# Columbia Elementary rebuild breaks ground

"Well, it's about time." Las Cruces Public Schools board member Bob Wofford opened his speech with a sentiment many might have been thinking Thursday morning, standing or sitting in folding chairs on slightly muddy ground prepared for construction of the new Columbia Elementary School.
The original school, built in 2003 on Elks Drive in northern Las Cruces, was abruptly closed in September 2018 over persistent and severe mold infestations that had plagued the school since it opened. The grounds of the school, sitting in an arroyo, were also subject to flooding, although the school district determined that flawed construction, rather than storm runoff, was behind the mold.
It was only after the school was shuttered that district staff cut into a wall and discovered that a subcontractor had evidently installed vapor barriers backwards, causing them to move moisture into the internal walls over the years, allowing mold to infiltrate and spread. By then, the building had been in service for 15 years.

In a single day, the entire elementary school shifted to the campus of Centennial High School, 10 miles away, and has remained there for over five years without a permanent building of its own.

The school board agonized publicly in deciding whether to rehabilitate the original building or

demolish it, and where to build a new school. Ultimately, the school building was torn down in 2022 with plans to construct a new building retaining the original name, at a different spot on the same property.

The entire student body of Columbia was present, many of the girls in colorful ballet folklorico dresses and all wearing small construction helmets colored orange, yellow, blue, pink, gleaming in the sun like a field of Easter eggs.

Construction equipment flanked the ceremony as workers with contractor HB Construction looked on. Architect Ray Vigil was seated in the audience.
Among those Wofford thanked during his speech was Centennial, for continuing to house the elementary school over several years, and county voters who approved bond issues needed to complete
funding for the $\$ 64$ million project.

Wofford also talked about the school's name, chosen by the community in honor of the space shuttle Columbia, which disintegrated during a mission on Feb. 1, 2003, killing seven astronauts who were on board. Prior to the shuttle, Wofford walked through numerous historic seacraft that had worn the name.
"'Columbia' symbolizes renewal, inspiration, hope; it is ... the renewal of our country, personified," he said.

For the ceremonial groundbreaking, the district set up boxes of loose earth in two rows. District staff and three school board members joined Ruíz for the honors, while a row of Columbia students lined up in front.
The new school building will be larger than the original, at more than 103,000 square feet, enough to accommodate

752 students, with specialized classrooms serving pre-Kindergarten through fifth grade and modern computer technology and labs and spaces for art, music and science instruction. The campus will include an offsite retention pond to protect the grounds from runoff.
The district plans to have it ready for the 202526 school year.
"The facility is not just a structure," LCPS Superintendent Ignacio Ruíz said in a speech. "It's a bright beacon of our com-
mitment to nurturing the minds and hearts of our students."
When Columbia was shuttered, its student population was a little more than 500. Over the years at Centennial, enrollment has dwindled to "just under 200 " students, LCPS spokesperson Kelly Jameson told the Bulletin.

When the new Columbia opens, Jameson said, "We will need more staff, but it's unclear right now if we will hire additional or make adjustments from other schools."

# Las Cruces police: Crime rates decreased in 2023

Violent crime and property crime reports fell in 2023 compared to 2022, according to the Las Cruces Police Department.
Violent crime - a category encompassing shootings, sexual assaults, homicides, and robberies - fell by 18 percent while property crime - such as burglaries, break-ins, thefts, and shoplifting - decreased by 2 percent.
"It's definitely a positive result that we should celebrate," LCPD Chief Jeremy Story said during a town hall presentation on Jan. 23. "But we need to continue that overall trend in 2024."

