for Blank Conversations Theatre Company's recent production of "American Idiot." His acting credits include BCTC's "The Importance of Being Earnest" and Toadhall productions of "Van Gogh" and "Two Gentlemen of Verona."

"When Ken first described 'Stones in His Pockets' to me, I was intimidated," Cousler said. "The idea of playing so many characters is both exciting and challenging. I've worked with Ken on multiple productions before this and he's always had a way of getting the best

out of my performances. I have had the pleasure to work with Jason several times before, but the last time we were on stage together was some time ago. I'm excited to play opposite him once again and in such a close-knit play."

Prior to "Stones in His Pockets," Wyatt performed in "The Wizard of Oz" and "Little Miss Sunshine" for Las Cruces Community Theatre and "The Game's Afoot" for Doña Ana Repertory Theatre. He joined Cousler in the cast of "Two Gentlemen of Verona."

"This is a very challenging show, both from an acting perspective as well as in terms of the themes addressed, which include mental health and substance abuse," Wyatt said. "Not only is it a challenge to play multiple characters in quick succession but it takes a great deal of finesse and sensitivity, I think, to balance the comedic elements in the play with the heavy themes, to make sure that these themes are being given the gravity they deserve. As a mental health professional, it is important to me that art addresses themes around mental health seriously and directly but also with sensitivity and this show does just that."

"'Stones In His Pockets' presents an interesting challenge: The actors portray several characters of both genders and varied accents," Forestal said. "The direc-

tor must create a process that supports the actors' challenge and assures that the audience is aware of and has an understanding of all characters and their relationship to the plot."

The play "is an excellent theatrical work that provides a moving experience for the audience," Forestal said. "Stones in His Pockets," first produced in 1999, takes place near a small town in County Kerry, Ireland, that has been taken over by a Hollywood film crew, according to stageagent.com. Conlan and Quinn are extras on the film set and tell the story of the impact the movie has on the local community.

"Charlie claims to be escaping the aftermath of a failed business venture and has great aspirations to get his own script made into a film," the website said. "Jake has recently returned from America and is enthralled by the beauty of the movie's leading lady until it becomes clear that she only wants to use him to appropriate his accent. The play depicts the local

excitement and enthusiasm at being part of a huge movie, but the glamour quickly fades."

Charlie and Jake play 13 other eccentric and eclectic characters between them.

Forestal said he decided to produce and direct the play because his wife, Joan, asked him to as part of their recent 50th wedding anniversary.

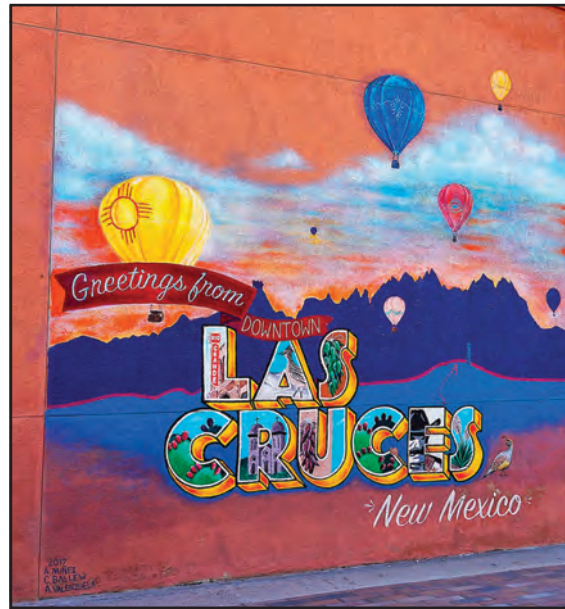
Nuñez was among 65 applicants from across the United States who submitted designs, the City of Las Cruces said in a news release.

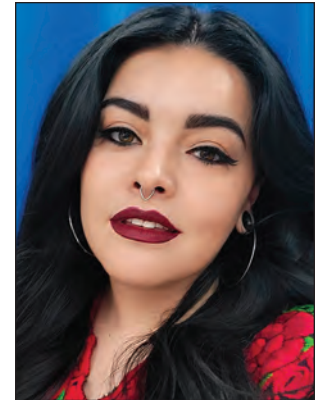

'Fuel for the Future': National Nutrition Month

March is National Nutrition Month, an annual campaign driven by the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics that focuses on the importance of making informed food choices, developing sound eating habits and maintaining regular physical activity. This year's theme is "Fuel for the Future" – a reminder the food and drinks you consume today will work as fuel for your body and mind in the future.

