'September surprise' could prevent driest monsoon season

Las Cruces could be in for its driest monsoon season ever, but there is a "glimmer of hope" if current weather conditions deliver a "September surprise," said National Weather Service meteorologist Jason Laney, who is stationed in Santa Teresa.

Thunderstorms are occurring in higher terraces – the Sacramento

Mountains northeast of Las Cruces and the Black Range Mountains to the northwest, Laney said. Those thunderstorms "produce a cool outflow that spreads out to the lowlands," including Las Cruces, and that "deep moisture in the atmosphere is the first and most important feature of monsoon rainfall," he said.

The local monsoon season, officially June 15-Sept. 30, usually delivers about five inches of rain, which is 60 percent of the area's annual total. This year, however, monsoons may produce only about an inch of rain – "a very disappointing number for us," Laney said.

A monsoon is a seasonal reversal of wind. Rainfall is a byproduct.

The driest monsoon season on record is 1.17 inches in 1948, Laney said. Weather records date back to the late 1800s.

The culprit this year is "El Niño," a weather pattern (winds and sea-surface temperatures) in the equatorial Pacific Ocean that impacts weather around the world.

"The atmosphere is battling itself," Laney said. "You've got so many

different controls trying to push the moisture our way. El Niño says, 'Send it somewhere else.' That's what we see happening."

The more than 100 weather models NWS is currently running include many predicting a half-inch of rainfall in this year's monsoon season, a few showing no rainfall at all and some (the glimmer of hope) forecasting up to two inches of rain, said Laney, who has been forecasting weather for 34 years.

September "could bring some of that moisture our way," he said. "It makes a tremendous amount of sense."

This summer, every local heat record has been broken except for the one-day high temperature, Laney said.

The record high, 110 degrees, was recorded in Las Cruces June 28, 1994, he said. This year, Las Cruces reached 109 on both July 20 and Aug. 7.

Las Cruces has set records for total number of 100-degree days, consecutive days of 100 degrees or higher and days over 105 degrees," Laney said.

"It has definitely been a record-breaking summer," Laney said.

- Wednesdays, Fridays and Sundays: Outdoor watering for odd-numbered addresses (addresses ending in 1, 3, 5, 7 or 9).

Burrell College of Medicine students present research projects

Second-year students at Burrell College of Osteopathic Medicine (BCOM) worked individually and in groups to create 21 projects for BCOM's 2023 Medical Student Research Day, held Saturday, Aug. 12, at BCOM on the New Mexico State University campus.

Emily C. Muhlenhaupt won first place for her research project, titled "Preventative Effect of Non-Steroidal Anti-Inflammatory Drug Use and Impact of Floor Exercise Equipment on Achilles Tendon Ruptures in Female Collegiate Gymnasts."

Page Shipman took second place for her research project, "Quantification of Budesonide Retained in the

Sinonasal Cavity After High Volume Saline Irrigation in Post-Operative Chronic Rhinosinusitis and Healthy Subjects."

Taking third place were Onyinyechi G. Nwosu and Megan E. Sampath for their research project, "Health-care Provider Perceptions and Behaviors May Have Influenced HPV Vaccine Uptake in the El Paso/Doña Ana County Community."

Other abstracts that placed in the top six were "Translating a Historic Fluorometric Assay to Measure Cortisol Concentrations into the 21st Century," by Rami Radwan and Lillian Wang; "Observations from a Post-Radical Mastectomy Cadaver: Radical Mastectomy Too Radical?" by Rose-Mary Colon, Andie Evans, Mohini Vadalía and Victoria

Vicuña; and "Utilization of ChatGPT to Enhance Medical Education," by Maha Ali, Nicolas Hunt, Khanhtran Anna Levu and Samuel Stewart.

The program was hosted by Harald M. Stauss, M.D., Ph.D., who is BCOM's assistant dean for research and professor of physiology and pathology, left, and Joseph Benoit, Ph.D., BCOM professor of pharmacology and director of student research.

The event's keynote speaker was Analia S. Loria-Kinsey, Ph.D., associate professor of pharmacology and nutritional sciences at the University of Kentucky College of Medicine. Her topic was "The Opioid Crisis and Childhood Adversity in America: What Are We Overlooking?"

Council receives audit report

The City of Las Cruces FY23 internal audit report and ethics survey were presented to the Las Cruces City Council at its Aug. 14 work session.

The city internal audit office (IAO) completed eight projects during FY23, July 1, 2022-June 30, 2023, the city said in a news release, including three scheduled audits, two strategic reviews and three hotline investigations. The office also completed draft reports on three more audits that will be finalized during FY024, the city said.

IAO oversees citizen and employee hotlines through which anonymous reports can be submitted, the news release said. The toll-free number for the citizen hotline is 844-297-5947. The number for

the employee hotline is 800-780-9554. Reports can also be submitted online. The citizen hotline link is <https://secure.ethicspoint.com/domain/media/en/gui/74318/index.html>. The council also received a report on the FY23 activities of the City Oversight Committee, which is chaired by former City Councilor Jack Eakman, with former Municipal Judge Kieran Ryan and Charles Tucker as members. Mayor Ken Miyagishima and City Councilor Tessa Abeyta are non-voting members

of the committee.

The committee was created by the city council 2018 and held its first meeting in October 2020.

During FY23, the Oversight Committee recommended certain improvements to OIR Group reports that have been regularly reviewed by the committee, the city said. The OIR Group is the external, independent auditor of the Las Cruces Police Department.

"We are pleased to note that our recommendations were met with support from the City Manager, the Las Cruces Police Department, and the OIR Group, themselves," Eakman said. "We especially commend the Las Cruces Police Department for their responsiveness and follow through on these recommendations."

THREE DREAMERS GO TO SPACE

Ticket holder waited 18 years for first flight

Imagine being on an airplane flight, being invited to a promotion for a nonprofit organization and filling out a form to go to space. There are thousands of other people who have filled out the forms and you know you don't have a chance.

But ... then you get a call saying you are in the final 20 and your heart bumps a little. Then one day, there is a knock at the door at your home on the little island of Antigua. You open it and Virgin Galactic founder, Richard Branson, is standing with his huge smile.

Keisha Schahaff and Anastatia Mayers, mother and daughter, from Antigua and Barbuda, had that experience. And that was just the start. On Thursday, Aug. 10, at Spaceport America in New Mexico the experience came true. Mayers, at 18, became the youngest person to have gone to space.

Virgin Galactic's Galactic 02 took off at 8:30 a.m., reached apogee at 55 miles above the earth and landed at 9:30 a.m. Richard Branson watched virtually from Antigua with the ex-

cited residents of those islands.

