Entries open now for Electric Light Parade

The City of Las Cruces Parks and Recreation Department is accepting entries for lighted floats to participate in the 2023 Electric Light Parade, the city said in a news release.

Registration continues until 5 p.m. Monday, June 26. There are no entry or participation fees, the city said. Some restrictions apply.

The parade will begin at 9 p.m. Monday, July 3, at Apodaca Park, 801 E. Madrid Ave. The parade route will travel south on Solano Drive, east on Hadley Avenue, and end at Maag Softball Complex.

This year's parade theme is "RED, WHITE, and BOOM!"

Commercial and non-commercial groups and car and motorcycle clubs are encouraged to participate in the parade, the city said. Car, vehicle and motorcycle clubs are limited

to 20 vehicles.

Trophies will be awarded to first through third place in the commercial and non-commercial categories, and a best overall float trophy. Floats will be judged on originality, depiction of the theme and effective use of lights. No bicycles, walkers, single ATV's, UTV's or single vehicles will be permitted.

Progress continues on Amador Hotel project

The west facade of the Amador Hotel is nearing completion.

The concrete stucco has been removed, the original adobes have been repaired, the wall has been covered in lime plaster, the upper windows have been milled (shaped), painted and installed, landscaping is complete. Ground-floor doors and windows should be installed in May and the entire west side of the hotel should be completed by the end of June.

In accordance with decisions made by the New Mexico Historic Preservation Division (NMHPD), the restoration is follow-

ing a mid-1930s photo of the Amador. Once enlarged, the rough texture of the lime plaster is visible and the territorial-style portico is clear. If the photo were in color, you would also see the blue of the upper-story windows. That color was identified from both archival research and chemical analysis of the paint. An exact match was made to those findings. The windows and doors will be boarded up to protect them from vandalism while work continues on the building. However, historic photos are being selected that will be placed over the plywood so people can see the hotel images through time.

The Historic Structure Report (HSR) on the hotel



has been completed and accepted by the NMHPD.

This is a huge step forward because the HSR not only details every architectural aspect of the building through time (1880-today) but is the detailed road map to restore and adapt the building to serve as the City of Las Cruces Amador Event Center. Until now we have had only the 2009 Amador Adaptive Re-Use Study to guide the work. Now

we have 'the blueprints' that will specify how we proceed room by room. The Period of Significance has been determined to be 1885-1969, which is the entire time the building functioned as the Amador Hotel and was operated by the Amador family and their descendants.

The historic Amador Hotel can now be nominated for listing on the National Register of Historic Places. The completion of the National

Register nomination is a huge step forward for two reasons.

The first reason is that now the NMHPD believes the building is eligible for nomination. The Amador Hotel Foundation received a grant to write and submit a National Register nomination in 2014. However, NMHPD would not

forward the nomination to Washington, DC because they did not believe enough historic fabric and structural integrity remained. We convinced the state historic preservation officer to give us time to deliver the proof they needed. And, we have.

The meeting will consist of updates from the Office of the Natural Resources Trustee and other state entities followed by a question-and-answer session.

What's the real state aroma?

Now that New Mexico has an official state aroma, I'm already having second thoughts about its accuracy.

The state legislature passed the measure in its 2023 session naming the smell of roasting green chile as the aroma of the Land of Enchantment. As do most New Mexicans, I love this scent. When it pervades the state in August into September, we all break out into a grin and, quite frequently, a drool.

But that's the problem. This aroma only drifts across our air a few weeks out of the year.

There's another aroma, decidedly less pleasant, that is now drifting around all year long. It's the smell of burning marijuana.

Since marijuana became legal a year ago, it's difficult to go a

day without getting a cannabis whiff or two, making it less enjoyable to drive with your windows down.

A few years ago, I wrote a column for our sister publication, Desert Exposure, saying legalized marijuana might actually help our state, and give us a leg up on something, since we seem to be behind on everything. A year into it, the state has seen about \$300 million in adult-use

cannabis sales, which translates into about \$30 million in excise taxes for our state's general fund and to municipalities.

I think now I regret endorsing the "bad herb," as one of my college friends used to call it. Sure, there is some revenue, but how many more cannabis businesses

are going to open and close in the next year? We're already known as the Land of Mañana. Was it wise to do something that can make about 15-20 percent of our population even more laid back and mellow?

But for me, the worst part is that nasty smell.

People often dismiss these "official state" declarations as frivolous, but they provide identity.

You know by now our Official State Question is "Red or Green?"

The other day, while dining at Mi Pueblito, I realized selecting "Red or Green?" was not a slam dunk. They chose right, but there were lots of other possibilities. Simply by ordering an enchilada plate, you are bombarded.

"Flat or rolled?"

"Refrito or borracho?"

"Corn or flour?"

"Onions?"

"An egg?" (and, if yes, "How would you like it cooked?").

If you order iced tea, you might hear "Sweet or unsweet?"

Occasionally you'll hear "Hot or mild?" That's not really a question for me, or most New Mexicans, but I suppose it's an indicator of how many tourists a restaurant serves.

There are other local questions that don't deal with food.

"Aggies or Lobos?"

Growing up in Oklahoma, where "Cowboys or Sooners?" is a question, the answer is easy for me, a graduate of Oklahoma State University who transplanted to New Mexico in 1995. I always go with Pistol Pete.

And then there's that dreaded question we all hate to hear, "Do you know how fast you were going?"

State, feds to lock horns on waste site

The United States government has a nuclear waste storage problem, and sees its solution in southeast New Mexico.

