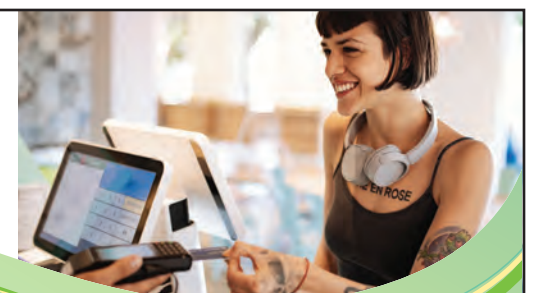

Seat Belts are appropriate for your child if:

All occupants must be properly restrained in all seating positions. Violators must pay a \$25 fine plus court fees and receive 2 driver's license points against their driving privilege.

RESTRAINT DEVICE MUST meet federal standards, must be appropriate for the age and size of the child, and must be properly used.

A CHILD UNDER THE AGE OF 1

Must ride in a rear-facing child safety seat in a back seat. If vehicle has no backseat, a child under 1 can ride in a front seat if the air bag is deactivated or if the vehicle does not have an air bag deactivation switch.

IMPORTANT: The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration recommends NEVER putting a rear-facing child safety seat in front passenger seat air bag.

CHILD AGE 1 THROUGH 4 YEARS OR UNDER 40 POUNDS

Must ride in a child safety seat.

CHILD AGE 5 THROUGH 6 YEARS

Must ride in a child safety booster seat.

CHILD UNDER 60 POUNDS

Must ride in a child safety seat or booster seat, regardless of age.

CHILD AGE 7 THROUGH 12 YEARS

Must be properly restrained in a child safety seat, booster seat, or seat belt.

CHILD AGE 13 THROUGH 17 YEARS

Must wear a seat belt.

Fire department to take over ambulance billing

The Las Cruces Fire Department (LCFD) will begin billing for ground ambulance service the department provides.

That change, effective July 1, is part of an agreement among the City of Las Cruces, Doña Ana County and American Medical Response (AMR) ambulance service, Fire Chief Jason Smith told the Las Cruces City Council at its May 22 work session.

LCFD and Doña Ana County are currently evaluating responses to a joint RFP to provide ground

ambulance service. Once a provider is selected, LCFD will monitor the provider's service for the county.

Billing for transport will include relief in hardship cases, Smith said. For example, a family of four with an annual household income of \$30,000 or less could receive a 100 percent reduction in their out-of-pocket expenses. A family of four with a \$60,000 income will receive a 75 percent reduction and a family of four with a \$90,000 income will receive a 25 percent reduction.

Charges will be \$100 for a patient evaluation and

\$625-\$750 depending on the life support services provided, plus mileage.

LCFD is also interested in developing automatic aid agreements with the county, New Mexico State University and the Town of Mesilla, Smith said.

Las Cruces had various ground ambulance service providers until 1990, when the city entered multiple agreements with Doña Ana County for the service.

In March 2020, at the direction of the city council, LCFD filed for a certificate of necessity (CON) from the New Mexico Public Regulation Commission

to allow the city greater influence in contracting for ambulance service, with a goal of improving 911 emergency response time. Both the county and AMR filed protests, which were withdrawn as part of a July 2020 settlement among the three parties.

For the period July-December 2022, AMR received 3,506 calls for service, Smith said, with a benchmark of responding to 85 percent of calls within 10 minutes and 59 seconds. AMR met the benchmark less than 65 percent of the time, the

chief said, and almost five percent of calls took 21 minutes or longer.

During that same period, LCFD met the 10:59 benchmark 84.5 percent (squads) and 94.2 percent (engines/trucks) of the time, Smith said. The LCFD strategic plan called for the department to respond to 90 percent of emergency calls within nine minutes. Its response time was actually under nine minutes 84.5 percent of the time, the chief said. LCFD is staffing an additional LCFD squad (ambulance) during peak daytime hours and is de-

signing a ninth fire station to improve response times, the chief said.

LCFD began training emergency medical technicians (EMTs) in the 1990s and graduated its first paramedic class in 2006. Today, 51 of LCFD's 163 sworn personnel are paramedics, with more coming, Smith said. In 2002, LCFD responded to about 11,000 calls. The current call volume is 22,000-24,000 calls a year, Smith said.

LCFD has eight fire stations throughout the city, with a ninth planned for 2025 on the East Mesa.

Juneteenth celebration planned for June 16-19

A weekend of Juneteenth events and activities will be held Friday-Monday, June 16-19, hosted by the New Mexico State University Men of Color program, DJ Black, Doña Ana County NAACP and the City of Las Cruces.

The Juneteenth celebration “emphasizes the importance of freedom, for all people,” said NAACP DAC President Bobbie Green.

The 2023 theme is “This is Power,” which “speaks to the strength and resiliency of the NAACP and its supporters,” Green said.

“Over the last few years there has been increased

political and, in some cases, physical attacks on human rights, civil rights, trans rights, women rights, DEI efforts, and assaults on Black and Brown people,” said Patrick Turner, NMSU associate provost for student success and the creator of the Men of Color program. “Juneteenth not only reminds us to honor and celebrate the work of our ancestors, but also to make America accountable to the promise made and debt owed of life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness for everyone. My role is to constantly send the ‘payment due’ notice in the mail to America. This celebration allows me to share this moment with the NMSU campus and the local Las

Cruces community.”

