Legislature passes record budget, \$500 rebates

The first session of New Mexico's 56th legislature ended at noon Saturday, March 18, as state senators and representatives passed the largest budget in state history, along with tax reform legislation and bills that oppose high-level nuclear waste storage in the state, address medical malpractice, voting rights, firearms, teacher salaries and education funding, human and gender rights, health and behavioral health.

The tax bill also provides for a tax rebate of \$500 to most New Mexicans.

Here is a brief summary of some of the bills passed during the session. They will become law if signed by April 7 by Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham, who can veto a bill outright and also has line-item veto authority. If she does not act on a bill by that date, it is pocket vetoed. June 16 is the effective date of bills signed into law by the governor, except for general appropriations bills and any legislation with an emergency clause or specified date.

• **House Bill 2:** General Appropriations Act, totals \$9.57 billion, an increase of almost 14 percent from the current state budget. The bill, which maintains 30 percent reserves, includes a \$302 million (eight percent) increase for public schools, a six percent raise for teachers, \$135 million in appropriations to the New Mexico Early Childhood and Education Care Department, a six percent increase in funding for the state Children, Youth and Families Department, \$489.5 million for recurring and non-recurring expenses in the Environment Department, \$50 million to establish the Land of Enchantment Legacy Fund (a new conservation permanent fund), \$124 million to the Office of Broadband Access and Expansion, \$55 million for state airports and \$230 million for state and local roads. The bill was sponsored by state

Finance Committee. HB 2 passed the house 52-17 and passed the senate 25-16.

• **HB 547:** Tax Changes, "makes tax policy more equitable, provides relief for working families, eases tax burdens for small business and veterans and supports climate goals," according to a news release from New Mexico House of Representatives Democrats. The bill reduces capital gains tax, flattens corporate income tax, reduces the state's overall gross receipts tax by 0.5 percent over the next five years, increases the state's low-income comprehensive tax rebate, provides tax rebates of \$500 to individuals who filed 2021 tax returns and \$1,000 to joint filers, increases the refundable child income tax credit, doubles the tax credit for parents who adopt a child with special needs and provides a new tax exemption for military retirement pay. The bill also creates tax credits for electric vehicle purchases. It also raises alcohol excise taxes by 20 percent, and distributes a portion to a new alcohol harms

alleviation fund. HB 547 passed the house 50-18 and the senate 24-12.

• **Senate Bill 53:** Storage of Certain Radioactive Waste, "prohibits storage of nuclear waste in New Mexico without the state's consent," according to House Democrats. The bill was

sponsored by **Sen. Jeff Steinborn**, D-Doña Ana. The bill passed the house 35-28 and the senate 21-13

• **SB 523:** Public Peace, Health, Safety and Welfare Medical Malpractice Changes, amends the state Medical Malpractice Act "to change the limitation of recovery for certain claims against facilities that are not hospital controlled," according to nmlegis.gov. The bill is "a long-term fix to the malpractice insurance crisis that threatened to put independent providers and outpatient facilities in New Mexico out of business," according to a news release from the New Mexico Senate Republican Office. The bill passed the house 63-0 and the senate 40-2.

• **HB 130:** K-12 Plus Program, would increase learning time from the current minimums of 990 hours for elementary school students and 1,080 for middle and high school students to 1,400 hours for all students. It passed the house 62-0 and the senate 34-6.

• **SB 426** establishes a civil rights division in the New Mexico Attorney General's office that would have the authority to investigate, intervene and bring civil actions related to civil rights violations, according to nmlegis.gov. The bill is sponsored by

• **HB 9:** Unlawful Access to a Firearm by a Minor (Bennie's Bill), co-sponsored by state

Rep. Joanne Ferrary, D-Doña Ana, "protects kids from gun violence and senseless tragedies by holding adults accountable for reckless storage of firearms," according to New Mexico House Democrats. Lujan Grisham signed HB 9 March 14. The bill passed the house 37-32 and the senate 24-16.

• **HB 306:** Purchase of Firearms for Another, co-sponsored by state

Rep. Ray

Lara, D-Doña Ana, "makes it a felony to knowingly buy a gun for someone who can't legally own it or intends to use it for a crime," according to House Democrats. The bill passed the house 62-3 and the senate 28-10.

• **HB 27:** Breast Exam Health Coverage, eliminates out-of-pocket costs for breast examinations. The bill passed the house 58-0 and the senate 35-0.

• **SB 310:** Expands centers in New Mexico "to treat those in crisis as well as authorizing peace officers to bring individuals to these centers for evaluation rather than having to take them to the ER or jail," according to House Democrats. The bill was sponsored by state

Ana. It passed the house 63-0 and the senate 35-0.

• New Mexico Secretary of State Maggie Toulouse Oliver said three bills passed by the legislature "are big wins for voting access, election security and election administration in New Mexico." The bills are **HB 4:** Voting Rights Protections (the New Mexico Voting Rights Act; sponsored by Lara and passed the house 41-26 and the senate 27-14); **SB 180:** Election Administration

Changes, which passed the house 44-25 and the senate 23-13; and **SB 43:** Intimidation of Election Officials, which passed the house 62-1 and the senate 38-0.

• **HB 7:** Reproductive and Gender Affirming Health Care Act “protects access to reproductive and gender-affirming health care by prohibiting counties and local municipalities from denying, restricting or discriminating against a person’s right to care,” according to House Democrats. Lujan Grisham signed HB 7 March 16. It passed the house 38-31 and the senate 23-15.

• **HB 207:** Expand

Human Rights Act, “expands discrimination protections,” accord-

ing to House Democrats. The bill was sponsored by **Sen. Carrie Hamblen**, D-Doña Ana. It passed the house 47-20 and the senate 26-10.

• **HB 8:** Creative Industries Division in EDD, creates the division with the state Economic Development Department (NMEDD) “to spur the growth of New Mexico’s creative industries and diversity the state’s economy,” according to House Democrats. Steinborn sponsored the bill. It passed the house 56-10 and the senate 30-2.

