# Councilor Gandara announces bid for mayor

Kasandra Gandara will host “Listening to Las Cruces” events in April across the city as she launches her campaign for mayor of Las Cruces.

Gandara said she will visit each of the city’s six council districts, hosting family-friendly opportunities to “hear what’s important to the citizens of Las Cruces.” For details and directions to each “Listening to Las Cruces” event, call 575-373-0456 and visit [kasandraforlascruces.com](http://kasandraforlascruces.com).

“I am here to represent all people,” said Gandara, including the “underserved (and those) living in the margins. I feel I am their voice.”

If elected, Gandara said she wants to continue the work she has started and the causes she has championed as the District One representative on the city council since 2015 and as mayor pro tempore for the past three years.

“I’m a collaborator,” Gandara said, citing her leadership on city policy review committees (PRCs) composed of city councilors, city staff and community members working together to develop policies with communitywide impact on the wellbeing of city residents. Gandara is a member of the economic development, health and housing PRCs. The city also has a quality of life/education PRC and a transportation, sustainability and infrastructure PRC.

Gandara said she has been a strong proponent of performance-based budgeting that mandates “accountability all the way

around,” and the strategic planning that guides “how we run the city” and has brought accolades to Las Cruces. As mayor, Gandara said she will facilitate greater communication between the city and the community.

“People are wanting that connection,” she said. “You see me at a lot of different places (because) connection and coordination with the public helps me understand where people are at. I’m a social worker at heart.”

Gandara said she also wants to “elevate small business” in Las Cruces and strengthen ties with El Paso, Juarez and other surrounding communities.

“I want to continue to be the trailblazer on a lot of these important issues,” Gandara said.

The city needs to be more proactive in the way it deals with community issues, Gandara said. For her part, Gandara said she is “committed to addressing” public safety, poverty, affordable housing (“absolutely a top priority”) health and behavioral health, business and workforce development and education.

“I will talk to anybody,” Gandara said. “I will listen and do my best. You’re going to get a responsive council and a responsive mayor.”

The current city council includes the “most amazing, compassionate people I’ve ever worked with,” Gandara said. “I want to be their leader.”

Lift Up Las Cruces, a city program “to improve neighborhoods one at a time,” will be a cornerstone of her administra-

tion as mayor, Gandara said, and part of her goal to reduce the city’s nearly 30-percent poverty rate.

Gandara led creation of the city’s Mano y Mano day labor program that employs Mesilla Valley Community of Hope clients struggling with homelessness to assist city Parks and Recreation Department staff in cleaning and beautifying city parks and other property. The program was created in 2018 and expanded in 2022 to two crews of 20 people working five days a week.

The city’s Las Cruces Cares program, “another one of my babies,” Gandara said, hired two social workers as advocates to work with individuals, families and businesses who are victims of property crimes and violent crimes and need help negotiating the criminal justice system and dealing with personal issues.

Gandara wants to allocate \$1-\$1.5 million to build a regional substance abuse treatment facility in Las Cruces.

The city Economic Development Department has “grown by leaps and bounds” since it was created in 2017, Gandara said, and has become a major part of creating greater economic prosperity and building individual wealth in Las Cruces, she said, along with the growth of the Las Cruces Innovation and Industrial Park and Las Cruces International Airport.

Small business development such as the city’s and state’s partnership with 828 Productions to build a film studio in Las Cruces means better paying jobs

that will keep “kids here,” Gandara said, and make the city more attractive to businesses starting up or moving to the city.

“Business is always important,” she said. “I’m going to hear what their concerns are.”

The city council’s recent vote to designate portions of El Paseo Road, south Solano Drive and west Picacho Avenue as metropolitan redevelopment areas (MRAs) continues the city’s commitment to increasing public and private investment to address blight conditions in those areas, Gandara said.

Building on “the pride and the energy” of Las Cruces neighborhoods means addressing issues like completing sidewalks, improving streets and

streetlights and having more police presence, she said.

Gandara said she wants to continue the city’s partnership with Las Cruces Public Schools to create more community schools to benefit students and community members.

If Gandara wins the Nov. 7, 2023, nonpartisan mayoral election, Gandara will succeed incumbent Ken Miyagishima, who is not seeking re-election. She would be the city’s first female mayor.

# Chaparral to launch solar array

New Mexico Commissioner of Public Lands Stephanie Garcia Richard joined NextEra Energy Resources and El Paso Electric at a ribbon cutting ceremony April 5 to celebrate the completion of construction of the Buena Vista Energy Center on more than 2,700 acres of state land in Chaparral, New Mexico.

The project is the largest solar array constructed on state lands in New Mexico and is expected to produce more 120 megawatts of solar

power – enough energy to power roughly 60,000 homes, according to NextEra Energy Resources, the State Land Office (SLO) said in a news release.

Over the lifetime of the lease, the project is expected to generate about \$12 million in revenue for New Mexico's public schools and New Mexico State University, the news release said.

“New Mexico is blessed with amazing sun and wind resources, and we have a great opportunity before us to harness these resources and create new and steady streams of revenue for our public schools and other beneficiaries. The Buena Vista project adds to this rapidly expanding footprint

of renewable energy production on state lands and moves us one step forward to a cleaner future,” Garcia Richard said. “As New Mexico strives to meet the renewable energy standards set under the (2019 state) Energy Transition Act, our Office of Renewable Energy (ORE) continues to encourage projects that will make a tangible impact in the long run. And now that ORE is a permanent fixture at SLO, the possibilities for future renewable energy production on state lands are endless.”

