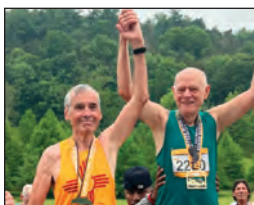

City Council reviews partnerships in work session

“You’ve moved mountains,” Mayor Ken Miyagishima told state Sen. Jeff Steinborn, president of Film Las Cruces (FLC), at the Las Cruces City Council’s July 24 work session.

Steinborn, new FLC Director Amorette Jones and Associate Film Liaison Andrew Jara gave the council an update on the program’s activities during the past year, along with fellow city economic development partners Downtown Las Cruces Partnership and the Las Cruces Farmers and Crafts Market.

Film Las Cruces

“The reason we have the film industry burgeoning here in Las Cruces is because of you,” Miyagishima told Steinborn, who has helped create tax incentives for filmmakers working in New Mexico during his current service in the New Mexico State Senate and previous service in the state House of Representatives.

“It’s our partnership, it’s our staff. It really is a team effort,” Steinborn said.

Under contract with the city and Doña Ana County, FLC works to promote the local film industry, support the local film workforce, provide local site assistance to filmmakers and maintain a film vendor and crew database, Jara said.

“Definitely part of our brand is having that personal touch,” Jara said.

FLC is building its local film crew base, he

said, which is “very exciting for the crew members here and for the college students who want to stay in town.”

During the fiscal year that ended June 30, FLC’s economic impact included 5,129 worker days, 126 production days and local spending of \$12.65 million, Jones said.

Farmers Market

Farmers and Crafts Market of Las Cruces (FCMLC) has 167 permanent vendors; 115 temporary vendors; 62 musicians and entertainers, including 19 who are under 18 years old; and more than 150 nonprofits and community outreach and educational groups

that regularly participate in the market, Market Manager Karin Bradshaw said.

Last year, FCMLC was ranked 125th among 7,000 farmers markets nationwide and was top ranked among markets in New Mexico. In this year’s favorite market in the nation vote, FCMLC was ranked second in the Southwest region and 19th nationwide as of July 24, Bradshaw said. Voting remains open until Sept. 18. Vote at markets.farmland.org.

The market covers seven blocks of Main Street, from Bowman Avenue to the roundabout. It is open 8:30 a.m.-1 p.m. every Wednesday and Saturday. There will be evening markets 5-9 p.m.

DLCP

Downtown is “where economic development is happening,” Downtown Las Cruces Partnership (DLCP) Executive Director Jennifer L. Garcia Kozlowski said. DLCP is “promoting downtown Las Cruces as a unified entity,” she said.

In the past year, DLCP has created 76 new jobs

and helped bring 19 new businesses to downtown, Kozlowski said. It helped generate \$3.6 million in private improvements downtown and \$3.7 million in public improvements. The organization’s 147 volunteers produced 1,448 volunteer hours.

Kozlowski said there were more than 5,000 attendees at this year’s downtown Chile Drop event and more than 7,000 at the Zombie Walk.

She said DLCP’s third annual Generations Com-

munity Writing Project included 10 writers, and its second annual Litfest at Rio Grande Theatre in April was successful.

DLCP received a \$900,000 grant from New Mexico MainStreet to complete downtown lighting and wayfinding projects, Kozlowski said.

Kozlowski said DLCP is continuing a downtown property and business inventory and is continuing to work with the city spending \$200,000 in state capital outlay funds on downtown projects.

LCPS, students struggle with bus issues

The start of the 2023-24 Las Cruces Public Schools school year was met with challenges regarding bus delays for students and driver shortages.

“These are the hurdles we expect at the start of any school year,” LCPD Interim Superintendent Sherley O’Brien said in a news release. “But not having solutions that our students and families can depend on is unacceptable.”

O’Brien and several

LCPS administrative staff met July 24 with STS of New Mexico, the contracted bus company for the school district, to discuss ongoing bus delays and remedies, LCPS said.

“STS acknowledges they haven’t been able to keep up with turnover after retirements and vacancies,” the news release said. “They are currently looking at other strategies to get qualified drivers behind the wheel, but that could take time.”

The Bulletin made attempts to reach STS of

New Mexico for comment, but calls and messages were not answered by the newspaper’s presstime July 26.

“As a district, we are allocating every resource we have to alleviate the stress of these delays,” O’Brien said. “We send additional staff to schools who have students waiting on buses, we’re looking at providing drinks and snacks to those students and we are communicating with families about what we know up to this point.”

As all students returned

to school last week, traffic issues throughout the city, coupled with new drivers, caused some students’ routes to be delayed for up to two hours, LCPS said. STS office staff were unable to keep up with the volume of calls from parents, as relief drivers in the office pitched in to drive routes, LCPS said.

As the bus company works to resolve these issues, STS of New Mexico has a smart phone app for parents that will send text-message updates on delays and expected arrival times.

Landfill fire off Sonoma Ranch smolders for days

The large pile of yard waste at the Las Cruces Foothills Landfill continued to smolder well after it began July 22, the Las Cruces Fire Department (LCFD) said in a new release. LCFD said residents may continue to see and smell smoke in the area for several days.

There is no immediate danger to the public. However, anyone with respiratory difficulties should avoid the area near the landfill, the news release said.

The fire is believed to have been caused by a lightning strike shortly before 11 p.m.

Saturday, July 22, at the landfill, located on the 500 block of south Sonoma Ranch Boulevard, LCFD said. The fire began during a large thunderstorm passing through the city, with heavy rain, lightning and strong winds.

LCFD was dispatched to the landfill about 11:30 p.m. July 22 and found a large pit of raw yard waste burning, including branches, leaves and debris that had yet to be processed into mulch, LCFD said.

The pit, estimated at approximately 150-feet by 150-feet in size and eight-feet deep, was heavily involved in the fire and

the amount of yard waste was estimated at several tons, the news release said.

Staff from the City of Las Cruces Solid Waste Department (SWD) and LCFD determined the safest and most effective way to mitigate the fire, due to its size and other factors, was to allow it to burn out on its own. The fire is contained to the pit and the smoldering debris has been closely monitored by SWD staff. Operations at the landfill continue to run normally, LCFD said. Green waste continues to be accepted and compost is still available for pickup by Las Cruces residents.

Starting at LCU as a crewman, he progressed through various positions, including operator, crew leader, line locator, and inspector, bringing over 20 years of experience to the field. "With my experience, it makes the job easier because I have been exposed to several positions and scenarios in our line of work," Ramos stated.

Ramos is joined by a team of three other inspectors, each tasked with unique

responsibilities. Ruben Garcia oversees gas welders and is a Certified Welding Inspector (CWI), Dan Norris assists with Operator Qualification (OQ) training, and Juan Molina, who possesses his Natural Gas Fitter (JG) Journeyman license, specializes in meticulously inspecting meter stalls to ascertain the correct installation conducted by meter technicians.

Becoming an inspector not only requires extensive experience but also supplementary training. Inspectors undergo the same comprehensive trainings as other positions within the LCU Natural Gas and Energy team, and even further receive specialized training to qualify as both inspectors and trainers. Armed with profound knowledge of gas infrastructure and industry best practices, these inspectors conduct thorough assessments, upholding rigorous standards. "There are many members of LCU's Natural Gas and Energy

Linda A. Samples, who has 17 years of legal experience, has been named Las Cruces city attorney effective July 31, the city said in a news release.

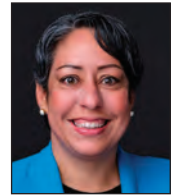

CFSNM making differences in unexpected ways

There are moments in our lives that stir inspiration. Usually when we think back to these times, they are filled with creative thinking, hope, and enthusiasm. But from time to time, seeds for these ideas are also planted during times of tragedy.

The Community Foundation of Southern New Mexico's (CFSNM) Federal Probation and Pretrial Officer Benevolence Fund began during one of the hardest times in Glynis Eaton's life. Glynis was living a full, happy life in Charlotte, North Carolina, with her husband, Brian, and two daughters. Her career as a supervising federal probation officer for the



Western District of North Carolina kept her busy, and she was appointed the Mid-Atlantic regional president of the Federal Probation and Pretrial Officers Association (FPPOA).

