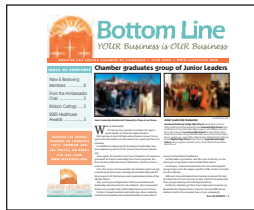

# BUCKLING UP SAVES LIVES.

Seat Belts are appropriate for your child if:

- |   |   |  |

| <b>1</b>  | <b>2</b>  | <b>3</b>   |
| The lap belt fits across a child's upper thighs and hips (not the abdomen); AND | The shoulder strap fits across the center a child's chest (not the neck); AND | The child can sit all the way back with knees bent over the seat edge. |



All occupants must be properly restrained in all seating positions. Violators must pay a \$25 fine plus court fees and receive 2 driver's license points against their driving privilege.

**RESTRAINT DEVICE MUST** meet federal standards, must be appropriate for the age and size of the child, and must be properly used.

### A CHILD UNDER THE AGE OF 1

Must ride in a rear-facing child safety seat in a back seat. If vehicle has no backseat, a child under 1 can ride in a front seat if the air bag is deactivated or if the vehicle does not have an air bag deactivation switch.

**IMPORTANT:** The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration recommends NEVER putting a rear-facing child safety seat in front passenger seat air bag.

### CHILD AGE 1 THROUGH 4 YEARS OR UNDER 40 POUNDS

Must ride in a child safety seat.

### CHILD AGE 5 THROUGH 6 YEARS

Must ride in a child safety booster seat.

### CHILD UNDER 60 POUNDS

Must ride in a child safety seat or booster seat, regardless of age.

### CHILD AGE 7 THROUGH 12 YEARS

Must be properly restrained in a child safety seat, booster seat, or seat belt.

### CHILD AGE 13 THROUGH 17 YEARS

Must wear a seat belt.

# FYI+ launches free summer meals program

## BULLETIN REPORT

Families & Youth Innovations Plus (FYI+) will launch its six-week Summer Food Service Program Monday, June 5, at more than 30 locations throughout Las Cruces and surrounding areas.

Children and youth ages 1-18 and adults with disabilities are eligible to visit any of the designated sites for free meals, FYI+ said in a news release. The program continues through Friday, July 14.

The program is managed by the State of New Mexico and is funded by the United States Department of Agriculture. The state works with multiple agencies like FYI+ “to ensure children across the state do not go hungry while school is out for summer break,” the news release said. “This year, FYI+ celebrates 30 years of providing this much-needed program,” said FYI+ Summer Food Program Manager Vanessa Uzueta. “And, we are happy to continue our service to children, youth and families in our community.”

FYI+ will employ 30 additional staff members to support the Summer Food Service Program, as approximately 1,500 meals a day will be delivered to about 30 site locations. The meals are prepared by Cravings Catering in Las Cruces in accordance with USDA guidelines for nutritious meals, FYI+ said.

To ensure each child receives a full meal and the best nutrition possible, children are required to eat meals on-site.

“Ever since the COVID-19 pandemic, the number of children and youth in need of healthy meals has increased tremendously,” Uzueta said, “This is why we work with so many sponsoring sites like parks, schools and community centers across our area to serve the needs of the community.”

A full list of meal service sites is at [www.summerfoodnm.org](http://www.summerfoodnm.org). Some sites serve breakfast and lunch, while others only serve lunch or dinner.

The Summer Food Service Program will serve dinner on four dates during the City of Las Cruces Music in the Park Series and three dates during the city’s Movies in the Park series. The program will not provide meals on the national

holidays of Juneteenth (Monday, June 19) or Independence Day (Tuesday, July 4).

# Veterans Treatment Court celebrates five years

"I am holding my head up," a graduate of the Doña Ana County Veterans

Treatment Court said May 23, as the court celebrated its fifth anniversary with a gala in courtroom No. 1 of the Third Judicial District Courthouse in Las Cru-

ces. "This program really works," he said.

The court provides substance abuse treatment, mental and behavioral health counseling, case management and other services "to divert justice-involved veterans and active service members from the traditional criminal justice system," according to the court.

"This is such an important program," said Four Paws and a Wakeup founder and owner Andrea Joseph, whose nonprofit trains service dogs who are donated to veterans.

