CTC staff is available 24/7 to provide professional, peer, and self-help care to those in crisis. Those in need can also call or text 988 for immediate assistance.

A tree grows in Mesilla

Before she passed, the Queen of England launched a global initiative called the Queen's Green Canopy, with a goal of planting trees throughout the world.

Facilitated by the Town of Mesilla and the Borderplex Alliance, one of those trees now grows in Mesilla, the only one in New Mexico and quite possibly the last one officially recognized by the project, which ended March 31.

"We are honored to host this dedication ceremony for the Queen's Green Canopy in our town," said Mesilla Mayor Nora L. Barraza.

Borderplex Alliance CEO Jon Barela said the canopy "is an incredible initiative that brings the Borderplex region and the United Kingdom closer and celebrates the special relationship between our two great nations. I'm proud our region is playing a part in this historic designation."

CMT building first step of Creative Campus

Ground was broken on Doña Ana Community College's new Creative Media Technology (CMT) building March 28 at 4006 Film St. in New Mexico State University's Arrowhead Park, south of Burrell College of Osteopathic Medicine.

Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham donned a hard hat and yellow reflective vest to join state Sen. Jeff Steinborn of Las Cruces, DACC president Monica Torres and others as they put ceremonial shovels in the ground.

The 14,000 square-foot CMT building will house classrooms and a commons area, complete with a 4,000 square-foot soundstage. The cost of the building is \$11.2 million with a tentative completion date of

May 2024.

"The new DACC Creative Media Technology studio will be another critical tool in our regional film industry to train students in modern film and digital media technology," Steinborn said. "It will be a real-world training environment to work hand in hand with industry to create great jobs in our community." Steinborn is also president of the nonprofit Film Las Cruces.

"This new state-of-the-art facility will help us provide expanded mixed-use space for film, animation, game design and virtual production," says DACC Arts Department Chair Matthew Byrnes. "Co-locating with the New Mexico Media Academy and Arrowhead Center places our students in the center

of the film fast-track and entrepreneurship activities."

The CMT building is the first phase of the Las Cruces Creative Campus. The campus is a digital media complex which will also include a planned satellite facility of the New Mexico Creative Media Institute

building, and facilities for KRWG-TV and KRWG-FM.

The campus is a partnership between DACC, NMSU, Arrowhead Center, KRWG Public Media, the nonprofit Film Las Cruces, Las Cruces Public Schools and the New Mexico Economic Development Department.

Retiring superintendent Ramos reflects on career

“There are a lot of celebrations,” Las Cruces Public Schools Superintendent Ralph Ramos said April 3, as he prepared to retire after more than 30 years with the school district.

Ramos, 54, announced in March his last day with the school district is April 7.

Ramos knew he “had some huge shoes to fill” when he was appointed interim superintendent in February 2021 after the death of Karen Trujillo, he said. He was named permanent superintendent the following June.

Ramos promised the LCPS Board of Education he would serve two years as superintendent, he said.

“I gave it my all at 100 miles per hour and we accomplished a lot,” Ramos said.

As a teacher, principal and superintendent, Ramos said he has been guided by the FFA motto he first put into practice as an agricultural science teacher in 1992: “Learning to do, doing to learn, earning to live, living to serve.”

“I’ve done a lot of listening,” Ramos said, working hard to “balance the needs that were brought to me.”

That has included balancing his personal religious beliefs with school district policies and regulations he has been charged with enforcing, Ramos said, and always making “what’s best for kids a priority for myself and LCPS.”

Starting the school day with the Pledge of Allegiance and a personal moment of silence or prayer has been “a great way to spiritually get your mind

and soul ready, along with a focus on personal “morals, values and how we treat each other in a challenging world,” he said.

“I know I left LCPS in a better place than I found it,” he said. “I raised the bar for the next superintendent.”

Ramos said his accomplishments as superintendent – with strong support from staff and leadership – include guiding LCPS through much of Covid-19, which “taught us so much on how to do things differently;” increased pay for teachers, classified staff and substitute teachers; instituting a districtwide balanced calendar and adding 10 days to the school year – making LCPS a statewide model for these initiatives; providing school district funding for travel and meals for all activities so sponsors can focus on activities instead of fundraising; adding almost \$16 million to classrooms for equipment; ensuring every school has a student council and continuing student advisors on the school board “to listen to student needs;” further extending learning beyond the classroom through athletics,

fine arts and other after-school activities because “every student needs to find their niche;” making sure all students are treated equally in terms of their opportunities and discipline; student graduation portfolios beginning in the sixth grade; inter-

ventions for students at all levels, including those struggling with classwork and honors students; creating a model process for transfer requests; advertising all positions that come open in LCPS to give everyone an equal opportunity to apply; and adhering to a strategic plan that includes quarterly checks to “hold us accountable.”

A student activities handbook that outlines expectations for all students, parents, coaches, sponsors and booster club members will be completed by the start of the 2023-24 school year, he said.

Going forward, Ramos said he is very concerned about the loss of millions of dollars in federal funding after 2024 for many LCPS tutoring, interven-

tion and social-emotional programs.

The state legislature “needs to step up and sufficiently fund education in New Mexico,” he said.

Ramos expressed his gratitude to the school board, his executive team and cabinet, principals, teachers, other staff, parents, students and student leaders.

“You’ve made me what I am today,” Ramos said.

Ramos said he will take the next year off to “decompress” and then explore his options. He and his wife, Yolanda, will stay in Las Cruces, he said, and he likely will continue to be involved with education, “do a lot of things with youth (and) doing more with my church.”

O'Brien named interim superintendent

The Las Cruces Public Schools Board of Education announced March 28 that Sherley O'Brien, the current LCPS chief of staff, has been selected to serve as interim superintendent of the school district.



O'BRIEN

O'Brien's term begins April 8 and ends Aug. 15 unless the board names a permanent replacement before then, LCPS said in a news release.

O'Brien succeeds Ralph Ramos, who became superintendent in 2021 and announced earlier this year he will retire effective April 7.

At the March 28 meeting, the board approved preliminary steps to hire a permanent superintendent, the news release said. At its April 11 work session,

the board will consider options for a superintendent search consultant and will name volunteers for the superintendent search committee.

O'Brien holds a master's degree in educational administration from New Mexico State University. She has a bachelor's in elementary education from the University of Arizona and taught at elementary school for five years, LCPS said. O'Brien was an assistant principal for three years before leaving education to work in the private sector as a chief operations officer. In 2017, O'Brien returned to LCPS and spent five years in human resources, first as a coordinator and working her way through the ranks to become director. As interim superintendent, O'Brien will receive a pro-rated salary of \$172,500 per year.