Earlier this month, the Nuclear Regulatory Commission approved the application by a Florida-based company named Holtec to build a new waste storage facility in Lea County. The license authorizes Holtec to store 500 canisters holding 100,000 metric tons of spent nuclear fuel, though Holtec plans to eventually store up to 10,000 canisters, shipped in from nuclear power plants around the country.

Those plans give state leaders good reason to doubt this facility will be temporary.

The New Mexico Legislature did all it could during the last session to throw roadblocks in front of the project. Senate Bill 53, sponsored by Jeff Steinborn, D-Las Cruces, requires the state consent to the new facility and

that a permanent storage facility be in operation before any construction permits can be granted.

Holtec will undoubtedly challenge the new law in court.

Meanwhile, about 88,000 metric tons of nuclear waste is being stored onsite at 77 different nuclear reactors spread across 35 states, and that is increasing by about 2,000 metric tons a year, according to a March story in Scientific American.

The current storage sites are only constructed to be safe for decades.

Original plans to build a storage site at Yucca Mountain in Nevada were scuttled by the political power of former U.S. Senate Leader Harry Reid. Now, the political might of New Mexico's state leaders and members of

Congress will apparently be put to the test.

Several years ago, I was given a tour of the Waste Isolation Pilot Plant near Carlsbad, which is an abandoned underground salt mine where low-level waste is being held. I came away convinced that was about as safe as we can get.

The bitter experiences of New Mexico residents exposed to radiation following the explosion at Trinity Site give us good reason to distrust the federal government. The "downwinders" here remain the only ones harmed during the early days of testing who have not been compensated.

It seems clear the waste will eventually be stored deep underground, which will limit the number of states where a federal storage site can be located.

I support the effort by state leaders to put the brakes on the Holtec plan. While I was impressed by WIPP, I also note it was intended to be a "pilot plant." Yet it's still flying solo. Only a fool would believe the Holtec site would be temporary.

The nation does need a central repository, and New Mexico may prove to be the safest site available. But that decision needs to come from an open and transparent process.

Border: Consider humanity as well as politics

“Where are all the migrants?” we asked as we toured Juárez, Anapra, El Paso and Sunland Park on May 10 and 11.

Our first stop was the Sacred Heart Church on Oregon Street in El Paso where there were far fewer people on the streets than when I had last visited on April 28.

Then we crossed into Juárez to the site of the deadly fire that killed 40 migrants on March 27 and spoke to a 16-year-old girl named Ana who had made the arduous journey from Venezuela with her father and her younger sister, Fatima, age 12. They left Venezuela eight months ago, crossed the very dangerous Darien Gap, traveled with a small group instead of hiring a “coyote” because that would have been too expensive. They had spent two months in the Mexican government’s Kiki Romero shelter in Juárez, a former gymnasium converted to shelter up to 200 people but said it was so horrible that they

decided to live on the street in a tent. Their hope is for an asylum hearing soon and they certainly deserve it.

We then took food and clothing to the nearby Respetrans shelter. They were housing roughly 200 migrants and there had been no additional influx due to Title 42.

We drove along both the U.S and the Mexican sides of the border wall to the west in the Sunland Park-Anapra area and eastward to the Zaragoza bridge, spotted a few migrants on the Mexican side but no build up.

On Thursday, May 11, we took food, clothing and medical supplies to Sacred Heart but there were only about 45 migrants there, far fewer than two weeks earlier.

Later we returned to Juárez and spent several hours driving around in the city center but saw nothing out of the ordinary.

In short, ending Title 42 didn’t cause any of the chaos that was predicted.

Conclusions, recommendations

We’ll continue to have a need for migrant shelters and it’s time, therefore, to set standards,



support the non-profits like Respetrans that are humane and cost effective, force improvements in shelters like the Kiki Romero. Thus, I continue to recommend the creation of a U.S.-Mexico Shelter Task Force that would include the involvement of those who run the non-profits.

Since September 2022, I’ve had extensive contact with hundreds of Venezuelan migrants often in very harsh circumstances as when they were living in terrible conditions on the river bank in Juárez across from El Paso. They have always displayed great optimism and courtesy and many would be assets to our economy if we had an expanded guest worker program that could work for them. Now there are about 4 million unfilled jobs in the U.S. for which we have no workers.

Conditions in countries like Venezuela aren’t going to suddenly improve so we can’t just

focus on migration when there’s an event like Title 42 and then forget about it.

In addition, the Border Patrol (BP) deserves support for its extraordinarily difficult work. The BP is understaffed, a problem that Congress could easily resolve just as it could resolve the shortage of judges for the 2 million pending asylum cases.

Instead of constantly complaining that the system is broken and that we need comprehensive reform, why couldn’t Congress unite with these three small steps – an expanded guest worker program

that would benefit both migrants and U.S. employers, plus funding for the Border Patrol and for judges who would work on the asylum caseload? Maybe a few small successes would lead to larger reforms.

Last, we can’t forget that this is an issue of humanity, not just political gain. Let’s not walk away from these issues just because Title 42’s ending wasn’t as dramatic as expected.

Men of Color initiative celebrates

“My success in college was because I had a community around me,” New Mexico State University Vice President for Student Success Renay Scott told the NMSU Men of Color initiative’s “Living the Dream” Achievement Ceremony May 3 in Corbett Center.

“That community is really the reason you succeed,” said Scott, who was a first-generation college student in rural Michigan. “I am here to support you,” she said.

NMSU Associate Provost for Student Success Patrick Turner created MOC three years ago “to close the opportunity gap for all students, especially men of color,” he said.

High schoolers working to make a difference for youth

Shreeya Moolamalla and a group of committed high school students are also working to make a difference for youth in our community through the HandinHand organization.

