Collins connects dots of Juneteenth history

NMSU's general counsel is a native of Galveston, where holiday originated

New Mexico State University General Counsel Roy Collins III has a special connection to Juneteenth, the holiday that will be celebrated in Las Cruces June 16-19.

Collins is a native of Galveston, Texas, where United States Army Major Gen. Gordon Granger, on June 19, 1865, issued General Order No. 3, giving formal notification that slavery had ended in Texas. That event has come to be celebrated across the country as Juneteenth.

The story began much earlier," Collins said, and spread far beyond Galveston.

Human slavery dates to an-

tiquity, he said, and was likely brought to the western hemisphere by French and Spanish colonizers in the 16th and 17th centuries. Spanish merchants brought African captives to San Augustine, Florida in 1565. When Spanish explorer Álvaro Núñez Cabeza de Vaca landed on Galveston Island in 1528, his party included an African slave named Estevanico.

British privateers brought the

first shiploads of slaves from Angola to Virginia in 1619.

The first victim of the Boston Massacre (March 5, 1770), and the first to die in the American Revolution, was Crispus Attucks, who was of African and Native American descent and may have been an escaped slave.

Through the mid-1800s, "human commerce" – the slave trade – was an active commercial enterprise and "a funda-

mental part" of the American economy, Collins said.

The role of slavery within society was a root cause of the American Civil War, which brought "the worst bloodshed in the history of this country," he said.

Emancipation Proclamation

In the middle of the war, President Abraham Lincoln issued

City council denies lifting cannabis buffer zone

In a split vote, the Las Cruces City Council denied a proposed change to the city code that would have eliminated a 300-foot buffer zone between cannabis retailers and

single-family residences and between cannabis retailers.

Councilors Johana Bencomo, Becki Graham and Becky Corran voted in favor of the change at the council's June 5 regular meeting. Councilors

Tessa Abeyta and Yvonne Flores, Mayor Pro Tempore Kasandra Gandara and Mayor Ken Miyagishima (who voted by phone) voted against it.

The vote came after more than two hours of discussion and public

input about the proposed change, which came before the council as an appeal of a Feb. 28 ruling by the city Planning and Zoning Commission (P&Z) approving a special use permit within the 300-foot buffer.

Adult recreational use of marijuana began in the city in April 2022. Since then, 48 cannabis-related businesses have opened, generating \$42.5 million in total sales, the city said. 58 percent of sales are for recreational use and 42 percent for medicinal use, the city said.

Cannabis retailers are now "adaptively reusing buildings city officials "were looking at nobody ever going back into," city Community Development Department Deputy Director Tim Pitts said in proposing the city code changes at the meeting. "From an economic development perspective, we very much want these businesses to be able to go in because they're going to reinvigorate neighborhoods," Pitts said.

"We do not propose to allow cannabis facilities in any residential districts," he said, nor would the

code change have allowed sales near schools.

By maintaining the 300-foot buffer in city code, "We are in essence continuing to place Prohibition-style barriers on this industry that is now a legal industry," Bencomo said. "I do want all of you to reflect on what makes you say definitely keep the buffer for cannabis but not for full sale of liquor. While the buffer may or may not be removed, you still cannot have any type of retail business smack in the middle or a residential neighborhood because it is not zoned that way," Bencomo said.

"What every step toward prohibition suggests is that we want to control someone else in a way that will maintain a stigma that we are trying to reduce," Corran said.

"I continue to be concerned about youth consumption and density," Gandara said.

"I'm personally really glad that legalization has occurred," Greg White said during public input. "I also believe you must have standards for locational changes." By eliminating the buffer zone,

he said, "you take away the public's right to have a voice in what occurs in proximity to their homes."

Karen Salas, who said she owns childcare centers in Las Cruces, said the existing 300-foot buffer zone "is not big enough for childcare centers and schools."

"I'm really bothered about lifting this restriction," said Lori English. "In fact, I think it should be increased. Do you want your child exposed to this?" English also said the state should not allow cannabis sales to anyone who is not a state resident.

William Beerman said he is against removing the buffer and said the city "will approve anything" to increase revenue.

"The buffer zones are important because they create a space between our children and what they can see adults doing," Don White said. "The boundaries aren't so important as the modeling. We need to set an example."

Two representatives from High Horse Cannabis Company, which locations in Las Cruces and Chaparral, spoke in favor of removing the buffer zone.

the Emancipation Proclamation, which declared freedom for more than 3.5 million enslaved African Americans in the 11 Confederate States of America (Feb. 8, 1861-May 9, 1865).

Lincoln called the Emancipation Proclamation “an act of justice warranted by the Constitution.”

But in Texas and the other Confederate states, slavery continued.

Many slaves were people of faith who had placed their “trust in the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob” and remembered Moses’ cry to the Egyptian pharaoh to “Let my people go,” Collins said. “Generations prayed and prayed,” he said, “and were praying on New Year’s Eve 1862,” the day before the Emancipation Proclamation was issued.

“But through nine decades of testing the pronouncements of the nation’s Declaration of Independence that liberty is an unalienable right and that equality is self-evident, many enslaved people were asking, ‘How about us?’” Collins said.

After Gen. Robert E. Lee’s surrender in April 1865, enforcing the Emancipation Proclamation became a matter of logistics, he said.

“How do you get to people who are still captured in those southern states?” Collins said.

That is what brought Granger to Galveston, “the commercial and intellectual center” of Texas. With a company of about 2,000, a majority of whom were Black soldiers, Granger proclaimed the end of slavery.

The first celebration of

that event was held Jan. 1, 1866, as Black people, including members of Collins’ family, marched from the county courthouse in Galveston to a nearby “colored church,” where General Order No. 3 and the Emancipation Proclamation were read.

