If you could turn back time ...

Don't forget to set your clocks back one hour (spring

forward/fall back)! Daylight Saving Time (DST) 2023 ends at 2 a.m. Sunday, Nov. 5, and Mountain Standard Time (MST) returns.

When you reset your clocks, it is also a good time to check smoke-alarm batteries.

MST 2023-24 will last until Sunday, March 10, 2024.

DST was first enacted in the United States in 1918, repealed the next year and reinstated as "war time" February 1942-September

1945 during World War II. It became permanent in 1966, and began earlier than before in 1974, after President Richard Nixon signed the Emergency DST Energy Conservation Act because of an OPEC oil embargo

that started in October 1973 and ended in March 1974.

President George W. Bush

signed the Energy Policy Act in August 2005, which moved the end of DST from the last Sunday in October to the first Sunday in November and the start date for DST to the second Sunday in March.

And by the way, the correct spelling (and the correct way to say it) is Daylight Saving Time – there is no "s" at the end of saving.

New Mexico is one of 48 states that observes DST. Only Arizona (except for the Navajo Nation) and Hawaii do not recognize DST, along with American Samoa, Guam, Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands.

Veterans Day Parade to recognize Desert Storm

The 28th annual Las Cruces Veterans Day Parade will be at 11 a.m. Saturday, Nov. 11, in downtown Las Cruces, the City of Las cruces said in a news release.

The parade will form at the corner of Main Street and Lohman Avenue, travel north on Main Street to the roundabout near City Hall and continue south on Water Street back to the staging area.

The theme for this year's parade is "Honoring Desert Storm Veterans."

The parade review stand will be at the intersection of Main Street and Las Cruces Avenue. This is where the presentation of medals to the parade's grand marshals will occur.

Opening ceremonies are scheduled for 10:30 a.m. at the parade review stand. This is where a cannon will be fired to mark the start of the parade, the city said.

To accommodate the parade, Main Street, as well as streets that feed into the parade route will begin closing at 6 a.m. Nov. 11, the news release said.

The Veterans Memorial Wall at Veterans Park, 2651 Roadrunner Parkway, has the names of 479 Doña Ana County veterans who served in Desert Storm.

Desert Storm was the U.S. military action that took place in January and February 1991 as a response to Iraq's August 1990 invasion of Kuwait.

It was the follow-on to Operation Desert Shield, in which the U.S. military deployed 500,000 American troops in Saudi Arabia to defend in case of an Iraqi attack. On Nov. 11, the parade participants will report at 9 a.m. to the staging area on the corner of Main Street and Lohman Ave. The parade starts at 11 a.m. and will travel north down Main Street to the traffic circle, west to Water Street, south, back to the staging area.

Parking will be available at the parking lot just south of El Paso Electric, the Doña Ana County Judicial Complex, Thomas Branigan Memorial Library, City Hall and several parking lots on the East side of the downtown area, between Main and Church streets.

The Las Cruces Veterans Day Parade website (www.lascrucesvetday. org) listed 69 parade entries in October, with the Las Cruces Police Department leading and concluding the order of march.

Other parade participants will include parade grand marshals Marine Corps league Chapter 478 El Perro Diablo; local VFW, American Legion, DAV, Mesilla Valley Chap-

ter 2004 Military Order of the Purple Heart, the 2023 Veterans Parade poster contest winner; Military Officers Association of America; Las Cruces Special Forces Association Chapter 80; Honor Flight of Southern New Mexico and El Paso; Vietnam veterans; Military Rescue Ram Club; United Military Women of the Southwest; NMSU Army and Air Force ROTC; Remember Bataan Foundation; other military veterans; ROTC, bands, sports teams and other Las Cruces Public Schools and Gadsden Independent School District school organizations; the Las Cruces Fire Department; other local law enforcement agencies; Scout troops; car and motorcycle clubs; nonprofits; and others.

Tuesday is Election Day; early voting goes through Saturday

Tuesday, Nov. 7, is election day, as voters in Las Cruces, Mesilla, Hatch, Sunland Park and Anthony, New Mexico go to the polls to elect mayors, city and town councilors and municipal judges, and voters throughout Doña Ana County cast ballots in races for seats on Las Cruces, Hatch and Gadsden school boards and a half-dozen conservation district boards. Doña Ana Community College also has a \$16 million general obligation bond question on the ballot.