The seed for HandinHand was planted in Shreeya's freshman year at Mesilla Valley Christian School during spiritual emphasis week. A speaker at the school shared what it was like to grow up with facial deformities and his experience being raised in a Native American household as a victim of child abuse and neglect.

The speech sparked something in Shreeya.

"His experience made me open to the fact that people in this world are going through unimaginable things," she said.

"Children can't control their educational experiences, abuse or being born into poverty," she said.

Her ideas quickly gained momentum and Shreeya realized she could turn service projects into an actual organization, creating the HandinHand program, with a mission of building the leadership skills of participating teens to children in Doña Ana County by fundraising and advocating for neurodiversity, health and wellbeing, financial security and more.

"We seek to make a difference in the lives of the children we meet," Shreeya said.

Shreeya asked her friends to join her on her journey of service. She appointed a governing

body and took her idea to the Community Foundation of Southern New Mexico (CFSNM). Although HandinHand did not have enough funds to set up a permanent endowment, the program closely aligned with initiatives the foundation had already undertaken.

"Our team and our board of directors are committed to cultivating the next generation of young philanthropists," said CFSNM President and CEO Terra Winter. "By creating a designated fund at the

Completion date in sight for Amador

Thanks to \$5 million in funding over the next five years from the City of Las Cruces, the historic Amador Hotel may be fully restored and reopened by 2028.

“This funding is a milestone for the restoration of this incredible building and is a signal that this city believes in historic preservation,” said Heather Pollard, who has been president of the Amador Hotel Foundation for the past 14 years.

The money comes from the city’s downtown Tax Increment and Development District (TIDD), which the city created in 2009 to generate revenue for public improvement projects in the downtown

area. TIDD is funded through existing gross receipts tax revenues, with additional funding from the New Mexico Legislature. Funds were awarded at the city’s April 24 TIDD

meeting. The Amador restoration project also received \$1.5 million in TIDD funding in 2021 and \$500,000 in 2022.

In addition to thank-

ing Mayor Ken Miyagishima and members of the Las Cruces City Council for their support of Amador Hotel renovations, Pollard also thanked staff at the city Public Works, Quality of Life and Economic Development departments, along with former New Mexico State Senate Pro Tempore Mary Kay Papen and former state Representative and city lobbyist Ray Davenport (1929-2016), who served in the New Mexico House of Representatives 1961-68. Pollard also thanked the Amador family and current members of the New Mexico Legislature for their support.

With selective external and internal demolition, we found a time capsule that demonstrates a variety of features through time (e.g., all three floors that were ever in the building, the vigas from 1885 used to construct the second floor, columns

from 1885 that support not only the second floor but also the roof, the interior ceiling from 1885, the staircase from 1910, electrical wiring from 1921, wallpaper from every time period, etc.).

HPD now considers the historic Amador Hotel to be a most significant structure in New Mexico and understands that it is unique. It is the only two-

story adobe hotel in not only New Mexico but the country.

The second reason is that once the Amador Hotel is on the National Register, the Amador Foundation and the city will have many more opportunities for fundraising. Many federal and state grants and private foundation grants require a building to be on the

National Register to be eligible for grant funds. Consequently, we have had to watch those grant cycles go by each year without being able to apply.

Production is complete of a 13-minute video giving an overview of the Amador family and hotel through time with a view of the (planned) Amador Event Center.

La Casa shares in domestic violence/sexual assault grant

La Casa, Inc. is the only recipient from southern New Mexico of a grant from two national organizations to organizations providing domestic or sexual assault services, La Casa said in a news release.

The Hispanic and Latin@ Culturally Specific Domestic Violence or Sexual Assault Services grant is being shared by La Casa and 27 other recipients across the country, the news release said. The grant was announced May 10 by Esperanza United and Mujeres Latinas en Acción.

The three-year grant allocates almost \$12 million through the federal 2021 Family Violence Prevention and Services Act and the American Rescue Plan Act “to enhance access to critical services and support for Hispanic and Latin@ survivors of sexual assault and domestic violence” and to “address emergent needs resulting from the spread of COVID-19.”

Grants funds will help La Casa recruit and hire a full-time bilingual, peer support coordinator, a full-time bilingual legal advocate and a quarter-time prevention educator and “will leverage other key assets,” La Casa said, including distribution of clothing, supplies and home goods.

“As a result, we will be able to distribute 2,500 pounds of clothing, shoes and household items to Hispanic and Latin@ survivors of domestic violence and their children,”

La Casa said.

La Casa is a Las Cruces-based domestic violence prevention, awareness, advocacy and support organization that serves Doña Ana, Luna and Hidalgo counties “as a culturally responsive, trauma-informed and bilingual safe haven for over 1,500 domestic violence survivors a year,” the nonprofit said. La Casa’s three offices serve migrant farm workers, immigrants and sub-segments of the Latin@ community, the news release said.

“We gratefully accept this transformative award that will strengthen our collaborative efforts and impact by increasing

availability of a comprehensive range of quality domestic violence and community-based services in the most rural southwestern areas of Doña Ana, Luna and Hidalgo counties,” said La Casa CEO Marcie Davis. “These funds will enable La Casa staff to elevate the community’s access to culturally responsive, trauma-informed and bilingual domestic violence services.”

