Mayor's race decided in Ranked Choice Voting

At 10:42 p.m. on Election Night, Nov. 7, mayoral candidate Eric Enriquez got the great news.

No, not that he won the election, but that he had a new grandson: Antonio Joseph Enriquez, born in North Carolina to Zachary and Lydia, and named for Eric's uncle and father.

About an hour later, he got the other news: In the sixth round of Ranked Choice Voting, Enriquez had won the mayoral race, with 7,044 votes to 6,420 for runner-up Kasandra Gandara.

Throughout the evening, as votes were tallied and posted, Enriquez was behind Gandara by a few hundred votes. But as the seven candidates dwindled, when the lowest vote-getters were eliminated and their voters' other votes redistributed, Enriquez gained ground.

Also gaining ground was third-place finisher Isabella Solis. But in the final round, when Solis was knocked out, her voters' other votes were re-distrib-

uted enough in Enriquez's favor to sway the victory.

"It's the ninth in-ning," Enriquez said right after the official word. "A true blessing. I just want to thank all of our friends, family, volunteers and, most of all, the voters. The journey was amazing."

Enriquez, a Las Cruces native and graduate of Mayfield High School and New Mexico State University, spent much of his career working for the Las Cruces Fire Department. He left and spent a few years working for the Hobbs Fire Department before returning to LCFD as fire chief. After retiring from LCFD, he served as assistant city manager for the City of Las Cruces, before retiring from the city altogether.

"I'm proud of the campaign we ran," he said Election Night. "We were present, we were transparent, and we put ourselves in a position to win."

Gandara, the mayor pro tempore, first elected to the council in 2015, called Enriquez to concede about 12:30 a.m. Wednesday. "Although it wasn't the result my team wanted, I am proud of the campaign I can't thank my team and our citizens (enough) for their support in the last eight years," Gandara said. "We have done some great things for the city and I am very proud of that."

Incumbent Mayor Ken Miyagishima who is the longest serving mayor in the city's history, did not run for a fifth consecutive four-year term.

Other city races

In the District 1 city council race to succeed Gandara, Cassie McClure had 1,119 votes (58 percent) after four rounds of ranked choice voting. Jason Estrada was second with 816 votes (42). Daniel Buck, Patrick Potter and Mark O'Neil were eliminated in earlier rounds. McClure had almost 37 percent of the vote after the first round of ranked-choice voting. Estrada had almost 25 percent, Buck about 22.5 percent and Potter and O'Neill each had about eight percent.

In the District 2 city council race, former Las Cruces mayor Bill Mattiace defeated incumbent Tessa Abeyta 1,229 (51 percent) to 1,175 (49 percent).

Mattiace was mayor 2002-06 and served four years on the council before that. He ran unsuccessfully for re-election in 2007, and ran again for mayor in 2019, finishing second in a 10-candidate race.

"Tessa has to be commended," Mattiace said. "She ran a good race. A really big thank you to the voters, and I want voters on both sides, those who voted for me and those who didn't, to know I'm here for everyone in the district. I promise to keep the door

open."

In the District 4 city council race, incumbent Johana Bencomo won re-election in the second round of ranked choice voting. She had 1,121 votes (51.4 percent) to 807 votes (37) for Gabriel Duran, Jr. and 254 votes (11.6) for Lorenzo Medina. Ramon Ortega was eliminated after the first round.

Anthony Filosa was the only candidate for municipal judge I. Filosa, currently municipal judge

II, succeeds incumbent presiding Municipal Judge Joy Goldbaum, who did not run for a second four-year term. Filosa received 11,258 votes.

Mesilla Board

In Mesilla, Russell Hernandez was elected mayor without opposition, collecting 425 votes (See Page 10). In the race for two seats on the Town of Mesilla Board of Trustees, incumbent Stephanie Johnson received 243 votes (30 percent), Gerald Nevarez received 238 votes (29), in-

cumbent Veronica Garcia received 258 votes (25) and Priscilla Sandoval received 134 votes (16).

LCPS Board

In Las Cruces Board Schools Board of Education races, where there is no ranked choice, incumbent Patrick Nolan was elected to a full four-year term in District 1. Appointed to the board in April, Nolan received 2,103 votes (57 percent) to 1,612 votes (43) for Joseph Sousa.

In District 4, incumbent

Virgin Galactic completes sixth mission of 2023

BULLETIN REPORT

Thursday, Nov. 2, Virgin Galactic completed its sixth space mission in six months and 10th to date. The Galactic 05 mission saw Virgin Galactic's spaceship converted into a suborbital lab for space-based scientific research for the second time.

"Providing researchers with reliable and repeatable access to a high-quality microgravity environment is vital to our mission of expanding human knowledge and enabling scientific

discoveries," said Michael Colglazier, CEO of Virgin Galactic.

The crew of the Galactic 05 mission included Astronaut 020, Dr. Alan Stern, U.S. planetary scientist and associate vice president in Southwest Research Institute's (SwRI) Space Sector; Astronaut 021, Kellie Gerardi, U.S. payload specialist and bioastronautics researcher for the International Institute for Astronautical Sciences (IIAS); and Astronaut 022, Ketty Pucci-Sisti Maisonrouge, a private astronaut of Franco-Italian

nationality.

Stern and Gerardi are experienced researchers who conducted human-tended research during

the suborbital spaceflight. As a former NASA Associate Administrator for the Science Mission Directorate, Stern's mission was

planned to be a training flight for a future suborbital spaceflight as part of the NASA's Flight Opportunities program. He will fly a biomedical harness to collect physiological data related to human spaceflight and conduct

practice activities for an astronomical experiment on the NASA flight.

Galactic 05 was Virgin Galactic's sixth spaceflight carrying microgravity and space-based research and its second in 2023, following Galactic 01, a research mission with the Italian Air Force and National Research Council.

The Galactic 06 mission is expected to take place in January 2024 to allow time for routine, planned annual vehicle inspections before re-commencing with standard pre-flight readiness procedures.

NMSU cuts ribbon on state-of-the-art ag buildings

Fabian Garcia would have been so proud.

Garcia was a member of the first graduating class of the New Mexico College of Agriculture and Mechanical Arts, now New Mexico State University, graduating in 1894 and beginning a 50-year career with NMSU that contrib-

uted to the development of agriculture in the region, nation and around the world.

The great tradition he helped start at NMSU took another giant leap forward Nov. 3, as Lt. Gov. Howie Morales, NMSU interim President Jay Gogue, NMSU Board of Regents President Ammu Devasthali, New Mexico Dept. of Agriculture Sec. Jeff Witte

and others cut the ribbon and officially opened NMSU's new Food Science, Security and Safety Center and Animal Nutrition and Feed Manufacturing Facility on NMSU's Las Cruces campus.

They are the first agriculture buildings on campus since the Skeen Building was completed more than two decades ago.

Construction on the buildings began in 2021 with funds from general obligation bonds approved by local voters in 2008 and 2020. Monetary contributions to the construction were also made by the New Mexico Beef Council, Caviness Beef Packers and other donors.