Schahaff had a message for her people back in the Caribbean islands:

"We have to go beyond our fears," she said. "We have so much big dreams, a lot of times we are afraid to even voice it because it's too big and we don't want to be shut down by our dreams. But it is okay to dream big and voice your dream and you will be uncomfortable trying to get to that dream, but this is how we stretch ourselves and you have got to go beyond your limits and that's why you get there."

Also on the flight was the first Virgin Galactic private astronaut, Jon Goodwin from the United Kingdom, a former Olympian with Parkinson's disease. He was the fourth person to put money down, \$250,000, to buy a ticket for the journey to space 18 years ago.

Goodman, 80, said he thought the experience would be curtailed by the onset of his disease, but the people at Virgin Galactic made sure it would happen.

"I signed up in September 2005," he said. "It exceeded my wildest dreams. It was just completely sur-

real. I hope this inspires all others facing adversity and shows them challenges don't have to inhibit or stop them from pursuing their dreams."

Goodwin participated in the 1972 Summer Olympics in Munich as a canoeist and became the second individual with Parkinson's disease to fly to space. In addition to taking his grandson's photo and four rings that belonged to his wife, he wore a badge from his canoe club which, he said, inspired the first Olympic gold medal winner from Britain.

The Aug. 10 flight marked a milestone in terms of private space tourism as none of the three international private astronauts had any extensive prior training before traveling to the edge of space. It is the third successful spaceflight in just over three months. Virgin Galactic expects to launch roughly one commercial flight each month from Spaceport America through the conclusion of 2023. With a fleet of third-generation spacecrafts – the Delta class – currently in production, Virgin Galactic's launch cadence will increase further beginning in 2026.

Buck announces candidacy for City Council District 1

"It's time for a new voice," Las Cruces business owner Daniel Buck said about his decision to run for Las Cruces City Council District 1.

The owner and publisher of "The Historic Mesilla Valley Magazine," Buck is making his first run for public office. Incumbent District 1 Councilor and Mayor Pro Tempore Kasandra Gandara is giving up the District 1 council seat to run for mayor in the Nov. 7

local election. Cassie McClure has also announced her candidacy in District 1 in the nonpartisan race. Filing day for all races is Aug. 29.

As part of his campaign, Buck said he has studied the city charter to become familiar with city policy so he can advocate for changes to city code that are needed to better serve the community.

"I do a lot of investigation," he said. "I ask questions. I want to go deeper."

For example, Buck said the council needs to reinstitute a ban on pan-

handling and loitering, which he said would make the city safer for everyone, including the panhandlers who operate on busy streets.

Communication should be clear between the council and the Las Cruces Police Department that existing city code will be enforced regarding vandalism and property crime so cases can be prosecuted in municipal court, he said.

If city code isn't giving the police and the court

the tools needed to make Las Cruces safe, the code should be amended by the council, Buck said.

"People shouldn't be scared to go to the gym or Albertsons," said Buck, who said he walks along El Paseo Road near Mesquite Street and Main Street at

least three times a week and would welcome city councilors to join him on the walk. He also regularly rides RoadRUNNER Transit public transpor-

tation at night along El Paseo.

"I've been there. I do it," he said.

Buck said he's aware of assaults and incidents in the District 1 area, including a rock thrown through a restaurant window that struck an employee in the mouth, and a fire that destroyed playground equipment in a park.

Buck said there are people who won't go into city parks in District 1 because of a "lack of maintenance and safety concerns."

"Clean it up first," he

said, by transitioning people from the streets to the services they need.

"The best kind of help is human contact," Buck said.

A long-term city investment in single-family housing is necessary, along with ensuring new housing developments "are a part of the community," he said.

"That's smart development," Buck said. "That's how you lift each other up."

The city must also



Las Cruces Utilities Advances Gas Pressure Monitoring with RANGER Devices *By C.T. Barnes*

Las Cruces Utilities (LCU) has embraced cutting-edge gas pressure monitoring with the introduction of the innovative RANGER device.

Discovered by LCU Gas System Operations Supervisor Pressure & Service, Jaime Medina, at the 2022 APGA Conference, the RANGER, developed by SignalFire, utilizes cellular LTE-M telemetry and MQTT cloud technology for seamless connectivity, remote sensing, control, and monitoring. Medina was impressed with its potential benefits, including early detection of pressure issues, reduced house calls for repairs, and faster issue resolution for residents.

“This really helps us oversee our gas system and provide gas to the customer,” Medina said.

“Our customers are valuable to us, and we want to provide the best experience and seamless energy delivery to them,” Medina concluded.

The RANGER, a compact, battery powered, seven-inch white cap-shaped device, is securely mounted on the gas system’s outlet to continuously measure pressure. In the event RANGER detects abnormal pressure levels, it sends instant alerts to Medina, the Deputy Director, two technicians, and a 24/7 dispatch team to ensure a swift response to any gas system issues. This real-time notification system allows quick remote adjustments, often eliminating the need for on-site management. If remote correction is not possible, a technician with knowledge of the issue can be dispatched.

In addition to monitoring gas pressure through the RANGER device, Medina and his team can monitor the device itself, including its battery power and proper functioning. Cloud computing tracks these functions and send alerts in the event the monitor needs assistance.

Most RANGER devices in Las Cruces monitor low gas pressure with the remainder focusing on high gas pressure. Initially installed in residential areas with high gas consumption and areas that historically have had pressure issues and required on-site maintenance, the installation process itself is straightforward. During the RANGER’s initial introduction, a single LCU technician installed 25 devices in one day.

Medina plans to add another 25 devices by year-end, emphasizing the deployment of high-pressure monitors. Currently, Las Cruces boasts a total of 74 RANGER devices, with the goal of having all operational before the winter gas demand peaks. Medina envisions other gas companies in the area adopting the RANGER into their systems.

“Introducing the RANGER city-wide will enable us to provide a better quality of service to our customers. Detecting issues early on will allow us to provide timely service, Medina said.