"Robert's priority in all these circumstances has been to serve others," Third Judicial District Judge James Martin said of Lara. Lara credited his parents for showing him that "What it takes to be a parent" is an important part of "What it takes to be a judge." He also credited the court staff as "the people who make the court work."

for a team roping, and grew into the force behind Tough Enough to Wear Pink, and joined with New Mexico State University to create the biggest Pink campaign in the world. Their mission is to fund research to help treat the disease and move toward a cure. C4CR, as they have become lovingly known, created research

• **CARE (Cancer Aid Resource & Education)** – Another grassroots organization that started from the passion of a very small group, CARE works to address the "financial toxicity" of cancer. The disease itself is bad enough, but all the additional costs often ruin families' wealth. CARE works to provide services and support in small and large ways. From giving people rides to medical appointments, to helping someone pay a utility bill if their power is in danger of being shut off because they had to pay so much for their medical expenses. CARE was founded by sisters Yoli Diaz and Leticia Soto, who saw the many struggles their father, Emilio Rigales, faced when he contracted lung cancer. The organization celebrates its 10th an-

• **Cancer Warriors Las Cruces** – This brand new group is currently focusing on women's cancers, such as breast and ovarian cancers. And though the group is new, the name behind it is familiar. When local entrepreneur Marci Dickerson was diagnosed with breast cancer, she quickly learned the many unexpected struggles of the illness and surgeries. For example, you're so sore, you can barely lift your arms. And apparently, there are some disgusting issues with drainage. "We all know cancer sucks," Dickerson said. On the proper use of police mugshots

Do we have the right to see Donald Trump's mugshot? Do we have the right to see anybody's mugshot if they haven't had their day in court yet?

The second question came up during this year's Sunshine Week event, which featured an outstanding panel of local journalists talking about crime reporting. The consensus was that, while we all have the right to view any public document, the media also has a responsibility as to what it publishes.

Bob Moore, former editor of the El Paso Times who is now heading El Paso Matters, noted it is often the police who decide which mug shots get sent to and used by the media.

That was certainly true with my experience in Las Cruces, and not just with mugshots. Our reporting on the small, daily crimes

was almost entirely dependent on press releases the law enforcement departments sent us.

And, our stories almost never included the defendant's side. Running a mugshot with the story only made it worse.

Mugshots have proven to be a marvelous source of public humiliation for a handful of pompous jerks in desperate need of a good shaming, but that's not really what they're for. They are intended to be a tool to help police identify criminals.

My first hard news job was in Colorado, as the regional correspondent for the Pueblo Chieftain in Cañon City. Each morning, I would stop by the police station and sheriff's department to go through the reports from the night before. I would often bump

into reporters from the local newspaper and radio station doing the same thing.

We would all make our own editorial decisions as to what deserved to be covered.

I'm not sure when that got outsourced to the police public information officer, but I am sure the consequences now are much greater than they

were then.

Like every judgment call, sometimes I got it wrong. But the consequences then were that somebody would be embarrassed for a few days, and it would go away. Now, nothing ever goes away.

I was caught off guard the first time someone called and asked that we take down an online posting of a crime report

from several years ago, explaining that it was preventing him from finding work and housing. Until that phone call, I hadn't even considered the new consequences of what we had always done.

In hindsight, I think we made the wrong decision, reasoning that if we took down one post we would have to take them all down. That's exactly what we should have done.

Enchanting sights, sounds, smells of New Mexico

The New Mexico Legislature rarely makes me laugh.

This year they did.

An article in the Santa Fe New Mexican noted the New Mexico Legislature passed a bill designating the aroma of fire-roasted

green chile as the Official New Mexico smell. Governor Michele Lujan Grisham signed the bill in Las Cruces, March 28, 2023.

While New Mexico is not a country, to understand New Mexico, you should appreciate the unique aroma of fire-roasted green chile. Importantly, the roasting smell only lasts 30 minutes while eating green chile is an everyday pleasure.

Fire-roasting chile is when the outside waxy layer is quickly scorched with a flame to a char, allowing the removal of the outer skin without damaging the inside chile meat. The plant produces a waxy coating to keep moisture inside the chile pepper while it is growing. Fire-roasting prepares the outer skin for removal and also gives the chile meat a fantastic smokey flavor.

As to what made me

laugh, it was when discussing Senate Bill 188, one senator, a dairy farmer, noted the stuff sticking to his boots in the dairy barn happens to be the smell he associates most with New Mexico.

And friends, I know both the roasting smell and the cow pie smell. In fact, I am not revolted by either smell, but prefer the green chile roasting over mucking out of a cow shed, which I have done more times than I care to

remember.

Senate Bill 188, introduced by Senator Bill Soules, lists the official New Mexico names for: flower, bird, tree, fish, animal, vegetables, gem, grass (not the intoxicant) fossil, cookie, insect, question, answer, nickname, butterfly, reptile, amphibian, aircraft, historic railroad, tie, necklace, and last but not least, aroma.

They forgot the New Mexico sound of fire-roasting. It is a white

noise and could be on a white noise machine for going to sleep. During the next session they could add a 23rd designation, the sound of fire-roasting chile as the official New Mexico sound.

The New Mexico sound I recognize most often is the sound of wind moving swiftly across New Mexico as we hold onto our hats. One time the wind in New Mexico suddenly stopped

Bill would secure jobs, health care for patients

Few people know what a Certified Anesthesiologist Assistant (CAA) is. In New Mexico, only patients in Las Cruces, Albuquerque and Santa Fe have been cared for by us. CAAs are advanced practice personnel who attend a rigorous Master's Degree Program, overseen by physicians, that can be up to two-and-a-half years. Once we become Board Certified, we work exclusively in an anesthesia care team under the direct supervision of a physician anesthesiologist. CAAs started practicing at UNM in 2001 and, in 2015, legislation was passed to allow for their expansion to other Class A counties including Doña Ana County, my home.

I became the first CAA to

practice outside of UNM in January 2018. I was nervous, intimidated, and excited but felt a huge step had been taken for the CAAs of New Mexico and couldn't feel prouder to be a part of it. With time, I recruited my friend to move here and practice as a CAA alongside myself. I was on top of the world, and fell in love with the privilege of helping my fellow New Mexicans.

Unfortunately, this came to a screeching halt and we had some false starts and challenges getting a strong practice in Las Cruces. Because of this, I lost my job and was forced to leave the state for several months. However, thanks to the opening of Three Crosses Hospital, and even more thanks to their

commitment of creating and maintaining a strong anesthesia care team model, I am happy to come to work every day and care for my friends, colleagues, and neighbors.

We had discussions about current legislation that will act as a death sentence on jobs for CAAs in Santa Fe and Las Cruces after 2025 if the current law is not removed. The backlog of canceled cases due to Covid was lengthy, and our community needed their surgeries to be done. The practice I work for needed to expand but we were faced with the difficult decision of hiring more CAAs with the guilt of knowing their job may not be here in a few years. We disclosed this to our interviewees and were fortu-

nate enough to hire more CAAs, one of whom is a native New Mexican, to serve Las Cruces.