Other attendees included Las Cruces City Manager Ifo Pili, County Commissioners Susana Chaparro and Diana Murillo (the mayor of Anthony, New Mexico), Mesilla Mayor Nora Barraza, Third Judicial District Presiding Judge Conrad Perea, Third Judicial District Attorney Gerald Byers and City of Las Cruces Municipal Judge II Anthony F. Filosa.

"I couldn't do this work without the support of the community," said Third Judicial District Judge James T. Martin, who is the veterans court judge. "Treatment is a key component" of the court's success, Martin said.

The court is successful in "restoring individuals to meaningful, productive lives," said attorney Rory Rand, one of the court's founders. "It breaks the cycle of drugs and crime." "I see veterans who are struggling. I see veterans who are making progress," said Veterans Justice Outreach Coordinator Montevis Price, who works in the DA's office. "A program like this allows someone who has struggled to get back on track. This program works."

The court's alumni program is central to the success of veterans served by the court, said United States Army Master Sergeant (retired) Roy Maldonado, who is the court's mentor coordinator. Through that program, he said, the court "continues to be a part of their lives." "I came to the program

homeless and I am leaving it a homeowner," said the court's honorary graduate. "Above all, I am sober. [The court] opened my eyes. For once, I had purpose and direction."

The court, she said, helped her to answer questions such as "What is it that I value? (and) What is it that makes me happy." "The support was there," she said.

## Reflecting on the supreme sacrifice

For safety reasons, they were battery-powered candles, placed into clear plastic cups.

Physically, it was not the same as, say, a live candle in a crafted tin holder in St. Patrick's Cathedral.

But the gesture of listening to the name, then placing the candle in the cup, was as sacred as any prayer delivered in church.

I'm talking about the candle-light memorial service at Veterans Memorial Park on Memorial Day.

The volunteers lined up to get their candles as the sun dropped over the park, and a bagpipe player in the distance struck a melancholy tone.

With the candles, volunteers

also received a card with the name of the person who had paid the ultimate sacrifice in combat. The service was a tribute to the 204 residents of Doña Ana County who had fallen in military action since World War I.

I was given a pair of candles and the accompanying names.

Fred Montes and Felix Montoya, each U.S.

Army soldiers who gave their all in World War II.

It's difficult for us today to get the sense of what a national effort World War II became. Almost everyone, whether military or civilian, played a role.

As we waited for the ceremony to begin, I pondered the names, which I had not seen

until that evening. More than likely, Fred Montes and Felix Montoya were young men. They may or may not have been married. They may or may not have had children.

If they were young, anywhere from 18 to 25, it was likely their mother and father were still alive when the soldiers lost their lives.

These thoughts and more swirled in my head as we waited, and especially as the names began to be called.

I imagined – tried to imagine – the Montes and Montoya households when the news first arrived from Europe, or the Pacific, or wherever.

We've all seen the scenes in movies, where two soldiers wearing their dress uniforms arrive at a front door to deliver the

worst news possible.

Were Fred Montes and Felix Montoya elder children, with smaller siblings still at home? If so, I imagine the mother clutching a smaller child tightly as she cried her pain.

Or maybe Fred or Felix was a baby of the family. Maybe they had other brothers fighting the war.

As much as we can try to somehow imagine these things, as many times we see them in the movies, or read about them in books, nothing can compare to the reality of actually losing a loved one.

Losing a loved one at any age, for any reason, is unbearable.

For those lost in war, there is an additional element.

In some ways they belong to all of us.

## Is civilian review board best solution?

The effort to create a civilian review board for the Police Department threatens to create a rift between the City Council and some progressive voters during a municipal election year when police and crime will undoubtedly be a major topic.

There's little disagreement as to the need for reform. Fatal police interactions with Amelia Baca (settled for \$2.5 million) and Antonio Valenzuela (settled for \$6.5 million) have cost taxpayers \$9 million, and taken beloved members from two families.

Jonathan Strickland survived being shot 12 times by police, but Presley C. Eze Jr. was shot in the back of the head and killed after a scuffle with police that started with a can of beer stolen from a convenience store. That has led the local chapter of the NAACP to request a federal investigation into allegations there is a pattern

of civil rights abuses committed by police. The city's current system of police oversight has been outsourced to a private firm called the OIR Group. They audit the city's process for handling complaints and recommend systematic improvements, but don't actually look into the complaints themselves.

