Classes starting in LC

Las Cruces Public Schools begins the 2023-24 school year Wednesday, July 19, as the school district continues its year-round school calendar.

Kindergarten, sixth- and ninth-grade students return to classes July 19. All other students return July 20.

In August, LCPS will welcome new Superintendent Ignacio Ruíz, whose contract begins Aug. 1. Until Aug. 1, Shelley O'Brien continues as interim superintendent. She is expected to return to the position of chief of staff for the school district.

Free meals

Because of the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) program, all LCPS elementary and middle school students will receive free breakfasts and lunches during the 2023-24 school year.

School safety

LCPS reviewed its lightning protocol, and will keep the 10-mile safety radius, said Communication Director Kelly Jameson. "That means if lightning is detected within 10 miles of a school, the building will shelter in place, along with any outdoor activities including practices, games and scrimmages. Because school starts during the monsoon season, LCPS anticipates lightning could disrupt the school day, including dismissal times. Please know these safety protocols are for the safety of all stu-

dents and staff," Jameson said.

Middle schooler in D.C. to advocate for type 1 diabetes

Las Cruces middle school student Lila Sanchez is making her first trip to Washington, D.C., where she and other children from across the country are advocating for more diabetes research and lower insulin prices.

Lila, 13, has been a type 1 diabetic (T1D) since she was 8. T1D is a lifelong autoimmune condition that requires insulin injections to regulate blood sugar.

With love and support from her parents, Las Cruces Public Schools Board of Education President Teresa Tenorio and Doña Ana County Commissioner Manuel Sanchez, Lila has learned to manage her condition with a positive attitude, and to advocate for herself and others.

In the nation's capital, she will be the only New Mexico representative among 165 students from across the country at the Junior Diabetes Research Foundation's (JDRF) Children's Congress. During the July 7-9 event, Lila and her mother will visit the offices of U.S. Sens. Martin Heinrich and Ben Ray Lujan and U.S. Rep. Gabe Vasquez to raise awareness about T1D and support JDRF's goal of a T1D-free world.

For Lila, and for kids and adults like her, diabetes means constantly monitoring blood sugar levels and keeping track of her carbohydrate intake to make sure they are not too high or too low. She wears an insulin

pump that uses a plastic needle to inject insulin into her bloodstream. Lila also wears a continuous glucose monitor that is also inserted under the skin and tracks her blood sugar levels, which are automatically sent to Lila's and her parents' cell phones.

"I do believe a cure will be possible," said Lila, who will be an eighth grader at Picacho Middle School (PMS) when the 2023-24 school year begins. She likes to play basketball and softball and wants to try out for the Scorpions teams at PMS this year.

Since Lila's was diagnosed with T1D five years ago, her parents have helped her to "not associate negativity" with her illness, Tenorio said. "It's never 'why me?'" she said. "This could happen to anybody."

At the same time, "it's okay to vent," Tenorio said, as Lila deals with the demands and frustrations of being an active adolescent with T1D.

"I don't feel highs as much as I feel lows (too much insulin)," Lila said.

They can leave her with less energy than normal and feeling shaky.

Lila's condition means she and her family must deal with "a lot of things people take for granted," Tenorio said, like making sure Lila's insulin pump and monitor are working properly, that she has all the medical supplies she needs at home and wherever she goes, and she always has snacks on hand in case her blood sugar drops.

Last fall break, during a family trip to the Grand Canyon, Lila's insulin pump stopped working. She was hours away from a replacement, so her parents began making phone calls until a replacement pump could be purchased. In the meantime, Lila went back to making multiple injections of insulin a day to stay healthy and alive.

Needles are a necessary part of T1D, including the needles that are part of insulin pumps, the .16-.24-inch needles in the syringes a T1D patient uses instead of a pump and to prick a finger to test blood sugar levels, and the filament inserted under the skin for a continuous glucose monitor. They are also part of emergency glucagon shots that school nurses keep on hand – and must be trained to use – in case of an emergency. A new glucagon nasal spray is replacing these shots because of the ease of use and reduced user error, Tenorio said.

If Lila or one of the other 60 or so Las Cruces Public Schools students who have T1D go on a field trip, for example, at least one adult on that trip must be specifically trained to assist T1D students, Tenorio said. Per New Mexico Senate Bill 48, a minimum of two employees at every school must have that training, she said.

"In addition to school nurses, LCPS strives for educators and activities sponsors to be trained and that training is currently being updated and improved," said Tenorio,

who was elected to the LCPS Board of Education in 2019 and became board president earlier this year.

School nurses track their T1D students by computer and can take them juice or another snack if blood sugar levels drop, Tenorio said.

"Our nurses do a great job," she said.

T1D equipment is also expensive. An insulin pump lasts about four years, Tenorio said, and costs about \$4,000. With their insurance, Sanchez and Tenorio pay \$800 out of pocket. Lila's family pays about \$300 a month for insulin and the other T1D supplies she needs.

Lila joined JDRF a couple of years ago after she and Tenorio participated in a diabetes walk in Albuquerque.

"I enjoy talking about it," Lila said about her T1D condition.

The question she is most often asked is, "Can you eat this?" Lila said.

"I can eat pretty much anything as long as I dose for it," she said.

"Manny (Lila's father), Lila and I have memorized foods – how many carbs they have," Tenorio said, and how that will affect Lila's blood sugar and insulin levels.

"She owns that narrative of what it means to live with this," Tenorio said.

Dealing with T1D sometimes "gets me down," Lila said, especially dealing with needles. But, most of the time she feels well and enjoys her life. Lila's goal is to become a mechanical engineer and work for NASA.

What is type 1 diabetes?

From the national Centers for Disease Control and Prevention:

"If you have type 1 diabetes (T1D), your pancreas doesn't make insulin or makes very little. Insulin helps blood sugar enter the cells in your body for use as energy. Without insulin, blood sugar can't get into cells and builds up in the bloodstream. High blood sugar is damaging to the body and causes many of the symptoms and complications of diabetes.

"T1D was once called insulin-dependent or juvenile diabetes. It usually develops in children, teens, and young adults, but it can happen at any age.

