Abandoned property downtown to be demolished

At its Monday, Aug. 21, regular meeting, the Las Cruces City Council unanimously passed a resolution declaring an abandoned property at 430 S. Main St. as “so ruined, damaged and dilapidated that it constitutes a menace to the public comfort, health, peace or safety and warrants abatement and removal.”

City staff reported at the meeting the property owner has agreed to demolish the building.

As part of the meeting’s consent agenda, the council extended City Manager Ifo Pili’s contract for at least three additional years. The council also approved the donation of a vacant lot to be used for affordable housing.

The dilapidated building, over the 11-plus years it sat vacant and unused, earned the nickname “Eyesore of District 4,” referring to its City Council District. City Community Development Department (CCD) staff and officers from the Code Enforcement Division of the Las Cruces Police Department made the determination of the building’s condition after a site visit, the city said. “Multiple calls for service and complaints have been received by Codes Enforcement” about

the building, the city said.

“It’s an unfinished and unsafe structure based on inspections recently performed,” CCD Director Larry Nichols said during the meeting.

“No development (of the property) ever came to fruition,” Nichols said.

Nichols said property owner John Hoffman of El Paso did not respond to a letter the city sent earlier this year demanding abatement or demolition of the property, so the city sought relief from Third Judicial District Court. The court issued an inspectorial order, which Nichols said is the equivalent of a search warrant, which allowed city staff to inspect the interior of the building, where they discovered unsafe and hazardous conditions, he said.

In a July 15 telephone conversation, Nichols said

Hoffman told him he (Hoffman) “would pursue demolition” of the property.

The city issued a demolition permit Aug. 10, Nichols said, and the work began Aug. 16.

Nichols said the demolition permit is good for 180 days, but he expects the work to be completed before the permit expires.

The city respects the rights of property owners, but they also have to maintain their property and keep it “at a minimum safe standard,” Councilor Johana Bencomo said at the meeting.

“When you fail to do that, measures like this have to be taken,” said Bencomo, who represents City Council District 4, which includes the abandoned property.

Low-income housing

The council approved the donation of a vacant parcel of land the city owns at 2245 E. Griggs Ave. to Catholic Charities Housing Inc./Celsea Investment Corp., for the development of Three Sisters Affordable Housing Complex, a 70-unit low-income housing project to be constructed at 130 N. Walnut St. The donated land will allow for site improve-

ments, including a community center and access to the site, the city said.

The two properties are adjacent. The donation by the city is allowed under the state’s Affordable Housing Act.

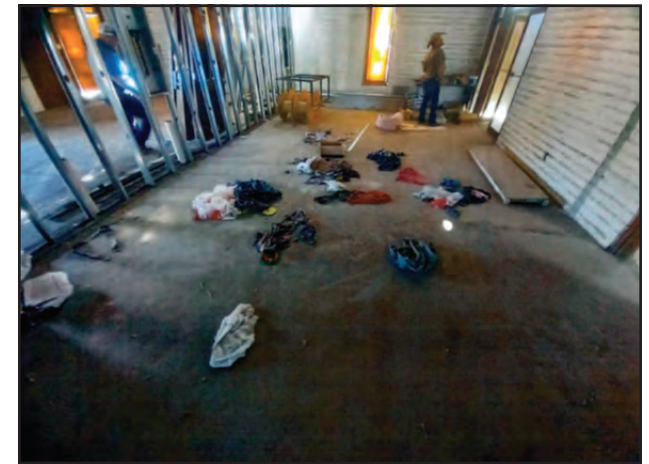

Superintendent pledges to teach business skills

New Las Cruces Public Schools superintendent, Ignacio Ruíz, spoke to members of the Greater Las Cruces Chamber of Commerce during a luncheon Thursday, Aug. 17.

Ruíz said the workforce is important to the community and the education system is in need strong partnerships with the businesses community.

"I am a true believer in pathways and with our local community to ensure we are looking at things the right way," he said, "so that we understand what are those components you need as business owners."

He said working to sweep up a local market where he grew up in

Tucson made him start thinking about the business world. And the snow cone lady who opened a window in her house that made him think about entrepreneurship.

"Our CTE (Career Technical Education) programs are so important, not only for preparing future doctors and lawyers but also preparing local business owners: the owner of that welding shop and the owner of that clinic," Ruíz said. "That's going to be very important and I'm looking forward to those conversations ensuring the pathways for our kiddos."

He said it's important to ensure all the children in the schools have the opportunity to learn what they need. Ruíz said he feels strongly

Earlier this year, we said goodbye to J. Paul Taylor, one of the most stalwart advocates for art, culture, and education in New Mexico's history. He would have been 103 on Aug. 24. To celebrate his life and legacy, New Mexico Historic Sites (NMHS) is throwing him a birthday celebration. New Mexicans of all stripes are invited to celebrate the lives of Mr. Taylor and Mary Daniels Taylor, his late wife.

On Saturday, Aug. 26, 10 a.m.-4 p.m., the public is invited to join staff and Mr. Taylor's loved ones on the Mesilla Plaza for family friendly activities and booths highlighting

the history and culture of the Mesilla Valley.

In addition to that, members of the Friends of the Taylor Family Monument will be granted an exclusive preview of the Taylor-Mesilla Historic Site ahead of its official unveiling. "Celebrating Mr. and Mrs. Taylor's lives without either of them is certainly bittersweet," said Rhonda Dass, manager of

"However, the extraordinary gift they have given the people of New Mexico in Taylor-Mesilla Historic Site is an ongoing reminder that we need to celebrate the incredible people who have blessed our community in their own unique ways. Birthday celebrations like this have been an annual affair since 2010. While Mr. Taylor was alive, they were an opportunity for him to engage with the public and tell his story and that of his home. This was not an obligation for him. He was enthusiastic about sharing the home's layers of history

and discussing the art he'd collected over the years, no matter who you were or when you spoke to him.

In 2003, the Taylors agreed to donate their historic home to the New Mexico Department of Cultural Affairs. The home became a state monument shortly thereafter.

In the spirit of Mr. Taylor's enthusiasm, NMHS, the Friends of the Taylor Family Monument, and the Taylor family have conjured a birthday celebration focused on celebrating him and the causes he championed in life again this year.

Film documents first Black NMSU graduate

The life story of Clara Belle Williams, the first African American graduate of New Mexico State University, will be featured in a special program on public television this month. The documentary "Clara Belle Williams: New Mexico Pioneer in Education" will air at 8 p.m. Thursday, Aug. 24 and rebroadcasted at 5 p.m. Sunday, Aug. 27 on KRWG television.