• **HB 118:** Create Office of Entrepreneurship, creates the office in NMEDD “to provide greater support and resources for budding business owners in New Mexico,” according to

House Democrats. Gallegos sponsored the bill. It passed the house 54-1 and the senate 32-4.

• **SB 182:** The Litter Control and Beautification Act, “improves recycling and litter cleanup in New Mexico,” said Steinborn, who co-sponsored the bill with **Sen.**

Crystal Diamond, R-Sierra, Luna, Hidalgo and Doña Ana. It passed the house 62-0 and the senate 37-0.

• **HB 15:** Special Immigrant Juvenile Classification “creates a path for young migrants, for whom returning to their home country is not in their best interest, to safely stay in the United States,” according to House Democrats. It passed the house 64-0 and the senate 33-6.

• **HB 139:** Flexibility in Fines and Fees “ensures that courts consider an individual’s ability to pay when imposing fines and fees.” Sponsored by state **Rep. Micaela Lara Cadena**, D-Doña Ana. It passed the house 42-18 and the senate 35-1.

• **HB 314:** Cannabis Record Expungement, “streamlines expungement of criminal records for acts no longer prohibited with the legalization of adult-use cannabis,” according to House Democrats. It passed the house 51-5 and the senate 34-8.

The Las Cruces Utilities (LCU) Water Conservation Program’s Lush & Lean Workshop “Passive Rainwater Harvesting” on Thursday, March 30, will ask attendees to consider their connection to water, not only in how they water their yard, but how they can conserve water for the future.

Mike Gaglio, biologist and managing member of High Desert Native Plants, has been implementing passive rainwater harvesting throughout the region for years and believes that there is an imminent change in how homeowners will think about harvesting water, even if we don’t see much rain in the desert.

“I get asked why we would do it; it never rains out here,” said Gaglio. “And that’s exactly why we need to do rainwater harvesting because it does, and we have to take care of every drop we get.”

Gaglio said residents usually use “expensive water” to water their yards.

“We spend energy to get water out of the

wells and then treat it. And then we turn around and put that on our landscapes,” he said. “If we were doing things a little bit differently, using native plants, not just desert-adapted plants, we could create a landscape that captures the water that falls on and around our yards and create a lush landscape that is in tune to the seasonal fluctuations of moisture.”

Gaglio said that proper planning at the beginning of the rainwater harvesting design, especially when planning for overflow, is key. “If you don’t plan for your overflow, someday we’re going to get a storm that

overwhelms it. Planning for that is critical,” he said. “That overflow is a resource.”

In the time he’s worked in landscapes, he’s seen changes in the designs and active incorporation of water harvesting. “We’ve shifted away from the high-intensity or the high-water use lawns,” he said. “Water harvesting is the next step in the evolution of how we build our front yards, our public spaces, and our communities.”

“It took xeriscaping 20 years to catch on, so it’s probably going to take rainwater harvesting 20 years to catch on,” he said. “I’ve worked on these landscapes for 15 years now, and so we’re getting close.”

Gaglio said that water harvesting could be the catalyst for thinking deeper about our environment. He said, “It’s a way where we can see the direct effects of our actions and how even the smallest actions have a positive impact on our environment.”

Radar helps locate graves in old Picacho Cemetery

There are only two grave markers in the old Picacho Cemetery located just outside Las Cruces near Shalem Colony and Fairacres and the names of fewer than 40 of the hundreds of children and adults buried there are known. But historical

records and a lot of work by the Doña Ana County Historical Society (DACHS) have shown that several hundred people are buried in the cemetery, which was in use circa 1860- 1949.

Using cutting-edge technology, including ground-penetrating radar (GPR), CSTi (Construction Survey Technologies, Inc.) of Las Cruces has

confirmed that about 400 unmarked graves are located on 1.2 acres on the north and south sites of the Village of Picacho Campo Santo de la Sagrada Familia Cemetery, including a couple of dozen graves that are stacked on top of each other.

“That’s a lot of unidentified people,” CSTi CEO and co-founder John Gallegos said at DACHS’s March 16 meeting at Good Samaritan Village.

GPR can’t identify the children and adults resting there – including many who likely died during the 1918-20 flu pandemic – but documenting the locations of their graves is important, Gallegos said. For the people buried there, it’s a way of saying “I matter again,” he said.

Gallegos, CSTi co-founder David Acosta and others from the company have made nearly a dozen visits to the cemetery since 2019 – volunteering their time and the use of their equipment – to locate the graves, which mostly lie about 3.5-eight feet below ground, Gallegos said.

“They’re exceptional,” DACHS member Sally Kading said about CSTi at the meeting. “They really have been wonderful.”

“We love to go out in the community,” Gallegos said, helping to “make the unknown known.”

In addition to confirming the location of graves, CSTi’s work also uncovered a couple of anomalies in the cemetery that have Gallegos and

Acosta curious and may lead to some additional work.

“We know there’s something there,” he said.

“The next steps are to scan the acres that are not pedestrian accessible,”

Gallegos said, “and try to locate a child’s grave marker that has marbles and toy cars embedded in the top. Is there more to learn from GPR and similar technologies at the site? To be continued ...”

will not be published.**Bill helps NM doctors, half of them anyway**

You don't often see a bill pass unanimously, but it happened a few times in the 2023 New Mexico Legislative Session, which wrapped up last week.

Notable was the House of Representatives' vote on Senate Bill 523, which had bipartisan sponsorship and passed 63-0. This was the revision of SB 296, which was designed to modify a 2021 House Bill.

That 2021 bill skyrocketed the malpractice caps in New Mexico, and would have gone into effect this year. The caps went from around \$600,000 to the \$5-6 million range. That issue sent some doctors packing to other states, and had many others thinking about it, as the increased insurance costs would have made practicing in the Land of Enchantment difficult at best. And we're already a state that has a hard time recruit-

ing doctors.