## Violent crime falls 18 percent

Las Cruces typically has seen at least five homicides annually over the last 30 years, according to an analysis of the FBI's Uni-
form Crime Report. Since 2019, that average has increased to 10 per year. 2023 bucked that trend and saw seven homicides in Las Cruces.
The increase in homicides (nearly all of which were the result of gun violence in Las Cruces) is likely tied to the wave of aggravated assaults that flooded the city since 2016. In this context, the FBI and LCPD define aggravated assault as the use of force or the threat of the use of force. It includes fist fights, shootings and everything in between.
In the 1990s, Las Cruces police reported between 400 and 500 aggravated assaults per year. The total fell in the 2000s and the 2010s to a record low of 70 reports in 2016. The trend reversed that year, and by 2021, Las Cruces set a 30-year record high for aggravated assaults at 562. Story reported that the trend seems to be on the decline
again. He said Las Cruces reported 442 aggravated assaults in 2023.
Reports of sexual assault cases were down by 10 percent, from 60 reports to 54 reports. There's reason to be skeptical of this data point, however. Only one in three rapes are reported, according to a national survey from the U.S. Department of Justice.
Lastly, there was a 14 percent decrease in robberies, defined as taking someone's property by force. Incidents like carjackings, store hold-ups and muggings are included in this category. Las Cruces police reported 78 robberies in 2022 and 68 robberies in 2023.

The FBI's data shows that robbery reports were about twice as high in the 1990s compared to today. However, the interim 30 years saw a steady decrease interrupted by a spike in 2021, which reached 86.

## Property crime down 2 percent

Property crime dramatically increased in 2022 compared to 2021. However, that trend seems to have stabilized based on the 2023 reports, which saw a 2 percent decrease overall.
"That doesn't mean we're out of the woods, it doesn't mean we don't have a lot of work left to do, but it's hopefully a positive trend in the right direction," Story said.

A surge in vehicle thefts
buoyed the increase in property crime in 2022.

From 2016 to 2022, vehicle thefts ballooned more than 300 percent, from 233 to 939 . Nearly a decade of increased vehicle theft reports ended in 2023 with LCPD's report of 815 in 2023, a 13 percent decrease.

Other year-to-year property crime comparisons include:

- Residential burglary down 18 percent from 322 to 394.
- Commercial burglary down 4 percent from 385 to 371.
- Non-residential burglary down 22 percent from 186 to 226. - Breaking and entering down 28 percent from 189 to 137.
- Auto burglary up 4 percent from 1,161 to 1,208 .
- Felony larceny down 20 percent from 492 to 394
- Misdemeanor larceny down 9 percent from 1,243 to 1,137 . - Misdemeanor shoplifting up

## Former cinema to house Boys and Girls Club

The nonprofit Boys \& Girls Club of Las Cruces, which specializes in afterschool and summer youth development programs, finalized the purchase of a new property for the club's primary location, the organization announced this week.
The property, located at 1005 El Paseo Road, was the former Video 4 Theater owned by Allen Theatres. The Boys \& Girls Club said it is purchasing the building using federal American Rescue Plan Act funds it received through the city of Las Cruces. Its grant was for $\$ 1.388$ million, the club stated. The original asking price was $\$ 1.5$ million, the club said, but as "long-time supporters" of the Las Cruces

club, the organization said Allen Theatres had reduced the price to $\$ 700,000$, making an $\$ 800,000$ in-kind donation.
The club has been located in a former church at 330 W. Las Cruces Avenue since 1965.

The club said it plans to launch a capital campaign
to raise up to $\$ 10$ million this spring to renovate and expand the property, with the goal to triple its capacity for daily youth services, including the construction of a STEM lab, gymnasium, arts facilities and a separate wing for teen members.
In a statement, Allen

Theatres president Russell Allen said the Boys \& Girls Club "has been an incredible resource for kids in our community," and said the building made an appropriate now home, as the club had frequented the Video 4 cinemas on summer field trips in the past.
"The Allen family’s generosity has allowed us to forge ahead with the capital campaign and work to give our kids the Club they deserve," Boys \& Girls Club board president Kayla Fikany stated in a news release. "The Club is a 'home away from home' for these children and teens, and we are committed to building the infrastructure to expand to ensure as many youth as possible have access to our programs."