There is no outside investigation in cases where the actions of police result in death. Those continue to be investigated by a task force of fellow officers from the same or nearby departments. They conduct a secret investigation, then file a secret report that inevitably leads to a public declaration by the District Attorney the officer had done nothing wrong.

The only time the public gets

to hear any of the details is if the lawsuit filed against the city goes to court. And that is usually prevented by multi-million dollar settlements at the expense of city taxpayers who remain in the dark.

A civilian review board would be one solution to that problem. The question is, would it be the best solution?

A 2001 report by the Department of Justice found there had been

an increase in the use of civilian review boards, but noted that, "many of these procedures have a troubled history involving serious - even bitter - conflict among the involved parties."

There is a mixed history as to the effectiveness of civilian review boards around the nation. Given the proper organization, funding and mission, a civilian

review board here could play a small role in the overall reform effort. But it won't solve the problem of who determines accountability following fatal interactions with police.

Recent legislation introduced in Santa Fe would have moved the investigation of police killings from the local agencies to the State Law Enforcement Academy. That would allow for a more unbiased and detached review.

## Galactic flight prepares for next missions

Virgin Galactic Holdings, Inc. on May 25 successfully completed its Unity 25 mission to space. Mission specialists Jamila Gilbert, Christopher Huie and Luke Mays became the newest Virgin Galactic Astronauts as they evaluated the end-to-end astronaut training and space-flight experience.

The company will now prepare for commercial spaceline operations beginning with the 'Galactic 01' mission planned for late June.

"The 'Unity 25' mission was a fantastic achievement for everyone at Virgin Galactic," said Michael Colglazier, CEO. "Witnessing our inspiring crew's pure joy upon landing, I have complete confidence in the unique astronaut experience we have built for our customers. Our teams now begin post-flight analysis as well as preparation for 'Galactic 01', our commercial research mission, planned for late June."

"New Mexico, you are even more enchanting from space," said Jamila Gilbert, Mission Specialist, Virgin Galactic. "I flew to space just one hour from the street I grew up on. It is hard to put into words what this experience was like, but I'm sure I'll spend the rest of my life trying. I'm not only honored to be one of the first 100 women and one of 16 Hispanic and Latinx people to go to space, I'm also incredibly proud to represent the community from where this new space age is blossoming. As one of the very few nontechnical people to fly to space, my role in this mission marks a sea change in who can go to space, and is a promising sign of the opportunities Virgin Galactic and the commercial space sector are ushering in."

"Looking down at our beautiful planet from space, something that so few humans

have experienced, was such a humbling, awe-inspiring, and reverent experience," said Christopher Huie, Mission Specialist, Virgin Galactic. "As one of the first 20 Black people who have gone to space, I hope that I can inspire the next generation of astronauts who look like me to set their goals high and break down the mental and institutional barriers that have held people of color back. This is just the beginning, and I look forward to continuing to push boundaries with Virgin Galactic and shine a spotlight on the doors that commercial space travel can open for innovation."

# Council hears update on natural gas procurement

The City of Las Cruces has more than 45,000 natural gas customers in Las Cruces and Doña Ana County, city Utilities (LCU) Director Adrienne Widmer told the Las Cruces City Council at its May 22 work session, as she updated the council on the city's natural gas providers, carriers and costs.

The city built its natural gas system in 1935 and began providing service to customers in 1936, Widmer said. The city joined the Village of Hatch in a gas service association in 1969 that broke up in 2010 as the Hatch service was sold to Zia Natural Gas Company in Las Cruces.

The city's natural gas system is today a nonprofit that relies entirely on the revenue it generates.

City gas service area includes 304 square miles. It has 42,605 connections in the city and 2,666 connections outside city limits. That total includes 12 industrial customers. The utility has 1,011 miles of gas lines, 91 regulator stations

and a staff of 47 employees and four others on contract.

The utility's 10 largest customers are New Mexico State University, Saputo Cheese, Memorial Medical Center, Olam West Coast, Inc. the City of Las Cruces, MountainView Regional Medical Center, Alaska Structures (a division of AKS Industries), NASA, American Linen Supply and Las Cruces Regional Medical.

The city received an American Public Gas Association (APGA) safety management excellence award in 2022, an APGA SOAR silver level award in 2021 and bronze level awards in 2020 and 2019.