During the legislative session, many people came together to create Senate Bill 35 to bring New Mexico's CAA ratio to CMS standards and, ultimately, repeal the 2015 death sentence on CAAs practicing outside of UNM. The bill was incredibly well received due to the CAAs' impeccable safety record of zero malpractice claims in over 20 years, and made it past the Senate and House with only one dissenting vote. It is now my hope the Governor will sign SB35 into law so that I, and my other CAA colleagues in Las Cruces, Santa Fe and future cities in Class A counties across the state, will be

able to stay in New Mexico, our home, and care for our fellow New Mexicans.

Our state is at a critical need for anesthesia personnel and we are hoping to avoid losing more with the signing of SB35. There is a serenity in the state that can't be felt anywhere else and, after having to leave the state once, I briefly lost that feeling. If SB35 does not become a law, my CAA colleagues, their families and I will be forced to move and lose that serene feeling only New Mexico can give. Governor Lujan Grisham, please sign SB35.

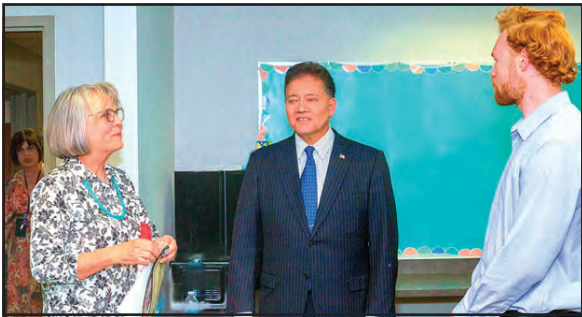

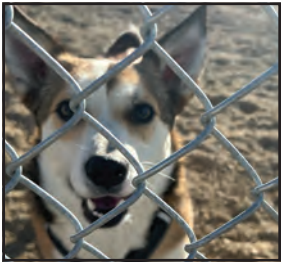

APA wins \$20K grant for efforts

ACTion Programs for Animals (APA) has received a Rachael Ray Save Them All (RRSTAG) grant of \$20,000 from Best Friends Animal Society (BFAS) for its rescue efforts of dogs and cats/kittens pulled from the Animal Services Center of the Mesilla Valley, APA said in a news release.

"This grant allows us to continue our work finding more homes for the pets in our care," APA Executive Director Michel Meunier said. "With these funds, our goal is to adopt out 200 dogs and cats/kittens in the next year to loving families. We appreciate the support of BFAS in making our efforts to rescue shelter dogs and cats/kittens possible."

APA is an active partner

in the Best Friends Network, which offers help and support to shelters, rescue groups and other animal welfare organizations working to save lives in their communities, APA said.

"When you choose to adopt your next pet, you are becoming part of the solution right here in our community," Meunier said.

RRSTAG is a grant program administered by BFAS and funded by The Rachael Ray Foundation, which provides grants to shelters for euthanasia-reduction initiatives. The foundation helps animals in need and is funded by a portion of proceeds from each sale of Rachael Ray's pet food, Nutrish.

APA is a progressive animal welfare organiza-

tion seeking to improve the quality of life for companion animals in Doña Ana County and greatly reduce the number of unwanted animals impounded and euthanized at the municipal shelter as well as keep people and their pets together, APA said.

Since May 2012, APA has rescued more than 5,700 animals. The majority of these have been dogs and cats/kittens pulled from the municipal shelter. APA is able to do this through volunteer work of rescue/foster coordinators, foster families, and donations.

Tax deadline nears; NM in top half for taxes

New Mexico has the 14th highest tax burden of all 50 states, the personal finance website WalletHub said in a March 28 news release.

WalletHub's survey at wallethub.com/edu/states-with-highest-lowest-tax-burden/20494 shows New Mexico with an overall tax burden of 8.83 percent, including a 1.95 percent property tax burden (43rd highest among the 50 states), a 1.26 percent individual income tax burden (39th) and a 5.62 percent total sales and excise tax burden (third highest).

New York has the highest overall tax burden at 12.47 percent, WalletHub said, followed by Hawaii (12.31 percent), Maine (11.14 percent), Vermont (10.28 percent) and Connecticut (9.83 percent.)

Alaska has the lowest tax burden at 5.06 percent, followed by Delaware (6.12 percent), New Hampshire (6.14 percent), Tennessee (6.22 percent) and Florida (6.33 percent). California (8.89 percent, 12th overall) has the highest tax burden in the western U.S., the survey said, fol-

lowed by New Mexico, Colorado (8.28 percent, 24th), Washington (8.24 percent, 25th), Utah (8.08 percent, 27th), Texas (8.01 percent, 29th), Oregon (7.8 percent, 31st), Nevada (7.69 percent, 32nd), Idaho (7.64 percent, 33rd), Arizona (7.62 percent, 34th), Montana (6.93 percent, 43rd) and Wyoming (6.42 percent, 45th).

Maine has the highest property tax burden, WalletHub said, followed by Vermont, New Hampshire, New Jersey and New York. New York has the highest individual income tax burden, the survey said, followed by Maryland, Oregon, Massachusetts and Delaware. Hawaii has the highest total sales and excise tax burden, followed by Washington, New Mexico, Nevada and Arkansas.

Because the usual tax filing day, April 15, falls on a Saturday this year, Tuesday, April 18, is the deadline for filing taxes, WalletHub said.

Tax facts

As income tax filing day approaches, WalletHub listed these Tax Day facts for 2023:

- Americans spend 6.5 billion hours

doing taxes each year. The average person spends 13 hours and \$250 completing his or her 1040 form.

- 92 percent of tax returns are expected to be filed electronically. The average refund in 2023 is \$3,079, as of Feb. 24. 168 million individual income tax returns are expected to be filed in 2023. 5.4 million taxpayers will receive refunds this year.

- Taxpayers had difficulty reaching the IRS by telephone during the 2022 filing season, with only 10 percent of calls receiving live assistance and hold times averaging about 29 minutes. That amounts to 3.9 million hours of hold time since 2019. More than 260 million Americans interact with the IRS each year, which is more than with any other agency of the federal government.

- \$2.58 trillion is the estimated revenue from individual income taxes in 2023, down from \$2.62 trillion in 2022.

- It costs the IRS 33 cents to collect \$100 in federal revenue.

- 96 percent of all federal revenue is brought in by the IRS.

- The estimated annual net tax gap between what is owed the IRS and what is

collected is \$428 billion.

- There is a 0.2 percent chance you will be audited by the IRS in 2023, a third less than in 2022.

