Departing city manager addresses legacy, regrets

Ifo Pili first heard of Las Cruces just two years before becoming the city's most powerful man.

He was serving as city manager of Eagle Mountain, Utah, when the city recorder mentioned Las Cruces to him as "a great place to

Two years later, Pili saw an opening for city manager of Las Cruces in a headhunter's email. He didn't think much of it but remembered Las Cruces from the conversation. But he applied anyway. The application was as easy as sending in a resume. The interview was just as trivial. Pili

The following day, Pili got a call from the headhunter, a firm the city of Las Cruces hired. He'd be a finalist for the Las Cruces city manager position, should he want it. Now it was real. Pili said. He'd have to decide if wanted to uproot his family – including his ten children - to Las Cruces, New Mexico.

As part of his evaluation of Las Cruces, Pili packed that family into a car and drove from Eagle

Mountain to Las Cruces. It's an 800-mile drive that takes about 12 to 15 hours.

When he got here, there was something about the City of the Crosses he couldn't shake. Something drew him here. But it wasn't just the shadow of the Organ Mountains or the great weather. Pili said something was driving him to leave Utah for something different.

"I think deep down inside, I was looking for a challenge," Pili said.

Three and a half years, one pandemic, dozens of cannabis shops, one new mayor and a heap of other changes later, Pili will soon leave the city of Las Cruces. He announced on Feb. 28 that he had taken a job as city manager of West Valley City, a community that hugs the outskirts of Salt Lake City, Utah.

"I don't know if I'm coming home or leaving home at this point," Pili told a gaggle of reporters at an impromptu news conference on Feb. 28.

Pili leaves big shoes to fill. The city manager is the most powerful position in city government. Pili oversaw an 1,800-person bureaucracy and a \$519 million budget. The decisions of this unelected official affected public safety outcomes, housing development, employee salaries and much more.

Pili started his job in Las Cruces on Sept. 8, 2020. Before his career in city administration, he had a life as a football player. As a teenager, he moved to Utah from American Samoa. He played on the defensive line at Brigham Young University and later in the NFL before changing careers.

Leaving Las Cruces

The news of Pili's departure came as a surprise.

Unlike New Mexico, governments in Utah do not have to publicly declare the names of finalists for executive positions. Pili has the support of the Las Cruces City Council and mayor, the only people who could fire

Pili said nothing pushed him out of Las Cruces. Although the resignation appeared to come on the heels of a public comment rebellion over the city's actions and the killing of a police officer on Feb. 19, fomenting a local political organization targeting council members ahead of the 2024 elections, Pili said he'd been considering a change since for weeks.

Still, it begs the question: Why now?

"It was really the opportunity with this city of West Valley," Pili said. "I've had other opportunities presented to go back to Utah. I started considering it only because... my children. I came here with eight of them. And now I have five. And they're all going

Las Cruces man killed following a vehicle versus bicycle crash

A Las Cruces man who was struck by a car while riding his bike on Lohman Avenue in February succumbed to his injuries and died on March 2, according to a city of Las Cruces news release.

Roy Parra, 45, was riding his bike on Lohman Avenue near the Interstate 25 overpass when a silver Ford Mustang struck him on Feb. 29, 2024. Police said 27-yearold Emily Elizabeth Portillo drove the Mustang.

According to an affidavit. Portillo admitted to police she had smoked cannabis before the crash. The affidavit said she also failed an alcohol breathalyzer test. Portillo told police she had tried to avoid Parra when she left I-25 and turned west on Lohman.

"Portillo failed to nego-

tiate the turn and crashed Even his age was dishead-on into Parra," a news release said.

Portillo is currently charged with aggravated DWI and reckless driving.

"The initial charges will be amended after the passing of Parra," a news release said.

Portillo had no listed attorney as of the publication of this article.

The Las Cruces Bulletin could not ascertain much information about Parra before press time.

puted. The city of Las Cruces said in its news release that Parra was 47. However, court records for a pending charge indicated he was 45, something a city spokesperson later confirmed.

The Las Cruces Bulletin reached out to Parra's attorney for more information as well as Parra's family via a phone number listed in court records, but has not received a response.

Las Cruces High Schooler killed in Texas crash

A Las Cruces High School student was killed in a car crash traveling to a club volleyball tournament in Midland, Texas, on March 1 around 9 p.m.

Samantha Bursum.14. was a 9th-grade student and volleyball player.

The Texas Department of Public Safety said a 2008 Cadillac CTS sat with lights off near a Pecos. Texas roadway after an unrelated crash blocked both traffic lanes.

Sitting in the passenger seat of a 2016 Toyota SUV. Bursum's vehicle slammed into the Cadillac. Bursum was killed, while the 25-year-old Cadillac driver and 50-year-old Toyota driver were taken to a hospital with serious injuries. The crash remains under investigation.

"Our hearts are with the Bursum family and the Bulldawg community," said LCPS Superintendent Ignacio Ruiz. "Right now, we are focused on how to best

back to Brigham Young University and Utah."

Pili began seriously considering a return to Utah in November 2023 when a search firm hired by West Valley contacted him. He worked through the process and appeared for an in-person interview on Feb. 12.

"At that point, I was still undecided," Pili said.

Pili and his family again made the 12-to-15-hour drive back to Utah for the interview. "When I got to West Valley, we had the interview. And I told my family I was there. All my siblings came up, and we took over a restaurant," Pili said, marking the number of family members at 50. "That started to really sink in. To see all my siblings again with other kids. And, of course, my

daughter was there."

Pili came to the city through a national search following the 2019 departure of Stuart Ed and two interim managers. The city appears to be seeking his successor among current city staff. His two assistant city managers, Sonya Delgado and Ikani Taumoepeau, have strong claims, as does his chief of staff. Barbara Bencomo. Pili also leaves Las Cruces of his own accord, not chased by scandal.

Both points are a far cry

from how he found the municipality in 2020.

