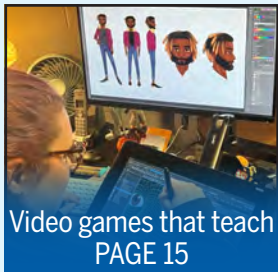

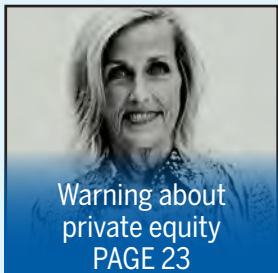

'IT DIDN'T GIVE UP ON ME'

Veterans' treatment court wins gold certification

On Monday, the courtroom 7 at the Third Judicial District court in Las Cruces was packed. The gallery was full, people stood at the sides of the room, and an additional row of chairs accommodated staff members. The jury seats were full, as well, but not with jurors. There was no trial or criminal proceeding this afternoon.

On the wall to the right of District Judge James T. Martin's bench sat a striking oil painting of a phoenix-like figure spreading its wings over a smoldering fire.

This was a hearing of the Doña Ana County Veterans Treatment Court. The program, which debuted in 2018, locates veterans and active service members who have fallen into the criminal justice system and provides a rigid, even invasive structure assisting them with substance abuse treat-

ment, behavioral health counseling and mental health treatment as needed, and other services on an individual case management basis.

The rigorous structure includes constant surveil-

lance to check compliance with curfews and attendance at work and/or class, supervised urine tests to make sure participants stay clean and sober and regular appearances in the courtroom to ac-

count for progress as well as lapses before Judge Martin.

The participants who testified Monday, in front of an unusually full courtroom, had mostly good news to report and

some moved up levels in the treatment courts' tiered system, receiving applause and congratulations from the judge. There were testimonies of improved family relations, lengthening periods of sobriety, job interviews and school.

Even these testimonies, however, revealed glimpses of struggle involved in completing the program and staying on track while breaking the chains of addiction to meth, heroin, alcohol and other substances. One man sought permission to travel to El Paso to visit an ailing brother in the hospital. Martin agreed, provided a staff member accompany him in case the stress of the family emergency threatened a relapse. Other participants spoke of challenges in balancing work and classes, finding living arrangements that support their sobriety. Appointments with program staff were

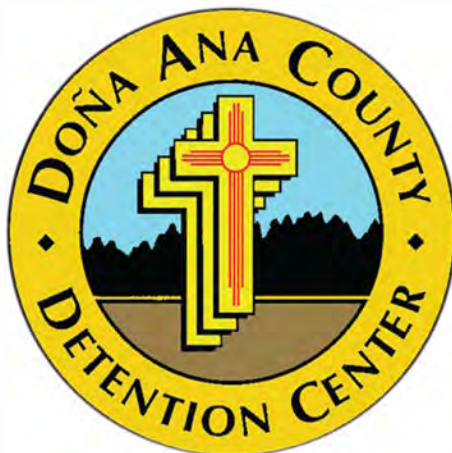

Council, city manager respond after comments slam city for officer's death

Around 40 people protested a Las Cruces City Council meeting Tuesday following the death of a Las Cruces Police Department officer.

The commenters – nearly all of whom identified themselves as local business owners – laid blame for the officer's death at the feet of the city council's governance and policy guidance over the last four years. Many commenters singled out Johana Bencomo, who represents District 4, for what they referred to as failed progressive policies that have led to more crime in Las Cruces and an underfunded police department.

"I think it's time that we do a congratulations to the councilor of District 4 for creating such a beautiful magnet to bring crime and lawlessness into our district," said Fred Huff, one of the commenters.

The city council – including Bencomo – has voted to increase the police department's budget by 25 percent over the last three years. They've allowed the police department to hire 18 new officers and spent nearly \$6 million on vehicles. During that time, the police department also reported a decrease in crime.

The commenters also suggested the council was responsible for executive action and execution of policy. But the charter and system of governance

makes the city manager responsible for that.

"If people understood that, rather than pointing fingers at the mayor and council, I think there would be more productiv-

ity in the conversations that we have," City Manager Ifo Pili said at the outset of the meeting.

Nearly all commenters – many of whom called for more transparency

and accountability from the council and said the public needed to pay more attention to the council's actions — did not stick around to hear the council and city management's responses at the end of the meeting.

"I'm happy to sit down with anybody and talk about the plans from administration, to talk about what's working and what's not; we've also asked for solutions and haven't really gotten much from those who have come," Pili said. "What they have walked away with is a better understanding of how city government works."

The catalyst for commenters' salvos was the stabbing death of Las Cruces Police Department

Officer Jonah Hernandez. Hernandez was stabbed by a man on the corner of Valley Drive and Amador Avenue while responding to a trespassing call earlier this month.

Jeremy Story, chief of LCPD, said the man was homeless at the time of the stabbing. Local television news stations reported that the man's family paid for him to live in an apartment, but it's unclear if he was actively utilizing it. The family also said that the man had schizophrenia. A bystander gunned down the assailant as police arrived.

While there are still numerous questions about what occurred – the city

Public safety takes priority at budget planning meetings

Public safety is an expensive endeavor.

About 42 percent or \$58 million of Las Cruces' general fund goes to the police and fire departments, according to the 2023 budget. In 2024, both departments are asking for more. The public safety asks were among dozens made during the yearly budget retreat on Feb. 15 and Feb. 16.

The two-day city council meeting held at the Las Cruces Convention Center is a yearly effort to reconcile the policy desires of the council, the budget requests of city departments and the realities of Las Cruces' finances.

The meetings are an essential step in the months-long marathon to complete a budget that outlines what services get funded and how much they get. During the budget process, dozens of requests are made. Some are minor, like a few thousand dollars to cover raises for union employees or police officers. Others are big.

"I think everybody has to get on board with a set amount, and everybody has their own priorities," Cassie Mclure, District 1 Councilor said. "This is the time where you really have to be — bipartisan is not the right word — but it's about the idea of give and take."

Here are a few of the big priorities discussed during the meeting.

Fire dept. seeks more staff

Last year, the Las Cruces Police Department, under then-Chief Miguel

Dominguez, swayed city administrators and councilors to increase the department's roster. The budget approved unanimously by the council in 2023 added 18 full-time positions to LCPD's police staff, bringing the total number of officers to 220.

This year, it was the fire department's turn.

Jason Smith, chief of the Las Cruces Fire Department, asked for 30 new firefighters to staff a new station in the Sonoma Ranch, East Mesa area. Smith asked for the budget to include money for 15 new firefighters this year. He said he'd return next year to ask for 15 more firefighters' salaries.

"If we get 15 this next fiscal year, we can do 15 the following year, then we'll have the 30 we need by the time station nine opens," Smith said.

Overall, the personnel cost would grow LCFD's budget by \$1,326,270. The 30 firefighters would staff Fire Station 9, for which voters approved a \$10 million GO Bond in 2022.

Police look for project funds

LCPD did not ask for more police officers this year. Instead, LCPD Chief Jeremy Story asked that the city fund two projects — one he said could help reduce crime, the other to improve the wellbeing of LCPD officers.