Polls will be open 7 a.m.-7 p.m. election day at 42 sites in Las Cruces and throughout the county. Visit www.donaanacountyelections.com/locations.

Visit candidateportal.servis.sos.state. nm.us/CandidateList. aspx?eid=2858&cty=99 and enter click on "Dona Ana" in the county box to see a complete list of candidates in the county. (Two of the 67 candidates listed were disqualified.)

Early voting continues through Saturday, Nov. 4, at nine locations in Las Cruces, Mesilla, Hatch, Anthony, Sunland Park and Chaparral. Eight of those locations are open 11 a.m.-7 p.m. The Doña Ana County Government Center, 845 N. Motel Blvd. in Las Cruces, is open 8 a.m.-5 p.m. Friday and 10 a.m.-6 p.m. Saturday. the last day for same-day voter registration. Absentee ballots must be turned in by 7 p.m. that day to be counted. There are nine secure locations across the county where absentee ballots can be dropped off.

Election day (Nov. 7) is

Las Cruces voters will choose a new mayor to take office next Jan. 1. Incumbent Mayor Ken Miyagishima, first elected in 2007, is not seeking reelection.

The city will also have a new presiding municipal judge. Current Municipal Judge II Anthony Filosa is the only candidate on the ballot to succeed Joy Goldbaum as presiding judge. Goldbaum is not seeking a second four-year term.

Las Cruces voters are also choosing city councilors in districts 1, 2 and 4. Districts 3, 5 and 6 are not on the ballot this year.

City of Las Cruces mayor and city council districts 1 and 4 will be decided by ranked choice voting because each race has more than two candidates: mayor: seven candidates, city council district 1: five candidates, city council district 4: four candidates. The District 2 city council race has only two candidates, so ranked choice voting will not apply.

Mesilla and Sunland Park will also elect mayors this year. Salud! de Mesilla co-owner Russell Hernandez will succeed Nora Barraza as Mesilla

mayor, as he is the only candidate on the ballot. Javier Perea will serve another four-year term as mayor of Sunland Park, as he is the only candidate in that race. Perea was appointed mayor in 2012 and re-elected in 2014 and 2018. Like Mesilla, Sunland Park did not hold a municipal election in 2022 as New Mexico towns and cities transitioned to cityand town-held elections under the state's Local Election Act, which was signed into law by Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham in April 2019.

DACC GO bond

If approved by voters, Doña Ana Community College's GO bond would provide \$16 million in upgrades and improvements to DACC campuses without raising property taxes. It would include \$1.4 million for security and safety upgrades; \$1.5 million for infrastructure Improvements, including maintenance, repair and site development; \$2.85 million for classroom upgrades and renovations; \$2.5 million for information technology upgrades and equipment acquisition; \$8.1 million to replace DACC Sunland Park Center portables with permanent classrooms and equip science labs and student areas.

Connect Doña Ana works to give people best care

Doña Ana County has launched Connect Doña Ana, a new closed-loop referral system to help residents in need receive healthcare and social services, the county said in a news release.

The program is a partnership between the county and Unite Us, a national cross-sector collaboration software company, the LC3 Behavioral Health Collaborative and Presbyterian Health Plan.

"Along with local health and social services providers, Doña Ana County is building a network of more than 100 partners and community health workers (CHWs) and making it easier for local providers to refer patients or clients to each other," the news release said.

"Connect Doña Ana makes it possible for each agency to welcome a client into Unite Us and seamlessly refer them to other

agencies for additional help," county Health and Human Services Department Director Jamie Michael said. "For example, if someone visited Casa de Peregrinos for food, staff could also find an agency in the platform that provides housing, without the client having to provide their information a second time."

"By facilitating information sharing and a seamless referral system across the health and social services provider network, all providers are able to offer more efficient and effective services to individuals and families in need," the news release said. "The key to the system is CHWs, who serve as navigators.