In 2018, Brian left town for a work conference. It felt like any other work trip. However, they had no clue it was the last time they would get to hug their husband and father goodbye. Sadly, Brian suffered a heart attack and passed away. "It took a few months to get myself to where I could even function – this was devastating for our whole family. Learning to be a widow

was the hardest thing I have ever done," she said.

As Glynis learned to live in a world without Brian, she focused on raising their daughters. However, she soon realized she could not dedicate time to much else and put her leadership position with FPPOA on pause. She started receiving bills for funeral expenses and was adapting to her now one-income household.

Something unexpected happened that gave Glynis a spark of hope. The President of the Loss Prevention Foundation visited her at her home and when he arrived, he delivered a \$5,000 check from the foundation's benevolence fund. Although he had never met

Brian personally, he spent time with Glynis as she showed him around their home and introduced him to their daughters. This gesture made a tremendous impact for Glynis.

"The biggest part I took away from this was that somebody thought Brian and his work mattered. He was always so proud of his work, his industry, and what he did for a living, but for someone else to acknowledge that meant the world to me."

Glynis slowly continued to pick up the pieces. Six months later, she stepped back into her role as a regional president with the FPPOA. She started speaking with leadership about ways they could help fallen probation officers when the idea came to her to create a benevolence fund to support families during their time of need, just like the one she benefited from. They had experienced the loss of several officers due to suicide, and with mental health a growing concern in their industry, Glynis wanted to find a meaningful way to support officer's families.

When Glynis shared this

idea with the association, Amy Denise Kord, then FPPOA treasurer from Las Cruces, said CFSNM would be the perfect home for this fund. Amy and Glynis reached out to CFSNM CEO Terra Winter and began the process of establishing the fund's parameters. They wanted to ensure the fund helped officers nationwide and was available for any officer who passed away, regardless of the circumstance of their passing.

The fund has already benefited five families and keeps growing.

"Part of our vision is that we want to get a check cut as soon as possible to give families a sense of security so another week doesn't go by where they experience added stress," Glynis said. Families of officers who have passed away from cancer and car accidents have been recipients of the benevolence fund, and Glynis hopes the fund continues to be a resource for years to come.

"Our entire team was incredibly moved by Glynis's story, and how despite her grief, she was motivated to make a difference for the families of fellow fallen officers," Winter said. "We look forward to growing the fund to allow FPPOA to make the largest impact possible across the U.S."

Quality of Life director: 'We can be the best'

"It doesn't seem like it's been 23 years," Carol Brey said about her return to Las Cruces in late 2022 to become director of the city's Quality of Life Department (QLD).

Brey had been administrator of Thomas Branigan Memorial Library for four years when she became director of the El Paso Public Library in 2000, a position she held for a decade.

Brey later served as a foreign service officer for the U.S. State Department in Washington, D.C., including tenure in the office of U.S. Sen. Ben Cardin of Maryland, the current chair of the Senate Subcommittee on State Department and U.S. Agency for International Development Management, International Operations and Bilateral International Development.

Brey was director of the State Department's Office of American Spaces 2018-21, overseeing more than 600 cultural and information centers in nearly 130 countries around the world. These platforms, or "American Spaces," were tasked with "creating an American experience for foreign nationals abroad," Brey said, along with teaching about American history and culture, and even teaching English.

In addition to her work in Las Cruces and El Paso, Brey was a library administrator in Illinois, Oklahoma and Missouri. She was president of the American Library Association 2004-05, earning her a Wikipedia site.

At QLD, Brey oversees 140 employees and Branigan Library, city museums, senior programs, public art and the city's volunteer network.

"Every one of them brings so much passion for what they do," Brey said. The department also has "a very close connection to transit," the city's RoadRUNNER Transit public transportation system, Brey said.

Brey said she was interested in being QLD director because "I wanted to give back to the community," and her skills and experience align with department programs and services.

At American Spaces, Brey provided direct support to nine South American countries through U.S. embassies in Argentina and Brazil, the city said in a news release. With that experience, Brey said she was drawn to the QLD in part because of its library and museums connections with Latin America and particularly the U.S.-Mexico border region and Chicano artists.

"It's a fascinating job," she said. "There are a lot of diverse elements to this job."

Brey also plays the flute and is looking forward to a personal connection with local musicians, she said.

Public art

The city's Public Art program includes more

than 60 pieces of public art.

"That's a lot for a city this size," Brey said. "I love that."

Public art can be found at City Hall, Animal Services Center of the Mesilla Valley, Las Cruces Fire Station No. 3, Visit Las Cruces and elsewhere throughout the city.

Volunteer Network

The city's Volunteer Network connects more than 350 volunteers with nearly 40 cultural sites, programs and departments throughout Las Cruces.

"That's an incredible number of people (working with QLD) to achieve our vision," Brey said.

Senior Programs

Senior Programs not only serves meals at five sites in Las Cruces, it also offers home-delivered meals (Meals on Wheels). The city served more than 250,000 meals during the past year, Brey said.

The city's Food 4 Paws program provides senior citizens with free pet food every two weeks.

Senior Programs also offers a wide range of classes and activities, including GED classes, Eng-

lish as a second language, a mystery book club, ceramics, acrylics, drawing, painting and weaving, swimnastics and aqua fitness, Zumba, tai chi and body balance, lapidary, silver jewelry and stained-glass open labs, games like Mah Jongg and chess, Dungeons and Dragons for teens and for adults, Spanish and even a personal archiving workshop.

Branigan Library

The library's summer reading program had more than 1,100 participants this year, Brey said, including more than 400 adults.

"It's really been very successful," she said.

The library's master plan includes adding additional locations in the city, Brey said.

Museums

The city's four museums had more than

100,000 visitors during July 1-June 30, Brey said, with attendance returning to pre-COVID levels.

Museums host a wide range of exhibits throughout the year and offer programming for children and adults. Most programs are offered free of charge.

"User experience is everything," Brey said, and staff are continuously working to increase programming at city museums.

As soon as she settled into her office at City Hall, "I felt like I was home," Brey said.

"People don't realize how much there is to offer here," she said. "We should not sell ourselves short. If we believe we are the best, we can be the best."

Grant to aid Gospel Rescue Mission

A \$162,000 grant from the Mabee Foundation will allow Las Cruces Gospel Rescue Mission (LCGRM) to build a new facility, the Compassion in Action (CIA) building, at its campus at 1050 W. Amador Ave.

CIA will house LCGRM's kitchen, food storage facilities, two dining halls, clothing distribution area, laundry and mentor counseling services, said LCGRM Executive Director Henry Young.

"This generous grant from the Mabee Foundation will have a huge positive impact with respect to our efforts to more effectively feed and house the homeless community in the Las Cruces area," Young said.

LCGRM has been providing services to people struggling with homelessness for more than 50 years. It can house up to 200 individuals/families and has provided 6,333 bed nights for women and children and 8,740 bed nights for men during the past year, Young said.

LCGRM provides three hot meals a day every day of the year to residents and nonresident homeless, and has served 43,000 meals during the past year, Young said.

The mission provides food distribution to local churches and food banks and has distributed more than 842,000 pounds of food during the past year, he said.

LCGRM operates Mission Cleaning Supply Store and Rock of Ages

Thrift Store, 1420 S. Solano Drive. It also operates a clothing store that provides free clothing to the poor and homeless and has given away 115,985 articles of clothing in the past year, Young said.

The Mabee Foundation has offices in Midland, Texas, and Tulsa, Oklahoma. It was founded in 1948 to help "fund new construction, building renovations and the purchase of major medical equipment for nonprofit organizations," according to mabeefoundation.com.

Ending World War II helped prevent many further deaths

Your preview of “Oppenheimer” addresses the “estimated 200,000 real humans who died” but ignores the much greater cost in human lives had the project not produced the weapons which brought the war to a rapid conclusion.

Operation Downfall was the plan for the invasion of Japan by U.S. and allied forces, cancellation of which was possible thanks to the efforts of Mr. Oppenheimer and associates. Estimates for the U.S. killed in action ranged to one million, independent of Allied losses. Huge numbers of Japanese military and civilian deaths also would have occurred had Downfall been necessary.

The battle for Okinawa alone cost U.S., Allied, and Japanese lives in staggering numbers. Projecting those numbers to a battle on the major Japanese islands is a scenario thankfully negated.