IRS history, budget

The Office of Commissioner of Internal Revenue was created by Congress July 1, 1862, according to www.irs.gov. The Bureau of Internal Revenue was created to collect taxes used to finance the American Civil War. The income tax was abolished after 10 years, but the agency remained to collect other revenues. Federal income tax was permanently reinstated in 1913.

"The Revenue Act of 1913 imposed a one percent tax on incomes above \$3,000, with a top tax rate of six percent on those earning more than \$500,000 per year," according to [Wikipedia.org](https://www.wikipedia.org). "Approximately three percent of the population was subject to the income tax."

The IRS had 93,654 full-and part-time employees in 2022. WalletHub said the IRS has decreased its staff by 14,000

since 2010 and has decreased its enforcement staff by 41 percent since that same year. 61 percent of IRS workers are expected to retire or leave the agency in the next five years, WalletHub said.

The federal Inflation Reduction Act signed into law by President Joe Biden last August includes a \$79.4 billion budget increase in IRS funding “to improve tax compliance,” according to whitehouse.gov. \$45.6 billion of that amount will go for enforcement. The increase will also pay for modernization and taxpayer services. The federal budget provides \$14.1 billion total for the IRS, a \$1.8 billion (15 percent) increase for FY 2024 over 2023.

Mayor gives final state of city speech

“I’m pleased to report to you, in this, my 16th and final State of the City address, that the state of our city is strong,” Mayor Ken Miyagishima said Tuesday, March 28, at City Hall.

Here are excerpts from the speech, which caps Miyagishima’s 22 years in city government. He was elected to the city council in 2001 and re-elected in 2005, elected mayor in 2007 and re-elected three times. Miyagishima announced last year that he would not run for a fifth four-year term as mayor this November. He served eight years on the Doña Ana County Commission before being elected to the city council.

• A continuing source of that strength is the commitment of successive councils and city administrations to fiscal responsibility and careful stewardship of city resources. We continue to maintain twice the financial reserves required by state law. Our bond rating is high. In January, the Government Finance Officers Association awarded us our 18th consecutive Certificate for Excellence in Financial Reporting, along with two other awards for excellence and transparency in reporting to the public.

• Working together, we began (following the 2007 election when he was first elected mayor) to develop basic principles for growth and development. As we engaged the people of the city in this process

– our residents and business community, community advocates and the developers themselves – what emerged was a remarkable consensus on how to proceed. One was a commitment – much ridiculed at first – to “smart growth” principles that emphasized a variety of building types and means of transportation, the importance of local neighborhoods, and active engagement by the public at large.

We began a search for ordinances and guidelines that reflected best practices nationally, especially by cities also experiencing rapid growth. We resolved that we would pay as much attention to the health and livability of our existing neighborhoods as we would to the building of new ones. We began talking a lot more about quality of life. We insisted that our residents would be fully informed and empowered in planning our future, with full transparency and input

from all.

I look back at these efforts as a real change in our city’s direction. From a contentious beginning, and tentatively at first, we began to plan consciously for the future, assessing our strengths and shared values as a community, identifying ways to balance inevitable growth with those strengths and values, and developing a common, evolving vision of who we wanted to be.

• (The city’s response to the Great Recession of 2008) led us to a second commitment that has made all the difference: we would find success as a city by investing in ourselves. We would take responsibility for the future of our city. We would bring everyone along as we moved ourselves forward. We would put our trust in the creativity and resilience of our people, our commitment to this place and one another, and our willingness to work together for the benefit

of all – assets that keep their value in good times and bad.

• We need to double down on our efforts as a city to engage residents and stakeholders, making sure they weigh in on issues affecting their lives and our future as a city. Neighborhood councils, frequent online surveys, and other city-organized outreach may be helpful in those efforts.

• We have dealt admirably and compassionately with a rapid influx of asylum seekers and refugees from other countries, fellow human beings fleeing failed states, criminal violence, and drought.

• Another challenge that has emerged over the last few years, not just here but in cities across the country, is the rising incidence – or at least greater visibility – of the severe problems some have with mental illness and drug addiction, domestic violence, and cases of property damage, along with what seems to be more people experiencing homelessness than ever before. We are strongly committed to helping those who struggle to find stability in their lives and within the larger community.

• We’ll address this challenge the same way we’ve successfully addressed so many others over the years, working together to make life better for each and every one of us – day after day, week after week, challenge after challenge – because that’s what great cities do.

Military honored at 'Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans Day'

City of Las Cruces representatives joined southern New Mexico military veterans to commemorate "Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans Day" in a ceremony at Veterans Memorial Park March 25.

As many as 250 southern New Mexico

veterans, their family members, friends, and residents attended the ceremony. The Las Cruces Vietnam Veterans Association hosted the event.

The Vietnam Memorial, at Veterans Memorial Park, 1251 N. Roadrunner Parkway, was the setting for the "Reading of the Names of New Mexico Veterans" who gave their lives during tours of duty in Vietnam, the city said. The Daughters of the American Revolution presented Vietnam combat veterans with lapel pins depicting the American Eagle symbol during the ceremony.

Mayor Ken Miya-gishima, city Community Development Director Larry Nichols and White Sands Missile Range Command Sgt. Maj. José G. Meléndez were keynote speakers at the event.

Nichols, a Vietnam veteran, serves as the city's liaison to the Veterans Advisory Board.

"Your service contributed to our freedom," Nichols said. "Your service and attendance promote healing among all veterans and honors the memory of those killed in action and supports our military men and women worldwide. "It took years before a lot of us mentioned to others, our service in Vietnam, due the negative (public) perception of the Vietnam War during that era. That has changed over the years ... the change has been due to veterans like you attending ceremonies such as these."

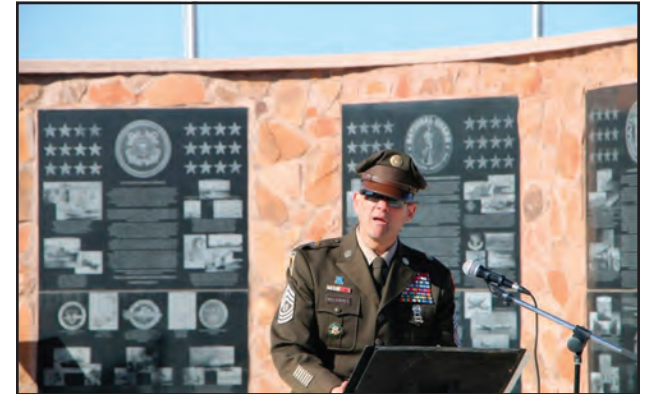
The Vietnam War Veterans Recognition Act, signed into law in 2017, designates March 29 as National Vietnam War Veterans Day. On March 29, 1973, the last U.S.

combat troops were withdrawn from Vietnam and the last prisoners of war held in North Vietnam arrived in the U.S. The day commemorates the sacrifices of Vietnam veterans and their families and is part of an effort to recognize the men and women who were denied a proper welcome upon returning home almost 50 years ago, the city said.