The Juneteenth banquet will begin at 6 p.m. Saturday, June 17, at the Las Cruces Convention Center, 680 W. University Ave. The keynote speaker is state Sen. Harold Pope Jr. of Albuquerque, the first African American ever elected to the New Mexico Senate, and the Derrick Lee Group.

Tickets to the banquet are \$50 and are available at naacpdac.org.

Juneteenth history

The Emancipation Proclamation, which President Abraham Lincoln signed Jan. 1, 1863, declared “all persons

held as slaves within any (rebellious state), shall be then, thenceforward, and forever free.”

Word did not reach Texas, the western-most state in the Confederacy, until June 19, 1865, when about 2,000 Union troops arrived at Galveston

Bay.

U.S. Army Major Gen. Gordon Granger (1821-76) read General Order No. 3, which carried news of the Emancipation Proclamation and freed all remaining slaves in Texas.

Juneteenth, which became a federal holiday in 2021, commemorates the announcement of the order and Granger’s enforcement of it.

“Juneteenth marks our country’s second independence day,” the National Museum of African American History and Culture said on its website.

The NAACP was founded Feb. 12, 1909, in Baltimore.

Visit Las Cruces unveils new tagline

"I can't wait until everyone hears this," Assistant City Manager Ikani Taumoepeau said Wednesday evening, May 31, just before Visit Las Cruces (VLC) unveiled its new slogan: "The Real New Mexico."

"You're a part of this tagline," Taumoepeau told attendees at the unveiling party at Amador Live. "We've got to live up to it."

The "new look and bold tagline" unveiled by the city's official marketing organization "represents who we are," said Christina Ballew of NMCO Creative Studio, the Las Cruces company that worked with VLC to cre-

ate the new brand, along with the visitors' guide, merchandise and advertising campaign that go with it.

"Southern New Mexico doesn't get the recognition it deserves," Ballew said. The rebranding will help "bring recognition to our part of the state."

"We're embracing our city and region's strengths by creating a brand with the surrounding southern New Mexico communities in mind," VLC Marketing Director Lorena Lozano said in a news release. "It opens itself up to future collaborations in a region that often feels overlooked."

The New Mexico Department of Tourism estimates visitor spending in Doña Ana County totaled

more than \$407 million in 2020, with the hospitality industry making up nearly 10 percent of the county's workforce, VLC said.

Going Downtown**Nuggets finally win with brown ball**

I was working at a trendy Denver restaurant called the Colorado Mine Company in 1975 when the Denver Nuggets brought North Carolina State phenom David Thompson in for dinner during his recruiting visit.

I was horrified to learn that restaurant owner Buck Scott had presented Thompson with a garish pair of cowboy boots as a gift. Denver was still desperate at that time to shed its reputation as a cowntown, but in the end, it didn't matter.

This was before the merger, when the National Basketball Association and American Basketball Association would engage in bidding wars for the best players. Thompson was drafted No. 1 by the NBA's Atlanta Hawks, but they were in the middle of an ownership change at the time and were in no position for a bidding war.

Thompson came in a package deal with pint-sized point guard Monte Towe, his friend from NC State. And Thompson was jaw-dropping right from the start.

Early in his career, Thomp-

son could go head-to-head with Julius Erving, Connie Hawkins, anybody when it came to amazing dunks. He is still included on the Sporting News list of top 10 dunkers of all time.

Thompson and the Nuggets tore up the ABA his rookie year, going 60-24 and advancing all the way to the finals before falling to Erving and the New York Nets. When Phoenix Suns center Alvan Adams won the NBA Rookie of the Year Award, he thanked Thompson for signing with the ABA and its signature red-white-and-blue basketball.

That signing was likely a big reason for the merger that came the next year, and for the fact Denver was one of the four ABA teams selected. The team had previously changed its name from Rockets to Nuggets so as not to conflict with Houston.

The sad truth is, the Nuggets have been noncompetitive ever since changing to the traditional brown basketball. After routinely

challenging for the ABA championship, the Nuggets have not had a sniff of an NBA title.

The NBA franchise highlight prior to this year came in 1994 when Dikembe Mutombo laid flat on his back at midcourt and held the ball aloft in celebration of their win over Seattle in the first round of the playoffs. It was the first time an eight-seed had beaten a one-seed, which was impressive. But, when your greatest moment came in the first round, that's just sad. Utah knocked them out in the next round.

As for Thompson, after that blazing start his career was slowed by a foot injury and drug addiction. Former Nuggets center Dan Issel wrote in his 1985 book "Parting Shots" that Thompson would smoke dope in the bathroom on the team bus after the game because he couldn't wait the 10 minutes it took to get back to the hotel.

All of which makes this year's Denver championship run so

much sweeter. Nuggets fans may not moan as loudly as fans of other beleaguered teams like the Cleveland Browns or pre-2016 Chicago Cubs, but we've experienced just as much disappointment.