This half-hour documentary produced by KRWG Public Media features interviews with Williams' family and others who discuss her impact on education.

"Our viewers will learn about a woman ahead of her time," said Adrian Velarde, general manager of NMSU's University Broadcasting. "Despite the challenges she faced, Clara Belle Williams' devotion to her family and the power of education is powerful lesson for us all."

Education was a major part of Williams' life. She was the valedictorian of Prairie View Normal and Industrial

College (now Prairie View A&M) in 1905. She taught at the college for a number of years where she met her husband, Jasper Williams.

The couple later moved to El Paso, Texas. In El Paso, Jasper ran a pharmacy and they had three children: Jasper, James, and Charles. In 1924, the

drugstore burned down and the couple moved to Vado, New Mexico.

Both became teachers and later moved to Las Cruces. While living in Las Cruces, Clara Belle Williams was a teacher at Phillips Chapel and Booker T. Washington schools.

During summers, Williams attended

New Mexico College of Agriculture and Mechanic Arts, which became NMSU. In spite of her challenges as an African American student, Williams graduated in 1937 with a bachelor's degree in English and education.

In 1980, she received an honorary doctorate from NMSU and later the university named a street after her and changed the name of the English Building to Clara Belle Williams Hall.

For the past year, KRWG production manager Christian Valle researched archives about Williams and conducted interviews about her. Valle is eager for the public to learn more about her inspiring life journey.

"I think viewers can expect a deeply personal account of how a family in the borderland region, of African American descent, lived during the time of segregation and what families had to do to survive and to get educated," Valle said.

Tents to Rents works to help others

Editor's note: This is another in a series about residents of the Mesilla Valley Community of Hope's Camp Hope tent city and the 2023 Tents to Rents fundraising campaign, which began Aug. 14, as Mesilla Valley Community of Hope (MVCH) raises funds to support Camp Hope, helping to move camp residents into their own apartments.

Jennifer served 10 years in the United States Army and Army Reserves. Her introduction to New Mexico came with her first duty post at

White Sands Missile Range. She is proud of her service and many accomplishments, but also suffers from PTSD stemming from sexual assault while in the military, and from unhealthy relationships.

After her service, Jennifer returned to North Carolina, where she worked as a community mental health worker until she had to become a caregiver for her elderly mother.

When her mother

died and her three grown children no longer needed her, Jennifer decided to retire to New Mexico, where the warmth and dry air provide a healthier environment.

Jennifer arrived at Camp Hope last Labor Day, and immediately began volunteering, helping with the food bank and clothing donations, which she continues to do.

Living in the tent camp was a challenge for a woman in her 60s, but Jennifer reminded herself that it was just like basic training in her Army days.

Her status as a military veteran qualified her for special preference in housing place-

ment, and by early December she was moved into an apartment in the complex for veterans, where she is the only female resident.

Jennifer is very happy to be there, where she feels accepted, not judged, and is giving back through volunteering at Mesilla Valley Community of Hope and serving on its board of directors.

Free legal clinic Saturday

A free legal clinic will be held 1-6 p.m. Saturday, Aug. 26, at Betty McKnight Community Center, 190 County Line Drive, in Chaparral, New Mexico, Third Judicial District Judge Robert Lara said. The areas of law to be served, according to an event flyer, are divorce, custody, visitation, child support, spousal support, paternity, kinship guardianship, personal injury, landlord/tenant, bankruptcy, creditor/debtor, wills/probate, powers of attorney, public benefits, employment, unemployment benefits, contracts and immigration. Consultations will take place on a first come, first served basis, the flyer said. "The goal of the clinic is to allow community members

who may have a legal issue to visit with a New Mexico attorney to get advice and guidance from that attorney," Lara said. "These volunteer attorneys will not represent anyone at the clinic but will provide important information and guidance on how that individual may proceed with their legal issue." Lara said attorneys from both Doña Ana and Otero counties will be part of the clinic, as Chaparral is in both counties. The clinic is sponsored by New Mexico's Third and Twelfth judicial district courts and the Volunteer Attorney program. WSMR selects Hall of Famers

White Sands Missile Range

White Sands Missile Range has elected Ms. Jean Simpkins and Mr. William Rice to its Hall of Fame for 2023. After a review of nominations by a committee of personnel from White Sands and the White Sands Historical Foundation, Brig. Gen. Eric Little, WSMR commander, made the selection in June. Simpkins and Rice will be the 57th and 58th members of the elite group that includes Clyde Tombaugh and Wernher von Braun.

Simpkins worked at White Sands from 1952 until her retirement in 1984. She is being recognized for her outstanding work as the missile range's real estate specialist where she managed the complicated world of land leases, purchases, payments, and court judgements. She was the authorizing officer for all payments due landowners for land use, damage claims and evacuations. She initiated and justified real estate acquisition actions for congressional approval, assisted in negotiations with the property owners and worked directly with the Rancher's Committee. She was responsible for budgeting for on-and-off range payments under the leases, condemnations, restorations, permits and evacuations in the many real estate arenas. She had a lot of irons in the fire.

While being incredibly efficient and inventive in accomplishing these tasks, she was often praised for her diplomacy in dealing with landowners. She felt ranchers deserved to be treated with respect and she made sure other officials at White Sands followed her example. Her nomination package states that her efforts helped create a much more positive relationship with White Sands ranchers after

years of combative interactions with the Army Corps of Engineers.

The map she created to help explain the complicated land ownership at White Sands

has been recreated by the New Mexico Farm and Ranch Heritage Museum and is the introduction to their exhibit "Home on the Range: From Ranches to Rockets." The exhibit details how ranch lands became a state-of-the-art technology testing facility because of World War II.

Simpkins died in May 2023.

Rice started work at White Sands in 1960 while finishing his degree in computer science at NMSU. He retired in Las Cruces in 1995. Rice is being inducted for his work perfecting some of the latest cutting-edge technology used to test missile systems at White Sands.

Initially Rice worked in "real-time computing." This means that computer-data systems

can collect, process and display information in the blink of an eye. To the observer, there is no perceptible lag time between when an event takes place and when they are made aware of it. For missiles, it means being able to track a missile and display its flight instantaneously to a safety officer who can destroy the vehicle if it malfunctions and threatens populated areas. Eventually, Rice was known as "Mr. Real-Time."