It received a \$10 million grant from the Natural Gas Distribution Infrastructure Safety and Modernization Grant Program that was presented by U.S. Secretary of Transportation Pete Buttigieg during an April visit to Las Cruces. The grant will be used for modernizing and rehabilitating the city natural gas system.

LCU has three natural gas suppliers: Shell Energy North America, New Mex-

ico Energy Acquisition Authority (NMEAA) and Public Energy Authority of Kentucky (PEAK). LCU has prepaid orders with NMMEAA and PEAK and places orders with Shell each month.

El Paso Natural Gas pipeline company delivers 100 percent of the natural gas received by LCU, with 55 percent coming from the Permian Basin in southeast New Mexico and west Texas and 45 percent coming from the San Juan Basin in northwest New Mexico, northeast Arizona, southwest Colorado and southeast Utah.

The city paid nearly \$7.4 million for natural gas in January 2023. Customers use more gas during heating season, November-March, than during the rest of the calendar year.

The cost of natural gas reached historically high prices because of colder-than-normal weather in the western

United States, reduced gas flow from Canada to northern California and an interruption of gas flow from the Permian Basin during the winter of 2022-23, said city gas business analyst Mario Puentes.

The city council adopted the city's energy transition plan in 2021, targeting a reduction in carbon emissions and the identification and prioritization of different energy sources that are economical and environmentally sustainable.

"The success of the homeowner journey for our families is made possible by the willingness of our community members. They show up. They work hard. Qualifying homeowners are selected based on economic need, ability to pay their share of the costs and willingness to help with the construc-

tion. Every local family that qualifies for a MVHH house must contribute 300-500 hours of sweat equity helping to build their own home or someone else's. Each participating family makes a small down payment on the house and

# Locals added to state council

City of Las Cruces Housing and Neighborhood Services Manager Natalie Green and KT Homes LLC CEO Kent Thurston of Las Cruces have been appointed to the New Mexico Housing Investment Council, which Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham created by executive order May 23.

“The housing investment council presents an opportunity to work with housing experts and utilize best practices to develop a plan that tailored to the needs of all New Mexicans no matter what stage of the housing continuum from homelessness to homeownership they may be in,” Green said. “I look forward to representing local government and southern New

Mexico in the efforts to solve the housing crisis through collaboration with the state, local governments, nonprofits and private partnerships.”

“There are a lot of things this council will help us out on,” Thurston said. “With this council and the ability to do it, you will see more people willing to invest in New Mexico because we won’t tie up their dollar as long.”

The executive order tasks the council “to develop a strategic housing investment plan that addresses gaps in available housing resources, inefficiencies in regulatory and zoning that impact housing development, workforce and business shortages in the housing development industries, the facilitation of public-

private partnerships and more,” the governor’s office said in a news release.

Other council members are former New Mexico House of Representatives speaker Brian Egolf of Santa Fe (chair), state Sen. Michael Padilla of Albuquerque, state Rep. ### What is leadership?

It's not an easy question to answer for experienced adults, let alone for high schoolers. But a group of about 30 high school juniors in Las Cruces spent several months over the school year exploring that very question.

In addition to exploring the meaning of leadership, they also explored a good bit of the Greater Las Cruces community.

Once again, the Greater Las Cruces Chamber of Commerce presented its Junior Leadership Las Cruces program, the first one since 2019 that wasn't affected by Covid in at least some way.

Over the course of nine months, the students spent one day a month away from class, learning about leadership and different aspects of the business and organizational sides of the Mesilla Valley.

The year began in September with an orientation and leadership education day for the students, who represented almost every public and private high school in Las Cruces.

October brought medical and health day, where students visited local hospitals and medical facilities to learn about

careers in the field of healthcare.

In November, agriculture was the topic of the day, as students got to experience some real-life farm duties.

In January, students learned how the arts and nonprofit groups help create the unique quality of life we have in southern New Mexico.

February showed students how local government fits into the daily lives of Las Cruces, as they visited first-hand with those people making and enforcing local laws.

In March, students got their trip to Spaceport America on Economic Development day to discuss the role different industries lend to the economic base of our community.