Establishing a well-balanced meal plan doesn't have to be intimidating. Taking small steps toward

changing eating habits can add up to big strides that will positively impact your overall health.

Here are five steps to get you started.

- Plan meals ahead of time. Before going grocery shopping, take inventory of what food you already have so you know what you need to purchase. Research healthy recipes that use items you currently have and fill your list with only what you need for the week. Portioning lunches or dinners in advance can save time, help maintain portion control and keep you accountable to healthy eating decisions.

- Try new recipes. Variety is the spice of life.

JC Penney partnership to take Prados Beauty nationwide

Growing up on a small farm in rural Arizona – “a little brown girl from the sticks” – Cece Meadows remembers telling her siblings, “One day I’m going to be famous. I’m going to do something really big.”

For the founder and CEO of Prados Beauty, the day has come.

Her unique beauty products are being introduced in JC Penney stores in Las Cruces and across the United States – more than 600 by the end of 2023 – and Meadows, whom the company calls a “beauty entrepreneur,” is one of the featured models in Penney’s new designer dress collection iMPOWER, “celebrating all women.”

“It was huge for me,” Meadows said about the collaboration, which comes through her partnership with 13 Lune, an online marketplace for beauty products created by black and brown business owners like Meadows, who identifies as Xicana (Chicana) and as Yoeme and N̄m̄m̄n̄n̄, Native Americans with homelands in Sonora, Mexico; New Mexico; Texas; and Arizona.

Meadows started Prados – which means “Meadows” in Spanish – in New York City in 2018. She moved the business to Las Cruces in 2020 when her husband, Daniel, a U.S. Army major, was transferred to White Sands Missile Range.

The couple had passed

through Las Cruces four years earlier.

“I just fell in love,” she said. “I told Daniel, ‘If we ever get the chance, can we come back here?’”

Meadows grew up on a farm in Arizona, doing 4H projects, riding horses, milking cows, making goat cheese and branding cattle.

“I’m a farm girl through and through,” she said.

After graduating from junior college in 2005,

Meadows moved to California and began her career in finance.

“I started learning about money and how it works,” she said.

After a diagnosis of ovarian cancer at age 27, the breakup of her first marriage and surviving domestic violence, Meadows found herself unemployed – and, at one point, homeless – with two young children to care for.

During her battle with cancer, Meadows lost all of hair because of chemotherapy, and “felt like I had lost a part of my identity,” she said. Then some friends “came over to my house one evening and gave me a makeover. I just looked like a million dollars,” she said.

That was a defining moment for Meadows, who told herself, “You’re beautiful. Keep fighting. I never, ever lost sight of the possibilities of what the future could be.”

Meadows dropped out of

beauty school and began volunteering at Ronald McDonald House and other nonprofits, helping children and adults battling health issues to look their best. She also created eyelashes and patent-pending makeup brushes for people with skin sensitivity during chemotherapy who need gentler products for their faces.

That was the start of Prados Beauty – “just wanting to help people,” Meadows said.

With a storefront at 1323 E. Lohman Ave. – No. 6 in the shopping center just east of Solano Drive – and a warehouse nearby, Meadows and her staff sell her beauty products in person, and the Prados website makes her products available to a growing clientele across the country and around the world.

Meadows pairs her own Sagrado Collection with the creations of artist Steven Paul Judd (the Matriarch Collection) and other local entrepreneurs for a collection that includes eyeshadow, blush, lipstick and lip gloss, eye lashes, face pads, spa headbands, soaps, bath bombs, candles and more.

The products are for both men and women – her sons, ages 5 and 9, are product testers along with her 14-year-old daughter, Meadows said.