Story asked the city for about \$500,000 to help launch a Real Time Crime Center, saying it would improve the department's ability to pursue and prevent crime.

The center utilizes security cameras to surveil public spaces. Dozens of

U.S. cities (including Albuquerque) have similar systems, although advocates like the ACLU have raised questions about the civil rights issues that arise from the surveillance.

"The real-time crime center is just one piece of the puzzle," Story said. "But it can prevent crime, which is really what we want to do first and foremost."

Story also asked for money to formalize and unify a wellness program for LCPD's officers. Whether it's the department's gym, an anonymous peer support program for officers to talk about their issues with other officers from other departments, or financial literacy education, Story said he'd like to unify the disparate parts into a singular program.

Community development tearing out blight

Recent years have not been kind to the decaying buildings of Las Cruces.

Two notable — if not also infamous — structures in Las Cruces were demolished at the behest of the city of Las Cruces.

The Kilby Motel, a 70-year-old structure at 1045 S. Main Street that had fallen into disrepair but was used as a home for a half-dozen Las Cruces residents, was condemned and demolished in 2022. The abandoned property at 430 S. Main Street, also known as the "eyesore," was torn down in 2023.

Now, the city's Community Development department is looking to grow that effort with \$300,000 for its Nuisances Abate-

ment Team. The money would support operations for the team, which consists of representatives from different city groups.

"We're having success," said Community Development Director Larry Nichols. "We're getting owners to recognize that we're serious about cleaning up our city."

Public works highlights improvements

The Public Works department — which oversees road construction and maintenance — highlighted

five roads scheduled for improvement. All the projects remain in the planning and design phase, so the orange barrels won't be going up just yet.

The stretch of Spruce Avenue between Telshor Drive and Triviz Drive was the most noteworthy. This \$3 million project will drastically change the Telshor-Spruce intersection, most notably by creating a dedicated lane on Telshor that surpasses the intersection altogether. Public works estimated a completion date of Spring

2026.

A few miles north, the Spruce intersection with Madrid Avenue requires a \$3.4 million investment to provide an entire intersection. Public Works anticipated this project would be completed in the fall of 2025.

Near Spruce, Public Works also wants to renovate Sacramento Road from Oasis Avenue to Poplar Avenue by applying new pavement, redoing the sidewalks, and adding

some lighting, among other changes. This project will cost \$1.5 million and is estimated to be completed in Spring 2025.

Across town, Public Works also highlighted a redesign of the Avenida de Mesilla and South Main Street intersection. The \$3.9 million renovation would re-pave the road and add bike lanes and pedestrian protections to the intersection, among other changes.

Finally, Public Works said a rework of Campo Street to Lohman Avenue and up Organ Avenue to Mesquite Street was also in the works. That project is estimated to cost \$6.5 million and be completed in Fall 2025.

The basics of municipal spending

The general fund is a vital funding source for essential

services.

Last budget year, the general fund held \$138,743,132, according to the budget book. That money has several different sources – none are more important than the gross receipts taxes.

The sources are:

- Gross receipts taxes, \$109,920,478 which is 79 percent.

- Property taxes, \$14,523,222 which is 10 percent.

- Fees and Charges, \$9,432,481 which is 7 percent.

- Franchise Fees, \$4,041,951 which is 3 percent.

- Other Fees and Charges, \$9,432,481 which is 7 percent.

- Cannabis Excise Tax, \$825,000 which is 1 percent.

The money in the general fund then goes out to several departments such as police, fire, public works, parks and more.

County nets clean audit

Doña Ana County received a clean audit following a presentation at a Board of Commissioners meeting on Feb. 13.

Auditors with Hinkle and Landers, an Albuquerque-based firm, issued unmodified opinions for the county's financial statements and federal awards. An unmodified opinion is the best possible outcome for an audit.

"My hat's off to (the county finance department)," Diana Murillo, District 2 Commissioner, said. "To have zero findings on budget speaks volumes."

The auditors reviewed the county's financial statements, which included reviews of what the county owns, county debts and other markers of the health of county financial records. The

federal awards included various COVID-19 relief grants and other grants from the federal Depart-

ment of Transportation, Health and Human Services, and Homeland Security.

rescheduled to accommodate, legal questions were assigned to staff members for research. Life is complicated and unpredictable, and these individuals rely on a team to help maintain a steady course and keep leaving the courtroom through the doors facing Picacho Avenue.

Michael Hubbard, a 57-year-old Navy veteran with grown children, graduated from the program on Monday, joining a slowly growing contingent of alumni that help support those still working through the phases and applying Moral Recognition Therapy that provides the process with its spine. For Hubbard, the process took more than 16 months; for others, the road may be longer.

Hubbard said he was located by a veterans' liaison after he landed in jail, falling into a feedback loop of meth addiction, aggravated by post-traumatic stress disorder and depression, that had alienated him from his family and landed him with criminal charges. The initial stages of detoxification, treatment and behavioral therapy were hard; but as difficult as the program seemed to him, he said, "It didn't give up on me."

After the proceedings, Martin and his staff celebrated a difficult achievement for the program itself. Last August, the state Administrative Office of the Courts' Department for Therapeutic Justice awarded the county's program with its gold certification, meaning it had met all mandatory standards and nearly 98 percent of

recommended standards for treatment courts, but the celebration had been delayed until this week.

Among those assembled in the gallery, with family members of the participants, community leaders and legal professionals, were Las Cruces Mayor Eric Enriquez, seated next to County Manager Fer-

nando Macias (a former district judge). City Councilor Becky Corran was seated in the back row.

The striking painting overlooking the event was donated to the court by the artist, who is also among the veterans who graduated from the program, Magdalena Escoto. She was in the courtroom

Monday to congratulate the participants and share her own story of working through the program.

Martin, a veteran himself, said he was initially skeptical of the treatment court approach, attributing it partially to his background as a federal prosecutor. Nearly six years since the first clients were welcomed to the new program, he said, "I stand here today a complete convert to the success of treatment court."

A theme he returned to repeatedly in his address to the gallery was that basic training taught people how to be soldiers, and the treatment court was providing another vital service: Teaching soldiers how to be healthy civilians.

The New Mexico treatment court standards are set by the state Su-

preme Court, and the certification followed a three-month process of scrutiny of the program's policies and procedures, team member reviews and surveys, and any gaps between the program's performance and those standards, according to the 3rd Judicial District. The "gold" threshold requires all mandatory standards be met along with 95 percent of recommended standards; and only a few treatment courts in the state have made it. According to the AOC, besides the county's veterans treatment court, other programs that have earned gold are the Doña Ana County Magistrate Court's DWI treatment court; a young adult treatment court program in Albuquerque; and adult treatment courts in Deming and Taos.

Superintendent hails clean LCPS audit

Las Cruces Public Schools Superintendent Ignacio Ruiz congratulated the district's top financial officer, Chenyu "Alex" Liu, Tuesday evening for an annual financial audit that contained zero findings, a rare and difficult achievement for a government agency, particularly one of the size of the second-largest school district in New Mexico.