The RANGER device has revolutionized gas pressure monitoring throughout the City of Las Cruces, setting an example for other cities and gas companies to follow. As technology continues to advance, innovations like the RANGER promise to shape a better, more efficient future for utility services nationwide. 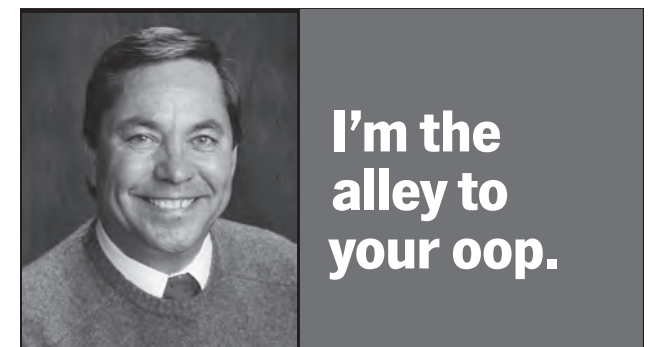
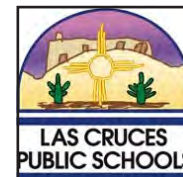

New provost sees success, opportunity at NM State

"I relish being here because of the students," Alan Shoho said. "I feel like I have a calling to be here."

Shoho joined NMSU April 17 as provost and chief academic officer after five years as dean and professor emeritus at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee School of Education, and 21 years at the University of Texas at San Antonio, serving as associate vice provost for academic and faculty support. Before that, he was a high school math teacher

in his native Hawaii and worked as an electrical engineer for Hughes Aircraft Company and Rockwell International.

"I came here with eyes wide open," Shoho said, fully aware of the issues NMSU has faced in the past couple of years, including the firing of the previous provost, the resignation of former President John Floros, the resignation of Chancellor Dan Arvizu two months before his five-year contract ended, a faculty no-confidence vote in NMSU leadership and issues with the NMSU basketball team, including a

shooting in Albuquerque and allegations of sexual abuse in the locker room.

Shoho, 64, said he is part of a new leadership team at NMSU that is focused on student success.

A major goal is to increase the university's four-year graduation rate of 34 percent, its six-year graduation rate of 51 percent and its freshman retention rate of 72 percent, he said. Those figures are lower than rates at peer institutions in Colorado, Utah, Washington, Nevada and

Oregon, which have retention rates in the mid-80s, Shoho said.

"We have a lot of work," he said. "I know we can get there."

Another part of his mission is to share the university's "heart-warming" success stories, Shoho said. NMSU has a world-class computer science program and agriculture and engineering colleges, he said, and is making major contributions to New Mexico's oil and gas industry, tourism and agriculture, leading water

desalinization efforts helping to diversify the state's economy.

Shoho said he has been visiting NMSU Cooperative Extension Service offices all over New Mexico.

"There's a lot of good things happening here," he said. "There's a new dawn for this institution." NMSU's fall 2023 enrollment includes about 2,500 freshmen, which is one of the largest first-year classes in recent memory and comes after about a decade of decline, Shoho said.

"All our dorms are filled," he said. "It's my job to make sure they feel welcome and supported."

Students will be greeted by 50 new faculty members this semester, Shoho said.

"I think we're turning the ship around," he said. "There's new blood, new energy, new ideas."

Shoho arrived in Las Cruces as NMSU continues its national search for a new president.

The university has had about a dozen presidents in the past 25 years, Shoho said.

"We cannot take that kind of instability," he said. "We need someone who can stick around five to 10 years."

"I love his style," Shoho said of Interim President Jay Gogue, who came on board after Arvizu's departure and will stay until a new president is chosen by the board of regents. "I've learned a lot from him."

For both the president and the provost, "It's important to go everywhere," Shoho said. "It's important to be visible. I am out of the office as much as possible."

As he walks around campus, Shoho said he frequently leaves post-it notes on office doors with a handwritten note to "make a person feel a little better."

"I will do what I can in my role to create a different environment," Shoho said.

His own story may be an inspiration.

Shoho had a 1.5 GPA as a freshman.

"I was not successful," he said. "I made the top 90 percent possible."

He stayed in school because he was a member of the golf team, and because of an adviser who believed in him.

"He saw something in me that I didn't see in myself," Shoho said. "I'll try to create that environment" at NMSU.

Community of Hope begins Tents to Rents fundraiser

Editor's note: This is one of a series about residents of the Mesilla Valley Community of Hope's Camp Hope tent city and the 2023 Tents to Rents fundraising campaign, which began Aug. 14, as Mesilla Valley Community of Hope (MVCH) raises funds to support Camp Hope, helping to move camp residents into their own apartments.

Camp Hope resident Janielle and her partner, Erin, have been together for 18 years, and for most of that time they have had their sweet dog, Nala. They have been at Camp Hope for almost nine months. Janielle loves the rugged scenery of New Mexico, which is very different from her home on the island of Maui in Hawaii. She remembers her childhood as she helped her family cultivate taro fields.

The couple came to Erin's hometown in New Mexico just as the pandemic hit. Their car was confiscated and they were evicted after two years of living in a hotel, leaving them with few options.

Camp Hope has proven to

be a refuge for them. They have been able to get a little money working through the Mano y Mano day labor program (a partnership between Mesilla Valley Community of Hope and the City of Las Cruces), and Erin is working with New Mexico Department of Workforce Solutions staff to see if he qualifies for jobs.

Janielle has made good friends in Camp Hope and has helped camp resident manager and volunteered at El Caldito Soup Kitchen and is happy to help in any way she can. She noticed that after people have been at the camp for a while, they begin to relax because they feel safe, and they open up to each other, building a sense of community.

While a few of her fellow campers have what she called "challenges in their head," she is happy to be in a community where people (and their dogs) all get along, respect each other, and where there is order and fairness which is in short supply beyond the camp gates.

Here is the impact Camp Hope has in the community:

- 16, 789: The number of nights this past year when someone did not sleep on the streets in Las Cruces, but rather in the safety of Camp Hope.
- 100 percent: The number of

Camp Hope residents who are relieved to have safety in the camp. "Living on the streets was as dangerous and terrifying as being in combat," said one camp resident.

- \$60: The pay received for a day of work with the City of Las Cruces' Mano Y Mano day labor program available to Camp Hope residents, as they pick up trash and do landscaping at city parks and facilities.

- \$0: The amount of money Camp Hope receives from the state, city or federal government for the operational expenses.

Camp Hope residents have access to showers, toilets and safe drinking water and are provided with a tent and essentials, as many arrive with little more than the clothes on their back.

Once they are part of the MVCH community, caseworkers can help people struggling with homelessness find stable housing. They also receive medical and psychological health services and can participate in addiction treatment. Camp residents also receive assistance with benefits they may qualify for as veterans or because of a disability.

The Tents to Rents campaign continues through Sept. 22.

Campaign participants raise funds for Tents to Rents by soliciting donations from family, friends, co-workers, churches

and other groups and individuals. Sponsors and donors are also welcome.