The new buildings "will benefit student education, support food and

value-added research of agricultural products and facilitate labor training for the meat and food industry – thus directly impacting the food safety of our agricultural products and the economic impact of the College of Agriculture, Consumer and Environmental Sciences (ACES) in New Mexico," ACES Dean Rolando A. Flores Galarza said in an NMSU news release.

"The new facility will allow the College of ACES and NMSU to become a regional provider of high-quality teaching, research and outreach in value-added agriculture and a hub for local, regional and international training in food science and bioprocessing," said Efrén Delgado, head of the family and Consumer Sciences

and Extension Family and Consumer Sciences departments and co-director of the Center of Excellent in Sustainable Food and Agricultural Systems at NMSU.

The new facility will also support a newly proposed NMSU Ph.D. program in food science, Delgado said.

The facility's state-of-

the-art laboratories will support emerging research in functional foods, nutraceuticals, minimization of water usage in food production and dairy technology, Delgado said in the news release, and will consolidate NMSU's livestock education and research into a single feed mill.

Teresa Tenorio received 1,444 votes (39 percent) to 1,301 (35) for Julia Ruiz and 991 (27) for Edward Howell.

In District 5, former board member Ed Frank received 1,299 votes (31 percent) to 1,271 votes (31) for incumbent Carol Cooper, 1,015 votes (24) for Jose Aranda and 568 votes (14) for Ernest Carlson. Frank won the seat in 2015 but was defeated by Cooper by 83 votes in 2019.

DACC bond

Voters overwhelmingly passed a \$16 million

general obligation bond to make improvements at Doña Ana Community College; 14,951 voters (71 percent) voted for the bond. 6,158 (29 percent) voted no.

Voter turnout

The New Mexico Secretary of State's office said 22,389 (18.3 percent) voters cast ballots in races in five municipalities, three school districts and multiple conservation board races in Doña Ana County. 122,307 voters were eligible.

With a theme of "Framing the Future," the event will honor NMSU and Las Cruces icons Clara Belle Williams, Delano Lewis and Clarence Fielder. It will also be an opportunity to meet new NMSU Black Programs Director Cecil Rose.

Williams (1885-1994) was the first African American to graduate from New Mexico College of Agriculture and Mechanic Arts (now NMSU). She earned a degree in English in 1937 at age 51. Because she was black, Williams was not allowed in lecture halls and attended classes in hallways. She became a Las Cruces teacher.

Lewis (1938-2023) was ambassador to South

Africa and held national leadership positions with the Peace Corps and National Public Radio.

Fielder (1928-2015) was a long-time Las Cruces teacher and NMSU professor. He began African American studies classes at NMSU and was instrumental in keeping Phillips Chapel C.M.E. open in Las Cruces.

The banquet's keynote speaker will be Second Judicial District (Albuquerque) Judge (ret.) Tommy Jewell.

AMERICAN PUBLIC GAS ASSOCIATION CONFERENCE 2023

Las Cruces Utilities (LCU) participated in the 2023 American Public Gas Association (APGA) Annual Conference this past July in Scottsdale, Arizona. The APGA conference is the largest gathering of publicly owned and community-owned natural gas professionals across the nation, which LCU staff attend each year to ensure they bring the best practices, equipment, and technology to the Las Cruces community.

This year, LCU sent seven of their top natural gas utility leaders to represent the City of Las Cruces. The 4-day conference offers attendees opportunities to explore vendors, attend presentations, and network with natural gas utility professionals from all areas of the United States.

This conference is where Jaime Medina, LCU Gas System Operations Supervisor, Gas Pressure and Service, discovered the RANGER remote gas-monitoring device last year and decided the device would be a

vital improvement to the natural gas system serving Las Cruces. The RANGER device was featured in an August edition of the Las Cruces Bulletin, and Medina attended the conference this year to bring continued improvements to Las Cruces.

Fellow attendee Ramiro Pereyra Jr., LCU Interim Deputy Director of Natural Gas and Energy, used the conference as a learning experience.

“When we network with professionals in our industry, we learn about the energy challenges they experience in their hometowns,” Pereyra Jr. explained. “By communicating, we can help each other come up with solutions.”

The APGA Annual Conference showcase the latest technology in the natural gas industry. Medina spoke about being impressed with a laser-based gas leak detection system and an efficient, stream-lined work-order system that will improve maintenance requests and compliance.

Pete Duran, LCU Construction Maintenance/Corrosion Supervisor, another attendee explains that his department already uses a form of laser-based gas leak detection, which allows maintenance workers to be able to identify methane leaks from a distance, bypass barriers, including fences and backyard animals. Another attendee, Juan Ramos, LCU Interim Gas System Inspection Supervisor, also oversees LCU compliance, and Medina hope both these technologies will enhance Duran and Ramos’s department’s capabilities.

Also featured at the conference were keynote speakers who spoke about

industry-related topics, including the future of the gas industry and the benefits of natural gas. Currently, Las Cruces is developing an energy transition plan and exploring energy alternatives, including solar power and wind power, as viable alternatives.

Ramos elaborated on a keynote speaker that spoke about the benefits of natural gas compared to electricity, including affordability. The speaker stated that during the winter, people who utilized a combination of natural gas and electricity for their heating needs did not experience the high spike in energy costs that those who only used electricity experienced.

“While Las Cruces is engaged with a dynamic energy transition process, Las Cruces Utilities will continue to provide natural gas to our residents,” Ramos said. “Our participation at APGA will help us with our goal to provide Las Cruces the best and most affordable services.”

Turner takes command at White Sands Missile Range

Col. George Turner took over leadership at White Sands Missile Range Nov. 2 in a Change of Command ceremony.

Following the passing of the colors ceremony, Major Gen. James J. Gallivan, commanding general for the Army Test & Evaluation Command spoke, beginning with a recognition of the beauty of the area.

“Look at the mountain and just breathe,” Gallivan told the attendees. “We should be paying to be here today, the weather, the people the scenery, we are blessed – it’s just Wow.”

He described the ceremony as symbolizing the relinquishment of leader-

ship.

“It allows us to reflect not on the leader, but on the organization’s past accomplishments and look to the future in anticipation of the organization’s great achievements yet to come,” he said.

Brig. Gen. Eric Little served as commander of WSMR since May 2021, Gallivan said. Little led a joint team of more than 6,000 service members, civilians, contractors and family members, commanding the geographically largest military installation in the lower 48 states.

One of the themes of Little’s command at

WSMR has been about care, Gallivan said. Then he welcomed the new commander, Turner, to the installation.

“George, your experience speaks volumes, and we are thrilled to welcome you to WSMR, ATEC, and this world-class community; I promise you will fall in love with the people of Las Cruces and El Paso, and it will change your life forever in a better way,” Gallivan told Turner.

As Little took the podium, he pointed out they were using the same podium used in 1963 by John F. Kennedy, the only sitting president to ever visit WSMR.