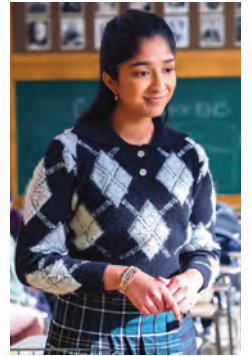
## "Tex Mex Motors - Season 1"

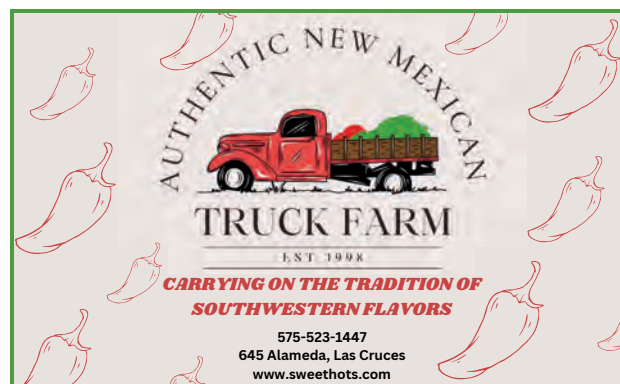

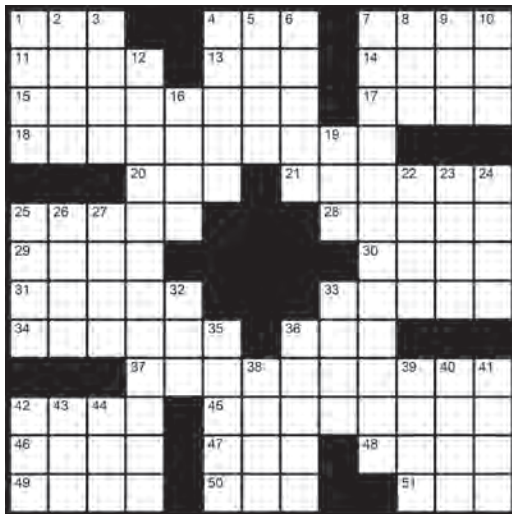

### Checking In with DIANE FARR

Diane Farr brought experience with her to "Fire Country" ... not from having been a firefighter, but from also having played one before.

Now a cast regular opposite star and executive producer Max Thieriot and others on the Friday CBS drama series (also streaming on Paramount+) that is headed toward its second season, the actress is skilled in both comedy ("The Drew Carey Show") and drama ("Grey's Anatomy"), but her serious side got a workout early in the run of the Denis Leary-led fire-company-themed show "Rescue Me." As she now plays the fire-division-chief mother of Thieriot's convict and volunteer-fireman character, Farr is finding elements of that earlier job useful.

Actually, she points out that "Fire Country" is "my third time" depicting that profession, the first being in the 2002 TV movie "Superfire." She says that for that, "I had to learn how to fly a Cessna. For the second job, I had to learn everything, because nobody thought I could be a firefighter. I trained with three ladies in three states. It was super-hard.

"And I didn't know what Cal Fire was before this," Farr notes about the organization "Fire Country" dramatizes. "I didn't understand the difference between a structure fire and an outdoor fire. I understood the concept that firefighters

are running in the building when everybody else is running out. It's like they come with a built-in hero (mindset). Even shooting in Vancouver, it was 112 (degrees) the first week we were there. We were in a rainforest. It's not equipped to have that much heat with that much fuel."

Indeed, Farr emphasizes, "The trees, the leaves, the bushes ... it's fuel, so it feels scarier in the world (rather than in a studio)."

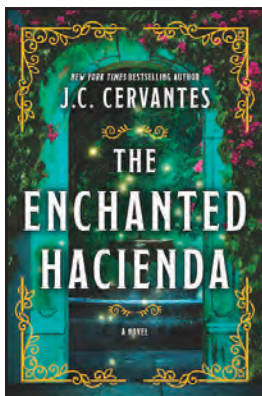
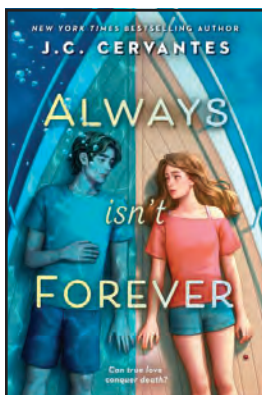

# Farm & Ranch Museum exhibit explores ag research

## BULLETIN REPORT

The New Mexico Farm and Ranch Heritage Museum (FRHM), 4100 Dripping Springs Road, is opening a new exhibit that uses the inspirational stories of seven remarkable individuals to explore the importance of agricultural research in an ever-changing world.