It turns out the ticket to success was not the can't-miss, top-pick bonus baby. It was an out-of-shape center from Novi Sad, Serbia, Nikola Jokic, who was taken with the 41st pick of the 2014 draft.

The Nuggets are playing the Miami Heat in the NBA finals. If Miami wins, it will be their fourth championship since 2006. Ho-hum. If Denver wins it will be something special.

Don't Recycle E-Waste and Household Hazardous Waste



While helium tanks say they are recyclable, it's not something for your blue recycle bin. If it's not listed on the sticker, it's better for the trash, or, like this canister, it's better to drop off at SCSWA at 2855 W. Amador for safer disposal.

In today's technology-driven world, the constant upgrading and replacement of electronics have become a common occurrence. But, electronic waste, like old phones or computer parts and also known as e-waste, does not go in your blue recycling bin. Similarly, other household hazardous waste (HHW) needs proper disposal instead of being recycled as well. The South Central Solid Waste Authority suggests to residents that "When in Doubt, Throw it Out."

"When electronics and hazardous household waste are improperly placed into the recycling, they can release harmful substances into the whole truckload load, even leading to the materials in the truck to catch on fire when chemicals mix," said SCSWA Director Patrick Peck.

E-waste represents a rapidly growing portion of the world's waste stream and often contain heavy metals such as lead, mercury, cadmium, and chromium that are harmful for the environment.

"But sometimes

it's even more simple, cords from electronics can tangle recycling machines," said Peck. HHW items like batteries, cleaning products, paints, pesticides, and fluorescent bulbs contain caustic and toxic chemicals that can be equally dangerous. "Mixed chemicals in your trash bin can catch on fire as well, so we suggest that residents take care with household hazardous waste and seek out free disposal at SCSWA." For e-waste and HHW, dispose of them directly at the Las Cruces Recycling Center – 2855 W. Amador – or any of the 8 County Collection Centers. There is no cost to

the residents and for liquids, such as a can of gasoline, residents can bring up to a 5-gallon limit.

Other potentially dangerous items that should not be thrown into a residential or commercial trash or recycling bin: dead animals, vehicle parts including car batteries; paint, paint thinners, oil, gas; fluorescent light bulbs or fluorescent light fixtures with ballasts; anything known to be toxic, flammable, corrosive, or an irritant; and appliances.

"It is our duty to ensure our recycling is clean and managed responsibly to create a sustainable future," said Peck.

NM elected officials discuss vote on debt ceiling

BULLETIN REPORT

All three members of southern New Mexico's Congressional Delegation voted last week to raise the nation's debt ceiling and avoid a government shutdown.

The vote was based on a compromise bill brokered between the White House and Speaker of the House Kevin McCarthy.

On May 31, the bill passed in the House, 314-117, with New Mexico's U.S. Representative from District 2, Gabe Vasquez, voting yes.

Voting no in the House were 71 Republicans and 46 Democrats.

The bill passed June 1 in the Senate, 63-36, with both of New Mexico's Senators, Martin Heinrich and Ben Ray Lujan, voting yes.

Voting no in the Senate were 30 Republicans, five Democrats and one independent.

Here's what Sen. Lujan, a Democrat, said:

"This bipartisan agreement is far from perfect, but it takes an unprecedented debt default off the table that would have wreaked havoc on the economy and slashed millions of American jobs," Lujan said.

"With the passage of this legislation, Americans can get back to their lives without worry that the economy could collapse. Now, Congress must ensure that it does not end up in this same position down the line. That is why I support eliminating the need to raise the debt limit, which has no impact on federal

spending and should not be used to hold the economy hostage."

Sen. Heinrich, also a Democrat, had this to say: "Members of Congress are elected to serve the people of the United States," Heinrich said. "Making sure this country pays its bills is the bare minimum we can do. There are things in this deal that I don't like, but that's the reality of divided government. We can't let the perfect be the enemy of the possible—especially when our entire economy is on the line."

U.S. Rep. Gabe Vasquez, a Democrat and former Las Cruces City Councilor, said, "It's frustrating and dangerous that we had to be at the brink of default for Washing-

ton to agree on a deal. The reality is that this is an irresponsible action, but we have to appreciate that we were able to avoid \$130 billion in cuts that would have hurt many working families. In this compromise, we were able to secure veterans' health care, Social Security, Medicare and Medicaid coverage, while keeping critical funding for infrastructure and programs that will bring jobs to New Mexico intact. But Washington must stop operating in a culture of chaos — the potential default we faced shows us how fragile our democracy truly is. We must do more to protect the integrity of good governance and to legislate in support of working-class families."

New Mexico's other two U.S. Representatives split on the vote.

Teresa Leger Fernandez, Democratic representative for District 3, which represents northern and eastern New Mexico, voted yes.

Melanie Stansbury, Democratic representative for District 1, which

represents central New Mexico, including the Albuquerque metropolitan area, voted no.

Stansbury said she voted no based on the bill's cuts to environmental programs and Covid relief, as well as new requirements for food stamps and other support programs.