Before his arrival, the previous full-time manager abruptly resigned. Ed, who began a run as city manager in 2016, left the office just before an audit found procurement violations and other irregularities. The city also settled \$1.4 million in three whistleblower lawsuits. The whistleblowers said they were the target of retaliation after reporting wasted public funds, procurement violations and other wrongdoing.

Pili was aware of the challenges that a city moving on from scandal entailed.

"The first thing I knew right out the gate is I had to build trust," he said. "An essential part of that, probably in any city government but certainly in ours, had to come from basically the third floor, from this office."

That was the focus for the first two years, Pili said. Through that trust building, Pili said he wanted staff to go from retaliation and whistleblowing to loving where they work and feeling safe in city hall. Practically, that meant giving employees higher salaries and better benefits.

The council and mayor's support was vital in that, he said.

"Those are the things
I needed to focus on because I felt like that was
the need," Pili said, adding
that he couldn't move forward on other initiatives
until that was done right.

Pili has not been immune from allegations of misconduct. A lawsuit filed in 2023 from former city attorney Jennifer Vega alleges Pili wrongfully fired her. The city denied any wrongdoing or retaliation in the matter. As of the publication of this article, the lawsuit remains pending.

Accomplishments and regrets

A city news release announcing Pili's departure touted his successes as city manager.

"Numerous General Obligation Bond projects have been initiated and completed during Pili's tenure as City Manager," the release said.

Those GO Bond projects unlocked funding for a new fire station, park improvement, the East Mesa Public Recreation Complex and public art. The GO Bond also sent \$6 million to an affordable housing trust fund the city uses to support a stunted housing supply.

"The city also has seen several new projects and significant programs implemented, including enhancements at the Las Cruces Innovation and Industrial Park, the start of the LiftUp Las Cruces program and the establishment of a Mobile Integrated Health unit for the Las Cruces Fire Department," the news release said.

But during his discussion with reporters on Feb. 28, Pili pointed to poverty as a source of regret. Shortly after taking the job, Pili told the Las Cruces Sun-News that poverty and economic development were top priorities.

"As a city administrator, I've never attacked

those issues before," Pili told the Sun-News in 2020. "But I'm learning. I'm learning that if we're looking at poverty, we have to go to the core of some of these issues, and I have to learn about how this city can be instrumental and partner in those areas."

Pili also pointed to affordable housing.

"The end of the day, no matter what types of jobs you're bringing in, if you have no place for people to stay that's affordable for them, it just defeats the whole purpose of raising people's income levels," Pili said.

As Pili leaves, he said he feels these goals go unmet.

"I asked the council what they wanted me to work on, and every one of them said we need to move the poverty dial," Pili said. "Well, that hasn't been moved, and that's something that'll probably continue to bother me."

The U.S. Census Bureau and most recent American Community Survey estimate that about 23 percent of Las Crucens live in poverty compared to the national rate of about 11 percent. But Pili expressed optimism about the future.

Pili started or oversaw initiatives like LiftUp Las Cruces, the metropolitan redevelopment areas in West Picacho and El Paseo/South Solano and the city's experiment with guaranteed basic income. He said those will have a lasting effect.

"You're going to see some noticeable changes in the literal landscape of the city, but also the way we operate," Pili said.

Las Cruces educator guest for State of the Union

A Las Cruces educator has been tapped to visit Washington for President Joe Biden's State of the Union address on Thursday evening.

Tatiana Del Toro-Frank, community school coordinator at MacArthur Elementary School, is attending the speech as a guest of U.S. Sen. Martin Heinrich, D-N.M. Heinrich's office said she was chosen in order to highlight her efforts "to bolster New Mexico students' education, health and wellbeing, and also to underscore the work that still lies ahead to expand access to early childhood education and increase funding for full-service community schools."

The community school initiative is a collaboration between school sites, the district, and other agencies and governments to establish programs

and services benefitting the immediate community close to the school. The added social and health supports have been shown, according to research from the state Public Education Department, to correlate with improved student engagement and educational outcomes for students, and beneficial to families and neighborhoods. The first community school established in Las Cruces was at Lynn Middle School in 2017. Since then, it has expanded to seven with the addition of Alameda Elementary, Booker T. Washington Elementary, Conlee Elementary, Doña Ana Elementary, MacArthur and Mesilla Park Elementary. "By partnering with

our local community and nonprofits, we offer our school communities a whole-family approach, providing free onsite school-based health centers, counseling, supplemental nutrition services, childcare and afterschool programs, parenting classes, com-

munity outreach classes, family engagement events and professional development opportunities," Del Toro-Frank explained in a news release. Del Toro-Frank's role

is to coordinate all of the services offered at MacArthur's community school program and work with various providers from the private and public sectors while defining strategies for aiding the specific populations served at her school.

Heinrich, who is running for a third six-year senate term, has been an advocate for community schools and early childhood education. The statewide hub for community school formation in New Mexico, the Southwest Initiative for Transforma-

tive Community Schools, or SWIFT, was established a year ago with federal funding Heinrich secured

> in 2022, and has also supported federal grants supporting community schools in Las Cruces, Taos and Bernalillo County.

"New Mexico's kids deserve a fu-

ture as bright as they are, and champions committed to delivering exactly that.

Tatiana Del Toro-Frank is one of those champions," Heinrich stated in a news release.

State of the Union guests

Presidents, members of congress and other officials regularly bring guests to attend the president's annual address to a joint session of Congress. The guests and their personal histories often represent issues and events of importance to

those officials, especially in election years.

1. Stop and analyze the situation

Is the seller, company, charity, organization or person credible? Contact the local or state consumer agencies to verify the legitimacy of the company. Verify the phone number on the company's website or the person's identity before giving out any of your personal information or clicking any links.

2. Never give out your personal information

Scammers can email or call asking you to verify your personal information. Do NOT give them any information, including one-time passcodes. Most reputable companies will not initiate contact to ask for your information.