Rice helped develop the Drone Formation Control System which used computers and data systems to remotely fly real aircraft in formation as targets for missile systems like Patriot. In fact, with Rice's assistance, the system was able to fly three jets to be fired upon by three Patriot missiles. As chief of the system, his team adapted it to remotely control Army tanks over 60 miles away on the north end of White Sands.

Other significant assignments for Rice included being chief of telemetry and the "executing agent" for developing global positioning for use in the missile range's instrumentation systems.

Rice lives in Las Cruces.

The Hall of Fame induction ceremony will be part of a luncheon at the Missile Range's Frontier Club on Wednesday, Sept. 13. The event will begin at 11:30 a.m. Reservations are required and can be made by calling the White Sands Protocol Office at 575-678-1028. The deadline for making reservations is Tuesday, Sept. 5. Diving canines to make splash in Las Cruces

More than 180 dogs, and their owners, will descend upon Las Cruces Aug. 25-27 for the North America Diving Dogs (NADD) Southwest Regionals.

Visit Las Cruces helped coordinate bringing this event to the city, organizers said. The event will take place at Burn Lake in Las Cruces.

Dogs registered to compete represent multiple states, including California, Nevada, Arizona, Texas, Colorado and

New Mexico.

The range of dogs include first-time competitors seasoned professionals such as a Guinness World Record holder and an NADD Hall of Fame dog, said Shannon Murray, who owns Las Cruces Dock Diving, a local facility where dogs can jump and train.

Dogs compete in three different categories.

In Air Retrieve, dogs

leap from the dock to grab a hanging buoy set a measured distance from the edge of the dock. That competition will be Friday, Aug. 25.

In Hydro Dash, dogs chase a buoy thrown by their owners in the air over the water. That competition will be Saturday, Aug. 26.

In Distance competition, the dog simply sprints from the dock to see how far it can jump into the water. Many dogs are able to leap more than 20 feet in the air. That competition will be Sunday, Aug. 27.

Rare 'blue super moon' rising

If you've expecting something that only happens "once in a blue moon," get ready, 'cause there's a blue moon a'comin'. And this one is real special – it's blue supermoon!

The 2023 blue supermoon will peak at 7:36 p.m. MDT Wednesday, Aug. 30.

The moon will also be visible the next night, Thursday, Aug. 31, during the White Sands National Park Full Moon Night.

A blue supermoon happens considerably less often than a standard blue moon, which shows up about every 2.5 years. The last blue supermoon was in December 2009. The next will be in August 2032, according to timeanddate.com.

There are two different kinds of blue moons, according to Farmers Almanac.

A seasonal blue moon is "an extra full moon that occurs within an astronomical season. One season – defined by the dates of the solstices and equinoxes – typically has three full moons occurring within it. If a season

has four full moons, the third one (not the fourth) in the season may be called a blue moon."

A calendrical blue moon, like the one at the end of August, is the second full moon to occur within a calendar month, Farmers' Almanac said.

It is called a supermoon because the moon is so close to Earth, just 222,043 miles away – almost 17,000 miles closer than average, according to Farmers' Almanac. (The closest the moon can come to Earth is 221,438 miles. The closest the moon has come to Earth in recent times was 221,454 miles Jan. 15, 1930. The next closest will be 221,469 miles Dec. 6,

2052, according to Farmers' Almanac.)

There is also such a thing as a black moon, which Farmers' Almanac describes as "the second new moon in a (calendar) month." A new moon is essentially the opposite of a full moon.

"During a full moon, we see the side of the moon that is being illuminated by the sun. During a new moon, we see the side of the moon that is not being illuminated by the sun, which makes the moon blend in with the dark night sky," Farmers' Almanac said.

A black moon occurs about every 29 months. The next black moon is Dec. 30, 2024.

Candidates to file Aug. 29

There will be nearly 40 races on the Tuesday, Nov. 7, local election ballot in five Doña Ana County municipalities, three school districts and five conservation districts.

Candidates must file at the Doña Ana County Clerk's Office Tuesday, Aug. 29, to be eligible for the election.

Only qualified voters in each community or district will vote in its particular races. For example, all qualified voters in Las Cruces will vote in the races for mayor and for municipal judge I, but only voters in Las Cruces City Council Districts 1, 2 and 4 will vote in those council races. Only qualified voters who reside in a particular school district or conservation district will vote in that district's races.

CHARLES EVAN DAVIES, 86

Charles Evan Davies was born April 27, 1937, in Manhattan, Kansas, to the Rev. Charles and Mildred Davies. He died July 2, 2023, in Las Cruces, New Mexico.

Evan spent his early years in Manhattan, Kansas, where his father was the Episcopal priest at St. Paul's Episcopal Church. In 1952, when Evan was a teenager, his family moved to Roswell, New Mexico, where his father was called to serve at St. Andrew's Episcopal Church. Upon graduation from Roswell High School, Evan

returned to Kansas to attend Kansas State University. He held a bachelor's degree in Greek from Kansas State, a Master's of Divinity from Church Divinity School of the Pacific, Berkeley, California, and a Master's and Doctorate from Oxford University, England. While at Oxford, he was ordained at Christ Church Cathedral, made Associate Chaplain of Pembroke College, and served as President of Oxford University Society of Bibliophiles.

Upon his return to the states in 1966, Evan was

assigned to serve in 12 Episcopal Texas missions in the Big Bend area.

In 1969, he transferred to New Mexico as Rector of St. Andrew's Episcopal Church, Las Cruces. Later he completed a 20-year stint with the American Red Cross as Executive Director of the Southwest New Mexico Chapter and served as a member of

the Red Cross President's Advisory Council in Washington, D.C.

Evan pursued his love of history and scholarship and founded the Institute of Historical Survey Foundation (IHSF), which in 1982 became a non-profit, 501(c)(3) archive, library and museum complex with multifaceted interests and disciplines. In the 1990s he raised funds to create a state-of-the-art facility in Mesilla Park, New Mexico, to preserve the Foundation's extensive collections. He served as the President of the Foun-

ation and the Director from its beginning until his death. He also served as the Archivist for the Episcopal Diocese of the Rio Grande.

With broad scholarly interests, and a love for the Episcopal Church, Evan gathered an extraordinary collection for the Archive. His love of collecting and preserving historical materials was an inspiration to many. The dedicated staff, volunteers, and supporters of the Institute will greatly miss him.