Citizen spaceflight: Astronaut 007 before, after

Before:

"I am so excited, it has been an unreal experience, I keep feeling like I'm watching someone else's life but it's my life," Jamila Gilbert, Virgin Galactic (VG) astronaut 007, said prior to her journey May 25 aboard VG's Unity 25 flight to space.

Gilbert, a Las Cruces native, has been working with the company for four years and sharing her excitement with people about the VG mission to take customers on commercial spaceflights. When she got the call in February asking if she would join an actual flight as a mission specialist, she couldn't believe it.

"I was told, and I had to have this secret that I wasn't allowed to share with anyone and to see this 140-foot wingspan giant mothership come in for a

landing (Unity 24, April 26) and know 'Oh, shoot! There's my ride' ... it was surreal," she said.

Gilbert said her job on the flight is to evaluate the customer experience end-to-end, "as if I had purchased a ticket."

She believes VG wants to hear the joy about the experience.

"We just want to hear what this experience was like from a very human perspective," she said. "We don't want to feedback engineering-minded metrics, they are just wanting to hear unfiltered content."

The customers who have already signed up for future journeys are interesting, Gilbert said. She has been able to meet a number of them over the past four years. The reasons and expectations are different for each.

For some people it's their childhood dream and

they remember watching launches on television and thinking, "Oh, I want to do that." Then there are the flat-out thrill seekers. They have climbed mountains, scuba-dived and done the most extreme things on the planet and now want to experience space.

And some want to experience the overview effect, as does Gilbert.

"It's been some great stuff," she said. "I'm very much looking forward to every second of it."

After:

As a visual learner, she describes her journey into space as "incredible" and "brilliant." As they headed for the ship on the runway from VG's hangar Gilbert's spacesuit pockets hid the turquoise earrings; more turquoise from Cerillos, New Mexico; pictures drawn by her niece and nephew; a few watercolor sketches she had done herself; and a personal mission statement.

"Then we boarded, and it was this unreal moment getting into a spaceship," she said. "The morning light was so beautiful."

The numbers counted down through the speakers: "5,4,3,2,1 release, release, release," and the ship is in freefall just before the engines kick in.

"You start feeling this exhilaration," she said. "You drop and feel this feeling of lightness and a few moments later you feel power, you start going for-

ward, just incredible raw power."

Then, another command from the speakers: "You are clear to unstrap," and she could get out of her seat into free float. She held the window grab and couldn't look away.

"It was just like a brilliant roundness and brightness and black as far as the eye could see," she said. "Something magical happened. I got eye-level and I

saw the crescent moon."

Later she learned it was a moon not visible from earth at that same time; earth hadn't even had its moonrise.

"I was taken about how vivid [the sight was], I have never seen anything as crisp," Gilbert said. "It was as if my vision got better. I've always had poor vision; I have contacts now. There was a time when having poor vision would have kept you from being an astronaut, but not any-

more."

On descent, "I felt incredibly brave, alive, all of my cells were turned on; elated; happy, felt awe."

She carries that feeling of awe with her today and doesn't think it's ever going to change.

When they landed and got out of the Rover back to the hangar, the crew was greeted by a group of people.

"I knew logically there was not 10 thousand people there but the eruption from our friends and our family, our colleagues, our co-workers — it sounded like there was a sea of people," she said. "It was the best day of my life."

Town hall: LCPD to add 20 cadets; violent crime down

The number of Las Cruces police officers will increase from 201 to 220 in July, Police Chief Miguel Dominguez said May 25 during a Las Cruces Police Department (LCPD) town hall meeting at City Hall.

The meeting, which had about 35 attendees in addition to LCPD leadership and city staff, included an update on city crime statistics, LCPD training and outreach, and questions from the public.

Dominguez and LCPD deputy chiefs Jeremy Story and Sean Mullen said preliminary statistics show violent crime decreased by nearly 50 percent in Las Cruces during the first three months of 2023, while property crime, driven by increases in burglaries and auto burglaries, increased by 10 percent.

The decrease in violent crime "is great news for us and great news for our city," Dominguez said.

LCPD recorded 100 incidents of violent crime, including homicide, rape, robbery and aggravated assault,

January-March 2023, compared to 192 incidents during the same period in 2022. Homicide was down from five to two, rape was up from nine to 11 and aggravated assault was down from 151 reports to 70.

There were 1,516 property crimes reported during the first quarter of 2023, compared to 1,383 during the same period in 2022, LCPD said.

Eighty residential burglaries were reported in 2023, compared to 71 during the period in 2022; 84 commercial burglaries in 2023 versus 76 in 2022; 68 non-residential burglaries in 2023 and 52 in 2022; 34 reports of breaking and entering in 2023 and 46 in 2022; 346 auto burglaries in 2023 versus 234 in 2022, 65 reports of felony larceny/theft in 2023 versus 123 in 2022; 335 reports of misdemeanor shoplifting in 2023 versus 274 in 2022; 200 reported vehicle thefts in 2023 versus 231 in 2022; and three reports of arson in 2023 versus six in 2022. Dominguez said 60 percent of vehicles stolen January-March 2023 have been recovered. Story said the number of vehicle burglaries could be substantially reduced if people locked their vehicles, did not leave valuables visible in vehicles and did

not leave vehicles running while unattended.