## Two men charged in fatal shooting

Two Las Cruces men face criminal charges after police say they shot a man in a dispensary parking lot.
Xavier Noe Altamirano,
20 , is charged with seconddegree murder and shooting at or from a motor vehicle. Jesus Adan Herrera, 36 , is charged with conspiracy to commit second-degree murder, tampering with evidence and possession of a firearm by a felon. The charges stem from the shooting death of 23-year-old Steven Alarcon on Dec. 23, 2023.
According to an affidavit, police believe Altamirano and Herrera drove to Top Crop at 2240 E. Lohman Avenue around 11 p.m. Police said surveillance footage covering
the dispensary's parking lot showed Alarcon walking up to Altamirano and Herrera, who sat in a truck. Police said the three men had gotten into an argument before Altamirano fired a gun several times out of the window, killing Alarcon. Altamirano was arrested a month on Jan. 23 in Las Cruces. According to the affidavit, police first arrested Herrera shortly after the shooting, then connected Altamirano to the killing. Las Cruces Det. David Benoit said in the affidavit police first identified Altamirano as the passenger by a set of rings he wore during the shooting. He wore the same rings, police said, when he and Herrera visited an El Paso mall days before the shooting.


# Protesters call for Gaza cease-fire

A group of about 40 demonstrators gathered downtown last Friday afternoon to protest the scale of civilian deaths and mass displacement amid overwhelming bombardments and a ground offensive in Gaza on the 112th day of Israel's war against Hamas, when the Gaza Health Ministry estimated the death toll in Gaza at over 26,000 .

Organizers said the purpose was not to take a side in the conflict but rather to reject the toll on civilian life in the occupied territory, which they called a genocide, and to call for a ceasefire. Coincidentally, the action fell on the same day that the International Court of Justice in the Hague warned Israel to ensure its military actions do not violate the 1948 Genocide Convention and to prevent incitements to genocide against Palestinians.

Organizers of the Las Cruces gathering said they were nonhierarchically organized and used social media, Instagram in particular, to invite the public for peaceful demonstrations. Their first gathering, over a week prior, drew just six people, they said, expressing confidence that the community willing to

take a public stand for peace was growing.
Participants pounded on drums, displayed signs with messages calling for a ceasefire and the end of occupation with statements such as "End the genocide now," "Palestinians are people" and "Injustice anywhere is a threat to justice everywhere." There were two Palestinian flags on display and chants of "Viva, viva, Palestina" and "Biden, Biden, you can't
hide; we charge you with genocide," taking the U.S. president to task for unrestricted military and other aid to Israel, a close ally.

Another chant the group vocalized was "From the river to the sea, Palestine will be free," which has been subject to angry debate nationwide, interpreted by some as a decades-old aspirational call for freedom compatible with a two-state solution and by others as a vow to eliminate

the state of Israel. When asked about the chant, organizers recommended the public research the slogan's history, which predates Hamas.
Hamas, for its part, has employed the slogan while maintaining a policy of driving Israel off of lands between the Jordan River and the Mediterranean Sea. On Oct. 7, Hamas executed a large-scale offensive against Israel, killing around 1,200 and abducting around 240 , to which Israel responded with overwhelming military force.

The Las Cruces demonstra-
tors, comprising a range of age groups and ethnic backgrounds, demonstrated for several minutes at the corner of Picacho and Main as rush hour traffic began, near the Thomas Branigan Memorial Library, before marching to the entrance of City Hall. Security personnel at the city building asked the protesters to refrain from drumming outside the entrance but welcomed them to hold a vigil. Instead, the group proceeded to march through downtown on

1. Unmaintained buried steel gas piping may be subject to the potential hazards of corrosion and subsequent gas leakage.
2. Buried gas piping should be:
a. Periodically inspected for leaks.
b. Periodically inspected for corrosion if the piping is metallic.
c. Repaired if unsafe conditions are found.
3. Before excavating near buried gas piping, the piping should be located, marked, and excavated by hand.
4. Licensed gas fitters/plumbers and contractors can assist in performing the required inspections described in 2 above, making leak repairs, and locating the buried gas piping prior to the start of any planned excavation.

