# Groups partner to help youngsters bicycle

“It’s pretty cool.”

That is what Daniel Lara, 14, said about the partnership between the nonprofit Velo Cruces’ Every Body Rides with Grace (EBRWG) and New Mexico State University Aggie Innovators, who are working together to create unique pedals for Daniel’s bicycle to make it easier for him to ride.

Aggie Innovators Veronica Gurrola and Jared Glaze, both NMSU students, have met with Daniel and his mother, Lianna, at The Hub Community Bike Shop, first measuring Daniel’s shoes and then trying various prototypes to come up with the best one-of-a-kind pedals for Daniel,

who uses a wheelchair, so he has the greatest possible safety and mobility when riding his bike.

In working with Daniel, Gurrola and Glaze have used a 3D printer to come up with prototypes that feature a unique toe cup but won’t trap Daniel’s feet. They work with Daniel at The Hub and then go back to the Aggie Innovation Space at the NMSU Engineering Complex to work on the pedals.

Gurrola, who is working on a masters in industrial engineering at NMSU and is about to begin an

internship in Knoxville, Tennessee, was also part of an Aggie Innovators project that created a prosthetic arm for a five-year-old, she said.

This is the first Aggie Innovators project that Glaze has worked on. He is a freshman majoring in mechanical engineering. Both Glaze and Gurrola are Las Cruces natives.

One of the joys of the project is “coming back and trying out (different prototypes) until we get it perfect,” Gurrola said. “We get to see the growth and be part of the prog-

ress.”

Working with Daniel to come up with the perfect pedals for his bike is “really challenging and fun,” said Glaze, adding that he likes to help people.

Having an engineering project focused on him “is pretty impressive,” said Daniel, who attends Organ Mountain High School. “It’s cool that they help people.”

“I appreciate the collaboration,” said Daniel’s mother, Lianna Lara. “The fact that so many

came together to volunteer their time and expertise is something that we greatly appreciate! It will afford Daniel an opportunity to ride a bike, get outdoors and exercise his legs! We are excited for him to experience a simple joy that we all typically get to experience.”

Daniel and his family requested an application with EBRWG for an adaptive cycle in May 2022, said Velo Cruces Board member Andrea Holguin.

“Since then, we have been working on finding a cycle and accessories for Daniel,” she said.

“After months of discussions with physical therapists, adaptive cycling companies and my fellow board members, I was still no closer to find-

ing a solution for Daniel,” Holguin said. “Our president, George Pearson, suggested talking to the engineering department at NMSU. I was happily surprised to find the Aggie Innovation Space.

“I am so impressed with these young engineers (Gurrola and Glaze),” Holguin said. “They are smart, professional and compassionate. It has been incredibly exciting to watch Daniel work with them to develop a pedal system that works well for him. They really are working together as a team.

“The most amazing part of all of this is that the Innovators are providing all of this at no cost to our program,” Holguin said. “This is a huge relief because the cost of adaptive cycles and accessories have doubled since Daniel ap-

plied for the program.” (The average cost of an adaptive cycle is \$2,000. Specialized pedal modifications would cost an additional \$400 or more.)

EBRWG adapts bikes for children with special needs. Velo Cruces formed in 2015 with a mission of “transforming Las Cruces into a great bicycle and pedestrian community.”

The Hub, part of Cruces Creatives nonprofit makerspace, 205 E. Lohman Ave., provides low-cost bicycle repair services. Its Used Bicycle Distribution Program provides bikes at no cost to people who are struggling with homelessness or have qualified for its earn-a-bike program.

## Everybody Rides with Grace

My daughter, Grace Holguin, a Las Cruces girl with special needs, received an adaptive cycle for her 14th birthday in January 2021. Two weeks later, the bike was stolen. Through the help of a dedicated law enforcement officer and the support of her community, Grace got her cycle back within a week. Now, Grace is paying it forward and partnering with the non-profit Velo Cruces to provide other kids with adaptive cycles through the Every Body Rides With Grace (EBRWG) program.

Children with disabilities can benefit from riding adaptive cycles. Physical benefits include increased joint motion, muscle movement, circulation, cardiovascular health, core development and improved

coordination and balance. Emotionally, riding adaptive cycles can help foster inclusion and a sense of independence.

Barriers to obtaining an adaptive cycle include prohibitive cost, lack of local availability and lack of support and guidance as to which cycle or accessory is best suited for a rider's needs. EBRWG seeks to draw attention to these barriers and increase accessibility to cycle riding for children with disabilities in New Mexico.

