County FD continues expansion

The Doña Ana County Fire Department (DACFD) is on pace to respond to about 11,000 calls county-wide in 2023, County Fire Chief Shannon Cherry told the Doña Ana County Commission in a September meeting.

Cherry said the department has 19 fire stations and will have 40 paid firefighters by next April. Including the DACFD chief, deputy chiefs, battalion chiefs, captains, lieuten-

ants and other officers, the department will have 60 career firefighters, Cherry said, compared to 16 in 2019. The department also has three 215 total volunteers, including officers, firefighters, EMTs and support staff.

In 2021, the department received 9,178 calls for service in 2021 and 10,802 in 2022, Cherry said. It expects to receive 10,950 calls in 2023, the chief said, about 90 percent of which will be medical in nature.

So far in 2023, DACFD

has responded to 98 structure fires, averaging more than eight firefighters at each fire, along with 42 vehicle fires, 126 wild-land/brush or field fires, 44 rubbish/trash fires and seven other outdoor fires.

Cherry said there are 73 new fire hydrant systems at commercial properties in the county since 2019. The county has 18 fire

water tender vehicles that can carry 38,000 gallons water and 37 fire engines that can carry 37,000 gallons.

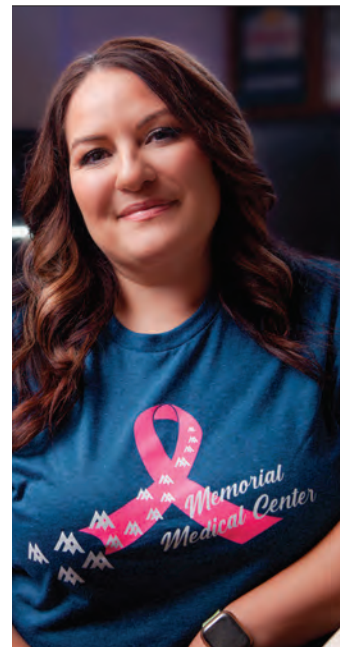

The Every Body Rides with Grace (EBRWG) program of Velo Cruces has received a Quality of Life Grant from the New Mexico Governor's Commission on Disability for fiscal year 2024, Andrea Holguin of EBRWG said in a news release.

"The grant enables EBRWG to continue gifting adaptive cycles to qualified residents of Doña Ana County," Holguin said.

EBRWG "aims to increase the quality of life for people with disabilities through the distribution of

adaptive cycles," the news release said. "Adaptive cycles are custom selected for recipients to accommo-

date their needs. Barriers to obtaining an adaptive bike include prohibitive cost, lack of local availability and lack of support and guidance as to which bike or accessory is best suited for a rider's needs."

With the grant, EBRWG will distribute at least five adaptive cycles to disabled residents in the county, Holguin said.

State funds Doña Ana youth outdoor projects

Five Doña Ana County outdoor youth programs will receive a total of \$160,000 from the New Mexico Economic Development Department (NMEDD) Outdoor Equity Fund (OEF).

For this first round of FY24 OEF awards, 54 organizations received more than \$1.74 million, with grants averaging more than \$32,000 each, NMEDD said in a news release.

To support the program and usher in the next generation of outdoor industry leaders, the state invested \$3 million in American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) money," NMEDD said. Additional funding for the Outdoor Equity Fund comes from annual state appropriations, pri-

vate donations, and the Land of Enchantment Legacy Fund, the state's first ever dedicated funding stream for land and water conservation and outdoor recreation.

"The Outdoor Equity Fund's intent from the start was to invest in our New Mexican youth and our communities," State Rep. Angelica Rubio of Las Cruces said. "The investments made to grantees since 2019, are not only growing and nurturing opportunities for young people to experience our great outdoor spaces, but they hold up our values of raising future generations of stewardship of New Mexico's water, air, and lands."

New Mexico's Outdoor Equity Fund encourages projects that get youth out and active.

• **Centennial High School, Student Success Program/Outdoors Club** (also known as the Centennial Hawks Student Success Program), \$10,000, to offer students the opportunity to learn through research, community partnerships and civic engagement about southern New

Mexico's history of the land, the people, and local culture and traditions. Students simultaneously learn about their own culture and identities, and about social awareness, issues, and creating change.

• **Doña Ana Village Association**, \$40,000, to continue its outdoor youth

engagement programs by engaging youth from colonia communities along the lower Rio Grande Valley and the surrounding area about the importance of the Camino Real Tierra Adentro through engaging outdoor activities that incorporate the villages and the trail. This will include engaging youth in the planning of the outdoor space south of the Doña Ana Village in conjunction with the Rivers Trails Conservation Assistance Grant.

• **Families & Youth Inc.**, \$40,000, to promote outdoor equity for New Mexico youth by managing and coordinating the Outdoor Legacy Project. The program provides resources and support to accomplish five objectives: Engage, Educate, Equip,

Encourage, Empower.

• **Friends of the Organ Mountains-Desert Peaks**, \$40,000, for its Moving Montañas program, which was established to specifically engage and connect youth with the monument. The program engages the broader community with conservation and lowers barriers by providing opportunities to local community youth to access public lands and recreate outside.

• **Southern New Mexico Mountain Biking**, \$30,000, to help reach its goal of creating a comprehensive youth mountain-biking program that reaches kids of all ages and demographics, helping to overcome traditional barriers to the sport due to gender, ethnic background, and economic status.

Is income support program sustainable?

I think we can cut to the chase regarding the city’s survey of those participating in its guaranteed basic income pilot program.

In 18 months, the responses will show that families who were given \$500 a month by the government benefited in all kinds of positive ways, and nearby businesses also got a boost. Results are already in from similar surveys in different communities, and show pretty conclusively people like free money.

