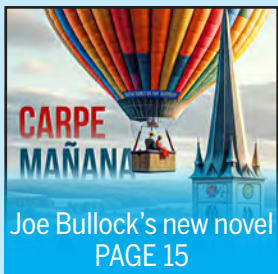

# Jesse Walden speaks of healing one year after shooting

NMSU grad was shot on reporting assignment

A full year has passed since Florida photojournalist and New Mexico State University alumnus Jesse Walden was critically injured while covering a shooting in the field. However, the passion he has for his work has not waned a bit.

Walden, 30, and his Spectrum News 13 colleague Dylan Lyons were preparing to report from the cleared scene of a shooting on Feb. 22, 2023, in Orlando when the alleged shooter returned and fired his handgun.

Lyons was killed on scene and Walden was seriously injured.

The shootings left three people dead and two injured that day.

"This year's been such a, you know, otherworldly experience for me. I'm looking forward to continuing to work and get back into my life and hopefully eventually feeling lost in the normalcy again," Walden said during a visit to Las Cruces last week.

Walden visited his alma mater and was also recognized by Mayor Eric Enriquez during a city council meeting on Feb. 20, when Enriquez said of Walden: "His journey to healing became an integral part of his narrative, enabling him to connect with people on a profound level and share stories of

the slowly widening time between realizing you were not thinking about a traumatic event.

"It's nice that's how healing works ... I'm definitely going through that and wanting to continue moving in that direction. That's what I see for myself for the future. And I'm still a firm believer that what we're doing makes a huge, positive impact on the world," he said.

However, Walden's path to journalism was not quite linear.

Walden explained that his father was in the mili-

# City Manager Ifo Pili resigning from Las Cruces

Las Cruces City Manager Ifo Pili, who has led Las Cruces' administration for three and a half years, announced he will leave the city in March. The announcement came Wednesday morning as the Bulletin went to press.

Pili had accepted another city manager position in another city, although a news release announcing Pili's departure did not say where he was headed.

"I have been honored to lead the City of Las Cruces for the last several years. It has been a privilege to work with a committed City Council and move their vision forward. I am proud

of the work the staff has done and I know I will be hearing more about their future accomplishments," Pili said in a news release.

Pili was appointed by the Las Cruces City Council in 2020.

He was previously employed as the city administrator of Eagle Mountain, Utah, since 2012 and also served as Eagle Mountain City's assistant city administrator and economic development coordinator for six years before becoming city administrator, according to past reporting in the Las Cruces Bulletin.

His time in Las Cruces was irrevocably affected by the Covid-19 pandemic and the city's response. But Pili also presided

over an ongoing transformation within the Las Cruces Police Department. He oversaw the establishment of several revitalization efforts, such as LiftUP Las Cruces and the two metropolitan redevelopment areas. The birth of a sprawling cannabis market in Las Cruces occurred under Pili's leadership.

Both Doña Ana County and the City of El Paso are searching for executive leaders, making the pool of applicants more competitive.

Mayor Eric Enriquez could not be immediately reached for comment about the process ahead. Mayor Pro Tem and Councilor Johana Bencomo told the Bulletin that a process to select a

new city manager had yet to be officially made.

The news release suggested that the next city would be an in-

ternal hire, saying, "Internal applications for the City Manager's position began being accepted Wednesday, Feb. 28, 2024. The Las Cruces City Council will hire a new City Manager, and interviews are anticipated to begin in March."

Typically, municipalities hire a search firm to provide them with a pool of applicants before interviewing and choosing one. But if the council – who has discretion in selecting the next city manager – decides to hire internally, parts or all of that process may be skipped.

"I believe we have a really deep bench," Bencomo said when asked about the future decision.

tary and the family moved around every few years. He was about 17 when his father was stationed at White Sands Missile Range and the family moved to Las Cruces.

Walden attended the former Oñate High School (now Organ Mountain High) and went on to study digital filmmaking at NMSU. While he never specifically studied journalism, he did work as an editor for News 22.

"I kind of just learned the ins and outs and how similar journalism was to documentary filmmaking, which is what I was studying at CMI (NMSU's Creative Media Institute)," Walden said. "They just had different people from different news organizations come and meet us

and I kind of clicked with some reporters from KOB who come down from Albuquerque."

Walden said he had a job offer from KOB before he graduated from NMSU. He started working in Albuquerque in 2016 where he became an editor and trained as a photographer.

When the Covid-19 pandemic hit, Walden moved to Salt Lake City, Utah to work at the FOX affiliate. Two years later, he moved again. This time to Orlando, where he said his cost of living is lower and the news market is larger.

"Florida was the nice combination of everything that I enjoyed about news," Walden said. "It was politically charged, it was exciting, there was crazy things happening and ... the height of entertainment is out there."

He explained that he

was a general assignment photojournalist when he first joined Spectrum News 13, but his coverage area has shifted since the shooting. He now describes the stories he covers as "traffic and attractions" with a focus on "character-driven storytelling" – similar to mini-documentaries, he said.

Stories are much more personal, Walden said. And because of this objective and the fact that Spectrum News 13 does not heavily emphasize crime coverage, it was a rare situation that Walden found himself covering a shooting last year.

"It really was just sort of crazy bad luck for us to even be on that story," Walden said. "On an average ... workweek, I would say we were only covering crime like one or two days a week."

Despite experiencing such a traumatic event and still going through the physical and mental process of healing, Walden said his perspective on amplifying voices through journalism has not changed at all.

"It still feels just as vital as it's always felt and I feel like it almost invigorates,

in a lot of ways," he said.

He added that people often ask him about his work and comment on how "depressing" journalism must be because you're "seeing all these horrible things all the time."

"There's so much more good in the world, so much more people volunteering and using their time for amazing causes and making the world a (more fun) and better place that I would have no idea if I wasn't doing this job," Walden said. "I think it's tremendously important for us to continue to showcase ... a real image of what the world is and I think, in a lot of ways, the world is a lot more positive and welcoming than people assume it is."

The openness and large capacity for empathy people have can be a counter to all the negativity the

news industry often highlights and is something Walden said he had seen, but never experienced personally until he was injured.

"I was floored by how much people cared, how much compassion and how many friends and coworkers and strangers would pour in and message me and visit and talk to me and call me. So much that really just kept reaffirming. I was like, 'man ... what a wonderful world this is,'" he said. "We're pulled by our emotions and that's such an important part of why storytelling matters."

Both Walden and Lyons will be honored with citations of courage at the Radio Television Digital News Association's 2024 First Amendment Awards in Washington D.C. on March 9.

# City re-ups \$3 million contract with ambulance service after controversy

The Las Cruces City Council voted unanimously to sign a \$3 million contract with American Medical Response (AMR) to provide ambulance services in Las Cruces and Doña Ana County.

The contract term is for five years and allows three one-year extensions. AMR, who has operated in Las Cruces for years, will continue providing

ambulance services like advanced life support and transportation to area hospitals alongside the Las Cruces Fire Department.

Fire officials explained to the city council during a Feb. 20 meeting that Las Cruces Doña Ana County would also pay for part of the service. Those payments would go through the city. However, the city would be the primary governmental entity overseeing the contract and AMR's performance.