“Collins’ great-grandfather, Ralph Albert Scull (1860-1949), on June 19, 1885, participated in a 20th anniversary “Emancipation Day” ceremony, in which his role was to read the Emancipation Proclamation. Over the years, the description of this commemoration evolved from “Emancipation Day” to “Juneteenth,” which Collins described as “shorthand for June nineteenth.”

The fight continues

When the Civil War ended, many Black U.S. Army soldiers “had no

where to go,” Collins said, and “had to find another mission.” Some were sent to New Mexico Territory, staffing 11 frontier forts the federal government built to protect travelers and settlers in the West.

They were “ferocious fighters,” Collins said, and an unheralded part of “how the West was won.”

Black infantry were nicknamed Buffalo Soldiers by Apache warriors like Geronimo and Victorio, and 18 earned the Medal of Honor during the so-called “Indian Wars,” including at least eight battles in New Mexico.

So-called Jim Crow laws were introduced in southern states in the late 19th century, enforcing racial segregation, and the 1896 U.S. Supreme Court

Plessy vs. Ferguson ruling established the doctrine of “separate but equal.”

More than 350,000 Black soldiers served in segregated units of the U.S. military during World War I – the war President Woodrow Wilson said was fought

to “make the world safe for democracy,” and more than one million Black men and women served during World War II

Again, Collins said, Black people were asking, “How about us? Do we get to be a part of this?”

“People began remem-

bering the story of the Emancipation Proclamation,” he said.

The Civil Rights Movement (1954-68), led by Martin Luther King and others overturned separate but equal and resulted in federal laws passed to end racial discrimination.

Juneteenth is born

Texas State Rep. Al Edwards (1937-2020) of Houston sponsored House Bill 1016 in the Texas Legislature, making June 19 (Juneteenth) a state holiday beginning in 1979. It has been a state holiday in New Mexico since 2006 and became a national holiday in 2021.

“It’s about hope,” Collins said about Juneteenth. It’s about gratitude.”

It is also significant that the 1866 march in Galveston ended in “a house of worship,” Collins said, confirming “the spiritual ethic” that is part of the celebration.

“I also continue giving God credit for changing the hearts of human beings,” he said.

Collins’ family has always been a part of Juneteenth in Galveston, Collins said, and his telling their story in Las Cruces “help(s) people understand how interconnected life is.”

UTEP rivalry about to get more interesting

There has been a lot of discussion the past few months about the athletic rivalry between New Mexico State University and the University of New Mexico.

The discussion is warranted given the incidents that happened during the rivalry football game last October in Las Cruces, and the shooting the night before the November rivalry basketball game, which ended in someone dying.

Most recently, the discussion has centered around security plans from both universities for rivalry games in the 2023-24 season. The Aggies are scheduled to play the Lobos in football on Mexican Independence Day, Sept. 16, in Albuquerque. Then there will be the traditional home-and-home

basketball series, which usually takes place in November and/or December.

My thoughts? Take whatever security was planned, and double it. Maybe more. The violence has to end.

As a lifelong sports fan, I've enjoyed many rivalries, whether it's Dallas-Washington in the NFL, Philadelphia-Boston in the early 1980s in the NBA or, my favorite, the Bedlam

Oklahoma State University and the evil Sooners of the University of Oklahoma. But the violence of those mostly stayed in the games.

During all this discussion around NMSU's UNM rivalry, however, we Aggie fans may have overlooked something.

Our rivalry with Texas-El Paso is about to get kicked up a notch or three.

On July 1, NMSU officially becomes a member of Conference USA, which includes among its 10-team lineup, the UTEP Miners.

Wednesday, Oct. 18, the Aggies travel south to the Sun Bowl to face the Miners in a football game that will mean more than Interstate 10 bragging rights. It will be a vital conference game.

Fans have long enjoyed both the UTEP and UNM rivalries, and they are usually good money-makers for both programs. But, for most of the schools' histories, the games were non-conference.

There was a period from 1935-1951 when all three schools were together in the Border Conference.. UNM left in 1951, and the Aggies and Miners remained in

the Border Conference until it disbanded in 1962.

That Oct. 18 game will also be broadcast on ESPN 2, meaning UTEP and NMSU alumni all over the country will get a chance to see this revitalized rivalry.

We'll know more in October, of course, but as it stands now, that Aggie-Miner game looks like it could be a good one. NMSU finished 7-6 and won the Quick Lane Bowl in Coach Jerry Kill's first season. One of those six losses was on the road against UTEP, which finished the season 5-7.

Because of the conference change and scheduling quirks, the Aggies will have to play at UTEP in football two years in a row, making the desired revenge that much trickier.

And, the guess here is, there will be some extra security.

Lawmakers don't want decrees challenged

I love democracy ... the purer the better. And so, I've always been a big fan of the referendum process, which allows citizens to circumvent the representative system and take their issue directly to the voters.

The angriest I've ever been with the Las Cruces City Council was in 2014 when they relied on slimy legal tricks to stop a successful effort to use the referendum process to raise the minimum wage. I had mixed feelings about the wage, but my feelings about City Councils' maneuvering were anything but mixed.

Now, a conservative group calling themselves The New Mexico Family Action Network is seeking to use the referendum process to repeal five bills passed this year by the state Legislature.

Unfortunately, Secretary of State Maggie Toulouse Oliver has greeted this effort of citizen involvement with the same

obstructionist mindset as our former City Council. More specifically, she has decided that one of the new laws can never be repealed, regardless of how many citizens support it.

House Bill 7 prohibits any local municipality or other public body in the state from passing local laws that would restrict abortion rights or access to transgender services.