Little commanded WSMR for two and a half years, the longest since Brig. Gen. Jerry L. Laws commanded the range

from June 1994 to April 1998.

After knowing Turner for seven years, Little said he is honored to hand the colors to Turner saying “I’ve seen fresh ideas; you are the right leader at the right time.”

Turner addressed the community for the first time, saying it was another great day to be an American soldier. He then shared his pride in serving as the 38th Commander of White Sands Missile Range, as well as the Deputy Commander for Developmental Testing for the Army Test and Evaluation Command.

Turner most recently served as the Chief of Staff for G-3/5/7 Force Management, Headquarters, Department of Army in Washington, D.C.,

where he was previously Programs Division Chief. Prior to that position, he was the Ministerial Advisory Group – Defense, Chief of Staff in Kabul, Afghanistan.

He has served in a variety of Armor and Force Management assignments, including at Vilseck, Germany; Camp Casey, Korea; Fort McPherson, Georgia; Fort

Stewart, Georgia; and Fort Shafter, Hawaii.

Turner’s deployments include Operation Able Sentry in Macedonia, Operation Iraqi Freedom in Iraq, Operation Enduring Freedom in Afghanistan and Operation Freedom’s Sentinel in Afghanistan.

He holds degrees from the College of William and Mary, Georgetown and the U.S. Army War College.

New Mesilla mayor: 'Now the work really starts'

Russell Hernandez filed his candidacy for mayor of Mesilla early on the morning of filing day, Aug. 29, and checked the New Mexico secretary of state's website throughout the day to see if any other candidates had filed.

When the 5 p.m. deadline passed without anyone else running for Mesilla's top job, "It was like 'wow,'" Hernandez said. "This is going to be amazing. Now the work really starts."

Being business- and community-focused "has really helped us," said Hernandez, 42, co-owner of Salud! de Mesilla, a fourth-generation Mesillero and a longtime community activist.

Hernandez becomes mayor-elect after the Nov. 7 local election and will be sworn into office Jan. 1, 2024, succeeding Nora Barraza, who is completing her 14th year as mayor.

"Nora's been awesome and amazing," Hernandez said. "Hopefully, that door is still open for communication."

Hernandez said he ex-

pects to call on Barraza when he has questions about town government.

Maintaining Mesilla's "historic integrity" will be a top priority for his administration, Hernandez said.

"I grew up in this town and I love this town," Hernandez said at an Oct. 24 Mesilla candidates' forum at Mesilla Community Center that included the four candidates for two seats on the Mesilla Board of Trustees: incumbents Stephanie Johnson and Veronica Garcia and challengers Priscilla Sandoval and Gerald Nevarez.

Mesilla "is such a unique community," Hernandez said. The gross receipts tax generated by its locally owned businesses – there are about 150 in Mesilla – "carries the town," he said. Focusing on small business and tourism, including Mesilla's fiestas and special events, shopping, dining and live entertainment, will provide "a lot of opportunity for marketing and promotion," he said.

Hernandez is chair and past president of the New

Mexico Restaurant Association and a member of the NMSU Hotel, Restaurant and Tourism Management board of advisers. He is a founder of Experi-

ence Mesilla, "a collaborative of businesses that work together to support and promote each other."

Hernandez said he is also committed to "110-percent transparency in everything," including the enforcement of town codes, accountability for "how everyday business is handled for the town" and "open and honest communication" and information sharing with Mesilla residents and business owners.

Hernandez said he would like to see "more active participation" by Mesilla residents in their government. More people are attending town council meetings, he said, "and that's a good thing," because it is important for town leaders to hear directly from residents about their concerns.

Hernandez said he is looking forward to working with whomever is elected the new mayor of

Las Cruces and "building a bridge" to renew the strong working relationship between Mesilla and Las Cruces. He already has a good start, Hernandez said, because Salud! is located in the City of Las Cruces, right on the Las Cruces-Mesilla line.

Hernandez said he has "an awesome relationship with all our legislators" on both sides of the aisle. He even went to high school with state Sen. Crystal Diamond, a Republican who lives a ranch near Elephant Butte and represents Sierra, Luna and Hidalgo counties and part of Doña Ana County.

"Having an open door ... makes for a stronger community overall," Hernandez said.

Co-owning a restaurant with husband Christopher Schaljo-Hernandez, a Doña Ana County commissioner, that is only steps from the Mesilla Plaza means Hernandez will spend a lot of time "walking and talking" to business owners, residents and visitors, he said.

Preserving Mesilla's green spaces and farmland is important to the community, Hernandez

said, and it serves as a buffer that is helping to keep Las Cruces' property crime issues out of Mesilla, he said. Making sure members of the Mesilla Marshal's Office are visible throughout the community is also an important part of community public safety, he said.

A long-time supporter of Mesilla Valley Community of Hope's Tent City for people struggling with homelessness, "Now I get to do that at a different level," Hernandez said.

"We're a caring community," he said.

In his run for mayor, Hernandez continues a long-standing tradition of his family's participation in Mesilla politics, he said,

starting with his great-grandparents, who were helpful in getting the town incorporated. His grandmother served as Mesilla town clerk and his uncle was Mesilla marshal.

Hernandez graduated from NMSU with a bachelor of science degree in agriculture economics and agricultural business.

Court of Appeals ruling in Texas limits nuclear waste options

A U.S. Court of Appeals ruling earlier this year could be “the final nail in the coffin” for a proposed high-level nuclear waste storage facility in southeast New Mexico, a Las Cruces state senator said.

The ruling, which said the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) does not have the authority to issue permits for private, temporary nuclear waste storage sites, canceled plans for a facility in Andrews County in west Texas. Andrews County has 18,610 residents and borders eastern New Mexico.

The court ruling could have “major, potentially precedent-setting, ramifications” for a proposed nuclear-waste storage site in New Mexico, state Sen. Jeff Steinborn said in a Bulletin interview.

In May, the NRC approved a

proposal by Florida-based company Holtec International to open a facility in Lea County in southeast New Mexico that would store 500 canisters holding 100,000 tons of spent nuclear fuel shipped to the site from all over the United States.

“It’s a very unjust way to proceed,” said Steinborn, who sponsored New Mexico Senate Bill 53: “Storage of Certain Radioactive Waste,” during the 2023 New Mexico legislative session. Effective last June, the law prohibits the storage of radioactive materials and nuclear waste in New Mexico without the state’s consent.

It is “the first layer of protection” for the state against nuclear waste storage,” Steinborn said.

The Court of Appeals ruling “gives more power to local communities and states” when it

comes to waste storage, he said.

“Our opinion does matter. Our rights do matter,” said Steinborn, who is vice chair of the New Mexico Legislature’s interim Radioactive and Hazardous

Materials Committee.

“This could play out in the courts or in Congress,” Steinborn said, and could reach the U.S. Supreme Court.

The issue “is too large of a decision to be made by an agency,” he said. Congress “needs to come up with a permanent solution for this waste, and the waste “should stay where it is” until that solution is reached.