Dr. Davies is survived by his cousins Dr. Leigh

Stamets of Carmichael, California, and Bradley Stamets of San Luis Obispo, California.

A memorial service is scheduled for August 26, 2023, at 10 a.m., at St. James Episcopal Church, Las Cruces. Arrangements by Getz Funeral Home, Las Cruces, New Mexico. 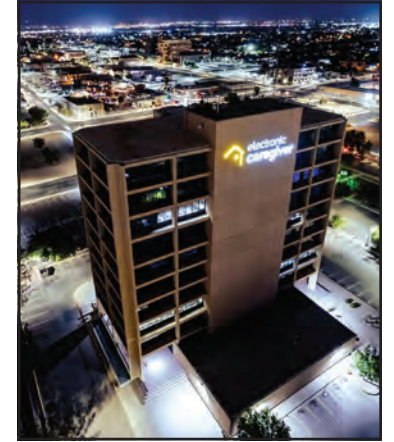

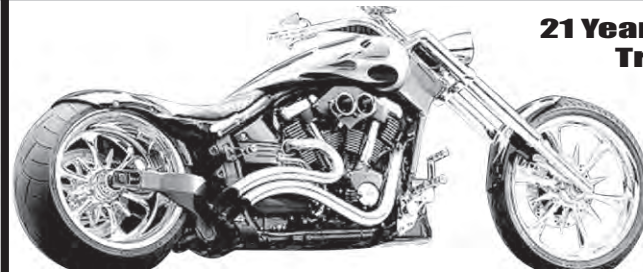

Students' return to NMSU brings vibrancy

The other day I was driving down University Avenue, silently cursing the decisionmakers who, for the second time in two years, chose to tear up the road for repairs in conjunction with New Mexico State University classes convening.

"Why didn't they start this in May?" I thought.

Then I had different thoughts.

Seeing all the traffic on University, as well as on campus itself, I was reminded how much the university means to Las Cruces.

Every year, when students return for fall classes, there's a rejuvenation in our whole community.

This year is particularly vibrant. Approximately 2,500 freshmen descended on campus Aug. 14 and 15, packing the dormitories full, and creating some housing shortages in Las Cruces. That's the most freshmen we've had on

campus in years.

Part of that growth is our emergence from the pandemic.

But there seems to be a bit more going on. NMSU's football team is coming off a winning season; that's a rarity in itself. But the excitement about Aggie football is overflowing like the freshman dorms.

The team's first football game is Saturday. It's Hispanic Heritage Day and the game will be broadcast nationally on ESPN. Do you know how long it's been since ESPN came to Las Cruces to cover a game on its mothership channel? Seventeen years. The same time lag as cicadas.

That national coverage speaks to the Aggies' success last year, when they turned a 1-5 start into a 7-6 finish with a bowl victory. It speaks to coach Jerry Kill, who formerly coached at the University

of Minnesota, and has helped his young players believe in themselves. If you've lived in Las Cruces the past year and a half, and you haven't run into Coach Kill, then you need to get out more.

Kill has been everywhere, immersing himself into the Las Cruces community like green chile.

The 2023 edition of NMSU football, Season Two for Kill, starts 5 p.m. Saturday against UMass at Aggie Memorial, under the cameras of ESPN and the hopeful gaze of a stadium full of fans.

The team is in a new league this year, Conference-USA, which includes some interesting midweek games in October.

If you're a sports fan, you may also find a good time watching Aggie soccer. Last year, these young women won their first ever conference title, as champions of the Western Athletic Conference. They host Cal State-Fullerton 1 p.m. Sunday at the NM State Soc-

cer Complex.

Don't forget Aggie volleyball. This historically good program hosts the NM State Invitational Sept. 1-3 at the Pan Am Center.

There's a new provost on campus, Alan Shoho, who has brought great energy to his work – maybe it's the spirit of aloha from his native Hawaii. Shoho has been engaging with students the way Kill has engaged with Las Cruces.

Proprietors of businesses around campus have had a bit of a spring in their steps the past week or so. On recent visits to St. Albert the Great Church, the campus bookstore, Milagro Coffee y Espresso, Toucan Market, Chilito's and Lorenzo's I've seen noticeably more people and happier staff. More students on campus translates to good news all around for Las Cruces.

Unless, that is, you're trying to drive quickly along University Avenue.

Shrinking labor unions flex their muscles

Most of our national holidays are a celebration of people and events that seem far removed. Labor Day is for us; the American worker. Our summers are bookended by three-day weekends. Memorial Day demands that we somberly remember those who died in war. Labor Day makes no demands.

But we should be aware of its history. Along with celebrating workers, the holiday also recognizes the contributions made by labor unions. President Grover Cleveland made it a national holiday in 1894, just as a violent and costly strike by the American Railway Union was taking place against the Pullman company.

This year, UPS and the Teamsters Union reached agreement on a deal to avert a strike that would have been the costliest ever to our economy, according to a report by

the Anderson Economic Group. A 10-day strike would have taken more than \$7 billion from our economy, with consumers absorbing \$4.6 billion of that.

But, as anyone who watches TV or goes to movies knows, not all strikes have been averted. The writer's guild has been on strike since May, and the actors joined them in August, bringing a halt to new production of TV shows and movies.

They aren't the only ones walking the picket line. More than 200 strikes have been called this year, involving more than 320,000 workers, according to the Cornell ILR School Labor Action Tracker. That's a huge increase from the 27,000 workers estimated to have been on strike during the same period last year.

Clearly, labor unions are flexing their muscles. But every year, a smaller percentage of workers belong to a union. That's especially true for those in the private sector.

Membership is down from 10.3 percent in 2021 to 10.1 percent last year, making it the lowest on record, according to the Bureau of Labor Sta-

tistics. The percentage of union workers has nearly been cut in half since 1983, when 20.1 percent were represented. And it's been dropping faster than that in the private sector.

Government employees now make up one third of all union members. Law enforcement officers, firefighters, teachers and library employees have the highest percentages of union workers.

Those workers earn, on average, 15 percent more than workers not in a union.

Without a union, workers have only the government to protect them. In New Mexico, that means a minimum wage of at least \$12 an hour. Fifty miles to the east in Texas, the minimum wage is still at \$7.25, where it's been since 2009. In Iowa, a new law allows 14-year-olds to work in slaughterhouses.