Tents to Rents began in 2016, raising \$13,000. In 2022, it raised \$105,763.2016-22, Tents to Rents has raised \$11,221, with 27 percent of that total raised last year. The fundraising goal for 2023 Tents to Rents is \$125,000.

There are currently 37 residents of MVCH's Camp Hope tent city. MVCH had several people transition out and is bringing people in from its waiting list. Camp Hope can accommodate 50 people.

It costs about \$7,800 to move a person struggling with homelessness into his or her own apartment.

"We could not keep Camp Hope open without the generosity of this community," MVCH Executive Director Nicole Martinez said. "There are a lot of people surviving outside and Tents to Rents provides a way for the Community of Hope to ensure unhoused people have a safe space close to services and amenities they need to keep them active in transitioning out of homelessness and into a place they can call home."

sharpen its focus on economic development, he said, including "forgotten" areas of the city like the West Mesa and El Paseo.

"We haven't planned for infrastructure," Buck said. "Where was this discussion 10 years ago?"

Creating high-end jobs is vital if Las Cruces is to retain its graduates and bring back those

who have moved away, he said.

"We need to be forward thinking," Buck said, about everything from low-income housing to his vision for "village-style living" that includes ideas such as sidewalk cafes.

The city should conduct more forums for builders and developers and offer "progressive economic incentives," he said. It should allocate funds from the millions of dollars it collects in impact fees to help small business development.

Buck said more questions need to be answered during city council work sessions before the city charter can be amended to create a police oversight board in Las Cruces.

"Let's look at all the facts," he said.

An oversight board would "guard the public" from excessive use of force and safeguard the police department from legal action, Buck said, but board members must be trained to "make the proper recommen-

dations to the council under the charter."

Additional de-escalation training for police is also called for, Buck said. The city's new Project LIGHT crisis response team is "a good step," he said.

Buck has lived in Las Cruces for the past 13 years.

"I consider myself a native," he said, and "a spearheading community member."

Buck is a graduate of Mayfield High School. He has a bachelor's degree in business

and finance from New Mexico State University.

As part of his campaign, Buck said he is knocking on doors at "20 houses a night, seven days a week."

"I don't need the backing of a political group to spread the message," he said. "I want to be able to talk to voters."

Rusty Pearce is Buck's campaign manager.

"I've got a great team," Buck said.

NMSU class to study plant life

New Mexico State University fungal plant pathology professor Soum Sanogo will begin the 2023 fall semester of his course “Diagnosing Plant Disorders” with a kick-off presentation at 1:30 p.m. Friday, Aug. 18 in Sam Steel Café, room 150 of Gerald Thomas Hall on the NMSU campus.

That first gathering will cover disorders that affect three commodities of global economic importance: coffee, tea and cocoa, Sanogo said.

“The kick-off presentation in a coffee shop is aimed to provide a perspective to the students on the economic disruption should these commodities and others be severely affected by plant disorders,” said Sanogo, a professor in fungal plant pathology in NMSU’s Department of Entomology, Plant Pathology and Weed Science.

The course has three objectives, Sanogo said: 1) to describe the major types of plant disorders; 2) to identify the agents

causing plant disorders; and 3) to define the approaches used in diagnosing plant disorders.

“Plant disorders can limit substantially the production of agricultural commodities, and they can affect the quality of urban and natural landscapes,” Sanogo said. “The ‘diagnosing plant disorders’ course aims to provide students with skillsets that will enable them to join the frontline workforce for the protection of food, agriculture,

and urban and natural ecosystems.”

Coffee, tea and cocoa are tropical beverages grown mostly in the southern hemisphere, although most of the consumption takes place in the northern hemisphere, according to the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations. Their sale and consumption generate hundreds of billions of dollars annually in the United States and around the world.

Online estimates of the value of each industry vary. MarketsandMarkets, based in India, said the recent global cocoa market was estimated to be about \$21 billion and the global chocolate market almost \$128 billion. According to Grand View Research, based in San Francisco, the global tea market was estimated at \$12.6 billion in 2018. According to Expert Market Research, based in Wyoming, the global coffee market was at almost \$126.4 billion in 2023.

"I've played basketball on the bartop at the Double Eagle," Donaldson said, drawing more than a few perplexed looks.

Donaldson, who grew up south of Las Cruces and went to Gadsden High School, went on to explain he played basketball for the Panthers as a youngster, and they

periodically traveled to Deming to play the Wildcats. According to Donaldson, wood from the former Deming High gymnasium floor was later used in crafting that Double Eagle bartop.

The Double Eagle is unique in its construction, with the dining rooms and ballroom on the perimeter and another separate restaurant, Peppers, smack dab in the middle. And, of course, that legendary bar. It's also unique in its location, right there on land that used to be in old Mexico, surrounded by stories about Billy the Kid aka the boy bandit king, and, of course, the ghosts some say still hang out in the Double Eagle.

You probably haven't danced on the bartop, but if you've lived in the Mesilla Valley for very long, you probably have your own story

or two about the unique restaurant on the Mesilla Plaza.

Proposals are a common occurrence at the Double Eagle as are, almost certainly, breakups. Life's occasions are celebrated there: birthdays, proms, graduations, job promotions, anniversaries. Sometimes going to the Double Eagle is a celebration in itself.

I've dined there with some of my favorite people in the world, and my oldest daughter got married in the ballroom in 2015. The place was packed with friends and loved ones, some of whom are no longer with us. Every time I hear the Rev. Al Green sing "Let's Stay Together" on the radio, I think of Jessica and Tyler's first dance there on the chessboard floor.

Buddy Ritter, who's owned the restaurant for the last 40 of its 50 years, told our reporter Mike Cook, in a story that appears on page 28, "A lot of multi-million

dollar deals have been negotiated" in the Double Eagle. I don't doubt that for a second. The first time I ever visited the Double Eagle, in 2001 when I still lived in Alamogordo, the event was hosted by one of those million-dollar business people.

A lot of smaller deals have been made, too, and sometimes those can actually be more important. When a family gathers to discuss college options with their high school senior. Or when a family dines with an older relative for what might be the last time. Or when a newly pregnant couple discusses plans for the future.

For a number of years, the Bulletin held its annual Christmas party at the Double Eagle, and those memories are quite fond.

As you may have, I've had a lot of great times at the Double Eagle, and had even more green chile wontons there.

Even Zoom recognizes its limitations

My last paying gig was covering the state Legislature for its 2021 session, which was conducted entirely over Zoom to protect lawmakers and staff from the Covid-19 virus. It didn't go well.