In March 2020, the city of Las Cruces sought to provide ambulance services to separately from AMR. However, they had to receive approval from the Public Regulation Commission.

At the time, Las Cruces Fire Department officials said they wanted to decrease the time it took to respond to emergency calls.

"It's a critical issue," Jason Smith, deputy fire chief at the time, told the Las Cruces Sun-News

in 2019. "You want your help to arrive as quickly and safely as they can get there. You want the properly medically trained person to be there so they can start delivering care."

AMR and Doña Ana County – with whom Las Cruces shared responsibility for paying for ambulance services – then protested Las Cruces' request. The three parties came to a settlement through the PRC in July 2020.

The settlement compelled Las Cruces and Doña Ana County to enter into a governmental agreement called a Memorandum of Understanding or MOU. The settlement also made the two entities responsible for emergency medical transportation and re-

quired them to request a bid for a private entity to provide that service.

AMR – the largest private and for-profit ambulance provider in the U.S. – was the only company meeting the budget's proposed standards.

Yvonne Flores, councilor for District 6, asked if the clash between AMR and the city of Las Cruces was still relevant.

"That was four years ago in 2020," Flores said. "But now we're extending to five years. So, they've done a good job?"

Smith, now chief of fire department, clarified that LCFD and AMR would work together. However, Smith added that LCFD would respond to the most critical calls in city limits and just outside the city, while AMR focused more

on the greater county and less serious calls.

Smith also pointed out criteria to evaluate AMR's performance – most requirements centered on response times, something AMR has struggled with in the past.

Joaquin Graham, regional manager of AMR's parent company, acknowledged that fact when addressing the council. He attributed those issues to staffing shortages but said the new contract with LCFD would help improve those response times and staffing issues.

"This contract is very innovative," Graham said. "It holds us to different standards and really develops what we were looking for, that of a partnership."

# NM tests high schools' wastewater for drugs without clear plan for results

On an afternoon with blowing dust and sideways snow, two people in bright yellow vests and heavy winter clothes worked over an open manhole in the brush behind Belen High School.

"Ice packs to make sure that everything stays cold. Not that that's a problem right now," said Tom Brown, an employee with Eastern Research Group, a company that the state of New Mexico is contracting with to test the wastewater from schools.

He and a state employee lowered tubes down into the sewer, then suspended a barrel-shaped device at the top. This rig pulled samples throughout the next school day.

"We're going to take 32 samples every fifteen minutes. That's 8 hours' worth of samples," Brown said.

This is happening across the state. Back in September, New Mexico Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham signed an executive order to address gun violence and illegal drug

use.

The order made national news for banning guns in public places. That was struck down within the week by a judge, but the order was broad and included many other mandates.

One of them is this: wastewater testing at nearly every high school. The governor said this will tell the state which communities need its attention most, but no one at the state level has laid out a clear plan for what they will do with the information once they have it. Advocates say that raises red flags.

Jonas Armstrong, director of strategic initiatives with the New Mexico Environment Department, said schools reflect their communities, and that's why it makes sense to test them.

"It can tell us that a substance is present. It can't tell us who is using it. It can't tell us how many people are using it," he said.

The process tests for fifteen different opioids and stimulants, and only gives a positive or

negative read. Some of the substances officials are testing for can also show up for legal substances. For example, amphetamine is an ingredient in the drug Adderall, as well as methamphetamine.

The state posts results online as it receives them and expects to be done with its first round in March. The testing costs have run about \$600,000 so far, and the department is asking for more to continue it.

"There's been a lot of wastewater testing for illicit substances in different

places around the country around the world," Armstrong said.

Wastewater testing for drugs has existed for decades and is more popular in Europe and Australia. Since COVID-19 began, it has become more accepted and common in the U.S., especially for municipalities and universities.

But not for schools with minors.

Carlton Poindexter does research measuring contaminants with the United States Department of Agriculture and teaches at Howard University. He said hopefully, this will

lead to more resources for kids who need it, but he said there is a risk of stigmatizations.

"And if that community already has some other overlapping stigmatizations and perceptions ... that just kind of adds on to it.

And he echoed the fear of many in these communities that it could lead to more police in schools.

"Especially with marginalized communities, they usually don't have the best experiences with authority figures and police officers," he said.

Poindexter said an evidence-based approach should start with the community.

"How aware are they of it and how much say do they have in this process? And should the results come back positive or high, how do they want outside bodies to potentially respond and work with them to address that issue?" he said.

Activists like Mikyle Gray with the Southwest Organizing Project in Albuquerque say the state does consult with community-based organizations

on ideas for cutting down on illegal drug use. But with the wastewater testing, it feels like that work is falling on deaf ears.

"It doesn't provide any solutions. It doesn't provide ways for people who are addicted to find support or treatment," he said.

He and his colleague Amanda Gallegos said it's not news that these drugs are in New Mexico schools. Gallegos said what shocks her is the price tag. She said that money could've gone elsewhere.

"I could name a couple things off the top of my head," she said.

Gallegos said teens need places to go, like a teen center or jobs. They also need more counselors in schools and treatment – there's not a lot available in New Mexico for young people dealing with addiction. The state has an ongoing shortage of counselors in schools.

"The solution should come from the impacted people," she said.

# School district reports clean audit, hears new book complaint

Las Cruces Public Schools Superintendent Ignacio Ruiz congratulated the district's top financial officer, Chenyu "Alex" Liu, last week for an annual financial audit that contained zero findings, a rare and difficult achievement for a government agency, particularly one of the size of the second-largest school district in New Mexico.

The annual financial audit is completed by an independent auditing firm recognized by the State Auditor's office. The report, released to the public at the end of January, delivered an "unmodified" opinion – the highest quality of opinion based on the agency's financial statements and examination of how the district handles and documents public funds.

It is common for audit reports to report findings, which range from minor deviations from accounting standards to significant deficiencies or material weaknesses. An audit with no findings for a large agency that handles state and federal funds is a rare achievement, Ruiz noted.

Much of the Feb. 20 business meeting involved routine business, celebrations and updates on strategic planning at the district.

Ruiz also reported that his administration had essentially completed its revision of regulations enforcing two policies pertaining to challenges of books at school libraries: One pertaining to books assigned

as course material, the other to books included in libraries for optional reading. The changes had been directed by the school board after a formal complaint about a book at Mayfield High School's library was handled using the wrong procedure.

The complainants, who had challenged the presence of L.C. Rosen's young adult novel, "Jack of Hearts (and other parts)," for being sexually explicit and inappropriate for minors, have the option of filing a new challenge to the book under the correct procedure, which includes a review of the book by a committee which could recommend removing a book. The removal would need to be agreed to by the superintendent and the school board.

Juan Garcia and Sarah Smith, the residents who challenged that book, appeared before the school board at Tuesday's meeting to flag another novel: "A Court of Silver Flames" by Sarah J. Maas. The novel is the fourth in a series of romance fantasies and includes erotic and sexually explicit passages, which Garcia and Smith read aloud to the school board during public comments.

They stated that the book is available in the high schools' libraries as well as one middle school library, and objected to its availability for minors. Garcia suggested its inclusion may have been a deliberate effort to "normalize" descriptions of sexual behavior and those acts themselves for children. Garcia suggested any minors present in the meeting room take leave

as he proceeded to read a passage that included frank language and sexual images.