Keith is also survived by his loving wife of 67 years, Evelyn, son Louie Keith Colson (Stacey) of Tucson, Arizona; daughters Sally Johnson (George) of Alpine, Texas; Martha Akers (James) of Dripping Springs, Texas; and Mary Jones (Steve) of Vernon, Texas. He is beloved by 13 grandchildren; Jami (Cody), Marti (Anthony), Shane (Julie), Jessi, Travis, Stephanie (Shane), Melissa, Colson, Matthew, Molly, Lillian, Maggie, Max and four

great grandchildren; William, Chas, Cass and Beau and a new one, on the way, in October. He will also be missed by many nieces, nephews and friends.

Keith was born Sept. 18, 1934, in Ringling, Oklahoma. He graduated from Ringling High School, in 1952, after excelling in basketball, football and baseball. He was also a three-time Golden Gloves boxer in 1948, 1949 and 1950 (much to his mother's dismay).

Keith was recruited by Presley Askew, to play basketball, at Connors State College, in Warner, Oklahoma, where he graduated in 1954.

After junior college, Keith came to New Mexico State University and was a two-year letterman for the Aggie basketball

team from 1954-56 under Presley Askew, and was a starting guard on the 1955-56 team that was 15-7 and posted upset wins over New Mexico, Tennessee, Arizona, Arizona State and Texas Tech.

Keith received a bachelor's degree in education from NMSU in 1956. He then returned to his native Ringling, where he coached football and basketball at the local high school for one year. From 1957-64 he worked in the Las Cruces school system, first as a teacher/coach at Court Junior High (1957-60) and then as junior varsity basketball coach

at Las Cruces High School (1960-64). While at LCHS, he completed work on his Master of Arts in teaching degree at New Mexico State.

In 1964 he joined his former Aggie teammate Lou Henson, as assistant basketball coach and head track coach, at Hardin-Simmons University. He returned to Las Cruces in 1965 to become the first head basketball coach at Mayfield High School. He stayed there until rejoining Henson at NMSU, in 1968, as assistant basketball coach and assistant athletic director. They had much success when they led the 1969-70 Aggies to the Final Four. When Lou Henson left for University of Illinois in 1975, Keith was named director of athletics until he retired in 1986. During

his 11 years as athletic director, he oversaw NMSU's transformation from a small, independent athletic program into a member of a major conference, the Big West. He was responsible for the greatest growth of athletic facilities in school history. He spearheaded the construction of Aggie Memorial Stadium, the Presley Askew Baseball and Softball complex, and new facilities for tennis and track. Aggie and Roadrunner teams won nine conference championships during his tenure and attendance records were established in both football and basketball.

In addition to his work on the prestigious Football Television Committee, Keith also served on the NCAA's Junior College Relations Committee

and the Post-Graduate Scholarship Committee. Keith is also in the NMSU Hall of Fame as of 1997.

Needless to say, Keith's family has always been extremely proud of him. In addition to spending time with his family, Keith enjoyed spending time with his loyal canine companion, Aggie.

The funeral service will be held at 10 a.m., Saturday, April 15, 2023, Getz Funeral Home, 1410 E. Bowman Ave., Las Cruces, NM 88001.

Recently, "CBS Saturday Morning" co-host Michelle Miller took an at-times painful journey into her past to write her memoir "Belonging: A Daughter's Search for Identity Through Loss and Love."

In the book, she describes her decades-long quest to reconnect with the mother that abandoned her at birth and to this day won't acknowledge her, and how her search for answers forced her to come to grips with her own identity as well as the secrets that have shaped her family for half a century.

In a recent interview with co-host Dana Jacobson on "CBS Saturday Morning," Miller fought back tears as she told her intensely personal story, one that apparently hit home with the book-buying public, as she found out at a recent book signing.

"Every other person told me this was their story," Miller says. "They were left behind, they are estranged, they are separated, they don't know who their parents are. The woman who drove me to my MSNBC interview told me she has not been acknowledged. ... So when I tell you that there are a wealth of people who I believe are living with secrets, living inside the reservoir of shame about their circumstances,

Esposito immerses himself into his roles

Fans can see 'Breaking Bad' actor at Las Cruces International Film Festival

Actor Giancarlo Esposito adapted to the New Mexico landscape, using it as inspiration during his time in Albuquerque filming the "Breaking Bad" series.

"I had great experiences shooting Breaking Bad," he said.

But it was not his only time in the state. He remembers shooting "Maze Runner: The Death Cure" (2018) in the Sandia Mountains and worked on two smaller independent films here as well, "Stargirl" (2020) and "Unpregnant" (2020). And, of course, "Better Call Saul."

"I spent 17 years in and out of New Mexico shooting film of different levels," he said. "My experience in New Mexico is also about illuminating great crews."

Esposito is the kind of actor who works to become the part he plays, no matter how big or small the role. New Mexico became part of the fabric of the "Breaking Bad" universe and therefore was part of his creation of the character of Gustavo "Gus" Fring, chicken

restaurant entrepreneur and dedicated narcotics distributor.

"New Mexico had a deep effect on how I played the role," Esposito said. "I feel like Fring, who came from Chile, had a community he could relate to and a place that had a certain distance. He could blend into that community and become part of it and have space to hide in plain sight to forward his business."

Esposito also appears in

the "Star Wars" television spinoff, "The Mandalorian," which streams on Disney Plus. He plays the role of Moff Gideon, for which he has earned two Primetime Emmy Award nominations.

To Esposito, making a part his own in depth and nature honors the author's words.

"I think what I do is a personal experience," he said. "You can feel the difference because my choice to do a role is based

on what resounds to me. I pick the material based on the statement it makes, and the impression it could make on a wide variety of people."

In 1988, Esposito had his first major role in the Spike Lee film "School Daze" and it kicked off a friendship and more movies (four in total) with Lee. The two had a background in common, from growing up mixed race and raised in Catholic schools.

"He [Lee] called me an Afro-European actor," Esposito said. "At the time we didn't have any positive representatives of ourselves in the mainstream world. I have the blessing to be half European."

"A very different impression was made on me connecting me to both worlds of black and white. By being both it allows me a space to understand how people connect and also disconnect. I am blessed to be in that position. We are all connected somehow, some way."

When asked what he would tell an alien about himself, Esposito said he is an alien too.

"My definition of an alien is someone who is in, but not of," he said. "It's about the creative expression of forward moving that may not be understood. I am a creative artist, using words, expressions physically, visually and creatively."

Esposito's experience is not limited to movies and television; he also played

a major part in the 2021 video game "Far Cry 6."

The experience of playing the evil Anton Castillo took him back to his days of live theater, he said.

But there was no costume but a bulky helmet, a hundred cameras and greenscreen-wrapped furniture.

