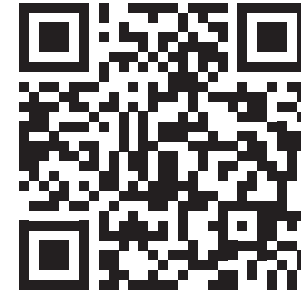

Farmers and Crafts Market competes nationally

BULLETIN REPORT

Now through Sept. 18, you can cast your vote for the Farmers and Crafts Market of Las Cruces (FCMLC) as America's best market in the 15th annual America's Farmers Market Celebration.

Visit markets.farmland.org, click on "Cast My Vote," enter "Las Cruces" in the search box, click on "Farmers & Crafts Market of Las Cruces," enter your name and email address and cast your vote – it takes less than a minute.

In 2023, the celebration will award a record \$15,000 in total cash awards to the top five markets in America: \$5,000 for first, \$2,500 for second, \$1,500 for third, \$750 for fourth, \$250 for fifth and \$100 to first in each state.

In 2022, FCMLC was the top vote getter in New Mexico and 10th in the Southwest region and No. 125 in the county out of more than 7,000 farmers markets, said FCMLC Market Manager Karin Bradshaw.

"We hope to improve our rankings this year as everyone knows we are the absolute best farmers market in the country," Bradshaw said. "With our access to fresh produce year-round, our world class artisans, the yummy cuisine offered by our food trucks and vendors plus the support from our local community and government, how could we not be the best in the nation," she said. "And as an authorized SNAP/Double Up Food Bucks provider, we ensure members of our community have access to fresh, local agricultural products year-round."

"I would like to encourage our residents and visitors alike to vote in this year's Farmers Market Competition," Mayor Ken Miyagishima said. "It was about seven years ago when we made the top ranking and it would be nice to repeat the title of the Best Farmers Market in America!"

The celebration is sponsored by American Farmland Trust nonprofit, which has a mission of saving farmland, promoting sound farming practices.

It has run the competition since it began in 2008. The Farmers Market Coalition became a celebration co-sponsor in 2021.

More than 200 FCMLC vendors cover seven city blocks along north Main Street downtown 7 a.m.-1 p.m. every Saturday and 8:30 a.m.-1 p.m. every Wednesday. The nonprofit market began in 1971 and was named "Number One Large Farmers Market in the Nation" in America's Farmland Trust nationwide poll in 2011.

Progress Club makes progress

During the recently ended fiscal year, the Progress Club of Las Cruces made \$47,152 in direct donations to about two dozen programs benefiting children and education, veterans and people affected by domestic violence, as well as health and wellness, the environment and arts and culture.

The Progress Club also made in-kind donations during the fiscal year valued at \$111,146, and contributed more than 40,000 volunteer hours, the club said in a report issued during a June donors reception at Picacho Hills Country Club.

Local beneficiaries of direct and in-kind donations during the year included the Children's Reading Alliance, Asombro Institute of Education, La Piñon Sexual Assault Recovery Service, Families and Youth, Inc.'s My Friends Place emergency youth shelter, 4 Paws and a Wake Up, Christ Child Society Layette Shower providing clothing and supplies for new mothers, the Doña Ana Arts Council's Misoula Children's Theatre, La Casa Domestic Violence Program, Thomas Branigan Memorial Library, New Mexico State University and Doña Ana Community College.

The club also donated gift cards for veterans and supported veterans' honor flights, volunteered at local schools and at the Asombro Institute, purchased books for school libraries and volunteered at DACC's

Renaissance Arts Faire.

Club history

The club celebrated its 100th anniversary in 2015 but got its start when the Women's Improvement Association was formed in 1894 by five Las Cruces women who wanted to help provide services to the community the city was not providing, according to club records. At the time, the women were riding behind a coal wagon taking the body of a friend of theirs to a local cemetery. Their first goal was to buy a hearse for the community. That commitment to serve evolved into the Progress

Club of Las Cruces' mission of "living the volunteer spirit."

Successful flight should boost spaceport

If you wonder if everyday people can make a difference in New Mexico, think of the Virgin Galactic spaceflight of June 29, the first commercial manned spaceflight out of New Mexico.

I know what some of you are thinking: "What?! Everyday people? That's a billionaire's playground for Richard Branson!"

True, the dream and beginning of Virgin spaceflights came from Branson the billionaire. But the reality of work happening from Spaceport America was influenced by everyday people, many of them Las Cruces, working at the State Capitol in Santa Fe in 2012 and 2013.

You may know this about New Mexico, but we have a historically pesky habit of shooting ourselves in the foot.

Even though the spaceport opened in Sierra County in 2011, funded in part by an optional tax voters passed in Sierra and Doña Ana counties, space businesses

were not flocking to come to New Mexico for their projects.

One reason was an obscure loophole in the fine print of Spaceport America rules and regulations, specifically some language that was

not there. Missing was a supply chain protection. This meant if something went wrong at the spaceport, liability could be legally sought all the way up and down the supply chain. So, if a rocket crashed, anyone could be sued, including the makers of the screws that hinged the seats and, presumably, the makers of

the stickers on the outside of a vehicle.

A simple fix, right? I mean, not many people had written spaceport language at that time. New Mexico legislators could go back to the Roundhouse, fix the language and we're off. But no. New Mexico legislators not only didn't fix it, they actively voted against fixing it. Not once, but twice.

That's when a lot of people in the state, knowing the investment we'd made into the spaceport, and knowing the economic development potential, said enough is enough. Ahead of and during the 2013 legislative session, proponents made their case with lawmakers. Organized groups, including the Greater Las Cruces Chamber of Commerce, presented their rationale. Grassroots individuals pleaded the cause.

Eventually the loophole was

closed. In the intervening time, however, several other states got into the spaceport business, though none could offer what New Mexico could: invaluable air space next to the restricted White Sands Missile Range, an elevation essentially making "the first mile free," and prevailing clear skies and mild weather.

Tragedy struck Virgin Galactic the next year, in 2014, when a test flight in California killed a co-pilot and badly injured the pilot.

The legal and experimental setbacks probably cost Virgin Galactic a decade in their progress.

VG's successful June 29 flight does not mean it's all smooth sailing ahead, but it sure is promising, and perhaps more important, a demonstration to many other companies worldwide who could take advantage of the benefits of Spaceport America.

Going Downtown

Now is the time to speak on OMDP plan

More than nine years after its designation as a national monument, the federal government has started the process to develop a resource management plan for the Organ Mountains/Desert Peaks National Monument.