"How is this educational material?" Garcia asked.

Smith argued that there was a "systemic problem" leading to age-inappropriate books being available in the libraries, and asked for a review committee to be established for screening library books as well as an audit into books currently on the stacks.

As is customary with public comments, the school board did not respond to the arguments presented during the open session, as the matter was not on the agenda.

Ruiz said revised regulations under policies KEF and KEC would be published on the district's website, clarifying the selection process for advisory committees when a book or course material is challenged, and to ensure compliance with the collective bargaining agreement that covers teachers and some other school staff.

On Jan. 30, the board unanimously voted to disband the review committee that had cleared

"Jack of Hearts (and other parts)" for continued inclusion in Mayfield's library, and signaled that Smith and Garcia could refile their complaint if they chose.

## Local funders push for investment in local news

Local news outlets and the reporters who work for them are declining sharply, with a Northwestern University study reporting newspapers closing at a rate of 2.5 weekly during 2023, an increase over the previous year, worsening the prob-

lem of "news deserts," such as in small or rural communities with few reliable news sources.

The Northwestern study also reported that philanthropists committed \$500 million to support local news organizations last year, while state lawmakers considered measures to address communities in danger of

losing independent news reporting. Local journalism is also attracting foundation support, and a new venture in New Mexico aims to support local reporting across the state.

Press Forward New Mexico is an initiative bringing the Thornburg Foundation together with the New Mexico Local News Fund under

the Santa Fe Community Foundation, along with the McCune Charitable Foundation and Albuquerque Community Foundation. The partners have a set a goal of raising \$3 million over five years from local foundations and donors and then seeking a matching grant from the national Press Forward mission, launched

last year.

Press Forward's initial list of chapters, announced last fall, were based in Alaska, Illinois, Minnesota, Kansas and Philadelphia. Last week, it announced new chapters in 11 more states and major cities, including New Mexico along with Colorado, Mississippi, New Jersey, Wyoming,

North Carolina, Pittsburgh and Lancaster, Penn., San Antonio, Florida's Miami area and Lexington, Ky.

In a written statement, Thornburg's executive director, Allan Oliver, said, "We are a big believer in the power of local journalism to be a key watchdog

# Jonah Hernandez laid to rest in El Paso

The morning before Jonah Hernandez was killed, he made sure to spend a few minutes helping his wife.

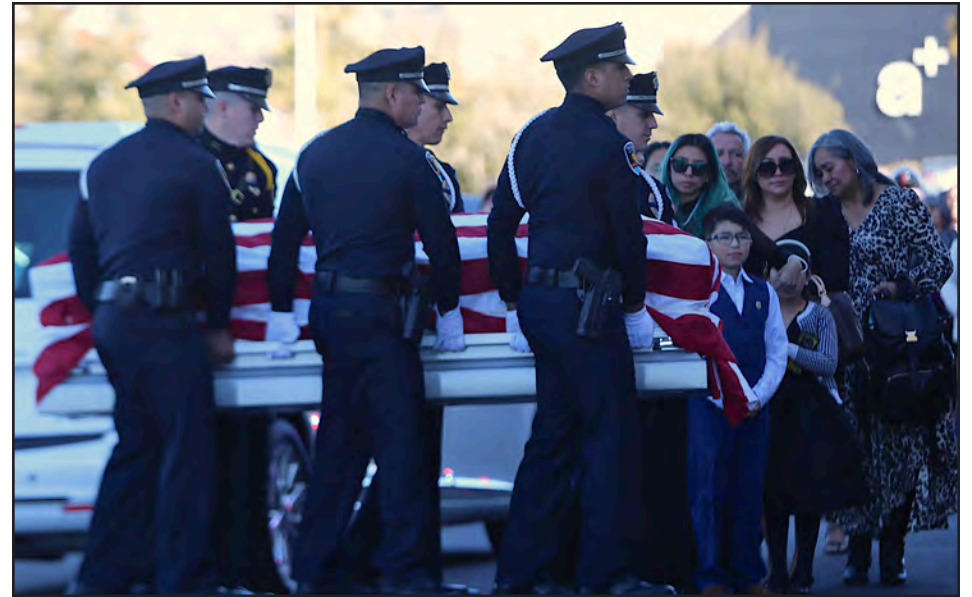
Yesenia Lopez had been sick the morning of Feb. 11, so she needed help getting out of bed. Hernandez did just that. He helped her out of bed, shared a cup of coffee with her and then brought her back to bed before

leaving his hometown, El Paso, for his place of work in Las Cruces. It was a small way the married couple could celebrate Valentine's Day together a little early.

Hernandez died hours later. On the corner of Valley Drive and Amador Avenue, he was stabbed to death while responding to a trespassing call at a local business. He was the first member of the Las Cruces Police Department to die in the line of duty.

On Feb 21, the department and his family laid Hernandez to rest at Our Lady of Mount Carmel Cemetery in El Paso, following a service.

"Today is about remembering Officer Jonah Hernandez and honoring not just his sacrifice, but his life," LCPD Chief Jeremy Story said. "Many of us remember him as Officer Hernandez, a man who dedicated himself to a calling that very few people can understand or

comprehend."

Story was one of several who spoke about Hernandez during the funeral service.

"This horrendous event has fractured Las Cruces. And there are ripples that have spread throughout the United States. The events of that day will leave a scar on our city that will never fully heal. But Jonah was not just a police officer. He was a father, husband, a son. He was a brother, a nephew, and uncle, a cousin," Story said.

Lopez also spoke about Hernandez. For a crowd of about 200 – mostly police officers and their fam-

ilies – she recounted how she and Hernandez met 11 years ago. It was a simple meeting, she said. It happened at a bar with an exchange of phone numbers. But afterward, they spent the week together and launched into a relationship shortly after.

"It was a non-stop adventure," Lopez said.

Lopez and others who knew Hernandez described his bright presence to those around him.

"He showed me a sense of peace and safety I had never known before," Lopez said. "I could follow him blindly and know that I would be safe."

Hernandez leaves behind his wife and his two sons, Sebastian Jonah, 10, and 2-year-old Joaquin Leonel. And, as Chief Story alluded to, a community he served.

"And as dark as this time is, the morning will come. But let us never forget the pain that is felt by his family and his friends in the community. Let us never forget the impact he has had on each one of us. There is a wound that will remain, and should remain, because Officer Hernandez will always be a part of us. Rest in Peace, Jonah, you are very loved," Story said.

of the government, helping keep elected officials honest and our democracy stronger.”

### Lead funders

Based in Santa Fe, the Thornburg Foundation addresses systemic problems such as water resilience in New Mexico, homelessness throughout the state, sustainable agriculture and reforms in education and governance.

The New Mexico Local News Fund, established in 2018, is a project of the Santa Fe Community Foundation and has offered assistance to newsrooms around the state. Among its projects are fellowship programs placing recent graduates into nine-month full-time reporting positions at newsrooms that apply, with the support of foundations as well as the state Workforce Solutions department. Locally, the Las Cruces Sun-News and Deming Headlight both welcomed Local News Fund fellows to their re-

porting teams last year.