The federal Nuclear Waste Policy Act that became effective in January 1983 “supports the use of deep geologic repositories for the safe storage and/or disposal of radioactive waste,” according to the U.S. Environmental Pro-

tection Agency. The act proposed a high-level waste repository at Yucca Mountain in south-central Nevada in 1987, but it has never opened.

Nuclear waste is currently stored at about 80 nuclear plants around the U.S., Steinborn said.

“The federal government needs to take full ownership of the challenge and not pass the buck,” instead of allowing the NRC “to give a license to someone that wants to shove it down our throats.”

New Mexico is “fighting back” against becoming “the de facto permanent solution,” Steinborn said, and pressing for “a more just policy nationally (that) will appropriately manage the risk, “compensate a state handsomely” for allowing waste storage, and “not “look the other way” and allow a private company to “file an application and trigger this situation.

Studies predict 13 rail ac-

cidents during the shipping of waste to the proposed temporary-stage site in Lea County, Steinborn said. “It’s not a matter of if, it’s a matter of when,” he said.

And, Steinborn said, the dry cask storage proposed for the Lea County site may not be safe for the proposed 40-year storage plan.

Hearing proponents say there is “very little chance of radiological release” is “very little comfort to me,” Steinborn said. “I don’t feel better hearing that.” “What if there is no other company to take over” when Holtec’s contract expires, Steinborn asked.

“We don’t really want to be the country’s guinea pig,” Steinborn said. “Nobody wants this in their back yard.”

“Congress is a very active battlefield on this issue, as are the courts. You have so many states that want to get rid of it.

I have watched a single mother and her small children help build the home they were able to buy because of Mesilla Valley Habitat for Humanity. I have seen Lorenzo Alba Jr. overcome because of the community's generosity in support of Casa de Peregrinos food program he leads.

I've held Mark Medoff's Tony award and touched a crumbling adobe wall at Fort Selden where Buffalo Soldiers were stationed 150 years ago.

I talked to Delano Lewis about

Vasquez bills address symptoms of immigration crisis

A package of immigration bills introduced in Congress recently by Rep. Gabe Vasquez of Las Cruces will not address the growing crisis on our border, which is now impacting nearly all of our major cities.

That's far beyond the grasp of this Congress, which has its hands full just trying to keep a speaker in place. To be fair, even in past years with stronger leaders in charge, immigration reform has always been out of reach. Both sides would rather have the problem to campaign on than a solution that seems so simple to me. More on that later.

Vasquez has proposed five bills, which all seek to address the symptoms of the crisis. The most im-

portant is the Strengthening Our Workforce Act.

It would allow undocumented immigrants working in critical professions such as law enforcement, healthcare, education, energy production, emergency response and other specified career fields to apply for a two-year temporary provisional status, allowing them to live and work here legally.

The Farm Workforce Support Act would call for a study of the program that gives temporary working status to agricultural workers, and its impact on the workforce.

The other three bills all deal with public safety.

The Smart Border Protection Act would provide an additional \$570 million for new hires in the Homeland Security Department, new screening technology and infrastructure improvements at the ports of entry. The Humane Accountability Act would hold detention

centers responsible for abuses that happen in their facilities.

The one bill I'm not a big fan of would impose mandatory sentencing for human trafficking crimes. While I understand the need to stop that horrible activity, federal crime bills calling for mandatory sentences bring back scary

memories from the Bush/Clinton days. They take discretion away from judges and feed our mass incarceration industry.

Despite my reservations, all of these seem like bills that could gain bipartisan support in a Congress that was interested in solving problems. Sadly, we don't have one of those.

Now, for my simple three-step solution to our immigration crisis:

First, develop clear guidelines as to who does and who does not qualify for asylum, along with a system for adjusting those guidelines as needed to address changing conditions around the world.

Then, broadcast that message throughout the world, along with a clear warning that the new law

will be enforced.

And finally, enforce the law. Undocumented immigrants who are already here get to stay. Those waiting at the gate who don't qualify can't get in.

I realize my plan only addresses asylum. Reform of the entire immigration system would take more steps than I have room for.

The Farm and Ranch Museum and the Museum of Space History are extended the program to include all veterans regardless of state residence, NMDCA said. The Space Museum is also extending it to National Guard personnel and first responders.

Former Aggie player, others, file another lawsuit

As this year’s New Mexico State University men’s basketball team was in Lexington, Kentucky, Nov. 6, preparing for its season-opening game, another lawsuit was filed in Las Cruces against last year’s men’s basketball team.

The civil suit, with two former players and a student manager as plaintiffs, portrays a pervasive culture of gun possession (disallowed on campus) among other players even after a Nov. 19, 2022, shooting in Albuquerque involving Aggie player Mike Peake.

Former player Kyle Feit, a guard originally from Boca Raton, Florida, who transferred to NMSU from Arizona State, decided to include his name because, according to the lawsuit, “his interest in speaking out and holding all of the defendants accountable outweighs his desire to protect his personal privacy interests.”

The other two plaintiffs are unnamed, and referred to as John Doe I, a former player, and John Doe II, a student manager, in the lawsuit.

The named defendants of the suit are the Board of Regents of NMSU, current NMSU athletic director Mario Moccia, former NMSU head basketball coach Greg Heiar, former NMSU assistant coach Dominique Taylor, and former players Kim Aiken Jr., Doctor Bradley and Deshawndre Washington.

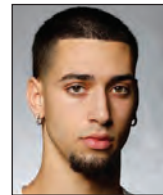
Except for Moccia, those were the named defendants in an April 2023 civil suit alleging sexual harassment, hazing and assault against teammates. That suit was filed with former players Deuce Benjamin and Shakiru Odunewu, and Benjamin’s father, William Benjamin as plaintiffs. NMSU settled that lawsuit, agreeing to pay \$8 million to the plaintiffs.

A few days after Deuce Benjamin reported his accusations to NMSU police, Feb 10, 2023,

Moccia and then-NMSU chancellor fired Heiar and shut down the basketball season with a handful of games left.

The lawsuit says Feit was “deeply impacted by the presence of guns in the locker room and on campus. During his time at NMSU, he saw guns in the locker room and guns carried by some of his fellow players, including Deshawndre Washington.” The suit cites three incidents where a gun was pulled on him from inside cars, after practice, but he could not identify the people pulling the gun.

The plaintiff John Doe II “also saw guns in the locker room, which concerned him and made him uncomfortable. He saw Washington with his gun out, pointing it around. He had heard stories about Wash-

ington’s history with guns in Chicago.”

Feit, John Doe I and John Doe II all described in the lawsuit occasions where they were sexually assaulted, and witnessed others being sexually assaulted.

The assaults and abuse described in the lawsuit include acts such as the following.

“Often, the perpetrators would tell the players they victimized to either pull their pants down and expose their backside or they would force them to. The victims would be asked if they were humble or told to say that they were humble. Some victims would be stripped and forced to engage in humiliating acts. Their genitals would be grabbed and squeezed, and their bare buttocks would be slapped. If a victim said no or fought it, it would only get worse. It would happen in the locker room, on the bus and on road trips.”