The annual financial audit is completed by

an independent auditing firm recognized by the State Auditor's office. Governments and public agencies undergo required audits of their financial statements to ensure their procedures and accounts are in keeping with generally accepted accounting principles. The LCPS audit for fiscal year 2023, released to the public at the end of January, delivers an "unmodified" opinion — the highest quality of opinion based on the agency's financial statements and examination of how the

district handles and documents public funds.

It is common for audit reports to report findings ranging from minor deviations from accounting standards to significant deficiencies or material weaknesses. An audit with no findings for a large agency that handles state and federal funds is a rare achievement, Ruiz noted.

The audit was part of Ruiz's regular report to the Las Cruces Public Schools Board of Education, which met in open session Tuesday night.

and police department have delayed records requests over body camera and police reports from the incident — most of the commenters still felt compelled to lay the fault for Hernandez's death at the feet of the council.

Michael Fraembs, owner of Arista Development, said the group was forming an organization they called "Business Owners for Public Safety."

"We all have the responsibility to uphold the criminal justice system," Fraembs said. "Criminals need to go to jail."

Fraembs and other commenters also demanded a work session to relitigate their concerns over fentanyl use in Las Cruces, allegations of harassment against business owners and a general fear of unhoused people and their motivations. One commenter also called for the council to reconsider Pili's contract as city manager.

Other commenters described their experience and feelings of fear when witnessing the public use of drugs, people in mental health crises and visible poverty. While every council member said they sympathized with those feelings, District 2's representative Bill Mattiace said he heard the comments as a wake-up call.

"I appreciate their words today. It's quite an eye-opener," Mattiace said.

Mattiace confirmed that he played a role in advising some of the com-

menters when asked by the Las Cruces Bulletin.

"The only suggestion I made was that a lot of businesses are not able to tell their story," Mattiace said. "And all I suggested was all of you could actually tell your story in three minutes."

Mattiace went on to say, "That's basically it. You've heard the stories as I have. Of course, I'm not a proponent of attacks. For example, I think it was unfair on Bencomo."

"I really saw it as bashing of mayor pro tem Bencomo," Yvonne Flores, who represents District 6, said. "She's worked very hard on many, many issues that are the root problem that contribute to the situation that we're in."

Flores added, "We have to be awfully naive or down-right ignorant to think that four years being on city council ... made all the difference and was a major contributing factor to homelessness."

Becki Graham, who represents district 3, and Becky Corran, who represents district 5, also voiced support for Bencomo.

"You shouldered a lot today. I want to recognize how heavy that was," Graham said.

Despite the comments directed at her, election results suggest Bencomo is popular among her constituency.

In 2023, she staved off three challengers to hold on to her seat. Bencomo won the election in the second round of ranked-choice. She collected 48 percent in the first round,

whereas the other candidates collected about 7 percent, 11 percent, and 34 percent.

At the end of the meeting, Bencomo had a chance to respond. Before starting, she paused, seemingly to collect her thoughts.

"I just want to say that I've felt deeply saddened by the loss of Officer Hernandez," she began her comments. "It has had a pretty profound impact on me."

Bencomo went on to say that she was grateful for LCPD's leadership.

"You're a deeply courageous and thoughtful leader," she told Chief Story.

Bencomo said societal problems are the problems of the community, not just government and nonprofit organizations.

"I think the question of what I could have done, what we could have done, will always stick with me," she said. "But ... shame and guilt and blame are dead weight emotions. Sadness can turn into anger, and anger can turn into action, and that's sort of how I see this moment. I think we have to reject calls for divisiveness, and we have to reject calls that are malicious."

"The moment that you cheer and laugh at my expense, it unfortunately creates a different narrative for me that perhaps this (public comments) isn't in good faith. But I'm not going to do that. I'm going to reject that as much as I can because I believe that we can build real safety," Bencomo said.

County approves new agreement to govern CRRUA

The Doña Ana County Board of Commissioners unanimously approved a change to the governance structure of the Camino Real Regional Utility Authority.

The move shifts the power – previously distributed evenly between the county and the city of Sunland Park – to give the city more representation.

The board comprises two county commissioners, two Sunland Park city councilors and two state

legislator as appointees. The new setup encases four people appointed by the Sunland Park council – two of whom will be city staff members – and three appointees from Doña Ana County. The change also takes some zoning authority from CRRUA and returns it to the county and city.

“It’s been over two years to get to this point,” Sunland Park City Manager Mario Juarez-Infante told commissioners during a meeting on Feb. 13.

Doña Ana County Manager Fernando Macias

said he expects the new governance structure will bring heightened technical awareness to CRRUA since some members will be city or county staff.

“The issues that CRRUA has been dealing with, there is a need for enhanced representation on the board,” Macias said.

The changes are part of



a joint powers agreement, a quasi-governmental entity created to serve a specific purpose. For example, the city of Las Cruces and Doña Ana County have a joint powers agreement to govern the Animal Services Center of Mesilla Valley.

The approval comes as CRRUA faces scrutiny for its handling of a water

crisis in December. The utility was fined \$251,580 after mishandling a “do not drink” order when they failed to notify customers their water had dangerously high pH levels. Attorneys representing affected households have filed a tort claim and claim of civil rights violations, a precursor to potential litigation.

“We’re getting bashed with the news media,” Susana Chaparro, county commissioner for District 4 and CRRUA’s board chair, said. “And we’re trying very, very hard as the board to rally and move forward with a master plan with CRRUA.”

Chaparro also said the board was not changing because of the news coverage of CRRUA’s failure to provide safe water to its customers and that the changes had been in the works for some time.

It’ll take several months before the changes to CRRUA’s governance go into effect. The amended JPA first has to be approved by the state Department of Finances and Administration.

Classroom hops away from dissecting frogs

Lauren Apodaca's classroom at Vista Middle School was buzzing with conversation as students working in groups focused on the internal anatomy of frogs on the table before them, turning over heart, liver and other internal organs with forceps.

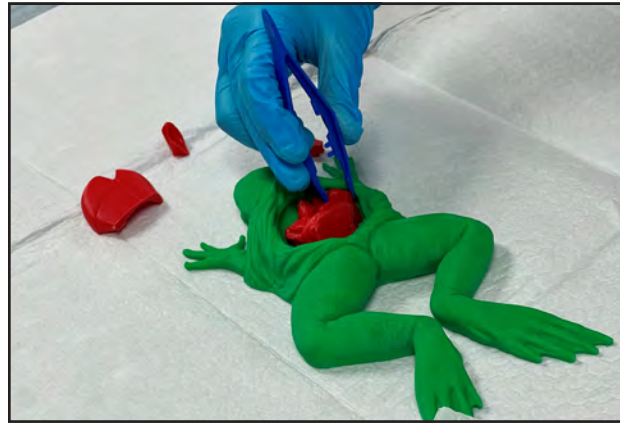
If you have memories of dissecting frogs or other animal specimens in science class, you probably remember the smell of formaldehyde and other chemicals used to preserve the specimens. That distinct odor was absent from this classroom. The frogs on the tables and their innards were all produced in the classroom on

a 3D printer.