The program is separate from another nonprofit project, Report for America, that helps pay salaries for emerging journalists who make a two-year commitment to a newsroom accepted by the program, and may or may not be hired on permanently afterward.

The LNF also supports a local news collaborative bringing together local newsrooms, grant programs and matching campaigns and an incubator funding startup news organizations, including one based in Las Cruces: an online news source named Organ Mountain News, whose launch is pending.

### Role of foundations

Public media organizations, organized under the nonprofit model, have frequently received support from foundations and trusts, and the number of nonprofit startups has expanded. Some focus on investigative reporting or covering communities of color while others address gaps in local government reporting. Newsrooms often collaborate to share

stories and build local news “ecosystems.”

The expansion of charitable and community foundations’ role in supporting news organizations including for-profit enterprises is a recent and growing development as the state of local news has continued to deteriorate. Allan Oliver, the Thornburg Foundation’s executive director, said Thornburg began its support of local news in 2017, and sees the public interest in journalism in alignment with the foundation’s other areas of concern.

“The vital stories that news organizations can bring to the public critically elevate the public discussion and public understanding,” Oliver told the Bulletin.

The reason it matters for communities, Local News Fund executive director Rashad Mahmood explained, is shown in data: “Without access to high quality local journalism, studies show that voter participation is lower, political polarization is higher, trust in government is lower,

people are less informed about important policy issues, city governments have higher borrowing costs, neighbors feel more disconnected from each other, and much more.”

Although LNF programs suggest strategies assisting newsrooms in areas such as distribution of content, boosting revenue and management, he said editorial control remains squarely with the

local newsrooms themselves.

Press Forward’s funding decisions are made by a steering committee, Mahmood explained, based on multiple criteria. “We’ll do our best to publicly communicate those criteria to ensure the public and news organizations seeking support will understand the process,” he continued. “Interested members of the public

and journalists will play a critical role in shaping Press Forward New Mexico’s work through our advisory committee.”

Oliver added, “We also recognize it is vital for news organizations to maintain their independence. That is why we offer grants to nonprofit news organizations for news projects focused on an issue area, but never for any story.”

## Las Cruces man sentenced for 2022 killing

### BULLETIN REPORT

A Las Cruces man was sentenced to 10 years in prison following a jury conviction in November 2023.

James Theriault, 82, was convicted of second-degree murder, attempted murder and tampering with evidence. A jury found Theriault shot Fatima

Ortiz and fatally shot Carlos Picharo on July 9, 2022.

Police believed that Theriault had a long-standing feud with his neighbors, Ortiz and Picharo, that ended in the fatal shooting on S. San Pedro Street. Part of the shooting was recorded by Ortiz, according to court records.

## Maybe that is who we are, after all

“That’s not who we are” is the pleading cry we so often hear in the wake of extremist political violence in the U.S.

The gallows brought to the steps of the U.S. Capitol on Jan. 6, 2021 by crowds calling for the vice president to be hanged, invaders equipped to capture members of Congress, a coordinated effort to disrupt the peaceful transition of elected power in the midst of chaos — that wasn’t us.

No more so than incidents of violence or terror aimed at the first Black president (hanged in effigy

outside the White House); the white supremacist rally in Charlottesville that turned deadly; a presidential candidate (and former president) claiming that unauthorized immigrants from certain regions are “poisoning the blood” of America; armed civilians turning up at public demonstrations a few years ago to keep an eye on progressive activists; threats made against election workers, shots fired into lawmakers’

homes; and more in that vein are not, we lament, who we are.

Yet history shows that this has been, and is, part of us. “Gods, Guns and Sedition: Far-Right Terrorism in America,” a recent book from Columbia University Press by two scholars of

domestic terrorism, Bruce Hoffman and Jacob Ware, does an admirable job of putting these and similar events into context extending back to the failed post-Civil-War Reconstruction.

## Progress on gun safety inches forward

After having her Bernalillo County gun ban overturned by the court, Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham tried to do it the right way, putting together an impressive public safety package of proposed legislation that addressed not only guns but also bail reform; sentencing; and police pay and recruitment.

If passed, it would have been a huge step toward addressing our state’s gun violence epidemic. New Mexico ranked seventh in the nation in gun deaths, according to a 2020 report by Johns Hopkins, which found that firearms were the leading cause of death for kids in our state

(mostly suicides).

Sadly, our legislature doesn’t move in huge steps. It moves in baby steps, when at all.

And so, only two gun bills were passed this year. One of them makes it illegal to bring firearms into a polling site, something I thought was already against the law. So, it was illegal to wear a campaign T-shirt while voting, but coming in with a rifle slung over both shoulders and a gun strapped to both hips was OK?

Sen. Joseph Cervantes

of Las Cruces was cosponsor of the only meaningful bill on gun safety to pass this year. It creates a new seven-day waiting period for the purchase of a gun and was only passed after being watered down. The original bill called for a 14-day waiting period.

Proposals by the governor to demand greater accountability for gun manufacturers, increase the age to buy an assault rifle and prohibit guns in municipal parks and playgrounds never made it to a vote.

Strains of white supremacy, paranoid conspiracism and agitation for the overthrow of republican governance have exploded, the authors write, thanks to the present-day internet, highly permissive laws regulating weapons and the uniquely infectious anti-establishment movement on which Donald Trump tenuously rides.

Helping us understand this side of our history, the authors lay out recommendations, from new domestic terrorism laws to assessing the penetration of our armed forces

and police by extremists to regulating anti-personnel weapons and confronting disinformation on social media sites.

This is a book that talks frankly about a particular strain in American history, situating it as a condition we can address for the sake of justice and civic health.

Moving into the post-January 6 presidential election, Hoffman and Ware offer edification and some hope for public awareness, even if the current Congress seems unlikely to act with urgency on the current malaise.

Neither did other bills not on the governor’s list that would have reformed our red flag laws, banned assault weapons and high-capacity magazines and created a new office of gun-violence prevention. Lawmakers even defeated a memorial that simply called for a study of such an office.

Gov. Lujan Grisham has suggested that she may call a special session to take a second bite of the apple. But unless she is able to convince lawmakers to change their views, that will be a pointless exercise.

A look at the recorded votes on the waiting pe-

riod bill that passed shows how challenging the issue is. The bill passed 37-33 in the House despite “no” votes by local Democrats Tara Jaramillo and Willie Madrid. It passed 23-18 in the Senate despite a “no” vote from local Democrat Siah Correa Hemphill.

The bill to ban guns at polling places was also opposed by those three Democrats and Rep. Raymundo Lara. Really? While I don’t agree with it, I do understand the argument against a waiting period in cases where someone is in immediate danger. What is the argument for why

# We need help to keep our schools vape-free

In the Las Cruces Public Schools and across the nation, a concerning trend has taken hold: the widespread use of e-cigarettes among tweens and teens. According to the Centers for Disease Control, more than 2.5 million kids used e-cigarettes in 2022, with 14.1 percent of high school students and 3.3 percent of middle school students falling prey to this epidemic.

Kids in our community are at risk.

When they vape, our children are exposing themselves to harmful chemicals like nicotine and formaldehyde, jeopardizing the development of their hearts, lungs, and brains and increasing the likelihood of addiction, not just to nicotine but to other substances as well. It's a complex issue that demands a comprehensive solution.

