La Viña celebrates 30 years with Spring Wine Festival

La Viña Winery will host its annual Spring Wine Festival Saturday and Sunday, April 29-30. With an emphasis on local, the festival will not only feature wine, but local food vendors and musicians.

La Viña Winery, 4201 NM-28, Anthony, New Mexico, is the oldest winery in the state, founded in Chamberino, in 1977 by a professor at the University of Texas-El Paso. That fall, the first wine festival was held. Ken Stark, current owner and operator, purchased the winery from its second owner in 1993. The spring of that year, Stark debuted the Spring Wine Festival.

"Everything is local, including the bands. It's like going to a park where it's legal to buy wine," Stark said.

In approaching the entrance of the wine festival, patrons park on the nine acres of the winery's pecan trees. Then the walkway

leading to the entrance takes you past the vineyard of 25 varieties of grapes.

Both days of the festival will have live music. On Saturday, the performers are LongLife 16 (noon), Twisted Hams (2:15 p.m.) and Hypnosis (4:30 p.m.). On Sunday, Jim Murphy Trio (noon), Frank Zona & Urban Edge (2:15 p.m.) and Jessica Flores (4:30 p.m.) will delight the crowds. Also on hand are 70 arts, crafts and food vendors, two acres of trees and grass to lounge on and a play area for children that includes inflatables and rock climbing.

With two annual wine festivals, guests have a unique opportunity to try red and white wines exclusive to the winery on the 25-acre property.

Twenty-plus wines are available to sample and purchase by the glass or bottle. Stark said La Viña Winery is a small business and dependent on volunteers for their knowledge of and passion for the product. His volunteers

return year after year and Stark believes the relationship with the volunteers provides an important experience for wine lovers.

Visitors to La Viña Winery have many photo opportunities around the grounds. Flowers will be in bloom on the arch that leads you into the patio. Once inside, art displays adorn the rock walls and a water fountain babbles for a relaxing and scenic setting.

Stark looks forward to presenting new wines each festival. He said in the spring, white wines such as La Pinta, a sparkling blend of White Zinfandel and Black Muscat, have been bottled and are ready to be discovered.

"The whole idea of a festival is to make it possible for people to try wine. If they like wine, you'll find the quality of wine made here in New Mexico is equivalent to California," Stark said.

Water restrictions set; May Water Awareness Month

City of Las Cruces spring/summer outdoor watering restrictions begin April 1 in the city.

The annual restrictions prohibit the watering of outside vegetation 10 a.m.-6 p.m. every day, the city said in a news release.

The watering schedule allows city residents with even-

numbered addresses to water outside vegetation every Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday. Residents with odd-numbered addresses are allowed to water on Wednesdays, Fridays and Sundays.

No watering is allowed on Mondays.

The Las Cruces Utilities Water Conservation Program has a 24-hour recorded voice-

mail hotline at 575-528-4444 to report water waste that includes watering on the wrong day or time, water leaving the property or ponding on the property, and not using a bucket and shut-off nozzle to wash vehicles or pavement.

Callers should include the day and time of their call and the address of the alleged violation.

Civil suit describes multiple incidents of hazing

A civil lawsuit filed in the state's Third Judicial Court in Doña Ana County April 19, regarding alleged hazing on the New Mexico State University men's basketball team in 2022-23, paints a picture of chaos in the program beginning not long after head coach Greg Heiar's hiring March 27, 2022.

Plaintiffs' assertions allege hazing began in the summer of 2022 and continued to escalate through 2023, reaching a point Feb. 10 when one player filed a report with the NMSU police. Heiar was fired by NMSU a few days later, and the season was suspended.

According to the lawsuit, that player was William

"Deuce" Benjamin, who along with Aggie teammate Shakiru Odenewu, and Benjamin's father, William Sr., are plaintiffs in the case, which cites five counts against NMSU players, coaches and the NMSU Board of Regents. The Board of Regents is considered a "body corporate," and is essentially an umbrella term covering the entire university. Specific coaches named are Heiar and his associate head coach, Dominique Taylor. Specific players named were Deshawndre Washington, Doctor Bradley and Kim Aiken Jr.

The counts include negligence brought pursuant to the Tort Claims Act; sexual assault, battery and false imprisonment; and violation of New Mexico

Civil Rights Act.

NMSU, through its spokesman Justin Banister, associate vice president, said this: "While NMSU does not comment on pending litigation, we want to assure everyone that this issue is being taken seriously. As we announced earlier this year, the university is working with Greenberg Traurig to look into these allegations. Their work is underway and running in parallel to our own internal investigation into this matter."

As of yet, no criminal charges have been filed.

One scene described in the civil suit characterizes a hazing incident as an "attack" and, when compared to other allegations in the suit, is consistent with a pattern of the behaviors

among the team.

The scene, as described, took place Nov. 12, 2022, when the NMSU men's basketball team was on the bus for a trip to El Paso to play traditional rival UTEP. The lawsuit doesn't say if the alleged incident was on the trip to El Paso or on the way back, but the Aggies lost that game 67-64.