The earlier modification bill, SB 296, which also had bipartisan sponsorship, was languishing in this busy, spendy session until, as I understand it, Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham got involved. It was tweaked to make the bill more palatable to some of its opponents, and sailed through, re-branded as SB 523. Primarily, the changes reduced the caps for independent doctors with smaller practices.

However, the revised bill still leaves vulnerable doctors who practice under the umbrella of a larger hospital or medical facility. And that is about half the doctors in New Mexico, 51 percent at last check.

No one is asking amnesty for doctors who make terrible errors. They should be punished and families should be compen-

sated. But why should they be punished in New Mexico way out of proportion with the rest of the country?

I'm pleased enough legislators, and apparently the governor, recognized the critical situation and made the late rally. But I doubt it would have happened without a whole lot of New Mexico doctors pleading the case. It's encouraging to know our elected representatives still listen to the people on occasion.

As our population ages, and as New Mexico has made concerted efforts to attract retirees, quality healthcare is increasingly important. I hope our state legislators and administrators recognize that only half the battle has been addressed. There is time between now and the next legislative session to do something about this serious issue for the other half of our state's doctors.

Also important to note is SB

523 did not pass unanimously in the senate. That vote was 40-2, with the no votes coming from our own Joseph Cervantes, and Albuquerque's Katy Duhigg. Both are attorneys.

Two bills that did pass both houses unanimously were HB 27, which eliminates out-of-pocket expenses for breast examinations, and SB 310, which expands authorization for peace officers to take individuals – particularly those with apparent mental health issues -- to crisis triage centers, often a better alternative than jail or the emergency room.

Las Cruces Sen. Bill Soules got national attention for SB 188, which establishes roasting green chile as the official state aroma. We all love our green chile, or so I thought, but even that bill didn't pass unanimously. It went through the house 57-0, but four senators evidently thought the bill stunk, and voted no.

I'm not at all comfortable with my new position to the right of Republican leaders on foreign policy.

As a child who grew up watching the Vietnam War on the nightly news and fearing it would still be raging when I turned 18, I have always opposed the military adventurism of Republican leaders, whether it was Richard Nixon in Vietnam and Cambodia; Ronald Reagan in Central America or George W. Bush in Iraq.

We all knew our roles back then. Republican leaders saw the world as a threat to be neutralized and an economic opportunity to be exploited. American exceptionalism meant remaking ancient cultures by means of force in nations like Iraq and Afghanistan.

My role was to shake my fist in anger and frustration and do my best to vote them out when given

the opportunity.

Now, I find myself to the right of the two leading Republican contenders for president on the war in Ukraine.

Donald Trump, who called Vladimir Putin a "genius" at the start of the invasion, is now advocating for a peace plan that would reward Russia for its aggression. Florida Gov. Ron DeSantis, his top challenger if the polls are to be believed, called the war a "territorial dispute" that is not in our national interest.

The Republican Party is divided on the issue, but trending toward isolationism. A recent Pew poll found that 40 percent of Republicans think we're doing too much to help Ukraine, while

only 17 percent said we weren't doing enough.

Do Republicans only support wars when it's our soldiers getting killed? Have we been an occupying force for so long our sympathies lie with the invaders? There are valid questions being asked by those who fear escalation of this war. I wrote a column a year ago at the start of the war that was nothing but questions. Most remain unanswered. None of us can predict what the last play of a defeated Putin will be.

President Joe Biden has attempted a "Three Little Bears" approach, trying not to be so hot as to invite World War III, nor so cold as to endanger Ukrainian defeat. It's not making anybody happy, but it seems to sort of be working. So far.

I don't know if Republican op-

position to the war in Ukraine reflects a dramatic shift on foreign policy, or just reflexive opposition to a Democratic president. But we'll find out soon.

The Senate is advancing a bill that would repeal the authorization granted during the Bush administration to go to war in Iraq. It will be interesting to see how many members vote against that bill while at the same time opposing support for Ukraine.

NMSU College of ACES has April 1 open house

New Mexico State University's College of Agricultural, Consumer and Environmental Sciences (ACES) will open its doors to the public for the annual ACES Open House, 9 a.m.-noon Saturday, April 1, at several of the college's facilities on campus, NMSU said in a news release.

"ACES Open House will provide residents of Las Cruces and the surrounding areas with the opportunity to visit our facilities, look at the advancements, learn about the research and activities that are being conducted to benefit New Mexicans," ACES Dean Rolando A. Flores Galarza said.

Visitors should start at the welcome tent outside Gerald Thomas Hall, 940

College Drive, NMSU said. A self-guided map includes a list of areas to visit along with a spot to collect stamps for the places visited.

There will be wine tasting and an opportunity to vote for the "People's Choice" award winner in the third annual Edible Book Festival. There will also be games, interactive activities and videos at the Learning Games Lab, and interaction with the Fashion Merchandising and Design program.

An equine program will provide a chance to interact with horses, sheep and goats. Displays will feature common birds, mammals and fish of New Mexico. Visitors can tour the ACES Arthropod Museum, home of the largest

collection of insects and other arthropods in the state. The museum features exotic insect displays and live walking sticks, hissing cockroaches, tarantulas and more. Another display will feature urban insects and provide information about how they affect our health, quality of life and cause significant economic loss.

The New Mexico 4-H program will showcase its "Shooting Sports" trailer. Visitors can learn firearm safety while practicing shooting an air pellet rifle in a controlled environment.

Collegiate 4-H will host a corn-hole competition.

Health-related activities include a giant inflatable colon (weather permitting) that visitors can walk

through to learn more about colon cancer. A demonstration on proper handwashing as well as information about a variety of free health and wellness programs will be provided.

City council creates affordable housing loan fund

At its March 6 regular meeting, the Las Cruces City Council unanimously approved resolutions creating an affordable housing loan fund and updating the city's policy for naming and renaming city streets.