Scoping meetings will be held throughout the area, including from 6 to 8 p.m. July 12 at the New Mexico Farm and Ranch Heritage Museum and 5 to 7 p.m. July 13 at the Village of Hatch Community Center.

each Monday through Friday except for holidays.

The resource management plan that comes from the scoping process will provide long-range rules and regulations to govern future land-use allocations. All plans must, "ensure that objects and values are conserved, protected and restored," according to the BLM website.

That site notes that the monument was created to, "preserve its cultural, prehistoric and historic legacy and maintain its diverse array of natural and scientific resources." The new plan must not lose sight of that original vision.

It's been so long now it's easy to forget the objections raised by those who opposed

the monument. There were two primary concerns raised at the time.

The first came from law enforcement ... or, more specifically, from former Sheriff Todd Garrison, who said the monument would create a lawless corridor where drug smugglers and other criminals could roam freely with-

out fear of pursuit from law enforcement.

The second came from ranchers who said restrictions on motorized vehicles would prevent them from mending fences, replenishing water tanks and doing other chores needed to manage a ranch.

Nine years later, I don't know how much validity there was to either of those claims. If either group has been harmed, this

would be the time for them to come forward and show their evidence.

Any management plan will have to address competing interests from agriculture, hikers, campers, anglers, nature lovers and conservationists. No plan will make every group happy. But the top priority has to be preservation of the area for future generations. That should be something all sides can agree on.

Congrats to City Council on cannabis ruling

As chairperson of the Unified Prevention Coalition of Doña Ana County, I want to offer the Coalition's congratulations to the Las Cruces City Council for their vote to keep a distance of 300-feet between individual cannabis stores as well as from single-family residences. This same distance is already in place for schools and daycare centers. The UP! Coalition sees this as an important measure to promote public health and help parents and our coalition in keeping our children away from drugs.

Based on the New Mexico Youth Risk and Resiliency Survey (YRRS), we have learned that one-fourth of high school students in Doña Ana County, from 9th through 12th grade, admit to using cannabis. Additionally, New Mexico has a higher rate of cannabis use before age 13 compared to the other 46 states included in this survey.

Studies have examined how the concentration and location of cannabis

stores impact youth. Similar research has also been done on two other legal drugs, alcohol and cigarettes, and the findings are consistent. Researchers have discovered when there are a lot of stores selling these substance in a particular area, youth in that area are more likely to use cannabis.

They have also found when cannabis use does begin, it will be at a younger age. Also, those young girls and boys are more likely to later develop major issues with marijuana and other mental health problems like anxiety and depression. Further studies have shown early cannabis use has a significant impact on the functioning of the adolescent brain.

When stores are close together and in home neighborhoods, it gives the impression to young people that cannabis must not be harmful. The more stores in an area and located in their neighborhoods, the more often kids see the signs and advertising. This repeated exposure reduces their perception of risks of using marijuana, leading them to believe it is less dangerous. As a result, they may decide to try marijuana at an earlier age, which can lead to

heavier use in the future. In other words, when cannabis stores are located and concentrated in one area, it normalizes cannabis use for young people, causing them to overlook the potential harms and consequences.

The UP! Coalition will continue to provide direct prevention initiatives targeted at reducing or preventing drinking or drug use among youth. However, we recognize the community can take other measures to ensure children's safety. By considering the impact of the environment on our children's health, the City Council's decision to maintain the buffer zones demonstrates their dedication to protecting our children by minimizing their exposure to stores and advertising.

The UP! Coalition strongly supports this decision by the City Council. We also urge them to expand the current zoning regulations to include multi-family residences and apartments in the 300-foot buffer zone, not just single-family homes. We also recommend and encourage the council to support the education of staff and the Planning and Zoning Commission about the effects of cannabis on our children to

address future waiver requests. The City Council's commitment to maintaining these buffer zones is a significant step in addressing the concerns and efforts of all parents in our community to keep our kids drug-free.

End-of-Life Options Act now two years old

In June 2021, the Elizabeth Whitefield End-of-Life Options Act went into effect authorizing medical aid in dying (MAID) in New Mexico. On this second anniversary it seems timely to provide a brief update about how the law is being implemented and, more broadly, how more New Mexicans are learning about their right to self-determination, the importance of advance care planning and the range of end-of-life options, including MAID.

Medical aid in dying allows a terminally ill person with less than six months to live the opportunity to request a prescription for medications that will peacefully end their life, if and when they choose. In addition to

the six-month prognosis, eligibility includes being at least 18, a New Mexico resident, having the capacity/ability to make an informed health care decision, and being able to self-administer the medications.

Our New Mexico law is considered by many a model of a balanced approach that improves access for those who qualify.

Once the law was enacted, advocates chose to organize further and a new nonprofit organization, End of Life Options New Mexico (ELONM), was launched. Its mission is to provide education and support for all end-of-life options and to assist the implementation of MAID.

Two years later, ELONM's 60-plus volunteers are actively accomplishing both the public and clinical outreach/education and individual support services to clients who request it. In 2022, ELONM participated in 25 tabling events, provided 64 talks and presentations and had more than 4,200 individual contacts. ELONM volunteers responded to more than 200 requests for personal support and assistance through our website, end-of-lifeoptionsnm.org, or our professionally staffed

call-in line, 505-393-1321.

In regard to medical aid in dying, according to our best count, MAID has been utilized more than 330 times by qualified patients who are suffering and wish to hasten their death. In almost all cases, they are enrolled in hospice and their prescribing clinician, hospice staff and/or one of our ELONM volunteers are at the bedside, supporting the family and loved ones.

We are now focusing our education and outreach efforts statewide to assist all people to understand their options and access the end-of-life care they choose, including palliative care and hospice.

More New Mexicans with serious medical conditions have greater peace of mind knowing that if things are difficult, they and their families can receive assistance/support from caring agencies and clinicians who will honor their choices.

No one should have to die alone, or suffer, or be fearful at the end. At ELONM we believe in "Quality of Life at the End of Life."

May it be so.

Game I, Game II, Game On! for Dickerson, Cancer Warriors

When Marci Dickerson sees a problem, she finds a solution or creates one.

That's true for Dickerson as the owner of The Game and Game II restaurants and Dickerson's Catering -- including finding ways to keep her businesses open and employees paid during Covid, and helping other businesses do the same -- founding three nonprofits, fundraising for the NMSU baseball team her older son plays for, working in politics -- and in her own battle with breast cancer.

Dickerson's cancer was discovered in August 2022. She underwent a biopsy and a double mastectomy last November (five surgeries, November-May), followed by four rounds of chemotherapy -- with Dick-

erson reporting on each live on social media from Memorial Medical Center (MMC) Cancer Center.