Legislation to establish a permanent ORE within SLO was recently signed into law, the news release said. The legislation builds on the early successes of the Office of

Renewable Energy that Commissioner Garcia Richard established in 2019, which tripled the amount of renewable energy under lease on state lands in four years, SLO said.

There are currently 27 leases for wind energy production either operational or under development on state lands, totaling about 1.6 gigawatts of wind power – roughly the amount of energy needed to power 320,000 homes, the news release said. Additionally, there are 12 leases for solar energy production either operational or under development on state lands, totaling about 273.5 megawatts of solar power, or enough energy to power roughly 54,700 homes.

# Rep. Vasquez, Secretary Buttigieg visit NMSU

U.S. Rep. Gabe Vasquez of New Mexico's District 2 came to Las Cruces Wednesday, April 5, along with U.S. Secretary of Transportation Pete Buttigieg and U.S. Rep. Nanette Barragan of California.

The three met at New Mexico State University's Corbett Center auditorium, along with NMSU Chancellor Dan Arvizu and four NMSU engineering students to discuss issues of transportation, infrastructure and workforce in New Mexico and the United States.

"I literally wouldn't exist if it weren't for this university," Buttigieg said.

He went on to tell the story of how his father, Joseph Buttigieg, an immigrant from Malta, took a teaching job at NMSU. The elder Buttigieg met another junior faculty member named Anne Montgomery, who was from Indiana but had grown up in El Paso. Before long, they were in Anne's parents' living room, getting married. Joseph's naturalization papers were drafted in Doña

Ana County.

Wednesday's visit was the younger Buttigieg's first visit to his origins, so to speak.

The four NMSU students were Jonah Madrid, a mechanical and aerospace engineering student from Hatch; Gregory Gonzales, a civil engineering student from Tularosa; Amelia Marmalejo, a geotechnical engineering student from Las Cruces; and Noah Madrigal, a civil engineering master's student from Nebraska.

Buttigieg, Vasquez and Barragan had spent the morning in Deming, and Buttigieg was in Albuquerque Tuesday, April 4.

At the Corbett Center, the students asked questions about aging infrastructure and the future of building plans. The visit was part of the Biden-Harris Administration's "Investing in America" tour, learning the needs of different regions of the country, and discussing investments being made.

Meeting with the students, and young people, was important, Buttigieg said, because the country will need their expertise and capabilities to accom-

plish the plans.

"Getting the funds was hard enough, but delivering will be even harder," Buttigieg said. "Recruiting will be a big part of that. We need to make sure we build out the human capital. It's a limiting factor on this infrastructure work."

Another reason for stopping at NMSU was so Barragan, the chair of Congress's Hispanic Caucus, could visit the Hispanic-serving university. Arvizu said that to qualify as a Hispanic-serving institution, the student body must be at least 20 percent Hispanic. At NMSU, Arvizu said, the percentage is 62.

Barragan said the current caucus, which has 42 members, including Vasquez, is the largest it's ever been.

Buttigieg, who met with Tuesday with New Mexico's U.S. senators Ben Ray Lujan and Martin Heinrich, as well as U.S. Rep. Melanie Stanbury, had praise for them, as well as Vasquez and U.S. Rep. Teresa Leger Fernandez.

"You are well served in New Mexico by a very energetic Congressional delegation," Buttigieg said.

## City gets big grant

While in Las Cruces, Buttigieg announced the City of Las Cruces has been awarded a \$10 million grant from the U.S. Department of Transportation and its Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration (PHMSA) to improve and modernize natural gas distribution lines in the city.

"This funding to modernize our gas pipelines will help protect residents

from dangerous leaks, create good-paying jobs, and reduce methane emissions in communities across the nation, particularly in rural and underserved areas," Buttigieg said.

Las Cruces is one of more than 20 communities to receive grants, projected to create hundreds of jobs. Grant funding recipients will repair, replace, or rehabilitate nearly 270 miles of pipe, expected to reduce methane emissions by approximately 212 metric tons annually.

## Wild ride in store for District 2 race

New Mexico's Congressional District 2 is, geographically, one of the biggest districts in the country.

These days, the district looms very large in the minds of the country's Democratic and Republican leaders.

The district was created in 1969 and long considered a Republican stronghold, with the seat held by the GOP for 40 years of its existence.

The last four two-year terms, however, the seat has been held by a different party.

Those Representatives were Republican Steve Pearce, Democrat Xotchil Torres Small, Republican Yvette Herrell and the current Congressman, Democrat Gabe Vasquez.

With the party margins so

close in both the U.S. House of Representatives and U.S. Senate, every district in the nation becomes a battleground, especially the swing districts, which CD2 has now become.

In re-districting, required following a census, the Democrat-led New Mexico legislature created what people thought would be a less-friendly district to the GOP.

Vasquez's 2022 victory of 1,350 votes in the re-drawn district, however, was even slimmer than Torres Small's 3,722 in 2018.

When Herrell won in between, in 2020, she defeated Torres Small by almost 20,000 votes.

In a span of five days last week, two prominent national party figures came to Las Cruces with their candidate of choice.

U.S. Secretary of Transportation Pete Buttigieg, who ran in the Democratic Presidential primary in 2020, came to Deming and New Mexico State University April 5, with Vasquez. They were talking primarily transportation issues, but another Buttigieg message was clear: "I'm a big name in politics, I'm a Democrat, and I'm backing Gabe Vasquez."

Then, on April 10, U.S. Speaker of the House Kevin McCarthy came to Las Cruces to join Herrell as she announced she's seeking to regain her seat.

McCarthy said a lot of things that day, but the gist could be boiled to this: "I'm a big name in politics, I'm a Republican, and I'm backing Yvette Herrell."