The equipment was purchased through the Pennsylvania-based non-profit Animalearn, which promotes humane science education as a division of the American Anti-Vivisection Society. Apodaca, who is in their seventh year of teaching, recently earned honorable mention as a nominee for Animalearn's 2023 Humane Science Educator of the Year award.

The honor came with a \$750 cash grant used to purchase the printer that spawns specimen frogs that are much harder to spoil with a careless incision and do not require harsh chemicals to store them.

"I do love the idea of

preserving animals," Apodaca said in an interview, including a fondness for holding on to animal bones. "But there's something about the dissecting that was not for me."

When Apodaca was a student growing up in southern Florida, dissecting real animals was no longer a requirement, and Apodaca said they don't feel as though they missed out on much: There are ample teaching methodologies and products available to present alternatives.

New Mexico has been a "dissection choice" state since 2005, when the Public Education Department ruled that classrooms engaging in dissections "shall provide virtual dissection techniques as alternative activities for any student who is opposed to real dissections for ethical, moral, cultural or religious reasons."

While artificial specimens are nothing new, the alternatives are increasingly sophisticated, particularly in mobile technology.

At one table in the classroom, students worked not with a plastic frog but a black cube with codes embedded on it. Viewed through a camera on a mobile electronic device, what appeared on screen

was a detailed illustration of a frog with interactive displays of its anatomy.

Apodaca said the technologies are inexpensive and allow their students to meet all of the instructional goals and content standards without the liabilities of handling animals, preservatives shown to be harmful to health or the stresses of performing surgery on a dead creature.

Instead, Apodaca's students watched as the printer produced their frogs.

"At first, when I told them about the award and how I wasn't really wanting to do dissection, they were a little disappointed," Apodaca said. "But then you see it 3D printed and they're like, 'Wow, you made this out of nothing, this is actually really impressive.' They aren't too disappointed with the alternative."

Apodaca has plans to produce plastic models for other lessons as well, such as cells and their anatomies, possibly other microscopic objects, to make elusive bodies more tangible.

Besides the risks to human health, Animalearn objects to real animal dissections on ethical grounds. They say animals harvested for science classrooms are often obtained taken from natural habitats and acquired cheaply to market for profit, which means they may be sourced from dealers or slaughterhouses that do not engage in humane practices.

The ethical concerns extend to damaged ecosystems as well as the dangers presented by preservatives, from classroom exposure to the disposal of the specimens.

Since its founding in 1990, Animalearn has advocated for alternative teaching methods and materials, and promoted its own "science bank," a free lending program that makes models, software and virtual technologies available for loan to classrooms.

"To see the technology that's available for today's students, it's pretty amazing," Animalearn's director, Nicole Green, said in

an interview.

One product manufactured by the SynDaver company, the SynFrog, offers model frogs made entirely from a proprietary material it calls SynTissue designed to imitate the appearance and sensation of handling organic tissue, with fully removable anatomical parts. The models retail for up to \$268 apiece through the company's website.

"It's giving that typical learning experience that you would if a student was dissecting a real frog, without harming any frogs," Green said.

For its annual educator awards, Animalearn begins searching and calling for nominations each November, according to Green. The awards have

been issued for approximately 20 years.

"All of our awardees stand out as role models not just for their students but also for their peers in the field of science education and we hope this recognition will encourage more science teachers to embrace compassionate science practices in their classrooms," she said.

Green said the number of educators who remain passionate about using real animal specimens is dwindling as alternatives improve, especially over the last decade: "Because technology has so rapidly advanced, I think there are just so many tools that teachers can take from the toolbox now and utilize in their classrooms. Students can learn just as well using some of these technologies as with specimens."

New Mexico sees first HPS case of 2024

The Scientific Laboratory Division of the New Mexico Department of Health (NMDOH) confirmed on Tuesday the first case of hantavirus pulmonary syndrome in 2024. A man living in San Juan County was hospitalized, released and is at home recovering, the health department stated.

HPS was described as an often severe, sometimes fatal, respiratory disease in humans caused by the Sin Nombre virus. In 2023, New Mexico had seven cases among residents of McKinley, San Juan and Taos counties, with two fatalities.

In New Mexico, deer mice are the primary

carriers of hantavirus, the department said. The virus is found in mice droppings and urine, and exposure typically happens around homes, cabins or sheds, especially when cleaning out or exploring enclosed areas with mouse droppings.

State Public Health Veterinarian Erin Phipps stated in a news release that seeking medical attention early and informing the provider of exposure to an environment with rodents, enhances chances of recovery.

The DOH said symptoms typically develop within one to six weeks after rodent exposure and may resemble flu, with symptoms including fever and muscle aches,

possible chills, headache, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, abdominal pain and cough, which can progress to respiratory distress and severe illness.

The department recommended airing out closed up cabins and sheds as well as abandoned or stored vehicles; trapping mice and sealing structures to prevent more from entering; soaking

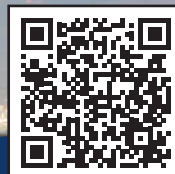
nests and dropping with disinfectant such as a 10 percent bleach solution before cleaning; and never sweeping rodent droppings up so as to introduce particles in the air; as well as other measures to keep rodents away from pet food and water, away from the home if possible, and to move hay, wood and compost away from the home.

dominated by a large photograph. Digging into the archives, I found that the previous name plate made its debut in our Oct. 9, 2003 edition. (Jim Rosenthal was the editor at the time.) That name plate had a good run for over 20 years, lending a sense of permanence and continuity, varying only in size over two decades.

The new name plate emphasizes “Bulletin,”

which is how we all refer to our local weekly, while retaining the city where we are based, the second-largest city in New Mexico, the seat of Doña Ana County. Local newspapers can certainly look afar to matters of state and even across the oceans to war, diplomacy and trade, but when they lose their local sense of place it is fatal. This is, after all, the lament we hear about our local daily paper under the

ownership of the Gannett company.

Our staff was invited to give input on different designs, colors and other details for the front page, and I doubt anyone got everything they preferred.

The Bulletin’s front page has taken many forms since this weekly published its first issue in December of 1969. We’ve kept the side frame with small “refers” to different stories inside, plus a QR code that will point your mobile device’s browser to our website, LasCru-

cesBulletin.com.

And for our first front page story, we chose not the most raucous or controversial story of the week, but a humane story about a program that helps people (indeed, saves lives) and addresses overlapping social problems that, experience is showing, can be remediated but only through slow, patient, sometimes grueling teamwork; through compassion; through accountability and love.

New Mexico takes stand against deep fakes

In the days leading up to the primary election in New Hampshire, several voters received phone calls from a voice that sounded like and claimed to be President Joe Biden encouraging them to stay home on election day.

It was the first well-publicized use of artificial intelligence in a dirty tricks political campaign, but it undoubtedly will not be the last.

The New Mexico Legislature took action this session to get in front of the problem. House Bill 182, which awaits the governor’s signature, amends the Campaign Reporting Act to require a disclaimer for any materially deceptive media created through AI, and makes it illegal to willfully distribute those messages without one.

The penalty is a misdemeanor on the first conviction and a fourth-degree felony on the second conviction. It would apply equally to both traditional print and broadcast media and online sites, which still enjoy special protection from libel laws.