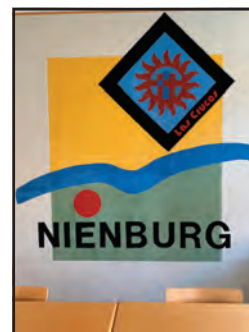

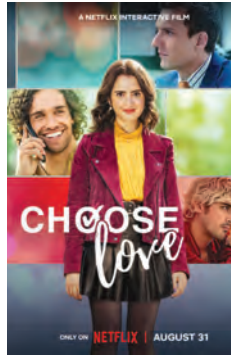
“The Great Seduction” (Aug. 30, Movie Premiere)

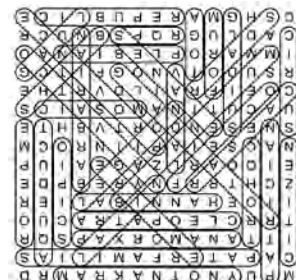

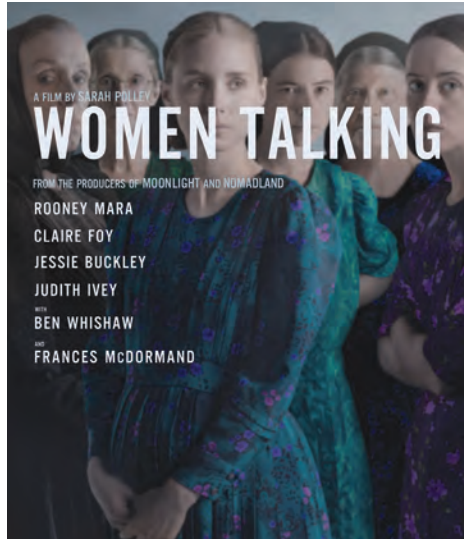

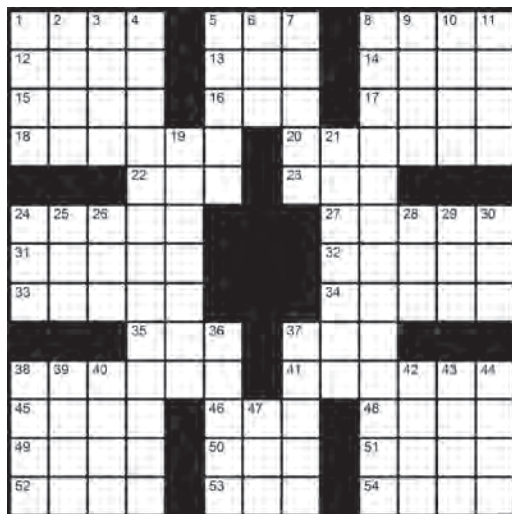

"THE FLASH"

Just after the end of a long-running series about the DC Comics character (the final season of which also becomes available on home video this week), the superhero also informed this feature film, sort of a "DC's Greatest Hits" that involves many other famous figures from that label's universe as well. Barry Allen (played here by Ezra Miller) uses his super-speed to alter history's

timeline, guaranteeing a much different future unless he can rely on one particular fellow hero ... Batman, who's played again by Michael Keaton in a startling and ultimately enjoyable return. Sasha Calle portrays Supergirl, with Michael Shannon appearing again as the sinister General Zod; Ron Livingston and Kiersey Clemons also appear, and several other performers reprise their earlier DC-movie roles. Franchise fans should be delighted to see the picture dip into past TV-series incarnations of certain characters, too. ★★★ (PG-13: AS, P, V) (Also on Blu-ray, 4K Ultra HD, Digital and On Demand)

"INFINITY POOL"

While vacationing at a resort, a writer and his wife (played by Alexander Skarsgard and Cleopatra Coleman) get into massive trouble after their involvement in an accident that results in a fatality in this drama's 4K Ultra HD premiere. The couple

later learns a very unique aspect of the site ... one that enables the guilty party to be cloned, with the duplicate punished in their place. And for the writer, that means death under his specific circumstances. Needless to say, a strong sci-fi element is at work here, with the story's plight for the central char-

acter devolving farther as others encourage him to keep taking advantage of the situation by committing more crimes that he supposedly will never have to pay a price for himself. Mia Goth and Thinas Kretschmann also star for writer-director Brandon Cronenberg, who made the picture in Croatia and Hungary. ★★★ (R: AS, N, P, V)

"MONK: SEASON ONE"

Long a noted supporting player previously (including a lengthy run on television's "Wings"), Tony Shalhoub became a star in his own right by bringing a unique and charismatic touch to this detective series, coming to Blu-ray for the first time. Adrian Monk is a former San Francisco police officer dealing with obsessive compulsive disorder while working as a private eye, with a number of phobias coming to the surface as he tackles various cases ... and continues to probe a very personal one, the murder of his reporter wife. His nurse Sharona (Bitty Schram) becomes his de facto partner in sleuthing, with the police department's homicide chief (Ted Levine, "The Silence of the Lambs") another ally for him, if often reluctantly. Shalhoub earned his first of three Primetime Emmy Awards for this year of the show, which ultimately ran for eight seasons. Peacock reportedly is planning a movie sequel to the series. ★★★ (Not rated: AS, P, V)

"THREE DAYS OF THE CONDOR"

One of the great movie thrillers of the '70s gets 4K Ultra HD treatment, with Robert Redford as a book analyst at a New York office that's a front for the CIA. After

all of his co-workers are killed in an office massacre, he goes on the run, not knowing who he can trust – even his main boss (Cliff Robertson) – while trying to determine why the murders were committed. Desperate for a place to hide out for a while, he takes a stranger (Faye Dunaway) hostage and eventually wins her over to his side. Max von Sydow is terrific as a suave assassin who has more than a bit to do with the mounting number of bodies; John Houseman also is in the cast of director Sydney Pollack's expertly mounted 1975 melodrama. ★★★★★ (R: AS, P, V)

"BLUE BLOODS: THE THIRTEENTH SEASON"

A couple of particularly notable guest appearances are included in this latest round of the CBS police-family drama. Jennifer Esposito returns in the role she originated early in the series, as Danny's (Donnie Wahlberg) former partner, Jackie Curatola, who's on the trail of a copycat killer; and Treat Williams was seen in his final episode of the series as Frank's (Tom Selleck) ex-partner. Other stories involve Erin's (Bridget Moynahan) consideration of becoming district attorney, and the very topical subject of large numbers of immigrants coming to New York. Cast regulars also continue to include Will Estes, Len Cariou, Marisa Ramirez, Vanessa Ray, Gregory Jbara, Steve Schirripa and Abigail Hawk. ★★★ (Not rated: AS, P, V)

Checking In with TERRY CREWS

Terry Crews hasn't always been the host of "America's Got Talent," but some fans of the contest might be hard-pressed to remember that.