Toulouse Oliver is arguing that the bill can never be overturned by the citizens because it falls into a protected class of legislation necessary for the "preservation of the public peace, health or safety" of the state.

That seems like an enormous stretch. Does anybody believe the peace, health and safety of residents in Hobbs or Carlsbad will be endangered if they don't have an abortion clinic? I suspect the

opposite is true. Any facilities in those towns would surely draw protesters.

To be clear, I don't agree with the proposed referendum, and would vote against it if given the chance. I'm just saying I should

have that chance, if the referendum organizers collect the necessary number of petitions.

There are four other bills that the group is seeking to have repealed. They protect patients and providers of abortion and transgender

care from outside investigations; automatically register eligible residents to vote; make other reforms to the election system; and establish public-school based health centers.

Toulouse Oliver said if any of those efforts are successful, they will be thrown out as well, because referendum organiz-

ers have not followed the proper procedure to begin a petition process.

She may be right. But this sure looks like a Democratic secretary of state doing everything possible to thwart an effort by her political opponents.

And I'm not sure why. I don't think any of these five proposed referendums would pass if put to the voters. But lawmakers simply can't stand to have their decrees challenged by the unwashed masses.

Tree planting group takes root; 50 trees coming

NeighborWoods Las Cruces is laying the groundwork for a massive tree planting this November.

The organization, which was formed in November 2022, is “trying to increase the tree canopy in our city,” said committee member Myr Dawson.

The New Mexico Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources Department estimates Las Cruces’ tree cover at less than four percent – nine trees per acre. That compares to 13 percent (22 trees per acre) in Albuquerque, five percent (12.7 trees per acre) in El Paso and 9 percent (12.9 trees per acre) in Phoenix.

Tree New Mexico re-

ceived a grant to do a demonstration NeighborWoods planting of 50 trees in a residential area bordered by Triviz Drive, Solano Drive, Madrid Road and Spruce Avenue in east Las Cruces.

NeighborWoods is comprised of three committees, Dawson said: the Neighborhood Group she belongs to along with Maria Contreras, Molly New of the Las Cruces Utilities Department and Robert Blair. The committee chair is former Doña Ana County Soil and Water Conservation District Supervisor Craig Fenske. The other two committees are the Volunteer Group and the Tree Species Group.

Earlier this year, a logo design contest for middle school students was won

by Emily Valencia, who will be an eighth grader this fall at Sierra Middle School. She and the other top contest entry winners – Jizelle Valenzuela (second place), Kayleigh Sais (third), Lincoln Quintaro (fourth) and Soloman Rigosta (fifth) -- received gift cards from Caliches, Sonic Drive In and Allen Theatres in a June 2 presentation.

Between now and the tree-planting event in November, members of the NeighborWoods committees are canvassing homeowners in the designated tree-planting area to adopt trees to be planted on their property, get tee shirts printed using the new logo,

recruit and train team members for the planting, verify and flag all the locations where trees will be planted, dig the holes, and finally, plant the trees on Saturday, Nov. 18.

“The Las Cruces NeighborWoods demonstration planting is truly a community effort with volunteer Tree Stewards, Lift Up neighborhood residents, several City of Las Cruces departments and other community volunteers dedicated to making Las Cruces a more livable community,” said Fenske.

The Las Cruces NeighborWoods group meets every few weeks and invites volunteers to participate in the planning

LCPS narrows superintendent list to seven

The Las Cruces Public Schools Board of Education has confirmed seven applicants to participate in semifinalist interviews in its search for a new superintendent of schools. The candidates, culled from a final qualified applicant pool of 30 people during a closed session of the board June 9, will be interviewed in closed session Friday and Saturday, June 16-17, at the Dr. Karen M. Trujillo Administration Complex. The Board of Education may expand the list at any time during the semifinalist stage to include any of the qualified applicants.

The semifinalist candidates are Debra Elder, Monica Mesa, Fred

Montalvo, Raul Peña, Geovanny Ponce, Cynthia Retana and Ignacio Ruiz.

Dr. Debra Elder is currently the interim superintendent at Los Lunas Schools. She joined Los Lunas in 2021 as Chief Academic Officer of Instruction, Accountability and Innovation. Prior to Los Lunas, Elder led the Office of Innovation and School Choice in the Albuquerque Public Schools district. She holds bachelor's, master's and educational specialist degrees from the University of New Mexico and is a graduate of the University of Southern California's Doctorate in Organizational Change and Leadership program.

Monica Mesa has been an educator for 31 years

and currently supervises 26 elementary schools as the Assistant Superintendent of East Elementary Schools in Mesa Public Schools, the largest school district in Arizona. She has served as an assistant principal, principal, principal coach and university instructor. Mesa received her master's degree in educational leadership and is currently pursuing a doctoral degree from Northern Arizona University.

Dr. Fred Montalvo is currently the Executive Director of Operations for Las Cruces Public Schools. Prior to LCPS, was a teacher and coach at Mescalero Apache Schools and Hatch Valley Public Schools. His administra-

tive experience includes serving as an assistant principal at Camino Real Middle School and Mayfield High School, and as principal at Picacho Middle School. Montalvo holds a master's degree in educational administration and a Ph.D. in curriculum and instruction.

Dr. Raul Peña has been an educator for more than two decades. He has served as a bilingual classroom teacher, middle school assistant principal, campus principal and district leader. In 2018, Dr. Peña joined Fort Worth (Texas) Independent School District as Chief of Schools and currently serves as Chief Talent Officer, charged with re-imagining the district's hiring process. He received his bachelor and doctoral degrees from the University of Texas at Austin and participated in the Harvard National Institute for Urban Leaders.