According to the civil suit, Aggie reserve player Shakiru (Shak) Odenewu was tackled by Washington, Bradley, and Aiken Jr. onto the floor in the back of the bus. The suit states the three pinned him

down, pulled his pants and underwear down to his ankles, held him face down and had his mouth muzzled by one of the three. The suit describes slapping of the buttocks and squeezing of the scrotum, and states the only response from coaches at the front of the bus was when one turned around and yelled, "Stop playing around."

A week later, Nov. 19, when the Aggies were in Albuquerque to play the University of New Mexico, an early morning fatal shooting took place involving NMSU player Mike

Peake, who was also shot.

The suit says the hazing treatment continued consistently in the weeks after the shooting, occurring a number of times in the locker room, with Odenewu and Deuce Benjamin the frequent targets. It also described an incident where Benjamin was harassed in a hotel room during a road trip, in front of women other players had brought in the room.

Benjamin has left the team to enter the transfer portal. NMSU hired Jason Hooten as the new men's basketball coach in March.

Collecting curious collections

Memory is a funny thing. Bulletin reporter Mike Cook has a small, intriguing story in the Business section this week about some collectible Hummel figurines for sale at the Emporium store downtown.

The photo of some of the porcelain child figurines sent my brain zooming back to 10-year-old me at my grandmother Boonie's house in Fort Worth, where she had a curio cabinet with a handful of Hummels. As a little kid, their little faces creeped me out.

Until Mike's story, though, I didn't know the backstory.

They are based on the drawings of a German Franciscan sister, Maria Innocentia Hummel, who lived a short life (1909-46).

During World War II, the Nazis seized her convent but, for some reason, allowed her to continue her art, which provided a primary income source for the sisters during the Nazi occupation.

That Nazi tie-in makes me even more creeped out.

But the whole thing got me to thinking about what people collect, and why.

I recently visited Edgar Digital on Montana Avenue near Solano Drive. I was needing some 5-volt DC adaptors and figured they might have some. "Oh, we've got lots of 'em," is the response I got when I called.

If you've never been there before, it feels like a combination

between an electronics museum and the junk drawer in your grandfather's garage. Only it's a building full of stuff that could fill both your grandfathers' garages put together.

Austin's Jewelry has a fascinating collection of items in its ring museum. I highly recommend a visit.

One of the coolest collections is no longer available for the public to see, but when the restaurant on Valley Drive near Avenida de Mesilla was Old Town Café (now it's called Lucy's), there were a half dozen or more old, worn cowboy hats on the wall above the cash register.

The hats belonged to longtime regular customers who had since gone on to the great cattle ranch in the sky. Even though I never knew any of the hats' owners,

seeing them in there always made me feel a little better.

There's an old saying, "One man's trash is another man's treasure." And that sure holds true with collectibles.

While I don't really want to be within 100 yards of one of those Hummels, there are many who cherish them and would pay good money for them.

For example, I collect embroidered patches from trips, travels and other experiences. And then I pay good money to The Leather Company of Las Cruces or Lita Castillo at Sew Much More to sew those patches on one of my beat-up vintage canvas travel bags.

When collections become hobbies, they become part of our lives, and that's a good thing. No matter how creepy it is.

Moccia leads Aggies to brighter future

The timing may seem odd, given the recent turmoil in the men's basketball program, but New Mexico State University was wise to give Athletic Director Mario Moccia a five-year contract extension.

The move brings stability to the department as the university is in the process of replacing its current leader. Moccia's previous contract was set to expire next summer. His top priority now must be to restore a men's basketball program that had clearly spun out of control.

When Moccia was hired in 2015, NMSU was still dealing with the consequences of its disastrous move to the Western Athletic Conference in 2005. The conference dropped football in 2012, leaving the Aggies to fend for themselves as one of only a handful of teams trying to survive in the top division as an independent.

Former Athletic Director McKinley Boston was able to rely on a lifetime of contacts to stitch together schedules that relied on so-called "money games" in which lesser teams get paid to take a beating at the hands of elite teams like Georgia and Alabama. Boston was the first to acknowledge that model wasn't sustainable.

Moccia led the effort to find a conference home for the Aggies. And, next year they will join Conference USA. They go into the new conference with a football team that is coming off a bowl game victory and appears to be far more competitive now under coach Jerry Kill.

There's no denying the men's basketball program last season was a mess. First there was the fatal late-night shooting involv-

ing an NMSU player on the University of New Mexico campus. Then came allegations of sexual abuse masquerading as hazing in the locker room.

Two former players, Deuce Benjamin and Shakiru Odunewu, have filed a lawsuit against the university, administrators, coaches and players alleging sexual assault, battery and false imprisonment. (See article on Page 5.) Both players say they reported the incident to coaches, but nothing was done.

It's hard not to feel bad for Benjamin, a hometown kid who watched from the stands as other hometown kids like Gordo Castillo and Johnny McCants made a name for themselves on the NMSU hardwood. That dream has been denied by the cruelty of those who called

themselves teammates.