The bill has an emergency clause, which means it will go into effect as soon as it is signed and will be in place for the upcoming election.

New Mexico is joining California, Texas, Minnesota, Washington and Michigan in banning AI from political advertising.

Secretary of State Maggie Toulouse Oliver said she knows of two other incidents before the New

Hampshire primary where AI was used in an attempt to influence a political campaign with misinformation. She said she hopes raising awareness of AI will make New Mexico voters more skeptical when assessing all political ads.

The Biden administration has issued an executive order regulating the use of AI within the federal government, but neither Congress nor the Federal Communications Commission have acted to regulate its use in political campaigns.

Every advancement in communications technology provides new opportunities for political campaigns. The govern-

ment was proactive in regulating messages on radio and television, but has thus far taken a more hands-off approach with this new technology.

AI can be incredibly helpful in helping campaigns identify and target their most likely voters and craft specific messages tailored for their interests. But it also has the potential to take misinformation campaigns to a whole new level.

It was challenging enough for voters to sort through the avalanche of claims, accusations and allegations made each election year when they were all human-generated. But at least with those we could trust our eyes and ears, if not the message.

I wish that more could be done to fact-check po-

litical advertising, especially in hotly contested races like the one we will have later this year in the 2nd Congressional District. The amount of outside money spent on those races allows for more propaganda than any voter should be expected to sort through.

The Attorney General’s Office notes that federal law already allows for disclosure requirements in political ads. That’s probably why the new law doesn’t simply ban the deep fakes.

We can’t stop political campaigns from stretching the truth. But this bill will at least make sure that the falsehoods come from a real person.

FUN, GAMES AND LEARNING

A visit to NMSU's Learning Games Lab

New Mexico State University's Learning Games Lab mostly does its work quietly, with a team of professional illustrators and animators at work over screens in a darkened room on the Las Cruces campus.

There are louder days, as well, when children are invited into the lab's meeting room, a place of warm colors, carpeted walls and large screens, to test video games under development and give feedback.

Barbara Chamberlin, who heads the university's Innovative Media Research and Extension department, explains that the lab's work is, no pun intended, an extension of the land grant institution's service mission: to solve problems and improve lives in its community.

The Learning Games Lab develops games, apps and virtual reality presentations geared mainly toward education or professional training.

As an example, the "Math Snacks" game series arose from research into why middle school students were struggling in math. Part of the prob-

lem, it was found, came from core concepts in previous school years that were not adequately learned, leaving many students marooned in sixth grade math. The games reviewing and reinforcing those early concepts were developed with support from NMSU's

Arrowhead Center and picked up by educational game distributor Game Learning last year.

Chamberlin says the technologies arise because people receive and process information in individual ways. "Sometimes you can read or hear

information, and that's all you need. That's great. But sometimes it's not enough. Sometimes you have to have visuals, to see what's not seen, or you have to understand something in context, to have an emotional impact. ... Our job is to figure out the thing that you can't learn by just reading about it."

The lab is funded in part through NMSU's extension service and partly through project-based grants.

Other games impart food safety information or financial literacy, using the structures and rewards from video games to encourage the acquisition of concepts and counteract less reliable information they may obtain from parents and relatives.

A virtual reality project under development aims to help dietitians practice interacting with patients with challenging diagnoses and treatment regimens, rehearsing interpersonal skills and professional behaviors in a realistic yet simulated environment.

The lab employs 28 people, including some students alongside profes-

sional game developers, and nearly every aspect of the finished products are fashioned in-house.

Matheus Cezarotto, an assistant professor and coordinator of the lab, explained that the projects are all research-based, from the problem or question they address to the design of the games them-

selves.

"We have the formative research to understand what the problem is, what kind of content we're going to teach," he said, "and we also have the summative evaluation that we do after, to measure the impact of the tool that we created. ... There's some liberty in being creative, creating characters, but it's all informed by research."

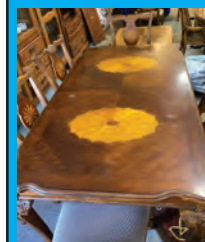

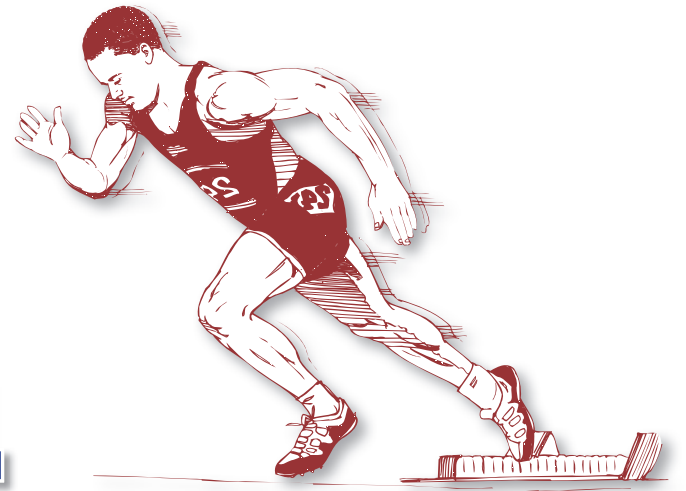



date(s). Therefore, you will want to take advantage of receiving instruction from our exceptional Event Managers.