"Type 1 diabetes is less common than type 2 – about 5-10 percent of people with diabetes have type 1. Currently, no one knows how to prevent T1D, but it can be treated successfully.

Nearly 30 million Americans – almost nine percent of the U.S. population – have diagnosed diabetes; a quarter million children and adolescents under age 20 have T1D.

Truck crash closes northbound I-25 crossover

A fiery truck crash closed parts of Interstates 10 and 25 about 8 p.m. Tuesday, July 11.

The New Mexico Department of Transportation said the driver escaped without injuries.

The next morning, July 12, I-10 eastbound to the I-25 northbound crossover was still closed.

According to New Mexico State Police (NMSP), the commercial motor vehicle involved rolled over and caught fire. The flames and smoke were visible for miles Tuesday evening.

Firefighters from the Las Cruces Fire Department (LCFD), Doña Ana County and New Mexico State University responded to the fire, LCFD said in a news release, along with area law enforcement.

First crews on the scene "discovered the fuel tanker fully engulfed in flames with fire extending from the bridge down onto the shoulder of I-10," LCFD said.

Fire crews, including LCFD's HazMat Team and the Aircraft Rescue Firefighting Team, battled the fire and brought it under control by about 9:20 p.m., LCFD said.

The incident is under investigation by the NMSP.

Smoke and flames were visible for miles in Las Cruces as a tanker truck rolled over and caught fire Tuesday night, July 11, on the Interstate 10/Interstate 25 exchange.

Waiting on the rains

As I write this, on Monday, July 10, the accumulated rainfall total for the calendar-year 2023 is 1.4 inches.

I don't have to tell you that's not a lot of rain.

We live in the desert, so we don't expect a lot of rain, but still, 1.4 inches.

Have you ever been to Dubuque, Iowa?

Me neither.

But in seeking to compare rain statistics, I randomly thought of Dubuque. It's on the eastern border of Iowa, very close to both Illinois and Wisconsin on the Mississippi River. I'm sure it's a nice place, with lots of trees and green grass. It has a population of just under 60,000 people. When I checked Google to learn more, I found they had a mass shooting the other day in which four people were shot. Of course, in

this day and age, that just makes it Anytown, USA.

Dubuque has also had 14.0 inches of rain this year. This HALF-year, I should say. My Oklahoma math tells me that's 10 times the rain we've had in Las Cruces.

Going Downtown

Most years, Las Cruces doesn't break double digits on rain inches for the whole 12 months. We almost did in 2018, with 9.4. And we did in both 2017 (11.6 inches) and 2015 (12.6 inches.)

In Dubuque, they got 31.5 inches last year, and broke 50 inches in 2018 and 2019.

I'm not complaining, and I sure as heck am not planning to relocate to Dubuque, but I was curious about other places' weather. And we do need the rain.

It's so easy to think things used

to be better, in all phases of life. In my mind, I've always thought the monsoons brought a lot more rain in the mid-1990s, when I first moved to southern New Mexico. But the records indicate from 1995, my first year here, through 1999, we had only one double-digit year. That was 1997, with 10.4 inches. And we came close in 2000, with 9.9.

The real rainy stretch was the mid-2000s. From 2004 through 2007, we had double digits four years in a row. Highlighted with 13.2 in 2004, and 14.2 in 2006. But that was followed with seven straight years of less than 10 inches. The worst was our centennial year, with 5.5 inches.

In Dubuque, the last 17 years, they've only had one year when rainfall was under 30 inches.

That was 2021, when it was 29.9.

The monsoon season is supposedly coming soon. (See Mike

Cook's article on Page 10). The afternoon clouds have started their annual afternoon bunching behind the Organs. We've been trained to expect big rains on the 3rd or 4th of July, but that didn't happen this year, which worries me a bit.

In Las Cruces, umbrellas get more use for shade than protection from rain. When our storms do hit, they often bring that big New Mexico wind, destroying your umbrella within seconds of opening it, rendering it useless as you stand there soaking.

When the rain finally stops, though, whether it's rained for two minutes, two hours, or two days (that's only happened once since I've lived here), we get something they'll never have in Dubuque. And that's the glorious smell of the desert after the rain.

Come on monsoons, we're ready.

Congressional district in hands of judge

District Judge Fred Van Soelen of Clovis has until Oct. 1 to decide if the redistricting map that allowed Democrats to wrest control of the Second Congressional District will still be in place for the 2024 election.

Last week the state Supreme Court sent a lawsuit filed by Republicans seeking to overturn the new map back to District Court, also giving Judge Van Soelen guidance on what he should consider in making his decision.

The order instructs that "a reasonable degree" of partisan gerrymandering is permissible, so long as it's not "egregious." The order notes the "inherently political nature" of redistricting.

Van Soelen is instructed to compare voter registration data on party affiliation under the old map and the new one.

And he is instructed to go by the three-part test laid out by U.S.

Supreme Court Justice Elena Kagen in a 2019 dissenting opinion. The first two tests are that the maps were intended to strengthen one party by diluting votes from its opponents and succeeded in that goal. The third test is if there is a legitimate, non-partisan explanation for the changes.

None of which would seem to be very helpful for Judge Van Soelen; assuming he lacks the ability to look into the hearts and minds of others.

Republicans look at the new map, which breaks up their traditional stronghold in the southeastern part of the state, and argue that the partisan intent is obvious. Democrats argue their intent was to bring more Hispanic representation into the district, which they have done.

Both could be true. But it is important to remember how the process played out. Democrats in the state Senate tossed out all of the proposed maps submitted by an independent redistricting commission, and replaced them with a map that diluted the power of southeast New Mexico in a way that none of the other maps considered.

This was the first time in 30 years Democrats had full control of the redistricting process. The last two redistricting periods, Republican governors were in office. Both of those times the process broke down, and final maps were drawn by the courts. This time Democrats took advantage of that power.

And that may have made the difference in a close race won by Democrat Gabriel Vasquez in

New Mexico's Second Congressional District House seat in 2022.