EBRWG aims to provide adaptive cycles with weather covers, locks and helmets, as well as opportunities to participate in rides and learn how to cycle safely.

EBRWG operates through grant funding and private donations.

# From high school to opportunity: Summer internships available

Keeping young people engaged, giving them experience in the workforce, providing them with income at a rate of \$15 an hour and offering businesses an opportunity to have more hands on deck for the summer, Doña Ana County is generating opportunity through the Summer Enrichment Internship Program.

“The county has been very fortunate to be able to partner with the New Mexico Public Education Department with funding for this program,” said County Manager Fernando Macias during a recent Chamber of Commerce event.

He said the program, which started two years ago placing 450 high school students in internship positions, placed 850 in 132 different locations last year. This year he is hoping to place close to 1,200 students into the summer jobs.

“This year they will get \$15 an hour with the potential to make \$3,000 dollars this summer, working 20 hours a week,” Macias

said. “The biggest problem is placements. The city places 83 in different departments. We are looking to support private business and nonprofits too.”

The students are classified as county employees, Macias said. They are covered by workers comp and insurance. They are also supervised as the county is also hiring 40-50 coordinators to manage the interns.

“We really have to be working with young people to help shape their future,” he said. “This way they also have a level of income, so they are not looking in the wrong

places to generate income.”

The internship program is open to 15-year-olds to graduating high school seniors and starts May 22, with graduating seniors starting as early as May 15.

“It is critical that we develop placements in a short period of time,” Macias said. “I want to encourage the community to assist us in making this program as impactful for our students and business partners as possible.”

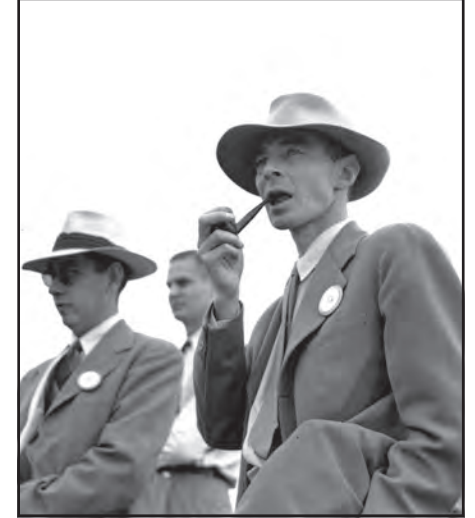
The film’s director, Larry L. Sheffield, will be present for a discussion and a question-and-answer session at the Sunday, May 7, screening.

## Fighting cancer one small step at a time

Cancer is hell. We've all lost loved ones to this dreaded disease.

Making a small donation to organizations fighting cancer and its collateral damage can't possibly help. Or can it?

April 29 marked the third anniversary of my father's death. While it was ultimately Parkinson's Disease that took him down, he had previously fought two different cancers: prostate and bladder.

All cancers are different, and all victims have their own journeys with it, but bladder cancer, even fairly recently, was one that almost always took people out, usually in a hurry. But because of advances in technology and

treatment, my dad was able to beat bladder cancer. He had beaten prostate cancer a few years before that.

Those medical improvements were spurred by millions of small donations from the hundreds of organizations nationwide and worldwide fighting cancer in one way or another. So, yes, small donations can help.

I am shaving my long-ish hair May 13 to raise awareness for local cancer-fighting groups and gather small donations.

One local organization, **CARE (Cancer Aid Resource & Education Inc.)**, works to help cancer victims make it through the struggles, whether it's helping them navigate confusing insur-

ance issues, or helping them make a rent payment. This year marks CARE's 10th anniversary, built on many small donations.

Another local organization, **Cancer Warriors Las Cruces**, is designed to "help cancer suck less." They work to provide support, comfort, equipment, clothing and personal care for victims of women's cancers, such as those of the breast and uterus. This group, founded by Marci Dickerson, is brand new, and yes, building from multiple small donations (and a few big ones!).

A third group, **Cowboys for Cancer Research**, has been around since 1982, and grew from a small fundraising team-roping event into an organization that now has million-dollar-plus endowments at both New Mexico

State University and the University of New Mexico funding vital cancer research.

"Every little bit helps," said Geraldine Calhoun, one of the original leaders of C4CR. "That's how we started."

My goal is to raise \$3,000, or \$1,000 for each of these organizations. So far, I've raised \$1,200, with donations from several people, including Ellen Saige, Rob McCorkle, Steve Ludington, Pam Lillibridge, Richard and Jana Williams and a very generous one from the Wellspring Church.