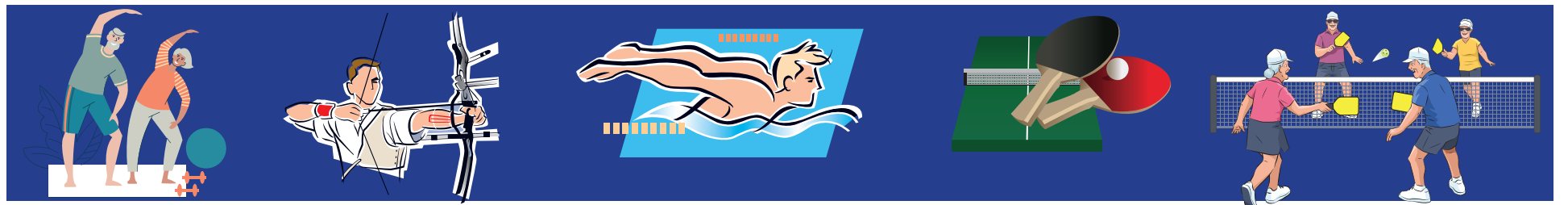

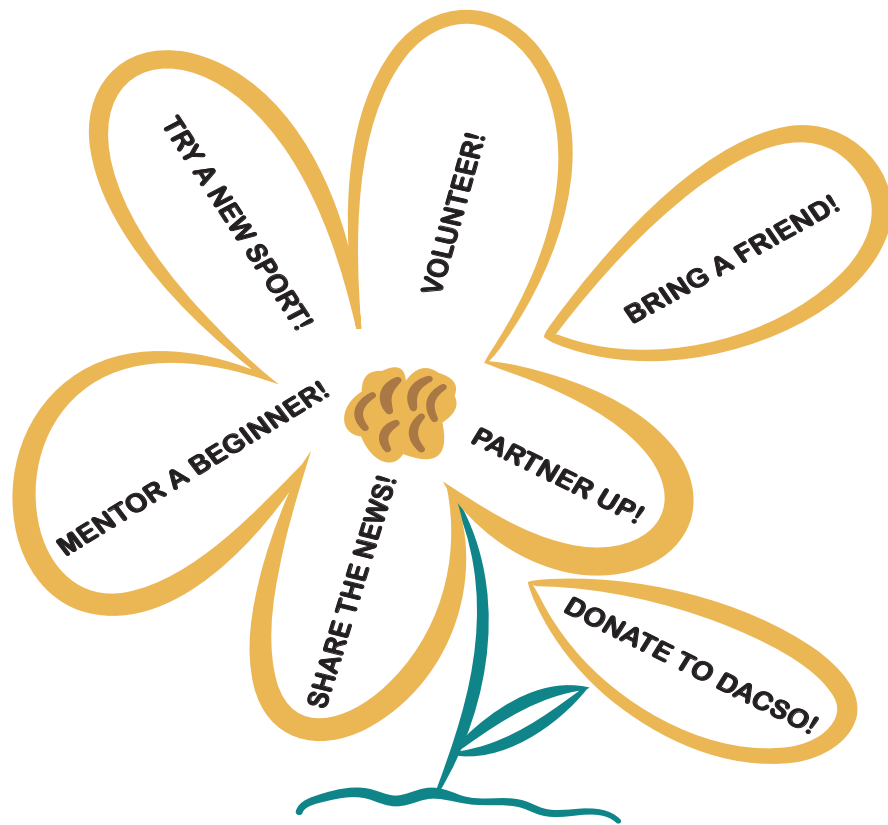

Dona Ana County Senior Olympics is committed to a program of sports and recreational events to promote healthy and active lifestyles for all seniors age 50 and above. Our programs encourage both the athlete and the beginner to participate within their own 5-year age category starting from 50-54 and going up to 90+. Senior Olympics in Dona Ana County is a volunteer group, with support coming from your modest registration fees. We offer 16+ events with opportunities for singles, doubles and mixed doubles play. When participating in any of our events, each person is covered by an athlete insurance policy. Your age group for competition is the age you are on December 31 of the registration year.

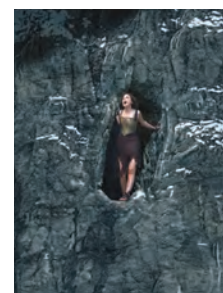

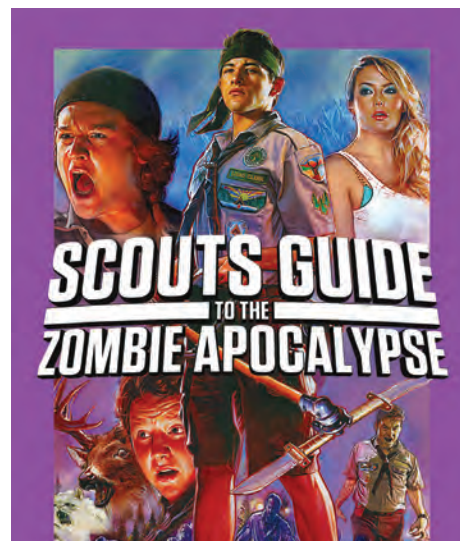

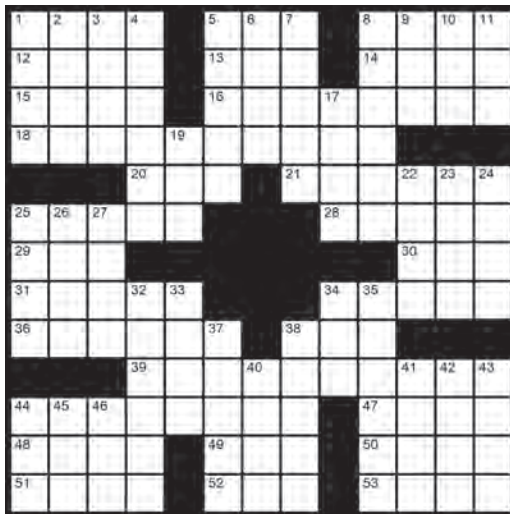

LOCAL WOMAN STARS IN DOLPH LUNDGREN FLICK

Raised in El Paso, actress returns to film in Las Cruces

Growing up in El Paso didn't keep actress Christina Villa from her dreams as she landed a leading role in a feature film titled "Wanted Man." In fact, her connection with the El Paso/Las Cruces area may have helped her get the part of Rosa in the movie directed by and starring Doph Lundgren, released in January.

Born and raised in El Paso, Villa attended Bel Air High School and lived in the lower valley. She was familiar with show business, as her mom was a performer in the city and a member of the Viva El Paso crew.

And while her mom would take her on stage

sometimes, Villa later became shy and didn't take an interest in acting until after her high school days. Yet she loved being part of a team and became a cheerleader at Bel Air.

It was at the University of Texas-Austin, after earning her bachelor's degree in public relations, that the acting bug grabbed her again.

"I guess it was in me at a young age and I missed performing," she said. "I took my first acting class and fell in love with it. I knew this is what I wanted to do and started taking whatever chances I could find."

As she put in time as an extra in films like "Spy Kids 3," she worked at the El Paso Times and was doing theater at the same

time. Then, attending the Plaza Classic Film Festival, Villa heard Al Pacino talking about studying at the Actor's Studio in New York and decided to jump in with both feet and auditioned for the school during an opportunity in

Los Angeles.

"The teacher admitted me on the spot," she said. "In four months, I was living in New York and going to school. Twice a week having teachers telling me, encouraging me, built that confidence that I lacked. Having their support made me feel like I'm in the right place and this is what I should be doing."

Villa spent seven years in New York City working retail, delivering Uber Eats and whatever else she could find as she auditioned and auditioned for parts.

"Eventually I met my manager, Sana from Steinberg Talent, right around the pandemic," she said. "I started to get more auditions and I got the audition for 'Wanted Man.'"

When she saw the movie was to shoot in the Las Cruces area, she included her information about living in El Paso in her audition notes. Weeks went by and Villa didn't hear anything, so she let it go and went on the next audition and the next. Finally, her agent said the producer had responded.

"It was an awesome

experience to get to do my first (leading) role near home," she said.

The movie was mostly filmed in Las Cruces from April to June 2022. And she has done two more movies since. "Wanted Man" is available on Amazon Prime or Apple TV, for on-demand viewing.

The experience in Las Cruces was amazing, Villa said. The team she worked with was great and filming in the desert itself added an element of reality to the process. She loved working with the local hair and make-up team.

"One of the funnest things to do was sit in that chair with them," she said. "And the cast was great, the costume designer. It was just all around a really great experience because I got to be around some really great people. There is a lot of talent in New Mexico."

To get into character, Villa used a lot of the tools she picked up in training, to which she added research and personalization. She portrays Rosa Barranco, a sex worker and eyewitness being escorted by a police officer (Lundgren) through Mexico and across the border. Villa describes Rosa as "a strong woman who doesn't suffer fools."