Because Vasquez is a very liberal Democrat, and Herrell is a very conservative Republican, few voters will be undecided.

Barring a surprise, that distinction in candidates means the election will come down to voter turnout, and both parties will do everything they can to get their people to the ballots.

In this district, turnout increases significantly during a Presidential election year. In the five Presidential election cycles since 2004, turnout has increased over the preceding non-Presidential year by 53, 48, 32, 54 and 32 percent. The only Democratic CD2 win in that stretch came in 2008, when Harry Teague of Hobbs beat Ed Tinsley.

Buckle up, New Mexicans. We're still more than 18 months away from November 2024, so expect to see a lot more volleying in this race. Probably some more big names and, assuredly, lots of bitter and ugly radio, TV and direct mail ads.

## Baseball curmudgeon applauds change

"The only clocks in a Major League stadium should tell us the time of day, and they should do so using hands, not digits."

That was my posting on our fantasy baseball message board a couple of years ago when Major League officials began toying with the idea of a pitch clock.

Baseball has long provided refuge to curmudgeonly traditionalists like me who revere the sport's history and fret over anything that would change the game we learned to love as a child. Other Johnny-Come-Latelys like the NBA and NFL can tinker with the rule book every year, but baseball should remain consistent.

I never understood all the complaints about games lasting more than three hours. Do people get mad at Bruce Springsteen when he comes out for a

third encore? Who cares if it screws up the TV schedule? For fans, it means more time at the ballpark.

Baseball is the one game where time doesn't matter.

All of the other major sports are the other major sports are a race to beat the clock. There is a frenzy in the final moments of a close game, where fractions of a second can make the difference between victory and defeat, and all eyes are on the clock.

Winning teams in baseball have to earn the final out. There are still unpredictable finishes, but they aren't as frantic. Fans watch the scoreboard to track the number of outs left in the game, not the number of seconds.

That leads to a more leisurely

pace I've always found appealing. But, there's a fine line between leisurely and boring, and baseball was tilting in the wrong direction.

The new rule this year limiting the amount of time between pitches has worked better than I thought it would. The pace of the game is much better now, and it's easier to stay focused on the ac-

tion.

Other new rules this year include larger bases and a limit on how many times pitchers can attempt to pick runners off base. Those have dramatically increased the number of stolen bases. And, new restrictions prohibiting defensive shifts have led to higher batting averages.

Some of these rules may go too far, and there could be

further tweaks. But the bigger story is baseball is finally willing to change at all.

The change that Major League baseball still desperately needs is a salary structure that allows all teams to compete on an equal footing. The New York Mets are paying their players a combined total of more than \$353 million this year. The Oakland Athletics are paying their players just under \$57 million. That's simply not a fair competition.

In fiscal year 2022, the state announced a record-breaking \$855.4 million dollars in production spend, with approximately \$50 million attributed to production spend outside of the Albuquerque - Santa Fe corridor.

"Las Cruces is honored to be named amongst the most prestigious and well-known filming towns in America," state Senator Jeff Steinborn of Las Cruces said. "Our great locations and crew, top notch film incentives, and full-service film office makes Las Cruces and Doña Ana County an excellent filming destination."

Further advancing the New Mexico film industry and ecosystem is Lujan Grisham's recent announcement of the New Mexico Media Academy (NMMA), a collaboration with the Higher Education Department and 15 of their film and media programs statewide, Netflix, NBCUniversal, 828 Productions, and IATSE Local 480. The NMMA will be an epicenter for industry-standard workforce training with facilities located in Albuquerque and Las Cruces.

## Breaking Down Cardboard is Key



*Are you filling up your recycling container too fast? Maybe it's time to break down the cardboard boxes, and remove your Styrofoam, saving you space and making sure that recycling isn't pushed in and stuck when it's picked up by the recycling truck.*

**With all the online shopping, your blue recycling bin might be full of cardboard boxes. However, if you don't break down your boxes, not only will you have less space, but it might be harder for your driver to get all the boxes out of your bin.**

**"What winds up happening is when the truck operates the gripper, it tightens as the container goes up. When it squeezes the container and if there's cardboard in there that is not very well broken down, or shoved in, it's not going to come out," explained Daniel Ortega, South Central Solid Waste Authority recycling operations foreman. He said that if bulky cardboard isn't broken down properly, it means a lot of extra air and space is present within a container and also takes up more space in the trucks used to pick up the material.**

**"Other problematic things we see are bagged recycling," he said. "Once it hits the conveyor belt at the processing plant, the workers are going to take the bag off and throw it directly into the trash."**

**recent estimate states that paper and cardboard represent the largest component of municipal solid waste, but here in Las Cruces, corrugated cardboard is one of the staples of its recycling program. Ortega recommends the best way to flatten out any cardboard box is to open all the flaps and then collapse the box along two adjacent corners.**

**While not breaking down recycling boxes may not seem super important, there are a few that can happen when**

**you don't:**

**- The recycling trucks have internal compactors; however, bigger unbroken boxes limit the space in the truck, resulting in the need for the trucks to head back to the Recycling Center, located at 2855 W Amador, more often.**

**- If you bring them to the Recycling Center and don't break them down, you won't be able to slide them into the containers that only have small slots to encourage breaking down the boxes.**

# Gogue: 'My plan is to hit the ground listening'

At a special meeting Friday, April 7, of the New Mexico State University Board of Regents, the board agreed to a mutual separation with Chancellor Dan Arvizu. The board also announced former NMSU President Jay Gogue will serve as the university's interim chancellor. Gogue (rhymes with "rouge") will lead the NMSU system while the search for the next permanent chancellor takes place.