## Governor can't change human nature

I doubt there are many people over the age of 50 who grew up in this country and have not experienced some form of hazing, including the governor.

I still remember sprinting home following the last day of class in elementary school to avoid the horrors of having lipstick smeared over my face, which had somehow become a tradition.

Later, when I was in Boy Scouts, the initiation to join a group called Order of the Arrow was to spend the day being bossed around by older boys already in the group as we cleaned and made minor repairs around the camp. Others doing the menial chores with me talked about how eager they were to come back next year when they would be the masters.

Fortunately, I never joined a fraternity. My experiences with hazing have been mild enough

that I can understand its value in helping to bring a group closer together. When people go through the same challenges and experiences in order to become a member, it can create a sense of bonding and team unity.

Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham now wants to outlaw all of that. In response to the alleged criminal misconduct on the NMSU men's basketball team, the governor has announced she will propose anti-hazing legislation for next year's session.

"I, along with my administration, have zero tolerance for abuse of any kind," Lujan Grisham declared in her press release. Really? Even mild teasing?

I'm not defending what allegedly happened in the NMSU locker room, but we already

have laws against sexual assault. If the charges made by the two players alleging assault are proven true in court, those responsible will be held to account.

The governor announced plans for a bill without giving any details as to what it would actually do. So, I'll reserve judgment until it is drafted, but I worry about government overreach.

Unfortunately, what happened in the NMSU locker room is not unique. The National Collaborative for Hazing Research and Prevention reports there have been more than 200 deaths caused by hazing at colleges and universities, with 40 in the 10-year period between 2007 and 2017. Most were caused by alcohol poisoning.

Any rituals involving the forced consumption of alcohol,

physical or sexual abuse should be made illegal if there aren't laws already covering those actions.

The most serious hazing incidents at NMSU did not happen in the locker room. In 2020, a student pledging to become a member of the Kappa Sigma fraternity was shot in the leg by another fraternity member during bizarre initiation rituals involving guns. But, that one didn't make the national news.

## Locators Are Ready for Your Call during National Safe Digging Month and Beyond

When Las Cruces Utilities (LCU) installs new infrastructure, there's a tracing wire that is conducive to electromagnetic frequencies that locating staff can use above ground to locate it. It's one of two ways to locate pipe underground. On the second day of a two day locate training, the LCU staff headed out to an older neighborhood to scout out pipe that was a bit trickier, more challenging to test and to refresh their skills.

LCU's training comes up before or during April's National Safe Digging Month. "We do our best to be proactive about our training and have support from the LCU management to ensure that we stay up to date with industry trends," said Joe Atencio, LCU Locating & Mapping Supervisor. LCU staff are recertified every two years, with classroom sessions and field work that culminates in a written exam.

Bill Mixer, the trainer from Staking

University, explained that the more complicated situation was called inductive locating, which uses two staff members. One uses the transmitter to send a broadcast signal into the ground for pipes. The signal bounces off metallic items, like steel gas lines. The receiver picks up the signal and helps pinpoint the pipe location.

The staff who does the locating and mapping for LCU are

the ones who come out when a customer calls 811 before digging. Call Before You Dig is a free service that sends LCU professionals out to mark the locations of gas, water, and sewer lines within your project area.

"Our calls pick up in the spring, especially when homeowners begin to do projects around their home, such as gardening, landscaping, and home improvements," said Atencio. "Regardless of

whether it's fence posts or new trees, it's hard to tell if there are lines that you could damage while digging. It's not just a water pipe you might hit, but it could be very dangerous by damaging and gas lines and potentially creating a leak."

"Homeowners should call 811 at least two business days before they dig, to have utilities marked for their projects that will help avoid pipes when they dig," said Atencio.

This flight started at 1 a.m. Thursday, April 27,

and we were back home at 9 p.m. Saturday, April 29.

We saw a lot and learned a lot. There were 18 veterans from Las Cruces and 17 from El Paso. It was a very rewarding, once-in-a-lifetime chapter in our lives.

Our visit day concluded at Arlington National Cemetery at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, where the changing of the guard takes place every half hour, rain or shine.

There were receptions at all the airports we stopped, with lots of fanfare.

I recommend others consider applying for future flights as volunteers or guardians. Donations are appreciated for the program's continuation.