She never missed a day's work or an Aggie baseball game or a gathering of The Association (the nonprofit she founded with Sumer Rose-Nolen to encourage women entrepreneurs), or a fundraising project of Revolution 120, the foundation she created to "change the way Las Cruces gives."

The last round of chemo was in April, her hair is growing back and Dickerson, 47, is cancer free.

"My battle with cancer was not nearly as severe as so many others," Dickerson said. "I believe God gave me enough cancer to experience the hardships and shortcomings of our systems that deal with cancer. But He didn't give me so much that I would

have been too sick or too exhausted to create the solution that was Cancer Warriors."

A lunch event she hosted at the Farm and Ranch Heritage Museum in April raised a staggering \$220,000 for the new nonprofit.

"The outpouring and generosity of this community is so overwhelming," she said. "Our community truly cares."

Dickerson credits her doctors and nurses, including X-Ray Associates of New Mexico in Alamogordo for the rapid diagnosis, doctors Kamali and Abuerto for the surgeries and MMC Cancer Center for the treatment -- "amazing people who did an amazing job," she said. "I was truly blessed."

As her treatment progressed, she saw a need -- and a way -- to help others

"to make the journey of cancer suck less," she said.

Dickerson is determined to make the fight against female cancers "more efficient and less chaotic," she said, including mastectomies and hysterectomies and other preventive care, so there are "fewer places for female cancer to land."

"Faster, better" is the goal, she said.

The founders of Cancer Warriors are working on a resource guide for women facing cancer. For example, after a mastectomy, patients are told not to raise their arms or bend over for two weeks or get the surgery site wet.

"How am I supposed to wash my hair?" Dickerson said. "This is a huge problem for a lot of people."

Dickerson said a hair stylist friend helped her out, but "others have no so-

lutions." Ways to find people who can help -- posting a request on social media, for example -- will be in the resource guide, she said.

It will also tell cancer patients what to expect in treatment and recovery; how to deal with X-rays and CT scans, chemotherapy, radiation, surgery and potential nerve damage; and how to advocate for themselves before, during and after, Dickerson said.

The guide will also include referrals to other programs to help pay bills


and find support groups and other resources.

Cancer Warriors supplies gift baskets for patients at each stage of the cancer journey, including items like mouthwash, socks and neuropathy gloves. Boxes should be available in doctors' offices by August, she said.

"Doctors and nurses are there to save your life," Dickerson said. "Cancer Warriors is there to help keep you out of the chaos."

Ruiz takes reins at LCPS

The Las Cruces Public Schools Board of Education unanimously voted July 1 to approve the selection of Ignacio Ruíz as the next LCPS superintendent. Ruíz's first day on the job will be Tuesday, Aug. 1. Interim Superintendent Sherley O'Brien will oversee the district until that date.

The board unanimously approved Ruíz's contract terms from Aug. 1, 2023, until June 30, 2025. His annual salary was set at \$200,000 and the board approved the engagement of an executive coach "to support the superintendent's leadership," as explained by LCPS Board of Education President Teresa Tenorio. Ruíz will also receive standard benefits per district policy.

"It's great to be here," Ruíz said in both English and Spanish from a Zoom connection following the board's announcement. "I'm glad for this opportunity, and I'm honored and humbled to

be selected as the new superintendent of LCPS. It was evident from the beginning that the board values what's best for kids, and I look forward to being part of the Las Cruces community."

Ruíz had been named one of three finalists during the board's superintendent search, which began after former superintendent Ralph Ramos announced his retirement in March.

Ruíz is an assistant superintendent for the Clark County School District in Nevada, which includes Las Vegas. It is the fifth largest school district in the nation. He has held several leadership positions including assistant principal, principal and director. Previously, Ruíz held the position of Director of Language Acquisition in the Tucson (Arizona) Unified School District. He is a graduate of the ALAS (Association of Latino Administrators and Superintendents) National Superintendent Academy and the McCourt School of Public Policy at Georgetown.

City tabs Story as interim chief

Las Cruces City Manager Ifo Pili announced June 30 Deputy Las Cruces Police Department Chief Jeremy Story will serve as interim chief of the department as of July 1, the city stated in a news release.

Story was named interim chief following the retirement of Chief Miguel Dominguez, whose last day was June 30. Dominguez was a 20-year veteran of LCPD and served as chief since November 2020.

"I've had the privilege of working with Jeremy Story and have full confidence that he'll successfully and honorably lead the Las Cruces Police Department until we find our next Chief," Pili said.

Story has served as Deputy Chief of Operations since October 2022 and has been a commissioned officer since graduating from LCPD's 38th Academy in 2007. Story was valedictorian of his graduating class.

Prior to his appointment as deputy chief, Story had been a lieutenant with LCPD since 2018. In Story's 16 years with Las Cruces police, he has overseen the department's Academy, SWAT team, Traffic Unit, Gang Unit, and he served as Commander of LCPD's Honor Guard.

In 2012, Story earned his bachelor's degree in criminal justice from New Mexico State University.

The Las Cruces Police Department has two deputy chiefs. As Deputy Chief of Operations, Story has overseen the department's three patrol shifts along with the Traffic Unit, SWAT team and Police Service Aides. Sean Mullen became Deputy Chief of Administration Jan. 1, 2023, and oversees the Criminal Investigations Section, Intelligence Unit, the Law Enforcement Training Academy, Community Outreach, Administrative Programs and Metro Narcotics.

The City of Las Cruces will conduct a nationwide search for its next Chief of Police and will fill the position as soon as possible, the city said.

Manager gives overview of impact in the county

“The level of impact the county is having is at an all-time high,” Doña Ana County Manager Fernando Macias said in a recent interview.

The county is making record investments in roads, flood control, fire protection, economic development and other infrastructure and quality of life issues, said Macias, who began his second stint as county manager in January 2018. He previously was county manager 1997-2000 and served as a state district judge 2006-17.

Macias also was a New Mexico State senator for 16 years and was on the Doña Ana County Commission for two years.

The county

With more than 223,300 residents (about 114,000 live in Las Cruces), Doña Ana County is the second most populous county in New Mexico. It is geographically twice the size of Delaware and three times the size of Rhode Island. The county's 2021 median household income was \$47,151 and its poverty rate was 19.3 percent, compared to \$54,020 and 18.4 percent statewide and \$69,021 and 11.6 percent nationally. The county has three cities (Las Cruces, Anthony and Sunland Park), one town (Mesilla),

one village (Hatch) and more than two dozen census-designated places, according to the U.S. Census Bureau, including Santa Teresa, Chaparral, Doña Ana, Garfield and Organ. It is home to the Las Cruces, Gadsden and Hatch school districts. The county has 850 employees.