Republicans who had feared their case would be tossed out by the state Supreme Court see last week's ruling as a victory. But Hannah Burling, of the League of Women Voters and the group Fair Districts for New Mexico, notes the guidance Van Soelen will rely on was authored by one of the Supreme Court's most progressive justices.

I remember watching with excitement of the home being built across the street from us. In particular, a memory that stands out of a woman on top of the roof and she was pushing out some rolled tar paper. I was surprised to see a lady on a roof working so hard when my own mother was afraid of the heights of a step ladder.

I have not seen again any ladies putting on tar paper since this one experience. I was impressed with the energy and enthusiasm Bernice displayed that day.

It was not long that my mother and I got to know Bernice. Bernice discovered I would be losing a tooth soon and she invited me to show it to her when the tooth finally came out. On the big day, my mother marched me over to your residence and I displayed the tooth that had popped out. Bernice was so excited and disappeared around a corner in the home and returned with a nickel in her hand. She told me to keep the tooth and the nickel. The best

I remember walking away thinking this person made me feel so good about myself. Somehow it lodged in my memory banks and came flooding back when I reviewed the article. It sounds like you have continued the family tradition of making people feel valued and special, which in the building business is the greatest construction you can do.

I would like you to know the little pebble you cast that day has had a rippling effect through the years. I was in the education business and served as a high school principal in Waldport, Oregon, for 21 years. The ripple effect was that I made an ef-

fort to help each student know they were loved and valued. I have had so many wonderful experiences with young people because of your example and many examples like it. I loved reading what you have done in my most favored community to try to make the lives of those citizens a little better and brighter. I pray that you will have many more years of going strong in Las Cruces and the surrounding area. It was not the tooth or the nickel that made me feel so good; it was the smile, warmth and genuine caring I felt that morning. Thank you for your love of serving. It has been passed along to many, many hearts. "Every act of kindness is a little love we leave behind us."

Thalia Chaverria, a member of New Mexico State University's Western Athletic Conference champion soccer team, was found dead in her Las Cruces residence July 10.

Investigators said July 11 they had no reason to believe the death of Chaverria, 20, was suspicious or the result of criminal activity. The Las Cruces Police Department and the Office of the New Mexico Medical Investigator were continuing investigations in efforts to learn a cause of death, according to an LCPD press release.

"The sudden loss of Thalia has completely rocked our Aggie soccer families' world," said Aggie head soccer coach Rob Baarts. "T was an inspiration and rock to this team. She will be missed but not forgotten. Her spirit will be with us every day, on and off the pitch. I will always love you T!"

Chaverria, a 5-10 defender from Bakersfield, California, started 20 games for the Aggies last season as a sophomore and earned All-WAC Honorable Mention honors as a freshman in 2021. She turned 20 on July 2.

"Yesterday, we lost an amazing young woman, and we are deeply saddened by the untimely passing of a member of our Aggie family," said Mario Moccia, NMSU director of athletics. "Thalia had a vibrant personality and those who were fortunate enough to spend time with her knew she had a bright future ahead of her. The New Mexico State community is very tight-knit, and this tragedy is felt throughout. Our most sincere thoughts and prayers go out to Thalia's family and friends in this time of mourning."

The university made grief counselors available to student-athletes and other friends through the Aggie Health and Wellness Center.

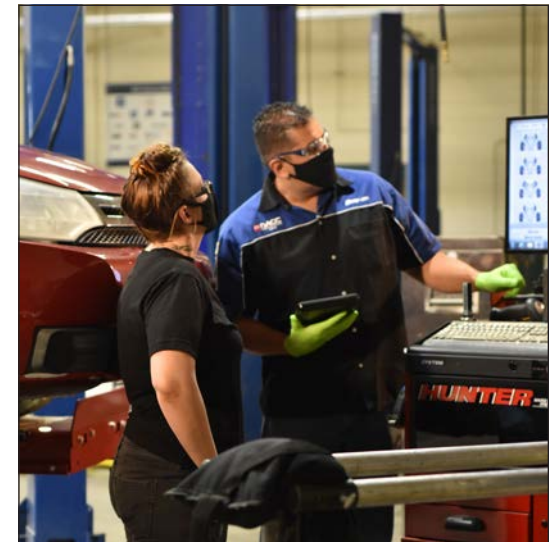
Doña Ana Community College Automotive Program has received full re-accreditation from the Automotive Service Excellence Education Foundation (ASE), DACC said in a news release.

Monsoon rains likely delayed until August

The 2023 monsoon season is “off to a slow start” but likely will have a “gangbuster finish,” said National Weather Service (NWS) meteorologist Jason Laney, based at NWS’ El Paso weather forecast office in Santa Teresa, New Mexico.

The monsoon season started in mid-June, he said, but the onset of the rain it typically brings to southern New Mexico likely will be delayed until early August.

“August and September should be fairly decent months for precipitation,” Laney said.

In the meantime, the area’s record heat will continue, he said.

The monsoon season, officially June 15-Sept. 30, usually brings about five inches of rain to the area, about 60 percent of its total annual precipitation, Laney said.

The region came out of a long-running drought last year because of a wetter-than-normal monsoon season and winter snowpack, he said.

Even so, “The lower Rio Grande is considered

abnormally dry,” Laney said. “If things don’t change, we could slip back into moderate drought in the next month.”

This year’s monsoon rains have been delayed because of the late arrival of El Niño, the warm phase of the El Niño–Southern Oscillation (ENSO) weather pattern (winds and sea-surface temperatures) in the equatorial Pacific Ocean that impacts weather around the world. La Niña is the opposite – a cooling phase of ENSO. There is also a third,

neutral phase. (“El Niño de Navidad,” a reference to the Christ Child, was given to the warm, south-flowing air current centuries ago by Peruvian fishermen because it was most noticeable around Christmas. “La Niña” [the girl] came into use sometime later to denote the opposite air current.)

A late starting El Niño has meant “heat and dry thunderstorms” in July, Laney said, duplicating the weather pattern more typical in the month of June in southern New Mexico.