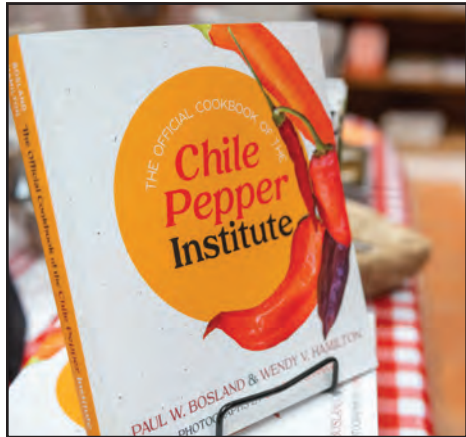


'Official Cookbook of the Chile Pepper Institute' released

Chile pepper enthusiasts have a new resource to explore with the launch of a new cookbook that features recipes developed by the Chile Pepper Institute (CPI) at New Mexico State University.

Horticulture Regents Professor Paul Bosland, also known as the "Chileman," teamed up with Wendy Hamilton, Extension

program specialist in the College of Agricultural, Consumer and Environmental Sciences, to create "The Official Cookbook of the Chile Pepper Institute."

The cookbook was recently published by University of New Mexico Press and features chile peppers grown at the CPI Teaching Garden at NMSU, the world's only garden dedicated to chile peppers, which has been a part of CPI's teaching and outreach programs since 1991.

"Many of our visitors asked for it," Bosland said. "They wanted a cookbook, and we give tours in the garden, and people ask how to use certain chile peppers from Hungary, Turkey and other places like that. So, it was always something we wanted to do, and we're really pleased to get it done."

Bosland wrote about each chile pepper in the teaching garden, Hamilton provided two recipes for each chile pepper and Carolyn Graham, photographer with New Mexico Magazine, took photos of each plate. The CPI mission is to educate the world about chiles, and the cookbook highlights a variety of rich culinary traditions embraced around the

globe.

"Former NMSU President James Halligan used to say chile peppers are New Mexico's identity, and so we like to say NMSU is the identity for chile pepper research," Bosland said.

The cookbook is a celebration of the institute's teaching garden and is a helpful guide to cooking and enjoying peppers with unique recipes.

"There are so many recipes, and it was a very difficult thing to pick the right varieties to go into the cookbook," Hamilton said. "We have suave fish tacos, pepper pizza, Mexican street corn, Jamaican curry chicken, quinoa tuna, chile rellenos, baked eggs, stuffed peppers and, of course, bhut jolokia brownies, which Paul made famous from the ghost pepper."

Hamilton said recipes were created and selected based on each chile pepper's

location, traditional uses, country of origin, exploration of species and varieties and different ways it can be prepared.

City to receive \$13 million

The City of Las Cruces will receive almost \$13 million in state appropriations from the 2023 session of the New Mexico Legislature.

The capital outlay and general appropriations and expenditures (“junior bill”) money will pay for 31 city projects, city lobbyist Larry Horan told the Las Cruces City Council during its May 8 work session, including:

- Almost \$2 million for senior citizen center improvements and construction citywide;
- \$300,000 to improve three fire stations;
- More than \$1.6 million

for two projects at Las Cruces International Airport;

- \$1.5 million for park renovations, including Pioneer Women’s Park, Klein Park and Veterans Memorial Park; and \$100,000 for trails improvements;

- Almost \$2 million for street improvements;

- Over \$200,000 to improve Branigan Cultural Center and the Museum of Nature and Science, plus \$75,000 to support a children’s mobile museum;

- More than \$3.25 million for Mesilla Valley Community of Hope, including construction and improvements at Casa de Pergrinos Emergency Food

Program, El Caldito Soup Kitchen and Jardin de los Niños childcare program;

- More than \$1 million for Mesquite Historical District renovations;

- \$75,000 for body cameras for the Las Cruces Police Department;

- \$400,000 to support mental health services and people struggling with homelessness;

- \$75,000 to support small business.

Horan said 1,083 bills and 210 memorials and joint resolutions were introduced during the session, and he tracked 192 pieces of legislation for the city.

Seventh grader wins Asombro's Desert Data Jam

For her winning project "How Fast Do Leaves Leaf Us?" Megan used crochet to represent leaf litter decomposition rates in Las Cruces, Alaska and Costa

Rica, AISE said in a news release.

"Megan's project was a perfect example of the creative communication skills and scientific understanding that students gain from the Desert Data Jam," AISE Executive Director Stephanie Bestelmeyer said.

Kate Shankel and Delila Ruth from Sierra Middle School took second place for

their project "Decomposition Mission," AISE said. There was a tie for third place between Soraya Kamali and Nilasha Basnyat from J. Paul Taylor Academy for their project "Mammals in the Court" and Avery Liefeld and Tian Tian Gong Rong from Sierra for "It's Snowing Dust." 13 other projects received honorable mentions.

With 339 students participating, 54 projects made it to the final competition, AISE.

AISE partners with the USDA's Jornada Experimental Range to host the jam, which "challenges seventh graders to find creative ways to present scientific data collected in our region to non-scientist audiences," the nonprofit said.

The Data Jam was created in Las Cruces in 2012.

Program helps inmates reintegrate

Students attend classes four to five hours a day five days a week, studying reading, math, history, science, language arts and other subjects, and can even take college-level courses. They use pencils and paper, textbooks, computers and tablets.

The setting could be any high school in Las Cruces. It's actually Southern New Mexico Correctional Facility (SNMCF), located about 13 miles west of Las Cruces.

The prison houses more than 600 adult male inmates, and 80-90 are enrolled in its high school equivalency (HSE) classes, taught by four instructors in morning, afternoon and night classes. Inmates have a wide range of educational backgrounds: some have completed a few years of elementary school, some are high school graduates, others have some college credits.

"We meet them where they are," said Alex Hallwyler, SNMCF program manager and supervisor of education, who became a teacher at the facility four years ago.