"Our partnership with Doña Ana County strengthens our partnership with other agencies throughout New Mexico, including Presbyterian Health Plan and the collaboration we are building

across healthcare and wellness services," Unite Us Community Engagement Manager Monique N. Rodriguez. "We are aligned on a shared mission of improving the lives of individuals in Doña Ana County by supporting community-led systems of care, building trust in communities and accurately capturing the whole picture of a person's health and the community's needs." "Connect Doña Ana

means more than speed and effective service delivery," Michael said. "A seamless referral system enables all of us to identify gaps, see trends and make adjustments. More importantly, providers can follow-up and ensure referred clients did, in fact access and receive help. In summary, Connect Doña Ana enables us to bolster better health outcomes and foster an improved quality of life, throughout our community."



October shootings cast pall on holiday festivities

The weekend before Halloween saw Las Cruces become part of the gun violence trend. A mass shooting at a party Saturday, Oct. 28, sent seven people to area hospitals, some with serious injuries.

According to the Las Cruces Police, about 11:30 p.m. Saturday on the 3100 block of Dyer Street, a drive-by shooting was directed at a house party. The incident was less than half of a mile from Hillrise Elementary School, which was closed because it happened on a weekend night.

"I'm really concerned for all of the gun violence both in our city, state and nation," said Las Cruces Mayor Ken Miyagishima. " I wish I knew the answer on how to stop these shootings, we just need to stay vigilant and learn to be kind to one another." Crime Stoppers of Las Cruces-Doña Ana County is offering up to \$1,000 for information that helps identify the person or persons responsible. Crime Stoppers allows tips to be provided anonymously. Anyone with information is asked to call 1-800-222-8477. Tips can also be provided through the Las **Cruces Crime Stoppers** app, "P3 TIPS." The app is available through the App Store on most devices.

The Las Cruces act of violence grouped southern New Mexico's largest city with communities across the nation the weekend before Halloween where mass shootings - defined by crowdsourced data site Mass Shooting Tracker as any incident in which four or more people are shot - took place. In Texarkana, Texas; Indianapolis, Tampa, Chicago and at least seven other cities, mass shootings took the lives of 11 people and wounded 76 more.

Gun Violence Archive reports more than 100 may have been wounded during the weekend.

"The increase in the amount of mass shootings should be (a) top priority for our government," said Las Crucen Jill Stull. She said "innocent children and bystanders." should not be victims, "because proper screening wasn't done," to keep guns out of the hands of those who will misuse them.

As a result of the Las Cruces shooting, seven victims, one who was 17 and six others who were 18 or older, were injured. Two victims are in critical, but stable, condition.

Christopher, a Las Cruces father of two children who asked that his last name not be used, said far too often youths are turning to guns to solve problems.

"This is not surprising given adults are oftentimes seen acting in a manner which is inconsistent with how we should behave as a society."

The seven victims were initially taken to Las Cruces hospitals, but one was later transferred to an El Paso hospital.

There were no deaths in this shooting.

As of Tuesday, no arrests hadbeen made, and the shooting is being investigated. Any additional information to be shared with LCPD can be made by calling 575-526-0795.

On Oct. 3, 45-year-old Teresa Gomez was killed during an interaction with an LCPD officer near Burley Court in Las Cruces.

On Oct. 14, a 14-year-old boy died from a gunshot sustained on the East Mesa. A 15-year-old boy was identified as the shooter and charged with involuntary manslaughter and unlawful possession of

a firearm.

The next day, Oct. 15, a 16-year-old boy died as a result of a shooting during an altercation outside Little Caesar's Pizza on North Main.

Sunday, Oct. 29, so far unconfirmed by Las Cruces Police, a Las Cruces man was reportedly shot near the intersection of Claude Dove Drive and Telshor Boulevard. The victim's truck had allegedly been stolen from his driveway, and he pursued the thief in his other vehicle.

When I joined the College of Education faculty as an assistant professor colleges need of mathematics education in 1998, there were six dedicated mathematics and science education faculty members, science, math three in mathematics and three in science.

> Now, there are only two faculty members in the College who identify as mathematics or science education faculty. From a cursory glance

through the New Mexico State University College of Education online directory, it appears that there are zero faculty at NMSU who are qualified to teach mathematics and science related courses for prospective teachers.