During the meeting, Arvizu said he believed accelerating the transition will allow the university to focus on finding the NMSU system's next permanent

chancellor.

"This separation is truly mutual," Arvizu said. "For the past five years, my only motivation has been to do what I believe is in the best interest of NMSU, and transitioning now will allow the university to devote the time and effort needed over the next several months for a successful search."

"The Board of Regents appreciates all Chancellor Arvizu has done for our university," said Ammu Devasthali, chair of the NMSU Board of Regents. "As we thank him and wish him well, we, at the

same time, welcome Jay and Susie Gogue back to Las Cruces."

Gogue

has a long and distinguished career in higher education. He served as NMSU president from 2000-2003 and later served as president and chancellor of the University of Houston system from 2003-2007 and as president of Auburn University from 2007-2017 and again from 2019-2022.

"Susie and I are pleased to be back at NMSU," Gogue said. "My plan is to hit the ground listening. No two institutions of

higher education are the same. Just because something worked at Auburn doesn't mean it will work at NMSU. In the coming days, I intend to meet with as many people as I can to get a better understanding of our overall landscape."

During the time Gogue spent at Auburn, that university continued to assert its status as a premier land-, sea- and space-grant university through research, academic rigor and national recognition. He holds a Ph.D. in horticulture from Michigan State University and bachelor's and master's degrees in horticulture from Auburn. He also served as provost at Utah State University from 1995-2000, vice president for research

at Clemson University from 1986-1995 and vice president for agriculture and natural resources at Clemson University from 1993-1995.

During Friday's meeting, the board of regents also selected the executive search firm WittKieffer to help with the chancellor

search process, including identifying qualified candidates, conducting initial screenings and evaluating individuals for the position. The board plans to begin hosting listening sessions and gathering input from stakeholders around the state in the coming weeks.

# Former Rep. Herrell, U.S. Speaker visit Las Cruces

“This is the kickoff for 2024, US Congress, second congressional district, Yvette Herrell for Congress!”

That was the announcement former Congresswoman Herrell made April 10 to about 750 people gathered at the New Mexico Farm & Ranch Heritage Museum. The mostly partisan audience gave Herrell a standing ovation in response to her intent to regain the seat she held in 2021-22.

“We’ve got about 16 months, 17 months, to get it right,” Herrell said. “And we will get it right. Together we will take our country back.”

Joining Herrell was U.S. Speaker of the House of Representatives Kevin McCarthy, a California Republican.

During the ovation for Herrell, McCarthy could be seen on the stage, snapping photos of the audience with his cell phone.

Soon after, Herrell introduced McCarthy and he came to the podium.

“I had to take a picture from back here, because if this is the announcement, I wonder what election night’s going to look like,” McCarthy said.

## ‘You cannot let me down’

“Four years ago, when I became Republican leader in the House, we set our goals,” McCarthy said. “Stop Biden’s agenda, fire Nancy Pelosi, and win the majority back. We achieved all three of those.”

“But we fell a little short, 1,350 votes,” McCarthy added, referencing current Congressman Gabe

Vasquez’s narrow victory over Herrell in the 2022 election for New Mexico’s District Two.

McCarthy then talked about how, each election cycle, he liked to pick what place he would go for a critical Congressional candidacy announcement.

“And every time I’ve done that, that person has won,” he said. “So, you cannot let me down. This is the first announcement I’ve been to for the next election cycle.”

## ‘Make New Mexico great’

Outside the museum, about 40 protesters stood along Dripping Springs Road, holding signs with messages such as “No No Yvette,” “Oppose Yvette Herrell, she voted against veterans,” “Abortion is health care,” “Gabe Vasquez for Congress,” and “No MAGA extremists.”

From the podium, Herrell said, “I hear there are some protesters outside. They’re probably getting paid. And that tells me two things. They’re scared. They’re not just scared about me; they’re scared of you. ... Together we can make this happen, we can start taking seats back, we can start making America great again, and let’s try making New Mexico great for the first time.”

This also drew a big ovation from the audience.

## ‘Some real fighters’

Opening the event was State Sen. Crystal Diamond, who represents parts of Doña Ana, Luna, Sierra and Hidalgo counties. Though New Mexico’s state Legislature is predominantly Demo-

cratic, the Republican Diamond felt positive about the recently completed 2023 session.

“We didn’t just hold the line, we gained some ground,” Diamond said, citing legislation bringing “meaningful reform” to the Children, Youth and Families Department; fire protection legislation led by State Sen. Bill Burt, who was in the audience; revisions to medical malpractice laws; and actions she said fought for small business, such as killing a mandatory paid family medical leave bill, and killing a minimum wage increase.

“You have elected some real fighters,” Diamond said of the Republicans in the state Legislature. “But our greatest setback is we lost CD 2.”

“Losing Yvette Herrell was a loss to the entire state, not just CD 2,” Diamond said. “The Democrats didn’t win that election, the Republicans lost it. But we could not have had a better candidate than Yvette Herrell. It’s just that not enough Republicans are voting in New Mexico. We’re working hard to get twice as many Republicans to vote. They’re not going to

outright us. The takeback fight starts today!”

Diamond then introduced Herrell, who began by recognizing a couple of audience members.

## ‘A very special day’

“I have to thank two very special people,” said Herrell, who is from Alamogordo. “My Mom and my Dad are here. Thank you, I love you.”

She then pivoted to criticizing her replacement in Washington, D.C.

“Gabe Vasquez has been in office, what? Four or five months?” Herrell asked. “What a disaster.

“We don’t have a seat at the table, we don’t have anybody watching out for our interests.

“He voted no on increasing American energy.