John Doe I “was frequently abused, including physically

harmed by being grabbed and pulled by his genitals.”

“Knowing what was coming, (John Doe II) fell to the ground face down, and tried to protect his genitalia,” the lawsuit alleges regarding an event in November 2022. “There was nothing else he could do to protect himself, as he is much smaller than his attackers, who easily overpowered and overwhelmed him.”

“From (John Doe II’s) vantage point, the atmosphere was very different during the two seasons when he was student manager,” the lawsuit says. “Coach (Chris) Jans had exercised far more control over the team than he saw when Coach Heiar took over. He describes the way the team acted on the two successive seasons as being like night and day.”

No response was given by Moccia or NMSU spokesperson Justin Bannister, who said the school does not comment on pending litigation.

Q: I know Matt LeBlanc had a couple of series after "Friends." What has he been doing lately?

A: Not a lot professionally since his CBS sitcom "Man With a Plan" ended in 2020. He famously appeared with his former fellow stars in the 2021 streaming special "Friends: The Reunion," which still can be found on Max, and it's quite touching to watch the embraces and memories shared by him and the other five actors with whom he shared so much time – and success – over the decade-long run of that much-repeated show (which was seen originally on NBC).

LeBlanc also was part of a 2021 "Top Gear" special that paid tribute to the late race driver Sabine Schmitz, who appeared often on that BBC series. LeBlanc's presence on that special acknowledged his own presence on "Top Gear" as a presenter on episodes that were spread over four seasons, after his participation as a guest. He was required to be in England to make the show, and he ultimately decided to leave that job and remain largely in the U.S.

It's not new for LeBlanc to take extended breaks from television work. He also did that after the NBC run of the "Friends" spinoff "Joey," and what was planned as one year off became five, with the actor eventually returning (and playing a variation of himself) in the Showtime comedy series "Episodes." He won a Golden Globe Award for that show, then he spent four seasons on "Man With a Plan."

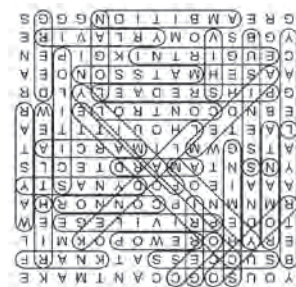

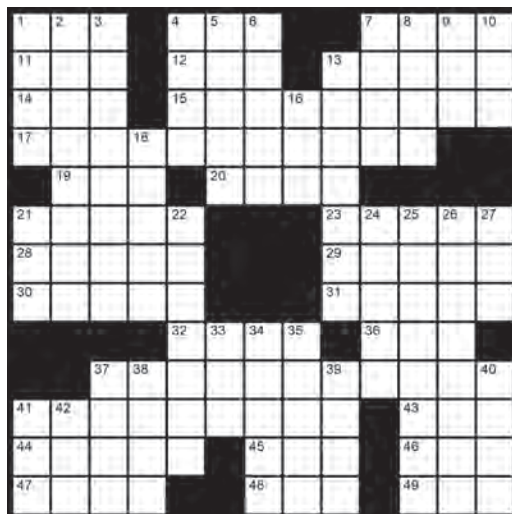

REVIEW: exactly 'As You Like It' Agave Gallery welcomes new artist, artist of the month

"All the world's a stage
| And all the men and
women merely players |
They have their exits and
their entrances | And
one man in his time plays
many parts."

If ever there was a
speech by Shakespeare
more agreeable for a re-
view, I can't imagine it.
And that this was so agree-
ably spoken by Darcy Har-
man in the role of Jacques
in the New Mexico State
University Theatre Depart-
ment's current production
of "As You Like It" made it
all the sweeter.

The production honors
the 400th anniversary of
Shakespeare's first folio
published in 1623. It also
honors the very best of
NMSU theatre – "such
stuff as dreams are made
on" (Shakespeare's "The
Tempest") – the pageantry
and eloquence, the toil and
tears, the heart, the love
and the magic.

"And thereby hangs a
tale," as Jacques also says.
For this production comes
to life because of the time
and talent invested in it by
about 60 people.

"As You Like It" has
a marvelous cast of 20
NMSU and community ac-
tors and a production staff
of nearly 40 students, staff
and community members
that includes a fight chore-
ographer (Joseph Lopez)
and fight captain (An-
gelique Reagan, who also
played multiple parts in
the show), intimacy coordi-
nator (Bobbi Masters) and
a welder (Judith Villalva).

New Theatre Depart-
ment faculty and staff
were costume, lighting and
scenic designers, including
the set's fabulous climb-
able trees.

"There were
a lot of new
skills learned
and practiced
for this one
from working
with Shake-
spearean text,
to set construc-
tion and scenic
painting, to
using the fly
system and
to construc-
tion of some
pretty intricate
period-inspired
costumes," the
play's director, Larissa
Lury, told me.

Elia Vasquez (Orlando),
Eliza Phillips (Rosalind)
and Athena McPeake
(Celia) are so powerful
in "As You Like It" lead
roles, and equally strong
are the supporting players,
who filled the Mark and
Stephanie Medoff Theatre
with the poetry and pas-
sion, the joy and genius
of the world's greatest
playwright, one of his best
plays and a truly outstand-
ing NMSU production.

"It is a strong ensemble,
who really work together
to make (the show) what it
is," Lury said.

The work of composer
Lisa Hermanson and the
songs Lury included in the
show, "Take Me Back,"
by Sara Ellen Jarosz and
"Inside Outside," which
Lury co-wrote with Mike
Simses, added even more
to this grand pageant.

Kudos to Elia Vasquez
(violin), Ben Ramsey
(guitar), Greta Greenblatt
(bass), Vance Cook (uke-
lele) and Eliza Phillips
(ukelele) who played their
instruments in character
and added immeasurably
to the show.

and weaving, Agave said.

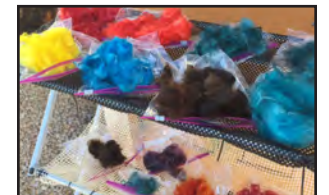

Classic comes to screen

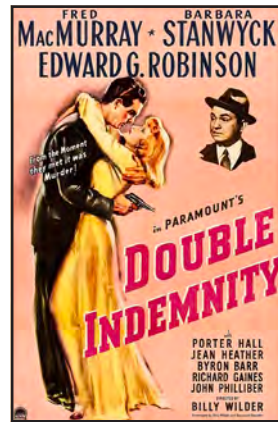

Author, scholar, performer shares fun, power of burlesque

Lynn Sally is an author, scholar and burlesque performer who has made her home in Las Cruces since 2019.

A California native, Sally lived in New York City for two decades and continues to teach there seasonally. She was traveling across the United States in an RV in 2018, writing her second book, “Neo-Burlesque: Striptease as Transformation,” when she made a stop in Albuquerque, hosting a burlesque show at the Kimo Theatre. In Truth or Consequences, she hosted several shows at the civic center and the Mr. Fiesta drag show fundraiser.