Training Director Lt. Josh Savage said the LCPD Academy requires 1,049 hours of cadet training, compared to 677 hours mandated by the state. For LCPD, that includes the required hours of training: 46: domestic violence, 111: use of force/defensive tactics training, 64: crisis intervention and communication skills, 125: firearms and 96: scenario-based training.

In response to a question from the public about creating a police oversight committee, Dominguez said structure already exists through OIR Group, a company hired by the city to regularly audit LCPD. Dominguez said OIR's audits are "far more intense" than those provided by the department's two previous auditors. LCPD has taken OIR's recommendations to improve department policies, procedures and training, he said.

Dominguez said there was a 50 percent reduction in use of force by officers in the first quarter 2023, due in part to increased de-escalation training. To see 2021, 2022 and first-quarter 2023 statistics, visit lascruces.gov/2589/ Police and click on "LCPD Transparency."

CMI students' web series spotlight local nonprofits

In a new class at New Mexico State University's Creative Media Institute (CMI), students are learning how to create a web series, and they are producing episodes "that have some real-world impact," said CMI instructor and filmmaker Rajeev Nirmalakhandan, who came up with the idea for the class and has been teaching it for the past three semesters.

Last spring, a dozen students worked on three different web series, each focused on a Las Cruces nonprofit: the Las Cruces Public Schools Foundation, Big Brothers Big Sisters of Las Cruces and Cancer Warriors. Each student team completed four short episodes about its nonprofit, which will be available for public viewing on YouTube.

NMSU senior Damien Trejo said LCPD Foundation Executive Director Amy McCarty "contributed so much" to that web series, "not only helping

the foundation but us students as well."

"What moved me most was the investment in student education," said Trejo, who fell in love with video production while attending a vocational high school in El Paso and was taking the web series class for the second time because "it was my favorite class within four years of college," he said.

"I was excited to have our foundation considered as a featured partner," McCarty said. "I was most impressed with the professionalism of the students with whom I worked. Through my conversations with them I realized that many people probably don't know that while we support the efforts of LCPS teachers and offer scholarships to LCPS students we are a completely separate entity. I hope to embed some of their work into our website and social media posts — although I might need their tech skills to do so," McCarty said.

Marci Dickerson, who owns the Game and Game II and Dickerson Catering in Las Cruces and created Cancer Warriors earlier this year, said she was honored to be the subject of a CMI web series, calling it

"a very great way for these kids to get experience while highlighting what makes our community amazing and unique," she said.

"You see,

Marci was diagnosed with breast cancer," student filmmaker David Alcalá Garcia said at the beginning of the Cancer Warriors series, "and her being Marci, being the charitable and amazing soul that she is, decided to make an organization dedicated to those who are affected by cancer."

Garcia attended the Cancer Warriors lunch in April that raised more than \$220,000. He was also on hand as Dickerson received the Las Cruces International Film Festival's 2023 hometown hero award.

"It's fun to be a part of an organization that gives back to kids," said Big Brothers Big Sisters regional board chair Cory Leiferman in a web episode about that nonprofit. "The meaning of Big Brothers Big Sisters is creating that one-on-one mentorship, creating that personal connection (between) a mentor (and adult) and a kid."

Pioneer Banks of Las Cruces President Kiel Hoffman decid

ed to become a big brother more than three years ago to give back to the community and because he "thought it would be cool to have a little brother since my kids are now grown and in college," Hoffman said. "You can make a difference in somebody's life."

The program has given Hoffman's little brother "someone to spend time with when my mom is at work," the boy said. "I really don't see my dad often; he lives in Albuquerque. Now that I've been with Kiel for a while, it's really fun."

Through all three of the

web series his students created, CMI and the nonprofits they worked with "come together to meaningfully impact the community," Raj said.

They also learn "the creative, logistical challenges of planning, shooting, editing a web series,"

Raj said, including how to be "very adaptive and thorough" as they shoot without a script and "have to fit into the world of their subject." They are learning communication skills with the community, he said, and experiencing firsthand "the power of filmmak-

Visual artist Daisy Quezada Ureña, who grew up in Las Cruces and Mexico, has been awarded a \$50,000 Latinx Artist Fellowship by the U.S. Latinx Art Forum (USLAF).

The award was announced May 31 by the forum, which is recognizing 15 “of the most compelling Latinx visual artists working in the United States today and aims to address a systemic lack of support, visibility, and patronage of Latinx visual artists,” the forum said in a news release.

Quezada Ureña is a visual artist and educator “who we have featured in two exhibitions here in the NMSU Art Museum,” said museum director Marisa Sage. “Her work speaks to many of our students here at NMSU and community members in Doña Ana (County), as she explores identity and place in relation to social structures that cross between imposed borders. We are so proud that Daisy is receiving this most deserved and prestigious award because beyond being a significant Latinx voice in contemporary art nationally, her practice is valuable to our Hispanic-majority community as it reflects their stories and triumphs.”