Dr. Geovanny Ponce is currently the Assistant Superintendent of the Houston Independent School District, where he has spent the last two decades of his career. Previously, he served as a middle and high school

principal in the Houston district where, under his guidance, campuses experienced improvements in student achievement. His educational experience includes a bachelor's degree in mechanical engineering from the National Autonomous University of Honduras in Tegucigalpa, a master's degree in educational administration and supervision from the University of Houston and a doctoral degree in public school administration from Texas A&M University.

Cynthia Retana has spent her 27-year career in the Socorro Independent School District in El Paso, Texas, and Ector County Independent School District, also in Texas. She has spent years supervising principals and campuses as an assistant superintendent and executive director. Prior to that, she served as a principal at the elementary, middle and high school levels and served her community as a teacher, counselor and assistant principal. She holds a bachelor's degree in interdisciplinary studies from the University of Texas at El Paso, a master's degree in educa-

tion and mid-management from the University of Texas at El Paso and is currently a doctoral student at Texas A&M-Commerce.

Ignacio Ruiz is an assistant superintendent for the Clark County School District in Nevada, the fifth largest school district in the nation. He has held several leadership positions including assistant principal, principal and director. Previously, Ruiz held the position of Director of Language Acquisition in the Tucson Unified School District. He is a graduate of the ALAS (Association of Latino Administrators and Superintendents) National Superintendent Academy and the McCourt School of Public Policy at Georgetown.

Following the first round of interviews on June 16 and 17, the board expects to announce the candidates who will go on to the Superintendent Public Forum on June 22 at 6 p.m. at Organ Mountain High School, followed by a meet and greet in the lobby of the OMHS Performing Arts Center. The Superintendent Public Forum is a moderated question-and-answer session using input and question recommendations from the Superintendent Search Committee – a volunteer group of students, parents, teachers, administrators and community members.

A final round of interviews is scheduled to be held in closed session on June 29 and 30, with the final candidate named in an open meeting as early as July 1.

Summer moons await

Summer 2023 officially begins at 8:57 a.m. MDT Wednesday, June 21 – the summer solstice.

At that moment, the sun reaches its highest point in the sky on the longest day of the year. That will be the exact moment in the northern hemisphere "when the axial tilt of the Earth is at its most inclined toward the sun during its 365-day orbit — at an angle of 23° 26'," according to www.space.com.

"The word solstice comes from the Latin solstitium, from sol (sun) and stitium (to stop), (as) the sun appears to stop at this time (and again at the winter solstice)," according to www.almanac.com.

The summer solstice occurs when the sun is directly over the Tropic of Cancer, the northern-most circle of latitude on Earth.

Summer will end with the autumnal equinox, 12:49 a.m. MDT Saturday, Sept. 23; which means summer 2023 will last 95 days.

And, just in case you were wondering, Daylight Saving Time 2023 ends Sunday, Nov. 5.

Full moons

Following the June 3 Full Strawberry Moon is the Full Buck Moon, at 5:39 a.m. MDT Monday, July 3.

There are two full moons in August: the Full Sturgeon Moon at 12:31 p.m.

MDT Tuesday, Aug. 1, and a Blue Moon (the second full moon in a calendar month) at 7:35 p.m. MDT Thursday, Aug. 31. This one is a super blue moon, meaning it will appear a little larger and brighter than usual. It is the first Blue Moon since August 2021.

A super moon (technical name is perigee syzygy) occurs when the moon's orbit brings it closest to Earth. (Perigee is the point at which the moon is nearest Earth; syzygy is the alignment of the Earth, moon and sun.)

Meteor shower

There will be a Perseid meteor shower July 14-Sept. 1, that likely will peak around Monday, Aug. 13.

The best way to view the meteor shower is to find a dark location and give your eyes about 15 minutes to adjust to the darkness. 2023 is expected to be a good year for viewing because of the moon's low illumination during the meteor shower's peak.

The Perseids "are a prolific meteor shower associated with the comet Swift-Tuttle," according to Wikipedia. They are called the Perseids "because the point at which they appear to hail (called the radiant) lies in the constellation Perseus." The Perseids were first recorded in 36 AD.

Historic preservation keeps region's past alive

History is all around us in Las Cruces. If you live or work in one of the older parts of town, eat in one of the fine restaurants or visit the shops, parks or art galleries in these areas, you have been surrounded by places where history happened and where our unique culture developed. The importance of our local history was reinforced with the proclamation by the Las Cruces City Council citing May as Historic Preservation Month. The city also has begun officially recognizing and honoring these places with the Las Cruces Register of Cultural Properties.

If you walk down Mesquite Street in the Mesquite Historic District, El Camino Real is right under your feet. You are walking where, for 300 years, traders, Indigenous peoples, soldiers, settlers and monks walked, rode their horses and drove their oxen between Mexico City and Santa Fe. You can almost feel their presence beside you; almost hear their horses' hooves, the oxen grunt and calls of greetings or warnings.

Great-great grandchild-

ren of the settlers still live in the adobe homes of their ancestors and carry on family history and traditions. The Native American youth of the Piro, Manso, Tiwa pueblos still dance at the yearly religious ceremonies.

Klein Park is a focal point of community gathering from large-scale events to community youth groups practicing T-ball and ballet folklorico.

Several neighborhood groups use the park for yearly events. One group has revitalized the Pachanga, a traditional Mexican festival that was very popular in the 1950s, then called Fiesta de Las Cruces. They have kept the foods, arts and crafts, games that are part of the traditions and added a low-rider car show that draws thousands of visitors. Another group holds a Winterfest with Santa and Mrs. Claus distributing goods to the local children and youth.