Roads

The county is engaged in “the most robust road effort in all of county history,” Macias said, with \$20 million in county funds and \$5 million from the state allocated “just for roads,” he said. That includes connectivity projects “to get people living in colonias onto major thoroughfares,” Macias said, as well as San Jacinto Road providing secondary

access to NM Hwy. 28 for Chamberino residents.

Economic development

“It’s like never before,” Macias said about economic development taking place in Santa Teresa, which he called a “driving force” in the state’s economy. The growth is “a prelude to additional large-scale manufacturing development” at the jetport and the industrial base in Santa Teresa, he said.

The county has requested \$33 million from the U.S. Department of Transportation (with a \$7 million county match) to build another overpass to “improve the flow of truck traffic through the industrial parks in Santa Teresa,” Macias said.

Nearby Santa Teresa and

its cross-border neighbor, San Geronimo, Chihuahua, Mexico, have more than six million square feet of industrial space in use, and more than two million square feet currently under construction.

Fire service

The county is “becoming more and more a full-time firefighter operation,” Macias said, with “very strong county commission funding and support” to create “a more established base in which to respond to fires and emergency services.”

The county will add an additional 14 full-time firefighters in the new fiscal year to bring the total number of paid county fire employees to 59, including county Fire Chief Shannon Cherry, administrators,

firefighters and EMTs. That is in addition to volunteer firefighters.

The county has seen a “really dramatic” increase in fire service in the past five years, Macias said, and is pursuing additional federal money to add “even more full-time staff.” 20 years ago, he said, the county had a fire marshal and one additional paid fire service employee.

County Triage Center

Thanks to legislation passed during the 2023 session and signed into law by Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham, the county will be able “to address liability issues voiced as impediments to the use of the (county) triage center,” Macias said.

The legislation, sponsored by state Rep. Doreen Gallegos of Las Cruces, allows for CTCs to involuntarily admit and treat “certain individuals in crisis,” according to the bill.

Macias said about 1,500 individuals have received service at the triage center since it opened in July 2021. The county has also begun mobile crisis service, so individuals in need of treatment don’t have to come to the center, located in Las Cruces.

The CTC has been “very positive,” Macias said, as it “takes the burden off area emergency rooms.”

Flood control

Macias said the county has allocated \$13 million to address flooding issues across the county, with millions of dollars in additional funding coming to complete projects in Hatch, Doña Ana, La Union, Chaparral, the East Mesa and elsewhere.

Italians exuberant on VG's initial spaceflight

A visit to space turned out better than expected for three Italians who rode the first commercial space mission on Virgin Galactic's Galactic 01 flight June 29.

"It was much better than expected," said the Italian Mission Commander Col. Walter Villadei, who is with the Italian air force, during a press conference immediately following the trip. "It was a very beautiful ride – interesting and amazing. You can be told, but in the end it was an unforgettable experience."

Villadei said, while it was over quickly, they were able to do all the experiments they had to do and also take in the views of earth.

Physician Lt. Col. Angelo Landolfi, also with the Italian air force, said he was concentrating on the tests he was tasked with but did get to look outside.

"It was beautiful, amazing, fantastic," he said before words failed him.

The mission objectives for the Italians included 13 human-tended and autonomous experiments in the biomedical field, thermos-fluid dynamics, and the development of

innovative and sustainable materials in microgravity conditions. They were to evaluate and measure hypergravity to microgravity transition effects on the human body and they collected data through wearable research payloads and sensors and by autonomous research payloads mounted in the cabin on the vessel's payload rack system.

But even as they carried experiments in their suits, the three travelers were able to tuck a few precious personal items in as well.

"I brought two pictures of my daughters when they were much smaller, a wedding picture with myself and wife and a few golden [items] for my daughters," Villadei said. "Most importantly, the prayer of the Marys which is supposed to be the protector."

Landolfi took a piece from the museum in Allegro, Italy, and will return it to the museum when he goes home.

Also on board was an engineer with Italy's National Research Council, Pantaleone Carlucci, who carried a photo of his grandmother who passed away two weeks ear-

lier.

"She was my big partner," he said.

Villadei said the mission means a lot in this year because both the Italian air force and the Italian National Research Council are celebrating 100 years.

"If you look back at space history in Italy, it was possible because of a strong bond with the U.S.," he said. "But now it's ... a new opportunity to open a new chapter of human exploration – not just about recalling the past but moving into the future."

Almost 15 years after Spaceport America welcomed Virgin Galactic as its anchor tenant. That dream of commercial space flight and exploration became real that Thursday, June 29.

"Virgin Galactic has shown

what perseverance really means in getting to this stage of their business," said Scott McLaughlin, Executive Director of the New Mexico Spaceport Authority in a press release. "In a very direct sense, the citizens of New Mexico have been investors in Virgin Galactic since the beginning and we look forward to the partnership for years to come."

The next Virgin Galactic commercial space mission, Galactic 02, is planned for August and flights are expected to continue monthly after that.

Society hosts dual celebration at Fort Selden

As United States Army soldiers – including Buffalo Soldiers, the Black infantry who were among the most decorated soldiers in the American Frontier Wars – abandoned Fort Selden in 1891, they dismantled and took away anything made of wood.

Without the support of window frames, doors and roofs, the fort's walls – once 10 feet tall and two feet thick – have suffered the extremes of weather, age and natural erosion for more than 130 years.

The Doña Ana County Historical Society (DACHS) was formed in 1963 to preserve Fort Selden, and the fort became a state monument in 1973.

New and longtime DACHS members and fort supporters gathered July 1 at the fort for a joint celebration – the historical society's 60th anniversary and the fort's 50th anniversary as a state property.

The event included presentations by New Mexico Historic Sites Executive Director Patrick Moore and Jerry Wallace of DACHS, along with a sunset tour of the fort led by State Historic Sites Instructional Coordinator Alexandra McKinney lead a Fort Selden tour. After the tour, visitors enjoyed two birthday cakes.

"This is really a community-based project," McKinney said during the tour.

Utilizing a National Park Service grant, stabilization efforts began at the fort

site in 1972, she said, and have included geo textiles and retaining grids. As excavation continues, McKinney said fort staff continue

to find artifacts on site, along ash from the 1889 fire at the fort.

Among the fort's most famous residents was a

young Douglas MacArthur, whose father, Arthur MacArthur, a Civil War veteran and recipient of the Medal of Honor, was

post commander in the late 1880s.