“He also voted against protecting the unborn,” she said. “He voted no on the abortion born-alive act ... He doesn’t care about kids either. In fact, he just cast his vote against the parents’ bill of rights.

“We’ve got to work on every single level; county, federal, state, local,” she said. “We’ve got to show up in November next year.

“We only lost the seat by 1,300 votes, that’s not that many,” Herrell said. “But

what we must do, must do ... We’ve got to get God back in the conversation. We need more God and less government.

“We need to protect our kids, protect our economy, protect our nation. And that’s why today is such a very special day.”

Later, McCarthy compared New Mexico to his home state.

“I happen to be from California,” McCarthy said to scattered boos. “People ask me why do I travel the country? To see all my former constituents. New Mexico is a little like California: a beautiful state with bad leadership.”

McCarthy criticized the

recent two-year stretch (2020-2022) when the Democrats controlled the House.

“God has blessed this nation,” McCarthy said. “They have given us the minerals that we can become energy independent. When we become energy independent, our energy costs are lower. If our energy costs are lower, more people are working. America’s stronger, but you know what else? The world is safer.

“In that short amount of time (Democrats) disrupted the world order,” he said. “Now OPEC determines what the price of gas is, not America.”

# Local fifth-grader's bill becomes New Mexico law

"My homework for TeenPact New Mexico was to write a bill, serious or fun, that I would be willing to discuss at the event," said Braden McIntosh, a Las Cruces fifth-grader. "I had no clue I would have a chance to share my idea with our state leaders."

Just a few weeks later, on April 5, McIntosh's idea was signed into law by the governor.

In the beginning, McIntosh had no inkling his idea for a bill to raise funds for additional youth programming through the New Mexico Department of Game and Fish would find traction.

He took his idea to two state senators, Cliff R. Pirtle and Joshua A. Sanchez, who quickly ran with his

idea.

After discussing his bill idea with Sen. Sanchez and Sen. Pirtle, McIntosh was accompanied to Legislative Council Services where he presented his bill idea for drafting.

Sponsored by Sen. Sanchez and Sen. Pirtle, Senate Bill 392 is a voluntary public fundraising effort to increase funding for already established youth programs administered by the New Mexico Game & Fish across all five state game commission districts.

As written, the bill "shall provide an opportunity for a person who

makes a purchase from the department of game and fish to donate money to the youth programs by rounding up the dollar amount or donating a custom amount."

The bill passed through two senate committee meetings in February, and it was presented on the Senate Floor Friday, March 3. McIntosh, who recently turned 11, was called to the Senate floor as an expert witness. The bill passed unanimously with a vote of 35-0. Then it passed the House of Representatives unanimously, 61-0, in the final hours of the 2023 legislative session.

TeenPact New Mexico, a national organization that hosts state events across the country to provide participants with

leadership experience and hands-on training in the political process. McIntosh's lesson in state law-making began with a homework assignment prior to attending the New Mexico TeenPact event in early February.

At the signing, Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham encouraged McIntosh by saying she believes his bill will inspire youth and their families because it will provide greater access to the outdoors.

McIntosh agreed that by getting more youth outdoors they can learn to appreciate New Mexico's natural resources. "Whether it's archery, fishing, off-roading, hiking or more, getting youth outside to experience nature will help our state in the

future to be the beautiful Land of Enchantment it is today," he said.

At the close of the bill signing, Lujan Grisham and McIntosh discovered they both have a passion for fly fishing. When asked

which fish was his favorite, McIntosh said, "The one that puts up the biggest fight."

McIntosh, who is homeschooled, is the son of Will and Jaylene McIntosh of Las Cruces.

A year after that, they moved him to Platte, South Dakota, where he worked on the Platte-Winner Concrete Bridge, which was mostly built while working off floating barges and boats. He later moved to Dunsmuir, California and worked on the earthfill McCloud Dam. After that, he moved to Omaha again to do Estimating, and shortly thereafter, they moved to Arroyo Grande, California, to work for E.L. Yeager Construction as the Project Engineer

Finally, he worked as operations manager of Big Chief Stone, Inc., in Las Cruces.

His many honors and activities were president of the NM Ready-Mix Association, Chairman of the Board of Directors of Big Brothers/Big Sisters of Las Cruces, member of the Greater Las Cruces Chamber of Commerce, Las Cruces Home Builders, Amador Museum

Foundation, Rio Grande Rotary Club of Las Cruces, Las Cruces Elks Lodge, University United Methodist Church, Mesilla Valley Hospice, University Park Toastmasters and Executive

Development Systems. In 1988, he was selected as one of the top 100 Engineering Alumni from the NMSU College of Engineering and in 2008, he and his brother, Ed, were honored with Honorary

## Digging: Your Rights and Responsibilities

Know what's below. Call before you dig.

New Mexico excavation law places certain responsibilities with the excavator (a person using a mechanical digging device) for preventing damage to underground facilities. The law provides for a one-call system that the excavator can use free of charge to arrange to have underground facilities located and marked before an excavation occurs.

#### State Law Requires Excavators to:

- 1) Plan your excavation.
- 2) Mark the excavation area in white.
- 3) Call before you dig.
- 4) Determine the location of any underground facilities.
- 5) Call the one call center if any facility is not marked to determine if it is "clear."
- 6) Preserve line location markings or provide offsets.
- 7) Expose any conflicts and maintain at least 18 inches of clearance from the horizontal mark and the edge of the mechanical digging device.
- 8) Support underground facilities during excavation as necessary.
- 9) Backfill in a careful manner.
- 10) Notify facility owners and 811 of any damage immediately.
- 11) Standard locate tickets are valid for 15 working days.