Sally settled in Las Cruces where she is renovating an old adobe home in the downtown area. Despite some online attacks – “drag queens dancing half-naked in front of our children” is a paraphrase of one comment

– her New Mexico shows have been “surprisingly well received,” Sally said.

With a Ph.D. in performance studies and a masters in gender studies and feminist theory, she taught an online class, “Performing Gender: Camp, Drag & Burlesque,” last semester at NMSU (and she would like to teach it again), and continues teaching The History of American Burlesque at NYU.

“I was impressed with the students at NMSU,” Sally said. “They were really engaged and had a love for drag. It was the most exciting class I’ve ever taught -- exciting for me, for the (17) students and for NMSU to have this course offered,” she said.

“Imagine something and become it; I think that’s what is so compelling about drag,” Sally said. Drag “offers a gender-fluid

version of self. It’s what kids are exploring today.”

Her classes allow students “to express themselves,” she said.

“Gender is a social construct,” she said.

Many people don’t understand what identifying as transgender or queer really means, she said.

For example, an NYU student of hers chose to identify as queer because, for her, to identify as a woman was to identify with powerlessness and an inability to break the patriarchal system.

Sally’s first burlesque class at NYU was filled with “young, beautiful people,” she said. They decided to not only study burlesque but do their own show.

Each student in New York and Las Cruces creates the concept for the performance, designs the choreography, creates the character, makes the costume and

chooses the music.

“That’s what’s exciting about burlesque and drag; the individual literally creates everything.

Sally said. That’s exciting for young people.”

It can also create “an experience for the audience that allows them to have fun, get outside their mundane lives and get away from the TV and see something they’ve never seen before.”

Sally has hosted shows around New Mexico, including Dr. Lucky’s Blue Revue in Albuquerque and PEEKSHOW, which toured the state with nine events and workshops in eight days earlier this year. She and PEEKSHOW artist Peekaboo Pointe were featured at the NMSU Art Museum, and in August, Thomas Branigan Memorial Library hosted her book talk.

Making crucial distinctions in the mideast trials

Christians often refer to Israel as “the Holy Land.” This is an allusion to the fact Jesus walked these highways and byways millennia ago. It may also refer to the notion the land, so revered throughout the Old Testament, is hallowed because, according to the story, God ceded it to the Hebrews who were escaping from captivity in Egypt. That escape is at the heart of the principal annual celebration in Judaism, Passover. Any glance at the New Testament shows the church began as a movement within the developing Judaism of the

time – and that history also contributes to the idea of holiness. We need, for the moment, to back away from that religious terminology.

Fast forward to today. We have seen an alarming amount of antisemitism in the USA recently, which has escalated since the hostilities between Israel and Gaza began earlier this year.

But wait. Stop and think for a moment. We need to draw a distinction between the contemporary state of Israel, which stands culpable for universal human rights violations and sanctions like

any other nation in the world, and Jewish people worldwide.

Israel is not Judaism. While Israel is now a state to which Jewish people fled after the Holocaust, and continue to migrate as a revered homeland, the nation itself is a rather odd combination of traditionalist Judaism and secular polity. It is not automatically antisemitic to criticize the nation of

Israel for faults in the international arena, including those recent attacks on Gaza. It is antisemitic to blame and target Jews as if they were responsible, by being Jewish, for actions deemed wrong committed by the Israeli government.

The protests seen on elite university campuses in recent weeks are a reminder that Jews have suffered ostracism and obloquy through the centuries simply by being themselves.

At the same time, we have got to recognize the Palestinians are not represented by nor equivalent to Hamas. Hamas is a militant movement within the Palestinian community whose goal is the erasure of Israel as a country. Hamas has, in fact, since its inception, completely refused any talk of a two-state solution and has called for jihad against Israel. We’ve got to recognize the Palestinians have been

abandoned by various Islamic countries. The Palestinians have not been welcomed everywhere, and they have been hampered in their efforts to come to terms with Israel by fractures in their own community, which have consistently led to the lack of any united front to bring to a peace table.

Both sides, meaning the movement of Hamas and the state of Israel, are culpable for the current disaster in Israel and Gaza. Neither one should nor can be let off the hook for the suffering that is currently ongoing in the region.

Hamas’s attack against Israel was horrendous. Israel’s response has been equally horrendous.

We should also remember a large contingent of Israelis (and Americans) have protested the Netanyahu government’s policies, particularly regarding new settlements, for years, to little avail. Certainly not all Palestin-

ians, 99 percent of whom are Muslim, back Hamas, either.

So, let’s call genuine antisemitism what it is.

It’s an ugly remnant of centuries of persecution, and it is certainly not helpful in the current situation.

An attempt to assign moral superiority to Hamas, furthermore, is dangerous. Hamas is no knight in shining armor come to free Palestinians; their callous disregard of their own people demonstrates that. Attempts to hold the Jewish people collectively guilty for the sins of the nation of Israel are similarly dangerous. We need balance in our assessment, calm voices to prevail, and we must dispel these old stereotypes.

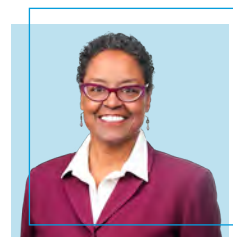

Learning to reduce your risk of lung cancer

MEMORIAL MEDICAL CENTER REPORT

Thanks to movies, TV shows, and extensive public awareness campaigns, lung cancer has long been a part of the public consciousness.

Many Americans recognize the disease is strongly linked to smoking, and its symptoms include coughing, wheezing and persistent chest pain. This awareness is a good thing – the first step in fighting lung cancer is learning its risk factors and early warning signs.

Unfortunately, many facts about lung cancer are not as widely known. For instance, not every lung cancer victim is a smoker. And not all lung cancer patients will experience symptoms – at least, not until the disease has progressed. That’s why it’s important to understand your other risk factors, and to screen for cancer early, at the recommendation of your care provider.

November is National Lung Cancer Awareness Month. Reduce your cancer risk through the following practices:

Quit Smoking

Tobacco products, such as cigarettes, cigars and pipes, remain the No. 1 risk factor for lung cancer. If you are a current smoker, quitting will drastically reduce your risk – however, it won’t eliminate it entirely. Former smokers are still at higher risk than the general population, and should consult their provider about the screenings and treatments they may need to stay healthy.

If you or someone you love is looking to quit smoking, you can find tips, articles and support at www.smokefree.gov, or call 800-QUIT-NOW (800-784-8669) to get connected.

Know Your Risk Factors

Smoking isn’t your only risk factor: the CDC estimates that 10-20 percent of lung cancer cases occur

in people who have never smoked. If you are a non-smoker, you can reduce your risk by avoiding carcinogens such as asbestos, air pollution and second-hand smoke. Genetic factors, such as personal or family history of lung cancer, can also increase your cancer risk.