# Mexico vanquishes French forces on Cinco de Mayo

On May 5 (Cinco de Mayo), 1862, the Mexican Army, led by Gen. Ignacio Zaragoza (1829-62), defeated a French invading force at the Battle of Puebla, Mexico near Puebla de Zaragoza.

An estimated 6,000-6,500 French troops led by Gen. Charles de Lorencez (1814-92) were repeatedly rebuffed by about 4,500 Mexican soldiers as

the French stormed Fort Loreto and Fort Guadalupe overlooking Puebla. Zaragoza lost an estimated 90 men in the battle; Lorencez lost about 1,000 and was relieved of his command. Zaragoza died four months later in Puebla of typhoid fever at age 33.

The French eventually captured the city during the Siege of Puebla, March 16-May 17, 1863, in their advance toward Mexico City as French Emperor Napo-

leon III continued efforts to conquer Mexico during the Second Franco-Mexican War, 1861-67. (The First Franco-Mexican War, known as the Pastry War, was fought 1838-39. The three-month war began after a French pastry chef claimed Mexican soldiers looted his shop on the outskirts of Mexico City. The British brokered a peace that resulted in Mexico paying 600,000 pesos to the French, which the French claimed in damages to shops

owned by French nationals in Mexico City.)

Mexican forces under the command of Gen. Porfirio Díaz recaptured Puebla from the French in the Battle of 2 de Abril (1867).

The invasion of Mexico was part of the Second French Empire, 1852-70, and the Second Mexican Empire. Maximilian I was emperor of Mexico 1864-67. A political faction in Mexico, defeated in the 1858-61 War of Reform, invited the French to

invade and overthrow the Mexican republic. The French were defeated in 1867 – Maximilian and two of his generals were executed by firing squad – and Benito Juárez continued as the constitutionally elected president until his death in 1872.

Puebla is Mexico's fourth largest city, with almost 1.7 million residents in 2020 and a metropolitan area of 3.2 million in southern central Mexico, 95 miles southeast of Mexico City.

# City, state police complete eight-week operation

New Mexico State Police (NMSP) and the Las Cruces Police Department (LCPD) have completed an eight-week operation to tackle high-crime areas in Las Cruces, LCPD said in a news release.

The goal of this collaborative effort, which began Feb. 1, was to maintain a law enforcement presence in high-crime areas, enforce criminal and traffic laws, identify individuals involved in illegal activity, locate wanted subjects, reduce auto thefts and build positive relationships within the community," the news release said.

Participating officers

conducted saturation patrols in the city's highest crime areas, LCPD said, "making positive contact with residents and reducing the fear of crime. They also carried out warrant roundups, targeting known felons associated with narcotics and violent felonies (and) recovered stolen vehicles linked to drug offenders by locating and apprehending those involved in auto theft."

LCPD said the operation resulted in a 19 percent reduction in auto thefts, a 9.9 percent reduction in burglaries and a 43 percent reduction in violent crime in Las Cruces as compared to the same period in 2022. Officers also seized a significant amount of drugs,

including 532 grams of methamphetamine, 28,000 fentanyl pills and \$14,000 in cash associated with narcotic sales, the news release said.

"This joint operation exemplifies how critical our law enforcement partnerships are in keeping our community safe," said Las Cruces Police Chief Miguel Dominguez. "Through the collaboration of our agencies, our officers' efforts have resulted in a significant reduction in property crime, several arrests and the removal of dangerous drugs off our streets. We will continue to work together to disrupt criminal activity and provide a safe environment for our citizens."

Officers made more than 1,300 citizen contacts during the operation, issued 111 citations, recovered 9 stolen vehicles and made 98 arrests, LCPD said. Arrests included 13 felony narcotic arrests, eight other felony arrests and 77 misdemeanor arrests. Eight firearms were taken off the street during the operation.

"Collaboration is key to reducing crime in our communities," said NMSP Chief Tim Johnson. "We cannot tackle this challenge alone, and we must work together with other law enforcement agencies to identify and address the root causes of criminal activity. By pooling our resources, expertise, and

information, we can develop effective strategies to prevent crime, apprehend offenders, and keep our communities safe.

NMSP and LCPD will continue to conduct proactive operations throughout the year, LCPD said.

# NMSU unveils renamed autism diagnostic center

The New Mexico State University College of Health, Education and Social Transformation hosted an April 26 ribbon cutting for the newly named Papan-Aprendamos Autism Diagnostic Center in

O'Donnell Hall, as well as the newly named Aprendamos Intervention Team, P.A. Lecture Hall.