“One of the first things that crossed my mind as I came to sit with what this recognition meant to me was my family,” said Quezada Ureña, who now lives in Santa Fe. “They have always been there

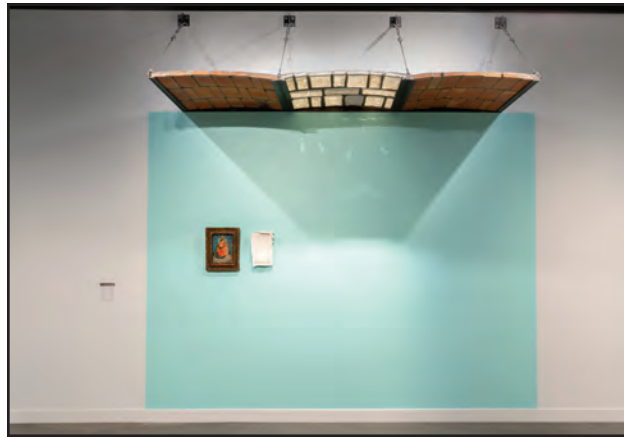

Beatty-Payne gave the performance of a lifetime opening night in this iconic role she was born to play, belting out "Everything's Coming Up Roses" and joining co-stars Cassandra Galban and Dustin Wright in "Together Wherever We Go." "Gypsy" is, from first note to final bow, an outstanding show.

In the role of Louise (Gypsy Rose Lee, upon whose life and burlesque career the Tony-winning musical is loosely based) Galban continues to be one of the most talented and versatile performers in Las Cruces. Wright, a newcomer to LCCT, was perfect in the role of Herbie.

No one could steal this show from Beatty-Payne, Galban and Wright, but several actors did their best. Rachel Thomas-Chappel, Xanthe Phillips and Rocio Chavez were brilliant as strippers Tessie Tura, Mazeppa and Electra. Jamin Bever was an excellent Tulsa, Taden Garzon and Rachel Snow were so great as June and Baby June, along with Makena Tellez as Baby Louise. Gabriella Azolini, Erica Padron, Charlie Bever and Jeanne Hornsby were terrific as the Toreoadorables, as were AJ Tumminaro, Braden Gonzales and Penny Bever as the Farm Boys. I wish I had space to credit the more than a dozen other actors

in this outstanding cast. They all deserve gold stars.

Huge credit goes to director and co-choreographer Constance Hasapopoulos for assembling cast and crew and guiding them in creating another memorable show in what has to be one of very best of LCCT's 60 seasons.

I was also impressed with the video (thank you, Vanessa Velarde) used to seamlessly cover scene changes. Set designer Doug Roby did some of his best work ever – and that's saying something, considering his long and brilliant work for LCCT. Roby, who somehow also found time to play three roles in "Gypsy," credits a construction crew that volunteered more than 500 man hours "building this complicated set."

Kudos also go to music director Maryel Arias-Anderson, stage manager Debbie Kocab, costume designer Richard Frederick, costumer Jinny Hornsby, co-choreographer Anna Robillard, light and sound designer Dan Robillard, props designer/mistress Pat Roby and Lara Dunton and techs Alecks Rundell, David Barela, Brittany Ramirez and Jessie Ortega.

"Gypsy: A Musical Fable" was written by Jule Styne, Stephen Sondheim and Arthur Laurents.

Remaining performances of "Gypsy" are 7:30 p.m. Friday-Saturday, June 9-10, and 16-17, and 2 p.m. Sunday, June 11, and June 18. Tickets are \$17 for adults, \$14 for seniors, students and military and \$10 for children.

Arts district receives \$2,500 grant

The Downtown Las Cruces Partnership (DLCP) and the Las Cruces Arts and Cultural District (LCACD) have received a \$2,500 grant for the LCACD Icons program.

The funds will help pay for videography, editing and promotion of LCACD Icon videos, said DLCP Executive Director Jennifer Garcia Kozlowski.

"Through the creation of videos that celebrate our artistic and cultural identity, the LCACD Icons program provides a window for the community to experience and enjoy the artists, makers, and creators, who weave our rich district tapestry," said LCACD Director Susan Caballo, who thanked the New

Mexico Resiliency Alliance (NMRA), which awarded the grant in partnership with New Mexico Main-Street and the McCune Charitable Foundation.

The icons program began in 2020 after the Las Cruces City Council created LCACD.

"At the time we were looking forward to establishing programming and implementing all of the wonderful ideas found in the masterplan of the program," Kozlowski said. "Then came Covid. Due to the restrictions, we had to regroup and reimagine how LCACD interfaced with the community."

As a result, LCACD established the Artists in Residence and Generations Community writing programs, Kozlowski said.

"It became clear last

year that Artists in Residence needed to be renamed," she said. "The program was conceptualized as a play on the traditional program, but instead of bringing in an outside artist, we would highlight the artists, makers, and creators who already lived/worked in the district. We did this through the creation of professional videos to celebrate and promote our district artists."

The name was changed and the program was expanded, she said. This year's focus has been "Authentically Southern New Mexico," and participants are preparing to celebrate the 175th anniversary of the founding of Las Cruces' original townsite, she said.

LCACD celebrates cul-

ture, local arts and artists. The district includes multiple arts assets like museums, galleries, theatres, Thomas Branigan Memorial Library, restaurants, historic buildings and arts-complimentary businesses.