The city has taken \$2 million of the \$24 million it received from the federal government under the American Rescue Plan Act and invested it in an 18-month pilot program in which people will be given \$500 a month to spend as they choose; 150 people will be chosen at random. To qualify, families must earn no more than 80 percent of the area median income, about \$46,500 a

year for a family of three.

Throughout the 18 months, they will document the ways their family has benefited from the additional income. Armed with all those feel-good testimonials, supporters will then look to expand the program to all qualify families.

Predictably, and sadly, the primary opposition to the program has come from those outraged that poor people don’t have restrictions on how they spend their money. They’re poor, so of course they’ll spend it on cigarettes, drugs and liquor.

Some will, but addictions aren’t limited to the lower class. The bigger issue is cost and sustainability.

Warning: I’m about to do math, and that’s always a

fraught proposition. So consider what follows as a ballpark estimate at best.

According to the latest census, the population of Las Cruces is 113,888. Setting the eligibility level at 80 percent of the median income means almost half of the families could qualify for the \$500 a month. That would mean about 11,400 families collecting \$6,000

a year for a total annual cost of just over \$68 million.

The city has two tax sources, gross receipts tax and property tax. The GRT is already set at the highest level allowed by the state.

The notion of free money goes against everything I was taught as a child about the importance of work and the value of a dollar. But the world has changed since

then.

According to the Congressional Budget Office, those in the top 1 percent now earn 84 times as much as those in the bottom 20 percent. That’s by design. The top marginal tax rate in 1979 was 70 percent. Today it’s 37 percent. There needs to be a readjustment.

So, OK, I’m open to the concept of a guaranteed basic income. Now, show me how we’re going to pay for it.

OMDP monument status brings multiple benefits

In our arid, sun-kissed region of Southern New Mexico, a remarkable tale of growth, resilience, and prosperity has been unfolding over the past decade. At the heart of this growth is the Organ Mountains-Desert Peaks National Monument (OMDPNM), a testament to how protected lands can fuel economic vitality. Conservation and increased access to public lands is a critical part of economic development in Las Cruces. Nearly a decade after its designation, OMDPNM is proving to be a success story that we can continue to build on into the future.

A new economic study released recently highlights the extraordinary impact these protected lands have had on our local economy, shattering previous estimates and proving that conservation and economic growth are not mutually exclusive. Aptly titled “A Decade of Opportunity: How the Designation of Organ Mountains-Desert Peaks National Monument is Boosting Southern New Mexico’s Economy,” reveals how the monument has breathed new life into the area. In addition to sparking a surge in job opportunities, the study also reveals increased tax revenue and a significant upswing in visitation since President Obama designated the monument in 2014.

The change in designation status into a national monument has not only elevated the region’s profile

but also ignited a spending spree that delivered more than \$234 million to our region. The monument helped elevate Las Cruces’ profile by joining the ranks of existing protected public lands like White Sands National Park and Prehistoric Trackways National Monument. Together, they offer visitors the chance to explore two monuments and a recently re-named National Park in one visit. Over the past decade, visitation to the monument has nearly tripled, infusing the local economy with spending that support jobs and a wide array of businesses, from gas stations to restaurants, motels, and retail establishments.

In 2022 alone, spending by out-of-town visitors resulted in \$35 million of positive economic impact, while also supporting 305 jobs. This translated into substantial growth for county coffers, generating \$1.9 million in tax revenue in 2022 and contributing nearly \$13 million in taxes over the past decade. This is money and resources our county desperately needs.

The Bureau of Land Management, responsible for the monument’s stewardship, significantly increased its operations and staffing budget too, intensifying protection, research, and recreational activities, benefiting not just visitors, but locals as well. The study shows the designation of the monument has encouraged more of

us to explore its wonders, enhancing our quality of life and our own health. The monument is also an asset, as retirees and even potential job seekers evaluate quality of life and access to the outdoors as part of their own physical and emotional well-being.

Let us not forget strong communities and prosperity can be found where nature thrives and where local residents, elected officials and businesses are united in purpose. Organ

Mountains-Desert Peaks National Monument stands as a testament to this truth, promising a brighter and more sustainable future for everyone.

What’s happening in Southern New Mexico is a model for the nation – protected public lands benefit local economies through increased jobs, visitor spending and tax revenues while also enhancing the quality of life for those who call these areas home.

Let’s spend the next decade continuing to build on the momentum we have seen over the past 10 years by using the Organ Mountains Desert Peaks National Monument as a tool to attract new businesses and resources that will help sustain a strong and vibrant local economy for us and future generations.

Cabeza de Baca to be inducted into National Ag Hall of Fame

Fabiola Cabeza de Baca, the first Spanish-speaking agent to serve in New Mexico State University’s Cooperative Extension Service who became one of the state’s foremost educators and cultural authorities of the 20th century, will be inducted into the National Agricultural Center’s Hall of Fame in October.

Cabeza de Baca will join the ranks of other illustrious figures who have made outstanding contributions to American agriculture, including George Washington Carver, Thomas Jefferson, Eli Whitney and another famous New Mexico resident with ties to NMSU, Fabián García, who became the first Hispanic member inducted into the Hall of Fame in 2020. The induction ceremony will take place Oct. 5 at the National Agricultural Center in Bonner Springs, Kansas.

Over a decades-long career, Cabeza de Baca brought life-changing educational opportunities to rural and pueblo communities across New Mexico. She broke barriers as a published author, becoming a trusted chronicler of the state’s heritage and cuisines through a trove of beloved books, stories and recipes. She followed a calling for teaching and shared her expertise widely, touching the lives of many over a life that began when New Mexico was still a territory.