This year’s heat wave is already breaking records

set in 1994, which Laney described as “a summer without a monsoon.” That year, NWS recorded 62 days that were 100 degrees or hotter, he said, including 23 days in a row.

The NWS had recorded 27 100-or-hotter days in 2023 through July 10, including 26 in row, Laney said.

Those conditions “are likely stay to with us through the end of July,” he said. “We’re on track to be 100 degrees or hotter every day between now and the end of the month.”

What is a monsoon?

A monsoon is not a rainstorm; it’s a seasonal reversal of winds.

In the desert Southwest, prevailing winds are from the west and southwest, Laney said. They come off other desert regions, so they don’t produce a lot of moisture. The pattern shifts in the summer “and we begin to have more of a flow from the south or southeast,” he said. “Most of the time it picks up moisture when it happens.”

Bus ridership up 28 percent

South Central Regional Transit District (SCRTD) ridership increased by 28 percent in the past fiscal year, with 99,318 trips generated from communities in Hatch, Las Cruces, Anthony, Chaparral, Sunland Park, and unincorporated areas of Doña Ana County and El Paso.

Ridership has grown for three consecutive years in the SCRTD service area, the transit district said in a news release.

The district is preparing to transition its bus fleet to zero-emission (all electric) vehicles, the news release said. Funding from federal and state sources will support the acquisition of 10 electric buses, delivering the first four buses by June 2024.

“The continued rise in ridership is due to the district attracting more riders by increasing service on its bus routes across the Mesilla Valley,” said SCRTD Executive Director David Armijo. “Adding zero-emission electric buses

These electric buses are similar to those on order for South Central Regional Transit District.

adds another challenge but will improve air quality and reduce maintenance costs by lowering vehicle emissions.”

The district is working with El Paso Electric to prepare for the transition to zero-emission electric buses, the news release said.

SCRTD was formed in

2006 and began operation in 2016. SCRTD services connect riders with Las Cruces’ Roadrunner, El Paso’s Sun Metro and other regional transportation services.

City council revises fees

At its July 3 regular meeting, the Las Cruces City Council unanimously approved revised fees for city Parks and Recreation Department programs and facilities. The council also approved a new program allocate funds to businesses that have suffered “catastrophic incidents.”

The revised fee schedule includes general recreation programs, including sports leagues and special events; swimming, including community education classes; facilities rentals, including community gardens, senior and recreation centers and other city-owned facilities; fundraising rentals; merchandise; memorial trees, benches and walk of honor bricks; park permit fees; sports league fees; downtown area fees; and mobile concession fees.

This is the first change in the fees since 2019-20.

Many of the new fees are unchanged from four years ago, and some new programming is included. There were price increases from \$48 to \$60 for fitness and water fitness punch cards (30 visits each) and for 30 visits to the weight room at the city’s Regional Aquatic Center.

The cost of sports league programming will increase for youth sports leagues and cheer from \$45 to \$50 per child with a jersey and from \$35 to \$40 without a jersey.

The cost of community education classes will increase by \$5: first aid: \$45-\$55; CPR-PR: \$70 to \$75; CPR or first aid recer-

tification and home swimming/water safety/open water: \$45 to \$50; lifeguard skills recertification: \$85 to \$90; home swimming pool/spa water safety and open water safety: \$25 to \$30.

Daily fees for swimming will stay the same: free for infants (ages 0-2 years), \$2 for youth (3-17 years old) and adults (18-59) and \$1 for seniors (60 and older). Fees were also set for the new Las Cruces Natatorium that opened in June.

Facility rental fees remained unchanged for the most part. The charge for using the auditorium at the Frank O’Brien Popen Community Center increased from \$30 to \$40.

The cost of some merchandise increased, and the city added pickle balls (available for \$1) and plush Ziggy (the city’s mascot) dolls (\$10).

The costs of city programs that declined under the new fee structure include after school and summer recreation programs and fall camps.

The cost of a tree memorial was set at \$500; the cost of a bench with a plaque will range from \$2,200-\$2,500 and will be \$1,800 for a bench without a plaque; and the cost of a walk of honor memorial brick will be \$35.

The city added sports league fees for non-city residents that are double the fees charged to city residents, which stayed the same.

The city said its target for cost recovery with the new fees is zero-20 percent for programs including therapeutic, special events and out-of-school time; 70-85 percent for programs that include youth

classes and athletics; 33 percent for programs that include aquatics; and 100 percent for programs that include adult recreation and athletics.

The city Parks and Recreation Advisory Board reviewed the proposed fee schedule and the revised fee schedule should be available soon at www.lascruces.gov/2588/Parks-Recreation-Fees-and-Charges-Policy.

Catastrophic funds for businesses

The city council also approved a new program to allocate funds to city businesses “that have suffered catastrophic incidents and need immediate relief,” the city said.

State Sen. Carrie Hamblen, D-Doña Ana, allocated \$150,000 in funding from the New Mexico Legislature to fund the program. The money will be administered by the city Economic Development Department (EDD) through its Local Economic Development Act (LEDA) program.

The program defines a catastrophic incident as “a sudden and devastating event that can cause significant harm or damage to a business and its assets.”

The city said that could include natural disasters and human-made events that “can lead to significant operational disruptions, loss of critical data and financial losses. In the case of equipment failure or malfunction, catastrophic incidents can cause significant downtime, increased maintenance costs or even

Regional residents now have access to affordable internet

A federal program launched during the pandemic helps low-income families pay their monthly internet cost – sometimes covering the whole bill. But many across Southern New Mexico are unaware of the program or have had problems signing up.

Thursday, July 6, local internet access advocates gathered in Las Cruces and formally announced a \$300,000 funding award for boosting awareness about and helping people sign up for the home internet subsidy, known as the Affordable Connectivity Program. The ACP pays families up to \$30 per month (or \$75 for tribal members) for internet.

Advocates say the new funding will help residents in rural, mostly Hispanic border communities known as colonias, as well as some people in cities like Las Cruces who are negatively affected by a national digital divide. Daisy Maldonado, executive director of Empowerment Congress, noted there are 37 colonias in Doña Ana County in need of access or better access. Broadband is “a vital public infrastructure that’s needed for daily living,” she said.