The NFL veteran had built a career as a comedic actor when he was summoned to start presiding over the NBC competition in 2019, succeeding Tyra Banks (and her forerunners Nick Cannon, Jerry Springer and Regis Philbin), and he's continuing that job in the contest's 18th season on Tuesdays. Crews actually had hosted the spinoff "America's Got Talent: The Champions" first, setting him up well to transfer to the mothership.

He also had a warmup of sorts by hosting the syndicated daytime version of "Who Wants to Be a Millionaire" for one season (2014-15), since that helped him hone his skills in dealing with contestants and being his own personality. That was a big personality to begin with, which Crews had established by starting an acting career after his time in pro football. Performing on the series "Battle Dome" convinced him to continue that path, and he built his comedy cred in movies including "Friday After Next," "White Chicks" and the 2005 remake of the football-themed "The Longest Yard."

Television had more in store for Crews, his next series stop being "Everybody Hates Chris," on which he played the family patriarch. He was cast as another family man on "Are We There Yet?," then came his run as Sgt. (and later Lt.) Terry Jeffords on the critically acclaimed police satire "Brooklyn Nine-Nine." He also starred in the reality show, "The Family Crews."

Tom is a young man who has already experienced a lifetime of challenges.

Living with autism and severe ADHD, he lived with his father in and out of shelters throughout his whole life. He became

homeless and on his own in September 2022 when he had a psychiatric episode that landed him in the hospital, and after his release he was on the streets for several months before coming to Camp Hope. The best thing about the camp for Tom is that he feels safe, no one is going to steal his things or hurt him, and no one judges him.

Feeling that people look down on him because he is homeless makes him sad and frustrated. He has been looking for jobs for which he is well qualified, but when employers see his mailing address is Camp Hope, they don't select him for the jobs. He would have liked to join the military, but the medica-

tions he takes for his mental health disqualify him from serving. Despite this, Tom continues to look for work and works with the Mesilla Valley Community of Hope case managers to apply for disability, which he acknowledges is a very complicated process and difficult to manage without their help.

Tom hopes for a better future and may look into attending the community college to upgrade his qualifications. Helping Tom and others at Camp Hope can be done at tentstorents.org.

tibles like sawdust and newspaper. The lid is placed on the can and the resulting carbon from the combustibles affects the glaze and gives beautiful results.

George, who has been a full-time artist for 40 years, makes all the pottery on his potters wheel and Wanda does the glazing and handles the business end of their

work.

George was an art instructor at Cisco College in Cisco, Texas; a teaching assistant at the Instituto Allende in San Miguel de Allende, Mexico; an art teacher with the Petersburg Independent School Dis-

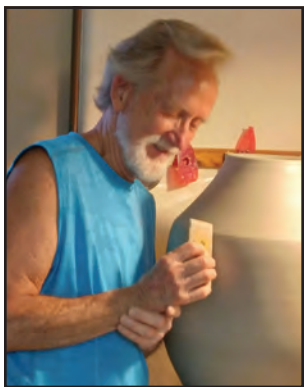

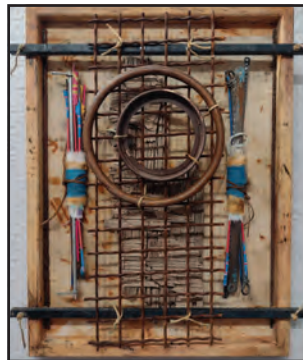

“It’s part lifetime perspective and it’s part garage sale – if your garage is full of your original art and not lawn mowers,” Diven said.

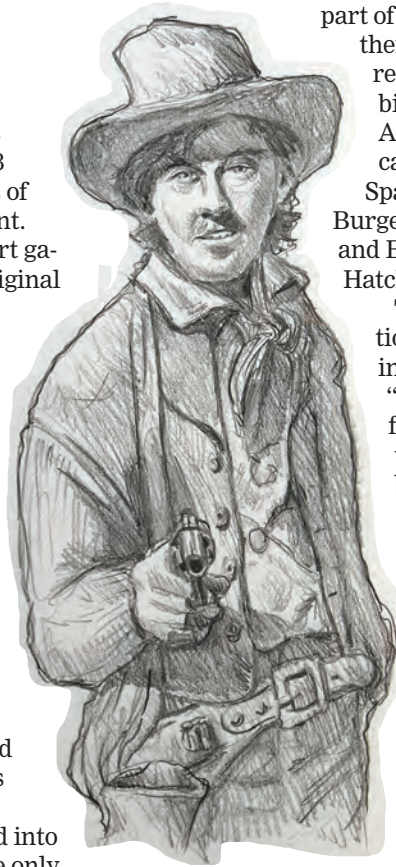

Diven’s pieces to be auctioned include paintings, drawings, sculptures, prints and “notable items from my history,” he said.

Those items include a handmade “Robert the Rusty” suit of armor and an English long bow custom made for Robert the Ratcatcher, the character Diven created for and performed in many Doña Ana Arts Council Renaissance Arts Faires over the years. The bow, which has little rats etched into it, was made by a Missouri artist and is the only piece in the auction Diven did not create.

Also included are one-of-a-kind pieces Diven made for Doña Ana Lyric opera and local theatre productions, including the painting he did for Las Cruces Community Theatre’s 2000 production of “Harvey.”

MMC technology adds new element to breast exams

Memorial Medical Center has added a new technology to improve the detection of breast cancer and provide advanced diagnostic technology for women with possible abnormal or inconclusive mammogram findings.

This new imaging service is designed specifically for women with dense breasts called ABUS (automated breast ultrasound). Memorial is the only facility in Southern New Mexico offering this advanced screening option. The technology at Memorial's Women's Imaging Center is a non-invasive ultrasound examination, which is supplementary to a mammography exam for asymptomatic women with dense breast tissue.

"Forty percent of women have dense breasts, which can mask the appearance of tumors and limit the performance of mammography," said Rob Shoots, MD, Radiologist at Memorial Medical Center. "This cutting-edge equipment has demonstrated a 35.7 percent improvement in cancer detection in these women, and we are very excited to offer this new technology to our community."