“The results of Fabiola’s focus on accessible

agriculture education resonate still today,” New Mexico Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham said. “You can see her work and forethought when we talk about food safety and being a champion for the diverse communities in New Mexico by demonstrating the cultural relevance and versatility of different agricultural practices. It is wonderful to see Fabiola’s legacy cemented by this induction into the National Agriculture Hall of Fame.”

Outreach, education

New Mexico Agriculture Secretary Jeff Witte nominated Cabeza de Baca for the distinction.

“Over decades as an Extension agent, Fabiola Cabeza de Baca created an educational, cultural and agricultural legacy in New Mexico and beyond,” Witte said. “The work she trailblazed in agricultural outreach and education continues to shape New Mexico’s agriculture industry today. It’s an honor to have nominated her as an inductee.”

Born in 1894, Cabeza de Baca grew up on a family

ranch in La Liendre, New Mexico, near Las Vegas in San Miguel County. She completed her early education at the Loretto Academy and later attended New Mexico Normal School, where she obtained a teaching certificate.

In 1916, she found work teaching in a one-room school in Guadalupe County. Since many children in her class spoke only Spanish, she developed her own bilingual teaching material and encouraged her students to teach one another their traditional songs, stories and customs. She taught at the school for 11 years, during which time she also completed a bachelor’s degree in education at New Mexico Highlands University.

By 1927, she enrolled at New Mexico College of Agriculture and Mechanical Arts – now NMSU – to pursue a second bachelor’s degree in home economics. While attending NMSU, she taught Spanish classes. One of her students was W.L.

Ballot includes DACC bond, rural tax questions

In addition to candidates for municipal offices, school boards and conservation districts on the Nov. 7 local election ballot, voters will consider a Doña Ana Community College (DACC) bond question. And voters who live in the Gadsden and Hatch school districts will consider property tax questions.

On the ballot

Here are the offices on the Nov. 7 ballot. Only voters in specific jurisdictions, including districts, vote in those elections. For example, only voters who live in Las Cruces will vote in City of Las Cruces races, and only those voters who live in specific city council districts will vote in those races. All positions are for four-year terms. Candidate filing date was Aug. 29; write-in candidate filing date was Sept. 5.

- City of Anthony: Two trustees at large (five can-

didates)

- City of Las Cruces (ranked choice voting): Mayor (seven candidates); councilors in district 1 (five candidates), 2 (two candidates) and 4 (four candidates); municipal judge (one candidate)

- City of Sunland Park: Mayor (one candidate); councilors in district 4 (two candidates), 5 (two candidates) and 6 (one candidate)

- Town of Mesilla: Mayor (one candidate); two trustees (four candidates)

- Village of Hatch: Two trustees at large (three candidates); municipal judge (one candidate)

- Gadsden Independent School District Board of Education members in district 1 (two candidates), 3 (one candidate) and 4 (two candidates)

- Hatch Valley Public Schools Board of Education members positions 2, 3 and 5 at large (six candidates)

Ballot questions

- DACC is asking for voter approval of \$16 million in general obligation bonds “for the purpose of erecting, furnishing, constructing, purchasing, remodeling and equipping buildings and utility facilities, exclusive of stadiums; making other real property improvements; purchasing grounds; and purchasing and installing computer hardware and software.”
- The Gadsden Independent School District (GISD) is asking voters in that district to approve a two mill property tax (\$2 on each \$1,000 of the next taxable value of property allocated to GISD for school district capital improvements) for 1) building, remodeling, making additions to, equipping and furnishing public school buildings, including teacher housing and pre-kindergarten classroom facilities; 2) purchasing or improving school or pre-kindergarten grounds; 3) maintenance of public school buildings; 4) purchasing activity vehicles for transporting students to extracurricular school activities; 5) purchasing computer software

and hardware for student use in classrooms; and 6) purchasing and installing education technology improvements.

- Hatch Valley Public Schools (HVPS) is asking voters in that district to approve a two-mill property tax for the same purposes in HVPS as outlined in the GISD question above.

Elser, a former director of the Cooperative Extension Service, who approached her about working for the university's outreach arm.

Extension begins

Cabeza de Baca's life took a new direction when she began her career as an Extension agent in 1929. Tasked with reaching Hispanic and Native American women, she worked primarily in Santa Fe and Rio Arriba counties. As the first agent assigned to pueblo communities, she learned to speak Tewa and, possibly, Towa to better communicate with the people of Nambé, Pojoaque, San Ildefonso, Ohkay Owingeh, Santa Clara, Tesuque and

Jemez pueblos.

"Not only was she able to reach Spanish-speaking audiences, but she also reached Indigenous audiences in their own language," said Karim Martinez, an Extension family life and child development specialist at NMSU.

Amid the Great Depression, Cabeza de Baca traveled across her districts to teach rural residents skills in food preservation, gardening, poultry-raising, sewing and home repair. She often encouraged residents living in communities without running water, paved roads, electricity or telephones to mobilize for more public services.

Despite losing a leg in a train collision, Cabeza de Baca continued to bring Extension education to residents across New Mexico. In 1947, she be-

came the district Extension agent-at-large for six counties, covering a sprawling region of rural northern New Mexico from Dulce to Vaughn.

"For nearly a century, Fabiola Cabeza de Baca has been a role model for all Extension agents, not just in New Mexico, but across the country," NMSU interim President Jay Gogue said. "Her steadfast commitment to our land-grant mission was truly remarkable. She spent decades traveling to all corners of the state to deliver knowledge to the people. New Mexico and our university are better because of her efforts."

Aah, the recipes

Cabeza de Baca is per-



haps best known for popularizing New Mexican food. She published her first recipes in the early 1930s and gained attention for writing about fried U-shaped tacos and cooking with chile.

Her first collection of recipes, "Historic Cookery," is widely considered the earliest cookbook about New Mexican food. She published a second book, "Good Life: New Mexico Traditions and Food," in 1949, followed by a memoir, "We Fed Them Cactus," in 1954.