Main Street, which was sparse at that hour. The demonstrators made their way to the federal courthouse on Church Street and gathered there to hold an open forum for people to express their views, passing a megaphone around.

There were few encounters with passers-by on Friday, given the time of day and locations. On Picacho, a few cars honked to signal solidarity. At the courthouse, vehicles stopped at the

LCPD also had fewer

Church Street traffic signal occasionally heckled them. One man in a brown pickup truck was so incensed he drove around the block, parked and approached the group to holler insults at them before storming off.
On Saturday, when a smaller contingent walked to the Las Cruces Farmers' and Crafts Market downtown, organizers said they met with physical resistance, reporting that two men intentionally bumped shoulders with marchers while someone handing out leaflets was aggressively shoved.

Story reported a 21 percent decrease in use of force reports, from 328 in 2022 to 260 in 2023.
"Keep in mind, use of force is a wide spectrum," Story said. "That's anything from forced stabilization to non-compliant handcuffing to taser and other intermediate force to all the way up to deadly force."

Story said most force use is on the lower end of the spectrum.
"Even so, having a 21 percent reduction is significant," Story said.

## A buffoonish impeachment

At this writing, the House of Representatives is likely to vote next week not on bipartisan legislation pertaining to the southern border, but on impeaching Homeland Security Secretary Alejandro Mayorkas. This would make him the first cabinet secretary to be impeached since 1876.

This seems to be a more attractive use of the public's time than governance.

We who live, work, raise families and run businesses in the borderlands know the need for sound policy and
adequate resources, addressing crime, humanitarian need, the right to seek asylum and industrial development.

House Repub licans have been signaling their opposition to legislative compromise. Texas Congressman Troy Nehls laid it bare in a comment for CNN: "I'm not willing to do too damn much right now to help a Democrat and to help Joe Biden's approval rating." Moreover, the likely Republican presidential

nominee has made it clear he intends to make the border crisis a key campaign issue, for which any progress would be inconvenient.
Thus, a national emergency supposedly dire enough to merit impeachment of federal officers does not, on the other hand, require short-term measures on which the governing parties can agree. This is not about policy.

Republicans once complained, with justification, of loose talk by
advocacy groups about impeaching President Donald Trump at the outset of his administration, before he even had an opportunity to commit an impeachable offense. Impeachment is a messy remedy vulnerable to political faction. It presents a dangerous intervention requiring the utmost discipline and rigor. Its use was once rare. Now, after Trump was impeached twice (but not convicted), our representatives are distracted by tit-for-tat impeachment threats that amount to showboating with no remedy or path
to governance.
Indeed, the articles that cleared a House panel Tuesday night present an impossible standard for any head of Homeland Security and simple disagreements with White House policy Republicans also faulted Mayorkas over a terminated asylum deal with Guatemala that he had nothing to do with, because, well, why not?
While our border communities and migrant families suffer, and actual criminals carry on with business, the House is captive to opportunism and buffoonery.

## Celebrating the restoration of sight

"Throw my brain in a hurricane

And the blind can have my eyes

And the deaf can have both of my ears

If they don't mind the size."

I wasn't blind yet when I had cornea transplant surgery in my left eye a couple of weeks ago, but I'm told that would have likely been my eventual fate.

I was diagnosed with Fuch's dystrophy, which impacts a thin layer of cells that pump fluid to the cornea. The loss of those cells causes fluid to build up on the cornea, leading to cloudy vision and, over time, blisters that can break and be-
come infected.
The surgery to restore that layer of cells truly is a modern miracle. And I'm incredibly grateful to the local doctors who first diagnosed the problem and the surgery team in El Paso. But it's a miracle that can't happen without a donated cornea.
I'd like to thank the person whose donation will restore the vision in my left eye. But, of course, I can't. That's not possible with posthumous organ donations. Donors trust that their gifts will help others, knowing they will never be thanked for them.