“This didn’t just get highlighted during the Covid-19 pandemic and stay-at-home orders here in New Mexico, but it was exponentially highlighted,” she said during a news conference at the Community Foundation of Southern New Mexico’s headquarters. “Children had to now do school from home. Parents had to work from home, and that was

almost impossible because, again, they didn’t have broadband internet.”

Access remains a challenge

Indeed, many families in rural and semi-rural areas of Southern New Mexico have few – if any – options to connect to high-speed internet. Just 10 miles south of Las Cruces, residents of Mesquite struggle to work from home or school, due to lack of availability of high-speed services. In more urban settings, better infrastructure exists, but many times families can’t afford subscriptions.

The newly announced Federal Communications Commission money will go to a group called Borderplex Connect, high-speed internet access advocates working in far West Texas and Southern New Mexico. Such groups are expected to play crucial roles in identifying needs, securing grants, and making headway toward solving connectivity gaps across the nation. Borderplex Connect is organized under the El Paso Community Foundation, which will administer the new grant

in cooperation with the coalition.

Eric Pearson, president and CEO of the El Paso Community Foundation, said the coalition has found the percentage of residents without adequate internet access is less than recorded in FCC data.

“When we talk about broadband access and devices and the ability to use those devices – we know that’s an important part of what it means to be part of the community to access health care, to access education, access the banking system, to be put on the rolls of the community,” he said.

The new funding will specifically go to work in Doña Ana and Luna counties to raise awareness about the Affordable Connectivity Program and directly help people enroll in it. The Southern New Mexico Journalism Collaborative has previously reported that residents face a variety of barriers to signing up – ranging from lack of awareness about the subsidy to language barriers to logistical hurdles. Compared to other U.S. states, New Mexico has

shown stronger enrollment in the subsidy. Even so, more than half of eligible households are still not participating.

‘Boots on the ground’

Terra Winter, president and CEO of the Community Foundation of Southern New Mexico, said funding will help support broadband coalition meetings in communities and hiring more personnel, such as through Empowerment Congress, to help residents sign up for the subsidy.

“It will employ further people in those programs because they already have boots on the ground,” said Winter, who sits on the coalition board. “So, it’s a way to try to increase their capacity.”

Recently, a pool of \$675 million dollars was announced by the federal government to boost high-speed internet infrastructure in New Mexico. Another pool of funding is expected to be awarded for digital equity – helping people get devices and internet service, as well as learn the skills needed to put broadband to use in

their lives.

Winter said she’s optimistic the \$300,000 will allow broadband advocates to show “proof of concept” in helping residents connect to the internet, and that could open the door to further funding for Borderplex Connect and for smaller nonprofits like Empowerment Congress.

Christie Ann Harvey, executive director of the nonprofit Greater Luna County Economic Opportunity Council, said about 8,500 residents in the unincorporated areas of Luna County are in “desperate need” of broadband access.

“These people cannot get educational opportunities,” she said. “They can’t work from home. Health care is limiting to them. They’re very deprived in their ability to create a living. Our poverty rate in Luna County is about twice the national average.”

In 2020, about 24 percent of Luna County residents were in poverty, compared to about 11 percent nationwide, according to U.S. Census Bureau numbers.

Representatives from the Federal Reserve Bank of Dallas, whose jurisdiction includes Southern New Mexico, have helped local broadband advocates identify grant opportunities.

Permanent change?

A Doña Ana County broadband coalition that was a basis for Borderplex Connect carried out an internet access survey among 5,000 residents in 2020 with the help of Empowerment Congress’ community health workers known as promotoras. The study identified significant needs among residents. Among respondents with-

out internet, 75 percent identified as Hispanic, and the majority reported a household income under \$21,000, according to BorderplexConnect.org.

“What they heard at the doors varied,” Maldonado said. “People said: ‘I can’t afford it, even if I wanted it.’ Some people said: ‘If I did have it, I wouldn’t know where to start.’ Some people said: ‘Well, there isn’t a service near me where I can get internet service at all.’”

Most internet services are provided by private companies, and the cost of subscriptions can be a hurdle to residents.

Winter said the recent funding award also allows “us to make tougher conversations happen.”

“In Luna County, they’ve talked about owning a utility,” she said. “We’ve talked about that with Borderplex Connect because of the cost of private companies. So, it’s allowing us to have those equity conversations, if it is a private company coming in.”

Borderplex Connect is applying for a different pool of funding for similar work in El Paso County, Winter said.

Pearson said the recent grant is the “very, very tip of the iceberg.”

“This grant will help us bridge over to what will have to be permanent change for our community,” he said.

Maldonado said the long-term goal is to not provide a “temporary Band-Aid” for broadband in communities but to create permanent, equitable high-speed access.

Chaparral solar array now online; could power up to 60,000 homes

One of the newest solar power arrays to come on line is in Doña Ana County. It's the Buena Vista Energy Center on more than 2,700 acres of state land in Chaparral.

The project is the largest solar array constructed on state lands in New Mexico and is expected to produce more 120 megawatts of solar power – enough energy to power roughly 60,000 homes, according to NextEra Energy Resources, the State Land Office (SLO) said in a news release.

Over the lifetime of the lease, the project is expected to generate about \$12 million in revenue for New Mexico's public schools and New Mexico State University, the news release said.

NextEra Energy, El Paso Electric and New Mexico Commissioner of Public Lands Stephanie Garcia Richard were on hand for the array's ribbon cutting.

"New Mexico is blessed with amazing sun and wind resources, and we

have a great opportunity before us to harness these resources and create new and steady streams of revenue for our public schools and other beneficiaries. The Buena Vista project adds to this rapidly expanding footprint of renewable energy production on state lands and moves us one step forward to a cleaner future," Garcia Richard said. "As New Mexico strives to meet the renewable energy standards set under the (2019 state) Energy Transition Act, our Office of Renewable Energy (ORE) continues to encourage projects that will make a tangible impact in the long run. And now that ORE is a permanent fixture at SLO, the possibilities for future renewable energy production on state lands are endless."