She also wrote extensively about traditions, folklore, herbal remedies, religious rituals and farming practices of In-

digenous, Spanish, Mexican and Anglo families in northern New Mexico. For many years, she penned a regular column in *El Nuevo Mexicano*, a Spanish newspaper in Santa Fe, contributed feature stories to the *Santa Fe New Mexican* and hosted weekly programs on community radio.

In 1950, Cabeza de Baca joined a United Nations mission to Mexico, taking her teaching skills across the southern border. In villages across the state of Michoacán, she set up 18 demonstration centers to teach household skills to women.

Cabeza de Baca continued to work in education and community building throughout her retirement and even trained a generation of Peace Corps volunteers. She died Oct. 14, 1991, in Albuquerque at age 97, leaving

behind a legacy marked by a deep love of New Mexico and a desire to improve the lives of those around her.

"The College of Agricultural, Consumer and Environmental Sciences (ACES) honors Fabiola Cabeza de Baca's legacy of outreach to all New Mexicans. She was a champion of food safety, cross-cultural learning and nutrition. Most of all, she understood that scientific knowledge and traditional knowledge inform one another and are embedded within cultural practices that connect us," ACES Dean Rolando A. Flores Galarza said. "Agriculture works to provide us with safe, nourishing food, and Fabiola's writings remind us how our work connects with the human stories and foodways in our diverse communities."

Former commissioner running for LC mayor

Former Doña Ana County Commissioner Isabella Solis is a candidate for mayor of Las Cruces.

“With a vision for a more prosperous, inclusive, and sustainable future for the city, Solis is committed to a plan for growth,” she said in a candidate announcement, describing herself as “a dedicated community activist.”

Solis was a county commissioner 2016-20. She ran unsuccessfully for mayor in 2018 and for state representative in 2020.

“Many of the Las Cruces voters I’m speaking to know our elected officials are out of touch with the people they’re supposed to represent,” Solis said. “Everyone knows what issues our city needs to prioritize, yet politicians

are doing the minimum.” Among the seven candidates for Las Cruces mayor in the Nov. 7, 2023, election, Solis believes her “ability to provide solutions is what will make her the top choice in the race,” she said.

“We have a lot of candidates hoping to work for the people of Las Cruces, and I think that’s awesome,” Solis said. “Las Cruces deserves to hear from all of the candidates, and to vote for who they believe will best represent them. As a former county commissioner, I have always considered myself a public servant – I will continue to do so if elected as your mayor. I’m going to keep this campaign focused on the issues Las Cruces cares about. I’m sharing my solutions directly with voters.”

The city “can make history this election by

electing the city’s first Latina mayor,” Solis said, adding that her campaign “is grassroots led, relying on Las Cruces residents rather than outside money and the establishment of career politicians.”

“Front and center of Solis’s plans for the city is working across the aisle to pass much needed policy,” her announcement said. Solis said she “strongly believes that the issues Las Cruces residents care about are carelessly made to be partisan issues, when in reality, people from all areas of the political spectrum want issues solved.”

Solis said her policy plans are 1) public safety, 2) infrastructure investments and improvements, 3) the border and immigration, 4) sustaining the environment and 5) affordable housing.

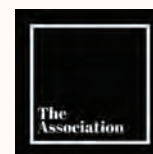

Q: I've enjoyed Rachel Boston in many of her cable movies. Where did she get her start?

A: Seen most recently in "The More Love Grows" on Hallmark Movies & Mysteries, the actress has been starting to play mothers more frequently ... which is appropriate, since she became a first-time mom herself early in 2022. Her first big credit was the 2002-05 NBC series "American Dreams," inspired by the legendary music show "American Bandstand" and featuring Boston as Beth, who became the sister-in-law of "Bandstand" dancer Beth (Brittany Snow). Boston went on to do guest shots on many series including "NCIS," "Crossing Jordan," "Las Vegas," "Grey's Anatomy," "ER" and "Castle." She landed continuing roles on "In Plain Sight" and "Witches of East End," and in 2014, she began what has become her long association with the Hallmark brand, which started with the movie "A Ring by Spring" (still repeated fairly often). The Christmas season has yielded a particular amount of work for Boston, who has worked again for Hallmark in "Ice Sculpture Christmas," "Christmas in Angel Falls," "Check Inn to Christmas," "The Christmas Carousel" and "A Christmas Cookie Catastrophe." "Stop the Wedding," "The Last Bridesmaid" and "Dating the Delaneys" have been among Boston's other Hallmark projects; she also has made films for Lifetime occasionally.



Additionally, Boston has had a recurring role on "SEAL Team" that enabled her to keep working while she was in later stages of her pregnancy, since her character on the series – Hannah Oliver – also was expecting, with high-school friend and Bravo Team member Sonny Quinn (A.J. Buckley) the father of her child.

"PREY"

The "Predator" franchise has yielded a number of movie thrillers, but it backed up in its timeline for this prequel, first shown by Hulu and currently nominated for six Primetime Emmy Awards. It follows the quest of an 18th-century Comanche warrior named Naru (played by Amber Midthunder, of the series "Legion" and "Roswell, New Mexico") to keep her people safe from an enemy who turns out to be an alien predator, of the sort that would torment Arnold Schwarzenegger's character in the original film. Dane DiLiegro plays the villain, who still has the advantage of invisibility even in a much earlier era, and Dakota Beavers and Michelle Thrush also are in the cast. "STEPHEN KING'S THE MIST"

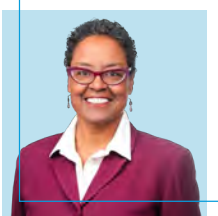

A gouge, dent, crease, or scrape may cause a future safety problem.