3. Contact your financial institution immediately

If you've given out your personal information or a one-time passcode, time is of the essence. The sooner you contact your financial institution, the better.

Las Cruces police call for changes as 'horrendous' video of officer's killing emerges

The bulk of a city hall news conference last Friday focused on changes and priorities that Las Cruces Police Chief Jeremy Story believes would make Las Cruces a safer place.

But it began with a graphic and blood-soaked video of the fatal stabbing of Jonah Hernandez, which left imagery impossible to forget among those who viewed it. The video was presented unredacted.

"The videos you're about to watch are horrendous," Story said. "They're exceptionally difficult to see. If I were not required to release them (because of) the Inspection of Public Records Act, I would not. One thing I want to say on the record is that Officer Hernandez did nothing wrong. This could have happened to any of us, including me," Story said.

Two videos – from surveillance footage and Hernandez's body-worn camera — showed Hernandez approaching a man identified as Armando Silva on Feb. 11 while responding to a trespassing call around 5 p.m. Silva and Hernandez exchange a few words before Silva draws a knife and closes the distance between them. After Hernandez trips on the asphalt, Silva stabs him repeatedly in the neck area.

Off camera, Silva is then confronted by a witness recently identified as Isaiah Astorga. After another brief exchange, Astorga can be heard firing his gun and killing Silva. Astorga and another bystander rush to Hernandez's aid and attempt to save him.

After the videos, Story outlined three short-term and three long-term items he said would make Las Cruces safer.

The first goal was to fill LCPD's 25 vacancies.

"If I had those 25 positions filled, I could do a lot of things I can't do now," Story said. "I could add officers to hot-spot crime areas. I could add detectives to property crime. But I have to fill those positions to make that happen."

LCPD is funded to have 220 police officers, according to the budget of the city of Las Cruces. But over the last four years, the department has struggled to stay fully staffed. At its lowest point in 2021, LCPD had 165 officers.

Low recruitment and poor retention are not unique to LCPD. Departments across New Mexico and the U.S. have experienced a similar phenomenon. This has led to the department increasing incentives like hiring bonuses and salary to become more competitive in the job market.

"The pool of qualified police officers, all agencies are fishing from that pool," Story said.

The city council and city manager recently agreed to a new contract with the police union that significantly raised officer's salaries. The pay was one part, but Story said community support and department morale were also essential to fill the gap.

Story's second point was to replace the city's unconstitutional ban on panhandling. Parts of the ordinance became unenforceable after a federal judge found that panhandling constituted free



speech in 2015. That ruling led to several successful lawsuits across the U.S. and caused Las Cruces to amend and stop enforcing the ordinance in 2018.

The problem with the Las Cruces ordinance, Story said, is partly enforceable and partly not. That leaves officers in a legal word problem about when and how those laws can be enforced. There's also the issue of humanity, as Story pointed out.

The third item was the establishment of the city's Real Time Crime Center. The center would utilize security cameras and databases to surveil public spaces and inform officers about situations as they enter them.

Dozens of U.S. cities have similar systems, al-

though advocates like the ACLU have raised questions about the civil rights issues that arise from the

surveillance.

Story also outlined three long-term goals, which included reforming the state's laws around involuntary commitment and bail reform.

Two bills were introduced in the state legislature this year that would have made it easier for a judge to have people involuntarily committed following a ruling of incompetence in a criminal matter. Both bills died quickly in the short session. Across the state, officials have cited problems with competency in the criminal justice system.

"When competency is raised, usually by the de-

fense attorney, it goes to district court. There's an evaluation. If the person is deemed incompetent ... it comes back down to either municipal court or magistrate court with an order to dismiss," Story said. "Zero discretion is given to the judge."

Story said 576 cases in municipal court were dismissed following this pattern. All 576 involved four people, Story said.


"There are zero consequences for all this crime. Nothing. It's dismissal, and that's it. There's no treatment. There is nothing that happens from all this crime," Story said.

The next topic Story outlined was bail reform.

In 2016, the voters of New Mexico approved a constitutional amendment that effectively ended cash bail. Instead, the legislature instituted a system that is meant to keep only

the most dangerous people in jail before a jury can decide their guilt.

"The problem was that people should not be held in jail for six to eight months because of the inability to pay a small bond. I don't disagree with that notion." Story said. "The problem is that we went from keeping too many people in jail to almost nobody in jail."

Contrary to that statement, the Doña Ana **County Detention Center** had 616 people in custody last week.

Story said that the burden to keep someone jailed is unreasonable, something other public safety officials have also said.

"Right now, the entire New Mexico system is set up to protect criminals over everyone else. Of course, I believe in constitutional rights. I believe in civil liberties. But all those are being applied to the criminals and victims be damned," Story said.

The sixth and final suggestion Story outlined was a call to focus on fentanyl.

"If you overlay the data on fentanyl seizures, the increase in crime and increase in homelessness. they line up," Story said.

Story said it was important not to be fatalistic about fentanyl. He suggested creating a law that would mandate treatment for people who have been convicted of drug-related crimes. Additionally, he said treatment should be mandated for people who have used certain drugs in the commission of a crime.

"We treat addiction differently than we treat any other disease," Story said. "We don't wait till stage four cancer or somebody is in hospice care to start treatment. But we say people need to hit rock bottom before treatment. Rock bottom is death or overdose at this point. It's too late. If we really care about these people, we will find a way to get them treatment long before it gets to that point."

By the end of the conference, Story spoke about the feelings that this entire incident and process had stirred in people.

"Unbridled anger, even righteous anger, will not accomplish anything positive," Story said. "We have to focus our emotions on productive goals while maintaining our humanity."

Mayor Tours Las Cruces Utilities Operations

For nine hours over two days, Las Cruces Mayor Eric Enriquez had an upclose view of Las Cruces Utilities (LCU) operations and facilities.