Abel Covarrubias, who provided major funding for the diagnostic center, attended the event, along with former New Mexico State Sen. Mary Kay Papan of Las Cruces, who first proposed the facility through legislation.

"It has always been my goal to make a difference in the lives of others, and creating this center is clearly a dream come true for giving back and helping those in need," Covarrubias said.

He is the founder and

CEO of the Aprendamos Family of Services, which provides early intervention services for children ages 3 and younger and their families, as well as additional services for individuals and families of all ages.

The Spanish word *aprendamos* means "let's learn" and pays tribute to the center's focus on training NMSU students and multiple community organizations to diagnose and treat autism. Staff-initiated autism-specific evidence-based training is also offered for parenting children with disruptive behaviors, as well as increasing teen social skills.

Through Covarrubias' contributions, a lecture hall inside O'Donnell Hall was refurbished, upgraded and renamed. In addition to classes in health, education and social transformation, the classroom is also used for meetings of student organiza-

tions and many other activities across campus. Apart from this gift, Covarrubias and his wife created an endowed scholarship in education, as well as the Aprendamos Intervention Team Endowed Scholarship.

Other Aprendamos contributors include Danny Palma, Monica Marrujo, Kerry Linnan, Kerry Palma-Szalay, Dean Palma and Bryan Tierney, many of whom are alumni of the NMSU Communication Disorders program.

The Papan-Aprendamos Autism Diagnostic Center is the only center in southern New Mexico providing evaluations for the medical diagnosis of autism. The center consists

of a large, interdisciplinary team experienced in autism, differential diagnosis and comorbid conditions across all age ranges.

# State senator's book explores legislative process

A total of 1,294 pieces of legislation, including 1,084 bills – the rest were memorials and resolutions – were introduced during the 2023 session of the New Mexico Legislature that ended in March. The Senate passed 127 bills and the House passed 119. Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham signed 211 pieces of legislation, including a state budget of about \$9.6 billion.

How many of us know how those bills were written or by whom, who sponsored them, how much they cost and how they will directly and indirectly affect our lives?

State Sen. Bill Soules of Las Cruces is helping to answer those questions

with his new book, “The Sausage Factory.”

The 282-page book, published earlier this year, is all about “how the legislative process works,” said Soules, who is chair of the Senate Education Committee. “It’s the A-Z of how a bill gets past.”

The book’s title comes from the old saying about passing laws being like making sausage – “it’s not pretty,” Soules said. “It can also be a long, tedious process (and) there are lots of things that go into it.”

It is also a vital process, Soules said, that should benefit everyone, no matter their economic status

or where they live. It is state government after all, not Uncle Sam, that sets the budget for New Mexico, creates the standards for education and public health, for public transportation, broadband and public safety, Soules said.

Soules covers turning an idea into a bill, drafting it and introducing it, the committee process, lobbying, debate, passage and action by the governor.

The book also discusses running for office and getting elected – he won a seat on the Las Cruces Public Schools Board of Education before being elected to the state Senate in 2012 and re-elected in 2016 and 2020. The book is dedicated to Soules’ wife, Kasandra Gandara, who was elected

to the Las Cruces City Council in 2015 and re-elected in 2019 and is running for mayor this year.

Soules discusses state revenue and state taxes, New Mexico’s economic policy, capital outlay and “junior money” appropriations, how the legislature operates and how it could operate better if sessions were longer, legislators were paid and the process was more transparent; meeting the legislators who represent you and getting your ideas turned into bills and getting your voice heard in state government; and even running for office yourself.

The book “can guide all of us to fixing broken systems of care and security, and offer innovative ideas to design new systems of

empowerment,” Katherine Ortega Courtney and Dominic Cappello wrote in the introduction. Ortega Courtney and Cappello are developers of the “100% Accountability” model for transforming social determinants of health and well-being from negative to positive. They are the authors of “Anna Age Eight: The data-driven prevention of childhood trauma and maltreatment,” and co-directors of the Anna Age Eight Institute, which recently moved from northern New Mexico to the Las Cruces campus of New Mexico State University.

“The good news is ... a search has identified the root causes of most of our challenges,” Ortega Courtney and Cappello wrote. All that’s been missing is

a practical guide for state legislators and change agents to implement informed solutions.”

That is where Soules’ book can show the way.