I respect those whose religious beliefs don't allow for organ donations. For the rest of us, it's an opportunity to help others in ways that all of the money in the world can't buy.
In New Mexico residents can register online through New Mexico Donor Services at donatelifenm.org. It only takes a few minutes, and while you are on that site you can learn more about organ, eye and tissue donations, and read about some of the people who have been helped by them.

According to the
group's website, an average of 20 people die each
day while waiting for an organ. Alanna TootoosisBaker was nearly one of them. She had decided that she would only stay on respiratory machines for two more weeks while waiting for a lung transplant. She had said her goodbyes to those she loved. Then, on April 19, her husband got the call they had been waiting for.
"It was Easter Sunday that year when I went into surgery," she said. "Waking up ... just being able to breathe on your own, it's amazing because there was a time I couldn't."
I wasn't able to find current statistics, but information on the state's Department of Health website showed that in 2014 there were 757 New

Mexicans on the waiting list for an organ transplant. For many of the people now on that list, it is literally a race against death.
There will come a time, perhaps in my lifetime, when scientists will find a way to replicate human organs and tissue in the lab. Until then, organ donations are literally the gift of life. Or, in my case, the gift of sight.
I can't thank my donor, but I do have the opportunity to send a note to his or her family. I'm struggling to find the right words. Everything I've come up with so far seems insufficient.

As coastal areas see higher and higher tides and damage from increas ingly violent storms and islands in some areas appear to be threatened by rising waters, we continue to pretend that it is not serious enough to act. People still want to drive their
big gas-guzzling trucks, resisting the move to more efficient vehicles; buy all kinds of stuff made from or wrapped in plastics which probably will end up in the ocean; and use water resources as if they come from an unending supply of clean drinking water.

Now this is not a holier-than-thou diatribe. I realize that I am as guilty as anyone, and I understand the resistance to giving up many things that we use and enjoy. I drive an internal combustion engine truck. I try to recycle, but I know that it is a fraction of what I use or consume. I water my lawn and plants whenever I want to. I buy products that are probably made overseas, where there are little or no environmental regulations. I also know that all of this is woven into our current society and will be extremely difficult to change.

I pray that Bill Maher is wrong, but I also fear that he may be right.

Kudos to Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham, Rep. Nathan Small (Chair of the House Appropriations Committee) and the Department of Transportation for creating a wildlife crossings program to reduce the thousands of wildlife vehicle collisions a year - invariably fatal to the critter and likely to dent the driver's vehicle and wallet. Exact numbers of collisions and their costs in millions are hard to determine because many crashes are not reported

As an advocate for re-
storing lobos (Mexican gray wolves), I know that only natural causes and poaching kill more of this endangered icon. Unfortunately, highways can be zones of death for New Mexico's wildlife following natural travel corridors.

One great thing about the current program is that, since 2019, it grew gradually and thoughtfully from an initial study to the present $\$ 50,000,000$ appropriation. With measured steps, the Department, with extensive public input, identified priority wildlife corridors and problem areas. In 2021, the governor provided support through her executive
"30x30" order. Last year the legislature funded signage and fencing and a start on crossing structures. (It turns out that some animals can be funneled into new or existing culverts and underpasses while others are claustrophobic and prefer overpasses.)

Another plus for this program is that it is inclusive and provides benefits throughout the state: Current projects planned or under construction include collision "hot spots" near Ruidoso, Silver City, Taos, Cuba.

# 'Every ounce of courage' History, food memoir, remembers Filipina heroine

Lourdes "Lulu" Reyes brother Willie found himself pushed to walk as a prisoner of war as part of the infamous Bataan Death March in the Philippines during World War II's "War in the Pacific." But it was another survivor of that march, Corporal Robert Dow of the American Army Air Forces, who was also forced to march with 70,000 others on a 65 -mile trek which many did not survive, and who reached out many years later to Elizabeth Ann BesaQuirino to tell her about her mother.
"The phone rang here at home in New Jersey at midnight," Besa-Quirino said. "I let the machine take the message. It was the voice of a stranger who said, 'You don't know me, but your mother
saved my life."
Besa-Quirino picked up the phone Dow explained he was a war veteran of World War II and had been looking for Besa-Quirino's mother for more than 15 years to thank her for his life. He told her stories of her mother's kindness in a POW camp and how her mother smuggled malaria medications and other things to the prisoners.