Heart of the city

Main Street was the heart of the city from 1849 until the mid-1960s. It was the place where the community came to shop, eat, socialize, and have concerts, dances and plays

on the plaza of St. Genevieve's Catholic Church. The elders of the neighborhood would meet daily to discuss the "affairs of the world" and watch the people and cars go by. In the 1960s it was the site of the first play by the Las Cruces Community Theatre. You could gather at the post office, pay your utility bills at City Hall, have a soda and hamburger, go to the movies at the Rio Grande, State, or Plaza theatres or buy the latest fashion. There was always something to do on Main Street or downtown for community members of all ages and cultural backgrounds.

High-style buildings, like the impressive Judge H. B. Holt home, a Trost-designed Mission Revival house on Alameda Boulevard, are culturally significant as much for their design as for who lived there. But at least as significant are the vernacular adobe buildings that are the still-existing embodiment of a tradition that continues today.

Some are associated with individuals who, for better or worse, left a mark on their times. A modest bungalow on South Miranda Street was once home to one of New Mexico's first U.S. senators and later secretary of the U.S. Department of the Interior in the Harding administration, Albert Bacon Fall. Unfortunately, he was also the first person holding a cabinet position to be convicted of a felony after accepting bribes from private oil interests in the infamous Teapot Dome Scandal.

A neat, white plastered, four-square adobe on West

Griggs Avenue once housed Sam Bean, Jr. whose brother, Judge Roy Bean, was the famous "Law West of the Pecos."

The city Historic Preservation Commission has established the Las Cruces Register of Cultural Properties,

which recognizes not only buildings, but places such as parks or sites where any of the many different groups of people who make up the rich culture of Las Cruces carry on traditional activities. Inclusion on this register honors these places and buildings for either or both their historical and cultural contributions.

Historic recognition

Anyone can propose a nomination for a site worthy of recognition, although the owners of the property must always give their permission. Forms can be obtained from the city Community Development Department at 575-528-3059. From there you can be directed to the city preservation specialist, Troy Ainsworth, who will provide information and advice on probable eligibility and filling out the form. Or you may contact him directly at 575-528-3027 or tainsworth@las-cruces.org. If you live or work in a historic or traditionally

built building or know of a culturally significant place, consider talking with Troy. He will help you decide if you wish to pursue it.

Benefits

Benefits of listing in the Las Cruces Register of Cultural Properties:

- Possibility of grants or tax rebates for restoration
 - Rise in property value.
- Many people prefer to live in an older home with character than in cookie-cutter tract housing, and artists and other creatives favor the stimulating atmosphere of older neighborhoods.

- It adds to the perception of Las Cruces as a historic city, increasing visitation and raising local revenue from Heritage tourism.

Misconceptions

Misconceptions of listing your property on a historic register:

- Misconception: The government will tell me how to remodel my home.

I won't be able to do anything with my property without getting permission first. Truth: Listing is only an honor and cannot overrule owner's rights.

- Misconception: I want to update my kitchen. Does it have to look original? Truth: You can do anything you want with the interior.

- Misconception: Listed properties are more expensive to maintain. Truth: Material and labor costs the same for similar work on any building.

- Misconception: Only expensive and ornate properties qualify for listing on a register. Truth: History and tradition also happen in small, simple buildings.

- Misconception: I will have to open my home to yearly tours. Truth: You are never required to open your home to visitors.

"AVATAR: THE WAY OF WATER"

Director and co-writer James Cameron's long-awaited fantasy sequel was a huge success at the box office, expected using sophisticated technology

to continue the saga of the world of Pandora. The revived conflict between the Na'vi and the RDA is the thrust of the adventure, with the sea and its dwellers becoming major participants as that struggle proceeds. Sam Worthington, Zoe Saldana, Sigourney Weaver, Stephen Lang, CCH Pounder and Giovanni Ribisi are among the returnees, with Cameron's "Titanic" star Kate Winslet a very notable addition here. Cliff Curtis and Edie Falco also are newcomers to the cast. Various bonus features, particularly encompassing "making-of" documentaries, are available in different editions being provided to different retailers. This is the second in what is projected to be a series of five films in total, with the third being aimed for release at the end of 2024. *** (PG-13: AS, N, P, V) (Also on Blu-ray, Blu-ray 3D, 4K Ultra HD, Digital and On Demand)

"GUY RITCHIE'S THE COVENANT"

Director and co-writer Ritchie ("Sherlock Holmes") moves to the status of having his name in the film's title with this often intense drama about two very different people bound by the wartime peril they share. Jake Gyllenhaal stars as an Army sergeant saved from an attack by his Afghan interpreter (Dar Salim, "Game of Thrones"), later

prompting the soldier to go back and rescue his rescuer when it turns out the latter wasn't sent safely to America with his family as was expected ... making them targets of the Taliban. Other actors supporting a typically solid Gyllenhaal include Antony Starr, Alexander Ludwig, Emily Beecham and Jonny Lee Miller. *** (R: AS, P, V) (Also on Blu-ray and On Demand)

"CRIMINAL MINDS: EVOLUTION - THE COMPLETE FIRST SEASON"

The original "Criminal Minds" series proved so popular, not only on CBS but also on streaming services, it seemed unlikely that it would stay canceled for long — and indeed, it was revived last fall with this Paramount+ iteration that reunites most of the cast members, though the absence of Matthew Gray Gubler is quite noticeable. David Rossi (Joe Mantegna), a bit the worse for wear due to personal trauma, and Emily Prentiss (Paget Brewster) are back to lead their Behavioral Analysis Unit of the FBI against a clever enemy (Zach Gilford) who used the pandemic to build a network of evildoers. A.J. Cook, Kirsten Vangsness, Aisha Tyler and Adam Rodriguez also return to the core cast, which will reassemble again for a Season 2 of this version. *** (Not rated: AS, P, V)