The pipeline may not follow a straight course between markers, which provide no information on the depth or number of pipelines in the vicinity. Don't try to guess the pipeline's location or route by the marker's placement. Call New Mexico One Call (NMOC) at 811.

Cómo Identificar Dónde Está Ubicada La Línea De Tubería

Ya que las líneas de tubería se encuentran bajo tierra, a veces se usan marcas para indicar de manera aproximada –no exacta– la localización de la línea. Los marcadores de las líneas pueden ser encontrados en donde la línea de la tubería interseca a una calle, carretera o vía del ferrocarril. Sin embargo, no son confiables para indicar la posición exacta de la línea de la tubería. La tubería puede no seguir un curso derecho entre dos marcas, lo cual no proporciona información de la profundidad o el número de líneas en la vecindad. No trate de adivinar la localización de la línea o ruta por la ubicación del marcador de las líneas de la tubería, llame al Centro de Una Llamada de Nuevo Mexico 811.

If you are a public safety official...

...you know to take whatever steps you deem necessary to safeguard the public in the event of a pipeline emergency.

The following suggestions are offered as a guide:

- Secure the area around the leak to a safe distance. This could include the evacuation of people from homes, businesses, schools, and other locations, as well as the erection of barricades to control access to the emergency site and similar precautions.
- If the pipeline leak is not burning, take steps to prevent ignition. This includes prohibiting smoking, rerouting traffic, and shutting off the electricity.
- If the pipeline leak is burning, try to prevent the spread of fire but do not attempt to extinguish it. Burning petroleum products will not explode. If the fire is extinguished, gas or vapor will collect and could explode when reignited by secondary fires.
- Contact the pipeline company as quickly as possible. Pipeline marker signs show the pipeline company's name, emergency telephone number, and pipeline contents.

'True West' comes to LCCT

One of Las Cruces' most revered directors brings together an outstanding cast and crew to perform a classic of the theatre with Las Cruces Community Theatre's (LCCT) production of "True West," by Sam Shepard, which opens Friday, Oct. 6, and continues for three weekends at LCCT, 313 N. Main St.

"I have always been attracted to Shepard's work," said Mike Wise, who is directing "True West for LCCT. "I have acted in his plays, have stage-managed productions of his works, and have been fortunate to have directed more than a few of his play texts," said Wise, who recently retired as production stage manager for the American Southwest Theatre Company and the New Mexico State University Theatre Department. "I find his scripts to be very muscular and substantial."

The cast includes Matthew Esqueda as Saul, Nick Check as Austin, Benjamin Ramsey as Lee and Claudia Billings as Mom.

"It has been a joy to work with these four talented actors, pouring over the words, taking scenes apart, making discoveries, and re-assembling moments and actions," Wise said.

"Sam Shepard's writing is so slice of life, at least in this show, that it's incredibly easy to fall into this character and just exist in that world, which is SO exciting for me as an actor, because it makes me want to question everything

more and say 'How can I get even more into this?'" Check said. "The audience won't have to jump to any conclusion about time, place or world; it's San Fernando in the '80's with Hollywood around the corner, and that's all the disbelief you have to suspend. So how can I make my character and performance truly unique? How can I elevate something that everyone already knows about, or at least has assumptions of? That's been my sort of Modus operandi with this show!"

"I have had the pleasure of working with Mike Wise in three previous productions," Esqueda said. "I truly enjoy working with Mike because he fine tunes his shows and highlights what others might miss. Working with this group of actors has been a great experience. We are constantly giving each other different line deliveries that can change how we see or deliver our next line and Mike is right there to tell us where we hit the mark. I have found myself being captivated by these actors to where I

can't remember my line because their intensity is overpowering. The show captures these two brothers (played by Check and Ramsey) at a moment in their lives where they become almost envious of each other's lives and begin to switch places," Esqueda said.

"I love the play and have for a long time," Billings said. "I love working with the great cast, all of whom I worked with before my retirement from NMSU. Most of all, I love working with Mike Wise.

We've been friends and colleagues for many years, and we see many things about the play and the theatre in the same way. It's great to be back."

Charley Davis returns as stage manager for "True West." Doug Roby is the set designer, Alecks Rundle the lighting designer, Wise the sound designer, Darin Cabot the fight choreographer, Lennie Brown the props and costume designer and Olive Flores, who is the stagehand.

Performance dates are 7:30 p.m. Friday-Saturday, Oct. 6-7, 13-14 and 20-21; and 2 p.m. Sunday, Oct. 8, 15 and 22.

Prokofiev (1891-1953) wrote “Romeo and Juliet,” a ballet based on Shakespeare’s play, in 1935. It premiered at the Mahen Theatre in Brno, Czech Republic in 1938. Tchaikovsky, also a Russian composer, (1840-93) wrote

“Swan Lake” in 1875-76. It premiered in 1877 at the Bolshoi Theatre in Moscow and has become one of the most popular ballets of all time.

Mendelssohn (1809-1847) composed the overture for Shakespeare’s play “A Midsummer Night’s Dream” in 1826. It was first performed in Stelting,

Poland, in 1827.

Here are the other performances during LCSO’s 2023-24 season:

• **Pops 1 Saturday-Sunday, Oct. 28-29.** The concert will be a celebration of Dia de los Muertos and will include a collaboration with the Paso del Norte Chamber Orchestra from Ciudad Juarez,

Mexico and include the music of de Falla and Marguez.

• **Classics 2 Saturday-Sunday, Dec. 2-3,** featuring George Frederic Handel’s “The Messiah,” which was first performed in Dublin in 1742 and in London in 1743. It has become one of the most popular choral works in history.

• **Pops 2 Saturday-Sunday, Feb. 10-11, 2024,** featuring famous movie music, including the themes from “Star Wars,” “Jurassic Park” and “Star Trek.”