The Roundhouse was closed to the public, and lawmakers were allowed to stay home and phone it in, via Zoom. My favorite moment was when an older legislator from a rural part of the state attempted to participate in a committee meeting from his car in the McDonalds parking lot because it was the only place he could find an Internet connection. He couldn't figure out how to turn the camera around, so we all got to look at his dashboard as he attempted to make his points.

Lawmakers weren't the only ones swapping face-to-face meetings and interactions at the office for Zoom meetings from home.

That made sense then, when every personal interaction carried a dangerous risk.

But it sent a horrible message, that we don't need actual, personal exchanges. Technology can take care of that for us.

The pandemic ended, and we have all come out in droves to attend concerts and movies. As I write this, "Barbie" has grossed \$502.6 million in the United States and \$1.1 billion globally, breaking box office records.

But we have been far more reluctant when it comes to going back to the office.

Before the pandemic, about 5 percent of paid employees worked from home. At the height of the pandemic that was closer to 50 percent, according to a Stanford University study. Now,

about 12 percent remain at home, while 30 percent work a hybrid schedule.

Earlier this month, even Zoom called its workers back to the office. To be clear, they are still allowing a hybrid format where employees work from home some days, but are required to come to the office on other days.

That probably makes sense for many jobs. Some tasks don't require coming to the office. But any endeavor that seeks to build an environment of teamwork and collaboration requires personal interactions that can't be replicated by technology.

To be fair, I was never the ideal customer for Zoom. I have struggled with technology ever since Tandy introduced the TRS-80 word processor during my

days as a sports writer. But, even for those more technologically adept than I am, Zoom meetings are still a far less effective means of interaction than turning to the person sitting at the desk next to you.

The pandemic showed we can muddle along in isolation and still manage to function. But now that it's over, we need to get back to work and we need to do it together. Even if that means wearing pants again.

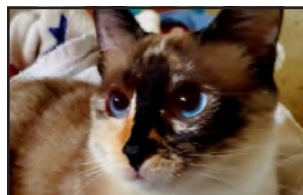
Local adoption center overwhelmed with cats

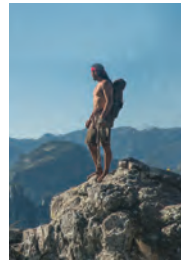
“Movie: Amsterdam”

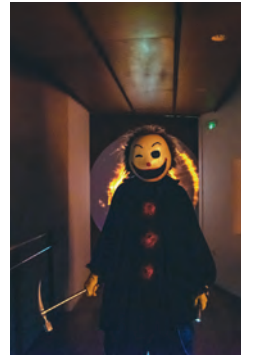



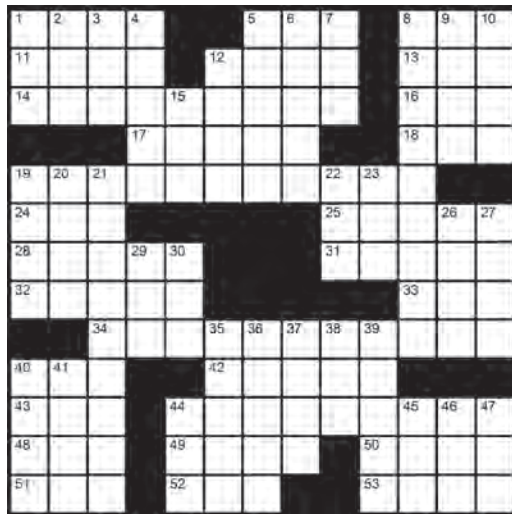

Lynn Sally, Ph.D., will give a reading and discussion of her book "NeoBurlesque Striptease as Transformation," 6 p.m. Wednesday, Aug. 23, at Thomas Branigan Memorial Library, 200 E. Picacho Ave.

"What I do is tell a story with a few readings," Sally told the Bulletin. "It's about the process of writing a book and some of the backlash I received. I'm a professor by day (she teaches at NMSU) and a burlesque performer by night." Sally has also produced shows in New York City, Washington, D.C., Albuquerque, Truth or Consequences and elsewhere.

The book corrects misconceptions about burlesque and striptease, Sally said.

At the Branigan Library event, she will be "telling a story about writing this book and those strange, challenging experiences."

She received a Ph.D. in performance studies from New York University and a master of arts degree in gender studies and feminist theory from The New School for Social Research in New York City.

"Neo-Burlesque: Striptease as Transformation," Sally's second book, was published by Rutgers University Press

in 2021.

The book "offers an inside look at the history, culture and philosophy of New York's new-burlesque scene," according to Sally's website. "Revealing how 21st century neo-burlesque is in constant dialogue with the classic burlesque of the 19th and 20th

centuries, she considers how today's performers use camp to comment on preconceived notions of femininity (and) explores how the striptease performer directs the audience's gaze, putting on layers of meaning while taking off layers of clothing."

Burlesque shows in the United States "came to be designed for exclusively male patronage, compounded of slapstick sketches, dirty jokes, chorus numbers and solo dances usually billed as 'daring' or 'sensational' in their female nudity," according to britannica.com.

Her first book, "Fighting the Flames at Coney Island: The Spectacular Performance of Fire," was published in 2006.

Sally also has published peer-reviewed articles and reviews in the Journal of American Drama and Theatre, Journal of Popular Culture, Senses & Society, New York History and other publications.

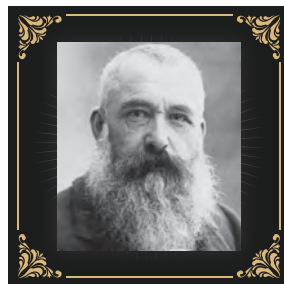

- **Oct. 13-29:** "Murder by Poe," written by Jeffrey Hatcher and directed by Joshua and Bekka Taulbee. Hatcher (1957-) is an American playwright and screenwriter. From Dramatists Play Service: "A dark and dreadful night. A woman in white lost within a wood. And the only shelter is a house full of murderers. Mixing funhouse tricks, Grand Guignol and a deadly game of cat

and mouse, 'Murder by Poe' is a theatrical reimagining of some of Edgar Allan Poe's (1809-49) most famous tales of terror, including 'The Black Cat,' 'The Tell-Tale Heart,' 'The Murders in the Rue Morgue' and 'The Fall of the House of Usher.'" BBT produced "Murderers" by Hatcher in 2014.

- **Dec. 1-17:** "Ben Hur," written by Patrick Barlow and directed by Autumn Gieb. The comedy is based on the novel by former New Mexico Territorial Gov. Lew Wallace. (1827-1905) Actor, comedian and playwright Barlow (1947-) also adapted "A Christmas Carol" and "39 Steps" (BBT produced it in 2011) for the stage. He was the

most performed playwright in America 2012-13.