"THE FIRM"

One of the best adaptations of a John Grisham novel, this 1993 drama from director Sydney Pollack (making its 4K Ultra HD debut) is lengthy but highly involving, with a fabulous cast led by Tom Cruise as a newly minted law-school graduate recruited by a Memphis firm that's quite eager to have him. Strange fates have befallen some of the other attorneys there, and federal agents view the newcomer as their ticket to finding out just what's going on. Gene Hackman also stars as the Cruise character's assigned mentor, who may be quite involved in the intrigue, with Jeanne Tripplehorn as Cruise's wife. Ed Harris, Holly Hunter, Hal Hol-

brook, Wilford Brimley, Gary Busey, David Strathairn, Paul Sorvino and Steven Hill also register strongly — as does the terrific music by Dave Grusin, principally an acoustic piano score. *** (R: AS, P, V)

"THE LEGEND OF GLYNN TURMAN"

Still going strong in his career at the time of this writing, Turman is a Primetime Emmy Award-winning actor-writer-director who has been active in show business since his performance as a youngster in the original Broadway staging of "A Raisin in the Sun." This appropriately reverent profile by filmmaker Juney Smith traces the New York native — primarily in his own words — through many of the diverse projects that have followed for him, from the classic television serial "Peyton Place" and the sitcom "A Different World" to the dramas "The Wire," "In Treatment" and "How to Get Away With Murder." 'The BIG circle of ... art'

Before he connected with Court Youth Center (CYC), Las Cruces native Nazario Sandoval was a young teenager hanging out on the street and expressing himself through graffiti and other sometimes illegal behavior.

"One of the city police came to Court Youth Center circa 1998 and said, 'We picked up this kid who thinks he is an artist and is tagging the whole town. Can you do something with him so we don't have to put him jail?'" Oliver-Lewis remembers. "Of course, I said 'sure,' and because of Nazario, we started our very successful CYC graffiti program. We created exhibits, sold their creations, conducted workshops and explained how graffiti was part of the visual art landscape."

"If it wasn't for (CYC founder) Irene Oliver-Lewis, I'd just barely be getting out of prison or I'd be dead," said Sandoval, who is now a successful artist living in Albuquerque and sharing his art in Las Cruces, Mesilla and all over the state.

"He says I changed his life," Oliver-Lewis said, "but in retrospect, he changed my life and how I worked with alternative youth artists. I love him dearly and am so proud of all he has accomplished."

"People like her really took a chance on people like us," Sandoval said. "She gave us a job, she gave us free (art) supplies."

Now it's my turn to kind of give back."

During a recent visit to Rio Grande Preparatory Institute, an alternative high school in Las Cruces, Sandoval helped students create a large mural.

"I reached five kids that day," he said, plus one student whom he described as a loner.

"Work on this by yourself," Sandoval told her. "She got to do an amazing piece," he said.

Sandoval connected with 65 third graders doing an art demonstration at Hatch Valley Elementary School

earlier this year.

"It came out really, really good," he said.

During a late May interview, Sandoval said he had scheduled visits to other schools and community groups in the state every weekend into July. And he was in Las Cruces and Mesilla visiting students, artists and community leaders every weekend in May.

"Even if we reach three of our youth to turn them around to do something else," Sandoval will consider his visit a success, he said.

"Everything is there," Sandoval tells older students. "If you want it, go get it. If it doesn't work that way, try it another way. Just because you live in a small town doesn't mean you can't have big dreams."

With his CYC experience as the turning point in his life, "now I'm doing what Irene has done for us," Sandoval said, "the big circle of life, or art."

Sandoval's first art show in his hometown was at Nopalitos Galería Las Cruces' Mesquite Historic District in March. More than 200 people attended the show, he said, including an 80-year-old former high school teacher of Sandoval's.

"I had to thank her too,"

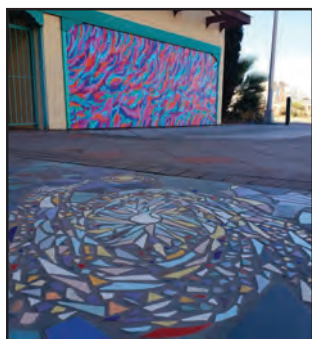
he said.

Sandoval described his art as "like abstract expressionism with a modern flair." His artwork is "free flowing," Sandoval said. "No rules. It puts a lot of balance back in my life."

He also works at an Albuquerque bank.

"I work full time and I do art full time," Sandoval said.

"He was always self-motivated, full of energy and had integrity for his art and other artists," Oliver-Lewis said.

Morrow continues rock art at NMSU golf course

Las Cruces artist Kathy Morrow continues work on the rock art project she is re-creating on a small hill across the road from the New Mexico State University golf course clubhouse.

The project began in January 2017 as Morrow walked her dog along Tortugas Dam. She first created a medicine wheel there, and added rock images inspired by the hawks, roadrunners, lizards, coyotes, dragonflies and other animals she saw during her walks and had been drawing and painting for years.

Although Elephant Butte Irrigation District

(EBID), which owns the dam, never objected to the artwork – which grew to 38 pieces in all – it was never officially sanctioned and had to be moved before EBID began an upgrade to the dam.

With the help of more than a dozen volunteers and a couple of front-end loaders, Morrow spent most of 2022 dismantling her rock animals and moving them about a quarter mile south onto NMSU property.

About 40 tons of rock were moved and more added to the new half-acre site that is directly across Herb Wimberly Drive from the clubhouse.