In addition to bringing “light and awareness to

A look at February housing stats

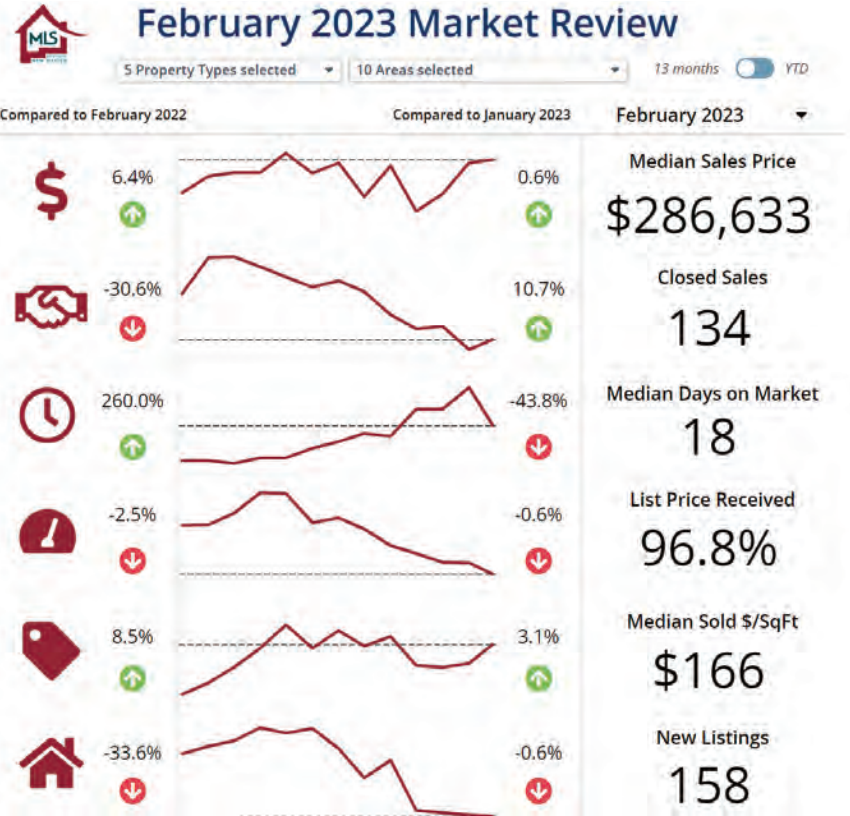

Bulldawgs, Knights advance

BULLETIN REPORT

Of the seven Las Cruces teams who made the state basketball tournament, two made the Final Four.

In the 5A girls division, only Las Cruces High School remained, after defeating #2 seed Farmington 62-60 March 7 at the Pit in Albuquerque.

In the 5A boys division, Organ Mountain High School beat West Mesa 59-55 in a morning game March 8 at the Pit. The Knights, seeded #5, defeated Hobbs 70-56 March 4 at home to advance to Albu-

querque.

The LCHS girls and the OMHS boys both played Volcano Vista March 9, in the semifinals at the Pit. The Bulldawgs met #3 seed VV girls at 1:15 p.m., and the Knights faced the #1 seed VV boys at 8:15 p.m. Both games were after the Bulletin's press time.

Centennial High School, the #6 seed in the 5A girls division, defeated Organ Mountain High School 40-39 March 3 at the CHS gym in the tournament's first round. The Hawks lost, however,

44-36, to Volcano Vista in the second round. Also on March 3 in Las Cruces, #7 seed LCHS beat Clovis 51-33. The #13 seed in the girls division, Mayfield High School, lost to La Cueva 49-29 in Albuquerque March 3.

In the Class A boys state tournament, Mesilla Valley Christian lost on the road to Melrose 69-48.

In the Class 5A boys state tournament, #14 seed Las Cruces High School nearly pulled the upset on #3 seed Los Lunas, narrowly losing to the Tigers 45-43.

NMUSSSA Hall of Fame honors locals and Lt. Gov.

When Howie Morales steps up to the plate, he could be facing a political challenge in his role as New Mexico's lieutenant governor, or he could be facing the opposing pitcher as one of the state's premier softball players.

Recognizing his three state championships (1992, 2003, 2006), his nearly 20 years as a member of the Grant County Sox softball team, and his success as a shortstop and lead-off batter, Morales was inducted into the New Mexico United States Specialty Sports Association (NMUSSSA) Softball Hall of Fame (HOF) Feb. 25 at the Las Cruces Convention Center.

Also inducted were men's slow-pitch softball team Saints n Sinnaz, umpire Jim Candelaria and BNUSSSA director

James Jackson, all of Las Cruces.

"It's all about collaboration and working together," Morales told the Bulletin after his induction.

Morales, who turned 50 in January, has been playing softball since age 19.

"I'm a product of NMUSSSA," Morales told attendees at the organization's state meeting as he accepted his induction award.

Morales said participation in NMUSSSA and his service as a coach of two Grant County high school baseball teams helped him learn the valuable life lesson that "You never forget where you came from."

"I am grateful to all my teammates and coaches over the years," Morales

said in a news release.

"Sports and softball have been a passion of mine through my whole life, and this award means so much to me."

USSSA is the nation's largest multi-sport organization for amateur athletes, and is the largest

sports organization in New Mexico, said USSANM director Ron Parra of Silver City.