"You find things and experiences you can relate to," she said. "You try to figure out how the character got to where they are now and trying to put yourself in their shoes. In terms of preparation, you just do your work for the role, let it go and show up."

Filming in the desert was also a good experi-

ence, she said.

"It added a lot – showing the struggles (the characters) are going through," she said. "We filmed in that 100-degree weather. One day the wind was crazy. It definitely added to the stakes of the characters, and I thought it was really great and I would do it again."

Working with Lundgren and Kelsey Grammer on the film was a pleasure, she said. Other than booking smaller roles in television, the experience of getting the lead in a film was a dream come true.

"It was exciting, I was nervous, but they were so supportive," she said. "I will always take with me how they made me feel like I belonged. Kelsey was right there and having someone like him cheer you on – I don't know what words to use. I am grateful. It was a humbling experience."

She described Lundgren as open to feedback, collaborative and always advocating for her; someone who knew what he was doing and when to delegate.

Villa's family is supportive, she said. They have all seen the film multiple times.

"If sales are going up, it's probably my family," she said. "My mom is so excited; my dad was thrilled (if a bit taken aback at the idea of me playing a sex worker). They are a really big support system."

Her small nephews, too, are excited about Villa making it as an actress and one of them is waiting for her to play Wonder Woman one day.

Las Cruces Utilities celebrated its 10th annual Employee Awards Ceremony Wednesday, Jan. 31, 2024, at the Las Cruces Convention Center.

The event, which included a luncheon for all LCU employees, honored the dedicated employees with 5, 10, 15 and 20 years of service to the City of Las Cruces. Over forty people were recognized for their commitment to serving the community and reaching these milestones. Three individuals reached 25 years, Diana Montoya, Jeffrey Garcia, and Leo Perez.

Additional notable awards presented to LCU employees include:

- **Jacob Cabrales, Interim Water Production Supervisor:** Customer Service – Above and Beyond Award. Cabrales took care of several customers concerns in a timely and

professional manner throughout the past year. He has always answered the call to go above and beyond for LCU customers and has always left them with a smile and sense of fulfillment.

- **Julian Morales, Wastewater Senior Heavy Equipment Operator:** Cost Effective Savings Solution Award. Morales took the lead on LCU's Biofilter Rehabilitation Project to replace all the old media with fresh media and inspect and repair the air lines of each Biofilter. He saved the City close to \$1 million by doing this project in-house.
- **Victor Ortiz, Collections Specialist:** Excellence Through Innovation Award. Ortiz began employment with the City as a temporary employee specifically to collect unpaid utility bills that



were past due, and in some cases, were written-off accounts that were greater than 60 days past due. He tackled an enormous list consisting of amounts due from past and present residents, and small and large commercial accounts. During the City's 2021 fiscal year, Ortiz collected \$1.08 million; in Fiscal Year 2022, collections increased to more than \$2.3 million; and in Fiscal Year 2023, collections continued to rise to almost \$4.2 million.

As of Dec. 31, 2023, collections for the fiscal year were \$2.04 million.

- **Julian Morales, Francisco Ramirez, Francisco Javier Herrera, James Crespin, Wastewater Operations and Maintenance:** LCU Board Award. Together, these four Wastewater employees tackled LCU's Biofilter Rehabilitation Project by inspecting and replacing all the old media with fresh media and then inspecting and repairing air lines of each Biofilter. Their work was accomplished during the past year and included starting their workdays at 4 a.m. and then continued regular work duties throughout the day. By doing this as an in-house project, this team saved the LCU Wastewater program close to \$1 million.

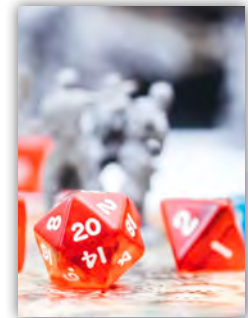

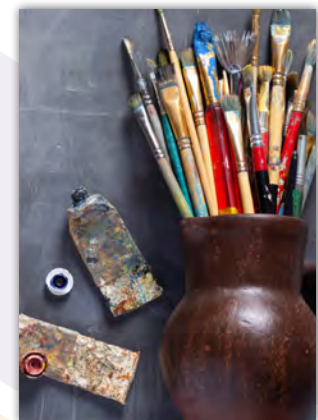

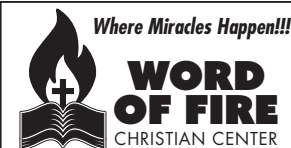

WHO ARE THE PLUNDERERS?

Pulitzer laureate Gretchen Morgenson visits NMSU

Private equity has fur- tively assumed control over numerous sectors of the economy, enriching a small community of private investors while tightening its grip on essential services on which the majority depends: This argument is a theme of a recent book by Pulitzer Prize-winning journalist Gretchen Morgenson, and a talk she gave Tuesday evening, Feb. 20, in Las Cruces.

New Mexico State

University's College of Business and Center for Border Economics hosted the author for a public talk where Morgenson was to sign copies of her 2023 work, co-authored with Joshua Rosner, "These are the Plunderers: How Private Equity Runs and Wrecks America," from Simon & Schuster.

"Private equity is kind of a secretive financial system, an approach that has been rising importance in this country and has been taking over vast swaths of our economy,"

Morgenson told the Bulletin in an interview. "Health care is a huge area where private equity investors have taken over a tremendous number of physician practices, emergency departments, hospitals."

Per reporting from ProPublica, private equity investment companies control over \$6 billion in assets in the U.S., acquiring companies in various industries in order to restructure them and sell them off for a profit.

Critics have raised alarms about private eq-

uity holdings in the health care industry, community hospitals, in particular. In Las Cruces, Memorial Medical Center is owned by LifePoint Health, itself a property of private equity firm Apollo Global Management.

Morgenson said impartial academic research is finding that "bad outcomes increase dramatically when private equity gets involved in health-care."

For instance, she cited studies by Harvard University and University of Chicago showing widely

different hospital outcomes overall for patients before and after private equity buyouts. "After the buyouts, these academics found a spike in serious infections, patient falls and blood clots after private equity became involved," she said, a trend found in other academic studies as well.

"Private equity has the reputation of slashing jobs," she continued. "Academic research shows that the average decline in jobs at a company taken over by a highly leveraged private equity firm is 13

percent."

In seeking interviews with private equity firms themselves, Morgenson said they have countered with claims that they have created more jobs than they have cut; but she said none provided documentation supporting the claim.

Morgenson is a senior financial reporter for NBC News and has previously been an investigative journalist at the Wall Street Journal and an assistant business and financial editor as well as a columnist for the New York Times.

She won a Pulitzer Prize in 2002 for her reporting on Wall Street and cowrote "Reckless Endangerment," a 2011 book about the U.S. mortgage crisis.

"(Morgenson) has been a sharp critic of our most powerful institutions, and our students will benefit greatly from her insights derived from her long experience in journalism and business," College of Business Dean Bryan Ashenbaum stated in a news release ahead of the talk.

Prayers, tears, candlelight at Hernandez memorial

Thousands gathered downtown on Friday night, Feb. 16, for a candlelight vigil and to offer condolences to the family of Las Cruces police officer Jonah Hernandez.