That was 20 years ago. The friendship grew between Dow and Besa-Quirino and he shared first hand stories she never knew, and a list of books by authors who had written about Lulu. Thus, started a journey of research and delving into family history.
Gathering things together from her mother's writings, letters and publications already written, Besa-Quirino built a picture of what her mother's life was

"I started to piece things together," she said. "Three years ago, during the pandemic, I looked at everything and decided it was time to write my mother's stories."
The stories came together as a book, "Every Ounce of Courage, A Daughter's Reflections on Her Mother's Bravery."
With her own memories of her mother tied closely to the scents of the kitchen and Lulu's cooking, it was natural to frame the chapters in the book with those food senses. At the back of the book, 24 recipes allow the reader to recreate the smells and tastes from the kitchen Besa-Quirino grew up in.
"It took a long time to decide to write this book," she said. "I was encouraged

Q: I always enjoy watching James Stewart's movies. Did he ever do a television series?

A: Actually, he did a couple of them. The first was NBC's appropriately titled comedy "The Jimmy Stewart Show" (1971-72), in which he played a college professor living a relatively tranquil life with his son's (Jonathan Daly) family under the same roof Also featuring Julie Adams as the Stewart character's wife, the show also had Stewart playing his alter ego's grandfather in flashback sequences.
It didn't take Stewart long to try series TV again, though on a reduced schedule. During the 1973-74 season, he played the title role in "Hawkins," which was one of the rotating elements of "The New CBS Tuesday Night Movies." The law drama alternated with a television version of "Shaft" - with Richard Roundtree reprising his movie part - and a variety of one-shot original films. Eight episodes of "Hawkins" were made, including the pilot movie that aired earlier in 1973, and Stewart won a Golden Globe Award for the show.
After that, the actor's TV work was relatively occasional, and he was seen as himself more often than not. He made quite a few appearances as a member of the dais on NBC's "Dean Martin Celebrity Roasts," as is verified now by the marathons of those specials that Catchy Comedy runs from time to time. Stewart also made a memorable visit to "The Carol Burnett Show" for its final CBS episode in 1978, with his "reveal" at a piano clearly surprising an emotional Burnett, who was a longtime fan of his.

## Arts roundup

- New Mexico Arts, a division of New Mexico Department of Cultural Affairs, has offered two residential fellowships to support the work of local and national artists. Las Cruces-based artist, Marcus Xavier Chormicle, is one of the artists chosen for an Artist-inResidence program at the Lincoln Historic Site. His residency is from Feb. 23 -April 5. Chormicle is a multidisciplinary, lensbased artist, as well as a multidisciplinary musical composer and performance artist who creates work that focuses primar ily on family, memory and the intersection of class, race and history in the American Southwest. While in residence, Chormicle will explore the legacy of the Oryx species in Southern New Mexico as it relates to colonizing his tories of land and peoples in the region. The other fellowship goes to Dylan McLaughlin, Diné multimedia artist, educator and researcher who looks critically to share stories of ecological extraction and climate change, with
special attention to their impact on Indigenous communities, through his creative practice. He will be in residence from April 26-June 7.
- The Las Cruces Museums have two exhibitions investigating how artists relate to the natural environment. "Connection:: Conjunto" is at the Branigan Cultural Center, 501 N. Main St., and features artwork from The Border Artists in which they consider the connection between artists, the natural environment, and the community in which they live. At the Museum of Art, "The Desert Was Red and Red the Dust Was Raised," at the Museum of Art, 491 N. Main St., uses abstraction to consider the relationship between the desert landscape and how it influences an artist's imagery. The exhibitions run through March 23. ## Spiritual practices for everyday life

There is a triad for a healthy life: spirit, mind and body. Spiritual practices unlock and connect us. The spiritual is emotional experience, which opens us to the largesse
of our universe. Through it we can see we are not alone. We may begin to see something larger than ourselves and for many, this is comforting but also quite strengthening.