"It returned me to a black box theater situation," he said. "There are no physical elements to relate to except your scene partner. It was challenging and interesting. I loved it, working in a very technical medium which I had to bring a human experience to."

Esposito looks forward to new challenges.

"As an actor I'm embedded in the character," he said. "I want [the audience] to see themselves, at least one trait they would want to be. I am obsessed with playing the every-man."

Esposito will be in Las Cruces Thursday, April 13, for the 2023 Las Cruces International Film Festival and receiving the "Outstanding Achievement in Entertainment" award at the event. He is screening a film of his at the Allen Theatres Cineport at 7 p.m. and hosting a question-and-answer session with the audience after the movie.

The eighth Las Cruces International Film Festival takes place April 12-16, live and in-person at the Cineport. More information and tickets are available at www.lascrucesfilmfest.com.

Review: 'Land of Dreams' opens LC film festival

On April, 12 the Las Cruces International Film Festival opens with the New Mexico-made movie "Land of Dreams."

The film centers around Simin (Sheila Vand), an Iranian immigrant who works for the census bureau which has gone beyond data collection and begins requesting people describe their dreams. The movie begins with a surreal dream sequence, taking the audience into Simin's own dreams immediately and setting a surreal tone that continues through the movie.

Throughout the film, reality and dreams intertwine in some intriguing ways. In one scene, Simin encounters a couple each lost in their separate virtual reality goggles, the wife singing along with Marilyn Monroe, and the husband playing golf.

Labeled as political satire, this mixture of near-future science fiction and twisting mind games is much more than that, delving into issues of immigration,

human interaction and love. The film implies government motivations that are perhaps nefarious but lets the viewer decide how.

Sometimes connections seem random, like the young man, Mark (William Moseley), who decides he loves Simin, seemingly out of the blue and a strange assignment that requires a bodyguard, Alan (Matt Dillon). But it's all part of the tapestry of this film. The characters are interesting even as their motivations are obtuse.

The puzzle builds as we learn Simin asks those who tell her about their dreams to pose for photos, something she does for herself and not for the agency. Later, we see her in her room surrounded by these photos and we wonder if the film is about her search for self as well. It's full of odd little details that keep you wondering, such as the two men who ride in the elevator at the census agency, and the religious icons in the home of one of her interviewees.

The world itself in "Land of Dreams" is stark and bright as filmed in New Mexico

in a small town, a gas station, in the middle of nowhere and numerous desert scenes. The setting and story are almost Orwellian.

From the trailer: "The border between dream and reality is very small." And this is a journey exploring that border – intimately drawing the viewer across that fine line through layered states of consciousness.

The film is directed by Iranian-born artists Shoja Azari and Shirin Neshat and produced by Sol Tryon, Amir Hamz and Christian Springer. In addition to the primary actors above, it features performances by Isabella Rossellini, Christopher McDonald and Anna Gunn. Some of the film's actors, directors and producers will be at the film festival for Q-and-A sessions following the showing.

The film screens 7 p.m., Wednesday, April 12, at the Allen Theatres Cineport at Mesilla Valley Mall. Tickets for the festival and the opening night screening are \$25 and can be purchased at www.lascrucesfilmfest.com. The festival will continue through April 16.

Luzietti studied acting with the actor and director Charles Nelson Reilly, who nicknamed him "Show-biz Alan," telling Luzietti his last name means "small light."

Other lights in his life, Luzietti said, include his "Big Gram"; Miss Pammy,

his high school theatre teacher; Tony Azito, a friend he met when they did a film together; Big Al, his dad; Al Harp, his partner; and Mom, Joanne Luzietti.

Luzietti's creative spark comes from his mother, who lives in Los Angeles. Joanne is a former dancer, teacher, hairdresser and "natural actress" who worked on the TV series "The Nanny" as a voiceover talent, Alan said. Lush & Lean: Know Your Bugs, Know Your Landscape

When bugs are in your yard, do you know who's who and what's what? If not, learn more at the free Lush & Lean Workshop "Pests and Beneficials," sponsored by Las Cruces Utilities (LCU) Water Conservation Program, on Thursday, April 13.

Presenter Dr. Joanie King, New Mexico State University (NMSU) Extension Entomology Specialist, will talk about how different types of bugs can be beneficial and which can be problematic. She'll discuss Integrated Pest Management (IPM), an environmentally sensitive and scientific approach to pest control.

"The most important thing is an awareness that not every insect should be smushed because some benefit your yard. You have to learn who these players are," she said. "Is it a pest or a pollinator? Or is it a natural enemy of a pest, a bug that helps keep everything in order? It can be complicated."

King's specialty is ants, and she cites their behavior as something that can be complicated,

especially when ants and humans share a space. "Ants can be problematic in our yards, but they are important organisms because they go through the land and clean up. They go after dead insects, rotting food, and turn over the soil."

She explained that navigating their role in an ecosystem has been something she's working on at NMSU, especially in rangeland restoration. "The ants will run off with the grass seeds that are being planted to restore the rangelands," King said. "We have to figure out at a large scale how to prevent them from taking the seeds, but we know they are important to be there for the health of the land."

King said another confusing issue could be the age or stage of a bug. "Some insects are beneficial in their adult form, but when they're juveniles, they are larvae (or nymphs) and may be problematic," she said. "Certain butterflies can be frustrating when they are young caterpillars eating plants but grow

up into good pollinators for other plants. Sometimes it's not always black and white."

King encourages attendees to bring samples of bugs they might have for identification if time allows.

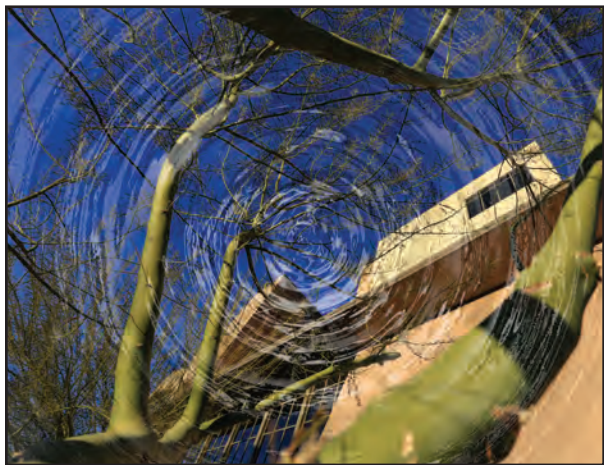

Taking a historical look at Easter Sunday

Easter 2023 is Sunday, April 9. Easter ("Pascha" in Greek and Latin) is the "principal festival of the Christian Church, which celebrates the resurrection of Jesus Christ on the third day after his crucifixion," according to britannica.com.