It is impossible to say with any degree of certainty how many total Allied and Japanese lives would have been lost had the physicists not been successful, but without doubt, it would have far exceeded the resultant deaths in Hiroshima and Nagasaki.

The other New Mexico Ground Zero

Most New Mexicans know Trinity Site, in the northern, Stallion Gate area of White Sands Missile Range, is Ground Zero for the first atomic bomb detonation in July 1945.

With the release of the new movie “Oppenheimer,” many more people in the world will know about Trinity Site.

Another thing most New Mexicans know, but most of the rest of the world still does not: Trinity Site lies about an hour’s drive from another Ground Zero: the birthplace of the green chile cheeseburger.

Tiny San Antonio, New Mexico, is situated on U.S. Hwy. 380, a mile or so east of Interstate 25, about nine miles south of Socorro, New Mexico. In any other

universe, the village would be most famous for being the birthplace and hometown of Conrad Hilton, the founder of Hilton Hotels.

Another thing most New Mexicans know, though, is the Land of Enchantment is a universe unto itself. And tiny San Antonio is most famous for having not one, but TWO of the most famous and delicious green chile cheeseburger restaurants in New Mexico which, by

definition, makes them two of the most famous and delicious green chile restaurants in the world.

The Owl Bar & Café and the Buckhorn Tavern in San Antonio both began in the 1940s.

The Buckhorn is owned by

former Las Cruces Ernie and Stephanie Sichler, both alumni of New Mexico State University. In 2019, they purchased it from Bobby Holguin, whose father and grandfather had owned it before him. Ernie is a native of Socorro County, so it was a bit of a homecoming for him.

I talked with Ernie the other day, to see if Oppenheimer and his fellow scientists might have visited the Buckhorn during the days leading up to the Trinity Test.

“I don’t know officially if that’s true,” Sichler said. Several pieces of information and lore that point to the Buckhorn moving to its current location in 1943, although it’s unclear if it was still a bar or if it had begun serving food. There are just as many questions, and very few

solid records. So, wisely, Ernie did not attach any definitive claims.

However, just down the street from the Buckhorn, at the Owl Bar & Café, fourth-generation owner Janice Argabright has more distinct stories about the bomb and its creators.

“My great-grandfather, J.E. Meira, had a little mercantile store and some cabins he rented out and these guys rented the cabins and hung out,” Argabright said. “They were the scientists, but they called themselves ‘prospectors’ because of the secrecy. They wanted some beer and whiskey and food and stuff.

“Around that time, my grandfather, Frank Chavez, came back

Sixth Amendment can’t be ignored

The Sixth Amendment guarantees the right to a “speedy and public trial.” The Speedy Trial Act of 1974 passed by Congress interprets that to mean an indictment within 30 days of arrest and a trial within 70 days of the indictment.

But that only applies to federal courts. In New Mexico, a backlog in the district courts has meant far too many defendants have been denied their Sixth Amendment right. The problem has been greatest in Albuquerque, leading the state legislature to pass the Bernalillo Criminal Justice and Review Act in 2013.

That bill led to the creation of the Case Management Pilot Program For Criminal Cases, which imposed deadlines similar to the federal law. The new law led to a 250 percent increase in the number of trials conducted, ac-

ording to a 2017 report by the Legislature. But, it also resulted in far too many cases being dismissed, the report said.

Ultimately, the new law resulted in a 40 percent reduction in trials for both property and violent crimes from 2014 to 2016, which helped spark Albuquerque’s sharp increase in crime.

What started as a pilot program has grown to include other districts. And recently, the Third Judicial District in Las Cruces was the latest to fall under a Case Management Order from the state Supreme Court. That will mean new deadlines for trials in our local district court.

It will also mean as many as 500 cases being dismissed, Third Judicial District Attorney Ger-

ald Byers has told local media. One case charging involuntary manslaughter for a woman’s death has already been dismissed, he said.

If his number is accurate, it’s a sad indictment on Byers and the ability of his office to efficiently bring cases to trial.

According to one report, more than a dozen defendants have been in

jail for longer than a year waiting for their cases to get to trial. Four of them spent more than 1,000 days in jail before getting their day in court. That’s not acceptable.

It’s important to note that cases dismissed now can be filed again later. And, Byers has vowed to do just that in the involuntary manslaughter case mentioned above.

There’s no doubt this process is going to be messy, and will likely result in some criminals being able to get away with their crimes, at least temporarily. But that kind of shock to the system may be necessary.

The Sixth Amendment doesn’t suggest a speedy trial, it demands one. Holding someone in jail for more than 1,000 days before trial is a clear violation of that person’s constitutional rights.

home from being enlisted, in the Navy, and he decided to help out," Argabright said. "So, he started a bar for them, and he cooked, and they drank."

This was 1945, and that's how the Owl Bar began. And, as still happens today if you find yourself at the Owl or the Buckhorn, the people had a tendency to make friends.

In those early days of the Owl, when they were just getting started cooking meals, it was the dishwasher's job to set out an area with the fixings for the cheeseburgers. There were plates and bowls with lettuce, tomatoes, onions and, if anybody wanted some, New Mexico green chile.

One day, the dishwasher didn't show up.

So rather than set out the condiments, Frank Chavez, in order to save time, just threw all of that stuff right on the burgers. According to Argabright, everybody loved it. And, if Chavez could deliver something world-shaking to those scientists, those scientists, apparently, decided to give Chavez some world-shaking information, too.

"The night before they

detonated the atomic bomb, they told my grandfather to get up early and look out to the east, and he would see something he'd never seen before and would never see again," Argabright said. "And, sure enough, he did, and he looked out and saw the mushroom cloud. My mom (Rowena Baca, who would become the Owl's third-generation owner) was just a little girl. Everyone thought it was the end of the world. Everything shook, glass broke, and my great-grandma Meira put all the kids under the beds.

"We have a lot of articles and historical things around the restaurant from all through the years," said Argabright, who took over the restaurant from her mother, who retired in 2018. "And now, with the movie, everybody's been looking at the articles and talking about Oppenheimer."

Everyone, of course, knows the name Oppenheimer, the man behind the atom bomb.

Sadly, however, no one knows that name of that dishwasher who didn't show up for work. That man who, inadvertently, may have been the man behind the glory that is the green chile cheeseburger.

Local news, newspapers good for businesses, communities

It's no secret that recent years have been tough on small businesses and on newspapers. A bipartisan bill, the Community News & Small Business Support Act, that has been introduced in Congress would offer relief to both newspapers and local businesses. For too many newspapers, help can't come soon enough. Economic challenges have resulted in too many communities seeing their local newspapers being forced to lay off staff, cut back on publication days or — worse yet — close. On average, two newspapers are closing each week. That hurts local businesses and residents in the long (and short) run. However, despite the challenges, what remains true is that local newspapers make a difference in their communities.

Study supports point

Don't just take my word for it. Let's look at the numbers and why America's Newspapers has been pushing for the Community News & Small Business Support Act to be introduced.

A recent national study of 5,000 Americans over 18 was conducted by the independent research firm Coda Ventures for America's Newspapers, and provides compelling evidence of the importance, relevance and vitality of today's newspapers in the American media landscape.

Readers told us their

local newspaper makes a difference. The study shows 79 percent of Americans read/use local news "to stay informed" about their cities, counties and communities. They also said they rely on their local paper to feel connected to their community, to decide where they stand on local issues, to find places and things to do, to talk with people about things happening in the community, because they find it enjoyable/entertaining and to be a better citizen.

All ages seek news

And, contrary to popular belief, readers across all age groups turn to local newspapers and their digital products to stay informed about their communities.

Readers also told us they need more local news from their community newspaper. As one survey respondent in California said, "Our paper keeps getting smaller. I would like to see more news items, what's happening in town, what's new in politics, etc. And they need to be quicker to respond to breaking news."

All of that takes a committed, local staff — something the legislation introduced by Congresswoman Claudia Tenney (NY-24) and Congresswoman Suzan DelBene (WA-1) will help to make happen.

So, what would this legislation mean to your local community?

Local businesses with fewer than 50 employees

would receive a five-year non-refundable tax credit of up to \$5,000 in the first year and up to \$2,500 in the subsequent four years based on their spending level with local newspapers and local media.