“Beyond the Farm: Groundbreaking Agriculture” opens in the museum’s north corridor with an opening reception 1:30-4 p.m. Friday, June 2, the museum said in a news release. Rolando Flores, dean of the NMSU College of Agricultural, Consumer and Environmental Sciences, will speak at 1:45 p.m.

“Farmers and ranch-

ers keep us fed, clothed and sheltered,” FRHM said. “With fewer farmers, less land in agriculture and more people to feed, the demand to increase efficiency and productivity is clear. Through the support of land grant universities like NMSU, researchers have increased our quality of life and continue to work towards solving worldwide challenges like hunger and disease.”

“NMSU has supported the groundbreaking research and discoveries of several agriculturalists and food scientists,” said FRHM Executive Director Heather Reed. “The individuals featured have a unique story to tell as they overcame challenges, broke barriers, and made

contributions to agriculture that paved the way for future scientists and healthier generations.”

The Beyond the Farm exhibit shares the individual stories of a diverse group of people connected to NMSU, including:

- Acclaimed for making chile more accessible to American tastes, Fabián García (1872-1948) is enshrined in the National Agricultural Hall of Fame and the National Hall of Fame for the American Society for Horticultural Science.

- A new immigrant to the United States, Sam Steel (1876-1893) would have been the first graduate of NMSU, then called New Mexico College of Agriculture & Mechanic Arts. A keen scholar, Steel

entered college at age 13 and would have received a bachelor’s degree at age 17, had he not been killed just a few months before graduation.

- One of NMSU’s first Spanish-speaking home demonstration agents, Fabiola Cabeza de Baca (1894-1991,) overcame many barriers to provide life-changing educational opportunities for low-income New Mexicans living in remote Hispanic and Pueblo communities.

- Roy Nakayama (1923-88) worked with New Mexico plant breeders and farmers and conducted

research at NMSU for 32 years, making important contributions to the chile and pecan industries.

- Jessie Fitzgerald (1930-2013) grew up on her parents’ remote homestead in New Mexico’s Jemez Mountains. Pushing through various barriers and challenges, she never stopped reaching for her dream of becoming the first female county agricultural agent in the United States.

- If you have a list of foods you deeply crave, you can probably thank Rose Marie Valdes Pangborn (1932-90), a sensory

scientist from Las Cruces who got her start at NMSU. Her research and discoveries left our dinner tables that much more delicious and satisfying.

- Globally acclaimed as a preeminent entomologist and a dedicated humanitarian, Anthony “Tony” Bellotti (1937-2013) was a graduate of NMSU and dedicated his life to improving the nutrition, health and agricultural sustainability of the world’s populace.

Understanding how these groundbreakers impact our lives and our communities is called “Agricultural Literacy,” the museum said. From creating a new variety of crops to making food safe to eat, scientists are working at research farms to make our lives better.”

Exhibit visitors are also invited to learn about the “Pillars of Agricultural Literacy,” which include agriculture’s relationship with the environment; food, fiber and energy; animals; lifestyle; technology and the economy, FRHM said.

FRHM is open 10 a.m.-4 p.m. Monday-Saturday. Admission is free for children ages 3 and under, Farm and Ranch Museum Friends members and senior citizens on Wednesdays; \$2 for active U.S. military and veterans; \$3 for children ages 4-17; \$4 for seniors ages 60 and older; and \$5 for adults.

The 47-acre interactive museum brings to life the 4,000-year history of growing food and fiber in this region.

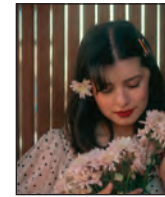

# Clearing the clutter for a pathway to simplicity

There are 20 self-storage facilities in Las Cruces.

My garage is full and most of the wall space is used up in the house. It's a serious problem, and not only for me. Many of us have more possessions than we can adequately store, and they turn on us!

Eventually they possess us; we don't possess them. We live with complexity and not with simplicity. We are a nation of gatherers, which goes against the tug of simplicity. It's a predicament. How did we get here?