At the heart of this crisis lies disposable, flavored e-cigarettes.

While the Food and Drug Administration

took a commendable step in 2020 by banning pod-based e-cigarettes, they neglected to impose restrictions on disposable counterparts, creating a dangerous loophole. Consequently, more than 5,800 unique disposable products have flooded the market, specifically targeting our children. It is a staggering 1,500 percent increase from early 2020. These products are designed to entice with sweet, candy-like flavors, flashy packaging and aggressive marketing on platforms like TikTok, often endorsed by popular influencers and celebrities. It's no surprise that 85 percent of youth e-cigarette users prefer flavored products, with fruit, candy and dessert-themed options topping the list.

The harsh reality is that the majority of these products are being sold illegally, blatantly violating FDA regulations. The Food and Drug Administration must approve each e-cigarette product before they can be sold. To date, the agency has

authorized only 23 specific e-cigarette products, all of which are tobacco-flavored alternatives to cigarettes, targeted at adults. These flashy, kid-friendly flavored products that are helping drive youth vaping rates should not be available for sale at all.

We need a call to action. The FDA must do its job, enforce existing regulations and crackdown on the sale of illegal, flavored vapes that directly endanger American children. As a mom and as president of the Las Cruces Public Schools Board of Education, I know we cannot afford to turn a blind eye to this issue and allow the health and well-being of our youth to be compromised.

It's time for the federal government to stand with local communities to take action and to call for the FDA to stop the sale of flavored disposable vapes now.

# Questions swirl after jury convicts man accused of shooting at police

A jury convicted a Las Cruces man accused of shooting at police officers following a car chase in 2023.

Bobby Charles Crawford, 47, was convicted of two counts of attempted first-degree murder, two counts of aggravated assault on a peace officer, aggravated fleeing a law

enforcement officer and shooting at or from a motor vehicle.

The jury also found Crawford not guilty on one additional account of aggravated assault upon a peace officer.

Police said Crawford fled from undercover New Mexico State Police officers on June 21, 2023. Las Cruces police joined the pursuit later and managed to wreck Crawford's

car on Holman Road. At that point, police body camera footage released to the public showed bullets flying near the head of an LCPD officer. LCPD officers then unloaded gunfire at Crawford.

Crawford then barricaded himself in a car, LCPD said, before surrendering himself.

According to a news

My family lived in the Middle East — in Amman, Jordan — when my husband, Clyde, was with a United States Agency for International Development agricultural project during 1987 - 1988. At that time, Jordan was one-third Palestinian and the Baqa'a Refugee Camp in Jordan was the largest Palestinian refugee camp in the world. And the intifada began on Dec. 9, 1987.

All of this made us aware of the concerns and issues of the Palestinian people. There were many and valid. Over time I became less pro-Israel and more understanding

of the complexity of the problem.

On Oct. 7, 2023 the Israeli - Hamas conflict began. Hamas killed 1,139 Israelis and took approximately 240 hostages. Because of this, Israel vowed to destroy Hamas.

However, in their effort to destroy Hamas, they have decimated the civilian population of Gaza, killing innocent women and children. Over 29,000 people have died in Gaza and over 69,000 have been injured. The United Nations says a quarter of the population is starving. And Doctors without Borders states that effective humanitarian aid cannot get to the people of Gaza.

Whereas Israel felt a response was needed to the death of 1,139 Israelis and the taking of 240 hostages, the decimation of the Palestinian people of Gaza is not acceptable. They are not Hamas, and a civilian population should not be asked to suffer and die for Hamas. This is wrong. Israel is wrong and the United States is wrong in its strong support of Israel. We are complicit.

Let me share what I read on a recent protest sign: "You need not be Muslim to care about the Palestinians. You only need to be human."

## New Mexico joins suit to stop Albertsons merger

New Mexico's Attorney General joined in a lawsuit against grocery giant Kroger's attempt to purchase another large chain, Albertsons.

The Federal Trade Commission announced Monday that New Mexico's Attorney General was part of a coalition that sued to block the \$24.6 billion merger. The FTC said that the merger would eliminate competition and so would raise prices for consumers and otherwise harm consumers by reducing quality. The commission also filed an administrative complaint in addition to the lawsuit.

The FTC also said it would harm workers, as there would be less competition for workers. Most workers at Kroger and Albertsons are members of the United Food and Commercial Workers union, the FTC noted, which allows them to compete for the best deals for workers.

Kroger operates nearly 1,300 stores under different brands throughout the United States, including Smith's and Price-Rite in New Mexico. Albertsons similarly has different regional brands, including the namesake Albertsons, Albertsons Markets and Safeway in New Mexico.

"My office proudly announces its collaborative stance alongside multiple

states and the Federal Trade Commission in a collective effort to challenge and prevent this anti-competitive merger that threatens fair market dynamics," Attorney General Raúl Torrez said in a statement. "This bipartisan legal action underscores our commitment to safeguarding consumer and labor interests to prevent higher grocery prices for New Mexican families and lower wages for employees."

The merger comes at a time when inflation and other issues have cut into wage increases for many workers across the country, including New Mexico.

"This supermarket mega merger comes as American consumers have seen the cost of groceries rise steadily over the past few years. Kroger's acquisition of Albertsons would lead to additional grocery price hikes for everyday goods, further exacerbating the financial strain consumers across the country face today," Henry Liu, Director of the FTC's Bureau of Competition, said in a statement.

In addition to New Mexico, the attorneys general of Arizona, California, the District of Columbia, Illinois, Maryland, Nevada, Oregon and Wyoming joined the FTC website.

As we move into the warmer months, we are coming up on April, which is the month the Excavation industry celebrates National Safe Digging Month. In preparation for this month, Las Cruces Utilities (LCU) sends out their annual Pipeline Safety and Call Before You Dig mailer which educates known excavators. Joe Atencio, Locating & Mapping Supervisor for LCU, has all the details of this mailer.

"This is an education and safety campaign," Atencio explains. "We want to promote damage prevention to excavators so we can prevent service interruptions, and more importantly, keep our workers and communities safe."

Underground utility pipelines are located out of sight, underground. Landscape can undergo changes such as weather

and natural erosion, and many even have undergone previous undisclosed excavation projects, so it is imperative that anyone preparing to excavate should always contact New Mexico One Call ("NM811") by dialing 811 and submit a dig ticket about the proposed excavation site.

This process is managed on the online Positive Response Web Portal System, which enhances communication between NM811, utility companies, and excavators. An excavator is anyone that is planning on breaking ground in a project, or anyone who contacts NM811 at least three business days before work begins. This initiates a dig ticket with NM811, who relays the request to the utility companies in the area.

Each utility company in the state is required to be a member of NM811 and



required to respond to any dig tickets in the Web Portal System. If there are facilities in the area, the technicians are dispatched to the area and mark the ground with those familiar flags you have probably seen before. If there are no facilities in the area, the utility company is still required to close out each dig ticket via the Web portal.