• **Classics 3 Saturday-Sunday, April 13-14, 2024,**

including music inspired by water and sounds from space, including Claude Debussy’s “La Mer” (published in 1905 in Paris) and Czech composer Bedřich Smetana’s “Die Moldau,” which he wrote in 1874 describing the course of the Vitava (river) from two small springs, “through woods and meadows, though landscapes where a farmer’s wedding is celebrated, the round dance of mermaids in the night’s moonshine, on the nearby rocks loom proud castles, palaces and ruins aloft,” Smetana said.

Las Cruces artist honored with Arts Council show on her 90th

Las Cruces artist Jo-an Smith's painting exhibit, "Ninety!...Something Bold and Something New," will be on display in the main gallery at Doña Ana Arts Council (DAAC), 230 S. Main St., DAAC said in a news release.

"When I turned 80, I tried to keep it a secret, but I soon learned that it is a lot more fun to celebrate," Smith said. "This year I embraced 90 and this show is an important part of my year-long celebration. Sharing my art brings me joy!"

Born in Eugene, Oregon, Smith grew up in the Pacific Northwest. Her early adult life was "nomadic" as she, husband, Don, and sons, Greg and Jeff, a military family, moved 20 times in 20 years. Set-

ting in Las Cruces in 1972, Smith finished her MA in art at New Mexico State University and was able to pursue her art, "which had been a passion since childhood," Smith said.

In 1975 Sally and Glenn Cutter invited Smith to be the jewelry designer at their newly opened Cutter Gallery. In 1990 she also became the Cutters' resident artist.

In 2019 when Cutter Gallery, closed Gail and Mark Bleiweiss of Phillips Gallery asked Jo-an to join their downtown Art Space at 221 N. Main St. She has been there ever since with Jo-an Smith Studios.

Smith's paintings have been collected nationally and internationally and she has exhibited extensively, including more than 20 one-woman exhibitions. She is excited to share this

newest show at DAAC, Smith said, calling "90!" a "Retrospective Plus" because it consists of paintings which have been in her private collection and rarely seen, plus a group of totally new paintings.

Smith said she loves to paint with oil, watercolor, alcohol ink and to explore new ways of painting, as "is inspired by Chile peppers, ancient cliff dwellings, outer space, our beautiful area and more."

Long before she started painting, Smith was fascinated by the interior walls of chiles, the way they meld into the outer walls and the way the seeds nestle into the chile crevices, she said, "not too different from ancient dwellings nestling into the crevices of their caves, which she also likes to paint.

"New Mexico is at the

heart of my art," Smith said.

Also at DAAC in October

Patricia Dunn's Fiber Art Exhibit, "Once," will be in DAAC's Staszewski Gallery through October.

Smith arrived in Las Cruces in 2020 from Zacatecas, Mexico, the DAAC news release said. She soon discovered Veterans Park/Arroyo Alameda.

"While walking there early in the mornings, Dunn felt connected to the intimate beauties of the desert arroyo," DAAC said. "What she experienced there, the forms and colors, were interpreted with copper wire warp and hand-dyed silk yarn into sculpture. Also, in those

A Pulitzer-prize-nominated photographer, a seasoned venue manager, an oft-cited tour accountant and a tour director who got his start working for U2, are all slated to visit New Mexico State University this fall to speak with students and community members.

The talks are part of an event and venue management course offered through NMSU’s School of Hotel, Restaurant and Tourism Management.

Barbara Hubbard, an entertainment industry veteran and longtime Aggie who teaches the course with HRTM Director Jean Hertzman, coordinated this year’s speaker series.

Each talk is free and open to the public and will take place 4:30-7 p.m. in the Pan American Center’s Barbara Hubbard Room on NMSU’s Las Cruces campus.

Photojournalist Mike McLean began the series Sept. 11. A former staff photographer for the Dallas Times Herald, McLean

“Most of our speakers are former NMSU gradu-

ates and ACTS (American Collegiate Talent Showcase) scholarship recipients,” said Hubbard, who has mentored and provided scholarships to hundreds of students through the ACTS program, which she created in the 1970s.

“We are so honored that Barbara Hubbard’s entertainment industry connections allow us to bring such wonderful experts from a variety of industry segments to enhance our students’ learning and expose them to career opportunities they may have never thought about,” Hertzman said. “We hope members of the NMSU and Las Cruces communities will join us to share in this experience.”

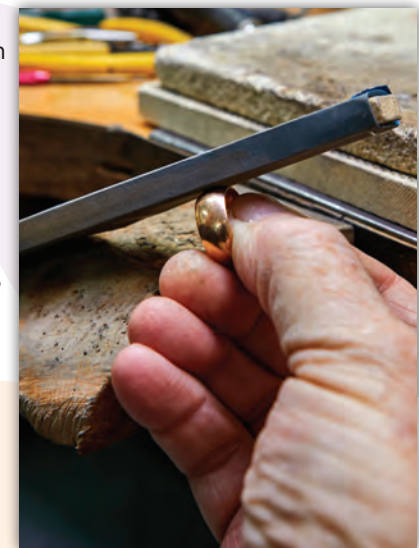

Ukrainian church leader brings prayer for peace

"I bring a message of peace to the people of this community," Ukrainian Orthodox Church of the USA (UOC) Archbishop Daniel Volodymyr Zelinsky said after leading a special service at St. Anthony of the Desert, the mission parish of UOC in Las Cruces, Sept. 21, the International Day of Peace.

Archbishop Daniel, who has visited Las Cruces more than a dozen times, is a native of Ukraine (it was part of the Soviet Union when he was born there in September 1972), and his mother, stepfather and brother still live there.