Henry David Thoreau sought simplicity and thus he thought many products were unnecessary and eventually burdensome. More clutter in a life already cluttered – even in the Nineteenth Century. “No labor-saving device in the history of mankind ever saved anyone any labor,” said Thoreau with, I think, a wink in his eye.

Another sage notion about clutter was that “every degree of luxury has a connection with unnecessary labor,” so said the Quaker sage John Woolman. Woolman was seeking simplicity in personal dress. I have known people with closets stuffed with more clothes than you can dream of, but

they were stuck with the obvious problem of which to choose on any given occasion.

When you spend so much time, let alone money, on figuring out what to wear, you are going to lose any simplicity.

There is a social concern with clothing; think about the people who produce the goods we wear on our heads, bodies, and feet. Are these people amply compensated for their labor? Do they have a good quality of life? Are their workplaces safe, clean, and protected? Questions like these come to mind if you are committed to an informed simplicity that takes into consideration the needs of others.

The search for simplicity includes opposition. If you choose the value of simplicity in your life, you are automatically opting out of greed and excess on any and every plane of life. Simplicity leads to spaciousness. As we simplify in various ways, we gain more inner and probably also more outer space to include others in our lives. We are not, to use the phrase, so full of ourselves that we have no room for others' opinions, values, insights and hopes.

My first great love in high school and beyond

was a girl whose parents were teachers. They lived in an ordinary house in an ordinary neighborhood, as did I, but there was something different about their home and, noticeably, their lives. They chose to live rather sparsely. It was a choice and not an imposition, that was clear. The parents seemed to listen to each other and to my girlfriend, their daughter. There was a palpable depth to their simplicity. It was not for show, nor was it a veneer pasted over their usual behavior. They proved that simplicity is not a mask for superficiality nor a cover for mediocrity.

Simplicity in speech means you don't tell lies, that you speak plainly and that you “let your yes be yes and your no be no” as we read in the Epistle of James in the New Testament, which is a repeat of a saying from Jesus. Simplicity is, in short, opposed to duplicity in speech as well as in other areas of life.

Simplicity is marked by a singular approach to life, in which clutter, whether mental or material, has been cleared. Such singularity is possible only by virtue of a focused and reflective mind and heart. With this awareness and realization, we are driven inward, to look within ourselves to see if we are free enough to be simple.

# LC Banitas making waves in women's league

The New Mexico Banitas, Las Cruces' women's tackle football team, will play their first ever Women's Football Alliance (WFA) playoff game in June.

The Banitas will play the Rocky Mountain Thundercats at 6 p.m. Saturday, June 24, at Bear Stadium at Cloudcroft High School in Cloudcroft, in the first round of the playoffs.

The Banitas played this season's home games in Cloudcroft because of renovations at the Field of Dreams in Las Cruces, where they played home games last year.

But first, the team finishes its six-game regular session with a Saturday, June 3, game against the Sun City Stealth at 6 p.m. at Andres High School in El Paso.

"It's the women's battle of Interstate 10," Banitas General Manager Jamar Cotton said.

With a win in El Paso, the Banitas would finish the 2023 season 5-1. They defeated the Stealth 38-28 in an April 29 game in Cloudcroft.

The highlight of the regular season was a 12-6 Banitas victory over the Mile High Blaze May 20 in Denver. The Blaze are the defending WFA Division 1 national champions.

"There was history made that night," Cotton said, as the victory marked the first time in WFA history that a Division 3 team defeated a

Division 1 team.

Some likened the upset to NMSU beating Alabama.

Cotton said the Blaze didn't score until the last two minutes of the game because of the strong performance of the Banitas defense throughout the contest.

"We prepared the ladies all that week. The coaches believed we had the opportunity to win, to do something that had never been done," he said. "They believe in the coaches; we believe in them. We all depend on each other. We figure out what we need to do as a team.

"You can see the difference last year to this year," Cotton said. "This year, we want it more."

Cotton said the Banitas' "great fan base" has also been part of the team's success. It has followed the team to home games in Cloudcroft and was also a big presence during the win in Denver.

The Village of Cloudcroft "has been open from day one," he said. "They gave us everything that we needed to be successful."

"We heard our fans" during the May 20 game against the Blaze, Cotton said. "It was like a home game."