Affordable housing loan fund

The construction revolving loan fund will be financed by the city's Affordable Housing Trust Fund, created in 2010,

which uses grants and loans to finance housing projects, city Housing and Neighborhood Services Manager Natalie Green said at the meeting.

Under the program, seed funding of \$500,000 will be loaned at one percent interest to Tierra del Sol, a nonprofit affordable housing developer in Las Cruces, to build houses on 39 lots at Metro Park Village on the city's East Mesa, Green said. There are 55 pre-screen applicants on the city's homeownership waiting list, all of

whom have incomes of up to 120 percent of area median income, and will be pre-approved before construction starts, she said.

"These are low- to moderate-income home buyers who otherwise would not have the opportunity to achieve homeownership," Green said.

The short-term loans, likely eight- to 12-months in duration, Green said, will be paid back to the city at closing.

Once built, homes will be sold for \$169,000-\$175,000, she said, with an

average interest savings on construction of \$2,800 passed on to the homeowner.

"In this area, which is in my district, the average home is probably about \$315,000, so immediately folks have a lot of equity, which is the great part of homeownership," Councilor Becky Corran said at the meeting.

"It's so great to see yet another example of empowering single-family home ownership," Councilor Becki Graham said.

The loan fund is "building wealth for people, for families," Councilor Johana Bencomo said. "Home ownership is further and further away for so many New Mexicans. I bought my home in 2019. I don't know that I would be able to afford my home this year. This kind of program ... is just such a

big deal."

The city hopes to "build on initial successes that we anticipate coming and do an expansion of the program," Green said. "We have selected Tierra del Sol because they're that experienced developer to work with, but we would like to see this open much broader and build that capacity across the continuum."

Naming and renaming streets

The resolution amending how the city names and renames its streets is the first update to that policy since 1980, the city said.

Amendments include allowing for the change of street names that are "deemed derogatory, discriminatory, racist or vulgar," the city said, and ensuring that street

names are "reasonably straightforward and easy to pronounce" and are not duplicated or sound the same.

Bencomo read an email from a member of the Navajo Nation Tribe who lives in Las Cruces and said, "The indigenous community both who reside here and from afar are in support of changing names that dishonor groups of people and continue to keep them in stereotyped and derogatory timelines, frozen and unchanging."

Squaw Mountain Drive, the name of a street located south of East Lohman Avenue between Foothills Road and Roadrunner Parkway, was cited in two emails Bencomo read and by other council members.

CdP seeks artists for mural

Jobless numbers decline

Unemployment in the City of Las Cruces was 3.1 percent in December 2022, down 1.5 percent from December 2021 and 1.8 percent lower than December 2019, City of Las Cruces economist Monica Torres, Ph.D., told the city council at its March 13 work session.

Torres said city employment totaled 46,735 last December, a growth of 475 workers from December 2021. 1,476 people were actively looking for a job in December 2022, 741 fewer than in December 2021 and about 900 fewer than in December 2019, she said.

The city's total labor force in December 2022 was 48,211, Torres said, down 266 workers.

Total nonfarm employment in the Las Cruces MSA was up 2.4 percent, about 1,800 workers, to 77,200 in

Mesilla mayor pondering fourth run

Nora Barraza has not yet decided if she will run for a fourth four-year term as mayor of the Town of Mesilla.

Barraza served eight years on the Mesilla Board of Trustees before being elected mayor in 2010. She was re-elected in 2014 and 2018. The 2023 town election will be Tuesday, Nov. 7.

Barraza said her most important accomplishment during her 12 years as mayor has been addressing the town's infrastructure needs, including water and sewer lines and roads, along with water wells and park improvements. Barraza said the town's community center and public safety building have undergone renovations and there have been upgrades to the historic Mesilla Plaza "kiosko." Calle del Norte Trail and streetlighting during her tenure as mayor.

"We've done a lot," Barraza said. "It's not about me. It's about us working together as a team."

Town improvements going forward will include major renovations on the west end of University Avenue that lies in Mesilla – the town is working with the New Mexico Department of Transportation (NMDOT) on that project.

The multi-million-dollar project will create "a safer environment" for students walking and biking to Zia Middle School (which Barraza attended), she said, and will also make the school safer for parents picking up their children at the school.

That is an initiative Barraza said she is working on with Las Cruces Public Schools (LCPS), for whom she worked for 30 years as a secretary before retiring in 2003.

"We're working on pedestrian and bike safety at Zia with the new NMDOT infrastructure project that will be going in next

year on University Avenue," said LCPS Safe Routes to Schools Coordinator, Ashleigh Curry. LCPS has one of the most successful SRTS program in the United States. It began at Mesilla Elementary School.

Barraza's success as mayor, she said, is "all about working with the people in the community."

The town is joining others around the state in upgrading its police and fire radio communications systems from analog to digital, Barraza said. That likely will cost about \$500,000.

Barraza said she made trips to Santa Fe during the 2023 legislative session to meet with legislators to seek support for the upgrade and other town capital improvements, including drainage improvements, sewer system and manhole rehabilitation, purchasing a street sweeper, road improvements, drilling a new well and buying a new vehicle for the Mesilla Marshal's Office.

Doña Ana County legislators "are very supportive," Barraza said.

Mesilla has faced recent staffing challenges, Barraza said, during which she lent a hand with community development and in the town clerk's office.

"Whatever it takes to do the job, I will step in to best of my ability," Barraza said.

She said Gloria Maya was promoted to town clerk from deputy town clerk in February. The town, she said, is seeking a new fire chief to replace Kevin Hoban, who retired at the end of the year.

Hoban "set a very high standard," Barraza said. "I feel we have the best volunteer fire department in the whole state of New Mexico."

Renovations to the town public safety building included providing sleeping quarters,

a kitchen, showers and a TV room for volunteer firefighters, she said.

Barraza said she also is "very satisfied" with the service provided by Mesilla Town Marshal Enrique Salas and his staff.