NMUSSSA created its HOF in 1999 and has "the greatest state HOF in the country," said long-time member Kevin Naegele of Hobbs. Naegele and fellow USSANM member Bert Frederick of Las Cruces were co-masters of ceremonies for the Feb. 25 HOF induction ceremony. Both are members of the national USSSA HOF.

Manager William Martinez and several team

members accepted the HOF induction award for the Las Cruces Saints n Sinnaz, which was founded in 2005.

Morales began playing softball in 1992, after Western New Mexico University in Silver City "unexpectedly canceled its men's baseball program." Morales had enrolled that year as a freshman at WNMU on a baseball scholarship. The university honored his scholarship, and Morales began his studies while working as a shoe salesman at a Silver City department store. He was invited to play softball with the Grant County Sox.

"While our team competed in tournaments nearly every weekend from May to October for 20 years, we had many successes during that time," Morales said, including participation in World Hispanic tournaments,

the Whole Enchilada Fiesta tournament in Las Cruces, the Silver City Blues Festival tournament, local benefit tournaments and state and regional play. Morales received all-tournament, all-state, golden glove and most valuable player awards throughout his career.

"I grew up, along with

my many relatives, at the softball field observing fastpitch and slow-pitch," Morales said. "I watched my father (Henry Morales, 1949-2019) organize tournaments, prepare fields, order team uniforms, fundraise and other lessons I have been able to apply in my coaching career as well as professional career."

Playing smart golf a sure way to score better

In golf, as in business, sports and even life, avoiding needless mistakes is a good thing.

The term “course management” has come to signify the proper use of smart mistake-free strategy and the decisions a player makes during a given round. When it comes to cutting strokes off your score in the quickest way possible, better planning and positioning your shots will do it.

There are multiple factors, of course, that affect the outcome of any given shot – and any given round of golf. Most of the factors are within our own control, but some are not. Bounces can be good or bad or in between. Luck can be good or bad. The ball can come to rest in a good or bad lie. A wind gust can come up

or lay down at the moment of impact. Distractions and noises come and go. Cups can be cut in the ground with precision and respected by the other players, or they can be cut haphazardly and damaged by clumsy sloths, causing the ball to lip out.

But mostly you can control how you golf your ball around the golf course. By playing smart golf.

Let’s say you face a shot to the green that requires a 170-yard carry over water. You can hit your 3 wood to carry 180 yards; what do you do? My usual answer, in this and several other things is “it depends.” If you can hit the big shot 9 out of 10 times, go for it. If it’s a match with nothing to lose, go for it. If it’s a stroke-play tournament, where a mistake can be

very costly, you need to realize that you would have to pull off the perfect shot to stay dry. So, hit the safe shot and lay up – and be sure to aim safe.

Players who don’t play smart often don’t check their aim. Another aspect of smart course management has to do with simply playing intelligent shots. That means noticing bunkers, hazards and places to avoid in your line of play. Chipping safely. Staying out of awkward areas. Choosing clubs that are easy for you to hit, not hard. Better to hit a 7 iron 120 yards than top a 3 wood 30 yards.

Here are a few key principles and takeaways for smart course management.

First, know your per-

sonal capabilities and play within those limits. Next, enhance your awareness and size up the situation realistically. Then, quickly factor in at least two choices that you have for every play. Carefully manage yourself and your emotions throughout your round. In difficult situations

think in terms of probabilities of success or failure, risk and reward.

And be keenly aware of where to miss and where not to miss.

Pro golfers do what is commonly called “grinding.” Grinding is where you focus all your effort and intensity on getting it up and down for the best score possible in a difficult situation. When

you miss the green, or hit into a bunker, or have to play from an awful spot, you just need to keep grinding to eke out a par. It seems to me the secret of grinding is to not give up on the hole. Sometimes grinding means taking your medicine, without worsening the matter, and don’t give up on the hole. Keep your focus, stick to your routine, look at the options and stay patient. Try to make the best play you possibly can, and accept what happens as the result. You have to be a grinder – a smart grinder – to win. Some folks become totally amazed at “miracle” par saves, but in reality they are witnessing the refusal to quit. Never give up on a hole.

To turn yourself into a smart, winning golfer you

sometimes have to take “par” out of the equation. In some ways, par is a fictitious number and concept, representing mostly a way to classify holes as to their length and difficulty. Your task is to play each shot as smartly as you can, and each hole in the fewest number of strokes, par notwithstanding. At times that means not letting your ball stray out of position, making sure your next shot is easier. Also, how about not focusing on the scorecard. You play 18 holes and add up the score at the end, not in the middle.