New basketball coach Jason Hooten had no choice but to clean house and start over.

The past few years have been challenging. Along with the problem in men's basketball, NMSU had to deal with New Mexico's Covid-19 laws, the most restrictive in the nation. Moccia has guided the Aggies through all of that and into what appears to be a brighter future in a new conference.

Rebates slated for mid-June

The State of New Mexico will begin sending out the newest round of rebates in mid-June, "putting more than \$673 million back into the pockets of New Mexicans," Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham said in a news release.

The state Taxation and Revenue Department (TRD) will send rebates of \$500 to single filers and \$1,000 to married taxpayers filing jointly, heads of household and surviving spouses, the governor said. Any New Mexico resident who filed a 2021 New Mexico personal income tax return (PIT) and who was not declared as a dependent on another taxpayer's return will receive the rebates automatically. There is no application

to receive the rebates, the news release said.

Taxpayers who received a refund by direct deposit on their 2021 return will receive the rebate by direct deposit, the governor's office said. All others will receive a check in the mail. Direct deposits will be distributed first, and checks will be mailed over the following weeks, beginning in mid-June.

Eligible New Mexico residents have until May 31, 2024, to file a 2021 New Mexico PIT return and still qualify for the rebates.

Taxpayers who have moved to a different address since filing their 2021 return can update their addresses using the taxpayer access point self-service portal or by submitting Form RPD-

41260, PIT change of address, to the state Taxation and Revenue Department (TRD) as soon as possible. Taxpayers whose banking information has changed since they submitted their 2021 returns will receive the rebate by mail.

New Mexico residents who are not required to file income taxes because of their income level will have the option of applying for relief payments on a first-come, first-serve basis through the state Human Services Department, the governor's office said. Applications are not yet available, and a public announcement will be made before the application process opens. Funds are limited to a total of \$15 million as appropriated by the legislature.

At its April 11 work session, the Las Cruces Public Schools Board of Education selected the Austin-based JG Consulting firm to lead the search for the next district superintendent, LCPS said in a news release.

The board also named a committee of parents, students, administrators, staff and representatives from local business and government sectors to serve on a search advisory board.

The primary responsibility of JG Consulting will be to serve as the main point of contact to the board for all matters related to the superintendent search, following a plan approved by the board in March, the school district said.

The firm will begin their work with the Superintendent Search Advisory Committee on two principal issues related to the search: the criteria desired in a new superintendent and to generate interview questions from the stakeholder perspective to be asked of the finalists in a

facilitated public forum, the news release said. A virtual introductory meeting was scheduled with other meetings to follow.

The board has made a target to select finalists by June 30, and make the final decision by Aug. 15.

An updated timeline for the search includes the following key dates:

- Tuesday, May 30: Pool of applicants to be screened.
- Friday, June 9: Board meets in executive session to identify semi-finalists
- Friday, June 30: Board narrows list to identify finalists.
- Friday, July 7: Finalists to be interviewed in a public forum.
- Monday, July 24: Board conducts interviews of finalists in closed session.
- Tuesday, Aug. 1: Board evaluates data in consideration of the final candidate selection.
- Tuesday, Aug. 15: Board to make final superintendent selection at its regular

The board has also appointed Patrick Nolan to serve as the district one representative on the board, replacing Ray Jaramillo, who resigned in March.

In a ranked-choice vote, Nolan was selected over applicants Steven Foldy, Vivian Fietze, Joseph Sousa and David Tofsted, LCPS said in a news release.

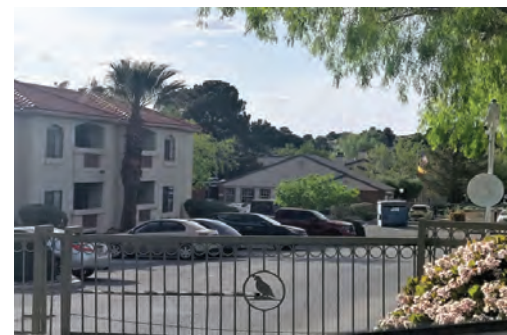
In his interview with the board, Nolan said his passion was “building relationships, and building things that have positive impacts on people.” In his closing comments, Nolan said his service on the board will be focused on “finding balance through thoughtful leadership.”

Nolan currently serves as the executive director of the Friends of Organ Mountains-Desert Peaks nonprofit. He has also worked as a union representative with the American Federation of Teachers New Mexico, LCPS said.

Commercial Recycling Works for Apartments



Quail Ridge Apartments is an example of an apartment community that supports local recycling for its residents.

If you own or manage an apartment complex, and want to save on the waste bill and do something good for the environment, consider applying for a South Central Solid Waste Authority commercial recycling container for your complex.

SCSWA considers apartment recycling as a commercial service for the complex and property owner, which operates slightly differently than curbside recycling for single-family homes. However, it can be a smart business decision when it comes to leaving space in trash containers.