Legislation to establish a permanent ORE within SLO was recently signed into law, the news release said. The legislation builds on the early successes of the Office of Renewable Energy that Commissioner Garcia Richard established in 2019, which tripled the

amount of renewable energy under lease on state lands in four years, SLO said.

There are currently 27 leases for wind energy production either operational or under development on state lands, totaling about 1.6 gigawatts of wind power – roughly the amount of energy needed to power 320,000 homes, the news release said. Additionally, there are 12 leases for solar energy production either operational or under development on state lands, totaling about 273.5 megawatts of solar power, or enough energy to power roughly 54,700 homes.

Revenue SLO generates from sources that do not permanently deplete resources, such as renewable energy, are distributed directly to public schools, universities and other institutions each month.

Local DJ, family, friends share their love of mountain biking

“Wanting to share the passion we have with mountain biking” is the reason Las Cruces native Jose Solis created MTB New Mexico in 2020.

MTB (mountain biking) has nearly 1,000 followers on Facebook and more than 850 subscribers to its YouTube channel, which includes almost 160 mountain-biking videos, along with information about local trails and the biking events regularly organized by MTB and others.

There is no cost to join MTB or to participate in any of its events, which, during hot summer weather include early-morning (starting as early as 5 a.m.), evening and even night-time trail rides.

“We love night riding,” Solis said. It includes lights on both helmets and bikes for safety.

A recent night ride on trails near Doña Ana began at 6:30 p.m. and continued until 9.

A Las Cruces High School graduate and local DJ, Solis has been mountain biking with older son, Isiah, 13, since the beginning. His daughter, Celeste, 9, and younger son, Jeremiah, 3, are now regular mountain bikers as well.

“I love it,” Celeste said.

And so does Jeremiah, who is learning to ride on a bike attachment that connects to a parent’s bike. Jeremiah also has his own balance bike, which does not have pedals; he propels himself forward with his feet while learning how to balance.

“He just loves his bike,” said Solis, whose wife, Selene, also joins the family for bike rides.

The entire Solis family and many of their friends “fell in love with what mountain biking does,” he said.

“It’s had a very positive impact,” said Solis, who has lost 40 pounds since he started riding. “We’ve become healthier people.”

Solis remembers his first mountain bike ride three years ago with his friend,

Enrique.

After a quarter mile of pedaling, they stopped.

“We were so exhausted,” Solis said.

Today, they typically bike for eight miles or more on a single ride and sometimes for 20 or more miles on a mountain trail or 30-40 miles on a gravel road.

“Now, every time we pass that quarter mile, we remember, ‘We stopped right there,’” Solis said.

Through MTB, Solis has connected with the nonprofit Velo Cruces, “the voice for the cycling community,” Danny Palma and Outdoor Adventures Bike Shop, a Las Cruces business that has helped MTB get mountain bikes for children and adults who want to ride but cannot afford a bike.

Through one partnership between MTB and Outdoor Adventures, a young Las Cruces teen who had recently lost his parents got a mountain bike and has found himself as a regular MTB rider.

It’s a case-by-case thing,” said Solis, whose first bike as a kid was “a Frankenstein,” he said, cobbled together with parts and pieces from other bikes because his family wasn’t wealthy enough to buy him a new one.

“If we see a family in need, we help out,” he said.

With help from Outdoor Adventures, MTB recently awarded new bikes to a family at Jardin de los Niños, a Las Cruces nonprofit that provides childcare and education for children who are struggling with homelessness.

Solis has also connected with Las Cruces Public Schools Safe Routes to Schools Coordinator Ashleigh Curry, and with Pablo Lopez and Matt Mason, who co-founded the Monumental Loop bike trail in the Organ Mountains and are long time mountain biking and bike packing enthusiasts.

“The friendships you develop, that’s pure gold,” Solis said.

And the trails are everywhere.

“There are trails north, south, east and west of here,” he said.

MTB welcomes everyone interested in mountain biking – all ages and experi-

ence levels, including beginners, even if you don’t have a bike. Just need to bring a safety helmet that fits you.

Solis and others will help kids and inexperienced riders learn how to negotiate hills, rolls, drops and all the other features of bike trails. And, because they always ride in groups, there are tools and experienced hands if a bike breaks down. And MTB bike rides often include stops for treats the participants bring.

Celeste, for example, often shares the cookies she bakes.

“It’s just a wonderful way to enjoy life,” Solis said. “It’s amazing to bring families together and see how the bonds grow stronger with every ride.”

Las Cruces entrepreneur launches yacht software company

Ruben Mena discovered “a huge problem in communication” in the multi-billion-dollar yachting industry. Mena worked in this unique industry while earning a master’s degree in luxury management at the International University of Monaco (IUM) in 2021.

Returning to Las Cruces, the Arrowhead Park Early College High School (APECHS) and New Mexico State University graduate created a software-as-a-service company to solve the problem. He launched YACHTNOTES LLC in 2022, making it accessible on desktops and mobile devices to connect yacht brokers, yacht charter managers, owners and charter guests.

It can cost \$1-\$3 million to charter a yacht for a week – “It’s basically a hotel for a few people in the ocean” – so expectations of a problem-free experience are very high, and “communication is just so important, Mena said.”

Mena and YACHTNOTES won a major international prize in May, taking first place in the 10th annual IUM Mark Challenge, a luxury products and services business-pitching competition in Monaco. The three-month competition included 122 teams representing 55 nationalities.

In the final round, Mena, representing both the United States and Mo-

naco, competed against Swiss, Portuguese and Spanish Israeli teams to win the challenge competition among post-graduate professionals and MBA students who have founded companies within the past three years.

“It was a lot of work,” said Mena, 26. “I was very nervous. The only thing I could do was my best.”

“To have a locally headquartered company win such a prestigious prize is a testimony to the talent we have here in the state,” said Jerry Pacheco, executive director of the International Business Accelerator, which is helping Mena tell the YACHTNOTES story and find investors.

“YACHTNOTES is a great example of the young entrepreneurialism that exists here in New Mexico,” said Pacheco, who is also president of the Santa Teresa-based Border Industrial Alliance.