#### What Happens When You Call:

Once you provide the necessary information, the one call operator will confirm all pertinent details. It is your responsibility to ensure the information was properly recorded on the request. Likewise, faxed or on-line requests will be returned to you as confirmation, and it is your responsibility to immediately confirm the information is correct.

## Escarbar: Sus Derechos y Responsabilidades

Entérese de lo que hay abajo. Llame antes de escarbar.

La ley de excavación de Nuevo México impone ciertas responsabilidades al excavador (Es una persona que utilice un artefacto mecánico para escarbar) para prevenir daños en las instalaciones bajo tierra. La ley provee un sistema de "una llamada" que el excavador puede utilizar sin costo para hacer arreglos para que se localicen las instalaciones bajo tierra y que estas sean marcadas antes de que la excavación ocurra.

#### La ley requiere que los excavadores hagan lo siguiente:

- 1) Planee su excavación.
- 2) Llame antes de escarbar.
- 3) Marcar el área de excavación en color blanco.
- 4) Determine la ubicación de cualquiera de las instalaciones existentes bajo tierra.
- 5) Llame al centro de "una llamada" si alguna de las instalaciones no está marcada para determinar si es "seguro proseguir."
- 6) Conserve la ubicación de las líneas marcadas o proporcione la distancia/desvío.
- 7) Avise de cualquier conflicto y manténgase al menos 18 pulgadas al margen y de la orilla de algún artefacto mecánico para escarbar.
- 8) Apoye/conservar las instalaciones bajo tierra según sea necesario cuando este excavando.
- 9) Rellene con cuidado.
- 10) Avise a los dueños de las instalaciones y marque el 811 inmediatamente para reportar cualquier daño.
- 11) Las peticiones estándar (ticket) son válidas 15 días hábiles solamente.

#### Qué pasa cuando usted llama:

Una vez que usted proporcione la información necesaria, la operadora de "una llamada" le confirmará acerca de los detalles pertinentes. Es su responsabilidad asegurarse de que la información sea registrada adecuadamente en el documento de la petición. A sí mismo, mande por fax o por Internet su petición, se le mandará una confirmación, y es su responsabilidad corroborar de inmediato que la información es correcta.

Angourie Rice didn't have to think too long before signing onto "The Last Thing He Told Me," the Apple TV+ thriller miniseries produced by the same company behind such awards-season darlings as "The Morning Show," "Little Fires Everywhere" and "Big Little Lies."

And it also helped that she loved the script and that it was pitched to her as a mother/daughter love story. But it certainly doesn't start out that way.

In the series, which began streaming its seven episodes Friday, April 14, Rice stars as Bailey, a San Francisco-area teen whose life is suddenly thrown into disarray when her father Owen (Nikolaj Coster-Waldau) disappears amid mysterious circumstances at his office.

In the ensuing confusion, she's forced to team up with her stepmother Hannah (Jennifer Garner), with whom she has a contentious relationship, to figure out what happened.

"I really love that mother/daughter arc," the Australian actress says, "and I was so intrigued by this woman who doesn't know how to be a mother and a girl who doesn't know how to have a mother and they have to come to-

gether and figure out how to tolerate each other. And I really wanted to build that arc with Jen."

Indeed, Rice says working out the relationship with Garner was fun and that their friendly off-camera relationship actually it made it easier to portray a not-so-friendly one on it.

"To find that friction in the relationship was really fun to explore, but also kind of sad," Rice explains. "Like afterwards, we would be like, 'Oh no, I'm so sorry I'm so mean.' But I think if you really get along with your scene partner, it gives you so much more freedom to be nasty and have those like contentious moments rather than if you actually felt that way towards your scene partner. So to have that freedom because we got along so well was so nice."

## Youth orchestra gets big boost from symphony members

Even though Larry and Kathy Hill moved to the Houston area earlier this year to be nearer their grandchildren, they continue to support music and musicians in Las Cruces in a big way.

Kathy plays viola in the Las Cruces Symphony Orchestra (LCSO); Larry is a member of the symphony association's board of directors; and both are heavily involved in LCSO's formation of a youth orchestra.

In fact, Kathy Hill recently donated about \$20,000 worth of string instruments – violas, violins and cellos – to the orchestra, which will find their way into the hands of young Las Cruces musicians.

With support from the Hills, LCSO Director Ming Luke, Las Cruces Public Schools Fine Arts Content Specialist Joseph Flores and middle and high school music teachers and others, the youth sym-

phony will perform with LCSO this May, and will have its first solo concert this fall, the Hills said.

The LCSO Youth Orchestra, with full strings, wind, brass and percussion, will include 60-75 students from Las Cruces high schools under the direction of Jorge Martinez-Rios, an associate professor of music at New Mexico State University, where LCSO makes its home. A similar youth orchestra for middle school students is expected to come to fruition within a year.

"The program's moving," Larry Hill said.

"We're really excited," Kathy Hill said.

The youth orchestra has "a big role to play" in the health of music programs at Las Cruces middle and

high schools," Larry said. "Augmenting school programs is so important," he said.

A youth orchestra is "an important part of any professional orchestra" and its efforts to "herald this new generation of music" and young musicians, Luke said.

"I've been working with youth orchestras my entire career," Luke said. "It's essential for every community to have a good, citywide, regional youth orchestra."

Helping form the Las Cruces youth orchestra "is something that is very close to their hearts," Luke said of the Hills. "They are such big advocates for music education in the region."

In fact, Luke said, Larry Hill was one of the first

people he met in Las Cruces when he became LCSO director in 2021.