Mayor Enriquez and new Las Cruces City Council members were invited to participate in an extensive overview of LCU facilities, how the City's utilities operate, and to learn about some of the innovations LCU is making. On the afternoon of Tuesday, February 6 and the morning of Wednesday, February 7, Mayor Enriquez was able to get more information and insight on LCU's operations and maintenance involving water, wastewater, solid waste, and natural gas and energy.

Enriquez said, "It was a great learning experience to more fully understand the hard work, safeguards, and regulatory demands, done by our Utilities team. I am impressed with the dedication and skills of our employees and the amazing things that happen at the different facilities across town."

Some of the highlights shared about LCU:

- The city's water distribution system has more than 700 miles of water lines.
- · Las Cruces has a daily water capacity of 42 million gallons.

Mayor Enriquez also learned during the tour:

The City has a new ultraviolet (UV) station at the JHWWTF that will sterilize bacteria. That system is expected to come online

The Solid Waste Collections program took control of its own fleet maintenance and vehicle parts a year and a half ago and has LCU staff dedicated to bringing vehicles back online quicker and more efficiently.

The City's natural gas system has a multitude of layers of protection with automatic pressure and relief valves that kick in if others are faulty. Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) systems help monitor control and always analyze gas systems, as well as water and wastewater systems.

The City converts sewage sludge into "Class A" compost that can be used in lawns and gardens. This free "Class A" compost is available at the JHWWTF in small increments and at the West Mesa for large truckloads.

Mayor Enriquez and City Council members will also have tours scheduled of other City departments.

Doña Ana County buys land for transitional housing project

The Doña Ana County Board of County Commissioners voted unanimously to purchase two plots of land for an upcoming transitional housing project near the intersection of W. Picacho and N. Motel boulevards.

Commissioners voted 4-0 to authorize the county manager to buy land at 854 and 856 N. Motel Boulevard for up to \$800,000 during a meeting on Feb. 27. Commissioner Shannon Revnolds was absent from the vote.

Advocates for the project said the housing is key to interrupting cycles of arrest and release and rearrest caused by underlying mental health issues. But some questions were raised about the impact the housing will have on the area.

"Right now, we need just more units available for people so we have fewer folks living completely unhoused or living right now," Michael said. in motels," said Jamie Michael, the county's health and human services director. "Neither of those environments are recovery-focused. And living in motels is definitely not financially feasible."

Michael said the project would bolster the supply of transitional housing to help people just released from the Doña Ana County Detention Center. The complex would consist of modular homes

owned but not used by the Doña Ana County Fire Department.

The project is still in an early phase, Michael said. But she estimated it could be operational in six months.

"We're going slow "We're just talking about how do we build the facility, how do we get the infrastructure in place."

Las Cruces has some transitional housing already. Organizations including Community of Hope, FYI+, La Clinica De Familia, and Zia Recovery Center offer the services to specific groups.

According to the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development, transitional

housing provides emergency shelter to prevent people from falling into

homelessness or interrupt cycles that prevent people from obtaining housing.

The housing is temporary. Typically, people aren't allowed to stay in the unit for over a year or two. Most transitional housing comes alongside other services like job training, therapy, and drug addiction recovery services. Michael said the vision for this project is for groups like the Community of Hope and La Clinica to participate.

This project would serve eight men who'd recently had contact with the criminal justice system but were diverted into a diversion program.

"Many of them may be recently released from jail. Some of them may have been diverted prior

to booking. Some of them may be leaving an inpatient facility," Michael said.

While that might seem like a few people, the Las Cruces Police Department has repeatedly emphasized the role that a handful of people stuck in cycles of crime, arrest, and release have on community safety.

The transitional housing complex would be located about one mile from Picacho Middle School, which Commissioner Susana Chaparro raised before the board approved the purchase. Chaparro said she supported the project but wanted to relay questions she'd received from her constituents.

"One of the questions that came to me, and it was from a teacher, was how a safe place to be cre-

ated for the community is, not so much for the participants," Chaparro asked. "As we all know. this corridor (W. Picacho and N. Motel) is one of the most unsafe places in the city."

Michael said the transitional housing project was geared toward addressing that problem.

"Their behavior that is scary or their behavior that is criminal behavior sometimes is motivated by an untreated mental illness or unmet needs," Michael said. "If we're able to meet those needs. then we reduce that scary behavior or that criminal behavior."

Chaparro restated her question, asking for more specifics. Robert Herrera, county director of facilities and parks, said the transitional housing project would be built and managed in such a way as to promote safety.

"We're in the very early stages of the design process," Herrera said. "But we will implement architectural elements that will control access to the facility."

Herrera said the facility would be gated, set back a few dozen feet from the main road and have a wall around it.

"This isn't a facility to keep people there," said Commissioner Christopher Schaljo-Hernandez. "It's a facility to alleviate the fact that they're without a home and without resources. This facility is to provide those and get them off the street."

Council approves new affordable housing strategy, \$6 million GO Bond

The Las Cruces City Council approved a \$6 million affordable housing general obligation bond and a strategy for how to spend it.

Across two votes during a council meeting on March 4, councilors issued the affordable housing bond that voters approved in 2022. The votes passed 5-0. Councilor Bill Mattiace and Mayor Eric Enriquez were absent from the meeting. City officials said \$4 million would develop more subsidized rental units, while \$2 million would go to land acquisition and development for affordable single-family housing.

City Housing and Neighborhood Revitalization Manager Natalie Green said the original goal of the bond was to help build 300 units and leverage about \$36 million in other grants and programs. However, she said Monday that the city expects to leverage \$142,182,000 and build about 800 units.

Most of the housing units in these projects will be to support potential renters and first-time home buyers – not people who are homeless.

"Affordable housing is such a broad spectrum and helps so many people in the community in many income levels," said Councilor Becki Graham.

The bond has been promised as a vital source

of funding to address the city's lack of affordable housing, something low-income residents depend on for stable shelter and the creation of generational wealth. A University of California Irvine study looking at affordable housing in Orange County, Calif., found that affordable housing can reduce crime.