Recognize the Symptoms

Signs of lung cancer vary from person to person, and may change depending on how far the disease has progressed. Most people will experience no symptoms early on. Symptoms may include:

- Coughing that gets worse or doesn’t go away
- Chest pain
- Shortness of breath
- Wheezing
- Coughing of blood
- Constant feeling of being very tired
- Weight loss without a known cause
- Repeated instances of pneumonia

• Swollen or enlarged lymph nodes inside the chest area between the lungs

Some of these signs may also indicate conditions other than lung cancer. If you experience any of these symptoms, talk to your provider immediately.

Get Screened

Because the signs of lung cancer may take a while to appear, waiting for symptoms is not the best way to detect cancer. Between 2016 and 2020, nearly half of all lung cancer cases were diagnosed when the disease had already spread to distant parts of the body. Once the disease

has spread, treatment is much less effective.

Thankfully, modern screening technologies such as a low-dose computed tomography (LDCT) scan can detect lung cancer before symptoms appear.

An LDCT scan uses special X-ray equipment and advanced technology to help identify suspicious spots on the lungs that may be cancerous. It is a simple test and usually takes less than one minute to complete.

While the LDCT scan is highly effective, it does carry some risk – over-testing can be expensive and may lead to false positive

results. The LDCT scan is recommended for patients who:

- Have a history of heavy smoking (1 pack per day for 20 years or 2 packs per day for 10 years) and
- Smoke now or have quit within the past 15 years and
- Are between 55 and 77 years old.

Vamos Niños: a unique mobile learning lab

A collective of early childhood stakeholders has been working tirelessly to address the quality of early childhood education in Doña Ana County. Only 4,856 (36 percent) of Doña Ana County's children are found to be enrolled in high quality, evidence-based early childhood education, and only 29 percent of children are ready for kindergarten in literacy and math (Community Needs Assessment, NMSU CCA, 2022). Children who have access to high quality early childhood education programs are more likely to be

school-ready when they enter kindergarten, less likely to be placed in special education, less likely to be retained in a grade, and more likely to graduate from high school.

The intention of the work was to create an early learning hub for the county to connect families with young children to early childhood resources and supports. With accessibility at the forefront of their concerns, the idea evolved into developing a mobile children's museum as the means to that end, and creating opportunities for play, interactive fun and learning, and family engagement as key elements to extending opportunities for quality early childhood experi-



ences to families, especially in the county's most rural communities.

Progress toward completion of this project has been made possible thanks to the Success Partnership's Early Childhood Education (ECE) Coalition, and visionary donors who've made this dream a reality. The Ngage New Mexico team is passionate about powering Vamos Niños: Play to Learn Mobile Children's Museum. It will make its grand debut as Southern New Mexico's first mobile

children's museum in the spring of 2024.

Vamos Niños has the potential to impact over 221,000 families in Doña Ana County alone, as well as many more throughout the entire Southern New Mexico region. Because the museum is intended to tour underserved areas of the county, including the colonias, Vamos Niños will provide bilingual STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Math) programming to these communities. Fundamentally address-

ing the whole child (physical, cognitive, social and emotional) by increasing school readiness for learning, play and experimentation by focusing on early childhood development and education of children aged 3-5.

Last time, Oct. 27, Centennial's Hawks defeated LCHS's Bulldawgs 30-23.

The Bulldawgs, seeded No. 7, advanced in the playoffs by silencing 10-seed Los Lunas, 42-6, Nov. 3, at the Field of Dreams. The Hawks, seeded No. 2, earned a first-round bye after finishing undefeated (5-0) in district play and 7-2 overall.

LCHS, who finished 4-1 in district, is

In the other state playoff game in Las Cruces Nov. 3, Mesilla Valley Christian School had its five-game winning streak snapped, falling 52-36 in the semifinals of the class 2A 8-man state playoffs. The SonBlazers finished the season 8-3.

Aggie athletics roundup ...

Women's volleyball: NM State heads into the final week of the regular season on a high note. The Aggies swept a pair of Conference USA matches Nov. 3-4 from Sam Houston in the Pan American Center, winning both 3-2 on Senior Day.

The Aggies will take their 17-9 overall record (9-5 in conference) on the road to Miami for matches against Florida International Nov. 10-11.

The Conference USA postseason tournament will take place the following weekend in Lynchburg, Virginia, home to Liberty University.

NM State is currently tied for third with UTEP in the conference USA standings. Western Kentucky is sitting in first place, with a 24-4 overall record and 14-0 in conference. Middle Tennessee is in second place at 11-3 in conference play.

Women's soccer:

After defeating Sam Houston 2-0 Nov. 3 to reach the finals in the Conference USA women's soccer tournament, NM State fell Nov. 5 to Liberty 2-1. The tournament took place in Ruston, Louisiana.

The Aggies went into

the tournament seeded No. 1 after winning the regular-season C-USA championship, and Liberty was seeded No. 2.

The tournament final was a re-match of a Sept. 30 game in which NM State defeated Liberty on the road 2-0.

In the final, Liberty went up 1-0 early, and the Aggies tied it 1-1 going into halftime with a goal from Gia Valenti. It stayed 1-1 until the 86th minute of the scheduled 90-minute match, when Liberty scored again. It was the Aggies' first loss in C-USA play, and ends their season at 10-6-3.

Aggie basketball seasons getting under way

Last year, the Aggies showed improvement in their first year under head coach Jody Adams. NM State finished 18-17 overall and 10-8 in the last year of Western Athletic Conference

play. Those numbers were considerably better than the 2021-22 season, which saw the Aggies go 10-19 overall and 6-12 in conference.

The Aggies can again expect solid work from senior guard Molly Kaiser who was named last month to

the Conference USA pre-season all-conference team. Kaiser led the Aggies last season in both scoring (13.0 points per game), assists (2.0 ppg) and steals (1.4 ppg), and chipped in 3.1 rebounds per game.

Also returning for the Aggies are Sabou Gueye, a junior guard; Ene Adams, a senior forward; Sianny Sanchez-Oliver, a junior guard; Sylena Peterson, a junior guard; Lucia Yenes, a sophomore forward; and Fama Thiam, a graduate-student guard.

There are several newcomers as well, ranging from a freshman to a graduate student. Imani Warren, a highly regarded 5-10 guard, comes to the Aggies from Rufus King High School in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Maiya Bergdoff, a 5-11 junior forward, was the leading scorer and rebounder at Three Rivers, a junior college in Missouri. Femme

Sikuzani Masudi, a 6-5 graduate student, is a center who played the last two seasons at the University of Texas.

MEN: For the Aggie men's basketball team, the 2023-24 season is starting from scratch.

New head coach Jason Hooten assembled a brand-new squad with players from Canada to the Congo, and from seven different American states, and an Australian thrown in for good measure.

None have played together on the collegiate level.

NM State opened its season Monday, Nov. 6, on the road against the University of Kentucky, losing 86-46 to the 16th-ranked Wildcats.

The home opener, against Sul Ross State Wednesday, Nov. 8, ended after the Bulletin's Wednesday deadline, so the result was unavailable for the

newspaper, but check our website, www.lascrucesbulletin.com to see the final score.