“Cardboard boxes from residents in an apartment complex really fill up the commercial trash bin. With a recycling container, they can cut down on the air in their trash and allow residents to contribute to the local recycling community,” said Daniel Ortega, SCSWA recycling operations foreman.

“Cardboard is like a sponge. Even if you compress it in

the trash, it can pop up and create wasted space.”

“When a customer reaches out, I usually go for a site visit and check the location they are considering for their recycling container,” said Ortega. “It has to be free of obstructions like parked cars or trees; it must be located where the trucks can safely provide service.”

SCSWA containers must also remain in the same location they were delivered; however, due to the ebb and flow of traffic and unforeseen circumstances, SCSWA cannot guarantee the same time of pick-up each day. Pick-up for recycling is at least once a week, but can be more depending on need. Accepted materials includes corrugated

cardboard (which must be flattened to fit through the container’s slot), office copier paper, plastic bottles #1 and #2, and aluminum, steel, or tin cans.

And if you are a resident in an apartment complex without a recycling container, reach out to your apartment manager to see whether or not that might be an option for your complex.

“If a resident would like this opportunity for their apartment, their apartment manager may have more information about the options for their complex,” said Ortega. Property managers can find the application online at: <https://www.scswa.net/160/Commercial-Recycling-Rates>

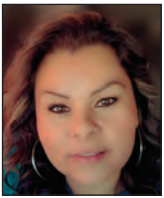

NMSU receives \$10.5 million for online

New Mexico State University's Global Campus will receive a \$10.5 million legislative appropriation to continue the development of its innovative fully online programs.

The funding will support the expansion of NMSU Global Campus' degree programs, non-credit microlearning courses and skill-based workforce development initiatives.

"We are grateful to the legislature for recognizing the importance of creating inclusive and accessible education regardless of geographic location, and for their continued support of NMSU Global," said NMSU interim Chancellor Jay Gogue. "This funding will allow us to continue to grow and scale our competitive programs and initiatives that meet the evolving needs of our students and our state, while providing flexible, high-quality education to learners around the world."

Global Campus has seen a significant

increase in enrollment in the last two years, in large part due to the New Mexico Opportunity Scholarship (OS). The scholarship has provided funding to undergraduate students who might not have otherwise been able to afford college and has helped to create a more diverse and inclusive student body. That paired with the flexibility of earning a degree while working is the perfect match for adult learners and for those who have some college credit and are trying to complete their degrees while working and supporting their families.

OS "has been instrumental in increasing enrollment at NMSU Global Campus," said Sherry Kollmann, NMSU associate vice chancellor of digital learning.

The year 2023 is a big one for the Boys & Girls Club of Las Cruces.

The year marks the 60th anniversary for the club that opened in Las Cruces in 1963.

The year marks the 15th anniversary of the Lou & Mary Henson Breakfast, which has become the most important fundraiser for the club, and which has brought numerous

big names in the world of sports as well as the world of Boys & Girls Clubs.

The year marks the 10th anniversary of Ashley Echavarria's hiring as the Las Cruces club's chief executive officer, a role she took on at age 26.

The year also marks the official announcement of the club's coming new home and location.

At the club's 2023 Lou & Mary Henson Breakfast April 20, which featured former NBA player Anthony "Spud" Webb, Echavarria announced the club will be renovating, then moving into, the old Allen Theatres' Video 4 building on El Paseo Road.

"We are finally able to make this longtime dream of a new building a reality," Echavarria said. "This project is huge. But our kids deserve this. The world has changed and we need to change, too. It doesn't stop at home, and it doesn't stop at school. It takes all of us."

Mary Henson, widow of longtime New Mexico

State University basketball coach Lou Henson, spoke to the audience and talked about this year's special guest, Webb, noted for winning the 1986 NBA Slam Dunk Contest, despite standing just 5-foot-6.

"Coach Henson didn't care how big the players were," Mary Henson said. "He just cared about how big their hearts were."

Another little guy at the event was Alex Saenz, a current Las Cruces club member who was named Member of the Year for both Las Cruces and the entire state of New Mexico.

Saenz spoke of his family's struggles with homelessness, and said, "The Boys & Girls Club was always there for me."

As a youngster growing up in Dallas, Texas, Webb said the Boys Club was there for him as well.

Webb mentioned the man who convinced him to join the club.

"My mentor at the Boys Club took me off the streets," Webb said. "A lot of my other buddies be-

came statistics."

He described the dilapidated conditions of some of the Dallas Boys & Girls clubs, comparable to the outdated current Las Cruces club, which has been in the same building since 1963, a building much older than that.

"When I get to the NBA," he said he told himself, "I'm going to turn that around." He said he has helped raise more than \$1 million for Boys & Girls Clubs since.

Interviewed on the stage at the New Mexico Farm & Ranch Heritage Museum by NMSU broadcaster Adam Young, Webb talked about being recruited by North Carolina State University coach Jim Valvano, whose Wolfpack had just won the 1983 NCAA national championship.

Webb's Midland (Texas) College team had won the junior college national championship the year before, but standing in the airport, at 5-6, he didn't look like the kind of player who could help a Division I

powerhouse.