After getting approval from NMSU, Morrow began work on the new

project in April 2022. She has made great progress, but in late May said it likely will take about 17 more months to finish.

Morrow also said she has used up all the available rock she has and would welcome donations of all colors and sizes of rock, along with whole

or broken terra cotta roofing tiles. She also welcomes volunteers to help with the project.

When the project is complete in 2024, Morrow will have created a cougar measuring 27 feet wide by 35 feet tall, along with a hummingbird, dragonfly, roadrunner, rabbit, bear, horse, horned toad, falcon and an eagle – along with the NMSU logo.

UAM exhibits explore diverse subject matter

Three new art exhibitions will have opening receptions at New Mexico State University's Art Museum at 5:30 p.m. Thursday, June 22. These exhibitions are free and open to the public and will run through Sept. 16.

"Cara Despain: Specter," on view in the UAM's Contemporary Gallery, is an immersive multimedia exhibition featuring work by Miami-based

artist Cara Despain. Using sculptural and video-based installations created with found objects and archival film from the 1940s-60s, Despain explores the irreversible environmental consequences and hidden psychological and microscopic health effects left in the wake of nuclear weapons development and testing across the Southwest.

"Agnes Martin & Karen Yank: Meditations on Mentor and Student" will be on display in the Bunny Conlon Modern & Contemporary Art Gallery. This exhibition explores the work and intersecting lives of the artists Agnes Martin and Karen Yank. For nearly 17 years, Yank and Martin met weekly as a friendship and mentorship flourished.

Featured in this exhibition are a selection of Martin's lithographs on vellum, whose complex

and meditative grids are indicative of the artist's style, which impacted upon Abstract expressionism, Minimalism, and Transcendentalism. Yank's steel wall-based sculptures reference nature and convey abstract emotional content in minimalist/maximalist forms.

15 local homeless students receive scholarships

Catholic Charities of Southern New Mexico announced scholarships to Doña Ana Community College and New Mexico State University have been awarded to 11 Las Cruces Public Schools high school seniors and four continuing college students.

All 15 of the students currently are or have previously faced homelessness, Catholic Charities said in a news release.

Through an anonymous \$75,000 donation, Catholic Charities was able to fund 15 \$5,000 scholarships for 2023-2024. The students awarded have varying in-

terests, and plan to delve into careers that benefit the public good via service to their community. A majority are first-generation college students.

"This scholarship has helped me to become more involved within my community and on campus, as well as played a role in

propelling me forward as a first-generation female college student in the field of pharmacy," one second-year recipient said of the scholarship.

"Receiving this scholarship has made me have greater hope for my future," a first-time recipient said. In 2021, the National

Center for Homeless Education reported more than 1.3 million public school students were homeless in the U.S., 2.5 percent of the total number of students enrolled in public schools. In addition, The National Center for Homeless Education reported 9,033 homeless children/youth

enrolled in New Mexico public schools for the 2019-2020 school year, 2.7 percent of the state's student population.

Sullivan was joined in a panel discussion by other members of the NMSU economic development cabinet: Ken Van Winkle, associate vice chancellor for external relations and economic development; Kathryn Hansen, director and chief executive officer of Arrowhead Center; Scott Eschenbrenner, president and chief executive officer of Aggie Development, Inc.; and Patricia M. Knighten, director of innovation commercialization in the of-

face of intellectual property at Arrowhead Center.

Mesilla Valley Economic Development Alliance (MVEDA) President and CEO

Davin Lopez hosted the panel, which was part of MVEDA's Business in the NMBorderplex Forum lunch, held June 6 at Hotel Encanto.

“It's all about partnerships,” said Eschenbrenner, who said NMSU's Aggie Uptown development will soon add a Maverik convenience store at the corner of Las Alturas and University Avenue in

the development's 36 acres. A new Starbucks and an electronic vehicle charging station are going on 6.8-acres of land owned by the NMSU regents and leased by Aggie Development. The site fronts on Triviz Drive, adjacent and to the east of the existing Pan Am Plaza Shopping Center, he said.

Sullivan said NMSU is also using its

alumni networks and other resources to keep Aggie graduates “attached to their alma mater.”

Doña Ana Community College is focused not only on providing students the technical skills they need to compete in today's workforce, it also is looking ahead to train them “for jobs of the future,” Van Winkle said.

NMSU's economic development cabinet meets monthly, Van Winkle said, and has developed a “fairly specific” economic development plan for the university, with input from each of its colleges and metrics to measure its success. NMSU is in the plan's implementation stage, he said.

Part of the plan is helping businesses and NMSU faculty move laboratory research into the marketplace, Hansen said. Providing mentoring and guidance along “the commercialization pathway” and helping products “make it to the real world (is) one of our missions,” she said.

The Scale Up New Mexico program, housed at New Mexico State University's Arrowhead Center, is seeking entrepreneurs and startups in New Mexico to apply for its free July 13-Aug. 17 TechSprint online accelerator.

TechSprint is one of several initiatives under Scale Up NM, a suite of startup support programming for early-stage technology venture development.

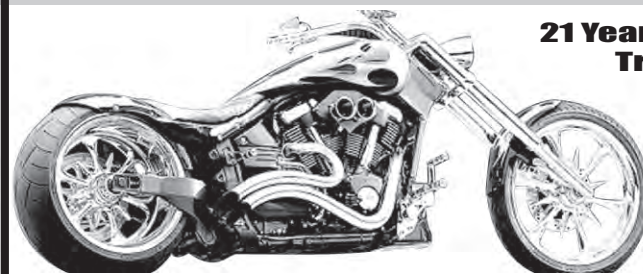

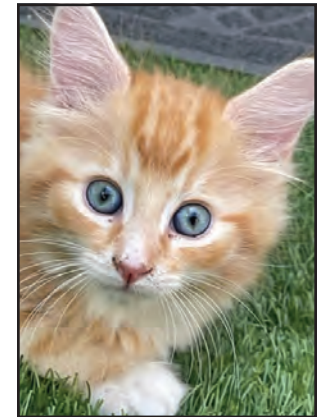

Adams furthers women's re-build

NM State women's head basketball coach Jody Adams has had a busy recent few weeks, signing coaches and players.