Easter occurs the first Sunday after the Paschal Full Moon, which is the first full moon following the spring equinox. In 2023, the equinox was March 20, and the Paschal Full Moon is Wednesday, April 5. Rules for selecting the date of Easter for western Christians, who follow the Gregorian calendar, were set by the First Council of Nicaea in 325 A.D. For nearly 1,800 years, Easter has been the first Sunday

after the 14th day of the paschal lunar month.

Eastern Christians follow the Julian calendar, which means there are usually two separate Easter celebrations. (Eastern Christianity refers in general to Christian traditions and churches in Western Asia, Eastern Europe, the Middle East, the Balkans and the Caucasus. Western Christianity developed in western Europe.)

The sun, the moon and the date of the Jewish feast of Passover are all part of the computus (Latin for computation) algorithm used to determine when Easter falls each year.

"The earliest recorded observance of an Easter celebration comes from the second century," britannica.com said.

CBS News said the English word Easter and its German

counterpart, Ostern, come from Ostara (Anglo-Saxon "Eostre"), the Germanic goddess of spring. That may also explain why bunnies – symbols of fertility – are part of the Easter celebration. Easter egg hunts may date to the 15th century, possibly begun by theologian and Christian reformer Martin Luther (1483-1546).

The egg, which symbolized the rebirth of the earth in pre-Christian celebrations, came to be defined by early Christians as an Easter symbol of Christ's resurrection.

The April full moon is also traditionally called the Pink

Moon, which celebrates "the early springtime blooms of a certain wildflower native to eastern North America: Phlox subulate ... which also went by the name "moss pink," according to almanac.com.

Agriculture has \$40 billion impact in New Mexico

On March 21, 25 food and agriculture groups re-

leased the seventh annual Feeding the Economy report, revealing food and

agriculture industries and their suppliers contribute more than \$8.6 trillion to the U.S. economy, nearly one-fifth of total national output and a 22 percent increase since the 2019 report.

In New Mexico, agriculture generates 257,697 jobs with total wages of \$11.52 billion, total business taxes of \$4.13 billion, exports of \$275 million and a total food and ag industry economic impact of \$40.23 billion, the New Mexico Department of Agriculture said in a news release.

"Our state's food and agriculture industry continues to show resiliency,"

said New Mexico Agriculture Secretary Jeff Witte. "When we sit down to eat a meal, it's important to remember all the work it took to get that food from the farm to our plates."

"We are still farming and ranching, despite the many challenges New Mexico farmers and ranchers have faced," said New Mexico Farm and Livestock Bureau President Larry Reagan. "I am proud that agriculture is rising to the challenge of feeding, clothing and fueling our communities and world while supporting our rural economies and stewarding our natural resources."

"Agriculture is one of the most efficient industrial processes that we have in the world," New Mexico State University College of Agricultural, Consumer and Environmental Sciences Dean Rolando Flores Galarza told the Bulletin. "Especially in our country, where it only takes less than two percent of the U.S. population to feed millions of citizens in the U.S. and the world; thus, is a clear statement on the importance of agriculture that allows the other 98 percent of the U.S. population to be dedicated to activities other than agriculture. In the U.S., the success of the agriculture and food systems is based on the work of the land grant universities strengthened on the development of research, teaching, extension and outreach."

"It is not surpris-

ing that agriculture is a key economic driver, especially here in New Mexico," said New Mexico Cattle Growers' Association President Loren Patterson. "Beef cattle ranches operate in every county in New Mexico. We are an innovative industry, combining science and artistry to produce not only abundant food for every fork, but precious food that inspires our culinary arts and cultural traditions. It was the first industry in our state and one which is perpetually evolving."

The report shows the U.S. food and agriculture sector directly supports nearly 23 million jobs, provides \$927 billion in wages, and is particularly vital to rural communities across America. Notably, the 2023 report reveals that the manufacturing of agricultural products accounts for nearly one-fifth of total manufacturing jobs in the U.S. Overall, more than 46 million jobs are supported across the food and agriculture supply chain, increasing nearly two percent since

the 2019 report despite the economic challenges and disruptions associated with the pandemic.

The strength and growth highlighted in this year's report reinforce that agriculture is evolving and innovating to meet the demands of the 21st century, the news release said. According to the U.S. Department of Agriculture, land use for agriculture decreased by 28 percent 1948-2019, while land productivity grew nearly four times and labor productivity grew more than 10 times.

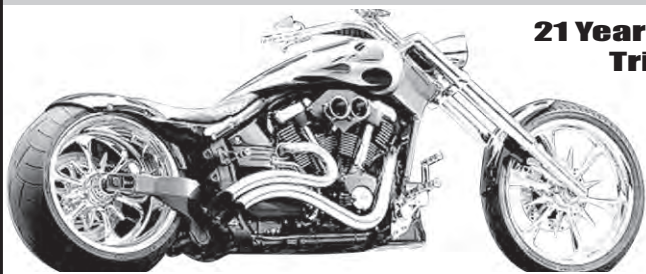

Colon issues, including cancer, often preventable

Dr. Rony Salloum started working with the MountainView Medical Group in November and has brought his extensive experience to the service of the people of Las Cruces.

He is a specialist in colorectal surgery and is glad to be here serving a population which, unfortunately, tends to be at high risk for colon cancer.

Salloum said he is drawn to the specialty because of its diverse experiences and the variety of treatments he can help people with.

“You get to experience all aspects of surgical care,” he said. “You do the one-time procedures. You do the continuity of care over a long time, for inflammatory bowel disease, for example.”

He also sees cancer patients, but said he wishes there were fewer of them.

Colon cancer is the fourth most common by

incidence in the United States with 151,000 estimated cases in 2022.

No. 2 cancer killer

It is the second most common cause of (cancer) death, right after lung cancer and, Salloum said, there are things that can be done to change that.

“When I was doing my rotations, I realized that these (cancers) can be fixed so easily if someone would just do it,” he said. “You get to screen for cancer with colonoscopies and you get to change the balance from trying to play catch-up with cancer to catching it and treating it even before it becomes cancer.”

“That dramatically changes the ballgame.”

Salloum said he practices a broad scope of colorectal surgery on conditions that include cancer and diverticulitis, and benign diseases, such as fecal incontinence, rectal prolapse, hemorrhoids, fissures and fistu-

las, among other things.

“The scope of my practice is really trying to address the colorectal need in this part of the country,” he said.

Medically, and specifically with colorectal matters, people tend to bypass screenings with a, “if-it’s-not-broken-don’t-fix-it attitude,” he said.

Waiting can be deadly

“People wait one more year, then one more year, and then one more year and then after all that time when you could have done something, you end up with cancer,” he said.

The age to begin colon cancer screening used to be 50, and now it’s 45 because, more and more, younger people are being affected, he said. These guidelines started a few years ago but it doesn’t seem like it’s really reached everybody because there are still many people who think the age is 50.