Our study showed six out of 10 American adults use newspaper advertising to help them decide what brands, products and local services to buy. Newspaper readers also are almost twice as likely to purchase products from a number of important advertising categories than non-newspaper readers, including: automobiles, trucks and SUVs; home furnishings; home improvement products and services; and home services like pest control, plumbing, heating, etc.

Legislation promising

With this legislation, we expect to see more businesses being able to afford to advertise to consumers, which — in turn — helps communities thrive.

A five-year refundable tax credit would help local newspapers hire more journalists to bring you more news. It's a win-win for local communities. Newspapers would receive a tax credit to be used for the compensation of journalists. The credit would cover 50 percent of journalists' compensation in the first year and 30 percent of compensation (up to \$50,000) in the subsequent four years.

This tax credit would only be available to local community papers with fewer than 750 employees and, if

they don't invest in their newsroom, they don't get the credit.

And these tax credits are only available to local newspapers. National newspaper outlets are not eligible.

The importance of local newspapers and local business is the reason Reps. Tenney and DelBene introduced the legislation. We are most grateful for their support.

We need your support, as well, to encourage legislators to enact this legislation. Please contact the offices of your senators and representatives in the U.S. Congress and encourage them to add their support to this legislation. These tax credits aren't permanent; they will sunset in five years. But, these critical five years will allow the newspaper industry time needed to address the challenges it is facing from Big Tech, which often uses newspapers' content without compensation, as well as other technological and market challenges. More local reporting means more access for hometown news that citizens like you rely on. And stronger newspapers mean stronger advertising vehicles for local businesses.

Abeyta runs for re-election in Council Dist. 2

“I vote first every single time,” Las Cruces City Councilor Tessa Abeyta said. “I don’t get to ride on the coattails of anyone else.”

As the District 2 councilor, Abeyta is the first to say “yes” or “no” on every council vote because Kasandra Gandara, who represents District 1, serves as mayor pro tempore and sits next to Mayor Ken Miyagishima on the council dais.

“It’s a very interesting place to be. You have to stand on your decision in a very strong way.”

Abeyta launched her re-election campaign July 1 for a second four-year term as the council’s District 2 representative.

The election is Nov. 7.

“Access and equity have been really big factors for us on the council,” said Abeyta, chair of the city’s Quality of Life Policy Review Committee (PRC) and also serves on the Public

Safety PRC, the city’s Juvenile Justice Continuum, Oversight Committee, Utilities

Board, the University District Citizens Design Committee and is the city’s representative on the Mesilla Valley Economic Development Alliance Board of Directors.

Abeyta said she has spent a great deal of time studying the city charter to become familiar with the policies and procedures that guide the council and city government.

In making decisions, councilors must “follow the law,” she said, be thoughtful, do necessary research and “look at the community as a whole.”

And, Abeyta said, “What’s a good idea isn’t always a good policy.”

Abeyta, 38, was born in Grants, New Mexico, and grew up in Los Alamos. She moved to Las Cruces

to attend New Mexico State University, earning a bachelor of arts degree in government in 2009.

Abeyta has three children: 14-year-old twin sons and a 9-year-old daughter, and said she is the first woman elected to the city council to serve while raising children.

Being a member of city council is a full-time job, Abeyta said. She also serves as the part-time executive director of the non-profit New Mexico Public Health Association.

Abeyta becomes president of the New Mexico Municipal League Board of Directors in August. The organization represents 105 incorporated municipalities in the state.

“It’s good to have a statewide perspective,” she said. “You have to participate and show that Las Cruces is the place to be.”

Abeyta has been endorsed by Las Cruces Firefighters Local 2362.

Police and crime

“I asked good questions,” Abeyta said about the city council’s May 2023 work session regarding the possibility of creating a Las Cruces Police Department (LCPD) oversight board.

There is “no quantifiable data” to support creating an oversight board, Abeyta said. “I want transparency and accountability,” she said, but an oversight board “may not be the best way. We have more questions.”

Abeyta said one of her greatest concerns about a local citizens group’s call for police oversight is access to police officers’ personnel files and allowing “non-city employees to address HR issues.”

City councilors “don’t see HR files, even in closed session,” Abeyta said, and allowing members of an oversight board to see those records would violate city charter and the city’s bargaining agreement with Las Cruces police officers.

Abeyta supports additional training for police officers and said the focus for the department and the guide for hiring a new police chief should also be on community and officer safety, recruitment, retention and training.

“We do have a lot of great officers,” Abeyta said.

“Systems must work together” to address the property crime, she said, and the city must “give our officers all the resources to respond.” The city council must “address the root causes of our most pressing crime and public safety challenges by investing in public health approaches to interrupt cycles of trauma and addiction,” Abeyta said on her campaign website.

The city launched Project LIGHT (Lessen the Incidence of Grief, Harm and Trauma), earlier this year to provide teams of trauma-informed firefighter/paramedics and social workers to deal with behavioral health issues. That should help “take the stress off” police officers, Abeyta said.

City manager

Abeyta said she is pleased with the performance of City Manager Ifo Pili, whom the council hired in September 2020.

“I have been very happy with our choice,” Abeyta said about Pili, who has helped create “a stable

- In Las Cruces, the mayor; council districts 1, 2 and 4; and presiding municipal judge are on the November ballot. There will also be municipal elections in Mesilla, Sunland Park, Hatch and Anthony, New Mexico; elections for seats on boards of education representing Las Cruces Public Schools, Gadsden Independent School District and Hatch Valley Public Schools; and Doña Ana Soil and Water Conservation District Board of Supervisor positions. foundation” within the city, she said. “I think he’s done very well.”

Accomplishments

If re-elected, Abeyta said she will continue to be “a champion for the district.” Among her first-term accomplishments for District 2, Abeyta listed improving insurance benefits for city employees, redevelopment of Tony Gomez and Frenger parks and community art projects.

Her priorities for the district going forward include building community engagement and communication, addressing aging infrastructure, supporting quality of life programs, and revitalization of the El Paseo Corridor, Abeyta said on her page on the city website.

“We are such a great city,” Abeyta said. “I want to be the city’s biggest

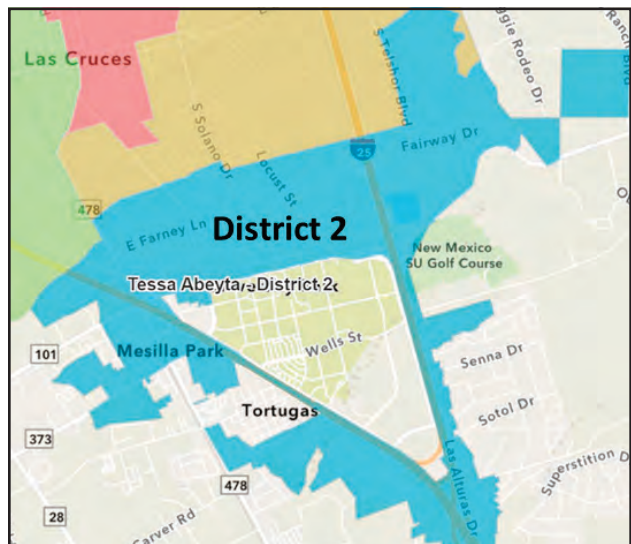
champion and biggest marketer. I know I can help continue to move (Las Cruces) forward.”

2019 city council race

In the 2019 District 2 city council race, Abeyta received 55 percent of the vote and Philip VanVeen (who also ran for the seat in 2015) received 45 percent after three rounds of ranked-choice voting. After the first round, Abeyta had 43 percent, VanVeen 35 percent, former City Councilor Jack Valencia 17 percent and Jason Estrada 5.4 percent. Greg Smith represented the district for two terms, from 2011-19.

District 2

Las Cruces City Council District 2 includes southeast Las Cruces. The city council approved redistricting of council districts in October 2022.

Message from the President

Dr. Monica Torres



This month, Doña Ana Community College (DACC) launched a year-long celebration of 50 years of service to the people of Doña Ana County. Founded in 1973 in collaboration with local school districts to support what was then called “occupational education,” DACC has evolved into a multi-faceted institution that provides transformative educational opportunities to meet the needs of people living in communities across the county. Over the last 50 years, the college has developed a wide range of educational offerings including adult education courses, general and transfer education options, career technical education certificates and degrees, and small business assistance through individual consultations and workshops.