The LCU Digging Safety mailer also includes information that directs excavators to online damage prevention resources. These include the Excavator's Handbook and the free Excavation Law & Damage

Prevention class, offered by the Public Regulation Commission, the state-run agency dedicated to safe operations and reliable utility services. These resources educate people about New Mexico excavation law and what their responsibilities are as an excavator from project beginning to project close-out.

If a utility pipeline is punctured, natural gas can leak into the air, and water and wastewater can leak into the ground, disrupting communities as well as services, and more dangerously, possibly igniting and injuring people. Digging safety is not just important to keeping utilities up and running but is also important for the safety of our whole community.

"Luckily, Las Cruces has not had an ignition in over 20 years," Atencio states. "LCU works diligently to keep the community safe by training and educating in digging safety. We are always one call away."

## Faith, signs and human nature move his pen

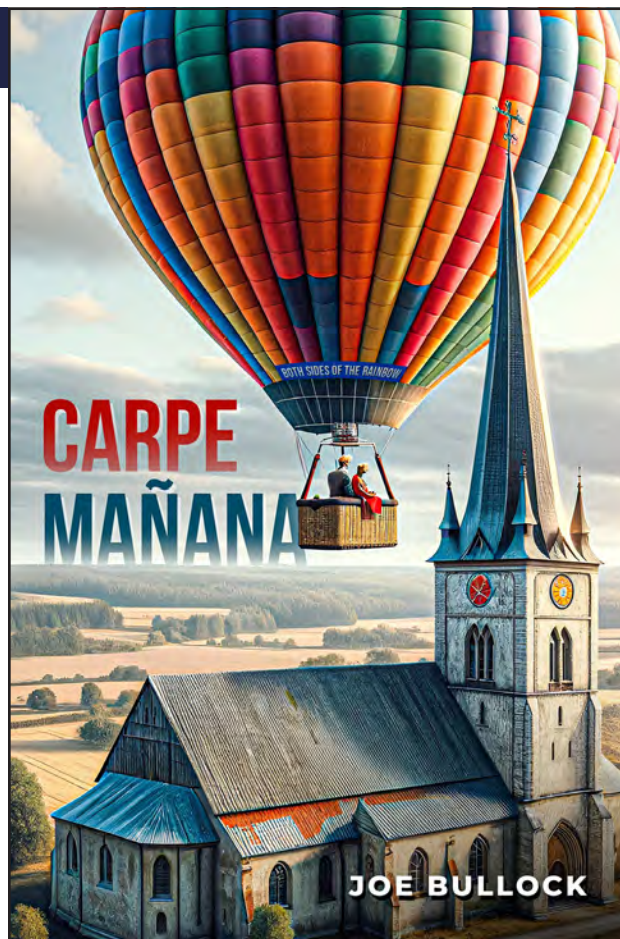
When banker Joe Bullock wrote a little book of faith-based fiction, including an angelic twist on his friend and New Mexico State University golf legend, Herb Wimberly, he had no idea the result, “Walking With Herb,” would inspire so many people. He just hoped someone would find something spiritually meaningful in it.

Now, another book, “Carpe Mañana,” that he has penned, is ready to move on to the presses

and will be soon hitting the bookstores.

“I want to tell stories that need to be told,” Bullock said. “I particularly want to tell spiritual stories that have a message to them. Like a spiritual vitamin, but with enough humor and action to make the medicine go down easy.”

Bullock said he is not interested in preaching to the choir. Rather he would like to see somebody pick up the book, read it and “kind of absorb a spiritual lesson without even know-



ing they really did it.”

People have told him “Walking with Herb” did just that. Made into a movie released in March 2020 (derailed quickly by the onset of Covid-19), film creators Ross Marks and Mark Medoff have

talked about the spiritual effect the story had on them. Even the stars Kathleen Quinlan and Edward James Olmos say the experience of making it was spiritually uplifting.

The story for “Carpe

Mañana” was inspired by experiences Bullock and his wife, Sheila, have had. He said much of the story centers around a clinic and what he calls “the baby trap.”

He said he sees young women who have gotten themselves in a trap with two or more children, all with different fathers. The women are not married and have no financial support and so are trapped in a life of public assistance.

Sheila worked for many years teaching in a combination kindergarten, first and second grade classroom and Joe said she has seen many young women in the unfortunate situation. After that she worked for a local assistance organization as a developmental specialist and would go out in the community to meet with families.

“She became like a surrogate grandmother for

every one of these families,” Joe said. “It wasn’t untypical of her to go out and go to a place where they live in a mobile home on the east mesa. There is a 37-year-old grandmother – she’s got two 19- or 20-year-old daughters, each of them has two kids. For some reason, the culture is if you are dating a guy for six months and aren’t pregnant, something is wrong.”

The clinic in the “Carpe Mañana” story is run by a priest, also a celestial type character by the name of Herb, Joe said. At the clinic, young women can work to complete their education and take care of their babies at the same time.

The hero in this book is a retired Marine colonel who retired because of some depression he’s had. Protagonist James Viejo’s

release from the 3rd Judicial District Attorney's Office, the jury deliberated for four hours following a three-day trial. Judge Richard Jacquez presided over the trial.

“We sincerely appreciate the Doña Ana County jury's hard work which found defendant Crawford guilty of the attempted murder of two Las Cruces police officers and other associated violent crimes,” District Attorney Gerald Byers said in a news release. “Their verdict demonstrates Doña Ana County juries will assign accountability for

proven criminal conduct. We also thank the court for presiding over a fair and efficient trial. At sentencing, my office will request the court impose the maximum sentence permitted by law, so that this dangerous convict

“There are some very serious issues with the case and we do plan to appeal,” said Jonathan Miller, Crawford's attorney.

**Q: It was fun to see Lisa Ann Walter win the latest "Celebrity Jeopardy!" tournament. I know she's on "Abbott Elementary" now, but what other series has she been in?**

wife died. His son, also a Marine, was killed in combat and Viejo is having a difficult time dealing with the guilt of training people to kill and be killed.

Viejo's dead wife is in an urn he carries with him everywhere he goes. The urn, a music box, plays "Somewhere over the Rainbow," their favorite song. Some of the chapters in the book are even from her point of view from the urn.

The story includes a move to Albuquerque where Viejo's granddaughter is in college and wants him to meet an attractive woman, Renee, who is a judge and teaches part time at the law school. He gets involved with the clinic where Renee volunteers and the story moves on from there.

In the book, Renee is a balloonist with her own balloon. She takes Viejo on a ride, and they have an accident, with

their lives saved by being caught on a church spire. This becomes a sign for the two about making a difference and putting their all into the clinic.

Joe said there are conflicts in the book, "a little romance, a little kicking some gang members butts and it all resolves in the end."

A strong believer in signs, Bullock said he met publisher Linda Sterling after sitting next to Sterling's daughter on a flight and getting acquainted when he spotted her reading a medical manual. (Bullock is the chair of the MountainView Regional Medical Center board.)

"I thought, 'this is a sign if there ever was one,'" he recalled. "So, I feel like I'm in good hands with somebody who is a little small publishing company and I think will give a real personal interest in the project."

Not only is Sterling's company publishing his new book, but it is also reprinting "Walking with Herb."

The title, "Carpe Mañana," is a play off the motto, "carpe diem (seize the day)," to mean "Seize tomorrow," Joe said.