Joining the Aggies as Adams' associate head coach is James Frey, who had a gaudy 306-61 record in 11 years as head coach at South Georgia Technical College, a junior college in Americus, Georgia. Coming with Frey are two of his former players and an assistant coach.

Loes Rozing is a 5-10 junior guard originally from the Netherlands who played two seasons for Frey at SGTC. Feme Sikuzani Masudi is a 6-5 graduate student center originally from the Democratic Republic

of Congo who played two years at SGTC, and then last year was at the University of Texas in Austin. Maka Jackson was a coach and recruiter for Frey last year at SGTC. Originally from Hawaii, Jackson played collegiately at Texas Tech and Utah.

Another new assistant coach, Bridgette Gordon, just might be the only person in Las Cruces with an Olympic gold medal, which she won in 1988 as a player with the U.S. women's basketball team in Seoul, South Korea. Gordon was part of two national championship teams at Tennessee, and was the Final Four MVP in 1989. As a coach, she has worked with seven different Division I programs, including Wichita State, where she coached with Adams.

In addition to Rozing and Masudi, the Aggies signed three more players: Jaila Harding, 5-8 junior guard from Wichita, who finished two seasons at Butler Community College; Maiya Bergdorf, 5-11 junior forward from Belmont, Massachusetts, who played at Three Rivers Community College and Sacred Heart; and Tylie Jones, 6-0 junior guard/forward from Rigby, Idaho, a transfer from College of Southern Idaho.

The signings will help replace several departed Aggies, including Tayelin Grays, Shania Harper, Soufia Inoussa, Moe Shida and Janessa Johnson, who all exhausted their eligibility last season as seniors.

NM State was 18-17 last year in Adams' first season, including a 10-8 record in Western Athletic Conference play. That was an improvement over the 2021-22 season, when the Aggies finished 10-19, and 6-12 in the WAC. Next season will be the Aggies' first in Conference USA.

The truth of awareness and the need for adjustment

In 2007, a remarkable golf book appeared on the scene: “Golf’s Three Noble Truths,” with the subtitle, “The Fine Art of Playing Awake.” The author is James Ragonnet, PhD, an English professor at Springfield College in Massachusetts, and also a golf teacher and coach.

Dr. Ragonnet chose “noble” as a brilliant designation to mean “worthy,” and because, in Eastern thought, the Buddha used noble to denote one path of enlightenment for all people. The first noble truth is AWARENESS. The other two are Balance and Unity, discussed at a later date.

“Awareness is a liberating force that will tell you what matters most. You control only the things of which you are aware. The things of which you’re

not aware will ultimately control you. ... If you want to become a self-sufficient golfer, sharpen your powers of awareness. Awareness – the key to growth – is your private path of guided discovery,” so writes Ragonnet.

So exactly which variables should we enhance our awareness of? It’s basically everything: “Awareness means being conscious of what’s happening at every moment. Being aware is synonymous with being watchful, alert, awake, mindful, attentive, observant and perceptive. It will relax, center, and anchor you in the moment and intensify your sensitivities.” He continues: “Most golfers suffer from a pov-

erty of awareness. They go about their business unaware of what’s happen-

ing around them. Without awareness, you’ll make the same mistakes again and again. With awareness, however, you’ll wake up, look deeply, and start to grow. Becoming aware means

watching everything you do – your actions, your thoughts, your feelings, and your watching itself.”

Once we become skilled and proficient at being aware and totally awake, then we are faced with the perhaps even more daunting challenge of adjusting to what we notice in a manner that produces successful results. Your adjustment to changing,

unusual or different conditions and circumstances can mean anything from slightly modified swing movement to changing club selection, altering your stance or aim, a different target or strategy on a given hole.

Of course, if you’re not aware of what’s going on around you, and the nature of the variances you’re facing, you might as well pick any club and any target, since it won’t make a bit of difference in the outcome.

I had always appreciated the astute commentary of CBS on-course golf analyst and expert golf teacher Peter Kostis (now retired) who mentioned his all-important mantra “awareness and adjustment” on almost every telecast. He continually harped on the fact four pros have to pre-

cisely calibrate their play and decisions to each new golf course and conditions of each new day.

Yes, the pros have caddies, who are probably better at sensing the conditions than their player. But for us hacks, the bad news is the detailed, difficult process of becoming awareness-savvy and making successful adjustments each round seem like we should carry along a computer as we play.

But here’s the good news: As we gain golf experience and golfing intelligence, we become more adept at adapting. That means we should become better as we acquire greater sensitivity to everything we should recognize, and greater capacity to regulate and modify our play to an infinite array of

changing conditions.

Some of the variables that may cause stress as we try to accommodate them are wind, location of hazards (now “penalty areas” like ponds), thickness and density of the rough, consistency of the bunker sand, speed of the greens, the grain as well as the breaks, the lie of the golf ball, and much more.

Yes, a multitude of variables to be aware of. It’s similar to the notion, “if you don’t know what you don’t know, you don’t have a chance.”

One last thing. Enhancing your skill in staying awake and figuring out what adjustments to make takes a lot of practice.