Unlike traditional mammography, ABUS technology is not affected by breast density, and, as a secondary screening examination, it can see through dense breast tissue and has been shown to demonstrate a significant improvement in cancer detection. ABUS does not use radiation and features a 15-minute exam as patients

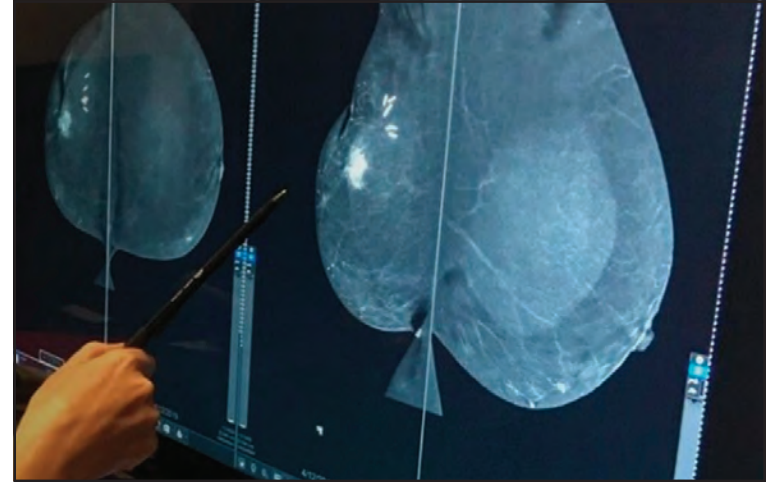
lay on their back and the scanner takes images of all breast tissue.

With ABUS, breast tissue appears white, and cancer appears black on the ultrasound image, which can improve cancer detection in dense tissue.

"This is significant for women who may not even realize they have dense breast tissue and might have had a difficult time finding cancer," Shoots said. "We believe ABUS will become an integral part of our practice for the detection of breast cancer."

The addition of the GE Invenia ABUS 2.0 system as an adjunct to mammography is expected to increase early cancer detection in women with dense breast tissue.

New patients are now being

copay and deductible.

In addition to the introduction of the ABUS, the installation of a second 3D mammography

machine and available weekend hours for mammograms, Memorial now has a novel contrast technique that quickly highlights any significant areas of concern.

GE Healthcare's SenoBright HD contrast-enhanced spectral mammography and Serena Bright contrast-guided biopsy

work in tandem with the Senographe Pristina mammography system, which radiologists use to image the breast. A practitioner will first use a contrast medium to highlight the area of concern. During this exam, called contrast-enhanced spectral mammography (CESM), doctors inject an iodine-based agent into the breast so X-rays can illuminate vascularity and show clinicians where a potential tumor might lie.

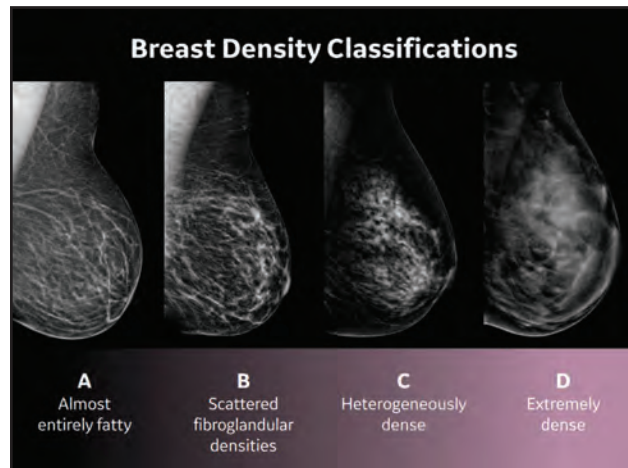
If patients need further examination of a suspicious finding following their CESM exams, they now can get this procedure done in the same or familiar setting with familiar staff and get scheduled quickly with Serena Bright. dollar investment for equipment, installation, and training at the Women's Imaging Center in Las Cruces.

The American Cancer Society recommends women receive yearly mammograms beginning at the age of 40. If they have been informed that they have dense breast tissue, they should talk to their doctor about their

specific risk and consider additional screening tests that might be appropriate.

NMSU researchers discuss threats to public health

The Covid-19 pandemic brought significant societal changes across social, economic, cultural and political landscapes. But researchers from New Mexico State University's College of Health, Education and Social Transformation believe public health may have suffered the worst effects of the global crisis. Now, they're calling on health practitioners and policymakers to address emerging health threats with a renewed focus. These experts shared their thoughts on the biggest public health dangers facing humanity.

Food insecurity from climate change

More than 10 percent of all Americans are food insecure, and almost a billion people worldwide struggle with food insecurity. As the world's population continues to grow, so does the need to accelerate and increase food production, said Elizabeth England-Kennedy, an assistant professor of public health at NMSU.

"The key reason is climate change. Climate change affects production by causing extreme changes in weather systems, including drought, flooding, life-threatening heat, hailstorms and pollinator death," England-Kennedy said. "Recent changes in weather and new threats to our environment, such as the 2023 El Niño pattern, wars and conflict, rising temperatures, refugees and displacement, will intensify these conditions, increasing individual and simultaneous crop failures and food shortages."

The energy sector is a major driver of climate change, followed by agriculture/meat production, and both affect food

production and distribution capacity, England-Kennedy said. Solutions include international collaborations, enhancing research and development for agricultural technology, pollution reduction, curtailing food waste and maldistribution, and a managed transition to clean energy, she said.

She added that collaborations between producers, researchers and policymakers may help increase production and distribution options, while enhanced weather modeling may help producers better adapt to rapidly changing conditions.

"New drought-resistant plant varieties, more efficient irrigation, better use of land and resources, and facilities and infrastructure updates are the need of the hour," she said. "Creating a sustainable food system in response to climate change requires solutions at local and global levels. Changes must begin now."

Health care workforce shortages

In the United States, health care professions enjoy some of the highest salaries and rapid

growth in employment projections. Yet, there is a chronic shortage of health care professionals in most key positions, such as nurses, pharmacists and physical therapists, said Teresa Keller, a professor of nursing at NMSU.

These shortages existed even before the Covid-19 pandemic, Keller said, and are projected to grow over the next decade, making access to health care services more difficult for all in an aging nation.

"The Covid-19 pandemic changed the landscape of health

care workforce with problems ranging from mental distress to death of health care workers," she said.