The Aggies' next home game is 7 p.m. Tuesday, Nov. 14, against Western New Mexico in the Pan American Center. Despite their lack of playing time together, players on the Aggie roster don't lack playing time at a high level.

Four seniors on the roster – 6-6 guard Brandon Suggs, 6-6 guard Femi Odukale, 6-10 forward Kaosi Ezeagu, and 6-2 guard Jordan Rawls – have all played 86 or more games at the NCAA Division I level. And junior guard Christian Cook started 52 games for Division II Northeastern (Okla.) State, leading the team in scoring last season.

Bowl-bound Aggies now head to Western Kentucky

Let the speculation begin.

The NM State Aggie football team is now bowl-eligible after defeating Middle Tennessee 13-7 Nov. 4 at the Homecoming game at Aggie Memorial Stadium.

The official postseason bowl schedule won't be announced until Sunday, Dec. 3, but that won't stop fans from speculating which bowl game the Aggies, now 7-3, will make.

Athlon Sports, in its Nov. 6 bowl projections, had the Aggies playing UNLV in the Dec. 16 New Mexico Bowl in Albuquerque. But there is a lot of football to be played, and the projections can change with each game. Last week,

Athlon projected NM State to be in the New Orleans Bowl, another of the eight bowls with a Conference USA tie-in.

Before any post-season bowling, however, the Aggies have a different color of "bowling" to tend to.

Bowling Green, Kentucky, to be exact, where the Aggies face Western Kentucky in a conference game 1:30 p.m. Mountain Time, Saturday, Nov. 11. Western Kentucky is 5-4 overall and 3-2 in C-USA after defeating UTEP 21-13 Nov. 4 in El Paso.

The Aggies struggled offensively in the victory against Middle Tennessee, with their lowest point total of the season, and only scored three points in the second half. Fortunately for NM State, the Aggie

defense equaled its lowest point total allowed of the season, and were able to keep Middle Tennessee out of the end zone after a furious drive that started at their own 10-yard-line, and ended on an incomplete fourth-down pass from the Aggie 15-yard-line as time expired.

It was the fifth straight win for NM State.

"I'm excited for the kids," said Aggie head coach Jerry Kill about the bowl-clinching victory. "Because it's about the players. It's not about anything else. It's not about Coach Kill. It's not about assistant coaches. It's not about anybody. It's about the players."

The Aggies also have a good shot at playing in the Conference USA

championship game Saturday, Dec. 2.

The game will be played between the top two regular-season conference finishers and will be at the home field of the first-place team, which almost certainly will be at Liberty in Virginia.

Liberty is undefeated in conference play and in first place at 7-0, with only UTEP left to play in C-USA games. The Aggies are tied for second place with Jacksonville State, as both teams are 5-1. For each team, the only conference loss so far is to Liberty.

If the Aggies defeat Western Kentucky this weekend, and if Jacksonville State defeats Louisiana Tech Nov. 18 at home

in Jacksonville, Alabama, the second-place position and a berth in the conference championship game would be decided at the Aggies' final home game of the season, when they host Jax State Nov. 25 in a 2 p.m. game at Aggie Memorial Stadium.

Jax State lost Nov. 4 on the road 38-28 at South Carolina from the Southeast Conference. The Aggies also have a Southeast Conference foe

on the schedule, as they travel to Auburn for a Nov. 18 game.

Regardless of where the Aggies go for their bowl game, it will mark the first time NM State has qualified for bowls in back-to-back seasons in 63 years.

The last time the Aggies went bowling back-to-back was 1959 and 1960, when they played in, and won, the Sun Bowl in El Paso, defeating North Texas in 1959 and Utah State in 1960.

Last year, in NM State's final season as a football independent, and Kill's first season as head coach, the Aggies defeated Bowling Green in the 2022 Quick Lane Bowl in Detroit.

The other two bowl games the Aggies played in were the 1935 Sun Bowl, in which they tied Hardin-Simmons, and the 2017 Arizona Bowl, where they defeated Utah State.

With no defeats, their overall bowl record is 4-0-1.

Learn to practice while practicing to get better

It is my considered opinion recreational golfers don't spend near enough time practicing.

High- or middle-handicap golfers long to get much better with their game, and often buy a new driver or other clubs, hoping to solve the problem.

These folks should be booking lessons and spending much more time practicing. Lessons are really necessary for everyone; even tour pros have their own private swing coaches, mental coaches and others in their "team."

But here, let's focus on practice. We must realize we need to learn to practice in order to learn golf, especially for beginners.

First, write down four or five of your main goals for improvement. Whether it is swing tempo, distance

with woods, accuracy with irons, eliminating three-putts, you need to write the goals so you can practice with purpose.

Eighty percent of your faults, mistakes and problems come from 20 percent of your clubs.

Have a plan for your practice sessions. It does no good to empty a bucket and beat balls onto the range with no sense of what you are trying to accomplish. I see it all the time.

When we go to the practice range it's important to warm up before even pulling out a club. That lets you swing with most of your flexibility, instead of wasting a dozen swings. It's also a good idea to start a practice session hitting

pitching wedges, or other short irons, with easy swings, instead of flailing away at your driver. Go through a specific pattern of clubs to hit in a specific manner. At least half the time you should carefully line up your shot and use your pre-

shot routine like you do on the golf course, even though you are on the range. It creates a habit. We may think we are hitting good shots on the range, but maybe we aren't aiming at targets that are specific enough. Fairways on practice ranges are wide; fairways on the golf course, not so much.

There are other important practice routines. You should always visit at least

one fundamental each time you practice. By "fundamental," I mean a basic in your swing or set-up, such as grip, stance, weight shift, aim, tempo or posture. A breakdown in one's game usually happens as a result of a fundamental gone wrong. If you are making the same swing mistake on the golf course, work to correct it on the range. Practice is a time for eliminating mistakes and solving problems. Keep a handy small notebook for "notes to self" on swing thoughts, failures, problems and so on. Write down reminders of key shots you're going to need to hit during tournament play, or important money games, so you can prepare for those shots. In addition, work on "trouble" shots, such as downhill lies and

side-hill lies, or keeping the ball low under tree branches in your way. The range is where to dial in the feel for certain shots and yardages, by understanding how you hit the ball and how it feels, and then check the distance. The way you can get better, Hogan said, is to "dig it out of the dirt." Later, Tiger repeated that sentiment.

Golf practice should include rounds on the course, where you can play from distances and places of your own choosing and replay shots to get the right feel for them. I like to do that when the course is not busy so I'm in no rush and don't hold anybody up. That's what playing lessons on the golf course are for – to have your pro see how you do with golf course rather than range

conditions.

The short game, especially chipping and bunker play, and putting practice should make up 30-40 percent of your practice efforts. Practicing putting is a topic all its own. In terms of functions the golf swing means gross motor skills and putting constitutes fine motor skills, like the difference between throwing a football and playing the violin. More on this in a future column.