The fact that both UNM and NMSU have not prioritized having mathematics and science education faculty is nothing short of a disaster for the state of New Mexico. It is simply unacceptable that UNM and NMSU place so little value on preparing teachers to effectively teach mathematics and science in New Mexico's PK-12 classrooms!

Administrators at UNM and NMSU need to take a closer look at how colleges of education in New Mexico seem incapable of understanding the importance of having dedicated faculty who have the primary

job of preparing prospective teachers to teach mathematics and science in grades PK-12. If administrators are unwilling to act, the New Mexico legislature needs to get involved to ensure the state's students have access to teachers who know and can teach them mathematics and science.

Fire hits Telshor

An office at Telshor Tower Plaza, 755 S. Telshor Blvd. caught fire Monday, Oct. 30.


Las Cruces Fire Department vehicles and more than 40 firefighters responded and put out the fire within an hour.

LCFD officials on the scene said there were two "civilian injuries," both cases of smoke inhalation.

Upon arrival, firefighters found substantial flames coming from second-floor windows of the building, the city said in a news release. Attempted fire attacks through an interior stairwell were hindered by zero visibility and intense heat, prompting LCFD to shift tactics to gain access to the second floor, using ladders and additional firefighters who entered from the rear. Limited access to the second floor and a significant amount of stored materials posed challenges. No other nearby buildings were damaged. An investigation into what caused the fire continues. An estimated cost of damages caused by the fire has not yet been determined.



Conditions forced firefighters to attack the fire at Telshor Tower Plaza through the second floor.







Irish singer Karan Casey comes to Las Cruces

"I'm really looking forward to it," world renown Irish singer Karan Casey said about her upcoming performance in Las Cruces.

Casey will perform at 7 p.m. Friday, Nov. 3, at Unitarian Universalist Church (UUC), 2000 S. Solano Drive.

She will be joined by guitarist Seán Óg, and fiddler/singer Niamh Dunne for the show.

"I just feel this is a really special trio. We've worked together for nearly 10 years," Casey said. The three have collaborated in writing many of the songs they will perform in Las Cruces, she said.

Casey has released 11 albums, including 2023's "Nine Apples of Gold." Casey said the Las Cruces concert will include songs from that album, along with songs about nature, female activism and camaraderie, and anti-colonialism - "songs that welcome immigrants,' she said. The performance will also include new songs Casey has written. "Hopefully, people

will be singing along." she said.

To find inspiration for her songwriting, Casey often visits a glen near her home that is filled with egrets, herons and other birds and wildlife – "the natural world," she said. She also finds traveling to be inspirational, along with her work on "historical songs" to honor women.

"I'm writing more,"

Casey said. "I'm always trying to evolve."

"A lover of ballads, love songs and searing versions of social justice songs, fond of a good yarn, she has toured the world making deep connections with her audience connecting via Ireland's past but crucially repositioning women and songs in a

REVIEW: Film offers new take on time theme

"Quantum Cowboys" plays with time the way a cat plays with a mouse. It could be described with equal energy as brilliant or as confusing. It is a ride you have to hold on for; things become clearer in the end but in the meanwhile, it can be tricky to get there.

For people like me, where themes around time concepts have a fascination and enjoyment all our lives, "Quantum Cowboys" is a delight with its new take on the theme. Essentially, the idea is time splits into different directions on every decision made and so nothing is real wherever you are in time. Except when a memory is captured in art, then it stays the same.

Two hapless drifters, Frank and Bruno (Kiowa Gordon and John Way), team with Linde (Lily Gladstone) to recover her land and trek across 1870s Southern Arizona to find an elusive frontier musician. The complex quantum time theory is blended with philosophical musings about art as the way we understand our history and memories, with gunfights, horses, dance halls, cacti and saloons.

The characters are likeable and engaging, despite their constant mutating - from live action to line drawing to Claymation and everything in between. Despite watching the men and woman change, they are always recognizable and strongly individual.

Ultimately, this is simply a Western, a hero's journey and a

good story. Have patience, get to the end, and you may be satisfied with the result. I was.