YACHTNOTES “enables charter guests to communicate their demands to all their dedicated professionals at once and increases transparency into how the yachts are being managed for yacht owners/family offices,” said Mena, a 2015 graduate of APECHS.

His bachelor’s degree from NMSU is in economics and business administration, and he continues to

receive assistance with YACHTNOTES from NMSU’s Arrowhead Center.

“I never saw myself as an entrepreneur a few years ago,” Mena said.

Mena said getting YACHTNOTES fully launched is “a 24/7 job. It’s like a baby,” he said.

Mena is currently creating and copywriting highly technical YACHTNOTES software, which must be avail-

able in multiple languages and include each country’s unique regulations because the yachting industry is worldwide. It generates about \$3 billion a year in the U.S., according to multiple sources.

While New Mexico may not be a popular destination for yacht enthusiasts, it is a good place to start a business, Mena said. And, he hopes to attract local investors in YACHTNOTES.

“Our state is really changing,” Mena said, noting that New Mexico is home to Virgin Galactic and a booming movie industry.

“I am happy to contribute to that changing perception,” he said. “I’m thankful New Mexico is helping me put this forward.”

Because of Zoom and other remote audiovisual web-based platforms, Mena can instantly communicate with partners, potential investors and advisors anywhere in the world. He just returned

from an IUM alumni event in New York City, where he would eventually like to live.

Mena is fluent in English, Spanish and Mandarin Chinese (he spent most of his senior year in high school living in China as part of a stu-

dent exchange program), and also speaks French. And, he spent a year studying in Switzerland and Denmark during college. Mena’s principal YACHTNOTES partners are in Germany (marketing) and India (software).

“I believe in this project

so much,” he said.

Born in El Paso, Mena grew up in the Mesilla Valley. His family owns a pecan farm in Mesilla.

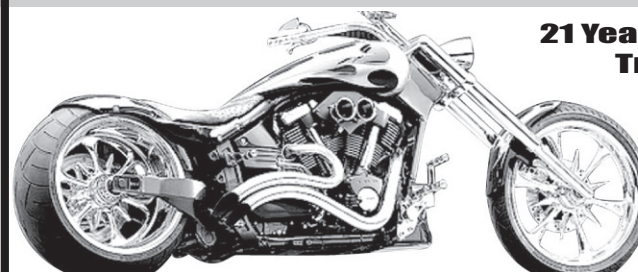
“They’re very proud,” Mena said. “I have very supportive parents.”

Hospital working on recruiting, increasing capacity

MountainView Regional Medical Center is operating at “a level I’ve never seen for a hospital our size,” said MVRMC CEO Matt Conrad.

The 168-bed hospital has 200 providers with active privileges and is the highest-rated trauma center in Doña Ana county, providing “full-service medicine” and functioning at “almost a medical center level,” Conrad said.

A good example, he said, is Dr. Charles Dow, a cardiothoracic surgeon who returned to the medical staff at MVRMC in January. Dow was head of the hospital’s cardiac surgery program from its inception in 2002 until 2009, guiding it to the only five-star rat-

ing of any cardiac surgery program in New Mexico, according to MVRMC’s website. Dow was the first surgeon in the state to perform off-pump (beating heart) bypass surgery, thoracic endovascular aortic (aneurysm) repair and endovascular vein harvesting for bypass surgery, the website said.

“He’s phenomenal,” Conrad said.

Conrad became MVRMC’s interim chief executive officer in December 2020 and was named permanent CEO four months later. After guiding the hospital through COVID-19, he is now focused on recruiting outstanding medical staff, like Dow, to the hospital.

“We’re seeing people coming in from all over the place,” Conrad said.

“If you can get somebody to Las Cruces, they fall in love with it.”

As a group of doctors and nurses at MVRMC prepare to retire, he said, the hospital is recruiting younger doctors and nurses – “bringing people in with families” – to serve in a wide range of programs.

“We’re doing a good job bringing in specialties,” he said.

Burrell College of Osteopathic Medicine (BCOM), located on the New Mexico State University campus in Las Cruces, has “been very helpful” in recruitment efforts, Conrad said.

MVRMC’s four residency programs (internal medicine, osteopathic neuromusculoskeletal medicine, orthopedic surgery and transitional year)

include residents from BCOM, along with medical schools in Providence, Rhode Island, Huntington,

West Virginia, New York City, India, Venezuela and other states and countries. Dr. Ugonna Ezech was a

to change his career. He earned a pre-med degree from Harvard and graduated from the Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine. Ezeh applied to MVRMC's Graduate Medical Education program for his residency.

"Las Cruces reminded me of home, and I felt comfortable here," Ezeh told MountainView. "Add to that the deeply talented and committed physicians who trained and mentored us, and my wife and I knew this warm and welcoming community was where we wanted to be."

Ezeh specializes in hip and knee joint replacement surgeries with MountainView Medical Group.

MVRMC has recruited providers in cardiothoracic surgery, GI, general surgery as well as bariatric, colorectal and orthopedic (total joint, sports medicine, spine, foot and ankle), surgery, family medicine and rheumatology.

Malpractice insurance

MVRMC – like hospitals across New Mexico – has lost doctors because of the cost of the high cost of medical malpractice insurance in the state, Conrad said.

Conrad said he is in regular communication with New Mexico Hospital Association President and CEO Troy Clark on the issue.