“If the pandemic taught us anything,” it’s that it’s up to each state to take care of its own people,” Soules says in the book’s epilogue. “We have the power to begin replacing lack of awareness and apathy with empowerment and altruism. Pragmatism mixed with altruism, the selfless caring for others, can guide our daily actions as well as public policy,” he says. “You have way more power to influence the future than you know, if only you will use it,” Soules tells readers. The paperback book is available online at amazon.com.

# Record budget funding important local projects

Las Cruces is a model for the rest of the state as it makes state funds available “to help our businesses when there’s a catastrophe,” state Sen. Carrie Hamblen of Las Cruces said April 26 during the Greater Las Cruces Chamber of Commerce’s annual legislative wrap-up lunch at New Mexico Farm and Ranch Heritage Museum.

A \$5,000-\$10,000 one-time allocation can “help a business stay afloat” as it deals with the aftermath of a fire or some other catastrophic event, said Hamblen, a first-term

Democrat who is vice chair of the Senate Tax, Business and Transportation Committee. The funds come from the so-called junior bill, a supplemental appropriation separate from capital outlay that allocates state funds to specific agencies, projects and entities.

State Sen. Bill Soules said each New Mexico senator received about \$4.1 million in capital outlay funds during the 2023 session, and he will allocate that money to support Las Cruces International Airport, the Doña Ana County Election Warehouse Center and infrastructure on the city’s East Mesa, among

other programs and projects. Soules, a Las Cruces Democrat first elected in 2013, is chair of the Senate Education Committee and the legislature’s interim Legislative Education Study Committee.

State Rep. Nathan Small, who is the new chair of the House Appropriations and Finance Committee (HAFC), said New Mexico is making “record investments” in career and technical education (CTE) for students across the state, including internship programs like the one Doña Ana County will sponsor for the third consecutive year in 2023. Those programs are an important part of the legislature’s investment in education, Small said, because students who participate in internship programs “are not involved in the criminal justice system.”

Soules said he would like to “get the business community pulling as hard as the legislature is pushing” to make CTE programs successful. He said the legislature appropriated \$70 million for CTE and early childhood

education centers around the state and for increased school security.

Soules also stressed the overall benefit of education and training to businesses and the workforce of New Mexico.

“Good education IS economic development,” Soules said.

State Rep. Michaela Lara Cadena said, while tax reform legislation passed during the 2023

session with support from both Democrats and Republicans that “cut taxes for 98 percent of New Mexicans,” and included a reduction in the state gross receipts tax, she was disappointed Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham line-item vetoed big chunks of the bill (House Bill 547). Cadena, a Democrat who lives in Mesilla, is vice chair of the House Taxation and Revenue

Committee. She was first elected in 2018.

Cadena said one of her goals for capital outlay spending – each New Mexico House of Representatives member received about \$2 million in capital outlay funds in 2023 – made available more “partner agencies” that demonstrate need and haven’t been funded before. An important goal for capital outlay spending is “interrupting the cycle of poverty,” said Cadena.

Small said Grisham signed a record \$9.6 billion budget for New Mexico for the fiscal year that starts July 1. New Mexico is one of only a few states in which the legislature “builds its own budget alongside the governor,” Small said. HAFC crafted the General Appropriation Act of 2023 (House Bill 2).

“I was very, very proud of our committee,” Small said.

Small said the state budget is likely to continue growing at least into the 2030s, noting that the state is now second (behind Texas) in oil production.

Mission statement. Vision statement. Who are we? What’s our brand? All of these catch-words and more have come up in discussion in meetings recently. Seems like we are all trying to design a new logo, upgrade our missions as we move forward. As businesses and organizations, we want an identifier that is easy recognizable and memorable. The “golden arches” is a prime example of a long time identifier across the world for McDonald’s. It is one logo/brand that has certainly surpassed time and place.

Interesting though, when an organization begins to develop, re-develop a mission statement, it seems as if we want to put everything in that statement. but I remember Mr. Jensen, our janitor. As clear as day as I’m writing this I remember his smile as he often leaned on his mop or broom as we passed by to another classroom or the cafeteria. The conversations were brief, but I remember. I assume Mr. Jensen never thought about the mission and/or vision of his class, and probably never thought about the impact he was making on this little girl’s life.