DACC program offers career, life pathways

One of Doña Ana Community College's newest programs, the Career and Life Skills Academy (CLSA), is helping neurodiverse (developmentally disabled) students discover their life goals and how to achieve them.

The year-long program for young adults who are high school graduates or the equivalent, began as a pilot last year

at the DACC Workforce Center in Las Cruces, with six students enrolled. This year's program, which continues with internships this summer, has nine students enrolled, said DACC program specialist Kay Lilley, who teaches the course.

CLSA got its start in 2022 when Michelle Roybal, a young woman with Down Syndrome, wanted a college experience after graduating high school but was unable to find such a program.

Michelle and her mother, Sharon Roybal, met with Susan Wood, a member of DACC President Monica Torres' cabinet, who "saw this as an opportunity to address a community need," Lilley said. A coalition that also included Mary Ulrich, director of DACC's Workforce Development and Career Readiness Department, "took on the project to engage and support a sector of the community that is traditionally excluded from employment

and post-secondary opportunities," Lilley said.

CLSA is now one of three programs of its type in New Mexico. The others are in Roswell and Farmington.

Lilley is the founder of Beloved Community (BC), which she started in 2013 to build a local community for young, neurodiverse adults that included "shared experiences (like theater workshops and art exhibits) for people with and without intel-

lectual and developmental disabilities."

Lilley dissolved BC in 2022, as she became the CLSA instructor. "CLSA recognizes that neurodiverse individuals are at risk of being misunderstood and often fulfill stereotypes and live up to low expectations that others have of and for them," Lilley said.

"It's called 'graduating to the couch,'" she said.

"In the program's first semes-

Suit regarding hazing allegations settled quickly

In the world of civil lawsuits, a swift resolution in two months is not typical. They usually drag on much longer.

But that's what happened regarding the suit alleging hazing on the New Mexico State University 2022-23 men's basketball team. The suit was filed April 19, and a settlement reached June 28, awarding a total of \$8 million to the plaintiffs.

"Generally we see a quick resolution if a case is either very strong or very weak, or if the parties are highly motivated," said Joleen Youngers, who represented two of the plaintiffs in the suit, William Benjamin and William (Deuce) Benjamin Jr., an NMSU player on last year's team. Youngers is an attorney with Almanzar & Youngers, which has offices in Las Cruces and Santa Fe, where Youngers primarily practices.

The Benjamins, along with player Shakiru Odenewu, who had different legal representation, named former Aggie head

coach Greg Heiar and his associate head coach, Dominique Taylor in the suit.

Specific players named were Deshawndre Washington, Doctor Bradley and Kim Aiken Jr.

"We believe this case was very strong and all the parties were highly motivated," Youngers said.

In settling the suit, NMSU admitted no guilt, and the lawsuit will be dismissed.

"New Mexico State University has reached a settlement agreement with William Benjamin, Deuce Benjamin and Shakiru Odenewu," said Justin Bannister, NMSU's associate vice president of marketing and communications. "We're pleased this situation has now come to a resolution and all parties are able to move forward."

The settlement calls for payment to be made in a lump sum, coming not from NMSU's general fund, but from the state's Risk Management Division, a taxpayer-funded insurance fund.

The Benjamins will receive \$4.125 and Shakiru Odenewu will receive \$3.875.

"The Benjamins' piece is a little bit bigger because we had two claimants," Youngers said.

"There's been recognition by NMSU they're going to continue to investigate about what happened and what can be done to avoid problems like this in the future."

The counts in the civil suit include negligence brought pursuant to the Tort Claims Act; sexual assault, battery and false imprisonment; and violation of New Mexico Civil Rights Act.

William Benjamin Sr.'s claim falls in the Tort Claims Act section of the suit, which addresses New Mexico's law allowing claims for loss of consortium. If a person in a close relationship, in this case father and son, suffers an injury, sometimes that injury can harm the relationship. The suit claims the suffering of Benjamin Jr. negatively affected the relationship. Benjamin Sr. played for the Aggies in the 1990s and has, for several years, been the head basketball coach at Las Cruces High School, where Benjamin Jr. played.

The two teamed to help the Bulldawgs win the 2020 state 5A basketball championship.

Regarding the NMSU players and the claims, the civil suit asserts Benjamin Jr. and Odenewu were harassed and physically assaulted multiple times dating back as early as November 2022 and continuing through the season, which ended in February 2023, when the university suspended the team's season and fired Heiar.

The civil suit cited incidents in the Aggies' home locker room, on the team bus and in a hotel room during a road trip. It describes one hazing incident as an "attack." The civil suit also asserts coaches were notified of incidents but did nothing in response.

While the settlement ends the civil case, nothing precludes a criminal case.

"In fact, it is my understanding the attorney general's office has assigned a special prosecutor and a special investigative unit, and is still actively investigating," Youngers said.

Youngers said her clients would not speak on the

record regarding the settlement.

"The resolution is a way of buying peace for both sides, and it becomes particularly true for my clients. Victims of type of assault we're talking about, to go through months or years of litigation can be a second victimization. It's not very easy for these gentlemen to be unnoticed in Las Cruces. So, this gives them a turn toward healing. Ongoing litigation can be like a wound that isn't allowed to heal."

Neither Benjamin, Odenewu, nor any other players from the 2022-23 Aggie roster are left in the Aggie fold. NMSU hired Jason Hooten as coach in March and, to date, he has signed 10 players and six coaches.

As of July 1, the Aggies are officially members of Conference USA, which will have 11 teams playing men's basketball, including NMSU rival University of Texas-El Paso, and Hooten's old team Sam Houston.

Heiar gets new job

Mineral Area College in Park Hills, Missouri, a

Division 1 junior college, announced July 1 it had named Heiar as its new head coach.

"Heiar's lengthy career has not been without controversy," the college said in its press release.

In addition to the hazing allegations, Heiar's tenure at NMSU is marked by the November 2022 shooting at the University of New Mexico campus in Albuquerque, in which Aggie player Mike Peake was shot and returned fire, killing a local resident. The incident took place the early morning before the scheduled Aggie-Lobo basketball game. Peake's shooting was ruled self-defense, and no charges were filed against him.

Heiar had been a junior college coach in Florida before his March 2022 hiring at NMSU, where he helped lead Northwest Florida State to the National Junior College Division II national championship.

The Aggies' record in the shortened season under Heiar was 9-15 overall, and 2-10 in the Western Athletic Conference.

ter, students focus on “the identities that are true to themselves and become authors of their own narrative,” sharing their stories through drawing, collaging, theater and storytelling.