In class, inmates might learn basic computer skills, work on fractions or improve their reading skills. They could also do beginning algebra or complex geometry. Most speak English, but some are learning it as a second language.

One of the instructors, K.C. Cunningham, also teaches a Freedom Writers course to help inmates improve their writing skills.

"Our educational system is the key to success when (inmates) leave the facility," said Cunning-

ham, who has been teaching at SNMCF for about a year and a half. She has a bachelors degree in secondary education with a minor in history and a masters degree in curriculum development.

"With the right tools, they can do it," she said.

"We teach everything." Sometimes, Cunningham said, "You can see the lightbulb go on" and know the student is progressing, doing math problems he never thought he could do or thinking about going to college for the first time in his life.

"They talk about what they want to do," Cunningham said. "They talk about the future. That's a huge, huge motivator."

"Inmates are coming to us at the lowest point in their lives," Hallwyler said. Taking classes, they see themselves making progress and it snowballs, he said, as they think, "Maybe I can do this."

"I love seeing that happen," Cunningham said. "Our job is to find that and run with it."

It's especially heart-warming, she said, when an inmate tells her about a conversation he has had with his wife, girlfriend or mother about the progress he is making in class.

"Education really does have the power to change lives," Cunningham said.

The prison offers a wrap-around program, Hallwyler said, so students can not only take classes to prepare for the HSE exam, they also can enroll in beginning college-level classes like welding and auto mechanics.

Since July 2022, SNMCF has also offered a heavy equipment operator certification program. Through a partnership with the New Mexico Workforce Connections Department and an outside vocational training provider, "eight inmates completed rigorous instruction, utilizing online curriculum, video lectures and practice on an official CAT heavy

equipment simulator," the New Mexico Corrections Department (NMCD) said. "The training culminated in hands-on assessments with an instructor on site, for both construction site and tool safety, and 40-hour training on an actual bulldozer that had been

transported onto prison grounds." "The program was a huge success and planning has begun for another cohort to begin in July 2023," NMCD said.

SNMCF also offers two post-secondary programs, including Ashland University, which allows incarcerated students to receive Pell Grant funding to complete four-year degrees, NMCD said. "Instruction takes place on specialized tablets utilizing a secure cellular network," the department said. "The program is rigorous and students are held to the same academic standards as on-campus students at the university," NMCD said.

They can also continue their educations in person or remotely at New Mexico State University

or Doña Ana Community College, and SNMCF even helps with admission forms and applying for financial aid.

"I love the classes," said SNMCF Warden Ronald Martinez. "They have a chance to get out and make it again," he said. "We are here to rehabilitate the inmates, to make every inmate a productive citizen when they leave."

Because of its education program, "morale is so much better" at the prison, the warden said. "They have hope. We want to give them a second chance and make them well-rounded citizens."

Cunningham said she feels a real connection with her students.

"They have helped me see the positive side," she said. "I enjoy being there with them."

"I've got a great staff here," Martinez said. "They care about what they do."

SNMCF also has two full libraries on site that provide assistance to inmates with resources and materials needed for their own legal research, the department said.

SNMCF "is contributing to the statewide goal of 165 HSE completions

by the end of FY23 (June 30)," NMCD said.

SNMCF has 12 successful completions this school year, with additional groups of students starting the testing process every week. In just one week in April, seven students completed all testing and were waiting for scores.

"Our completion number is up from seven high school graduates in FY21 and eight graduates in FY22," the department said.

"We offer cognitive and family reunification programs, helping participants learn from their own life stories and prepare to be more positive influences in their communities and families," said NMCD Public Relations Manager Carmelina Hart. "Our department also offers comprehensive reentry services, including requesting replacement of vital documents (Social Security cards and birth certificates), resume writing and job searching, and general pre-release planning and preparation.

Sorg serving on Soil & Water Conservation District Board

Gill Sorg got a longer title and a little bit lighter workload when he gave up his seat on the Las Cruces City Council and was elected to the Doña Ana Soil and Water Conservation District (DASWCD) Board of Supervisors in 2021.

The district, as with others like it around the state, was created “to conserve and develop” the natural resources within its boundaries, provide for flood control, preserve wildlife, protect the tax base and promote the health and safety of district residents. DASWCD was created June 17, 1966, as the La Union Soil and Water Conservation District, according to daswcd.org. Its original boundaries were changed to include the City of Las Cruces in 2010 and the district’s name was changed.

One of DASWCD’s most important functions is “protecting our water,” Sorg said, “a very difficult thing to do when you’ve only got so much water.” Noxious weed control is another important role for soil and water conservation districts, along with preserving healthy soils and acting as the reviewing agency for Doña Ana County’s land use regulations.

One of Sorg’s “pet projects,” he said, is finding ways to control flash flooding in arroyos that feed into the Rio Grande. The goal is to “slow the water down” to reduce flood damage to homes, farmland and other

property and keep valuable sediment from being washed into the river. A good way to do that is encouraging the growth of vegetation in arroyos, which slows rushing storm water and also provides habitat for wildlife, Sorg said.

“We want to act like beavers,” he said, using dams of various sizes – sometimes just a simple row of rocks, Sorg said – to slow the water.

“There’s a lot of wins here,” he said.

DASWCD partners include the New Mexico Department of Agriculture (NMDA), New Mexico Water Resources Research Institute, U.S. Bureau of Reclamation, U.S. Bureau of Land Management and USDA’s Natural Resources Conservation Service.

“We’re all working together,” Sorg said. “We’re all on the same page.”

New Mexico soil and water conservation districts are governmental subdivisions of the state and receive state funding.