At the end of the day, career and even our lives, isn’t that what it’s all about... making an impact, making a difference? Sometimes we put our “leaders” on pedestals and expect them to fulfill their mission of their life the way we think it should be done. And, on the flip-side, leaders often want followers to simply, perhaps blindly,

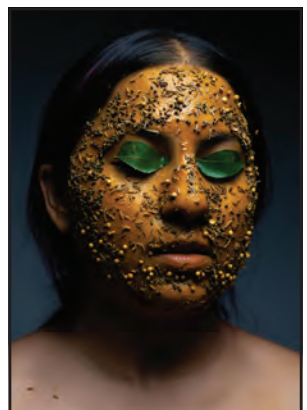
## Student exhibits open at UAM

## Join Las Cruces Utilities at Downtown Farmer's Market

LCU staff will be out at the Downtown Farmer's Market just like last year and will be asking residents to fill out their annual survey so they can improve their services and communication.

Las Cruces Utilities (LCU) is coming to the Farmer's Market – and they want to hear from you. On Saturday, May 6, LCU will ask residents to fill out their annual survey. It's a way for LCU to make sure that information that is both critical and helpful becomes common knowledge. “We want to make sure that customers know about our services and find out where we can improve with our outreach,” said LCU Director Adrienne L. Widmer, P.E.

After filling out the survey, customers can also ask about specific things they might be curious about; for example, does LCU have its own emergency dispatch, or what number should homeowners call before they dig?

“Over time, customers might think that their trash needs to be out the night before when it needs to be out by 6 a.m. the day of their trash pickup day,” said Widmer.

For new residents, clarifying the difference between the regular grappler, for

bulky trash that comes once a month, and the Green Grappler, which comes for yard waste like branches or grass clipping or leaves in clear bags. That green yard waste is transformed into mulch that residents can pick up for free at the City of Las Cruces Foothills Clean Fill location at 555 S. Sonoma Ranch Blvd.

With only 11 questions, the survey asks if residents have already signed up for UtilityHawk. In this free online portal, customers can monitor

natural gas and water usage along with setting alerts for their accounts.

The survey also asks about residents' knowledge about water restrictions, what shouldn't go down the drain, and how LCU is funded.

If you prefer to fill out the survey at home, keep an eye out for your bill. Those surveys can be mailed in or dropped off at one of the two Customer Central locations at City Hall or the East Mesa Customer Central location at 5195 Bataan Memorial West. For those who would

# CCC topic of Culture Series

The history of the Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC) in New Mexico is the topic of the next Culture Series presentation at the New Mexico Farm and Ranch Heritage Museum (FRHM), 4100 Dripping Springs Road.

His presentation, "Coming of Age in the Great Depression: The Civilian Conservation Corps Experience in New Mexico, 1933-1942," is based on his book of the same name,

Melzer will discuss how CCC projects impacted New Mexico, its resources and its population during the Great Depression.

During the depth of The Depression, it employed 54,000 young men in conservation projects across New Mexico. Melzer also will describe the value of the CCC in World War II and the post-war era, the news release said.

Melzer is the author of many books, including "A History of New Mexico Since Statehood," "Don Perkins: A Champion's Life," "Sanatoriums of New Mexico," "Ernie Pyle in the American Southwest" and "Casey Luna: A Colorful Life in Business, Politics and Motor Sports Championships."

# The 'I'm spiritual but not religious' mantra ...

That mantra began sometime around the mid- to late-1970s, as I recall. Suddenly it was all around me, especially since I was a representative of (gasp!) organized religion – even if it felt rather

unorganized to me.

There seem to be three meanings to the second half of the phrase, “not religious.”

First, at face value, it means the speaker is either not a fan of, or not con-


nected to, a community of faith that has the earmarks of an institution.

Second, the phrase may represent a level of hostility toward “organized religion.” Fair enough. This goes with the

observation “the church (or whatever name you insert here) is full of hypocrites.” True. We’re a sorry lot, and we’re

so glad for the purity of the world that surrounds us with its absence of ethical problems.

Third, the phrase may be and has been used specifically to cut off conversation with a representative of a religious tradition – like me, for instance. And I get it: nobody wants to be lectured about a particular take on religion, no matter how close or far from the truth it may be. Unfortunately, “religious leaders” are all tarred with the same brush, as if there were no difference in either our approach or our aim. My aim has always been to share, not overpower, but I have been the target of zealots trying to mind-wrestle me into their religious box. I know why people instinctively flee from such types.

What about that first part, “I’m spiritual”? I have no objection to the sentiment expressed; the problem is there’s spirituality and then there’s spirituality. Woolly thinking simply affirms peak experiences as the be-all and end-all of spiritual experience. We know peak experiences in acts like falling in love, giving birth, sitting with someone as they die, and true befriending. They are, on one hand, perfectly normal and, on the other, perfectly extraordinary. They are “spiritual” experiences that transcend those mundane everyday activities we overlook.