Students use graphic images, colors and text “to envision a future for themselves, (including) a blueprint for personal, academic and career development,” Lilley said. It spells out the knowledge and skills the student needs to develop and the resources available to help him or her be successful.

“Before I didn’t know what I wanted to do,” said CLSA student Amelia Nelson. “This program has helped me find myself.”

The document also suggests college and job opportunities, along with additional training available at places like Cruces Creatives makerspace and Mesilla Valley Timebank.

The final blueprint “is the

basis for much of the classroom instruction, independent study, campus and community engagement activities and resource coordination” in CLSA’s second semester, Lilley said.

“A constant loop of feedback” from CLSA students and their parents is also helping develop the curriculum as the program moves forward, she said.

This summer, CLSA students are completing internships at Thomas Branigan Memorial Library, the City of Las Cruces Parks and Recreation Department, Munson Center and Rio Grande Theatre, among other placements.

Lilley said outcomes could include paid employment and college enrollment.

CLSA student Nick Ontiveros is excelling in his internship with Parks and Rec this summer, Lilley said.

“He loves it, and they love him,” Lilley said.

“He fits in just right,” Parks and Rec Internship Supervisor Joey Dominguez – a member of CLSA’s original cohort, em-

ployed with the city for more than a year – said about Ontiveros. “He’s very well liked and appreciated. Nick has been critical to our crew since we were short. He’s very meticulous, detail-oriented.”

“Not only is this a testament to Nick’s character and abilities, it is an indication that he has developed the basic work skills that employers look for,” Lilley said.

Another student is a youth monitor for the city’s after-school programming, and that also could develop into permanent employment. One CLSA student is a watercolor artist getting help with a business model and marketing plan as he looks at starting his own business.

As they complete CLSA, students create resumes listing internship experience, training and other credentials that are uploaded to job search sites and presented to prospective employers. DACC also works with the New Mexico Department of Workforce Solutions and the New Mexico Public Education Department’s Division of Vo-

ational Rehabilitation and other agencies to identify job prospects for CLSA students.

“Her confidence has been in the stratosphere since she’s been in this program,” a DVR counselor said about CLSA student Marisa Gonzales.

“In general, CLSA students (and parents) have indicated they have become empowered to take charge of their health and acquired the ability to develop informed opinions, speak up and take action on issues they care about,” Lilley said.

“This is a remarkable program. The academy provides an educational opportunity for those in our community who often have too few opportunities to continue their personal and professional development,” DACC President Monica Torres said. “We are happy to continue to be an all-inclusive, welcoming, and supportive college.”

CLSA’s future could include a residential program, Lilley said, pairing a neurodiverse and a tra-

ditional student as roommates, with the traditional student providing support and mentoring in exchange for a break on his or her rent. That would be part of CLSA’s goal of engaging students in campus life and higher education.

"The exhibit discusses the use of Chinese immigrant labor in the United States and Mexico (in the late 19th and early 20th centuries) and the impact it had on regional Chinese settlements," the city said. "It addresses anti-Chinese backlash by Borderland citizens and the govern-

ments of the United States and Mexico that resulted in anti-Chinese immigrant laws, in particular the federal Chinese Exclusion Act of 1882 and the New Mexico Alien Land Act of 1921.

"Through this changing political landscape, a small Chinese settlement developed in El Paso, plus there was a thriving Chinese-owned truck farming business in Deming and several small businesses in Las Cruces," the news release said. "Chinese artifacts from the El Paso settlement that were uncovered during a 1980s urban archeological excavation are featured in the exhibit."

BCC is open 9 a.m.-4:30 p.m. Tuesday-Friday and 9 a.m.-4:30 p.m. Saturday.

Review: Gieb embodies Victoria in play

To the benefit of Black Box Theatre (BBT) audiences, Queen Victoria was a prolific diarist.

Victoria, who reigned as queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland from 1837 until her 1901 death, wrote more than 120 journals. Her two published works were the source of the original play “Victoria in the Highlands” now in production at BBT, 430 N. Main St.

Cast members Autumn Gieb (Victoria) and Monte H. Wright (narrator) are also the playwrights, with a script that’s about 90 minutes with intermission. Wright is also the director.

The production presents a compelling view of one

of the most iconic figures of the 19th century. An entire era of British history was named for Victoria.

As the second act opens with Victoria grieving the loss of her beloved husband, Prince Albert, she lifts her black veil. It is an eerie and poignant moment because, more than at any other time in the show, the actor looked exactly like the character she was playing. Credit that to Gieb’s talent as an actor and as a costume designer.

I also was particularly taken with the scene detailing Victoria’s carriage accident. The play touches on her rather mysterious relationship with John Brown (1827-83), who had been one of Albert’s servants and became the queen’s confidant after Albert’s death.

I’ve seen Gieb give many outstanding performances, including in BBT’s 2021 one-person show “Every Brilliant Thing” and earlier this year in “Love, Loss and What I Wore.” As Queen Victoria, she adds to her impressive resume.

Kudos go to Wright for his performance as the narrator and his work directing Gieb. He also deserves credit as the show’s scenic designer, for the idea of the play and for his collaboration with Gieb and BBT owners Ceil and Peter Herman to make the whole thing come to life.

The cast includes Karen Buerdsell as Victoria’s lady’s maid. Buerdsell is fabulous, as always.

I think, an important aspect of Victoria’s character in her relationship with

her servant; neither speaks a single word to the other in the show.

Credit also goes to stage manager Erin Chenoweth and assistant stage manager Heather Olvera, lighting designer Peter Herman, set builder Joshua Taulbee, light operator Lisa Taylor and sound and projection operator Bekah Taulbee.