The majority of Mesilla's gross receipts tax collections come from visitors to the community, and it is important to continue that, she said. But the town also must "preserve our history" and the community events and activities that are "special to us," and share that experience with visitors.

During her two trips to Washington, D.C., to advocate for the creation of Organ Mountain Desert Peaks National Monument, Barraza said she stressed "the importance of preservation."

Barraza is fifth-generation Mesillera.

"That's why I take my role so seriously," she said. "My roots are here. My heart is definitely here in the Town of Mesilla."

Barraza, the third of six children, was the last one born in her parents' Mesilla home, she said. She and her husband, Paul, have been married for 48 years and have two children and four grandchildren.

Barraza said Mesilla icon J. Paul Taylor, who died in February at age 102, was a long-time friend and mentor.

"His legacy will live on for the Town of Mesilla and the whole community," she said.

After her retirement from LCPS, Barraza was office manager for the Basilica of San Albino in Mesilla for two years before she was elected mayor.

She currently serves as chair of the South Central Council of Governments, vice chair (and former chair) of the South Central Regional Transit District Board of Directors and a member of the New Mexico Municipal League, Mesilla Valley Metropolitan Planning Organization and the J. Paul Taylor Museum Board.

The second email Bencomo read was written by a member of the Piro Manso Tiwa Tribe, who said, "Place names can carry powerful historical significance and the use of discriminatory language or racial slurs represents a traumatic history of racism and colonization that continues into the present day.

"New Mexico is the

state with the most cases of missing and murdered indigenous women," the writer said.

"The continued use of slurs that devalue and demonize us are linked to this epidemic of violence. Everyone deserves to feel safe and valued in our community."

December 2022 compared to December 2021, Torres said.

"2022 was also characterized by high inflation," Torres said, which reached a 40-year high in June 2022.

The consumer price index was up 6.3 percent in January 2023 as compared to January 2022.

The city's gross receipts tax (GRT) revenue was almost \$11.8 million in December 2022, an increase of almost five percent from the year before. GRT increased 9.7 percent in 2022 over 2021, Torres said.

Cannabis sales averaged about \$3 million a month since recreational cannabis sales became legal last April, Torres said. She said 37 cannabis retailers generated \$616,533 in excise tax, April-December 2022. Torres said recreational cannabis accounted for 57 percent sales.

Holocaust survivor to speak in Las Cruces

On her 16th birthday, May 28, 1944, Esther Basch was sent to the Auschwitz concentration camp.

Nearly 80 years later, on Sunday, March 26, Basch, now 94, will be in Las Cruces to tell her story.

“Soon all Holocaust survivors will be gone,” said Rabbi Bery Schmukler of Alevy Chabad, which is sponsoring Basch’s presentation. “It is an honor and privilege for us to be able to bring

survivor Esther Basch to Las Cruces, so she can share her first-hand account with us. We hope for the entire community to come out in her merit and to learn from her story.”

The event will begin with a VIP reception at 3 p.m., following by Basch’s presentation at 4 p.m., at the ASNMSU Center for the Arts, 1000 E. University Ave.

Tickets to the presentation only are \$18 for adults, \$15 for seniors and \$5 for students.

Tickets are \$180 if

you wish to attend and be a sponsor of the VIP event, which includes two tickets to the presentation. Corporate sponsorships are \$500.

Basch was born in Sevlus, Czechoslovakia, which is now the village of Vinograd, Ukraine. Nazi forces occupied the town in 1944, sending many of its Jewish members to concentration camps, including Basch and her parents. After they were unloaded from a cattle car at Auschwitz, which was located in Nazi-occupied Poland, Basch

never saw her parents again.

Basch remembers twice being in groups at the camp that were reviewed by Josef Mengele (1911-79), known as the Angel of Death, a Nazi physician and SS officer who performed medical experimentations on prisoners at Auschwitz.

After the camp was liberated in 1945, Basch made her way to Palestine and then to Canada before settling in Brooklyn, New York. She married and had four children. Basch now lives in Prescott,

Arizona, and has eight grandchildren and two great-grandchildren.

BCOM offers CPR training

Student doctors at Burrell College of Osteopathic Medicine (BCOM) will provide free CPR training 11 a.m.-3 p.m. Saturday, April 1, at BCOM, 3501 Arrowhead Drive, on the New Mexico State University campus.

The training will be conducted by student doctors who are members of the BCOM chapter of the National Two Step CPR organization, said BCOM student doctor and organization member Marina Sasnau.

There is no charge to participate, and pre-registration is not required.

“We are a group of medical students that organize and lead compressions-only CPR training sessions,” Sasnau said. “The organization has a simple focus: to teach hands-only CPR to community members in an effort to improve sudden cardiac arrest survival

rates. In five minutes or less and free of charge, we teach participants how to dial 9-1-1 and to begin chest compressions.

“Although this is not a certification course, we hope to leave community members prepared to act in the event of an emergency,” she said. “This is a mission aligned with current American Heart Association bystander recommendations.” (Visit <https://cpr.heart.org/en/cpr-courses-and-kits/hands-only-cpr>.)

Following a brief hands-on CPR demonstration that will begin the April training, “participants can partake in a hands-on experience,” Sasnau said. “There will also be interactive opportunities to learn more about nutrition and general health.”

Jaramillo discusses board resignation

Ray Jaramillo said his decision to resign March 9 from the Las Cruces Public Schools Board of Education was made in the “best interests of the district, the new superintendent, my fellow board members and especially my family.”

Jaramillo said he decided to resign after receiving a phone call from LCPS Superintendent Ralph Ramos during which Ramos told Jaramillo he had decided to retire as superintendent, effective April 7.

“If Ralph was still there, I’d still probably be there,” Jaramillo said. “Ralph and I made a connection. We worked hard to develop a relationship that I thought was good for the district.”

After Jaramillo visited with his wife and children following Ramos’ phone call, “I had to resign,” Jaramillo said.