NMRA awards seed grants to local economic development projects in the state. It has awarded nearly \$500,000 in grants since 2014 and logged more than 13,500 volunteer hours for economic development projects.

The LCACD grant was one of NMRA Resilient Communities Fund awards made by the alliance in May.

A jazz man keeps playing, teaching, giving back

Frank “Pancho” Romero has a doctorate in trumpet performance; he is also a trumpet doctor.

In fact, when it comes to the trumpet, Romero can play it, teach others to play it, compose and arrange music for it, clean it, repair it and rebuild it. His doctoral dissertation at the University of Oklahoma was published, so he also has written about the trumpet.

Romero retired in 2021 after 20 years as a trumpet professor at New Mexico State University. He has been principal trumpet for the Las Cruces Symphony Orchestra for the past 22 years, plays trumpet in the NMSU Faculty Brass Quintet and has performed with the El Paso Symphony and the Juarez Symphony.

Romero founded both the Albuquerque Jazz Orchestra and the Border Jazz Orchestra in Las Cru-

ces, was in on the ground floor of the Mesilla Valley Jazz Happenings Jazz Festival and, with Bob Burns, was a founding member of the Mesilla Jazz and Blues Society more than 20 years ago. He has also served as president and treasurer of the New Mexico Jazz Educators Association.

Romero has performed across the country and around the world, playing with Rita Moreno, Reba McEntire, the Temptations, the Four Tops and the Supremes, among many others. He was a cultural envoy for the U.S. Department of State, working with the Ministry of Culture and teaching and performing with band students and directors in Colombia, South America, where he took the NMSU Symphonic Band and faculty in 2007. Romero was invited to a reception at the White House that same year because of his work in Colombia.

Since retiring two years ago, Romero is playing the

trumpet “more now than ever,” he said.

The big payback

“I went from full time-plus to just full time,” Romero said. “All I feel I’m doing now is giving back.”

And that is Romero’s philosophy: “Give as much as you receive.”

Romero continues to help lead a monthly jam session for music students of all ages at Mom’s Coffee along with another Las Cruces jazz musician, Roman Chip.

He conducts musical instrument repair workshops for NMSU students – they cleaned and repaired 86 instruments last summer.

As president of the Mesilla Jazz and Blues Society, along with MVJBS board members, he oversees the selection of college and high school music scholarship recipients, runs the society’s monthly meetings and helps organize the Jazz and Blues Festival (Sept. 29-Oct. 1,

2023, in Mesilla and Las Cruces).

Romero regularly performs with the Border Jazz Orchestra, the Faculty Brass Quintet and other classical and jazz ensembles.

Early influences

Romero first picked up a cornet (a brass horn that is a little smaller than a trumpet) when he was in the second grade.

“I think it was probably chosen for me,” he said.

His grandfather played the violin as a resident of Taos Pueblo; his father, Litra, played the trombone and his brother, Donald, played the euphonium in Las Vegas, New Mexico, where Romero grew up.

His father, two uncles, brother and seven of their cousins were musicians, music teachers and band directors in various parts of New Mexico.

Initially, “I was not a very good player,” Romero said. But that changed with guidance from his father and the mentorship of Sam Trimble, another great trumpet player, who taught at NMSU, UTEP and North Texas State University.

“Sam was a huge influence in my life,” said Romero, who was also influenced by the music of jazz performers Stan Kenton and Woody Herman.

With guidance from his father and Trimble, Romero continued practicing and performing.

One of his first lessons was with legendary Mexican trumpet player Rafael Mendez (1906-81), who was performing with the West Las Vegas High School Band that Romero’s father directed. Romero also

played with Mendez when he performed with the NMSU Symphonic Band when Romero was a member in 1974. (At about age 10, Mendez performed for Pancho Villa at his campsite, became Villa’s favorite musician and traveled with his army for several months.)

On the road

After earning a bachelor’s degree from NMSU and master’s degrees at North Texas State University in music education, Romero spent a year “on the road,” playing jazz and commercial music “in a different town every night,” he said.

“It was fun and exciting at first,” Romero said.

He settled in Albuquerque in 1978 and went to work for Bob Farley at Farley’s Music Center.

“It was a great learn-

ing experience for me,” Romero said.

As a music education specialist, he sold, rented and repaired instruments and worked with Albuquerque Public Schools music teachers.

Romero went into business for himself and opened Romero Family Music in 1986. He closed that business in 1992 and took a job at Oklahoma Baptist University, where he taught until moving to Las Cruces to join the NMSU faculty nine years later.

“My legacy? – my students,” Romero said. “I am so proud of my kids.”

O'Keeffe classes starting June 13

The Doña Ana Arts Council (DAAC) is partnering with the ARTE Institute for Lifelong Learning of Las Cruces to create six weekly art history classes focused on iconic American artist Georgia O'Keeffe, DAAC said in a news release.

The collaboration begins with a kickoff event, 4-5:30 p.m. Tuesday, June 13, at DAAC, 230 S. Water St. Classes will be held 4-5:30 p.m. every Monday, June 19-July 21.