"He took me to Lescombes Winery and bought me a bottle of green chile wine," Luke said. "He's a very special person."

LCSO has "a very engaged board of directors and a lot of exciting ideas," including the youth orchestra, Larry said. "The future is really bright and Ming is a huge part of it. Ming will take the orchestra to the next level."

The Hills have a long history of playing, teaching and sharing music in Las Cruces and elsewhere.

Kathy was orchestra director at Mayfield High School for 13 years, taught music at Zia Middle

Larry, a trumpet player, teaches a weekly trumpet class at Chaparral High School in the Gadsden Independent School District via Zoom.

The nonprofits they started, the Brass Factory and the String Factory, "promote artistic excellence through education, mentorship and performance," and help remove barriers that keep kids from learning through music, including the cost of instruments and private lessons.

Continuing that work by starting the youth orchestra "has so many benefits," Larry Hill said. Students "learn differently; they listen differently; they experience their academics in a completely different way when they're in music," he said.

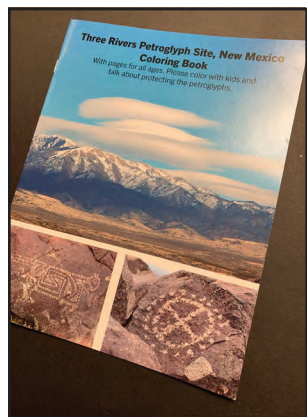

## CORROSION SURVEYOR: Maintaining natural gas lines

When it comes to installing and maintaining gas lines in the long term, there are many considerations, one of which is corrosion. That's why Las Cruces Utilities (LCU) has a team of Corrosion Surveyors on the job every day checking the City of Las Cruces' (City's) natural gas lines for corrosion.

This team of three Corrosion Technicians continually maintains and monitors natural gas lines for any damage or corrosion. The city is divided into three sections. Each corrosion technician is assigned to one of the sections. About 90% of the natural gas line system is below ground throughout the entire city.

To detect issues with the gas lines, our team inspects coating on the gas lines as well as Cathodic Protection current readings that will tell the technician

the level of corrosion that is occurring in the pipe, if any. The corrosion technicians check test boxes that are designed to monitor corrosion on the natural gas line below, pictured in this article. Each area is electrically isolated throughout the city and broken down into smaller areas. This makes it easier to troubleshoot and gives the technicians a location of where trouble may be happening and an idea of what is going on with the natural gas system.

"The City's Gas System has isolation test boxes at different locations to isolate one area from another steel natural gas line to electrically keep it away from the rest of the system," LCU Corrosion Technician Stephan Klingelmeier stated. "As we are surveying our designated areas, we then go to each house and take readings off every steel riser to make sure

the Cathodic Protection corresponds with what we put on at the steel main. This way we make sure each house is safe," Klingelmeier concluded.

If any work is needed from the previous year, it must be completed before we begin a new cycle of checking the system. These check cycles are performed every year. If a problem is found we have up to 15 months to complete the repair. LCU's corrosion technicians are also called every time a contractor exposes a steel natural gas line. This could happen when contractors are

updating cable and fiber systems, building new housing developments, and with any new construction that involves digging. Even residential projects performed by homeowners can expose gas lines.

"Any time we get a chance to inspect our exposed gas system we check to ensure that the coating is in good condition to protect the steel gas lines, especially high-pressure natural gas lines," Klingelmeier pointed out.

LCU puts the safety of Las Cruces first by constantly monitoring and updating our natural gas systems. Corrosion Technicians and Leak Surveyors technicians, work with each other to ensure that our LCU Natural Gas customers are safe and receive a reliable product. Help us keep the community safe, call 811 BEFORE you dig, it's a free service and locators will be dispatched to mark the lines to prevent damage.

in the New Mexico State University Music Building, 1075 N. Horseshoe St. on campus, the orchestra said in a news release.

In its fifth year of programming, CDS will bring back its largest configuration, a 16-piece string orchestra, for the first time since February 2022 when the ensemble received an award from the National Endowment for the Arts to perform music by Baroque women composers, CDS said.

CDS will open the concert with "Italian Serenade for Strings" by Hugo Wolf.

"I am very excited to have the opportunity to perform this little gem of a late Romantic work by Hugo Wolf, CDS Artistic

Director Daniel Vega-Albela said.

"The piece is so full of joie de vivre, so bright and infectiously hopeful that it has become one of the most popular staples of the string quartet and string orchestra repertoire."

The program also includes the local premiere of "Tenebrae," by Osvaldo Golijov. With a title that is Latin for "darkness," the Argentinian born Jewish composer conceived this piece as a meditation on the dichotomy of the beauty of Earth as seen from

outer space and the pain and suffering contained within it as we approach its surface, the news release said.

Third in the program is a song cycle by Dominic Dousa, Ph.D., an El Paso composer and professor of music theory and composition at UTEP.

"Through the Refining Fire" is "a musical setting of works from the 1920s by three African American poets," Dousa said.

"The set opens with a selection from 'I Must Share That Rung With You' by El Paso poet Bernice Love Wiggins. The poem's text is a buoyant and optimistic exhortation for those in the African-American

community to rise up and share their rightful place in society."

The other poems in Dousa's piece were composed by literary figures closely associated with the Harlem Renaissance, CDS said. The vocal part of Dousa's piece will be performed by tenor John Carlo Pierce.

Pierce "enjoys an international reputation for beautiful sound and incisive acting," CDS said.

"As an operatic tenor, he held contracted positions with the opera theaters in the German cities of Cologne and Mainz and has appeared on stages and concert platforms in North and South America, China, and across Western Eu-

rope."