Peak experiences are special, so we tend to give them the title “spiritual.”

Many people have another experience they label “spiritual.” This is the ground level experience of the interconnectedness to all things that sometimes

overtakes us at odd moments. Poet W. H. Auden called it “the vision of dame kind,” a natural spirituality that comes

from recognizing this interconnectedness. It is an experience which is external and, thus, captivates you for a moment. Because it is not inward, however, this vision is not capable of sustenance. It comes and goes like the tide.

Many people get stuck at this ground level, deem it “spiritual,” and never progress beyond it. It’s tricky because we cannot deny that it is transcendent, but it’s not the whole story. St. Teresa sketches an extended metaphor about different rooms you enter to draw close to the Holy. Her work, like

that of many medieval mystics, was based on a threefold movement of mind and heart. Entering the interior castle is really a process that moves from cleansing by self-denial and repentance through a growing awareness of the presence of the Holy lighting up all of life. Finally, there is a sense of union and communion with the Holy, which St. Teresa termed the spiritual marriage of the soul with God. This complete spiritual experience can never be fully explained; it will always remain ineffable, but it is real. It is far more wonderful and complex than the ground level. This is the deeper meaning to “I’m spiritual” that I invite you to.

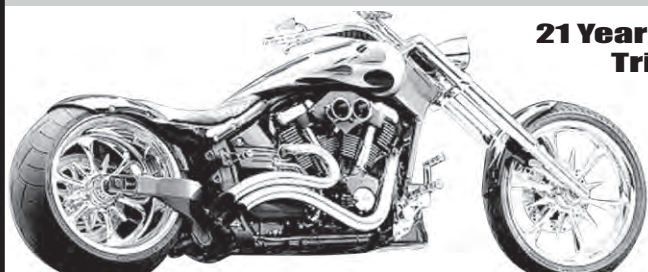

# Key secrets to conquering golf's mental game

Years ago Yogi Berra offered us this piece of wisdom: "Half of the game is ninety percent mental." Maybe it's even more than that. All competitive sport has a strong mental aspect, since thought and imagery are fundamentally required. I'll give you my take on the "mental game."

First I don't believe it's really possible to compartmentalize the physical from the mental skill in any human endeavor. That would be like separating mind and body; or thought and spirit. The two are inexorably connected, whether we're talking about an NFL quarterback, a concert violinist or a professional golfer. Over 120 years ago, James Allen wrote the small but profound book "As A Man

Thinketh," in which he explained that all of behavior, including personally perceived conditions in life, is connected to thought, and with the proper attitude anything is possible. "Thought and character are one, and as character can only manifest and discover itself through environment and circumstance, the outer conditions of a person's life will always be found to be harmoniously related to his inner state," Allen counseled.

Many beginners and struggling golfers on the practice range attempt to swing the club and hit the ball seemingly without a clue as to how to do it. They seem oblivious to

the brain work and mental image resembling a vaguely correct golf swing, and the results show it; still they persist in trying and trying in vain. It's like they are trying to disengage their brain from their body and it isn't working. It's axiomatic you can't do golf all by yourself.

One of the true keys to the mental game is knowing how to learn, how to think and how to practice. Mentally alert golfers recognize their shortcomings, and are smart enough to ask for help, take lessons and get feedback.

In my view, the most underestimated aspect to the mental game is the

a true saying about having a purpose and making plans: "If you don't know where you're going any road will take you there." Maybe your long term goal is to get to a single-digit handicap; a medium goal might be to win a net tournament this year; and a short term goal could be to increase driving distance by 20 yards. Those require specific plans of action. In the words of James Allen, "until thought is linked with purpose there is no intelligent accomplishment ... that strength can only be developed by effort and practice."

Raw talent will take an athlete only so far in any sport. Coachability, constantly striving for improvement, a super-positive attitude and the

heart of a champion will produce a winning performance, even when talent is seemingly underrated. When I was a freshman in 1960 at Notre Dame I was an unknown as a swimmer. I came to the Irish to swim but without a stellar resume. But I was coachable, knew what I was doing, had a passion for excellence and a commitment to winning. From 1961 through 1964 I won over 90 percent of my races. I set a dozen varsity records, was elected captain in 1963, and won MVP awards in 1963 and 1964. On April 1, I presented the 59th Charles W. Blanchard Award to two Irish swimmers.