"He's done a wonderful job" getting hospitals in the state to work more collaboratively – "getting our ducks in a row" – in deal-

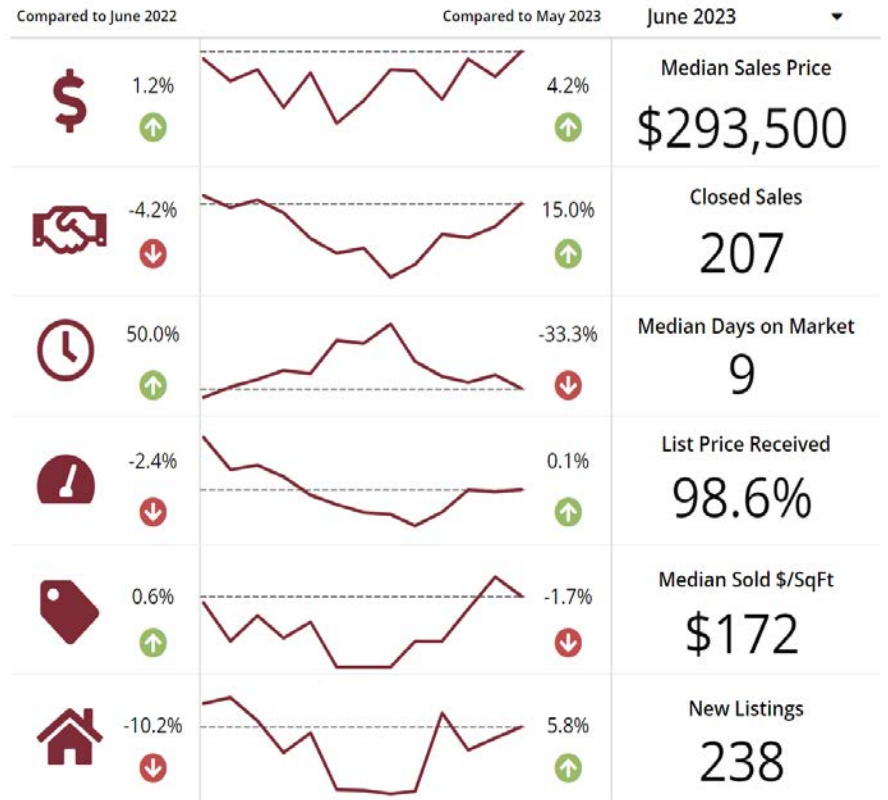

MVRMC accreditations include knee replacement, its primary stroke center, level III trauma center and chest pain center with PCI (percutaneous coronary intervention). It is designated

a “baby-friendly hospital” by the World Health Organization and UNICEF and is an accredited sleep medicine center.

NM Banitas: On to the championship!

BULLETIN REPORT

Despite a 45-minute delay in the game because of lightning, the New Mexico Banitas, Las Cruces' women's tackle football team, defeated the Zydeco Spice from Lafayette, Louisiana, 40-15 Saturday night, July 8, at Cloudcroft High School's Bear Stadium in Cloudcroft.

The victory advances the Banitas to the Women's Football Alliance Division III American Conference National Championship July 21 in Canton, Ohio. They will play the Palm Beach Coyotes.

The Banitas defeated the Rocky Mountain ThunderKatz 22-0 June 24 in Cloudcroft to reach the conference championship game against the Spice. The Banitas are

the first women's tackle football team from New Mexico to play in the WFA national championship.

The Banitas played this season in Cloudcroft because the Las Cruces Public Schools Field of Dreams, where the Banitas played last season, is under renovation.

We may be getting older but we still can get better

Forty years ago, in 1983, I wrote a feature article for the Detroit Free Press entitled "Older, wiser and getting faster." It was about Masters swimmers that were swimming faster than they did in their college days. As a marathon runner I had run the Boston Marathon in under 2 hours, 50 minutes three years in a row, but I also was a Masters swimmer.

In 1980 and 1981 I had won back-to-back Detroit YMCA Marathon Swim Championships, swimming 6.2 miles in the designated three hours in a 25-yard indoor pool. Then I turned to triathlons. From 1982 through 1984 I competed in four Ironman World Triathlons Championships in Kona, Hawaii, and won two Masters Championships,

while then over age 40. Today, at 80, I'm a golfer, and have been a serious golfer almost all my life.

I moved to Las Cruces in 1988 and became acquainted with Herb Wimberly, former Aggie golf coach and Director of Golf at NMSU Golf Course. Herb wanted me to be part of his teaching program, and in 1988, we started Performance Golf Schools, weekend instruction and play for adult golfers of all levels, throughout New Mexico and Far West Texas. Due to mutual medical problems, our last golf schools were in 2014.

One of the important things we learned doing over a hundred weekend

golf schools is how best to help senior men and women play the golf they were capable of.

Here are several key suggestions as you're getting older and continue to value your golf. The first thing we have to adjust with aging is our attitude: Don't accept that as we are getting older, we

are going to lose talent. We may not be able to create the length we once did, but we still need to become a student of the game and work on new shots and suitable swing changes. Up-to-date golf clubs help.

Do not underestimate the value of golf instruction on a periodic basis. Whether you need to cure

a worsening slice, or solve a case of the putting yips, or your game has you in such low spirits that Prozac doesn't help, or your divots travel farther than your ball, or your monthly expense for new drivers exceeds your club dues, or you just feel you have totally lost your swing, you'll be amazed what your PGA pro can do for you. Old golfers can learn new tricks, so don't resist range or playing lessons or radical change. Work with your teacher to set challenging goals and measure your progress. For the last several years my goal for a round of golf is to shoot under my age; I do that most of the time.

The magic of taking golf lessons is in regular practice. I recommend at

least one shorter practice session and one longer session, say two hours. You may not hit like you did 20 years ago, so you need to practice your short game – chipping, putting and bunkers. If you become an expert in chipping and putting you'll be a match for anyone. Trust Dr. Golf on that one.

The older we get the more important it is we manage our fitness, which means strength, balance, flexibility and stamina. Exercise physiologists say you can build muscle, get stronger and become more flexible even into your 90s. Be disciplined about strength workouts at the gym, as well as aerobic exercise like running, walking and bicycling. While you're at it, watch your

diet. If you're looking for more tips for older golfers I suggest "A Different Game: Golf After 50" by Sarbin and Brown. Here's one: "Always keep your eye/face/head just behind the ball prior to impact ... and focus on the back, not the top of the ball."

As I think about aging and practicing, I'm reminded of the late Pablo Casals, when asked by an interviewer: "Mr. Casals you're 95, and the greatest cellist the world has ever known. Why do you still practice six hours a day?" Mr. Casals paused and replied: "I think I'm beginning to notice some improvement."