Performances of “Victoria in the Highlands” are 8 p.m. Friday-Saturday, July 7-8 and 14-15; 2:30 p.m. Sundays, July 9 and 16; and 7 p.m. Thursday, July 13. Tickets are \$15 regular admission, \$12 for students and seniors over age 65 and \$10 for all seats for the Thursday, July 13, performance only. 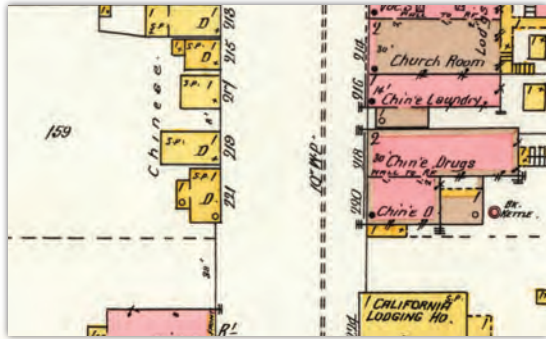

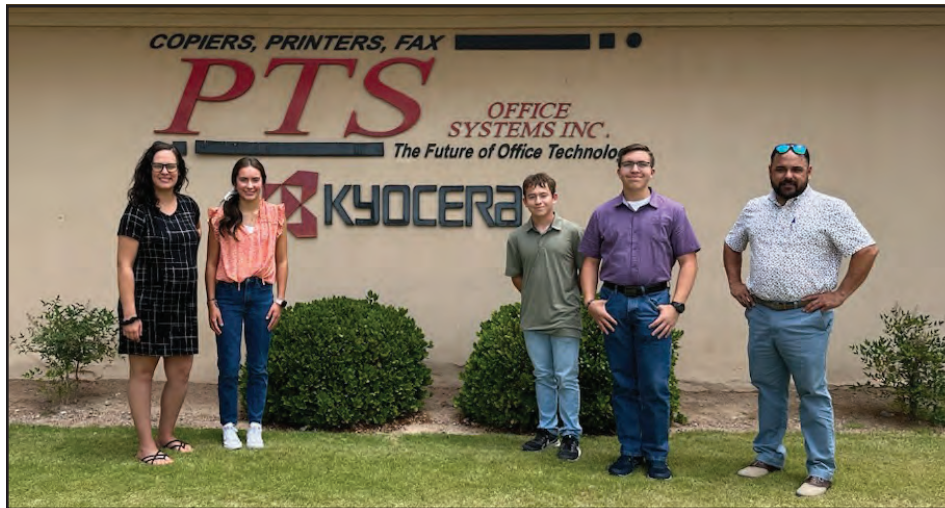

La Semilla receives grant for healthy living, eating

The New Mexico Department of Health’s Las Cruces Public Health Office at 1170 N. Solano Dr. in Las Cruces, will be

providing no cost back-to-school vaccinations Monday through Friday from July 10 through July 14. Limited walk-in and appointments are available on other days.

“I can’t say enough how successful vaccines have been over decades in greatly reducing once devastating diseases in the U.S.,” said New Mexico Department of Health Secretary Patrick Allen. “The Got Shots? campaign provides opportunities statewide for parents to bring their children for the vaccinations that safeguard their health

and their families too.”

This year, 78 community health centers, public health offices, and private practices across New Mexico are participating in Got Shots?.

To find a clinic in local communities statewide, people are encouraged to go online to immunization.doh.nm.gov and click on the “Got Shots? Information” link. The DOH provides immunizations at no cost year-round at public health clinics in every county for uninsured children.

already received, visit VaxViewNM.org or call 1-833-882-6454, hours of operation are 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. M-F, closed 12 to 1 p.m. for lunch, customers may also leave a voicemail and receive a call back. Othering: strange word, awful action

As a young white kid during World War II, I remember propaganda cartoons about Japanese soldiers.

They were short, yellow-skinned, wearing glasses over enlarged oriental eyes, with buck teeth like a comic squirrel. They were not called Japanese. They were “Japs” or Nips.” They had been “othered.”

I knew no actual Japanese people in Philadelphia – an important point.

Othering is a way to deprive your supposed enemies of their humanity. Doesn't matter who they are: women, Republicans,

Democrats, you name it. First you reduce them to stereotypes, and then systematically demonize them.

The word “othering” may be new, but the process has gone on throughout history as far back as one can trace. In some instances, it led to slavery; think Egyptians and

Hebrews, or Americans and Africans who were forcibly removed from their homelands. Remember the old cartoons about Black people: big heads, big lips, stupid speech patterns? Little Black Sambo?

This process of othering has gone on a long time, sometimes with cultural approval from those in charge.

We invent ways to dehumanize those we isolate and ostracize because they are different from us in race or religion or sex or politics. Know this: we want to be different because we consider ourselves superior. Think Nazi Germany, where anyone not “pure Aryan” was deprived of humanity:

gypsies, mentally challenged, physically impaired, homosexuals and, of course, the Jews. All these people were demonized to deny them, eventually, the right to live. If you need a reminder of cruelty to physically impaired people, check out the short film “Forgive us our Trespasses” on Netflix.

Al Hirschfeld was a legendary caricaturist regularly featured in the New York Times. I mention this for contrast: Caricature is a form of flattery, and usually involves only one subject, although it does involve exaggeration of physical aspects, usually facial features. Caricature is not the same thing as the cartoon images of Japanese people I knew in childhood. Caricature is positive; those cartoon images were negative. The first is based on genuine admiration, the second on abject hatred. The first is a humorous depiction, the second a pictorial form of othering.

Construct an image of the other by lumping them into a preconceived set of images or beliefs that you have invented, based on previous preju-

dices. For example, if you hate “Islam” generically based on hearsay or prejudice, you will dump every anti-Muslim trope you know on the next available Muslim. This creates an unbridgeable gap because you control the rules of discourse. You don't allow such persons to define themselves. You tell them who they are; you don't allow them the dignity of telling you who they are. You feel free to dump every stereotype and cartoon image of Islam on them. This serves only to isolate them, destroys the relationship, and enables you to feel smug because they fit your image of everything you find detestable in Islam.

Pursued on an individual level, othering destroys relationships and persons; pursued on a collective level it destroys democracy and nations. It's a very dangerous and toxic act, and we see it roundabout us everywhere these days in America, sad to say.

It's well beyond the hour when we should be asking ourselves if we really want to pursue such a course of action about individual people and whole groups whom we “other.”

To continue will be catastrophic for our future as a united people. Who do you waste time “othering”?

It's time to affirm our common humanity rather than trash others.

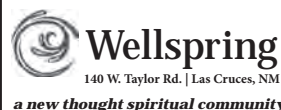

Aggie TV details released

NMSU REPORT

Kickoff times and networks have been announced for 10 of the 13 NM State football games this season. As NM State prepares for its first season as a member of Conference USA, head coach Jerry Kill and company will play at least five games on national, linear television with two additional contests already announced for national streaming on ESPN+.

The Aggies will kick off the 2023 season on ESPN versus UMass 5 p.m. Saturday, Aug. 26, MDT. The contest will be the second straight NM State football game to air on ESPN's main channel following the Aggies' victory in the December 2022 Quick Lane Bowl.

The 100th edition of the Battle of I-10 between NM State and UTEP will air nationally on ESPN2. Kickoff from

the Sun Bowl will be 7 p.m. Wednesday, Oct. 18, MDT.