- **Feb. 9-25, 2024:** "I Love You, You're Perfect, Now Change," book and lyrics by Joe DiPietro (1961-) and music by Jimmy Roberts (1952-); directed by Kate Keyser. With more than 5,000 performances over 12 years, the show is the second-longest running Off-Broadway musical. It is a series of vignettes connected by the central theme of love and relationships. The play's tagline is "Everything you have ever secretly thought about dating, romance, marriage, lovers, husbands, wives and in-

laws, but were afraid to admit." The show's many characters are performed by a cast of four.

• **March 1-17:** "Home," by David Storey, directed by Ceil Herman. The play, set in a mental health facility, premiered in London in 1970. The London and Broadway casts included Sir John Gielgud and Sir Ralph Richardson. Jessica Tandy was in the Broadway cast. Storey (1933-2017) was an English playwright, screenwriter and award-winning novelist. He was also a professional rugby player.

• **April 19-May 5:** "In the Next Room or the Vibrator Play," by Sarah Ruhl, directed by Joshua Taulbee. Set in the 1880s at the dawn of the age

of electricity and based on the bizarre historical fact that doctors used vibrators to treat 'hysterical' women (and some men), the play centers on a doctor and his wife and how

his new therapy affects their entire household. In 2010, the play earned a 2010 Tony Award nomination for best play and was a finalist for a Pulitzer Prize for drama. BBT produced "Dead Man's Cell Phone" by Ruhl (1974-) in 2013.

• **June 14-30:** "A Walk in the Woods," by Lee Blessing. The play depicts the developing relationship between two arms-limitation negotiators, one Russian and one American, over a year of negotiations.

They eventually develop a relationship, although their personalities differ. The play is suggested by a real-life incident, which occurred in 1982. "Negotiators Paul H. Nitze and Yuli A. Kvitsinsky left the official Geneva sessions for an unofficial "walk in the woods" and achieved a breakthrough, soon rejected by their governments. This is the second play by Blessing BBT will produce in 2023 and the fourth since the theatre opened. BBT performed Blessing's "Down the Road" in 2002 and "Two Rooms" in 2005.

Dates, times, tickets

There will be performances of each show over three weekends: 8 p.m. Friday and Saturday nights all three weekends, 2:30 p.m. Sundays the second and third weekends and 7 p.m. Thursday the third weekend. REVIEW: 'Bat Boy' the Musical takes flight

There are many reasons to see "Bat Boy: The Musical" at Las Cruces Community Theatre, and one of the best is the performance of Christian Nieves. He is beyond outstanding in this challenging lead role.

As the bat, as the boy – the animal and the human – Nieves captures the essence of the musical: the overwhelming need to be loved and understood. His work is powerful and subtle, intense and vulnerable. Crawling on hands and knees in almost no clothing, snarling and hissing, he transforms into an elegant young man in a three-piece suit who sings and dances

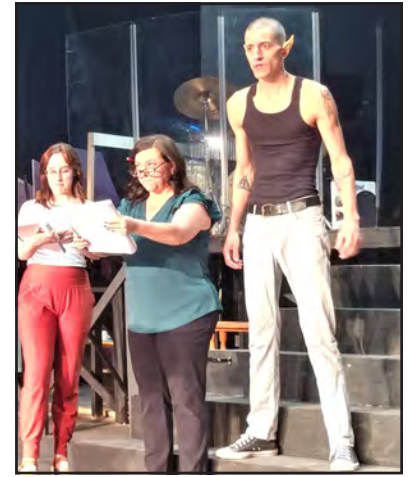
with grace and fluidity and has a tongue as sharp as his ears and teeth.

And what an all-star supporting cast this show has.

Eric Drummond and Shari Drummond as Dr. and Mrs. Parker add such a rich flavor to this story with their characters' secrets and the wounds they carry. Shari Drummond's duet with Nieves in the first act, before Bat Boy can talk, is one of my favorite moments in this show.

Alyssa Gose (many great performances, including Blank Conversations Theatre Company's 2022 production of "The Complete History of America abridged"), Bianca Marie Castro (so memorable as Miss

Honey in LCCT's "Matilda" earlier this year), Peyton Womble (amazing most recently in NMSU's "Godspell"), Jose Luis Solorzano (I loved the total commitment to Mrs. Taylor), Hugo De Billie V (his performance in "Spelling Bee" at NMSU in 2020 is one of my all-time favorites), John Kulpa (electric as Rev. Hightower), Eva Cullen (also outstanding in "Godspell"), Katie Mayers, Peggy Flores, Melissa Muñoz-Chavez (a great mayor), Kacie Bauer, Tanya Camargo and Gabriella Azollini. Credit co-directors

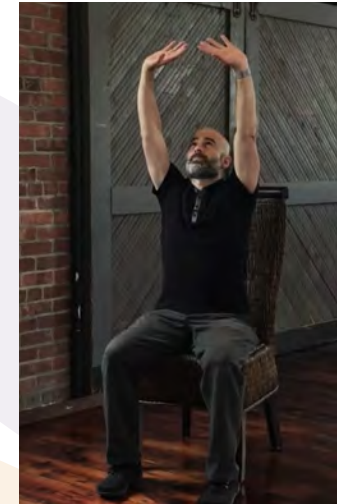

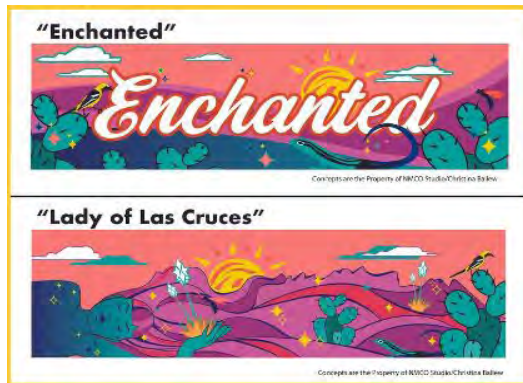

Auditions and performances

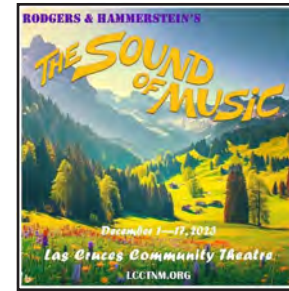

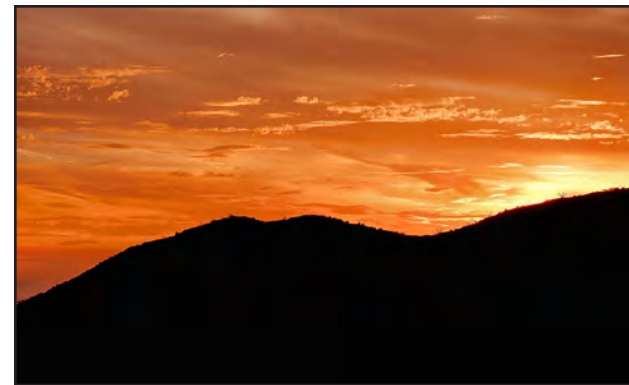

The 10 Baha'i women from

Shiraz, Iran, were hanged because they would not recant their faith. The women, ranging in age from 17 to 57, were hanged while the remaining women were made to watch. They were repeatedly told they could recant their beliefs and be safe or else be executed. Their only crime was to be members of the Baha'i Faith.