For me, the key idea here is “transformative” or “transformational.” There is no doubt that the students who leave DACC after completing their studies are not the same people who walked through our doors. When they leave DACC—credential in hand—they leave with new knowledge, new skills, new identities—as dental hygienists and diagnostic medical sonographers, as EMTs and firefighters, as water utilities operators and electrical lineworkers, as computer network specialists or web designers, as early childhood care workers or law enforcement professionals, as people who can succeed in higher education and the workforce.

And with those new skills and identities come advantages. Research tells us people who earn post-secondary credentials tend to have lower unemployment rates, make more money, and access jobs with better benefits than those with high school diplomas. For over 50 years,

DACC has created instructional spaces where residents from the county (and other places) study, develop, transform and launch themselves into new professional opportunities.

But the benefits do not accrue to individual students or graduates alone. I am reminded of this almost every day. It is virtually impossible to conduct business in this community without running into DACC graduates: when we get our blood drawn for laboratory tests, when we need X-rays, when we want plans drawn for a new house or a renovation, when we need automobile repair work, when we need our HVAC systems worked on, when we go to restaurants, when we talk to medical billing offices, when we need help setting up our home networks, etc. In addition, research shows that people with college degrees are more likely to vote, more likely to volunteer, more likely to contribute to their community. Higher education credentials improve the quality of life for those who hold them and for those of us who live in the communities where those graduates work and live.

DACC has been doing this work since 1973. I am proud to be part of this history. I consider myself fortunate to stand with the faculty and staff from across those five decades who have worked so diligently to support student learning and development. I am thankful for so many alumni and community members who have donated from their resources to create scholarships so students could complete their studies. We could not do any of this without the voters, taxpayers, and elected officials in the county (and across the state) who have supported the college so we could support the students. And I am most grateful for the students who walked through DACC's doors in the last 50 years and modeled the art of transformation—for themselves, their families, and our communities.

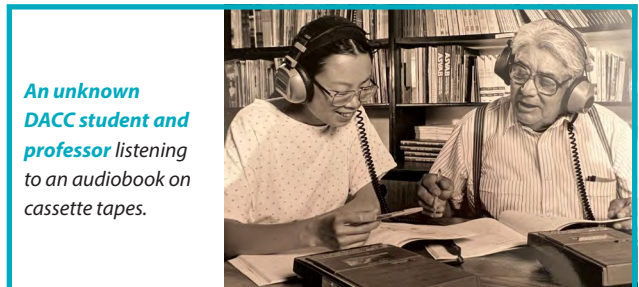

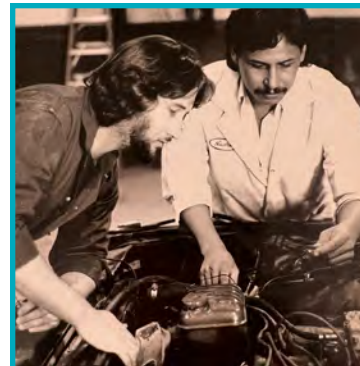

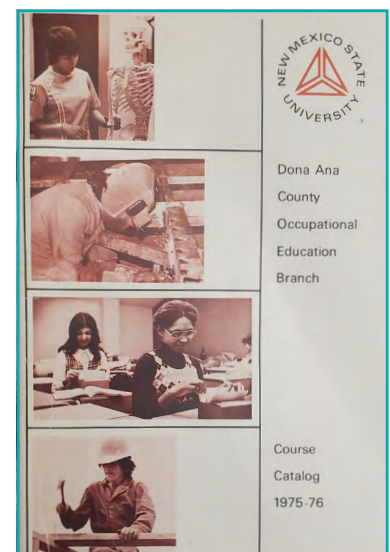

One of the first course catalogs for DACC was provided only in paper format. Applications, registration and admissions information was all done in-person and on paper only.



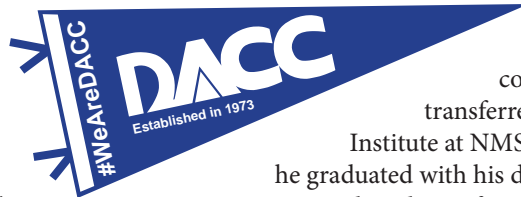
School as a Family

In 2015, DACC took the unusual step of bestowing the Distinguished Alumni award on an entire family, the Salazars. In 2010, Lizet Salazar was the first in her family to inquire about the English as a Second Language and the General Equivalency Diploma programs at the Sunland Park Learning Center. She worked several jobs at a time to pay for everything they needed, even if it meant another part-time job. She is said to have great respect for education and wanted most of all for her son Luis, and nephew Cesar “Max” to get their GEDs and go to college.

Lizet set an example and even started a trend. She became the first in her family to finish her GED, followed by her son Luis, her husband Alejandro, and then, their nephew Max. It was a family of graduates. “He (Max) is remembered for his sacrifices and dedication to attending classes,” said Christy Roye, DACC Sunland Park Center. Christy said he “would take several buses

across the city to arrive at the center, sometimes quite early in the morning because these were the only buses that would get him here on time; he never wanted to be late.” However, Luis and Max didn’t stop there, they’ve both continued on with their education at DACC and NMSU.

After earning his GED, Max set his sights on becoming an animator. After completing common core classes at DACC, he transferred to the Creative Media Institute at NMSU. In the spring of 2016, he graduated with his degree and headed to Juarez, where he co-founded a videogame studio and worked as an art director. Max then sold his studio, moved to Mexico City and worked at Dreamerians. Max currently works as a technical artist at 360 Devlabs, and teaches game art courses at the local university. Looking back, he’s grateful for his journey and excited for what the future continues to hold, “(we) are thankful for what DACC did for our lives, I could not have become who I am without DACC and NMSU.”

Investing in Our Communities

In 2022, DACC, along with Union Pacific, made an investment in the Sunland Park and Santa Teresa communities – creating the Union Pacific Industrial Careers Academy.

This academy, housed at the DACC Sunland Park Center, is a fast-track workforce training academy designed to meet the needs of employers and residents in the south communities. Career training includes logistics, warehousing, transportation, advanced manufacturing, automation, and next-generation digital skills.

Students leave the academy with basic skills and English-language skills and are ensured they will be entry-level and experienced employees. Graduates of the program receive industry-recognized credentials, earn family-supporting salaries, and advance in their careers.

East Mesa Campus 2800 Sonoma Ranch Blvd.

The East Mesa Campus is home to the following associate degree and certificate programs: the Associate of Arts Degree program, Business Management, Business Office Technology, Computer and Information Technology, Creative Media Technology, Criminal Justice, Culinary Arts, Drafting and Design Technologies, Early Childhood Education, Education, Emergency Medical Services, Fire Investigations, Fire Science, Health Information Technology, Hospitality and Tourism, Hospitality Services Management, Law Enforcement, Library Science, Paralegal Studies, Pre-Business, and Public Health.

In addition, DACC Student Services is located on this campus, as well as central administration. The campus has a bookstore, library, computer labs, Student Success Center (student tutoring), and a 350-seat auditorium.



Espina Campus 3400 S. Espina St.

Adjacent to New Mexico State University, the Espina Campus is home to the following associate degree and certificate programs: Automotive Technology; Associate of Science Degree program; Dental Assistant; Dental Hygiene; Diagnostic Medical Sonography; Electrical Programs; Electronics Technology; General Engineering; Health Care Assistant; Heating, Ventilation, Air Conditioning and

Refrigeration; Radiologic Technology; Respiratory Therapy; Water Technology; and Welding Technology.

Also on this campus are the library, computer labs, Student Success Center (student tutoring), Academic Readiness Center, and the Quintana Learning Center, which provides adult education and helps prepare students to undertake college-level studies. A full complement of student services is offered on this campus.



Workforce Center 2345 E. Nevada Ave.

The following associate degree and certificate programs are offered at this site: Aerospace Technology, Automation and Manufacturing Technology, Building Construction Technology, and Environmental and Energy Technologies.