Upon seeing Webb, Valvano reportedly turned to the assistant coach who'd recruited him and said, "If that's Spud Webb, you're fired."

But Valvano indeed brought Webb to NC State and treated the young Texan "like I was his son," Webb said.

After two years at NC State, Webb was drafted by the NBA Detroit Pistons, but was cut. He was soon picked up by the Atlanta Hawks, where he would

wind up playing seven of his 13 NBA seasons. With the Hawks, he played with such names as Hall of Famer Dominique Wilkins, Tree Rollins, Doc Rivers, Antoine Carr and Cliff Levingston.

"I saw all these guys, and wondered what I could do," Webb said. "I realized I could pass them the ball. They all wanted to shoot the ball, so they needed someone to pass it. Dominique would think he was open if he was in a phone booth."

Anyone with an interest in guinea pigs and/or rabbits is welcome to exhibit in the

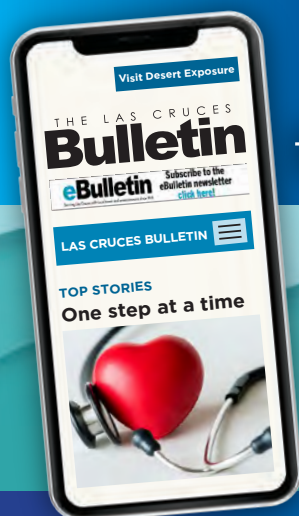

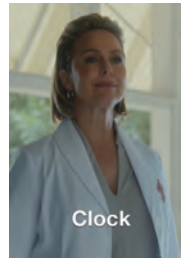

RECERTIFICATION COURSES: Las Cruces Utilities works hard to keep skills sharp.

How often do you have to recertify your skills for your job? If you are a Las Cruces Utilities (LCU) Natural Gas and Energy team member, the answer is annually.

Safety is the number one priority for LCU. They strive to not only provide a safe work environment for their team, but to also create a safe environment for the Las Cruces community.

"In total we have identified 65 tasks - everything a team member would do on the natural gas pipeline system," LCU Gas Training Safety Coordinator Jeff Griffith pointed out. On an annual basis, team members are put through Knowledge, Skills, and Assessments, or KSAs, also known as Operator Qualifications or OQ. The assessments include a hands-on procedure, written test, and verbal test. In each test, they are assigned

a task and must follow the proper procedures to complete the task safely. Each test must be completed and scored with a 100% to pass.

"The most tasks that a single individual may have could be up to 35 tasks and all the way down to 6 tasks," Griffith stated. The majority of the tasks require a three-year qualification, but there are also annual qualifications, and six-month qualifications. Each qualification is based on the type of natural gas pipeline associated with the task. If the task deals with a plastic pipeline, the requalification is annual. If the task involves working on a steel pipeline with welding, the qualification is every six months.

Some of these positions included in the trainings are locators, regulators, leak surveyors, corrosion technicians, construction

maintenance, and contractors. There are five tasks that everyone on the LCU Natural Gas team must do. With a focus on excavation and safe digging courses, part of these five tasks include Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and first aid training. Each LCU Natural Gas worker must also be certified to go out in the field.

In addition, there are also 10 Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) certifications that focus on job-related safety and health hazards.

Some team members are required to get OSHA 30 certification, which focus on industry-specific training and is usually for supervisors and team members with safety responsibility. Others go through Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA) training to be able to wear the SCBA masks when needed.

LCU continues to grow their nationally award-winning safety programs. Part of these certifications and trainings also include an annual "surprise" training for new LCU Natural Gas and Energy team members, where LCU partners with the City's Fire Department to do two "mock strike" scenarios. "All training and certifications identified are not only for the safety of our workers, but also for the safety of the community while we are out working in the field," Griffith concluded.

of the stage for 575 as co-lead singer along with deMilliano, is originally from Albuquerque. He was a rodeo cowboy for 30 years. Kelly began playing guitar about eight years ago, he said. In addition to vocals, Kelly plays rhythm guitar for 575.

Kelly is “a pure country, ‘don’t ever change’ kind of guy that genuinely loves playing music,” he said.

Zambardi, a New Jersey na-

tive, played bass with country music star Sammy Kershaw and played in bands that opened for England Dan and John Ford Coley, Bonnie Raitt, Jackson Browne and Michael Martin Murphey. He has backed Eddie Raven and John Wesley Riles.

Guitarist Segreto grew up in Las Cruces and El Paso and has been playing guitar since age 13. He fondly remembers playing with a band in the Swiss Alps

while he was in the Navy. Segreto was a member of the band Kruceez in the 1980s and ‘90s. He is a two-time New Mexico Music Awards winner.

Gabaldon, the 575 percussionist, is Las Cruces born and raised. Like Zambardi and Segreto, he has performed in a number of bands over the years, including some well-known rock and country performers.

Band members had played shows together in various combinations and have found an audience since coming together as The 575 Band, the members said.