UOC has raised more than

\$3 million in humanitarian aid to Ukraine since the Russian invasion of that country in February 2022, the archbishop said. Some of that aid has gone to Ukrainian refugee camps in Poland, Romania and Germany, he said. Funds raised have also purchased 170 ambulances for Ukraine, along with more than a dozen refrigerated minivans used as morgues.

While teaching at UOC headquarters in New Jersey, the archbishop said one of his students left the class to take a phone call from his home in Ukraine. The student learned that his brother, a soldier in the Ukrainian military, had suffered a spinal cord injury in battle. The soldier was airlifted to a hospital in Norway. The archbishop surprised his student by taking him to Norway to visit his injured brother.

"It was heartbreaking," Archbishop Daniel said.

Estimates are that more than 7,000 Ukrainian soldiers have died in the war, he said, along with more than 70,000 civilians.

"Mothers and fathers have lost thousands of children on both sides," the archbishop said.

Part of his concern about the war is that it will grow into an openly international conflict, he said.

"The Cold War never ended. It just took a different shape," the archbishop said. "If Ukraine fails, who knows what may happen to the rest of the world."

Russian President Vladimir Putin has made religion a part of his message to Russian soldiers, Archbishop Daniel said, telling them they will go to heaven for killing Ukrainian soldiers, as the Russian leader tries to justify the invasion of a sovereign nation that has a

right to exist as an independent state.

But even as the war continues, it is important to "pray for our enemies," the archbishop said. "I pray for Putin."

His prayer is that Putin will recognize the loss of innocent lives he is inflicting on Ukraine and end the war. He is also hopeful the people of Russia will "see the evil (their) government is doing," the archbishop said.

"We will win this war," he said. "The Russians will see the suffering and they will say 'no more.'"

Archbishop Daniel is also hopeful the international community will force Putin to participate in peace talks and end the war.

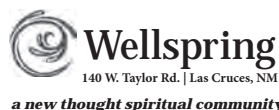

EV part manufacturer expects to make big impact

Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham and Hota Industrial Manufacturing Chairman David Shen announced a final agreement Sept. 20 to expand business for the major auto parts supplier into Santa Teresa, New Mexico.

Taiwan-based Hota Industrial Manufacturing, a producer of automotive gears for North American and European clients, including Tesla, signed an agreement for a 30-acre parcel in the Westpark Industrial Park in Santa Teresa, with construction expected to begin in 2024, the governor's office said in a news release. The company plans to hire 350 employees and invest \$99 million in the state, with future expansions possible over the coming decade.

Company executives,

business and government leaders made the announcement at a news conference in Taipei City, where Lujan Grisham was a guest speaker at U.S. Business Day and is leading a trade mission to advance New Mexico as a destination for reshoring Asian manufacturing to the United States.

"With the latest addition of our third Taiwanese company recruited, Santa Teresa has become the posterchild for reshoring industry from Asia to the U.S.," said Jerry Pacheco, president of the Border Industrial Alliance based in Santa Teresa.

"Hota shares with me a strong belief in the potential of the great state of New Mexico," Lujan Grisham said. "This announcement sits at the nexus of so many of this administration's priori-

ties, including bolstering global trade and securing a cleaner automotive industry. Hota's investment in the Borderplex reaffirms what we already know: New Mexico is on the move."

Hota's expansion into the United States is driven by increasing awareness that manufacturing companies need a more diverse and resilient supply chain so businesses do not experience production slowdowns due to labor or transportation interruptions. Some 70 percent of Hota's market is in the Americas.

"Hota has picked Santa Teresa as its next manufacturing site based on various comparison analyses among the states on the U.S.-Mexico border," Shen said. "Its location makes it a one-day trucking distance to

many of our main customers. Transportation infrastructure is in place to support the logistics of our goods and services. Utility supply is stable and relatively inexpensive. Labor costs are currently the lowest among its neighboring states. Another important thing is that New Mexico has no major natural disasters. Most importantly, the fast responsiveness and support from the state officials have enhanced our decision and confidence to go to New Mexico. We believe that the state government will offer the assistance and incentives needed for us to run our business there."

The state of New Mexico has awarded Hota \$3 million to assist with land, building and infrastructure costs from the Local Economic Development

Act (LEDA) Job-Creation Fund, the governor's office said. The business stands to qualify for other incentives, including the High Wage Jobs Tax Credit, the Manufacturers Investment Tax Credit and the Job Training Incentive Program (JTIP).

The City of Anthony, New Mexico, is assisting with the expansion by issuing industrial revenue bonds, which lessen the property tax burden.

"On behalf of the board of trustees, the City of Anthony is grateful to assist the state of New Mexico and Doña Ana County in helping to locate Hota Manufacturing to the Santa Teresa Borderplex," Anthony Mayor Diana Murillo said. "This project will create jobs and economic opportunities for New Mexicans that are much needed,"

said Murillo, who is also a Doña Ana County commissioner.

"Hota's announcement highlights our region's competitive advantages for advanced manufacturing, including our skilled workforce, business-friendly environment, and strategic location," said Jon Barela, CEO of the Borderplex Alliance, an El Paso-based organization that works to advance the region's economy.

The project has an estimated economic impact of \$4.3 billion over 10 years, the governor's office said.

Hota Group has a global footprint with facilities in Japan, Taiwan, Thailand, China, as well as in the United States in Michigan and California, with more than 4,000 employees globally.

The Santa Teresa Port of Entry is a primary crossing between the United States and Mexico is the first land port without a bridge structure from the east, the news release said. Because of this, it serves a critical function for the El Paso and Ciudad Juárez industrial regions as the only port not limited by space or weight. The port also clears many regular commercial vehicles and a larger segment of private commuters. In the last two years, the Santa Teresa Port of Entry has doubled the number of commercial vehicles processed per hour and hit a new record in 2022 by processing more than 160,000 trucks.