Cotton also credited the Banitas' success to team sponsors in Las Cruces, Alamogordo, Deming and El Paso.

"It's a beautiful thing when everything comes together. We just need to keep the momentum going; can't let down

now we've come too far," said Banitas Head Coach Brian Bartlett. The other coaches are Noah Bartlett, Tre Bennett and Jessica Segura.

"We started this season with a goal and that goal was to make it to Canton," said Banitas tight end and defensive end/outside linebacker Cindy Pitts.

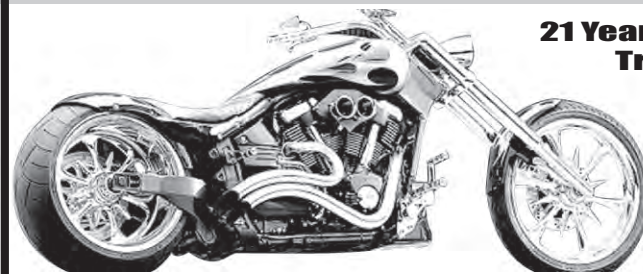

# You can do something about your chronic slice

I think somebody long ago applied the word “slice” to golf upon noticing that a slicer’s golf club moves across the ball much like a knife slices across a roast, from outside in. When you do that with a golf club, your clubface imparts a clockwise spin to the ball (for righties) resulting in an often dramatic right to right bending shot that vaguely resembles a foul ball into the right field bleachers. The slice – sometimes called a banana ball, a shrimp, a pitchout or powerfade – has been the bane of golfers since they sent featheries sailing into the gorse centuries ago.

I estimate golf teachers, golf club companies, golf gadget makers and golf magazines have spent

more time, money and effort trying to find a solution for slicers than any other facet of golf. Putting is second.

Maybe it’s because 80 percent of recreational golfers slice the ball. It puzzles me how the dreaded slice has become regarded as a disease and a curse which requires the afflicted to seek a “cure.” Club throwing, tantrums, shanking, sandbagging, dawdling, stupid wardrobes, and driving a cart under the influence should classify more as behaviors needing a cure. Still, most golfers who play with an awful slice go on for years feeling miserable and yet do nothing about it. Almost all slicers tend

to swing with an “over-the-top” move, instead of dropping the club down from an inside path to the ball. Hitting from the top causes the club to return to the outside in, and usually with the clubface open. The slice is further worsened by doing what is called “casting” (as you

would use a fishing rod), or simply flipping the club down with the hands before making a weight shift. Accompanying these two defective moves, we see a “chicken wing” right elbow with hunched shoulders moving horizontally not vertically. Correcting these swing flaws may take a little time but don’t get dis-

couraged; it can be done.

It doesn’t matter how unconventional your backswing may be; what really matters is how the club head is returned to the ball at impact. We have seen so many champion golfers who start their swing way outside but then bring the club back for perfect impact. Lee Trevino and Jim Furyk are good examples of that very idea. Slicers usually take their club back too far and too high, making it difficult to get it on the proper plane for an inside path. If you are over 50 and lacking flexibility, shorten your swing and keep your trail arm close to your side. You can generate adequate club speed with a three-quarter swing.

You can buy a lot of expensive anti-slice training

aids, but here’s a free and effective one. Get a block of Styrofoam (6 inches by 8 inches) and place it outside your ball. A large head cover will also do. If you’re coming over the top and outside in your club will hit the foam. Placing alignment rods so you bring the club inside will also work. Beware of expensive golf products, including DVDs, that promise an instant cure to your slice.

As the late curmudgeon H. L. Mencken once said, “for every complex problem there is a solution that is simple, neat and wrong.”

If you are an habitual slicer think of the law of inertia which says “a body in motion remains in motion unless acted upon by an outside force.” In your case the “outside force” is

a golf teacher. You need somebody with a keen eye for the golf swing and a good sense of communication to give you feedback and training. Intuitively you must realize there is cause-and-effect going on here.

There might be several dozen causes for your slice. It could be a weak grip, bad posture, poor set-up, Zorro-fast swing, arms-only swing, wrong clubs, reverse (backward) pivot or other faults. Have your swing teacher analyze your swing mechanics to identify the flaws. And if you refuse to take lessons and continue to slice, get your brain analyzed.