"Carpe Mañana" started as a screenplay, he said. But then he felt there was no place to go with a screenplay.

"In a book you tell people, in a screenplay you show people," he said. "It's a whole different writing style."

The "Walking with Herb" movie, because it was released during Covid, did not make a lot of money, but is now streaming on several platforms. It is also screened at charity events, where Joe sometimes gives talks.

Wimberly passed away Dec. 20, 2023, and following his funeral, Joe is grateful for the life of his friend and for having him on the movie set.

"Herb was on the set all the time," Joe said. "He was a wonderful man who helped hundreds of people. There are not many people like Herb in Hollywood."

# Organ Mountains-Desert Peaks artist sought

## BULLETIN REPORT

The Las Cruces district office of the federal Bureau of Land Management and the nonprofit Friends of Organ Mountains-Desert Peaks are calling for applications for the national monument's spring artist-in-residence program. This year's artist will be assigned to cover the monument's 10th anniversary.

The artist-in-residence program takes place from May 1 – 31, educating and promoting the appreciation, protection and preservation of natural and cultural resources on public lands, as put in a news release.

"With more than 496,000 acres of public land encompassing five scenic mountain ranges – the Robledo, Sierra de las Uvas, Organ, Potrillo, and Doña Ana Mountains, the monument is an iconic landscape to host the BLM Artist-in-Residence Program," the agency stated. "The area's unique geological, biological and cultural resources provide the artist with endless possibilities for self-expression through their lens, painting, sculpture, poetry, music, etc."

In addition to the landscape, flora and fauna of neighboring mountain ranges, BLM noted the local wealth of Paleo Indian and historical artifacts on hand to inspire the artist and the mission of the program.

During the residency, housing will

be provided for the artist by BLM along with a \$1,000 stipend via Friends of the OMDP. The artist commits to a creative community project, a public event and a completed art project useful for promoting the monument and this year's anniversary.

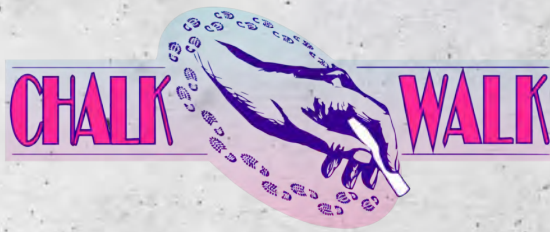

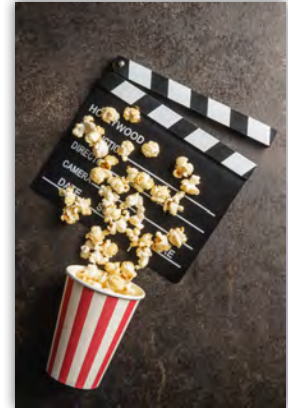

# New ethnic studies research center debuts

## BULLETIN REPORT

A new research center was unveiled at New Mexico State University this week as part of "Research and Creativity Week" at the university.

Faculty members of the Borderlands and Ethnic Studies department welcomed the new research center, which department head Dulcinea Lara said

in a news release "will contribute to research and scholarship in the field of social justice and advocate for inclusive and equitable research environments."

The department was established in 2019 and houses relational ethnic studies, Native American studies, Chicana/Chicano studies, decolonial research Palestinian studies, according to a news release. The

department confers three undergraduate minor degrees and two graduate certificates.

The department says the research center will raise awareness of New Mexico's diverse ethnic makeup and nurture collaborative relationships while addressing "racialized oppression, discrimination and epistemicide," the latter term referring to the erasure of

ways of knowing, such as those rooted in ethnic traditions.

The research center's director is professor Manal Hamzeh, who said the center is envisioned as "a hub of creativity, forward-thinking and sustainable practices that foster ethnic studies and place-based learning for all New Mexicans." Hamzeh teaches courses in decolonial research methodolo-

gies and two courses in Palestine studies, per the university.

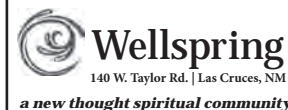

## Virgin Galactic updates investors on next flight, new fleet

An investigation into the loss of a pin during Virgin Galactic's most recent flight to the edge of space over New Mexico is not expected to require design changes or delays as the spaceliner company develops a new fleet of spaceships, president of operations Mike Moses said during an investor call Tuesday. An alignment pin fell from the carrier aircraft, VMS Eve, during the January 26 mission from Spaceport America in Sierra County.

Moses said the investigation was currently in a "corrective action" phase, adding that the issue did not present any safety risk during the flight.

Moses, along with CEO Michael Colglazier, said the company was moving ahead with plans for its seventh mission during the second quarter of 2024. Meanwhile, a new fleet of the company's space plane is in development at a manufacturing facility in Pheonix, Ariz., with plans to begin testing next year and commence commercial service in 2026.

The Delta fleet spacecraft will include more seating for passengers and be able to fly missions more often with quicker inspections and preparations between flights, allowing each craft to fly eight times per month as the company plans to launch 300 flights per month at a projected revenue of \$1 billion once the operation is scaled up.

The mission this year, dubbed Galactic 07, is projected to generate \$800,000 in revenue per seat, with a manifest comprising private commercial passengers and

researchers.

Ticket sales are not currently open, but Colglazier said the price has increased to \$600,000 and would remain at least that high when sales resume.

"Our astronaut journey is delivering an incomparable life experience," Colglazier said during the call.

As part of that business plan, Colglazier told investors Virgin Galactic will explore operations at multiple spaceports worldwide, while refining its operation in New

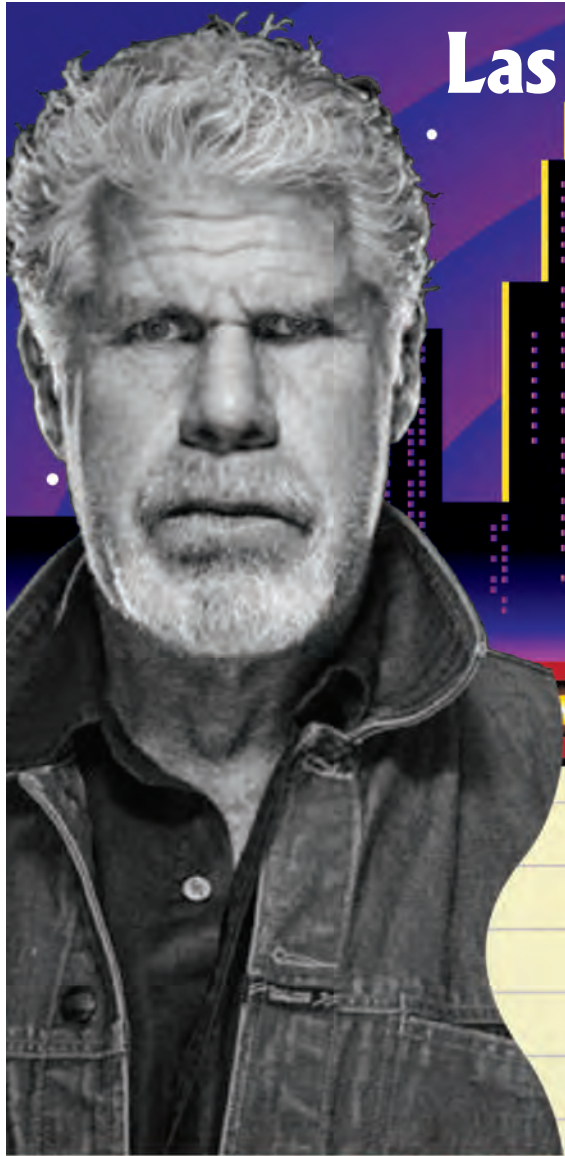
Mexico. He said the facility, located outside Truth or Consequences, had the capacity for them to expand operations there as well. He projected that relationships with a second spaceport could come to fruition by 2029.