To close the program, CDS will invite NMSU and El Paso Community College music students and high school students from the Las Cruces Symphony Youth Orchestra and El Paso Symphony Youth Orchestra to join them for a performance of Edvard Grieg's "Holberg Suite."

"I hope this will be the first of many more collaborations of this type," Vega-Albela said.

"As a professional training ensemble, this effort is very much in line with our mission within the musical community of Las Cruces and El Paso."

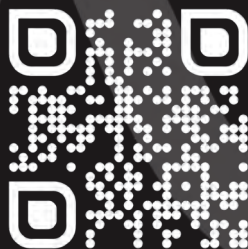

At its March 20 regular meeting, the Las Cruces City Council approved a three-year pre-development agreement with Sierra Norte Land Holdings, LLC of Las Cruces for the development, design and pursuit of federal funding for the Mesa Grande Drive Project.

Under the agreement, Sierra Norte will perform all services required at its sole expense, the city said, will be responsible for planning, preliminary design, engineering and other project-related activities and will secure necessary rights-of-way. The city will act as the applicant for federal grants and will prioritize the project for future federal funding.

At the meeting, the city council also adopted a resolution that designates the El Paseo and south Solano and west Picacho areas of the city as metropolitan redevelopment areas (MRAs).

## NM State athletics notes

### BULLETIN REPORT

#### Baseball:

NM State hosts Stephen F. Austin in a trio of weekend WAC games Friday through Sunday, April 14-16, at Presley Askew Field. Both the Friday and Saturday games have 6 p.m. starts, and Sunday is a noon game.

Following that, the Aggies will host the University of New Mexico in a midweek non-conference game 6 p.m. Tuesday, April 18, at Presley Askew Field.

The Aggies are 6-22 overall and 4-11 in conference after losing 14-2 against the University of Arizona April 11 in Tucson.

Prior to the Arizona game, NM State won one of three games April 6-8 at home against Cal Baptist. A five-run outburst in the eighth inning fueled the Aggies to a 13-17 victory April 8.

**Softball:** NM State lost to UTEP 7-4 Tuesday, April 11, in El Paso. That followed a weekend with the Aggies winning two games at home against Western Athletic Conference opponent Sam Houston April 7 and 8. NMSU swept a doubleheader against Sam Houston Friday, April 7, winning 9-6 and 10-8, but fell in the April 8 series finale 7-4.

After the UTEP game, NMSU is 17-17 overall and 6-6. The Aggies are on the road April 14-15 against WAC foe Tarleton.

# Golf a trial by ordeal? Sometimes it's exactly that

Trial by ordeal was an ancient judicial practice by which the guilt or innocence of the accused was determined by subjecting them to a painful, dangerous or at least unpleasant experience.

It is uncertain when the practice began, but it spanned many cultures and to many forms, from boiling oil and poison, to hot and cold water. Especially in medieval Europe, it was recorded in "witch hunts" and sometimes considered "a judgment of God," based on the premise God would help save the innocent by performing a miracle. In this case I'm using "trial by ordeal" as a metaphor for the torment and agony and the painful experience involved with the trials of

golf, and perhaps the test of our patience as golfers.

Some non-golfers would rather not put themselves through the "ordeal" of even trying to learn golf, since they figure it's way too hard and time-consuming. Some avid golfers wonder why they put themselves through such and ordeal every week; and then they make a miraculous birdie and go out the next week to play and torment themselves again. In some golfing situations the trial and ordeal we are going through seems all too real.

Let's take finding your golf ball in a deep sand bunker, which requires an expert golfer to loft

that ball out and on to the green. Instead, you take five maddening strokes

to extract your ball, thereby ruining an otherwise decent round.

There's a reason the Scots named one sand trap at St. Andrews the "hell bunker." Then there's the horror of hitting

four or five putts to get the ball in the cup, while struggling with the anguish of the yips.

And, yes, golf's torment includes the "s" word – the dreaded shank. That affliction, truly a trial by ordeal, may come and go indefinitely.

Other golfers experience ordeals, not by playing, but by accidents and

mishaps. Accidents on the course account for more than 40,000 serious injuries (requiring ER visits) or deaths annually in the U.S.; that doesn't include strokes or heart attacks. Five years ago a close friend of mine got bit by a rattlesnake as he stepped off the cart path toward his ball at one of our local golf courses. It was very serious, requiring 14 vials of anti-venin; the hospital only had 15 on hand. Twelve years ago, playing on my home course, I hit my drive on the 13th hole, picked up my tee, and was immediately flattened to the ground having been hit by a driver swung by a member of our group practicing his swing right next to the tee. It was painful and bloody, and I

needed 12 stitches above the eye, but thankfully, no eye damage. Ordeals can happen anytime and anywhere.

Waiting for slow golfers is an ordeal of a different sort. Slow golfers often play inappropriately long tees, and then waste time looking for their mis-hit balls. Then you are forced to watch as they slowly take five practice swings, go back to their bag to change clubs, slowly walk back to their cart, slowly clean their club, slowly put the head cover on, slowly get into the cart, chat with their passenger and then slowly drive off. And then waiting for four or five players on the green to decide who's away, and only decide to size up the putt when it's

their turn, and agonize over an 18-inch putt, and slowly walk off the green.

If anyone has tuned in to an LIV golf tour 54-hole tournament you know it's an ordeal just listening to the ear-splitting rappers blaring through giant speakers before LIV players tee off. The LIV people even have a dumb-down slogan that goes "Pro golf but louder."

Finally, it may not constitute an ordeal but it sure is very annoying, hearing some overserved cretin yell "get in the hole" on almost every hole on TV. That thankfully doesn't happen at the Masters.