The cost is \$245 per person, which entitles participants to attend all six classes live and/or via Zoom, to receive class recordings and access to the four-week Zoom class "History of Silk, Cotton, Wool and Linen" with Nicholas Dahle. The cost is reduced to only receive Zoom recordings.

The classes are "an in-depth study of Georgia O'Keeffe's incredible artwork and her incredible life," DAAC said. "The structure of the class will be to compare the artwork of European and American artists who were working at the same time as

O'Keeffe."

"Comparing O'Keeffe's work to the top artists of Europe and America reveals how exceptional and original she really was," said ARTE co-founder Kathleen Key, who teaches art history at UTEP. "It is our goal for you to study her career beginning in 1915 to her last days in Santa Fe. We will also study the work of her greatest teacher, Arthur Wesley Dow, and the work of her husband, photographer Alfred Stieglitz. Several recent exhibits showcase her fashion style and clothing and her homes in Abiquiu and Ghost Ranch — so we will cover those as well."

"Our main purpose is to prepare students to experience great works of art in person," said ARTE co-founder Kathleen Albers, the former long-time DAAC executive director. "That's the ultimate classroom — museums and the actual landscapes and buildings that inspired great artists. That's why art, education and travel are the fundamentals of ARTE."

This O'Keeffe classes will help pre-

pare ARTE students for an Oct. 23-29 ARTE trip to "walk in the footsteps of Georgia O'Keeffe, to see where she lived and worked in Abiquiu and Ghost Ranch, New Mexico, plus see the Georgia O'Keeffe Museum in Santa Fe," Albers said.

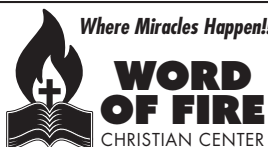

Time for some summer reading, especially on golf

Summer is a great time to catch up on your reading. By the pool, or in your favorite chair, summer reading is relaxing. Here are a few suggestions.

Dr. Bob Rotella stands as golf's pre-eminent sport psychologist. In his latest – "Make Your Next Shot Your Best Shot" – he covers bouncing back from adversity, believing in yourself, and using statistics to help you practice and play. In Chapter 3, "Harnessing the Power of Persistence" Rotella writes: "You must be willing to do whatever it takes to get as good as you dream of getting. You can call it patience, dogged determination, perseverance or simply old-fashioned persistence." That's exactly how I felt at Notre Dame as captain of the

Irish swim team, and later the highest age-group finisher in four Ironman Triathlons in Hawaii. In Chapter 7, "A Quiet Mind Will Set Your Talent Free," Rotella reminds us that "if you don't trust your swing on the golf course and play with an unconscious mindset, you'll never reach your potential. I like to say 'there's a time to train and there's a time to trust.'"

In 2003, popular spiritual teacher Deepak Chopra came out with his first golf book: "Golf for Enlightenment: The Seven Lessons for the Game of Life." Chopra has also authored or co-authored 20 other books, including "the Seven Spiritual Laws

of Success" and "Ageless Body, Ageless Mind." As an average high-handicapper, Copra loves the game of golf, with all of its delights and frustrations. Confronted by the wild ups and downs of his play he consulted golf professionals and developed a unique approach

that any golfer, novice or expert, can follow. "Golf for Enlightenment" is the story of an Everyman named Adam who we follow as he starts as a terrible golfer and ends up mastering the game thanks to an extraordinary and mysterious teacher named Leela. The chapters are in the form of "lessons." Lesson 5, "Winning Is Passion

with Detachment," notes the following: "Once you appreciate the emotional drama being played out, it's no wonder that golf pierces the soul. At any moment defeat be snatched from the jaws of victory, yet the most impossible shots can also go right. The whole game is like life condensed to its essence, lightning caught in a bottle." Ain't it the truth.

James Dodson is one of the most famous golf book writers in America, having twice won the coveted USGA Herbert Warren Wind Award. His most celebrated books include "Final Rounds (a father, a son, the golf journey of a lifetime);" "The DewswEEPERS: Seasons of Golf and Friendship;" "A Son of the Game: A story of Golf,

Going Home and Sharing Life's Lessons;" "A Golfer's Life" with and about Arnold Palmer. However, my recommended reading today is his 2017 "The Range Bucket List: The Golf Adventure of a Lifetime." When he was a kid of 13 and already addicted to golf, Dodson wrote himself a list titled "Things to Do in Golf." It included the golfing aspirations of a young boy who had no idea where life would take him. A few years ago, in his mid-60s, Dodson rediscovered the piece of paper in an old trunk. Number one on the list was "meet Arnold Palmer and Mr. Bobby Jones." One out of two isn't bad. Number 7 was "live in Pinehurst." He's close now. Number 4 was "play on the PGA Tour."

Well, James, you can't have all your wishes. In 21 chapters and 307 pages, Dodson takes us on a journey of his personal history, remembrance of famous and valued persons and reflections on the joys and the challenges of the game of golf. Dodson recalls dining with Arnold on one of his trips to Latrobe, Pennsylvania, as he was writing the "Life" book: "Arnold's memory never fails to amaze me. During the nearly two years I traveled with him to open new golf courses or make public appearances, I frequently saw him surprise and delight scores of fans by remembering names."