"What's happening right now isn't happening in a vacuum," said councilor Johana Bencomo, referring to crime rates and homelessness in Las Cruces. "And the context in which we're operating is that there has been a decades-long disinvestment from the federal government."

The bond was one of four GO bond-funded projects worth \$23 million voters in Las Cruces approved in 2022. \$6 million for affordable housing was joined by \$10 million for a new fire station in Sonoma Ranch, \$2 million for park improvements across the city and \$5 million for the East Mesa Recreation Complex.

The council issued the other bonds shortly after voters approved them in 2022. The council held off on issuing the affordable housing GO bond, fearing the interest rates and taxes would gobble up too much of the bond. Later, after a former Las Cruces councilor criticized news coverage of the council's declination to issue the bond, the city said they also wanted to understand better how to use

the bond money to maximize its effectiveness.

Ultimately, they chose to issue the bond now, expecting an interest rate of 5.2 percent.

"Maybe a year or two ago, if you'd have told me 5.2 percent, I would've thrown up," City Manager Ifo Pili said. "But right now, that's what the market is."

That's where the report comes in.

The report was written by Colorado-based con-

sultant Project Moxie and cost the city about \$98,000, according to Green.

The report outlined strategies to address needs in the rental market, housing market, land development, preserving the city's supply of affordable housing and other approaches to support implementation.

"We wanted to do things that were actionable," Green said.

Those strategies included increasing tax

credit developments, a significant tool for affordable housing development across the U.S. The report also called for growing subsidies to make more land in Las Cruces suitable for housing construction, installing a decision matrix to select locations for development, and prioritizing efforts in the city's two redevelopment areas in West Picacho and El Paseo/South Solano.

Understanding the need

The federal government defines affordable housing as rent or mortgage that costs less than 30 percent of the combined income of everyone living in the unit.

The report said that the average cost of rent in Las Cruces is \$1,400, according to rental property websites and aggregators. That means to afford the average rental unit in Las Cruces, the Las Cruces


family would need to make about \$56,000 annually.

Less than half of all Las Cruces households meet that number. The U.S. Census Bureau estimates the median household income in Las Cruces to be about \$51,000.

The Project Moxie report said the rental problem is compounded further by two major institutions in the area: New Mexico State University and the various U.S. military installations. Students at NMSU and workers at the bases are more likely to rent than buy since their time in Las Cruces will be temporary. Those groups increase the demand for rentals.

The report also found that just 20 percent of units in Las Cruces were suited to be easily rentable as a single-family attached unit (commonly known as a "mother-inlaw casitas") or multi-

A whiff of a rolling quorum

Las Cruces has periodically learned expensive lessons about New Mexico's Open Meetings Act.

Except for certain carefully designed exceptions, governing bodies are required to meet and converse in the open. The law states: "All meetings of any public body except the legislature and the courts shall be public meetings, and all persons desiring shall be permitted to attend and listen to the deliberations and proceedings."

In 2002, members of the

school board were accused of approving incentive pay for a superintendent out-

side of a legally noticed meeting of the body. Five people faced criminal charges for violating the law requiring government bodies to conduct the public's business openly. Violations

of the Open Meetings Act are a misdemeanor with a potential \$500 penalty for each offense.

In 2003, the Las Cruces Sun-News and the New Mexico Foundation for

> Open Government sued the city for conducting what is typically called a "rolling quorum," in which council members discuss policy and other public business with each other outside of public

business meetings even if a quorum (the required number of members for an official proceeding) is

not present at the same place or time. For instance, as the state Attornev General's compliance guide for OMA states, "if three members of a five member board discuss public business in a series of telephone or email conversations, the discussion is a meeting of a quorum." That would constitute an unlawful unofficial meeting.

As City Manager Ifo Pili announced his departure last week, he recommended an internal hire

in discussions with councilors; with how many, it is not clear. We reached out to Mayor Eric Enriquez to ask about those conversations. He was traveling this week and did not respond by press time.

Hiring Pili's successor from among current staff might be a very good decision, but if a quorum of the council discussed it through Pili and/or with each other, an unlawful rolling quorum likely took place.

With the recent announcement that City Manager Ifo Pili will be returning to his home state of Utah, we are now in a situation where the city, county and New Mexico State University are all searching for new leaders at the same time.

The process to fill these top positions should be thorough and transparent. NMSU is furthest along, having narrowed its list of candidates to five finalists after a nationwide search.

The five candidates are completing their campus visits, and the Board of Regents is expected to announce its decision on March 11. Let's hope regents have learned from

the fiasco they created the last time they went through this process.

Instead of selecting one new leader to replace Garrey Car-

ruthers, regents picked two; at a combined salary of almost \$1 million a vear. It was a half-baked plan concocted without input from faculty, staff or the community that was always destined to create animosity and end in failure.

In 2021, both the Faculty Senate and the student Senate passed no-confidence votes against university leaders. Since then, a hazing

The city has taken a different approach. Mayor Eric Enriquez suggested they will look to the group of city administrators working for Pili to

fill the position. That may make sense, given the different circumstances of this transition. Pili isn't being forced out. If the city council is happy with his work, it may make sense to promote from within and maintain continuity.

Pili did just that a few months ago when he named Jeremy Story the new police chief. That seems to have worked out well so far.

While the three new leaders will all face different challenges, they will also have one thing working in their favor. They will be coming into power at a time when the state is

Red flag law threatens 2nd Amendment freedoms

The affidavit form used to implement the Extreme Risk Firearm Protection Orders and a related petition form, under New Mexico's "Red Flag" law, are the enabling instruments government can use to confiscate an indi-

vidual's firearms temporarily or permanently.

Yet these forms contain unresolved loopholes that can unjustly affect the reporting party, respondent, or law enforcement officers, including school educators, employers and prosecutors.