“We’re busy,” deMilliano said.

The group has already performed or has scheduled nearly three dozen shows in 2023, with more to come.

“Versatility is the key to that,” Zambardi said.

“We have fun,” Kelly said.

The wide range of musical styles performed by 575 is part of their popularity, the members said. Audiences recognize the songs they play and find many to dance to or sing along with. Band members also write and per-

form some of their own original music, Zambardi said.

When they are not performing, 575 members have day jobs that include property management (deMilliano), spirits and wine distribution (Kelly) and teaching at Chaparral High School in Chaparral, New Mexico (Gabaldon). Segreto and Zambardi are retired.

“After all the years of entertaining people, I still love being on stage and making people happy,” deMilliano said. “I really enjoy being involved with a group of people that have the same goals, and enjoy what we are doing. Look for big things from the 575 Band in the near future!”

for an account, and it will enable you to set up limits of use.

Are you kind to your drains?

Some critical materials should not be flushed down the toilet or dumped down the drain. Fats, oils, and grease (F.O.G.) might not be a problem when hot and liquified, but when they cool in the drain, they'll catch other items and clog. Medications should not go down the drain because they interfere in the wastewater

treatment process, and there is no such thing as a “flushable” wipe, regardless of what the marketing says. Those wipes clog your drains and LCU sewer lines.

Why are there different watering restrictions during the summer?

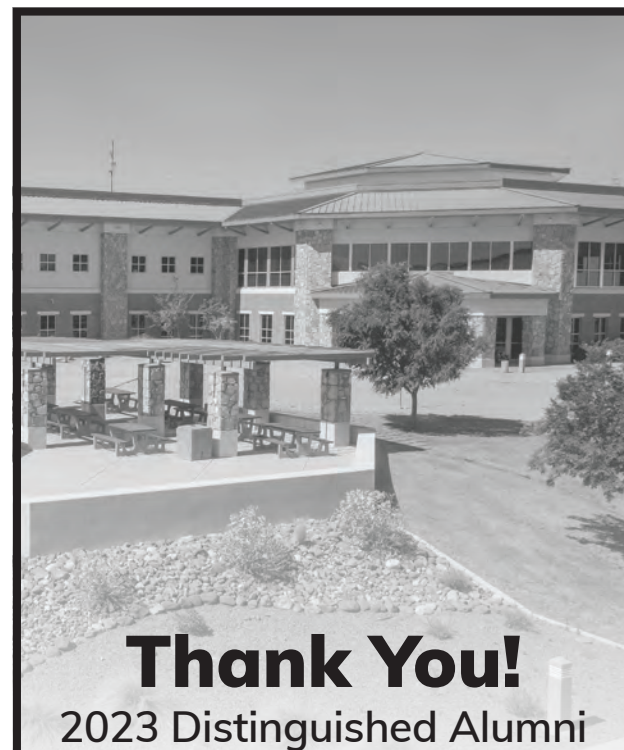
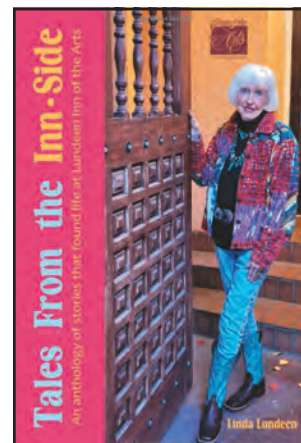

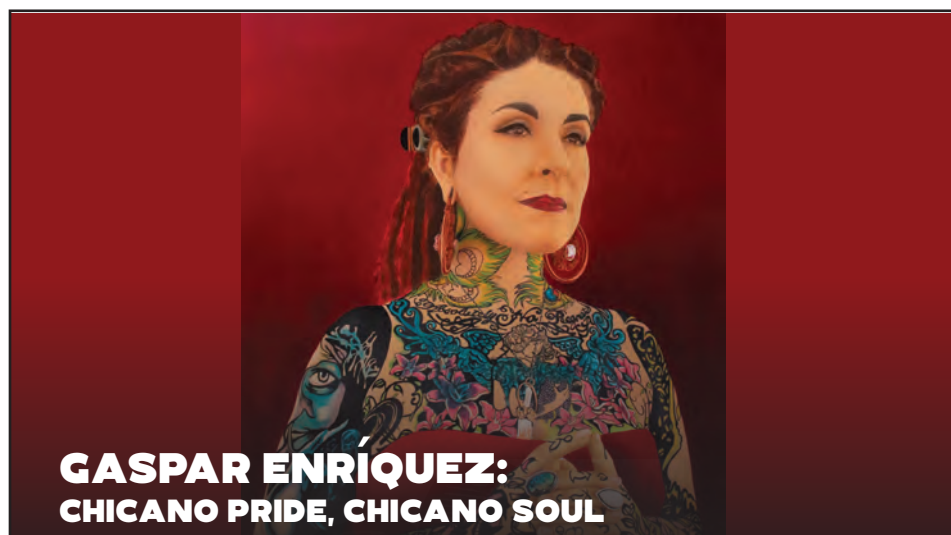
Shearer teaches graduate, undergraduate and honors students at NMSU and performs in concerts and presents master classes and lectures as a Yamaha performing artist.