With bi-partisan support in both houses, the New Mexico Legislature passed Senate Bill 9 earlier this year, creating a number of “legacy permanent funds,” including the Land of Enchantment Legacy Fund, which will provide revenue to NMDA to “carry out programs and projects pursuant to the Noxious Weed Management Act,

the healthy Soil Act and the Soil and Water Conservation District Act,” according to the final version of the bill, which Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham signed into law in March.

The DASWCD board meets at 9 a.m. the second Thursday of the month at the USDA Services Center, 760 Stern Drive in Las Cruces, according to the DASWCD website. Sorg and the six other supervisors get along well and almost always vote unanimously on the issues that come before them, he said.

Sorg was a contractor representing Pioneer Seed Company assisting growers to produce alfalfa seed before being elected to the city council in 2009. He was re-elected in 2013 and 2017, giving up the seat after 12 years and winning a seat on the DASWCD board.

Sorg continues to serve on other boards as well, including the Mesilla Valley Audubon Society, the BLM’s Southern New Mexico Resource Advisory Council, the Outdoor New Mexico Board, the Conservation Board of New Mexico and the Paso del Norte Watershed Council. He also is part of the local NieghborWoods that encourages planting trees.

“We’re doing as much as we can,” Sorg said, but he is still concerned about what may be looming.

“I fear the future,” he said, including climate change and an inadequate water supply. “We can do a lot more conservation.”

Last year, "FBI: Most Wanted" got lucky, since the star it needed already was in executive producer Dick Wolf's employ.

As Julian McMahon's tenure on the CBS "FBI" spinoff was coming to an end, Dylan McDermott's stint on the Wolf-made NBC drama "Law & Order: Organized Crime" also was wrapping up. After McMahon's character Jess LaCroix died in the line of duty, McDermott stepped in as his successor, Remy Scott. In "Most Wanted's" fourth-season finale May 23, Scott gets a new chapter in his grief over his brother's death, since he gets fresh clues in the pursuit of the sibling's killer.

McDermott, whose daughter Colette recently appeared on "FBI: Most Wanted," recalls that he entered the show in an appropriate way ... with Scott meeting the other agents just as McDermott was meeting the other cast regulars. "I think that because these are professional people and these are agents, they know they have a job to do," McDermott reasons. 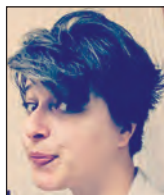

The event will feature

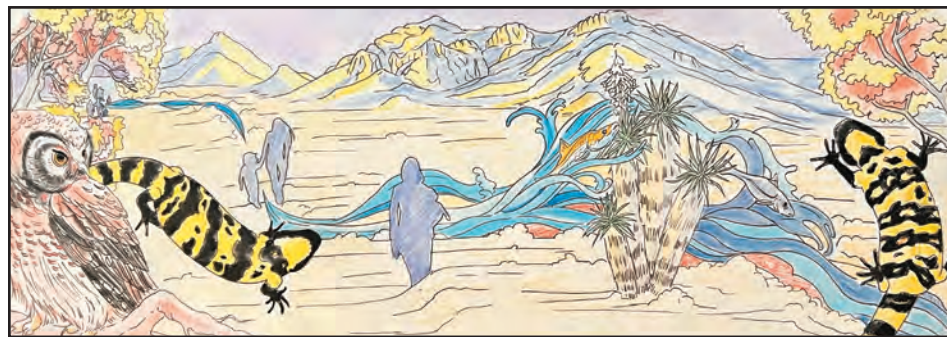

Imagine coming into work one morning and immediately having to respond to an emergency call. When you arrive on the scene you realize it is just a drill. Scenarios like this happen yearly for Las Cruces Utilities (LCU) Gas employees. Every year, LCU hosts a much-needed safety drill in partnership with the local fire department regarding natural gas emergencies.

LCU supervisors and trainers work closely with the Las Cruces Fire Department to set up drills for newer team members in both departments. Only a select few know when the drills will happen and what the scenario will be. Each drill is recorded so both teams can see how accurately their response was, and what they could improve upon for when a real-life event happens.

"It is important that we grow with positive feedback and with safety as a reminder," LCU Technical Gas Service Supervisor and Interim Gas System Operations Supervisor Pete Duran stated. "For instance, this last drill we had, one of our new team members passed out from the heat, and the fire department had to respond in this now real-life event," Duran continued.

On the day of these drills, two scenarios are presented. The first drill is a blowing natural gas line called in by the fire department, and the second drill is a natural gas line leak in which the fire department is called in for support. Each drill lasts up to two and a half hours. The first drill will take part in the morning and the second drill will take place early afternoon.

Drills only take place in the spring due to the extreme heat summers can bring. There are 25-30 people involved including natural gas locators, dispatchers, and service departments.

"The great thing about these drills is how they show what our strengths and weaknesses are as a team," Duran stated. "There is no discipline involved for mistakes, just a debrief meeting at the end of each drill and an opportunity to get better," Duran concluded.

The drills also provide an opportunity for both sides to learn the code words and lingo involved when both teams are called out to manage natural gas issues in the community.

"The first time we did this drill, we found a gap in not knowing code words that the fire department used, which we both were able to fix to work together as one team," Duran concluded.

Safety is a top priority at LCU. In fact, last year, LCU was nationally recognized for their efforts. Even with the last drill they were able to identify simple issues such as the importance of eating right and remaining hydrated when working in the field. LCU is committed to learning and growing with each drill to better serve the Las Cruces community.

“Don Quixote”

Borderlands Ballet Company (BBC) will perform “Don Quixote” at 7 p.m. Friday-Saturday, May 26-27, at the AS-NMSU Center for the Arts, 1000 E. University Ave.