A pair of home games will air nationally on the CBS Sports Network when the Aggies host Florida International (Oct. 4) and Sam Houston (Oct. 11), with kickoffs at 7 p.m. MDT from Aggie Memorial Stadium.

NM State will play a third contest on CBS Sports Network when the Aggies go head-to-head with Louisiana Tech at 5 p.m. MDT Tuesday, Oct. 24.

Two more contests – one at home and one on the road – will be streamed on ESPN+. The Aggies will host Western Illinois in a Sept. 2 contest on the ESPN streaming platform with kickoff

slated for 7 p.m. MDT. One week later, Sept. 9, NM State will head to Lynchburg, Virginia. Kickoff from Lynchburg is at 4 p.m. MDT.

Three additional games – Middle Tennessee (Nov. 4, 4 p.m. MDT); at Western Kentucky (Nov. 11, 1:30 p.m. MDT); and Jacksonville State (Nov. 25, 2 p.m. MDT) will all air on the ESPN platforms. Games designated on ESPN platforms are subject to changing kick times based upon television placement.

Details surrounding other games have yet to be determined.

Season tickets are on sale now for the 2023 NM State football campaign. Season tickets start at \$70 (\$55 for NM State faculty and staff), while single-game tickets will go on sale at a later date. NM State students are admitted to all home sporting events with their student ID.

NMSU officially part of C-USA

NMSU REPORT

The New Mexico State University Aggies embark on a new chapter as they officially began their affiliation with Conference USA July 1.

This move comes after the initial announcement was made nearly two years ago, signifying the end of their nearly 20-year association with the Western Athletic Conference. Along with NM State, Jacksonville State, Liberty and Sam Houston have traded in their league affiliations for the C-USA flag. The four new institutions will join current conference members Florida International, Louisiana Tech, Middle Tennessee, UTEP and Western Kentucky to make up a nine-member conference entering the 2023-24 seasons.

This transition has extra significance for Aggie football. Formerly one of seven FBS independent programs, the Aggies will be affiliated with a conference for the first time since being a part of the Sun Belt



from 2014-17. Additionally, the majority of NM State's NCAA Division I men's and women's athletic programs have become full members of Conference USA. The exception is the swimming and diving program, which will remain an affiliate member of the WAC due to the absence of women's swimming and diving sponsorship in C-USA.

In total, NM State spent 18 years as a member of the WAC – beginning its membership in 2005.

C-USA now becomes the fifth conference affiliation for the Aggies after representing the Border Conference (1931-62), Missouri Valley Conference (1971-83), the Pacific Coast Athletic Association/Big West Conference (1983-2001), the Sun Belt Conference (2001-05) and the WAC (2005-23).

Over the course of 18 years in the WAC, NM State secured 85 conference titles, second only to Brigham Young University's 193 championships during its 36-year membership. Since 2005, the Aggies claimed 26 more titles than the next closest institution.

Controversy, questions surround PGA Tour/PIF

"You never change things by fighting the existing reality. To change something, build a new model that makes the existing model obsolete."

— R. Buckminster Fuller (1896-1983), architect, creator of the geodesic dome.

Following the June 6 stunning announcement of the of the alliance between the PGA Tour and the \$650 billion Saudi sovereign Public Investment Fund (PIF), backers of LIV Golf, PGA Tour Commissioner Jay Monahan explained to the press that "circumstances change." They certainly have. Monahan then added, "We just realized we were better off together than we were fighting or apart."

So, since that news shook the golf world, it is now known the PGA Tour determined the mounting monetary toll of litigations, along with the expenditure of designated tour events and player incentives, were financially unsustainable. That, coupled with the Saudis' reluctance to open their PIF books to the world through the "discovery" process, created an avenue for candid discussion.

At this point, the alliance is only a "framework agreement" with many, many questions and details to be ironed out. Just as the introduction of the airplane and tank in World War I changed the nature of the battlefield, the reality of a new world order means professional golf has been forever changed.

There are many who decry the agreement on moral grounds, notably Saudi Arabia's ties to the 9/11 attacks, when all the planes were hijacked by Saudi nationals, as well as the outcry of that nation's abysmal human rights record.

Then there's the matter of sportswashing.

The PGA Tour/PIF agreement has now drawn the attention of the Department of Justice and Congress. Senator Richard Blumenthal (D.-Conn.) released this statement just after the Tour's announcement: "The PGA Tour has placed a price on human rights and betrayed the long history of sports and athletes that advocate for social change and progress. I will keep a close eye on the structure

of this deal and its implications."

Both Golfweek writer Eamon Lynch and Golf Channel analyst Brandel Chamblee have come out strongly criticizing the agreement as total hypocrisy.

In an open letter to Commissioner Jay Monahan, the PGA Tour's Board and fellow tour players, World Golf Hall of Famer Tom Watson wrote: "Please educate me and others in a way that allows loyalty to both (golf and country) in a way that makes it easy to look 9/11 families in the eye and ourselves in the mirror." Sports Illustrated's Michael Rosenberg writes,

"The future of men's professional golf hinges on whether specific moral questions matter." Or are set aside, since circumstances change in a hurry.

Commissioner Monahan recently said he met with several members of Congress to discuss LIV's entry into golf in the U.S. and suggested ways that lawmakers could support the PGA Tour in that battle. On June 9 Monahan sent a letter to Congress which read in part: "Over the past two years the PGA Tour has fought an intense and highly publicized battle as the Saudi Arabian PIF-backed LIV golf league attempted to 'buy' PGA Tour players and take over the game of golf ... we were largely left on our own to fend

off the attacks, ostensibly due to (our) complex geopolitical alliance with the Kingdom."

All of that said, there are many other major questions in the 22 years post-9/11, which I haven't noticed being discussed. Yes, in those intervening years, circumstances changed. Saudi Arabia is by far our biggest military arms customer, with us supplying F-15 fighter jets, Black Hawk helicopters, tanks and artillery. In the past two decades our arms sales may have even surpassed the PIF fortune. Nobody is protesting outside the Pentagon gates. A substantial portion of our country's Fortune 500 corporations do big business with the Saudis, and have for the past half-

century. Nobody is lining up with protest signs in front of General Motors, General Electric, General Dynamics or Coca-Cola headquarters.

It seems to be just fine with Congress that big companies do business with the Saudis, but when our sacred golf institution tries it, Oh that's a different story. And then there are the massive investments in U.S. companies and land by the Saudis and the PIF itself. Nobody is carrying protest signs in front of the New York Stock Exchange.

I detect some hypocrisy all the way around, but especially in government.