The Workforce Center also offers customer-driven, lifelong-learning opportunities, which serve as a bridge between our diverse community and the college. The aim is to be business-solution partners for Doña Ana County. DACC's Customized Training, Small Business Development Center, and Truck Driving Academy currently occupy the Workforce Center. Together, these programs address everything from the start-up needs of small businesses to the larger training needs of established, growing businesses. Many business assessment tools are available, as well as training space and commercial space on a short-term, rental basis for outside organizations.



South County Centers Gadsden Center 1700 E. O'Hara Road, Anthony, NM Sunland Park Center 3365 McNutt Road, Sunland Park, NM

These centers offer freshman- and sophomore-level coursework in vocational, technical, developmental, and general education. A number of DACC certificates and associate degrees are offered, as well. The centers also provide concurrent enrollment (dual credit) programming for the Gadsden School District. ESL, GED, and citizenship classes for the border area are available through the Adult Education program, also housed at the centers. These

centers also provide a Student Success Center (student tutoring), computer labs, and library support services.



Chaparral Center 755 Prescott Anthony Drive, Chaparral, NM

Located in the southeastern corner of Doña Ana County, the Chaparral Center, which opened in Spring 2012, is situated adjacent to Chaparral High School. The 6,200-square-foot center offers freshman- and sophomore-level coursework, including dual-credit courses for high school students. It also is the site of the Adult Education program in Chaparral.

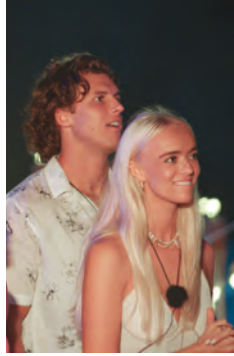

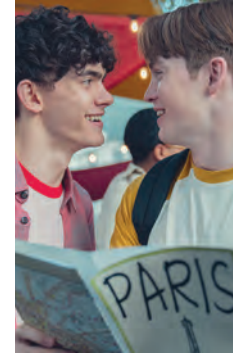
“Documentary: The Lady of Silence: The Mataviejitas Murders”

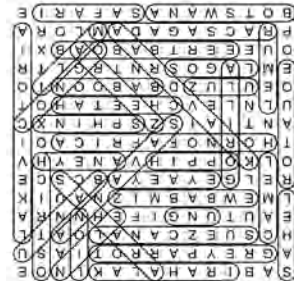

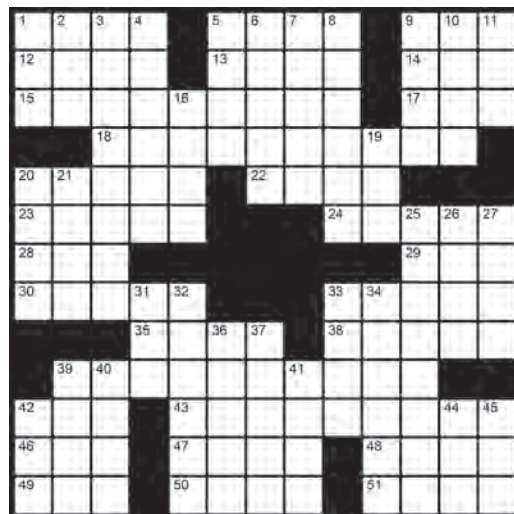

"GUARDIANS OF THE GALAXY VOL. 3"

The popular Marvel Studios adventure-with-humor franchise about a group of intergalactic misfits reaches its conclusion with this chapter, as a wounded Rocket (voice of Bradley Cooper) struggles to recover from an attack while a personally troubled Peter Quill (Chris Pratt) leads the other Guardians in a mission to do what's necessary

to save their ally's life. That involves infiltrating the technologically complex lair of a mad scientist known as the High Evolutionary (Chukwudi Iwujii). Returning cast members also include Zoe Saldana, Dave Bautista, Karen Gillan, Vin Diesel, Sean Gunn (brother of the film's writer-director, James Gunn), Michael Rooker, Elizabeth Debicki and Sylvester Stallone; also among additions are "The Rookie's" Nathan Fillion (though he did a voice cameo in the first picture) and Will Poulter. "CINDERELLA"

One of the ultimate gems in the animated Disney canon gets a general home-video release in the 4K Ultra HD format, and in SteelBook packaging, as part of the studio's 100th-anniversary celebration after having been available only to Disney Movie Club

members earlier in the year. The 1950 classic hews closely to the storyline of the long-beloved fairy tale, with the title character (with the voice of Ilene Woods) – oppressed by a cruel stepmother and scheming step-sisters – getting her chance to shine as the literal belle of a ball, under the guidance of a benevolent Fairy Godmother (voice of

Verna Felton, who also was heard as Wilma's mother on "The Flintstones"). As many fans know, that sets her up to be courted by a genuine Prince Charming (whose singing voice was furnished by Mike Douglas, later a successful syndicated-talk-show host). One of the most famous voices in animation history, June Foray, supplies the words of the character Lucifer. ★★★★★ (G) (Also on Blu-ray and Digital)

"THE BIG LEBOWSKI"

"The Dude" still abides in the 4K Ultra HD debut of what might be considered a cult classic, but it's actually bigger than that, considering the wide popularity that this comedy has enjoyed for 25 years. Joel and Ethan Coen's saga revolves around a bowling-devoted slacker – Jeff Bridges, in a truly iconic performance – who's attacked instead of the intended target, a wealthy man (David Huddleston) who has the same name. Things get even more complicated when the millionaire's wife (Tara Reid) is kidnapped, and he enlists the "wrong" Lebowski to make the ransom drop ... though the latter's pal (John Goodman) wants to keep the money. The fabulous cast also includes Sam Elliott, Julianne Moore, Steve Buscemi, John Turturro, Philip Seymour Hoffman, Peter Stormare and Ben Gazzara. The distinctive music score is by Coen-movie regular Carter Burwell. ★★★★★ (R: AS, P, V)

"THE PIANO LESSON"

Though it's much more scarce now, the "Hallmark Hall of Fame" banner long was

a prestige label for television movies, and a new six-title collection culled from that franchise includes this 1995 version of August Wilson's renowned play (which had a Tony-nominated revival on Broadway last season). Much of the original stage cast returns as Charles S. Dutton plays a man who wants his sister (Alfre Woodard, who received several awards for her performance here) to give him the family piano, which he hopes to sell to afford an intended land purchase. Carl Gordon and Courtney B. Vance also star. Also in the set are "After the Glory" (starring Tom Sizemore), "Cupid & Cate" (Mary-Louise Parker), "Follow the Stars Home" (Kimberly Williams-Paisley), "Grace & Glorie" (Gena Rowlands) and "Rose Hill" (Jennifer Garner). ★★★★★ (Not rated: AS, P)

"NOVA: INTO THE MEGAVOLCANO"

A Montreal native, the three-time Daytime Emmy winner (for "The Bold and the Beautiful") has spent the past several years in Nova Scotia making the serio-comic series "Moonshine," about a family power struggle for control of a resort. Created by executive producer Sheri Elwood, the show now is airing its third season on Canada's CBC while its first-year episodes are getting an American run Fridays on The CW, following their earlier U.S. availability on Freevee.

"It's been super-fun," Finnigan says of playing central "Moonshine" figure Lidia, an architect who wants to redeem herself via her own plans for the site – and finds a sizable portion of her blended clan not particularly welcoming. "It starts off by easing everyone in, then it gets weirder and funnier. I've come to a scary point in my career and age range where I'm being offered a lot of 'the mean PTA mom,' and that's just not for me.

"I always want to push the envelope as an actress," maintains Finnigan, "and when you work with a group of very talented writers, you always hope that as they get to know you personally, they'll tap into your brand of humor and what you bring to the table ... and that's exactly what's happened. Though I started out as the 'straight man' in the show, they quickly realized that I'm crazier than anyone."

"Moonshine" – which brought Finnigan a Canadian Screen Awards nomination – has given her an opportunity to work with her husband, fellow actor Jonathan Silverman ("Weekend at Bernie's"), as her on-screen spouse as they enact a challenging marriage.

"It's always great when he can take part in what I'm doing," Finnigan notes. "He's incredible at what he does, though I have certain rules. I

don't want to 'meet cute' with him in our roles together. I don't want to be flirty with him. I've spent 20 years of my life with him, so I don't need to play that."