Tickets are \$25.

“How, you might wonder, is it possible to turn Miguel de Cervantes’s 1,072-page epic story into a 90-minute ballet? The answer: You don’t,” BBC said in a news release.

The ballet’s libretto by Marius Petipa is based on only two chapters from the novel, BBC said. The story involves a love triangle between the beautiful and spirited Kitri (Allene Barton), the town barber Basilio (Joshua Godman) and the rich but vain Gamache (John Pohl).

“It’s a love story,” Barton said. “But it has some incredible comedic moments that are fun for the dancers as well as the audience. At the same time, this makes the show a challenge to perform because we can’t just focus on dancing, since so much of the show depends on really capturing the characters and the way they interact.”

“Don Quixote” is “a farcical romp that captures a passing moment in the

life of a Spanish town in hilarious and outlandish detail,” the news release said. “But don’t let the comedic overlay fool you. ‘Don Quixote’ has some of the most demanding choreography in the ballet repertoire.”

“If you look at the second act of ‘The Nutcracker,’ you can think of it as little more than a fantasy setting to perform a bunch of great dances to great music. Don Quixote is similar,” said BBC Artist Director Monique Foster. “You have this upbeat commedia dell’arte storyline full of high-energy dances culminating in the great wedding pas de deux.”

“The choreography for the cup dance is very technically demanding,” said Rachel Breck, who plays Mercedes, a street dancer who performs one of the ballet’s most iconic dances, BBC said. “The steps are hard enough, but it’s a real challenge to do them without knocking over the glasses!

But what I enjoy most about the scene is that Mercedes is the life of the party. In real life, I’m pretty quiet and introverted and it’s fun to play a character that is so different from myself.”

Often performed as a stand-alone piece, the final Grande Pas (Kitri’s Wedding) is a spectacular finale to the show, BBC said.

“The Wedding Pas is a beautiful ending,” said Barton. “The one-handed lifts are, of course, a showstopper. It’s been great having Josh (Godman) supporting me. He is such an experienced and strong partner. I hope the audience feels the same joy watching that we do performing the piece!”

across the landscape,” ESA said. “The river depicted in the mural is a potent force, breathing new life into the terrain and restoring its vitality. In the mural’s corners, one can observe the towering cottonwood trees, which are indigenous to the Doña Ana community and serve as a poignant reminder of the region’s rich natural heritage.”

“Despite the obstacles faced by the endangered species depicted in the mural, the artwork’s overarching message is one of hope,” artist Raquel Madrigal said. “It conveys that through diligent effort and unwavering commitment, it is conceivable to re-establish equilibrium in the ecosystem and revive the region’s vitality. The mural is a beautiful tribute to the significance of preserving the natural world and its diverse fauna.”

“Madrigal is an interdisciplinary artist with a degree in fine arts, who is

widely known for her captivating murals, posters and zines that incorporate her unique poetry,” ESA said.

The Endangered Species Act 50th Anniversary mural series will spotlight regional ecological and cultural diversity within the US by highlighting plants and animals that are protected by ESA, the news release said. Murals will be installed throughout 2023 across the United States.

The "cosmic horror" film stars Joe Sinclitico, Valerie Alene, Rachel Olsen and Pablo Medina.

It tells the story of a woman going to a support group to deal with anxiety and depression after a violent attack left her boyfriend dead.

"When her boyfriend seemingly returns from the dead, she will have to

face her fears to find out exactly who or what has come back before she loses her grip on reality," a news release about the film said.

The film script "was written as I was coming to terms with my own mental illness," Jara said. "Using the tropes and techniques of the horror genre, I wanted to find a way to give the audience a very intense visceral experience so they could feel both the dark but also

the slivers of light. Hopefully, this gives a fresh perspective to living with anxiety and depression that lets the viewers know that they aren't alone in this."

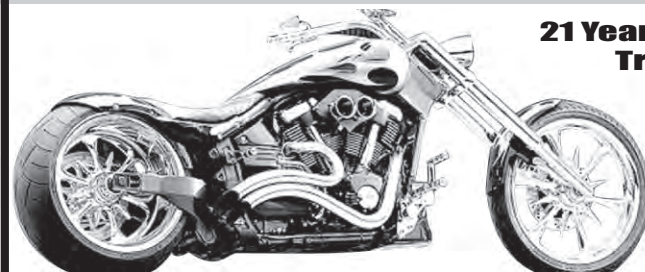

Aggie track tops WAC

Champions. No word in the world of sports is sweeter. After a tumultuous, weather-laden weekend that included torrential downpours and lightning delays, NM State was crowned the 2023 WAC Outdoor Track & Field Champions May 13.

Jhana Downie led the way for NM State, winning both the 200m and 400m titles, sweeping the events at both the Indoor and Outdoor 2023 WAC Track & Field Championships. Terice Steen broke the school record in the 400m hurdles, and joins the four other Aggies who recorded runner-up finishes.

Saturday

Makiya Moore secured the Aggie's first points on Saturday, launching herself into second place in the discus with a toss of 49.09m (161-1).

Bailey Beene took home a fourth-place finish in the javelin toss with a mark of 44.57m (146-3).

The 4x100 relay team of Sierra Brewer, Terice Steen, Jhana Downie and Grace Pendarvis combined to post a time of 44.80 – good for a silver medal finish and ties for the second fastest time in NM State history.

Thobile Amon paced herself for a big finish in the 1500m, timing in ninth after 300m and climbing all the way to a second-place finish with a time of 4:25.80.