Cancer can develop when an inflamed state

happens in the rectum or in the colon because an inflamed state causes a tissue injury and the body tries to heal it, Salloum said.

The more your body tries to heal itself, the more likely you are to have defects in that healing process. And that is “kind of” how cancer cells start, he said.

Risk factors like smoking, heavy alcohol consumption, and a diet of fatty foods with low fiber, give the colorectum a predisposition to get more inflammatory damage and become more prone to cancers, he said. There are also inherited disorders that can make people more prone to cancer.

Diet can help

Maintaining a diet high in fiber helps a lot with cancer reduction and also helps lower the risk of diverticulitis which, Salloum said, he is seeing in younger and younger people. Diverticulitis is the major reason people get admitted to the hospital regarding colorectal issues.

Symptoms of diverticulitis can include abdominal pain, (on the left usually), fevers, nausea, vomiting and difficulty eating, he said. But cancer symptoms are not so obvious and often tend to go silent and unnoticed until they are more advanced. Symptoms include rectal bleeding, weight loss or just overall fatigue.

While New Mexico has improved overall in how

frequently people are screened with colonoscopies, from 2012-2020, Salloum said the state must do better.

Goal is 80 percent

Currently in New Mexico, 65 percent of people are up to date on the procedure, but the goal is 80 percent.

Screening colonoscopies are generally covered 100 percent by health plans, he said.

“Colorectal conditions are nothing to be embarrassed or ashamed of and should not prevent you from trying to seek care,” Salloum said. “It is an organ, just like any other organs in the body that can have problems that can be fixed. It is important to seek care early enough while problems are still manageable in a fairly simple way, before things get too out of hand and more complex.”

Colson made big local impact

When it comes to Las Cruces sports history, few have been involved in as many milestones as Keith Colson, who passed away March 26 at age 88.

“Keith Colson’s certainly an all-time Aggie great,” Mario Moccia, New Mexico State University athletic director, told the Bulletin in a phone interview. “He will be sorely missed.”

Colson came to Las Cruces in 1954, in tow with Presley Askew, the coach for whom he’d played junior college basketball in Oklahoma. Colson played alongside another Oklahoma import, Lou Henson. Askew was hired to coach New Mexico State University (then New Mexico A&M), which he did for 12 seasons through 1965, adding baseball coaching duties in 1962 when the Aggies started that program.

In 1960, Colson began coaching the Las Cruces High School junior varsity basketball team. The varsity coach at that time was Henson, with whom Colson

would follow to Hardin-Simmons University in 1962. That was Henson’s first collegiate coaching job, and Colson was a basketball assistant coach and head track coach.

In 1965, when Mayfield High School opened, Colson returned to

Las Cruces to become the Trojans’ first head basketball coach.

Henson returned to Las Cruces in 1966 to become the Aggies’ head basketball coach. In 1968, Henson tabbed Colson to be NMSU’s assistant coach. The two made history in 1970, as they guided the Aggies to the Final Four.

“Keith’s name is synonymous with Lou Henson,” Moccia said.

When Henson left to coach Illinois in 1975, Colson stepped up to take the athletic director position, a job he would hold until 1986. During that time, Colson helped instrument the transformation of NMSU from a small, independent athletic program to a member of the Big West, while building the framework for

the department that exists today.

Under Colson’s leadership, Aggie facilities experienced the greatest growth in school history as he spearheaded the construction of Aggie Memorial Stadium, the Presley Askew Baseball Field, the NM State Softball Complex and new facilities for tennis and track.

He was also a factor nationally, serving on a number of NCAA committees, including the NCAA Football Television Committee.

“Throughout the years, I would talk to Coach Colson at different games and events,” Moccia said. “We always got off to the side and would talk athletic director stuff and about the difficulties of this job. He was a great counsel, as well as a historian who knew so much about this program over the years.”

Colson’s work at NMSU through the years was recognized in 1997, when he was inducted into the US Bank/NM State Athletics Hall of Fame.

Links to leadership: Golf offers lessons to lead

If you have played golf seriously for a substantial period of time you know the big difference between our success and failure at any given time is almost always mental, not physical. When athletes of similar talent compete, in any sport, mental toughness is what separates the winners from the others. So it is also with senior executives, whose success or failure largely depends on their mental and emotional strengths. That simply means the ability to exercise the necessary discipline over our thinking and behavior, while maintaining absolute control over our emotions. Moreover, it also means maintaining utmost confidence in our abilities, combined with the pres-

ence of mind to size up the circumstances correctly.

Just as golfers need to learn shotmaking, positioning, recovery plays and other critical skills, leaders in any field have to master certain competencies which are required for performance that is consistent with winning. As golfers, we need to master swing fundamentals, course management, touch, feel and nerves. As leaders we need to master organizational fundamentals, people management, situational context, and nerves. In both golf and leadership we have to be constantly aware of changing conditions and adjust accordingly. In golf, in

business and in leadership we are expected to know, understand and follow the rules of the game.

As golfers and leaders, we should carry ourselves with class and behave with professionalism and honor. In golf and leadership, what counts most is what we do when no one is watching.

To perform brilliantly when it counts the most, whether you're an athlete or in a leadership position, there are three essential aptitudes we can learn from golf, and are all components of high emotional intelligence, or EQ.

The most basic is getting to know ourselves as deeply as possible. High

self-awareness means understanding our strengths, our tendencies, our limitations, our attitudes, our peculiar habits and those areas where we need to grow. That is absolutely essential for us to manage others effectively.

Secondly, we need to have full control of our emotions, which is the main earmark of high EQ people. Hall-of-Fame golfers like Jack Nicklaus and Annika Sorenstam stand out as classic performers who were always under control and didn't lose their cool no matter what. Loss of command of our emotions can hijack our brains. We see that countless times with politicians and celebrities. If you are a speaker, saying the right thing in public depends on

a grasp of your emotions. A symphony musician must have total control to let the composer's music come out with virtuosity. PGA Tour golfer Scottie Scheffler, currently ranked number one in the world, is a prime example of someone who demonstrates complete control of his game and his emotions.

Lastly, high-performing leaders need to have a savvy grasp of the situation at all times. Not only do they need to see the big picture, but also be keenly focused on what is happening in the moment. When Frenchman Jan Van de Velde had is famous meltdown on the final hole of the 1999 British Open, he was leading by three (yes, three!) shots, standing on the tee of the 72nd hole of

the tournament. He failed to completely grasp the situation, and proceeded to make a succession of poor choices combined with poor swings, and bad luck and changing conditions added up to an eventual loss.

As with Van de Velde, sometimes circumstances conspire with bad decisions to sabotage politicians, top executives, generals, sportsmen and investors, to name a few. Sometimes they sabotage themselves. Sometimes it's only a thoughtless word or two.