Today in Iran, the struggle for justice, equality and religious freedom is ongoing among women of all backgrounds. Since last fall, arrests of Baha'is have escalated dramatically as have the confiscation and looting of property. Baha'is having already served sentences from a year to 10 years have been rearrested.

The Double Eagle celebrates 50th anniversary

When C.W. “Buddy” Ritter bought the Double Eagle in 1983, the restaurant manager asked him, “Did the ghost come with the sale?”

“What ghost?” Ritter asked.

The rest, as they say, is history.

There is no experience like a visit to the Double Eagle, which is celebrating its 50th anniversary in 2023.

You can hunt for ghosts in the Carlota Salon; enjoy a meal beneath the 24-karat gold leaf ceiling in the Maximillian Room that honors the emperor of the Second Mexican Empire; celebrate weddings, anniversaries and other special events in the Isabella Ballroom, where

a direct descendant of Christopher Columbus was honored in 1992, the 500th anniversary of Columbus’ voyage to America; climb onto a stool in the Imperial Bar to sample

the house margarita that has been served there for more than 40 years; visit the Gadsden Room to see the Library of Congress archive proofs of the Gadsden Purchase document that brought the Territory of New Mexico into the United States; stop by the Billy the Kid Patio to see the newest post where the world’s most famous outlaw carved his name.

It’s all part of the rich and colorful history of the Double Eagle, just as the restaurant and the historic property it occupies at 2355 Calle de Guadalupe are so much a part of the history and lore of Mesilla.

The building itself dates to 1850, when it became the first structure on the plaza, shortly after the founding of Mesilla, Ritter said.

Oilman



and entrepreneur Robert O. Anderson opened the Double Eagle in 1973.

Ritter, who bought the restaurant 10 years later from Anderson’s son-in-law, Tom Denton, is celebrating its golden anniversary with a commemorative menu featuring signature dishes from the past five decades and a celebration dinner and dance Sept. 9.

The invitation-only event will include longtime customers of the Double Eagle, Ritter said, including some who were married at the restaurant.

“It should be a very wonderful evening,” he said.

It was Ritter’s wife, Margaret, who suggested he buy the Double Eagle.

After Denton told Ritter the restaurant was for sale, Ritter asked, “How much?”

“How much will you give me?” Denton replied.

Ritter took 24 hours to research the property’s value, then made an offer that Denton accepted.

“I’ve never regretted it,” said Ritter, a fifth-generation Mesilla native who has owned four hotels and 14 restaurants in Cloudcroft, Las Cruces, Mesilla and Tucson. He was also

in the racehorse business for 24 years.

The Double Eagle’s original building was made of adobe bricks, as Ritter details in his 2014 book “Mesilla Comes Alive.” Shallow trenches were

dug, lined with rock and the adobe placed on top. The building has no foundation.

The restaurant patio was originally a corral. Anderson added onto the building and Ritter continued renovations, turning Anderson’s rose garden into the restaurant’s ballroom.

Local adobe expert Larry Limon was hired to restore deteriorating adobe in the building that in some cases is 173 years old, Ritter said. You can see Limon’s work in Ritter’s office, which is just to the right as you walk in the Double Eagle’s front door. The office was the surgical suite of Ritter’s great-great grandfather, Dr. Edwin Burt, who came to Mesilla in the 1870s.

Ritter’s heritage includes grandfathers named Charles and Winfield – his first and middle names. To avoid confusion, his parents started calling him “Buddy.”

The ghosts

Ritter and his staff have had “some very, very weird experiences that there’s no way I can explain,” he said.

In 1988, a couple cele-

brating their engagement were the last patrons in the restaurant one night. They left an unfinished bottle of wine in the Carlota Salon. The manager, Bill, was the last employee in the building. He left the wine on the table and “told the ghost to have a good time,” Ritter said. Bill set the burglar alarm and motion detector, locked up for the night

and left. The first person in the building the next morning, Bill unlocked the door, turned off the alarms and, upon visiting the Carlota Salon, discovered the wine bottle empty and lying on its side – there was no stain on the tablecloth – and two broken glasses.

“He flew out of the

building,” Ritter said, and came to Ritter’s office in Las Cruces. He threw his keys on the desk and told another Ritter employee, “I’m outta here. I’ll never walk in that building again. I really like Mr. Ritter, but I’m not going to work there.”

“Bill told me the story himself,” Ritter said.

Ritter needed a food and beverage manager at his property in Tucson, and Bill took the job. He hasn’t been back in the Double Eagle since.

The ghosts have likely been in residence since the 1860s, when the Double Eagle was the home of an affluent Mexican family (portraits of Señor and Señora Maese hang on the salon wall) whose teenage son fell in love

with the maid, much to his mother’s distress. She came home one afternoon to find the two lovers in bed in the son’s room (now the salon). Enraged, she stabbed the maid to death with a pair of scissors, accidentally stabbing her son in the attack as he tried to save his lover. He died the next day. It is said that the ghosts of the young lovers inhabit the Carlota Salon to this day.

There are two upholstered Victorian armchairs in the room that are rarely used. Yet the cut velvet fabric is worn in the shape of human bodies, and one chair in particular shows continuous wear that matches the description of the petite young maid and her lover, Ritter said.

“There’s got to be some reason they’re wearing

out,” he said. “The room is really alive.”

Many New Mexico governors and prominent local businesspeople have dined in the salon.

“A lot of multi-million-dollar deals have been negotiated in that room,” Ritter said.

The salon’s gilded brass and cut crystal lamp once lighted the boudoir of famed red-light madame ‘Silver City Millie.’

Robert O. Anderson restaurants

In addition to the Double Eagle, Anderson owned the Silver Dollar steakhouse in Tinnie, near Lincoln, New Mexico, the Maria Theresa in Albuquerque, the Legal Tender in Santa Fe and the Palace in Las Vegas, New Mexico.