Mendoza publishes Pearson embraces the night with poetry third book in trilogy

Las Cruces artist and author George Mendoza completes his Spirit Man trilogy with the publication of book three in the series, "Heart of the Spirit Man."

"Heart of the Spirit Man is a hero's journey about Michael's quest to get his heart back, which was stolen by a mad god who dwells in the wastelands of Shook,"



Mendoza said. "it is an inspirational story about a young man's courage and his incredible triumph over defeat and despair."

Mendoza has published more than 30 books. He began painting and drawing in childhood and has been a fulltime artist since the early 1990s. Mendoza, 68, has been legally blind since age 15. Some peripheral vision remains, he said, along with the colors he sees and paints.

A New York City native, Mendoza graduated from New Mexico School for the Blind and Visually Impaired in Alamogordo. He was seriously injured while running in the Organ Mountains in 2011, suffering a broken left arm and broken jaw and damage to his right hip and knee, Mendoza said. That experience helped him "discover" the location in the Organs of the gateway that leads his hero, Michael, on his adventures in the "Spirit Man" series. The character is based on Mendoza's real-life son, Michael, and "Journey of the Spirit Man" was dedicated to Mendoza's daughter, Maria.

Mendoza's artwork has been shown in galleries around the world and hangs in many private collections. His exhibition "Colors of the Wind" was a national Smithsonian traveling art exhibit. Biographies of Mendoza include one by that same name, "Colors of the Wind," and "Running Toward the Light."

Mendoza is a Smithsonian fellow and received the New Mexico State University distinguished alumni award in 2014.

Through his paintings and books, "the world gets to see how I see," Mendoza said.

Valley Sessions crafts mood, meaning for musicians

By MIKE COOK Las Cruces Bulletin

Las Cruces entrepreneur and filmmaker Ryan Robson created Valley Sessions in 2022 and shot his first video for Southwest Expeditions at the old county courthouse earlier this year. He has since completed nearly a dozen videos at local venues, working with local musicians and filmmakers and calling on the expertise of his own cadre of young, creative artists.

Valley Sessions doesn't have a space; Robson and his team travel to whatever indoor or outdoor site has been chosen to make the best video or to capture a musician or band in a live story out there, which is the performance.

Shooting several hours of video, Robson and his team can produce a completed video in as little as 72 hours, he said. They can help with marketing the finished product as well. Robson is also creating a database of musicians and crew available to collaborate on a wide range of creative projects.

But the real work begins before the cameras roll.

To begin, Robson and his team sit down with a client to collectively decide how to make a video that is "the best representation of the artist," he said.

"We take a lot of pride in that." They get to know a perform-

er's history and listen to and talk about the songs he or she will perform.

"There is such a tenderness in the conversation about the music," said Jenna Ivey, a Las Cruces filmmaker, actor, vocalist and musician who serves as Valley Session's music supervisor. "It's so collaborative."

The musician as writer/creator of the music is "so vulnerable" at this point, she said. Part of the creative team's work is to help him or her "feel safe."

"It's a relationship you can trust." Robson said.

"This is your time to get the reason why I do this," said Las Cruces musician and artist Margus "M. Qu" McDermott, who shot his first video with Vallev Sessions.

Robson is "constantly checking in. He represents me authentically," said McDermott, an R&B artist originally from Tennessee who moved to Las Cruces two years ago. "It's very courageous and very encouraging. The moments are made when you have that silent interaction," said McDermott, who sings and plays the piano.

"You're giving me a piece of yourself, your poetry," Robson

told McDermott.

"He created something special with us," Robson said about McDermott. "I fell in love with his music even before we shot it."

The team makes the best use it's using to create the highest quality audio and video possible, Robson said. The editing process builds the video around "finding one take that we love," he said.

"We treat every musician like a rock star," Robson said. "The only thing a musician is worried about is their art. We're taking care of everything else."

"There's a vision there," said Valley Sessions copywriter Austin Martin-Likes. Generosity is a cornerstone of the team's work, he said. Robson is "open to the needs and interests of the people he's working with. There is a spirit of creating something for Las Cruces."

"We know what we're doing," Robson said. "We trust what we've created."