For instance, every respondent will be imme-

diately registered on the National Instant Criminal Background Check System (NICS), which could affect their rights to employment and/or community reputation. The initial affidavit form does not explain to the reporting party that they will be subpoenaed to testify at a court hearing

in the county where the respondent resides. This form also does not warn the reporting party of the penalties for malicious or deliberately false statements, nor is there any indication that a copy is to be given to the reporting party.

Both forms require detailed evidence of the accused's firearms and ammunition, their numbers, type and location. These forms, which must be notarized, also require evidence of intimate personal details of the respondent: age, health, personality, criminal record, mental state, including any past, present or future basis for issuing any future protection or-

ders under this law. These forms require the reporting party to indicate who is at risk and invite additional comments and observations in addition to the 30-plus inquiries listed on each form. The reporting party is also expected to divulge any relationship between everyone listed in the affidavit, the petition or court hearing including personal, emotional or legal information.

The law enforcement officer and the court then adjudicate the evidence. The process of confiscating the respondent's firearms and ammunition could be immediate, at the court's discretion, while notification of the court

hearing is only issued to the respondent 10 working days in advance. Such short notice regarding the hearing and possible confiscation of firearms conflicts with the right to sufficient time to obtain legal advice and prepare rebuttal.

The obvious threat to the guarantees of the 2nd Amendment posed by this red flag law is manifest in the ease with which the affidavit form may be initiated. Anyone, regardless of their relationship, spouse, family member, ex-partner, employer, co-worker, school administrator, without regard to possible bias, or qualification, may act as a reporting person.

LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Dear Editor,

A recent puff piece by Dr. Prasad Podila in the Las Cruces Sun-News, lauding the administration of Memorial Medical Center, compels me to write. Spoiler alert: Mine is a dissenting opinion.

I was a practicing physician in Las Cruces from 1981 to 2021. Memorial Medical Center was never a "rural hospital," as Dr. Podila calls it. When he came here, there were two neurosurgeons covering the emergency room 24/7. Their presence made the difference between life and death for a severe head injury. There were two plastic surgeons on

call to the ER for dog bites, facial fractures and hand injuries. We had an excellent corps of physician-anesthesiologists. We had cardio-pulmonary surgeons and excellent orthopedists doing innovative procedures.

More important than the scope of services, which looks impressive on a web site, is the quality of the people providing those services. Memorial Medical Center used to be staffed by physicians who spent their careers here, who devoted themselves to the care of the community, who were an integral part of Las Cruces. They were men and women to whom I entrusted the care of myself and my family. Now it seems that the medical staff is made up of transients.

Memorial Medical
Center was originally Memorial General Hospital,
a city-county facility. It
did not have the financial
support to sustain itself
and so became a private
nonprofit institution,
and then a private forprofit owned by Lifepoint
Health, which itself is
owned by Apollo Global
Management.

I don't recognize the hospital as Dr. Podila described it in 1998, and I don't recognize what it is now.

flush with new revenue.

The \$10.2 billion budget passed by the Legislature this year is by far the largest in state history and includes \$1.5 billion for higher education. At a recent budget retreat, Pili told members of the city council that its budget had increased by 25 percent in the past three years.

Those entrusted with

family housing such as apartment complexes.

The report expected the problem to grow over the next decade as the population grows.

Home-buying issues stem from a lack of supply and cost combined with national and global context.

"One of the major

market factors impacting for-sale opportunities is mortgage interest rates," the report said. "Unfortunately, interest rates have been climbing steadily since autumn of 2022."

Rising interest rates are saddled with a booming housing market. The report recited market statistics from New Mexico MLS.

The statistics stated that the median housing

cost has grown 63 percent in five years from about \$180,000 to \$295,000. New Mexico MLS also said the active supply of homes has dropped from 741 in 2018 to 472 in 2023, a 36 percent decrease.

"While typical home values in Las Cruces increased... affordability gaps continue to grow," the report said, adding that only Santa Fe had a greater affordability gap.

MountainView calls for peanut butter to fight hunger

MountainView Regional Medical Center issued a call for peanut butter, a much sought-after item by community food banks, to benefit Casa de Peregrinos' emergency food program.

All the discomforts of 'Home'

There is something decidedly British afoot at the Black Box Theatre.

Two tweedy gentlemen meet to exchange pleasantries and small talk. All is not as it seems, however, as offset by the arrival of two straight-talking women who lend an ominous note to the proceedings. What is the secret these very different people are hiding? Spoiler alert, it's not that shocking.

At its core, "Home" is a ponderous and plodding exploration of human disconnectedness, shot through with amusing, if somewhat absurd, interchanges between five disparate and desperate characters. First performed in 1970, David Storey's play has been compared to other "naturalist" offerings of the time, by the likes of Tom Stoppard and Harold Pinter. The difference may be that whereas Stoppard and Pinter almost always give the audience a payoff that benefits from the droll interchange between characters, the same

cannot be said for Storey.

Harry and Jack, winningly portrayed by newcomer Nick Heeb and veteran Danny Wade, are two sides of the same coin. Harry is distracted and kinetic, prowling the stage with the intensity of a caged animal. Jack is voluble and expressive, tossing out non-sequiturs with practiced badinerie. Their banter reveals little of their situation, but is notable for its clipped vaudevil-

lian pacing and the fact that, though they obviously know one another, they actually know very little about each other.

Enter Kathleen and Marjorie, cockney blatherskites adroitly played by veteran Jamie Bronstein



and another newcomer, Sandra Williams. These two cynical babble merchants have a better grasp of why they're in their situation, lending a sobering aspect to the whole. It

becomes obvious

that all four

characters

are being held against their will. Ah, yes, something is definitely afoot. If you, as audience member, can't figure out what that situation is by the end of the first act, you probably haven't been paying attention.

The addition of a fifth character in the second act – a physically confounding performance by yet another newcomer, Bob

"revelation," while adding a somewhat menacing aspect to the proceedings. Sadly, the reveal isn't nearly as disquieting as the story, and Storey, might suggest. In fact, short of a compassionate and somewhat awk-

Q: I've been watching repeats of early "Chicago P.D." episodes that have Sophia Bush as Erin Lindsay. How did the character leave the show?