Jaramillo has participated in three LCPS superintendent searches, including two as a member of the school board, and said he did not

want to be part of another search. That, along with family health issues and his purchase of Alpha School, Inc., prompted his resignation.

Alpha School, where Jaramillo was employed for nearly 30 years before purchasing the business last year, has 36 employees, along with 150 preschoolers “who need my full attention,” Jaramillo said.

“There’s a lot of things I’m going to miss” not being on the board, Jaramillo said, but “making sure my family is healthy and making sure my business is successful,” are his top priorities, he said.

Jaramillo was elected to the LCPS board in 2017 without opposition. He was re-elected in 2021, receiving 55 percent of the vote in a campaign during which he did not accept campaign contributions, advertise or put up yard signs.

Jaramillo served as board president 2021-22, helping guide LCPS through COVID-19, the death of Superintendent Karen Trujillo and the selection of Ramos as interim and then permanent superintendent, the resignation and replacement of former school board member Terrie Dallman and dissension over school district policy.

“I think I provided some stability on the board,” Jaramillo said.

“That was very close to my heart,” Jaramillo said of the gender-inclusive policy adopted by the school board during his tenure. “Making sure all children are safe” has been another top priority, he said, along with getting Columbia Elementary School rebuilt and open.

Jaramillo said he will continue to be an advocate for early childhood education.

Jaramillo said his goal for LCPS is “to leave the district in a better place than when I came, and I think that will happen,” he said.

Jaramillo said the other members of the LCPS board were “very supportive” of his decision to resign from the board.

“They saw how thin I was stretched,” he said.

Jaramillo said he hopes LCPS will find a new superintendent who is “passionate about education,” understands relationships, can “bring people together for education” and “respects and honors the people in the classroom and classified staff as well.”

“Ralph (Ramos) was great at it,” Jaramillo said. “Ralph was visible. He was everywhere. He had passion for the job.

“He’s done everything we asked him to do,” Jaramillo said of Ramos.

The two “listened to and respected each other,” Jaramillo said. “I think that’s what’s needed. That’s what’s missing in school board-superintendent relationships.”

His advice to his replacement on the school board: “Know what you’re getting into. It can be very rewarding at times and it can be very lonely,” Jaramillo said.

Jaramillo became an LCPS volunteer in 2007 and was elected president of the parent-teacher organization at Jornada Elementary School, which his son and daughter attended. The principal at the time was Arsenio Romero, who has just been named by Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham as secretary of the New Mexico Public Education Department.

Jaramillo is the author of the children’s book “Gust, Gust, Gust!” and is at work on a second children’s book.

Selection process

Superintendent Ramos will retire April 7 after more than 30 years with LCPS.

The board of education “may discuss the interim superintendent position” during its March 28 board meeting, LCPS Public Relations Coordinator Samantha Lewis said.

“It hasn’t been determined who the interim superintendent will be.”

Lewis said the board has not yet announced a timeline for the selection of a new permanent superintendent.

This is the third time the board has replaced a school board member who has resigned since 2010. Then board member Serena Shoop resigned that year from the district 2 seat to which she was elected in 2009. The board appointed Barbara Hall as her replacement.

Terrie Dallman was elected to the District 2 seat in 2017 and resigned in 2021. The board appointed Pamela Cort to the vacancy. Cort was elected to a full four-year term on the board in 2021.

Filling the school board vacancy

The application deadline is Wednesday, April 12, for anyone interested in being appointed to the district 1 vacancy on the LCPS Board of Education created by the resignation of Ray Jaramillo.

A qualified candidate must be a registered voter who lives in District 1 and is 18 years old or older.

Board members must attend LCPS board meetings, professional training and other related district events,” the school district said.

The application packet must include a letter of interest describing the applicant’s interest in being appointed to the school board and why that person would be a good board member; a copy (printed on the same day as the applicant’s signature on the declaration of interest form) of the applicant’s voter registration information from <https://voterportal.servis.sos.state.nm.us/WhereToVote.aspx>, showing the applicant resides in LCPS District 1; and a completed and notarized declaration of interest form. Visit at lcp.net, scroll down and click on “LCPS Board of Education Outlines Process to Fill Vacant Seat.”

The LCPS board will meet in open session at 1 p.m. Wednesday, April 19, at the Dr. Karen M. Trujillo Administration Complex, 505 S. Main St., suite 249, to conduct candidate interviews. The selected candidate will be sworn in before the deadline of Sunday, April 23, LCPS said.

Farm and Ranch Museum honors pioneer women

BULLETIN REPORT

The New Mexico Farm and Ranch Heritage Museum (NMFHRM) pays tribute to women making a difference in New Mexico agriculture with a current, rotating wall display in the central corridor of the Museum's main building. The exhibit is "Her Land: Women in Agriculture" and the new, featured exemplar is Fita Witte of Las Cruces, the museum said in a news release.

"Museums typically focus on the stories of our ancestors and their incredible accomplishments," NMFHRM Executive Director Heather Reed said. "We often forget to look around to see that history is unfolding right in front of us within our communities and our state. 'Her Land' spotlights the amazing feats and contributions of modern-day women and showcases the young women working on the future of

agriculture. This ongoing project will rotate every few months and will allow us to record history in real time for generations to come." The museum created the exhibit in 2021. Previous honorees were Felicia Thal of northeastern New Mexico and Sophia Moreno of La Union.

Witte was raised on a ranch in central New Mexico that has been in her family for seven generations, NMFHRM said. Her father was a farmer, rancher and Chimayo weaver. Her mother came from a prominent Hispanic family whose ancestors founded the city of Albuquerque. Her husband, Jerry, was raised on a ranch in north-central New Mexico that belonged to his family for five generations. Jerry and Fita ranched in Lamy, New Mexico, and in Arizona until Jerry's father retired

in 1974 and the couple moved back to Rowe Mesa and ran the Witte Ranch. They now live in Las Cruces, the museum said.