"It was such a cool experience," said McDermott, who has competed on "American Idol" and "The Voice." "You don't feel rushed, the support shows. People are getting connected. They show up for each other."

Robson gives musicians "the opportunity to shine the most," McDermott said. "He is lifting

up the community."

Robson recently shot a video in Apodaca Park, liking "the atmosphere of the park," he said, including the sounds of running water and kids playing baseball.

For another video, he and his team used candles to light the set because "the song is more intimate," Robson said.

"We're curating these spaces to create something authentic," Martin-Likes said.

A perfectionist, Robson said reshooting different performances of the same song can create a completely different video each time, reflecting the emotion of the performer and his or her connection with the crowd that's watching.

"I liked it the first time. The fifth time, I loved it," he said. "This is a piece of this musician. It's unique to them. I get it."

Robson's vision is to grow Valley Sessions by "involving more people in creative roles," he said. His volunteer crew includes more than 20 musicians, filmmakers, sound engineers and designers, including NMSU music and film students.





Al could influence the game of golf as we know it

Today we're talking about artificial intelligence, or "AI." No going back to C3PO, R2D2 or Hal.

AI is short for the development of computergenerated systems and processes able to perform tasks and brain-type functions that normally require human intelligence, such as speech and language, visual and speech recognition and complicated reasoning, including thinking and responding both humanly and rationally.

It's a complex and daunting scientific advancement, especially for folks in their senior, third-third of their lives, to comprehend. Advances in deep learning and machine learning have allowed AI to enter almost every sector of society and industry. Yes, even golf. AI is changing the game of

golf from improving player create even more dramatic of Club Champion. performance, to club design, to course design, coaching, simulators, data analytics, media production and more.

There is debate whether AI should be vilified or celebrated regarding golf course design. Skilled course designers have been doing this for centuries, but some think

AI can help. AI can analyze data from millions of rounds played on existing courses and identify improvements for playability, speed up play and reduce costs. It can reveal hazards that are dangerous or unfair, allowing designers to change them.

Expert designers try to use interesting natural features of the course and

landforms. Some feel abandoning the designer's touch could render a course soulless and void of

an identity.

Personal club fitting is another emerging application of AI. Club Champion, one of the leading club fitters with 150 studios nationwide, leads the way with their

data-driven AIbased "Fitter Co-Pilot." The Co-Pilot technology takes data from nearly a million swings per month and distills it to actionable data, narrowing the huge matrix to recommendations, avoiding testing components that won't fit the golfer's profile, says Nick Sherburne, founder

Co-Pilot uses a Track-Man Optimizer to find player characteristics like clubhead speed, attack angle, carry distance and ball speed to match previous fitting data. The system includes over 65 golf brands and 65,000 clubhead and shaft combinations.

"Co-Pilot doesn't replace a highly trained fitter," says Sherburne. "It's another tool in their toolbox; he still has to understand the principles of fitting, the club technology, and golfer's needs and how to interpret the data."

Callaway has used AI to develop its latest clubs, and says an AI Machine Learning algorithm and supercomputer helped reduce a tradition of over three decades of product design to just a few weeks.

D team in 2017. The team focused on the design of the face of the driver, and specifically the "sweet spot," which generates the fastest ball speed. That effort produced the "Flash Face" which went into the Epic Flash driver series. In order to create, test and analyze the 15,000 prototypes needed it would have taken Callaway's lab people years instead of weeks. Other performance parameters Callaway plans on improving with AI include increasing stability and forgiveness of a clubhead, lowering the backspin off metalwoods and improving golf ball aerodynamics. Now almost every major golf club manufacturer uses AI-driven club design in some way. This week Callaway's Odyssey brand

putters announced the introduction of their "Ai-One" line of putters developed using AI.

Sportsbox AI emerged in 2020 as an AI-powered tech company that developed mobile applications for coaching sports, including golf, using 3D motion analysis. In 2021, the company launched Sportsbox 3D Golf as a coaching app (using a smart phone) for instructors, and then unveiled Sportsbox 3D Practice as a consumer app; go to sportsbox.ai.com. They refer to it as "a launch monitor for your body." The company's stable of advisers/investors include David Leadbetter and Sean Foley. It's real!