There are many pathways of such practices: study, exercise, and prayer,
and by prayer I include contemplative practices such as meditation. It's important to note that the word "spirit" comes to us from the Latin "spiritus," meaning breath. We might infer from this that any practice we do that involves our breath is
"spiritual." Yet it is clearly more than that. If we place our attention on our breath during any activity, we might call that a "spiritual" practice, even while simply sitting at our desks. In Genesis, it is said that Ruach HaKadosh created the world, that is, the spirit
of the holy one, or breath. Today, many spiritual teachers will admonish us to "just breathe." Long distance runners pace breath and footfalls in order to bring body and mind together. We might say breath is key to creativity as well as to the unifica-
tion of mind and body. Many would not include study as a spiritual practice, yet most religions require practitioners to study sacred texts. Study of the Hebrew scriptures, the Christian Bible, Bud-

# Oil and gas flexes muscle in Santa Fe

Large oil and gas companies gave nearly $\$ 800,000$ in the past 12 months to Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham (D), partisan legislative political action committees and individual state lawmakers, according to a partial review of campaign finance reports filed by lobbyists.
That amount almost certainly will grow in coming months due to a quirk in New Mexico's disclosure laws. Elected officials don't have to report contributions they
received in the last quarter of last year until this spring.

The amount of money the industry showers on elected officials offers a glimpse into the influence it has at the state Capitol during legislative sessions.

The industry's ability to shape legislation was on full display Thursday, Jan. 25, when a House committee substantively stripped a bill of new regulations that would have required oil and gas infrastructure to be set back more than a third of a mile from schools, health
facilities, multifamily housing, occupied homes and at least 300 feet from waterways.
The political giving reflects the industry's outsized dominance in a state that ranks second in oil production nationally and where more than 40 percent of funding for New Mexico's state budget can be tied directly to the industry.
The money spread around to New Mexico's elected officials has been well-documented, as has its power. A March 2020 report by Common Cause New Mexico and New


Mexico Ethics Watch detailed the largess over the years 2017-2019, with almost $\$ 12$ million funneled into political campaign coffers, and more than a million more was given by October of that year.
New Mexico In Depth also has documented the political spending and the push and pull over regulation through the years. In 2019, the first year Lujan Grisham took over as governor from Republican Gov. Susana Martinez, there was a push by environmentalists to implement greater regulations for the oil and gas industry, but in the end, the oil and gas industry had little to fear.
The industry far exceeds other industries in its political giving, and has for many years. During the 2022 election, New Mexico In Depth reported on a new round of giving, pointing out the donations in particular of the biggest player, Chevron Corporation.
Chevron continued its

pattern of big spending in 2023, as did other large oil and gas companies, a review of lobbyist reports filed with the Secretary of State's office shows. Lobbyists are required to file reports in May, October and January.

Patrick Killen, a lobbyist for Chevron USA, contributed \$479,000 on behalf of the company to Lujan Grisham, several legislative political action committees and individual state lawmakers, according to May and Oc-
tober campaign finance reports.
Randi Valverde, a lobbyist for Marathon Oil and Permian Resources, donated $\$ 122,500$ in the last quarter of 2023 to a mix of state lawmakers, both Democrats and Republicans. Matthew Jaramillo, a lobbyist for Exxon Mobil, gave lawmakers \$93,000. Gabrielle Gerholt, a registered lobbyist reporting just one employer - ConocoPhillips - gave contributions in 2023 totaling \$90,000.

dhist sutras, or the Koran allow us to bring our minds to what may be important principles for daily living. When we sit down, open a text, relax into our breath and place our attention on its meaning for us in our lives, we connect to something larger.

Body practices are activities such as running, walking, tai chi and yoga. Any activity that includes movement, such as sports, may be body practice if these include mindful at-
tention to body, mind and breath. While learning Iyengar yoga, my teacher would often admonish me, "Breathe, Harvey!" She did this because I would often hold my breath while going into an asanga (a yoga pose). As soon as I released my breath, I would easily fall into the pose and my mind would relax its grip.