LCHS Bulldawg earns 2023 Spirit of Sport Award

Caleb Lewis, a junior at Las Cruces High School, has been selected as the recipient of the 2023 New Mexico Activities Association Spirit of Sport Award.

The NMAA Spirit of Sport Award was created by the association to recognize individuals who exemplify the ideals of the spirit of sport that represent the core mission of education-based athletics.

Two years ago, Lewis fell into the water while riding a wakeboard at the lake. He appeared okay at the time, but it wasn't until the next day when his fall became near fatal. It turns out the force of

hitting his head on the water caused internal bleeding he was unaware of at the time.

"We get to the ER and they're saying, 'You're in really big trouble,'" Lewis said. "For a while we didn't know if I was going to be all right."

Officially, he suffered an epidural hematoma, which means he had bleeding between the skull and the brain. A craniotomy was required, and a titanium plate was placed in his skull. In his hospital bed, Lewis was now being told about how his vision, speech and mobility could be affected.

"They told us post-surgery, 6-to-9 months before his speech will regulate and it could be 6-to-9

months before his gait regulates and he can walk regularly," his mother Christy said.

"They told me the worst," said Lewis. "They told me I would have seizures, that I would possibly have a lot of learning issues and that there was no shot at ever playing football."

"That just wasn't going to be acceptable for Caleb," Christy said.

Giving up an active lifestyle was not an option for Lewis. After extensive rehab and testing, Caleb was finally cleared to participate in athletics. Caleb convinced his mom his passion and focus was to play football again.

"I just fell in love with the process and the way everything worked here

with Las Cruces football and I wasn't going to let that go," Lewis said.

"When they told him there was a possibility he wasn't going to play, he wasn't going to have it," said Christy.

"It was the mom that told us, 'Coach, it's going to hurt him more mentally if he can't play more than anything that will hurt him if he came back and played,'" said LCHS head coach Mark Lopez. "That opened my eyes that we've got to find a way to do this, and we have to find the best way. We have to get him in the best scenario we can, from a contact perspective, to a helmet perspective, and from that point on, all the focus was on how can we get this kid

back and how can we help him be a part of this."

Through hard work, will and relentless perseverance, Lewis is the Bulldawgs' starting defensive end, playing without hesitation.

"We have a 'Be Strong' mentality here," Lopez said. "It's our core values and what we do here. The R stands for Relentless Perseverance. To me, that's what Caleb is. He is just relentless in what he does."

"You can be in such a low place, but if you just work every day, you can get back to wherever you would like to be," Lewis said.

Arnie's non-golf tips are full of golf wisdom

As the celebrity spokesman for Administaff, a big HR services company, golf legend Arnold Palmer, who passed in 2016, was featured in a magazine ad about 12 years ago. The ad consisted of "Tips from the Pros at Administaff." I saved it, since all the "tips" seemed applicable as much to golf as to succeeding in business. Here's my own version of some of those tips for getting where you want to go in golf.

Aspire to Excellence. Nobody ever became great by settling for average or middle-of-the-pack. Always try to be the best you can be, just like Arnie did. As for me, I'm the son of an athletic coach who wanted me to do the best I possibly could every time I took the field or dove into the pool.

Choose Wisely. Golf is

about decisions, choices, from picking the right club for the right shot, to choosing the line and speed of your putt. That's why many golfers – good and not so good – falter. They don't know how to make correct, successful decisions, and they can be too impulsive, resulting in negative consequences. It's that way in golf and in life. The best decision makers are clear-headed, extremely focused and unencumbered by emotional turmoil.

Avoid the Hazards. In a manner similar to the avoid losing strategy, staying away from hazards, no matter what they might be, seems key to success in all sports, not just on the golf course. In sports there are

penalties, fouls, obstacles and rules infractions of all sorts. Just as in life. Getting entangled with hazards and pitfalls because of poor choices off the field has mired so many sports stars over the years that the list would go on for pages. On

the golf course, bunkers, boundaries, streams and lakes are usually positioned in spots that attract over-zealous or inept golfers – not unlike the temptations in business and in life, which also seem to attract the unprepared, unthinking and unaware.

Become Mentally Tough. There is no other characteristic of successful people more shared among business leaders

and sports winners (even soldiers) than mental toughness. That's because the challenges are so similar in terms of emotions. Being mentally tough isn't a matter of never choking or never getting nervous. No. You become stronger from within as you learn to become emotionally resilient. On the golf course and in the office and on sales calls, bad breaks happen, things turn sour, and it seems like the cards (and world) are stacked against you. How we respond to setbacks and adversity defines how genuinely strong we are, and often, whether we will ultimately prevail.

Attend Closely to Details. I have noticed people who are expert in what they do pay close attention to details. I don't care if we're talking about

musicians or architects or lobbyists or surgeons or tour golfers. Solid leaders and achievers in their fields sharpen their understanding of their work every hour of every day. The best golfers stride confidently onto the putting green, quickly observing the several slopes, gaging the distance, the break and the grain of the grass, subconsciously remembering preceding similar putts, and noting where the intelligent leave of the putt would be. Those details are all processed in seconds by a mind that is focused and practiced.

The last tip is **Maintain a Positive Attitude.** One of the most powerful books of the modern era is Dr. Norman Vincent Peale's *The Power of Positive Thinking*, which posited

that what we reap in reality is proportionate to what we sow mentally. Do you like working with negative whiners? Do you like playing golf with angry, grouchy folks who pout and trudge around all 18 holes with bad vibes? I like to hang out with positive, upbeat people, not downers. If you want good things to happen in the work group you lead encourage your people to perform brilliantly, not continually threaten them with punishment. Attitude is linked to our overall belief system, what we think of ourselves, how we perceive things. If you want to play good golf think positive.