A: Toward the end of the NBC drama's fourth season, Lindsay lost her cool while interrogating a suspected pedophile and made a very threatening move with her gun that definitely wasn't by the book. Hailey Upton (Tracy Spiridakos) — who eventually became Lindsay's successor on the squad — was there at the time and tried to dissuade Lindsay, who wasn't having any of it. The latter woman came under investigation by the Internal Affairs Division, and she was on a path to her police career ending, but a job offer from the FBI saved her from going full through that process. Interest in her becoming a federal agent had been expressed earlier, but her boss and mentor Hank Voight (Jason Beghe) stepped in to help get her the opportunity at that time. Leaving Chicago for New York and the FBI position also meant Lindsay breaking things off with her professional partner Jay Halstead (Jesse Lee Soffer), with whom she was involved romantically. She also left town when her mother (who was played by the late Markie Post) was a murder suspect, and Voight knew that Lindsay going elsewhere would spare her much of the pain of enduring that situation.

Bush later returned to series work in the Hulu drama "Love, Victor" and the CBS medical show "Good Sam." She also produced the latter program, and a notable episode reunited her with her former "One Tree Hill" co-stars Hilarie Burton Morgan and Bethany Joy Lenz, with whom she also does the podcast "Drama Queens."

Consistency is key


Recently, I ran across a saying from John Maxwell: "Consistency ... It doesn't matter how talented you are. It doesn't matter how many opportunities you receive. 





ward denouement, there are many questions left dangling that one wonders might have lent a little more heft to the proceedings.


Why, exactly, are all of these broken characters here? Their stories are convoluted and untidy, but we never get the payoff we're expecting. It's clear that none are innocent, but innocent of what? Their "crimes" are never really divulged; hence we are left wondering whether we should feel sorry for them or be glad they've been separated from the rest of humanity.

This is problematic, and if not for the understated and witty performances by the actors themselves, might leave some audience members wondering why they bothered. The real joy, it seems, comes from watching two veteran actors put promising newcomers through their paces, with admirable ease. It's up to you to decide whether or not that is enough.



The nature of sauntering

HENRY DAVID THOREAU

NOTE: This is the introduction to Thoreau's 1851 essay, "Walking."

I wish to speak a word for Nature, for absolute freedom and wildness, as contrasted with a freedom and culture merely civil. - to regard man as an inhabitant, or a part and parcel of Nature, rather than a member of society. I wish

to make an extreme statement, if so I may make an emphatic one, for there are enough champions of civilization: The minister and the school committee and every one of you will take care of that.

I have met with but one or two persons in the course of my life who understood the art of Walking, that is, of taking walks, - who had a genius, so to speak, for sauntering: which word is beautifully derived "from idle people who

roved about the country, in the Middle Ages, and asked charity, under pretense of going à la Sainte Terre," to the Holy Land, till the children exclaimed, "There goes a Sainte-Terrer," a Saunterer, a Holy-Lander. They who never go to the Holy Land in their walks, as they pretend, are indeed mere idlers and vagabonds; but they who do go there are saunterers in the good sense, such as I mean. Some, however, would derive the word from "sans terre." without land or a home, which, therefore, in the good sense, will mean, having no particular

home, but equally at home everywhere. For this is the secret of successful sauntering. He who sits still in a house all the time may be the greatest vagrant of all; but the saunterer, in the good sense, is no more vagrant than the meandering river, which is all the while sedulously seeking the shortest course to the sea. But I prefer the first, which, indeed, is the most probable derivation. For every walk is a sort of crusade, preached by some Peter the Hermit in us. to go forth and reconquer this Holy Land from the hands of the Infidels.

Concerns about mergers

New Mexico has plenty of hospitals owned by outof-state entities or private equity firms. The Private Equity Stakeholder Project reports 17 New Mexico hospitals, or about 38 percent, are owned by private equity firms — the highest proportion of any state.

Those holdings include Mimbres Memorial Hospital in Deming as well as four of five hospitals in Las Cruces plus Peak Behavioral Health Services in Santa Teresa.

That's part of a larger national movement that's resulted in some troubling trends. Harvard University researchers released a study last year that indicated patients "are more likely to fall, get new infections, or experience other forms of harm during their stay in a hospital after it is acquired by a private equity firm," according to one release about the study.

a private equity firm or simply a non-local private owner, the concern is that profit will drive decisionmaking.

"There is often either a reduction in services altogether ... a reduction in the quality of services that are offered, and often an increase in price," Duhigg said.

While those trends have been true nationally, she added, New Mexico leaders don't have a lot of data to show that's happening here because of the lack of regulation of hospital ownership transactions.

"Right now, we really don't know how it's impacting New Mexicans other than ... what we hear word of mouth," she said.

Szczepanski pointed to the recent acquisition of Gerald Champion Regional Medical Center in Alamogordo by Texasbased Christus Health, the Catholic health group that also owns Christus St. Vincent Regional Medical Center. In the weeks leading up to the merger, community members raised concerns about whether they would lose access to reproductive health care. media outlets reported at the time.

Christus Health declined an interview for this story and didn't respond to a question about those concerns. Instead, it issued a statement pointing to its 15-year track record with its Santa

Fe hospital, which it described as "incredibly successful" for both patients and staff.

"CHRISTUS Health has demonstrated its commitment to deeply invest in the state of New Mexico and in the health and wellbeing of the communities we serve," spokeswoman Leigh Strope wrote in the statement.

Industry's perspective

The health care industry's initial response to Senate Bill 15 wasn't exactly full-throated support.

New Mexico Superintendent of Insurance Alice Kane said the measure was based on Oregon's comprehensive model, but she believes the plan came together too late this year.

"I think the hospitals needed more time to digest it," Kane said.