Expanded film incentive 'a huge win for Las Cruces'

"It was a huge win for Las Cruces and Doña Ana County to double the 'rural uplift' film incentive to help us continue to grow film production here, and other emerging production centers in New Mexico," state Sen. Jeff Steinborn of Las Cruces said.

Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham signed House Bill 547, an omnibus tax bill that included the film tax credit increase, which "will continue to position our community and state as one of the best places to film in the world," said Steinborn, who worked with the New Mexico Film Office, Netflix, NBC, 828 Productions and film industry leaders to craft the

legislation.

"The rural uplift now puts Las Cruces at a base incentive of 35 percent, whereas

Albuquerque and Santa Fe are at 25 percent," said Las Cruces Film Liaison Jonathan Sepp. "This puts Las Cruces in an advantageous position to capture even more productions looking at New Mexico, as well as those looking around the country."

HB 547 "enacted updates gradually increase the annual cap on (film) industry tax credits from \$110 million to \$160 million in \$10 million annual incre-

ments over the next five fiscal years," the New Mexico Film Office said in a news re-

lease. "With the continued growth of productions in New Mexico, the increase is essential to prevent a backlog of rebates. These updates exempt resident principal performers from a \$5 million credit cap per production to further incentivize local casting for leading roles."

Also included in the bill is an increase to the above-the-line credit cap from \$5 million to \$15 million per production for New Mexico

film partners Netflix, NBCUniversal and 828 Productions, with a maximum total credit cap of \$40 million per fiscal year.

"This increase will allow New Mexico to capture larger and more lucrative productions and also bolster post-production work inside the state," the Film Office said.

In addition, HB 547 increases the rural uplift incentive from 5 percent to 10 percent while updating the zoning to at least 60 miles from the city hall of each county to align with other jurisdictions. In fiscal year 2022, rural areas outside Albuquerque and Santa Fe received \$50 million; enhancing this uplift will be a game changer for

communities statewide – including areas like Doña Ana County, McKinley County and the Mescalero Apache Reservation.

In fiscal year 2022, New Mexico hit a record-breaking high in production spend for the second consecutive year, recording \$855.4 million, a 36 percent increase over fiscal year 2021, the Film Office said. MovieMaker Magazine named Santa Fe, Albuquerque and Las Cruces as three of the "Best Places to Live and Work as a Movie-maker" in 2023.

The state recently announced the establishment of the New Mexico Media Academy (NMMA), led by the Economic Development Department in col-

laboration with the Higher Education Department and 15 film and media programs statewide. The academy will provide advanced training and expand the workforce. New Mexico film partners will also develop and provide apprenticeships. The headquarters of NMMA will be at the Albuquerque Rail Yards, and a satellite facility will be at the Creative Campus at the Arrowhead Center in Las Cruces.

The film industry has some 8,000 jobs throughout the state, the Film Office said. The median wage of a film worker in New Mexico is approximately \$32 an hour, compared to other New Mexico industries at \$18 an hour.

Hummels are porcelain figurines based on the drawings of Sister Maria Innocentia Hummel (1909-46), a German Franciscan sister and artist. When the Nazis seized her convent in Germany, she was allowed to continue her art, which generated the main source of income for the sisters there throughout the Nazi

occupation. Hummel died of tuberculosis at age 37. Franz Goebel, who owned a porcelain company, began making figurines based on Hummel's artwork in the 1930s, with interest increasing after the figurines were displayed at the 1935 Leipzig Trade Fair. Goebel discontinued distribution of Hummels in 2008.

Digging: Your Rights and Responsibilities

Know what's below. Call before you dig.

New Mexico excavation law places certain responsibilities with the excavator (a person using a mechanical digging device) for preventing damage to underground facilities. The law provides for a one-call system that the excavator can use free of charge to arrange to have underground facilities located and marked before an excavation occurs.

State Law Requires Excavators to:

- 1) Plan your excavation.
- 2) Mark the excavation area in white.
- 3) Call before you dig.
- 4) Determine the location of any underground facilities.
- 5) Call the one call center if any facility is not marked to determine if it is "clear."
- 6) Preserve line location markings or provide offsets.
- 7) Expose any conflicts and maintain at least 18 inches of clearance from the horizontal mark and the edge of the mechanical digging device.
- 8) Support underground facilities during excavation as necessary.
- 9) Backfill in a careful manner.
- 10) Notify facility owners and 811 of any damage immediately.
- 11) Standard locate tickets are valid for 15 working days.

What Happens When You Call:

Once you provide the necessary information, the one call operator will confirm all pertinent details. It is your responsibility to ensure the information was properly recorded on the request. Likewise, faxed or on-line requests will be returned to you as confirmation, and it is your responsibility to immediately confirm the information is correct.