As a runner, now
walker/hiker, I have found mindful attention to breathing and footfalls to be an essential element in these practices.

Lastly, our mind. To practice meditation is to discipline our minds to
stay put. To do this, we focus on our breath, an object, sound or image. With practice we learn to quiet what Zen teachers call our monkey mind. Seated meditation is simple, yet challenging. We take a seat, place our attention on our breath and just breathe without moving for a period of time. There are many forms of meditation but space does not allow further exploration here. Be well and just breathe.

"It's about getting the community together," De La Garza said.
The run is scheduled for Sunday, Feb. 4 at 10 a.m. It starts at Las Cruces City Hall, 700 N. Main Street, wraps around the downtown mall and ends at the Roberto V. Estrada Pavilion at Plaza de Las Cruces. De La Garza said the event is for everyone, not just law enforcement or first responders.

# To jump start your game, think outside the box 

In the spring of 1938, with war in Europe looming, Britain's military intelligence and espionage arm (MI-6), responsible for breaking foreign codes and communications, moved into a large Victorian mansion 45 miles north of London at Bletchley Park. Since the Treasury refused to put up 7,500 pounds sterling (about \$35,000 U.S.) to buy the estate, Admiral Hugh Sinclair, head of MI-6, came up with the cash out his own pocket. The main effort for the cryptographers in the secret hideaway was the Enigma code, used by all German military forces and thought to be "unbreakable." Cracking the Enigma code would be a task requiring
teamwork of hundreds of to the task they faced. people. Multiple strategies were used to locate and recruit desired talent, but perhaps the most imaginative focused on crossword puzzle addicts. They tend to think in ways that separated them from most other people. They cracked the Enigma code, greatly shortening the war.
What's that got to do with golf? The successful Bletchley Park "Ultra" cryptographers were able to think outside the box. Their mindset was not controlled by hard and fast rules, but rather they applied unusual and unconventional thinking

If you ponder how often you are given options and choices in a round of golf, you can see how thinking outside the box might help.
Bryson DeChambeau may be professional golf's poster child for thinking outside the box - and it takes a little quirkiness to do that. He has all his irons measured the same length; he practically invented the "arm-lock" style of putting; he even puts lines on his golf ball so that at least three dimples line up, so that he avoids glancing mishits. Jim Furyk is another one. He has a wildly un-
conventional swing that no one would try to teach a kid. But his father did, and Furyk has made tons of money on tour with that swing. Tiger Woods was thinking outside the box as he won the Open Championship in 2000 at St. Andrews, when he hit mostly irons off the tee and avoided every fairway bunker on the course for 72 holes.

Your short game is a perfect place to start thinking outside the box. If you are 10 yards short of the green on an upslope, it may look like a chip shot, but those chips are testy and the lie isn't good. You could try a bump-and-run with a hybrid or a 5 -wood. If you have a level ground and smooth grass, you
could putt the ball. It was Trevino who said a decent putt is better than a poor chip. Another area of the game that you might start thinking unconventionally is a long par 4: Consider playing it as a par 5 , hit a straight 3-wood, a sensible layup and pitch it close for a 5 , net 4 .

Consider playing a full 18-hole round with half the number of clubs in your bag - that would be seven clubs. It will mean you're going have to be creative with whatever club you choose to hit the ball. Several years ago, my golf buddies insisted on playing an "emergency nine" after our regular 18 holes. The twist was, we could only use two clubs. I chose my
six iron and my putter. I finished that nine only one stroke over what I shot on that nine earlier.

Inventors, designers and manufacturers of golf equipment have been thinking outside the box with hundreds of remarkable innovations, especially since 1990, when metal "woods" emerged.

If you want to improve your game and focus only on your swing and mechanics, you're missing a key element. Strength, flexibility and stamina will do much more for your game than two extra buckets of range balls. Golf outside the box.