The New Mexico Hospital Association at first opposed the bill, which as initially proposed included other types of health care organizations as well as hospitals, contained a larger community review element and did not include a sunset date. By the time the paring-down was through, the group was on board, and Trov Clark, the association's president and CEO, said he's committed to working with sponsors over the next year on a more permanent measure.

"There are just a lot of challenges that have to be worked through," he said.

Clark said his members are concerned about what

it will cost to go through the review process and whether the decision is being made "on an objective, not subjective, basis, regardless of who's in office" at the time. He also said they're worried about having to go through a lengthy review if they're considering a merger for financial relief.

Duhigg said even the first version of Senate Bill 15 included allowances for expediting approval of mergers involving hospitals that were in danger of shutting down. Clark said he'd like to see that available to hospitals that are in financial turmoil but not necessarily on the brink of closure.

Leaders of Presbyterian Healthcare Services declined an interview for this story, but CEO Dale Maxwell said in a written statement the organization is looking "forward to participating in continued discussions during the interim."

Clark said he understands concerns about private equity ownership but added in New Mexico "we have good evidence that it can be done successfully."

He pointed to Lovelace Health System, which is owned by Ardent Health Services, as one example of a hospital system with high-quality scores and strong local ties.

"We need all of the hospitals that we've got, and they are huge contributors to their communities," he said.

Bunch crowned UNF Collegiate co-champion

NMSU REPORTS

Tuesday the Aggies wrapped up their stay in Jacksonville. Fla. as they closed out play at the Momentum Transportation UNF Collegiate hosted by the University of North Florida.

For the second straight week, Emma Bunch finished atop the leaderboard as she fired a 69 (-3) in the final round to close the gap and earn the honor of cochampion along with North Florida's Christin Eisenbeiss as both finished the tournament with a three-round score of 204 (-12) at the Jacksonville Golf and Country Club. Bunch's stellar week comes just one week after running away with the individual title at the GCU Invitational.

As a team, the Aggies posted an 875 (+11) to finish in 12th place among a leaderboard which featured 19 programs, including fellow Conference USA programs, Sam Houston, Western Kentucky, Jacksonville State and future CUSA member Kennesaw State. By shooting 16 under par. Sam Houston claimed the team title.

After ending the opening day of competition tied for second. Bunch finished off her second round of play on Tuesday morning – posting a 67 to mark the lowest second-round score of any competitor in the 102-person field while moving within two strokes of the leader. The native of Lynge, Denmark then recorded a final

round 69 which featured four birdies to fully close the gap and take home a share of the championship.

On the week, Bunch ranked second in average score on the par 3s, third on the par 4s and second on the par 5s while ranking second in total birdies among individuals.

Meanwhile, Alison Gastelum finished second among Aggies – posting a final score of 222 (+6) to finish 51st after compiling six birdies and one of the tournament's 10 eagles of the three-round event.

The Aggies will now be out of competition for three weeks as they ready for the PING/ASU Thunderbird Classic in Phoenix beginning Thursday, March 28. The three-day event will take place at the Papago Golf Club.



Why is the golf swing so difficult?

In 1969 Homer Kelly published a classic golf book called, "The Golfing Machine: Geometric Golf; The Computer Age Approach To Golfing Perfection." The book generated thousands of devotees, and still does today. Kelly listed 26 variables in the golf swing as "major directional factors," which are specifically "variations or execution from pattern or address configuration."

Several years ago I read an article in a learned scholarly journal stating that the golf swing requires 180 body parts to move in sequence, including muscles, bones, tendons and ligaments, all working together to accomplish a proper golf swing. That's a lot! No wonder golf is so difficult.

In an effort to calm the nerves of our golf school students, Coach Herb Wimberly used to say, "The golf swing is easy, it's the game that's hard." Well. the swing was fairly easy for Herb, since he had an effortless. natural, buttery-smooth swing that was powerful and accurate. The truth is that the vast majority of the millions of folks who enjoy recreational golf find the golf swing to be difficult to execute correctly. I'll never forget a talented high school golfer from El Paso whose parents asked me to work

with her so that she might become a division I college

player. One day I

asked her why she

chose golf instead

of soccer or even

tennis. She hesi-

tated a moment

and said, "I liked

so hard that few

other girls could

play and I knew

golf because it was

I could be the best." She won a golf scholarship to Texas Tech.

In reality, the golf swing is far from a natural movement of the body, unlike swinging a baseball bat or throwing a football or kicking a soccer ball. What's more, you are trying to hit a small, stationary ball using a stick

with a smallish head. It's almost impossible for a novice get the golf ball airborne right away, because the swing mechanics are so complicated. You need optimal body rotation to get your clubface on the correct path for impact to produce consistent trajectory, distance and accuracy. The basic mechanics, simplified, concern flexibility, agility, balance, a kinesthetic sense and some strength. Golf teachers want you to focus on your hands, shoulders, arms, torso, hips and legs. Those are the areas that I work out the hardest at the gym to avoid developing an "old guy" swing. It's easier for children to pick up golf because their bodies move

in a more elastic manner; it's much more difficult for adults to start golf from scratch. The fundamentals of the golf swing are grip, tempo, speed, stance and posture – all with precision and movement synchronization. That takes time, learning and practice.

learning and practice.

Sometimes golf seems illogical. For example, you need to hit down on the ball to get the ball up. If you try to scoop the ball it won't work. With the driver, you need to slow it down to get longer distance. And we cannot try to watch the ball to see where it's going before we finish the swing; we have to keep our eye on the ball until after we finish the swing. Nerves and anxiety

play havoc with the golf swing due to the "stationary ball" effect.

There is a difference between a golf professional and a professional golfer. The latter is playing for money: the former is teaching golf and managing golf clubs. In order to make the golf swing less difficult, you need to take lessons from a PGA golf professional. For some unknown reason, some adults try swinging a golf club without taking lessons. To me, that's like trying to play the violin without taking violin from a music teacher.