The 35-year-old officer, a 2022 police academy graduate, became the first LCPD officer killed in the line of duty on Feb. 11 when he was attacked and killed responding to a service call. Police say his attacker was Armando Silva, who was shot and killed by a witness at the scene.

"The pain we feel today is because of our love for Jonah and if you did not know him personally, because he gave his life selflessly protecting and serving Las Cruces," Chief Jeremy Story said, wearing a dress uniform with a black mourning ribbon across his service badge. "Jonah was a kind and compassionate man. He genuinely cared for his fellow citizens and took every opportunity to demonstrate that love."

The city organized a service bookended with Christian messages, music and tributes to

Hernandez, an El Paso resident and father of two young sons. His wife and children, along with his parents and other relatives, were seated near a small stage and podium while members of the public filled Albert Johnson Park, a grassy area adjacent to city hall and Branigan Memorial Library. Tables and food trucks were stationed in several locations, offering free bottled water and hot chocolate, a popular service as the sun went down and the evening grew colder.

Lt. Gov. Howie Morales and other state and local officials were among the crowd that gathered here, embracing community members and law enforcement officers in and out of uniform, as well as the Las Cruces Fire Department.

"He had a heart of gold," Yesenia Lopez said of her husband, briefly taking the podium to thank the community for a tribute that included heartfelt remembrances of two brother officers who had gone through the academy with Hernandez. They shared stories of friendship, laughter and shared ordeals as cadets.

Luis Balderrama, who once supervised Hernandez as a sergeant, spoke of Hernandez as a peer rather than a subordinate: "Jonah is an inspiration to us all because he gave the ultimate sacrifice so that we could all go home; and also a personal inspiration for my continued growth to be a better person."

A cellist with the Las Cruces Symphony played Bach while a mix of real candles with battery-operated lights were distributed and lit, spreading white globes of light framed by the red and blue flashing lights of police cars that bordered the

park along Main Street and Picacho Avenue.

"I know he's looking over us right now with a big smile on his face," officer Carlos Hernandez, who shared a surname with his deceased colleague but was not a relative, "and I know he did not regret anything."

Funeral services for Hernandez will also be open to the public at 10 a.m., Wednesday, Feb. 21, at Abundant Church, 1000 Valley Crest Drive in El Paso. After the service, a police procession will take Hernandez to his resting place at Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Cemetery.

Religious messages

From the memorial cards distributed to participants as well as addresses by Mayor Eric Enriquez, two chaplains and others who spoke, Biblical scriptures and Christian faith were cited throughout the public service to impart messages about police officers' commitment and the nature of authority.

There were frequent expressions of love and devotion to the community, while Chief Story made explicit reference to confronting "evil," echoing a statement made in a press conference on Tuesday. On that occasion, with the pain of Hernandez's death plainly fresh, Story told reporters and the public from a written statement, "This is an evil world. There is evil in our beautiful city. As officers, we see it every day; but it takes selfless men and women to stand against that evil."

Chaplain Conant Carr turned from Psalm 116 ("Precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of his faithful servants") to Romans: "Let everyone be subject to the governing authorities for there is no authority except that which God has established

and the authorities that exist have been established by God himself, and consequently, those who rebel against the authority are rebelling against what God has instituted. ... They are God's servants, agents of wrath to bring punishment upon the wrongdoer."

Enriquez, in his address, read a verse from the Book of Lamentations ("Though He brings grief, He will show compassion, so great is His unfailing love") and aimed for a message of healing and unity: "It's a difficult time that we're going through now, and it doesn't seem like there's anything that will soften this blow; but I tell you, it's love that will."

John Powell, pastor emeritus of the First Evangelical Free Church, delivered a closing benediction from Psalms ("... unless the Lord watches over the city, the watchman stays awake in vain"), stating in a prayer that police and firefighters were the city's watchmen: "Bless and empower them, grant them zeal tempered with humility and strength tempered with kindness, even as modeled by Jonah Hernandez."

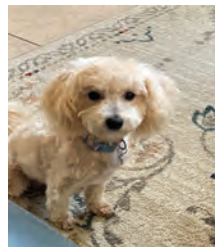

Many golfers' problems solved by behavior modification

The idea for this column came to me while re-reading the all-time 1972 classic, "Golf in the Kingdom" by Michael Murphy, a book that should be on the shelf of every serious golfer.

The story is about a fictitious Scottish golf pro named Shivas Irons. While teaching a student during a playing round, Irons insists the player let his awareness of his score recede to the "back of their minds." He would institute a "second scoring system" for pupils who were struggling. He would give them points for certain attitudes and behaviors, to reinforce changes he wanted. It was done to "preserve (the player's) dignity." Murphy writes: "Experts in behavior modification

and operant conditioning would have been proud of my obscure Scottish professional's grasp of science. You might try making your own 'second scoring system,' giving yourself points for a calm and centered attitude or a gracious remark to your playing partner when he beats you."

That passage startled me. I thought back to my years of Ph.D. training as a cognitive behavioral therapist and how it would apply to golf. Cognitive behavioral therapy is based on the premise that maladaptive behaviors are mostly a function of thinking, or lack thereof. So I considered what types of

problems, failures and self-defeating behaviors that golfers demonstrate could be changed with behavior modification. After a couple of weeks the list grew so long that I had to select the most salient ones to share here.

We can start with golfers who are continually discouraged and angry about the fact that their golf scores reflect a performance on the golf course that is unacceptable. The root of the problem, very often, is the individual's thinking and attitudes. Examples are: "I should be playing much better;" "I never get any good breaks;" "golf is simply not fair;" "the

cards are stacked against me;" "I used to play really good and now I suck." Perfectionism, emotional volatility, chronic complaining, rudeness and constant excuses about bad play are also common problems. It's hard to make friends by acting like a jerk. Change your thinking – you can change your results.

Negative attitudes hold many regular golfers back. Take the reluctance to have lessons, for example. Some people think, "I'll never get any better." Or, "I tried lessons but they didn't work." The issue sometimes is the same in teaching golf as it is with clinical advice to patients: Individuals so often reject the advice and don't follow up with what they are told

to do, and unhappiness continues.

And then we have to consider behaviors on the golf course that are unacceptable by normal standards. Things like temper tantrums, frequent yelling and club throwing. A few years ago, I was playing with a temper-challenged friend who missed a short shot to the green whereupon he threw his laser rangefinder at his golf cart and it completely shattered. And tantrums aren't just an amateur problem. In the 2019 Open Championship at Royal Portrush, Henrik Stenson badly shanked his iron shot on the 17th hole and then proceeded to snap his club across his knee for millions to see on television. Other unappealing

behaviors include phone distractions, incessant chatting, ultra-slow play, disrespect for the game (e.g. shabby attire) and excessive on-course alcohol consumption.

I believe the main difficulty with unruly behavior by golfers is lack of self-awareness: Folks don't realize their awful annoying habits. That makes it hard to work on self-behavior modification. Corporate managers often find out their behaviors need modification after they have been fired. Golfers might benefit by asking their playing buddies if they need to improve some of their actions and habits.