The NM State trio of Aliyah Logan (13.08), Valissa Brown (13.32)

and T'Erica Boyd (13.70) crossed the line in the 100m hurdles in second, third and sixth respectively.

Following a nearly two-hour lightning delay, Jhana Downie lined up as the only Aggie in the 400m finals. After starting the race as the top-seed after Friday's prelims, Jhana Downie secured a photo-finish gold medal, edging out UT Arlington's Tatyana Terrell with a time of 52.72 – a new personal best and the third fastest time in NM State history. Competing in her second event of the afternoon, Sierra Brewer raced to fourth place in the 100m dash, crossing the line with a time of 11.73.

After her sister's silver medal performance in the 1500m run, it was Thulisile Amon's turn in the 800m. Following in her footsteps, Amon posted a time of 2:08.58 to finish in second, collecting a silver medal of her own and earning eight points for NM State.

Terice Steen, T'Erica Boyd and Breanna Moss

became the second Aggie trio to compete in the hurdles on Saturday, this time in the 400m variation. Earning the top spot and middle lane with her time of 58.81 in Thursday's prelims, Steen finished the race in second, recording a time of 58.36 – a personal best and the top time in NM State history.

Boyd followed next for the Aggies, posting a time of 1:00.16 en route to a fourth-place finish. Moss claimed fifth place, crossing the line with a time of 1:00.41.

Returning after her first-place finish in the 400m dash, Jhana Downie came from behind over the last stretch of the 200m race to take her second gold medal of the afternoon, posting a time of 23:37. In the deepest field of the afternoon, NM State had four student-athletes representing them in the 5,000m. Maggie Gibbs recorded a sixth-place finish after posting a time of 16:46.82, while Emily Stutesman posted a final time of 16:51.37 to take eighth.

In round 3, Centennial fell to No. 2 seed Carlsbad 2-1, which pushed the Hawks into the consolation round. There, they faced Piedra Vista again, this time falling 4-2. Centennial finished the season at 29-2, and undefeated at 15-0 in district play to win the district title.

Hooten brought Kenneth Mangrum to NMSU as associate head coach, as well as two assistant coaches: Payne Andrus and Zach Settembre.

Golf has a way of keeping its mysteries secret

I learned to play golf from my father and grandfather when I was 11 and 12. My Grandpa, Charles Hauser, was an expert golfer, who won many tournaments hosted by in Cleveland from 1940 to 1960 at some of the top local golf clubs. In my studio at home I have a half-dozen of his two-foot high trophies he handed down to me.

Throughout my youth, Grandpa Hauser always talked about the “secret” to golf. Every few months he would demonstrate something new with the swing – “the answer” – he would say, that he picked up from what he read or from golf pros he was friendly with. He had custom made clubs, the last set of which I have stored in my garage. His idol was Ben Hogan.

At the height of his play-

ing powers, during the 1940s and ‘50s Ben Hogan was thought to possess the “secret” to the golf swing and mastering the game of golf, a notion popularized by the media and that he promoted himself. In 1954, Hogan was paid \$10,000 by Time magazine for a story entitled “Ben Hogan’s Secret: a Debate.” Seven golf pros tried to guess what the secret was, to no avail.

At the time, rival tour pro Sam Snead cynically quipped “anybody can say he’s got a secret if he won’t tell what it is.” Then Life magazine featured Hogan on the cover of its August 8, 1955, issue (an original copy is valuable), and in its “Hogan’s Secret” article Hogan revealed the truth

about cupping (pronating) his left wrist, which he discovered after hitting thousands of balls on the practice range, in an effort to eliminate the dreaded hook. In his best-selling book, Ben Hogan’s Five Lessons (1957), he does share diagrams of the positions of his left wrist from the

backswing through impact. After those two magazine articles came, out a book titled “Golf Secrets of the Pros” suddenly appeared in 1956 featuring 18 of the biggest name pros at the time, except Hogan.

Over the years there have been thousands of articles and books dealing with golfing “secrets” (including some of my own)

as if we are still searching for the one golden key.

According to the Modern University Dictionary the definition of SECRET is: The key to a mystery, the governing principle of anything, known only to the initiated.

Back in the day of Charles Hauser, pro golfers were the “initiated” and all others were on the outside having to learn by lessons.

With all the information and products available in this post-modern age there should be no real secrets. But a prime example of how themes persist is the book “The Secret of Golf: A Century of Groundbreaking, Innovative and Occasionally Outlandish Ways To Master The World’s Most Vexing Game” (2005), Edited by George Pepper; it’s really good.

Yes, there are solid fundamentals, but no hidden secrets. Golf is too complicated for there to be one (secret) right way. As Mr. Herb Wimberly used to say, “the golf swing is simple; it’s the game that’s complicated.” Even with four professionals no two golfers have the same swing. There’s Jim Furyk and John Daly; Lee Trevino and Jack Nicklaus; Jon Rahm and Sungjae Im. And on and on.

My friend Jay Golden, PGA of America Life Member, golf teacher, motivational speaker and renaissance man, offers this: “Golf’s greatest gift is that golfers keep searching for the secret to golf. The secret is an element of the golf swing which will provide excellent shots consistently.

We’ve all hit great shots in our life. What did we do on that swing that we haven’t done on other swings? That is a never-ending search. It is the search which brings us to the driving range, the golf course, reading books, watching videos and taking lessons. What they’re doing is trying to find the ‘secret’ that will enable them to hit excellent shots almost all the time. I have searched for the secret almost every day for the last 60 years. In some ways it’s easy to find because I found it over 3,000 times.”

My secret is that there is no secret to the game of golf, or life.