Arts Council presents 'Frank Peacock Retrospective'

"Frank Peacock Retrospective – Then to Now" is a Doña Ana Arts Council exhibition featuring 55 years of work by the acclaimed Las Cruces artist.

The show is Aug. 4-28 at DAAC, 230 S. Water St., and begins with an opening reception, 5-8 p.m. Friday, Aug. 4. Peacock will be the featured guest during "An Afternoon with the Artist," noon-4 p.m. Saturday, Aug. 12, at DAAC.

"Above all, painting is a communication art," Peacock said. "The artist acts as translator of nature for the viewer, combining accuracy of subject matter, imaginative use of the painting medium, and the drama of the real event. Thus, the viewer is

encouraged to participate by formulating their own moment of realization through the artist's vision of a time and place.

"Another important phase of my work is the ability of acrylic to be painted on one surface and when dry it can be removed, cut, or formed and then affixed to another surface," Peacock said. "Two types of paintings result from this approach: overlapping and interwoven geometric shapes to illustrate the light/surface relationship of color and texture; and quasi-abstract compositions to illustrate either a physical, mental, or emotional theme."

A Las Cruces native, Peacock attended New Mexico State University on a music scholarship. But, confined to a house in

Compton, California, during the Watts riots in 1968, with the Democratic National Convention on television, Peacock completed

two paintings that changed his career choice and his life. He became an artist.

"I was 19 when I started," said Peacock.

"My dad didn't talk to me for 10 years."

Peacock, who turns 74 July 28, has had more than 70 exhibitions in multiple states in the past five-plus decades. After living in California, Pennsylvania, Colorado and, for 26 years in Santa Fe, Peacock returned to Las Cruces with his wife, Jane, in January 2015.

After Peacock graduated from NMSU in 1973 with a BA in English and a BFA in studio painting, he moved to Berkeley, California, to attend

graduate school, and fell in with local artists – the "literati."

"You're a studio artist," someone told him after about six months; "go paint." He did.

Peacock has created many series of paintings, including the foggy Golden Gate Bridge, the snow of the Rocky Mountains, and the Canyon Road (Santa Fe) "pot shard" and "red

tree" series as he returned to his New Mexico roots. Since returning to Las Cruces, and in 2021, he transformed St. Andrew's Episcopal Church's Kendrick Chapel into "a unique spiritual space" by creating and installing eight windows consisting of 1,943 individual pieces of stained glass in brilliant reds, blues, greens and yellows.

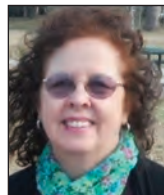

REVIEW: 'Oppenheimer' encourages exploration

Thank you Christopher Nolan for creating a movie that will encourage people to understand, to explore the truth and find history, looking to connect the past with the future.

As I left the theater after seeing "Oppenheimer," I expected people to say things like, "it was too long," and "I didn't understand that much." But what I heard was the opposite, people wanted to know more, I heard them talking about visiting Trinity Site next time it's open and saying it was fantastic.

It was here in Southern New Mexico, on the Jornada del Muerto just west of the Tularosa Basin, the first atomic bomb was

tested in July 1945. J. Robert Oppenheimer led the team creating and setting it off in our backyard. This movie, based on the 2005 Pulitzer Prize-winning biography "American Prometheus" by Kai Bird and Martin J. Sherwin, is not glorious, not a tribute to the man who invited in the "atomic age." It is many things though – a snapshot of a time of war and fear; a portrait of an egomaniac who changed the world; a story about the future?

This movie is not packed with action, jump scares and Hollywood hullabaloo. Rather, it contains scientists, politicians, rivalry, bitterness, intrigue and – yes – romance. But it also contains an untold story behind almost every line.

Every scene has so much

behind it I would recommend seeing it, learning more, then seeing it again. Marvel, Disney, "Star Wars" and other movies contain "Easter eggs," things that refer to other movies and other stories, imaginary things. But in "Oppenheimer" the Easter eggs are truths, entire stories in themselves.

For example, when Oppenheimer leaves his home in Los Alamos to drive south to the bomb test site and perform the actual test, he can't tell his wife, Kitty, where he is going because of the top secret nature of the project. Instead, he looks at the laundry, as it is blowing in the wind and tells her to take it in. Later, when the test has been done, he leaves a phone message

for her, again to take the laundry in. This is code between them, first telling her where he is going, then telling her it has happened.

That single line is also the whole history of the people of Southern New Mexico who were in the vicinity of the test. It meant Oppenheimer understood there might be dangerous fallout that could settle on the laundry out on the line. It echoed the lives of people, communities, close to the Trinity Site – people who had their lives, their laundry, their cattle, their farms and their cisterns right where the ashes, and radiation, could settle. It meant he knew it and didn't consider it more important than his mission.

All that in one line, and just as much in other lines

and scenes. The people, scientists and others, were real people, each with their own story and importance, not in the movie, but in the background waiting to be understood. The actress who played Kitty, Emily Blunt, has said this was the most layered part she ever played. This is because Kitty was a real person and real people are layered.

Nolan tells a layered story in this film, so layered one could dig into it and find fascinating people and history underneath. But even on the surface, the film works. You don't have to know what lies beneath to be captivated, lost in the characters and their dilemmas both moral and scientific. It can be hard to follow at times because there are so many

individuals involved and Nolan works to make their personalities distinct in the little time they have on screen. My favorite, I have to admit, is Albert Einstein and the twists he brings.

The performances are amazing, the sets accurate and detailed, the shots into Oppenheimer's mind startling, and the ghosts in his dreams believable. Most important, the devastation begun with the atomic age that day in July 1945, is not trivialized and the relevance to the current world is terrifying.

British test successful at Spaceport America

British engineers from BAE Systems and its partner, U.S. Army White Sands Missile Range, recently released results of a June test at Spaceport America, adding to the spaceport's growing list of successful high-altitude pseudo satellite (HAPS) system launches.

BAE announced last week that in June, it used Spaceport America as a proving ground to complete a stratospheric flight of its HAPS Uncrewed Aerial System (UAS) – PHASA-35.

Attaining a peak altitude of over 66,000 feet through the course of its 24-hour flight period, PHASA-35 slowly powered its way into the stratosphere before successfully touching down at its home base at Spaceport America. The trial gave BAE Systems' engineering team the ability to engage in performance assessments of the experimental solar-electric drone while it maneuvered to the far reaches of Earth's atmosphere.

"This is a fantastic achievement for every-

one involved and shows the commitment of BAE Systems to invest in new technologies and markets," remarked Dave Corfield, CEO of Prismatic Ltd. "PHASA-35's first stratospheric flight demonstrates that this vehicle is on track to become the go-to system for long endurance, high altitude and communications applications in the future."

Originally conceived and developed by BAE Systems' subsidiary, Prismatic Ltd., in 2018, PHASA-35's voyage to the stratosphere represents an important milestone. PHASA-35 was designed to operate above weather phenomena and conventional air traffic to provide a persistent and stable platform for a multitude of uses including ultra-long endurance intelligence operations, security, reconnaissance missions, and surveillance undertakings.

"Spaceport America is proud to have Prismatic as a customer and extends our congratulations in succeeding at this difficult task," detailed Scott McLaughlin, executive director of the New Mexico

Spaceport Authority. "We look forward to their continuing success and the new records they will break over the coming months and years."

BAE Systems joins current Spaceport America tenant HAPSMobile/AeroVironment and customer Swift Engineering as partners who have successfully completed HAPS testing missions.

"This is the third HAPS system that has found success testing at Spaceport America, and shows that we can play a vital role in aerospace development ventures of varying types," McLaughlin added.

Boasting a 35-meter wingspan and employing a collection of world-class technologies which include advanced composites, energy management, solar electric cells, and photovoltaic arrays, PHASA-35 is provided with energy throughout the daylight hours thanks to the technologies. They also allow PHASA-35 to operate under the cover of darkness by tapping into its rechargeable cells where the energy gathered during the day is

stored.

June's trial represents the starting point of a series of continued trials for PHASA-35. The trial series plans to further

ascertain and confirm system performance, support development activities and validate test points. Following the successes of these further

tests, PHASA-35 would be cleared for use in defense and commercial markets in North America, Europe, and the rest of the planet.