The Wittes raised two sons who continue to work in agriculture. Jon Witte lives in Clint, Texas, where he raised cattle, cotton, and pecans. Jeff Witte is secretary of the New Mexico Department of Agriculture and lives in Las Cruces where he raises miniature Hereford cattle.

"Mom is an amazing role model," Jeff Witte told the Bulletin. "Both she and my dad have always committed 110 percent to whatever they do, and they always get involved to support the industry and their community. Mom grew up in a small community and yet had an impact across our great nation. She is an inspiration to many, including her family. We are very proud of her."

Fita Witte is active

in many organizations that support agriculture, NMFHRM said.

"If we don't tell our story, no one else is gonna tell it for us, and who knows our story better than we do," Fita said.

Fita Witte is a member of the Roadrunner CowBelles and served as president of New Mexico CowBelles and as its state cook-off chair. She has been a member of the American National CattleWomen since 1962 and served as its president in 2008. Fita was named Outstanding CattleWoman of the Year by the organization in 2015.

"Fita is a tireless supporter of the beef industry and agriculture in general," NMFHRM said. "After she and her husband retired from the ranch, she remains active in the CowBelles association and continues to promote agriculture."

Fita Witte would like to see women who are involved in agriculture

become mentors for younger women looking for an active role in the farming and ranching industries, the museum said. She also hopes to see more emphasis on agriculture in the classroom.

For women in agriculture, "I think the sky's the limit," Fita said.

Indeed, whatever happened to Randolph Scott?

Tales from the Cassock

“Ride the High Country” is a 1962 movie revered as the first revisionist Western. In earlier Westerns, heroes appear as huge as the landscape, but in later Westerns, the landscape can overpower and shrink the characters down to human and, occasionally,

less than human stature.

The movie was a hinge between ages of the Western genre, and arguably ages of our country. These were not simply good guys in white hats and bad guys in black, but rather conflicted and complicated characters. Think newer movies such

as Clint Eastwood’s “Unforgiven.”

“Ride the High Country” was Randolph Scott’s last movie (at age 64), almost the final one for Joel McCrea, and close to the first for director Sam Peckinpah. Scott, often considered the best Western actor of all

time, and McCrea play men gone long in the tooth. Scott works in sideshows as a has-been gunslinger and McCrea plays an aging out of work lawman. McCrea quipped they were, in fact, has-beens like the men they portrayed. Remember the 1973 hit, “Whatever Hap-

pened to Randolph Scott,” by the Statler Brothers?

McCrea is hired to deliver a gold shipment. Scott becomes his sidekick, but plans to steal the fortune. For Scott, this was a departure from his image in Western movies made in col-

laboration with director Budd Boetticher in the 1950s. Scott, an incredibly handsome man in his early years, had weathered into a craggy, gaunt, leathery figure who fit the part perfectly. McCrea's performance was arguably the best in his career.

The key to this movie is the honesty of the characters. Nobody is putting on a show; there is no hidden agenda. Everything is on the surface and that surface is rocky and difficult like the mountains impeccably filmed as part of the story. There is no nostalgia for a past age of either reality or film. We get pure emotion and intelligence in even proportions.

What makes this movie worthy of watching so many years later is the focus on values upheld even in the face of honorable (and some dishonorable) alternatives.

"Ride the High Country" rides the razor's edge between the virtues and values of a past age and the cynicism and nihilism of the present. It is a reminder of an age of civility that has been surpassed by the crudities of the present age, including our time. Western movies have always been a mirror of contemporary culture and morals. This movie depicts a more honest and forthright time.

I was thinking about the significance of this Western when serendipity hit. In searching the web for "Ride the High Country," an article popped up by the young writer Hannah Long. She prefaced it with Jesus'

words from the parable of the pharisee and the publican: "I tell you, this man went down to his house justified, rather than the other. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted" (Luke 18:14).

Ms. Long uses the quote to summarize her understanding of the characterizations in classic Westerns, epitomized by Scott and McCrea's portrayal. Director Michael Curtiz called Scott a true gentleman on and off the screen, a sig-

nificant note also true for McCrea. Their Western characters demonstrate courage, strength, and intensity, yet blush humbly when their skills or accomplishments are acknowledged. They quietly withstand adversity. They have hope when all seems hopeless. They are capable of redemption. All this would be no small achievement in our age of entitlement, diffidence, and polarization.

Indeed, whatever happened to Randolph Scott? We could use a few like him again.

The bill, as written, details a need to anticipate, plan for and accomplish effective litter control through a state-coordinated plan of education, control, prevention, recycling, and elimination.

The act will establish a statewide Keep America Beautiful program and hire a full-time employee to coordinate different state government departments, cities, and counties to work with federal land management agencies in New Mexico and nonprofit organizations to develop a statewide litter and solid waste reduction program.

Non-profit New Mexico Recycling Coalition's Executive Director Sarah Pierpont explained that federal funding for recycling and illegal dumping could

be more flexible in selecting projects.

"For example, Habitat for Humanity is interested in applying for funds to educate their homeowners on how to recycle in their community. Or, there's a group out of Taos called Amigos Bravos that works closely with river cleanups which can apply for these funds," said Pierpont. "Or new programs can be bolsters, like northern Indian pueblos can purchase equipment that they can share, like mobile cardboard baler."

"Everybody can agree that we don't like illegal dumping. It's bad for tourism. It's bad for the quality of life," said Peck. "It comes from a starting point of agreement which helps to facilitate a productive discussion for our state's recycling future."

The Job Training Incentive Program (JTIP), an initiative of the New Mexico Economic Development Department (NMEDD), approved funding in March 2023 for more than 100 trainees at businesses in Las Cruces and Santa Teresa, NMEDD said in a news release.

Electronic Caregiver, Inc. (ECG) received JTIP funds for 73 trainees at an average wage of \$23.18 for a total award of \$628,404, NMEDD said. ECG is a digital health technology and service company in Las Cruces.