Keller said recent estimates suggest that more than 100,000 health care workers worldwide died as a result of Covid-19, including almost 4,000 from the U.S. Additionally, a recent survey from the National Council of State Boards of Nursing suggests about 100,000 nurses nationwide left the workplace due to stresses caused by the pandemic.

"The economic and social drivers of these shortages are complex and addressing these shortages will require cooperation and thoughtful action in the health services sector," Keller said.

To address these shortages, Keller suggests expanding and funding professional and continuing education, streamlining licensing requirements, loan repayment and other non-cash incentives, revising immigration policies for skilled foreign health care professionals, and developing strategies to build better workplaces where individuals can flourish.

Health information and misinformation

Health misinformation is a "claim of fact" about health-related phenomena that is false or misleading. Public reactions to the Covid-19 pandemic showed the very stark consequences of health misinformation, said Marshall Taylor, the interim associate dean for research in the College of HEST at NMSU.

"People who are susceptible to misinformation tend to be more distrustful of science and the government, which can lead people to be more resistant to public health measures," Taylor said. "Health misinformation spreads for many reasons, and they are amplified by social media. For example, there is an entire fake news genre for monetizing online disinformation — intentional misinformation — and social media provides political actors with an opportunity to bypass news media's vetting processes to spread unsubstantiated claims."

Taylor said some individuals are more likely to believe and spread misinformation when the information aligns with their other deeply held beliefs (what researchers call "confirmation bias") and when they consume media in echo chambers that elevate belief-consistent news sources and remove opportunities for exposure to disconfirming information. Further, health misinformation may spread on social media faster than accurate information because false information is more likely to be seen as novel and attention-grabbing, he said.

In 2021, the U.S. surgeon general issued an advisory to combat health misinformation. The report, Taylor said, emphasizes that this will be a "whole-of-society effort" that involves, among many other actions, promoting information literacy and crafting news headlines that avoid trying to provoke emotional reactions from readers.

Poor mental health

NMSU studies conducted by Jagdish Khubchandani, a professor of public health, during the pandemic found that anxiety and depression rates nearly doubled, higher stress resulted in unhealthy lifestyles and excess internet/media consumption led to psychological distress.

Before the pandemic, he said, nearly one in five people had a diagnosable mental health condition, including substance-use disorders. Now, the burden has substantially increased, but less than 10% government health budgets worldwide go toward mental health care.

"Over recent years, mental health problems have grown at a rate that far outpaces available mental health care services and resources," he said. "The U.S. will spend nearly \$300 billion this year on mental health care, and yet, more than half of those who need services will not get timely or adequate care," he said.

He warned poor mental health may cause greater disability, reduced quality of life, incarceration, homelessness, overdose deaths and a higher number of suicides. Untreated mental illness in the U.S. may cost up to \$300 billion every year in related productivity losses, he added.

"I call it a trillion-dollar problem in the U.S., given what we spend on treatment and what we lose due to untreated mental illnesses," he said.

Khubchandani said policymakers should consider mental health care as an issue of social and economic development. He calls for higher government funding, reducing stigma around mental illnesses, and using more technological tools to improve health care.

"We all have a role to play, as well, by increasing awareness, creating a culture of mental health promotion, and watching out for those at risk or struggling," he said.

Train your brain for a better golf performance

There is no such thing as a “mental game.” That is, unless you play golf only in your head. But that’s no fun, unless you’re a prisoner of war. The whole idea of a “mental game” came from some pro who happened to tell a guy his golf problems were all in his head. And the golf pro took it from Ralph Cramden (Jackie Gleason in the “Honeymooners”) calling Norton a “mental case.”

Regardless of your actual handicap you’re really a bundle of excesses and deficits, strengths and weaknesses when it comes to the role your brain plays in your golf game. The most common brain failings and excesses I have noticed over the years are these: over-thinking, which is self-sabotaging;

roller coaster emotions with inappropriate effect, i.e. tantrums; unreasonable worrying, nervous anxiety and tenseness; refusal to take personal responsibility for how one plays; excessive self-conscious thoughts with fear of social evaluation; being too impatient and impulsive, often leading to poor decision making. Other brain-related difficulties include undisciplined shot preparation with no set routine; lack of imagination, especially with trouble shots; frequent lapses in attention and concentration; a pervasive self-defeating negative attitude; a paucity of confidence; slowness, or refusal, to learn new things. Don’t get me wrong, as

I play with a lot of golfers who have wonderful inner strengths, I admire high golf intelligence, and traits such as perseverance, tenaciousness, playfulness, emotional resilience, a “never quit” attitude and good social graces.

Of course, the simple formula to improve your game is to play to your strengths while you play catch-up with your weak spots. But before you do anything else, get some feedback on how well or poorly you manage yourself with a golf club in your hands. Pick your resources carefully. Ask some questions of your trusted playing companions. Play a few rounds

on the course with your teacher and get his or her opinion of where you need the most work. Business consultants call this “360” feedback. It can be unnerving but eye-opening.

So, let’s consider how you can actually train your brain for playing better golf. First, there is the matter of thinking on the golf course. We should be aware of over-thinking or under-thinking or remaining brain-dead. When you’re standing over a shot to the green at, say, 120 yards, there are visual cues, sensual cues (wind, temperature, incline, etc.), aiming cues and no-miss cues. These can be quickly assimilated by your brain in the form of rapid cognition. Some golfers are prone to “information aversion” where

they are too self-absorbed, or too hurried, or too lazy to intelligently figure out what they have to do. But then there is the matter of thinking about swinging the club with your pre-shot routine, swing key and self-talk. Limit that to 10 seconds. Secondly, practice those same variables and processes on the range when you hit practice shots. Don’t just rake balls over and machine-gun out to random targets in front of you.

Practice being calm. On the golf course, you need to be your own caddie. If you had an actual caddie when you play, you would get information on the shot quickly, and you would also get the calming effect of emotional support. Also, consider jotting down a few brief reminders about

how to be fully engaged in the process of golfing your ball.

One of my mantras, as my playing companions well know, is “don’t give up on a hole.” Just because you hit a bad shot, and it ends up in an awkward predicament, it doesn’t mean the hole can’t be salvaged. Simply try your best and see what happens. And for the bad shot, forget the mistake, but remember the lesson. Complaining and whining are not conducive to good thinking.

As former Notre Dame coach Lou Holtz once said, “The man who complains about the way the ball bounces is likely to be the one who dropped it.”