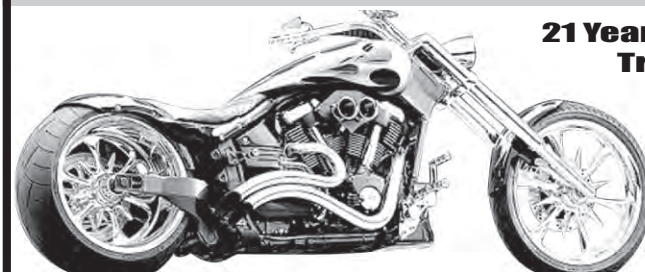

Spaceport Authority discrimination suit settled

The New Mexico Spaceport Authority settled a lawsuit by a former employee who alleged discrimination and retaliation, just before a trial was scheduled to begin July 31, according to court documents.

The settlement agreement ends a three-year-long civil lawsuit against the agency. The terms of the settlement will be released on the state's Sunshine Portal settlement and awards page, within the next few days to weeks.

Karen Barker, a space systems engineer, brought the lawsuit to Santa Fe's First Judicial District Court in 2020. Barker worked for two years between 2017 and 2019 as

the Strategic Solutions Director at the New Mexico Spaceport Authority.

Barker sued former Spaceport America CEO Dan Hicks and the state agency for subjecting her to "different, less favorable treatment than male counterparts," at the agency.

"She was not included as part of the male team, leaving her in a subordinate role only to be used to provide contacts for male members of the team and support them with enough knowledge so they could appear to understand the Spaceport business," the complaint said.

Barker asserted Hicks made a hostile work environment by "scolding Barker demeaningly over the Spaceport open-broadcast radio,"

in front of customers, yelling during meetings, and "benching" her. This culminated when Barker was put on "indefinite, involuntary leave," for raising complaints of a sexist workplace in 2019, the lawsuit states. She submitted a written resignation, but said she felt she was forced to resign.

Replies and responses from Paula Maynes, who represented the New Mexico Spaceport Authority, countered Barker's allegations. In motions for dismissal, the agency said she wasn't fired because of sex discrimination, but because she "demonstrated her unfitness for management."

Spaceport attorneys wrote in a motion with an attached confidential memo from Hicks, alleging Barker had inap-

propriately disclosed a subordinate's confidential health issues, and made "racially offensive comments," about other employees.

Those comments included saying two coworkers would never be fired "because they are Mexicans," court documents said.

Motions were flying around until the last minute. In late June, both sides were requesting Judge Matthew Wilson to limit who could testify in the matter. Barker's attorney also requested that her mental health, financial status, and former coworkers at a previous firm be barred from testimony.

The court dismissed the case July 10, after attorneys notified the judge that a settlement was in place.

Emails to the attorneys for Barker, Hicks went unreturned Wednesday. Attorneys for the New Mexico Spaceport Authority said there would be no comment from the agency.

A second, unrelated whistleblower lawsuit filed by former CFO Zach DeGregorio is currently in a mediation phase,

which will end July 31. Until then, it's unclear whether a settlement agreement will result from those confidential negotiations.

New Mexico shines at nationals

Al Berryman runs three days a week, including a Saturday morning run that often covers six miles or more; he does strength training at Planet Fitness on El Paseo Road two mornings a week; rides a stationary bike in his Las Cruces home 30-40 minutes at a time, three days a week; is an active member of Mesilla Valley Search and Rescue and the Las Cruces Running Club; and he just finished in second place in two national running events.

Oh yeah, and Al is 80 years old.

Berryman won silver medals in both the 5K (3.1 miles) and 10K (6.2 miles) road races at the 2023 National Senior Games (the Senior Olympics) held in July in Pittsburgh.

He was one of 11,000 participants in the games, where senior athletes from New Mexico collected 120 total medals (39 gold, 37 silver, 44 bronze) to finish

15th among the 50 states.

"We did really well," Berryman said of New Mexico. "We were knocking down medals. I was proud to part of that group."

"We're very competitive," Berryman said of Senior Games athletes – he passed Franklin Crow of California with 11 seconds left in the race to take second in the 10K – "but we're all friends."

The key to physical ex-

ercise, Berryman said, is treating it "kind of like a job. You gotta show up."

For Berryman, maintaining a healthy lifestyle not only means running, cycling and working out; he also is very nutrition conscious.

"I tend to avoid processed foods," Berryman said, along with sugar and "fried stuff."

But he still splurges occasionally, like having a hamburger and french

fries.

"You shouldn't be a slave to what you eat," Berryman said. "You should have a good relationship with food."

Another outdoor activity Berryman enjoys is taking care of his yard, and that's no small task since his house sits on a full acre.

"Stay healthy. Stay close to family. Work hard." That's his philosophy, Berryman said.

Berryman moved to Las Cruces about 12 years ago after owning an insurance company in Roswell. He taught finance and insurance at New Mexico State University, and finally fully retired five years ago, at age 75.

Two of Berryman's three children live in Las Cruces, along with his three grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.

Berryman admits he inspires them a little with his commitment to nutrition and exercise.

"It's a healthy family," he said.

Pressure, adversity and what we communicate

Everything we do and say communicates.

When asked about his always spiffy appearance famed PGA Tour golfer Tom Lehman put it this way: “You look nice, you feel nice; you feel nice, you play nice; you play nice, you win lots of money, and you get the pretty girl.”

Our verbal and non-verbal behavior let others know something about what to expect.

How do you react when you miss an “easy” putt? Do you wince and whine, or do you stoically dismiss an oddly yanked stroke with the putter?

What you don’t say out loud can be powerful. What do you do when things start to go bad? Do you walk off the green, head down, in a sulky, pouty manner, having just lost

the hole? Or do you suck it up, forget about the mistakes, and focus on the next shot?

Confidence can be a huge weapon, as with Tiger Woods, Scotty Scheffler and Lydia Ko. Golfers without confidence seem transparent, and as predators in the wild, savvy opponents can smell a nervous target. Fuzzy thinking and raw emotions can destroy confidence.

When you’re challenged to perform outside your comfort zone, you’re likely to feel the pressure. Usually it’s the terror of social embarrassment – looking like a chump. Under the pressure of performing well, your brain becomes numb, while insidious waves of panic, below

your threshold of awareness, become unnerving and distracting. Physical tension resulting from pressure can transform a normally easy, relaxed swing motion into a paralyzed, frightened hack with a driver, or a yippy stab with a putter. Good sportsman-

ship means you must resist feeling you want your golf enemy to cave in to the pressure. When there are “press” bets involved in the last couple of holes, quite often the pressure tends to elevate like the Goodyear blimp. The cool, confident player – the one not afraid to lose – is the one I bet on.

In competitive golf, or even recreational golf, what we say, how we walk,

how we present our self, how we behave in our group, how we look, how we treat others, how we approach sportsmanship, how we treat the golf course, how we honor the rules of golf, and whether we respect the traditions of the game, all become variables in the way others regard us as golfers.

Golf strips a person bare in public. It causes grown, burly men, and often self-assured women, to whiff on the first tee. It causes neurosurgeons to suddenly get the yips. It leads to scratch players hitting flubs instead of flops. Golf can make a strong person weak and a weak person strong, if he has some luck. The pressure to perform, coupled with the scrutiny of onlookers, tends to build inner strain, doubt and

fear that can be unnerving and then unmanageable – to the unaware. One of the most basic elements of mental toughness is immunizing one’s self to placing results before the process of playing.

When your focus becomes the possible outcome, good or bad, you expose yourself to the emotional and mental weakness of self-defeating probability. You must be willing to fail a few times, while retaining your dignity, in order to win often. The mentally tough competitor can’t really be psyched-out.

Let’s address the problem of adversity. Adversity in sport and in life can take many forms, such as injuries, slumps, accidents and tragic events like the loss of a loved one. Prevailing

wisdom about adversity is “if it doesn’t kill you, it will make you stronger.” We are challenged to be mentally resilient, to bounce forward from a major setback. Tiger Woods has done it many times, with his injuries and surgeries.

In 2011, I suffered from a near-fatal fall and was in a coma for three days. My golfing friends whispered that, of course, my golfing days were over. And here I am shooting below my age, weeks shy of 81, almost every round. In golf and in life, Living every hour of every day of every week to the fullest requires discipline, patience, a cherished loved one and feeling joy in the ride.