“The company’s mission is to design and deliver innovative, impactful

telehealth products and services such as remote patient monitoring, chronic care management and virtual visits that bridge the chasm between the doctor’s office and patient’s home to improve outcomes, expand access, and deliver value-based care,” NMEDD said.

Franklin Mountain Packaging, LLC (FMP) in Santa Teresa received JTIP funding for 55 trainees at an average wage of \$17.39 for a total award of \$565,202, the news release said.

“FMP is a newly formed company engaged in the manufacturing of corrugated sheets and providing unique digital

printing services for the corrugated box-making industry,” NMEDD said. “FMP will target sheet converting plants in the Southwestern US and the maquiladoras and Mexican domestic market.”

JTIP funds are paid after all employee training is complete, the news release said.

JTIP “encourages companies to move to, stay in, and/or grow in New Mexico and to hire New Mexican employees,” NMEDD said.

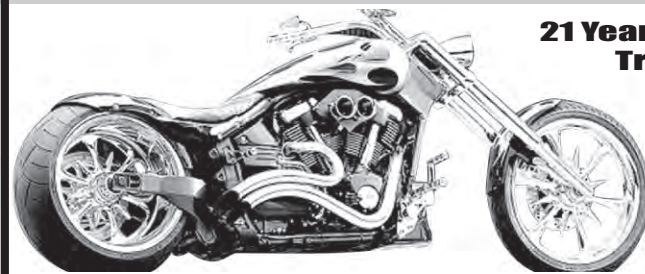

Aggie women reach finals of WBI championship

A furious comeback against a familiar foe fell just short for NM State in the Women's Basketball Invitational final March 19.

California Baptist, one of the Aggies' Western Athletic Conference rivals, defeated NM State 63-61. The Aggies were down 60-49 with 3:17 left in the game, and outscored Cal Baptist 12-3 down the stretch, falling one basket short of sending the game into overtime.

The eight-team WBI, played in Lexington, Kentucky, is one of a handful of post-season tournaments for teams who did not make the NCAAs.

The WBI final marked the third time the Aggies and Cal Baptist met this season.

On Feb. 2, on the road at Cal Baptist, NM State defeated the Lancers 62-61 on a late basket by

On March 17, NM State defeated the University of Illinois-Chicago 51-41 to reach the semifinal against East Tennessee State. It was the Aggies' first-ever post-season win in women's basketball.

In the semifinal, the Aggies defeated ETSU 57-53, in a back-and-forth affair that saw a dozen lead changes. Against ETSU, NM State owned the offensive glass 16-3, especially in the second half, recording 11 of those boards in the final 20 minutes and holding ETSU to just one offensive rebound in the final two quarters.

The Aggies fought hard on the boards all night against Cal Baptist, winning the rebounding battle with a 10-rebound margin. The turnover battle was even with both teams seeing 17 possessions switch hands.

Despite the loss, NM State finished the year with a winning record, going 18-17 overall, and 10-8 in the WAC. The record for the Aggies, in coach Jody Adams' first season leading the team, was a marked

improvement over 2021-22, when NM State finished 10-19 overall and 6-12 in conference.

The Masters: a tournament unlike any other

On April 6-9 is the 87th edition of the Masters Golf Tournament at Augusta National Golf Club in Georgia, the first of the four majors of the season.

Augusta National was founded in 1932 by famed amateur Bobby Jones, along with Clifford Roberts, on the 365-acre site of a former antebellum plantation called Fruitland.

The first Masters tournament was in 1934. The golf course has changed dramatically over the years, but continues to demonstrate the magic, charm and fan attraction from day one. In 1940, the course measured 6,800 yards; this year it tips out at 7,510 yards. The defending champion is Scottie Scheffler, who won The Players Championship a couple of weeks ago.

The past year has been a tumultuous and controversial one for professional golf, with the start-up of the Saudi-funded LIV golf tour. While LIV golfers were banned from the PGA Tour and playing in any PGA Tour events, Augusta National and the Masters are independent of any tour, with their own criteria for player invitations, and have chosen to allow any LIV golfer who is qualified to play. It remains to be seen if there will be any fallout from patrons to LIV players.

The U.S. Open, the Open Championship and the Ryder Cup are all superb, exciting tournaments, but the Masters is the best. It is arguably the most coveted golf trophy and has the smallest field of all the four majors, albeit

with a quirky process for qualifications. And then there's the champion's green jacket, seen by many as the ultimate statement of success for golfing. Tiger Woods has five of them.

I have many reasons why I relish watching the Masters, so I'll name just a few.

First, you can't help but marvel at the pristine, manicured grounds of Augusta National, maintained at enormous expense, which ought not be a standard to measure other golf clubs. Still, I'm ever in awe of the closely mown fairways, so fast that even a short hitter could be proud. I drool at the snow white bunkers with sharp, clean lips,

the perfectly smooth and lightning-fast greens, the geometric, flat teeing grounds, with walkways cut ahead to the fairway, the pine trees and pine straw, the ponds and creeks bordered with slick, sharp, treacherous banks that aren't unfair, just

intimidating. There are magnolias, rhododendron and flowers all over the place. All the holes have names. My favorite hole is the par 5 number 13 (545 yds.) named Azalea, which is also the official cocktail of the Masters (pineapple puree, lemon juice grenadine and gin).

No noisy blimps at the Masters. Raise your hand if you really love the aerial

Then there is Amen Corner. Nowhere in sports is there a more defining venue than the 11th, 12th and 13th holes at Augusta – Amen Corner. The term was first used in print by

late sports author Herbert Warren Wind in his April 21, 1958, Sports Illustrated article about the Masters. There is baseball's "hot corner" and football's "coffin corner;" so why not an "Amen Corner"?

I relish watching the game as it should be played with the genteel atmosphere that honors the tradition of golf. I prepare pimento cheese sandwiches (that cost only \$1.50 to this day for patrons) at home on Sunday while watching the last nine holes on TV.

Call me a sentimental fool but I even light a fire in my fireplace to mimic being inside the Butler Cabin late in the day.