La ley de excavación de Nuevo México impone ciertas responsabilidades al excavador (Es una persona que utilice un artefacto mecánico para escarbar) para prevenir daños en las instalaciones bajo tierra. La ley provee un sistema de "una llamada" que el excavador puede utilizar sin costo para hacer arreglos para que se localicen las instalaciones bajo tierra y que estas sean marcadas antes de que la excavación ocurra.

La ley requiere que los excavadores hagan lo siguiente:

- 1) Planeé su excavación.
- 2) Llame antes de escarbar.
- 3) Marcar el área de excavación en color blanco.
- 4) Determine la ubicación de cualquiera de las instalaciones existentes bajo tierra.
- 5) Llame al centro de "una llamada" si alguna de las instalaciones no está marcada para determinar si es "seguro proseguir."
- 6) Conserve la ubicación de las líneas marcadas o proporcione la distancia/desvío.
- 7) Avise de cualquier conflicto y manténgase al menos 18 pulgadas al margen y de la orilla de algún artefacto mecánico para escarbar.
- 8) Apoye/preserve las instalaciones bajo tierra según sea necesario cuando este excavando.
- 9) Rellene con cuidado.
- 10) Avise a los dueños de las instalaciones y marque el 811 inmediatamente para reportar cualquier daño.
- 11) Las peticiones estándar (ticket) son válidas 15 días hábiles solamente.

Qué pasa cuando usted llama:

Una vez que usted proporcione la información necesaria, la operadora de "una llamada" le confirmará acerca de los detalles pertinentes. Es su responsabilidad asegurarse de que la información sea registrada adecuadamente en el documento de la petición. A sí mismo, mande por fax o por Internet su petición, se le mandará una confirmación, y es su responsabilidad corroborar de inmediato que la información es correcta.

Which variety of sand wedge is best for you?

While I was working out at my gym recently, a golfing acquaintance approached with a question. "I was looking for a sand wedge on eBay," he said, "and most of the wedges listed the bounce along with the loft. I didn't know what that was."

I helped with a short answer.

First, let's delve into a little background about wedges. Some 95 years ago, late golfing legend Gene Sarazen felt a better way had to be found to extricate the golf ball from a sand bunker. So Sarazen invented a wedge that would not dig into the sand, but glance off the sand layer while the ball was resting on top of it in such a way that the propulsion of the sand itself would lift the ball in the air and out onto

the green. It was truly a brilliant stroke of genius.

The original invention had a bottom flange deeper and wider than the original sole of the club which allowed the club to bottom out in the sand when the face was open. The extended area of the flange on the lower part of the club sole – specifically, the metal that extends downward – is called the "bounce." Sand wedges can have 0 to 14 degrees of bounce. Nearly all of the top-of-the-line sand wedge manufacturers have the bounce stamped somewhere on the clubhead. And you can ask your pro or take it to a golf shop and they can measure it.

If you carry two or three

sand wedges (in addition to your pitching wedge) you will need to figure what

bounce to have with each one.

Short game guru Dave Pelz advises this: "Even if you own a perfect wedge swing, it's the bounce that ultimately determines how much each club will

react with the turf, sand and water, or whatever else your ball may be sitting in, through impact." He goes on to say, "the bounce on your wedges is just as important as the attack angle of your swing. The two combine to help you maintain speed through the ball or – gulp – dig into the ground and slow down." Pelz urges taking a few minutes to research

the bounce angle on each of the wedges we play. If you are typically playing off hard, partially wet, sand, Pelz suggests using a lower bounce club. Let's say you have both 56- and 60-degree clubs in your bag. The 60-degree wedge should have the lower bounce, leading you to use it from tight sand and also from very short sand shots where you need to loft the ball over a high bunker face. The bounce on your 60-, 62- or 64-degree lob wedges should be not more than 4 because you will often use them from tight grass lies where you need to flip the ball high in the air and expect it to land like a butterfly with sore feet. The flange on those clubs is relatively flat so you can slip the club under the ball, with some ac-

celeration, regardless of the lie, and spin it enough to stop it almost immediately. Higher bounce clubs are quite effective out of thick, fluffy sand, where the flange can prevent the club from digging in. "The important thing is to learn if the range of bounces in your wedge set is wide enough to tackle whatever the course throws at you. Regardless of the lofts you carry, make sure that your wedges offer a low-bounce, mid-bounce and high-bounce option," Pelz says.

America's hands-down master maker of sand wedges is Bob Vokey, who designs wedges with both his name and Titleist on them. Vokey is a leading example of a golf club artisan who has taken the bounce concept one step further. Vokey's more re-

cent wedges are stamped with "SM" which stands for "spin mill design." All of Vokey's current wedges are produced with six "grind" options. A Vokey grind is the "manipulation or removal of material from the sole of the club helping improve contact with the turf or the sand." It's an adjustment to the basic bounce of the sole itself. That provides more options for a player's swing and course conditions. For instance, an L grind is for sweepers of the ball off the ground; an L grind is more for sand. "Proper bounce and grind combination promotes optimum contact, control and ball spin," Vokey says.