City, county again approve funds for economic development

Both the Las Cruces City Council and the Doña Ana County Commission have approved continued funding for the Mesilla Valley Economic Development Alliance (MVEDA).

At its Aug. 8 regular meeting, the county commission voted 4-1 to approve “a sole source contract to MVEDA for economic development services in the amount of \$300,000,” according to the meeting agenda.

As part of the consent agenda at its Aug. 7 regular meeting, the city council

allocated \$250,000 to MVEDA “for economic development services” on a one-year contract through June 30, 2024, with an option to renew.

The city “has been a participating member of MVEDA since its inception in 1994,” the city said, “and the two organizations have worked together to fulfill the city’s goals of increasing the city focus on strategic job creation, promoting responsible, stable and sustainable economic development and promoting Las Cruces’ unique identity as a place to do business.”

“MVEDA is excited to

continue our partnership with the City of Las Cruces and Doña Ana County in growing economic development opportunities,” MVEDA President and CEO Davin Lopez told the Bulletin. “Along with increased support from the private sector, we enter the new fiscal year with strong momentum with enhanced services for our clients.”

MVEDA has a total operating budget of \$1.165 million, which also includes support from private business, “to grow the wealth and health of Doña Ana County and its residents,” MVEDA President and CEO Davin Lopez said at the city council meeting.

High school football kicks off this weekend

All four Las Cruces Public Schools high school football teams return to action this weekend, with three of the four playing in Albuquerque.

The one home game is 1 p.m. Saturday, Aug. 19, at the newly re-surfaced Field of Dreams stadium, as Centennial High School with a pre-season rank of No. 3 in Class 6A, hosts three-time defending state champion Cleveland High School from Rio Rancho, who is ranked No. 1 again in 6A. Cleveland finished last year 11-2, with one of those two losses last year coming at the hands

of Centennial, who beat Cleveland on the road in the season opener 38-35.

Two of Centennial's District 6A-3/4 rivals, Las Cruces High School and Organ Mountain High School, play at 7 p.m. August 18, in Albuquerque. The Bulldawgs, ranked No. 8 in 6A, travel to Volcano Vista High School, while the Knights will play Albuquerque High School.

Mayfield High School, ranked No. 8 in Class 5A, is also in Albuquerque, with a 1 p.m. Saturday, Aug. 19, game against Manzano High School.

Mesilla Valley Christian School, which plays in the

8-man District 2, doesn't start its season until Friday, Sept. 8, when it too opens in Albuquerque with a 7 p.m. game against Menaul High School. The SonBlazers are led by Head Coach Doug Coyle and finished last season at 3-5.

Organ Mountain and Mayfield both enter the season with new head coaches.

Kenny Sanchez came in from Las Vegas, Nevada, where he coached Bishop Gorman High School for 11 years, including 2016, when he was named National Coach of the Year by MaxPreps. The Knights were 3-7 last season.

The new coach at May-

field is a familiar name. Gary Bradley is the brother of Michael Bradley, who retired last year after coaching the Trojans since 2006. Of course, they are both sons of longtime Trojan Head Coach Jim Bradley.

CHS Head Coach Aaron Ocampo is in his 12th year leading the Hawks. They were 9-2 last year: 9-and made it to the 2022 state semifinals.

Time keeps on slippin,' slippin,' slippin' into the future

Covid pandemic. LIV rival golf league. Threat of nuclear war. Climate change. Makes me wonder what will golf be like in 20, 50 or 100 years. It would have been impossible for Old Tom Morris, on the Scottish links in the mid-1800s, to fathom the game we currently play, with space-age equipment and velvet grass courses. Not to mention the vast sums of money pros make.

Many forces conspire to threaten the game of golf we now know. Take, for example, the growing number of golf courses, both public and private, forced to close because of governmental and land use disputes, escalating maintenance costs (including chemicals), water scarcity and other factors. If we think about industrial

technology in the U.S. in the early 1920s, including manufacturing, communications, electronics, transportation, energy, production of consumer goods, medicine and health care, and compare it to what exists in the 100 years since, it is mind-boggling. The upward pace of technological development is ever-quicken- ing, almost exponentially.

It's not just time, but technology that's slipping into the future.

Let's not worry about golf in 100 years; let's look at 2073, 50 years hence. First, consider courses themselves. With ongoing drought, global warming, as well as new course designs by new architects, there will probably be

a mix of old and new. Augusta National, while pristine and beautiful, is not a model for a sustainable golf course. And there is some question about whether communities will embrace golf over the next 50 years and support municipal courses.

Next, we turn to technology. Over the past 25 years we have seen emergence and popularity of GPS and laser range-finders, sophisticated launch monitors, monster golf simulators and the growth of analytics. During the next several decades there will be breakthroughs in golf-targeting body strength and exercise, discoveries in the management of

brain power (the mental game) and a transformation in golf instruction. I would not be surprised by golf balls with internal microchips linked to smart phones, and micro-cameras inside the ball.

The PGA Tour began 55 years ago. Just over a year ago the biggest threat to the PGA Tour popped up in the form of LIV golf, funded by the Saudi Public Investment Fund (PIF). Needing to stop the LIV tour from raiding the PGA Tour for their players, the PGA Tour reached a controversial agreement with the Saudi PIF to join forces. Who knows what professional golf will be like 40 or 50 years from now? One thing I know for sure is people will still be betting, and losing, their hard-earned money on

sports.

Young golfers are getting better and better. The top men and women college players are already at the professional level when they leave school. Current examples are Ludvig Aberg and Zhang Rose. Still, I wonder if a super talented player will emerge in the next 50 years to eclipse a Tiger Woods or an Annika Sorenstam. I have my doubts, but it is certainly possible.

It's hard to believe it's been 50 years since I was playing at Birmingham Country Club in suburban Detroit. Birmingham C.C. was a high-end golf course, less than a mile from Oakland Hills C.C. It was the host of the 1953 PGA Championship, won by Detroit's own Walter Burkemo. When I look

back, I am struck so much has changed in golf, and yet golf is basically the same game it always was. Some demands on how we play remain: swing hard in case you hit it; keep your head down you fool; don't choke; putting is everything; ball in hole important.

The headline today is from the Steve Miller Band's 1976 hit "Fly Like An Eagle." I attended a Steve Miller Band concert in Dallas a few weeks ago, and was totally spellbound by 79-year-old Steve Miller playing the guitar and singing like nothing has changed in 50 years.

Maybe golf will be all right.