Virgin Galactic flew six flights in six months during 2023, but has also operated at a loss for years as it develops its technology and flight operations in preparation for regular commercial service for space tourism as well as research.

The company saw \$6.8

million in revenue during 2023, while its operating expenses reached \$538 million. Although it has recently shut down operations for an extended maintenance period and laid off staff, company executives said the company has enough cash on hand, nearly \$1 billion, to continue into 2026, and expected more investment capital to come.

This was in answer to news in December that Virgin Galactic's founder, Richard Branson, was not planning to invest further in the company.

# Bowling to return with new entertainment center

## BULLETIN REPORT

The return of a full-size bowling center would be cause for celebration enough in a city still feeling the loss of 10 Pin Alley bowling since it closed in 2018.

But a pair of developers have much more than that planned for the vacant Kmart building on Bataan Memorial West.

Kevin McGrath, who is partnering with Michael Parker, told the Bulletin an ambitious plan for a 92,000-square-foot family entertainment center is on track to open this summer. The city Planning and Zoning Commission approved a minor zoning

change this week and the interior of the building, including the former 99-cent store, has been cleared with work to begin on what McGrath promises will be the biggest center of its kind in the region.

A brand-new Burger Time restaurant is planned for the old 99-cent store location, while the rest of the facility will house Elite Family Entertainment Center.

Developers say the bowling center will consist of 30 lanes, including six for children. Additionally, the campus will include the first indoor pickleball courts in the city, a laser tag arena, 5D

cinemas, bumper cars and virtual reality theme parks and sports simulators. Design plans also include a sports bar and restaurant and community facilities.

The complex will share a shopping plaza with the Telshor 12 cinema. The Kmart once located here closed in 2017.

The partners say their business plan will include tournaments and community events intended to bring visitors in from other communities and neighboring states, with Parker stating the size and scope of the facility will rival other large entertainment centers in New Mexico and west Texas.

to produce an annual economic impact of \$2.5

million for the city once it is running.

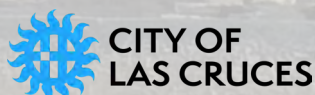

## Tatyana Battle promoted to assistant coach

An Aggie legend will now be coaching the next generation. After two years as Director of Operations, Tatyana Battle has been elevated to an assistant coach for NM State Volleyball.

Battle joined the Aggie staff in the spring of 2022 after playing for the Aggies for four years (2015-18). In 2024, she will begin her first season with a coaching designation in what is set to be her seventh season of Aggie volleyball.

Over the past two seasons, Battle has assisted with day-to-day operations and player development of the team, overseeing a pair of squads that have combined for 37 wins. In 2023, Battle and the coaching staff led the Aggies to a CUSA Championship appearance in their first season as conference members. The team finished as the league's No. 2 seed, ending at 11-5 in CUSA and 21-10 overall. Under Battle, the Aggies won eight straight matches entering the championship game, falling to the nation's 22nd-ranked Western Kentucky Hilltoppers and ending the season.

A native of Albuquerque, Battle established an incredible career with the Aggies during her time as a player. As an outside hitter, she amassed 1,386 kills to rank fourth all-time in program history. She was also named First Team All-WAC three times (2016, '17, '18), while also earning WAC All-Tournament Team honors in 2018 and WAC All-Freshman Team recognition in 2015. Battle also garnered three WAC Player of the Week selections and was named to the 2018 Academic All-WAC Team.

In addition to her individual accolades, Battle helped NM State collect three WAC regular season

titles, two WAC tournament titles and a pair of NCAA Tournament berths. Across the four years that Battle played for the Aggies, NM State compiled an overall record of 97-29 while posting an astonishing 51-6 record in WAC play.

Battle began her coaching career as a graduate assistant and director of team operations for UTEP's volleyball program in 2019. While there, she assisted under the lead of former Aggie assistant and current UTEP Head Coach, Ben Wallis. After one season in El Paso, Battle finished up her master's while living in Albuquerque.

# Ten ways to help you make more putts

After a practice session, Ben Hogan retired to the lounge for drinks. A friend came up and asked, "Mr. Hogan, how can I make more putts?" Hogan hesitated and then replied, "just hit it closer to the hole." I love that story, but we know putting is much more complicated than that. For recreational golfers and tour pros as well, putting is the sure way to lose strokes in a round, and a sure way to gain strokes. Here are ten ways to help you become a better putter.

First is aim. If you aren't aiming properly at your target, you need a lot of luck for any putts to fall. In a previous column, I addressed the matter of

aim as it related to vision. Most golfers have a dominant eye which affects putts.

Next comes the business of speed and distance control. The late Herb Wimberly used to say, "Putting is basically simple – just line and distance." He was right, but distance is more important. Most golfers know where the putt will go within a few feet, but have trouble with the speed.

Green reading is crucial in managing aim and speed. It takes experience, practice, perception and time. The speed of the roll, type of grass and the grain, the overall lay of

the land and other factors all affect how putts will break.

Then there is the putting stroke itself, which many regard as the predominant determinant in making putts. High-handicap players should have a pro take a look at their stroke (see below).

Practice ranks near the top of ways to become a better putter. The pros spend over half their practice time with their short game – chipping and putting.

Putting practice drills are some of the best ways to correct poor technique and develop confidence

around the greens. One of my favorites is called the "ladder drill," in which you place balls three, six, nine, 12 and 15 feet from the hole. If you hole a putt, it's a birdie, a wide miss is a par and a putt short is a bogie. I also like the "circle drill," where you place five balls at six-foot distances around the hole and keep putting until you make all five.

Practice putting aids are also important in developing good putting form and fundamentals. Putting mirrors (placed on the ground) work well in helping to keep your eyes centered. I like the simplicity of a "string line," which is an elastic string attached to two

pencils that helps keep your eyes bisecting the ball, and the "chalk line," a simple masonry string on a reel with chalk inside that you snap on the green to give you a straight roll sight.

Putting games on the practice green are a wonderful way to enhance your sense of line and distance and the confidence in your technique. When I was recovering from a serious accident some 13 years ago, a good buddy was also recovering from surgery and we spent hours on the practice green playing for beers. When I got back on the golf course, I found my putting improved spectacularly.

Putting is such a refined skill and science that the putting instrument is of great importance. Some putters are perfect for some golfers and others are not. The dimensions and configuration of putters vary immensely. They include length, weight, balance, lie angle, grip and much more. Get fitted.

Lessons from your local club pro are a must if you have been struggling with your putting. He or she can look at what you're doing and recommend what you need to do to fix those mistakes.
